CHAPTER - I
INTRODUCTION

1.1 - Location :-

The district of Satara is placed in the historically famous central part of Deccan Maharashtra. It is surrounded by Poona District in the north, Sholapur district in the east Sahgali district to the south and ranges of Sahyadri and beyond Sahyadri by Kolaba and Ratnagiri districts towards the west. It is partly situated in the Phima river basin and partly in the basin of Krishna river and the rest of the district lies in the upper Krishna-basin. It has an area of 10436.9 square Kilometre with a total population of 14,30,105 persons according to 1961 population census. The length of the district is about 120 Km. and its breadth also comes to near about its length.

The district of Satara lies between 17 5' and 18 11' north latitude and 73 33' and 74 54' East longitude. In terms of area and population it makes 3.4 per cent and 3.6 per cent respectively of the state of Maharashtra; while within the Poona Division it stands 4 th and 5 th respectively.

1.2 Topography

1) Soil :-

The soil, in the western part of the district (consisting the talukas of Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jaoli and Patan), is formed from the red laterite of the ghats and is thin and poor on the hill slopes, but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil and vegetable matter washed down by the rains. Rich black soils are, however, found in Wai, Jaoli and Patan talukas in low lands in the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers.

Medium to deep black alluvial soils are found in the central portion of the Satara district. Krishna valley soils are said to be one of the richest in the Deccan and the portion which lies in Satara and Karad talukas is reported as the finest black alluvial soil highly retentive of moisture and very fertile.

But, the soil is poor and stony in the talukas of Khandala and Phaltan, in the vicinity of the hills. However, there are, also, good black soils along the Nira and its tributaries. In the eastern portion of Khandala, soils are poor, shallow and whitish but capable of producing wheat if enough water is available.

The soils get poorer towards the east of the Krishna Valley; and although there are wide stretches of good black soils along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon taluka the lands near the hills are very poor.

In further east of Satara district consisting the talukas of Khatav and Man extremely poor and shallow soils are found. The soil condition on the whole, excepting certain parts of the central portion, is not much fertile for agriculture in Satara district.

2) Rivers :- The main hill ranges of the district form valleys through which flow several streams which make up the head waters of the river Krishna. Thus, the river Krishna is the principal river of the region. Krishna rises in the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar plateau, with its source at about 4500' above mean sea level. Of its total flow of 800 miles, nearly 100 miles lie within the limits of the district. The drainage system of Krishna includes, besides the drainage of the central system, the drainage of five feeders from the right side, namely, Kudali, Venna, Urmodi, Tarali and Koyana and two feeders on the left, namely, the Vasana and Yerala.

Next to Krishna, the other important rivers of the district are Koyana, Nira, Venna, Kudali, Unnodi, Vasana, Yerala and Tarali. Koyana is the largest of Satara feeders of Krishna. It rises on the west side of the Mahabaleshwar Plateau near Elephinstone point. In the first 40 miles of its course, it runs nearly south up to Helwak in Patan taluka where the famous Dam has been built. After that point it suddenly turns east and after a further course of 40 miles falls into Krishna at Karad.

Of the Bhima system of rivers the two Chief Satara representatives are the Nira in the north and the Man or Manganga in the north-east. The river Nira, from its source in Bhor taluka of Poona district, runs east to north of the Wai and Phaltan talukas of Satara district, After leaving Phaltan it runs north of Malstras in Sholapur and falls into Bhima. The Man river runs a length of about 40 miles in Satara Dist. Beyond Satara limits, it runs through Atpadi, Sangola, in Sholapur district and falls into Bhima at Sarkoli about 10 miles south east of Pandharpur. Only during the rainy season these rivers are full. But in the hot months they go dry.

3) Hill Ranges :- There are two main systems of hills in Satara dist. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots and the Mahadeo range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of sixty miles from north to south forms the western boundary of the district. The Mahadeo range starts about 10 miles north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and south-east across the whole breadth of the district. From this range three spurs also stretch to the south in the district.

The hills in Satara district are very low, barren and rugged, except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar is about 4710' above mean sea level. This is the highest point in the district. The off-shoots of the Sahyadri range separate the valleys of adjacent rivers. For

example, one of these off-shoots separates the main Krishna basin from the basin of Venna; another off-shoot separates the Venna basin from the basin of Tarali and still another separates the Tarali basin from that of the famous Koyana river.

4) Minerals

As regards the minerals in this district, iron deposits are found in twenty villages of Jaoli taluka and thirty villages of Patan. Due to the rocky nature of the soil the district is well supplied with stones for building and road metal. Sand of good quality is also found in the beds of all large streams on the plains. Lime stone is found all over the district in the plains, especially near Wai. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found in nearly all river banks.

1.3 - Climate

1) Rainfall

Rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the dist. It is heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri, with Mahabaleshwar getting on an average 6,000 mm. in the year. The western zone has sharp transitions in the rainfall pattern. The extreme west gets over 5,000 mm. rain while the eastern belt of the Sahyadri Zone gets between 1,200 and 2,000 mm. The central or the transitional zone shows a further break from the western zone and gets a rainfall from 600 to 1,200 mm. The eastern zone has the lowest rainfall averaging to less than 600 mm. in the year.

The rains start about the middle of June and last till the end of september. The intensity of rain fall is greatest in July. Although the monsoon rains cease by the end of september, light drizzling intervals are not unusual till December.

The seasonal distribution of rainfall also varies from zone to zone. In the western zone most of the rains are received from the south-west monsoon. This heavy rainfall in the Sahyadri area loses much of its economic value due to its concentration in a short period. The distribution changes in the central zone which also gets 150-175 mm. rainfall in October and November. In the eastern zone the rainfall is low and precarious but it is distributed over a longer period.

2) Temperature

Monthly temperature records are available only for one station at Mahabaleshwar which is over 4000' above sea level. The data do not naturally represent the climate of the dist. as a whole. The year may be better divided into five seasons- the rainy season from about 10 th June to the end of September; Sultry climate from about the end of September to the middle of November; a cold climate from the middle of November to the end of January; a dry hot climate in which easterly winds prevail from the beginning of February to the end of March and the hot weather from the beginning of April to about 10 th of June.

Within the district the seasons show local variations also. The climate is cool and healthy in the hot weather in the western zone but becomes chilly during the rainy season. The plains of Wai taluka, however, have temperate climate throughout the year. The warmth increases as one proceeds from west to east. In the central part there is considerable heat during hot months. During the cold weather the days are warm and nights cool. The eastern zone has a wider range of temperature variation from season to season and the climate therein is comparable with the climate of Sholapur district.

1.4 Natural Zone

There are three geographical zones which can clearly be distinguished in the district. To the west, bordering the Sahyadri Ranges, lies a hilly tract receiving between 1200 mm. to 5000 mm. of rainfall and comprising of the talukas of Patan Jacli, Mahabaleshwar and parts of Satara and Wai. The soil in this area is thin and poor on the hilly slopes. The agriculture and occupation of this zone would be similar to that of the people living in Kokan tract.

As against this, the central zone or the transitional belt comprising of the talukas of Koregaon, Karad, eastern parts of Satara and Wai is flat and contains the richer agricultural tracts of the district. The rainfall is certain here. It varies from 600 to 1,200 mm. per annum. The major parts of this area consists of medium or deep alluvial soil and is extremely fertile.

The eastern zone, however, where the soil is light and terrain undulating is the famous scarcity zone consisting of the talukas of Phaltan, Khatav, Man and the remaining parts of Khandala mahal, which do not fall in the western zone.

1.5 - Famine & Scarcity:-

Due to above situation, parts of the district have been affected by scarcity from early times. The areas which have suffered in the past were in Khandala, Man Khatav, Koregaon and Phaltan talukas of this district. The fact-Finding committee appointed by the then Government of Bombay in 1960 had reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas and they are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions as shown below.

1.6 - Territorial Changes

As far as the territorial changes in the district are concerned, it will be seen that one village from Khanapur taluka of Sangli district was transferred to Karad taluka in 1958. The name of the village is "Shamgaon"

1.7 - District Administration

Having discussed the general features of the dist. let us turn to the Administrative set up in the district. The city of Satara is the Head Quarter of Satara district. The Collector of the district is in charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil supplies etc. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector and three Dy. Collectors who hold charge of the three Revenue Divisions and have their head quarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar respectively. Nine Mamalatdars are in charge of nine taluka offices and two Mahalkaris in charge of the two Mahal offices. The details of the same can be seen from the following table.

Figures in the bracket under column 4 above indicate the towns in the concerned talukas.

As far as the developmental and administrative subjects transferred to Zilla Parishad of the district are concerned the executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1961 vests in the Chief Executive Officer at the Zilla Parishad level and in the Block Development officers at taluka level.

The Chief Executive Officer is assisted by the Dy. Chief Executive Officer and all other Heads of Departments under the Zilla Parishad. The entire rural area and the non-municipal urban area of Satara Road with the population of 12,79,476 persons is under the control of Zilla Parishad Satara.

