## CHAPTER 1

### I N T R O D U C T I O N

- 1.1 General :- Kolhapur district is located between 15° to 17° North latitude and 73° to 74° East longitude. The District is bounded by Sangli district at the North by Belgaum district of Karnatak State at the South and East, and by Ratnagiri district at the West.

### AREA AND POPULATION

- 1.2 The area of the district is 8059 square kilometres. Its population according to the 1971 Census is 20,48,049. The district comprises of 12 Tahsils and the boundary of the district has not under gone any change since 1961.

### PHYSICAL SETTING

- 1.3 The Main part of the district is traversed by the Sahyadry mountains in the West. It has thrown severel spurs in the East of the district and in this range some of the points are as high as 900 metres above mean sea level. Major portion of the district is 390 to 600 metres above mean sea level.

### RIVERS

- 1.4 The principal rivers of Kolhapur district are the Krishna, the Warna, the Panchaganga, the Doodhganga, the Vedganga and the Hiranyakeshi. The Warna river, which has fairly South Eastern trend, serves as the boundary, between Kolhapur and Sangli Districts. Its approximate length in the district is 130 Kilometres. The Panchaganga is formed by the four tributaries namely, the Kasari, the Kumbhi, the Tulashi and the Bhogawati. The Panchaganga falls into the Krishna at Narsobawadi in Shirol tahsil after covering a distance of approximately 136 Kilometres in the district.

drained by the Doodhaganga river flowing a length of  
83 K.m. in the district. The main tributary of the  
Doodhaganga is Vedganga the length of which is nearly  
64 K.m. The Doodhaganga ultimately falls into the  
Krishna River at Yedur of Belgaum district of Karnataka  
State.

#### FORESTS

1.5 The forests in Kolhapur district are confined  
to the Western half of the district. In the high rain-  
fall region in the extreme West Jambul, Hirda, Anjan,  
Supari, Karvi and Panshi plant species are found while  
Amba(Mango), Nana, Sissum, Asan, Kumbhi, Dhavada, Kinjal,  
Ainiba etc. are found in the moist deciduous and semi  
evergreen region. The famous scented wood specie  
Chandan is found in Ajra tahsil. The dry deciduous  
type of Forests are spread for and wide in small patches  
with species of sissum. Besides Timber, Sandalwood, fruit  
trees, firewood, grass, Timber Bamboo, Hirda, Kaju, Bibi  
fruits and minor forest products such as shikekai, cocums  
honey and wax Karanji seeds are grown in marketable  
quantities in these forests. The total forest area in  
Kolhapur district is 1,74,983 and 1,72,140 hectares in  
the years 1977-78 & 1978-79 respectively.

#### SOIL

1.6 Kolhapur district has three broad zones,  
the Western part is covered with lateritious soil, the  
central part has fertile, brownish well-drained soil  
while the eastern zone is covered with alluvial medium  
the deep black soil.

## MINERALS

- 1.7 Bauxite is the only mineral that is found in a sizeable quantity. It is found in Radhanagari, Bhudargad Chandgad and Shahuwadi tahsils. At present Bauxite mined in the district is transported as raw material to the Alluminium factory in Karnataka State. Gypsum is also found in small quantities in Bhudargad tahsil.

## RAINFALL

- 1.8 The rainfall is not evenly distributed in the district and it varies from place to place. Bavda in the west receives a little over 6000 mm. rainfall while Hatkanangle in the east receives rainfall as little as 500 mm. The district gets rain from the South west as well as from the South east monsoon. The main rainy season is from June to October. Ajra, Chandgad, Bavda, Radhanagari and Shahuwadi tahsils come in the heavy rainfall tract. In this tract the normal rainfall ranges from 2096 mm. In Chandgad tahsil to 6232 in Bavda tahsil. Bhudargad Gadhinglaj and Karvir tahsils have sufficient rainfall, while Kagal tahsil falls in inadequate rainfall tract. The remaining two tahsils viz. Hatkanangle and Shirol tahsils may be classified under poor rainfall tract. The normal rainfall in both these tahsils is less than 600 mm.

## SCARCITY CONDITIONS

- 1.9 None of the Villages in the district were affected by scarcity conditions during the year 1977-78 and 1978-79.

## DEMOGRAPHY

- 1.10 According to the 1971 census the population of Kolhapur district is 20,48,049. The density of population is 254 per Sq. Km. whereas in the urban area

it is 2295 Sq. Km. Barring Greater Bombay, district Kolhapur has the highest density of population in 1971. Amongst the tahsils in the district Karvir tahsil has the highest population density i.e. 704 per Sq. Km. while the lowest density of 92 per Sq. Km. is found in Bavda tahsil.

- 1.11 During the period of 10 years from 1961 to 1971 the population in the district has increased by 28.28 percent. This is due to the concentration of industries in four big town in Kolhapur, Ichalkaranji, Jaysingpur in the district.
- 1.12 Considering only the urban areas it is observed that percentage of decadal growth is the highest in Hatkanangle tahsil 65.48. This is due to rapid industrial development in Ichalkaranji town.

IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENT IN THE DISTRICT DURING 1980-81

- 1.13 The western Maharashtra Development Corporation limited Pune started a new watch factory at Kolhapur in collaboration with the H.M.T. Only assembly work is undertaken in the factory.
- 1.14 An amount of Rs. 25,45,000 was sanctioned to 327 educated unemployed persons under the Employment Promotion Programme during the year under report.
- 1.15 The leather goods viz. Kolhapuri Chappals, leather gloves, Pressed leather worth Rs. 9 lakhs were exported by the Maharashtra State Leather Industries Development Corporation.
- 1.16 The Target fixed for the Family Planning was achieved by making various efforts by the concerned agencies in the district.

### SPECIAL FEATURE OF THE DISTRICT

- 1.17 The Kolhapur district is well known for sugarcane production. Sugarcane is used for production of quality gur as well as for sugar.
- 1.18 There are in all 12 Co-operative sugar factories registered in the district besides one privately owned factory. Out of the 12 Co-operative sugar factories 8 are in production and the recovery percentage of sugar is favourably comparable with any other district in the state. These factories together with the privately owned factory are contributing to large share to the State's sugar production.
- 1.19 Another important Industry worth noting is Kolhapuri Chappal which has a large export potential. There are number of small scale manufacturing units and cottage units in the district engaged in production of Kapashi and Kolhapuri Chappals which are quite popular not only in India, but in some foreign contries also.
- 1.20 Kolhapur district is also famous for small scale units manufacturing oil engines, spare parts for oil engines and other allied agricultural implements. A special feature of these units is that most of them are owned and run by small entrepreneurs rather than big industrialists.
- 1.21 Silverware and silver ornaments manufactured in Hupari of Hatkanangle tahsil are known for artistic value and are exported out of district in fairly large quantity.

