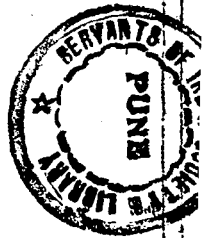
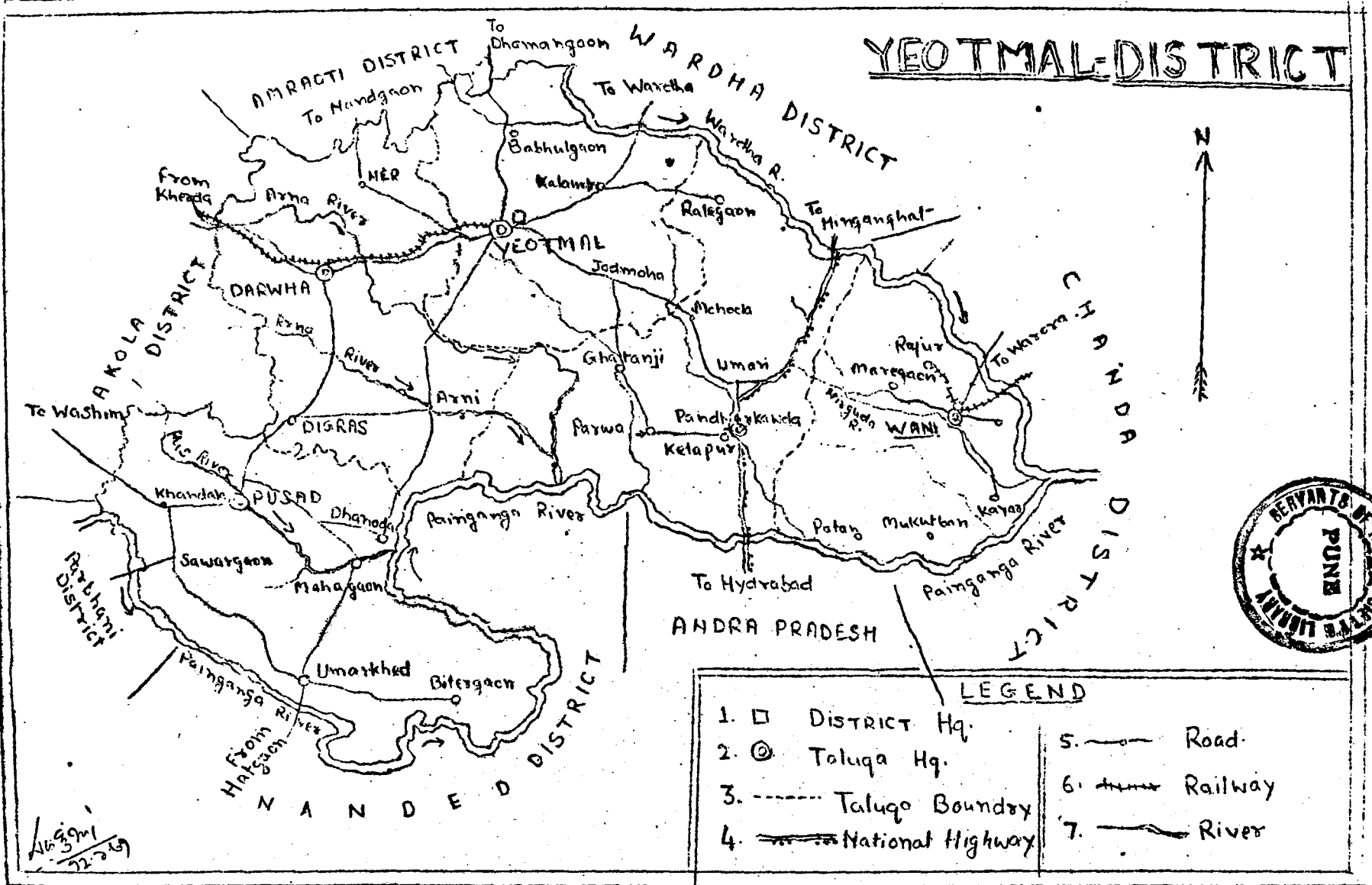

CHAPTER- I

I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Location

Yeotmal district is one of the four southern districts of Vidarbha. It lies between 19° 36' and 20° 42' North Latitude and 77° 18' and 79° 9' East longitudes. Most of the district comprises Balaghats i.e. the southern plateau of Berar.

1.2 Boundaries

It is bounded by Amraoti district in the North, Akola and Parbhani districts in the west, Nanded district and Andhra Pradesh in the south and Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the East. The district is quite extensive in size and ranks 2nd in Nagpur region and 8th in Maharashtra in terms of area. It has a natural boundary as the Wardha river in the north east separates it from the districts of Wardha and Chandrapur and by the Painganga in the North which separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

1.3 Administrative set up

The district is divided into 5 tahsils for administrative purpose at present. The collector is in-charge of the district. He is responsible for general administration, Law and order, Land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and four Deputy Collectors at head-quarters and five Sub-Divisional Officers of Deputy Collector's grade posted at five Sub-Divisions. There is one

revenue Sub-division for each tahsil. The Tahsildar assisted by few Naib-Tahsildars is in-charge of the Tahsil and assisted the Sub-Divisional Officer in his duties.

