CHAPTER I  
INTRODUCTION  
in

1.1 Nasik is situated partly in Tapi basin and partly in the upper Gadovari basin. It is bounded on the North West side by Dangs and Surat Districts of Gujarat State, on the North by Dhulia and on the North East and East by Jalgaon District. In the East and South-East lies Aurangabad Dist., to the south Ahmednagar District and to the North-East lies Thana District.

1.2 The total Geographical area is 6013 sq. miles and its total population according to 1961 census is 18,55,246. Going according to area of the District, it ranks first in Bombay Division and fifth in the Maharashtra State, According to population, Nasik District also ranks first in Bombay Division ~~(excluding of course Gr. Bombay Dist.)~~ and third in Maharashtra State.

1.3 For administrative set up, the district is divided in (11) Talukas and two mahals. The area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, 1961 population and the position in the district by percentage of area and population of each taluka and mahal are as below:

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and to secure greater measure of participation by people in Development plans and in Local and Governmental affairs by de-centralization of powers and functions, the Zilla Parishad and (13) panchayat samitis have been established in the district in the year 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively except in case of Municipal towns and Cantonment Boards which are not covered by them.

Three towns viz. Lasalgaon, Chandor and Ravalgaon which do not have Municipal Committees but which are treated as towns in the 1961 Census, are however included under the jurisdiction of the

Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis concerned. Manmad-non-municipal area which is included in the Manmad Municipal town in 1961 Census is however covered by the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.44 percent of the area and 76.06 percent of the total population of the district. The population covered includes entire rural population and 6.23 percent of urban population of the district in 1961. The number of villages, number of non-municipal towns and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samitis are shown in the table given below :

The figure included Manmad (non-municipal) area, which together with Manmad town is treated as one town in 1961 Census.

1.4 Area:- The District lies between 19°33' and 20°53' North latitude and 73°15' East longitude. In terms of area and population this district makes 5.08 percent and 4.64 percent respectively of the Maharashtra State.

1.5 Taking into account the height, climate, rainfall and soil pattern the District can be well divided into three parts. The first part comprising of Peint and Surgana mahals and the Western parts of Igatpuri, Nasik, Dindori, Kalwan and Baglan Taluka, bounds in hills and is popularly known as "Kokan part" or "Dang" part of Nasik District. This area has a normal rainfall of 150" and is full of thick forests. The only crops in this area are Paddy, Nagli, Vari..

Adjacent to this hilly tract is the sloping range extending from North and South. This tract comprise, of the eastern parts of Nasik, Igatpuri, Kalwan, Dindori and Baglan Talukas and Chandor Taluka. This being shadow rainfall, one, has got a very low rainfall between 20" to 30". But this tract shows the commercial crops like sugarcane, Grapes, Cotton, <sup>and</sup> food crops, wheat, Bajra and Pulses.

The third tract is one stretching on the eastern side of the District comprising of Malegaon, Nandgaon, Yeola, Niphad and Sinnar Talukas. This area has a low rainfall of only 20" to 22" and that too uncertain. Most of the parts of Sinnar and Yeola are quite occasionally affected by scarcity. However because of the "Gangapur Canal" passing through Niphad Taluka part, which gets irrigation facilities, grows crop like sugarcane and wheat etc. Onions, Grapes, Chillies and Vegetables are also grown to a considerable extent in this area. Two cooperative and one private Sugar factories are located in this area respectively at Niphad, Dabhad and Ravalraon.

b) River system.

Godavari and Girna are the two chief rivers of the district. The other important rivers are Vaitarana, Darna, Mosur and Kadva.

The Godavari rises at Brmhagiri in the Sahyadri ranges near Trimbak and drains Nasik and Niphad Talukas for about sixty miles. At a distance of about 12 miles from its source, a huge earthen dam has been built at Gangapur for storage and irrigation.

During its course many small streams meet the Godavari, the important amongst them are Kadva, Darna and Nasardi.

Many dams have been built on these tributaries for storage and diversion canals for irrigation.

