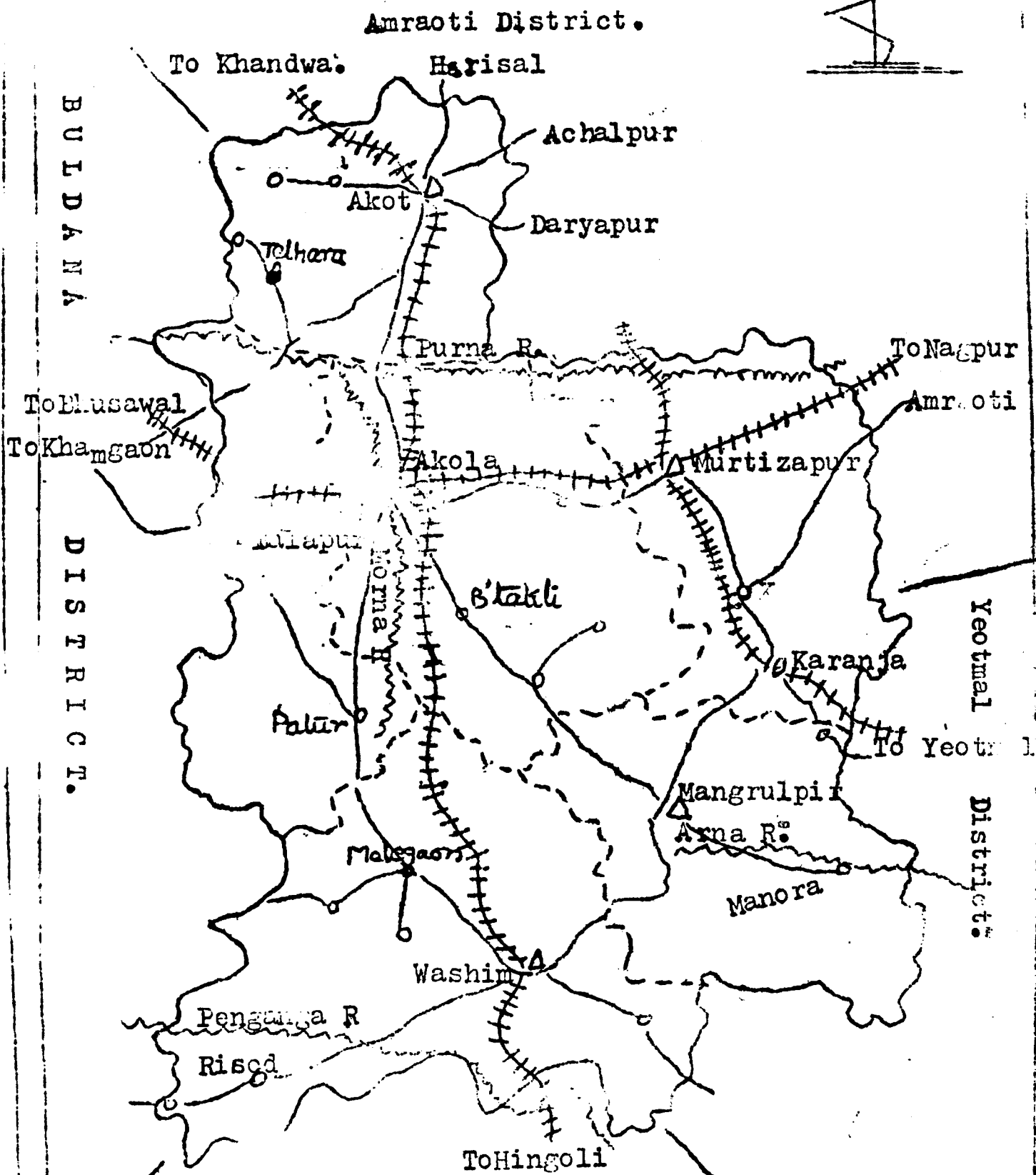
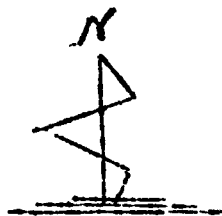



CHAPTER I.Introduction.1.1: Location.

Akola district lying between 19°51' and 21°16' N. latitude and 76°38' and 77°44' longitude with an area of 10,595.7 km² (4091 sq.miles) is surrounded by Buldhana, Amraoti and Yeotmal districts of Vidarbha and Parbhani district of Marathwada.

