## SOCIO ECONOMIC REVIEW OF SHOLAPUR DISTRICT

1967-68

### CHAPTER - I -

#### INTRODUCTION

##### 1.1 LOCATION:-

The district is bounded on the North by Ahmednagar and Osmanabad district, on the east by Osmanabad and Andhra Pradesh on the South by Sangli district and the State of Mysore and on the West by Satara and Poona districts. The District has an area of 15,057 Sq.Km.

Sholapur city, the district Head quarter is situated at a distance of about 450 Km. from Bombay city, The State Head quarter on the South Central Railway line connecting Bombay & Madras. Poona the Divisional Head quarter is also on the same line situated between Sholapur and Bombay at a distance of about 265 Km. from Sholapur.

##### 1.2 TOPOGRAPHY:-

1(i) Soil:- The soils are basically derived from Volcanic trap and are formed in Situ i.e they are mostly Sedentary except along the rivers, where transported soils have been deposited. The soils of the district can be divided in to three groups.

- (i) Coarse gray or brown Known as Murmad or Barad.
- (ii) Reddish black and red soils
- (iii) Black or medium black soils.

Murmad soils are shallow, coarse and contain partially decomposed rock pieces. These are to/seen along the hill slopes, where /be the upper soil, is subjected to continuous erosion. Along the lower slopes of hills, the depth is slightly more. These soils may also contain pieces of stones. This type of soils support inferior millet only.

The reddish black soils are found on hill tops, along the ridges. These soils are not common in this district. The medium black soils are more clayey in texture. The lime nodules are seenmixed in these medium soils. They also crack heavily depending upon the depth and clay content. These soils are quite fertile and produce excellent garden crops and as well. In case of restricted sub-soil drainage, they do not end themselves to irrigation. Barring few strips of deep soil all the soils have been badly damaged by constant erosion.

The soils of Mangalwedha and part of South Sholapur have deep black soils while the rest of the district has light and medium soils. The medium deep soils are located in the river valleys of Bhima, Sina, Nira and Man.

2) RIVERS:- The chief rivers are the Bhima with its right bank feeders, the Nira and the Man and its left bank feeder The Sina which receives the Bhogavati from the North. The Bhima and the Sina run South east, the Nira and the Man nearly east & the Bhogavati, South east. During the dry season all the rivers are fordable. Even in the Bhima except for occassional pools, the stream drives up or runs only ankle-deep.

3) HILL-RANGES:- There is no important hill system in the district. Except in North east of Barshi, West of Madha, South West of Malsiras and Karmala talukas where the tract is hilly, the district has a generally flat or undulating terrain. The low table land and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha talukas act as the water shed between Bhima river and Sina river.

### 1.3 CLIMATE:

The climate is healthy and agreeable except from March to May. In the summer from March to June, the climate is very hot during the day time though cool at night. The rainy season starts from middle-June and lasts upto the end of October. It is followed by cold season from November to February and hot season from March to middle June. During cold season the air is generally bright, clear and invigorating. The hot season is marked by a dry scorching heat, strong hot winds and occasional dust storms. Nights are however generally cool. The rainy months are pleasant. The temperature is generally mild and even. Except hot months of March, April and May the climate is free from extremes of heat and cold. Bitter cold is almost unknown.

There are very little variations in climate in different parts of the district. The climate is dry and hot in all parts except that portion of Barsai taluka which lies above the Ghats where it is somewhat cooler than in the rest of the district.

1) RAINFALL:- The rainfall all over the district is scanty. The rainfall starts by the middle of June and continues till the end of October. The precipitation during June to August is rather precarious. The showers in September and October though fair are heavy and more assured. The following table gives the rainfall statistics under each taluka of the district for the year 1966 and 1967.

It is evident from the above table that the average rain fall in this district was less in the year 1967 as compared to the year 1966. However the crop prospects shown signs of improvement which can set the pace for economic recovery. During the year 1967 the average rainfall recorded in the district was 553.2 which was short of normal. ~~rainfall recorded in the district~~ However the rainfall recorded in the year 1967 in the talukas of Sholapur, Sangola, Akkalkot and Mangalwedha was above normal. The above table also indicates that the range of variation is very wide in Malsiras and Akkalkot talukas the rainfall being 260.8 m.m. in Malsiras taluka and 873.4 m.m. in Akkalkot taluka in the year 1967.

2. Temperature:- The temperature is generally mild and even. Except the hot months of March, April and May the climate is free from extremes of heat or cold. Bitter cold is almost unknown. The average temperature of the district was 29.9 degrees centigrade in the year 1967. During this year the temperature was lowest in November and highest in May, The mean minimum and mean maximum being 16.4 contigrdae and 40.8 centigrade.

3. Humidity:- According to Maharashtra Irrigation commission Report of 1961, The humidity is high during rainy season in this district, the Summer temperatures are high and Winter temperatures are cool. For perennial tropical crops like sugarcane the summer is a little too hot and winter is a little too cool. However there is frost and although there is some risk in growing crops sensitive to cold it is not such as to warrant abandoning their cultivation altogether. In general the humidity is less in this district, as compared to the other districts of Poona Division with a high altitude and situated not too far away from the Sea. During monsoonal season humidity is generally high which goes down in Winter Season and in the hot weather season the air becomes rapidly dry.

#### 1.4 NATURAL ZONES:-

The district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. The eastern zone comprising Barshi, North Sholapur, South Sholapur and Akkalkot talukas has medium to deep black soils, some what assured rainfall and grows Jowar, Bajra and pulses. It accounts for 32.86 percent of the total geographical area of the district.

The Central or the transitional zones comprising Mohol, Mangalwedha, eastern parts of Pandharpur and Madha taluka has uncertain rainfall, light to medium soil and grows kharif and Rabi crop. The Western zone comprises scarcity areas of Karmala, Sangola and Malsiras talukas and western parts of Madha and Pandharpur talukas with light soil and uncertain rainfall. Mainly rabi crops are grown in Karmala, Pandharpur and Madha talukas and kharif crops such as Bajri and groundnut in Sangola taluka. Large parts of Malsiras taluka received protection from Scarcity due to irrigation provided by Nira Right Bank Canal and sugarcane is the major crop of that area.

#### 1.5 FAMINE & SCARCITY:-

Since the average annual precipitation is very low(577.1 m.m) and subject to a large element of uncertainty this district is exposed to frequent scarcities and occasional famines. The fact finding Committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay had also reported that the rainfall is not dependable in almost all the talukas of the district and they area likely to be affected by Scarcity conditions.

It is a redeeming feature that in the year 1967 there were no scarcity conditions in the district.

#### 1.6 TERRITORIAL CHANGES IN THE DISTRICT:-

The District of Sholapur was formed in the year 1869. The district was carved out from the districts of Ahmednagar, Poona and Satara, Karmala was transferred from Ahmednagar, Mohol from Poona and Pandharpur, Malsiras and Sangola from Satara district. There were frequent changes in Poona, Setara, Sholapur and Ahmednagar districts. No major change took place until the annexation of former princely states in the year 1949. During that year and in the subsequent year this district underwent some changes by addition or deletion of some enclave villages from nearby dist.s. The present constitution of the district is unchanged since the year 1956.

#### 1.7 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:-

State Government Administration:- For administrative purposes the district is at present divided in to eleven talukas. The Collector is in charge of general Administration, Law and order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies, He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector of the three revenue divisions viz. Sholapur, Madha and Pandharpur and have their head quarters at Sholapur, Kurduwadi and Pandharpur. Eleven Tahasildars are in charge of eleven taluka offices.

The District and Session Judge is the Head of the Judicial department in the district having his assistant/district and Tehsil levels. The Judiciary is entirely separated from the executive. However the Collector continues to be the district Magistrate and the Deputy Collector and Tahasildars are vested with limited magisterial powers.

✓ in his office and three Dy. Collectors who hold charge.

The District and the Session Judge is assisted by two Assistant judges and Additional Session Judge. They have Jurisdiction over entire district. They attend to Civil and criminal work both original and appellate. The Civil Judge (Senior Divn,) attends to Civil suits in the whole of the district.

There are also 15 Civil Judges (Junior Divn) and First-class Judicial Magistrate who have their Head quarters at different taluka places in the district. They deal with civil and criminal cases.

The two special First class Judicial Magistrate deal with prohibition cases and Municipal cases respectively in their respective areas.

There is also one First class judicial Magistrate for Sholapur taluka police station and Sholapur city Sadar-Bazar police station.

