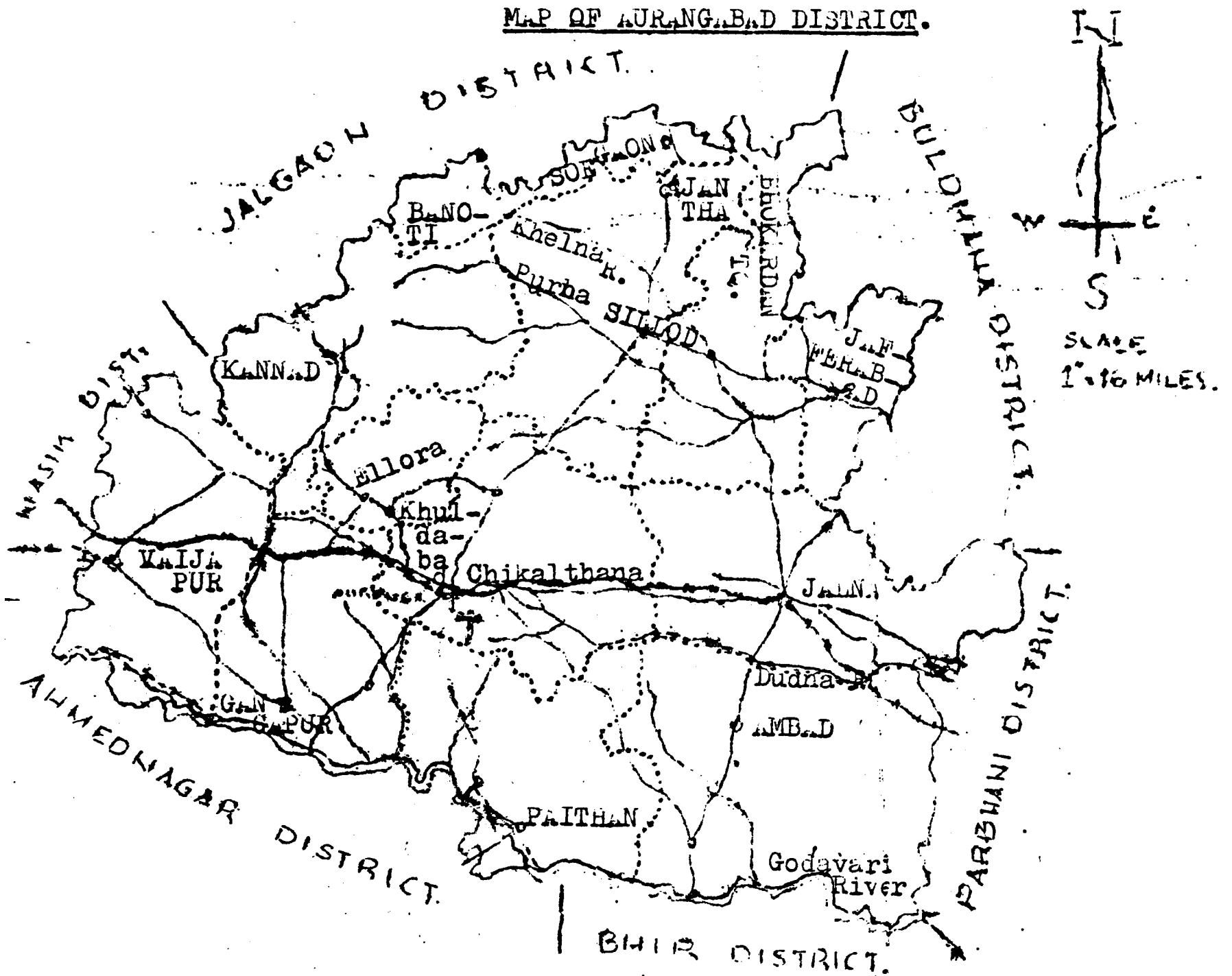

CHAPTER-I.