The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive and the District and sessions Judge is the head of the judicial department in the district. However the Collector continues to be the District Magistrate but his powers are limited to law and order only. The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by one Civil Judge (Sr. Division) and five Civil Judges (Jr. Division) and first class Judicial Magistrate whose head quarters are at tahsil places. The police force in the district functions under District Superintendent of Police. In addition to these there are various District heads of offices under various departments.

Local Bodies, Panchayat Samitis and Zilla Parishad.

In order to promote democratic decentralisation and secure greater participations of the people in the developmental activities in the district, the Zilla Parishad and 14 Panchayat Samitis have been formed in the district on 1st May, 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad is the entire rural area of the district, excluding municipal jurisdictions for promoting developmental activities. There are 8 Nagar Parishads (municipalities) to look after the development of urban areas. The area of Panchayat Samiti is the area of the corresponding to Community Development block.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by its President, assisted by Vice President both of whom are elected from the elected Councillors. An officer in the Senior I.A.S. scale works as Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad comprises various departments and the heads of these departments at district level, are officers of class I or class II service under State Govt. The Deputy Chief Executive officer works as the Secretary of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee presided by the President and six Subject committees, viz finance works, agriculture, co-operation education and health. At block level, the Panchayat Samities have elected Chairmen and vice-Chairman. The Block Development Officer works as secretary to the Panchayat Samiti which do not have subject committees. There are 1,096 village Panchayats in the district. There are elected members from the villages or the group of villages. The Sarpanch is elected from these elected members who look after the developmental activities at his village level.

1.4 Area and Territorial changes

The area of the district is 13,517 sq.kms. (5219.0 Sq.miles) which is 14.5% of the total area of Nagpur Region and 4.4% of the total area of Maharashtra. Its maximum length from east to west is 192 kms. where as the maximum breadth from north to south is 160 kms.

Yeotmal district, which is one of the four districts of Berar was handed over by the Nizam to the

Government of India in 1853. Upto 1863 it was a part of the East Berar district. In 1864, new Wun (Wani) District was formed by separating Yeotmal, Darwaha, Kelapur and Wani, taluqs from East Berar district. In 1905 Pusad taluka from Basim district was transferred to this Wun district and new Yeotmal district was constituted. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1956 when the district was transferred to the then bilingual State from Madhya Pradesh due to States reorganisation. Now it is a part of Maharashtra State since 1st May 1960.

1.5 Topography

The district has an undulating topography. It is wholly covered by the Ajanta ranges broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by plains. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats, with an elevation of 1000' to 1500' above mean sea-level. Both the Wardha and the Painganga rivers and their tributaries provide strips of plains in many parts along their course. The width of these plains varies from 5 to 15 kms.

1.6 Hills, River system, soils etc.

The main system of hills is the Balaghats forming the Ajanta mountains. The whole district is occupied by small East West ranges of these mountains. The offshoots of Ajanta ranges are at places broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of the Wardha and the Painganga.

The main rivers of the district are the Wardha and the Painganga, both of which flow along north eastern and southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries which traverse the heart of the district. The bed of the Wardha is broad and deep but the banks are overflowed by floods many a times. The Wardha has two big tributaries viz. The Rembla and the Nirguda. The Rembla flows across the north of Yeotmal tahsil below the ghats. The entire course of the Nirguda is in Wani tahsil.

The Painganga has six important tributaries viz. the Pus, the Arunawati, the Adan, the Waghadi, the Khuni and the Vadarbha. The Pus flows through Pusad tahsil, the Arunawati and the Adan through Darda tahsil, the Waghadi through Yeotmal and Kelapur tahsils and the Vadarbha through Wani tahsil. All these rivers maintain flow for a greater part of the year. These rivers are flooded in rainy season but there is little water in them in summer.

The soil of the district as a whole is uniformly good in texture and varies from black to dark brown. They are slightly inferior in productive capacity to those of Akola and Amravati districts of Vidarbha.

Three defects are commonly seen in the soils of the district viz. (i) a mixture of chunkhadi (limestone) (ii) sloping surface and (iii) an excessive admixture of sand. However the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tract in the vallies to hilly hard parts on the plateau.

In Wani tahsil the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a redish colour.

In Kelapur tahsil and central and southern parts of Yeotmal tahsil and hilly parts of Pusad tahsil, the soils are of coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey.

In western parts of Yeotmal tahsil and middle part of Darwaha and Pusad tahsils rich fertile alluvial soils are found.

Minerals.

Coal and lime stones are the only important minerals found in the district. There is only one coal field near Pilsaon in Wani tahsil, extending over 12 square miles. The reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes. The limestones can be better utilised for production of cement and in near future a cement factory will come up in the district. A third mineral i.e. farashi stones are found in Kelapur tahsil of the district.

1.7 Climate, Temperature & Rainfall.

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. Generally there is a breeze in the summer season rendering it tolerable and pleasant. The temperature ranges from 15° C (59° F) in Winter to 41° C (105° F) in Summer.

