C H A P T E R - I

Introduction

1.1 LOCATION.:

Ahmednagar district with an area of 16,776 Sq. Kilometer is the second biggest district in the Maharashtra State. It ranks next only to Chanda district. Ahmednagar district is located in the central part of the State and is situated between 18.2 and 19.9 North latitudes and 73.9 and 75.5 East longitudes. The district is bounded by Bhir and Osmanabad districts on the East and South-east sides, Sholapur district on the Southern side, Poona district on the South-west, Thana district on the western side, Nasik district on the North and Auran-gabad district on the North-east. Thus the district has got common boundaries with Seven districts of the state.

Ahmednagar, the city of district head quarter is only 74 miles from Poona and is connected by State high way, as well as by broad guage rail line Poona-Dhond-Ahmednagar-Manmad.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY

(1)SOILS :

Among the important types of soils that are found in this district are black, red laterite, barad and the white. Of these types

barad soils are poor in fertility but others are fertile. Red soil is found in the hilly tract of Akola taluka . In Sangamner taluka, the soil along the banks of Pravara is extremely rich but it grows poor away from the banks. In Kopergaon and Shrirampur taluka the soil along the banks of Godavari and Pravara is white very deep, and fertile. In Rahuri taluka the soil is generally black, deep & fertile. The southern parts of the district i.e. Parner, Shrigonda and Karjat talukas have deep soiled pathars and rich valleys, But most of the plain land in this region is poor and shallow. It is suitable only for millets.

(2) RIVERS.

Godavari and Bhima are the two important river systems of the district. Godavari traverses through Kopergaon taluka and then along the border of Shrirampur, Newasa and Shevgaon talukas. Pravara is an important tributary of Godavari, it originates in Akola taluka and passes through Sangamner taluka, then along the border of Shrirampur and Rahuri talukas to Newasa taluka and joins Godavari at Pravara Sangam. A dam known as Bhandardara has been built across Pravara in Akola taluka. Pravara canals have irrigated large areas of this famine stricken district & has converted them into rich areas. Mula, Adhala, Mahalungi are the important tributaries of Pravara. Work of construction of a dam on Mula river in Rahuri taluka has been undertaken. There...

is another tributary of Godavari. It rises at north of Ahmednagar town and traverses through Newasa and Shevgaon talukas.

Whole of southern part is in the basin of Bhima river which itself flows along the boundary of this district with Poona for about 35 miles. Main tributaries of Bhima are Ghod and Sina. Ghod also flows along the south-western boundary of the Ahmednagar district with Poona district. A dam built across Ghod river at Chinchani in Poona district also irrigates land in Ahmednagar district. Sina river originates^s near Ahmednagar town and traverses through it towards south and joins Bhima near Sholapur City.

(3) HILL RANGES.

In this district there is only ^{one} system of hills viz. the main range of Sahyadri and its offshoots. The main range touches only Akola taluka i.e. in the Western part of the district. From this main range, three spurs viz. Kalasubai, Baleshwar and Harishchandragad stretch towards east.

The spur of Kalasubai stretches out eastwards along the northern border of the district & goes on up to Dudheshwar hill in Sangamner taluka. The highest peak of Sahyadri viz. Kalasubai (5,427) is in this range. The Harishchandragad spur extends about 60 miles in the district. The third spur e

(CONTD)...

called the Baleshwar range is the longest one and it forms boundary between Ahmednagar district and Poona district. On entering in the Parner taluka this spur forms a plateau from which two / spurs branch off. One goes to the east from north of Ahmednagar town while another turns south, crosses north-east corner of Shrigonda taluka and enters Karjat taluka. All the three main spurs decrease in height as they extend eastwards.

(4) MINERALS :

There are no minerals available in the district. Limestone is found in some parts, notably in Parner taluka.

1.3 CLIMATE

(1) RAIN FALL

Details of rainfall and rainy days during 1961 and 1965 are given in table No. 1.1 in the Statistical Abstract. Monsoon generally sets in during June and major rainfall is obtained upto September. The distribution of rainfall over the district is quite uneven. In the western hilly part in Akola taluka it is of the extent of 5,000 mm. while in the southern part it is nearabout 500mm. Comparison of the rainfall during 1965 with that during 1961 and normal rainfall shows that majority of the centres had registered less rains during 1965. Out of 13 rain gauge centres, 10 had registered less rainfall in 1965 as compared to Normal rainfall while 8 centres had registered less rainfall than that during 1961.

(2) TEMPERATURE.

The climate of the district is generally dry and rainfall in most of the parts is meagre. Climate throughout the year excepting in Summer is moderate. In summer i.e., from March to June the climate is rather hot. Temperature data for Ahmednagar City for the years 1961 and 1965 is given in table No. 1.2 in the Statistical Abstract. It shows that May-1965 was the hottest month the maximum temperature reached being 39.5 c. Mean temperature during May 1965 was 30.9 c. which gradually fell in further period and reached 21.9 c in December-1965. Comparison with 1961 data shows that Maximum temperature was reached during April and it was 39.6 c. Minimum temperature during 1961 was 12.4 in December 1961 while during 1965 Minimum temperature was higher at 13.5 c in January.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES :

According to topography and climate the district can be classified into 4 different, Natural Zones, as described below :

ZONE- I : Whole of Akola taluka which has got characteristics different from rest of the district comes under this zone. Western part of this zone is hilly and receives heavy rainfall. It is full of forest. This area grows mainly Kharip crops.

ZONE-II : Ahmednagar, Sangamner, Parner, Shrigonda...

and Karjat talukas together make up this zone. This zone receives low rainfall and is usually affected by scarcity and density of population is comparatively low. Excepting industries in Nagar City, this zone is devoid of main industries.

ZONE III : Irrigated talukas of Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri are included in this zone. This zone also receives low rainfall but vast areas are irrigated by Gangapur & Phandardara dams. Various industries have developed in this region.

ZONE-IV : This zone includes Jankhed, Shevgaon, Pathardi and Newasa talukas, which receive relatively regular rain. Soil in Newasa and Shevgaon taluka is quite fertile. Soils in Jankhed & Pathardi talukas are however of low fertility.

1.5 FAMINE & SCARCITY :

As a result of the shortage of rains, 653 villages were affected by famine and chronic scarcity conditions. Large area of Akola (153 villages) Parner (109 villages) Ahmednagar (97 villages), Shrigonda (85 villages) Karjat (81 villages) and Sangamner (65 villages) talukas were affected by scarcity. Population of the affected villages was about 6,82,000.

In order to mitigate the hardships of the scarcity affected population 151 relief

works were undertaken by Government so that people could get wages. Total expenses on the relief works was Rs. 9,25,616. Tagai loans of Rs. 29.20 lakhs were also distributed during 1965-66.

1.6 TERRITORIAL CHANGES :

In 1891, the district consisted of following sub-divisions :

In 1913, Pathardi Peta was newly formed & remaining part of Jamkhed taluka was renamed as Jamkhed Mahal. Karjat taluka had also been downgraded as peta during 1931-41. From 1941 Pathardi and Karjat Petas were upgraded as talukas while in 1945 Shrirampur taluka was newly formed. In 1950 21 enclave villages were transferred from Bhir district to this district while 26 villages were transferred from this district to Bhir district and 1 was transferred to Aurangabad district.

As already pointed out the district with an area of 16,773 Sq. Km. was the second biggest in the State. Urban areas in the district constituted only a small portion of 129 Sq. Km. which was less...

less than 1% of the total area. This was because there were only 5 towns in the district as per 1961 census. Within the district itself, Parner taluka having an area of 1788 Sq. Km. was the biggest of all followed by Sangamner (1681 sq. km.) and Shrigonda (1661 sq. km.) Shrirampur was the smallest taluka with an area of only 807 sq. km.

1.7 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

The district is composed of 4 sub-divisions, which together contain 12 talukas and 1 Mahal. The administrative ^{setup} is shown below :-

The number of villages and population, figures given above are as per 1961 population census. The number of towns viz. 5 is the smallest in any district of the Maharashtra State, Each of the sub-divisions was under a Deputy Collector or a Prant Officer and Mamlatdar was in charge of the taluka. Revenue administration of Jamkhed mahal was looked after by a Mahalkari.

With the acceptance of policy of Democratic Decentralisation, Zilla Parishads came into existence with effect from May-1962. Most of the developmental functions were transferred to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad has an elected President assisted by three vice presidents and on the administrative side it is headed by a Chief Executive Officer.

Ahmednagar City having population of 1,19,020 was completely left out of the Zilla Parishad while 3 towns, although outside the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad for administration, were considered for fixing the size of blocks and budget. At the taluka level Panchayat Samitis functioned as Developmental agencies while at village level Gram-Panchayats looked to the local administration. The number of Grampanchayats was stationary at 897 during the year 1966-67.

Ahmednagar, Kopergaon, Sangamner and Shrirampur were the towns administered by the Municipality....

Municipalities. The fifth town viz. Wari which had a population of only 6,895 did not have a Municipality but had a panchayat.

1.8 DEMOGRAPHY :As per the population Census held in 1961, total population of the district ^{was} 17,75,969. Out of this 9,05,313 were males and 8,70,656 were females. The sex ratio, therefore, works out to 962 females per 1000 males. During 1951 census the sex ratio of the district was 971. The sex ratio in Urban areas during 1961 was 890 while in Rural area it was 969. Highest ratio was 1020 in Akola taluka and the lowest 928 in Shrirampur taluka.

Out of the total population of 17,75,969 1,87,315 i.e. about 11 percent lived in Urban areas of five towns viz. Ahmednagar, Kopergaon, Wari, Sangamner and Shrirampur. Thus the Urban areas were limited only to 4 talukas of Ahmednagar, Kopergaon, Sangamner and Shrirampur. In the other 9 talukas, there were no towns. The Urban area measured 49.7 Sq. Miles i.e. areas less than 1 percent of the total area of the district viz. 6471.9 sq. miles.

In 1901 the population of the district was only 8,20,346 and from this it grew steadily to 17,75,969 in 1961. The percent growth in the population from 1901 to 1961 was about 116. In 1951 the population was 14,10,873 which means that during the decade 1951-1961 the population increased by ...

by about 26 percent. This was a considerable growth rate. Growth rate of the Poona division and Maharashtra State during the decade was 24 percent.

According^{to} 1961 population census figures the density of the district was 105 persons per Sq. km. which shows increase of 23 as compared to density during 1951. Shrirampur and Kopergaon taluka had densities of 220 and 188 respectively. Since these areas are advanced and have industries, they are crowded. The density in urban areas was 1,448 per Sq. Km. while that in rural areas was 95 per Sq. Km.