The police force in the district functions under the District Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendents and two Circle Police Inspectors at Sholapur & Pandharpur. There are 21 Police stations in the district.

There are two divisional level soil Conservation officers at Sholapur and Pandharpur to supervise the soil Conservation activities under Agricultural Department. The Malaria Eradication Programme in the district is administered by the Malaria Office at Pandharpur. In addition to these there are other offices representing various departments at district level like Sub-Regional Employment Exchange Office, Govt. Milk distribution scheme office, Factory Inspector, Labour Officer, Executive Engineer, B & C Div, District Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Department to look after the entire programme of cooperative Department and Civil Surgeon to supervise the State Medical and Health services. There are Govt. Institutions of North Cote pole & technical High school and the Polytechnic.

#### Central Govt. Administration:-

Under Central Government sectors there are Divisional offices of the Post and Telegraph Department and South Central Railway. There is also the Office of the Superintendent of Central Excise.

#### Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities:-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti Act 1962 one Zilla Parishad and 11 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district in the year 1962. The number of Panchayat Samities remained unchanged during the period under review and the areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samities corresponds to the district and taluk boundaries except in case of Municipal towns which are not covered by them. There is now no town in the district which does not have a Municipal committee. Zilla Parishad covers 96.05 percent of the area and 72.05 percent of the Total population of the district.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by the elected president from among the elected councillors. To carryout the administrative & executive work an officer in the Senior scale of I.A.S. Cadre works as the Chief Executive Officer to the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departments and the heads of those departments at the district level are officers belonging to class-I and class-II services under the State Govt. The Block Development Officer works as secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

#### Local Bodies Administration:-

As regards the administrative set up under local sector there is Municipal Corporation in Sholapur. The Municipal Commissioner works as the Executive Head of the Corporation. There are nine Municipalities in the district under the administrative control of the Chief Officer, of which Barshi and Pandharpur are city Municipalities.

#### Public Bodies Administration:-

The Maharashtra State Road Transport corporation has earned for it self a unique place among the public sector undertaking in the district. It has maintained an efficient and economic road Transport services through out the district. The Divisional Controller functions as the Executive Head of this undertaking in this district. There are six depots under him each under the charge of Depot Manager. There is also Maharashtra State Electricity Board entrusted with the work of rural electrification programme. The Executive Engineer, M.S.E.B. works as the executive head of this Board.

#### 1.8 Demography:-

1) General:- Census is the principal source of Demographic data in India as well as in Maharashtra. Sholapur district ranks third in population and 6th in area among the 26 districts of Maharashtra State. The population has increased by more than 110 percent over the period of 1901 to 1961. The population of Sholapur district according to 1961 census is 18,60,119. The population increased in the decades 1941-51 and 1951-61 at a very high rates of 22.57 and 23.57 percent respectively.

#### . 2) Density:-

According to 1961 census the density of Sholapur district is 124 in North Sholapur taluka to 78 percent per Sq.Km. in Manga;wedha taluka. These difference correspond to those of Topography and Land utilisation and also the growth of urban areas. The high density in Sholapur North and Barshi taluka is due to large urban centres like Sholapur city and Barshi twe town. Manglavedha Sangola, Karmala and Mohol talukas are having very low density because of the light and rocky soil existing in those talukas.

#### 3) Literacy:-

According to 1961 census literacy in Sholapur district is lowest in Poona division. It is 25 percent in this district where as the State and the division average literacy percentage is around 29.

The literacy percentage has increased more than 5 times during the last sixty years. However substantial improvement has taken place only since 1931 particularly female literacy showed phenomenal rise from 1.35 percent in 1931 to 6.27 percent in 1941. There was fall in the literacy rate in 1951. Growth of literacy in the decade 1951-61 in this district was 10 percent. The tahasilwise literacy percentages are shown in the table appended herewith.

It is seen from the appended table that the highest literacy rates are concentrated in North Sholapur taluka. This is due to vicinity of the district Head quarter Sholapur city and availability of extensive educational facilities. Literacy rates drop down as we move away from this area but highest rates are found in the central and eastern regions of Barshi taluka and North Sholapur and central portion of Pandharpur taluka. The lowest rates are found in the Southern zone comprising Sangola, Mangalwedha and parts of Mohol and Akkalkot talukas which partly cover the scarcity zone in the district.

#### 4) Livelihood classification:-

Of the total population of the district 44 percent is engaged in work Remaining 56 percent is non working or dependent population. The proportion of workers dependent on agril. is very high i.e about 70 percent but it is slightly less than the division and State percentages which are about 75 and 72 respectively. However the district has large population of workers engaged as Agril. laboures than the division average. Proportion of workers engaged in house hold industry and manufacturing other than household industries are higher in the district than those for the division average. In manufacturing other than household industries the distict has 7.64 percent of worker as compared to 5.2 percent for the division. The proportion of the household industry is 8.06 percent which is little less than double the average of 4.39 percent for the State. Household industry therefore provides employment significantly to large no. of persons in the district. The district does not however have significant proportion in construction. The proportion in other services and commerce and Transport and Storage and Communication is not significant. However the proportion under these heads is slightly higher than the division average.

There is marked difference in the distribution pattern for non working among males and females 34.6 percent out of male non workers are full time student while the corresponding proportion for female is 9.5 percent In urban area the percentage of full time students is higher and that for dependents, infants etc. lower both for males and females. The percentage of females engaged in houschld duties is also highest in urban area than in rural areas.

#### Scheduled Castes:-

The comparative position of the scheduled population in 1951 and 1961 in the district is as follows:-

It is evident from the above table that the proportion of scheduled castes has decreased from 15.36 percent in 1951 to 12.84 percent in 1961. It is due to conversion of a large number of persons from the erst while Hindu scheduled castes to Bhuddism. Such conversion to Bhuddism has however been chiefly from among the Mahars who were formerly also numerous in scheduled castes in the district.

The percentage of literacy to the total population of scheduled castes in the district is 13 which is much behind than the general literacy percentage of the district. They are however trying to cover the gap.

#### Scheduled Tribes:-

The total population of scheduled tribes is only 9089 or 0.49 percent of the total population of the district. The scheduled tribes population of the district has increased from 8993 in 1951 to 9089 in 1961.

The Scheduled tribes as a group do not seem to have made much progress in literacy and education inspite of various educational facilities available to them 76.84 percent of the worker from the scheduled tribes work in Agricultural activities.

#### Languages:-

Marathi is the principal language and is the mother tongue of 71.5 percent of the population. In rural areas Marathi speakers account for 80.1 percent of the population. They constitute 49.1 percent of the population in urban areas. Kannad has the second largest number of speakers. It forms 11.5 percent of the total population in the district. Urdu has the third largest number of speakers. It forms 8.8 percent of the total population of the district. It is spoken more in Urban area where its speakers form as much as 16.3 percent against 5.9 percent for rural areas. The speakers of Banjra languages are concentrated in rural areas and so also of Gujrathi speakers to some extent. Hindi, Tamil and Telegu speakers are mostly concentrated in urban area.

## CHAPTER -II-

### EXPLANATORY note on the sources and limitations of the data presented in the Statistical Abstract

#### Preamble:-

1. This is the ninth issue of the District Statistical Abstract brought out by this office since 1958-59.

The purpose of this issue is to present Statistical material on various topics so that the abstract may be useful as a reference book for research, Planning or further Socio Economic studies of the district.

The information given in the abstract is mostly for two years of 1966-67 and 1967-68 or for calendar years 1966 & 1967. The reference years are 1965-66 and 1966-67 in case of some Tables.

The following paragraphs contain brief notes on the Tables included in this Abstract. These are explanatory Notes which are restricted to give the nature of data expressed and point out high lights of some data and show its limitations.

#### 2.1 Climate and Temperature:-

Table No.1. This table presents the data on normal rainfall, No. of Rainy days and actual rainfall in 12 selected centres of Sholapur district during the year 1966 and 1967. It is obtained from the Statistician Deptt. of Agriculture Maharashtra State Poona.

Rainfall all over district is uncertain and scanty with an annual average of 577.1 m.m. Barshi taluka is comparatively well-off due to the proximity of Balaghat hills having rainfall average about 657.m.m.

The rainfall in the year 1967 recorded in the district was less than in the year 1966.

During the year 1967 the average rainfall recorded in the district was 553.2 m.m. which was short of normal. However the rainfall recorded in the year 1967 in the talukas of Sholapur, Sangli, Mangalwedha and Akkalkot centres was above normal.