1.2: Boundaries:

The northern boundary of the district is of Melghat hills, and it is bounded on the east by Daryapur, Amraoti and Chandur tahsils of Amraoti district and Darwaha and Pusad tahsils of Yeotmal district. Buldhana district lies to the West of this district, while Parbhani district of Marathwada forms its southern boundary.

1.3: Administrative set-up

For administrative purpose, the district is divided in 6 tahsils and the details about number of villages, population, area covered by each tahsil are given in the following table :

The Collector is in-charge of general administration, Law and order, land Revenue and Civil supplies and he is assisted by a few Deputy Collectors including Resident Deputy Collector in his office and 6 Deputy Collectors (Sub-Divisional Officers) who are in-charge of 6 Revenue Divisions. Each Revenue division corresponds with tahsil and each sub-Divisional officer is assisted by a Tahsildar and a few Naib-Tahsildars.

There are many other state Government offices at the district headquarter to facilitate smooth and Co-ordinated working of Government machinery.

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti Act 1962, a parallel set-up of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities came into existence with their jurisdiction over the entire district, excepting the municipal towns. These, being democratic institutions, the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat samities have two wings namely deliberative or decision making wing and executive wing. At Zilla Parishad level, the policy making body has 47 directly elected councillors, one co-opted lady member and few associate councillors; and at the panchayat samiti level, the policy making body consists of elected, co-opted and associate councillors. The executive wing at the Zilla Parishad level, is headed by the Chief Executive Officer, assisted by various departmental heads. The executive power at panchayat samiti level are vested in the Block Development officer. There are 13 Panchayat Samities in the district.

The developmental and administrative subjects transferred to Zilla Parishad and panchayat Samities cover, by and large, all functions of Government administration including developmental activities, but, it excludes matters relating to law and order,

judicial and quassi-judicial functions etc. the Zilla Parishad works through various committees formed for different activities. The finance of these local bodies come from two major sources one of which is taxes and levies imposed by these bodies and the other being assistance given by the Government.

1.4: Administrative History

In the complete overhauling effected in the districts of Berar in 1905, Akola district, in more or less the present form, came into existence; and there were no major changes in the boundaries of the district and its tahsils since 1911 till today. With the re-organisation of states, in 1956, Akola district, which till then was a part of Madhya Pradesh, was transferred to Bombay state. The district formed part of Maharashtra on 1st May 1960. But, all these transfers did not affect the territorial boundaries of the district.

1.5: Area.

The district covers an area of 10,595.7 sq.km (4091 sq. miles). The district accounts for 3.46 percent and 3.01 percent of the of the State area and population respectively. In terms of area and population, the district ranks 4 and 5th respectively in Vedarbha as per 1961 Census.

1.6: Topography.

The northern part of the district lies in Purna valley which is itself a part of Tapi river basin. The river Purna has formed a fertile basin in the talukas of Akot, Balapur, Akola and Murtizapur. This portion of the district is called Payanghat whereas the southern part of the district is known as Balaghat which is drained by the Penganga. The Balaghat Plateau forms one of the great water sheds in the country.

1.7: Hills, River system, Soils.

Akola district has no mountains of importance but, the Satpata plateau stretches on its northern border, and a range of steep hills of Ajanta mountains run across the middle of the southern tahsils forming a plateau known as the Balaghat which is great water shed. On one of the Satpata hills the *Stands* large ancient fort of Narnala. To the southern side ranges of hills are very distinct along the junction of Washim with Balapur and Akola tahsils and again in the middle and towards south-east of Mangrulpir Tahsil.

The Purna which is the principal river of the district rises in Betul district of Madhya Pradesh and flows due west through northern parts of Akola district. It is an important tributary of the Tapi. The chief tributories of the Purna are the Penchi, the Lonar, the Man, the Uma, the Kaetpurna, the Morna and the Nirguna. Khetpurna, which is the largest of all these tributories, rises within a few miles of Washim and flows across the eastern part of Akola tahsil and north-west corner of Murtizapur tahsil. The Penganga which flows south east across Washim tahsil is another important river of the district. The Aran, the Arnawati and the Pus rise in Washim tahsil and flows through Mangrulpir tahsil finally meet the Penganga.

