INTRODUCTION

1.1 Nasik District is situated partly in Tapi Basin and partly in the Upper Godavari Basin. It is bounded on the North West sides by Dangs and Surat Districts of Gujarat State, on the East North by Dhulia, on the North-East, lies Aurangabad District, by Jalgaon District, to the South, Ahmednagar District and to the South West lies on the east on the east Thana District.

1.2 The total geographical area is 15573 sq. kms. and its total population as per 1961 census is 18,55,246. Going according to area, this district ranks first in Bombay Division and fifth in Maharashtra State. According to population, Nasik District also ranks first in Bombay Division (excluding Greater Bombay District) and third in Maharashtra State.

1.3 Administratively, the district is divided in thirteen talukas. The area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, 1961 population and the position in district by percentage of area and population of each taluka are given below:-

Nasik Zilla Parishad with District jurisdiction and 13 Taluka Panchayat Samitis with respective taluka jurisdiction have been established since 1962. The Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis have however no jurisdiction in Municipal towns and Cantonment areas. Other towns viz. Lasalgaon, Chandor, Ravalgaon and Manmad non municipal area which do not have municipal committees are however included under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and the respective taluka Panchayat Samiti. The Zilla Parishad, Nasik covers 98.4 percent of area of 76.06 percent of the total population of the district and covers the entire rural population and 6.23 percent of urban population.

1.4 The district lies between $19^{\circ}28'$ and $20^{\circ}53'$ north latitudes and $73^{\circ}16'$ and $75^{\circ}06'$ east longitudes. Nasik District accounts for 5.08 percent of area and 4.34 percent of population of the Maharashtra State.

1.5 Taking into account the height, climate, rainfall and soil pattern, Nasik District can well be divided into three parts. The first part, comprising of Peint, Surgana talukas and western parts of Igatpuri, Nasik, Dindori, Kalwan and Baglan

/This is known as Konkan Bhag talukas and Chandor taluka. /Other part is a shadow rainfall area and gets a very low rainfall between 500 to 700 mms. This tract however grows commercial crops like Grapes, Sugarcane and food crops of Bajra, Wheat mainly on well irrigation.

The third ^{tract} stretches on the eastern side of the district comprising of Malegaon, Nandgaon, Yeola, Niphad and Sinnar talukas. This part has still less rainfall of about 500 mms. only and that too uncertain. Most of the partes of Sinnar and Yeola are quite occasionally affected by scarcity. However because of Gangapur Canal, Nandur Madhyameshwar and other important dams and the consequential canal system, passing mainly through Niphad taluka, grows commercial crops of sugarcane, onion, Grapes and vegetables. Niphad and Malegaon talukas have already got three sugar factories (2 cooperative and one private) and the demand for two more sugar factories in in the sugarcane growing areas of Nasik, Dindori, are already there.

River System

Nasik District has got five important rivers viz. Mosam, Girna, Kadwa, Godavari and Darna of which Girna and Godavari are the main sources of irrigational facilities.

The Godavari rises in Sahyadri ranges near Trimbak and flows in the Nasik and Niphad talukas for over 90 kms. The earthen dam at Gangapur (10 kms. from Nasik) is the main canal source in the District. Many other small dams have been built on the tributaries for storage and diversion canals.

The Girna rises at the west of Satmala ranges in Surgana taluka and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon talukas. The course of the Girna river in the district is about 135 kms.

Soils

There are four kinds of soils in Nasik District, Black (kali), Red (Mal), Red and black (koral) and the light brown (barad). Except in the uplands, black soil is found mostly in the plain country near the beds of river. This is often deep, rich and yields excellent rabi crops. Red soil which is stiffer and shallower is found chiefly on hill slopes and plateaus and gives only rainy season crops. Red and black koral, found occasionally in hilly tracts, yields gram, and other cold weather crops. Light brown (barad) the lightest of the soils is found on hilly lands. It yields only light crops like Nagli and varai and yields nothing if the rainfall is scanty.

1.6 Climate, Temperature and rainfall

The climate of Nasik District can broadly be classified according to three distinct seasons.

