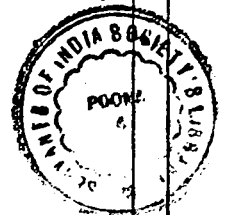

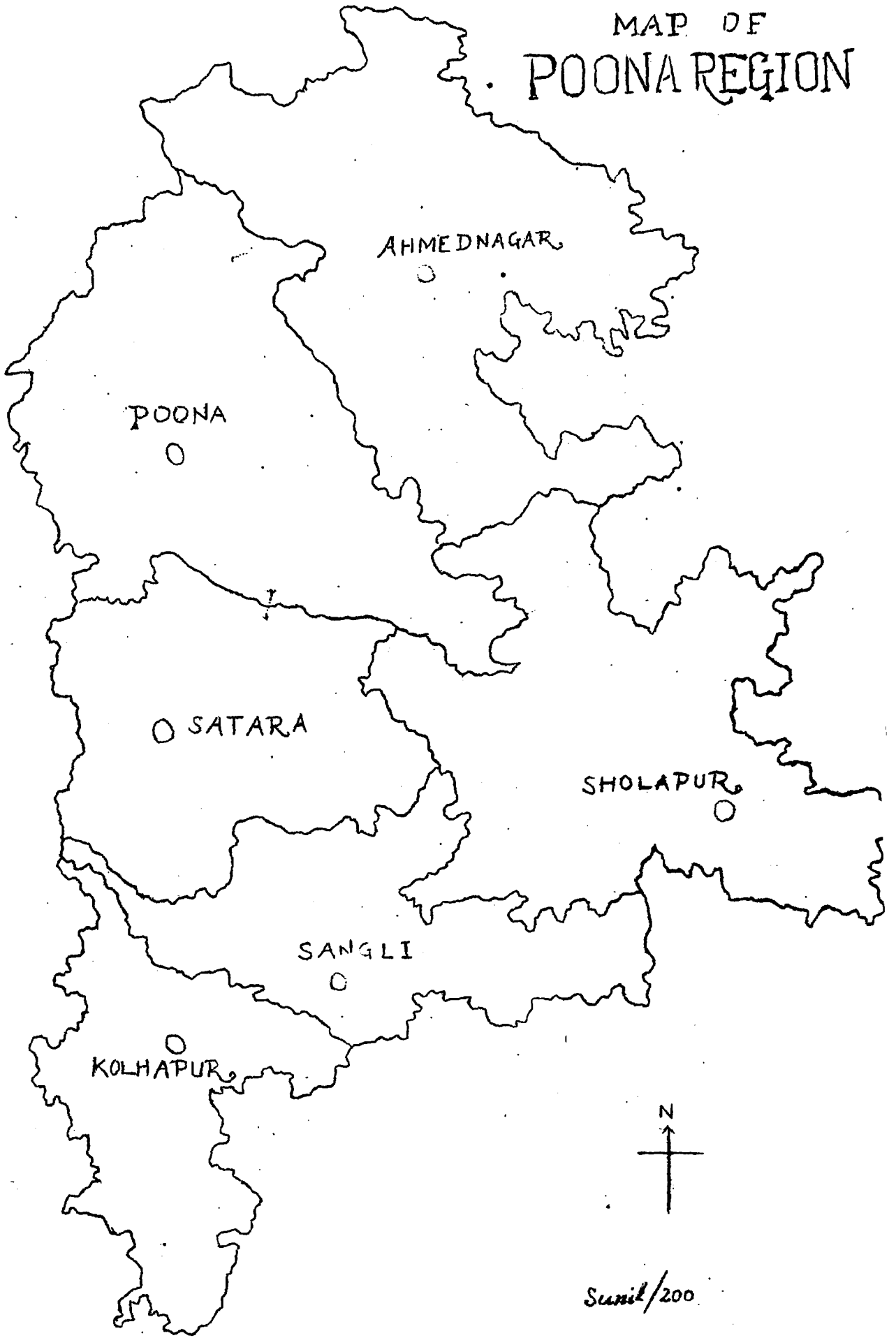

CHAPTER I
INTRODUCTION

1.1. General.

The Poona Division is composed of six districts of

- i. Ahmednagar,
- ii. P o o n a,
- iii. S a t a r a,
- iv. S a n g l i,
- v. S h o l a p u r,
- vi. K o l h a p u r.

