CHAPTER I

I n t r o d u c t i o n .

1.1 Ratnagiri District is situated in the south-west of Maharashtra. Sawantwadi Thasil of Ratnagiri district forms the last tip of Maharashtra, beyond which, Union territory of Goa starts. In terms of latitudes and longitudes, it lies between  $15^{\circ} - 36'$  and  $18^{\circ} 50'$  north latitudes and  $73^{\circ} 50'$  and  $74^{\circ} 36'$  East longitudes. The district is a long strip of land along the west coast of Maharashtra, separated distinctly 'desh' by the prominent ranges of Sahyadri. Thana, Kolaba, Ratnagiri are called 'Konkan' in general terms, to indicate their common geographical and environmental disposition. Ratnagiri is 'Tal Konkan' i.e. bottom of konkan. Administratively, to its north, lies Kolaba district, to its west lies the great Arabian sea. To the east beyond the Sahyadri mountains, the upghat district of Satara, part of Sangli and Kolhapur are situated. Belguam is situated in the eastern side of Sawantwadi Tahasil. To the south, the centrally administered territory of Gova exists. Ratnagiri is bestowed with the vast unbounded sea with its swinging waves on the one side and the high, tough and grand mountains of Sahyadri with its deep green vallies and thick forest on the other side. In between, the picturesque. Ratnagiri, with its tall and majestic bettanut and coconut trees, groves of mango orchards and cashewnut plantation, greenrice fields and vast medows looks like Kashmir of Maharashtra. Many of the Maharashtra. poets have sung the sublime beauty of this part of Maharashtra.

## 1.2. AREA AND POPULATION AND ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP:

This is a lengthwise district, the area of which comes to 12,905 sq. k.m. and its total population as per 1961 census is 18,27,203. The mid-term population estimate as per the Censusx Hand book of the district is 19.66 lakhs. In Bombay/ division greater Bombay excluding/ this district ranks second in terms of population and area. There are 15 Tahasils in the district. Ratnagiri district contains the largest number of Tahasils in the whole of Maharashtra. In Maharashtra state, as a whole Ratnagiri district ranks 9 th by size and fourth by population. Formerly there were four mahals viz. Lanja, Kanakawali, Kudal and Vengurla. But recently they have been up graded to Tahasils and therefore now there are in all 15 Tahasils. There are 1516 inhabited villages and 13 urban towns out of which only 7 have municipal councils at Khed, Chiplun, Ratnagiri, Rajapur, Malwan, Vengurla and Sawantwadi, There are no territorial changes in the district during the year under report.

## 1.3 GENERAL SOCIO ECONOMIC FEATURES:

The establishment of socio -economic-democracy through institutional changes has been carried out in the district. Panchayati-Raj institutions have been set-up in the district. These institutions are agencies of Government, and administration at the local level, to the extent that they are vested with powers which enable them to participate in the formalation of district plans and make them reponsible for implementing local programmes and shcemes. They can play a vital part in planning development\*. There are 15 Panchayat Samities, areas of which co terminate with the 15 Tahasils. The Zilla Parishad headed by its President is responsible for rural development

and rural family planning etc. At the Tahasil level, the 15 panchayat samities with 15 elected chairmen with the Secretarial assistance of the Block Development Officer, preside over the working of the 15 Panchayat Samities. #### 1.4 Topography:

The geography of Ratnagiri district is peculiar enough.



It is a lengthwise district having a length of 288 k.m. and a breadth of 64 k.m. in average. There are three distinct strips within this narrow width which make Ratnagiri peculiar. The strip near the sea coast is called the 'Khalathi' in colloquial language. Then next comes the "walati" which is rather fertile and contains the paddy fields of the district. The third strip of land forms the hill ranges of Sahyadri.

(1) Coastal tract--- western part of Mandangad, Dapoli, Guhagar, Ratnagiri, Rajapur, Deogad, Malwan, Vengurla comprise this tract. The area of this tract would come to 2755.2 (22%) sq. km. In this tract extensive plantation of coconut, betlenut, mango gardens, pine apple trees, jack fruit trees etc. are grown. The hot, humid and sa-~~lty~~ climate is most suited to Ratnagiri -- mango which is world famous. Fisheries is also an important feature of this part having 23 number of fishing ports. (2) The walati part or the gentle slope of Sahyadri forms an important economic topographical feature of Ratnagiri. The paddy fields are there and varkar land is also available where shifting cultivation is done. The varkar land is privately owned and due to ruthless tree cutting the soil is washed away and rivers and creeks are silted. Cashew nut plantation is proposed in this area. (3) The last tract clearly out cut is the hilly area. The peculiarity of the district is most of the forest of this area is privately owned. The ruthless tree cutting has resulted in base-mountains due to which it feared rainfall has been uneven even in this area. Only Sawantwadi area has a forest division in this district except a part of range in Dapoli Taluka. The Sahyadri mountains are well cut and the hills, dales and mountain peaks make this district a paradise of Maharashtra.

Generally, the eastern part of the district is hilly. Being made of lava flows they show the typical banded and terraced form, with a pronounced tendency to develop flat tops and smoother contours. \*Many of the peaks which were commanding in position and difficult in disposition became fortified points since time unknown. But these forts which are several in number were the pivotal points in social, economical and political point of view since Adilashahi and later Marathas made these their army head quarters. Mandangad, Palagad, Mahipatgad (3090 ft.), Sumargad (3090 ft.), Rasalgad, etc. were important because of their conspicuous landmark for many miles around".

