C H A P T E R - 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Location and

Nasik District lies between 19° 33' and 20° 53' north latitude and 73° 16' and 75° 60' east longitude and is situated partly in Tapi Basin and partly in the Upper Godavari Basin. It is bounded on the north-west side by Danga and Surat Districts of Gujrat State, on the north by Dhulia, and the north-east and east by Jalgaon District. To the east and South-east lies Aurangabad District and to the North lies Thana District.

1.2- A and Population

1.2-1 The total geographical area is 15,573 sq.kms. (6013 sq. miles) and its total population according to 1961 Census is 18,55,246. Thus, in terms of area and population, this district makes 5.08 percent and 4.64 percent respectively of Maharashtra State. The mid-census population is estimated for 1966 at 21,70,000 as per estimates given in the District Census Hand Book for Nasik District. Going according to area, Nasik Dist. ranks first in the revenue Division Bombay and fifth in Maharashtra State, and according to population, it ranks first in Bombay Division (excluding, of course, Greater Bombay) and third in Maharashtra State. If the Scheduled Tribe population is considered, Nasik District stands third in Bombay Division, with a total scheduled tribe population of 4,53,707 in the total scheduled tribe population of 13,87,229 in Bombay Division. In Maharashtra State also the position of Nasik District is third. This is due to the dense forest areas in

the western parts of this district.

1.3- Administrative set-up

1.3-1 This district is divided in 13 talukas, the area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, 1931 population and the position in the district by percentage of area and population of each taluka are as below:

1.3-2 The Nasik Zilla Parishad has been established in May 62 with 13 Panchayat Samities at Taluka level. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively except in the case of Municipal towns and Cantonment Board, which are not covered by them. However three towns viz. 1) Lasalgaon, 2) Chandor and 3) Ravalgaon which

do not have municipal councils, (but which are treated as towns in 1961 Census), are included in the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities concerned, so also the Manmad non-municipal area, which is included in the municipal town, has been given under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad. Thus, the Zilla Parishad covers 98.41% of the area and 76.06% of the population of the district. The population includes the entire rural population and only 6.23% of the urban population of the district.

1.3-3. The number of villages, number of non-municipal towns and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti is shown below:-

1.4-Topography

1.4-1. Taking into account the height, climate, rainfall and soil pattern, Nasik District can well be divided into three main parts. The first part- the western hilly tract of the Sahyadri Ranges, of Igatpuri, Peint, Durgana and Kalwan talukas and the western parts of Nasik, Dindori and Baglan talukas. This part is popularly known as "Dangi" or "Kokani" part of the district. This tract gets heavy rains of about 3600 mms. and is full of thick forests. The crops are Paddy, Nagli and Vari and the forests are rich with teak-wood and Bamboo trees and other important wealth. The other part is the sector, adjacent to this western tract, and is the sloping range extending from north to south: This tract's comprises of the eastern parts of Nasik, Igatpuri, Kalwan, Dindori and Baglan talukas and Chandor taluka. This is a shadow rainfall area with average rainfall upto 600 mms. Because of the heavy rains on the western side this eastern part is full of rivers and with a good system of well irrigation. Thereby this tract grows commercial crops like Sugarcane, Grapes and Cotton along with the main food crops of Wheat, Bajra and Pulses. The third tract is the land stretching on the eastern side of the district comprising of Malegaon, Nandgaon, Yeola, Niphad and Sinnar talukas. This area has a very low rainfall and in some parts is very uncertain. Most of the parts of Yeola, Sinnar and Nandgaon talukas are occasionally affected by scarcity. However because of good canal system on Girna, Mosam, Kadwa and Godavari rivers, the talukas of Niphad and Malegaon have been greatly benefitted and they grow commercial crops like sugarcane to a

good extent. Two co-operative and one private sugar factories are located in this area.

1.4-2 River System

Godavari and Girna are the two main rivers of the district. The other important rivers are Vaitarna, Darna, Mosam and Kadwa. Godavari rises in Brahmagiri (Near Trimbak) and drains Nasik and Niphad talukas for about 90 Kms. At a distance of 15 Kms. from its source an earthen dam is built at Gangapur. During its course, many small streams meet Godavari, the important being Kadva, Darna and Nasardi. Many small and big dams are built on these tributaries for storage and diversion canals for irrigation.

The Girna rises at the west of the district in Surgana and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon talukas. The course of Girna within the district is about 135 Kms. A big dam is built on Girna, little away from Nandgaon but its irrigation benefit is for adjoining Jalgaon district.