Table No.2.:- The data presented in this table about maximum, minimum temperature is collected from Regional Meteorological Department Government of India, Bombay.

The temperature is recorded from Two centres viz. Sholapur and Jeer in this district. The average Temperature of the dist. was 26.9 degree centigrade in this dist-rikt in the year 1967.

During the year the Temperature was lowest in December-67 and highest in May 1967. The mean minimum and mean maximum being 17.7 centigrades and 40.8 centigrades.

**2.2 Population:-** The most salient features of population Statistics i.e Area, Population, Density and variations on one decade(1951-1961) are presented in this section.

The population of Sholapur district is 18.60 lakhs which is about 18 percent of Poona Division and less than 5 percent of Maharashtra State. The details of population indicating Urban and Rural as found in the year 1951 and 1961 have been presented in this section. There are 6 Tables(3 to 8) under this head. The data in these tables gives particulars of area and population of Sholapur district. The information has been taken from Dist. Census Hand Book of 1961 and allied census publications. The Table 3 gives population variation(1961-61) in the district. The taluka-wise classification of villages and towns as per population ranges are given in Tables No.s 4 and 5. Classification of working population(Define as economic classification as per 1961 Census definition) is provided in Table No.6. The information of non workers are also incorporated in this Table. Table No.7 presented - the information regarding distribution of population according to age-group, Mother Tongue, and Religion. Table No.8 exhibits the information of schedule Castes and schedule Tribes as defined in 1961 Census.

**2.3** There are 11 Tables in this section( 9 to 19 ). The data from 9 to 14. Tables is obtained from the Statistician Deptt. of Agriculture M.S. Poona. The data relating to tables No.15 & 16 has been obtained from the Executive Engineer Irrigation Dn. Sholapur and Zilla Parishad Sholapur, 18 from Live stock Census 1966 and 19 from the Collector of the Sholapur. The data of Table No.17 has been collected by this office.

There are (11) Tables in this section(9 to 19). Of these the details regarding important tables are as follows. Table No. 9. This table presenting the land utilisation Statistics of the district indicates that about 79 percent of the Total geographical area is under cultivation. The area under Forest is significantly very low at 2.24 percent. There was an increase of 1.90 percent under fallow land during the year 1966-67 as compared to the year 1965-66.

Table No.10 :- This table presents the changes in the cropping pattern. The information about area under different crops is given in this table. It is evident from the above table that the cropping pattern of this district is dominated by few crops & especially of Jowar. In the year 1965-66, 65 percent of the total cropped area was under Jowar and the same was 63 percent during the year 1966-67. The figures of the two years indicate that there was no change in the cropping pattern. Non food crops viz. cotton and groundnut are sown on meagre scale in the dry area.

Table No.11.:-This table deals with yield per hectare & outturn of selected crops during the year 1965-66 & 1966-67.

In general it is observed that there is an increase of production of cereals and pulses. The increase in production of cereals is 44 percent and pulses is 11. However there appears to be slight decrease/27 percent in production of bajra during of the period 1965-66 and 1966-67

TABLE No.12:- This table presents the information about the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of Sholapur district for the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. It appears from the Table that net as well as gross irrigated have decreased during the period 1965-66 to 1966-67. Net irrigated area decreased from 1,33,278 to 1,14,413 while gross irrigated area from 1,72,106 to 1,41,930

Table No.13.:- The data presented here relates to area irrigated under different crops in each talukas of Sholapur district, during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The downward trend as observed in respect of acreage under different crop is also witnessed in respect of area irrigated under food crops during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. However the upward trend is witnessed in respect of percentage of area irrigated under food crops with that of the total irrigated area. The percentage of area irrigated under food crops in the year 1965-66 was 33.72 which increased to 88.96 in the year 1966-67.

Table No. 14:- This table indicates the No.of irrigation wells in use and not in use in year taluka of the district. During the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 a slight increase is observed in the number of wells in use and so also increase is observed in the total number of wells during this period.

Table No.15:- This table presents the number of minor irrigation works and the area irrigated under these sources. The minor irrigation works are only in six talukas viz. Karmala Barshi, South Sholapur, Sangola and Mangalwadiha. There is no minor irrigation work in the remaining talukas of the district.

Table No.16:- This table gives information about the medium irrigation projects in this district as on 31-3-68. There is no major project in this district. The data is obtained from the Executive Engineer, Irrigation Dn. Sholapur. There are three medium projects in this district viz. Ashti, Ekrak and Budhial.

Table No.17:- The district Statistical Office is collecting data on Agricultural wages(Mandrup, Madnimb and Vairag)-- \*from 3 centres in Sholapur district namely.in bracket. The data for two year 1965 and 1966 is presented in this table.

Table No. 18:- The data in this table on Agricultural implements is abstracted from 10th livestock census 1966. It is evident from the table that the no. of Iron ploughs in this district is larger than the wooden ploughs. So also the no. of sugarcane crushers worked by power is greater than worked by bullocks. Thus it can be said that this district is advancing towards mechanization and improvements in the techniques of Agriculture.

Table No. 19:- This table presents the data on Famine & Scarcity. In this the data is obtained from Collector office Sholapur. There was neither famine nor scarcity condition prevailing in this district,during the period under review.

#### 2.4 Animal Husbandry , Forest:-

The section of Animal Husbandry contains 4 tables(20 to 23) Out of them table No.20 presents data on live stock in this dist. which is obtained from Census of India 1966. Table No. 21 to 23 give veterinary Statistics of=attacks=and=deaths=and=slaughter relating to aids to live stock incidences of attacks and deaths and slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in these houses. Data in all these three tables is obtained from Animal Husbandry Deptt. Zilla Parishad, Sholapur for the year 1966-67 and 1967 - 1968.

#### Table No.24A and B.:-

These tables present forest Statistics. These 2 tables present forest Statistics. The break up of the table as Reserved, Protected and unclassed and that under Revenue Department and Forest Department is given. It appears from table No.24 B that the value of Forest produce has gone up from Rs.1,319 to 3,6881 during the year 1966-67 and 1967- 68.

## 2.5 Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:-

In this fifth section there are (10) tables(25 to 34). Data on Factory Statistics( by type of production) is given in table No.s 25 to 27 with further classification of labour employed and No.of days worked during the year 1967. Data on employment table No.28 is relating to activities of Sub-Regional employment exchange at Sholapur. The table No.29 shows break up Registration by occupation. In table No.30 volume of employment by Industry for quarter ending March 1967 and 1968 is based on reports of 942 establishments covered by the Sub-Regional Employment Exchange, Sholapur. Table No.31 exhibits the information about census of Govt. Employees in Sholapur District, under various Department. This data is obtained from the Bureau of Economics and Statistics Govt. of Maharashtra Bombay. Table No.32 is designed to give information on Registered factories in the Annual Survey of Industries. It can be seen that bulk of Factory employment in Sholapur District is in Textile sector. Particulars given in Table No.34 and 35 are based on information supplied from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and other private companies in the district. Table No.35 indicates the progress of electrification in the district in reference years. . . . . It can be seen that in the year ending March, 1968, 169 villages and 8 towns were electrified under the programme by the State Electricity Board.

## 2.6 Cooperation:-

There are (8) Tables (36 to 42 ) under this section. These tables are compiled from the Annual Reports of Cooperative institutions like Banks, Agricultural credit and other societies. Data is obtained from the office of the District Deputy Registrar coo p. Societies Sholapur.

Table No.35 relates to the information regarding number of different types of Cooperative societies working in Sholapur dist. in 1967- 68,

Table No. '36 presents the information regarding the Coop. Banks. The data pertaining to number of branches, number of members(individuals as well as societies), Share capital and loan advanced of all types is shown for District Central Cooperative Bank, District Land Development Bank, District Industrial Coop. Bank, District Development Bank and Urban Bank of the District. The information for two years 1966-67 and 1967-68 are presented here. The data pertaining to Agricultural credit societies in each talukas of Sholapur district is displayed in Table No. 37 The table giving information about number of societies, membership ,Capital structure and Loan advanced during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68, points out the development under cooperative sector. The term agricultural credit societies/ Thrift Societies, Urban/inclu credit societies, Grain Banks and Multipurpose Societies. Table des. No.38 relates to the activities of different types of cooperative societies other them Agriculture. Table No.39 presents the activities of Marketing societies, Table No.40 is designed to give the physical achievements of different types of cooperative societies during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

The information regarding commoditywise operation of regulated markets in all the talukas of Sholapur district are presented in table No.41. The position of business by money lenders in the district is displayed in table No.42. The data relates to the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

## 2.7 Medical and public health:-

There are (4) tables (43 to 46) in this section. Table No. 43 gives medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each taluka of Sholapur district for the year 1966 and 1967. The data is collected from State and Local sectors governing the health institutions.

