CHAPTER-I
I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Location and Boundaries

Dhulia District is situated on the extreme north-eastern part of Maharashtra and consequently this District has boundaries common with Gujarath-State, Madhya Pradesh on the western and northern sides. This District lies between 20°- 31' and 22° - 30' North Latitude and 73°- 17' East Longitude with the total area of 12562 Sq. K.M. according to land records and Survey Department of Maharashtra-State. This District has common boundaries with Jalgeon District on the east Nasik Dist. on the south. Stretching nearly 87 K.M. along Tapi and 48 K.M. along the eastern parts of Surat and Baroch Districts of Gujarath-State, varying in breadth from 52 K.M. to 122 K.M., the District forms, an upland basin, the most northernly section of the Deccan Plateau.

1.2 Administrative Set-up

1.2.1 Administratively, this District forms a part of Bombay-Division. Dhulia has got 10 Talukas. It is subdivided administratively into two sub-divisions. Area, population of each of the sub-divisions are as follows -

Territorial changes in this District as shown in the Table No. 1.3 are minor and are done for administrative convenience.

General Socio Economic features

1.4 With a view to promote democratic decentralization ^{the} Z.P. and Panchayat Samities were formed in Maharashtra. Accordingly Dhulia Z.P. was formed superseding the former District Local Board, Dist. School Board and Dist. Development Board. There are 10 Panchayat Samities, areas of which co-terminate with 10 Talukas. In these 10 Panchayat Samities 10 elected Chairmen

with the secretariat help of Block Development Officers preside over the working of 20 various developmental Blocks in the District.

1.42 The Z.P. and the Panchayat Samities have now completed 5 years since they started functioning and most of the development schemes are being implemented through the Z.P. For this purpose, it gets financial assistance by way of different grants from the Government. The Z.P. cover 98.9% area and 84.9% of the population of the District. The population covered includes total rural population and 5.33% of the urban population of the District. The number of villages, number of non-municipal towns and population included under Z.P. Dhulia and each Panchayat Samities are shown in Table No. 1.42.

1.5 Topography

This District forms an up plane basin. The most northerly part of Deccan plateau draining into the Tapi with a gentle westerly slope. It includes most varied tracts of the country, wild hills and forests, rich cultivated land and low rolling rocky hills. There are three well marked belts of the country. In the north the high and wild Satpudas, where no modern communication has yet been introduced. In the middle, the rich Tapi valley and in the south bare ridges well watered valleys flanked by the Sahyadri ranges.

1.6 Hills, River Systems and Soil

1.61 1) The Satpudas :- North of Tapi, the whole length of the rich alluvial plain is bounded by steep southern face of the Satpudas, a belt of mountain land from ~~thirty~~ to forty two K.Ms. broad. The ranges of Satpudas are peculiar enough to have a wall-like start at once. For example, the whole Shahada Taluka is fairly plane but the wall-like mountains of Akarani-Tahasil start at once and there are high mountain peaks in its ranges rising from 54864 to 91440 K.Ms. The grandest hill of the ranges is Toranmal, in Akarani Tahasil, which rises up to a height of 101132 K.Ms. This was once a seat of some great Ahir King and consists of a long narrow table land about 41.4 Sq. K.M. in area. There is a great lake on this high mountainous table land. It is named as 'Yashawant Sagar'. It is said that the lake is very deep and big fish dwell in it. Now this Toranmal is being developed as hill-station. The region beyond Toranmal is almost inaccessible in all months. Very difficult and ~~precipitating~~ precipitating mountains. Foot-paths exist, which are normally used by the Bhils living there. This tract ~~stretches~~ stretches northwards up-to

Narmada river which is our boundary with Madhya-Pradesh and Gujarath. The Satpuda ranges are full of rich forest and about ^{with} wild life. If one travels from Dhádgaon to Toranmal on foot, he will surely come across all types of wild life,, such as bears, tigers, leopards and animals like stag, wild cows etc.

ii) The Sahyadri :- South of Tapi valley, the country is more varied than either in Tapi valley or in the north. In the East drained by the river Bori, wide stoney, thorney plains rise in low broad topped basaltic ridges or sink in rich valleys. West of the Bori, the land as it draws nearer the Sahyadri, grows wilder and more picturesque ranges and quite cut out hills, separated by the well watered valleys of the Panzara. The Kan, the Borai, stretch far east across the District. The extreme west of these Sahyadri ranges is wild and hilly covered by forests. This part is also inhabited by wild life and Adiwashis. The well watered valleys are found in Sakri and Dhulia Talukas. This region also comprises of non-Tapi plains of Nandurbar and Sindheda Talukas. The high parts of Sakri and Nandurbar Talukas and the whole of Nawapur Taluka is situated mostly in Sahyadri ranges and is inhabited by Adivasis. These Talukas have Tribal Development Blocks.

1.62 Rivers

i) Tapi :- Tapi is the major river of this District. This is also called 'Tapti' from the Sanskrit root 'Tap' or heat, because of the belief that the river was created by God the Sun to protect himself from his own heat. In the Aadiparva of Mahabharat this river is mentioned as daughter

of God, the Sun. This bears witness to the terrible heat that exists in this part of the District. Without this river this area would not have been developed to this extent. This major river has its course of 87 K.Ms. in this District. It forms the northern boundary of Sindkheda and Nandurbar Talukas. Its banks are too high to enable the use of its water for irrigation. Recently some Lift Irrigation Projects have been started. The important contribution of this river to this District is the silt it deposits on either sides of its bank - especially during flood. However it does causes damages along its course during flood. The village Javakhede is completely uprooted and resettled in Shirpur Taluka. Work of such resettlement is in progress. Prakasha is one of the holy places on the banks of Tapi. This Prakashawhich is regarded as another Kashi in this District is 13 K.Ms. from Shahada in Dhulia-District.

The minor rivers are 1) Bori 2) Borai 3) Panzara 4) Kan 5) Arunavati 6) Gomai. The river Bori passes through Dhulia Taluka only, whdle river Panzara and Kan pass through Sakri Taluka. Kan meets Panzara in Sakri only. Panzara passes through Dhulia Taluka into Sindkheda Taluka and joins Tapi where it enters Dhulia District. River Borai passes through Nandurbar Taluka into Sindkheda Taluka from south-west and joins Tapi in the north. River Arunawati forms the eastern boundary of Shirpur Taluka and joins Tapi in the same Taluka. River Gomai runs through Shahada Taluka and joins Tapi in the same Taluka near Prakasha.

The great river Narmada passes on the northern boundary of the District for 56 K.Ms. and its numerous tributaries drain Akarani-Tahasil and portion of Akkalkuwa Tahasil.