As regards the administrative convenience of the police force, the district has been split up in two parts namely Satara and Karad. The district superintendent of police looks after the administration of police force in the district. His head quarter is also located at Satara city.

For efficacy and efficiency the police force has been divided in number of branches such as local crime Branch, Local Intelligence Branch, Anti-corruption Branch and so on.

The Judicial proceedings of the district are looked after by the District Judge - the man of jurisprudence. The judiciary is separated from the executive.

The District and sessions Judge is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional sessions Judges. They have jurisdiction over the entire Satara district. They attend to civil and criminal work both original and appellate. Moreover, there are ten civil Judges (Junior Division) and First class Judicial Magistrates with head quarters at different taluka places.

From the economic point of view, taking into consideration the hilly and backward nature of the district, the services of the state Transport and Maharashtra State Electricity Board are of vital interest. The offices of the Divisional controller S.T. Division Satara and the Executive Engineer M.S.E.B. Satara are located at Satara city only.

In the co-operative field, the District Deputy Registrar of co-operative societies is of paramount importance. He is assisted by three Assistant Registrars who have territorial jurisdiction and deal with all the aspects of the co-operative movement in the district. The Zilla Parishad Satara, also, looks to the promotion and extension of the co-operative movement in the district as a whole.

1.8 - Demography

1) General :

Indian population statistics show that the rate of population growth prior to 1921 was slow and erratic while

while subsequent to 1921 it has been maintaining a steady upward trend. What is true about India is also true about the district of Satara.

According to 1961 census, the population of the district is 14,30,105 persons or 137 persons per sq.km. In 1951 it was 11,77,016 or 112 persons per sq.km. The population has increased by about 2,53,089 or 21.5 per cent during the last 10 years.

2) Growth rate :-

This significant increase in the growth rate during the last decade in the 1,160 villages and 10 towns of Satara district is the result of control of epidemics and other diseases since 1950. Malaria, which used to be a major public health problem in the district, has now been controlled. Due to such other improved conditions the death rate has been reduced and has resulted in the higher growth rate although the birth rate may not have increased at all.

However, the net percentage increase during the last six decades for Satara District is lower when compared with growthrate of Poona Division and the state of Maharashtra. The growth rate upto 1921 was greatly affected due to draughts, famines and severe influenza. But after 1921 there has been a distinct change in the upward direction. During 1951-61 the figures of net percentage increase for Satara, Poona Dn., and the state of Maharashtra are 21.50, 24.07 and 23.60 respectively. From 1901 to 1961 the same figures are 68.31, 99.42 & 103.97 for Satara, Poona Dn. and the state of Maharashtra, respectively. That means the district growth

rates have always been lower than the state and Division averages and this was mostly due to the well-known feature of the district of population out-migration to Greater Bombay.

3) Density :-

Eventhough the district growth rates have always been lower than Maharashtra averages, as stated above, the density of population in the district is 355 persons per sq. mile which is higher than that of the state (i.e.334 persons per sq. mile).

However, there is a great variation in the density from taluka to taluka within the district itself. The density of population is comparatively lower in the hilly tracts i.e. western part of the district and also in the scarcity affected talukas lying in the eastern part of the district. It varies from 609 persons per sq. mile in Karad taluka to 179 persons per sq. mile in Man taluka. The differences correspond to those of topography and land utilisation. The Central zone consisting of rich soils on the Krishna river bank and high proportion of net sown area to geographical area has the highest density of population. In fact, Karad taluka is a part of the most densely populated region in Maharashtra.

4) Literacy :-

As per 1961 census, the percentage of literates in the district comes to 33.98 percent, whereas the percentage of literacy in Maharashtra state is 29.82. The percentage of literacy in the district in 1951 was 20.60 percent. It would be seen that the number of literates has increased by 13.38 percent during the last 10 years. The district ranks highest in the state in literacy in

rural areas and in respect of literacy for women. Within Poona Dn. it stands 2nd when the percentage of literate persons to the total district population is considered.

5) Livelihood classification :-

As far as the economic classification of the workers, it will be seen that as per the 1961 census, the classification of livelihood classes has been changed and the distribution of the population as per the changed - livelihood classes show that out of the total population of 14.30 lakhs total workers are 6.92 lakhs i.e. 48.42 percent of the total population of the district comes under the category of workers. This further means that 7.37 lakhs of 51.58 percent of the total population of the district falls under non-workers category.

It has further been noticed during the 1961 census that out of the total workers the majority of them work as cultivators; while very little number is engaged in the category of Transport and communications. Amongst the different talukas the taluka of Jaoli stood first in the category of 'Cultivators' while Mahabaleshwar stood the lowest, due to its hilly nature, The number of Agricultural labourers is highest in Phaltan taluka and the lowest in the Mahabaleshwar. The persons engaged in household industries are more in Man taluka and lower in Jaoli taluka. As far as other services are concerned the number is highest in Mahabaleshwar and lowest in Jaoli taluka, The percentages of persons engaged in Mining, Manufacturing Industries, construction, Trade and commerce etc. are not worth noting in the district of Satara.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTE

On sources and limitations of statistics presented in the District Statistical Abstract.

OBJECT :- Statistics on as many as possible subjects have been depicted in the Abstract so as to provide the scope for further studies in Socio-Economic aspects of the district. Attempt has been made here to furnish the talukawise position on different topics for the year 1961-62 and 1965-66; i.e. for the period of III Five Year Plan.

The sources of the material reproduced in the Abstract have also been shown at the end of each table. However, exhaustive statistics is not free from limitations due to various reasons although steps were taken to remove them, as far as possible.

In the following paras sources and limitations etc. of statistics presented in the preceding pages have been discussed in short.

I - CLIMATE :-

Table No. 1.1 :- This table gives the normal rainfall, number of rainy days and actual rainfall of the 15 centres of Satara district. The rainfall is highest at Mahabaleshwar centre, while it is the lowest in Vaduj centre. It is not uniform in all the parts of the district. It is heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri and very scanty in the eastern zone of the district.

Table No. 1.2 :- The table shows the mean, maximum and the minimum temperature of Mahabaleshwar station. The temperature is maximum in the month of April at 30.2 centigrade and minimum in the month of January at 13.6 centigrade. Monthly temperature records are available only for one station at Mahabaleshwar which is 4000' above mean sea level. As such, the data supplied in this table do not naturally represent the temperature of the district as a whole.

II - AREA AND POPULATION :-

Table No. 2.1 :- This table indicates the figures on population - density of population population variation and population break up as rural- urban for each taluka of Satara district. The figures of 1951 census are adjusted so as to depict comparative information for all the talukas at one place.

Table No. 2.2 :- This table gives the classification of different inhabited villages according to population ranges. It is seen that all villages fall under population ranges 1000-1999, 2000 to 4999 and 500-999. There is no village having population more than 10,000 in this dist.

Table No. 2.3 :- The table is on the same lines that of 2.2. The classification of towns according to population ranges is given in this table, There is no town having population more than 50,000 in this district.

Table No. 2.4 :- This table shows the total no. of workers in each livelihood class of working population for each taluka of the district separately. For purpose of easy comparison, the classification is given for rural and urban areas separately. The population under classification I & II is classified as Agril. population while

while that under category III to IX as non-agricultural population. Obviously the proportion of agricultural population is more in rural areas than that in urban areas. As regards non-agricultural population the situation is exactly reverse.

Table No. 2.5 :- The classification of non working population is given in this table for 11 talukas of the district. The talukawise break up of urban non-working population is not available and hence not given. It is seen that most of non working persons are dependants and disabled persons. Below them rank persons engaged in household industry and students.

Table No. 2.6 :- The information on the talukawise population of scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes is given in this table. The majority of scheduled caste population is in Karad taluka while that of scheduled Tribes is in Jaoli taluka. The list of scheduled caste and scheduled Tribes is available from list No. L.5.

Table No. 2.7 :- This table details out urban population and its break up according to sex.

III AGRICULTURE.

The important statistics under this section for the year 1961-62 and 1964-65 is sub-divided into i) Land Utilisation ii) Area under different crops iii) Out turn of principal crops iv) Irrigation by sources v) Area irrigated under different crops vi) Irrigation wells VII) Irrigation works viii) Major & Medium Projects ix) Distribution of households engaged in cultivation classified by interest in land and size of land cultivated. x) Agricultural wage Rates xi) Agricultural implements in each taluka and xii) Famines, scarcity data etc.

Table No. 3.1 :- The table shows the utilisation of land areas under various crops for two years 1961-62 and 1964-65. The terms used in the table are explained below.

- 1) Geographical area :- This area represents the total land area and is worked out from the records of Survey and settlement.
- 2) Forests :- This category includes all area actually under forests whether state owned or private and classed or administered as forest.
- 3) Barren and unculturable land :- This includes barren and unculturable lands like mountains, river beds etc.
- 4) Culturable waste :- This includes lands which can be brought under cultivation but which have not been or having been cultivated for some time, have not been cultivated successively for five years.
- 5) Permanent pastures and grazing grounds :- This includes all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.
- 6) Miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the area sown :- This category includes lands under thatching grass, bamboo bushes or other trees used for fuel.
- 7) Current fallows :- This includes lands which are left fallow during the current year only.
- 8) Other fallow land :- All lands which have been cultivated but which are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.
- 9) Net area sown :- The net area sown is the actual area under crop, counting areas sown more than once in the same year only once.

