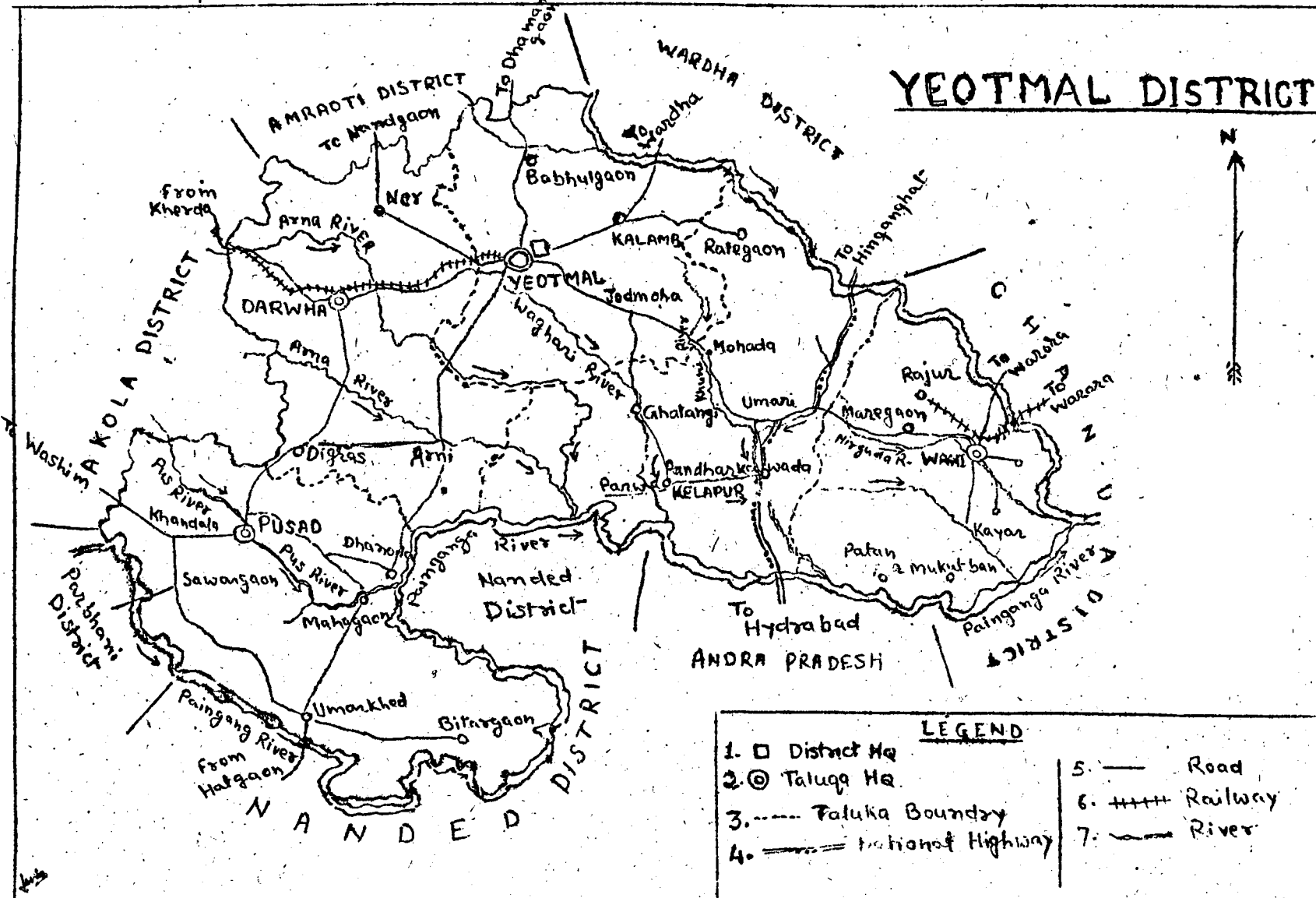

C H A P T E R - 1

I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Location

Yeotmal district is one of the four Berar districts of Vidarbha. It lies between  $19^{\circ}.26'$  and  $20^{\circ}.42'$  North latitudes and  $77^{\circ}.18'$  and  $79^{\circ}.9'$  east longitudes. Most of the district is spread on the Balaghats i.e. southern plateau of Berar.