1.4-3. Soils

There are four kinds of soils in the district, black (Kali), red (Mal), red and black (Karad) and the light brown (Barad). Except in the uplands, black soil is found mostly in the plain areas near the beds of the rivers. This is often deep and rich and yields excellent rabi crops. Red soil is stiffer and shallower and is found mainly on hill slopes. Red and black soil is occasionally found in the hilly tracts. Light brown is the lightest of all soils, and is found on hilly lands.

1.4-4. Climate, Temperature and Rainfall.

The climate of Nasik District can broadly be classified according to three distinct seasons;

- i) Monsoon from middle of June to end of September.
- ii) Winter from October to middle of March and
- iii) Summer from middle of March to middle of June.

Except for the western slopes of Sahyadris, the district generally experiences Salubrious climate, the summer months are moderately hot. The climate of the western parts, particularly of Peint and Surgana talukas, is different from the rest of the district. The dampness and moisture make the climate unhealthy.

As regards rainfall, the distribution is affected by the presence of the Sahyadri Ranges on the western side. The rainfall is heavier in this western part and gradually declines as we go from west to east. The average rainfall in the western part is from 2000 to 3500 mms. with the highest in Igatpuri taluka. In the central part, the average rainfall ranges between 500 to 800 mms. In the eastern part the rainfall is barely 400 mms.

1.5 Special Features

The following specialities of Nasik dsitric are also notable.

- i) Grapes: With an area of about 700 hectares and production of about 15,000 tonnes.
- ii) Onions: With an area of about 12,000 hectares.
- iii) The India Security Press at Nasik Road.

- iv) The MIG factory at Ozar (Taluka-Niphad)
- v) One of the biggest stocking Centre of the Govt. of India (Food Ministry) at Manmad Junction.
- vi) The three Sugar Factories (Two Cooperative at Niphad and Dabhadi and one private at Ravalgaon).
- vii) The Co-operative Fruit Canning and Processing Industry at Fimpalgaon Basawant. (Taluka-Niphad)
- viii) The fast growing Co-operative Industrial Estate at Satpur near Nasik.
- ix) One of the main sources of supply of vegetables to Greater Bombay.

C H A P T E R - I I

Explanatory Notes

2.1 In this chapter, short notes on the tables presented in the Abstract-part, are given. There are in all 86 tables in the present District Statistical Abstract.

2.2 Climate and Rainfall

The two table Nos. 1 & 2 give the information of climate and rainfall in Nasik District (selected centres) for the years 1965 and 1966 as far as information is concerned there are 2 stations (Nasik and Malegaon) and the information is supplied by the ^{meteorological} Department, Bombay. It will be seen that the maximum temperature in Nasik rises only upto 28.8 while that of Malegaon rises upto 39.5°C.

As regards rainfall there are 3 distinct regions, western with heavy rainfall upto 3500 mms. central with an average of 600 mms. and the eastern part with less than 500 mms.

2.3 Area and Population

There are six tables (3 to 8) on this topic. The tables give the talukawise area and population according to the 1961 Census. The classification of population into rural and urban, Towns and Villages, workers and Non-workers and into Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is shown in these tables. The table No.7 gives the language and religion-wise population of Nasik District. The main characteristics of population (as per 1961 Population Census) of Nasik District, are as follows:-

a) The urban population is 25.60% with the maximum percentage of 67.34 in Nasik Taluka.

b) The biggest taluka is Nasik with a population of 3,27,281 out of the total of 18,55,246 population of the District.

c) For villages out of 1652 i.e. 42.5%, belong to the population group of "Below 500".

d) As for workers, 88% belong to 'Agriculture' group in rural areas and only 8.43 % in urban areas.

e) The percentage of scheduled caste population is only 3.66 while that of scheduled tribes is as high as 24.45 (which is the third highest in Maharashtra State, next only to Thana and Dhulia District).

2.4 Agriculture

There are in all 11 tables (9 to 19) giving the details of agricultural information mostly talukawise, for the year 1965-66, also giving data on irrigation, major and medium irrigation works in the district, Agricultural Wage Rates etc. Table No. 19 gives the information on famine and scarcity affected villages in Nasik District during the year 1966-67.

Table No. 9 gives Land Utilisation statistics. The area under forests forms 21.88% of the total geographical area. This shows the predominance of 'forests' and the 'consequential habitation of 'Scheduled Tribes'.

The total gross cropped area is 9,64,677 hectares which forms 61.93% of the total geographical area. In this respect the position of Nasik District is much better as compared to the position of other districts in Bombay Division.

Table Nos. 10 & 11 give the data on areawise crops and outturn of principal crops. It will be seen that the main

crop is 'Bajra' amongst the food-crops. Amongst the commercial crops, Sugarcane, groundnut and cotton are worth a mention especially in the talukas of Malegaon, Baglan, Niphad and Nasik.