1c) Gross Cropped Area :- This is the sum of area under all crops and represents the sum of net area sown and area sown more than once.

In the year 1964-65 net area sown has been increased while acreage under Gross Cropped area decreased due to the decrease in the acreages of area sown more than once-over the corresponding years. The increase in net area sown is denoted in Phaltan, Wai, Khatav and Patan Talukas. Area under fallow land, culturable waste, appears to have been reduced in 1964-65 when compared with corresponding figures in the year 1961-62.

Table No. 3.2 :-

This table presents the details of areas under different crops. The crops are classified in two main groups viz. Food crops and non-food crops. Food crops are further grouped into cereals, pulses and other food crops. Non-food crops are similarly shown under Fibers, oil seeds, drugs and narcotics etc. The information for two years 1961-62 and 1964-65 for 11 talukas is presented here. Data of the year 64-65 when compared with that of 1961-62 the following observations can be noticed.

- 1) Area under total food crops in 1964-65 has decreased in comparison with that in the year 1961-62; but area under non-food crops although increased has not increased proportionately.
- 2) Among food crops area under cereals and pulses shows decrease in 1964-65.
- 3) Area under sugarcane and condiment and spices have slightly increased in 64-65 whereas there is a fall under fruits and vegetables in 64-65 in comparison with the year 61-62.

4) Under non-food crops there is an increase in area under fibers, oil-seeds and miscellaneous non food crops in 64-65.

Table No. 3.3 :-

This table presents the outturn and average yield per hectare of principal crops in the district. The data are exhibited for food crops like rice, wheat, Jowar, Bajra, maize etc. and non-food crops like groundnut, tobacco, cotton etc. The outturn figures are in Metric tonnes and average yield is shown in Kg. per hectare. Although the area under cereals in 64-65 showed decrease, it is observed that out-turn of cereals has slightly increased, practically in respect of Jowar, wheat and other cereals.

Production of pulses shows a slight decrease with the decrease in its acreage in 64-65. Outturn of Gur has increased in 64-65 in comparison with that of 61-62. The increase in acreage under sugarcane accounts for this increase. Cotton and groundnut figures also denote increase in 64-65.

Table No. 3.4 :-

This table presents gross and net irrigated areas and the distribution of net irrigated areas by sources of irrigation viz. canals, wells, tanks and other. The data is presented for two years 1961-62 and 1964-65 and also separately for each taluka. Net area under irrigation by all sources indicates rise in 64-65 over that in 61-62; the bulk however arising out of well irrigation.

Table No. 3.5 :-

This table shows the acreage of various crops under irrigation for two years 61-62 and 64-65. The

material is presented for the district as a whole and for each taluka separately. When acreage of crops under irrigation for 64-65 is compared to that of 61-62, the following points are observed -

- 1) Area under total food and total non-food crops under irrigation has increased in 64-65.
- 2) Area under sugarcane slightly increased in 64-65.
- 3) Under non-food crops group, area under cotton, tobacco and other miscellaneous crops under irrigation show a rise in 64-65 over that in 61-62.

Table No. 3.6 (a) :-

This table presents data on wells. It gives total no. of wells, and further breakup as wells in use and wells not in use. The talukwise figures relate to years 61-62 and 64-65.

Table No. 3.6 (b) :-

The information on number of minor irrigation works completed upto 31-3-66 and allied information regarding irrigation is presented in this table. The information for Zilla Parishad, Co-operative and state sector is given separately.

Table No. 3.6 (c) :-

The information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works is presented in this table. The same is collected from Executive Engineer, Fire Right Bank Canal Division, Phaltan.

Table No. 3.7 :-

This table shows the distribution of sample households engaged in cultivation classified by size of land

and interest in land cultivated. Ten size groups are shown horizontally while the interests in land are classified in three groups viz. i) Entirely owned or held from Government. ii) Entirely held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. iii) Partly held from Government and partly from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. The material is presented for total, rural and urban areas of the district separately and only for rural areas of each taluka.

Table No. 3.8 :-

The District Statistical Officer is collecting the data on wage rates of different categories of agricultural labour for each fortnight. The monthly average for two calendar years 1965 and 1966 for each of the three centres is shown in this table separately. The skilled workers include carpenter, Blacksmith and Cobbler while unskilled category includes field labour and herdsman.

Table No. 3.9 :-

This table presents the figures of Agricultural implements enumerated in the 10th livestock census in 1966. The figures for carts shown in the table are in respect of carts used for agriculture purposes only. The number of tractors is inclusive of those owned by private persons and by Government. However, the figures presented here are provisional.

Table No. 3.10 :-

This table depicts data on famines, scarcity and akin to scarcity in Satara district. The information

reported here for the year 65-66 indicates the presence of the famine and chronic scarcity conditions in all talukas except Wai, Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon and Khatav. The presence of akin to scarcity was noted in Wai, Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon, Khatav and Man. However, no taluka was affected by floods.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY FOREST AND FISHERIES

Table No. 4.1 :- The summary of the district population figures of Livestock census conducted in 1966 for each category of Animals and poultry is given in this table.

Table No. 4.2 :- The medical facilities available to the livestock population in this district during the financial year 61-62 and 65-66 and the no. of animals treated in dispensaries and different aid centres is exhibited in this table. The total no. of the centres for insemination and no. of animals inseminated is also given here. There are four hospitals, ten dispensaries, thirty one aid centres and 9 centres of insemination in this district. The information is collected from Animal Husbandry Officer, Satara Zilla Parishad, Satara. There has been an overall progress in the veterinary facilities extended in the district in the year 65-66 as compared to that in the year 1961-62. The increase in the no. of animals treated by the various centres is an indicator of this progress. There is also increase in the no. of animals inseminated during the year 65-66.

Table No. 4.3 :- The information regarding attacks of diseases and livestock mortality due to some important diseases of cattle and Bovine, sheep and goats, dogs, camels and poultry is presented in this table for the

year 61-62 and 65-66. The no. of livestock and poultry mortality in 65-66 has been found to be significantly low when compared to the no. of livestock and poultry mortality in 1961-62. The no. of livestock and poultry attacked by different diseases has also been on the decline in 65-66.

Table No. 4.4 :- The title itself suggests that the information presented here relates to slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the district. The no. of slaughter houses for Bovine and sheep and goat is given separately. Though the table displays data on animals slaughtered for the district as a whole, the limitation of the data in full coverage is there as the data on animals slaughtered in non-recognised animal slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available.

Table No. 4.5 :- This table gives circlewise figures of area under forest in this district. The classification is indicated in two ways - 1) Forest area according to protected, Reserved and Unclassed and 2) Administrative control by Revenue and Forest Dept.

Table No. 4.6 :- The information regarding production and value of major and minor forest products is displayed in this table. The information pertains to Poona and Aurangabad circles as the districtwise break up is not available for the concerned years.

EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY

Table No. 5.1 :- Factory statistics of the district is given in table No. 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3. The factories are classified into 29 Industry groups and the tables

depict information for calendar years 1963 and 1964. Table No. 5.1 gives average daily employment of Adults, Adolescents and children sexwise and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed returns under the Act. The average daily employment for factories not submitting returns is also estimated and given in the table. It is observed that the no. of factories has decreased in the year 1964, with the corresponding decrease in mandays etc.

Table No. 5.2 :- This table throws light on another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted in this table. There is not much variation in the classification of factories for both the years.

Table No. 5.3 :- The classification of factories according to no. of days worked in the years 1963 and 1964 is shown in this table. The number of factories working more than 300 days has decreased to 8 in the year 1964.

Table No. 5.4 :- The no. of handlooms and powerlooms, their production and average daily employment in each centre of this district is given in this table. There is considerable decrease in no. of handlooms while the no. of powerlooms has increased during 65-66. The decrease in the production in the year 1965-66 is also noted, due to the decrease in the no. of handlooms in this district.

Table No. 5.5 :- Table No. 5.5, 5.6 and 5.7 exhibit information relating to Employment Exchange and volume of employment. The information is collected from the

District Employment Officer. Table No. 5.6 gives month-wise figures of registration, vacancies notified, placements done in public and private sector and live register at the end of each month. The information on placement of scheduled caste, scheduled Tribes candidate is also supplied monthwise.

Table No. 5.6 :- The further break up of total no. of registration according to National classification such as 1) Professional, Technical and related workers 2) Administrative, scientific and Managerial workers 3) Clerical and related workers etc. for the years 63-64, 64-65 and 65-66 is shown here. The no. of persons registering their names increased in 65-66 while there is very little increase in the placement made.

Table No. 5.7 :- This table gives an idea about changes in the value of employment. The data is given for 8 different industries group for the year 64-65 and 65-66. The changes can be viewed from cols. 3 and 5 and cols. 4 and 8. In total, there is slight increase in the no. of reporting establishment and total no. of employees therein.