1.2 Boundaries

It is bounded by Amraoti district in the North, Akola and Parbhani districts in the west, Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh in the south and Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the east. The district is quite extensive in size. As compared to other districts it ranks 2nd in Nagpur Region and 8th in the entire Maharashtra in terms of area.

The district has a natural boundary in the east and south. The Wardha river separates the district from the districts of Wardha and Chandrapur in the east and the Painganga separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

1.3 Administrative set up

The district is divided into 5 talukas for administrative purpose at present. The Collector is incharge of the district. He is responsible for General administration law and order, land revenue and Civil supplies. He is assisted by resident Dy. Collector and

4 Dy. Collectors at headquarters and five Sub-Divisional officers of the Dy. Collectors grade posted at five Sub-divisions. There is one revenue sub-division for each taluka. The Tahsildar assisted by few Maib Tahsildars is in charge of the taluka and assists, the Sub-Divisional officer in his duties.

The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive and the District and Session Judge is the head of the judicial department in the district. However the Collector continues to be the District Magistrate, but the powers are limited to security, law and order. The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by one Civil Judge (Sr. Division) and five Civil Judges (Jr. Division) and first class Judicial magistrates whose headquarters are at taluka places. The police force in the district functions under the district superintendent of Police. In addition to these there are various district heads of the offices under various offices under various departments.

#### Local Bodies, Panchayat Samities and Zilla Parishad.

With a view to promote democratic decentralisation and secure greater participation of the people in the developmental activities in the district, the Zilla Parishad and 14 Panchayat Samities have been formed in the district on 1st May, 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad is the entire rural area of the district excluding municipal jurisdiction for promoting developmental activities. There are 8 municipalities to look after the development of urban areas. The area of the Panchayat Samiti is the area of the corresponding community development block.

There are 49 directly elected councillors. Out of these two seats are reserved for scheduled castes and five for scheduled tribes. There are five associated members who are presidents of five cooperative societies conducting business in the district. Elected chairman of 14 Panchayat Samities are also exofficio councillors of the Zilla Parishad. At block level the Panchayat Samiti consists of elected and coopted councillors from the area of the block. The Zilla Parishad is headed by its President, assisted by Vice President, both of whom are elected from the elected councillors. An officer in the <sup>senior</sup> I.A.S. scale works as chief Executive officer of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad comprises various departments and the head of these departments at district level are officers of Class I or Class II service under State Govt. The Dy. Chief Executive Officer works as secretary to Z.P. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee presided over by the president and six Subject Committees viz Finance Works, Agriculture, Cooperation, Education and Health. At the block level the Panchayat Samities have elected chairman and Vice Chairman. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti which do not have subject committee. There are 1095 village Panchayats in the district. There are elected members from these elected the village or the group of villages. The Sarpanch is elected from these elected members who look after the developmental activities at his village level.

#### 1.4 Area & the Territorial changes.

The area of the district is 13517.2 sq.kms. (5219.0 sq.miles) which is 14.5 % of the total area of Nagpur

Region and 4.4 % of the total area of Maharashtra. Its maximum length from east to west is 192 kms, where as maximum breadth from North to south is 160 kms.

Yeotmal district, which is one of the four district of Berar was handed over by the Nizam to the Govt. of India in 1853. Upto 1863 it was a part of East Berar district. In 1864, new Wani (Wani) District was formed by separating Yeotmal, Darwaha, Kelapur and Wani talukas from east Berar District. In 1905 Pusad Taluka from Basim district was transferred to this Wani district and Yeotmal district was newly constituted. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1953 where the district was transferred to the then <sup>bilingual</sup> ~~bilingual~~ state from Madhya Pradesh due to State Reorganisation. Now it is a part of Vidharbha Region of Maharashtra since 1st May, 1960.

### Topography

The whole district is covered by the Balaghats ~~are~~ broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by plains. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats with an elevation of 1000'-1500' above mean sea level. Both Wardha and Painganga rivers and their tributaries provide strips of plains in many parts along their course. The width of these plains <sup>varies</sup> ~~varies~~ from 5 km to 15 km.

### 1.6 Hills, river system soil etc.

The main system of hills is the Ajantha mountains. The whole district is occupied by small east west ranges of these mountains. The off shoots of Ajantha ranges are at places broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of the tributaries of the Painganga.