The soil is basically derived from volcanic trap rock and is quite fertile. The surface soil of most of the area of the district is rich, black soil. Most of the northern part of the district, central part of Washim tahsil and north-western part of Mangrulpir tahsil have rich, black soil. On the other hand, most of the southern portion of Balapur and Akola tahsils, the border of Washim tahsil, southern parts of Mangrulpir tahsil and the east- and north-east portion of Murtizapur tahsil are shallow, stony and less productive. On the eastern

On the eastern side of the road leading from Akola to Akot, there is saline tract on both sides of the Purna river in which formerly salt used to be manufactured.

1.7: Climate, Temperature and rain-fall

Within the district, the seasons show local variations. The hilly tracts of Washim and Mangrulpir talukas have slightly cooler climate than others. Akola city is considered to be hottest place. The rainy season starts from June and lasts upto September. It is followed by sultry weather from October to middle of November. Winter starts from middle of November, and lasts till the end of February. The dry season commences generally from the last week of March and continues till the end of May. A good breeze generally blows during hot weather making the evenings and nights comparatively cooler. The district has extremes of climate with too hot summers and too hot winters. Monthly temperature records for the district are available only for Akola station. The average highest temperature recorded during 1967 was 43.2 c and lowest temperature during the same period was 13.2 C. The average rain-fall in 1967 was 643.7 mm in the district. The rain-fall is more in the southern part than in the northern part. Mangrulpir got more rains measuring 863 mm as against 460 mm at Balapur during the year 1967.

The district has suffered from scarcity on a few occasions. The Fact finding committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 has reported that there is no area in the district which can be regarded as 'Scarcity Areas'.

Chapter II

The statistical data under thirteen sections are presented in this Abstract. Explanatory notes on some of the tables under each section are given in the following paragraphs to indicate some of the salient features in addition to explanation of certain terms used in the table.

I- Climate:

1.1 : The table No.1 presents information regarding month-wise rainfall and number of rainy days in each taluka of the district during the years 1966 and 1967.

1.2: The table No.2 indicates month-wise statistical information on temperature of the district in the selected centres for the years 1966 and 1967, including average temperature in each ~~tax~~ month of the year.

II. Area and Population

Under this section, figures from 1961 population census are presented.

Final figures of 1961 Census are presented in tables 3 to 8. Table No.3 gives talukawise rural and urban area and rural and urban population for the years 1951 and 1961. It also gives percentage variation over 1951 and density of population. The terms 'rural' and 'urban' used in population tables are defined as :-

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has -

1. A Municipality, a cantonment or Civil lines

2. i) A population of 5,000 or over and
ii) At least $\frac{1}{2}$ or more of male workers in the area engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

Rural population is a population of all villages in a revenue unit.

A 'village' is a statutorily recognised village having defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, Wadis or Padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'Uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

The table No.4 gives information on inhabited villages classified according to population ranges in each taluka of the district. Similarly, the table No.5 gives information on taluka-wise towns classified according to population ranges.

The table No.6 gives talukawise workers and non-workers according to the 1961 Census.

A person is classified as worker if-

a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation

livestock, dairying, household industry etc., he had some regular work of more

than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and,

b) in the case of regular employment in any

trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of

III. Agriculture

Statistical information mainly on i) Land utilisation, ii) Area and out-turn and iii) Irrigation is presented under this topic for the year 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The table No.9 gives talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard head of utilisation. The area according to village papers is calculated from village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes

1. Total Geographical area by
 - a) professional survey.
 - b) village papers.

Under forests are included all actually forested areas on the lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether state-owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but, put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or un-cultivated land.

Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountain, deserts etc. (land which can-not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost) is classed as unculturable

whether such lands is in an isolated block or within cultivated holdings).

Land put to non-agricultural covers lands occupied by buildings roads, and railways or under water, eg. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture.

Culturable waste covers all lands available for cultivation, whether or not taken up for cultivation or abandoned after five years for one reason or the other. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or un-assessed and may be in isolated blocks or within cultivation but, not cultivated for five years in succession is also included in this category, at the end of five years.

Permanent pastures or other grazing lands cover all grazing lands whether permanent pastures and meadows or otherwise.

Land under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown include all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but, is put to some agricultural use. Lands under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuel, etc. which are not included under 'orchards' will be classed under this.

Current fallows include all lands which are left fallow during the current year only.

Other fallow lands comprise all lands which were taken up for cultivation but, are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The reasons for keeping such lands fallow may be inter-alia one of the following:

- 1. Poverty of cultivators;
- 2. Inadequate water-supply;
- 3. Malarial climate;
- 4. Silting of canals and rivers ; or
- 5. Unremunerative nature of farming etc.