The drainage of the district is mostly parallel. The major rivers receive their waters from the Sahyadrian main range and flow westwards to the Arabian sea, through deep well cut channels. In length they seldom exceed forty miles. Each of them however, has a small drainage area and hence they are of small size and volume. Their intensely seasonal regime is yet another limitation to their economic use\*.

Out of the 22 rivers flowing through the district seven are major and navigable in some parts of the district (Khalati), during fair season. The Socio Economic Review and District Statistical Abstract of 1962-64 contains details information of the rivers in the district.

#### Soils:

The predominant soils in the district are laterite soils. These are found in various textures. Generally the soil is not rich as compared to neighbouring Kolhapur or Saggali district soils. This may be due to the constant washing away of the soil into the sea. The Soils in the district can be divided into five grades i) Rice soils, ii) Warkas soils, iii) Garden soils, iv) Coastal alluviums, v) Salty sands.

These soils are normally found in the generally stratified areas as elsewhere mentioned. Warkas soils are found on the slopes of hills and are partly eroded, yellowish red and poor in fertility. This part of soil is not deep. Ragi, cashew and mangoes are cultivated in this soil. In the middle, we find the garden soils, located in the basins of the rivers. These are better soils having arecanut and coconut gardens, having commercial -- importance. Salty lands are locally called Khar lands. According to the survey carried out by the Kharland Development Board, this land is estimated to be 3600 hectares.

Geologically the soil of this district is formed out of the 'Jambha' stones which quarries of which can be seen everywhere in the district. Thana and Kolaba district have the mouths of Ulhas and Savitri rivers which have provided deep soils carried from the flow. In general, potash and phosphates of Ratnagiri soil are much deficient. It is acidic in nature with varying pH value and deficient in Calcium, Nitrogen, phosphorus.

#### 1.6 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall:

Ratnagiri, being a coastal district, it has a temperate climate. The temperatures do not vary in day and night and even from season to season, unlike the districts which are remote from the sea. The climate generally is sultry and never extreme and on the whole healthy. The maximum temperature in the hot season which was 30.8°C in May 1967 was at its minimum 28.1°C in the month of January 1967. The maximum temperature in the hot season seldom rises to about 37°C while minimum temperature in the winter rarely falls below 15°C. The span of the year is generally divided into summer, rainy season and winter. Summer starts by March and ends by mid

June. With prefin of a few days of very hot weather the rains start which are proverbial. Waters are poured from above the heaven. The rainy seasons continues up to Seotember. After the October heat is over, winter srabts and ends by Februa-ary. The winter days are pleasant because the winds are modest.

Rainfall:

Ratnagiri being on the right side of <sup>sahyadri,</sup> Sahyadri, receives heavy rainfall. The coastal Tahasils received on an average 2359 and 2517 mms. rainfall during 1966 and 1967 respectively. The Tahasils which are rather situated on the ranges or in between ranges of the Sahyadri mountain for example Chiplun, received 3279 and 3585 mms. of rainfall during the same period. The district has assured rainfall. The follwoing table gives total rainfall in Ratnagiri district for the year 1965 to , 1967 in mms.

## Scarcities, natural calamities etc. :

This district did not have any scarcity and famine during the year, under review. However in this year, " the State was affected by a major calamity when the earthquake rocked Koynanagar and the surrounding areas in the early hours of 11th December, 1967 affecting over 1,600 villages in Satara, Ratnagiri, Sangali and Kolhapur district. Over 57 thousand houses were totally destroyed or badly damaged. In addition 63 thousand houses were partially damaged, Considerable damage was caused to roads, bridges, culverts and other construction. The total population affected in the four districts is estimated at nearly eight lakhs. The damage caused to public property is estimated to be about 4.8 crores and that to the private property about Rs. 10.4 crores." \* Separate figures of the above caused damage for Ratnagiri are not available. However, the Collector, in his Annual Administration Report 1967-68 states that Rs. 40,00,826.37 were distributed in the form of subsidy. Rs. 59,62,960 = 98 were distributed as loans in cash and Rs. 9,64,278.03 loans in kind were given to the people to resettle the affected.

### 1.7 Special features:

Worth noting features of Ratnagiri are numerous but only the following few are highlighted.

1. Ratnagiri district is one of the districts of Maharashtra state which is endowed with rich deposits of some of the industrial minerals. These can sustain mineral based industries in the district and the State. The major minerals are the-- Ilmenite manganese ore, iron ore, salt, Bauxite, Mica, Chromite mangrove tile type clay, Cilica.

2. Ratnagiri is world famous for its Alphonso - mangoes. Mango based industries like canning, pulp making, pickle making etc. are started throughout the district. Tinned mango pulp and juice are exported to other parts of Maharashtra, India and abroad. The humid, hot and temperate climate of the coastal tract is suitable for this delicate fruit which is extremely tasty and handsome to look at. In addition, cashew coconut, jack fruit, pineapple are the specialisation of this district small factories of cashew have been set up at Vengurla and Kudal Tahasils.

3. Ratnagiri has the largest coastal length in Maharashtra (320 KM). There are two all weather ports <sup>/ even though they are not well developed</sup> in Ratnagiri port i.e. Bhagawati Bunder is being developed as an all weather port. The programme of mechanization of fishing boats has become very popular. We have now over 320 mechanised fishing trawlers engaged in fishing operation as against 2000 in the whole of Maharashtra\*. In addition there are 21 fish curing yards being run by the Department. Where facilities to cure fish in salt are provided to fishermen.