The main rivers of the district are the Wardha and the Painganga both of which flow along north eastern and southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries which traverse the heart of the district. The bed of the Wardha is broad and deep but the banks are overflowed by floods many a times. The Wardha has two big tributaries viz Bembla and Nirguda. The Nirguda has its entire course in Wani tahsil and the Bembla flows across the North of Yeotmal taluka below the Ghats. The Painganga has six important tributaries viz, the Pus, the Arunawati, the Adan, the Waghadi, the Khuni and the Vidarbha. The Pus flows through Pusad taluka, the Arunawati and the Adan through Darwha taluka, the Waghadi through Yeotmal and Kelapur talukas and the Vidarbha through Wani taluka. All these rivers maintain flow for a greater part of the year. These rivers are flooded in rainy season but there is little water in them in summer.

The soil of the district as a whole is uniformly good in texture and varies in colour from black to dark brown. They are, however, slightly inferior in productive capacity to those in Akola and Amraoti districts of Vidarbha.

These defects are commonly seen in the soils of the district, viz 1) a mixture of <sup>pieces</sup> ~~pieces~~ of Chunchadi (limestone) 2) sloping surface and 3) an excessive admixture of sand. However the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tracks in the valleys to hilly and hard parts on the plateaus.

In Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a redish colour.

In Kelapur taluka and central and southern parts of Yeotmal taluka and hilly parts of Pusad taluka, the soils

is of coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey.

In Western parts of Yeotmal taluka and in middle of Darwaha and Pusad talukas rich fertile alluvial soils are found.

#### 1.7 Minerals.

Coal and limestone are only important minerals found in the district. There is only one coal field near Pilsaon in Wani taluka, extending over 12 sq. miles. The reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes. The lime stones can be better utilised for production of cement and in near future/a cement factory will come up in the district. A third mineral called farshi stones are found in Kelapur taluka of the district.

#### 1.8 Climate, Temperature & Rainfall.

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. Generally there is a breeze in the summer season rendering it tolerable and pleasant. The temperature ranges from 15° c (59 F) in winter 41° c (105 F) in summer.

The southwest monsoon brings rain to Yeotmal district. The rainy season lasts from June to Oct. In the month of August the intensity of rainfall is highest. The rainfall varies from 889 mm (35 inch) to 1125 m.m. (45") In the past few years the monsoon is very irregular. It is also not uniform in the district. It increases from West to east. Wani in eastern parts gets an average of about 1125 m.m. rains and the lowest is in Darwaha <sup>in</sup> western parts, which gets about 889 m.m. of rain. The central region covering Yeotmal taluka gets on an average nearly 1099 mms. of rain.

There is no tract in the district which can be regarded as a chronic scarcity area.



Explanatory Notes.

The different tables in the Abstract are grouped into thirteen sections. Brief explanatory notes are given below on the tables included in each of the thirteen sections in the Abstract.

I. Climate & Rainfall (Table 1 to 2)

The table No.1 gives monthly normal rainfall, number of rainy days and total rainfall during the month. The figures of the rain gauge stations at the taluka head quarters are shown in the table for the year 1886 and 1967. figures of normal rainfall are worked out by the Indian Meteorological Department on the <sup>basis of</sup> actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. As regards rainy days, a day was treated if the rain gauge received minimum of 2.5 m.ms. of rain during the twenty four hours.

The table No.2 gives, mean, mean maximum and mean minimum temperature in respect of Yeotmal and Pusad centres in the district. The figures are based on the data supplied by the Regional meteorological station Nagpur. The 'mean-maximum' and the 'mean minimum' temperatures are the averages of the maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the year. Mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperatures.

II. Area & Population (Table Nos.3 to 8)

Final figures of 1961 population Census are presented in the tables in this sections. The table 3 give talukewise rural and urban population and variations with

1951 census. The table 4 gives tahsilwise classification of villages according to population ranges. In table 5 population rangwise distribution of towns is shown.

Table No.6 deals with the number of workers according to livelihood classes in each tahsil for urban and rural area and for the district. Similarly the number of non-workers are also given. The term 'workers' used in this table is defined as noted below.