1.63 Soil

The soil of this District can broadly be classified into three zones viz 1) Light 2) Medium black 3) Deep black. Approximately 40% of the cultivated area is of high type of soil, 18% is of medium black soil and remaining 34% is deep black soil. The light type of soil is largely found in Dhulia and Sakri Tahasils, western part of Nawapur Tahasil and southern part of Nandurbar Tahasil. Medium black soil is largely found in Sindkheda Taluka and Akarani Tahasil and western part of Dhulia Tahasil. Deep black soils is largely found on the banks of Tapi river, particularly in Shirpur, Shahada and Taloda Tahasils. Eastern part of Nawapur Tahasil and northern part of Nandurbar Tahasil. These soil cover a width of about 16 k.Ms. on each side of Tapi river and are very fertile. The soil in Shirpur and Shahada Talukas is supposed to be extremely rich. The cultivation of soil; if done by mechanization of Agriculture, the vast rich land in this District will definitely make this District a surplus District in food-production. From that point of view certain amount of mechanization is - initiated in Shahada Taluka. Chemical analysis of the soil is done in Agricultural College, Dhulia.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rain-fall

1.71 Climate and Temperature

This District is far remote from the coastal tracts and hence the climate of this District is extreme and dry, resulting in large variations in day and night temperatures.

The following table gives the highest maximum and lowest minimum temperatures in summer and winter seasons for the important centre in the District i.e. Nandurbar for the year 1961 and 1965.

From the above table it is seen that the highest maximum temperature in Summer was as high as 40.6 C. and 40.2 C. in 1961 and 1965 respectively. Where as the lowest minimum temperature recorded was 12.6 C. and 16.3 C. during Winter of 1961 and 1965 respectively. The soil of the District, too has largely conditioned the variations in day and night temperatures of this District. The northern, western and southern-western part of this District is hilly. The Soil in these tracts does not retain heat to a large extent. Hence in the day time the temperature soars high while the nights are cool. Also nearly 50% of the area of the District is having soil either of higher type or very light, which has a very low capacity to retain heat. This too has resulted in high day temperatures and low night temperatures. This peculiar situation of this District and its topography has largely conditioned the temperature.

1.72 Seasons

There are two broad seasons Summer and Winter. The Summer months are from Mid-March to Mid-October. While Winter months are Mid-October to Mid-March. There is rainy season too in this District, which interrupts Summer from very late June to late September.

1.73 Rain-fall

Dhulia District is just adjacent to the Sahyadri and on the wrong side of it. As far as monsoons are concerned, this tract comes under the water shade area of Sahyadri. As such, the part of the District (West and South West) having ranges of Sahyadri in it, experiences good rains. The plains to the south of this District and those of the Tapi valleys do not get sufficient rains and are comparatively dry. The northern part of the District with Satapuda ranges, experiences good rains. The table below gives rainfall data for all Tahasil in the District for the year 1963, 1964 and 1965.

1.74 It seems that western and souther part of Dhulia, Nawapur, Akarani as well as northern part records higher rainfall as compared to the rainfall received by the Tapi valley and other plains. Generally ^{wet} months are July and August and to certain extent September.

1.8 Scarcity Conditions

From the above table, it can be seen that during 1965 the rains were not satisfactory. Dhulia, Sakri, Shirpur parts of Sindkheda, Shahada received rain-fall which was insufficient to sustain crops in the field.

7.81 The causes of scarcity and the extent of the failtre of the harvest

The main cause of scarcity was insufficient and untimely rainfall. The monsoon set in late in the middle of July 1965 consequently sowing was delayed in many places. Practically there were no rains after 1st of Sept. 1965. Jowar and Bajara yields were very poor; only irrigated Wheat and Rabi-Jowar yielded fairly well. The extent of crop failure was to the tune of 60% to 65% of the total crops. The statement below shows the Annawari in the Revenue villages of the District.

7.82 Area, Population and Classes affected and the degree of distress

Almost all the Tahasils except Taloda Tahasil were affected by the scarcity. In all 841 Kharif Villages and 49 Rabi Villages out of 1243 Revenue villages in the District were affected by the scarcity. The population comes to about 9,37,278 affected in kharif villages, and 71,088 in affected Rabi villages. There was no sufficient work for the agriculturists and agricultural labourers and other labourers as almost all Kharif crops had failed. The Rabi season was also disappointing as practically no Rabi Crops except irrigated Wheat and Dadar (Rabi-Jowar) had given good results.

7.83 Relief works etc. to redress distress in the District

Road works were started through the agency of Panchayat Samities and Z.P. authorities. Labourers were also provided with work at the Karwant, Malangaon etc. Project areas. The Forest Department also started plantation of trees, road works, construction of wells and cutting and collection of grass in forest areas and had provided employment to the affected persons. The scarcity ended when the Kharif season of 1966-67 actually started. During scarcity fodder was supplied to the extent needed from the Laling Fodder Bank of the Forest Department.

8 Conclusion

8.1 The people of this District who are in majority agriculturists speak Ahirani language which is an off-shoot of Marathi language.

CHAPTER-II

EXPLANATORY - NOTES

In this Chapter short notes on the tables presented in the Abstract-Part are given. In the last District Statistical Abstract, there were 96 Tables and 13 Lists, in all there were 109 Tables. In the present Dist. Statistical Abstract there are 89 Tables and 5 Lists. Table No.91 is trends in selected indicators.

1) Climate and Rainfall

Table No.1.1 :- This Table presents No.of rainy days and total rain-fall at 10 selected Taluka-places. The data is presented for 1961 and 1965. This Table fairly indicates the rain-fall position in 1961 and 1965 which is a scarcity year. Except Sakri and Dhulia Talukas, the rain-fall is less during 1965 as compared to 1961.

Table No. 1.2 :- Mean, Mean Maximum and Mean Minimum Temperature at Nandurbar-Centre is presented in this Table. During 1961 Maximum Temperature was in May i.e. 40.6 C. In 1965 the maximum temperature of 40.2 C. was in May. Dhulia being an inland district experiences extreme climate.

2) Area and Population

Table No. 2.1 :- This table gives Taluka-wise Rural and Urban population according to 1961 Census and variation with 1951 Census. Total population of the District 1961 was 1351236. During 1951 there were only 85 persons per Sq. K.M. This figure shot upto 108 persons per Sq.K.M. in 1961. There is significant rise in Urban Population per Sq. K.M. Percentage variations over a decade comes to 27.44 rise in population.

Table Nos. 2.2 and 2.3 - Indicate classification of towns and villages taluka-wise according to population-ranges. 364 villages i.e. maximum number come under 200-499 population-range. Villages having population less than 200 come to 270.