The south west monsoon brings rain to Yeotmal district. The rainy season lasts from June to October. In the month of August the intensity of rain is highest. The rainfall varies from 912 m.ms. (36 inches) to 1125 m.ms. (45 inches) In the past few years the monsoon was very

irregular. It is also not uniform in the district. It increases from West to East. Wani in Eastern parts gets an average of about 1125 m.ms. of rains while Darwaha in Western parts gets 890 m.ms. of rains. The Central region covering Yeotmal tahsil gets an average of 1096 m.ms. of rains.

In the district there is no tract which can be regarded as a Chronic Scarcity area.

CHAPTER IIExplanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the
Statistical data presented in the Part II (Statistical
Abstract.)

I. Purpose: The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, the data for 1969-70 have been indicated with data for 1968-69 or even for earlier years. In the tables wherein data for 1968-69 and 1969-70 could not be presented, the same for the latest two years, for which they were available, have been shown. In case of population (1961), livestock (1966) and Census of Government employees (1966), however, the data for latest Census have been presented. All the data are collected from the State and Central Government offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance: This table presents a birds-eye-view of the Socio-Economic indicators of development in Yeotmal district and Nagpur division, under different heads, such as, areas, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, Plan and C.D. programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. Contents, Scope & Limitation: The statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scopes and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1. **Climate:**

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Yeotmal district.

The table no.1 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the years 1968 and 1969. The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as a "rainy day" if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 m.m. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. "Normal rainfall" is the average rainfall over a period ranging from five to eighty years.

The table no.2 gives monthwise "mean", "mean maximum" and "mean minimum" and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the years 1968 and 1969. The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature.

2. Area and population:

In all 6 tables i.e. tables Nos. 3 to 8 are included in this section. Data for 1961 Census are indicated in all the tables except table No.3 wherein data for both 1951 and 1961 Censuses are shown as reference period of the 1961 Census was sunrise of 1st March 1961.

The table No.3 indicates sexwise rural and urban population enumerated in 1951 and 1961 Censuses, along with variation in between the two Censuses. The population figures for 1951 Census shown in the table have been adjusted to cover the boundaries or areas of the district and talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 Census. According to 1961 Census, the term urban area as used in col. 3 of the table were defined as under-

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has-

1. A municipality, a Cantonment or Civil lines or
2. (i) A population of 5,000 or over and
(ii) Atleast $\frac{3}{4}$ or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

Table No.4 gives talukawise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, Wadies or Padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as

"Uninhabited" villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

The table No.6 gives number of workers and non-workers in each taluka of Yeotmal district according to 1961 Census, and they are classified according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is shown separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1961 Census. Instead, the population is classified into workers and non-workers. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and

(b) In the case of regular employment in any trade, a profession service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of enumerator's visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers, etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation. A person who had been offered work, but who had not actually joined has been classified as a non-worker.

The table No.7 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group, (B) Mother tongue and (C) Religion,

separately for Rural and Urban area and for the district as a whole. Here "Mothers tongue" is defined as a language spoken by the person's mother to the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the house. Dialects have been included in the main languages on the basis of Grierson's classification.

The table no.8 gives talukawise details of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole.

3. **Agriculture:**

In all 11 tables i.e. table Nos. 9 to 19 are included in this section.

The table no. 9 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable wastes, permanent pastures,

land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown. Current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown under 'Forests' are included all actually forest areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. 'Land put to non-agricultural uses' stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers, and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. 'Barren and uncultivable land' covers all barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as 'barren and uncultivable land', whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. 'Culturable waste' includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. 'Permanent pastures' and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head. 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown' are included all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use.

Land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under 'orchards' are classed under the category. 'Current fallows' comprise cropped area, which are kept fallow during the current year.

'Other fallow' land includes all land which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped area' represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.16 gives the information on Major and Medium Projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30th June, 1970. The cost of Medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 lakhs to Rs. 5 crores, whereas that of a Major irrigation project, it is Rs. 5 crores and above.

Table No.17 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1968 and 1969. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural centres viz. (1) Ner, (2) Kalamb and (3) Maregaon. Only one centre is selected from a taluka.

4. Animal Husbandry and Forest-

A-Animal Husbandry:

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 20 to 24 B are included in this section.

Table No. 20 gives talukawise number of various types of Livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock Census, 1966. The Census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in five years. During the Livestock Census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age-groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

B. Forest:

The table No. 24 (A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forests refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called 'leased forests'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such but in

Nagpur division, some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forest area shown in the table No.24(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No.9. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons-

(i) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forests, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural statistics.

(iii) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural statistics relate to the agricultural year.

5. Employment, Industry and Electricity:-

In all ten tables i.e. table Nos.25 to 34 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in Table Nos. 25, 26 and 27 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act, 1948.-

- (1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 (i)).
- (2) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2(ii), and
- (3) Those registered under Section 85 of the Act, under which

which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

The table no. 29 gives occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 according to Standard National Classification.

