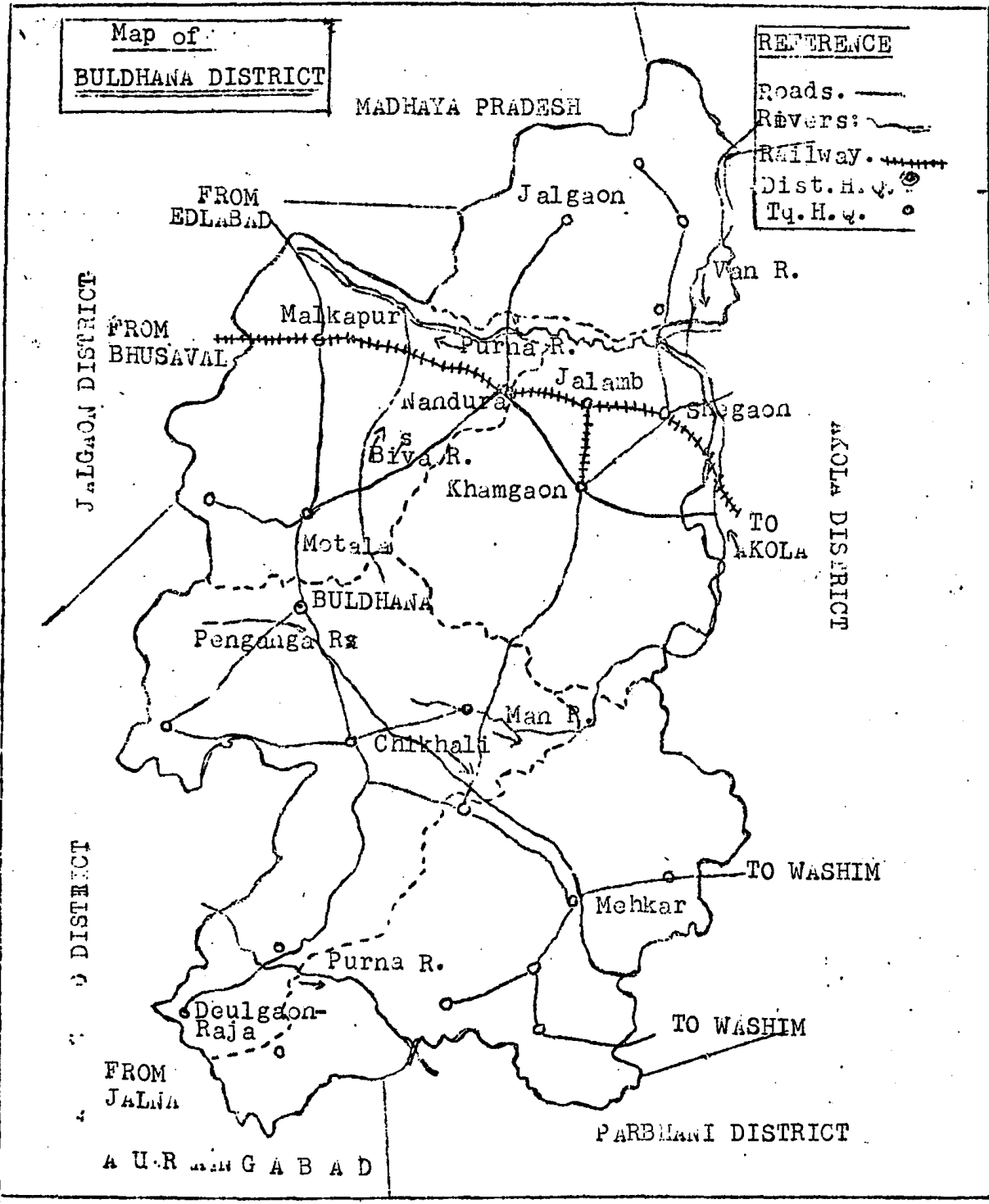

CHAPTER - IIntroductionPhysical features1.1 Location

Buldhana district has been named ~~xxxx~~ after Buldhana town, which was selected as the district head quarters in the year 1867. It is partly in the Tapi basin and partly in the Godavari basin. The northern half broadly called Payanghat is drained by the Purna which is a tributary of the Tapi. The southern half known as the Balaghat is drained by the Peinganga and the Kate Purna rivers which are tributaries of the Godavari.

1.2 Boundaries

The district lies between  $19^{\circ}51'$  and  $21^{\circ}17'$  North latitude and  $75^{\circ}57'$  and  $76^{\circ}49'$  East Longitude. It is bounded on the north by the Niner district of Madhya Pradesh, on the east by Akola district, on the south by Parbhani district and on the west by Aurangabad and Jalgaon districts. The district covers an area of 9754 square kilometers.

1.3 History and Administrative set up

The history of Buldhana district is obscure and is devoid of interest until the arrival of the mohamedans in deccan in 1294. The greater part of southern India was included in the empire of the Mauryas and on its disruption, the north-western tracts of the deccan (including Buldhana district) fell into the possession of the conquerors viz. the Shakas, the Pallavas, the Ywanas, the Andhras, the Yadavas and local dynasty of the vacatakas.

The fifth king of this dynasty-Mahadev Ugrasavabhuma, who reigned from 1260 to 1271 had a Brahmin minister named Hemadri, whose name is of much local importance as the Hindu temples of Chalukyan style the finest of which is at Lonar the oldest town of Berar in the district, are attributed to him and are popularly known as the 'Hemadpanthi Temples'.

With the arrival of Allauddin Khilji in 1294, the Mohamedans first appeared in the Deccan. In 1312, Malik Kafur marched through the district to Devgiri and having slain Shakardao, the Devgiri prince, annexed his dominions.

In 1758, Balajirao attacked Sindkhed (birth place of Jijabai mother of Shri Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj) and Nizam Ali hastened to rescue that place. He was compelled to fight on his way from Aurangabad to Sindkhed, but succeeded in relieving the place. Daulatrao Scindia and Raghujji Bhonsale had encamped at Malkapur, when in August 1803, they allowed the British envoy to depart and received General Wellasleys declaration of war. A month or two later, General Wellasley traversed the district, while pursuing them from Assaye to Argabn.

In 1853, Berar (Vidarbha) and other districts of the Nizam's dominions were assigned to the East India company in liquidation of a large debt due on account of the arrears of pay of the Hyderabad contingent and as a security for the further payment of these forces. At the assignment, Berar (Balaghat) with its headquarters at Hingoli and North Berar with its headquarters at Buldhana were established.