Table Nos. 2.4 and 2.5 - Show number of workers in each Taluka according to 1961 Census. There were 565899 rural workers in this District, out of these 288703 work as cultivators and 223584 work as agricultural labourers. The number of Agricultural-labourers is significant in this District. As compared to this, only 18423 persons work at household industries. This indicates the predominance of agriculture here. The percentage of households engages in small-scale and cottage industries establishment in Bombay-Division is the lowest i.e. 2.6 as compared to Aurangabad 5.4, Nagpur 5.7. As per a Survey of small-scale and cottage industries carried out by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, there were estimated by 7300 establishments and 13899 workers. This estimate puts Dhulia 5th in the Division, Jalgaon being first.

Table No. 2.6 - Shows Scheduled and Scheduled Tribes according to 1961 Census. Population of Scheduled-Castes is 48054. The Scheduled Tribes population is significant i.e. 513344. This will be 37.99 percent of the total population. The percentage proportion of Scheduled Tribes population to total population has increased from 37.30 percent in 1951 to 37.99 percent in 1961 inspite of the transfer of some predominantly tribal areas to Gujarath-State. This District

has the largest proportion of Scheduled Tribes in the State. Nawapur, part of Nandurbar, Akkalkuwa and Akarani are declared as Scheduled areas by the President of India.

Table No. 2.7 - Shows population in Urban areas as per 1961 Census.

3) Agriculture

Agriculture being the predominant occupation of this District we shall now study the agricultural tables.

Table No. 3.1 - Gives land utilisation statistics. Figures for 1961-62 and 1964-65 i.e., the latest figures available are given. We have a comparative data. The year 1961-62 is the base year of the Third Five Year Plan. 1964-65 is the last but one year of the Third Plan. The significant factors are as follows 1) Area under forests has increased from 540065 hectares in 1961 to 579721 hectares in 1965. Land put to non-agricultural use is also increased by 24 hectares only. Most significant factor is that barren and un-culturable land has come down from 77050 hectore in 1961 to 54527. This means 22523 hectares of land has been diverted to some useful purpose. Culturable waste is also reduced from 37480 hectares to 16474. This means about 21000 hectares culturable waste is brought under cultivation. Net area sown has increased from 671382 hectares in 1961 to 690804 i.e. an increase of 19422 hectore over the Plan period.

Table No. 3.2 - Area under different crops in each Taluka is furnished for the years 1961-62 and 1964-65. This is an important table inasmuch as it indicates variation in cropping pattern due to planned efforts. The figures are in hectares.

Significant changes are observed in respect of Wheat, Rabi-
Jowar, Sugarcane, Condiments and ^{Species}, Fruits and Vegeta-
bles. Most significant change is noted in case of Cotton,
where during 1961-62, 85171 hectares area was under Cotton.

The figure for 1964-65 is 103504. This means 18433 hectares
of area has been diverted towards Cotton. This certainly is
a function of extension work undertaken to develop Cotton
production in the District. Cotton production has been
intensified in Taloda, Shirpur, Sakri and Sindkheda Talukas.

Table No. 3.3 - Yield per hectore and outturn of principal
crops. This is an important table gives comparative figures
for 1961-62 and 1964-65. The yield per hectore of Rice has
come down from 490 Kg. per Hectore in 1961-62 to 483 Kg. in
1964-65. Consequently outturn also dwindled from 1.47 lakh
quintals to 1.43 lakh quintals. Yield per hectore of Wheat
is also reduced but outturn has increased from 2.35 lakh
quintals to 2.61 lakh quintals. The yields per hectore of
Jowar, Bajara have noted significant rise and the outturn
seems significantly marked in respect of Jowar only. Jowar
outturn has risen from 2.56 lakh quintals to 7.68 lakh
quintals. Bajara outturn declined from 7.21 lakh quintals
to 6.27 lakh quintals. The yield per hectore of Cotton has
increased from 141 bales per hectore to 437 bales per hectore.
But outturn has declined from 69100 bales to 45300 bales
during the period.

Table No. 3.4 and 3.5 - Area irrigated under different
crops under various sources in each Taluka and cropping
pattern thereof. Irrigation by wells is predominant in
this District although one major and one medium projec

are nearing completion in this District. Area irrigated by wells has increased to a great extent, from 18903 hectares in 1961-62 to 28513 hectares in 1964-65. Net irrigated increase by 9636 hecter over the Plan period. Gross cropped area under irrigation has been increased by 10344 hectares. Considerable increase is noted in Akkalkuwa, Nandurbar, Shirpur, Sindkheda, Sakri Talukas. The only Taluka which has reversed in irrigation is Shahada where a reduction by 271 hectares is noted. If the same Talukas mentioned above are taken for study regarding irrigation of crops we may say that, in Akkalkuwa Wheat, in Nandurbar Rice and Wheat are irrigated. Rice which was only 17 in 1961-62, has gone to 1288 hectares in 1964-65, Sindkheda has intensified Wheat irrigation. Cotton is irrigated in Dhulia and Sindkheda only.

Table No. 3.9 Agricultural Implements in each Taluka. This table is important inasmuch as it represents the degree of mechanisation of agriculture in this District. Comparatively this District is quite suited for mechanisation. If economic holding is to be considered as an essential criteria for mechanisation, the same is fulfilled. The following Table reveals the same.

From the above table economic holdings from size 10-12.5 to 50 and above are sufficient to take up the machanized farming. For machanized farming another prerequisite is the sure irrigation. This District even though is not well advanced in irrigation, has progressed in well irrigation to a great extent recently Shahada, Dhulia and Sakri talukas are well advanced in irrigation. Mechanization of agriculture in the sense tractor ploughing, thrashing, sowing etc. is done in Shahada taluka to certain extent. With this background the following data of agricultural implements would reveal the position in Dhulia

Famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data. Regarding this subject detailed information is given in the first chapter.

4) Animal Husbandry, Forests and Fisheries.

This subject is proposed to be discussed in chapter 3 where analytical review of sectoral trends is proposed to be taken. Therefore no notes are being given on table 4.1 to 4.4 .

Table No.4.5 - Range-wise Forest Area - In this Table area and Revenue under Forest/Departments is considered. According to Forest Department there is decrease in Forest area during the Plan period. All Forest is reserved. The total area is reported to be 361416 Hectors in-charge of Forest-Department, for the year 1965-66. Inall 393273 Hectors of land is under forest for the year 1965-66, Large area of private forest exists in Akkalkuwa Taluka. The same naturally is not reported by the Forest-Department.

Table No. 4.6 - Gives information regarding Forest products.

5) Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity

Table No.5.1 - Employment in factories. The table gives information regarding employments in factories in Dhulia District. The Bureau of Economics and Btistics, Bombay, has drawn Taluka Indicators of Development. According to that Indicator there were 5446 factory workers during the year 1966. Dhulia Taluka tops, the other having 2292. Sakri 705, Shahada 699. There is not much factory concentration in this District.