According to 1961 census, a person is classified as a worker if (a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, live stock, dairying, house hold industry, etc, he had some regular work of more than one hour per day, throughout the greater part of the working season and (b) in case of regular employment, in any trade profession, service business or commerce, he was employed during any of the 15 days preceding the day of enumerators visit to the household. Those who did not conform to the above concept (women doing household work, students, rent receivers, beggars and unemployed persons etc,) were classified as non-workers. Here 'work' means gainful work. The workers were further classified into nine main categories of economic activity. Category I includes both owner cultivators and tenant, cultivators. Category II covers all other persons working on land as labourers on wages without holding any right upon the land. Workers in household industry are included under category IV. Household industry is defined as an industry conducted at home in urban areas or within the village in rural areas by the head of the household himself and or mainly by the members of the household. A Household industry is not run on the scale of a registered factory and <sup>relates</sup> ~~relates~~ to repairing or making of goods. Manufacturing (Category V) includes all types of productions.

processing, servicing or repairing of goods. The category does not include production, processing etc. already classified as house hold industry in Category IV. Category VI covers workers engaged in construction and maintenance of buildings, roads, railways, bridges, ~~the~~ telegraph and telephone lines, waterways, reservoirs etc., under category VII, workers engaged in any capacity in wholesale, or retail trading activity, and commercial transactions relating to imports and exports, real estate properties, stocks and shares, insurances, money-lending banking etc. are included Category VIII includes workers engaged in transport activities by air, rail, road and water and in services indential to transport such as packing, carting, loading, unloading etc., workers engaged in storage, warehousing, communications services such as Posts, Telegraphs, Telephones, Wireless signalling. Information and Broadcasting are also included in this Category. Workers engaged in (i) Public utility services like electricity, gas or water supply and secnitary services, (ii) Central, State, Quasi Government or associations, recreation services etc. are covered under category IX. The distribution of population according to (a) age group (b) mother tongue and (c) religion is displayed in table No.7. Mother tongue is defined<sup>as</sup> a language spoken by a person's mother to the person in this childhood or mainly spoken in the house. The table No.8 gives scheduled caste and scheduled tribes in rural as well as urban areas of the tahsils in the district. The notified scheduled caste and scheduled tribes are as fellows.

III. Agriculture (Table Nos. 9 to 19)

In table No.9 land utilisation statistics pertaining to each tahsil is presented for two year viz 1965-66 and 1966-67. The utilisation is given in the standard heads of utilisation. Against each tahsil the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. Under 'Forest' are included all actually forested area or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. "Barren and Unculturable Land" include all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. (land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classed as unculturable whether such land is an isolated block or within cultivated holdings). "Land put to non-agricultural use" covers all lands occupied by building, roads, railways, under water, river, canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural.

'Culturable Waste' includes all lands available for cultivation or abandoned after five years for one season or the other. Such land may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or unassessed and may be isolated blocks or within

cultivated holding. Land not cultivated for five years in succession is also included in this category at the end of five years. Under 'Permenent Pastures or other grazing' lands all grazing lands whether permanent pastures and meadows or otherwise are included. "Land under miscell-  
tree  
aneous ~~tree~~ crops and groves not included in net area sown" includes all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Lands under casurina trees, that-ching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuel etc. which are not included under

'orchards' are included in this category 'Current fallows' *include* *land kept fallow* during the current year only. 'Other fallow' denote all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years. The reasons for keeping such lands fallows may be interalia one of the following.

1. Inadequate water supply.
2. Malerial climate.
3. Poverty of the cultivator.
4. Silting of curals and rivers or
5. Unremunerative nature of farming.

'Net area sown' represents the area sown to crops counting areas shown more than once in the same year only once. This represents the difference between the total geographical area and sum of the areas under forest, barren and uncultivable land, land to put to non-agricultural uses, culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing lands, miscellaneous tree crops, and groves not included in net area sown current fallow and other fallow land. 'Area sown more than once' included area sown with two or more than two crops and counted more than ~~two~~ <sup>same</sup> once in the ~~one~~ year. Total cropped area is the

total of net area sown and area sown more than once.

The table No.10 displays area under different crops for each tahsil in the district, for 66-67 and 65-66. The table No.11 gives yield per hectare and out turn of Principal crops in the district for 1965-66 and 1966-67. Area irrigated by different sources in each tahsil in 1965-66 and 1966-67 shown in the table No.12. The table 13 gives further break up of the irrigated area with cropwise irrigated area for both the years in each taluka of the district. In table No.13 14 data on irrigation wells are presented tahsilwise for 1965-66 and 66-67. The table No.15 is devoted to minor irrigation works such as tanks, bandharas and lift irrigation. Information regarding Major and Medium projects is shown in table No.16. The table No.17 gives wages paid to agricultural and other skilled and unskilled labourers in three selected centres in the district. Monthwise average wage rates for males and females are shown. The fortnightly wage rates are collected from three centres in the district and monthly average is worked out from them. The table 18 is devoted to show the agricultural implements in use in the district. 1966 census data is shown here. The table 19 shows data relating to Famine, Scarcity, and akin to scarcity in the district during 67-68.