Net area sown denote the area sown to crops counting areas sown more than once in the same year only once. This represents the difference between the total geographical area and sum of area under forests, barren and unculturable land, land put to non-agricultural uses, culturable waste, permanent

permenent pastures and other grazing lands, miscellaneous tree crops and groves, not included in net area sown, other fallow land and current fallow.

Area sown more than once is the area sown with two or more than two crops and counted more than once in the same year. /croppedTotal/ geographical area is the total of net area sown and area sown ~~more~~ more than once.

The table No.9 presents information regarding land utilization statistics during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67, in each taluka of district, and the table No.10 gives taluka-wise statistics about area under different crops grown in the district during the same period.

The table No.11, indicates yeild per hectare of the selected crops in the district and their out-turn during the years 65-66 and 66-67. The figures for 65-66 are based on final forecast and for 66-67 are provisional as per statement of agriculture Department.

The table No.12 and 13 present statistical data in respect of area irrigated by different sources like canals, wells and others and area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during the year 65-66 and 66-67.

The table No.14 indicates data regarding number of irrigation wells in use and those not in use in each taluka of the district during the years 65-66 and 66-67.

the table No.15 presents statistical information regarding minor irrigation works excluding wells, and thenet area irrigated under them in each taluka of the district during the year 1966-67.

the table No.16 gives information regarding medium projects in the district and their perticulars of location, year of completion, irrigation potentiality and commandable area etc.

The table No.17 deals with the information on the agricultural wage rates during twelve months of the years 1967 and 1968 prevailing at the three selected rural centres of the district.

The table No.19 presents information for the district as a whole regarding relief works undertaken, number of villages affected by scarcity or floods during the year ~~1967~~ 1967-68 and

67-68 and employment created and expenditure incurred for that purpose.

IV. Animal Husbandary, Forests and Fisheries.

The table No.20 indicates the number of livestock population including poultry as enumerated at the time of 1966 Livestock census in the district, which is conducted every five years in the country on certain uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration.

The table No.21, 22, and 23 give information on veretinary statistics during the period of two years 66-67 and 67-68. This includes facilities like veretinary dispensaries, hospitals, and aid-centres and the number of animals treated under various diseases during that period.

The table No.24 indicates data regarding unclassed, protected and reserved forests and the value of forests products including quantity sold during the year 66-67 and 67-68.

V. Employment, Industry, Mining, and Electricity.

The table No.25 ~~gives~~ gives statistics regarding number of factories registered under factory act and dealing with various type of industries during the year 1967 in the district and those employing ten or more workers. Information about number of factories submitting their annual returns to Govt., total number of workers engaged (male and female) and Mandays and average daily employment in each type of industry, is given in this table.

The table No. 28, 29 and 30 ~~give~~ give the employment and un-employment position in each month of the years 1966 and 1967. It gives registration of candidates in each month at the district employment Exchange office, number of vacancies notified and Candidates placed in services both under private and public sectors during the same period. Table No.31 and 32 give data regarding Census of Govt. employees during 1966 according to their basic pay and emoluments ranges.

Table No.33 give figures of electricity generated and sold for various purposes like industrial, domestic and others, during the year 66-67 and 67-68 in the district. The district gets its electric supply from Paras. Similarly the table No.34 gives information regarding number of villages and towns electrified at the end of each financial year 1961, 1966 and 1967 and 1968 by

of different agencies, and the population benefitted by these facilities. There is no private agency in the district.

VI. Co-Operation.

The table No.35 to 42 give information regarding different type of co-operative societies functioning in the district during 1967 and 1968. Items of statistical information covered under this section show data on co-operative Banks, Industrial co-operative Banks, Urban Banks and credit and Non-credit societies together with their membership, working capital, share capital and loans advanced by these societies and received during this period. The table No.41 deals with the operation of regulated marketing societies and other allied activities in the district. The table No.42 gives information regarding number of money lenders in each taluka of the district and loan advanced by them during the year 1967 and 1968.

VII. Medical and Public health.

Under this section, statistical information on medical facilities available in the district during 1966 and 1967 are detailed. Table No.43 gives taluka-wise statistical information regarding number of hospitals, dispensaries and number of Doctors and Nurses working therein including number of beds and the total patients (in-door and out-door) treated during that period.

The table No.44 indicates taluka-wise information regarding number of births and deaths registered including infant deaths during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The table No.45 presents data regarding deaths due to various causes in the district during 1965.