The area of Poona Division is 74,705 sq.km.s which is about 25 per cent of the area of Maharashtra State.

The Poona Division is located between 15.6° to 20.0° North latitude and 73.2° to 76.2° East longitude.

The Poona Division is bounded on the North and West by Bombay Division, on the East by the Aurangabad Division and on the South by the Mysore State.

Since 1961 Census, the boundaries of the Constituent districts of Poona Division have not undergone any changes.

1.2 Administrative set up :

The Districts under the control of the Collectors are further divided into sub-divisions (under the control of Prant Officers/Deputy Collector) and into Talukas/Mahals under the control of Mamlatdars/Mahalkaris. The break-up is shown below :-

For administrative purposes, Miraj and Khanapur talukas were split up and two additional mahals (1) Kavathe Mahankal (Miraj) and (2) Atpadi (Khanapur) have been formed in 1964.

1.3. Historical background :

Stone age remains are found on the bank of Mutha River in Poona city area.

In the beginning of the 13th century there was kingdom of Dakshinapath, having his capital at Junnar.

In the 13th Century Muslims ruled over the major part of the Poona Division till they were dislodged by Shiwaji. Further they were fully driven out by Peshwas, in whose regime, Poona was de-facto capital of India. But the British removed Maratha Power from 1818.

The economic activity suffered to a great extent due to intermittent wars during the rules of Muslims and Peshwas. Most of the revenue collected in those times was spent on maintenance of armies.

Social life was thoroughly changed after 1818. New methods and techniques were introduced in the social life. Also Education was introduced on large scale. There was peace all over India.

Poona had a considerable contribution in the effort for Independence which was gained in 1947.

1.4. Physical Setting.

(a) Poona Division, which is geographically part of western India, constitutes of Sahyadri Ghats and an undulating plateau beyond them.

Geologically, the basal complex of Western India consists of igneous rocks, upon which rests a metamorphic series. The Poona Division falls wholly in a deep and uniform cover of the Deccan Trap.

(b) The chain of Sahyadris starts from western shoulder of the Division and traverses in the South-west upto Bor Ghat and then goes almost straight in Southern direction. The creastline is a succession of high and low plateau tops like Mahabaleshwar and Panchgani. The western flank of the ghats is a fractured edge of the plateau marked by a series of terraces; whereas the eastern flank has an entirely different topography, consisting of plateaus. There are fairly broad basins drained eastwards.

(c) Poona Division forms almost the beginning of the Godavari and Krishna systems which cover about one-third portion of Peninsular Table land. The Bhima river cuts right across the division. The rivers Bhima and Krishna have almost an equal drainage in the State, whereas the Godavari has a very small drainage comparatively. The Mahadev ranges separate the upper Krishna drainage from the Bhima basin. The Balaghat range distinguishes the Bhima Basin from that of Godavari. All the rivers in this region are graded streams and develop shallow and meandering courses outside the Sahyadrian zone. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during

dry part of the year they resume a slender course in a large bed." All other water courses in the east are markedly seasonal in their flow.

(d) Poona Division has no important minerals, except for building stones, clay sand and limestones, which are common to all the districts. Laterite is widespread in the western position of Satara district. 20 villages in Jaoli and 30 villages in Patan Talukas of Satara district contain iron ore in the murum below the laterite. The ore is of low grade and unsuitable as yet for commercial exploitation. Only Gypsum is available on large scale in Kolhapur District.

1.5. Climate

(a) Rainfall :- There is immense variation in the distribution of annual total rainfall, due to relief of the land and the direction of the rain-bearing winds. Broadly rainfall declines from the south-west to the east and the north, but relief locally modifies this tendency. On the western face of the Sahyadris, the rain is about 2,500 mm.s. This rainfall increases from the coastal region to the Sahyadris, while beyond the creastline, there is very rapid decline. Most of the rainfall in Division is received from the South-west monsoons, but later monsoons also contribute a share. Failure of rainfall is practically unknown to the western part of the Poona Division, while it is frequent experience to the eastern margin of the Poona Division. Thus Sholapur district and some easternly talukas of Ahmednagar, Satara, Poona and Sangli districts are liable to scarcity.