Percentage of Literacy in the district in 1961 was 26.45 as compared to 29.30 in Poona division and 29.82 in Maharashtra State. In urban areas the literacy in the district was 51.12 percent while in rural areas it was only 23.54 percent. Corresponding figures for Poona division and Maharashtra State were 49.27 and 23.58 and 51.07 & 21.46 respectively.

As per 1961 census 50 percent of the population was classified as workers. Out of the workers 59 percent were working as cultivators, and 22 percent as agricultural labourers. Corresponding proportion in the State was 46 percent and 24 percent respectively. Percentage of workers in Industry was 8 in the district and 11 in the State.

Of the total population in the district 1,57,500 belonged to scheduled castes and 1,09,827 to scheduled tribes. This means that proportion of Scheduled caste and Scheduled tribes population to total was 8.9 percent and 6.2 percent respectively. Proportion of scheduled Tribes population in the district was very high as compared to the divisional average of only 2.1 percent.

CHAPTER - 2

Explanatory Notes on the Tables included in the District Statistical Abstract - 1965 - 66

In this chapter descriptive notes are given regarding the scope, limitations and points of special interest in the different tables included in Part II of this publication i.e. District Statistical Abstract. Broad observations based on the data presented in various tables are also included.

1. CLIMATE.

TABLE 1.1 : In this table data on Rain fall in the district during two years 1961 and 1965 is given. It includes rainfall data i.e. normal rainfall, number of rainy days and rainfall during reference years in respect of 13 centres in the district. All these centres are taluka places. Out of 13 centres, rainfall during 1965 was less than that during 1961 in case of 7 centres. During 1965, maximum rainfall was recorded at Kopergaon centre. Excepting the western part of Akola taluka, whole of this district receives scanty rainfall and some talukas viz. Parner Nagar, Karjat, Sangamner etc. are recognised as areas liable to scarcity.

TABLE 1.2 : Table 1.2 gives monthly temperature data recorded at Ahmednagar centre during the two years 1961 and 1965. The temperature figures are given in centigrade. Mean temperature ranged between 21.9^o to 30.9^o during 1965 while during 1961 it ranged bet-

between 21.1° and 31.3°. Highest level touched by the mercury during 1965 was at 39.5°/ was recorded in Jan-13.5° in May & lowest temp. of uary. During 1961 the maximum and minimum temperatures attained were 39.6° and 12.4° respectively.

2. AREA & POPULATION :

TABLE 2.1 : This table gives talukawise Rural and Urban Population and areas of the district as per 1951 and 1961 census. Figures of 1951 are adjusted according to definitions of urban and rural areas as per 1961 census. Total area of district is 16,647 Sq. Km. Biggest taluka in the district is Parner having an area of 1,788 Sq. Km. followed by Sangamner (1681 Sq. Km.) and Shrigonda (1607 Sq. Km.) Shrirampur is the smallest with an area of just 807 Sq. Km. Ahmednagar taluka is the most populated taluka with population of 2,45,581 in 1961. Average density of whole district in 1961 was 106 per Sq. Km. Shrirampur taluka has the maximum density of 221 persons per Sq. Km. During the decade 1951-1961 the population of the district increased by about 26 percent. The percentage increase was above district average in case of Kopar-gaon (38%) Shrirampur (33%) Rahuri (35%) and Karjat (33%) talukas.

TABLE 2.2 : In this table data regarding taluka-wise number of villages and their total population is given for 1961 census according to various population groups. Total number of villages is 1,323 includ...

including 5 deserted villages. The deserted villages are Ghanegaon and Pimpri Ghummat in Nagar Taluka, Mhalapur in Newasa taluka, Gangapur in Shevgaon taluka and Bhingar Dhumala in Shrigonda. Maximum No. of villages viz. 448 belonged to the population group 509-999. These villages formed 34 percent of the total and had 52 percent of total rural population. Average population per inhabited village is however 1205. It is interesting to note that there are 8 villages having a population exceeding 10,000. Villages Rahuri, Vambori, Jamkhed, Kharda, Karjat, Pathardi, Shevgaon and Shrigonda were treated as towns during 1951 census but in the 1961 census as per new definition of town, they were declassified.

TABLE 2.3 Table 2.3 gives taluka-wise classification of towns in different population groups. There are only 5 towns viz. Ahmednagar (Ahmednagar taluka), Kopargaon and Wari (Kopargaon Taluka), Sngamner (Sangamner taluka) and Shrirampur (Shrirampur Taluka) in this district. Excepting Ahmednagar City, all other towns are small and as per 1961 census population of each was less than 25,000.

TABLE 3.4 : This table gives no. of workers in each taluka according to livelihood classes. As per 1961 census, out of the total population of 17,75,969 - 8,92,801 were workers. This works out to about 50 percent. Following table gives proportion of

workers belonging to various livelihood classes. Comparative figures of Maharashtra State are also given:-

Thus about 81 per cent of the workers in the district are engaged in Agriculture as against 70 percent in the whole State. Percentage of workers in Manufacturing (Household and other) is 8 percent for the district & 11 per-cent for the State.

TABLE 2.5 : In this table number of non-workers in every taluka is given according to their pursuits. Out of the total of 8.83 lakh non-workers in the district 2.23 lakh i.e. (25%) belong to the category of Infants & Children not attending school and persons

permanently disabled, 1.90 lakh(22%) are full time students and 1.58 lakh(18%) are persons engaged only in household duties.

TABLE 2.6 : This table deals with scheduled caste and scheduled Tribes population. As per 1961 census there are 1,57,500 persons belonging to Scheduled Castes & 1,09,827 belonging to Scheduled Tribes. These work out to 8.87 percent and 6.18 percent respectively. Talukwise proportions of backward class population (i.e. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes together) is 47.94 percent in Akola, 17.36 percent in Rahuri & 17.12 percent in Shrirampur.

TABLE 2.7 : This table gives sexwise population in the 5 towns in the district. Total population of all these towns is 1,87,315 which works out to 11 percent of the total population.

3. AGRICULTURE

TABLE 3.1 : This table details of land utilisation in the district are presented for the years 1961-62 and 1964-65. Total geographical area is 17.02 lakhs hectares. Land put to various uses is more or less the same during the two reference years. Increase of about 1600 hectares has been registered in the forest area. Net area sown has gone down by about 3100 hectares during the period 1961-62 to 1964-65

while area sown more than once has also declined from 80,711 hectares in 1961-62 to 70,617 in 1964-65.

It is observed that area under cereals has increased by 16,000 hectares while that under pulses has declined by 18,000 hectares during the 3 years period. As for the cash crops, area under sugarcane registered small decrease of 1,000 hectares while area under cotton declined by about 3,000 hectares. Amongst the cereals Bajara had registered an increase of about 56,000 hectares while areas under Wheat and Jowar (Rabi) had declined. Among other crops area under fruits and vegetables registered an increase of about 1,000 hectares.

TABLE 3.3 : In this table yields of principal agricultural crops and their production during the years

1961-62 and 1964-65 are presented. The information is given for district as a whole since talukwise estimates are not prepared. Amongst the cereals, Wheat yield had improved from 405 Kg. per hectare during 1961-62 to 421 Kg. per hectare while in case of Rabi Jowar an increase of 187 Kg. per hectare was witnessed. Yields in respect of Bajari had however gone down by about 5 Kg. per hectare. Production of all cereals had increased by 1.13 lakh tonnes. In case of pulses, yield per hectares had improved in case of all pulses and hence as a result production increased from 26,011 tonnes during 1961-62 to 27,129 tonnes during 1964-65 although area under pulses had declined. Yield rate of sugarcane and Cotton decreased slightly, thus reducing the production, there was however an appreciable increase in yield rate of 223 Kg. per hectare in case of groundnut and its production increased by about 54 percent during the reference period.

Above table shows that proportion of land irrigated by govt. canals and private canals had gone down slightly while proportion of well irrigated area increased from 65 percent to 68 percent during 1964-65. Total area irrigated during 1961-62 was 1.46 lakh hectares while during 1964-65 it has increased to 1.51 lakhs hectares. Following table gives proportion of area irrigated in each taluka to net area sown in that taluka and also proportion of irrigated area in taluka to total irrigated area in the district during 1964-65.

Thus it is found that in the district 12 per cent of the net area sown was under irrigation.

Shrirampur, Kopergaon and Rahuri taluka had more proportions of irrigated area, than the district average.

TABLE 3.5 : In this table figures of area irrigated under different crops from the years 1961-62 and 1964-65 are presented for each taluka. It shows that total gross area irrigated for the district had increased from 1,65,420 hectares in 1961-62 to 1,71,412 hectares in 1964-65. Irrigated area under Wheat, Jowar Bajri, Cotton had increased during the period 1961-62 to 1964-65, while areas under Rice, Gram, Sugar-cane, Groundnut etc. had gone down.

TABLE 3.6(a) : This table presents data in respect of irrigation wells in each of the talukas during 1961-62 and 1964-65. During the period 1961-62 to 1964-65, no. of wells had increased from 72,547 to 77,334 i.e. by 4,787. Out of these, 4,060 and 3737 wells were out of use, respectively in 1961-62 in 1964-65. Sangamner taluka had highest number of wells in use during 1964-65 the number being 7700 followed by Shrirampur (7,679), Kopergaon (7,554) and Parner (7404).

TABLE 3.6(b) : In this table data regarding Minor Irrigation works in the district as on 30-6-66 is given. In all there were 14 works in use irrigating about 2107 hectares of lands as against the maximum

irrigable area of 5,625. Out of these, 6 works irrigating an area of 544 hectares were in Zilla Parishad Sector and remaining 8 were in State Sector.

TABLE 3.6(c) : Data regarding Major & Medium Irrigation Projects in the district is presented in this table. There are two Major Projects in the district viz. Bhandardara Dam which was already completed and Mula dam which is in progress. Under Bhandardara Project 23,331 hectares were irrigated perennially and 52,462 hectares seasonally. Estimated cost of Mula Project is Rs. 10 crores. After completion of this project this will irrigate area of 65,530 hectares. Visapur tank is a medium project Unit at the cost of Rs. 40 lakhs in 1929. During 1965-66, it irrigated 235 hectares perennially and 2122 seasonally.

TABLE 3.7 : In this table distribution of households is given according to their interest in land and area cultivated. This data is based on 20 percent sample households, and was collected at the time of 1961 census. Following table gives the percentage distribution of households according to size of land.

It is observed from these figures that about 45 percent of the households possessed less than 10 acres of land.