After the war of Independence in 1857, the province was reconstituted into the East and West Berar with the headquarters at Amravati and Akola respectively the present Buldhana district being included in the later.

Till 1st November 1956, Buldhana was one of the districts of the erstwhile Madhya Pradesh. However consequent upon the re-organisation of states, it formed part of Bilingual Bombay state till 1st May 1960, when it became a part of the Maharashtra. However, these changes involved no changes in the geographical boundaries of the district.

The district comprises 5 sub-divisions or talukas viz. Jalgaon, Malkapur, Khangaon, Chikhali & Mehkar. The collector as the head is in charge of general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. He is also a district Magistrate and District Registrar. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office and by other Deputy Collectors, who look after different branches. A Sub-Divisional Officer<sup>of</sup> the rank of a Deputy Collector, has been put in-charge of the administration of each of the five talukas. He is assisted by a Tahsildar and Naib-Tahasildars. The taluka has further been divided into revenue circles each in-charge of a Revenue Inspector, assisted by a number of Patwaries, whose number in each circle is determined by the size and volume of work there<sup>in</sup>.

There are many other offices of the Government and quasi-Government institutions at the district head-quarter for facilitating the smooth and co-ordinated working of the Government machinery.

#### Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishads and Panchayat Samitis Act, 1961 a three tier structure was established embodying the zilla parishad at the apex, the village panchayat at the base and the panchayat samiti at the intermediate level. The zilla parishad and village panchayats are both local bodies directly elected by universal suffrage at the district and village levels. ¶

The panchayat samiti, however is a body at the block level constituted by indirect elections. Each of these bodies has been given a clearly defined sphere of activities, with major part of the funds transferred to it with the executive staff required for implementing its responsibilities.

The formation of the zilla parishad and panchayat samitis has been a land mark in the history of the local self government, which revolutionised the existing administrative set up at the district and block levels.

The anticipated catalytic role of community development funds in mobilising rural savings for the rural areas had fallen short of expectations to emerge to the extent necessary. To develop this local leadership, it was necessary to give it a positive and effective part to play in the Local Self Government.

This consideration led to the establishment of the zilla parishad with vast powers of administrative sanction in relation to development schemes of local interest. The existing administrative machinery, which otherwise would have been responsible for executing the schemes, has been placed under the zilla parishad. However, while the zilla parishad and its subordinate bodies have power to determine the form and direction in which the development schemes are implemented, this power is circumscribed within the existing framework of five year plans. The administration headed by the Chief Executive Officer is statutorily responsible for executing the decisions of non-official bodies at various levels. This administration -being independent and yet responsible to the Government, ensures that the decisions are executed within the framework. The local leadership can determine priorities within the overall framework of Govt. rules and development policies.

The Zilla Parishad, Buldhana comprise 59 members, of which 47 are elected from the constituencies with an average electorate of 35000, while the remaining 12 members are co-opted representatives of various institutions such as co-operative societies, Banks, Ladies representatives, panchayat Samits etc. From among these members, the zilla parishad elects a president, a vice president and two Chairmen of standing committees, all of whom have certain executive functions and the Chairmen of Subject Committees with supervisory powers in relation to certain subjects.

The spheres of development of district importance relating to the Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Minor Irrigation, Community Development, Public Health, Public Works, Co-operation and Industries etc. have been transferred to the Zilla Parishad.

Thirteen panchayat Samitis have been established each having a Chairman with certain statutory functions, with a budget normally varying according to the stage of the Block Panchayat Samiti. These bodies have limited powers of administrative sanction pertaining to the existing schemes implemented within their jurisdiction. The panchayat samiti is essentially responsible for granting the financial aid to the Village panchayats, which in turn provide basic amenities at the village level. The Panchayat Samiti is also responsible for providing technical guidance to the village level staff in educating the village in modern methods of agriculture, animal husbandry etc. Finally it is responsible for supervising the overall administration of all the village panchayats in the district.

The co-ordination with this elaborate three-tier structure is essential in two ways. The Panchayat Samiti consists of the persons elected by members of the village panchayat and also of zilla parishad members elected from within its jurisdiction. The chairmen of the panchayat samitis are also co-opted members of the zilla parishad.

1.4 -Area

The area, number of villages, population etc. according to 1961 census covered by each taluka are given in the following table :-

Out of the total population of 10,59,698 of the district in 1961, 8,84,260 persons i.e. 83.45 percent and

1,75,438 persons i.e. 16.55 percent reside in the rural and urban areas respectively. The area of the district is 9754 square kilometers which accounts for 9.98 percent and 3.18 percent of the total area of Vidarbha and Maharashtra, respectively. The district accounts for <sup>11.47</sup> percent of the population of Vidarbha and 2.68 percent of the population of Maharashtra.

1.5 Topography

Out of the five talukas now forming the district the talukas of Chikhali and Mehkar lie on the Balaghat plateau, while the rest of the three talukas of Malkapur, Khamgaon and Jalgaon are in the great plain below known as the payanghat.

There are, thus two natural sub-divisions, which correspond closely to the administrative sub-divisions of the district. The edge of the plateau, where it falls abruptly into the valley is intersected by numerous deep ravines.

The landscape is of varied character fertile villages alternating with barren hill-sides and deep ravines. Below the ghats, the land is flat, except where it is broken by spurs of hills putting out into a plain. The general slope of the district above the ghat is from north to south.

#### 1.6 Hills, River System, Soils etc.

The main system of hills is the Ajanta range which has formed a plateau called the Balaghat. It covers the southern portion of the district, comprising Chikhali and Mehkar tahsils. A ridge of low hills running from north-west to south-east through the Balaghat forms the watershed between the valleys of the Penganga and the Kate-Purna. The main Ajanta range forms the northern wall of the Deccan table-land and the watershed between the Godavari and Tapi valleys.

There is also a branch of the Satpura range in the north of Jalgaon tahsil, which separates the district from the state of Madhya Pradesh.

The general slope of the country above the ghats is from north to south.

The elevation of the three plain tahsils of Malkapur, Khangaon and Jalgaon varies from 264 to 278 meters above sea level. The elevation of Chikhali and Mehkar table-land varies from 529 to 737 meters above sea level. Buldhana town the district headquarter, is situated at an elevation of 668 meters.