The Girna rises at the west of the district north of the Satmala ranges near Hatied village in Surgana Mahal and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon talukas till it passes, through Jalgaon District from where it turns north to meet Tapi. The course of the Girna within the district is 90 miles. Many small streams rising in Kalwan, Baglan and Dindori talukas feed it, the prominent among them are Aram, Mosam, Panjan Maniad.

#### c) Soils

There are four kinds of soils in the district; black (kali Red (Mal), red and black (koral) and light brown (barad). Except in the uplands, black soil is found mostly in the plain country near the beds of rivers, such as Girna and Mosam. It is often deep and very rich and yields excellent rabi crops of wheat and gram. Red soil which is stiffer and shallower, is found chiefly on hills slopes and plateaus and yields good rainy season crops. Red and black koral found occasionally in hilly tracts and yields gram, lentils and other cold weather crops. Light brown (barad) the lightest of all soils, is found on hilly lands, is often strewn with boulder and mixed with lime boulders. It never gives more than a light crop and yields nothing at all when the rainfall is scanty.

The eastern part of Malegaon taluka and other talukas of Nandgaon and Chandor also have poor soils. The Godavari and Kadva river valleys have deep black soils.

1.7 Climate, temperature and rain fall.:- The climate of Nasik district can broadly be differentiated into three district seasons.

- 1) Monsoon from middle of June to end of Sept.,
- 2) Winter from Oct. to middle of March and
- 3) Summer from middle of March to the middle of June.

Except for the western slopes of Sahyadries the district generally experience salubrious climate. The summer months are moderately hot and the temperature varies from 36c to 43c and becomes unbearable. Although the days are hot, the nights are cold and pleasant. The rainy season is comparatively cooler with sporadic rains distributed over the four months of Monsoon. The major fall is however during the months of July and August but at no time it is very heavy. Continuous downpour is almost unknown. After a short spell of hot weather during the month of Oct., the short winter season begins and becomes fairly severe during the months of December and January. During this period temperature generally remains between ~~20~~ 20°C to 10°C and occasionally going it is still down even to 5°C. In some parts, the temperature even lowers down to the freezing point but such occurrence is rare. The winter season continues till middle of March when it imperceptibly merges with the summer weather.

The climate of the western parts particularly the below that area of Peint and Surgana Mahals is different from the rest of the district. The rain which begins from early June & continues till middle of Oct. and heavy down-pour is generally experience during July, August and September. The dampness and moisture makes the climate unhealthy. The Winter is also fairly severe some of these ranges are flat topped and regular in height and slope.

The dampness and moisture makes the climate unhealthy. The Winter is also fairly severe but generally of a short ~~XXXXX~~

duration and hot season almost begins from the middle of Feb. The summer months are very sultry and on account of high humidity becomes unbearable though the rising temperature is in almost insignificant and days and nights are equally unbearable.

In the district the major part of the rainfall is precipitated from June to October under the influence of South West Monsoon. The distribution of the rainfall is effected by the presence of Sahyadri Range, which runs from North to South in the western part of the District, As a result the rainfall is on the heavier side in the extreme Western portion of the district and it gradually declines ~~xxx~~ as we go from West to East. The following table provides the statistics regarding distribution of average rainfall in the various talukas of ~~the~~ the district.

It will thus be seen that the rainfall is heaviest in the western part comprising of Surnana, Peint and Igatpuri and it ranges from 2000 M.M. to 3700 M.M. among the talukas of the District, Igatpuri is the receiptant of the heighest rainfall with an average of 3712 M.M. per annum. From agricultural point of view, the rain in this part loses much of their economic value due to the rugged terrain on account of which profitable agriculture cannot thrive. Continuous down-pour of rainfall in this region also makes certain areas of this part inaccessible and isolated from the rest of the district during rainy season. Heavy rainfall in the part favors the growth of forest. The rainfall in the Central part ranges from 600 M.Ms. to 790 M.Ms. and is more helpful to agriculture. The rainfall in the Eastern part is very moderate and ranges from 730 M.M. to 560 M.M. The distribution of rainfall in this part is particularly uneven and scanty. On account of uncertainty of rains the areas with richer type of soil has to depend on irrigation.