4. Special emphasis on horticultural development is being given by the state Government. Programme for the cultivation of mango and cashewnut in the konkan region have been drawn up with the object of promoting export of these fruits under centrally sponsored -- programme<sup>3</sup>.

5. Sindhudurg, Vijaydurg, Suvarnadurga etc. forts of Maharashtra are situated in this district. Sindhudurga of Malwan

attracts special attention as it was built by Shri Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. In addition, Govalkot near Chiplun, Mandangad Fattedgad in Dapoli Tahasil, Mahipatgad in Khed, Jangali Jayagad in Chiplun, etc. are famous mountainous forts.

6. Rajapur Ganga is a natural phenomenon nowhere noticed. The Ganga water springs of its own accord every after 3 years and continues for about 60 days. People from far away places come there to have a dip in the holy water.

Canapatipule, Karneshwar near Sangameshwar, Parshuram near Chiplun, Dhut Papeshwar near Rajapur and Kunakeshwar near Deogad are the famous Temples of this district.

7. In beauty, Ratnagiri exceeds all other parts of Maharashtra. The sea with its unfathomable depth embraces this district with its himalayan tides. On the other side, the Sahyadri stands like a sage blessing this district with plentiful rains. The tall betlenut and coconut trees raise their heads high the green meadows and paddy fields look beautiful. The small boats with their masts make this district enchanting. In other words, Ratnagiri is Kashmir of Maharashtra.

8. This district has produced great national leaders like the Late Lokmanya Tilak who was born and brought up in Ratnagiri. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, the founding father of Indian Constitution, Gopal Krishna Gokhale, the Guru of Mahatma Gandhi, Maharshi Karve, R.P. Paranjape, Sane Guruji are all born in this district. Even to day this district is serving the nation. This District has given birth to saints. The swami Swaroopananda of Pawas is the one to be named. The Freedom Figher, the late Sawarkar was detained here for several years by the foreign rulers

9. Amboli, hill resort is being developed by the Government.

## CHAPTER II

### Explanatory Note on Sources and limitations of Statistics presented in the Statistical Abstract.

1. Purpose and scope : This is the sixth issue of the Statistical Abstract of this district. <sup>The</sup> purpose of publishing this Abstract is to present background statistical material on as many socio economic characteristics of the dist. as is possible so that the Abstract may prove useful as a reference book and for planning at the district level. Some social and economics Statistics are presented over a series of years to bring out changes in this field.

1.2 The present issue relates to the year - 1967-68 and the detailed data are published for the year 1967-68. Wherever possible the data for the available year are given. The Statistical data presented in these Abstracts are initially compiled by various departments of the state Government, Govt. of India Local bodies etc. These departments usually prepare and release provisional figures for recent years. Ultimately when the figures are finalized, they are slightly different from the provisional figures released elsewhere. For this reason, the data published in the Bureau's other publications viz. Statistical Abstract of Maharashtra State, Hand-book of basic statistics of Maharashtra State etc. Some time do not tally.

#### 2. Area and population:

2.1 Final figures of 1961 Population Census are presented in all the tables in this section. Table No. 3 gives tahasil-wise area, population by sex and population per Sq. K.M. along with percentage variation over 1951. Table No. 4 gives Tahasil wise classification of villages in Ratnagiri district according to population range in 1961 Census. A 'village' is a statutorily



recognized village having a defined boundary and a separate land records. Hamlets or wadis are not considered. Table No. 5 gives Tahasilwise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1961 in Ratnagiri district. For the purpose of 1961 Census, a town or an Urban area was defined as a place which has (i) a municipality, a cantonment or civil lines or (ii) population of 5000 or over and at least three-fourths or more of male workers engaged in non-agricultural pursuits. Table No. 6 gives number of workers and non workers in each Tahasil of Ratnagiri district according to 1961 census.

### 3. Climate :

3.1 The table No. 2 gives 'mean' 'Mean maximum' and mean minimum annual temperature in respect of 4 centres in Ratnagiri district. The figures are based on the monthly data supplied by the Govt. of India's regional meteorological office. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the year. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature thus arrived at . . .

Table No. 1 gives monthly normal rainfall, rainy days and rainfall at the 16 centres in the district. The figures are simple averages of the normal rainfall at different raingauges stations in each district and the normal number of rainy days respectively. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eight years. As regards rainy days, a day was treated as rainy day if during the twenty four hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5. m.m. of rainfall.

4. Agriculture:

4.1 The important statistics in the section are subdivided into (i) Land utilization, (ii) Irrigation and (iii) Area and outturn of individual crops.

4.2 Table No. 9 gives Tahasilwise land utilization under the standard heads of utilization. Against each Tahasil, the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purpose.<sup>1</sup>

Under 'Forest' are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and under water, e.g. river and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. Barren and Unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts, etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classified as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing land cover all grazing lands, whether they are

permanant pastures and medows or not village common and grazing land cover all grazing lands, within forest crops are included under this head. Under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Land under Casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel, etc. which are not included under 'orchards' are classed under this category. Cultivable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such land may be either fallow or covered under shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assosed or not assosed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Current fallows comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but the temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than five years. The reason for keeping such land fallow may be one of the following: (1) poverty of cultivator (2) Inadequate supply of water, (3) malarial climate, (4) Sitting of canals and rivers, (5) Soil erosion and (6) Unremunerative nature of farming. The net area sown consts of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. Table No. 10 gives Tahasilwise area under different crops in Ratnagiri District. Table No. 11 gives yield per hectares and outturn of principal crops in Ratnagiri district. The figures are for the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. The estimates of outturn are based partely on the results of crop cutting surveys and partly on 'anawari' method. At present, crop cutting surveys are being conducted in respect of

rice, Bajri, Jowar, Wheat, Ragi, Gram, Tur (partly), Sugarcane Cotton, groundnut and tobacco (Satara, Sangali and Kolhapur dist. only). This is the reason why yield and outturn of