Table No.44 gives information about the number of births & deaths registered in Sholapur district during the year 1966 and 1967. Table No.45 reveals the number of deaths due to important census in Sholapur district for the year 1966 and 1967. The information about vaccination and cholera inoculations for the year 1966 and 1967 are presented in table No.46. It is observed from the table that the number of revaccination and cholera inoculation have increased in the year 1967 as compared to the year 1966.

## 2.8 Education:-

Out of eight tables(47 to 54 ) in this section first three tables relates to literacy and allied details rural and urban in the district as revealed from 1961 census. It is significant to note that taluka North Sholapur is having literacy percentage 37.4 (Maximum) as is obvious/ Table No.47. Next to North /from Sholapur taluka, Barshi occupied the second place in literacy. It is also observed that in Malsiras, Akkalkot and Barshi talukas literates without educational level were large.

Table No.50 presents the information regarding No.of institutions, pupils and teachers in pre-primary, Primary secondary schools, higher and special institutions. The material is presented for the district as a whole for the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table No.51 shows the number of backward class students with the break up of schedule caste, schedule tribes and other backward classes. The information pertains to the year 1966-67 and 1967-68. The concession of free education given to economically backward classes are displayed in table No.52. This information is obtained from Zilla Parishad and Director of Education ,M.S. Poona. The Economic benefit accrued to this class of students amounts to Rs. 24.64 lakhs during the year 1967-68. The term economically backward class covers those families whose annual income is below 1200/- . These state Govt. employees whose annual income is below Rs.1880/- are also included in this.

Every year the State Govt. is giving grants to Zilla - Parishad and Municipalities to reimburse some percentage of expenditure incurred by them on primary education. The Table No.53 gives information about actual amount of such grants to Zilla Parishad, Municipalities, Commissions, cooperation and other expenditure including building grants.

The table No.54 shows number of villages with schools or without schools. Further break up of villages without primary school is given according to different population ranges. The position of the district in 1968 was the same as it was in 1967. The data relating to this table is obtained from the Zilla Parishad, Sholapur.

## 2.9 Transport and Communication:-

There are (7) tables (55 to 61) in this section. Length of routes(by type) is presented in table No.(55). The data is obtained from Railway authorities. In Maharashtra, Sholapur district enjoys maximum railway facilities as it crosses through nine talukas of the district.

The table No.56 gives us an idea of length of Road of various types and categories in the district. The classification according to category as National High ways, State High Ways etc. and the classification according to surface as cements concret Black Top ped etc. is given in this table. The table No.57 presents the data about Motor vehicles in operation in Poona division as on 31st March 1967 and 1968. It is evident from the table that there was an increase in operation of motor vehicles from 34,796 to 47,637 in Poona Region during the year 1967 and 1968. The term motor vehicles includes Motor cycle, cars, Taxis, Rickshaws, Stage carriages, Lorries, School buses, tractors etc. The districtwise information being not available the data relates to area covered by Poona Regional Transport office of which Sholapur District is a part.

The data presented in table No.58 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The information No.8f routes distance, vehicles, Vehicles, on Roads per day, No.of operating fleets and earning is given as on 31-3-1967 and 31-3-1968. The data is obtained from the Divisional Controlled of State Transport Sholapur.

The results of Traffic census conducted in November 65 are presented in table No.59. The table gives information regarding No.of vehicles, light motor vehicles, medium heavy motor vehicles, slow moving vehicles and total traffic intensively in 24 hrs. The highest No.of vehicles was found in Sholapur Road State high way No.50 -A.

Table No.60 gives the information on number of post offices Telegraph offices, letter boxes, Telephone and Radio licenses issued. The information is presented for financial year 1961-61, 1964-65, 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68. The material presented in table No.61 pertains to Rural Broad Casting. It gives the no. of Radio sets and villages where radio sets are installed. The information is obtained from the Divisional Engineer, Rural Broad Casting and the Director of Publicity Govt. of Maharashtra.

## 2.10 Local Bodies:-

In four tables No.(62 to 65 ) in this section income and expenditure particulars of local bodies in Sholapur district are illustrated.

Table No.62 covers total income and expenditure of villages- Panchayat, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68. The table No.63 reveals information of village Panchayats(Panchayat Samitiwise) for the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table No.64 part-'A' presents the headwise receipts of Zilla Parishad Sholapur for the year 1966-66, 1966-67, and 1967-68 while Table No.64 part-'B' gives the headwise expenditure of Zilla Parishad during the same period so also in the same manner Table No.65 indicates the income and expenditure of Municipalities during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

#### 2.11 Plan and Community Development:-

There are (5) tables(Table No.66 to 70) in this section Data in tables 66 and 67 relates to achievements financial and physical under district level Plan schemes during the period 1966-67 and 1967-68. Expenditure under scheme of soil conservation Minor Irrigation, Corporation, and Irrigation and Power is more than other schemes. The other tables 68, 69 and 72 deal in particular with the Community Development programme as on 31st March 1968, Coverage in this district is now completed as shown in Table No.68. Expenditure under Community Development Blocks is given in table No.69 and selected physical Achievements are shown in table No.70.

All the data revealed in this section has been compiled by the District Statistical Office on the information from concerned implementing officers of plan schemes and from Block offices.

#### 2.12 Prices:-

There are two tables in this section(71 and 72) . Table No. 71 gives the average retail prices of important commodities at District Head quarter in Sholapur District for each month for the year 1966 and 1967. The data is for the calendar year. The computations are based on weekly prices collected at Sholapur by the District Statistical Office and indicate price levels of covered commodities in the said period.

As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop in the district head quarter, The average shown in the Table No. 71 for individual commodities can not be said to be fully representative but the data may prove more useful as a broad indicator of the Trend in changes in retail prices of over the period of time. Table No.72 gives the consumer price index number for working class at Sholapur centre for the year 1967-68.

The index on food items which stood at 168 in May 1967 advanced sharply to 188 in October 1967.

The data is obtained from the Bureau of Economics and Statistics Bombay.

#### 2.13 Miscellaneous

There are in all (11) tables (73 to 83) on variety of topics in this last section. Table No. 73 gives particulars of police force and crime. Statistics are given in table No. 74 for calendar year 1966 and 1967. The data has been collected from police Deptt. Table No. 75 presents information regarding cases decided/Judicial Department in the year 1966 and 1967. The data is obtained from the District Session Judge Sholapur. The number of cases both Civil and criminal decreased during the year 1967 as compared to the year 1966. Cinema Statistics as shown in Table No. 76 indicate that most of these entertainment Units were located in North-Sholapur taluka (in Particulars of Banking-offices-working-in Sholapur city). In table No. 77 and 78 particulars of Banking offices working in Sholapur district and those of Joint stock companies are furnished. Progress of Life Insurance Business as shown in table No. 79 indicate that the number of Insurance---Insurance policies issued during during the year 1967-68 was higher as compared to the year 1966-67. Collection under small savings given in table No. 80 relates to period 1966-67 and 1967-68. In the year 1967-68 gross collection under small saving has gone down except under C.T.D. items as compared to the year 1966-67. Particulars of Land Revenue collection in the district for the year 1966-67 and 1967-68 are given table No. 81. Excepting in Akkalkot taluka there were arrears in all the talukas of the district. The highest amount of arrears is in Pandharpur and the lowest in Mochi taluka. Table No. 82 gives the no. of presses, news papers and periodicals as on 31st March, 68 in Sholapur district. The highest number of printing press is in North Sholapur and next to it comes Pandharpur. There is no printing press in South Sholapur.

The table No. 83 presents Statistics relating to general election held in 1967 in Sholapur district. It is evident from the Table that the highest percentage of votes to total electorates for Assembly constituency was from Malsiras (73 percent). The percentage was equal in Barsi and North Sholapur. The lowest percentage was in South Sholapur. For Parliamentary constituency the highest percentage of votes was from Pandharpur taluka (68 percent).

