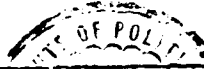

CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 LOCATION :

The district of Sangli is a part of the famous Deccan plateau. It lies between 16° 45' and 17° 33' North latitude and 73° 42' and 75° 40' East longitude with the borders of districts Satara and Sholapur in the north, Bijapur of Mysore State in the east, Kolhapur and Belgaum in the South and Ratnagiri towards the west.

The district has an area of 8591.3 sq. km. with a total population of 12.31 lakh persons according to 1961 population Census. The length of the district is about 200 km. and its breadth comes to about half of its length. In terms of area and population it makes 2.80 percent and 3.11 percent respectively of the State of Maharashtra, while within the Poona division it stands 5th and 6th respectively.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY :

(1) SOIL : The soil in the district varies from the deep black in river valleys to shallow murmad red or grey in the hilly areas.

The Western part of the district consisting the tahsil of Shirala has got the soil formed from red laterite mixed with hard murum due to hilly nature of the zone.

In the central portion of the district consisting the tahsil of Walva and parts of Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils, contains the heavy deep black soils capable of yielding bumper kharif crop.

These soils, which are highly retentive of moisture also grow jowar, Wheat and Gram. They are also good for irrigated crops like Sugarcane, Turmeric, Chillies etc. In fact it is the rich agricultural tract of the district.

The hilly tract comprising parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils grows Jowar and Bajri, while the eastern zone is a well-known scarcity area consisting of Jath, Atpadi and Navathe-Mahankal tahsils with very low rainfall and poor grey soils.

(ii) RIVERS : Krishna and Warna are the principal rivers of Sangli district. Yerala, Morna, Manganga, Nani, Agrani and Bor are other small rivers flowing through this district. During rainy season the flood water entail much soil erosion, while during dry part they resume a slender course. These rivers go dry in summer season.

(iii) HILL RANGES : There are two main systems of hills. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the off-shoots of Mahadev range. The Sahyadri system includes the main range of the Sahyadris which forms the western boundry of the district. One of the spurs of the Mahadeo range known as Mahimanagad-Panhala spur stretches up-to Khanapur. At Khanapur it splits in two branches - one branch passes twenty miles in the south till it ends in the old Panhala Fort, 15 miles from Athani Road Railway Station. The other branch stretches south-east to Belur about five miles south-west of Jath. It forms the water parting between the valley of the Yerala, a tributary of the Krishna on the right and the valley of Man, a tributary of the Bhima on the left.

(iv) MINERALS : There are no important mineral deposits except for building stones and clay and lime stones. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers. No other mineral of importance is known to occur in any part of the district.

1.3 CLIMATE :

1) Rainfall : The rains start about the middle of June and last till the end of September in Sangli district.

The district gets major part of the rain between July and September. The pre-monsoon rain usually comes all of a sudden with thundering noise and rains heavily. During the first half of monsoon, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains a bit heavily.

Rainfall is heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri. Western portion of Shirala tahsil on an average gets over 2,000 mm. in the year. The central and eastern portions get a rainfall of 750 mm. The north-eastern portion has the lowest rainfall averaging to about 500 mm. in the year.

In the eastern zone the rainfall is low and precarious but it is distributed over a longer period. In Jath tahsil and parts of Khanapur tahsil, which fall in this zone, the average rainfall is about 572 mm. Between 125 to 130 mm. of this falls in October and November. The deviation table is given below for further details.

ii) Temperature :

Monthly temperature records are available for one station at Miraj. Naturally, the data do not represent the climate of the district as a whole. However the district does not experiences abrupt changes in temperature. The seasons are considerably uniform. During rainy season climate is cool and is followed by sultry weather in October and November. Winter sets in thereafter till January end. Dry hot climate is experienced in February and March followed by hot climate till mansoons set in.

Altitude modifies the average temperature in different seasons. In western part climate is cool and healthy in hot weather and is chilly during rainy season. Temperate climate persists on the plains of Walwa and Miraj tahsils. The eastern part experiences hotter climate than the central and western parts of the district.