The table No. 31 present the results of the Census of Government employees as on 1-7-1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics & Statistics, Bombay. The data presented in these tables are restricted to the Class I, II, III and IV employees of the State Government and do not cover any other category such as work-charged personnel, Class IV employees paid from contingencies, daily rated workers, part-time workers or honorary workers. The distribution of employees according to specified basic pay/emoluments ranges is shown separately in respect of Class I, II, III and IV employees.

The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emolument ranges is shown in table No. 31.

6. Co-operation:

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 35 to 42 are included in this section.

The table No. 37 gives talukawise number of primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced and recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. 'Working capital' includes paid up capital, deposits

and borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstanding in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The table No. 42 gives talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during 1968-69 and 1969-70. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the State are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted a licence, and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and Public Health:-

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 43 to 46 are included in this section.

The table No. 43 given in this section indicates talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and Primary Health centres, doctors, nurses, vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated as well for the years 1968 and 1969. The table covers all the State and Central Government medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in the table.

The table No. 44 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district. Sexwise classification of births, deaths and infant deaths for 1966 is not available for each taluka and hence the total under each category is given in the table for that year.

8. Education:-

In all 8 tables i.e. table nos. 47 to 54 are included in this section.

The table No. 47 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1961 Population Census. As per 1961 Census. definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

The table No. 50 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'type' is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many Secondary Schools, which also impart education in primary courses. Nevertheless, the entire enrollment of students is included under 'Secondary' education. Primary institutions provided education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teachers the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach students for Standard VIII to X or XI/XII with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination, which leads to a degree examination.

The table No. 51 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as Scheduled castes, Scheduled tribes and other backward classes for the years 1968-69 & 1969-70. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships, etc.

The table No.54 gives number of villages without primary schools or schooling facilities according to population ranges at the end of the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Villages with schooling facilities include smaller villages (generally below population of 300 persons), which can not be given independent schools for economic reasons, and are, therefore, attended for school facilities to bigger villages or urban areas within 'walking distance' of one mile from them. The deserted villages as per 1961 Census are also included in the population range 0-199.

9. Transport and Communications:-

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos.55 to 62 are included in this section.

The table No.55 gives total railway length as at the end of 1968-69 and 1969-70 according to type of routes Broad gauge, Metre gauge and Narrow gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and not accurate.

The table No.58 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Amraoti Division. For this table, the S.T. Division comprises (1) Amraoti and (2) Veerwar District.

The table No.59 depicts the results of traffic census on important roads conducted in Building and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra. The data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and locations of count-post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10. Local Bodies:-

In all 4 tables i.e. tables Nos. 62 to 65 are included in this Section.

The Table No. 62 gives Abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities, for the financial years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The number of Village Panchayats includes number of independent Village Panchayats as well as group Village Panchayats.

The Table No. 64 is divided into two parts (A) and (B). Table No. 64 (A) gives the total receipts of Zilla Parishad, Yeotmal derived from self raised resources, Government grants, debt section and remittances. Table No. 64(B) gives the total expenditure incurred by Zilla Parishad. The expenditure is divided into two parts viz. (i) Revenue expenditure (ii) debt section and (iii) Remittances. Data for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 are shown in the table.

The table no. 65 gives income and expenditure figures of the Municipal Councils in the district separately and the district total for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

11. Plan and Community Development:

In all 5 tables i.e. tables Nos. 66 to 70 are included in this section.

12. Prices:-

Only 2 tables i.e. table Nos. 71 and 72 are included in this section.

The table No.71 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district headquarter Yeotmal. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the years 1968 & 1969 along with units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Officer every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Headquarter, the average price for individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

The table No.72 gives consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 commencing from April and also averages for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (new series) is 1960. The Index Numbers of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of construction of the index is given in the Appendix to the Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India revised series(1956)

issued by the office of the Economic Advisor to Government of India. The equivalent of old Index Numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as Multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous:-

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 73 to 84 are included in this section.

The table No.76 gives talukawise Cinema Statistics for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres and their seating capacity per show has been indicated in the table.

C H A P T E R- III

In this chapter, the pace of development of Yeotmal District in various sectors of its economy is reviewed by presenting tahsilwise sectorial trends, by spot lighting the development during 1960-61 and the year 1968-70 (1968-69 for agricultural activities) in the following indicators-

Indicator No.1

3.1 Percentage of gross sown area

The following table shows the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in 1960-61 and 1968-69.

It is seen from the above table that there was little increase in the percentage of gross cropped area as compared to net sown area during the span of eight years from 1960-61 to 1968-69 although there was sizeable increase in the double cropped area during these years. There was an increase of 22.75 % in the double cropped area, during 1968-69 as compared to 1960-61. The percentage of gross cropped area

to net cropped area was, however, not so marked as the percentage of double cropped area during this period was less than 1 %.

During 1968-69 the percentage of double cropped area to net sown area was highest in Pusad and lowest in Darwha tahsil. Well irrigation is the main source of irrigation and other irrigation facilities are very meagre in the district. The double cropped area will increase only when more and more irrigation facilities are made available.