#### 2.14 Trend in selected Indicators

Table No. 84 presents the important indicators in the field of Development such as ~~Agriculture~~ Agriculture, Irrigation, Livestock and Poultry, Factory Employment, Electricity, Coop. Education, Medical and health, Transport and Communication and Community Development etc. for the years 1960-61 to 1967-68. The indicators for Agriculture are upto the year 1966-67. These indicators will be of great help while assessing the progress of Development in every field of activity during the five year plan period.

2.15 Selected Indicators:-

Tables regarding selected indicators of development of each taluk of Sholapur district are appended at the end. These tables cover topics like population, agriculture, electricity, factory workers, education etc. An attempt is made to show the position of each taluk in relation to its development under each item by way of ranking on the basis of the latest data available for the year 1967-68.

## CHAPTER XI

### Sectorial Trend:-

3.1 This chapter is meant to analyse the data giving the sectorial trends position in the division and comparison between talukas. The important indicators on which the review is based are.

- 1) Agriculture
- 2) Livestock
- 3) Electricity Consumption
- 4) Employment position
- 5) Public Health
- 6) Education
- 7) Transport.
- 8) Banking.
- 9) Prices.

### Agriculture:-

Even though Sholapur district is one of the most industrialised districts in Maharashtra, the economy of the dist. is mainly agrarian in character. Agriculture constitutes the most important segment of the economy from the point of view of both giving livelihood and also its contribution to State Income.

The pattern of land use can be best seen from No.R. 3 . 1 mentioned below. This shows that the net area sown in the dist. was about 79.37 percent of the total geographical area in the year 1965-66 which slightly decreased to 78.61 percent during the year 1966-67. Forest formed only 2.25 percent of the area which also registered a slight decrease to 2.24 percent. There was an increase of 1.90 percent under fallow land during the year 1966-67 as compared to the year 1965-66. A slight decrease of 0.68 percent is observed under other uncultivated land excluding current fallow. There is not much scope of further reduction in this area. However the total cropped area can be increased by increasing area under multiple crops. This is possible only by extending irrigation facilities.

3.3 Percentage of gross sown area:-

1. The gross sown area in the district was 12.34 lakh hectares during 1965-66 which slightly decreased to 12.22 lakh hectares during 1966-67. Similarly, the net area sown decreased from 11.91 hectares during the year 1965-66 to 11.79 hectares during the year 1966-67. The proportion of gross cropped area to net area sown was 104 percent during the year 1965-66 which remained the same during the year 1966-67. The corresponding proportion of the Poona division in the year 1965-66 was also the same i.e 104.
2. Within the district the proportion of gross cropped area to net area sown does not show any marked increase in any of the taluka except in Mohol taluka during the period 1966-66 and 1966-1967. The proportion of the gross cropped area to net area sown in \* Mohol taluka from 101 percent to 103 percent during the period under review. There was also slight increase in the talukas of Malsiras and Mangalwedni during the year 1966-67 over the previous year. The downward trend in the proportion is observed in the talukas of Barshi, Madha, Pandharpur, North Sholapur, Sangola and Akkalkot. The proportion was stationary in the talukas of Karmala and South Sholapur. The proportion of Karmala taluka was higher than the district average in both the years.

It was however lower than the district average in the talukas of Barshi, Madha, South Sholapur, Sangola and Akkalkot. The proportion of the gross cropped area to the net area in the district is shown below in Table No. R.3.2

It is observed from the above Table that the possibilities of increasing double cropped area appear to be considerable. During the period under/ the percentage increase of the double cropped/review area was the same as that of the preceding year. Extension of irrigation would enable some increase in double cropping.

(iv) In the talukas of Mangalwehda, Sangola and Pandharpur which are predominantly of Rabi area, it is possible to some extent to take kharif crops sown in June, July and harvested well in time for preparation of Rabi season. In the remaining kharif areas there is enough moisture left in the soil after harvest to sustain a short Rabi crop. But the raising of cash crops is not likely to add substantially to food output. For increasing the output of food grain we will have to improve the productivity of existing cultivated area through irrigation conservation and better technique.

### 3.4 Productivity of important crops:-

1. Generally speaking the productivity of the soil of this district is poor. This district falls in the plateau where the rainfall is low and highly variable. Irrigation facilities have not developed to a degree as would significantly mitigate these natural disadvantages. However

The Developmental efforts of the district under the three Five Year Plans have undoubtedly contributed to raise the productivity of land. However it appears from the large fluctuations of output from year to year that despite the programme of development, the weather appears to be the prime determinant of the level of output as is obvious from Table No.R.3.3

It is seen from the above Table that excepting Rice, Wheat, Bajra, and Gram, the yield per hectare has increased in respect of all other mentioned crops.

The principal food crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra and Sugarcane and other important cash crops are groundnut and cotton.

Jowar:- Jowar is one of the principal crops of the district. As far Jowar is concerned this district accounts for more than 30 percent of the contribution in the Divisions turn of the crop. Jowar is extensively produced in the district and about 34 percent of the Divisions area is under Jowar in this district. During the year 1965-66 the yield rate for Jowar was 267 Kg. per hectare which increased 435 Kg per hectare in the year 1966-67.

Rice and Wheat:- No doubt these are the principal food crops of the State the area in this district under these crops is negligible. The yield per hectare under both the crops has gone down during the period 1965-66 and 1966-67.

Sugarcane:- This district is quite rich in sugarcane. About 10 percent of sugarcane is produced in this district. Though the yield of various crops are generally low in this district yet in the case of sugarcane the productivity seems to be favourable. The yield per hectare is more than 6000 Kg. as against 8600 for the division. During the year 1965-66, the yield rate for sugarcane was 5908 Kg. per hectare which increased to 6601 Kg. per hectare during the year 1966-67.

Groundnut and Cotton:- No doubt these are the principal cash crops of the state, the area under these crops is negligible in this district. However the yield per hectare under groundnut crop increase from 341 Kg. per hectare in the year 1965-66 to 531 Kg. in the year 1966-67.

### 3.5 Gross value of Agricultural production:-

Since 1959 there has been a marked upward trend in the per capita(Rural population) gross value of agricultural output of this district which is estimated to Rs.193 in the year 1959-60. By 1960-61 it had increased to Rs.197. A distinct slackening in the pace of growth is noticeable towards the end of the period and as such it was steady and stationary in the year 1961-62. As against this the gross value of Poona division is estimated to be 184, 193 and 192 in the years 1959-60 and 1960-61 and 1961-62 respectively. The Table N.R.3.4 gives the comparative picture of the per capita(Rural population) gross value of Agricultural produce during the period 1959-60 to 1961-62 in Sholapur District.

It appears from the above Table that compared to the division the per capita gross value was higher in the district in all the three years i.e 1959-60 to 1961-62.

**3.6      Percentage of gross Irrigated area:-**

A)    Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

In this district the scope for increasing the area under cultivation is severely limited. But irrigation makes possible the use of the land resources more intensive by keeping land under crops for longer period in the year than it is possible merely by soil moisture derived from natural precipitation. For example with irrigation we can grow late maturing varieties of rice in shallow soil and long staple cotton which is a six month crop & sugarcane which is a ~~perennnial~~ perennial crop.

The proportion of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area increased from 129 to 130 during the period 1965-66 and 1966-67. Thus the extent of increase in the double cropped area due to irrigation is estimated to be one percent in this district during the year 1966-67. Within the district the proportion of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in 1966-67 varies from 106 in Sangola taluka to 175 in Akkalkot taluka. During the year 1966-67, the proportion is above the district average in the talukas of Madha, Pandharpur, Mchol, South Sholapur and Mangalwedha. In the remaining talukas it is below the district average. The percentages of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area under each taluka is given in Table N.O.R.3.5

**B. Percentage of not irrigated area to net area sown**

(i) As stated earlier the irrigation facilities now available are very scanty as compared to the vast area under cultivation in this district. The percentage of not irrigated area to net area sown was 11.18 in the year in 1965-66 which reduced 9.44 in the year 1966-67.

(ii) Within the district this proportion varies from 3.78 in South Sholapur to 31.46 in Malsiras taluka. This is due to irrigation facilities provided by the Nira Right Bank Canal. The proportion is above the district average in the talukas of Pandharpur, Sangola and Malsiras. In the remaining talukas it is below the district average. Table No.R.3.6 gives the trend in respect of percentage of irrigated area to net area sown.