At Akola the wage rates for field labour were on average Rs. 2.50 per day for male and Rs. 2.00 for female. At Belapur they were between 2.00 and 2.50 for Male & between 1.00 and 2.00 for females. At Karjat centre the rates were 1.50 for male and 1.00 for female. Karjat is a dry area and labour is available readily there. Generally Labour charges in the irrigated area are more than the charges in the dry areas.

TABLE 3.9 : Gives data regarding Agricultural implements as per the census held in 1966, It is found from the table that out of the 21,997 oil engines in the district, 5,296 were in Kopargaon taluka,

4,697 in Shrirampur and 3,031 in Rahuri taluka. Thus these three talukas together accounted for 13,024 engines which comes to 59 percent of the total. Similarly in case of tractors these three irrigated talukas had 87 percent of the district total. Iron Ploughs, however were found to be distributed comparatively evenly in all talukas. This shows that cultivator in all areas are now satisfied of the advantages of using Iron ploughs rather than wooden ones.

TABLE 3.10 : In this table, Famine and scarcity data is presented. During 1965-66 in all 653 villages had been affected by famine and chronic scarcity. Out of these, in case of 396 villages full suspension of land Revenue was granted. 161 scarcity works were undertaken by Govt. for providing work and wages to the rural population. An expenditure of Rs. 9.25 lakhs was incurred on these works. Tagai loan to the extent of Rs. 29.20 lakhs were also distributed. Amongst the areas affected were Akola, Karjat, Parner and Shrigonda talukas and large areas of Sangli and Nagar talukas.

TABLE 4.1 : In this table the statistics of Live-stock in each taluka, as per the Live-stock census held in 1966 is presented. Total cattle population in the district was 9,19,426 of which 4,15,910

were males and remaining were females. Buffaloes numbered 79,630 majority of these, 47,532 being females. Sheep and Goats together numbered 7,28,513. Total of all types of live-stock came to 18,09,899, and total of poultry was 6,90,172.

TABLE 4.2 : Veterinary statistics in the district is given in this table. At the end of 1965-66, there were 3 Hospitals and 12 Dispensaries for animals. This number had been stagnant since 1961-62. No. of Veterinary Aid centres had however gone up from 19 during 1961-62 to 37 during 1965-66. During the year 1965-66, 1,69,373 animals were given treatment in all these institutions together. At the end of 1961-62, there were only 3 Artificial insemination centres, in which 1,68 animals were inseminated, While in 1965-66, the number of centres gone up to 15 and No. of animals artificially inseminated to 5,715.

TABLE 4.3 : Live-stock Mortality according to various diseases is presented in this table, for 1961-62 & 1965-66. It is found that in case of most of the diseases attacks during 1965-66 were less than during 1961-62. Total Number of attacks during 1961-62 was 673 as against 414 during 1965-66. The number of deaths also had fallen from 564 during 1961-62 to 414 in 1965-66.

TABLE 4.5 : This table gives data ⁱⁿ respect of forest. It is observed that the total area under forest which stood at 2,05,873 hectares in 1961-62, decreased to 2,02,558 in 1965-66. Out of this 94,716 hectares was under Revenue department and 1,07,842 under Forest Department.

TABLE 4.6 : In this table data in respect of major and Minor forest produce in Poona and Aurangabad Circles is given. Due to changes in the composition of Circles the data given for the two years 1961-62 and 1965-66 are not comparable. During 1965-66, in Poona Division timber worth Rs. 4,21,000 and Fuel worth Rs. 3,72,000 were produced while in Aurangabad Circle. Timber valued at Rs. 24,000 and Fuel of Rs. 77,000 were produced. Minor Forest Produce to the tune of Rs. 8,66,000 and Rs. 1,01,000 was also produced in Poona and Aurangabad Circles respectively.

Statistics of the district for 1963 and 1964. During the year 1963, there were 285 working Factoræes out of which 228 had submitted returns, while during 1964 the number of working factories had declined to 270 and of these only 106 had submitted returns. Out of the 270 working factories during 1964, 112 were engaged in Tobacco products manufacture, 47 were /Gur producers while 33 were Cotton Ginning and baling factories. All these working factories together had employed 21,155 workers in 1964.

TABLE 5.2 : In this table distribution of working Factories is given according to their product and working strength. There were 7 factories which employed less than 10 workers, 54 factories which employed workers between 10 and 19, 66 which employed 20 to 49 workers, 90 which employed 50 to 99 workers, 48 which employed 100 to 499 workers and 5 factories which employed 500 to 999 workers. All the 5 factories in the latest group were Sugar Factories.

TABLE 5.3 : This table gives distribution of factories according to number of days worked during 1964. It is found that there was not a single factory which worked for more than 300 days during 1963 or 1964. During 1963, 137 factories had worked for 241 to 300 days. But during 1964 number of such factories had gone down abruptly to 29. Tobacco manufacturing industries were the most conspicuous amongst factories working for maximum number of days.

TABLE 5.4 : This table gives statistics regarding Handlooms and Powerlooms during 1964-65 and 1965-66. There are only 4 main centres viz. Ahmednagar, Sangamner, Pathardi and Parner where these industries are concentrated. During 1965-66, Ahmednagar had 962 (Out of district total 1222) Handlooms and 329 Powerlooms (Out of district total of 514). It is thus the most important centre in the district.

TABLE 5.5 : Employment Exchange statistics in the district for 1961-62 and 1965-66 is included in this table. During 1961-62 registration was 10,152 while during 1965-66 it was 9,705. Progress made was reflected in increased number of vacancies notified from 1403 during 1961-62 to 2036 during 1965-66. During 1961-62 1314 candidates had been placed in employment 1 in private sector and 1313 in public sector. During 1965-66, 351 persons had been placed in employment in private sector and 1063 in public sector.

TABLE 5.6 : This table presents distribution of registration and placement during 1963-64, 1964-65 and 1965-66, according to various occupations. It is seen from the table that maximum number of registrations are from industry group 10 i.e. of unskilled workers. At the same time proportion of these having got employment is quite small to registrations. Proper-

tion of placement to registration in fairly large in case of industry groups 0, 2 & 3 and 4 & 5 .

TABLE 5.8 : In this table details about Registered factories during 1961 are presented. It is found that out of the total 315 factories, 126 i.e. 40 percent were engaged in production of Sugar, Gur etc. While 108 (34%) were engaged in tobacco manufacturing. Productive capital of all factories together stood at Rs. 18.94 crores. These factories had employed 19,531 persons on average and net value added was of the order of Rs. 618.68 lakhs.

TABLE 5.9 : This table gives details about the generation and consumption of electricity in the district during 1964-65 and 1965-66. We find that the consumption of electricity has increased from 63.80 lakh u. K.W. to 66.63 lakh K.W. during the year 1965-66. TABLE 6.1 : In this table typewise number of cooperative Societies is given for the year 1965-66 i.e. as on 30-6-1966. There were 1587 societies in all, made up of 1078 Agricultural credit, 87 Non-Agricultural credit, 172 Agricultural Non-Credit and 250 Non-Agricultural Non-Credit Societies.

TABLE 6.2 : This table presents statistics regarding Cooperative Banks during 1961-62 and 1965-66. During 1961-62, the District central Cooperative Bank had 28 Branches. By 1965-66, 13 new branches were opened. During this period owned funds increased from Rs. 99.93 lakhs to Rs. 159.56 lakhs and working capital from Rs. 941.94 lakhs to 1277.11 lakhs. Advances granted had increased from Rs. 512.06 lakhs to Rs. 796.55 lakhs at the end of 1965-66.

The Land Development Bank which is expected to look after long term Medium term finance of cultivators, had 13 branches at the end of 1965-66. It had granted finance to the tune of Rs. 77.54 lakhs during 1965-66 as against Rs. 54.14 lakhs during 1961-62. There were also 6 Urban Banks in the district at the end of 1965-66.

TABLE 6.3 : In this table figures on working of primary Agricultural credit societies are given.

Progress made by these societies is reflected in the figures of increase in number of societies by 32 during the period 1961-62 to 1965-66, increase of 40,674 members and working capital of Rs. 386.10 lakhs. These societies had advanced an amount of Rs. 513.66 lakhs during 1961-62. During 1965-66 loans to the extent of Rs. 686.49 lakhs were granted by these societies. Percentage of overdues to outstanding loans which stood at 22.7 in 1961-62 had, however, increased to 27.7 at the end of 1965-66.

TABLE 6.4 : In this table figures in respect of working of different types of Cooperative Societies excepting Agricultural credit are given. No. of Agricultural Marketing Societies in the district had remained stationary at 22 since 1961-62. But their working capital had increased from Rs. 50.82 lakhs in the year 1961-62 to Rs. 111.70 lakhs during 1965-66. No. of cooperative Farming Societies increased by 19 to 54 during the period 1961-62 to 1965-66. Their working capital showed a remarkable increase of Rs. 12.48 lakhs during this period. 1961-62, 17 such stores functioned in the district with a working capital of Rs. 3.40 lakhs. At the end of 1965-66 their number had increased to 26 with working capital of Rs. 19.38 lakhs.

TABLE 6.5 : This table includes data regarding the operations of Cooperative Marketing Societies in the district during 1961-62 and 1965-66. During 1961-62 there were 14 such societies in the district while at the end of 1965-66 this number had gone up to 19. During the year 1965-66 these societies had purchased material worth Rs. 495.00 lakhs, which included Agricultural Produce, Agricultural requisites and consumer goods. Sales of Agricultural Produce & Agricultural requisites by these societies amounted to Rs. 464.00 lakhs. Amongst the Agricultural requisites fertilisers accounted for about 76 percent of the total sales.

TABLE 6.6 : In this table operation of different types of cooperative Societies in the district during 1961-62 and 1965-66 are detailed. It shows that during... 1965-66 arrivals of agricultural produce amounted to Rs. 112.00 lakhs. In case of Milk Societies purchases increased from Rs. 6.31 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs. 6.60 lakhs in 1965-66 while sales increased from Rs. 7.26 lakhs to Rs. 7.02 lakhs during the same period. In 1961-62 Sugar factories had produced sugar worth Rs. 11.51 lakhs while in 1965-66 ...

the value of production had gone up to Rs. 15.29 lakhs. Activities of Consumers' Societies. Shared really a big improvement. During 1961-62 their purchases and Sales were of the order of Rs. 0.89 lakhs and Rs. 6.18 lakhs respectively. While during 1965-66 the figures were as high as Rs. 125.16 lakhs and Rs. 126.21 lakhs respectively.