During 1964-65, there were sufficient rains in Sangli, Sholapur and Kolhapur districts, whereas there were conditions akin to scarcity in some villages of Ahmednagar, Poona and Satara districts.

(b) Temperature : Cold season starts normally from second part of October. There is, however, a general rise in temperature all over the Division during March. Temperature starts cooling down from June to first week of October, when it again shows a slight increase. November, however, marks onset of winter season. Altitude modifies the average summer and winter temperatures; but eastwards over the plateau higher temperatures and higher seasonal ranges are recorded. On the western and central portion of the Division, nights are cool and early mornings cooler.

(c) Humidity and annual cloudiness :

In general, humidity is less in this division as compared with the coastal regions of the Bombay Division.

Humidity

It is generally high during the monsoon season and goes down in winter. The air is dry in summer.

In cold weather season, the skies are clear, while July and August are the months of maximum clouds. The proportion of clouds is very low in April and May.

From October onwards cloudiness begins to decrease.

The Western tips of Poona, Satara and Kolhapur districts witness very heavy rainfall over 375 mm. high humidity and lower temperatures on higher slopes. Immediately after this region there is a belt of about 50 to 100 Km. in width, running straight from North to south. In this belt the rainfall varies from 1,000 to 1,750 mm. and rapidly declines eastwards. In the third part of the Division rainfall is received from south west and north-east monsoons. Winter maximum in this region goes on increasing towards the east, rainfall is also variable and hence there is greater incidence of scarcity.

(d) Soil : Most of the soil is of the type ^S medium black soil on Trap ". In the superior tracts on the banks of the rivers Krishna, Bhima, Godavari the soil is of the type " Deep Black Soil from Trap ". Red soil, where only Kharif crops like Paddy grow, is found on slopes of hills and is available in major part of Kolhapur, Western portion of Poona/Satara/Sangli districts.

(e) Geographical region :- The whole of the Division falls into what can be termed as Maharashtra Plateau. It is that portion of Deccan Table land which is bounded on the north by Satpuras, on West by the edge of the Sahyadris, on the East and South by administrative boundaries. There are the following six sub-groups on the geographical basis :-

- i. Sahyadrian Main Range : This enters Poona Division, takes a south-west turn for about 80 km. and then runs almost parallel to the coastline. Mahabaleshwar and Panchgani Plateaus are situated in this tract. This region is thinly populated and only a limited area is cultivated.
- ii. Maval Transitional Tract :- The eastern flank of Sahyadris drained by the rivers Godavari and Bhima is the transitional region, which is a region of alternate hills and valleys.

The hills are bare and valleys are regions of intensive cultivation. This is well-populated area and has commercial towns like Bhor, Junnar.

iii. Balaghat and Mahadev Upland Tract : The eastern Plateau is marked by two major and many minor hill ranges. Balaghat range demarcates the basin of Godavari from that of Krishna.* Major portion is covered by Bhima; forests and grass lands. There is inferior cultivations.

*while Mahadev hills separate Bhima basin from that of Krishna.

iv. Godavari Basin :- A part of Godavari basin lies in Poona Division. This has rich black soil yielding good crops and gains a greater economic importance in the Talukas of Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Newase, where the advantages of soil are further enhanced by canal irrigation. This area is well developed area for garden crops, particularly Sugarcane, on which depends the sugar industry of Ahmednagar district.

v. Bhima Basin :- The drainage area, trap soils of varying fertility, and drier climate have given distinctive feature to this Basin. The southern-east and central portions of the basin have dry climate and poorer soil. The immediate flanks of Bhima basin are well cultivated, but yields are highly susceptible to scarcity. The upland portions of the basin formed by Balaghat and Mahadev ranges are mostly given to rough grazing and hardier crops like Bajri. The Sina and Nira rivers have formed tributary basins of this region.

vi. Krishna-Ranchaganga Basin : - This is the region drained by Krishna river with its major tributaries, Koyana and Ranchaganga. This region also has a rich black soil cover developed on the Deccan lavas under a more humid climate. The valleys form belts of intensive cultivation. Sugarcane and Tobacco are the main cash crops along with other crops of Jowar, Wheat, Cotton. In the southern part of the region, sugarcane has gained importance due to rapid development of sugar industry in Miraj-Sangli-Kolhapur area. This area is free from scarcity.