1.1. INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION.

The District of Aurangabad occupying an area of 16,713.2 Kms. is situated in upper Godavari basin and in the extreme north-west of Marathwada with a population of 15,82,341 according to 1961 Census. The district was known as Mulaka in different Vedic Epic and Puranic ages. The Royal edicts of Ashoka also refer indirectly to a city in Marathwada petenikas i.e. the people of Paithan. The articulate history of the Deccan begins with Satavahana power which in 2nd Century B.C. saw the emergence of the Marathwada as a seat of mighty empire of the Satavahanas with their capital at Pratishthana (Paithan).

The district of Aurangabad has a long chequered and hoary past. In addition to its legendary background it was ruled by Kolarians, Satavahanas, the Parthians of Gujarat, the Chalukyas, the Rashtrakutas and the Yadavas. It was under the strain of Muslim invasion and between 1313 and 1347 it was a part and parcel of Delhi sultanate under Mohammed Tughlaq. Subsequently it formed parts of the Bahamani Kingdom and Nizam Shahi Kingdom of Ahmednagar. From 1724 to 1956 it formed part of old Hyderabad State and since 1956 it is included in Maharashtra.

Amongst the notable Hindu writers of the District mentioned may be made of Salivahana, Mukund Raja, Dnanoba, Hemad Pant Atmanayaka, Janardhan Pant, Ekanath, Ramadas Sarni, Mukteshwar, Amritrao and Bahipati.

Aurangabad which was a great city in the past was founded on the site of Village Khirki by Malik Ambar, the Prime Minister of Murtaza Nizam Shah who was an Abyssinian foreigner.

The first Mughal emperor lies buried in Kabul a foreign land, the second in Delhi, the third in Sikandra, the fourth in Lahore, the fifth in Taj at Agra and the last lies stratified in this soil. After

Zilla Parishad.

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and Government affairs a Zilla Parishad and (12) Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively. The Municipal towns are however, not covered by them including the area of Aurangabad cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.7 percent of the area and 85.56 percent of the total population of the district.

The number of Villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti alongwith the number of councillors and co-opted members are shown in Table No. 1.2 .

During a visit to Aurangabad in 1913, Forter entered the following remark in his diary.

" Here endeth India " as he found the journey between Samarkand to Aurangabad a long and trying one.

The district forms 5.5% of the total area of the state and 3.87% of the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north-west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at banks of the Godavari. In general the district slopes down towards the south and south-east. The district lies between the parallels of 19° 17' 30" and 20° 40' 10" north latitude and between 74° 40' and 76° 40' east longitude.

1.2 Boundaries.

It is bounded on the north by Jalgaon district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts, and on the south by Bhir district, and a portion of Ahmednagar district, and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from the north to the south is about 161 Kms. and from east to west is about 201 Kms.

1.3 Administrative Set-Up.

Aurangabad district is divided into three sub-divisions which are further sub divided in to talukas and mahals as given in table No. 1.1.

During the period 1901 to 1941 the district or its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950 and the new mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad are created. Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 from Kamad taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1.11.1953 the district was transferred from the erst-while Hyderabad state alongwith the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra.

1.5 Topography.

In general the district slopes down towards south and south-east. The general elevation above sea level varies from 2000 to 2200 feet on the north and 1700 to 1900 feet towards the south.

1.6 Hills & River System Soils:-

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valey of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat are a continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidharbha. There are important and noted hills projections like Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotana. All these hills in the district have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. The hills of the district comprise Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kunkura, Sureanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghat and Aurangabad hills. Their average height, ^{is} about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in places they also reach a height of about 3,000 feet. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is the Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 127 miles separating Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir districts and its tributaries are

The Subject Committees are presided over by the Vice President and four by two Chairmen elected by the Zilla Parishad to preside over two specified Subject Committees each. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary of the Standing Committees while the District Heads of Departments work as Secretaries to the Subject Committees concerned. The co-ordination between the sub-committees is achieved through Standing Committee which includes the Chairman of all the Subject Committees. The Panchayat Samities consist of all the councillors who are elected from the electoral divisions including the Block co-opted councillors and associated members. It is presided over by the Chairman who is elected by the Panchayat Samiti from amongst its members. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

The Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad and the Block - Development Officer look after the development work in their jurisdictions.