The table No.46 gives data on the number of vaccinations and inoculations and re-vaccinations for the years 66 and 67 in each taluka of the district.

VIII. Education.

Important education statistics has been presented in the table Nos. 47 to 53 under this head showing taluka-wise literacy in the district based on the population data of 1961 Census and progress of education in rural and urban areas of the district based on 1961 Census. The table No.50 gives information on number of institutions, enrolment and teachers therein during the year 1967-68.

The table No.51 and 52 give the data on the number of students from backward communities and those economically backward benefitted by schlorships and other educational concessions during that period. The table No.53 presents data regarding expenditure on primary education, in the district incurred by local bodies like Zilla Parishad and Municipalities during the years 66-67 and 67-68 including the expenditure on Plan schemes.

IX. Transport and Communication:

The table No.55 presents information on the Railway routes and their length under broad gauge, metre-gauge and narrow-gauge railway lines existing in the district during 1967 and 1968 financial years. The data is taken from Railway time Table and denotes length of railway upto the last railway station near the district border.

The table No.56 gives information on length or roads, and their construction by various agencies like Zilla Parishad, B.& C. department, Municipal councils with the type of surface during 1961, 1967 and 1968.

The table No.57 presents statistical information regarding motor vehicles of all types in operation in the district during the year 1967-68.

The table No.58 gives information on the operational statistics of Maharashtra State Road Transport division, Akola during the years 1967 and 1968 pertaining to number of routes, their distance, number of passengers travelled per day and an average of earning per day.

Information regarding traffic census carried on important district roads in 1966 is given in the table No.57. This information is collected from the B.& C. deparrrment.

The table No.60 gives some important statistics regarding post and telegraph offices, number of letter boxes, number of Postmen, number of telephones and number of radio licences issued newly and renewed during the year 1967-68. Information in this table is collected from the concerned postal authorities of the district.

X. Local bodies:

The table No.62 to 65 give information on income and expenditure of the local bodies existing in the district during the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

XI. Plan and Community Development.

The table No.67 and 68 give information regarding Plan expenditure under different development sub heads of the plan schemes, implemented in the district during the years 1967-68 and 1966-67 and the physical achievements under selected items during the same period.

The table No.69 to 70 give information on the number of C.D.blocks with their stages, expenditure incurred by them on plan schemes and progress of physical achievements made by each Panchayat Samiti during the years 66-67 and 67-68.

XII. Prices.

The table No.71 indicates average retail prices of the selected commodities and articles, prevailing at the district head quarter during each month of the years 1966 and 1967. Consumer price index numbers for working class (revised series) are presented in the table No.72, for Nagpur city with 1960 as base year. Similar consumer index for Akola city is not worked out and hence the same for Nagpur city is given.

XIII. Miscellaneous.

The table No.73 gives information in respect of strength of police in the district during 1966 and 1967, number of police stations, out-posts and cost of the police force etc.

Crime statistics, both cognizable and non-cognizable in 1968 and 1969 are presented in the table No.74 with number of cases tried, convicted and acquitted during the same period.

The table No.75 gives information about the disposal of cases in the Civil Court and Criminal courts during the years 1966 and 1967 in the district. Information required for this table is collected from the office of the District ~~and~~ Sessions Judge, Akola.

Indicator No. 1: Percentage of gross sown area.

The following table shows the talukawise percentage of gross sown area to net sown area for the years 1960-61 to 1966-67.

It will be seen from the above figures that the area sown more than once in the district is quite negligible due to meagre irrigational facilities. As compared to the position in 1960-61, there is however, a slight increase in 1966-67 in the district as a whole and it has not decreased in any taluka over the year 1960-61. The percentage of double cropped area was highest in Washim taluka and lowest in Murtizapur tahsil in 1966-67.

Indicator No. 2: Productivity of important crops.

The productivity of the crops generally depends upon i) timely rainfall, ii) adequate rains and iii) equal distribution of rain in all parts. The following table indicates the productivity of important crops in 1960-61 and 1966-67.

The production of majority of the above crops except wheat and sugarcane decreased in 1966-67 as compared to the year 1960-61, as during the last two years the rain fall was inadequate and was not well distributed in all parts of the district. The production of Wheat showed a small increase in 1966-67 over the year 1960-61, whereas the increase in sugarcane was ~~high~~ significant and four times more as compared to the production of 1960-61.

Indicator No.3: Gross value of Agricultural production.