CHAPTER II
EXPLANATORY NOTE TO
DIVISION STATISTICAL ABSTRACT.

Divisional Statistical Abstract for the year 1964-65 presents data in tabular form of various departments. As far as possible, efforts are made to incorporate data for the year 1964-65 in the Divisional Statistical Abstract. The compilation of the Divisional Statistical Abstract is based on the District Statistical Abstracts. These Abstracts are prepared by the District Statistical Offices.

If data for the year 1964-65 are not available for various reasons, the data for the earlier years are published.

In most of the tables presented herein, the break-up of the data is shown districtwise. In cases, however, where districtwise figures are too unwidely and unrepresentable, only figures for Division are shown.

For convenience of ready reference, the tables are grouped under 13 major heads, such as,

- i. Climate,
- ii. Population, etc.

The limitations and salient features are given below :-

2.1. Climate :

As pointed out in the previous chapter, the climate of the Poona Division differs from Plateau to Plateau. Higher seasonal ranges are recorded over the Plateau of eastern side.

In Summer, maximum temperature (41.3°c) is recorded at Sholapur during MAY, 1964 in Poona Division.

The temperature of Mahabaleshwar ranges from 13.8°c to 32.1°c in the year 1964.

As regards rainfall, western face of Sahyadris receives rainfall more than 2,500 mm. Mahabaleshwar receives the highest rainfall (6,635 mm normal) in Poona Division. Failures of rains are unknown in this tract.

Beyond main ridge of Sahyadris, there is a rapid decline in the rains. Eastern portion of this Division is always liable to scarcity. In this portion rainfall varies between 500 mm.s to 700 mm.s.

2.3. Population.

The total population of the Division as per 1961 Census is 103.60 lakhs which is about 26.2 per cent of the population in Maharashtra State.

A glance at the figures of the table 2.1 shows the fact of the critical and alarmingly high rate of growth of population in the Poona Division. The total average annual rate of increase in the

decade ending 1951 varies between 2.1 percent and 2.6 percent, while the rural and urban rate of annual increase varies between 1.9 per cent to and 2.7 per cent and 2.0 per cent and 3.7 per cent respectively.

The density of population per square kilometer has increased from 111 persons in 1951 to 139 persons in 1961. The density of 193 persons per square km. is the highest in Kolhapur district and the lowest of 106 persons in Ahmednagar district.

The data in table no.2.1 depicting population figures of 1951 and 1961 Census are made comparable.

The table no.2.2 indicates that more than half of the rural population stays in those villages which have population between 500 to 1,999, and such villages constitute between 50 to 60 per cent of the total villages. On the other hand, more than 75 per cent of the population live in villages varying population between 500 to 4,999 and such villages make up 60 per cent of the total villages.

As regards economic classification, the population is classified into two main groups - workers and non-workers. The population of workers in the Poona Division is about 47.14 lakhs, which is about 45.5 per cent of the total population. The percentage of the cultivators and agricultural labourers in the working population is 74.1.

In pursuance of the articles 341 and 342 of the Constitution of India, certain classes are declared as Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Few of them are declared for the whole State, but others for the specified areas.

The Scheduled Castes are scattered in all areas of this Division. The percentage of scheduled caste population to the total population of the Poona Division varies from 12.8 in Sholapur district to 4.9 in Poona district. Unlike scheduled caste, scheduled tribes are thinly populated in this Division. The percentage of the scheduled tribes to the total population in this Division works out at 2.06. The scheduled tribes show heavy concentration in Ahmednagar district (3.18 per cent) Poona (3.64 per cent).