The principal river in the district is the Penganga. The other important rivers are the Purna, the Kate Purna, the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga, the Gyanganga and the Bangana.

The Penganga rises in the hills near Deulghat, runs in a south-easterly direction past Mehkar, and then enters the Akola district. The portion of the river which lies in this district is almost dry in the hot weather.

The Kate or lower Purna rises in the Ajanta hills to the west of the district, which it enters a little to the north of Deulgaon Raja, and traverses the tahsil of Mehkar in a south-easterly direction for a distance of about 48 kilometers, its course running parallel to, and south of, that of the Penganga. It does not flow in the hot weather. Both the Penganga and the Kate Purna are important rivers of the Godavari basin, but they do not acquire their importance till they come out the district.

The Purna rises in the lower slopes of the Gawilgad hills in the Amravati district and runs westward until it leaves the district at the northernmost corner of Malkapur tahsil. Its principal tributaries within the district are the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga and the Gyanganga from the south, and the Banganga from the north.

The Nalganga rising in the hills near Deulghat runs due north and joins the Purna near Narvel. An Irrigation project on the river Nalganga has been completed in 1966. The Vishwaganga rises at Buldana itself. The Gyanganga rises in the table lands north of the valley of the Penganga and runs past Mandura before joining the Purna. The Banganga rises in the Melghat to the north of Jalgaon tahsil and flows south wards to meet the Purna.

The soils are derived from trap rock of volcanic origin. There are three main categories of soils in the district, viz. (i) Bharkali, which is deep black soil of a very fine texture and very receptive of moisture (ii) Morand, which is black cotton soil containing lime and is less fertile than pure black cotton soil, and (iii) Bagad, which is the shallow soil of the higher lands of the Plateau and of black, brown or reddish colour.

The soils in the northern tahsils viz. Jalgaon, Malkapur and Khamgaon are generally deep black, formed by transported material washed from the higher lands. Cotton and kharif jowar are the main crops. The largest stretches of such heavy soils are formed in strips of about thirteen kilometers on either side of the Purna river.

The belt lying between the railway main line and the Purna river comprise some of the most fertile lands in Vidarbha.

Towards the south, the soil is light and stony, but pockets and belts of rich soil are found right upto the hills, particularly in Malkapur tahsil.



On the plateau, i.e. in Chikhali and Mehkar tahsils there are considerable areas of medium black soil interspersed amidst the light and shallow soils which grow cotton jowar, pulses and bajari. The Chikhali and Mehkar tahsils are well known for their wheat which is grown in the low lands between the plateau. These soils have a murum substratum and are, therefore, well drained. The existence of rock sub-soil is also not uncommon and the soils formed on such rocky beds suffer both, during scanty and heavy rains.

The district is not known to have any mineral of outstanding importance, except some saline deposits and lead in the lake of Lonar. These saline deposits were exploited for sometime past, but subsequently found unprofitable and hence further exploitation of these deposits was abandoned. However, the agates, corne lians and calcite formed in the trap in southern part of the district have some utility, the first two for ornamental purposes the last for optical purposes.

### 1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is dry and hot in general and considered to be generally healthy. The maximum temperature at Buldana in summer is 39.2° centigrades and the minimum 15.0 centigrade in winter season in 1967. After may, the temperature rapidly falls down. Then after June, with the arrivals of mansoons, starts the rainy season and lasts upto the end of September. It is followed by winter season, which is quite pleasant.

The above temperature figures are typical of the Balghat plateau (i.e. Chikhali & Mehkar talukas), where the hot season sets in late and the heat is not intense. The rainy season is pleasant and the winter is invigouriting. Buldhana town itself is the coolest and the most pleasant district headquarters in Vidarbha. The climate of the Páyanghat (i.e. Malkapur, Jalgaon & Khamgaon tahsils) affords a great contrast. There the heat is - intense and specially in the months of March to May, it is perhaps as intense as in the hottest part of the country. The strong westerly winds, which then prevail become intensely heated and exercise their influence.

The rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It is highest at Buldhana with an average of about 875 mm. as against the average of 715 mm. at Malkapur.

If rains come in time and are spread over the entire manson period properly the average rainfall in the district proves to be adequate for good crops. The district gets rain from the south-west masons during the period from June to September.

CHAPTER - IIExplanatory notes

The statistical data under 13 sections are presented in this abstract. Explanatory notes on some of the tables under each section are given in the following paragraphs to indicate some of the salient features in addition to explanation of certain terms used in the tables.

I- Climate

The table No.1 gives monthly normal rainfall, actual rainfall, and number of rainy days at some selected centres in the district for the year 1966 & 1967. The centrewise figures are the simple averages of the rainfall recorded at different rain gauge stations in the district. The centres are generally taluka and district headquarters in the district. As regards rainy days, a day is treated as rainy day if during the twenty-four hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

The table No.2 gives 'Mean' mean maximum and 'mean minimum' monthly temperature in respect of Buldana centre. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the month. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature.

II. Area and Population

Final figures of 1961 census are presented in tables 3 to 8. Table No.3 gives talukawise rural and urban area and rural and urban population for the years 1951 and 1961. It also gives percentage variation over 1951 and density of population. The terms 'rural' and 'urban' used in population tables are defined as-

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has -

- 1) A municipality a cantonment or civil lines. -
- 2) (i) A population of 5,000 or over and (ii). At least 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

Rural population is a population of all villages in a revenue unit.

A 'Village' is a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets wadis or padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

The table NO.6 given talukawise workers and non workers according to the 1961 census.

A person is classified as a workers if (a) in case of seaonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, house hold industry etc, he had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season, and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the 15 days proceeding the day of enumerators visit to the house hold. Workers are classified unto nine categories of economic activity. Table No.8 gives scheduled caste and scheduled tribes pppulation according to 1961 census.

The following thirteen castes have been notified as sche-

dule castes in Buldhana district.

- 2) Balahi or Babai
- 3) Basor, Burud Banson or Bansodi

- 9) Ghasi or Ghasia

- 11) Katia or Patharia
- 12) Khatik, Chikwa or Chikvi
- 13) Madhni or Mehra

No tribes have been notified as a scheduled tribe in Buldhana district.

**III. Agriculture**

The table NO. 9 gives talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard head of utilisations. Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The area according to village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes. Under forests are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forest whether state-owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually forested wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water, e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture.

Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head. Under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Culturable waste land includes all lands available for cultivation whether or not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year or last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or unculturable land like deserts etc. Land which is covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Current fallows comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. These lands are kept fallow due to some reasons. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total cropped area and net sown area is accounted for by the area sown more than once on the same land during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table no. 10 gives break-up of the total gross cropped area according to major groups of food crops and of non-food crops. Table no.11 gives yield rates and outturn of principal crops. The figures for 1965-66 are based fully on revised estimates. Those for the year 1966-67 are based on final forecast estimates. The estimates of outturn are based partly <sup>on</sup> the results of crop cutting surveys & partly on the annawari method. The irrigation statistics are shown in table Nos. 12 to 14. Table numbers 15 & 16 gives number of minor, medium and major irrigation projects and area irrigated by them. The data on agricultural wage rates presented in table no.17 are the monthly averages. These data are collected by the District Statistical Office fortnightly for selected three rural centres which may not represent the position in the district as a whole.

#### IV. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries

##### Animal Husbandry

The table no.20 gives the number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district at the time of 1966 livestock census. The livestock censuses are conducted quinquennially through out the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration. Table no.20 and 21 give statistics regarding veterinary facilities available, number of animals treated in hospitals and dispensaries, and disease wise live stock mortality during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68. Table No. 23 gives the number of animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

Forest

Table No.24 (a) gives details of area under different types of forests. Information regarding forests under the control of the states forest Department and those under the control of the states Revenue Department separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forest, protected forest and unclassed forest. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian forest Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forests or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on leased basis are called 'leased forests.

The two sets of figures differ due to different methods of classifying the areas. The Forest Department figures are for financial years while that of Revenue Department figures are for agricultural years. The table No. 24 (b) gives production of major and minor forest produce for 1966-67 and 1967-68. These figures refer to the areas under the control of forest Department only.



W. Employment, Industry, Mining And Electricity

In this section, statistics, regarding employment in industries, number of Industrial units, Employment exchange statistics, Census of Government employees, generation and consumption of electricity, number of towns and villages electrified, etc.<sup>is supplied.</sup> The factory statistics shown in table Nos. 25, 26 & 27 cover following types of factories registered under factories Act, 1948 :- 1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 m (i), (ii) those employing twenty or more workers and working with out the aid of power (section 2 m (ii) and (iii) those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the state Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act even through the above conditions are not fulfilled. However defence factories are excluded. Table No.25 gives the distribution of working factories according to the size of the factory in terms of average daily employment of workers. Table No.26 gives number of working factories and average daily employment therein accoring to major groups of industries. The number of workers shown in these two tables are the average number of workers working daily through out the year and not the total number on the roll of the factories.

The table No.28 to 30 gives important statistics relating to employment exchange, Buldhana.

The table Nos. 31 and 32 present results of the census of state government employees (as on 1.7.1966) conducted by the Bureau. The data presented in these tables are restricted to class I, II, III & IV employees of the

State Government and do not cover any other category such as work charged personnel, class IV employees paid from contingencies, daily rated workers, parttime workers or honorary workers. In the above tables the employees are given department wise and according to the monthly pay and emolument ranges.

The No. 34 gives purposewise consumption of electricity for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. The supply of electricity to this district is made from the Khaparkhedā power house and from the Paras power station in Nagpur and Akola district respectively and hence figures of generation are not applicable to this district. The table No. 35 given the progress of electrification in the district.

#### VI. Co-Operation

Statistical information in respect of co-operative banks, Primary agricultural societies, other co-operatives of different types, marketing societies etc. is given separately the years 1966-67 and 1967-68 under table Nos. 36 to 42. In the case of those societies whose main function is to advance credit to the people, information regarding their working capital, advances, recoveries, over dues etc. is shown in detail. In the case of non-credit societies, statistics showing salient features of their non-credit activities such as 'Value of goods received' value of goods sold' are also shown. Table No. 36 give different types of societies under two types viz. 'Credit societies' and 'Non-credit societies.'

These are again sub-divided into agricultural credit and non-agricultural credit and agricultural non-credit and non-agricultural non-credit.

The table No. 37 gives statistical information of co-operative banks. Table No. 38 gives detailed information of primary agricultural societies. The table No. 39 gives working of other types of societies where as the table No. 40 gives in detail working of primary marketing societies. The table No. 42 gives operation of regulated markets. Information of some important commodities which have<sup>been</sup> marketed is given in detail. The table No. 43 gives information regarding 'Money Lenders' and loan advances by them.

#### VII- Medical and Public Health

The statistical information is presented in table Nos. 44 to 47 for the years 1966 & 1967. The table No. 44 covers all Government institutions, institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies and also private aided institutions. The private clinics run by individuals are not included. The table also covers primary health centres under the control of Public Health Department and Zilla Parishads. The indoor and out door patients treated in these institutions is also given in this table. The figures of patients treated in 1967 are provisional. The table No. 45 gives births and deaths registered during 1966 & 1967. The table No. 46 gives break-up of deaths registered due to important causes such as malaria, Small pox T.B., pneumonia, Dysentery, diarrhoea etc. The table No. 47 gives vaccination statistics of primary vaccination, re-vaccination and cholera inoculations.

#### VIII- Education

Salient features of progress of education in various parts of the district are presented in this section.

The table nos. 48, 49 and 50 are based on 1961 population census. In these tables literacy in the district, progress of education in rural and urban areas are given. The table No. 51 gives information regarding number of institutions, number of teachers and enrolment therein, by type of education. In this table talukawise information in respect of secondary & higher education for the year 1967-68 is given. The table No. 52 gives number of beneficiaries among scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes. In this table all the pupils under backward classes who have been given financial assistance during the year are included. The table No. 53 gives number of type wise pupils under economically backward class who have been provided some concessions. The table No. 54 gives expenditure on primary education. The table No. 55 gives number villages with and without schooling facilities. Villages without schooling facilities are given according to population ranges.