1.4 Area.

The district of Aurangabad covers an area of 16,353 Sq.Kms. according to the figures supplied by the Surveyor General of India and 16,713 Sq. Kms. according to figures supplied by State Land Records and Survey Department. The rural area of district covers 16,447.9 Sq. Kms. as per figures of State Land Records and Survey Departments. The urban area of the District covers 270.9 Sq.Kms. Rural area forms 98.4% and urban area in the district accounts for 1.6% of its total area.

The winter Season is comparatively dry and starts from November and ends February, January ~~is~~ the coldest month of the year. The mean maximum temperature in the month of May rises even as high as 41° c. Occasionally hot dry winds prevail in April and May. During Summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. Thus the climate of Aurangabad is pleasant, charming and healthy.

(ii) Temperature.

At Aurangabad centre the mean maximum temperature was highest in April (38.9° c.) in the year 1966. The same was highest in the month of May (40.7° c.) in the year 1967. The Chikalthana centre has indicated the highest temperature in the month of April (38.6° c.) for the year 1966 and in May (40.3° c.) for the year 1967. As regards mean minimum temperature in the month of January was the coolest at Chikalthana Centre in 1966 and at Aurangabad Centre in December 1966 whereas the mean minimum temperature was the coolest, in January 1967 at both the centres.

The table No. 1.3 indicates the average temperature in three seasons of the year 1966 and 1967 for both the centres of Chikalthana and Aurangabad.

Shivna rising in the Kannad hills, the Dhenda rising near Daultabad, Dudhana flowing from the hills east of Aurangabad Kham which rises near Khulda- bad and passess through the heart of Aurangabad town and Dheku which passess through Vaijapur taluka. The Virbhadra flows through Paithan taluka and the Gahati passess through Ambad taluka. The river Purna which is the biggest tributary of the Godavari rises from the Kannad hills and flows through the northern talukas of the district. The Jui passess through Ehokardan taluka. The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga, Virbudra, Kasner, Nanni, Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala, Hewra, Arnavati & Gulduth.

The prevailing soil of Aurangabad district is black cotton soil of " Regur " formed by the weltering of the Trap rock. The geological formations of the district are 1. Middlea traps of Deccan Teritary. 2. The older Alluvial deposits of the Godavari and 3. The modern alluvial deposits of the Godavari and the other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes ^{sticky} ~~stiff~~; on weltering by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture and depth. In the hilly tracks in the north it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godavari Valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

1.7 (1) Climate.

The Climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided in to three short seasons a moderatly warm wet season from June to September, a cool dry season from October to February and a dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below 17° and normally ranges between 21° c. to 36° c.

From the table above it is evident that during 1966 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Kannad Soegaon, Khuldabad, Aurangabad and Jalna. It ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Sillod, Jafferabad, Gangapur and Paithan whereas it was below 650 millimetres in Bhokardan, Vaijapur and Ambad. In the year 1967 three talukas viz. Bhokardan, Jafferabad and Vaijapur had rainfall below 650 millimetres. Among all talukas Vaijapur had the lowest rainfall of 493.0 Mms. and Paithan had a highest rainfall of 936.7 Mms. in 1967 in the district.

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas which ^{are} likely to be affected by scarcity conditions as follows:-

<u>A r e a.</u>	<u>Estimated frequency.</u>
1. Vaijapur Taluka.	Once in ten years.
2. Gangapur Taluka.	Once in ten years.

Thus the south western Region of the district generally recording poor rainfall is more susceptible to crop failures due to inadequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes to scarcity conditions.

CHAPTER - II.

Explanatory note on scope and limitations of Statistics presented in Statistical Abstract.