Table No.5.2 - Gives Distribution of Working Factory according to product and their working strength.

Table No.5.3 - Distribution of factories according to Nos. of days worked.

Table No.5.4 - Gives statistics of hand-looms and power-looms. The hand-loom and power-loom industry is concentrated at Dhulia and Shahada.

Table No.5.5 - Gives employment exchange statistics.

Table No.5.6 - Gives occupational distribution of total registration of employment.

Table No.5.7 - Gives changes in the volume of employment in different industries. This subject of employment statistics will be taken up in Chapter-3.

Table No.5.8 and 5.9 - Gives statistics relating to annual survey of industries and generation and consumption of electricity. The subject of electricity would be discussed in the next chapter.

6) Co-operation

Table No.6.1 to 6.7 - Gives information on the co-operation movement. This subject is proposed to be discussed under the sectoral trends chapter No. 3.

7) Medical and Public Health

Table No.7.1 to 7.8 - Disclose data on persons engaged in medicine, medical facilities, classification of patients, vital statistics, hygienic drinking water supply etc.

8) Education

Table No.8.1 and 8.2 - are repeated again from the 1964-65 Abstract. The information is regarding Literacy in each Taluka and education in Rural areas in each Taluka respectively.

Table 8.3 - is also, the same from the last years Abstract. This table is regarding Education in Urban areas according to 1961 Census.

Table No.8.4 - Gives information regarding institutions, pupils and teachers. This information is for the year 65-66.

Table No. 8.5 and 8.6 give information on concessible to Backward Classes and Economically backward Classes. This information is given for the District. Taluka-wise information could not be obtained from the concerned authorities.

Table No. 8.7 and 8.8 give information regarding expenditure on primary education by way of grants-in-aids to local bodies.

Table No. 8.8 is regarding classification of towns and villages without primary schools.

9) Transport and Communications

Table No. 9.1 - Gives information on length of Railway route. There is no change in the railway route statistics. The information is given for two years to have a comparative study. During 1961, 184.29 k.M. was the length. In 1966, it is reported to be only 171.61 k.M. as after bifercation, some railway route admeasuring 12.68 k.M. went to Gujarath-State.

Table No. 9.2-a and 9.2.b - Give statistics pertaining to road length (Extra-municipal) according to category and surface. This subject will be discussed in the next chapter.

Table No. 9.3 - Motor vehicles in operation. This is an important table which gives information for 1960-61 and 1965-66. This is exactly the Plan period. The statistics presented indicates the degree of automation in road transport and in agriculture etc. There were only 150 motor-cycles in 1961. The number rose to 516 in 1966. The increase is 244 p.c. There were 283 motor-cars in 1961, during 1966, 603 motor-cars were reported. This is more than twofold. There were 130 diesel engine stage

carriages in 1961. The figure for 1966 is 154. There was not a single patrol stage carriage engine in 1961. Only one is reported in 1966. The number of lorries, private (diesel engine) have come down from 39 to 31 during the Plan period. Whereas public-diesel engine carriages have increased from 221 to 600 during the period. The number of ambulances reported are only two. There were only 56 tractors in 1961. This figure rose to 254 in 1966. This indicates the degree of mechanisation of agriculture in Dhulia.

Table No. 9.4 - Indicates operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport

This data is also important to measure the mobilization of rural Dhulia during the Plan period.

The data given pertains to Dhulia-Division of Nationalised Road Transport. Comparative figures for 1961 and 1966 are provided. Number of routes rose from 260 in 1961 to 348 in

1966. This in terms of rise in length comes from 8824 K.M.

to 14086 K.M. Vehicles on road per day during 1961 were 186.

In 1966 they were 310. 71799 persons travelled per day in

1960-61 and during 1965-66, 123541 persons travelled by the

S.T. Buses. Still large area in Akarani, Akkalkuwa, Taloda,

Nawapur and Nandurbar is out of the perview of mechanised

transport.

Table No. 9.5 - Gives Traffic Census on important roads.

There are six important routes in this District. They are

as follows -

- 1) Bombay Agra Road - National High-way.
- 2) Surat-Dhulia-Edlabad-Nagpur Road.
- 3) Navapur-Dhulia-Road - State High-way.
- 4) Vinchur-Prakasha Road - Stage High-way.
- 5) Dhulia-Chalisingaon-Daulatabad Road - State High-way.
- 6) Ankaleshwar-Shahada-Burhanpur-Road - State High-way.

In addition to these Major District Roads and Other District Roads are covered. The first three have experienced rather more traffic intensity of light, medium and heavy motor vehicles. Slow moving vehicles are experienced on Nandurbar Road i.e. 2095. The next number in this regard are Jalgaon and Shahada roads.

Table No. 9.6 - Gives information of postal, telegraph and telephone statistics. The statistics pertains to 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66. If we compare the progress in the Plan period, we clearly see that No. of post offices, which were 178 in 1961-62, rose to 238 in 1965-66. Telegraph Offices rose from 17 to 23. Letter boxes rose from 291 to 415 during the same period. The telephones figure rose from 538 in 1961-62 to 1166 in 1965-66. This means the postal, telegraph and telephone communications has been expanded in consonance with the requirements of the society.

10) Local-Bodies

The Local-Bodies are required to play a very important role in the democratic set up. Tables 10.1 to 10.4 deal with statistics pertaining to local bodies. Significant high-lights in these statistics are as follows -
Total incomes of all village panchayats during 1961-62 was Rs. 30.32 lakhs. The same went to Rs. 93.05 lakhs by the end of 1966. This is clearly three-fold increase. The expenditure is in consonance with the income of Village Panchayats. The study of Z.P. income and expenditure reveals that in 1961-62 its income was Rs. 161.65 lakhs and during 1965-66, it rose to Rs. 346.75 lakhs. This is just above two-fold. The income of Municipalities was

Rs. 61.48 lakhs in 1961-62 and Rs. 50 lakhs in 1965-66.

As regards the receipts of Z.P.Dhulia, out of Rs. 346.75 lakhs, 286.06 lakhs are Government-Grants. This is 82.49 p.c. of the total receipts.

CHAPTER-III

ANALYTICAL REVIEW GIVING SECTORAL TRENDS

The period considered here is the third five year plan.

1) Percentage gross sown area

Gross cropped area of Dhulia District in 1961-62 was 762026 hectares i.e. 53% of the total geographical area. The latest figures in this regard are available for 1964-65 and in that year ^{the gross cropped area of} 769672 hectares i.e. 54% total geographical area. There is no significant increase in the Gross cropped area.