Due to non-availability of Farm harvest prices of various commodities, this indicator is not worked out.

of ~~that~~ It is seen from the above percentages irrigated area to net area sown in the district which was 0.43 percent in 1960-61 has increased during 1966-67 to 1.55 percent. In all the tahsils, it has increased in 1966-67 as compared to 1960-61. In Akot, Balapur, Akola and Mangrulpir talukas, it has increased three times or more as compared to the year 1960-61. (This increase is more significant in Akola taluka followed by Mangrulpir taluka. Other talukas have a smaller increase). The area irrigated more than once had increased in the district by 3.99 percent in 1966-67 over the year 1960-61. It was highest in Washim taluka because of Ekburji tank and lowest in Mangrulpir in 1966-67 over 1960-61.

It will be seen from the above percentages that area under food crops decreased in 1966-67 in Akot, Murtizapur and Washim taluka as compared to the year 1960-61, whereas it increased in the remaining three talukas of the district. In the district, as a whole, the area under food crops increased from 51.57 percent in 1960-61 to 53.45 percent during 1966-67, whereas the area under non-food crops decreased in the same proportion correspondingly in 1966-67 from 48.43 percent in 60-61 to 46.55 percent.

Agriculture is largely dependent upon rainfall in the district and the years 1964-65 and 1965-66 were drought years due to which area under groundnut declined in 1966-67 when compared with the corresponding figures of 1960-61.

The area under gram mainly decreased in 1966-67 in Akot, Washim and Murtizapur talukas as compared to the year 1960-61. The area under groundnut decreased in Balapur, Akola, Washim, Mangrulpur and Murtizapur during the year 1966-67 over 1960-61. The area under cotton increased in 1966-67 over the year 1960-61 except in

Balapur taluka whereas groundnut decreased in all the talukas excepting Akot during the same period.

Due to availability of more lift irrigation facilities, expansion of electricity and use of pumping sets, it is seen that irrigated area in the district under food crops which was only 0.75 percent in 1960-61 increased to 2.72 percent in 1966-67 which was a substantial increase. The major source of irrigation in the district is wells in addition to the Ekburji tank project at Washim. The other medium project in the district are yet to be completed.

Indicator No.6: Increase in agricultural credits outstanding dues? and gross value of agricultural productions.

Agricultural credit made available by the primary agricultural credit societies catering to the needs of farmers, play an important role in development of agriculture in the district. It will be seen from the above figures that there was substantial increase in loans advanced from Rs.126.09 lakhs in

126.09 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs.310.38 lakhs in 1967-68. Among talukas, it was more-over double in Akot, Balapur and Murtizapur in 1967-68 as compared to 1961-62 and two and half to three times in Akola, Mangrulpir and Washim talukas. In 1961-62 Akot taluka accounted for 22 percent of the total amount of loans in the district, but, in 1967-68 Washim taluka ranked first by accounting for 27 percent of the total amount of loan in the district.

It can also be seen that there was a substantial increase in the outstanding dues from Rs.202.06 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs.490.43 lakhs in 1967-68. In 1961-62, Akola taluka had more dues forming 22 percent of the total amount of loans in the district whereas in 1967-68 Washim taluka ranked first in this respect accounting 27 percent of the district total of outstanding dues followed by Akola taluka accounting for 17 percent.

Indicator No.7: Agricultural wage rates.

Agricultural labour has an important role in the rural areas of the district and its economic uplift is essential. According to the Census of 1961, the total number of agricultural labourers in the district was 2,76,188 forming 23.22 percent of district population. The average agricultural wage rates prevailing in 1964 and in 1967 at the three selected centres in the district are given in the following table:

It will be seen that the average daily wage rate for ~~xxx~~ skilled workers in 1967 for carpenters ranged from Rs.3.82 to Rs.5.72, for Black-smiths from Rs.3.47 to Rs.5.00 and for Cobblers from Rs.3.00 to Rs.3.36.

Similarly, in the case of unskilled workers, their wage rates for male labour ranged in 1967 from Rs.1.73 to Rs.2.24, for females from Rs.0.82 to Rs.1.10 and for herdsmen from Rs.1.25 to Rs.1.30. Compared to the wage level in 1964, the average wages for all categories of labour had gone up in 1967 except in the case of Carpenter at Chohatta when the average daily wage went down from Rs.3.89 in 1964 to Rs.3.80 in 1967.