Cashew, mangoes etc. is not given in the abstract. The irrigating statistics are shown in table Nos. 12, 13 and 14. Here again the primary source of information in the village record A quinquennial census of irrigation source takes place after every five years. For only intermediate years, the village officers are instructed to note the number of new irrigation wells constructed or old wells which have gone out of use and thus bring up-to-date the earlier quinquennial census figures of wells. Table No. 15 gives minor irrigation data. Table No. 16 belongs to medium and major irrigation but since there are no major and medium projects, the table is blank. Table No. 17 gives agricultural wage rates at 3 selected centres in the district. The wage rate data is collected by the Block Senior Assistant (Statistics) when he visits the centre for his rural retail price collection work. The data is presented for two years 1966- and 1967. Table no. 18 gives data on different types of agricultural implements as per 1966 Livestock census in each Tahasil of Ratnagiri.

5. Community Development Programme:

5.1 The entire rural area of the district is now covered by community Development programme. Table 68, 69, 70 gives information about C.D. Programme, expenditure incurred in different stages of Blocks, physical achievements on selected items. The information in the later tables is furnished for the year 1966-67 and 1967-68. The tables show achievements through other departmental activities also besides these under C.D. Programme.

6. Animal Husbandry:

6.1 Tables 20, 21, 22, 23 give data regarding veterinary statistics. Statistics of Livestock in each Tahasil, Hospitals and dispensaries in each tahasil, diseasewise livestock and mortality in Ratnagiri and data of recognized slaughter houses in the district. The figures of Livestock pertain to the 1966 Livestock Census. These are quinquennial censuses conducted throughout the country on the uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration. At these censuses, all the livestock is enumerated by house to house enquiry. Table no. 21 gives statistics of animals treated, artificial insemination in the district.

7. Forests:

Table No. 24 (A) and 24 (B) are dedicated to forest statistics. Table No. 24(A) gives details of area under different types of forest. Information regarding forests under the control of the State Forest Department and those under the control of the State Revenue Department is shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forest Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the unaccessible forests or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Govt. from local bodies or private individuals for management on leased basis are called

leased forests. Such forests are not existing in Ratnagiri district. The forest area shown in table 24 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table on land utilization

The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons

(i) In the Indian <sup>Forest</sup> / Statistical Returns, the whole area including non-wooded area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forest while in agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its utilization. (ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of forest areas the actual utilization of these areas is not so important from their point of view as it is in the land utilization statistics for agricultural statistics. (iii) The Forest Department returns relate to the financial years and Agricultural Statistics relate for the agricultural years .

#### 8. Fisheries :

8.1 Table No. 24(c) gives information regarding quantity of fish brought for curing at curing yard, quantity of salt issued and the quantity of fish removed.

#### 9. Co-operation :

9.1 In all there are 8 tables for which information from the District Deputy Registrar has been obtained. Statistical information is shown separately in respect of the following groups of co-operative institutions (1) Co-operative Banks, (2) Primary Agricultural credit Societies in each Tahasil, (3) Other co-operative societies of different types, (4) Tahasilwise operation of primary co-operative marketing societies, (5) Operations of other types of societies, (6) Information regarding registered money lenders. Owned Capital shows paid up capital. Working capital includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowing. Loans outstanding

includes outstanding in respect of loans, cash credits and over drafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority. Table No. 33 gives information regarding operation of marketing societies and agricultural marketing society is a cooperative institution the main object of which is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or members of cooperative credit societies in its area of operation.

10. Electricity:

10.1 The table No. 33 gives data regarding generation and consumption of electricity in Ratnagiri district. Table No. 34 gives number of towns and villages electrified. This information is for 1961, 1966, 1967 and 1968 ending years. This facilitates comparative study of stride of electricity in this dist.

11. Local Bodies:

11.1 Financial position regarding village panchayats, Municipal Councils, Zilla Parishad Ratnagiri are shown at Tables 62, 63, 64 A and B.

12. Other Tables :

12 There are other tables on Industries, Employment, Education, Judicial and Administrative, Medical, Prices, Annual Pla etc. They need no explanation as such. These tables are dealt with at length elsewhere.

### CHAPTER III

#### :ANALYTICAL REVIEW GIVING SECTORAL TRENDS:

The period considered here is the Annual Plan period 1967-68.

1. Gross sown area and net sown area:

This year, the monsoon set in the second week of June. Substantial rains were received and facilitated timely completion of sowing. Rains received in the first week of July were scanty and trasplanting of paddy was held up in konkan tract. However wide spread rains were received in the second fortnight of July which facilitated transplating of paddy. How ever, the dry spell that prevailed till the third week of September, which was also the critical phase of crop growth, caused considerable anxiety. Maharashtra an economic review 1967-68 says-- "Rice croap in Kolhapur and Ratnagiri districts was also affected" widespread rains, practically all over the state in the third week of September once again brightened the prospects of Kharif crops.