#### IX. Transport and Communication

In this section statistical information relating to roads, motor vehicles, state transport, postal facilities, rural broadcasting etc. is given. The table No. 56 (a) gives length of railway route in the district. The distance is calculated from the railway time table by accounting for the distance upto last station near the borders & the railway distance from the border stations to the actual boundary of the district is not included. The table No. 57 gives figures of road length as on 31.3. of each year. X

The figures relate to the extra-municipal road maintained by the states Building and Communication Department and Zilla Parishad. Roads maintained by municipalities are also given separately in this table. The table No.58 gives figures relating to different types of motor vehicles in operation as at the end of each year. The figures given in this table are for the Amravati Division comprising Amravati, Akola, Yeotmal & Buldana district. The table No.59 gives important operational statistics relating to Maharashtra State Road <sup>Transport</sup> Corporation for Akola Division comprising of Akola and Buldana district. The table No. 60 gives important statistical information of traffic census. The data pertains to the traffic census conducted by the Building and Communication Department on 6.11.1966 on one National Highway at four places and on six State Highways at 10 different places. The duration of the census was 24 hours. The table No.61 gives information regarding Post Offices, Telegraph Offices, number of telephones and radio licences issued in each year. The table No.62 gives statistical information relating to rural broadcastings.

#### X- Local Bodies

Statistics regarding Village Panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad are shown in this section. The table No.63 gives number of village panchayats number of villages covered by them and their total income and expenditure, income and expenditure of Zilla Parishad and number of municipalities and their income and expenditure. The table No. 64 gives detail information (Panchayat Samitiwise) regarding village panchayats.

Information for the years 1966-67 & 1967-68 in respect of sourcewise income and headwise expenditure is given in this table. The table No.65-A gives sourcewise income of Zilla parishad for each years whereas the table No.65 (B) gives headwise expenditure. The income and expenditure of the Zilla Parishad includes Government expenditure on plan schemes implemented through Zilla Parishads. The table No.66 gives municipalitywise income and expenditure for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. The figures of income are given separately for different sources of income and the figures of expenditure are also given separately different heads of expenditure.

XI- Plan and Community Development

The table NO. 67 gives details of expenditure under each sub-head & major head of development under the Annual Plan 1966-67 and 1967-68. The expenditure figures relate to district level plan schemes only. The table No.68 gives important physical achievements under the Annual Plans 1966-67 and 1967-68.

The table No.69 gives coverage under Community Development Programme in the district. Stagewise number of blocks, area covered, number of villages, population (1961) etc. covered by these blocks is given as at the end of the year 1967-68. The table No.70 gives stagewise expenditure under each block since inauguration of that block in '000' Rs. blockwise important achievements under the C.D. Programme for the years 1966-67 & 1967-68.

Table No.71 gives

/\* are further divided under state sector & local sector. The expenditure figures.

XII- Prices

This section contains two tables viz. table No. 72 and 73. The table No. 72 gives monthly average retail prices at the district head quarter Buldhana for the years 1966 & 1967 for some important selected commodities. The prices are collected on every Friday by the District Statistical Office, Buldhana from some selected shops and hence these are not representatives for the district prices. While collecting these prices the prices of only those varieties which have been fixed are collected and if these varieties are not available a substitute comparable variety is taken. The monthly averages are worked out for each month while reporting the prices. The table No. 73 gives the consumers price index number for Nagpur centre for 66-67 & 67-68.

XIII- Miscellaneous

Statistics relating to Police-force, Crime, Courts, Cinema, Banks & Joint stock companies, insurance, small savings, land revenue etc. are given in this section.

The table No. 74 gives police-force of different categories working in the district during 1966 & 1967. Item 6 in this table gives the total cost of the police-force. The table No. 75 gives information relating to crime statistics. This gives information of cognizable and non-cognizable crimes separately. The table No. 76 gives information relating to the civil and criminal courts during 1966 & 1967. The table No. 77 gives taluka wise information pertaining to number of cinema theaters & their seating capacity. The information is given separately for permanent, semi-permanent and touring theaters.

The table NO.78 presents statistics relating to banking offices in the district. It gives number of banking offices typewise and population covered by them. The population considered in this table is calculated by adding population of towns/villages where a banking office is located. The table NO.80 gives number of insurance policies issued and amount insured during 1966-67 & 1967-68. The table NO.81 gives statistics regarding small savings in the district during 1966-67 & 1967-68. The table NO.82 gives target fixed for the district, gross collection, with - drawals and net collection. Net collection is worked out by subtracting withdrawal figures from gross collection. The table NO.82 gives statistical data relating to land revenue collection.



C H A P T E R - IIIIndicators of Development

In this chapter the progress of development covering roughly the period of Third Five Year Plan and Annual Plans 1966-67 & 1967-68 has been reviewed by presenting taluka-wise sectorial trends based on certain important indicators of development. Comparative talukawise figures, wherever available, for 1960-61 and 1966-67 or 1967-68 as the case may be have also been given to bring out the pace of development.

Indicator No.1 :-Percentage of gross sown area

The district accounted for a very low percentage of area sown more than once to the net area sown in Nagpur division as well as in Maharashtra during 1961-62, when it stood 22nd amongst the 26 districts of Maharashtra and 7th amongst the eight districts of Nagpur division.

The following table shows the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in 1966-61 and 1966-67 in each taluka.

The total gross cropped area of the district accounted for 7,09,776 hectares during the year 1966-67 of which an area of 30,578 hectares was cropped more than once. From the above table it is seen that the percentage under double crops has increased from 2.96 in 1960-61 to 4.50 in 1966-67. The percentage of area under double crops in 1966-67 was highest in Mehkar taluka (9.18) followed by Chikhali (5.41). The percentage of area under double crops was lower in other talukas than the district average and the same was lowest in Khamgaon taluka. The percentage of double crops in Mehkar and Chikhali is comparatively higher as most of the cultivators grow Mung, Groundnut etc. in kharif season and the same is again brought under rabi - jowar, wheat or safflower etc. in rabi season.

Indicator No.2 :- Productivity of important crops

The productivity of crops generally depends on equitable distribution of rains in the absence of adequate irrigational facilities. The year 1960-61 was supposed to be the best agricultural year in which the outturn of crops has broken all the past records. The agricultural production in the year 1966-67 was lower than the production in 1960-61.

The following table gives the figures of out-turn of important crops in the year 1960-61 and 1966-67.

From the above table it is seen that the production of cereals decreased slightly while that of pulses had increased and especially production of tur increased more than three times in 1966-67 as compared to the year 1960-61. The total production of food grains increased by about 5.7 per cent in 1966-67 as compared to the production in 1960-61. Production of other crops decreased in 1966-67 as compared to the year 1960-61. During the year the hybrid jowar was grown in large areas in the district which gave comparatively better yield.