Irrigation statistics are given in tables 12 & 13. The main source of irrigation is Govt. canals whereunder 17230 hectares are covered out of the total irrigated area of 54262 hectares. As for crops under irrigation, the important crop is sugarcane which covers 10159 hectares. Going according to talukas, Malegaon, Niphad, Nasik and Baglan are comparatively well off in irrigation facilities. The irrigation is obviously negligible in the western tract comprising the talukas of Igatpuri, Peint and Kalwan.

2.5 Animal Husbandry, Forests

Table Nos. 20 to 24 give the information on livestock Census 1966, Veterinary Statistics, Slaughter Houses, Forest area and forest products. The importance of 'Forest' in Nasik District is already stated in the foregoing paras. The total forest area is 3,40,743 hectares and the total value of forest produce was about Rs. 1,09,81,000 in Nasik District.

2.6 Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity.

There are 10 tables on these subjects (from 26 to 35).

Factory statistics (Table Nos. 26, 27 and 28) given in this abstract relate to the year 1966. It will be seen that the highest employment is provided by Printing, Publishing and allied industries. Out of the total of 19361 factory workers in Nasik District 6731 were employed in this group - the next in importance is the Bidi making industry with 6,374

working strength. The other main factories are transport, equipments and food.

Employment exchange statistics are given in tables 29, 30 & 31. Table Nos. 32-A & 32-B give the details of Govt. employees in Nasik District compiled from the Census of Public Sector employees as on 1-7-1966.

Table Nos. 34 & 35 give the 'Electricity' statistics'. It will be seen from table No. 35 that 265 villages have been electrified by the end of 1966-67. It may specifically added here that the Rural electrification programme has been taken up at a fast rate recently, while only 11 towns were electrified at the end of 2nd plan (1961); 186 villages were electrified by the end of 1965-66 and 285 villages by the end of 1966-67.

2.7 Cooperation

Table Nos. 36 to 43 present the data on 'Cooperative' movement in Nasik District. Nasik District had achieved great strides in the cooperative field in the IIIrd five year plan period and the same momentum is continued in the year 1966-67. Talukawise study of the cooperative growth is separately made in chapter III of this Review.

2.8 Medical and Public Health

Table Nos. 44 to 48 give the data on medical facilities available in each taluka, on births and deaths, Vaccination statistics and hygienic water supply sources. The medical facilities have increased considerably during the IIIrd Five Year Plan period and the pace of the service has been maintained thereafter.

2.9 Education

Talukawise literacy information as per 1961 census will be seen in Table No. 49. The urban areas have literacy percentage of 46.03 while in rural areas this percentage was only 20.32. With a complete coverage of rural areas under the "primary schools" and with the added programme of Adult education, the picture in rural areas is bound to show change in the ensuing 1971 census. Table Nos. 49 to 56, supply the information on literacy, education in Rural and Urban areas as per 1961 census; as also the number of institutions, pupils and teachers (1955-56 & 1966-67), benefits of B.C. and E.B.C. Schemes, expenditure on education and villages without primary schools.

2.10 Transport and Communication

Table Nos. 57 to 63 give the information on transport and communications in Nasik District. Table No. 57 give the 'Railway Mileage'. Table No. 58 shows the surface-wise and category wise roads in Nasik District. Table Nos. 59 & 60 show the number of vehicles and the operations of State Transport in Nasik. Table No. 61 presents the data on Traffic Census. Table Nos. 62 & 63 supply us the data on posts and telegraphs, telephones and Rural Broadcasting facilities in Nasik District.

2.11 Local Bodies

Table Nos. 64 to 67 supply the information on the income and expenditure of Local Bodies (Zilla Parishad, Panchayat Samitis, Village Panchayats and Municipal Councils) in Nasik District for the years 1955-56 and 1966-67.

2.14 Miscellaneous Information

Tables 75 to 85 give the information on Police Force, Crime Statistics, work of the civil and criminal courts, Cinema statistics, Banks, Joint stock Companies, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue Collection, News papers and periodicals printed and published in Nasik District, and statistics of General election (1967).

2.15 Selected Indicators

Table No. 86 give the Trends in selected indicators.

C H A P T E R III

Relative position of talukas in the various fields of economic progress.

3.1 Nasik District has got three geographical sectors. One of the hilly areas, other forming the main irrigated tract and the third is scanty rainfall area akin to Khandesh tract. Those basic characteristics obviously have their effect on the economic progress of the talukas concerned.