Jowar occupies the first place among the crops of the District with 177143 hectares under total Jowar in 1961-62 and 160043 hectares in 1964-65. It is evident that the area under Jowar has declined. During 1961-62 of the total cereals 43% was under Jowar and during 1964-65 the same % was 39. The talukas which excell in Jowar are Shahada with 31776 hectares in 1961-62 and 30376 hectare in 1964-65, Nandurbar 24558 hectares and 22546 hectares in 1961-62 and 1964-65 respectively. Area under Jowar in Sindkheda has come down from about 27 thousand hectares to 18 thousand hectares.

Bajra has 139514 hectares area in 1964-65. It was 135963 hectares in 1961-62 i.e. 3% increase is noticed.

Pulses have 91162 hectares area in 1964-65. The corresponding figure in 1961-62 was 95914 hectares. There is a decline in the area under pulses.

Increase in the area is noticed under wheat from 32299 hectares in 1961-62 to 39104 hectares in 1964-65. This means 21% increase. Even though the figures under wheat for the year 1965-66 are not given, we may state here that, the first prize c

wheat out-turn in India has been captured by Dhulia District. Shri Pundalik Maharaj Rajput of Savalade village, who took part in the National Competition has been declared as winner of the first prize. He produced 2679.47 kilo grams of wheat in one acre. An award of Rs.3000 and the coveted title of "Krishi-pandit" has been bestowed upon him.

As far as groundnut is concerned, there is practically no change in the area.

Area under cotton which was 85171 hectares in 1961-62, rose to 103504 hectares in 1964-65. This is 21.52% increase.

2 Productivity of improved crops

We have described the fact of winning first prize in wheat production. But that shows the trend of efforts. The figures as made available by the Statistician Department of Agriculture in respect of production and out-turn are as follows-

Agricultural output in the District is showing a mixed trend. As the figures shown in the above table would reveal that the production of Rice has shown a declining trend except in the year 1963-64.

wheat has shown increasing trend. The production of wheat was 23600 M.Tons in 1961-62. It increased to 24000 M.Tons, in 1963-64 and to 26100 M.Tons in 1964-65. Jowar has shown a steady increase from 1961-62 to 1963-64. The production increase from 95000 M.Tons to 112000 M.Tons. But in 1964-65, it fell down to 76800 M.Tons. This is perhaps the scarcity conditions prevailing in 1964-65. Crop of Bajra shows a mixed trend as shown above.

4. Percentage of Irrigated area

The Gross cropped area of Dhulia District comes to 769672 hectares in 1964-65. Total gross area irrigated during the 64-65 was 48182 hectares, which means 6% of the gross cropped area. The comparative increase over the period 1961-62 to 1964-65 is 10844 hectare which is 27% increase in the irrigation. During the plan period a number of small bandharas were taken up and completed and about 2793 wells were dug during the plan period, which indicates the increase in the percentage of irrigation.

5. Changes in the crop pattern (total and irrigated)

Net area sown in the District during 1964-65 was 690804 hectares. The same was 671382 hectares in 1961-62. This indicates a rise of 3% over the period. The study of crop pattern is interesting in this District.

The following table would help us to analyse the data over a period of 4 years of the Third plan for which only figures are available.

Allmost all food crops except wheat and Bajara, have experienced a declining trend. The increase in wheat crop is 21.06% and Bajara has increased by only 2.62%. This shows the increase to be only marginal. Condiments and spices have also increased. Groundnut which was nearing Bajara in 1961-62 has declined to some extent. Among all crops cotton has experienced the largest rise i.e. by 21.52%. In short non food crops

have shown marginal advance during the period. Cotton is an important crop of Maharashtra. One of the important

which grow cotton is Dhulia. There is spinning and weaving mill in Dhulia and it has remained closed for the period under report. Improved variety of cotton has been introduced in this District and provision for supply of improved seed, fertilizers, pesticides is made. Special staff is appointed at places where cotton is normally grown to propagate improved variety of cotton. Co-operative Societies and Land Development Banks are also co-operating in extending credit to needy cultivators.

(+) As regards the cropping pattern of irrigated land /the position as follows. Among all the crops area under rice is 3224 hectares for 1964-65. This comes to 7% of the total irrigated area in Dhulia. Wheat (Rabi crop) is normally irrigated

where-ever possible. In this District during 1964-65, 20780 hectares of Land under wheat was irrigated. If we compare these figures with these of 1961, we see that only 2250 hectares irrigated area was under rice. Irrigated rice area rose to 3224 hectares. Area under irrigated wheat during 1961-62 was 15261 hectares, this figure rose to 20780 hectares in 1964-65. This means the rise in respect of rice during the span of 4 years is 43% and in respect of wheat is 36%.

Another important irrigated crop in this district is sugarcane. During 1961-62, 2642 hectares area under sugarcane was irrigated, this figure fell to 2477 during 1964-65. Sakri taluka is predominant in producing sugarcane.

sugar factory is proposed to be started in this taluka on

co-operative basis. From that point of view efforts are being made by Officials at the Dist.level. During 1961-62, 1040 hectares of sugarcane area was reported in Sakri taluka, this figure rose to 1117 hectares in 1964-65. Regarding other cash crops figures of area under irrigation, condiments and spices has been ascribed 14149 hectares. The corresponding figure for 1961-62 is 11042 hectares. The rise is 28%.

The comparison of irrigated food crops and non food crops would reveal the trend of cropping pattern.

From the above Statistics, it becomes clear that the greatest percentage increase is noted for total cereals and also total food-grains. The percentage increase of total non-food irrigated crops is 25%. Chillies are an important non-food irrigated crop and Nandurbar variety is famous in western Maharashtra.

6. Increase in Agricultural Credit, out-standing dues

Co-operative movement in Dhulia has been significant in many respects. The largest number of co-operative farming societies have been organised in this district. Co-operative

movement is an invention of the ingenious human brain to combat the social difficulties collectively. Especially this movement has been very helpful to bring the economically poor cultivators and others in this district. Dr. A.U. Shaikh, former Secretary, Agriculture and Co-operation Department says ".... In the initial stages of development the resources of our own contry, also foriegn aid falls short as compared to requirement. The administra-tive expences of Central Government, State Governments and Local Self Governments are already high and with some efforts budgets are balanced. Therefore peoples participation, efforts, co-operation from the people for development becomes essential." (Lokrajya June 1968). In the field of co-operation this district has done significant work in organisang, Co-operative, Farming Societies, Housing Societies, a net work of Co-operative Consumers. (Wholesale and Retail) Sotres are opened to meet the requirements of the people.