Indicator No. 3 :- Gross Value of agricultural production

As relevant price data required are not available the gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated.

Indicator No.4: Percentage of irrigated area

The district stood 4th in Vidarbha during 1964-65 in respect to the percentage of gross irrigated area to net sown area.

During 1966-67, the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is highest in Mehkar taluka. The following table shows talukawise percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in 1960-61 and 1966-67.

Out of the total irrigated area of 15878 hectares during 1966-67, 35.64 percent is in Chikhali taluka, followed by Mehkar with 22.06 percent, Malkapur with 20.02 percent. Jalgaon & Khamgaon talukas have lowest irrigation as compared with others talukas, where only 11.68 percent and 10.60 percent of the total area is irrigated during the Year 1966-67.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net area sown during 1966-67 accounted for 2.34 percent for the district as against 1.85 percent during 1960-61.

The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown has increased in 1966-67 as compared to the year 1960-61 except in Mehkar taluka.

Indicator NO.5: Changes in the crop pattern (total & irrigated)

The district stood 6th in the division and 16th in Maharashtra <sup>in</sup> 1961-62 as far as cultivable area per agricultural worker is concerned. In so far it relates to the net area sown per agricultural worker during 1961-62, it stood 4th and 13th in the division and state respectively.

The following table shows percentage of area under food-crops and non-food crops in each taluka during 1960-61 and 1966-67.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of area under food crops had decreased by about 0.8 percent in 1966-67 as compared to the corresponding percentage in 1960-61. This percentage had increased in Jalgaon & Khamgaon talukas while it had decreased in other talukas. The percentage of area under food crops was higher in 1966-67 to gross cropped area in Mehkar taluka (63.52) % followed by Chikhali taluka (57.17) % while it is lower than the district average in other talukas.

The main food crops of the district is jowar and the main non-food crop is cotton.

The main irrigated crops of the district are wheat, gram, sugarcane, chillies & cotton. The following table shows percentage of gross irrigated food crops and gross irrigated non-food crops to gross irrigated area during 1960-61 and 1966-67.

The percentage of irrigated area under food crops has decreased from 92.1 % in 1960-61 to 85.8 % in 1966-67. The decrease is mainly in Chikhali and Mehkar talukas. In Jalgaon and Khamgaon the percentage of irrigated area under food crops has increased while there is no remarkable change in Malkapur taluka. The decrease is mainly due to the tendency of cultivators of taking cotton as a irrigated crop, in chikhali and Mehkar talukas while in other talukas more area under wheat, gram, sugarcane, fruits etc., is being brought under irrigation & hence % of irrigated food crops has increase in those talukas.

Indicator No.6 :- Increase in Agricultural credit and out-standing dues and gross value of Agricultural produce

Agricultural credit plays an important role in development of agriculture. According to the per capita

(Rural population) gross value of agricultural out-put in 1961 the district stood first in Vidarbha and fifth in Maharashtra. During the last seven years there was an increase of about <sup>115</sup> percent in the amount of loans advanced. The following table shows the percentage increase in the agricultural credit during 1963-64 and 1967-68. Talukawise break-up of loan advanced for the year 1960-61 to 1962-63 is however not available.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of loan advanced has increased in Jalgaon, Chikhli and Mehkar while it has decreased in Malkapur & Khamgaon talukas in 1967-68 as compared to the loan, advanced in 1963-64 (Figures for 1960-61 are not available). The percentage of loans over due to loan out-standing has also increased in 1967-68 as compared to the year 1963-64.

#### Indicator No.7: Agricultural Wage Rates

The agricultural wage rates are collected from selected cultivators from selected centres viz. Dargaon,



Deulghat and Asalgaon in Mehkar, Chikhli and Jalgaon talukas respectively. Generally the skilled workers like carpenters, black-smiths, cobblers etc. are not employed on daily wages & hence wage rates for these categories are not collected. These wage rates are collected every fortnight. These centres do not represent the district position prev of prevalent wage rates very correctly and as such these wage rates may be taken as a broad indicator of wage level in the district.

The following table gives average wage rates at the above selected centres for the year 1963-64 and 1966-67 as the work of collection of these wage rates was started from June 1963.

The agricultural wage rates are highest at Dongaon for both male & female in 1966-67, while they are lowest at Asalgaon in case of male and lowest in at Deulghat in case of female in that year. The agricultural wage rates have increased by about 48 percent in case of males and by 51 percent in case of females for the district in 1966-67 as compared to the wage rates in year 1963-64.

Indicator No.8 :- Livestock per hectare of land

The total livestock in the district has decreased from 7,78,495 in 1961 to 7,35,841 in 1966. As per 1966 livestock census, a total number of 7,25,161 livestock (ovine & Bovine) was enumerated in the district of which Mehkar taluka shared 1/3 followed by Chikhli with 24 %.

The following table indicates talukawise livestock (Ovine & Bovine) per hectare of cultivable land in 1960-61 & 1966-67.

The livestock (Ovine & Bovine) per hectare of cultivable land had decreased from 0.97 in 1960-61 to 0.90 in 1966-67. This has happened mainly because of decrease in livestock population in 1966 as compared to the livestock population in 1961 and increase in cultivable land in 1966-67 as compared to 1960-61. The live stock per hectare of land was however more or less equal in all talukas in the district during 1966-67.

Indicator No.9 : Poultry as compared to population

The total poultry population in the district according to 1966 livestock census is which decreased by about 33.5 percent as compared to the corresponding number as per 1961 livestock census. The following table gives talukawise poultry population per 100 persons in Guldhana District.

The poultry population in the district has decreased by about 34 percent during 1966 as compared to the poultry population in 1961. This decrease has been observed in all talukas of the district. The poultry per 100 persons is above the district average in Chikhli and Mehkar talukas while it is below the district average in other talukas of the district. It is highest in Chikhli taluka and lowest in Khamgaon taluka. The district ranked 6th in vidarbha and 22nd in Maharashtra in 1961 in respect of poultry population.

Indicator No.10 : Per capita consumption of electricity

The district receives its electric power from the Paras thermal power station located in Akola district. On the basis of the number of establishments (manufacturing & repairing) using electricity in the district in 1961 census, the district ranked 7th and 13th in Nagpur division and Maharashtra respectively. In all 215 villages and '9' towns were electrified by the end of March 1968. The total population of these electrified towns & villages formed <sup>45.7</sup> Percent of the total population of the district.