Indicator No.2

Productivity of Important crops

3.2 The productivity of the crops is primarily dependent on the equitable distribution of rains as the irrigation facilities are too meagre in the district.

The following table shows the production of the different crops in 1960-61 and 1968-69.

It is observed that the production of the majority of the crops was less during 1968-69 as compared to the production in the year 1960-61. Only groundnut and sugarcane showed an increase in the production during 1968-69 as compared to 1960-61.

The increase is due to introduction of better farm practices such as improved seeds and fertilizers but the decrease in the production of the other crops is due to the failure of crops in comparison to 1960-61 crop position in the district.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage increase was highest in the case of sugarcane while the decrease was highest in the case of Bajara.

Indicator No.3

Gross value of Agricultural production

3.3 As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available; this indicator has not been worked out.

Indicator No.4

Percentage of Irrigated area

3.4 The following table shows the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown and the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area during 1960-61 and 1968-69.

Although there was an increase in the irrigated area it is very insignificant as compared to net sown area. Hardly 0.82 % of the net sown area at present gets the benefit of the irrigation facilities. In each tahsil except Yeotmal & Kelapur the irrigated area during 1968-69 has more than doubled in case of Darwaha and Pusad and nearly doubled in the case of Wani as compared to the corresponding area in 1960-61. The increase in the irrigated area is mainly due to the construction of irrigation wells and energizing of the pumps for irrigation purposes. In Pusad tahsil, the increase is remarkable followed by Darwaha which ranked 2nd in this regard, while Wani and Yeotmal tahsils ranked down below in 1968-69.

The area irrigated more than once had increased from 1.88 % to 14.57 % during the span of 8 years from 1960-61 to 1968-69. The increase in the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was highest in Pusad tahsil and lowest in Wani tahsil.

Indicator No.5

Changes in the crop pattern

3.5 The following tables show the changes in the area of food crops and non-food crops for 1960-61 and 1968-69 and adoption of irrigation for food crops and non-food crops for the above period:

It is observed that nearly 55% of the gross cropped area was under food crops during 1960-61 which went down to 52.63 % during 1968-69. There was a decline in area under food crops in every tahsil. Pused tahsil had the highest percentage (57.08) of gross cropped area under food crops in 1968-69. The lowest percentage of gross cropped area under food crops was in Darwaha tahsil (48.26) in that year. Generally in Yeotmal district cultivators prefer the cash crop of Cotton to jowar as it is the major cash crops of the district.

Out of the total irrigated area its utilisation for food crops and non-food crops is given below-

It is seen that during 1960-61 as high as 89.12% of the gross irrigated area was under food crops. It decreased to 84.54 % during 1968-69. Irrigated area under food crops is decreasing year after year as the agriculturists are growing more and more cash crops. During 1968-69 Darwaha tahsil had the highest percentage of irrigated area under non-food crops. During 1960-61 Kelapur tahsil had highest percentage

of area under non-food crops. But during 1968-69 it had highest percentage of area under food crops. During 1960-61 there was no irrigated area under non-food crops in Wani tahsil, but the position has changed and during 1968-69 there was 7.29 % of the gross irrigated area under non-food crops. There is significant increase in r this regard in Darwha, Pusad and Wani tahsils but Kolapur tahsil however showed a marked decrease in the irrigation of non-food crops.

Indicator No.6

Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues-

3.6 Agricultural finance through short term and long term loans is helping the green revolution in the country. In the district, the co-operative credit, especially primary agricultural credit societies are playing an important role in meeting the demand of the cultivators for agricultural finance at moderate cost.

The following table shows the number of primary agricultural credit societies, the amount of loans advanced and the loans outstanding in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

It will be seen from the above table that the number of primary agricultural credit societies 19 in 1969-70 has remained unchanged as compared with the corresponding number in 1960-61 with marginal changes in tahsil figures. There was an increase in the number of primary agricultural credit societies in Darwaha, Veetmal and Wani tahsils and decrease in their number in Pusad and Kelapur tahsils.

The total amount of loans advanced by the primary agricultural credit societies during 1969-70 showed an increase of 175.8 % over 1960-61. The highest increase is in case of Pusad tahsil (536 %) and the lowest increase is in Darwaha tahsil (86 %). The outstanding dues has amounted further and during 1969-70 the magnitude was to the tune of Rs.323 lakhs as against Rs. 6 lakhs during 1960-61. Darwaha tahsil had the maximum amount of overdues as compared to other tahsils. Wani tahsil had the lowest amount outstanding in 1969-70.

Indicator No.7

Agricultural wage rates:-

3.7 Agricultural wage rates were collected regularly at three centres in the district since 1963. The average sex-wise wage rates for three centres for 1963 and 1969 are shown below:

The average agricultural wage rates have increased from Rs. 1.71 during 1963 to Rs. 2.83 during 1969 for males and from Rs. 0.79 to Rs. 1.36 in case of females during the same period. This increase was of 65% in case of male wage rate and of 72% in case of females. Kalamb and Maregaon centres had higher wage rates for males than with those at Nor which had the highest wages for females.

The following table shows average centrewise wage rates for skilled labour such as carpenters, blacksmith, cobbler and herdsman.