## CHAPTER II

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1980-81. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, where as the data on 'Co-operation' is for the co-operative year (1st July to 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calander year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter-tahsil comparision.

### DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres such as :

- i) Population
- ii) Agriculture
- iii) Animal husbandry
- iv) Industries
- v) Co-operation
- vi) Medical and public health
- vii) Education
- viii) Transport and communication
- ix) Plan expenditure etc.

Pertaining to the district is presented alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for the comparision.

### DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summerised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

## AREA & POPULATION

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural and urban break up etc. is presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variations 1951-61 and 1961-71 classification of villages and towns according to population ranges number of workers and non workers, population of scheduled castes, and scheduled tribes, distribution of population according to age group and religion is also given in these tables.

### 2.5 A) URBAN AREA

The following places have been treated as 'Urban areas'

1. Every place having a municipality or cantonment board irrespective of its population.
2. Every other place which satisfies following three conditions :
  - i) Population at least 5,000
  - ii) At least three-fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits and
  - iii) Density of population of at least 400 persons per square Km.

Any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify its being treated as urban such as a project area or a developing township.

### B) RURAL AREA

These areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called 'Rural areas'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well defined boundaries, a map and separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

C) WORKER

A worker is defined as a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or Political workers actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party is also regarded as a 'Worker'. In case of perennial work such as cultivation, livestock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person is treated as a worker by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year, even if he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person is considered as 'Worker' if he had participated in such a regular work on any one of the days during the week preceeding the date of enumeration and that work has been considered his main activity.

D) NON WORKER

Non workers are those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work.

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity but not on full time scale were treated as 'Non worker' in respect of their main activity.

## CLIMATE

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effect on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No. 8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1980 for the selected 12 centres. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years and maximum of 80 years. A day was treated as a 'Rainy day' if during the twenty-four hours the raingauge recorded a minimum of 25 mm. of rainfall. The table no. 9 given actual maximum and minimum tempratures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1980 in respect of Kolhapur centre.

## AGRICULTURE

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistic on agriculture such as:

- i) Land utilisation
- ii) Area Under different crops
- iii) Yield per hectare & outturn of principal crops
- iv) Sourcewise irrigated area, and
- v) Data on irrigation
- vi) Irrigated area under different crops etc.

are given in tables 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definations adopted are given below :

### A) GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

It is according to village papers calculated from village returns prepared by village officials for revenue purpose and such it may be different from that of surveyor General.

### B) FOREST

It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'Forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not

actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

C) LANDPUT TO NON AGRICULTURAL USES

It stands for all lands occupied by buildings roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other lands put to uses other than agricultural purposes.

D) BARREN & UNCULTURABLE LAND

It covers all barren & unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classes as unculturable whether such land is isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings.

E) PERMANENT PASTURES AND OTHER GRAZING LAND

It covers all grazing land whether they are permanent pastures & meadows or not; Village common & grazing lands and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head.

F) CULTURABLE WASTE

These may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession.

G) MISCELLANEOUS TREE CROPS AND GROVES NOT INCLUDED IN THE NET AREA SOWN

This category comprises all cultivable land which is not included in net area sown but put to some agricultural use.

#### H) CURRENT FALLOW LANDS

These comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow'.

#### I) OTHER FALLOW

All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.

#### J) NET AREA SOWN

This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards area sown more than once being counted only once.

#### K) GROSS CROPPED AREA

It represents the sum total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'.

#### L) CULTIVABLE AREA IS A SUM OF AREAS AS UNDER

- a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown.
- b) Current fallows
- c) Other fallows
- d) Culturable waste land
- e) Net area sown.

#### ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & FORESTS

2.11 Population of livestock and poultry as per livestock census, 1978 is shown tahsilwise in Table No.24. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease wise mortality of livestock are given in Table No. 25 & 26. Table No. 27 furnishes data on animal slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.12 The data on 'area under forests' and Major and Minor forests produce for the year 1980-81 have been shown in Tables 28(a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into:-

- i) Reserved
- ii) Protected
- iii) Unclassed forests under the control of

State revenue department and under State Forest Department has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in Table No. 10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitation and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to inaccessible or unoccupied waste.

## INLAND FISHERIES

2.13 The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in Table No. 29 (A).

## EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, mandays worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the year 1980 in Table No. 30,31 and 32 which cover following types of factories registered under factories Act.

- a) those employing 10 or more workers working with the aid of power,
- b) those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power and
- c) those registered under the factory act 1948. Eventhough the above conditions are fulfilled, the defence factories are excluded.

Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual survey of Industries for the year 1979-1980 is given in Table No. 33. Monthwise registration, Vacancies notified placement done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the month, occupation wise and sectorial, other data of employment exchange have been shown in Table No. 34, 35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under employment gurantee scheme is also given in Table No. 36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1980-81 is given in Table No. 38 and number of towns and villages electrified during and upto the end of selected years are given in Table No. 39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric supply companies and sugar factories in the district.

#### CO-OPERATION

2.16 Statistical information on the co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1980-81 on the following items.

i) Loan advanced by Co-operative banks & primary agricultural credit societies and different types of societies their membership

ii) Total value of purchase and sales by the central and primary Co-operative marketing societies,

iii) Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of district has been given in Tables 42 to 46. Tahsilwise data regarding no. of members, capital structure loans advanced and recovered etc. have also been given.

#### WORKING CAPITAL

It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowing loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted overdues refer to the amount of loans on instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which was not extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in Table No. 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilisers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the agricultural product.

2.17 The agricultural non credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.18 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban Credit Co-operative Societies and salary earners' Co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy and Co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.19 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purpose to run Montessories primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

Contd.....

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or members of co-operative societies in its area of operation.

#### MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

2.20 In this section, data on medical and public health for the year 1980 is given. Table No. 48 gives medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'Vital Statistics' e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1980 with break-up into male and female and number of deaths due to important causes of the year 1980 are given in Table No. 49 and 50 respectively. Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1980 is given in Table No. 51. Table No. 52 gives statistics on family planning during the year 1980.

#### EDUCATION

2.21 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in Table No. 53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in Table No. 54 and 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with number of institutions in Pre-primary, Primary, Secondary and Higher categories are presented in Table No. 56. Enrollment and concessions granted to Economically Backward Classes, the data on backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in Table No. 57 & 59.

## TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATIONS

2.22 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in Table No. 60. The Table No. 61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Road maintained by municipal councils/cantonment boards are also shown separately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Kolhapur region covering Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in Table No. 62. (Districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to Kolhapur division of Maharashtra State Road Transport corporation are given in Table No. 63. (Kolhapur State Transport Division comprises of Kolhapur district). Results of traffic census conducted in May 1980 and December 1980 on important roads in Kolhapur district are given in Table No. 64. Statistics on postal, Telegraphs and Telephone facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in Table No. 65 & 66 respectively.