- 1) 'Monsoon' from middle of June to end of September.
- 2) 'Winter' from October to middle of March.
- 3) 'Summer' from middle of March to middle of June.

Except for the western slopes of Sahyadris, the district generally experiences salubrious climate. The summer months are moderately hot, and the temperature varies from 36° c to 43° c. Although the days are hot, the nights are cool and pleasant. The rainy season is comparatively cooler with sporadic rains distributed over the four months of monsoon. The major rainfall is during the months of July and August and at no time it is heavy. After a short spell of hot weather during the month of October, the short winter season begins and becomes fairly severe during the months of December and January. During the period, the temperature generally remains between -

contd...

during the period, the temperature generally remains between 29 c to 10 c. The winter seasons continues till middle of M March, when it imperceptably merges with summer weather.

The climate of the western parts, particularly the below Ghat area of Peint and Surgana talukas, is different from the rest of the district. The rains which begin from early June continue till middle of October and heavy downpath is generally experienced during July, August and September. The dampness, and moisture make the climate unhealthy. The winter is also fairly severe. The summer months are very sultry and on account of high humidity, are unbearable.

The district receives major rainfall because of the influence of South-west Monsoon during the months of June to October. The return-rains are also experienced in some parts in January and April. The distribution of rainfall, over the talukas of the district, is quite uneven and is affected by the presence of Sahyadri Ranges in the western part of the district. The rainfall is heavy in the extreme western portion of the district and gradually declines as we go from west to east. The following table provides the statistics regarding distribution of average rainfall in the various talukas of the district.

It will be seen from the above table that the rainfall is heaviest in Sargana, Peint and Igatpuri talukas ranging from 2000 mms. to 3500 mms. Continued downpour of rainfall in this region makes certain areas inaccessible and isolated from the rest of the district. The Sahyadri Ranges, in this region with this heavy rain, thrive in thick forests. The rainfall in the central part ranges from 500 mms. to 750 mms. and is quite helpful to agriculture. The rainfall in the eastern part is very moderate and is about 500 mms. only, with uneven and at places scanty rainfall in some areas. However some of the talukas in this eastern region viz. Baglan, Niphad and Malegaon have benefitted by canal irrigation.

In the end the following special points of Nasik District are notable.

- 1) Area under grapes:- over 1000 hectares.
- 2) Area under onions:- over 5,000 hectares.
- 3) Area under Sugarcane:- over 9,000 hectares.
- 4) Main source of "vegetable" supply to Greater Bombay.
- 5) One of the highest stocking centres of Government of India at Manmad C.R.Junction point.
- 6) The India Security Press and Government Printing Press at Nasik-Road.
- 7) The M.I.G. Factory at Ozar near Nasik.
- 8) The Co-operative Fruit Canning and Juice Factory at Pimpalgaon Basawant (with its famous drink PIBOLA)
- 9) The Central Wheat Research Station at Niphad.
- and 10) The new Thermal Power Generation unit at Eklahare near Nasik Road station.

C H A P T E R - II
Explanatory Notes

In this chapter, short notes on the tables presented in the Abstract part, are given. There are in all 85 tables in the present abstract of 1967-68.

2.1 Climate and Rainfall

The two tables 1 & 2 give the information of climate and rainfall in the selected centres for the year 1967 and 1968. For "Climate" there are only 2 reading stations in Nasik District viz. Nasik and Malegaon. This information is supplied by the Meteorological Department, Bombay. It will be seen that the maximum temperature at Nasik is about 29 c which that of ~~Nasik~~ Malegaon is upto 39 c.

As regards "rainfall", there are three specific regions, the western mountains region gets rainfall about 3500 mms., the middle zone gets an average of 600 mms., while the eastern zone gets even less than 520 mms.

2.2 Area and Population

There are 6 tables on this topic. The tables mainly give talukawise area and population data as per 1961 census. The classification of population into rural and urban, towns and villages, workers and non-workers and Schedules ~~and~~ Castes and Scheduled Tribes is shown in three tables. The language and religion data is also given in these tables. The main characteristics of population as revealed in these tables are as follows:-

a) The urban population is 25.60% in the district with the maximum percentage of 67.34 % in Nasik Taluka.

contd...

b) Out of 1352 villages, 42.53% villages belong to the population group of "below 500".

c) The percentage of Scheduled Caste population is only 3.6 while that of Schedules Tribe is 24.45, which is the third highest in Maharashtra State i.e. next only to Thana and Dhulia Districts.