Table No. 5-8 :- The information regarding employment, capital, production and value of production, collected through Annual Survey of Industries in the year 1961 is compiled in this table. The information on total no. of registered factories is based on the data collected by Chief Inspector of Factories, Maharashtra.

Table No. 5.9 :- Table No. 5.9 and 5.10 deal with electricity. The information in these tables is collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and all electric

companies in the district.

Table No. 5.9 gives information about generation and consumption of electricity in Satara district. Since the private companies are only purchasing bulk supplies of electricity from the Koyana Power, the figures of generation of electricity in this district are nil. The consumption is given purposewise in this table. However, there is a slight decrease in the consumption of electricity in the year 65-66 due to the closure of the private Electric Companies at Mahabaleshwar and Panhngani resulting in the stoppage of electric consumption for some months. In the consumption of electricity the category other purposes ranks top in Satara district. It includes the power supplied for irrigation purposes.

Table No. 5.10 :- This table gives the total no. of towns and villages electrified in the district as on 31-3-61 and 31-3-66. The break up of no. of villages and towns as electrified by private companies and by Maharashtra State Electricity Board is also given. There are 186 villages and 9 towns electrified in this district.

CO-OPERATION

Table No. 6.1 :- The table gives information regarding total no. of each type of co-operative Societies-viz. Agricultural credit, Agril. non-credit and Non-Agril. non-credit as on 30-6-66 in Satara district.

Table No. 6.2 :- The information regarding co-operative banks is presented in this table. There is no industrial co-operative bank in Satara district. The data pertaining to no. of branches, no. of members, individual as well as societies, capital structure and loan advanced of all

types is compiled for District central co-operative Bank, District Land Development Bank and Co-operative Urban Banks of this district. It is seen from the table that the banks are making progress and there is a good deal of increase in share capital and loan operations along with working capital.

Table No. 6.3 :- The table gives talukawise position regarding Pre-primary agril. credit societies, members (Societies and individuals), capital structure, loans advanced, recovered etc. along with the position of percentage recovery with outstanding loans, Perusal of the table would reveal that the position of all the items has been improved in the year 1965-66 when compared with 61-62.

Table No. 6.4 :- This table gives information about other co-operative societies of different types other than Agril. credit banks, for the years 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66 (as on 30 th June) in Satara district. The data regarding no. of societies, members and capital structure show increasing trend in the year 1965-66 as compared with the previous years 61-62 and 64-65.

Table No. 6.5 :- This table displays the information of Agril. marketing societies for the year 1965-66. The same data for the year 1961-62, however, not available and as such comparison cannot be made. District total for primary societies is given separately. The talukawise information presented here covers information on value of purchase, value of sales of Agril. produce and agril. requisites. The sale proceeds as owners and agents is given. One more salient feature of this table is that the information on different items under head agril. Produce viz. Paddy, Wheat etc.

and under head agril. requisites viz. Fertilisers, seeds, implements etc. is given separately.

Table No. 6.6 :- This table narrates information regarding other co-operative societies for the year 1965-66. (The data for the year 61-62 is not available). The achievements of important activities of agril. marketing, processing, sugar factories, Handloom societies, consumer stores and Housing Societies etc. in the year 1965-66 have been presented in this table.

Table No. 6.7 :- The information regarding money lenders and their loan activities during 61-62 and 65-66 is given in this table. As regards the talukawise break up of the information, the same is not given as it is not available. From the table it is seen that no. of money lenders and loans advanced by them to the traders has been decreased in 65-66 when compared with 61-62, whereas loans advanced to non-traders show the increasing trend in the same period.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Table No. 7.1 :- This table is adopted from the census Hand Book of Satara District (1961). This two way table gives us the information on no. of Physicians, Surgeons & dentists; nurses, Pharmacists and other medical health technicians. The sexwise classification and classification according to rural and urban areas is also given.

Table No. 7.2 :- This table shows the medical facilities available in the district. The material is presented for two years 1961 and 1965 and shows the no. of hospitals, maternity homes, dispensaries, primary health centres, doctors, nurses, beds and indoor and out door patients treated.

The information is presented for each taluka separately. The material includes only public and public aided institutions. The information of all the items reported shows increasing trend in the year 1965 except a slight decline in the no. of vaidyas and female outdoor patients treated.

Table No. 7.3 :- The break up of District totals of indoor and out door patients treated during both the year 1961 and 1965 (shown in table No. 7.2) in 25 diseases is available in this table. The information of surgical operations is given against item 26. The total at item 27 is total of item 1 to 25. The total no. of deaths in the year 1965 has decreased ^{to 1961} the death due to small pox, tuberculosis, injuries, poisoning etc. have registered a considerable increase in the above period.

Table No. 7.4 :- This table shows data about births, deaths, and infant deaths for the years 1961 and 1965. The figure of infant deaths relates to deaths of children below one year. The information is collected from Assistant Director of Public Health. The no. of births and infant deaths have increased. The decrease in deaths is an effect of good facilities of public health.

Table No. 7.5 :- This table shows the no. of deaths due to principal causes in the district during 1961 to 1965. The causes of deaths shown are cholera, small pox, Plague, fever, dysentery, Diarrhoeas, respiratory diseases, suicide and other causes. Other includes diphtheria, chicken pox, poliomyelitis, leprosy, cancer, deaths from child birth etc. The deaths have registered considerable decline in 1965 as compared to 1961 due to availability

of more medical aid etc.

Table No. 7.6 :- The talukewise data presented here give information on no. of primary vaccination, revaccination and cholera inoculation during the year 1964 and 1965. There is considerable increase in cholera inoculation whereas no. of primary vaccination below one year has decreased.

Table No. 7.7 :- This table shows information on B.C.G. vaccination. The same is given for two years 1963 and 1964. The information relates to total tested, total not tested, absents, vaccinated and non-vaccinated.

Table No. 7.8 :- The information on hygienic drinking water supply is available in this table. The items covered are no. of villages without any drinking water source and with inadequate supply. Presuming that all the remaining villages have the hygienic source of water, no. of pumps, tube wells, hand pumps well and conserved tanks is given.

EDUCATION

Table No. 8.1 :- This table gives data of literacy in each taluka of Satara district. The no. of literates sex-wise is given for rural and urban areas separately. Side by side with this, the percentage of literacy for each taluka for urban area and rural area and for males and females separately is given in this table.

Table No. 8.2 :- This table gives information for rural population only. The total no. of illiterates, and literates with different level of education is given sexwise.

Table No. 8.3 :- The table is on the same pattern as that of 8.2. However, two educational levels, technical

and non-technical are added. The information pertains to urban areas only. The talukwise position could not be shown on account of non-availability of data.

Table No. 8.4 :- This table shows the talukwise no. of different types of educational institutions and the total no. of pupils (boys and girls) and teachers (trained and untrained) for each type of institutions in the year 61-62 and 65-66. The information pertains to academic year. The no. of primary, secondary and higher institutions alongwith the teaching staff and pupils have increased in 65-66. However, the no. of pre-primary institutions, and special schools have declined in the above period.

Table No. 8.5 :- This table shows the no. of backward class students and concession given to them at each level of education- preprimary to special. The other backward class students included economically backward class students also. The information pertains to academic year 1965-66. The data for 1961-62 is not available.

Table No. 8.6 :- The total no. of students taking benefits under the scheme of free studentship as economically backward class students and total value of such concessions for all educational levels for the district as a whole is shown in this table for the year 64-65 and 65-66. The information for 61-62 is not available. The beneficiaries reported above are as per revised Govt. orders.

Table No. 8.7 :- Every year the state Government is giving grants to Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for recovering some percentage of expenditure incurred by them on primary education. This table gives information

about actual amount of such grants (normal and plan) to local bodies in this district during the academic years 1964-65 and 1965-66.

Table No. 8.8 :- This table shows total no. of villages having schools and those without schools, as on 31-3-66. Further break up of villages without primary school is given in different population ranges. The information is collected from Parishad Education Officer, Zilla Parishad Satara. Data for 1961 is not available.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

Table No. 9.1 :- This table gives information on length of railway in this district. There is only one gauge namely meter gauge in this district.

Table No. 9.2 A and 9.2 B :- These two tables give us an idea about the length of roads of various types and categories in the district as on 31st March 61 and 31st March 1966. Table No. 9.2 A gives information for roads under Zilla Parishad and building and Communication department. The classification into different category as N.H. S.H., MDR, MR and classification according to type of surface such as cement concrete, F.T. WPM is also given. The total road mileage shows an increasing trend.

In table No. 9.2B, the information on length of roads under municipal authority is given. The total municipal roads have been increased in the district. The information is given for each municipality separately.

Table No. 9.3 :- This table presents data about motor vehicles in the Poona Region. Poona Region consists of A'nagar, Poona, Satara and Solapur districts. The term motor vehicles includes motorcycles, cars, Taxis, Rikshws, stage carriages, Lorries, ambulances, school buses, tractors, etc. This information is not available for each

district separately and hence the data for Poona Region as a whole given. The reference date is 31-3-1961 and 31-3-1966. The no. of motor-cycles and cars have increased considerably.