**3.7 Changes in the crop pattern(Total and irrigated)**

1) The crop pattern of this district is dominated by Jowar, Bajra and such other low value crop. Of 12.22 lakh hectares of cropped area 7.73 lakh hectares(63 percent) were under Jowar during the year 1966-67. Where perennial irrigation is available farmers have taken to sugarcane which is extensively grown in Malsiras taluka of the district.

ii) A peculiar feature of the district and one which is shared by the Western tracts of the district is the predominance of Rabi cultivation. This is due to the fact that these areas have two peaks of rainfall one in June, July and other in September. The former being unreliable, the cultivators find it more advantageous to take rabi crop on the basis of moisture carried out from the rainy season.

iii) In the year 1965-66 87 percent of the total cropped area was under food crops and 13 percent under non food crops which increased to 88 percent under food crops. Among the food crops Jowar occupied 65 percent in the year 1965-66 which reduced to 63 percent in the year 1966-67. Bajra occupied 7.8 percent in the year 1965-66 which increased to 8.9 percent in the year 1966-67. During the year 1965-66 The area covered under wheat was 1.78 percent which increased to 1.84 percent in the year 1966-67. However the area under sugarcane decreased from 1.13 to 0.91 in the year 1966-67. The following figures show the changes in percentages in nutshell.

(iv) It is evident from the above table that the percentage under food crops has slightly increased while it decreased under non food crops. It is also observed that in case of Jowar and Dajra a high proportion of cropped area is covered. It is also observed that changes in crop pattern have been quite significant during the period under review.

### 3.8 Agricultural Wage rates:

(i) The wage rate paid to hired labourers in the agricultural industry as in any other industry depends upon the supply of labour in relation to the demand. However it differs from the wages paid in other industries in respect of the mode of payment of these wages which may be partly in cash and partly in kind. Further over the period of agricultural year the wages fluctuate according to agricultural operations which are conducted at different stages of crop production. Thirdly the nature of accrual of these wages is not fixed as weekly monthly or yearly. Some may be paid on daily basis while others may receive their dues after harvest.

(ii) In this district the agricultural wage rate for field labour per day of male labour varies between Rs.1.50 to Rs.2.50 while that of female labours varies between Rs.0.75 to Rs.1.25 during the years 1966 and 1967. Under the skilled labour the rate was highest under cobbler during the years 1966 and 1967 which ranges between Rs.5.00 to Rs.6.12.

In the year 1966-67, the trend of agricultural wages was found to be on the upward side which is consistent with the general rise in the price line.

### 3.9 Livestock per hectare of land:-

(i) On comparing the gross cropped area with the Bovine and ovine population it is observed that there are about 110 bullocks per hundred hectares of cultivated land in this dist. as against 140 bullocks per hundred hectares of cultivated land in the year 1966-67 in Poona division.

(ii) Within the district the ratio of the livestock population was the highest in Malsiras taluka(132) in the year 1965-66 which increased to 191 in the year 1966-67. The lowest ratio was in South Sholapur i.e 68 in the year 1965-66 which increased to 76 in the year 1966-67. The talukas Sangola, Malsiras and Mangalyedha have ratios more than 110 i.e above the dist. average in the year 1966-67. Whereas the remaining talukas have ratios less than the district average. The talukewise live stock population per hundred hectares of cultivated land is given below in table No.R.3.8.

(iii) The figures of number of bullocks per 100 hectares of cultivated land normally indicate the extent to which animal power is being utilised for agriculture. However there are other factors such as availability of grass, mechanical operations which also influence these ratios.,.

### 3.10 Poultry as compared to population:-

(i) Poultry is generally understood, includes a variety of domestic birds like, fowls, ducks, gees, turkeys, etc. Of these, fowls form the major category constituting almost the entire poultry in the district. Poultry is a quick returning livestock as such its development has got a great importance in food production programme. Poultry.. and its products rich in protein value can supplement the food supply in short time,

(ii) The total poultry population of Sholapur district was 4.53 lakhs in the year 1961 which increased to 4.73 lakhs in the year 1966 as against this the human population was 8,60 lakhs.

(iii) Thus the total poultry population in the district formed nearly 13 and 12 percents of poultry population in the div. in the year 1961 and 1966 respectively which shows lower share of this district. The proportion of poultry population to human population in the district was 24 in the year 1961 which increased to 25 in the year 1966. As against this the corresponding proportion in Poona Division was 34 and 39 in the years 1961 and 1966 respectively.

The table No.R.3.9 below indicates the proportion of poultry to the total population in the year 1961 and 1966.

### 3.11 Per capita consumption of electricity :-

The position of the district in power consumption was satisfactory in the year 1967-68. The per capita consumption of electricity in this district in 1966-67 was 41.20 KWT. which increased to 43.00 KWT as against this the corresponding consumption for the division is estimated to be 53 during the year 1966-67. During the year 1966-67, the percentage of number of electrified villages and towns to total was 15 which increased to 18 by the end of 1967-68. The table below No.F.8 3.10 shows the per capita consumption of Electricity in the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

3.12 Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment exchange and vacancies notified

At the end of the year 1966-67, There were 13430 persons on the live Registers of Employment Exchange in this district which decreased to 13154 persons in the year 1967-68. The number of placement effected was 1314 in 1966-68 which decreased to 676 in the year 1967-68. The number of vacancies notified during the year 1966-67 was 2026 which decreased to 1799. For the year 1966-67 the number of vacancies was 15 percent of the total registration and where as the number of placement was 10 percent the corresponding percentages for the year 1967-68 was 14 and 5 respectively.

The Table No.R.3.11 gives the number of placement made during the years 1966-67 and 1967-68 and the number of candidates enrolled.

It is evident from the above table that the picture is not very encouraging so far notification is concerned in relation to the Registration of candidates. The vacancies were only about 15 percent of the total Registration in 1966-67 which reduced to 14 per cent in 1967-68. Further placement is not of the same magnitude as vacancies notified.

3.13 Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated in hospital.

The number of indoor patients treated has shown an increase during the period 1966 to 1967. The number of indoor patients increased from 26691 to 30739 i.e increase by 15 percent. So also the number of outdoor patients increased from 641230 in 1966 to 693216 in 1967 i.e increase by 8 percent. The table No. R.3.12 gives the picture of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the period 1966 and 1967.

Thus it is observed from the above table that there is a large increase in the number of indoor patients which may be due to increase in the number of beds.

3.14 Increase in number of students in different categories ( Boys and Girls separately).

Considerable progress in the spread of primary education is observed in this district during the year 1967-68. The enrollment in primary schools in this district has increased by 3 percent in the year 1967-68 over the period 1966-67. The relative increase was more for girls i.e 4 percent as against 3 percent for Boys.

The number of students in secondary school in the district increased from 48716 in the year 1966-67 to 51393 i.e increase by 6 percent, the relative increase was more for boys i.e 6 percent for boys and 5 percent for girls. The number of students taking higher education increased from 6665 in 1966-67 to 8350 in 1967-68 i.e increase by 25 percent.

3.15 Increase in Road length as per 100 Sq. Km.

The road length per 100 sq. km. area was only 14.3 k.m. in this district in the year 1960-61, as against this the corresponding length for Poona division was estimated to be 20 k.m. The proportion of road length to total area in this district increased to 21.0 in the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 which remained the same in the year 1967-68.

3.16 Increase Banking facilities in proportion to population

The number of banking offices in the district was 72 on 31-3-66 which increased to 83 on 31-3-67. The total No. of towns and villages having banking facilities was 23 on 31-3-66 which increased to 24 on 31-3-67. The population served per banking in the district was 8573 on 31-3-66 which reduced to 7494 on 31-3-67.

3.17 Prices:-

The past year has been period of severe strains. The adverse agricultural situation caused by the unprecedented drought of the year 1965-66 continued to some extent in the year 1966-67. As a result the availability of agricultural raw material for industry declined. This had an adverse affect on the rate of industrial growth also. The general price level therefore continued to show upward trend.

The crop prospects for the year 1967-68 have however shown signs of improvement which can set the pace for economic recovery.

Since April, 1967 the general level of prices continued to rise. The average retail price Index which stood at /in 1966 - 150 in 1967 rose to 165 in 1967-68. The main contributing factor to the rise in prices was food group which rose to 188 in the month of Dec, 1967. The price index has however begun to show a decline since January 1968. The trend in ~~sp~~ price line can be judged from the prices of various commodities given below in statement No. R.3.13.

It is evident from the above table that there has been considerable rise in prices in almost all the essential commodities during the period 1966 and 1967. A Phenomeal rise in prices is observed especially in pulses and gur. However down ward trend in # prices is obsrvcd in respect of prices of dry chillies groundnut oil and dalda.