2.3 Agriculture

There are in all 11 tables on this subject. They give details of agricultural data like (talukawise) land utilisation, area under main crops, area under irrigation by sources and by crops, number of irrigation wells etc.

The gross cropped area of Nasik District is 62% of its geographical area. In this respect, the position of Nasik District is much better as compared to other district in Bombay Division.

Amongst food crops, Bajra is the main crop and amongst commercial crops Sugarcane is worth a special mention. There are 3 sugar factories, two in co-operative sector and one in private sector. Over and above this, there is a demand for two more co-operative sugar factories in Nasik District.

Nasik District (middle and eastern parts) have a comparatively good irrigation facility. The talukas of Baglan, Dindori, Nasik, Niphad and Sinnar have got irrigated land of more than 6 % with Niphad taluka having 15% of the total area under irrigation. The irrigation facilities are obviously negligible in the western tract of Igatpuri, Peint and Kalwan talukas.

2.4 Animal Husbandry and Forests

There are 5 tables on this topic. They provide the information on the livestock census 1966, Veterinary services, Slaughter Houses, Forest area etc.

It is to be specially noted that the western hilly parts abound in valuable forests with the district total area under forest of about 3,40,000 hectares and the total value of forest produce of more than one crore of rupee.

2.5 Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity

The information on these subjects is covered in table Nos. 25 to 34.

Factory statistics is given table Nos. 25, 26 & 27. It will be seen from the tables that the highest employment is provided "Printing and Allied Industries", next in importance is "Bidi" Industry. Sinnar being the main centre for it. The next main sector is the "Powerloom" with Malegaon Yeola is main centres of this activity.

Employment Exchange statistics is given in tables 28, 29 and 30 while the table Nos. 31 and 32 give the details of Govt. employees in Nasik District as on 1-7-1966.

Electricity statistics is provided in tables Nos. 33 and 34. Till the end of 1967-68, 293 villages have been electrified with more than 7,000 electric pumps. A very enthusiastic programme for further electrification taken in hand in 1968-69.

2.6 Co-operation

Table Nos. 35 to 42 present data on Co-operative movement in Nasik District giving taluka wise statistics on Co-operative Credit, Marketing, money lending and Regulated markets.

Nasik District has achieved great strides in the recent years in the Co-operative field. The newly registered Co-operative Spinning Mill (near Satana) will be an additional feather in this Cap. Table wise details are studied in Chapter-III of this review.

2.7 Medical and Public Health

There are four tables (43 to 46) on this subject and the data on medical facilities in each taluka, on births and deaths and vaccination are given in these tables.

With the establishment of primary health centres in all blocks, the medical facilities have reached to all possible centres.

2.8 Education

There are in all 8 tables supplying data on education. The first three tables reproduce the data regarding literacy, (Rural and Urban) from the 1961 census tables. The other tables provide data on the latest No. of institutions, pupils, and teachers, beneficiaries under the B.C. and E.B.C. schemes, expenditure on primary education etc.

2.9 Transport and Communications

Table Nos. 55 to 61 give the information on transport and Communications in Nasik District. The tables are the information on Railway length, surface wise and categorywise roads, motor vehicles, State Transport statistics and Traffic Census. This part also provides the information on Postal facilities (including telegraph and telephones) and Rural Broadcasting.

2.10 Local Bodies

Table Nos. 62 to 65 provide the statistics on the income and expenditure of municipal bodies, Village Panchayats, and Zilla Parishad for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

2.11 Plan and Community Development

(Table Nos. 66 to 70). These tables give the information on plan expenditure and achievements as well as the coverage, expenditure and achievements by the C.D.Blocks in Nasik Dist.

2.12 Prices

There are two tables on this topic one gives the average retail prices of important commodities at Nasik(District Head Quarter) and the other shows the information about the Consumer Price Index (revised series) for the years 1966 and 1967.