The net area sown in the district did not increase substantially since 1960-61. The net area almost remained constant. In 1960-61 net area sown which was 3,50,212 hecateres. The same was 3,55,176 hecateres in 1966-67. It is to be noted the decline of net area sown from 3,59,562 hecateres in 1965-66 to 3,55,176 hecateres in 1966-67. However, the area sown more than once has gone up from 10,080 hecateres in 1965-66 to 14,271 in 1966-67. The Gross area consequently has practically remained

the same. The following table will throw light on the other sectoral changes in the land utilization of Ratnagiri district.

The figures of agricultural data supplied by the Statistician, Deptt of agriculture are, however provisional and will be revised when the final figures are made available. The figures of area under different crops as presented in table no. 10 indicate less deviations in the cropping pattern. However area under total cereals has declined from 2,24,113 hectares in 1965-66 to 2,21,947 hectares in 1967-68. Also area under total pulses and foodgrains in general have declined. Mangoes crop, other fruits and vegetables have noted increasing trend in the area. As per the divisional soil conservation officer an area of 20,121<sup>\*</sup> hectares were brought under cashew plantation.

Ratnagiri being a coastal district, Cropping pattern is quite limited. Paddy is the main crop. The following tables will reveal the sectoral changes in the cropping pattern.

From the above figures, it becomes clear that not much change is noticed in the cropping pattern of the district. The efforts under horticultural-- schemes and mango schemes are yet

to be noted. The figures of outturn shown under area in brackets also do not show any impressive departure from the normal trend. Sugarcane has been introduced in the districts and Groundnut also seems to have some scope. Special -- Sugarcane Development Officer is appointed at Chiplun and he is working under the Administrative control of the Zilla Parishad. The Groundnut development is being looked after by the Asst. Horticultural Development Officer, Sawantwadi.

Percentage of Irrigation:

The total gross irrigated area of Ratnagiri district is 15,517 hectares during 1965-66 and 14,273 hectares during 1966-67. This comes to 3.9% of the gross cropped area. The figures of irrigation in other districts of Konkan region are as follows:

This means Ratnagiri stands first in respect of irrigation in Konkan. In Bombay Division Nasik stands first with 775 hundred gross hectares of land under irrigation. Jalgaon comes next having 697 hundred hectares of land under irrigation. Dhulia comes third. These are upghat district where assumed rainfall is not available. Within district paddy is the crop having 5,113 hectares of land under irrigation. About 200 hectares of ~~lof sunarrai~~ is also irrigated. Maximum irrigation is by private canals. Next to it is by other sources. One significant factor regarding irrigation is <sup>that net</sup> area irrigated and gross area irrigated are the same. This is because by irrigation only one crop is taken.

Agricultural Credit:

The Co-operative Movement in Maharashtra State a

Reappraisal\* by Hon. Shri Y. J. Mohite, Minister for co-operation has excluded Konkan districts from the operation of the new pattern of Banking to give them specialised treatment. "The three District -- Central Co-operative Banks, of Ratnagiri, Thana and Kolaba represent therefore, even to day as a consequence the weakest financial institution in the long chain of Banks catering to the credit requirements of the people<sup>1</sup>.

As regards the operation of agricultural credit and multi purpose societies, in the district the trend can be seen from the following table. The figures are presented for 3 years.

From the above table it becomes clear that the trend of change in this sector is normal and rising. The number of societies

which were 696 in 1963-64 rose to 720 in 65-66 and 708 in 66-67. During 1967-68 they were 711 in number. As regards membership. The corresponding figures are 121, 163, 202, 209 respectively. Owned capital rose from 3,488 thousand rupees in 1963-64 to Rs. 3,827 in 1967-68. The position of % overdues truly reflects the healthy trend of the co-operative movement. From this point of view the overdues which stood at Rs. 1,849 thousand rupees in 1963-64 went to Rs. 3,671 at the end of the third Plan i.e. 1965-66. During the year 1967-68 the same is Rs. 4,590 thousand. The percentage overdues to outstanding recovery during 1965-66, was 36, during 1966-67, 45 and during the year under report the same is 57 % The overdues are mounting and the recoveries are not commensurate with advances.

It is an established fact that the agricultural production programme in the state depends to a large extent on the production credit provided by the co-operative institutions. From that point of view the <sup>volume</sup> % of credit provided by the co-operative societies in the district has increased significantly.

The State Government has been taking various steps for linking credit with marketing and for strengthening and expanding the co-operative marketing movement such as Share Capital contribution on liberalised pattern, guarantees for the clean cash credit for purchase and distribution of foodgrains-- through co-operative societies\* etc. In Ratnagiri there were 20 marketing societies during 1965-66 i.e. by end of the Third Plan period. The corresponding figures for other district in kon-kan region and Bombay division are as follows.

The co-operative sector has to gain much ground in the field of forest oriented industrial co-operation. The fisheries Deptt. has come forward to give all help in the form of finance and technical know-how if fisheries co-operatives are organised and made viable " Canning of sea products, the latest method of growing in sea bed algae, the greatest source of protein will transforme konkan agriculture into a commanding position. Ship building as a decentralised industry can be organised on a massive scale. Sand Collection as an industry to supplement the income of the people.\* There is a horticultural produce market committee in this district.