1.4 NATURAL ZONE :

The district can be broadly divided in-to four zones. The western zone has heavy rainfall, forests and the soil is hard and less fertile and grows crops like paddy and nachani. This zone makes more than 7 per cent of the area of the district. The hilly area of Shirala tahsil is covered in this zone. The central zone making about 41 per cent of the area of the district comprises of the rich agricultural tract of the Miraj, Walwa and Tasgaon tahsils. Krishna and Yerla flow through this zone. Jowar, Wheat, Gram, Chillies, Sugarcane, Turmeric are the principal crops of this zone.

The hilly tract comprises parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils with medium type soil and low rainfall. This zone grows Jowar and Bajari crops.

The eastern zone is a scarcity prone area consisting of Jath and Atpadi tahsils and part of Khanapur tahsil. It has low rainfall and poor soil; Bajari is the main crop of this zone.

Irrigation facilities have been developed in the central zone.

1.5 TERRITORIAL CHANGES :

The present Sangli district is mainly comprised of the former princely States - Sangli, Miraj (Jr.), Miraj (Sr.) , Jath, and parts of Aundh State and part of British territory namely Shirala, Walwa, Khanapur and Tasgaon tahsils from Satara district.

Besides, one village from former Kurundwad State(Sr.) one village of former Wadi State, two villages from Athani taluka of Belgaum district and two villages from Shirol tahsil of Kolhapur district are also included in Sangli district.

Consequent upon the merger of these princely States they were included in the Satara district. On 1st August, 1949, Satara district was bifurcated to form two districts, namely North-Satara and South Satara. The North Satara district comprised of the former Satara district with Head-Quarter at Satara and the South Satara district of the aforesaid former princely States and the four tahsils of former Satara district with Head-Quarter at Sangli. These North and South Satara districts were renamed as Satara and Sangli districts respectively in 1960. In 1964, for administrative convenience, Miraj and Khanapur tahsils were split up in two additional tahsils viz. (1) Kavathe-Mahankal and (2) Atpadi, respectively.

1.6 (I) DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:

(i) State Administration :

The Collector of the district is in-charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies etc. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and two Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the two Revenue Divisions and have their head quarters at Sangli and Miraj. Eight tahsildars are in charge of eight tahsils. The details of the same can be seen from the following table.

2) The judicial proceedings of the district are looked after by the District Judge the man of jurisprudence. The judiciary is separated from the executive.

The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judges. They attend to civil and criminal work both original and appellate.

3) As regards the administrative convenience of the police force, District Superintendent of Police looks after the administration of Police force in the district. His head-quarter is located at Vishrambag-Sangli.

For efficient administration, the police force has been divided in number of branches such as local crime branches, Local Intelligence Branch, Anti-corruption Branch and so on.

4) The office of the Divisional Soil Conservation Officer, is located at Miraj who looks after the works relating to Bunding, Terracing, Land Reclamation etc.

Moreover, Executive Engineer, Irrigation Division, Executive Engineer, Road Projects are located at Sangli and Krishna Valley Milk Project for collecting and redistribution of milk, Intensive Cattle Development Project to improve the local livestock breed is located at Miraj. In the co-operative field, the District Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies is of paramount importance. He is assisted by three Assistant Registrars who have territorial jurisdiction and deal with all the aspects of the co-operative movement in the district. The Zilla Parishad Sangli also, looks to the promotion and extension of the co-operative movement in the district as whole.

1.6 (II) CENTRAL GOVT. ADMINISTRATION :

The Head quarters of the offices of the Post and Telegraph, Superintendent of Central Excise and Income-Tax Officer of the Central Govt. are located at Sangli city only. Sub post offices are located at tahsil Headquarters and Towns and the branch post offices are located in big villages. The office of the Station Director, All India Radio is located at Sangli and its sub station is established at Tung(Sangli) for the information and social education services in the rural areas.

1.6 (III)-LOCAL BODIES :

As far as the developmental and administrative subjects transferred to Zilla Parishad of the district are concerned, the executive authority for the purpose of Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1961 vests in the Chief Executive Officer at the Zilla Parishad level and the Block Development Officers at Block level.

The Chief Executive Officer is assisted by the Deputy Chief Executive Officer and all other Heads of Departments under the Zilla Parishad, The entire rural area with the population of 10.38 lakh persons is under the control of Zilla Parishad, Sangli.

The municipal administration is in the towns of Sangli, Miraj, Islampur, Ashta, Tasgaon and Vita.