--:000:-

Purpose:-

In this Abstract exhaustive statistics about important Socio-Economic indicators of the economy have been presented. Statistical information on as many topics as possible has been furnished so as to make it useful as a reference book. The talukawise figures will enable reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

District at a glance:-

In this table salient features and district indicators under various heads like population, agriculture etc., are presented.

The scope and limitations of the information in this Abstract is discussed in the following paragraphs.

I) Climate and Rainfall:-

The monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at selected centres in the district, during 1966 and 1967 is given in table No.1. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56. The table No. 2 gives monthly maximum, minimum and average temperatures at two selected centres in the district.

II) Area and Population:-

The data of 1951 population Census and 1961 population Census are presented in table 3 to 5. The district Census Hand Book, 1961 of Aurangabad district has been used for preparing these tables.

The table No. 3 gives talukawise rural and urban population according to 1961 Census and variations with 1951 Census. The table No. 4. shows talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1961 Census. The table No. 6 presents talukawise figures of

number of workers according to livelihood classes. The distribution of population according to age group, mother tongue and religion is given in table No. 7.

The table No. 8 gives information regarding population of schedule Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the District at the time of 1961 Census.

III) Agriculture:-

The information regarding agriculture is furnished in table Nos. 9 to 19. The table No. 9 gives information about land utilisation in the district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The area under different crops in each taluka of the district for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 is given in table No. 10. The yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops in the district is furnished in table No. 11. The data regarding the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district is supplied in table No. 12. The area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district is given in the table No. 13. The information regarding No. of irrigation wells and Minor irrigation works and Major and medium projects is furnished in table No. 14, 15 and 16 respectively. CHAPTER - III.

This chapter deals with important selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important selected sectors of economy.

INDICATOR NO. 3.

Percentage of Gross sown area to net sown area for the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. The double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. It is observed in table No. 10 of the Abstract that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area slightly decreased from 105.89 in the year 1965-66 to 105.50 in 1966-67.

It is observed that during the year 1966-67, percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was highest in Kannad taluka, being - 107.95 while the minimum was found in Jafferabad taluka. Thus the range of variation comes to 101.45 to 107.95.

The comparison of data in 1966-67 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there was decrease of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of Sillod, Soegaon, Jafferabad and Gangapur talukas while in the case of remaining talukas it had increased.

INDICATOR NO. 2.

Productivity of Important Crops.

In this indicator productivity of important crops in Aurangabad District during the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67 has been discussed. There is a separate table in the abstract part denoting, the yield rates of different crops per hectare. In the following table yield rates of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67 have been indicated.

The year 1965-66 was noted as a year of famine and scarcity and hence as compared to year 1965-66 increase was observed during the year 1966-67 in yield rates of all crops except rice, chillies and Sugarcane. This increase was not worthy in case of kharif and rabi jowar. In the case of chillies and sugarcane slight decrease was observed while this decrease was considerable in case of rice. The comparison of yield rates during 1966-67 with that during 1961-62 reveals an increase in yield rates only in case of Rabi Jowar, Gram Chillies and Sugarcane.

INDICATOR NO. 3.

Gross value of Agricultural Production.

In this indicator efforts are made to discuss the gross value of important agricultural products in the Aurangabad district. The gross value of particular commodity has been arrived at by multiplying total outturn by the prices prevailing during the harvest season of the commodity.

In the table below gross value of important agricultural commodities for the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1966-67 is given in crores of rupees.

It is to be seen from the table that as compared to gross value of agricultural products during 1965-66, gross value of corresponding commodities in 1966-67 recorded an all round increase except that of rice. However this increase was more due to increase in production rather than in prices. Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1966-67 reveals that except in case of rice and jowar increase is observed in all products but this increase was more due to increase in prices and less due to increase in production.

Percentage of Irrigated Area.

This indicator denotes the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of irrigated area increased in all the talukas except Kannad, Khuldabad,

~~Paithan~~ ~~Ambad~~ in the year 1966-67, as compared to the same in 1961-62. The percentage in taluka Kannad had decreased due to increase in the net area sown. The area irrigated by wells had decreased in Khuldabad, Paithan and Ambad resulting into the decrease in percentage of net area irrigated.