### LOCAL BODIES

2.23 The financial position of village Panchayats, Municipal councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1980-81.

2.24 The number of village Panchayats includes number of independent village Panchayats as also group village Panchayat. Income and expenditure of village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat samities for developmental activities. Government grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants.

Government grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purpose for medical purpose and on account of percentage on land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz.

- i) Self raised resources,
- ii) Government grants
- iii) Grants from agency scheme and
- iv) debt section, the expenditure is shown under

two heads revenue Expenditure & Debt section.

2.25 The data are collected from Zilla Parishad, Kolhapur and all the municipal councils in District Kolhapur.

#### PLAN & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

2.26 Data on plan expenditure under state and local sectors and physical achievement in important fields during the year 1980-81 are given respectively in Table No. 71 & 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme, stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in Table No. 73 to 75.

#### PRICES

2.27 The Table No. 76 gives monthly average wholesale prices on agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.28 The Table No. 77 gives the monthly maximum, minimum and average retail prices of important commodities at Kolhapur head-quarter during 1980. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district head-quarter. The average shown for individual

commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in change in retail prices over the period of time. The Table No. 78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Pune centres for the year 1980-81. For the calculation of index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as 'Base Years' for Sholapur & Pune centres respectively.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

2.29 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics cases disposed of in civil & criminal courts, cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of the theatres, number of banking offices number of scheduled banks their deposits and advance and number of joint stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published etc. are given in the Table No. 79 to 89. Table No. 90 gives information about the quantity of rice, wheat & sugar issued to fair price shops. Statistics relating to general elections held in 1980 is given in Table No. 92.

2.30 The Table No. 93 shows trends in selected indicators in the fields of development such as :

- i) agriculture,
- ii) livestock,
- iii) industry,
- iv) education,
- v) health etc.

These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.



## CHAPTER III

### AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

3.1 The data on different sectors have been presented in various tables of Part II of this volume. On the basis of the said data, an attempt is made to take analytical review of broad sectorial trends. The talukawise indicators pertaining to the level of development reached in different sectors of economy are worked out wherever possible to show the position of each tahsil in the district during the year 1960-61, 1970-71, 1977-78, 1978-79 and 1979-80.

2.2 As elsewhere in the state the agriculture in the district depends considerably on the vagaries of the monsoon and as such the special programmes were launched to increase irrigation facilities and encourage agricultural to adoption of improved agricultural practices which together help to increase agricultural production. The data on agricultural statistics are analysed for the year 1960-61, 1970-71, 1977-78, 1978-79 and 1979-80. The provisional figures are used for the years 1979-80.

3.3 The area sown more than once was 11125 hectares for 1960-61 which had increased to 15632 hectares during 1977-78. It however declined to 11336 hectares during 1978-79. During 1979-80 it again showed an upward trend.

The agriculturists in the district are not in favour of taking double crops as they earn more by taking such commercial crops as sugarcane, there being facility of perennial irrigation.

3.4 The following table will broadly indicates the cropping pattern in the district.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of area under sugarcane is increasing while percentage of area under foodgrains decreasing as compared to the corresponding figures for 1960-61. The Rice is the main crop of the district the area under which constitutes nearly 22 % of gross cropped area. The percentage of the area under non goodcrops more or less remained constant.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown showed increase in respect of all tahsils except Kagal in the district.

However the percentage increase is much higher in respect of Shirol, Gadhinglaj & Ajra tahsil. It comes to 302 %, 224 %, 245 % respectively when compared with the corresponding figures for the year 1960-61.

3 10 Almost all the villages in the district have been covered by the primary agricultural credit societies and these societies serves the credit needs of the agriculturists to a great extent. 3.11 While there was marginal increase in the number of societies since 1960-61, the increase in number of member was remarkable. Actually it was more than doubled till March 1981. After an initial increase the amount of loans overdue was seen decreasing from 1978-79 onwards. However the loans, outstanding was showing constant increase.

#### WAGE RATES

3.12 The agriculture wage rate data are called from three rural centres namely Shirol in Shirol tahsil, Kapashi in Kagal tahsil & Madilge Bk. in Bhudargad tahsil. As usual the highest wage rates are found in Shirol centre. This may be due to the fact that Shirol lies in the fairly prosperous agricultural tract and in the vicinity of big urban areas like Ichalkaranji and Jaysingpur.

3.13 In Shirol an average male unskilled labour got Rs. 5.00 per day and the female unskilled labourer got Rs. 4.00 per day. In Madilge Bk a male unskilled labourer got Rs. 3.50 per day, while the female unskilled labour got Rs. 3.00 per day. In Kapashi centre both the male & female unskilled labourers were paid almost equal wage rates of Rs. 3.00 per day.

3.14 In all the three centres the average daily earnings of skilled workers i.e. carpenters, blacksmiths and cobblers were reported to be about Rs. 12/-, Rs. 10/- and Rs. 5/- per day respectively.

3.15 The livestock plays an important role in an agriculture predominant country like ours where in most of the agricultural operations are done with the help of bullocks. The milch animals like cows, buffaloes and she goats not only cater to the day to day of milk requirements of the agriculturists but also supplement their earnings. Hence their importance is pivotal.

The twelfth quinquennial livestock was carried out all over the country during 1978.

3.16 From the above table it is seen that the Bovine and Ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land in Kolhapur district was 182. The same was less in Bavada, Chandgad, Radhanagari, Bhudargad, Ajra and Shahuwadi tahsils.

ELECTRICITY

3.17 The total consumption of electricity in the district was 20 Million KWH in 1960-61 which increased to 772 Million KWH in 1980-81. This increase was mainly due to increase in number of villages electrified pumps energised and increase in consumption of electricity in factories. The progress

of villages electrified and pumps energised is depicted in the table No. 9 below.

3.18 The parameter of use of electric power per capita is an important indicator of economic progress. The per capita consumption was 12.52 KWH in 1960-61 which increased to 376.95 KWH during the year 1980-81.

3.19 Out of the total villages 935 were electrified till 1980-81. All villages from Karvir, Panhala, Hatkanangle and Shirol tahsil are electrified. Due to hilly and in accessible terrain the number of villages in Chandgad, Radhanagari, Bavda and Shahuwadi tahsil was much less than there mentioned above.

3.20 With the expansion of rural electrification programme, use of electric pumpsets for irrigation purpose had been constantly increasing. Out of total 22597 agricultural pumpsets energised till March 1981 in the district nearly 74 % pumps were installed in Karvir, Hatkanangle, Shirol and Gadhinglaj tahsils.