TABLE 6.7 : In this table information in respect of Registered Money lenders and their operations is given. During 1961-62 there were 143 Registered Money lenders in the district while at the end of 1965-66 The number had decreased slightly to 139. But the total advances made by these Money lenders increased by 89 percent from Rs. 49.27 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs. 93.59 lakhs. During 1961-62, loans to traders and non-traders were 25 per. and 75 percent respectively. While during 1965-66 the percentages were 46 and 54. Non-traders category mainly consists of cultivators and have smaller percentage of loans to non-traders during 1965-66, as compared to 1961-62, shows less dependence of cultivators on Money lenders. This must be due to the expanding activities of cooperative movements. It is significant to note that during 1965-66, out of total loans of Rs. 93.59 lakhs granted by all Money lenders in the district, large amount to the extent of Rs. 50.61 lakhs had been granted by Money lenders in Kopergaon taluka along...

7. MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH.

TABLE 7.1 : In this table data regarding the persons engaged in Medical and Public Health professions, as per the census in 1961 is presented. It shows that there were 355 Doctors in Rural areas and 232 in Urban areas. Thus there was 1 Doctor for population of 4475 in rural areas and population of 807 in Urban areas. This shows wide disparity in provision for looking after health problems in Urban and Rural areas. It also underlines the need for Doctors to dispense to the Rural areas. In addition to the Doctors, there were 971 persons in the district which include Nurses, Pharmacists and other Health technicians. 484 of these were in Rural areas and 487 in Urban.

TABLE 7.2 : In this table statistics regarding availability of medical facilities during 1961 and 1965 is presented. At the end of 1965 there were 3 Hospitals in the district, 13 dispensaries and 17 Primary Health centres. The number of Doctors was 73 and Vaidyas 2. The number of beds which was 274 at the end of 1961, had increased to 415 at the end of 1965. During 1965 20,143 indoor patients and 2,77,088 outdoor patients were treated in these institutions.

TABLE 7.3 : This table gives classification of patients treated in the district during 1961 and

1965 by diseases. During 1961, out of a total no. of 1,06,886 patients treated 1,611 had died. This proportion works out to 1.50 percent. During 1965 out of the total of 1,07,515 persons treated, 1693 i.e. 1.57 percent had died. During 1965, 184 persons had died of local and general injuries, 69 died of Pneumonia, 63 due to diseases of circulatory system 77 due to diseases of Respiratory system and 61 due to diseases of digestive system.

TABLE 7.4 : Gives registration of births and deaths in various talukas during 1961 and 1965. It is necessary to stress that these figures are not completed despite efforts made to expand the scope of registration. It is found that during 1965 number of births registered had decreased to 38,326 from 56,939 in 1961. Similarly number of deaths registered had declined from 21,539 in 1961 to 14,426 in 1965. The number of infant deaths decreased from 5029 in 1961 to 2,864 in 1965. The percentage of infant deaths to births was 8.8 percent in 1961 and 7.5 percent in 1965.

TABLE 7.5 : In this table classification of deaths is given according to important diseases, for the years 1961 to 1965. It is found that during 1965 great damage to human life was done by fever (2161 deaths) and Periparturary diseases(1,827 deaths). It is observed that Cholera which had claimed 138 lives in (Contd)...

1963 and 475 in 1964 had got only 22 victims in 1965. Similarly deaths due to small pox were 243 in 1963, 377 in 1964 and 67 in 1965. Thus these two important diseases had been prevented to a great extent in 1965.

TABLE 7.6 : In this table vaccination & inoculation statistics during 1964 and 1965 are presented. It shows that during 1965, 2,17,887 persons had been revaccinated and 1,28,964 had been inoculated against Cholera.

TABLE 7.7 : This table presents data regarding B.C. G. vaccination in 1964 and 1965. During 1965 no testing had been done. During 1964 out of the 1945 tested, 54 percent showed positive results, 29 percent showed negative results.

TABLE 7.8 : Statistics regarding Hygienic Drinking water supply available in Rural areas as on 15th June 1965 is given in this table. It is found that in case of 55 percent villages sufficient Hygienic Water was available, in case of 27 percent villages water supply was inadequate while in remaining 18 percent villages there was no hygienic water supply available.

In case of Higher education and special education fees being high, amounts of concessions were also more. Hence although number of students taking Higher and special education was less the proportion of fees to comparatively more than any other categories.

TABLE 8.6 : In this table details about the concessions of free education given to Economically Backward classes are given. During 1961-62 the number of beneficiaries was 15,735 and the amount of concession was about Rs. 9.18 lakhs. During 1965-66, 22,449 pupils got the benefit of this scheme and the amount of concession rose to Rs. 22.21 lakhs.

9. TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION.

TABLE 9.1 : This table gives the length of Railway route in the Ahmednagar district. There is only one line viz. Dhond-Manmad of the Central Railway, passing through this district. Its length is 174 km. It is broad gauge single line, with 19 Stations in the District.

TABLE 9.2(A) : In this table length of Roads excepting Municipal roads, is given according to category & surface classification. Total length of roads which stood at 3,026 km. at the end of 1960-61 had increased by 524 km. to 3550 km. as on 31-3-66. Out of this, 61 belong to the category of National Highway viz. Poona-Nasik road, which passes through Sangamner taluka. Total of length of cement concrete, black topped and water bound macadam roads was 1834 km. i.e. 51 percent of the total length. Length of Rural roads had increased from 449 km. in 1960-61 to 868 during 1965-66.

TABLE 9.2 (B) : This table indicates information about Municipal roads. There are 4 Municipal towns and one cantonment board in the district. Ahmednagar Municipal area had length of 28.98 km. which was unaltered during the five year period 1961-1966. Length of roads in cantonment area was also unchanged at 6.06 km. An increase of 4.40 km. was registered in the lengths of roads in the other Municipal areas viz. Kopergaon, Sangamner & Shrirampur, together. Although there was not any Significant increase in road length, there was improvement in respect of the surface of roads. Length of black topped roads which stood at 24.77 km. as on 31-3-61 for all Municipalities together, increased to 42.04 km. at the end of 31-3-1966.

TABLE 9.3 : Gives details about Motor vehicles in operation in Poona Region, which consists of districts of Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara, Sangli, Sholapur and Kolhapur district. Districtwise figures are not maintained by the Regional Transport Officer. As on 31-3-1961 there were tractors registered but by 31-3-1966, 1115 tractors⁷⁵ had been registered. As on 31-3-66, Shrirampur taluka only was added to the division. During the five year period, 57 vehicles were added to the fleet of the Division. Average daily earnings increased from Rs. 21,795 to Rs. 41,980. Average earning for vehicle also increased from Rs. 272.98 during 1960-61 to Rs. 292.44 during 1965-66. Road transport is more popular in this district since there are only 6 trains on the route, Railway passing from Dhond to Manmad and they are irregular.

TABLE 9.5 : This table gives information regarding traffic census held in May 1965 on different roads in the district. On the National Highway viz. Poona Nasik Road the census was held at Bota, Pimpalgaon and Sangamner in this district. Traffic intensity was found to be maximum at Mile No. 87/ near Sangamner where total average of 2021 vehicles were counted per day and total traffic intensity per 24 hours in tons was 7824 . Other roads on which census was held included Gholi-Manjlegaon Road-State Highway No. 10, Malegaon, Ahmednagar Palas Road-State Highway No. 14, Poona Ahmednagar Jalgaon Road, State Highway No. 27 and Madhe Wadgaon Phir Gangakhed Road State Highway No. 31. Amongst all these roads maximum intensity was found at Shirampur on State Highway No. 10. Which was 6710 tons per 24 hours.

TABLE 9.6 : Gives regarding Post Telegraph and Telephones in the district. No. of Post Offices had increased from 365 in 1961-62 to 433 in 1965-66, But during 1965-66 some branch post offices were closed since they were running beyond permissible loss. Increase in the number of telephones was very significant. It had jumped from 429 in 1961-62, by 660 to 1089 at the end of 31-3-1966.

TABLE 9.7 : This table represents data regarding availability of postal facilities in various villa -

villages. It is found that about 30 percent villages had post offices in the village itself, 22 percent villages had to go a distance of 3 km. for post office, 22 percent villages had an office at a distance ranging from 3 to 6 km. About 26 percent villages did not have post office within an area of 6 Km.

TABLE 9.8 : In this table data regarding Rural Broadcasting is incorporated. During the year 1965-66, 149 new villages had been provided with radio sets by the Rural Broad-casting development department, and thus the total number of such villages was increased to 706 out of total of 1318. The number of Radio farm forums, however, was very low at 130 at the end of 31-3-1966. Villages are expected to form such forums in every village, having a radio and hold discussion on the useful programmes broadcasted.

TABLE 10.2 : This table gives taluka wise details about Income and Expenditure of Village Panchayats. Total income during 1965-66 of all Panchayats was Rs. 72.27 lakhs while the expenditure amounted to Rs. 65.87 lakhs. Taxes and fees together accounted for Rs. 17.83 lakhs which comes to 25 percent of the total income. Amount of receipt as grant was Rs. 42.49 lakhs or 59 per-cent of the total income. On the expenditure side Lincoln's share of expenditure was on account of Public works the amount being Rs. 29.09 lakhs i.e. 44 percent of total expenditure. Expenditure on administration was Rs. 11.45 lakhs which works out to 17 percent.

TABLE 10.3 : In part A of this table Headwise receipts of Zilla Parishad are given while in part B Head-wise expenditure figures are presented. Total income of the Zilla Parishad was Rs. 1016.92 lakhs in 1965-66, as compared to the figure of Rs. 739.70 lakhs during 1964-65. Revenue receipts, however, amounted to only Rs. 393.85 lakhs during 1965-66. Out of this, self raised resources accounted for 11 percent, while remaining amount of Rs. 350.53 lakhs was received from Govt. as grants. Total expenditure had increased from Rs. 739.70 lakhs in 1964-65 to Rs. 1016.92 lakhs in 1965-66. Total revenue expenditure during 1965-66 was Rs. 330.09 lakhs. Bulk of the expenditure was on Education...

The amount of expenditure on Education was Rs. 141.03 lakhs. This works out to 38 percent of total expenditure.

TABLE 10.4 : There are four Municipalities and 1 cantonment board in this district. Total income of all these Local bodies together was Rs. 57.89 lakhs during 1961-62 while in 1965-66, it had gone up to Rs. 87.81 lakhs. Percentage composition of the Income is given below :-

Expenditure of the Municipalities increased from Rs. 57.11 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs. 77.77 lakhs during 1965-66. Out of the expenditure during 1965-66, an amount of Rs. 3.01 lakhs (4%) was spent on Administration, Rs. 5.39 lakhs (7%) for collection of taxes, Rs. 41.57 lakhs (53%) on Public Health Rs. 7.65 lakhs (10%) on Public works and Rs. 3.78 lakhs (11%) was spent on Public Institution.