Indicator No.8: Live-stock population per hectare of cultivable land (bovine and ovine population)

Importance of livestock in agriculture can not be under-rated in spite of propagation of electricity, pumping sets and tractors. The following table indicates live-stock per hectare of cultivable land in the district during 1967

From the above table, it will be seen that percentage of poultry decreased in 1966 as compared to 1961. In Murtizapur and Mangrulpir talukas it increased from 144.4 to 160.5 percent and from 189.8 to 200.0 percent respectively, whereas it has been decreased in the other talukas of the district during that period.

According to results of data collected through special schedule introduced by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Govt. of Maharashtra, Bombay after the 1961 livestock Census at the time of rationalised supervision just after the livestock census, it is estimated that the average number of birds kept per 100 households in Akola as per 1961 Census was 68.53 fowls, 0.14 ducks, and 69.03 poultry as against the Divisional average of 127.61, fowls, 0.22 ducks and 129.01 total poultry, and corresponding figures for Maharashtra were 136.47 fowls, 0.35 ducks and 137.40 poultry. Again the percentage of improved fowls to all fowls in Akola district in 1961 was estimated at 1.37 as against the corresponding figure of 1.07 for Nagpur Division and 1.69 for Maharashtra. Similarly, during the same period the average number of eggs produced per annum per hen worked out to 84 for Akola, 61 for Nagpur and 84 for Maharashtra.

The use of electricity for domestic as well as for agricultural purposes shows an increasing trend in the district. In 1961-62 the per capita consumption of electricity was only 9.04 KWH increased by two and half times more in 1967-68 to 24.36 KWH. It is significant to note the expansion of electricity in the district. The number of villages and towns electrified increased from 61, as on 31-3-1961, to 406 as on 31-3-68.

It is observed that registration of candidates had decreased in 1967-68 by 17 percent as compared to 1961-62. Similar is the case with the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchange. During 1967-68 675 vacancies were notified as against 923 in 1961-62, resulting in a decrease of 27 percent as the number of employers using the exchange was less.

From the above data, it will be seen that number of hospitals and dispensaries increased in 1967 by more than three and half times as compared to 1961. This resulted in reducing the number of out-door patients per hospital and dispensary treated in 1967 in the district. Similar was the case with the indoor patients treated in each hospital and dispensary. As the number of hospitals increased, the number of patients per hospital and dispensary decreased considerably. The number of Indoor patients treated per hospital and dispensary in 1967 decreased to 181 as against 458 patients in 1961.

It will be seen from the above table that there was a substantial increase in the number of students in primary, Secondary and higher stages of education in 1967-68 over their corresponding number of 1961. The percentage of students in 1967-68 in primary schools increased by 34.75, in secondary schools by 70.27 and in higher stages of education by 179.49 over their corresponding number in 1961-62. The number of higher institutions increased nearly three times the corresponding number in the year 1961-62, the percentage increase in this respect being 79.49. In all 18.44 percent of population was school going in the district in 1967-68 as compared to 12.88 percent in 1961-62. There were only 1237 primary schools in 1961-62 and their number increased to 1539 schools in 1967-68. Similarly, the number of Secondary and higher schools had also increased from 83 in 1961-62 to 126 in 1967-68. Considering the number of institutions and number of teachers in the primary schools, it may be said that for every four teachers there was one primary institution in 1967-68. The overall strength of girl students increased by 28,601 in 1967-68 over the year 1961-62 in all stages of education. There was one teacher for every 28 students at the primary stage and 25 students in secondary stage in 1967-68.

It will be seen from the above table that the road length per 100 sq.km. was slightly more than the double in 1967-68 over the year 1960-61. The road length in the district increased from 532 km. in 1960-61 to 1234 km. in 1967-68. There was substantial increase in the length of state highways and the major district roads. During the last seven years, sufficient progress has been made in spreading the roads throughout the district and all the talukas headquarters and big commercial centres have been connected with the district headquarter. The Road length of W.B.M. and black topped roads also increased from 292 km. in 1960-61 to 666 km. in 1967-68 and from 240 km. to 535 km. respectively. The percentage of surfaced roads in the district was 11.33 per 100 sq.km, and that of un-surfaced roads was 0.39 per 100 sq.km of area in the district, in 1967-68.

It will be seen from the above table that the prices of all most all the commodities have registered a rise in 1967 as compared to the prices of 1962. The up-ward trend of prices of cereals and pulses was more than double in 1967 as compared to their average in 1962. Among pulses, Gramdal showed an increase of 300 percent in 1967 over the year 1962.