#### IV. Animal Husbandry (Table Nos.20 to 23)

The table 20 gives the number of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district during 1966 livestock census which is a decennial occurrence. Tahsilwise distribution of livestock is also given here. The table No.21 gives data regarding available veterinary facilities in each tahsil of the district with two years comparative data

The table 22 shows diseasewise livestock mortality in the district during the years 1966-67 & 1967-68. The table 23 is devoted to the slaughter houses and animals slaughtered there.

#### V. Forests. ( 24 A, B)

Here two tables are included. The table No. 24 (A) gives forest area in the district. Forest area in the district is classified " reserved " "Protected" and "unclassed" categories. The 'reserved forests' are those that are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In " protected forests " the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The " unclassed forest " refers to the accessible forests or unoccupied waste. The table No. 24 (B) gives major and minor forest products in the district for 66-67 and 67-68.

#### VI. Industry, Employment & Electricity.

(Table No. 25 to 34)

In this section data regarding employment in factories, distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of <sup>days</sup> worked in the year, employment exchange statistics and generation, consumption of electricity are presented. The table 25 gives average daily employment of working in factories for 1967. The table 26 and 27 gives the distribution of working factories according to working strength and period for which worked. The table 28 is devoted to show the employment exchange statistics, regarding registration, vacancies notified

and placements given. The table 29 gives the occupational distribution of total registration and placements. The table 30 gives the volume of employment in different industries. The tables No.s. 31 and 32 give data of Census of Government Employment Employees in the district as on 1-7-1966. The table No.33 gives generation and consumption of the electricity for various purchases. The table 34 devotes to the villages and towns electrified so far and the population benefitted thereby.

#### VII. Co-operation (Tables No.35 to 42)

It is seen from the above table that the areas sown more than once was quite negligible during 1966-67. As compared to 1950-51 there is little increase of 0.13% in the area sown more than once. There is a decrease in double cropped area of Yeotmal, Kelapur and Wani tahsils, during 1966-67 as compared to 1950-51.

The percentage of double cropped area was highest in Kelapur tahsil and lowest in Darwha tahsil in 1966-67.

Well irrigation is the main source of irrigation and irrigation facilities are very meagre in the

Productivity of Important Crops.

3.2 The productivity of the crops is dependent on the equitable distribution of rains as the irrigation facilities are too meagre in the district, During the year 1966-67 there was a decrease in the productivity of the most of the crops as compared to 1960-61 except gram and sugarcane.

The production of majority of the crops was less as the crops were damaged considerably during 1965-67. There is a marked increase in the production of sugarcane and gram. The cultivators have started taking sugarcane cultivation as a second cash crop in the district. The decrease in production ranges from 14% in the case of chillies to 63% in the case of Bajara. The percentage decrease of other crops was between 16 to 63 except gram and sugarcane where the increase was 36% and 132% respectively.

It is observed that the irrigated area is very insignificant in the district as it was just 0.40% of the net sown area during 1960-61. It was increased to 0.80% during 1966-67. In all the tahsils the irrigated area was as compared to net area sown was nearly double during 1966-67 as compared to 1960-61 except Kelapur. The increase was due to the construction of new irrigation wells and pumping facilities made available to the cultivators. In Pusad tahsil the increase in the irrigated area was remarkable followed by Darwha Tahsil which ranked 2nd in this regard while Wani tahsil ranked 5th and the last.

The area irrigated more than once had increased from 1.88% to 18.74%, during the span of 6 years (i.e. from 60-61 to 66-67) The increase in the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was highest in Kelapur tahsil and lowest in Pusad tahsil.

It is observed that nearly 55% of the gross cropped area was under food crops during 1960-61 which went down to 53.15% during 1966-67. There was a decline in the food cropped area in every tahsil except Kelapur where there was a little increase. In Wani tahsil there was highest percentage of gross cropped area under food crops during 1960-61. It decreased by 3.55% during 1966-67. Darwaha and Yeotmal tahsils had more than 50% of its gross cropped area under non-food crops. Generally the tendency of the agriculturist is to grow non-food crops being cash crops.