EMPLOYMENT

Enrolement in the Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

3.21 The following table gives the statistical data in respect of candidates enrolled vacancies notified and placement made through the employment exchange in the district.

There was a decrease in the number of vacancies notified to the employment exchange during the year 1980-81. This was due to the policy of the State Govt. to channelise the recruitment of temporary persons who had worked during the strike of Govt. servants in December 1977 to Feb. 1978 through the Collectorate and setting up of the State Selection (Subordinate Services) Board. As such percentage of placement to enrolement showed declining trend during the period 1979-80

and 1980-81. Moreover the Central Govt. had also created the Central Recruitment Commission Recruitment Board for filling the posts in different nationalised banks.

3.22 The comparative figures of job seekers reflect the magnitude of the unemployment problem. This does not include the unemployed persons seeking manual work in the unorganised sectors and those who have not registered their names with Employment Exchange.

3.23 The following table gives the number of hospitals, Primary Health Centres, dispensaries and indoor and outdoor patients treated in public and public aided medical institutions in the district.

3.24 The above table indicates the increasing trend in the number of medical facilities in the district. The increase in the number of indoor patients was mainly due to availability of more medical facilities provided in the above medical institutions. 3.26 The above table reflects an appreciable progress in Primary, Secondary and Higher educational facilities in the district since 1960-61 onwards. At present almost all villages have primary schooling facilities. In 1960-61 the percentage of drop out students was 88 % from primary to secondary & from secondary to higher education. It has been reduced to 68 % from primary to secondary and 80 % from secondary to higher education in 1980-81.

3.27 With the establishment of number of secondary schools the ratio of secondary to primary institutions is reduced from 12 in 1960-61 to 8 in 1980-81.

3.28 The teacher/pupil ratios for different categories of institutions also indicates that the staffing strength was maintained as per the prescribed standard norms.

BANKING

3.29 The accepted policy of Govt. is to extend banking facilities to far corners of the rural areas and accordingly number of branches of commercial banks as well as of co-operative banks are seen increasing. During the year 1979 the number of banking offices increased to over and above the corresponding compared with the figure for 1961. In the year 1961 number of households served per banking office was 6006 which has reduced to 1215 households in 1979. From the data in the table No. 33 it is observed that more banking offices are required to be opened in Shahwadi, Bavada, Radhanagari, Bhudargad, Ajra, Chandgad, Kappa & Panhala tahsils.

ROADS

3.30 There has been significant progress in respect of road length since 1961. The total road length in 1961 was 1764 Km. which increased to 4375 Km. in 1980-81 recording an increase of 248 %.

3.31 The length of road per 100 Sq.Km. works out to 54.29 Km. which compares very favourably with the figures 21.36 & 34.52 for the years 1960-61 & 1970-71 respectively. The length of roads per lakh of population in 1980-81 comes to 213.62 Km. which is nearly twice the figure for 1960-61.

PRICES

3.32 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at the district headquarter in the Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. The following table gives the trend of the prices of important commodities during the year 1968, 1971, 1978, 1979 and 1980.

3.34 The price index is worked out by the commissioner of labour, Bombay. The index worked out for Sholapur centre is applicable for working class for Kolhapur centre has reached the mark of 372 in 1979-80 with the base year 1961.

## CHAPTER NO. IV

### I N T R O D U C T I O N

- 4.1 With a view to ensure full and efficient use of local resources and to provide a firm base to the process of planning, as also to achieve balanced economic growth, an idea of formulation of the Plan at the district level has been adopted since 1974-75. In the process, 'District' has been adopted as a unit and importance has been attached to the District Planning. The District Planning Boards have been constituted to debate and decide development plans to be implemented in the district. This body was subsequently enlarged to accommodate as many as peoples representatives as possible and the same is renamed as 'District Planning & Development Council' headed by the designated Minister of the District as the Chairman and the Collector as the 'Member Secretary.' Other Minister who hail from the District and the Divisional Commissioner are the Vice-Chairman of the District Planning & Development Council. The other Members of the Council include all the seating MLAs, MLCs, MPs, President of Zilla Parishad, Mayor of the Municipal corporations, if any, and one President each from the 'A', 'B' & 'C' Class municipal councils. The Chairman of the District Central Co-operative Bank, the Director of Land Development Bank, the Chief Executive Officer of the Z.P., and nine non-official members appointed by Government.
- 4.2 The Council is supposed to meet twice a year for formulation of the Plan and to ensure co-ordination amongst different implementing agencies.
- 4.3 In this Chapter IV a brief review of the Annual Plan for 1980-81 is taken.

4.4 The following table gives the consolidated information about the budget provisions and the expenditure incurred under state plan and centrally sponsored schemes for the year 1979-80 and 1980-81.

From the above table it will be seen that the total expenditure during the year 1979-80 was 994 Lakhs which was 101.5 percent of the total budget provision. While in the year 1980-81 the total expenditure was 1043 Lakhs which was 111.3 percent of the total budget provision. It could further be seen that during both the years budget provisions made for the State plan district level schemes were fully utilised.

4.5 The performance of state plan schemes and centrally sponsored scheme during the year 1979-80 & 1980-81 is reviewed separately in the paragraphs to follow.

STATE PLAN SCHEMES

4.6 The following table shows the budget provision and the expenditure made under different major heads of development for two years 1979-80 & 1980-81.

The above table shows that during the year 1979-80 the budget provision was not fully utilised under three Major heads, viz, industry & mining, social services & miscellaneous. While during the year 1980-81 the budget provisions made for "industry & mining & transport & communication were not fully utilized. The utilisation of the budget provisions made for all the schemes put together during both the years was more than 100 %.

As could be seen from the table mentioned above, there are slight variation observed in the percentage of expenditure incurred on different heads of development.

PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS : STATE PLAN SCHEMES

4.8

The details of physical achievements under different state schemes are given in the table no. 72 in Part II of this publication. However a brief review of the important achievements under each sub-head of development is taken in the following paragraphs :-

I) Agricultural Programme

4.9

Under this major head important programme like agricultural production, soil conservation, land reforms, animal husbandary, dairy development, minor irrigation, fisheries & forest are covered.

1) Agricultural Production

4.10 The budget provision of Rs. 2.25 Lakhs was made during the year 1980-81 and expenditure of Rs. 2.10 Lakhs was incurred on different schemes. The insecticides and pesticides were spread to 7845 hectares as against the target of 1000 hectares under crop protection programme. Under the horticulture development programme 14832 fruit plants were distributed on subsidy.