The total incomes of all the Local Bodies i.e. Zilla Parishad, Village Panchayats, and Municipalities come to Rs.5.24 crores. Working capital of only the Dist. Central Co-operative bank during the same period i.e. 1965-66 comes to 3.60 crores. If all the co-operative institutions are taken together they have done a great deal in advancing credit in particular and in the district economy in general. This clearly shows that the co-operative institutions can do much more than the statutory local bodies like the Zilla Parishad, Municipalities, Panchayat Samiti etc. These co-operative bodies have acquired a unique place in the economic of this District. However the percentage of-

overdues to outstanding of Agricultural credit societies comes to 42%. This indicates much remains to be desired from societies.

7. Agricultural Wage Rates

Table No.3.8 gives agricultural wage rates in Dhulia District at 3 centres, namely Songir in Dhulia Tahasil, Thalner in Shirpur Tahasil and Dhanora in Nandurbar Tahasil. The average Agricultural Wage Rates at Songir during 1965 were Rs. 1=75, and for female Rs. 1=13. The corresponding figures for the year 1966 were for male Rs. 1=85 and for women Rs. 1=24. At Thalner average male Agricultural Wage Rates were 1=89 and for females Rs. 1=30 per day. The corresponding wage rates for 1966 at Thalner were Rs. 2=05 and 1=30 for males and females respectively. The last centre i.e. Dhanora, during 1965, wages at the rates Rs. 1=55 and Rs. 1=09 were paid for males and females. The corresponding wage rates in 1966 were Rs. 2=03 and Rs. 1=06 for males and females respectively. The above figures show a slight increase in the wage rate in 1966.

8. Livestock per acre of land

The total livestock in the District is 935598. Net area shown in the district during 1965-66 comes to 690804 hectares. Therefore Livestock per acre of land comes to 1.35. The following figures would give talukawise livestock along with net area sown and livestock per acre of land.

10 Per Capital Consumption of Electricity

In the early fifties of the present century, electricity, in the district was considered a luxury, which was largely associated with lighting and such other amenities which people in the low income group could hardly afford. As a result, the

growth of electricity services was extremely low. The scheme received impetus in the later part of the Third Five Year Plan. The Socio Economic Review of 1962-64 of this district says-

"In 1950 there were two towns viz. Dhulia and Nandurbar in the District, served by electricity. In 1952, a third town, viz. Shirpur, was served with electricity. In 1962 a village Khandbara was served with electricity. Later in 1958 a village, viz. Dondaicha was electrified. Thus by the end of 1960, 4 towns and 1 village in the district were electrified. In 1963, Shahada City has been electrified. Thus in all 6 places have been electrified in the District which is rather below normal considering requirements of the District."

In the next three years, State Government took up programme of power development and by the end of March 1966, 28 villages covering 54819 rural population and 5 towns covering 74982 population were electrified by Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Dhulia.

11 Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchanges and vacancies notified

There were 6361 registrations made at Dhulia Employment Exchange during 1961-62. This figure increased to 7194 during 1965-66. Vacancies notified to the Exchange were 1165 in 1961-62 and 1347 in 1965-66.

12 Increase in the number of students in different categories boys and girls separately

Pre-Primary - During 1965-66, there were 5 institutions in which 68 boys and 82 girls were attending.

Primary Schools :- Table No.8.4 shows 15647 boys and girls in primary schools. Seperate break-up is not available. The figure rose to 185525. There were 118790 boys and 66735 girls.

Secondary Schools :- There were 18453 boys and girls during 1961-62. Seperate figures not available. This number of boys and girls rose to 29251. The increase is 59 percent. There were 23595 boys and 5656 girls. The percent increase shows the tremendous expansion of secondary schools during the Third Five Year Plan period.

13. Increase in Road mileage per 100 Sq. Metres

Road length (Extra Municipal) according to category and surface is shown in table No.9.2 (a). The extra municipal road length of Dhulia District as on 31st March 1966, was 2260 K.M. area. This comes to about 18 K.M. per 100 Sq.K.M. area. The corresponding figure of Maharashtra State for the same period is 17 K.M. per 100 Sq. K.M. area.

14. Banking facilities in proportion to population

Of the total number of 51 banking offices, 11 were scheduled bank offices and 40 were offices of co-operative banks. The population served by these offices by end of 1965 was 320226.

CHAPTER-IV

Third Five Year Plan.

1) General

1.1 The Third Five Year Plan was aimed at building up of an agro-industrial society, simultaneously removing imbalances that exist in different parts of the State. In order to translate this objective, scheme-wise details even at the District Level were worked out, and agencies through which the Plan was to be implemented were fixed. In order to have organic inter-connection between rural development efforts and popular support, the Panchayat-Raj institutions were started during the Third Plan period. Investment of time, effort and money on local development plans cannot yield the expected results unless the people primarily affected are fully involved, through their representative institutions, in formulating and implementing plans for their welfare.

2.1 The allocation over various heads in each aspects reveals the priorities given to development heads. In Dhulia District 50.39 of total allocation is for agricultural development. Next in priority comes Co-operation and Community Development. In the schematic budgets of C.D.Block, agricultural development is again given priority. Social Services get 92.05 lakhs of ruppees, having number three in priority. Transport and Communication with 31.40 lakhs of Rs. allocation stands 4th. Industries and Mining, the last sector has been allocated only 6.29 lakhs. During Third Plan due to power and water shortage industries and mineral development could not be contemplated.

3) Progress of Plan schemes - Expenditure

3.1 The progress of Plan can be seen to some extent from the expenditure incurred in the District.

3.2 Except Agricultural Programme, the expenditure in all other heads has been exceeded. Under agricultural programme 299.70 lakhs were provided as against them 279.85 lakhs are spent, keeping a balance of Rs.19.85 lakhs. It can safely be said that during Third Plan, Bombay-Division, excepting Ratnagiri has spent more than the provision. The Divisional critical review says -

"..... All the remaining districts have incurred excess expenditure over the Plan provision for Social Services. Under Agricultural Programmes only Kolaba, Nasik and Jalgaon show expenditure more than the respective Plan provisions. Whereas in case of co-operation and Community Development Nasik and Dhulia Districts and in case of Transport and Communications Thana and Jalgaon have exceeded the respective Plan provisions."

4) Achievements

4.1 The second dimension of development effort is the physical work produced or achieved. In certain cases qualitative assessment has limits. For example, the No. of societies organised in a District has less meaning if they are not properly managed and organised. However the following assessment will throw light on some important features and achievements in Dhulia District.

4.2 While studying the progress in the Plan we shall give the figures as they existed at the end of 1961-62, i.e. the beginning of the Third Plan and the end of 1965-66, end of Third Plan. This will naturally give us an idea

and the extent of development during the Third Plan.