It is seen that during 1960-61 as high as 89.12% of the gross irrigated area was under food crops ~~it~~ and ~~it~~ decreased to 80.27% during 1966-67. Irrigated area under food crops is decreasing year after year as the agriculturists are growing more ~~than~~ and more cash crops. During 1966-67 Yeotmal tahsil had the maximum irrigated area under non-food crops. During 1960-61 Kelapur tahsil has highest percent of irrigated area under non-food crops. Wani tahsil had the lowest irrigated area under non-food crops in 1966-67. There was significant increase in the irrigation of non-food crops in Wani, Yeotmal, Pusad & Darwaha. On the <sup>other</sup> hand Kelapur tahsil showed a slight decline of 1.50% in the irrigation of non-food crops.

Agricultural credit which plays an important part in development of agriculture increased twofold from Rs. 108 lakhs during 1960-61 to Rs. 239 lakhs during 1967-68. Amongst tahsils Pusad tahsil received the largest credit in the district during 1967-68. Darwha tahsil followed with Rs. 54 lakhs. Wani tahsil received the lowest credit in the district during the year 1967-68. Considering the total number <sup>of</sup> cultivators as per 1961 census per cultivator agricultural credit made available works out Rs. 117 per head. There were 602 primary agricultural credit societies functioning in the district during 1967-68.

It is observed that the overdues have increased year after year. During 1961-62 the overdues were more than Rs. 6 lakhs. During 1966-67 the overdues increased to Rs. 265/- lakhs and during 1967-68 the overdues have mounted to Rs. 371/- lakhs. Darwha tahsil continues to have <sup>had</sup> maximum amount of overdues and Wani tahsil ~~and~~ the lowest amount of overdues amongst the tahsils in 1966-67

and 1967-68. The percentage of recovery worked out to be 51.6%. The highest percentage of recovery was done by Pusad (68%) and it was lowest in Kelapur tahsil (47%).

As per 1961 livestock census poultry per 100 persons in the district worked out to 41 which sharply decreased to 21 during 1936. Amongst tahsils the poultry per 100 persons is highest in Wani tahsil while it is lowest in Pusad. The decrease in poultry was highest in Kelapur tahsil (58%) while it is least in Darwha and Yeotmal tahsils. (43%)

According to 1961 census it is estimated that the district had on an average 189.64 poultry ~~xx~~ birds as against 129.01 in Vidarbha and 137.40 in Maharashtra. Similarly the district had 1.75% improved fowls to total number of fowls as against 1.07% in Vidarbha and 1.69% in Maharashtra. As stated earlier the progress of rural electrification is very rapid in the district, At the end of 2nd plan only 1.56% of the villages were electrified. But during third five year plan considerable progress has been made in rural electrification work and 9.82% of villages were covered upto the end of third five year plan. At the end of the year 1967-68 there were in all 17.43% of villages electrified. This gave an impetus to the agricultural production in the district as the villages were eletrified mainly for energising pumps. The growth of primary education in the district during the 3rd five year plan was noteworthy. There were 83 thousand students attending primary schools. The facilities for secondary education had greatly increased and high schools were started in many remote places in the district. The growth of secondary education was more conspicuous than the primary education. It is observed that the percentage increase in the students was 98% during 1967-68 as compared to 1960-61. The highest increase is in Wani tahsil (170.8%) and lowest is in Kelapur tahsil (21.7%). In secondary schools boys formed 78% where <sup>as</sup> girls constituted the remaining 22% of total strength. While during 1967-68 boys accounted for 73% and girls for 27% of the total strength. This clearly shows that more girls are taking advantage of secondary education in the district.

3.14 Increase in Road Mileage per 100 Sq.Kms.

The District suffers from low road mileage in the division. The following table gives the road mileage per 100 Sq.Kms. in the district in 1961 and 1968.

On 31-3-1961 the road mileage per 100 Sq. Kms. was 9.80 Kms. which increased to 11.02 Kms. during 1966-67. And at the end of 1967-68 the road mileage per 100 Sq.Kms. was 12.02 Kms. During 1967-68 in all 134.99 Kms. roads were constructed and the road mileage during 1967-68 increased by 21.45% as compared to 60-61.