3.2 In the following paragraphs, some important developmental aspects are studied to show the relative position of the talukas:

Classes of Population

3.3 Nasik District has got 4,53,707 population of scheduled Tribes forming 24.4% of total population. This percentage for Bombay Division is 12.3% and for Maharashtra State 6.05% .

The main concentration is of course in the hilly talukas of Igatpuri, Peint, Kalwan and Dindori. The highest percentage of tribal population is in the Peint Talukax with 75.4% and the lowest in the Yeola taluka with 6.41%. In all these tribal areas, 9 tribal development blocks have been opened to cater the basic needs of the economically and socially backward tribal people, like primary agriculture, communications, schools etc.

Agricultural situation

The net area sown in the Nasik District is 9,18,342 hectares which forms 59% of the total geographical area. The gross irrigated area in Nasik District is 77,453 hectares which is 8% of the total cropped area. These percentages are higher than the respective percentage of Bombay Division

which are 46.3 and 5.1 respectively.

The net area sown per agricultural worker (cultivators and labourers) when studied, shows us that position of Yeola 2.0 hectares, Nandgaon 1.7 hectares, Sinnar 1.7 hectares, Chandor 1.5 hectares, Dindori 1.4 hectares, Malegaon 1.4 hectares, and Baglan 1.6 hectares is satisfactory, if compared to the District average of 1.4 hectares. The position of the talukas in the hilly region viz. Surgana, Kalwan, Igatpuri and Peint is quite not good with figure round about only one hectare per worker.

The percentage of gross irrigated area is very good so far as talukas of Niphad and Malegaon ^{with} 14% and 11% respectively, when compared to the district percentage of 8% ^{remaining} the talukas are either the scanty rainfall areas or the hilly areas where there is no much scope for irrigation.

Amongst the main irrigated talukas, the main crops grown are Sugarcane, Wheat and Vegetables and the areas under Sugarcane in Niphad and Malegaon talukas ^{have} increased from 99% and 2820 hectares in 62-63 to 1753 and 2919 hectares respectively in 65-66.

Co-operation

3.4. The growth of co-operative agricultural credit is quite spectacular in Nasik District during the IIIrd plan period with the loan advanced of Rs.3.33 crores in 1961-62 to Rs. 5.50 crores in 1966-67. If we study the talukawise growth, the work in talukas of Niphad, Malegaon and Baglan is notable. The district average loaning per society has increased from Rs. 35,000 in 1961-62 to Rs 45,500 in 1966-67. The figures of 66-67 for Niphad Rs. 83,000, Malegaon, Rs. 95,000

Baglan Rs. 75,000 speak of the good and substantial growth of cooperatives in these talukas.

Livestock and Poultry

3.5 The total livestock in Nasik District as per 1966 quinquennial census is 1420711 and the total poultry 367366. The rise from 1961 is 4196 in livestock and poultry almost the same but the increase is observed mainly in the urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon. The average livestock per hectare^{of} geographical area is 0.91. The highest is in Malegaon taluka and the lowest is in Surgana taluka.

Dairying as one of the main additional occupation of the common agriculturist, has developed in the talukas of Malegaon, Nasik and Nandgaon, where the number of the buffaloes in milk has been 6462, 4505 and 2190 respectively.

Poultry is another important side-occupation of the agriculturist and the main concentration is naturally in the proximity of the highly urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon talukas. The poultry is quite insignificant in the talukas of Niphad, Chandor and Yeola. The growth of poultry during the five years from 1961 to 1966 is quite significant in the talukas of Nasik and Baglan.

Education

3.6 The growth of primary education is quite notable in the district where the number of primary schools and pupils has gone up from 1608 and 1,88,709 in 1961 to 1963 and 2,68,316 respectively in 1966-67.

The growth of secondary education is also quite satisfactory in the district, where the number of schools..

Medical facilities

3.7. With ^{the} establishment of primary health centres, in all talukas, this facility has reached to the nearest possible centres from the villages in each taluka.

The number of primary health centres (and sub centres) has gone up from 8 to 18. It is quite satisfactory that in all the 13 talukas the Primary Health Centres are established.

Industrial growth

3.8. There were 261 factories and 19,961 workers at the end of 1966. If we study the talukawise break-up, the number of factory workers in Baglan, Chandor, Surgana, Peint and Kalwan are very negligible (either nil or less than 100). The position of Baglan will improve shortly with the establishment of the Co-operative Spinning Mill near Satana. In the remaining talukas the concentration is only in Sinnar (6374 Bidi workers), Malegaon (1969 powerlooms) talukas.