However, as compared to the net irrigated area during 1961-62 the percentage of net irrigated area increased in all the talukas except Aurangabad during the year 1966-67.

It is observed that from the above table that the area under cereals and pulses increased during the year 1966-67 as compared to the same during the year 1965-66.

INDICATOR NO. 6.

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of Agricultural Production .

This indicator furnishes the increase in agricultural credit , outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of co-operative societies provide all type of facilities needed by agriculturist to improve their financial condition and production. During the year 1966-67 there were 1,175 agricultural credit societies in the district, whereas the same decreased by 4 in succeeding year but the membership increased from 1,13,073 to 1,20,247.

It may be observed that the amount of advances during the year 1967-68 increased considerably as compared to the figure of 1961-62 in the district. The corresponding percentage increase is also noticed in case of outstanding, dues during the year 1967-68 in comparison to 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 7.

Agricultural Wage Rates.

This indicator deals with the agricultural wage rates of three selected centres in Aurangabad district during the year 1966 and 1967.

From table No. 17 of the Abstract it is observed that average wage rates of carpenter of Ajantha centre of Sillod taluka were highest i.e. Rs. 5-00 and Rs. 4-00 in the year 1966 and 1967 respectively as compared to the other 2 centres, Bidkin and Mahalgaon. The average rates of Black-smith in Ajantha in the year 1966 were highest as compared to the remaining two centres.

The average wage rates of unskilled male field labourer at Ajantha, Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres in the district were Rs. 0.88, Rs. 2.15 and Rs. 2.25 respectively in the year 1966. As such the average wage rates in Mahalgaon centre was highest as compared to the remaining two centres. During the year 1967 the average rates of the same centres were Rs. 1.50, 2.60 and 2.19 respectively.

INDICATOR NO. 8.

Livestock per hectare of land.

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in A-urangabad district as per 1961 census and 1966 Census.

In an agricultural country like India the importance of working Cattle can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an important bearing on the total output of agricultural production. As agriculture is a non-mechanised industry in India the cattle supply is the most important motive power for almost all agricultural operations, such as ploughing, lifting of water and transport of produce to the market.

The number of working bullocks in the district rose from 3.80 lakhs in 1961 to 3.85 lakhs in 1966 Census. The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1966 Census comes to 7.16 hectares per pair of working bullocks. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is found to be highest in Ambad taluka whereas the lowest is in Paithan taluka.

The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is varying between 5.40 and 9.61 hectares. As against total cultivable area 13.80 lakhs hectares the total bovine and ovine population in 1966 was 12.77 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to 92.

INDICATOR NO. 9.

Poultry as compared to Population.

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad district.

During Third Plan period special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry breeding and supply of improved poultry and loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the Census of 1966 total number of poultry in Aurangabad district was 2.01 lakhs as against 2.23 lakhs, during year 1961. This indicates a decrease of 0.22 lakhs over the period 1961.

It may be observed from the above that the ratio of poultry to the population as per 1966 Census was highest in Soegaon taluka while the same was lowest in Ambad taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 213 while the minimum was 95 only.

This indicator denotes the per capita consumption of electricity in Aurangabad district during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68.

The total electricity consumption during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68 was 136.51 and 173.33 lakhs of K.W.H. respectively. As such the percentage increase of consumption of electricity was 26.97 lakhs K.W.H. in the year 1967-68 over 1966-67. The per capita consumption of electricity in the district during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68 works out to 8.90 K.W.H. and 11.31 K.W.H. respectively.

The table No. 23 of the Abstract furnishes the information regarding candidates enrolled and vacancies notified during 1966-67 and 1967-68 and it is observed that continuous increase in un-employment inspite of creation of employment opportunities has been the burning problem to be solved. But according to the statistics maintained in Employment Exchange, the number of candidates enrolled decreased in the year 1967-68 over 1966-67 with corresponding decrease in the vacancies notified.