The consumption of electricity for different ~~xxx~~ purposes in the district for the years 1961-62 and 1967-68 is given in the following table.

The consumption of electricity for all purpose has increased in 1967-68 as compared to the year 1961-62. This mainly due to the rural electrification programme taken

up by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. The per capita consumption of electricity during 1961-62 and 1967-68 taking into consideration 1961 population worked out to 7.3 kwh and 15.6 kwh respectively.

Indicator No.11 : Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in employment exchange and vacancies notified

Because of an increase in population and literacy & employment potential created during the plan periods 20.7 percent the registration in Employment Exchange had increased by 20.7 percent in the year 1967-68 as compared to the year 1960-61.

The following table gives the number of registrations and vacancies notified during 1960-61 and 1967-68 in Employment Exchange, Buldhana.

and the IIIrd plan began in 1961-62 and a large no. of vacancies in public and Private sector occurred. Hence the number of vacancies notified in 1960-61 and 1961-62 were highest as compared to the year 1967-68.

Indicator No.12 : Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated in hospitals

The number of indoor and out-door Patients treated has increased considerably in all the talukas in 1967 as compared to the year 1960. The increase in number of indoor patients treated was mainly due to expansion of hospitals & provision of more beds in them. During 1960 there were

only '13' dispensaries and '7' rural health centres while in 1967 there were 34 dispensaries and 12 Primary health centres. The medical facilities were ~~xxxx~~ extended in rural areas & hence the number of out door patients treated had ~~in~~ increased considerably in 1967 as compared in the year 1960.

✓ Indicator No.13 : Increase in the number of students in different categories

Primary education had reached almost all the villages and by the end of 1967-68 every village in the district was <sup>within</sup> the vicinity of a primary school or had a primary school inf. Secondary education had also made tremendous progress upto the year 1967-68 as compared to the year 1960-61.

The following table gives the number of primary school going children during the year 1960-61 and 1967-68 in the district.

The number of pupils enrolled in secondary schools has also increased during 1967-68 as compared to the year 1960-61. The following table indicates the enrolment in secondary and higher educational institutions in Buldhana district during 1960-61 and 1967-68.

From the above table, it is seen that the enrolment in secondary institutions has increased by 78.3 percent while that in higher institutions increased by 215.2 percent during the year 1967-68 as compared to the year 1960-61. Both for secondary and higher education the percentage increase in enrolment of girls is higher as compared to the number of boys. The increase in enrolment in these types of institutions is mainly due to the increase in number of institutions which are scattered all over the district.

Indicator No.14: Increase in Road Length per  
100 Sq. Km.

The Road development Programme for the Third Five Year Plan and Annual Plans 1966-67 & 1967-68 had been formulated in accordance with the broad objectives laid down in the Nagpur Road Development Plan 1961-81. The broad objectives of this plan were that no village in a developed



and agricultural area should remain more than four miles away from a metalled road and more than 1½ miles from any type of road. The following table indicates road length per 100 sq. kms. and per lakh of population in the district during 1960-61 and 1967-68.

The road length per 100 sq. kilometers has increased from 9.56 kms. in 1960-61 to 22.27 kms. in 1967-68, while road length per lakh of population increased from 87.95 kms. in 1960-61 to 204.96 in 1967-68. The increase in road length was more than double during the period from 1961 to 1968. The district ranked 2nd and 9th in Nagpur Division and Maharashtra respectively in regard to the road mileage per 100 sq. kms. as on 31.3.62. The district ranked 4th & 9th in the division and in Maharashtra as far as road mileage per lakh of population as on 31.3.1962.

Indicator No.15 - Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

There were 10 scheduled banks and 12 co-operative banks functioning in this district during the year 1960-61. At the beginning of the year 1968 the number of co-operative banks rose to 29 while the scheduled banks rose to 12. The following table indicates the number of banks during the year 1960-61 and 1967-68.

The population covered formed 23.0 percent of the district population. At the end of the year 1967-68 every panchayat samiti head quarter was having a co-operative bank.

#### Indicator NO.16 - Prices

Since the declaration of the Emergency in the country, price quotations for some important commodities from all district headquarters are obtained on weekly basis. The price collection work was started since November 1962. The prices of different commodities are ~~also~~ collected at district headquarters on each Friday & therefore do not fully represent the price prevalent. The data however is useful as a broad indicators of the trend in changes in retail prices over a period of time. The following.

From the above table it is seen that of all the commodities except turmeric have increased during 1967 as compared to the price in 1962. The increase is remarkable in all the food grains, Gur, Oils, Chillies etc. The increase is highest in case of gramdal (269.3) % followed by mung dal (204.8) % Jowar (153.3) % while the increase in sugar and clothing (Dhoti & Sari) is negligible. The same price trend is also observed in rural areas also.

CHAPTER - IVAnnual Plan 1967-68

Since the fourth five year plan for nation has not yet been finalised, an Annual Plan for the second year of intervening period after the closure of Third Five Year Plan, has been framed for one year.

The Annual Plan lays emphasis on the productive sectors and includes provisions for the key programmes. The progress under the Annual Plan 1967-68 in comparison with the progress of last year <sup>is</sup> given below.

During the year 1967-68, a total provision of Rs.178.06 lakhs was earmarked for Buldhana district out of which an amount of Rs.155.86 lakhs were expended under different heads of development as compared to budget provision of Rs.175.65 lakhs and an expenditure of Rs.149.31 lakhs during the year 1966-67. The percentage of expenditure to budget provision for the year 1967-68 worked out to 87.53 as against 85.0 during 1966-67.

The table below gives the budget provision and expenditure on district-level plan schemes during the year 1966-67 & 1967-68:

It is seen from the above table that 46.06 percent of budget provision was allocated to "Agricultural programmes" followed by 28.78 percent for "Social Services" 9.55 percent for "Irrigation & Power" 7.86 percent for "Transport and Communication", 7.23 percent for "Co-operation and Community Development" and remaining 0.52 percent for "Industry and Mining" in the year 1967-68, whereas during 1966-67, 45.8 percent of the budget provision was allocated to Agricultural Programmes, followed by 17.1 percent for "social Services", 16.8 percent for "Irrigation & Power" 10.71 percent for "Co-operation and Community Development" 9.12 percent for "Transport and Communication" and 0.5 percent for Industry.