2.3. Agriculture.

Out of the total geographical area, about 81 per cent area is classified as cultivable area out of which 86.5 per cent area is ' net sown area '. During the years under report, there appears to be no change in the net area sown in the Division; but area sown more than once has increased from 3.01 lakh hectares to 3.29 lakh hectares. More than 10 per cent area is classified under ' Forests '.

From the cropping pattern table, it will be revealed that there is no appreciable change in the foodgrain as well as in the non-food

years under report. The area under foodgrains during the year 1963-64 constitutes 74.3 per cent of the gross cropped area. Sugarcane is the important cash crop in this Division. The percentage of the area under sugarcane is about 2 during the year 1963-64.

Table no.3.3 will indicate the yield rates per hectare of the principle crops.

There is slight increase in yield rate for Rice, Jowar and Sugarcane, whereas there is decrease in yield rates of wheat, Bajari, Gram and Cotton.

Considering the sources of irrigation, it will be observed that contribution from well irrigation is the highest and is 52 percent of the gross irrigated area. This phenomenon is not particular in this Division, but common for the State as a whole. There are a few government canal facilities in Kolhapur and Sangli districts. During the last century, Deccan Canal Irrigation works, especially Khadakwasla, Bhandar-dara, Vir, Bhatghar were developed in the ^{command} areas of the Ahmednagar, Poona Satara and Sholapur districts.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to the Gross cropped area is 11.4 during both the years under report.

As pointed out above, well irrigation is the important source of irrigation in the Division. The percentage of wells not in use to total wells is 7.2 in the year 1963-64 as against 9.3 in the year 1962-63. There is significant achievement in construction of wells in the districts, viz., Sangli and Poona, With this result the number of wells has increased in these two districts in the year 1963-64 over the earlier years.

Agricultural tables are obtained from Department of Agriculture. The figures in these tables should be treated as ' provisional '.

The scarcity conditions prevailed in Satara, Poona and Ahmednagar districts during the year 1964-65. The chronic condition in 73 villages in Poona district was declared, whereas akin to scarcity condition was declared in 292 villages of these three districts. The populated affected was about 3.70 lakhs.

2.4. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries.

The total livestock population according to 1961 Livestock Census is 74.87 lakhs as against 64.52 lakhs in 1956. The rise of 16 per cent was witnessed during these two quinquennial censuses. About 42 per cent of the cattle is for working bullocks and 11 per cent of the population is of milch cattle. On the other hand, working buffaloes constitute only about 7 per cent or less. The percentage of buffaloes in milk is round about 30. This is consistent with the fact that buffaloes are being used for milk in all districts on large scale. The poultry population of this Division is 34.80 lakhs as against 30.23 in 1956. During the quinquennial the population of horses and ponies was decreased by about

25 per cent.

Districtwise livestock figures show that average working bullock per agricultural worker is the highest (13.2) in Sholapur district whereas it is lowest (6.5) in Kolhapur district. Distribution of livestock population is varying within the districts of Poona Division. The proportion per thousand human population is the highest in cattle population in Ahmednagar district; for buffaloes in Kolhapur district, in poultry in Satara district and in sheep and goats in Ahmednagar district.

Veterinary statistics available from the Zilla Parishad show that nine hospitals, 65 dispensaries and 185 Aid centres were available for treatment of animals. In these hospitals, dispensaries and aid centres 6.20-lakhs animals were treated during the year 1964-65 as against 5.55 lakhs during the year 1963-64.

There are some limitations in these data because the corporation areas are excluded from the activities of the Zilla Parishad and hence the figures are underestimated.

Forest :- The area under ' Forest ' during the year 1963-64 was increased from 6.44 lakh hectares to 7.83 lakh hectares. There is no significant change in the forest area, which is under the control of the Forest Department. But the forest area under Revenue Department increased from 0.96 lakh hectares to 2.34 lakh hectares. The highest area under Forests is in Ahmednagar district.

Major income from the forest produce is derived from timber and fuel.

2.5 : Industries Mining and Electricity :

Poona Division has no important minerals. The quarrying of stones, sand and limestone is common in all districts. Laterite is widespread in the western portion of Satara district. Only Gypsum and Bauxite are available in Kolhapur district.