#### Electricity:

Electricity is changing the face of many village in this district and setting the pace for the spread of the green revolution. The potential for increasing the per acre yield of garden crops of this district alone justifies a massive stepping up of the power programme. So far 144 village out of 1516 village have been electrified by end of 1967-68. The population covered is estimated at 3,49,195. There are two division one at Chiplun and the other at Kudal. By end of 1967 116 villages were electrified and during next Annual Plans 28 villages were electrified. The Zilla Parisjad, Ratnagiri is very keen to cover the

whole/area by the power. In this district 437 pumps are electri-  
fied by end of 1968. The coming of electricity changes the pattern  
of life in the villages. To start with, it adds several hours  
to the villages working hours. The pumps enable him to give assured  
water to his crops.

Transport and Communications:

Road Development: Total surfaced road in this district as on  
31-3-1968 is 4,925 k.m. out of this 230 K.M. cement concrete,  
641 k.m. Black topped, 1587 k.m. / In addition 2467 k.m. are un-  
surfaced i.e. village roads are existing in this district.

At present all weath r Bombay- Konkan Goa road is the  
most important and only comminicable road liking Kashedi in  
the north to Dodamarg in the South of the district. This road is  
vital link for commincation but some of its patches in Sangameshwar  
Taluka are remaining incomplete.

## C H A P T E R . I V

### ANNUAL PLAN 1967 - 68.

As the national Fourth Five Year Plan could not be finalised the state of Maharashtra for the uninterrupted continuance and maintainance of schemes already in progress, certain provisions were made in the interim budget presented in the last March viz<sup>1</sup> 1967. Final Annual Plan 1967-68 was presented to the Assembly on 15th June 1967 where in Annual Plan 1967-68<sup>was</sup> of the order of Rs. 110.55 crores, although anticipated expenditure is to the tune of Rs. 122.00. With effect from the financial year 1967-68 some of the centrally sponsored schemes financed entirely by the Govt. of India have been transferred to the State Plan-But these transferred schemes will still continue to be financed wholly by Centre as thereto. These schemes have therefore been shown separately as "additional State Plan schemes" transferred from centrally sponsored programmes and over and above the state plan as such. The change in classification affords a greater measure of operational freedom in implementing these schemes subject to the overall guidance from the centre<sup>1</sup>.

In the preface of the Annual Plan 1967-68 part one, it is clearly stated that the Annual Plan lays emphasis on the production sectors of the Plan and includes provisions for the key programmes. "The key note of the Annual Plan has been consolidation of the gains already made, avoidance of inflationary spending, and enlargement of these areas of operation where optimum gains accrue within the shortest possible time and with the utmost economy"<sup>1</sup>. We may safely say that this key note also pervades in the Ratnagiri District Annual Plan outlay for 67-68

## SIZE OF THE ANNUAL PLAN:

The District Annual Plan 1967-68 is of the order of Rs. 323.44 lakhs which comes to 2.9% of the state plan 1967-68. The per capita expenditure of the plan comes to Rs. 16.37 per head. The State Finance minister, while presenting budget estimates and the State Annual Plan to the Assembly on 15th June 1967, said "But this amount is obviously far below our minimum needs. We require large amounts for carrying out essential programmes like rural electrification, minor irrigation schemes and major and medium irrigation projects".<sup>2</sup> All these schemes mentioned above are the felt needs of this district where only one 144 villages are electrified out of 1516 villages. There are no major and medium irrigation projects. During the Third Five Year Plan period, an amount of Rs. 704.41 lacks were spent in the Dist. In the Annual Plan period of 1966-67, Rs. 212.14 laks were spent. It must be noted here that the third Plan and Annual Plan expenditure figures are not comparable as changes in the district and divisional schemes have been made. It is therefore felt that comparison of the two Annual Plans will be meaningful. The following tables give the figures under major head.

The figures reveal that the annual Plan 1967-68 was consolidation oriented arising "enlargement of these areas of operation/optimism gains accrue within the shortest possible time". On almost all the heads, the expenditure is on the rising trend. Now to turn to the major heads, the following paragraphs indicate the salient features of the economic and the key programme included in the Annual Plan 1967-68.

AGRICULTURE PROGRAMME:

As in the past, the programmes for the agriculture production have been assigned the highest priority. Out of the total outlay of Rs. 107.71 lakhs, Rs. 94.10 lakhs or about 87% of the total outlay has been earmarked for the programmes relating to the agriculture and allied programmes including irrigation, electrification of Agriculture pumps. The major feature of these programmes is the adoption of high yielding varieties as the case is the in the other district. The reasons for shortfall are obvious. The tract is unsuitable for commercial crops like, groundnuts, cotton, chillies, sugar cane etc. although every effort is being made to popularise sugarcane and groundnuts in the Ratnagiri Dist. The programme of high yielding varieties of paddy is only undertaken in this district. The percentage of area under high yielding varieties to total area under paddy is as under

There is no canal irrigation in this district. The main source of irrigation are gravitation flow on kacha bandharas and lift irrigation in some areas of Rajapur and Dorukh Tahsils<sup>1</sup>. Although the percentage of utilization of high yielding variety is low as compared to upghat districts like Dhulia where the targets set for hybrid and high yielding varieties have been fulfilled, (2)<sup>the varieties</sup> IN 1 and IR - 8 are gaining popularity among the cultivators and the area under these varieties is steadily increasing.