CHAPTER -IV  
ANNUAL PLAN 1967-68

**4.1 Introduction:-**

The fourth Plan of the country has not yet been finalised by the Govt. of India. The States Fourth Plan, which forms an integral part of the country's Fourth Plan could not therefore be finalised. Meanwhile, to facilitate the work of preparation of the annual plans the planning commission has tentatively approved the Sectoral outlays on the States Fourth Plan.

During the year 1967-68 some of the centrally sponsored schemes financed entirely by the Govt. of India have been transferred to the State Plan. But these transferred schemes will still continue to be financed wholly by the Central as heretofore, and will not form an additional burden on the States Financial resources. These schemes have therefore been shown separately as additional State Plan schemes transferred from centrally sponsored programmes and are over and above the State Plan as such.

The Annual Plan now prepared is for the whole financial year i.e 1967-68 and includes the provisions already made in the interim budget on account of continuing schemes.

During the year 1967-68, the size of the State Annual Plan was Rs.124 crores and almost, the same as that of the last year. The annual Plan provision for the district and division level schemes for Poona Division is observed to about Rs.25 crores. This allotment is nearly 20 percent of the State Plan. Sholapur dist. received 3.09 crores of this provision for the State and Local sector schemes altogether.

**4.2 Allocation between State and Local sector:-**

Since the Zilla Parishad is entrusted with the responsibility of the Local Development, out of 101 schemes, 44 schemes were implemented by the Zilla Parishad and 57 by the State Sector officers. Though the schemes implemented by the Zilla Parishad are 44 the expenditure incurred by the Zilla Parishad is comparatively less. The total expenditure incurred during the year 289.45 lakhs out of which the expenditure on schemes implemented by the Zilla Parishad is only 65.90 lakhs which comes to 22.77 percent. The expenditure in the State sector is Rs.223.55 lakhs which comes to 77.23 percent. Expenditure percentage for the Zilla Parishad is low as the schemes entrusted with the Z.P. were having comparatively small Budget revision. On the contrary the major schemes like Rural electrification, Contour Bunding, Irrigation and Cooperative schemes having huge budget provision were implemented by the State sector officers.

**4.3 Expenditure:-**

The progress of the Plan can be seen to some extent from the expenditure incurred on various heads of development. The total expenditure during the 1967-68 is 289.45 lakhs. This gives per capita expenditure of Rs. 16. The following Table gives the major headwise progress of expenditure during 1967-68.

It is evident from the above table that the head of development/Agricultural programmes has been given the Top 1 and priority claiming 39.16 percent of the total expenditure. Social services claim 25.12 percent. Irrigation and power 14.22 percent, Industry and Mining 9.93 percent, Cooperation and Community Development 7.55 and Transport and Communication 4.02 percent.

The Review of these schemes can be better seen if analysed separately for State sector and Local sector. The performances of State Sector and Local sectors separately can be seen from the following Table:-

It appears from the above table that the share of local sector in the expenditure position of the District is less than 25 percent. Thus the major share is 74% by the State sector. It is also observed from the above table that out of the total expenditure under Agricultural programme amounting to Rs. 118.59 lakhs during the year 1967-68, Rs.106.78 have been incurred under State sector and the remaining amount of Rs.11.81 is spent by the Zilla Parishad on Local sector schemes. The share of expenditure on Local sector schemes on Cooperation and Community Development is higher than that of State sector schemes under this Head,.

#### 4.4 Schemewise progress of expenditure & Achievement:-

Detail review of expenditure and achievement is taken below:-

#### 4.5 Agricultural programmes:-

Taking into consideration of the general characteristics of the District a high priority for investment in Agricultural programmes aiming at increase in yield per acre as well as income from ancillary activities has been given in the Annual plan 1967-68 as it was given in the previous year. Development of Irrigation from large as well as small work, Soil Conservation programmes and supplies of Fertilisers and improved seeds are some of the measures undertaken directly to increase production. As such the Agricultural programmes cover schemes relating to Agricultural production, Land Development, Minor Irrigation, Soil Conservation Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, Forest, Fisheries, Ware housing and Marketing.

##### 4.5-1. Expenditure:-

Out of the total Budget provision of 294.02 lakhs for the year 1967-68, The total expenditure incurred over the schemes under Agricultural programmes amounts to Rs.118.59. The details are as below:-

It is evident from the above table that the total expenditure over the schemes related to Agricultural programmes amounts to Rs.118.50 lakhs. It is also seen that Soil Conservation, and Minor Irrigation have been first priority among all the heads under Agricultural programmes. The Total amount spent under those Sub- Head which comes to Rs.96.40 lakhs is included to boost the Agricultural production. The above table reveals that out of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes, least expenditure has been incurred under Forest. In addition to these the progress under Agricultural production was not satisfactory due to late rains in kharif season. More over the Land acquisition proposal at Vairag could not be finalised.

#### 4.5.2 Physical Achievement:-

Brief account of physical achievement under various Sub-Heads ~~xx~~ relating to Agricultural programmes during the period under review is detailed below:-

##### 1) Agricultural production:-

Progress in agriculture can be gauged from (a) additional acreages brought under cultivation, irrigation and contour bunding (b) increase in crop yield resulting from the adoption of Modern Method of cultivation. Since agriculture is a private enterprise and the farmers are free to take their own decision, the achievements on behalf of the Government in this regard consist mainly of distribution of (a) improved Seeds(b) Chemical fertilisers(c) improved agricultural implements, plant protection etc. There were(11) schemes under operation during the period under Review performances some of the important schemes under agricultural programmes are given below:-

It appears from the above table that remarkable progress has been achieved under soil conservation.

Agriculture being the primary producing sector supporting about 70 percent of working population of the district, efforts on this sector have not been impeded in any manner during the Annual Plans for the year 1967-68. In view of this fact the same schemes of the Annual Plan for the year 1966-67 have been included during the Annual Plan for the year 1967-68. The scheme for the supply of chemical and fertilisers was intensified during the period under review as it was done during the year 1966-67. During the period under Review 10,106 Tons of Chemical fertilisers were distributed in the district through the Local cooperative Societies.

## 2) Land Development:-

In order to eradicate the evils of excessive fragmentation and Sub-division of agricultural holdings which seriously hamper the progress in Agriculture. The work of consolidation of holdings was regulated by Law in this district. Under this scheme 1,12,000 areas were covered during the period under Review.

## 3) Soil Conservation:-

For securing fair crop under adverse Soil and climatic conditions in the scarcity tract of Maharashtra State contour bunding has played a very important role in soil and moisture conservation and also in increasing the fertility of the soil. This dist. is one of the scarcity affected districts of the State. It has about 24 lakhs of acres having shallow and medium type of soil. During the year 1967-68 1,14,000 acres were banded.

## 4) (Minor Irrigation)

Among the various measures undertaken by Govt. for increasing food production minor irrigation occupies important place. The irrigation programme can broadly be classified (a) Minor Works programme (b) Medium irrigation (c) Major Irrigation projects.

The District level schemes in this district in main relate to the first category i.e Minor Works programme.

Schemes of minor irrigation were implemented both in Local and State sector. Construction of new wells, installation of pumping sets, improvement of irrigation wells by boring Air compressor drilling and blasting operations and Cooperative lift irrigation schemes are implemented in the State sector. The scheme regarding construction of Community wells is implemented under Local sector.

Under these schemes the achievements are as under. During the period 1967-68, 3 spillover works classified under district level schemes were undertaken under State sector as detailed below:-

The irrigation tanks at Junoni and Achakdani are likely to be completed in June, 1969 6 works taken up under drainage scheme are in progress.

The programme of minor irrigation works also included a scheme of financial assistance to cultivators for sinking new and repairs to old wells. Liberal Tagai Lans for this purpose were advanced to cultivators 2613 wells were completed during the period under review. Assistance was also rendered for well-repairs to extent of 417 wells. Under the scheme for installation of pumping sets financial assistance was given to the cultivators for installation 1180 pumping sets. With all these efforts and measures additional irrigational potential to the extent of 16006 acres has been created during the year 1967-68.

#### 5) Animal Husbandry:-

There were only(6) schemes under this sub- Head and all these schemes were under Local sector. The Animal Husbandry can be broadly classified in the following categories.

- 1) Provision of veterinary facilities (2) Improvement of Livestock i.e cattle, sheep and poultry and education in veterinary.