C H A P T E R II

1. Population The population of Nasik District is 18,55,246 persons according to 1961 population Census. This forms 4.7% of the population of Maharashtra State. The urban population of the District is 4,74,982 which is 25.6 percent of the District total as against 28.22 percent urban population in Maharashtra State. The rural population is 13,80,264 and is 74.4 percent of the District total as against 71.78 percent of the rural population in Maharashtra State. The population rise in the decade 1951-61 is 29.75 percent.

The density of population in the district works out to 119 per Sq. Kilo meter as compared to the density of 130 persons per Sq. K.M. in Maharashtra State. The density of rural population is 91 while in urban area it is 1493 per Sq. K.M.

The sex ratio in Nasik District is 946 females for 1000 males. In urban areas it is 874 females to 1000 males while in rural areas it is 971 females to 1000 males.

The classification of population, as per 1961 Census, shows that 49.3 percent of total population of the district were "workers" and the rest 50.7 percent as non-workers. Of this total working population, 18.2 percent i.e. 1,66,074 were in urban areas and the rest in rural areas. Out of the total working population of 7,47,983 souls in rural areas, 64.5 percent were engaged in agriculture, while the working population in urban areas is well distributed over the different classes of workers viz. Trade and Commerce, Transport, Storage and Communication and other services.



The scheduled caste population is 67,845 which is 3.67 percent of the total of District population and the scheduled tribed population is concentrated in the ~~hilly~~ hilly regions of Nasik, Surgana, Kalwan, Dindori, Peint, Baglan and Igatpuri talukas.

2. Agriculture : Agriculture is the most important economic activity and engages 73.54 percent of the working population of the district. The total gross cropped area of the District is 9,61,665 hectares which is 61.5 percent of the total geographical area of the district. The weather, rainfall, irrigation, and soil conditions govern the pattern of crops grown in the different parts of the district. The district has got three clearcut zones governing the agricultural ~~area~~ production. The first is the "Kokan or Dangi" tract (Igatpuri, Surgana, Peint talukas) of heavy rainfall, the second is of Nasik, Kalwan, Baglan, Dindori and Chandor talukas of comparatively less rainfall and the third tract is of Malegaon, Niphad, Sinnar, Yeola and Nandgaon talukas where the area is "Khandesh type", but because of good irrigation facilities, a good number of Commercial crops are grown in this tract. The main food crops of this district are 1) Bajra 2) Paddy, 3) Wheat, 4) Jowar and 5) groundnut. Amongst important Commercial or (cash crop) crops the main are ~~ixkrownd~~ ~~mxk~~ 1) Sugarcane (8517) hectares) 2) Groundnut 69094 Hectares. The "grapes" continue to be grown in big areas and are being taken up more and more by the progressive cultivators. The Co.-op. Canning Factory at Pimpalgaon Basawant (Taluka Niphad) is an added attraction to grow more Grapes over and above, the usual export of grapes outside Nasik to the tune

of 15000 tones per annum. 13 :-

The onions of Niphad (at Lasalgaon) Taluka have also got a name in the trade of the commodity. The total arrivals in the main trading centre for onions at Lasalgaon (C.R.Stn.) during the season of 1963-64 were 12527 tonnes.

There are three sugar factories in Nasik District. 1. Royalgaon (Private) and 1 Dabhadi (Co.-op.) in Malegaon Taluka and 1 Sahakari Sugar Factory (Co.-op.) at Niphad in Niphad Taluka.

The gross irrigated area of the District is 64371 hectares distributed as under cropwise 1) Rice 4098 2) Wheat 13622 and 3) Sugarcane 8117. The sourcewise distribution of the net irrigated area of 47192 hectares is as follows:-

3) Forests: The district abounds in thick forests. The total area under forests being 341139 hectares i.e. 21.8 percent of the total geographical area. For their administration of these forests, there are 2 forest divisions in the district (East and West). The total income from forest revenue is of the order of Rs. 1,04,34,000. The products being 1) Timber 2) Fuel 3) Minor forest products.