It is seen that wage rates for skilled labour and other agricultural labour had considerably increased during the period from 1963 to 1969. In general variations in wage rates from one centre to other centre were not very large during the year 1969.

Indicator No.8Livestock population (Bovine and ovine) per
hectare of cultivable land.

3.8 Livestock (bovine and ovine) population plays an important part in agriculture in spite of the propagation and use of modern mechanisation and use of electric pumps. Although now chemical fertilizers are made available and farmers make use of it, cowdung manure still has its own importance in farming.

The following table shows tahsilwise livestock population (bovine and ovine) per hectare of cultivable land.

The livestock population per hectare of cultivable land has decreased from 1.12 in 1961 to 1.06 in 1966. The livestock population per hectare of cultivable land was highest in Wani tahsil and lowest in Kelapur tahsil in 1966.

During the 1961 census it was highest in Pusad tahsil but lowest again in Kelapur tahsil. The decrease in the livestock population is steep in Kelapur, Pusad and Yeotmal tahsils. On the other hand Wani tahsil showed a slight increase in the livestock population per hectare in 1966 as compared to 1961.

Poultry as compared to population.

3.9 The total poultry population in the district according to 1966 livestock census was 2,38,325 and it has decreased by about 49 % during 1966 over 1961. The following table gives tahsilwise poultry population per 100 persons (1961 population Census) in the district.

As per 1961 livestock census poultry per 100 persons in the district worked out to 41 which sharply decreased to 21 during 1966 livestock census. Amongst tahsils the poultry per 100 persons was highest in Wani tahsil while it was lowest in Pusad in 1961. The decrease in poultry was highest in Kolapur (58 %) while it is lowest in Darwaha and Yeotmal tahsils (43 %) during 1966 as compared to the corresponding figures in 1961.

According to 1961 livestock census it was estimated that the district had on an average 189.64 poultry birds as against 139.01 in Vidarbha and 137.40 in Maharashtra. Similarly the district had 1.75 % of improved fowls to total number of fowls as against 1.07 % in Vidarbha and 1.69 % in

Maharashtra. It was also estimated that the number of eggs produced in the district was 47 as against 61 in Vidarbha and 84 in Maharashtra.

3.10 Following table gives per capita consumption of electricity.

At the beginning of the third plan the per capita consumption of electricity was 5.68 kwh. There was a rapid development in rural electrification during the Third Five Year Plan period and subsequent Annual Plans and the per capita consumption increased to 16.70 kwh. at the end of 1969-70. It has nearly tripled during these 9 years.

As stated earlier the progress of rural electrification was very rapid in the district during these 9 years. At the end of Second Five Year Plan only 1.56 % of the villages were electrified. But during Third Five Year Plan considerable progress had been made in rural electrification work and 9.82 % of the villages were electrified upto the end of Third Five Year Plan. At the end of the year 1969-70 in all 20.95 % of the villages electrified. This gave an impetus to the agricultural production in the district as the villages were electrified mainly for energizing pumps. Darwaha tahsil topped the list of villages electrified with 31.88 % of its villages electrified. But Wani tahsil had only 5.37 % of the villages electrified. The rate of progress is very rapid all over the district except in Wani tahsil.

Indicator No. 11

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in employment exchanges and vacancies notified.

It is observed that the registration of candidates had decreased during 1969-70 by 21 % as compared to 1960-61 along with the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchange. During 1969-70 only 479 vacancies were

notified as against 926 vacancies in 1960-61 showing a decrease of 48 %. This however, showed that there was very little generation of employment potential in the district.

The table below gives the comparative picture of the percentage of vacancies notified and placement of candidates through the Employment Exchange as compared to total registration.

It is observed that the percentage of the vacancies notified to registration had gone down from 15 during 1960-61 to 9.8 during 1969-70. Placements were only 9 % and 5.9 % of the registration during 1960-61 and 1969-70 respectively. From the percentage of placements to the vacancies notified it is observed that all the vacancies created notified are not filled in by the candidates registered in the employment exchange. During the year 1960-61 only 59 % of the vacancies notified were filled in by the candidates registered with the Employment Exchange. However, the position had improved a little and during 1969-70 the placements are 60% of the vacancies notified.

Indicator No.12

Increase in the number of Indoor and outdoor patients treated per lakh of population.

3.12 The Medical facilities available in the district are inadequate as compared to the extensive size of the district.

The following table gives the number of hospitals and dispensaries and the number of beds in them per lakh of population.

It will be seen that the medical facilities such as hospitals and dispensaries had increased by 50 % during the span of nine years (i.e. between 1961 and 1969). The highest increase is observed in Wani tahsil where the facilities have doubled during 1969 (100% increase) as compared to 1961. The lowest increase of 20 % is seen in Pusad tahsil during the same period.

As the facilities of hospitals and dispensaries increased, the number of beds in these hospitals had also increased proportionately except for Wani tahsil which showed a decrease of 19 % during 1969 as compared to 1961. The highest increase is seen in case of Veotmal tahsil where the district hospital, T.R. hospital, Women hospital and Police hospital are available and the number of beds are also increased in Women's hospital and District hospital.