The scheme for expansion of veterinary facilities fall under(3) groups viz. provision of veterinary dispensaries, treatment against diseases and research in to diseases of livestock. There are (12) veterinary dispensaries and 30 aid centres in this district. The programme for the year 1967-68 includes provision for completion of the construction works of cattle shed quarters etc. at the cattle breeding farm at Junoni During the period under Review 2 spillover works regarding construction of building for establishment of veterinary dispensaries and centres have been taken up.

#### 6) Dairy Development:-

There are four schemes under this sub- Head and all these are State sector schemes. Supply of unadulterated milk at reasonable price to the people especially in the Urban areas was a long felt need. Accordingly Govt. milk supply scheme for Sholapur town was taken up during the second plan. The milk is procured through various centres and Cooperative societies.

The Dairy milk procurement was 6226 litres per day during the year 1966-67 which gone down 3008 litres per day. Since the procurement of the milk is done by cooperative unions. The progress of the scheme depends upon the progress and efficiency of the milk supplying unions. Both the unions(Naldurg and Sholapur Union) have supplied much less quantity of milk than expected in lean season and hence the shortfall.

#### 7) Forest:-

The scheme 'Afforestation for soil Conservation was implemented as State sector during the year 1967-68. The principal achievement under this scheme is that the afforestation of area about 188 hectares have been covered during the period under Review.

#### 8) Fisheries:-

The scheme for stock of inland water with carp-fry envisages survey of fresh water sheets and stocking suitable perennial sheets with rapidly growing various carp-fry(Baby fish). During the Second five year plan about 1160 acres of water sheets in this district was surveyed. About 4.3 lakhs carp-fry and fingerlings were stocked during the Second Five year plan period and 1.40 lakhs fish were netted. The scheme continued during the third five year plan and also during the period 1966-67 and 1967-68. During the period 1967-68 2.58 lakhs fingerlings were stocked and 0.30 lakhs of Kgs of fish were netted.

#### 9) Ware housing and Marketing:-

Development of Agricultural Marketing and development of grading were 2 State sector schemes under this head. Development of orderly marketing of Agricultural produce occupied a place of vital importance in the proper functioning of the Agriculture economy of the country. The schemes of development under this head envisages coverage of market by way of regulation and/great handling of large value of marketable surplus on cooperative basis 9 marketing societies formed during the period 1966-67, continued in the year 1967-68,

#### 4.6 Cooperation and Community Development:-

Cooperation and Community Development are two sub-heads under this major head. The expenditure incurred during the year 1967-68. On Cooperation and Community Development amounts to Rs.5.08 lakhs and Rs.16.77 lakhs respectively. Thus the total expenditure under this major head is Rs. 21.85 lakhs during the year 1967-68.

##### Cooperation:-

The Cooperative movement has considerable stricks in this district since agriculture is the main stay of our economy and credit to carryout agricultural activities is the desperate need of the Farmer. So far cooperative movement is concerned the Sholapur district has been in the forefront. The first legislation for cooperative societies in Bombay State was passed int the year 1904 and the first cooperative societies was establishment in this district in the year 1905 at the village Tadval in Akkalkot taluk. During the year 1967-68, the cooperative movement in this district has made considerable progress in the establishment of agricultural credit societies. During the period under review there were (3) schemes under this head and these were under State sector. There were three major schemes (1) Development of cooperative marketing(2) Labour contract societies(3) Consumers Cooperative Stores, constitute largest Share of expenditure amounting to Rs. 4.47 lakhs during 1967-68. On scheme of Labour contract Society only expenditure of Rs. 1.72 lakhs has been incurred. The Low share of expenditure on the scheme Distribution of consumer articles in rural areas through Marketing Cooperatives is observed 0.04 lakhs.

During the year 1967-68 the following achievements have been made under the Community Development and cooperation sector. The entire rural area of the district of Sholapur has already been covered under the C.D. programme. Under the Rural works programme(16) drinking water wells have been dug. Karmala and Pandharpur blocks were selected for Applied Nutrition programme under during the year 1967-68.

#### 4.7 Irrigation and Power:-

There is only one scheme under this head implemented by State sector namely Rural Electrification. The total expenditure under this head was 41.16 lakhs during the year 1967-68. During the year 1967-68, 38 villages have been electrified and 794 pumps connected. It is reported that nonavailability of service connection material is hampering the works. However remarkable achievements are expected in the years to come.

#### 4.8 Industry and Mining:-

There are three schemes under this head out of these one is implemented by State and the other one by Local sector, and the remaining one is under State and Local both.

The programme of Industry involves the total expenditure of Rs.28.74 lakhs during the year 1967-68. The development of Cottage Industries occupies an important place among the industrial development in this district. The programme is designed to promote the growth of Handloom weaving Industries. During the year 1967-68, 48 membership added under Handloom weavers cooperative societies.

#### 4.9 Transport and Communication:-

Development of Road is the only activity undertaken under this head and the same is implemented under 3 different schemes. Out of these three schemes, two are completely implemented by the Zilla Parishad and the remaining one scheme is implemented by both Local and State sectors.

The total expenditure under this head on all the three schemes amounts to Rs.11.63 lakhs during the year 1967-68. The programme of Road Development has been viewed in the light of the needs of the district for Communication to feed the Industrial areas to important Rail Heads and marketing centres with the interior to provide all weather Roads to facilitate extension of passengers transport services. During the year 1967-68, 12 miles Roads modernised. In addition to this 33 miles constructed under Rural Roads programme during the period under Review.

#### 4.10 Social Service:-

There were 10 sub-heads under this sector which are as detailed below:-

## 2. Technical Education:-

In the field of Technical education there is one scheme which comprises scheme for expansion of existing polytechnic and starting of new polytechnics. Under this scheme a Polytechnic institution was established at Sholapur in the month of June 1956, providing for Diploma Courses in Civil Mechanical and Electrical Engineering with 60 admissions. During the second five year plan 120 students were admitted and this strength incurred to 300 during the Third Five Year Plan. No significant progress appears to have been made during the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. However the expenditure incurred during 1967-68 under this head was Rs.43 lakhs which was on Staff.

## 3. Medical and Health:-

During the Third Five Year Plan appreciable progress has been made in providing curative and preventive health services. The same measures have been continued during the year 1966-67 & 1967-68.

## 4. Public Health:-

There are (5) schemes under this sub-head. Out of these (3) are under Local sector and the remaining (2) are under State sector. The total expenditure incurred over these schemes amounts to Rs.17.88 lakhs. During the period under Review the activities of the health centres have been strengthened. Under the Family Planning programmes 14,187 persons have undergone sterilisation operations and 721 Females have adopted intra-Uterine contraceptive methods especially loop.

The National Malaria Eradication programme Unit Pandharpur has been functioning in Sholapur district Since April 1954. During the year 1967-68, 2.54 lakhs blood-smears were taken.

## 5. Water supply & Drainage:-

The expenditure under this head amounts to Rs.28.75 lakhs. The following scheme were undertaken during the period under Review.

- 1) Govt. Water Supply and Drainage scheme.
- 2) Sholapur Municipal water supply & drainage scheme
- 3) Village Panchayat water supply & Drainage scheme.
- 4) Rural water supply scheme
  - a) Piped water supply(special Measures)
  - b) Well water supply(simple Measures)

## 6) Welfare of Backward Classes:-

There are (9) schemes under this head, and out of these 6 are implemented by Local sector and (3) under State sector. The total expenditure incurred over this head amounts to Rs.1.85 lakhs

The disabilities from which the backward classes including schedule caste and schedule Tribes suffer can be divided in to (3) broad categories.

- 1) Social, 2) Economic 3) Education.

The plan seeks to provide liberal assistance to this weaker section of the Community so that the Social and economic disabilities from which these communities suffer are removed. To promote literacy in the backward classes and to encourage the students of these communities to join institutions of higher learning special concessions have been provided in the development programme. During the period under review 1846 students were given scholarships. In addition to this 18 cosmopolitan hostels have been established during the year 1967-68. Liberal Tagai Loans were sanctioned for digging of wells for irrigation purposes to 15 persons of backward classes.

#### 7. Housing:-

In order to mitigate the housing shortage and also to develop Sholapur Town, housing programme has been continued in the Annual Plan 1967-68 also. There are three schemes under this programme and out of these two are implemented under State sector and the remaining one is implemented under Local sector. The total expenditure incurred over these schemes amounts to Rs. 4.75 lakhs during the year 1967-68.