1.6 (IV)- PUBLIC BODIES ADMINISTRATION :

For the rapid development of the district, the services of the State Transport and Maharashtra State Electricity Board are of vital interest. The office of the Divisional Controller, S.T. Division, Sangli has been recently opened at Sangli.

The offices of the Superintending Engineer and Executive Engineer of Maharashtra State Electricity Board are also located at Sangli.

1.7 DEMOGRAPHY :

a) General :

The population of the Sangli district in 1901 was 6.45 lakh which rose to 12.31 lakh in 1961. That is, the population has increased by 91 per cent in 60 years period. The growth rate is found to have increased at very high rates during the two decades 1941-51 and 1951-61. The population increased at 22.8 per cent in 1941-51 decade, while it increased at 23.3 per cent during the 1951-61 decade. With this rate, the population of the district will be nearly double that of 1961 in the year 1991.

b) Density :

The density of population of this district was 143 per Sq. km. in 1961 as against 129 of the State of Maharashtra as a whole.

Among the tahsils Walwa and Miraj tahsils are thickly populated with population densities 261 and 339 respectively. The high density in Miraj tahsil is partly due to large urban population in Sangli and Miraj townships and partly due to fertile soil under intensive cultivation. Walwa tahsil is most densely populated rural area in Sangli district. The soil in the tahsil is very fertile and rich, people are generally progressive and have adopted intensive cultivation methods in recent years. Very low density is observed in Jath tahsil. It is 61 per Sq. km. Land is of poor quality and the area is often prone to scarcity conditions.

c) Literacy :

The percentages of literacy in the district for total, males and females in 1951 and 1961 are given below :

There is substantial increase in literacy during the decade 1951-61, it is more pronounced in case of females.

The literacy percentages for total, males and females for the year 1961, in the Poona Division and in the Maharashtra State were 29.30, 42.03, 16.10 and 29.82, 42.04, 16.76 respectively. Thus, it will be seen that the progress of literacy in Sangli district was below that of the Poona division and also of the State.

Miraj tahsil has the highest literacy for total, male and female population, both in rural and urban areas.

The age group wise percentage of literacy in Sangli district is given below.

The average literacy rates both for males and females are very high in the districts because of very high proportion for the age group 15-34 and high proportion even for the age group 35-59.

d) Household Size:

On the basis of 20 per cent sample study, the following observations are made in respect of household size.

Households with 4 to 6 members are more common (41 per cent) than others. The single member and two to three members size households are more (36 per cent) in urban areas than in rural areas (27 per cent). The average size of the household is 5.47 persons for the district.

e) Livelihood classification :

Of the total population of the district 43 per cent is engaged in work, remaining 57 per cent is non working or dependent population.

80 per cent of the working population is deriving its livelihood from agricultural pursuits while the rest from non-agricultural activities such as construction, industry, trade and commerce, transport and other services. The proportion of workers dependent on agriculture is very high. The corresponding proportion in the State is 72.07 per cent.

The ratio of cultivators to agricultural labourers is very high in Sangli district. It is 5:1 as against the State ratio 2:1 .

There is a marked difference in the distribution pattern for non workers among males and females. 38.8 per cent out of male non-workers are full time students while full time female students account only 10.34 per cent. In urban areas this percentage is more than in rural areas. The percentage of non-workers such as dependents, Infants, disabled persons, is lower in urban areas, The percentage of non working females engaged in household duties is higher in urban areas.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

ON SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF STATISTICS PRESENTED IN THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT - 1968-69 & 1969 -70.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE :

2.1 In this Abstract, statistics on as many as possible subjects have been presented so as to provide the scope for further studies in Socio-Economic aspects of Sangli District. Attempts have been made here to furnish the tahsilwise position on different topics for the years 1968-69 & 1969-70.

The sources of the material reproduced in this Abstract have also been shown at the end of each table. Besides, the notes explaining the major deficiencies in the tables have been also cited at the end of concerned table.

In the following paras, the concepts of certain terms, sources and limitations etc. of statistics presented in this Abstract have been discussed in short.

2.2 DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

In this table, some general particulars about the Sangli District and Poona Division are given. Against each item, mention of the period is made to which the figures concerning Sangli and Poona Division, are related. The data on location of District and division, its population, area, no. of villages, towns, total workers and non-workers, literacy percentages are shown.