4.3 The main occupation of Dhulia District is Agriculture and the Plan out-lay also confirms the priority given to it.

The cultivable area of Dhulia during 1964-65 was 690804 Hectares (the latest figure that is available) In 1961-62 the cultivable area in this District was 671382 hectares. This means, cultivable area has increased by 19422 hectares i.e. an increase of 2.81 %. The corresponding increase of Bombay-Division is 2 % during the same period. Some area of Akkalkuwa and Dhadgaon which being forest area and remains unsurveyed, if that area is taken into account the reclamation work in this District will show better picture. But the figures of cultivation in forest area are not available for the present.

4.4 The net irrigated area formed 29789 Hectares in 1961-62 and 39425 Hectares in 1964-65. This means an increase of 9636 Hectares over 4 years. The percentage increase comes to about 33 % during this period which indicates the trend of efforts in this direction. The percentage of area under irrigation in this District is still very small and therefore the output of crops very much depends upon the quantum and distribution of the rainfall. The gross area irrigated in the District during 1964-65 was 48182 Hectares. The corresponding gross irrigated area during 1961-62 was 37838 Hectares which similarly clearly indicates

27.33 % increase in the gross irrigated area over the years. The main increase in the area irrigated is under wells. About 59.17 % of the gross irrigated area is under well irrigation. About 43.12 % of the gross irrigated area is under Wheat, 6.69 % under Rice, 5.14 % under Sugarcane.

During the Third Five Year Plan an irrigation potential of 42254 Hectares was created. About 6636 new wells were constructed in the Third Five Year Plan. During the last year of the Third Plan when this District was hit by scarcity, efforts to utilise all available water resources were made and an additional area of 49755 hectares was brought under irrigated Wheat. By the end Third Plan there were 12300 ^{pumping} sets. During Third Plan 5281 new sets were installed. 901 boring is done for irrigation. 55265 holes were made by way ^{of} blasting. This work has gathered sufficient momentum in the District.

Minor irrigation bandharas are existing in this District. Two major dams 1) Karwand, 2) Malangaon projects were in progress during the Third Plan period. Both of them would bring 6838 hectares of land under irrigation.

Agriculture

More and more agricultural production for the growing population is the main aim of all the agricultural programmes. It is also aimed at bringing agriculture on the sound footing, making it equal to that of any other commercial enterprise. To this end all available resources are utilised. Improved varieties of seeds of Jowar, Wheat, Bajari, Paddy, Mung, Gram, Cotton, Groundnut are distributed.

16058 quintals of Wheat and 672 quintals of Jowar seeds are distributed during the Plan period. Table No.11.2 shows all other details. Improved agricultural implements like Iron plough, other implements are also introduced in this District. But the magnitude of the utilisation of improved implements from the Plan reports will not justify facts. The agriculturists in this tract are experienced and are forward in adopting new implements. Tractors, dusters, sprayers, thrashers are also utilised by some of the farmers in this District, especially in Shahada and Taloda area.

Soil Conservation

The purpose of soil conservation programme is to prevent soil erosion to correct erosion where it has already set in and further to build up soil productivity continuously. The soil conservation programme also includes efficient use and management of soil and water resources and is a key programme for increasing agricultural production. Various measures needed to control erosion, are contour bunding, terracing, afforestation in hilly areas, water-sheds and forests and reclamation of lands for economic utilisation.

The bunding programme is undertaken as far as possible on water-shed basis in a comprehensive manner so as to tackle the problems associated with soil and water use and management, field drainage. The bunding programme has as far as possible been dovetailed with the well construction programme so as to result in an appreciable recharging of ground water to support linked programme of wells

construction. By the end of Third Plan 335036 acres area has been bunded. Except Nawapur, Sakri Talukas all the other Talukas are covered under this programme. During the same period 6236 new wells are constructed.

Afforestation for soil conservation

The main factor which naturally checks erosion is the vegetative cover on land, be it grass or trees. Under the scheme of afforestation for soil conservation are covered. 6915 acres has been covered during the Third Plan period. 1155 valuable trees are also planted.

Tractor Ploughing
a fleet

The Z.P. has a fleet of tractors through which deep ploughing is done. During the Third Plan period tractor ploughing was done in an area of 889 Hectares. The Z.P. has its own work-shop.

Consolidation of holdings

In order to make agriculture an economic and commercial enterprise consolidation of fragmented holdings is important. An area of 48000 acres has been covered by consolidation till the end of the Third Plan. This work is done only in 43 villages out of 1360 villages of this District.

and
Research/Training

The agricultural research station is functioning in this District. Also there is Agricultural College which conducts various experiments and propagates its beneficial findings among the nearby villages. For this the College has adopted certain area where the work is concentrated. An Agricultural school at Dhulia is functioning under the

Z.P.Dhulia. During the Third Five Year Plan soil testing cell has been created in the Agricultural College, where the soils in this District are tested and agriculturist are advised on the deficiencies in the soil etc. Mass training Officer is attached to the Agricultural College and 239 farmers were trained during the Third Plan period. The scheme was started at the end of 1965.

Resettlement of landless labourers

The questions of improvement of the conditions of landless agricultural labourers - who number about 232913 in this District and 45 lakhs in the State was considered by a study group appointed at the time of formulation of the States Third Five Year Plan. One of the recommendation made by the study group was that such labourers should be settled on waste lands and lands rendered surplus as a result of lands ceiling act. Under this schemes 58 societies were given waste land for cultivation. 22 landless individuals were also brought under this scheme.

Kharif and Rabi Campaigns

Special kharif, Rabi and summer crop campaigns were initiated in the Third Plan. During these campaigns certain measures such as supply of seed at subsidised rates, supply of oil engines and pumping sets on hire at nominal rent, fertilisers mixtures at half cost, supply of irrigation water free of charge and intensification of plant protection measures were undertaken especially in intensive cultivation areas which have assured rain-fall

and high production potential. Kharif campaign 1964-65 was initiated on an auspicious day of Shivajayanti in 1964. Insecticides and pesticides were utilised in 13615 acres and an amount of Rs.36337 was incurred. Nachani is crop which is cultivated by the Adivashis of Nawapur and Sakri, In order to boost production of Nachani, free fertiliser ammonium sulphate and 68.220 tons of to the tune of 33.750 tons of Super Phosphate was distributed free in 1514 acres. An amount of Rs.31648.63 was spent.

Rabi Campaign 1964-65

Rabi campaign was made applicable to this District under G.R.IPC/1164/11811-A dated 28/8/1964. In all 104 tons of mixture fertiliser was purchased and 94 tons were distributed. An amount of Rs.18970 was spent on this fertiliser. Rs.200 per ton was the subsidy rate.