The number of primary schools in Aurangabad district rose from 1,303 in 1960-61 to 1,969 in the year 1967-68 and the number of pupils also increased by 73.60 % in the year 1967-63 over 1960-61.

The number of Secondary institutions in the district increased from 71 in 1960-61 to 152 in the year 1967-68 and the number of students attending these institution also increased tremendously by 165.51 per cent in the year 1967-63 as compared to 1960-61.

As regards higher education, the number of institution almost remained the same but the pupils increased by 86.75 percent in the year 1967-63 in comparison to the same during 1960-61.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of Industry and agriculture. In the year 1960-61 there were 8 scheduled Banks in the district. At the end of March, 67 there were 16 scheduled Banks and the number was constant in the succeeding year. As such no new office was opened in the year 1967-68.

The District Central Co-operative Bank plays the important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 46 branches of co-operative bank in the district as at the end of March, 1968, while there were only 20 branches at the end of March, 1961. As such, during the period of 7 years 26 new branches were opened.

The district population as per 1961 Census was 15,32,341 and the number of branches of the Bank was 62. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 24,715.

INDICATOR NO. 16.

P r i c e s .

The trends in prices prevailing at district Head Quarters, Aurangabad during the year 1967-68 have been discussed in this indicator.

The table below depicts the retail prices of important commodities prevailing at district head quarter during the first week of -- November, 1962, November 1966 and November 1967.

It is observed from this table that the rise in the prices was maximum in November, 1967 and increasing trends were at its peak. The rise in prices was observed in all the articles of consumption except Sweet Oil, Mutton and Vanaspati. There was slight decrease in the prices of Vanaspati and sweet Oil.

As compared to food articles, prices of clothing group have not shown considerable increase. The prices prevailing at District Headquarter during first week of November 1962 and 1966 and 1967 have shown in table below.

It is to be noted from this table that prices during 1962, 1966 and 1967 cannot be compared mainly because changes in varieties. The up and downs in prices is mainly due to changes in varieties.

PLANNING PART-I (EXPENDITURE.)

Each plan has had a distinctive objective. While the First Plan emphasised " self sufficiency in food grains ", the Second Plan aimed at " Socialistic Pattern" the Third sought to create a "Self-generating economy " and the Fourth Plan has as its goal " Self - reliance in economy ".

As the IVth Five Year Plan was yet to be formulated, Annual Plans were implemented since 1966-67. The Annual Plan for the year 1967-68, constituted the second Annual Plan in the district for which the total budgetary provision was made to the tune of Rs. 232.53 Lakhs. The total expenditure in the annual plan period amounted to Rs.202.75 Lakhs, the percentage to the total budget provision being 87.19.

The headwise expenditure in the Annual Plan 1967-68 in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the total expenditure under different heads of development, incurred during the year 1967-63, constituted 37.19 percent to the budget provision. The headwise expenditure given in the above table denotes that the Agricultural Programmes consumed the largest share of 50.76% of the total expenditure. In the order of priority, the Agricultural Programme were followed by the Social Services which shared 24.36 percent of the total expenditure. The Expenditure incurred on Co-operation and Community Development was only, 10.13 percent of the total expenditure. The expenditure on Transport & Communications was 13.32 percent of the total expenditure. The percentage of expenditure on Industries was very low that is, only 0.43 percent to total expenditure.

I AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES.

The Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority, and the percent of expenditure incurred was the highest among the different heads of development. The sub-headwise expenditure incurred under Agricultural Programmes during the Annual Plan of 1967-63 in the district is given in the following Table.

It is seen that among the sub-heads of development, soil Conservation accounted for the highest expenditure denoting 51.32 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes. Next in order of priority minor irrigation consumed the major portion of expenditure amounting to 39.77 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes. The expenditure under sub-heads, Agricultural Production constituted only 3.95 percent of the total expenditure.