Besides this, important information under the various heads such as agriculture, industry, animal husbandry, electricity, co-operation, education, transport and communications etc. is given.

2.3 CLIMATE :

The table no.1 gives monthly normal rainfall, number of rainy days and actual rainfall of 9 rainauge stations in Sangli district. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out by the Meteorological Department, Govt. of India on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. As regards rainy days a day is treated as a rainy day on which the rainfall is recorded in the rainauge during 24 hours of that day.

The table No.2 gives the maximum, minimum and average temperature of Miraj station. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the month. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature thus arrived at.

2.4 AREA AND POPULATION :

Final figures of 1961 population census are presented in all the tables in this section. The table No.3 shows the figures in population, density of population, population variation and population break-up as urban-rural for each tahsil. The table No.4 gives the classification of different inhabited villages according to population ranges. The table no.5 gives the classification of towns according to population ranges in the district. The table No. 6 shows the total

number of workers in each livelihood class of working population for each tahsil of this district, separately and also total non-workers in each tahsil. The table No.7 shows distribution of population according to age-group, mother tongue and religion in Sangli district. The table No.8 gives information on the tahsilwise scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population in this district.

2.5 AGRICULTURE :

The table No.9 gives tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of utilisation. Against each tahsil, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to the village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes. There are differences between the figures of total area according to the Surveyer General and according to the village paper because the latter is calculated by totalling up village returns while the former is calculated in blocks. Under 'forests', area includes all actually forested area or lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses

other than agricultural. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under 'miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown', is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Lands under casuarina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether or not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungals which are not put to any use. Current fallows comprise cropped area which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of a cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represented the sum total of area under all crops.

The difference between the total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area so sown more than once on the same land during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.10 presents the details of area under different crops. The table No.11 presents the outturn and average yield per hectare of principal crops in the district. The table No.12 presents gross and net irrigated areas and the distribution of net irrigated areas by sources of irrigation. The table No.13 shows the tahsilwise acreage of various crops under irrigation. The table No.14 presents data on total no. of wells and further break up as wells in use and wells not in use. The table No.15 gives the information on number of minor irrigation works completed and allied information regarding irrigation in Sangli district. The table No. 16 gives the information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works in Sangli district. The table No.17 gives information on average monthly wage rates collected by the Block Development Officers. The table No. 18 presents the figures of Agricultural implements enumerated in the 10th Live Stock Census 1966. The table No.19 depicts data on famines etc. . There are no famines, scarcity and conditions akin to scarcity in Sangli district during 1968-69 and 1969-70.

2.6 ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FORESTS & FISHERIES.:

The table no. 20 gives the number of various types of livestock, poultry etc. as enumerated at the time of 1966 livestock Census. At this census, all the livestock is ...

enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care is taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The table No.21 gives the information regarding medical facilities available to the livestock population in the district. The table No.22 gives the information regarding attacks of diseases. The table No. 23 shows the information regarding slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in the district. The information regarding animals slaughtered in non-recognised slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available. The table No. 24(a) gives figures of area under forest in the district. The forest area figures in this table is different from the figures in the table on land utilisation. The concepts of classifying areas into two departments are different. The table No. 24(b) gives the information regarding production and value of major and minor forest products in Sangli district.

2.7 EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY,
MINING & ELECTRICITY :

In this section, statistics regarding employment in industries is given. The table No.25 gives average daily employment and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed return under the Act. The table No.26 throws light on another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted. The table No. 27 gives the classification of factories according to No.of days worked during the year. The table no.28 gives monthwise figures of registration, vacancies notified, placements done in public & private sector and live register at the end of each month.

The table No. 29 gives break-up of total no. of registration according to National classification. The table No. 30 gives an idea about changes in the volume of employment. The table No. 31 shows the total no. of Govt. employees according to their basic pay and total emolument ranges separately and also the break-up into class I to class IV servants. The table No. 32 shows departmentwise total no. of Govt. employees in the district. Table No. 33 is designed to depict the position of registered factories as collected in the Annual Survey of Industries. In this table, data regarding number of factories, their employment as workers and other than workers and their financial position is presented. The table No. 34 gives information regarding generation and consumption of electricity in the district. The table No. 35 gives progress of electrification in the district. The table includes villages and towns which are electrified by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and Private electric agencies.