The total expenditure of Rs.155.86 lakhs incurred during the year 1967-68, was a sum total of Rs.95.76 lakhs incurred in state sector and Rs.60.10 lakhs incurred in local sector forming 61.44 percent and 38.56 percent respectively of the corresponding plan provision. In 1966-67 the total expenditure of Rs.149.31 lakhs comprised Rs.98.71 lakhs and Rs.50.60 lakhs incurred in state sector and local sector respectively. The percentage of expenditure to corresponding plan provision was 66.11 for state sector and 33.89 for local sector in 1966-67.

Out of the budget provision earmarked for the year 1967-68 Rs.103.32 lakhs were allocated in state sector and Rs.69.74 lakhs in local sector, the percentage of distribution of budget provision for state and local sector was 60.83 and 39.17 respectively, whereas the corresponding percentage for previous year were 73.6 and 26.4 for state sector and local sector respectively.

#### Agricultural Programmes

The emphasis being on productive sector in Plan, priority was given to Agricultural Programmes with a view to improve agricultural production to achieve self sufficiency in food grains, agricultural raw materials for industries etc.

The table below gives the allotments and expenditure on various agricultural programmes in district during the year 1967-68.

The details of sub-headwise expenditure & achievements are given in table no. 67 & 68 of the abstract, however a brief sketch of the progress is given below:

#### Agricultural Production

Out of Rs. 4.65 lakhs spent on the schemes relating to agricultural production an amount of Rs. 1.04 lakhs was spent on training of personnel in agricultural schools Rs. 0.40 lakhs were expended for development of cotton crops, Rs. 0.07 were spent on development of oil seeds, Rs. 0.50 lakhs were spent on Horticultural Development.



An amount of Rs.0.79 lakhs was expended for improvement of Agricultural Practices & Rs.1.83 lakhs were spent for securing improved seeds & another amount of Rs.0.02 lakhs was expended on Consolidation of land holdings. To boost up the agricultural production, specialised efforts for adoption of hybrid and high yielding varieties of food crops, propagation of improved methods of cultivation, use of various improved seeds, fertilisers and insecticides/ pesticides were undertaken.

#### Minor Irrigation

For securing irrigation facilities to boost up agricultural production by way of double cropping etc., and amount of Rs.32.46 lakhs was utilised for construction of 12 bandharas & 7 tanks. Besides, 211 irrigation wells and 644 pumping sets were installed for which an amount of Rs.4.36 lakhs was expended. The co-operative lift irrigation societies were also provided with subsidy of Rs.1.24 lakhs in addition to Rs.0.04 lakhs were utilised for air compressing and blasting of wells.

#### Animal Husbandry

To provide necessities to units already established in previous years, under development of veterinary services Rs.0.13 lakhs were utilised for construction of buildings. An amount of Rs.0.20 lakhs was expended on location of premium bulls and Rs.0.06 lakhs were granted as loans for poultry keeping.

Forest

The plantation of various species of general utility and industrial use were taken on about 40 hectares area and the soil Conservation measures were also completed on 20 hectares, besides construction of forest roads, utilising Rs.1.14 lakhs for this purpose.

Fisheries

An expenditure of Rs.0.03 lakhs was made for stocking and netting of fish in impounded waters. The remaining amount of Rs.0.01 lakhs was utilised for improvement of economic conditions of fishermen.

Ware Housing and Marketing

The existing Agricultural produce marketing committees were assisted with a total amount of Rs.4.02 lakhs during 1967-68.

Co-operation and Community development

With a view to seek promotions of co-operative organisations, an expenditure of Rs.1.18 Lakhs was booked for providing various subsidies, share capital contributions, loans etc. according to the needs of the societies.

To strengthen the socio economic conditions in rural areas through Community development Programme, Rs. 7.99 lakhs were expended on C.D. projects. An amount of Rs.1.85 lakhs was utilised on local development Works Programme aiming minly on construction and repairs of drinking water wells, and Rs. 1.20 lakhs were spent on applied nutrition programme.

Small scale and Cottage Industries

For improving economic conditions of weavers, they were encouraged to organise into co-operatives. The financial assistance of Rs.0.13 lakhs was given to weavers & their societies during the year 1967-68.

Irrigation & PowerRural Electrification

Rural electrification has special importance in development of rural economy during the year. In all 20 villages were electrified and 615 Agricultural pump sets were energised marking a total of 215 electrified villages and 3337 Agricultural pump sets energised for which an amount of Rs.13.79 lakhs was expended.

Transport and Communication

The Road Development Programme has a much significance in this district as it is not well equipped with road ways. The district roads of 21 kilometers and rural roads of 60 kilometers length were under construction, besides completion of 23 C.D. works. The investment for these works was of Rs.13.51 lakhs during the year 1967-68.

Social servicesGeneral Education

Education plays an important role amongst the factors which contribute its rapid economic growth and technological progress. An amount of Rs.12.62 lakhs was spent on promotion of general education programme.

Technical Education

With a view to develop the polytechnic already established at Khangaon, and for providing hostel facilities etc. the amount of Rs.5.23 lakhs was utilised

Medical and Public Health

The programme covers expanding facilities in hospitals, preventive measures for control and eradication of epidemics and communicable diseases and measures to control population growth. For Malaria and small pox eradication an amount of Rs.3.77 lakhs was expended. An expenditure of Rs.7.23 lakhs was incurred on family Planning Programme under which 9487 sterilisation operations and 341 insertion of loops were performed during 1967-68.

Water supply and drainage

With a view to provide hygienic drinking water an amount of Rs.7.03 lakhs was expended during the year.

Housing and Urban Development

Under village housing project scheme 42 homes were constructed at a cost of Rs.1.25 lakhs, further 19 villages were provided 32 hectares of land for extension of their gaothans for which an amount of Rs.0.83 lakhs was spent during the year under report.

Backward Classes welfare

The Plan seeks to provide liberal assistance to the weaker section of the community so that the social and economic disabilities are removed. Thus an amount of Rs.0.52 lakhs was expended towards various schemes of welfare both educational and economical up lift of Backwards Classes.

For welfare of women and children in rural areas an amount of Rs.0.10 lakhs was spent under welfare Extension project scheme during 1967-68.

Labour and labour welfare

An amount of Rs.2.30 lakhs was spent on technical and vocational training of inmates in Industrial training Institute at Kamgaon during the year.