During last decade, much industrial development is witnessed in this Division. The industrial complex zone is created along the Bombay-Poona railway line. The registered factories decreased from 2026 in 1963 to 1973 in 1964. The decrease was significantly noted in the Gur factories. This is quite natural because expansion of sugar factories has affected the Gur industry in the Division.

Spinning and cotton textiles formed more than 25 per cent. Machinery, tobacco manufactures and sugar factories were also important groups from the employment point. In Poona Division, there is much net work of sugar factories in Ahmednagar district, while machinery (including electrical) industries are located in Poona and Kolhapur districts only. Organized Gur industries were flourished in the

canal areas of this division.

Data on employment in factories for the year 1963 revealed that Poona, Sholapur and Ahmednagar districts occupied fourth, fifth and sixth places in Maharashtra State. Electricity is useful both for industry as well as agriculture. Development of industries depends on the growth in the electric generation.

The Koyana Hydro electricity Project in Satara district, Radhanagari Project in Kolhapur district and net works of Tata Hydro/^{electric} Projects are the main sources of electricity.

The electricity generated was 14,101 (300 K.w.h.) in 1964-65, as against 24,023 (K.w.h.) in 1963-64. The consumption of electricity as industrial power increased from 38 per cent to 50 per cent in 1964-65. During the year 1964-65, 43 per cent electricity used for industrial purposes was consumed in Poona district. During the last decade, there is much demand for industrial power in the Poona district. This speaks about the industrial expansion in Poona area.

It will be also observed from table no.5.11 that the number of villages/towns which have been electrified has gone to 769 in 1964-65 from 633 in 1963-64. From 1964-65 onwards, electrification programme was intensified in Ahmednagar/Sholapur districts.

There is a declining trend of registration in the employment exchange in the year 1964-65 over the previous year. Public sector is the biggest employer for the candidates registered in the employment exchange. From live register, it is observed that the pattern of unemployment remains the same under both years of report.

2.6. Co-operation :

The co-operative movement had made a considerable strides in the Poona division.

Agriculture is the main stay of economic and credit to carry out agricultural activities is the desperate need of the agriculturists. The scheme of improved agricultural practices is slowly but surely penetrating agricultural economy and without agricultural credit, the agriculturist cannot purchase fertilisers, pesticides which he needs for augmenting production.

The co-operative movement in this Region has made perceptible progress in the establishment of agricultural credit societies. The number of agricultural credit societies increased from 5,011 in 1963-64 to 5,014 in 1964-65 with corresponding increase of 10.5 per cent in the memberships. The position of loans advanced indicates the extent/^{to} which the agriculturist is benefitted by the societies. The loan advanced per member increased from Rs.241 in '63-64 to Rs.251 in '64-65. The loan advanced per member was the lowest in the Poona district (Rs.134) in the year '64-65.

District Land Development Bank is another important land mark made by the co-operative movement. This bank provides financial assistance to repairs of old wells, construction of new wells, purchase of tractors, etc. The total number of societies increased by 2 per cent in the year 1964-65 over 1963-64. The predominant class among the societies is the agricultural credit.

Processing societies, even though they are small in number, are very important for raising the standard of living of agriculturists in this Division. The working capital of these societies increased from Rs.37 crores in 1963-64 to Rs.43 crores in '64-65.

Other types of societies are Farming Societies, Consumers' Societies, Housing Societies and Producers' Societies. Loan advanced in all these societies increased from Rs.110 crores in '63-64 to Rs.133 crores in '64-65.

2.7. Medical & Public Health :

As per 1961 Census, number of physicians and surgeons per lakh population in the Division is 33 persons for rural areas and 219 persons in urban areas. Thus, the medical personnel are concentrated in the urban areas of the Division.. About 21,000 persons are engaged in the Medical and Public Health professions according to the 1961 Census. The proportion of physicians and surgeons works out at 36.6 per cent in the persons engaged in the Medical & Public Health professions. The proportion of female doctors was less than 11 per cent.