2.8 CO-OPERATION :

In this section, data on co-operative field is given. The table No. 36 gives information regarding total No. of each type of co-operative societies in the district. The table No. 37 gives the information regarding co-operative banks in the district. The data pertaining to no. of branches, no. of members, capital structure etc. is given. The table No. 38 gives tahsil-wise position regarding primary agricultural credit societies, members, capital structure, loans advanced, recovered and recovery percentage etc. in the district. The table No. 39 gives information about other co-operative societies of different types other than Agril. credit banks. The table No. 40

displays the data on Agril. marketing societies. The tahsil-wise information on value of purchase, value of sales of agril. produce and agril. requisites etc. is shown. The table No.41 shows the achievements of important activities of agricultural marketing, processing, Sugar Factories, handloom societies, consumer stores etc.. In table No.42 the data on operation of regulated marketing is shown. The table No. 43 gives the information regarding money lenders and their loan activities in the district. The tahsilwise break-up is not available.

2.9 MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH :

The table No.44 shows medical facilities available in the district. It shows the number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, beds available and indoor and outdoor patients treated. The material presented here includes only civil hospital, Zilla Parishad dispensaries, P.H.centres, municipal dispensaries and public aided institutions. It does not cover private institutions run by individuals or associations. The table No.45 shows data about births, deaths and infant deaths. The figures of infant deaths relates to deaths of children below one year. In table No.46 the data on number of deaths due to principal causes is shown. The table No.47 gives information regarding tahsilwise no.of primary vaccination, revaccination and cholera inoculations, in the district.

2.10 EDUCATION :

In this section, the literacy and the progress of education in different tahsils is presented. The table No.48 gives the number of literates sexwise for rural and urban areas separately. In table No.49 the total no.of illiterates

and literates with different levels of education (sexwise) of rural population only is shown. The table No.50 gives information regarding literates with different levels of education (technical and non technical) alongwith no.of illiterates in urban areas of the district. The table No.51 shows the number of different types of educational institutions, pupils and teachers for each type in the district. The number of institutions relates to the academic year ending June and the no.of pupils is as on 31st March of the respective years. In table No.52, the total number of beneficiaries (Backward class students) at each level of education is shown. The table No.53 gives the information regarding total no.of students taking benefits under the scheme of free studentship as E.B.C. students and the total value of such concessions for all the educational levels for the district as a whole. The table No.54 gives information about grants (normal and plan) given by Govt. to Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils for primary education. The table No.55 is meant to show total no.of villages without primary schools or schooling facilities. Further break-up of villages without primary schools is given in different population ranges.

2.11 TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION :

In this section, statistical information relating to various modes of transport is given. The table No.56 gives information on length of railway route in the district. There are two gauges viz. Meter and narrow, in the district. In table No.57 figures of road length as at the end of each year are shown. The figures relate to extra municipal roads maintained by the B & C and Zilla Parishad. Roads maintained by municipal authorities are given seperately.

The table No.58 presents data about motor vehicles in the Kolhapur Region. The data is presented for both Kolhapur and Sangli districts as separate figures for this district are not available. The table No.59 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The information on number of routes, route distance, average daily earnings etc. is given. There is no separate S.T. Division for Sangli district. The district is under the jurisdiction of Kolhapur S.T. Division. Khanapur tahsil of this district having depot. is under Satara S.T. division. In table No.60 the data of traffic census wherein information regarding no. of vehicles, light motor vehicles, total traffic intensity in 24 hours is given. The table No.61 gives some important statistics regarding post and telegraph offices, number of letter boxes etc. in the district. The table No.62 gives information regarding number of radio-sets and number of villages where radio sets are installed.

2.12 LOCAL BODIES :

Statistics regarding village panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad are shown in this section. The table No. 63 presents material on income and expenditure of village Panchayats Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. It is a summary table of tables 64,65 and 66. In table No.64 the break-up of the information on income and expenditure of village panchayats is given. This break-up is in two-way, on the one hand the information for each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand, total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads such as income from taxes, fees, donations, contributions and expenditure on administration, public works, sanitation etc. The table No. 65-A & 65-B give particulars of income & expenditure of

Sangli Zilla Parishad. The receipts are sub-divided into self raised resources, Govt. grants for agency scheme and debt section. The expenditure is likewise divided into many heads of development. The table No. 66 gives information on income and expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of Municipalities. Under income, information is separately shown under grants, taxes and other income. Under expenditure, further break-up into general administration, public safety, public works etc. is shown.