Seed

Rs.20 per quintal of Wheat seed was the subsidy. 200 quintals of Wheat seed was purchased and was distributed with subsidised rates. Apart from this 345 quintal Wheat from Madhya Pradesh, 40 quintal Wheat seed from Punjab was purchased. In all Rs.3840 were spent.

Kacha Bandharas

To tap the resources in full, the cultivators were encouraged to construct the Kacha Bandharas to bring additional area under Wheat crop by way of flow and lift irrigation. There was a good response and 301 bandharas have been constructed. Financial help of Rs.20 per acre subsidy was given. The area commanded under this item is 3978 acres as against the target of 2652 acres.

Supply of Oil-Engines

In the programme, Director of Agriculture, Maharashtra-State, Poona, allotted 150 Oil Engines to this District, but the Government restricted the supply to 125 Oil Engines only. The engines were supplied through the local dealers of the District. Engines were received in time but accessories for running the engine were received one month late. The supply of pipe position was also poor. However local purchases were arranged to start the functioning of the Oil engines in time. In this District there are old wells of ancient time with ample water supply. These wells ^{WER} were inspected and the cultivators were also contacted for utilising the source of water for irrigating wheat crop. 6 oil engines along with accessories were purchased locally from the Dhulia Dist. Central Co-operative sale and purchase union, Dhulia and supplied to the concerning village panchayats in Shirpur taluka. This was the first time in the History of this Dist. that water from ancient wells were even tapped. The wells were constructed by Shrimati Ahilyabai Holkar.

In this way due to scarcity conditions in the District the cultivators came forward to grow maximum wheat crop and the irrigation facilities were made available by supply of Oil Engines. The Chief Executive Officer and the Collector, Dhulia took joint tour for this programme and it was noticed that there were good water resources for irrigating wheat crop. Zilla Parishad requested the Department to supply additional supply of Oil Engines, but in view of the urgency, local purchases were effected and 31 Oil Engines of various Horse powers were purchased to help the cultivators to tap the water.

resources available. Government was approached for sanctioning this purchase of 37 Oil Engines costing Rs. 182250/- as there was saving in the budget of special Rabi Crop campaign. Thus Zilla Parishad could bring an additional area of 49755 acres of land under wheat crop, making the irrigated wheat area of 101115 acres against the previous year area of 51360 acres.

Intensive Cultivation Programme

During the third plan steps were taken to organise intensive cultivation in irrigated and assured rainfall areas by setting up compact blocks of 20000 acres each, with a special whole time staff of 10 Agricultural Assistants, one Agricultural Officer and one full time campaign Officer, since 1963-64, this scheme has been introduced in this District. Initially this scheme with two blocks was spread over in more than one Panchayat Samiti, subsequently blocks were reorganised coterminating Panchayat Samities. The achievement by end of third plan, has been 32550 acres against 45000 acres target. During 1st year of the Annual Plan 1966-67, another 4 blocks are proposed to be taken up.

In addition to the above prominent programmes the following various programmes were implemented in this District.

1. Mass Training Scheme

This scheme comes under the Zilla Parishad Peripetitic training classes of 3 days duration for farmers have been organised in 26 villages and 1100 farmers were trained. Reference to vocational courses of 15 days duration have been taken up at the college of Agriculture by the Mass Training Officer. So far 6 courses have been organised and 239 farmers have been trained.

2. Community wells

The scheme has been taken up as pilot scheme and a

advance action of 4th Plan. 40 wells have been taken up against the target of 75 wells. It is expected that small holders will be benefitted and considerable area will be brought under irrigation.

3) Hybrid seed production programme

In view of the demand for Hybrid seed, this programme is to be taken up by selecting suitable blocks of 500 acres, having assured irrigation facilities. For the present arrangements have been made for hybrid seed production at Nasik to meet the needs of this Division. Hybrid maize seed is ~~is~~ being produced on the farm of Dr. V.H.Patil, at Shahada. The programme of production of Hybrid Jowar seed has been taken up on the same farm under the technical guidance of National seed corporation, New-Delhi.

Now above is a detailed account of the agricultural efforts made in this District.

Intensive Cattle Development Project. Dhulia

Under the crash programme sponsored by the Government of India, three intensive cattle development blocks have been established at Miraj, Dhulia and Poona. District Dhulia was famous for quality ghee since past. With a view to develop the milk and milk products in this area, Government of Maharashtra has taken the Intensive Cattle Development Project, in the Milk shed area of the District covering Shirpur, Shahada, Dhulia talukas of this District and Chalisgaon taluka of Jalgaon District, comprising 456 villages having 250 Milk Societies. The Project aims development of three aspects - 1) Fodder, 2) Cattle, 3) Disease control.

1) Cattle Development work

Under this Programme Breeding bulls of Cow as well as Buffallow Bulls are posted in the area. The total No. of bulls

posted is 154, and in addition to this Artificial Insemination is carried out. Breeds of animals introduced in this area are as under 1) Buffallow - Surati and Murrah - 82, 2) Cows - Tharparkar - 82.

Dairy Extension Programme

Under this programme 319 Tharparkar Cows have been purchased by the Department and given on loan to various deserving Dairy and Joint Farming Societies in the project. The total milk supplied up to December 1966 is 2 lakhs 500 litres. 17 male and 11 female outstanding calves have been selected for subsidy.

3) Feed and Fodder Programme

With an object to increase and improve available fodder resources, the following schemes were taken up during 1965-66.

Dhulia is a traditional milk producing area. The above cattle development programme has been oriented to improve the milk yield varieties of cows and buffaloes, for which intensive cattle development project is established so as to serve the milk pocket in this part of the district.

Dairy Development

The programme of dairy development has been evolved around schemes for supply and distribution of whole some milk, processed under hygienic conditions, to towns and metropolitan areas at reasonable rates.

There are 11 urban milk supply schemes including the Greater Bombay Milk scheme.

Dhulia Milk Supply

In a survey conducted in 1959-60 it was revealed that areas around Dhulia, Shirpur Sindkheda, Shahada, Sakri along with certain area of Jalgaon District had sufficient potentiality to become a milk pocket. Under scheme MLK-3, an experimental milk project for collecting 5000 litres milk was commissioned. But soon this project began to collect 35000 litre milk and a processing equipment became necessary. The following statistics of milk collection will throw light on the momentum gathered by this project.

The machinery and equipment required for the dairy are being obtained from New Zealand under Colombo plan. During 1966-67 there were about 5000 cultivating families who earned Rs. 200/- per month in addition to the normal agricultural income they accrued.

By end of third plan 230 feeder societies were pooling milk. A milk union of these societies is also functioning with a fleet of 12 vehicles. Dhulia city consumes about 2000 litre milk. The rest of the pasturised milk is exported to Bombay.