The main difficulties in the increasing of area under high yielding are the rainfed fields, the rains being uneven, cultivators do not use full doses of fertilizers for Kharif crop. Assured water supply by way of irrigation is one of the solutions for this difficulty. Another difficulty is the area being of hills and dales, slight rains cut off a large number of villages situated in the interior and render transport of fertilizer impossible\*

Horticultural Development:

Annual Plan 1966-67 States -- " Horticultural development is of importance for the economic development of certain parts of the state like Konkan, apart from being a rich source of supplementary diet..... A special organisation for this programme has been created under the Joint Director of Agriculture (Horticulture) at the State, Divisional and District levels. A special scheme for development of Horticulture in Konkan areas has also been implemented during the third Plan.<sup>2</sup> The emphasis clearly indicates that horticulture is a relieving feature of Konkan in general and Ratnagiri district in particular. The emphasis is reiterated in the Annual Plan 1967-68. It says. " In the third Plan a total outlay of Rs. 247 lakhs was provided for horticultural development of which 226.50 lakhs were earmarked for the Konkan region where the potential for the horticultural development of fruits like cashewnut, mangoes, coconuts, and arecanuts is high. The scale of assistance for horticulture was liberalised by raising the limits of loan amount for different fruit crops, grant of subsidies to the fruits growers for seedlings, nitrogenous fertilizers and postieses small nurseries have been established at all seed farms having irrigation facilities for meeting the increasing demand of the farmers for the planting material. The coverage under the scheme during the Third Plan was as follows".

The figures into brackets indicate the work done in Ratnagiri in the Third Plan period. An expenditure of Rs. 5.98 lakhs was incurred on the scheme in Ratnagiri during 1966-67 mainly on loans for raising different fruit crops. During 1967-68, the expenditure on this scheme was Rs. 15.16 lakhs. An Amount of Rs. 9.00 lakhs was provided as loans to cyclone

affected fruit growers in Ratnagiri district for rehabilitating orchards<sup>1</sup>.

During the year under review a provision of Rs. 15.50 lakhs was made for granting long term loans. It was proposed to undertake new plantation on an area of 108630 hectares and rejuvenation of another 364 hectares during the year. Against this performance target set up for the district, an area 3,285 hectares was covered under new plantation and 86 hectares were rejuvenated. In this way horticulture has been the major <sup>pleenk</sup> and a relieving feature. A special Horticultural Development Officer is posted at Ratnagiri who looks after the whole of Konkan districts.

#### LAND DEVELOPMENT:

Ratnagiri district is situated in between the Sahyadri ranges on the one hand and the Arabian sea on the other. The slope of Sahyadri makes the drain of water precarious and has been a problem of soil conservation since pre-historic days. In the olden days, the area was thickly wooded and soil was naturally conserved but since the private forest is indiscriminately being cut, the problem of soil conservation has been a major one in the district. The annual Plan 1966-67 part I says-- "In the heavy rainfall areas, particularly in the region covered by the western Ghats and the coastal tract, heavy soil erosion by running water needs to be checked by terracing of hill slopes coupled with afforestation. Another special feature of the coastal region of the state is that a large number of waddy fields are constantly eroded by encroachment of sea water, and these have to be reclaimed for cultivation<sup>2</sup> Terracing of lands is resorted

to in hilly areas with high rainfall not only for checking soil erosion but also to convert into paddy fields all hill slopes on which only hill millets grow at present. From the beginning of the Third Plan up to end of 1966-67 789 hectares of land was terraced in this district. During the Annual Plan period of 1967-68 an area of 480 hectares was terraced. In konkan in general and in Ratnagiri in particular, combination of bunding and terracing with cashewnut plantation serves as an ideal measure of land development. An outlay of Rs. 16.58 lakhs was provided in the Annual Plan 1967-68 of the district. This programme was initially taken in Ratnagiri district with an outlay of Rs. 80 lakhs. Out of this amount Rs. 22.72 lakhs were spent bringing 3,977 hectares of land under this programme. "Due to difficulties of obtaining plantation labour an area of 4,453 Hectares only could be covered during the Third Plan".<sup>1</sup> During 1966-67 an area of 5,162 hectares was covered and during the year under report another 4,555 hectares was covered.

Soil conservation is an acute problem of this dist. which has been noted by the Government. Accordingly Kharland reclamation, soil conservation cum horticultural development, terracing etc. schemes are specially executed in Ratnagiri. Information booklet No. 304 of May 1968 gives detailed information of agricultural development schemes for Konkan. Out of an area of 3,644 hectares of reclamated kharland 2,700 is reclaimed. According to the Annual Plan 1967-68, in coastal areas of this State an area of about 60,720 hectares has gone out of use due to ingress of sea water is capable of being reclaimed and brought under cultivation by providing ring bunds and other improved practices. The estimated reclaimable kharland in Ratnagiri comes to 3,646 hectares which comes to 6% of the state.

The work is being done by the kharland development Board which initially incurs the whole expenditure and subsequently recover 50% thereof from the beneficiaries in 10 equal instalment

According to rough estimate an area of 2.55 lakh hectares in this state requires to be terraced, making available for paddy cultivation fields where formerly only inferior varieties of millets could be grown. In addition to this, the private forest which is cut without afforestation programme, /according to one estimate nearly 3.5 to 4.5 lakh hectares of barren and uncultivable land, privately owned, will be available for afforestation which ultimately will conserve the soil.<sup>1</sup> The main reason for heavy soil erosion are slope of the land, intensity of precipitation, removing the vegetation, keeping the land without cultivation ploughing the land along the ridges and clearing the forest. Since 1963 about 1,569 hectares of land has so far been covered as compared with 4,453 hectares covered in the State up to end of Third Plan<sup>2</sup>.