The expenditure under sub-heads Animal Husbandry and Dairy Development was very low, that is, 0.43 percent and 0.53 percent respectively. While the expenditure under sub-head forest accounted for 3.16 percent the expenditure under Fisheries and Warehousing and Marketing recorded only 0.11 percent and 0.63 percent respectively to the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes.

II CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

Out of total expenditure of Rs. 20.54 lakhs for co-operation and Community Development, the expenditure incurred by Co-operation amount to Rs. 6.15 lakhs, while the expenditure booked on Community Development was to the extent of Rs. 14.33 lakhs.

III) The percentage of expenditure on Small Scale Industries was very low, that is, only 0.43 percent of the total expenditure, which mainly constituted assistance to Industrial Co-operatives and Federations for the development of handlooms.

IV) TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION.

The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs. 28.03 Lakhs exceeding the budget provision of Rs. 27.56 lakhs.

V) SOCIAL SERVICES.

Next to the Agricultural Programmes, Social Services received the largest share of budget provision for 1967-68, as shown in Table No. 1. The expenditure incurred under Social Services constituted

24.36 percent of the total expenditure during 1967-68. The sub-head wise expenditure under Social Services during the Annual Plan of 1967-68, in the district, is given in the following table.

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under General Education was the highest, that is, 34.71 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services, followed by Public Health and Water Supply and Drainage, that is, 30.84 percent and 24.36 percent respectively. The expenditure incurred under Housing was 6.03 percent. Labour & Labour Welfare consumed 1.65 percent. The expenditure incurred on welfare of backward classes was the least, that is, 0.22 percent. Social Welfare accounted for only 0.44 percent of the total expenditure under Social Services.

PLANNING PART - II

(PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS)

The main object of planning in the process of economic development is to arrange available resources in such a manner as to achieve pre-determined targets in the prescribed time limit. The physical achievements of various developmental schemes during the Annual Plan of 1967-68, in the district are discussed in the following paragraphs.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES:

As already discussed elsewhere, Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority in the Annual Plan of 1967-68. The activities under the Agricultural Programmes are discussed under the different sub-heads as below.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION:

Under the sub-head Agricultural Production schemes directly relating to intensive cultivation of food crops were included and 1.73 lakhs of acres were brought under intensive cultivation. Under the scheme of ' Cotton development ' 6.30 quintal of improved seeds were distributed. Under the scheme " Manures and Fertilizers " 7502 tons of manures and fertilisers were distributed. Under the Plant protection scheme, 21392 acres of crops were dusted. Under the Horticultural development scheme, 430 acres were brought under plantation of fruit trees and 116 acres under rejuvenation and 225 trees were renovated during the Annual Plan period.

SOIL CONSERVATION:

Under the scheme of Contour Bunding 1.06 lakhs of acres were bunded against the target of 1.17 lakhs of acres during 1967-68.

MINOR IRRIGATION:

Under this programme, 602 new wells were constructed and 555 pump-sets were distributed. Boring was done in 13 wells and

under Aircompressing drilling and blasting 3720 shot holes were effected. Under Minor Irrigation, work in 3 Bandharas was nearing completion, under the local sector schemes and work in 3 Bandharas was in progress under State sector schemes. Under the scheme of prefabricated bandharas, 57 bandharas were completed.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Minor repairs were done in 4 dispensaries and 2 Aid-Centres were continued during the year 1967-68. No new Cattle breeding Centre was started. However, 10 premium bulls were located in the existing breeding centre. Under the poultry development scheme, loans were granted to 17 persons for starting poultry business by landless labourers.

DAIRY DEVELOPMENT:

Under the Town Milk Supply Scheme, 2163 litres of milk was handled per day and 4 units were assisted under the scheme of 'Assistance to Milk Societies,' during 1967-68.

F O R E S T S.

The scheme under Farm Forestry was not implemented during 1967-68. Under the scheme Extension of Forestry, plantation including pre-monsoon was done on 117 Kms. The central nurseries already established upto the year 1966-67, were maintained. Plantation of fuel wood and Bamboo was done over an area of 60 hectares and 135 hectares respectively. The plantation including pre-monsoon work in connection with Afforestation for Soil Conservation was effected in an area of 244 hectares. Under the development of fodder resources 40 hectares of land was covered as a pre-monsoon work.