Table No. 9.4 :- The data presented here relates to Nationalized Road Transport. The information on no. of routes, Route distance, vehicles on roads per day, no. of Fleets, average daily earnings etc. is given as on 31-3-61 and 31-3-66. Satara S.T. Division consists of whole Satara district and parts of Sangli and Sholapur district. The data as on 31-3-61 pertains to Poona Division as the present Satara Division was not in existence then.

Table No. 9.5 :- Every year a traffic census is conducted on different roads. The table represents the data of the traffic census conducted in May 1965. The table gives information regarding no. of vehicles, light motor vehicles, medium heavy motor vehicles and slow moving vehicles and total traffic intensity in 24 hours.

Table No. 9.6 :- This table gives information on no. of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, postmen, telephones and Radio licences issued. The information is as on the last day of the financial year of 61-62, 64-65 and 65-66. The increase in 1965-66 in no. of post offices, telephones and Radio licences is considerable. However, there is an decrease in the no. of postmen due to the abolition of posts of village postman during the year 1965-66.

Table No. 9.7 :- The classification of all villages in the district according to distance from the post office is presented here. The information is presented for each

taluka separately. It will be seen that there are 382 villages having post offices. Persons in 228 villages have to walk a distance of more than 6 Kms. for a post office.

Table No. 9.8 :- The material presented here pertains to rural broadcasting. It gives the no. of radio sets and villages where radio sets are installed. This talukwise information is the position as on 31-3-65 and 31-3-66. The no. of villages having Rural Broadcasting sets alongwith such sets have increased in the year ending 31-3-66 as compared with 31-3-65.

LOCAL BODIES

Table No. 10.1 :- This table presents material on income and expenditure of local bodies. The local bodies covered under this table are village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. The information is for years 1961-62 and 1965-66. The no. of village panchayats increased from 729 to 787. There is a considerable increase in the income and expenditure of Village Panchayats and municipalities in the year 1965-66.

Table No. 10.2 :- The break up of the information on income and expenditure of village panchayats is given in this table. This break up is two way. On the one hand the information for each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand the total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads and income from taxes, fees, donations, contribution and expenditure on Administration, public works, sanitation etc. The information for two years 61-62 and 64-65 is given here. The income of Village Panchayats has increased by 38 lakhs of rupees, in 65-66 while

expenditure increased by Rs. 31 lakhs.

Table No. 10.3 A & 10.3 B :- This table is on the same lines that of 10.2. The break up of income and expenditure of Zilla Parishad in 64-65 and 65-66 in different sub-heads is given in these two tables. Both the income and expenditure of Zilla Parishad has increased in the year 65-66. Income has increased on account of more Government grants. Expenditure increased due to added expenditure under the head General Administration, C.D.F. etc.

Table No. 10.4 :- The information on income from and expenditure on different sub-heads (of the Municipality) is displayed here. The information for each municipality is given separately. The reference years are 1961-62 and 1965-66. The income and expenditure reported shows an increasing trend in the year 65-66, when compared with the year 1961-62.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

Table No. 11.1 :- Schemes in the 3 rd Five Year Plan have been classified into district, divisional or state levels according to whether the benefits accruing due to implementation of the schemes, extend to district, division or state. The data in this table relate to the position of expenditure according to various development sub-heads in the years 61-65, 65-66 and 1961-66 which is further classified according to the Schemes implemented in the State and local sectors.

Table No. 11.2 :- This table gives the details regarding important physical achievements of the 3 rd Five Year Plan Schemes implemented in Satara District. For assessing the progress the data is tabulated for the first four years of the 3 rd Plan, fifth year of the III Plan and ultimately for the entire 3 rd Five Year Plan.

Table No. 11.3 :- Tables 11.3 to 11.5 give information about the community development blocks in the district. Table 11.3 gives the general information about the no. of blocks of C.P.A. Pattern in each stage, the population covered under these blocks and inhabited and deserted villages. The total no. of C.P.A. Pattern blocks is 17½ covering an area of 10137.9 Sq. Km.; 1279476 persons in 1175 villages are covered by these blocks.

Table No. 11.4 :- This table gives information about the expenditure incurred according to stage I, stage II and post stage II for the period ending 31-3-65, during 65-66 and upto 31-3-66.

Table No. 11.5 :- This table presents the information on physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks in Satara district for the years 64-65 & 65-66.

PRICES

Table No. 12.1 :- Since the Chinese aggression on our northern frontier, the price problem become day by day of special importance. Bureau of Economics and Statistics through its district agency of the District Statistical Officer is collecting the retail prices of important commodities every Friday. This table gives the monthly averages of prices of important commodities from January 1964 to December 1965. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the District Head Quarter the averages shown above for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No. 12.2 :- Regulated markets has become the necessity of to-days life. There are 4 regulated markets (with sub-markets) at Satara, Karad, Purgason and Phaltan. The information regarding the area under each regulated market alongwith arrivals and value of sales for each regulated commodity is given in this table. The information for each regulated market is given separately for the years 1961-62, 63 and 1965-66.

Table No. 12-3 :- This table gives consumer price Index number for working class of Sholapur Centre, which is also applicable to working class of Satara district. The index is worked out by the Labour Dept. taking into consideration the principles laid down by Lakdawala Committee. The index for food, fuel and lighting, clothing, house rent, miscellaneous etc. has also been given for the years 1949, 1951, 56, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, and 1965, monthwise. The year 1927 is taken as the base year for working out this index.

MISCELLANEOUS

All the other tables that cannot be included in any earlier section of the chapter are included in this section.

Table No. 13.1 :- This table presents information on police strength and crimes in the year 1961 and 66. There are two parts of the table. First of its part relates to strength of police and gives information about no. of superintendents, inspectors and constables. They are further divided in permanent and temporary cadres. The second part relates to strength of police force and gives information about no. of out posts, police stations, cognisable and non-cognizable crimes, etc. Though the reference year for this

table is called every year, the information of total cost of the police force is given for financial years 1961-62 & 1965-66.

Number of cognizable crimes has been increased, whereas the non-cognizable crimes decreased in the year 1966.

Table No. 13.2 :- The material presented here relates to cases decided by courts in this district. The information is given for two years 1961 and 1966. The break up of cases into civil and criminal in the first place, into original and appellate in the second place and lastly into Regular and miscellaneous is given. The figures, however, do not include the cases decided by the District Magistrate and Executive magistrate of Satara district.

Table No. 13.3 :- The information about talukawise cinema theatres is given in this table. The information pertains to permanent theatres as well as for semi-movement and touring theatres of this district, for the year 1964 and 1965.

Table No. 13.4 :- The table is self explanatory. Number of banks and the population covered by them as on 31-3-63 is given in this table.

Table No. 13.5 :- This table gives information about joint stock companies as on 31-3-63 and 31-3-65. Companies are classified as companies limited by shares and all companies limited by guarantees and associations not for profit. Their further break up into public and private is given which shows the decreasing trend. The information is collected from Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay.

Table No. 13.6 :- With a view to judge the achievements of Life Insurance Corporation, the comparative data for two successive years 64-65 and 65-66 is presented here. The data reported here shows downward trend regarding number of insurance policies issued and also, amount insured.

Table No. 13.7 :- Small Savings are of paramount importance from the view point of conserving funds for development purposes. As such, the data as regards gross and net collections under different schemes of small savings is presented in this table. The data for Schemes ND certificate, 10 year Def. certificates, 15 year Annuity certificates, post office savings bank, C.T.F. and others, is given separately for the year 64-65 and 65-66. The total net collections in 65-66 have been increased by about 4 lakhs over the year 64-65.

Table No. 13.8 :- Land Revenue forms one of the sources of revenue of the state. The talukawise information about the arrears in the previous years, Demand for the year, collection during the year and the arrears for next year is given. The data is presented for the years 1961-62 and 1965-66. There are no arrears in any taluka of this district at the end of the year 1965-66.

Table No. 13.9 :- The information about registration of documents is given in this table. The information is given separately for each taluka. The material covers the items such as net income from registration, Documents registered and value of property transferred for the year 1964 and 1965. Number of documents and net income have decreased whereas the data for the rest of the items show increase.

Table No. 13.10 :- The results of the 1962 General Elections are presented here in two parts. The first part deals with the results of Assembly Constituencies; while the other with the parliamentary Constituencies. It gives the no. of total votes polled, its percentage to total voters and no. of polling stations etc. For Assembly seats the % varied from 61 to 79. The same was between 63 & 64 for parliamentary constituencies. There are 10 Assembly Constituencies and 2 Parliamentary Constituencies. Two talukas viz. the taluka of Shirala and Walwa of Sangli district are merged in Karad Parliamentary Constituency.

List of Important Subjects :-

L-1 to L-5 :- These tables give the information regarding list of hospitals, dispensaries, primary health centres, railway stations, dak bungalows, inspection bungalows, regulated markets and list of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes in Satara District. Except L-5 all other lists provide the Talukawise information readily.