With a view to maximise production of groundnut "the mini cut experiments" were carried out in 399 plots. Under the scheme of demonstration project of Nagali production subsidy of Rs. 0.19 Lakhs was given to cultivators to purchase fertilisers to be used in an area of 385 hectares.

ii) Soil Conservation

4.11 Under this schemes, the work of eight old nala bunding were further continued and six new nala bands were taken up. The land protection of works in 214 hectares and land terracing in an area 125 hectares were completed. The soil conservation and manson works were under taken in 216 hectares. The expenditure of 37.68 Lakhs was incurred during the year 1980-81.

iii) Land Reforms

4.12 Under this scheme subsidy of Rs. 0.39 Lakhs was granted to 233 Landless agricultural labourers during the year 1980-81.

iv) Minor Irrigation

4.13 This is one of the very important schemes implemented in both local and state sectors; under this head two lift irrigation schemes, seven Bandharas and seven percolation tanks were completed. For renovation of 35 old wells for irrigation purposes a subsidy of Rs. 0.50 Lakhs was given.

v) Animal Husbandary

4.14 As against the total budget provision of Rs. 9.03 Lakhs for 11 schemes under this sub head the expenditure of Rs. 6.83 Lakhs was incurred. The major portion of the expenditure was on the construction of buildings for multipurpose veterinary hospital at/ -Nesari, Chandgad, Kagal & Gargoti. Under the individual beneficiary scheme of distribution of cockerels 519 cockerels were supplied.

vi) Dairy Development

4.15 The managerial subsidy amounting to Rs. 0.30 Lakhs was given to 30 Co-operative societies.

vii) Fisheries

4.16 The netting & stocking are the main activities encouraged under this programme. 12.47 Lakhs finger lings were stocked. Total 857 Kg. of nylon twine was distributed as an assistance to fishermen. A subsidy of Rs. 0.40 Lakhs was given to fishermen to purchase 857 Kg. nylon thread.

viii) Forest

4.17 Seven schemes with the budget provision of Rs. 9.69 Lakhs were implemented and the expenditure of Rs. 8.61 Lakhs was incurred. Trees for building timber were planted in an area of 874 hectares.

II) Co-operation

4.18 In all five schemes were implemented. The budget provision for all the schemes put together was Rs.5.08 Lakhs and it was fully utilised. In all 82 societies were assisted in the form of subsidy, loan and share capital etc. The Financial assistance of Rs.2.00 lakhs was given to 43 Rural societies to supply household articles in rural areas.

III) Irrigation & Power

1) Medium Irrigation Projects

4.19 The work of three medium projects namely Chikotra,

Kadavi & Kasari was in progress. The primary survey work of Kumbhi & Patgaon projects was undertaken. The total budget provision for these works was Rs. 32.00 Lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs. 44.98 Lakhs.

## 2) Power Projects

4.20 There were three schemes implemented in the district for which budget provision of Rs. 18.11 Lakhs was made, the expenditure being Rs. 80.16 Lakhs, which, however, exceeded the budget provision. As many as 11 Gavthans were electrified and substantial efforts were made to electrify the inhibitions, Wadies which are away from the villages under whose revenue limits they fall. In addition, 1964 pumps were energised during the year under report.

## IV) Industries And Mining

4.21 In order to enable the prospective entrepreneurs to avail of all the facilities necessary to start new ventures at the district, District Industries Centres were started. In the office of the District Industries Centre all the sections have been created so that the prospective entrepreneurs need not have to go out to get the necessary certificates/licences/recommendations etc.

There were 14 schemes implemented under this head of development for which budget provision of Rs. 47.14 Lakhs was made and an amount of Rs. 44.54 Lakhs was spent. Financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 25.45 Lakhs to 327 educated unemployed was given by way of seed money assistance. So also a subsidy of Rs. 0.79 Lakhs was granted to about 453 small scale industries under the scheme of 'financial assistance to small scale industries' units under S.A.I.Rules. As many as 12 block level balutedar co-operative societies were given financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 1.50 Lakhs.

V) Transport and Communication

4.22 The total budget provision of Rs. 104.83 Lakhs was made under this major head of development, as against of which an expenditure of Rs. 99.78 Lakhs was incurred. Under the scheme in the State sector improvement works were carried out in 1.35 kms. road length. So also 16 C.D. works and 2 'Sakavs' were constructed.

Under the scheme in Local sector improvement works in the road length of 7.32 kms. were carried out. Construction of one bridge as also 19 drainage works were undertaken during the year 1980-81.

VI) Social Services

4.23 The major head 'Social Services' covers sub heads like general education, health, water supply, housing, urban development labour and labour welfare of backward classes etc. The headwise data of budget and expenditure is given below :

4.24 In the following paragraphs, important physical achievements under each sub head are explained.

1) General Education

4.25 Under this sub head, as many as 23 schemes were implemented in this district. Under the scheme of attaching V to VIII Stds. to secondary schools, 16 new divisions during the year 1980-81 were created. Under the scheme of Development and Extension of Government Secondary Schools, 229 additional divisions were opened in the year 1980-81. About 30 kit donations were distributed under the UNICEF aided programme of supply of science kit boxes under the adult education programme. As many as 201 centres were opened and 85 libraries were started.

2) Art and Culture

4.26 A subsidy of Rs. 0.29 Lakhs was given to 48 public libraries.

3) Health

4.27 Under this sub head 13 schemes were implemented. An amount of Rs. 9.71 Lakhs was spent on construction of O.P.D. building, drainages, Gandhinagar Hospital. Under the B.C.G. inoculation scheme, the construction work of one isolation ward was completed.

4) Water Supply

4.28 Under the scheme of Government water supply 1037 water metres were installed, 173 Bore wells were drilled. In all 13 piped water supply schemes were completed. Besides 20 incomplete drinking water wells were completed.

5) Housing

4.29 Providing housesites to landless labourers was the only important scheme. 1573 huts were constructed with the expenditure of Rs. 24.66 Lakhs.

Contd.....

6) Urban Development

4.30 The assistance of Rs. 23.43 Lakhs was given to seven municipalities for development. Under the integrated development scheme of municipal corporation, a loan of Rs. 55.00 Lakhs was given to Kolhapur Municipal Corporation for the development of schools, roads & market.

7) Labour and Labour Welfare

4.31 Much of the expenditure under this head was booked on expansion of I.T.I. at Kolhapur. An amount of Rs. 3.10 Lakhs was spent on providing unemployment allowance to 2350 educated unemployed part time workers.

8) Welfare of Backward Classes

4.32 In all 12 schemes were implemented under this sub head. The expenditure of Rs. 13.48 Lakhs was incurred. The important achievements are as follows.

For improvement of 23 harijan locality an amount of Rs. 4.85 Lakhs was spent.