The Statement clearly indicate that there is a lot of scope for the soil conservation programme in this district. Due to high slope there is less scope for contour bunding as also the scope for terracing is not considerable as compared to total land available for soil conservation. The programme of trenching and plantation of cashew has got a wide scope in the district. The expenditure on these schemes was Rs. 24.01



lakh in 1966 and Rs. 26.26 lakh in 1967-68. The above two programmes i.e. Horticulture and land development are dealt with extensively in this chapter because they are the main plank of the development programme in addition to others in this district.

## II Co-operation and Community Development :

As far as co-operation is concerned, out of the budgeted amount of Rs. 3.02 lakhs in 1967-68 Rs. 3.08 lakhs are spent. As for the performance side, There were 713 societies with a membership of 2,08,552. Member-ship proportion for the district per 1000 population in 1967-68, was 94 and membership-proportion per 100 hectares for the district in 1967-68 was 47. The maximum proportion of membership per 1000 population was in Mandangad hundred and that of per/hectare was 84 in Deogad Tahasil. There were 84 defunct societies. Among the large sized societies. Only Sawantwadi Tahasil had one Society with 319 membership. As for the primary Agricultural Credity Societies membership increased from (1966-67) 2,01,929 to 2,08,552 (1967-68)

## Community Development :

Community Development Blocks now Cover the entire rural area of the district. The district had been allotted 28.50 CPA pattern blocks in the district during 1967-68.

The major Contribution of the C.D. Programme which was initiated in the state in 1952, has been to stimulate an inte-

grated total approach to rural development based on local institutions and community action through representative institutions of the people. In the year under review Rs. 30.35 lakhs were spent and there were 28.5 C.P.A. pattern Blocks which covered all the 1526 villages and 17,18,163 rural population. The activities under the C.P.A. programme are vital to agriculture. As all other programmes like seed villages, high yielding varieties programme, plant protection, Intensive cultivation programmes, scheme for small holders, crop compaigns, etc. are taken keeping generally Block as a unit. With the establishment of the Panchayati Raj institutions in 1962 at district block and village levels, and the transfer of authority to these institutions a significant advance has been made in the process of organizing the rural people socially for under taking economic and social activities in rural areas.

### III Irrigation and Power:

Under the scheme power project Rs. 56.33 lakhs are spent and 31 additional villages are electrified bringing the total number of electrified villages to 144 by end of 1967-68. Koyana power project is situated just near -- Ratnagiri. In fact the power house of Koyana is at Pophali in Chiplune Tahasil of this district.

At the end of the Third Plan 80 vilages were electrified and 7,096 K.W. hours of electricity was consumed.

Now after implementing 3 Annual Plan, the consumption has not surpassed the third Plan level. Consumption of domestic and industrial categories has substantially gone up. Consumption under other purposes has dropped conspicuously.

#### IV SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES:

Out of the budgeted grant of Rs. 0.29 lakhs Rs. 0.44 lakhs are spent. The achievements are (1) Rebate to two weavers coops was given. (2) Assistance to 1000 weavers was given for purchase of tools and equipments. (3) One Sales and purchase depot was opened. (4) Share capital contribution was given to society.

The Rural Industries project started as centrally sponsored scheme during the Third Plan was continued in 1967-68.

#### IV TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

Three schemes were taken up namely Road Development, Ports and harbours, Inland Waterways. The total budget grant for the sub-head was Rs. 93.77 lakhs out of which Rs. 76.51 were spent during 1967-68. Out of the entire length of 305 kms. of west coast Road in Ratnagiri District, nearabout 283 km of road has been completed in all respects. During the year under report a length <sup>km</sup> 18/ has road and 9 bridges were completed Road of 32 km was modernised and 22 km improved. ~~xxx~~ Besides a number of market roads and roads in hilly areas have been taken up in Rural works programme. Also independent provision has been made for roads in the hilly areas and inaccessible areas. As regards ports and harbours out of the 49 minor including intermediate port at Ratnagiri ports in Maharashtra, 26 are situated in Ratnagiri, this is 53% of the total minor ports\*. These ports are catering to about 232 thousand passengers on coastal and harbour services and about 3.20 lakhs tons of cargo traffic per annum.

In the Third Plan, the main programme relates to development of all weather shelter anchorage facilities at Mirya - Bay (near Ratnagiri) at the cost of Rs. 2 crores and included construction of break water 1500 feet in length, reclamation of 3.2 Hectares of land and construction of approach roads with the completion of these facilities, Vessels with a draft of 20 feet could anchor in the bay safely throughout the year. In the third Plan expenditure of 19 lakhs was done mainly on <sup>reclaiming</sup> of land. During 1966-67, an expenditure of Rs. 13 lakhs was incurred on the Mirya Bay port project. Minor works were also taken up on other ports. However, due to the delay in obtaining the budget, the programme of work could not be completed as per schedule.<sup>1</sup>

#### VI SOCIAL SERVICES:

Under this major head the following minor heads are covered. General Education, Technical education, Health and Family Planning water supply, Housing and Urban Development, welfare of backward classes, Social welfare, x craftsmen training and labour welfare are covered. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 38.36 lakhs under this major head, Rs. 16.47 lakhs are spent on General education. This comes to 43% of the major head and 5.1% of the whole Annual Plan Budget. Health and Family Planning is also an important subject in as much as rural dispensaries and primary / Health Centre are spread through out th Dist. The expansion of facilities for preventive and curative health services has had a salutary effect and has brought down the death rate from 25 per 1000 population in 1947 to 14 per one thousand population in the year 1964.<sup>2</sup> But the birthrate has not shown any significant fall and stands at 38 per 1000 population