F I S H E R I E S:

Under Fish farming in impounded water scheme 1.90 lakhs of fish were stocked in tanks and 0.34 lakhs Kg. fish was netted out. For the supply of fishery requisites 64 Kg nylon twine was supplied to fisherman.

WAREHOUSING AND MARKETING:

Under the scheme of Development of Agricultural Marketing one new market was regulated and under the development of grading scheme 5 societies were assisted.

CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Co-operation:

Under the scheme of Strengthening of the Co-operatives structure from district level & below, membership was increased by 5997. Towards the development of co-operative marketing, subsidies were granted to 11 godowns to increase storage capacity. For the development of Co-operative farming, loans to the extent of Rs. 0.20 lakhs were advanced. Under Consumer Co-operative Stores one store was assisted.

Community Development:

The whole district was already covered by 17 Community Development Blocks comprising 20½ C.P.A. pattern by the end of Third Plan period. The same Blocks were continued during the Annual Plan periods of 1966-67 and 1967-68. The schemes under Rural Work Programme implemented in the 5 Blocks of Kannad, Sillod, Vaijapur, Jafferabad and Ambad were continued during 1967-68. The scheme under Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in only Jalna Block during 1967-68.

I N D U S T R I E S .

Under the scheme of Development of Small Scale Industries (Handloom), two new Sales Depots were opened during 1967-68. Towards Financial Assistance to Industrial Co-operatives and Federations 13 societies were assisted during the annual plan period of 1967-68.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION:

The work of construction of new roads was completed to the extent of 19 kilometres in the State sector and the work of

consolidation was completed to the extent of 27.50 Kms. in the local sector. While 9 C.D. works were completed in the State sector, 59 C.D. works were completed in the local sector. Further, 3 medium works of bridges were completed in the local sector. Under the scheme of Roads under Public participation earth work was completed to the extent of 50 Kms., metal work to the extent of 3.37 Kms., and consolidation work to the extent of 5.37 Kms., during 1967-68. The work of Gondagaon, Banoti road was in progress, under the scheme of Roads in inaccessible and hilly areas.

S O C I A L S E R V I C E S .

GENERAL EDUCATION.

Under the programme of expansion of primary education, 259 teachers were appointed and as many as 575 teachers were imparted basic training during 1967-68. 7 full fledged primary schools were provided with science equipments. Towards the development of Non-government schools, 25 secondary schools were started. Under the scheme of opening of additional classes/sections in Government Secondary Schools 37 teachers were appointed. Merit scholarships to 230 students in secondary schools were awarded. Educational concessions were given to 322 students of economically backward classes, during 1967-68.

PUBLIC HEALTH:

Consumption work of the two primary health centres was completed. Under the family Planning scheme as many as 12002 vesectomy operations were done during 1967-68.

WATER SUPPLY AND DRAINAGE:

Under the rural water supply scheme, 127 drinking water wells were constructed during 1967-68.

H O U S I N G .

Under the Village housing project, scheme was implemented in 17 villages.

WELFARE OF BACKWARD CLASSES.

Grant of scholarships, tuition fees and examination fees were given to 19 pupils. Grants were awarded to 35 inmates of B.C. hostels of scheduled castes. 25 implements were distributed under the scheme of Propagation of improved agricultural implements among scheduled tribes and scheduled castes. Financial assistance was given to 3 industrial societies of backward classes.

SOCIAL WELFARE:

Under the scheme of welfare Extension Projects 20 balwadies, 10 literacy centres, 3 maternity centres and 11 arts and crafts classes were started.

LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE:

Under the Technical and Vocational training scheme 10 members of staff were appointed and 76 trainees were trained.

INFORMATION AND PUELCITY:

Under Rural Broadcasting scheme 139 radio sets were installed in different villages during 1967-68.