2.13 PLAN & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Statistics regarding expenditure and achievement under Annual Plans, Community Development Programme etc. are given. The table No. 67 gives plan expenditure under different development sub-heads in Sangli district. In table No. 68 the details regarding important physical achievements during 1968-69 and 1969-70 are shown. The table No. 69 shows the position of Community Development Programme in the district. The information regarding no. of blocks of C.P.A. Pattern in each stage, the population covered etc. is given. The table No. 70 gives information about the expenditure incurred according to stages for the period ending upto 31-3-1970 and also during 1968-69 and 1969-70. The table No. 71 gives information on important physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks in Sangli district.

2.14 PRICES :

The table No. 72 gives the monthly average prices of important commodities at Sangli Head Quarter during 1968 and 1969. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also

from only one shop in the district Head Quarter, the averages shown above for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No. 73 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Poona centres for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. For the calculation of Index the year 1960 and 1961 are taken as base years for Sholapur and Poona centres, respectively.

2.15 MISCELLANEOUS :

In this section, statistics regarding miscellaneous subjects like police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, small savings etc. are included. The table no. 74 relates to police force in the district. The table no. 75 gives information on cognizable and non-cognizable crimes in the district. In table no. 76, cases decided by courts in the district are shown. The figures do not include the cases decided by the District Magistrate and Executive magistrate. The table No. 77 gives tahsilwise Cinema theatres (viz. permanent, touring) in the district. There are no semi-movement talkies in this district. The table no. 78 gives the information regarding number of banks and the population covered by them in the district. In table No. 79, the data on joint stock companies limited by shares and limited by guarantees and associations not for profit are given. Their further break-up into public and private is also given. The table no. 80 gives the information regarding No. of insurance policies issued and also amount insured in the district.

The table no. 31 presents gross and net collections under different schemes of small savings. The table No. 32 gives information regarding demand, collection and arrears of land revenue. The demand minus collection tally with arrears. This data relates only to Land Revenue and excludes Local Fund cess. The table no. 33 gives information regarding no. of presses, News papers, periodical printed etc. in the district. The table no. 34 gives information regarding general elections held in 1967. The party wise number of votes polled are also shown therein.

In table No. 35, important indicators in the fields of development such as agriculture, livestock, Industry, Education, Health etc. are indicated for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 and 1969-70. These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

2.16 SELECTED INDICATORS :

Eight tables regarding selected indicators of development for each tahsil of Sangli District are appended at the end. Topics like population, agriculture, electricity, factory workers, road kilometrage, education medical facilities etc. are covered. An effort is also made in one more table to show the position of each tahsil in relation to its development under each item by way of ranking, on the basis of the latest available data.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

1968-69 and 1969-70.

3.1 An attempt has been made in the following lines to present the facts and figures which give an idea regarding several Socio-Economic features of the Sangli District, which occurred as a result of various developmental activities. The impact of these activities can better be seen from the sectorial trends in respect of Agriculturē and allied fields like livestock and poultry, employment, electric consumption, medical facilities or civic amenities, education, communications extent of credit and banking facilities and things of the kind.

The facts and figures, for the sake of analytical review, prior to Third Five Year Plan, at the end of the Third Plan and during Annual Plans 1967-68, 1968-69 and 1969-70 are utilised here.

3.2 Agriculture :

Agriculture backwardness is one of the prominent features of our Agro-Economy even to-day. This is more true in respect of the State of Maharashtra and the district of Sangli is no exception to this. The hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scanty and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, inadequate irrigation facilities, poor use of chemical fertilisers, all these have marred the productivity of the soil.

The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on the important aspects of agriculture in Sangli District. It can also be assessed from this, the position of Sangli District in the Poona Division and the position of different tahsils within the district.

3.3 Percentage gross sown area

The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net sown area and thereby the feasibility of double cropping can be assessed from the following table.