2.13 Miscellaneous Tables(73 to 83)

The tables gives the information on police force, crime statistics, Banks, Joint Stock Companies, Cinema Statistics, working of the courts, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue Collection, news papers, and periodicals published and statistics about the General Election 1967.

2.14 Table No. 84 gives the trends in selected indicators.

C H A P T E R - III

Relative position of Talukas in the various field of Economic Progress.

3.1 Nasik District is divided into three geographical sectors viz. the Western hilly zone, the central deccan plateau zone and the third eastern scanty rainfall area. These basic characteristics obviously have their effect on the economic progress of the talukas concerned. In the following paragraphs some important developmental aspects are studied to show the relative position of the talukas.

3.2 Class of Population

Nasik District has got 24.4% scheduled tribe population (4,53,707) out of the total population of 18,55,246 (Sowly). This percentage for Bombay Division is 12.3 while for the Maharashtra State it is only 6.05. The main concentration is of course in the hilly talukas of Igatpuri, Peint, Kalwan and Dindori. The highest percentage of tribal population is in Peint taluka with 75.4 % (and the lowest in Yeola taluka with only 6.4%). In these forest areas 3 Tribal Development blocks are functioning.

3.3 Agricultural Situation

The net area sown in Nasik District is 9,13,676 hectares, which forms 58 % of the total geographical area. The gross irrigated area is 79,106 hectares which forms 8% of the total cropped area. Both these characteristics show that Nasik District is better off than any other district in Bombay Division with 46% of cropped area and only 5% of irrigated area.

Going talukawise, the percentage of gross irrigated area is very good so far as talukas of Niphad and Malegaon are concerned with 14 and 20 % respectively, when compared to the district percentage of only 8%. (In the remaining talukas and especially in the hilly areas there is almost no scope for irrigation)

Amongst the main irrigated talukas, the main crop are sugarcane, wheat and vegetables. The following are the details:-

In the remaining talukas these crops are grown ^{on a} very small scale.

Co-operation

The Co-operative movement has got its deep roots in almost all the sectors. The coverage under "Agricultural Credit Society's is cent-percent villages and the coverage of membership (of the total cultivators or khatedars) is over 60% which compares well with the other advanced districts in this sphere viz. Jalgaon and Dhulia. The agricultural credit societies had advanced Rs. 5.60 crores of Rs. in the year 1967-68. The position of societies in Malegaon, Niphad and Baglan talukas is quite note worthy. The total loans advanced and the average loans for societies are as follows :-

As regards other talukas the position is comparatively good in the talukas of Nasik, Dindori, Chandor, Nandgaon and Yeola while in the konkani talukas of Igatpuri, Kalwan, Peint, and Surgana the average loaning is quite obviously ~~gx~~ because of the low potentially of agricultural growth. On the same lines, the growth of Co-operative Marketing, processing and industrial Co-operatives is quite good in the above mentioned ~~Tables~~ ^{talukas} while the transaction of such societies in the hilly areas, eventhough they are organised fully in these areas, are negligible.

Livestock and Poultry

The total livestock in Nasik District, as per 1966, quinquennial, is 14,20,711 and the total poultry 3,67,666. The urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon have a higher percentage of milk cattle. The average livestock per hectare of geographical area is 0.91. The highest is in Malegaon taluka and the lowest in Surgana taluka.

Dairying is one of the main additional occupation of the agriculturist and has developed well in the talukas of Malegaon, Nasik and Nandgaon where the number of buffaloes in milk has been 6,46,24,505 and 2,190 respectively.

Poultry is another important side occupation of the agriculturist and the main concentration is naturally in the proximity of the highly urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon.

Education

The growth of primary education is quite notable where the number of primary schools and pupils has gone up from 1963 and 2,68,316 to 1978 and 2,80,564 respectively in 1967-68.

The growth of secondary education is also quite remarkable note worthy where the number of schools of pupils has progressed as follows :-

Medical Facilities

19 Primary Health Centres have been established in all the 13 talukas and this facility has reached to the nearest possible place from the villages in each taluka.

In addition to this there are 37 dispensaries functioning in the district.