4) Livestock: Livestock is vitally concerned with agricultural economy. The total Livestock in the district in different types (Census of 1961) is as follows:-

of industries from Bombay is the location of Industrial Estates. There are in all 2 industrial Estates in Nasik Dist. of which the Industrial estate at Nasik has started functioning bringing 20 industrial units under its roof and with a capital investment of Rs. 7.55 lakhs at present. These twenty units include Engineering, Cement fabricating, printing etc. This unit is finally to bring 94 units under one organisation and the construction for additional 25 units is in hand.

6) Electrification: Electric supply is the main prerequisite to industrial and even agricultural growth. There was 231.41 lakhs k.w. electricity generated during the year 1964-65 as against 229.87 lakh k.w. during 1963-64 showing rise of 1 percent only. The coverage of electrification programme was 14 towns and 93 villages whereunder 95.28 percent of urban and 12.15 percent of rural population has been covered by end of March 1965.

7) Coordination: The co-operative movement in Nasik Dist. is sufficiently matured and the coverage of villages, is 95 percent. The co-operative movement in the District has spread into all the Sectors of co-operative growth such as, Marketing, Processing, Housing, Industrial co-operatives, over and above the primary field of Agril. credit.

Out of 1655 total Co.op- Societies, (on 30-6-65) 979 were Agril. Credit. Amongst the others the main were 20 Mfg. (including 2 Dist. Mfg. societies), 110 Industrial Societies, 60 Farming Societies, 93 urban credit societies, and 124 Housing Societies.

The District Central Co.-op. Bank Ltd. and the District Land Development Bank both have shown a good progress

during the year (1964-65) with the total loans advanced of Rs. ₹ 587.14 lakhs and Rs. 139.86 lakhs respectively. The C.F.A. (Dist. Central Bank Ltd.) had got 39 branches and the L.D. Bank was having 9 branch offices in the Dist. on 30-6-65.

There was a good growth of Cooperatives seen in all fields. The total share capital rose from Rs. 395.04 lakhs to Rs. 478.50 lakhs (21.4 percent increase).

The total working capital of all the societies increased from Rs. 2034.12 to Rs. 2593.48 in the year which shows a rise of 25.3 percent.

The notable co-operative achievements in Nasik Dist. are the two co.-op. Sugar Factories (Dabhadi & Niphad) in the Dist., the Co.-op. Fruit canning unit at Pimpalgaon Basawant (its famous Pibola grape Syrup) and the Cold Storage plant at Nasik of the Dist. Potato and Onion Co.-op. Mkg. Society Ltd. Efforts are afoot to have two Co.-op. Spinning Mills, one at Malegaon and the other in Satana which will, when they will start working, be an achievement similar to the establishment of Co.-op. Sugar factories.

On the urban side, the growth of co.-op. movement is also notable. There are in all 92 Co.-op. Urban Credit Societies, 10 consumers societies, with 2 ~~xxxxx~~ wholesale consumer stores, one at Nasik and the other at Malegaon.

The Co.-op. Industrial Estate at Nasik is one of the very few Co.-op. Industrial Estates in Maharashtra State which have started functioning.

S) Medical and Public Health: The Civil Hospital Nasik is the main Govt. Hospital in the Dist. In the Dist., there were in all 25 dispensaries, 19 maternity homes and 14 Primary Health Centres at the end of 1964-65. There were 36 doctors and 210 nurses to man these institutions. In all there were 775 beds in the Public and Govt. aided hospitals. The number of beds for one lakh of population works out to 43 beds. The number of patients treated per bed works out 33 (25245 indoor) and the number of outdoor patients treated stood at 1.19 lakhs.