The following table shows the number of patients treated per lakh of population in hospitals in the district during 1961 and 1969.

It is observed that at the end of 1961 in all 53,416 outdoor and 1,084 indoor patients were treated per lakh of population in the district. As the medical facilities are increasing people are taking advantage of these facilities and in 1969 there was an increase of 68 % in indoor patients treated over 1961 and 32 % in case of outdoor patients during the same period. The highest increase in this regard in 1969 as compared to 1961 observed in Kelapur tahsil for indoor as well as outdoor patients treated, while Darwha tahsil showed a decrease of 61 % in case of indoor patients treated because of the conversion of Hospital at Darwha into a Primary Health Centre at Talegaon. Wani tahsil showed a decrease of 15 % in case of outdoor patients treated in 1969 over 1961.

Indicator No. 13Increase in the number of students in different categories.

3.13 According to 1961 census 23.48 % (35.34 % males and 11.27 % females) of the population of this district was literate as against 27.88 % of Vidarbha Division and 29.82 % in Maharashtra. Thus the district is backward in educational facilities and educational facilities were also not uniformly distributed in the district.

The following table gives the number of boys and girls attending primary, secondary and higher education in the district.

The growth of primary education in the district during the third Five Year Plan was noteworthy. There were 83 thousand students attending 1,165 primary schools during 1960-61. Their number increased by 59% and there were nearly 132 thousand students attending 1,651 primary schools at the end of the year 1968-69.

As regards secondary education the progress made was tremendous. Secondary schools were started in many remote places in the district. Their number has increased from 59 schools in 1960-61 to 137 secondary schools at the end of 1968-69. The increase is more than double. There were merely 18 thousand

students taking secondary education in 1968-61. Their number had increased to 37 thousand at the end of 1968-69, showing an increase of 110 %. The percentage of increase in secondary schools students during 1968-69 as compared to 1960-61 is 98 for boys and 154 for girls. Higher education facilities also increased in the district and there were 5,541 students taking higher education in the district during 1968-69 as against 1,183 students during 1960-61 showing an increase of 368 %.

Indicator No.14

Increase in Road Length per 100 sq. kms.

3.14 The district suffers from low road mileage in the Division. The following table gives the road length per 100 sq. kms. in the district in 1961 and 1970.

On 31-3-1961 the road length per 100 sq. kms. was 9.80 kms. which increased to 12.18 kms. during 1968-69 and at the end of 1969-70 the road length per 100 sq. kms. was 19.80 kms. During the year 1969-70, 1030.67 kms. of road were completed by the Zilla Parishad. Hence the road length had increased considerably during that year as compared to previous years.

Indicator No.15

Increase in the banking facilities in proportion to population.

3.15 For the developing economy, banking facilities are the most essential. The scheduled banks as well as the

co-operative banks are lending the necessary credit to the cultivators in their pursuit of green revolution. There are 5 scheduled banks in the district with their branches at taluka and trade centres.

There were 12 scheduled banks and 12 co-operative banks catering to the credit need of the people in the district during 1961. Their number has, however, increased to 14 scheduled banks and 21 co-operative banks at the end of the year 1969, the percentage increase being of 45. The increase is more remarkable in Pusad tahsil. While in Kelapur tahsil it is found to be least.

It will be seen that the average prices of all the commodities had increased during 1969 as compared to 1963 prices. The increase was more than 25 % in all the commodities except Gur and Kerosene where the increase was of 24%. The least increase was observed in case of Gur and Kerosene & the maximum increase was in case of Turmeric where the prices had nearly tripled (193 % increase). Jowar was not sold in open market, hence the increase for the above commodity is not shown. It was seen that the average prices of food-grains had s

had shot up and in most of the cases the prices were more than double in 1969 as compared to 1963 prices. So also the average prices of essential commodities such as Groundnut oil (126 %), Eggs (59 %), Meat (67 %), Dry Chillies (76 %), Plaintains (147%), Fire wood (82 %), Tea (53 %), Turmeric (193 %), Washing soap (40%) had increased considerably causing hardships to the common man. The average prices of Supari increased by 44% and that of tobacco by 54 % as compared to 1963 prices.

ANNUAL PLAN 1969-70

The Annual plans were visualised in place of five year plans, to utilise the available resources to the maximum possible extent for the schemes of shorter durations.

The annual plan 1969-70 was the fourth of such plans for the district. A budget provision of Rs. 281.150 lakhs was made for the Annual plan 1969-70 and for the Annual Plan 1968-69 it was of Rs. 273.171 lakhs.

The following table gives the Headwise break up of the allotment for the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70.

It is observed that the budget provision for 1969-70 was more than the budget provision for Annual plan 1968-69 nearly by Rs. eight lakhs. During 1969-70 the allocation of the total budget provision was slightly altered and the provision for Irrigation and Power was increased by reducing

the provision of other heads, as rural electrification and energizing of pumps was given priority and thus received highest share of the budget provision (41.30%) during 1969-70 also.

During 1968-69 the total expenditure was 89.40% of the corresponding budget during 1969-70 thus percentage was slightly lower and worked out at 82.58 % of the total budget provision.