Trends in Selected Indicators :-

These indicators throw light on the various aspects such as population, agriculture, livestock, factory employment, electricity, co-operation, education, medical and health, transport and communications, community development, local self Government etc. for the years 1950-51, 1955-56, 1960-61 to 1965-66, thereby giving the idea of the overall progress in the district of Satara. The information has been collected from the respective departments.

Selected Indicators of Taluka Development :-

The tables from 1 to 8 (Indicator 1 to 15)

show the various talukwise indicators such as density of population per square kilometre, cultivable area per agricultural worker, net area sown per agricultural worker, percentage of gross irrigated to net area sown, workers employed per lakh of population, percentage of villages electrified, length of roads per lakh of population, percentage of primary school-going children and hospital beds per lakh of population, etc. in Sagar District. The various data required for working out the indicators have been collected from the respective district heads of the district.

CHAPTER - III

An Analytic Review of Sectorial Trends

In The Third Five Year Plan

MAHARA - DISTRICT.

An attempt has been made in the following pages to present the facts and figures which give an idea regarding several Socio-Economic features of the Satara Dist. which occurred as a result of various developmental activities undertaken during the 3rd Five Year Plan period i.e. from 1961-62 to 1965-66. The impact of various developmental activities can better be seen from the sectorial trends in respect of Agriculture and allied fields like Livestock and Poultry, Employment, Electric Consumption, Medical facilities or Civic amenities, Education, Communications, extent of credit and Banking facilities and things of the kind.

For sake of analytical review, the facts and figures prior to 3rd Five Year Plan and at the end of the 3rd Plan are utilised here.

3.1 - Agriculture - Agriculture backwardness is one of the prominent features of our Agro-Economy even to-day. This is more true in respect of the State of Maharashtra and that of Satara district in particular. The hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scanty and uncertain rains in the eastern Zone, inadequate irrigational facilities, meagre use of chemical fertilizers, lack of guidance etc. all these have marred the productivity per acre of land.

The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on the important aspects of agriculture in Satara district. It can also be assessed from this, the position of Satara district in the Poona Division and the position of different talukas within the district.

3.2 - Percentage gross sown area

The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net sown area and thereby the feasibility of double cropping can be assessed from the following table

From the above figures, it will be seen that percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown for district as a whole has been decreased by one percent from 1960-61 to 1964-65. This is also the case in respect of Poona Division. However, the district percentage is greater than the percentage of Poona Division in both the years. In spite of this increase in gross and net area sown in Satara district, the acreage under double cropping has not correspondingly increased in the same period. On the contrary the acreage under double cropping has been reduced. The decrease is noted in the talukas of Koregaon and Phaltan. In the talukas of Wai, Mahabaleshwar, Jacli and Karad the acreage under double cropping was more or less the same. The increasing trend in Man and Patan talukas was found as compared to the figures of 1960-61.

3.3 - Productivity of Important Crops :-

The principal crops of the district are Jowar, Bajara, Rice, Wheat, Gram, Tur, Groundnut, Sugarcane and Cotton. The productivity of these crops in Satara district can be assessed from their respective yield rates per hectare. The following table will furnish this information and the position of the district in the Poona Division will also be seen from this.

From the above figures it is seen that for some important crops yield rates were good in 1960-61 while for others yield rates were good in 1964-65 in Satara district. In 1960-61, yield rates of Jowar, Wheat, Gram, Tur, Sugarcane (in terms of Gur) and cotton were better when compared to their respective yield rates in 1964-65. In 1964-65, yield rates were good in respect of Bajra, Rice and Groundnut (pods), in Satara district. When compared to the yield rates of Poona division, it will be seen that in 1964-65, except sugarcane (in terms of Gur) the position of Satara district was better.

3.4 - Gross Value of Agril. Production:-

Agril. Production plays vital role in our economy as a whole. Prosperity and progress in India are geared up with the large agricultural production and the income earned by the agriculturists. The figures given below will throw light on the per capita (Rural Population) value of agricultural output in the different districts of Poona division for the years 1960-61 and 1961-62.

It will be seen from these figures that the per capita value is constant in Anagar and Sholapur districts while it is decreased by Rs. 2 in Poona, Rs. 4 in Satara and Rs. 7 in Kolhapur. Only in Sangli district it is increased by Rs. 4. However, both in 1960-61 and 1961-62 the district of Satara stands last in respect of per capita gross value of agril. output.

3.5 - Irrigation :- In Satara district, percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 127 in 1960-61, while in 1964-65 it was 130 percent. The corresponding figures for Poona division were 117 percent

and 122 percent in 1960-61 and 1964-65 respectively. However, percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was almost same (12 percent for Satara district and 10 percent for Poona Division) both in 1960-61 and 1964-65.

The talukwise position of gross irrigated to net irrigated area can be seen from the following table No. 4.A

As far as Satara district is concerned, very little increase is seen from the above figures; while the figures of Poona division are the same both in 1960-61 and 1964-65 in respect of percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area.

It will be revealed from the above table, that percentage of net irrigation to the net cropped area is the highest in Ihaltan taluka and/lowest in Jaoli Taluka.

Phaltan taluka is well served by Nira Right Bank Canal since 1933. Hilly areas are backward in the irrigation facilities.

3.6 - Changes in the cropping pattern :-

The figures supplied below throw light on the changes in the cropping pattern over a period from 1960-61 to 1964-65 in Satara district.

Little increase in the area under Wheat, Sugar-cane, Cotton and groundnut has been observed over a period of four years of the 3rd Five Year Plan. The area

under food crops decreased from 70.07 percent to 68.09 percent during the same period, resulting in the increase in the area under non-food crops.

In case of irrigation, the area irrigated increased from 101429 hectares to 107592 hectare, the increase being 6 percent. The area irrigated under sugarcane increased from 9869 hectare to 10924, the increase being 11 percent. The area irrigated under Jowar increased from 30,000 hectare to 37000 hectare, the increase being 23 percent. In case of Bajra and Rice, the increase is 10 and 13 percent respectively. However, the decrease is observed in case of Gram and Groundnut i.e. 24 and 26 percent respectively. The area irrigated by non-food crops has been increased by 20 percent due to the increase in cotton irrigation (127 percent increase) in 1960-61 to 1964-65.

3.7 - Agril. Credit and outstanding dues :-

At present, agril. credit is the vital strength of our agro-economy. The figures enumerated below will no doubt disclose the span of agril. Co-operative credit etc. during the 3 rd Five Year Plan period in Satara Dist.

It is apparent from the above that the loans advanced by Agril. Cooperative Societies increased by 56 percent as at the end of 3rd Plan; while the amount outstanding increased by 95 percent as compared to the position at the beginning of the 3rd Plan. Loan advanced per member was Rs. 141 in 1960-61 which rose to Rs. 221 in 1965-66.

The loans advanced by Land Development Bank also shown upward trend. Huge outstanding also is there due to the policy of advancing long term loans for agril. development for which the-recovering were spread up over a longer period.

3.8 - Agril. Wage Rates :-

Agril. Wage Rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. For each district three centres are selected and from three selected Rural Centres data on agril. wage rates are being collected.

As far as Satara district is concerned the selected rural centres are 1) Kale from Karad Block 2) Koregaon from Koregaon Block and 3) Limb from Satara Block.

Generally it is seen that wage rates in respect of male (unskilled) at Kale & Koregaon centres are more in the years 1965 and 1966 due to the nearness of towns. The male field labourers get wages between Rs. 2 to Rs. 2.70 and the female labourers get Rs. 0.93 to Rs. 1.16. Skilled workers like carpenters and Blacksmiths get wages of Rs. 4 to 5, whose services are still required for agril. sector of our economy.

It will be seen that due to the overall rise in prices, agril. wage rates are also found increased in 1966.

3.9 - Livestock :- In the year 1966 the 10 th quinquennial livestock census was carried out throughout India. Animal Husbandry in India, from the point of view of its substantial contribution by way of providing income and drought power to farmers; subsidiary food to human population etc. has a great impact on our rural economy. The figures provided below in this respect are the indicators of development of our economy. The number of livestock, particularly Bovine and Ovine population in relation to per hectare cultivable land is one of them.

The number of livestock per 100 hectare of cultivable land in 1961 was 112, while it was 105 in 1966, in Satara district. The figures for Poona Division are 124 and 116 in the years 1961 and 1966 respectively. The position of Satara district appears to be lower both in the years 1961 and 1966 as compared to the figures of Poona Division.

Within the district, the taluka of Man is having largest no. of livestock per hectare of cultivable

land. The no. of livestock per hectare cultivable land is more than the district average. The talukas of Man, Karad, Wai and Khandala, have also the livestock more than the district average. The remaining talukas have the livestock less than the district average, the lowest being the talukas of Phaltan and Jaoli.