The above table shows the part played by the Zilla Parishad in implementing the plan schemes under each head of achievement. Nearly 41 % of the total plan allocation is under local sector. The Zilla Parishad is therefore required to assume a great responsibility in implementing the various plan schemes.

The above table also shows that the percentage plan utilisation in all heads of development is substantial, the maximum being in the head "Agricultural Programme" which was in fitness of the necessity that demanded extra attention to agriculture.

The salient features of the physical achievements under each head of development are briefly described below:

1) Agricultural Production.

The programme under "Agricultural production" aims increasing the production by way of increasing measures such as use of improved varieties of seed, fertilisers, improved agricultural practices, crop protection, soil conservation etc.

Cotton and sugarcane are two important commercial crops for which special attention has been paid by undertaking two schemes 1) Cotton Extension Scheme including Deviraj Cotton and 2) Sugar-cane Development Schemes. 4634 quintals of seed of cotton has been distributed under cotton expansion schemes and 2340 quintals of seed of cotton under intensive cultivation scheme. The area covered and bales pressed during the period are given below :

6.8 lakh acres have been carved under Cotton Extension Scheme and 75 lakh acres under Intensive Cultivation.

Under the scheme of Sugarcane Development, 33600 quintals of ~~xxxxx~~ fertilizers have been distributed.

2000 setts were also distributed. The other ancillary activities of arranging exhibition and demonstrations were also undertaken under this scheme.

The development of oil-seed was also undertaken under the plan programme. The distribution of fertilizers and propagation of plant protection measures were undertaken in this scheme. 62800 acres of land has been covered under the scheme of development of soil seed.

The Intensive Cultivation Programme was also undertaken in the selected areas. Paddy, Nagli and Wheat crops were taken up and seed and fertilizers were distributed at subsidies rates.

Besides these schemes, one scheme of "Vegetable Development" was also implemented from 63-64. An area of 2100 acres was brought under the distribution of improved variety of vegetable.

The Taluka Seed Farms were established in all Talukas except in Surgana and Harsul, during the second plan period, itself. The seed farms one, at Surgana, and other at Harsul were established during the third plan.

Under horticultural development, plantation of fruit trees, over 2278 acres and cultivation over an area of 1862 acres have been completed by the end of 64-65.

Plant protection activities assure a very great importance when there is epidemic and the crops are affected severely. One scheme of extension of plant protection services has therefore been undertaken under the plan programme. 528 appliances have been distributed under the scheme and an area of 73,593 acres were covered under the plant protection measures.

#### Land Development

Fragmentation of land into pieces involves wastage of land and hence subsequent loss of production. A scheme of consolidation of land pieces (parcels) covering a targeted area of 3,82,000 acres in 208 villages was undertaken. By the end of 64-65 i.e. in 4 years of the III plan an area of 3,31,887 acres in 177 villages was covered.

Soil Conservation

The erosion of soil is to be prevented for preserving fertility of the soil. Similarly new area should also be brought under cultivation on slopes in hilly tracts by terracing. The schemes of ~~xx xxxx~~ contour bunding and terracing involving the plan provision of Rs. 133.00 and 27 lakhs respectively were undertaken. The achievements under the programme of bunding and terracing were spectacular. The areas covered against the targeted area of the plan period are shown below :

The programme of terracing of land was initially undertaken in the hilly tracts of western parts of Nasik and Igatpuri Talukas.

Minor Irrigation

The minor irrigation work like small bandharas, wells, tanks, etc. play a very important role in the tract where rainfall is fairly sufficient. The construction of minor irrigation works has therefore been undertaken on a large scale. The construction of bandharas has been undertaken Departmentally and through Zilla Parishad and the wells were got constructed by the cultivators by advancing loans and subsidies. The pump sets were also distributed by granting loans and subsidies. The achievements ~~xxxxxx~~ under the programme have been very spectacular. The following figures would themselves reveal that the achievements

The construction works of bandharas with an irrigation potential of about 5351 acres were constructed upto the end of 64-65. The construction of 3 works was in progress during 64-65. The programme of constructing "Percolation" tanks has also been undertaken and was in progress during 64-65.