TABLE 11.3 : This table gives information regarding the C.D. programme in the district as on 31-3-1966.

Out of the total number of blocks of 23.00 C.P.A. size, 12 were in stage I, 6 in stage II and 3 in stage III. Remaining 2 were T.D. Blocks viz. Rajur and Waki blocks, carried out of Akola C.D. Block. All the 1323 villages and 1 small town viz. Waki with population of 6,895 were covered by the C.D. programme. Total population covered by the programme was 15,95,549 as per 1961 census.

TABLE 11.4 : In this table figures ^{of} expenditure ^{incurred} during various stages by different blocks are presented. Funds granted to a block are Rs. 12.00 lakh per C.P.A. size in stage I and Rs. 5.00 lakhs in Stage II.

12. PRICES.

TABLE 12.1 : In this table average retail prices of selected commodities prevailing at Ahmednagar during 1964 and 1965 are given. As stated in the note below the table, the prices have been collected from only one selected shop in the City and hence the prices quoted cannot be taken as representative. This data is given only as an indicator of price trend.

We find from the table that rice was available in market only upto November-1964. Wheat (Medium) which was sold at Rs. 0.70 per kilo in January-64 had increased to Rs. 1.50 in December-65. Jowar was not available in market during 1965. Price of Bajri averaged at Rs. 0.66 per kilo during 64 and Rs. 0.97 during 1965. Among pulses also large variations were observed in prices for 1964 & 1965. Average prices of Gram dal were Rs. 1.00 and Rs. 1.61, Tur dal Rs. 1.22 and Rs. 1.30, Mung dal Rs. 1.24 and Rs. 1.31 and Urid dal Rs. 1.10 and Rs. 1.15 per Kilo during 1964 & 1965 respectively. Prices

of Gur had however declined from Rs. 3.08 per Kilo in 1966 to Rs. 0.78 in 1965. Price of Groundnut oil had increased by 46 paise per kilo from Rs. 2.50 in 1964 to Rs. 2.96 in 1965.

TABLE 12.2 : This table gives operations of Regulated Markets in the district during 1961-62 and 1965-66. During 1965-66 there were 10 Agricultural Produce Market Committees in the district. Commodity wise arrivals and their value are shown in respect of each Market in the table. During 1961-62 arrivals of Jowar were 41,440 tonnes but during 1965-66 it was only 8,349 which was due to the scheme of Monopoly procurement implemented by Govt. Arrivals of Bajri were 6,027 tonnes and 11,412 tonnes respectively during 1961-62 and 1965-66. Although some increase was due to opening of new Market yards, some increase could be due to more awareness amongst the cultivators, that they get better deal in the Regulated Market than elsewhere.

TABLE 12.3 : In this table consumer Price Index Nos. in Poona and Sholapur Cities are given since such an index is not being computed for Ahmednagar. It is expected that these will show general trend in prices in Ahmednagar also. In case of Poona Centre the index with 1961 prices as base had steadily increased from 131 in June 1965 to 138 in December-65. Only clothing had shown some decrease in August &

and October- November. In case of Sholapur Centre, (base 1927-28) the Index increased from 299 in 1949 to 490 in September-1965 which shows great increase in prices of all commodities. Food articles registered an increase of 248 points while House Rent Index rose from 107 to 219. Clothing articles went up from 316 to 419. In case of Fuel and Lighting, however, a slight decrease was witnessed from 408 in 1949 to 400ⁱⁿ September-1965. With effect from October-1965, 1960 prices have been used as base.

13. MISCELLANEOUS.

TABLE 13.1 : This table gives information in respect of Police Force and Crime statistics. It is significant to notice that during the period 1961-1965, the strength of Police force was stationary at 1093 of which 1034 were permanent and 59 were temporary. During 1961 number of cognisable and non-cognisable crimes reported were 4185 & 9231 respectively. During 1965 the corresponding figures were 1829 and 5726 respectively.

TABLE 13.2 : This table gives data regarding work disposed by Civil and Criminal courts in the district during 1961 & 1965. The respective number of cases decided was 21,451 & 15,811.

TABLE 13.3 : Deals with Cinema Statistics in the district, during 1964-65 and 1965-66. During these two years the number of permanent theatres stood at 17 while number of touring theatres increased by 1 to 6. Seating capacity at the end of 1965-66 was 8,150 in permanent theatres and 3500 in temporary ones.

TABLE 13.4 : In this table information about banking Offices is given. It is seen that at the end of 1965-66 only 34 towns and villages in the district were served by 51 cooperative and 17 scheduled Banks. The percentage of population of these towns and villages to total was about 21.

TABLE 13.5 : This table gives data about Joint stock companies at the end of 1961-62 and 1964-65. It is found that during this period there was increase of 2 Public limited by shares and 5 Private companies limited by shares.

TABLE 13.6 : This table deals with Life Insurance statistics. During 1964-65, 5,377 policies for Rs. 212.20 lakhs were issued. While during ¹⁹⁶⁵⁻⁶⁶ the figures were 5214 and 226,40 lakhs respectively.

TABLE 13.7 : Gives data regarding Small Savings collected in the district. During 1964-65, the district was given target of Rs. 37.00 lakhs...

Collection amounted to Rs. 174.80 lakhs but due to bad agricultural season there was heavy withdrawals of the order of Rs. 198.63 lakhs and hence the district had poor record of net collection of Rs. (-) 23.83 lakhs. During 1965-66 the target was reduced to Rs. 25.00 lakhs and net collections were Rs. (+) 14.96 lakhs.

TABLE 13.8 : This table gives talukawise details of land Revenue collections during 1961-62 and 1965-66. During this period the total demand had increased from Rs. 24.25 lakhs to Rs. 38.13 lakh and whole amount was collected in both the years. Following table gives percentage of demand in each taluka, to total demand for the district during 1965-66.

For this election, there were 877 polling stations. Out of the total Voters 4,61,154 i.e. 63.00 percent voted in the Assembly elections while 4,60,280 i.e. 60.5 percent voted in Parliamentary elections.

CHAPTER -3

ANALYTIC REVIEW OF AHMEDNAGAR DISTRICT & SECTORIAL TRENDS.

In this chapter comparative position of various talukas in the district and various districts in the Poona Division in respect of various achievements, based on different indicators is described. This will indicate the extent to which different talukas are developed in relation to one another, and also the position of development in the district as compared to the others in the Division.

1. AGRICULTURE

Agriculture occupies the most important position in the economy of our country since vast majority of our population is engaged in agriculture. Even so, unfortunately our agricultural practices are not yet developed to the desired level and we have to depend on the other countries for our need of foodgrains. Maharashtra State is also known as a deficit State in respect of production of foodgrains. Taking more than one crop, Irrigation & inputs like manures & chemical fertilisers, seed treatments and pesticides can increase the production many folds.

Even in absence of irrigation, if two or three crops are taken during the year the desired object of increase in agricultural production will be achieved to some extent. Of course this will depend upon the type of soil, rainfall, climate etc. From...

this point of view an indicator of Percentage of gross sown area to net sown area will be useful for comparing different regions. Table No. 3.3 gives such percentages for different districts in the Division for the years 1960-61 and 1964-65

Thus we find that only in case of Ahmednagar District this percentage has increased from 105 in 1960-61 to 106 in 1964-65. What has been stated above about the crop pattern under irrigation, holds good here also. In Poona and Satara the percentages were highest each being 107 while in case of Kolhapur district it was only 102.

As for the irrigation, it may be stated that gross irrigated area in the district which stood at only 92,800 hectares at the end of 1950-51, had increased by 78% to 1,65,400 hectares in 1961-62 &

(CONTD)...

further to 1,71,400 hectares in 1964-65. In 1961-62, the percentage of gross irrigated area to net area sown in Ahmednagar district was 13 percent and in this respect, the district held 4th position in the whole State, below Bhandara (32), Chanda (15) and Satara (14).

Even if irrigation in an area is not very extensive, increase in production can be achieved, to a limited extent depending upon the quantity of water available, by taking two or three crops with available irrigation. Thus attempts must be made to increase the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area. Table No. 3.1 given these percentages for two years 1960-61 & 1964-65 for the districts in the division and the percentages of net irrigated area to net area sown.

From the figures in table No. 301 we find that the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in Ahmednagar district had increased from 11 in 1960-61 to 12 in 1964-65. In this respect this district held the 1st position in the division jointly with Satara, Sholapur and Kolhapur closely followed with the percentages of 11 and 10 respectively while - Poona (8) and Sangli (7) lagged behind.

Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in Ahmednagar district decreased from 114 at the end of 1960-61 to 113 at the end of 1964-65. This was the solitary instance in the division where the percentage has gone during the period stated above. In all other districts the percentage had registered increase the largest being increase of Poona district (from 115 to 137) It is interesting to note that in Ahmednagar district, though the percentage of net area sown has increased during the period 1960-61 to 1964-65, the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area has actually decreased. This could be partly on account of insufficient water available, so that only one irrigated crop is taken through out the year and partly due to the increased area under the perennial crops. Thus, if instead of taking 2 or 3 different crops of short duration during a year, perennial crops like Sugar-cane are taken, the gross area under irrigation will be comparatively less.

Table No. 3.2 gives talukawise figures of Percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown and percentage of Gross Irrigated area to net irrigated area during 1964-65,

Figures in the table 3.2 reflect that Shrirampur taluka had maximum percentage viz. 39, of net area irrigated to net area sown, Kopergaon & Rahuri had the percentages of 37 and 18 respectively. Kopergaon taluka is irrigated by means of Gangapur Dam in Nasik District while Shrirampur & Rahuri talukas are irrigated by Bhandardara Dam on river Pravara.

(CONTD)...

Akola taluka which is hilly had the percentage of only 1. Western part of this taluka is covered with forest and rainfall is considerable.

As already made clear above, percentage of Gross irrigated area to net irrigated depends mainly on the crop pattern of a particular area. Thus although Shrirampur and Kopargaon talukas had large areas under irrigation, percentage of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated in these talukas was only 103 and 106 respectively. On the other hand Parner and Akola talukas which had comparatively smaller areas under irrigation, had large percentages of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area of 147 and 128 respectively. It will be relevant to state here that percentages of area under Sugarcane (Which is an important perennial crop) to gross area irrigated for Shrirampur, Kopargaon and Parner talukas were 58, 34 and 0.4 respectively.

CROP PATTERN : Table No. 3.4 shows the change in crop pattern of different talukas in 1961-62 and 1964-65.

In columns 3 and 4 of the table 3.4 whole area under crop i.e. irrigated and dry, is considered while for columns 5 and 6, only irrigated area is considered. Figures in the table are percentages of area under food grains i.e. Cereals and pulses only.