At the end of the year 1964, there were 45 hospitals, 212 dispensaries, 63 maternity homes, 31 health centres and 142 primary health centres. There were about 79 beds per lakh population.

2.8. E d u c a t i o n .

According to 1961 Census the percentage of literacy is 29.3 as against 29.8 in the State. In Rural areas, Satara district has the highest percentage of literates, while Sholapur district has the lowest percentage. The success^{of large % age of literacy is due to the success} of such institutions, such as 'Rayat Shikshana Sanstha'. In case of urban areas, Satara district has highest percentage of male literates and in case of female literates Poona district is leading which is due to special efforts made by such Advocates of female education, such as late Dr.D.K.Karve.

Education in the urban parts of the districts. From the table B.3. It is observed that the Poona district is leading in all the diverse fields of Education. It is interesting to note that in Poona district some women have chosen Engineering and Agriculture as their vocations.

Number of primary institutions has increased from 10,090 in '33-64 to 10,271 in '64-65, with corresponding increase in the number of pupils. On an average, there was one secondary school for every 11 primary

schools and one higher education institution (excluding Special education) for 10 secondary institutions. The proportion of female pupils was 37 per cent in primary education, 24 per cent in secondary education and 19 per cent in higher education in the year '64-65.

2.9. Transport & Communication :

The progress in various sectors of development is very much linked up with efficient system of Transport and Communication, especially provision of adequate transport facilities in essential and backward areas.

The total route mileages of broadgauge, metre-gauge and narrow gauge is 1,248 kilometre. On an average, 1.67 kilometre railway route length is in existence in an area of 100 sq.k.m.

Road Development lags considerably behind the Nagpur Targets although the position of the Poona Division is better as compared to other Divisions. The road length has increased from 16,441 k.m. to 19,470 k.m. in the year 1964-65. The road length per 100 sq.k.m. works out at 26 k.m. There are 4 national highways in the Division running a total length of 507 kilo metres. These are : viz.,

- i. Bombay - Poona - Bangalore Road,
- ii. Poona - Nasik Road,
- iii. Poona - Sholapur - Hyderabad Road, and
- iv. Sholapur - Bijapur Road.

The significant development during the last decade is the extension of Nationalised passenger transport. This was begun in the old Bombay State in the year 1950 and the programme of expansion was completed by the end of Second Five Year Plan.

The total number of routes in the Division as at the end of the year 1965 were 933 with route mileage 64,567 k.m.

The average service distance per day in kilometre was 2.15 lakhs. The number of vehicles on road per day was 938 in the year '64-65 as against 823 in the year '63-64. The average earning per vehicle in the Division was Rs.269 in the year '64-65.

The number of post offices has been increased from 2,263 in '63-64 to 2,372 in '64-65. The number of radio licences issued in '64-65 is in excess by about 24,500 of the previous year. The density of post offices per 100 sq.k.m. ^{was} 3.17 and, on an average a post office serves a population of about 3,521.

2.10. Local Bodies.

The effect to Democratic decentralisation in the administrative set up in Maharashtra State was given from the 1st MAY, 1962.

The total income of all the Zilla Parishads in the Poona division during the year 1964-65 was Rs.30.35 crores with the corresponding expenditure of Rs.29.24 crores.

Village Panchayats : There were 4,410 village panchayats in the Poona Division. As would be seen from the table 10.1, it is noticed that income per village panchayat was increased from Rs.6,872 to Rs.7,710 during 1964-65 compared with the year 1963-64.

Municipalities : There are in all 54 municipalities in the Poona Division having an average income of Rs.1.38 lakhs. / & Cantonment Boards

Poona and Sholapur district head-quarters have got municipal corporations.

2.11. Plan and Community Development.

The original outlay on State level schemes out of the total outlay of Rs.390.20 crores on all schemes is Rs.34.29 crores. The remaining outlay of Rs.355.91 crores is allocated over district and division level schemes. The allocation for the Poona division is Rs.90.83 crores, that is 25.5 per cent of the above amount. The finally revised outlay stands at Rs.103.04 crores. This gives per capita outlay of Rs.100. The revised outlays on each head of development in both district and division level schemes are more than the original outlays except for ' Industry & Mining ' head from district level schemes.