The land in the vicinity of canals and water courses is some-times water-logged and the crops are very adversely affected in the water-logged area. The clearing of water logged was therefore included in the minor irrigation programme. 184 acres of water-logged area has been cleared upto end of 64-65. The clearing of water-logged areas has been done mostly in Niphad Taluka where there is a net-work of irrigation canals.

Providing irrigation facilities through co-operatives has also been ~~attempted~~ attempted in the plan programme. One co-operative Lift Irrigation Society has been given loan and two were given subsidies upto 64-65.

#### Animal Husbandry

Livestock (Bovines) plays important role in agriculture and as such it is imperative that schemes for cattle development should be undertaken along with other schemes. Accordingly one cattle breeding centre has been started, 91 premium bulls were located and the construction of 4 buildings for veterinary Dispensaries were taken up

under the plan programme. (out of these 4 buildings only 2 were completed as on 31-3-66 and work of the other 2 were in progress.)

#### Dairy Development

The scheme of supply of pasturised milk to city dwellers was undertaken in the plan programme and the daily supply at the end of 64-65 was 2297 litres against the target of 11,800 litres. The pasturised milk is a necessity and this scheme has been a great boon to the city dwellers of Nasik and its vicinity.

The co-operative milk societies were also organised with the object that they should serve as feeders societies to the milk scheme. 9 such societies were organised by the end of 64-65.

Loans to the extent of Rs. 6 lakhs were also granted to the cultivators for purchase of milk cattle under the programme.

#### Forest

Plantation of trees has been undertaken in the programme for enriching the existing forests. The areas covered under various plantation programme are given below:

Co-operative Farming Societies were also formed and given financial assistance in the plan programme. 30 new co-operative farming societies were organised upto 64-65.

#### C.D. Programme

The whole District has been covered under the C.D. Blocks by the end of 1964-65.

#### Small Scale Industries

Promotion of Small Scale Industries through co-operatives ~~and~~ has been attempted in plan programme. 35 societies for Handicraft Workers and 3 societies of Handloom Weavers were organised upto 64-65.

#### Transport and Communications

The construction of District and Rural Roads has been included in the programme. Accordingly, 98.5 miles

of District Roads and 80 miles of Rural roads have been constructed upto 64-65. Improvement of 17 miles of road of Sugarcane areas has also been done under the plan programme.

### Social Schemes

#### General Education

There are two technical schools in the District. One at Nasik and other at Malegaon. Strengthening of these institutions has been included in the programme.

The training schemes of primary teachers was also undertaken. 669 teachers were trained upto 64-65. The construction of primary school buildings for 89 class rooms had been completed upto 64-65.

#### Medical and Nursing

The incomplete Cottage Hospital at Kalwan of the second plan was completed during the IIIrd plan period upto 64-65.

One Blood-Bank has also been started in the Civil Hospital at Nasik.

#### Public Health

The Malaria Eradication Scheme taken up in the plan programme has achieved a great success as in other Districts. Malaria has been practically eradicated by this measure. Sprayings and collection of smear slides for detection of malaria are the two important activities of the scheme. 22 lakh sprayings have been done and 7.5 lakh slides under active surveillance and 0.89 lakh slides under passive surveillance have been collected upto end of 64-65.

Under the family planning programme, 6486 sterilizations have been performed upto 64-65.

#### Housing

The Extension of Village Panchayats for house sites, construction of new houses and advancing of loans to people to the low income for constructing houses have been undertaken under this sector. 58 villages were benefitted by the extension of existing Panchayats and 22 individuals were given loan for construction of houses.

The work of 300 tenements was in progress during the year 64-65. These tenements were taken up in the slum areas of Nasik and Malegaon.

#### Water Supply

One Water Supply scheme has been taken up at Ghoti in the programme. It was in progress during 64-65.

34 drinking water wells were also constructed under village Well Water Supply scheme.