By subtracting these figures from 100, we will get percentages of areas under other crops, amongst which Sugarcane, Cotton and Groundnut are prominent.

Considering first the crop pattern in total area (dry and irrigated) it is found the district average of area under foodgrains has moved from 81 percent in 1961-62 to 82 percent in 1964-65...

(CONTD)...

which is not much significant change. The significant change in the crop pattern has taken place in Shrivgaon taluka wherein, percentage of land under foodgrains has gone up from 78 in 1961-62 to 83 in 1964-65. This had happened mainly due to increase of area under Rabi Jowar from 44,558 hectares in 1961-62 to 48,880 in 1964-65 and decrease in area under cotton which has gone down from 13,548 in 1961-62 to 8943 in 1964-65. In case of irrigated talukas of Kopergaon the percentages of areas under foodgrains had decreased from 75 to 73 during the period 1961-62 to 1964-65. It is found that place of foodgrains has been taken by Cotton, area under the crop having gone up from 1822 to 3376 hectares.

Considering the percentages of irrigated area under foodgrains, it is found that the district average has changed from 55 in 1961-62 to 56 in 1964-65, which again is not a significant change. In case of Akola taluka the percentage has decreased from 38 in 1961-62 to 32 in 1964-65, which means that cultivators have diverted irrigated area from foodgrains to cash crops. Similar diversion of irrigated areas from foodgrains to cash crops has taken place in Sangamner (45 to 35), Newasa (62 to 52), Sheogaon (75 to 72), Pathardi (65 to 57). On the other hand there are other talukas laid by Shrivampur wherein diversion has been from cash crops to foodgrains. In Shrivampur taluka the percentage of irrigated area under foodgrains was 24 in 1961-62 and 30 in 1964-65.

Productivity of Important crops:-

Productivity figures in Kg. per hectare of some important crops during 1964-65 in various districts of the division are given in Table 3.5.

RICE : Kolhapur which is the main Rice producing district of the division, had average yield of 951 Kg/Hectare.

Poona district had an average yield of 965 while Ahmednagar district topped with an average of 1024. Ahmednagar district however produced little quantity of Rice, the crop being mainly limited to Akola taluka.

JOWAR : Jowar is the most important crop of the division and it accounted for about 69 percent of ...

the production of cereals during 1964-65. Ahmednagar district accounted for about 25 percent of the production in the division while Sholapur produced 30 percent of total Jowar production. Average yield of Jowar was 1326 Kg/hectare in Kolhapur district, 786 Kg./hectare in Sangli district 576 Kg./Hectare in 463 and Kg/hectare in Ahmednagar.

WHEAT. : Ahmednagar produced major portion of Wheat produced in the division during 1964-65. It accounted for 29 percent of total production, while Sholapur district produced 22 percent. But yield rate was highest in Satara district, which produced at the rate of 700 Kg/hectare. All the districts in the Poona division had better yields per hectare than the average of 421 Kg. in Ahmednagar.

BAJRI. : In case of Bajri also, Ahmednagar was one of the major producer in the division and produced about 32 percent of the divisional total. Poona district produced 33 percent. As far as per hectare yield is concerned Poona had better production of 318 Kg. as compared to Satara's 244 Kg./Hectares and Ahmednagar's 179 Kg/Hectare. These three district stood first, second and third respectively in the matter of yield rates.

SUGARCANE : This is one of the important crops of the division since the Division Accounts for, for about 82 percent production of the whole State...

Sugarcane is the basic material of Sugar factories which have gone a long way in improving the lot of cultivators. Ahmednagar (37 percent), Kolhapur (28 percent) and Poona (11 percent), districts together accounted for 76 percent of the Sugarcane production in the division in 1964-65. In fact this is the crop which changed the economic face of the Northern part of Ahmednagar District. In Ahmednagar District the yield rate was 11,198 Kg/hectares (in terms of Gur) Second highest yield was obtained in Poona district and it was 3,068 Kg/hectare. This shows the extent to which Sugarcane Cultivators in Ahmednagar district have progressed.

COTTON : Yield of Cotton was highest in the division in Sangli district and it was 276 bales per hectare. In Satara it was 209 bales/hectare and in Sholapur 185 bales/hectare. Yield in Ahmednagar was 121 bales per hectare, which was a poor record.

GROUNDNUT : Satara and Sangli were the major Groundnut producing districts in the division. Satara produce 28 percent of the divisional total while Sangli produce 20 percent during 1964-65. Ahmednagar produce only 7 percent of the product. In the matter of per hectare yield, Satara and Kolhapur districts were on the fore-front with the averages of 1,213 Kg. per hectare and 940 Kg. per hectare respectively. In Ahmednagar district the average was only 639 Kg. per hectare which was lowest in the division.

Per capita (Rural population) Gross Value of Agricultural Output :

Table No. 3.6 given figures of per capita gross value of agricultural output in various districts in Poona division during 1959-60, 1960-61 & 1961-62.

It is seen from the table that Ahmednagar district has got the largest values in all the three years. As a matter of fact, Ahmednagar district had got the first ranking in this respect in whole of Maharashtra. This was due to the cultivation of cash crops especially Sugarcane to a large extent.

AGRICULTURAL CREDIT.

Table No. 3.7 gives figures of short term loans disbursed by various Agricultural Credit Societies in different talukas during 1961-62 and 1965-66.

During the year 1961-62 all the agricultural credit societies together had given short term loans to the tune of Rs. 513.66 lakh while during 1965-66 the amount had gone up by 33 percent. Percentage of increase of credit granted during 1965-66 over the grant during 1961-62 was found to be highest in Karjat taluka viz. 157 percent. In Jamkhed, Pathardi and Sheogaon talukas also it was more than 100. In Kopergaon taluka, however, the percentage was the lowest viz. 4 percent. During 1965-66, the highest amount of advance was granted in Kopergaon taluka, the amount being Rs. 190.71 lakhs. The amount of loans granted in

in Shrirampur (%. 164.16) and Rahuri (%. 91.98 lakhs) talukas also the amounts were considerable. These areas are irrigated tracts growing cash crops, mainly Sugarcane and hence there credit needs as well as capacity to borrow were much more than the cultivators in other talukas. The other extreme in Jamkhed, Shrigonda, Parner and Akola talukas, the credits granted during 1965-66 were only Rs. 13.31 lakhs, Rs. 15.15 lakhs, Rs. 16.15 lakhs and Rs. 16.43 lakhs respectively. Table No.3.8 presents districtwise position of Number of Agricultural credit societies in different districts of the Poona Division in 1965-66 and their operations.

The figures in above table clearly bring out the important position of Ahmednagar District in the Cooperative movement of the Division. The district has Ist rank in the matter of number of societies, IInd in the matter

of membership, 1st in the matter of total finance granted and 1st again in respect of loans granted per member. Finance per member is an important indicator for it brings out in condensed form the development achieved in a particular region. Kolhapur District stands second in this respect with per member finance of Rs. 314, as against Rs. 390 in Ahmednagar District. Sangli District was only a trifle behind with the amount of Rs. 312 per member. Remaining three districts had smaller figures than divisional average of Rs. 266. In the matter of membership, Kolhapur had 1st rank with membership of 1.94 lakhs and Ahmednagar 2nd with 1.76 lakh membership.

LIVESTOCK:- Possession of Livestock is a good asset to the rural people. Bullocks and he-buffaloes are useful for agricultural operation while cows, she-buffaloes and goats provide milk. Sheep provide wool and are useful for earning side income. Dairy industry is a good subsidiary occupation which a cultivator can pursue with little additional investment.

Table No. 3.9 gives talukawise details of livestock as per the census held in 1966.

From Table No. 3.9 we find that total livestock in the district was about 18.10 lakhs. Out of this 2.77 lakhs was located in Parner, 2.04 lakhs in Sanganner and 1.50 lakhs in Ahmednagar taluka. In 1966 these talukas held 1st, 2nd and 4th position. So it can be said that location of livestock was to some extent proportional to area. Shrirampur and Jamkhed talukas has 96,000 and 71,000 number of livestock. These two talukas were the two smallest talukas in the district.

Out of the total livestock, 4,28,372 were bullocks, used for agricultural work. In columns No. 5 of the table no. of bullocks per 10 hectares of gross cultivated area are given. This will give some idea about the availability of bullock power for agricultural work. Average for the district as a whole works out to 3 bullocks per 10 hectares. In Parner, Sanganner and Kopergaon talukas, this no. was 6, 5, and 4 respectively. In Shrirampur and Rahuri taluka the no. of bullocks per 10 hectares of land was 3. But in these talukas, there were 81 tractors and 4,697 oil

engines, and 31 tractors and 3,031 oil engines respectively, which substitute the bullocks, and hence position in these talukas can be also said to be satisfactory.

Kopergaon taluka had also got 117 tractors and 5,296 oil engines.

POULTRY:- Poultry is another industry which can provide additional income to a farmer with only some additional investment. It also provides food which is an important point for our country which is short of foodgrains. Table No. 3.10 gives talukawise position of poultry as per 1966 census:-

Column 3 of the table No. 3.10 gives total poultry located in the District while column 4 gives poultry per 1000 human population. In Parner taluka maximum no. of poultry birds viz. 96000 were located, followed by Sanganner (79,000), Ahmednagar (73,000), Shrigonda (65,000), and Karjat (64,000). Poultry per 1000 of human population will indicate how far people have taken to poultry industry to supplement their income. In this respect also Parner had first rank with number 732. Other important talukas were Karjat (646), Shrigonda (550), Sanganner (478), and Akola (475) in that order.

ELECTRICITY:- Ahmednagar District is backward as far as consumption of electricity is concerned. This district is situated at a very long distance from Kalyan, Paras or Khaparkheda Power stations and hence there was considerable delay in supply of power. During 1964-65 the consumption of electricity was of the order of 63,80,000 K.W.H. while during 1965-66, it had gone up by 4 percent to 66,63,000 K.W.H. This works out to 3.6 K.W.H. per capita in 1964-65 and 3.8 K.W.H. per capita in 1965-66, which is very poor by any standard. (Consumption by Sugar factories and other industries which had their own generators is not considered here.)

Table No. 3.11 gives districtwise position of per capita consumption of electricity during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66.

It is observed that the average per capita consumption of electricity in the division has gone up from 17.98 K.W.H. in 1961-62 to 43.04 K.W.H. in 1965-66. Maximum increase during the 4 years period is in Puna

District where it has gone up by 45.07 K.W.H. per head. Poor progress achieved in Ahmednagar is reflected from the fact that during the 4 years period, the consumption has gone up by only 1.04 K.W.H. as compared to the divisional average increase of 25.06 K.W.H.