The talukas of Niphad, Yeola and Igatpuri are too much backward from the industrial point of view. The proposed Industrial Estate at Malegaon, Manmad (or Yeola) and a composite programme of Co-operative processing Societies will alleviate the position of this industrial backwardness to some extent.

CHAPTER IV

4.1 Introductory Progress of Plan Schemes.

Nasik District has got more than 70% of population dependent on agriculture; and as such deserves special attention on schemes related to agricultural production. The third plan, i.e. 15 years of planning, ended in 65-66 and the fourth five year plan was to have commenced in the year 1966-67. Normally the Annual Plan of 1966-67 would have to be considered in the back ground of the fourth five year plan and as a programme of the first year of the Fourth Plan. But the finalisation of the country's Fourth Plan was delayed owing to the preoccupation of the Govt. of India on border troubles and the uncertainties of foreign aid. The Govt. of Maharashtra had submitted the State's Fourth Five Year Plan of Rs. 1106.85 crores to the Planning Commission but the dimensions and the Content of the State Plan depended on the finalisation of the National Plan. In the meantime, the Annual Plan for 1966-67 was passed as an interim plan for one year without prejudice to the size and content of the State's Fourth Five Year Plan.

4.2 Third Plan in Retrospect

In Nasik District, a good programme was undertaken with spectacular achievements in Seed and Fertilisers distribution, Land Development, Soil Conservation, Irrigation (minor and medium), Cooperation and electrification, amongst the other usual schemes. The establishment of Lilla Parishad at the beginning of the 3rd Plan and its incidental upsurge on the execution of the plan schemes, had a good effect on the will and enthusiasm to carry through the Plan. The two

invasions had also affirmed the need to intensify efforts on agricultural production. All this led to good achievements in the 3rd Plan in spite of economic worries and changes in priorities because of the declaration of National Emergency.

4.3 1966-67 Annual Plan

1. With this back ground in view, the Annual Plan for 1966-67 came to be executed. The following is the break-up of expenditure on District Level schemes incurred in the year 1966-67 under Agricultural Programme.

4.3:2 This expenditure of Rs. 1.58 crores on Agricultural Schemes is 49% of the total expenditure on all the schemes in the Annual Plan 66-67, which shows that the due importance was given to intensify the food production schemes. Intensified agricultural production schemes have led to increase the agricultural outputs which have raised the rural income, helped stabilise the price levels and given a stimulus to the pace of economic development.

4.3.4 Community Development

The establishment of Zilla Parishads at District Level and Panchayat Samitis at Taluka Level have obviously added to the public participation in the overall programmes of development. All the talukas of Nasik District have already been covered by the C.D. activity and because of the heavy forest and the tribal areas 9 Tribal Development blocks are also functioning. 4.3.5 Cooperation

Planning for democratic socialism has necessarily thrown an increasing weight on cooperative organisation of the various branches of economic life. The structure of the Cooperative Organisation is based on the three tier pattern viz. one Apex body at the State level, the District bodies and the primaries at the village level. The state plans have ^{sought} to promote these organisations through active financial support in the form of Subsidies, Share Capital investments and Loans to the Cooperative institutions for expansion activities. The cooperative movement in Nasik District is well established and very mature with cent percent coverage by rural credit societies, a net work of marketing societies, the ambitious loaning programme for well irrigation of the land development bank. The two cooperative sugar factories also speak well of the cooperative spirit and organisation of the sugarcane cultivators of Malegaon and Niphad Talukas. A number of cooperative processing factories (such as Rice Mills, Gins and Presses) are functioning. The proposed Cooperative Spinning Mill near Satana (Baglan) will prove to be an additional feather in the Cap of the Cooperative Movement in Nasik District. The main achievements under the Cooperative Plan schemes in 1966-67 are as follows :-

The cooperative societies are continuing their progress that was already achieved at the end of the 3rd Plan, during the year 1966-67 also, as will be seen from the figures in Table Nos. 40 to 46 in the Statistical Abstract attached.

4.3.6 Rural Electrification

The level of electricity consumption is always regarded as a good index of the status of an economy of any part. Apart from the fact that electricity is an essential prerequisite of industrialisation and urbanisation, an important aspect of power developments in rural areas, indicates increase in agricultural development and as an aid to develop small scale industries, in rural areas. The programme of ~~xxxxx~~ rural electrification was continued vigourously, keeping in view the pace achieved at the end of 3rd Plan (1965-66).

During the year 1965-66 97 more villages have been electrified in Nasik District with a total of 283 villages out of 1652 villages in Nasik District. The programme in this year was a bit slow because of less financial allotments.

4.3.7 Roads and Communications

During the year 1966-67 an expenditure of Rs.16,30,758 was incurred on the schemes under this head of development.