There were 2.2 banking offices serving every one lakh population in the district during 1961. The position has improved during 1967 and there were 2.8 banking offices serving every one lakh population at the end of 1967. Yeotmal tahsil had the highest number of banking offices available as it is the district head-quarter. Kelapur tahsil was still having the lowest number of banking offices available. The increase was more significant for Pusad tahsil where the availability of the banking offices has been doubled. The increase in respect of Darwha tahsil is very negligible.

It will be seen that the average prices of the commodities have increased during 1967 as compared to 1963 prices. The increase is more than 25 % in all the commodities except Kerosene and Sugar where the increase is 18 % and 17 % respectively. The least increase is observed in case of Sugar (fair price shop) 17 % and the highest increase in prices have taken place in respect of Gram Dal (312 %). Jowar and Rice was not available in open market and hence the increase for the above two commodities are not given. It is seen that average prices of food grains have shot up and in some cases, they are more than double of what they were during 1963. So also the average prices of other essential commodities such as Ground nut oil (124 %), meat (62 %), Dry chillies (70 %) Plaintains (106 %) Charcoal (48 %), Fire-wood (43 %) and Washing soap (40 %) had increased considerably causing hardships to the commonmen. The average prices of Tea increased by 42 % and in case of Supari and Tobacco the increase was 36 % in 1967 as compared to 1963 prices.



ANNUAL PLAN 1967-68

4.1 The Annual Plans were visualised in place of five year plans, to utilise the available resources to the maximum possible extent for the schemes of shorter durations.

The Annual Plan 1967-68 was 2nd such plan for the district. The budget provision of Rs.239.19 lakhs was made for the year 1967-68.

The following table gives the headwise break up of the allotment for the district.-

Thus it will be seen that a major portion of the budget (49.56%) was allotted for agricultural programme, to boost agricultural productivity in the district by implementation of schemes such as Propagation of improved agricultural practices, Animal husbandry, Dairy development, Forest etc. Social services shared 27.40% of the total budget provision. Irrigation and Power 10.47% and roads and communication received 7.25% of the total

allotment. Cooperation, C.D., Industry & mining and miscellaneous heads were allotted less than 5% of the total share.

### 4.3 Agriculture Production.

More than 15 lakhs of Rs. were spent on the schemes related to agricultural production. These schemes received a good response from the cultivators. Intensive cultivation programmes, procurement and ~~etc~~ Distribution of improved high yielding varieties undertaken, alongwith fungicides. distribution of fertilizers, pesticides and ~~fungicides~~. The Hybrid jawar, campaign was a success in the district. The commercial hybrid production programme was undertaken in 1,30,250 acres of land during 1967-68. The table below will give an account of actual achievements in the district under different schemes-

#### 4.4 Minor Irrigation-

. 111

With limited irrigation resources minor irrigation has been given greater stress in the Annual Plans in the district and 24.27 lakhs of Rs. were spent during the year. During the year under report 4 Bandharas were completed and irrigation potential of 8865 acres was created in the district. Subsidy was granted to 371 newly constructed irrigation wells and 127 old wells were repaired. Under the Community wells programme 23 community wells were completed out of the targets of 30 wells. Similarly 421 electric pumpsets were installed for irrigation purpose and subsidy to these pumps was also granted during the year.

#### 4.5 Soil conservation.

Due to undulating topography of the district, the soil erosion is a problem in the district. As a measure of soil conservation bunding was done for 85,145 ~~are~~ acres of land during the year.

#### 4.6 Animal Husbandry.

During the Annual Plan 1967-68, 15 thousand Rs. were spent for construction of Veterinary Aid centre and one sub centre. 15 premium bulls were distributed in the district for the improvement of local nondiscript cattle. Under the programme of Sheep Breeding 7 supplementary Sheep Breeding centres were established and one Poultry Breeding station was established under the intensive poultry development block. A loan of 18 thousand Rs. was granted to 21 persons for starting poultry to 21 persons for starting poultry farming as a <sup>subsidiary</sup> ~~subsidiary~~ occupation to landless labourers.

#### 4.7 Forests & Fisheries.

The area under forest is 3,08,325 hectares i.e. nearly 24% of the area of the district. The schemes under the sub-head "Forest" are aimed at the development of forest areas and new plantation of economic utility such as teak and other utility timber bamboos etc. In all 395 acres of new plantation of fuel, timber and general utility timber was carried out in the district. Bamboos were planted in 700 acres during 1967-68. For soil conservation measures afforestation in 130 acres of land was done. For ~~impro-~~ improving forest communications <sup>4</sup> 3/4 kms of forest roads were built and construction of one bridge was undertaken. On forest development schemes Rs. 4.05 lakhs were spent.