One word of caution is necessary in incorporating the figures in Table No. 3.11. Figures of both years 1961-62 and 1965-66 were computed on the basis of population as per 1961 census and hence the figures of increase in per capita consumption are clearly overestimates since no cognisance is taken of increase in population. Nevertheless the figures can be used for making comparison among various districts.

Employment exchange statistics:- All unemployed persons do not register themselves at the exchange and hence number registered at the exchange does not itself indicate the number of unemployed. Also especially in rural areas many persons are employed only part-time i.e. they are ^{under} employed

and would go in for other jobs if they are available. Estimate of such persons is also not available. Statistics of employment exchange must be used or interpreted with these limitations in view.

Table No. 3.12 gives important statistics of employment exchanges in different districts of Poona Division for the years 1964-65.

Employment exchanges generally give employment to literate and educated persons mostly in Government and Quasi-Government offices. Mainly persons in urban areas only register with the exchanges. Persons on live register is thus only indicative of such unemployed persons. Poona and Sholapur cities where exchanges are situated are big cities and hence number on their live register was considerably large. Since many offices and factories are situated in these places, placements by Poona and Sholapur exchanges are also high. But proportion of

placement to live register is high in Nagar(26.6 %) and Satara (25.1 %) districts.

EDUCATION:- Table No. 3.13 shows districtwise number of pupils in all schools (pre-primary, primary and secondary) during 1961-62 and 1965-66 .

During 1965-66, in the whole division about 13.08 lakh boys and 7.16 lakh girls attended school i.e. the total of pupils attending school was 20.24 lakhs. This shows that proportion of girls was far low than boys. In Poona district 3.20 lakh boys and 1.95 lakh girls attended school. Poona district had maximum population of about 25 lakhs in the division. In addition population of urban areas is also large and hence it is natural expect large number of boys and girls from this district attending school. Sholapur district was the next highest with 2.15 lakh boys and 1.16 lakh girls attending school. Total population of Sholapur district (about 19 lakh) was second highest

in the division). Figures in Column 7 and 8 of the table shows percentage increase in the number of pupils during 1961-62 to 1965-66. During this period, maximum increase in pupils was witnessed in Ahmednagar District. The percentage increase in boys was 29 and in girls it was 40. In Poona District also the increase was impressive viz. 23 percent. for both boys and girls. It is significant to note that percentage increase (24) in the girls in division as a whole was more than corresponding percentage for boys viz. 20. This shows that people are now increasing getting aware of the need to educate their daughters also.

During 1965-66, Poona district accounted for 44 percent. of total boy. pupils in the division and 62 percent of girl pupils. Reason for this has been already given above. College education is more costly than school education and hence generally rural population is not able to

take it. Number of colleges in rural areas is also comparatively small and hence wherever there is large urban population, pupils going to colleges will be more. Percentage increase in girl-pupils in Satara (222 percent) Ahmednagar (170), Sangli (140), and Sholapur (137) is considerably large. This is on account of the fact that in 1961-62, number of girl-pupils was very small but now large number of girls are attending college.

ROADS:-

It has been rightly said that roads are arteries of nation. With increase in length of roads and improvement in the surface of existing roads, cultivators can take their produce to a centre where they will get fair price. Trade will also increase and will lead to economic progress.

Table No. 3.15 gives the length of roads (all categories) in each district of Poona division at the end of 1964-65 and length of roads per 100 Square Kilometers.

Length of roads in Poona District was 4,093 Km. and that in Ahmednagar was 3,638 Km. In the Division, Kolhapur district had smallest length of 2,088 and held last rank in this respect. In case of Railway, Sholapur with a length of 451 km. held the first rank while Poona had second rank with the length of 293 km. In respect of Railway also Kolhapur District was comparatively backward and held last rank with length of only 38 km.

While making comparison between various districts it is also necessary to consider their areas. Hence length of roads and railway is calculated per 100 Sq.Km. area and presented in columns 5 and 6 respectively. We find that Sangli had largest ratio of 39.4 Km. per 100 Sq.Km. and

and Sholapur the smallest viz. 20.9. Ahmednagar District held 5th rank. In case of Railways, Sholapur District with a length of 2.9 km. per 100 sq.km. area had 1st rank while Kolhapur District had a meagre ratio of 0.4 km. In this respect also Ahmednagar District held 5th position in the Division.

BANKING FACILITIES:-

In Ahmednagar District at the end of 1962-63, there were 46 banking offices. This number gradually increased to 53 in 1963-64, 61 in 1964-65 and 68 in 1965-66. In 1965-66 the population covered by banking offices was 3,67,171 i.e. 21 percent of total.

Table No. 3.16 gives districtwise number of banking offices in the Poona Division at the end of 1965-66.

As table No. 3.16 indicates at the end of 1965-66 there were 466 Banking offices in the Poona Division. Poona District had maximum number of 139 offices followed by Kolhapur (76), Sholapur (72), and Ahmednagar (61).

In the matter of coverage places, Poona had 1st rank with 38 places and Ahmednagar had 2nd rank with 31 places covered by banks.

PRICES:-

The work of collection of weekly retail prices at Ahmednagar was started from November 1962. In the following lines review of difference in prices between the periods November 1962 and November 1965 is taken. Since prices of the same months are considered seasonal fluctuations will be omitted.

Rice (medium) which was sold at 0.70 paise per kilo in 1962, was not available in local market in 1965 due to Government restrictions. Bakshi wheat was quoted at Rs. 0.65 per kilo in 1962 but in 1965, its prices had gone up by 92 percent, to Rs. 1.25 per kilo. Price of Jowar was Rs. 0.55 per kilo in 1962 and in 1965 due to the Monopoly procurement and sale by Government it was not available in shops. Prices of Bajri increased from Rs. 0.51 per kilo to Rs. 1.10 per kilo.

Gram and Tur are the two important pulses which find place in the daily food of a common man. Their prices rose from Rs. 0.60 to Rs. 1.62 per kilo and from Rs. 0.87 to Rs. 1.25 per kilo during the 3 year period 1962 - 1965. Main reason for this big increase was ban on free import of pulses from other states.

In prices of Gur there was a small decrease of 2 paise per kilo from Rs. 0.77 to Rs. 0.75 per kilo. Sugar was controlled and prices were Rs. 1.09 per kilo in 1962 and Rs. 1.24 per kilo in 1965.

Groundnut oil prices underwent lot of fluctuations. In 1962 its price was Rs. 2.08 per kilo but in 1965 it had gained 1.70 per kilo and reached Rs. 3.78 per kilo. Similarly prices of Vanaspati increased from Rs. 3.47 to Rs. 4.49 per kilo, due to shortage of the commodity.

Prices of dry chillies decreased from Rs. 3.12 per kilo to Rs. 2.75 during the period 1962-1965. Prices of Kerosene, however, increased sharply from Rs. 0.32 to Rs. 0.50 per litre, due to additional taxes.

Under clothing, prices of Dhoti and Sari which were Rs. 10.53 and Rs. 17.50 per pair respectively rose to Rs. 10.88 and Rs. 19.00 respectively. Prices of Shirting also went up from Rs. 1.19 per metre in 1962 to Rs. 1.40 per metre in 1965. Similarly prices of Blouse piece increased from Rs. 1.25 to Rs. 1.50 per metre.

Among other commodities, prices of brass registered sharp increase from Rs. 6.63 per kilo in 1962 to Rs. 11.00 per kilo i.e. increase of about 65 percent. Prices of Washing soap (501 Bar) went up from Rs. 1.50 to Rs. 1.75.

CHAPTER - 4

Achievements under the Third Plan

4.1 All the plan schemes under-taken during the III plan were classified into three categories viz. (1) State Level (2) Divisional Level and (3) District Level, according to the areas benefited by the Scheme. Progress of District Level Plan Schemes in Ahmednagar District is described below :

4.2 In order to accelerate the pace of progress of development the principle of decentralisation of powers was accepted and Zilla Parishads were established from May-1962. Some of the plan schemes were then transferred to Zilla Parishads for implementation in Local Sector while other schemes were implemented by the officers of various Departments in State Sector. Statement showing sub-headwise expenditure during the plan period separately for State Sector and Local Sector is included in Table No. 11.1 of the District Statistical Abstract Table No. 4. It gives the overall picture of expenditure incurred during the five-year period 1961-62 to 1965-66.

4.3 Evidently lion's share of the expenditure was spent on Agricultural Programme the percentage being 48. This was on account of the fact that 80% of the workers depended on Agriculture for their living. In order to improve their lot and also to increase the agricultural production it was necessary to spend substantial amount. 25 percent of the total expenditure was incurred on Cooperation and Community Development. Most of the schemes under ... (C

which are also closely linked with Agriculture. Industry and Mining accounted for a small expenditure of only Rs. 10.29 over the whole Plan period since there few schemes at the district level. Headwise review of progress is taken in the following paragraphs.

4.4 Agricultural Programme.

Agricultural economy of Ahmednagar district is very heterogeneous. On the one hand an average cultivator from dry southern part (viz. Parner, Karjat, Shrigonda etc) has to strive very hard just to earn his livelihood whereas his counterpart in Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri Talukas, can earn handsome return from his irrigated land. Although need for increase in production of foodgrains is of paramount importance, cash crops also play their role by provi-

providing raw material to Industries and by substantially contributing to National Income, Thus the Agricultural Plan schemes must cater to the needs of both these categories of cultivators Expenditure on various sub-Heads is reflected in the following table :

4.5 As reflected by the figures the programme of soil Conservation has been given great importance amongst all the schemes. This programme is expected to play a vital role in agricultural development of Ahmednagar district since most of the talukas are known as scarcity areas, and with bunding it is possible to conserve the moisture from scarcity rains & arrest erosion of Soil. Sub-headwise details of progress are given under.

4.6 Agricultural Production : Under this sub-head schemes which were expected to directly increase food-production were included. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 57.17 lakhs incurred during the Plan period, Rs. 18.32 lakhs were spent by the State Sector while the remaining schemes entailing an outlay of Rs. 38.85 lakhs were implemented by the Zilla Parishad. In an effort to increase food-production, 4570 quintals of improved seed of various food-grains was distributed to cultivators. 3890 quintals of improved cotton-seed and 50 quintals of other oilseeds were also distributed. In addition, 519 iron ploughs and 269 dry farming sets were distributed during the 5 years Plan period. Chemical fertilisers and compost are important input factors which contributed substantially to increased production. During the Plan period, following quantities of chemical fertilisers were distributed :-

During the period over 52,000 compost pits were dug and 1,31,115 tons of compost was prepared. 5,184 acres of land was covered with green manures such as 'Tag&' and 'Dhencha'.