The percentage increase in case of cloth, kerosene, Charcoal and Bidi etc. was between 0.5 to 41 percent. Sugar, Rice and Jowar were the controlled articles and hence their percentage increase over their prices in 1962 was not much. The highest increase was recorded in case of Gramdal (300 percent) as noted above, whereas it was lowest in case of Dhotis (10.5 percent).

I. Agricultural programme:

Since agriculture and allied programmes was assigned a high priority in the Annual Plan 1967-68 as in the last year, a major portion of the total out-lay was earmarked for it, as can be seen from the expenditure on it forming 81.13 percent of the total budget provision. Forty quintals of improved seeds of food grains was distributed and an additional area of 211 hectares

was brought under fruit trees in the district. The achievement regarding area banded in the district in 1967-68 was more by 10 thousand acres over 1966-67 and 719 new wells were constructed being about three times the corresponding number of last year.

Under intensive cultivation scheme, 75 percent target was achieved upto Dec.67, and during the Plan period, aerial spraying on 11000 acres was done.

Cent-percent achievement under the cotton extension scheme was achieved with total expenditure of Rs.1.71 lakhs as against a provision of Rs.1.90 lakhs made for the year under review.

For improvement of poultry in the district, an expenditure of Rs.93 thousand as against the budgetted amount of Rs.98 thousands was booked. The entire amount of Rs.3 thousands provided for supply of premium bulls during this period was spent for purchase of five premium bulls in the district.

II. CO-Operation and C.D. Programme.

Under this head of development 89.59 percent expenditure was made during the year 67-68, to strengthen the co-operative structure in the district. Two agriculture marketing societies were given aid. And a hundred societies were granted financial assistance of Rs.49 thousand. Besides, seven co-operative consumer stores were given a loan of Rs.10 thousands to extend their activities in the district.

Out of the budget provision, Rs.14 lakhs under this head of development, more than 50 percent expenditure was made on community Development programme. On the achievement side, financial assistance of Rs.17 thousand to 68 backward villages was given during the period of 1967-68. An expenditure about Rs.3.24 lakhs was made for the construction of new 62 wells against the target of 251 wells.

III. Irrigation and Power.

During the year 1967-68, an amount of Rs.25.28 lakhs was spent forming 98.82 percent of the corresponding budget provision. The work of Morna and Giroli as medium projects and Katepurna a major project was in progress and on their completion, irrigation potentiality in the district will increase.

An estimated area of 5701 and 8339 hectares respectively is expected to be irrigated under these two projects.

IV. Industry and Mining.

During the plan period a programme for industrialisation in rural areas of the district was also undertaken, and the total expenditure under this activity was Rs.24 thousand in the year 67-68 as against the budget provision of Rs.72 thousands. The expenditure under local sector was nearly 8 times more than the state sector. Three handloom societies and few other co-operative societies were given an aid in addition to a loan of Rs.34 thousands during the same period.

V. Transport and communication.

Road development plays a vital role in improving the economic condition of the district. At the beginning of this plan, the district had 1187 km. road length which increased to 1243 km. The total expenditure on the development of roads amounted to Rs.20.81 lakhs in 1967-68 of which 97 percent was under local sector. During this period rural road of 8 km. were completed.

VI. Social Services.

For expansion of education and other allied activities in the district, an amount of Rs.67.49 lakhs was spent during the year 1967-68 against the corresponding provision of Rs.55.32 lakhs forming 122.00 percent of the plan provision. In all 58 institutions of various types in the district were benefitted by getting grant-in-aid of Rs.9.18 lakhs, and 259 new teachers were appointed during 1967-68.

With a view to improve quality of education and to upgrade a few schools, 178 teachers were selected for training. They were granted stipend during their training period @Rs.60/-p.m. per head.

Out of the total expenditure of Rs.67.49 lakhs under this development head, an expenditure of Rs.9.73 lakhs was made on medical and public health. 83 nurses underwent training during this period and measures to control epidemic diseases were taken in the district. Various schemes relating to social problems like family planning, establishment of Balwadis and Nutrition programmes for the welfare of children etc. were implemented.

In addition to this, construction of houses under rural housing project was undertaken in 21 villages of the district in 1967-68 and an expenditure of Rs.2.50 lakhs was made out of the total provision of Rs.3.65 lakhs in this regard.

VIII. Miscellaneous.

For miscellaneous scheme like publicity etc. to be implemented in the district, an expenditure of Rs.40 thousand was made in the year 1967-68, against the budget provision of Rs.3.65 lakhs.