3.10 - Poultry :- In 1961 total poultry in Satara district was 6.58 lakhs while the same was 7.76 lakhs in 1966. The no. of poultry per 1000 population thus increased from 460 in 1961 to 543 in 1966. The rate of increase in poultry per 1000 human population in Satara district is 18 percent from 1961 to 1966. The same is only 10 percent in respect of Poona division. This comparison, however, is based on constant human population factor of 1961 for both the years 1961 and 1966.

3.11 - Consumption of Electricity

The per capita consumption of Electricity in Satara district in 1960-61 was 4.53 KWH. In 1961-62 it was 4.91 KWH, while in 1964-65 it rose to 26 KWH. However, in the year 1965-66 the figure is little decreased due to the stoppage of private companies in Mahabaleshwar and Panchgani towns.

3.12 - Enrolment at employment exchange and

vacancies notified :- Employment generation is no doubt the vital issue in the country like India. Our planning is paying due attention in offering employment opportunities and reducing the unemployment.

The position of Satara district as regards the registration in the employment exchange and the vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the figures supplied in the below table.

From the above figures everywhere decrease is noticed. This is because of the fact that statistics of employment exchange alone is not enough to indicate the trend of the extent of unemployment etc. and the opportunities provided in Satara district. Employment provided in private Sector, not through the employment exchange, is also substantial one and hence it will not be appropriate to draw conclusions and comment upon them on the basis of employment exchange Statistics, alone.

3.13 - Increase in Indoor & Outdoor Patients

Treated :- The increase can be seen from the following figures :-

Both the indoor and outdoor patients treated has increased over four years of the 3 rd Plan. The increase is about 8 percent for the period under reference.

3.14 :- Increase in No. of Students of different Categories :- Education is the backbone of all sided development. The percentage of pupils taking education either in Primary, Secondary or higher has increased during the 3 rd Plan period.

The figures supplied below will show the percentage increase in 1965-66 over 60-61 in respect of different types of education etc.

The increase in respect of girl students is notable for all the three types noted above.

3.15 :- Increase in road length per 100 sq. Km.

Roads of any kind have great significance in the Social Life of a nation. This is more true in respect of the State of Maharashtra and particularly the hilly districts of it. The road facilities available in the district could better be judged by working out road length per 100 sq. Km.

In Satara district the road length per 100 Sq. Km. was 23.77 in 1960-61; while in 1965-66 the same was

30.31. In 60-61 the total road length was 2481 Km. The same has been increased by 683 Km. in 1965-66.

3.16 :- Increase in Banking facilities in

Proportion to population :- In the modern days the emergence of Banking facilities is inevitable. In 1961 there were 41 Banks of different types in Satara district. The same rose to 54 in 1966. That means in 1961, there were 3 bank offices per lakh of population in Satara district. The no. rose by 1 in 1966. This indicates that day by day people are taking advantages of banking facilities both in urban and rural areas of the district.

3.17 :- Prices :- Price phenomenon is a matter of pivotal importance in every day life. This has greatly been felt since November 1962.

As it is the case, the work of collection of prices at each district head quarter in Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. From this data changes in the prices of important commodities during the 3rd Five Year Plan period can broadly be seen. The price trends in retail prices have thumping impact on the masses at large.

The price trend for the items like cereals and pulses under Food, Sugar, Gur and edible and other Oils, condiments and spices, vegetables and such other items of daily consumption, shirting, sarrees, Dhotis etc. under clothing, Kerosene, Charcoal, match box, firewood etc. under Fuel, tea & coffee under Beverages, and washing soap, Fan, Supari, Tobacco, Cigarettes, Bidī, Hair Oils,

penicillin, quinine etc. under Miscellaneous articles has a tendency to rise in an upward direction since 1962.

The consumer price index for Sholapur for item Food in 1962 was 423 which rose by 24 percent in 1965. As regards Fuel and lighting the same was 389 in 1962 which increased to 397 i.e. by 2 percent. As far as clothing is concerned, the price index in 1962 was 279 which rose to 416 in 1965 with a percentage increase of 49 percent over a period of three years.

For Miscellaneous items of consumption the Sholapur price index (which is applicable to Satara district) was 498 in 1962. The same was 510 in 1965.

To conclude, we may say that there is a rise of 36 percent in the retail prices as prevailing at the end of 3rd Plan, over the prices in 1961.

C H A P T E R I V
THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN
1961-1966.

1) INTRODUCTORY :-

The basic objective of planned development in India lies in providing the masses the opportunity to lead a good life in all its spheres. Planning, therefore, aims at gainful employment and improving living standards and working conditions of our masses.

Viewed from this fundamental aim of our Five year Planning, two Five year Plans have helped to strengthen the foundations of our economic and social life and also stimulated industrial growth and scientific and technological know-how. After this has been done, the Third Five Year Plan seeks to give a more precise meaning to the social objectives of our Constitution and attempts for their realisations.

To Maharashtra, Third Plan is of more significance as it is the first Five Year Plan of the newly formed composite state. The revised Plan out lay is fixed at Rs.- 436 crores for Maharashtra, which is practically double as compared to that of the Second Plan. Consequently the per capita out lay has also gone up from Rs.57.74 in the Second Plan to Rs. 110 in the Third Plan period.

Unlike in earlier two plans, the schemes in the Third Five Year Plan have been classified according to whether the benefits of the scheme extend to a particular district or many districts in a division or many districts

irrespective of the division. Thus, the schemes were termed as 'District Level', 'Divisional Level', 'State Level' etc. as stated above.

2) Dist.Level Plan Schemes In Satara Dist.:-

There were in all 75 district level plan schemes implemented in Satara district during the period of III Five Year Plan. Out of these schemes 44 schemes were executed in the state sector i.e. through Government machinery proper; while 31 were implemented under Local Sector i.e. the Zilla Parishad machinery. Three schemes, however, have been implemented in both the sectors. These are, namely, MIN- 7 (Minor Irrigation Works), SSI - 11 (Industrial Co-operatives including co-operatives of handicrafts workers) and WS - 6 (Village Panchayat water supply and drainage scheme). The table 4.1 supplied below gives the information on number of schemes implemented in state and Local sectors, in Satara District, according to the major heads of development etc.

3) Progress of Plan Expenditure In Satara Dist.:-

An amount of Rs. 722.09 lakhs was spent in the implementation of the district level plan schemes in Satara district during the period of Third Five Year Plan i.e. 1961-1966. That means the per capita plan expenditure comes to Rs. 50 in the district.

However, the position of the amount spent during 1961-66, on various heads of development, reveals that the pace of expenditure is not uniform in both the state and Local Sectors. Bulk of expenditure (more than 50 %) has been spent during last two years of the 3rd Plan- i.e. during 1964-65 and 65-66. This is prominently seen under the major heads of Agril. Programmes, Transport and communications and social services.

Under the major head Agril. Programmes, Rs.324.03 lakhs were incurred (Rs. 279.65 lakhs from state and Rs.-44.43 lakhs from Local Sectors) during the Third Plan period i.e. 1961-66. But out of this total expenditure only Rs. 152.27 lakhs were utilized in the first four years of the Plan; while Rs. 171.81 lakhs were spent in the last year of the 3rd plan i.e. 65-66.

As far as the major head of co-operation and community Development is concerned, Rs. 139.86 lakhs were incurred (Rs. 27.85 lakhs from state and Rs. 112.01 lakhs from Local) during 1961-66. Here also the pace of expenditure was more in the last years of the plan.

Under Industries and Mining an amount of Rs.1.36 lakhs (Rs. 0.63 and Rs. 0.73 lakhs from state and Local sectors respectively) was utilized during 1961-66. Out of this total expenditure Rs. 0.63 lakhs were spent during the first three years of the plan; while Rs. 0.73 lakhs were spent during the last two years. In 1965-66 Rs.0.41 lakhs were spent.

For the major Head Transport and communications an amount of Rs. 93.94 lakhs was utilised under Local Sector for the period 1961-66. In the first year of the Plan Rs. 3.28 lakhs were spent; while during the second year, Rs. 53.29 lakhs were spent. During 3 rd, 4 th and 5 th year of the plan Rs. 3.89, 19.12 and 14.36 lakhs respectively were incurred in Satara District.

As far as the major head of development " Social-Services " is concerned, it has been observed that during the first three years of the plan, Rs. 70.03 lakhs were spent; while during 1964-65 and 1965-66 Rs. 47.19 and Rs. 46.63 lakhs respectively, were spent. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 162.85 lakhs, under this major head, during 1961-66 Rs. 89.31 and Rs. 73.54 lakhs respectively, were spent from state and Local sectors in this district.

4) In the following lines schemewise progress from the view point of expenditure as well as physical achievements is discussed.

Under Agril. Production Programme, 38 schemes were implemented- 24 in state and 14 in Local sector. The schemes oilseeds Development (AGR - 27), Plant Protection (AGR -33) in state sector have showed very good progress, Under Local sector the schemes Horticultural Development (AGR - 31), Intensive Cultivation of food crops (AGR-34) have also showed good progress. However, progress of the Schemes Cotton Development (AGR -26) and Taluka seed farm (AGR-36) from state sector and New Agril. School (AGR - 21), Improved Agril. Implements (AGR - 24) from Local sector was slow in Satara Dist.