4.7 Land Development : Under this sub-head only one scheme viz. Consolidation of Holdings was taken up in the State Sector. The expenditure of Rs. 1.68 lakhs was incurred on staff only. Although the principal underlying this scheme is sound, in practice cultivators do not relish the idea of parting with their land even in exchange of similar land of other. Difficulties were experienced in finding land of equal fertility and also in allotting compensation for trees on the boundaries of fields.

4.8 Soil Conservation : As already stated above the Soil Conservation scheme i.e., contour bunding is to play vital part in the agricultural economy of this district and hence as much as Rs. 235.92 lakh were spent on it during the Plan period. This was about 32% of the total amount spent on all the schemes in the district. During the III Plan period 4,57,000 acres of area in the district was bunded while at the end of the year 1965-66 total of 8,24,388 acres of area was bunded. The percentage of bunded area to bundable area comes to 43. Comparatively there is also much scope for terracing in this district in Akola talukas 289 acres of land was terraced during the five year period of III Plan.

4.9 Minor Irrigation : Major Irrigation Projects provide water to vast areas of land but their advantage can reach only those cultivators whose land is under the command of the project and that too after consi-

considerable time. In order to provide irrigation water to other cultivators minor irrigation works are under taken or financed. They also yield quick results. Under this sub-head irrigation and percolation-tanks were taken up in both, the State & Local sector and subsidies were granted to the cultivators for construction of irrigation wells and installation of pumping sets.

4.10 Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 55.65 lakh incurred on this sub-head, Rs. 51.78 lakhs. lakh were spent by State Sector and remaining Rs.

3.87 lakh by Local Sector. Major part of the expenditure was incurred on the schemes of grant of subsidy for construction of wells and installation of pumping sets. During the Plan period, 11,724 new wells were constructed, 1964 old ones were repaired and 6,267 pumping sets were installed. Due to various achievements additional irrigation potential of about 49,000 acres was created.

4.11 Animal Husbandry : Although quantitatively there is no dearth of cattle and buffaloes in our region the quality of animals, capacity for work and giving milk, is admittedly poor. Under this sector of development, two types of activities were undertaken. Improvement of quality of animals that may be bred in future on the one hand and looking after the health of existing animals on the other. At district level

level only one major scheme was taken up during the III Plan, under which quality bulls were located with Village Panchayats or progressive cultivators, and these were available for giving services for breeding of cows. An amount of Rs. 1.35 lakhs was spent on this scheme during the period, Veterinary dispensaries and stockmen's centres were of course existing and working in various talukas for giving veterinary aid to farmers.

4.12 Dairy Development : Dairy industry provides good subsidiary occupation for farmers and also helps in making available more milk to the Urban population. Under this scheme loans to the extent of Rs. 2,08,000 were granted for purchase of milch cattle. Assistance was also given to 20 cooperative societies for undertaking these activities.

4.13 Forest, Existence of forest not only attracts rain but also is a source of income that can be derived from various forest products. Afforestation is used as a measure for conservation of soil. As per the national forest policy 33% of forest has been prescribed. At the end of 1965-66, the percentage of area under forest to total geographical area in this district was 12. During the Plan period over 10,000 acres of land was afforested. For this an expenditure of Rs. 2.43 lakhs was incurred.

4.14 Fisheries : There is little scope for fisheries industry in Ahmednagar district. It is limited to inland water. Bhandardara lake is the only place ideal for fishing. During the Plan period above 45,000 of fingerlings of quick growing species were stocked in various waters. Fishermen were also given requisite equipment worth Rs. 166. The scheme for grant of financial assistance to fishermen did not meet with success since they could not give security for loans. Total expenditure on all fisheries schemes implemented in the district during the whole plan period amounted to Rs. 18000 only.

4.15 Warehousing & Marketing : Under this sub-head of Development there were only two schemes at district level, both of which were implemented by the District Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies in State Sector. One of the schemes aimed at providing various facilities such as roads, drinking water etc. to the Agricultural Produce Market Committees. An amount of Rs. 5.08 lakhs was spent on this scheme during the III Plan period. The other scheme provided for staff for work of Grading of various types of Agricultural produce coming to the Markets. Expenditure on this scheme was of the order of Rs. 32000/-

Cooperation and Community Development :

4.16 Under this major Head of Development two sub-head of Development viz. (1) Cooperation and (2) Community Development were included.

(Contd)...

Cooperation : Since it was realised that cooperation could provide a key to the economic prosperity especially in rural life, great stress was laid for expanding this sector. Societies were established in every walk of human life and attempts were made to make people learn the value of thrift and mutual dependence. Activities during the III Plan period are summarised below :-

4.17 During five year period of the III Plan short term loans of Rs. 26.17 crores and medium term loan of Rs. 85.10 lakhs were advanced to the farmers by the Agricultural credit Societies. On the expenditure side, total expenditure of Rs. 51.76 lakhs was booked on all the schemes together. These schemes included assistance to Agricultural credit societies, Central Cooperative Banks and Marketing and Farming Societies. Financial help was granted for varied purposes such as for managerial staff, construction of Godowns, & Construction of cattle-sheds etc.

4.18 Community Development : The Community Development movement had been originally started to make people aware of their responsibilities in the programme of development and give them opportunity for participation in various programmes. With the advent of Zilla Parishad, rural people could have more say in the matters of development. At the end of 31-3-1966, 13 Panchayat Samitis were functioning in the district. Out of the 15 C.D.Blocks in the district two viz. Rajur and Waki were Tribal Development Blocks. Of the 15 blocks, 9 were in stage I, 4 in Stage II, and 2 in post Intensive stage i.e. stage III.

4.19 . During the five year plan period, amount of Rs. 144.95 lakhs was spent on various schemes under Community Development.

Industry and Mining.

Small Scale Industries :

4.20 Under the Major head of Development viz. Industry & Mining schemes under only one sub-head viz. Small Scale Industries were being implemented in the district at district level. Under these schemes financial assistance was given to small industries to effect change in their economic condition. Handicraft and Handloom workers benefited from these schemes. As against the plan provision of Rs. 16.57 lakhs expenditure to the tune of Rs. 10.29 lakhs was incurred on these schemes during the III Plan period.

Transport & Communication

Road Development :

4.21 Since rail connections are of very limited use to the rural population, for their economic uplift it is necessary to provide road connection from as many villages as possible to the taluka places and important markets. When roads are constructed, passenger buses are introduced and a man becomes more mobile. This helps in widening his outlook. Roads also help a farmer to transport his produce to a market where he can expect better deal than he gets from village merchants or village money-landers.

4.22 During the five-year period of III Plan 30 miles of new rural roads were constructed 87.49 Miles of roads were modernised. Two bridges one at Nowasa on the river Pravara and the other at Belapur were also constructed during the period. An expenditure of Rs. 61.83 lakhs was incurred on different schemes by State Sector and Local sector together.

Social Services :

4.23 Under this major head of development are grouped various schemes undertaken for the welfare of the people. There is no direct economic benefit from these but still they cover no less important aspect of human life. On all such schemes together an amount of Rs. 146.98 lakhs was spent of which 52% was spent by the State sector and 48% in Local sector. Sub-headwise details are given below :.

4.24 General Education : Percentage of literacy in Ahmednagar was only 26% percent in 1961 at the time of census. Unless people are literate and educated they will not understand their responsibility and also will not be able to develop themselves. In rural area it was necessary to open primary schools in each village so that pupils get at least primary education in the village only. Similarly it was necessary to construct building to house the schools. In order to improve the quality of education it was essential to train the teachers. All such schemes were included in the III Plan, and an expenditure of Rs. 60.31 lakhs was incurred on these, during the five-year period.

4.25 During the III Plan, 157 school buildings comprising of 362 class-rooms were constructed. 232 primary and 48 secondary schools were opened during this period, while 1,446 teachers were trained. Increase of 59,929 pupils was registered in primary schools and 16,899 in secondary schools.

4.26 Medical & Nursing : The existing building of the Ripen General Hospital in Ahmednagar City has become become old and inadequate. It was therefore proposed to construct a new building to house the hospital. But due to economy measures and ban on constructional works only the Out Patients' Department could be constructed during the plan period. Expenditure of Rs. 7.60 lakhs only was incurred on this sub-head as against the plan provision of Rs. 20.70 lakhs.

4.27 Public Health : Under this sub-head of development were included the schemes like construction of buildings for Primary Health Centre, Malaria Eradication, Eradication of Small Pox, Family Planning etc. As against the total provision of Rs. 31.01 lakhs - lakhs expenditure to the tune of Rs. 49.65 lakhs / was incurred on all schemes together. Out of this amount of Rs. 29.15 lakhs was spent on schemes in State Sector i.e. Malaria Eradication Programme. During the Plans period 7 Primary Health centres were started and their buildings constructed. 105 Family Planning units also were established. 16 Doctors and 72 Nurses were appointed in various dispensaries and Health centres.

4.28 Water supply & Drainage : Under this sub-head of development, schemes were taken up for construction of drinkingwater wells and piped water supply schemes. As against the provision of Rs. 2.15 lakhs expenditure of Rs. 1.23 lakhs was incurred during the plan period. 32 drinking water wells were constructed benefitting 32 villages.

4.29 Housing : These schemes were taken up to tackle the problem of increasing shortage of housing accommodation in the urban areas. Schemes for extending gaothans of villages and construction of houses in rural areas were also included in the Plan.

4.30 As against the provision of Rs. 14.11 lakhs expenditure to the tune of Rs. 20.17 lakhs was incurred on all schemes together. Bulk of the expenditure viz. Rs. 13.67 lakhs was incurred on the scheme of Subsidised Industrial Housing under which assistance was given to various Sugar Factories for construction of tenements for their workers. Assistance was also made available to Ahmednagar Municipality for construction of quarters for their employees living in slums.

4.31 During the Plan period 576 tenements were constructed under the scheme of Industrial housing, 3 under low Income group housing scheme, and 90 under the slum clearance scheme.

4.32 Social Welfare : Only one scheme was taken up under this sub-head, which was Extension welfare centres run by Central Social Welfare Board, Bombay. Expenditure of Rs. 1.30 lakhs was incurred on this as against the provision of Rs. 0.73 lakhs.

4.33 Labour & Labour Welfare : Under this sub-head of development, scheme was under taken to construct a building for the Industrial Technical Institute and to increase its capacity. As against the provision of Rs. 8.45 lakhs an amount of Rs. 7.18 lakhs was spent on this. The capacity of the Industrial training Institute, was increased by 252.