As per revised outlay, it will be seen that among the divisional level schemes, ' Irrigation & Power ' has been provided with maximum amount, i.e., 68 per cent of the total. This is because most of the amount is intended to boost agricultural production by bringing more acreage under Irrigation. Power generated from hydro projects would also be utilised for the purpose of industrial development. The outlay on all other heads except ' Social Services ' is either 3 per cent or less of the total provision.

Under district level schemes, maximum provision (46 per cent) has been made for Agricultural production, Co-operation & Community Development and Social Services claim 20 per cent and 25 per cent of the total outlay respectively. There are no schemes under ' Irrigation & Power.

The total expenditure incurred on district and divisional level schemes upto 1964-65 is Rs.69.99, i.e., 68 per cent of the revised plan provision. By the end of 1964-65 about 69 and 68 per cent of the plan provisions are utilized for district and division level schemes respectively. The progress of expenditure is uniform in both levels, upto 1964-65. The expenditure and achievements for the year '61-62 to '64-65 are presented in table no.s 11.1 and 11.2.

All rural area of the Division comes under the impact of the community programme. Of the 114.5 C.D.B. Blocks, 40 C.D.B. Blocks are classified as stage 1 Blocks. Tribal development blocks are opened in the Ahmednagar and Poona districts. About 20 per cent block provision is utilised in the year 1964-65.

2.12. P r i c e s .

District Statistical organisation collects weekly prices at the district head-quarter. Average retail prices of selected commodities (more than fifty) are presented for each month from April, 1964 to March, 1965. There are limitations to the price data. The price data is expected to serve as a broad indicator of trend in change in prices rather than being representative of the price situation. This is because of the fact that prices are collected from one shop only in each district head-quarters.

The index numbers for Sholapur which have been calculated on the basis of principles laid down by Lakadawala Committee are presented in this section. The consumer price index has increased from 417 in MARCH, 1964 to 454 in MARCH, 1965, indicating rise of 8.8 per cent.

2.13. M i s c e l l a n e o u s :

There are in all 13 tables on a variety of topics in this last section.

About 6 per cent crimes are reduced in the year 1964-65 over the previous year. The cost on Police force is Rs.1.62 crores in the year 1964-65 as against Rs.1.37 crores in the year 1963-64, i.e., about 18 per cent rise in the cost of police force. The per capita cost on police force is Rs.1.56 in the year 1964-65.

In the Civil Courts, 1.94 lakh cases are disposed off in the year 1964-65 as against 1.85 lakh cases. The level of disposal of cases is constant on civil side, where there is a reduction in the disposal of criminal cases.

Under ' Cinema Statistics, ' only one theatre is added in the year 1964-65 with corresponding change in the capacity. In this division, most of the cinema theatres are located in the Poona district.

Table 13.4 gives particulars both by ranges of salary and by category about State Government employees in the Division. This is based on Census of Government Employees conducted by the Bureau in the year 1961.

Of the 52 thousand employees, 43.5 per cent employees work in the Poona district alone. The emoluments paid to these employees are to the tune of Rs.6.91 crores.

The next table 13.5 gives the information on banking facilities. Banking facilities have increased from 387 in 1963-64 to 423 in '64-65.

The facilities are increased in co-operative side. Poona district accounts the highest share of banking facilities.

In the life insurance table, it is observed that the business went a little low in the year 1964-65.

In the Small savings, the Division has shown poor performance in the year 1964-65 over the previous year.

Under Land revenue collection, it is seen that arrears are decreased in the year 1964-65 over 1963-64.

Receipts due to taxes such as Excise, Revenue, Sales Tax and Entertainment Tax are more in the year 1964-65 than the earlier year.

Registration in the year 1964-65 have also earned more income to Government than the earlier year.

General Election, 1962 Statistics shows that voting percentage for Legislative Constituencies was above 63 per cent while that for Parliamentary Constituencies it was less than 53 per cent.

Last table in this section provides pattern of housing conditions of the population. This table is based on twenty per cent sample households in each district covered in the year 1961.