Under soil conservation, progress of all the three schemes (2 from state and 1 from Local) was satisfactory. Under Minor Irrigation four Schemes were implemented and the progress of Schemes Pumping sets (MIN-2) and Minor Irrigation Works (MIN-6) was found good. Three schemes under Animal Husbandry were implemented in Local sector. But except the Scheme Construction of Veterinary Dispensary Buildings (AH-2), the progress of supplementary Cattle Breeding centre (AH-7) and District Premium bull Scheme (AH-8) was satisfactory. Same is the case for the Scheme Loans for purchase of Cattle (MLK - 3 A) under Dairy Development.

Progress of the scheme Assistance to Village Panchayats for Afforestation (FOR-1) in Local Sector was better than other schemes in State Sector. The Scheme Afforestation for Soil Conservation (FOR-7) showed poor performance in this district.

Under Fisheries and Warehousing and Marketing all the Schemes (6 and 2 respectively) were implemented in the State Sector. Progress of Assistance for purchase of fishery requisites (FSH-2), Scheme for Development of Coop. fisheries (FSH - 23) and Development of Grading (WM-5) was good. But no expenditure was made under the Schemes Estt. of fish farms (FSH -6), Preservation, Marketing Facilities for Fish (FSH-10) and Grant of Loans to Fishermen (FSH-24).

Although the progress for some Schemes as shown above was poor, overall position for the major head Agril. Programmes was satisfactory.

The progress of the Schemes of Co-operation implemented in the State Sector was good. So also, under the sub-head 'Community Development' all the schemes were satisfactorily implemented, in Local Sector.

Progress of expenditure under the major head Small Scale Industries was not satisfactory in both the Sectors. Under Transport and Communications all the three schemes were implemented in the Local Sector and their progress was good.

As far as the major head " Social Services " was concerned, the general performance of expenditure in both the sectors was also satisfactory. Progress of the Schemes Primary School Buildings (GE-6), Malaria Eradication (PH-2), B.C.G. Vaccinations (PH-4), Small pox (PH-7), Village Well Water Supply Scheme (WS-5), Village Panchayat Water Supply and Drainage (WS-6), Low Income Group Housing (HSG-2), Village Housing Projects (HSG - 4), and Gaathan Extension (HSG-5), was very good; while it was

not up to the mark for the schemes Basic Training of Primary Teachers (GE-4), Primary Health Centres (PH-1) and Subsidised Industrial Housing (HSG - 1).

It can be stated that eventhough the progress in a few Schemes was not up to the mark, the desired progress in the Plan expenditure, on the whole, was achieved in Satara District.

4 - B - PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS :-

Picture of Plan Schemes will not be complete unless it is linked with the physical progress of the Schemes. In fact, physical progress is of more significance than the mere expenditure, as the first provides the real fruits and benefits of the schemes to the people. The statement of important items on physical achievements is given in the Table 11.2 of the current Abstract. However, selected achievements under significant schemes are discussed in the following paras :-

I - Agricultural Programmes :-

1) Agricultural Production :- Under this important sub-head of the Agril. Programme, the schemes of distribution of improved seeds, implements, chemical fertilisers, oilseeds, horticultural development, compost, cotton development, plant protection, seed farms etc. were implemented during 3rd Plan period. More than 7000 quintals of various types of improved seeds of paddy, wheat, Jowar, Gram, Maize have been distributed to the cultivators. 6020 quintals of oil seeds, namely, groundnut were distributed during the period 1961-66 in Satara District. Additional area of 1618 acres have been brought under plantation and rejuvenation under 97 acres have been done.

Further, more than 26000 tons of chemical fertilisers such as Ammonium Sulphate, Super Phosphate, Urea, Fertiliser Mixtures, etc. have been distributed in the reference period. Nine seed farms were established in the district and in these farms the improved varieties of seeds were produced. Under the scheme of consolidation of holdings 23 villages with 47000 acres of land have been covered.

2) Soil Conservation :- Under this sub-head, contour bunding and terracing were the important schemes implemented in Satara district. About 1,50,000 acres of land was bunded and 6736 acres terraced during the 3rd Plan period and upto the end of 31-3-66 bunding in 180982 acres and terracing in 6825 acres was done.

3) Minor Irrigation :- The schemes, namely, construction of new wells, and repairs to old wells, community wells installation of running sets, bore wells, Co-operative Lift irrigation project etc. were implemented under this important sub-head. The work of 540 new wells, 4206 (repairs) old wells, 1471 pumps, 34 bandharas have been completed. 15 Co-operative Lift irrigation societies were also assisted and this way 21000 acres of additional land was brought under irrigation by the above works.

4) Animal Husbandry :- Under this programme, one veterinary Aid Centre and dispensary and one A.I. centre and two cattle Breeding centres were started. 352 premium Bulls were located in the above period in this district.

5) Dairy Development :- Loans for purchase of cattle were disbursed and financial assistance to 78 Milk-Societies and federations was given under this scheme.

6) Forests :- 215 acres of Land was brought under afforestation and 165 acres of plantation of valuable trees was done during 3rd plan period.

7) Fisheries :- Under fisheries, the schemes for assistance for purchase of fishery requisites, stocking of tanks with carp fry etc. were implemented and 99 Kg. of Nylon, 328 Kg. of Cotton were supplied for netting of fish. Stocking of 80,000 fish and 25561 Kg. netting of fish was done in the above period. Moreover, three Co-operative Societies were assisted for development of Co-operative fisheries.

8) Warehousing & Marketing :- Under this scheme of development of Agricultural marketing, four Agril. produce Market Committees were assisted.

II - Co-operation & Community Development :-

1) Co-operations:- Under this sub-head schemes like strengthening of co-operative Credit structure, Development of Co-operative Marketing, Co-operative farming in and outside the pilot areas etc. were implemented. New 26 Agril. Primary Societies were formed and 2097 members were added. 11 cooperative Marketing Societies were started and Rs.1077.31 lakhs as short term, Rs.23.30 lakhs as medium term and Rs.305.38 lakhs as long term credit was given in the 3rd plan period, in Satara district. 57 per cent of all types of outstanding loans were also recovered during the same period.

2) Community Development :- Under the scheme of C. D. Projects all the Blocks from this district have already been brought under C.D. Programmes. During the 3rd Plan period the Blocks of Phaltan, Mahabaleshwar, Jaoli, Mani and Khatav were converted from pre-Extension service

stage to I stage Blocks.

Under the scheme of Local Development works programme, 115 well works and 19 piped water supply works were under-taken and completed.

IV - Industry & Mining

Under this major head of development, the sub-head Small Scale Industries consisting of the schemes of financial Assistance to co-operative societies including weavers' Societies and handloom development was implemented in this district. Three societies were assisted during the reference period.

V - Transport & Communications

There were 2481 Km. of all types of roads in Satara district as on 31-3-61 and on 31-3-66 the road mileage was 3164 Km. Under this head 83 Km. of new District Roads were constructed and 194 Km. of road modernised; 86 Km. of Rural Roads, 3 bridges and 271 culverts were also constructed during the reference period, due to implementation of the District Level Plan Schemes.

VI - Social Services

1) Primary Education :- Under Normal Expansion of Primary Education Scheme, two ADEIS and 1209 teachers were appointed. Under the Scheme of Basic Training to Primary teachers 1005 teachers were trained. 43 primary School buildings with 89 rooms were constructed. During the above period, 75 primary schools and 52 secondary schools were started and total strength of pupils increased by 49501 and 26988 respectively. During the 3rd Plan period special schools like Sainik School and public school at Satara and Koyananagar respectively, were also started.

2) Technical Education :- ~~Existing Government~~
polytechnic at Karad was developed and 411 students were
admitted. Hostel buildings were constructed at Karad for
Engineering College and polytechnic students.

3) Medical and Public Health :- Spill over works
of cottage hospital at Karad and now civil Hospital at
Satara were almost completed and 55 additional beds were
provided. Moreover, four buildings of public Health centres
were constructed and 9 new Public Health centres were
opened. At the same time 21 Family Planning Centres were
started; and under the National Malaria Eradication Pro-
gramme the entire population of the district was covered.

4) Water Supply :- 33 Drinking water wells were
constructed and 9 villages were covered under the Village
Panchayat water supply and drainage schemes.

5) Housing :- The Schemes of subsidised Indu-
strial Housing, Low Income Group Housing, Village Housing
Projects and Extention of Viillage Gaothans were implement-
ed under " Housing Programme". 50, 80 and 343 tenements
were constructed under subsidised Industrial Housing, Low
Income Group and Village Housing Projects, respectively.

Under the Gaothan Extention Scheme, 32 villages
with 152 acres of area were covered during the reference
period.

6) Labour & Labour Welfare :-

Under these Schemes, 352 students were admitted
to I.T.I. Karad and Satara for training in the various
trades during 3 rd Plan period.

The overall picture of the 3 rd plan and the
developmental activities in Satara District can vividly
be seen from the foregoing narration.