Under the fisheries development schemes stocking of 6,42,500 carp fry seedling was undertaken in the inland tanks & reservoirs and netting of 66 thousand kg. of fish was done. Nearly 50 kg. of nylon twine was provided to the fishery societies with subsidized rates. In all 4 fishermen societies were assisted with management subsidy.

#### 4.8 Cooperation & Community Development.

On cooperation and community development Rs. 9.18 lakhs were spent during the year 1967-68. Five cooperative processing societies were provided with share capital and loans for construction of godowns were advanced to these societies. Nearly 13 new godowns were constructed through the marketing societies which were provided with loans. In all 17 new collective farming societies were organised in the district during 1967-68.

Under community development all the 15 blocks were maintained. Applied nutrition programme was made applicable to Ghatanji block during the year and 95 thousand Rs. were spent over it.

#### 4.9 Irrigation and Power.

Under this head the Rural electrification work was done in the district and Rs.24.04 lakhs were spent and electricity was provided to 43 new villages in the district and connections were given to 421 electric pumps.

#### 4.10 Industries & Mining.

An amount of Rs.81 thousand was spent on various schemes under this head, The percentage of expenditure was 58% of the budget provision. Under this head schemes were taken for strengthening small scale industries in the district. They were provided with loans for purchase of tools and equipments construction of godowns etc.

#### 4.11 Transport and Communications.

The district is not well served with railways and hence roads are of significant importance in the development of the district. At the beginning of the year there were 1560.00 kms of roads. During the Annual Plan 1967-68 Rs.17.76 lakhs were spent for development of roads in the district. Three schemes viz, District roads, Roads of economic importance and Rural roads were under taken in the district. Under these scheme 52.50 kms of road length was constructed and 1 bridge was completed.

#### 4.12 Social Services.

In the Annual Plan of the district the important development of the people and providing them with the social facilities for their welfare is also undertaken. In all Rs. 65.53 lakhs were provided for this purpose.

The expenditure has outstripped the budget provision and the expenditure incurred amounted Rs. 75.02 lakhs i.e. (109.06% of the budget provision for that head)

The following table gives the break down expenditure under this head according to various sub-head of the various schemes included in social welfare programme.

Under 'General Education' primary education was given more importance. During the year primary schools were provided to 15 more villages. Now only 191 villages remained to be covered by primary education and they are in population range 0.200. During the 1967-68 period 226 primary teachers were appointed. For improvement of science education grant, was given to 7 primary schools and Rs. 3,000 were spent

for this purpose. For the betterment of primary education scholarships were granted to 53 students. For development of non-Govt. secondary schools Rs. 4.55 lakhs were spent and 20 schools received this grant.

Under technical education the expenditure was incurred on completion of <sup>the</sup> building of polytechnic.

An amount of Rs. 14.80 lakhs was spent for various schemes of vital importance under Public Health. Family planning programme was given more importance and Rs. 7.93 lakhs were spent in organising <sup>-ing</sup> various camps and 7310 cases were operated for vasectomy or tubectomy. Construction work of 3 P.H.C. buildings were under progress and Rs. 40.00 thousand were spent for the same. To solve Rural water supply problem in the district construction of drinking water wells in rural area was undertaken and 137 wells were constructed at the cost of Rs. 2.41 lakhs. For municipal water supply schemes the work of Umekhed and Pusad municipal councils was in progress and nearing completion. Rs. 39.66 lakhs were spent over these schemes.

The B Village Housing Project scheme was undertaken and 70 houses were constructed and Gaathan extension sites were provided to 49 villages in the district. For Backward class welfare schemes were provided with an amount of Rs. <sup>17</sup> lakhs and grants were given to the various institutions run by them.

Vocational training for the male labour and labour welfare was provided with an amount of Rs. 9000.

Miscellaneous schemes, such as Rural Broadcasting, Rural Man Power etc were implemented and Rs. 2.64 lakhs were spent on them. In all 250 new Radio sets were installed. Under rural man power scheme 6 kms of new roads were constructed in the district and 319 compost pits were dug under R.M.P. scheme.