4.2 Agricultural programmes

Under this major head the schemes pertaining to agricultural production, Soil conservation, Minor Irrigation, Animal Husbandry, Forest, Fisheries, Warehousing and Marketing were included. The table below gives the expenditure under these sub-heads:

Schemes relating to agricultural production, soil conservation and minor irrigation were given more importance under agricultural programmes in the district. The district has an undulating topography and hence soil erosion is a problem in the district. As a measure of soil conservation, bunding was done in 84,653 acres during 1968-69 and in 48,076 acres during 1969-70.

To increase irrigation potential in the district four bandharas and five irrigation tanks were started during 1968-69. During 1969-70 in all seven percolation tanks were undertaken to rise the sub-soil water level and the work was in progress.

Under agricultural production programmes schemes of vital importance such as development of seed farms for improved seeds, manures and fertilizers, horticultural development, cotton development, oilseed development and agricultural education were undertaken.

Establishment of poultry feed supply depot was undertaken in the district in the Intensive Poultry Development Block and loans were given to landless agricultural labourers for starting the poultry business.

New irrigation tanks have provided a new scope for development of inland fisheries in Veeral district and accordingly stocking of 7.50 lakhs of carp fry seedlings was done in these tanks and netting of one lakh Kg. of fish was done in the district, which earned nearly Rs. two lakhs a revenue to the State.

4.3 Co-operation & Community Development

On co-operation and community development Rs. 10.828 lakhs and 5.070 lakhs were spent during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under the programme the existing community blocks were continued in the district and applied nutrition programme was made applicable to 3 blocks. For this purpose 10 villages in each block were selected. Kitchen gardens, feeding programmes to the childrens and expectant mothers were implemented in these villages. Under the Sub-Head of co-operation share capital loans and subsidy were given to primary agric. societies to strengthen the cooperative structure at village level and 8 godowns were constructed during 1968-69. No construction programme was undertaken during 1969-70.

4.4 Irrigation and Power

Under this head irrigation and power, only rural electrification work is undertaken in both the years and agricultural connections to 600 pumps were given during 1968-69 and to 567 pumps during 1969-70 & electrification of 44 vill-

ages was also done.

4.5 Industry and Mining

An amount of Rs. 61.2 thousand and Rs. 77.4 thousands was spent on these schemes under this head during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under the small scale industries loans were given to 108 artisans during 1968-69 and 128 artisans during 1969-70.

4.6 Transport and Communication.

The district is not well-served with railway and hence roads are of significant importance in the development of the district. At the beginning of 1968-69, there were 1612 kms. of roads in the district. During 1968-69 Rs. 16.3 lakhs were spent for the development of roads and 33.60 kms. of new roads were constructed and construction of one bridge was undertaken. During 1969-70 an amount of Rs. 10.645 lakhs was spent and the bridge across the Painganga river was completed in all respects and 40.20 kms of new district roads and 14 kms of village roads were constructed in the district.

4.7 Social Services

In the Annual Plan different schemes for the Socio Economic development of the district were undertaken and an amount of Rs. 43.62 lakhs was spent for this purpose during 1968-69 and Rs. 40.949 lakhs were spent during 1969-70.

The following table gives the break-up of expenditure under this head according to different sub-heads of various schemes included in social welfare programme.

Under General education primary education was given more importance. During the Annual plan 1968-69 and 1969-70, 48 and 75 additional teachers were appointed to strengthen the existing primary education facilities in the interior places in the district. Training was also provided to 85 primary teachers during 1968-69 and 126 primary teachers in 1969-70. School building programme was undertaken during 1968-69 and 25 primary schools and 3 secondary school buildings were provided with construction grants. During 1969-70 being a Gandhi Centenary year a special programme of eradication of illiteracy was chalked out and nearly 60,000 persons were made literates.

The Government Polytechnic building was completed during 1968-69 and the remaining construction activities were carried out during 1969-70, at a cost of Rs.1.450 lakhs.

Under the minor head of development of public

health family planning programmes were geared up and in all 3,813 operations were performed in the district during 1968-69 and another 3,621 during 1969-70. Construction of two primary health centres were completed during 1969-70.

The drinking water schemes of five municipal towns were started during the year 1969-70 and they were in progress. The underground drainage scheme for Wani municipal town was undertaken during 1969-70.

During 1968-69 and 1969-70 greater importance was given to solve the drinking water problem of the water scarcity areas in the district and accordingly 110 wells were constructed during 1968-69 and 255 wells during 1969-70 to remove hardships of drinking water.

Housing sites were provided to 51 expanding villages during 1968-69 and 44 villages during 1969-70 under the Gaon than Extension schemes.

For backward classes welfare schemes loans were given to the tune of Rs. 4.482 lakhs during 1968-69 and Rs. 2.593 lakhs during 1969-70.

Under the Welfare Extension programme 12 Bal Vikas kendras and two Gruh Kalyan kendras-one at Digras and other at Ghatanji were functioning in the district during 1969-70.

Under the Rural Broadcasting scheme 119 new radio sets were installed during 1969-70 for the benefit of village masses in the district.