9) Social Welfare

4.33 Under this sub head the financial assistance of Rs. 0.88 Lakhs was given to six institutes of handicapped persons

10) Nutrition Programme

4.34 Under this scheme mid-day-food (Sukhadi) was given to 7,132 school students and an amount of Rs. 1.40 Lakhs was spent on it.

VII) Other Programmes

4.35 Under this major head, the Employment Guarantee Scheme was implemented during the year 1980-81.

4.36 The main object of the scheme is to provide gainful and productive employment (gainful to the individual and productive to economy) on approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the area of 'C' class municipal councils who are in need of work and are willing to do manual labour work. The guarantee is for unskilled work and the work will be given to panchayat samiti level. The budgetary provision for this scheme was Rs. 7.24 Lakhs as against which the expenditure of Rs. 27.81 Lakhs was booked. The workwise achievements for the year 1980-81 are given below:

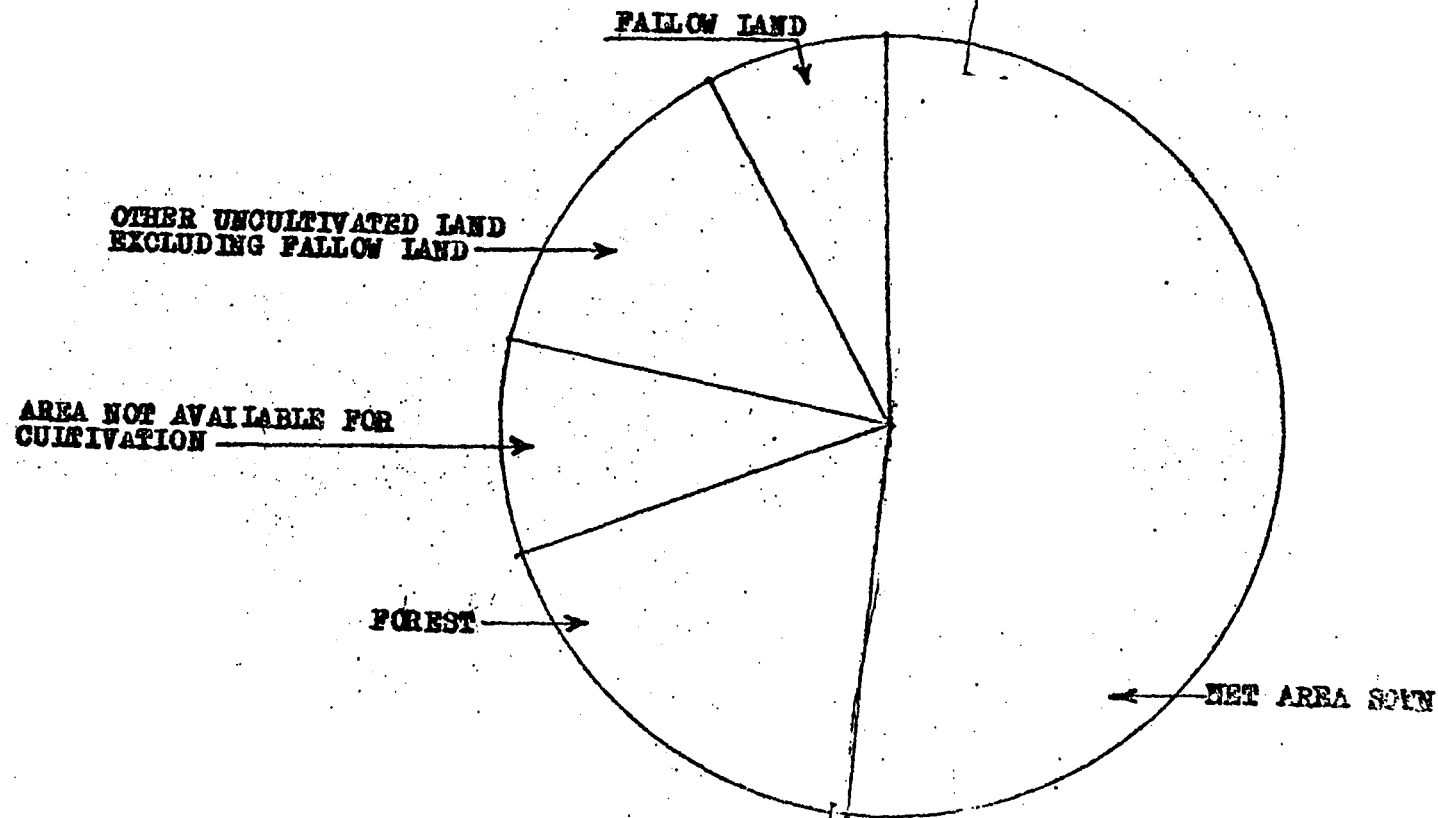

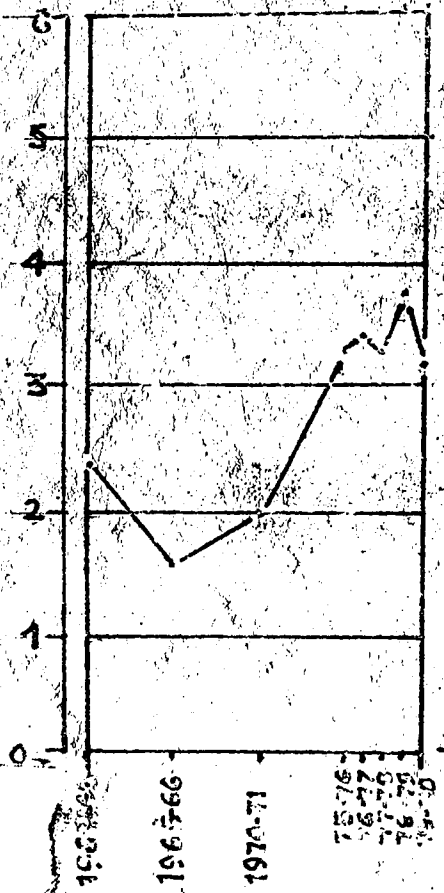
# LAND UTILISATION IN KOLHAPUR DISTRICT 1979-80



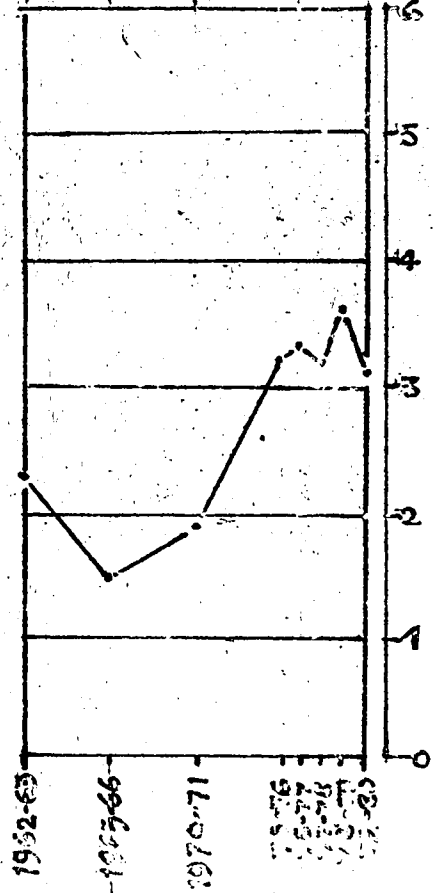
# FOODGRAIN PRODUCTION KOLHAPUR DISTRICT

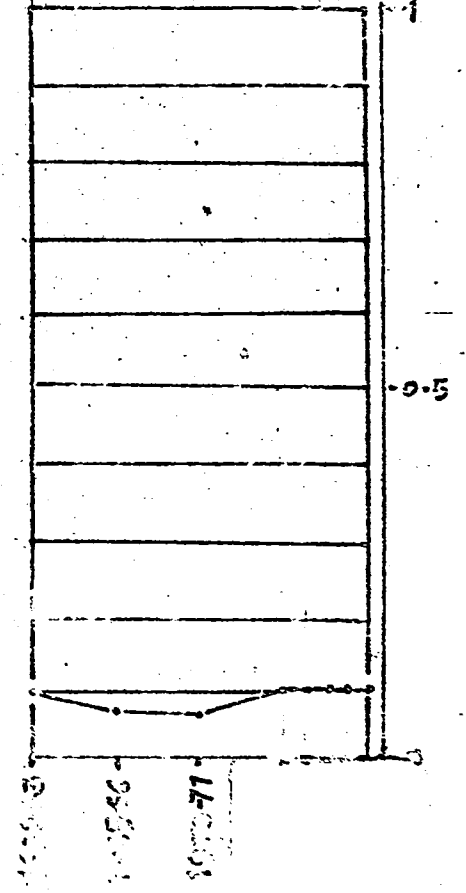

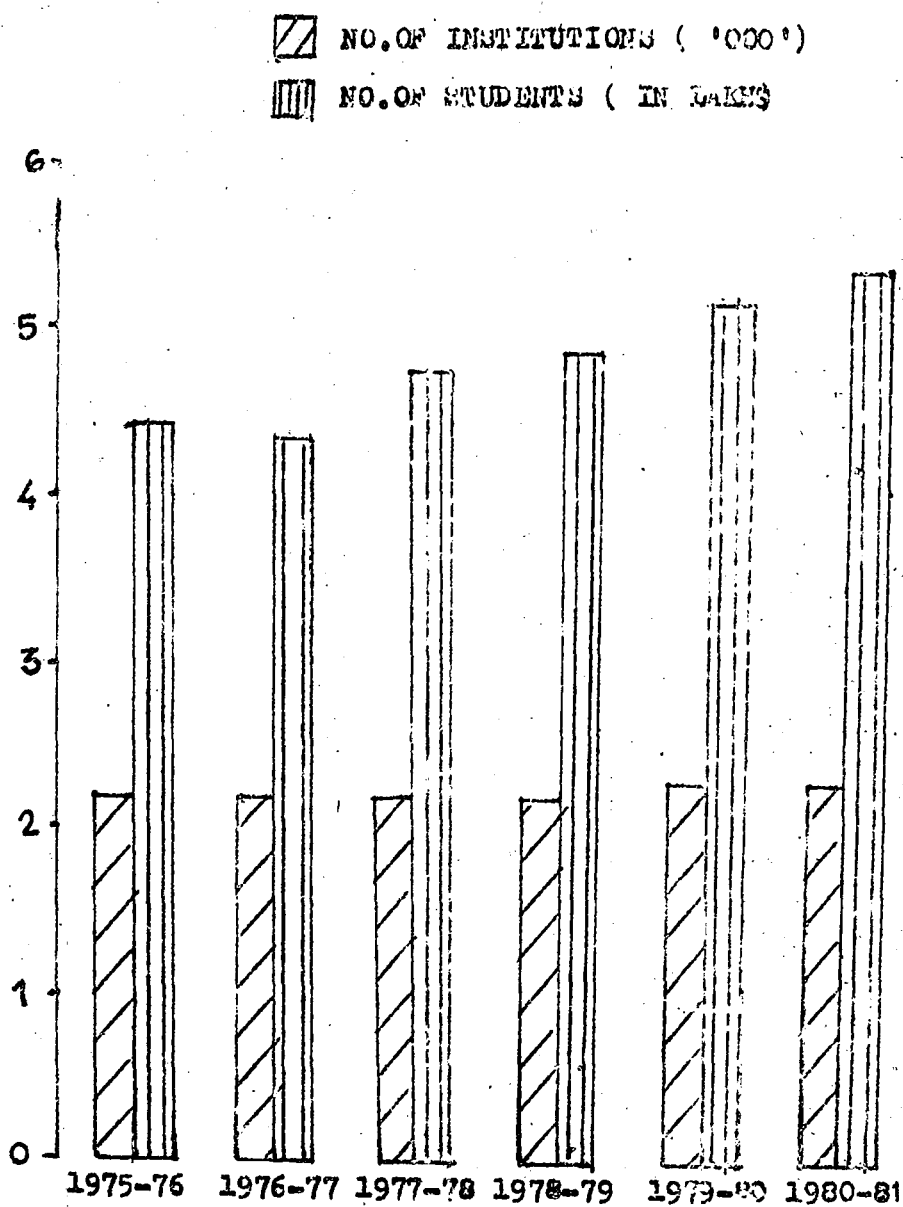

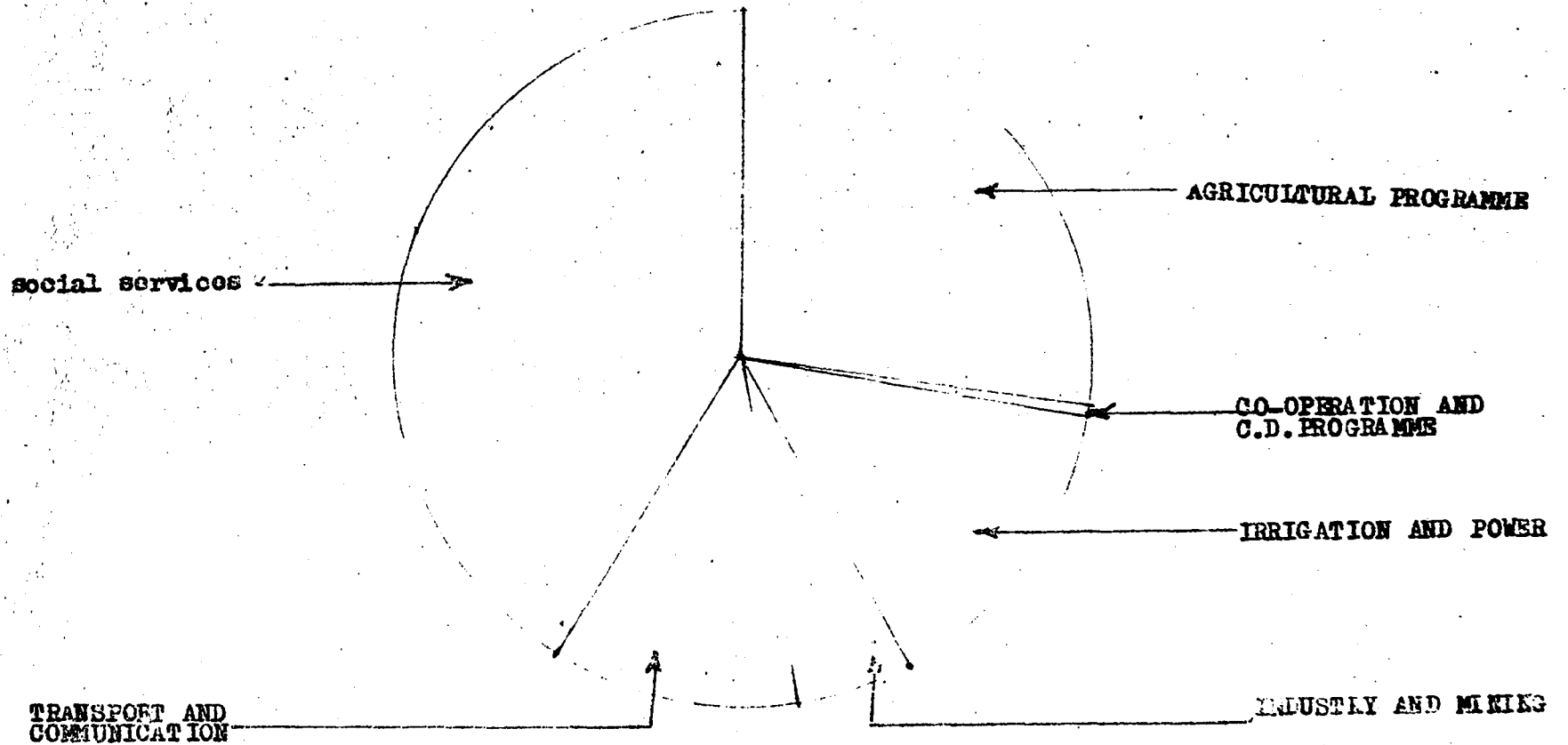

# PLAN EXPENDITURE UNDER DIFFERENT HEADS IN KOLHAPUR DISTRICT 1980-81

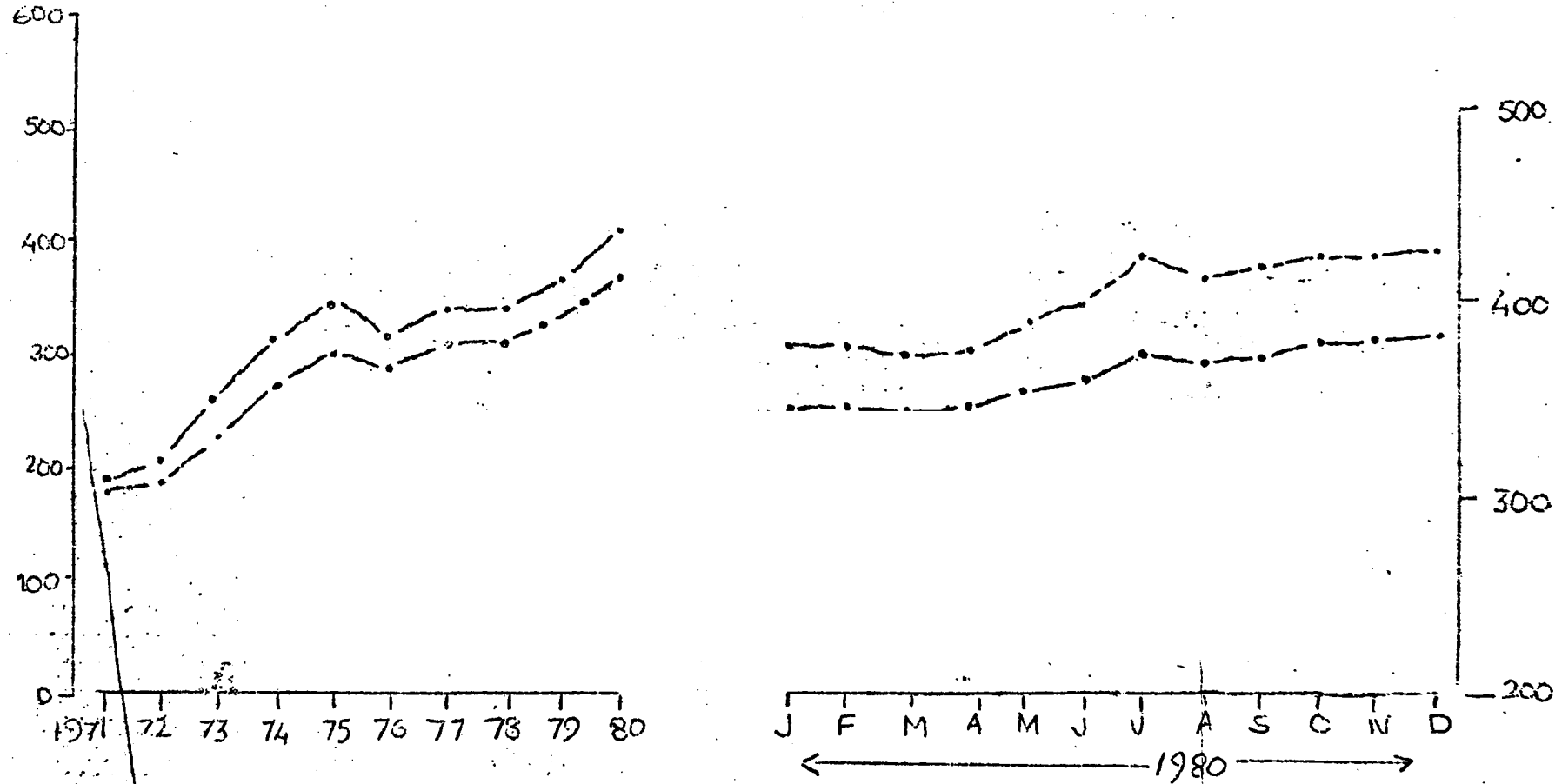