Industrial growth

There were in all 352 factories and 16,251 workers at the end of 1967. There is a good industrial growth in the talukas of Nasik, Malegaon, Nandgaon and Niphad. The No. of factories and workers are almost negligible in the talukas of Baglan, Chandor, Surgana Peint and Kalwan. The proposed Co-operative Spinning Mill will improve the position of Baglan after its establishment.

In the industrially advanced talukas the concentration is in Sinnar (Bidi Industry) and Malegaon (Power loom). The proposed Co-operative Industrial establishment at Malegaon and Manmad and the composite programme of Co-operative Processing Societies will accelerate the growth of industries in this area to a certain extent.

Chapter IV

Progress of Plan Schemes

4.1 Introductory

Nasik District has got more than 70 % of population dependent on agriculture, and as such deserves special attention on schemes related to the agricultural production. This aspect has been borne in mind while framing the Annual Plan 1967-68. As in the last year 1966-67, this year also only an Annual Plan is drawn up because the Fourth Five Year Plan of the country has not been finalised and the state's Fourth Five Year Plan which forms an ~~integrated~~ ^{integral} part of the country's Fourth Five Year Plan. In ~~the~~ drawing the Annual Plan, the main objectives and policies of the State's Fourth Five Year Plan have been kept in view. The annual plan by emphasis on the productive sectors and includes provisions for the key-programmes. The outlay for Maharashtra State for the Annual Plan 1967-68 was of the order of Rs. 111 crores approximately and the expenditure on the District Level Schemes (State Sector and Local Sector) for Nasik District during the year (1967-68) was Rs. 2.16 crores. (For details please see statement No.66 in the Statistical Tables). The sector wise details of expenditure and physical achievements are as follows :-

4.2 Agriculture

Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 2.16 crores on the district level schemes in 1967-68 the expenditure on the schemes relating to Agricultural programme was Rs. 87.79 lakh i.e. 40% of the total. The details, of the expenditure on the main schemes are as follows:-

Irrigation

Nasik District has got 6% area under Irrigation. In 1967-68 the efforts to increase the irrigation potential were continued and the expenditure incurred on irrigation schemes (District level) in 1967-68 was of the order of Rs. 35.70 lakhs. Over and above this, many medium and major irrigation projects like 'Karanjwan' and 'Bhojapur' (State level schemes) have been started, which after their completion, will add greatly to the irrigated area of the district.

Animal Husbandry

The Veterinary Centres are established in all the talukas of and there is one Veterinary Hospital at Nasik. These all, suffice the needs of the agriculturists for the health and well being of their cattle. The scheme of the expansion of the Veterinary hospital at Nasik is also taken in hand which will further modernise the amenities now available.

Community Development

All the talukas of Nasik District have been covered by C.D. activity and more over in the tribal areas 9 T.D. blocks are also functioning. The main achievements of these C.D. and T.D. blocks during the year 1967-68 are as follows :-

Co-operation

During the year 1967-68 the growth of Cooperative movement continued at the same pace. The total expenditure on Co-operative schemes of granting share capital, subsidy and loans to cooperative institutions during the year 1967-68 is of the order of Rs. 9.38 lakhs. The main physical achievements are as follows :-

new Hybrid programme to keep in tune with the "Self Sufficiency in food grains" programme of the Govt. The Central Co-operative Bank and the Land Development Banks are also progressing well. There is a demand for two new Co-operative sugar factories one for Nasik and nearby areas and one for Dindori and nearby areas. The work for the establishment of the Co-operative Spinning mill near Satana (Baglan) is also progressing well in respect of collection of Share capital from the cultivators.

Rural Electrification

The demand for the rural electrification is growing fast. During the year 1967-68 only 10 more villages have been electrified. The progressive figures of villages electrified at the end of 67-68 is 293 and the progressive number of electric pump-sets is 7016. This year also the programme was a bit slow because of less financial allotments.

Roads and Communications

An amount of Rs. 7.51 lakhs has been spent during the year 1967-68 and the main portion i.e. Rs. 6.71 lakhs has been spent by the Zilla Parishad, Nasik on ^{their} roads.