From the above figures, it will be seen that percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown for district as a whole has been decreased by one percent for subsequent years. The district percentage is smaller than the percentage of Poona Division in 1960-61 and 1965-66.

It can be seen from the above table that there was no decrease during 1967-68. However, the decrease is observed during 1968-69 for Atpadi, Shirala and Tasgaon tahsils. The highest percentage of double cropped area is observed in Shirala tahsil of this district for both the years 1967-68 and 1968-69 due to change in the cropping pattern.

3.4 Productivity of Important Crops :

The principal crops of the district are jowar, bajara, rice, wheat, gram, tur, groundnut, and sugarcane. The productivity of these crops in Sangli district can be assessed from their respective yield rates per hectare. The following table will furnish this information and the position of the district in the Poona division will also be seen from this.

From the above figures it is seen that yield rates were good in 1960-61, while in 65-66 they were decreased due to scarcity conditions in Sangli District. However, the position was improved in 1967-68 and 1968-69 to some extent in respect of all important crops. When compared to yield rates of Poona Division it will be seen that the yield rates of Sangli District for Jowar, Wheat and Tur were better.

3.5 Gross value of Agril. Production :

Agril. Production plays vital role in our economy as a whole. Prosperity and progress in India are geared up with the large agricultural production and the income earned by the agriculturists. The figures given below will throw light on the per capita (Rural population) value of agricultural output in the different districts of Poona Division for the years 1960-61 and 1961-62.

It will be seen from these figures that the per capita value is constant in Ahmednagar and Sholapur district,

while it is decreased by Rs. 2 in Poona, Rs. 4 in Satara and Rs. 7 in Kolhapur. Only in Sangli district it is increased by Rs. 4. However both in 1960-61 and 1961-62 the district of Sangli stand 5th in respect of per capita gross value of Agriculture output.

3.6 Irrigation :

In Sangli district, percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 113 in 1960-61, 115 in 65-66 and 118 in 1967-68 and 117 in 1968-69. The figures for Poona division were 117 percent and 122 percent in 1960-61 and 1965-66. Percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 6.73 in 1960-61, 7.60 in 1965-66 and 7.85 during 1967-68 and 8.85 during 1968-69.

The tahsilwise position of gross irrigated to net irrigated area can be seen from the following table No. 4-A.

From the above figures, it will be seen that in all tahsils, except Miraj and Tasgaon, the percentage appears to be little bit good in the year 1968-69. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area can be seen from the below table No. 4-B.

As far as Sangli district is concerned, increase is seen during 1968-69 over the year 1967-68 for the tahsils of Khanapur, Shirala, Walwa, Tasgaon, K.Mahankal and Miraj. In the remaining tahsils the same is found to be decreased. The position of Poona Division in respect of percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area, has increased little in 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61. It will be revealed from the above table that percentage of net irrigation to the net cropped area is the highest in Miraj tahsil and

the lowest in Shirala tahsil in 1968-69 due to hilly nature of the tahsil.

3.7 Changes in the cropping pattern.:

The figures supplied below throw light on the changes in the cropping pattern over a period from 1960-61 to 1965-66 and 1967-68 and 1968-69 in Sangli District.

It will be seen from the above table that the area under Rice, Wheat, Bajra and Sugarcane has been increased while the same is decreased in respect of other crops during the year 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68. The area under food crops increased only by 0.39 % during 1968-69.

In case of irrigation, the gross area irrigated increased from 53,385 hectares to 65,438 hectares in 1968-69 as compared to 1965-66. In case of Wheat, Bajra, Rice, Gram there is also increase in the acreage.

3.8 Agril. Credit and Outstanding dues :

At present, Agril. Credit is the vital strength of our agro-economy. The figures enumerated below will no doubt disclose the span of agril. co-operative credit etc. during the Third Five Year Plan period and during 1968-69 and 1969-70 in Sangli district. The district of Sangli is on the front of co-op. movement, especially in strengthening the co-op. credit structure.

It is apparent from the above table that the loans advanced by Agril. Co-operative Societies, increased by 148 percent as at the end of Third Plan and 77% and 83% during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively, as compared to 1965-66. The amount outstanding increased by 1,163 percent during 1968-69 and 1330% during 1969-70 as compared to the position at the end of the Third Plan. Loan advanced per member was Rs. 189 in 1960-61 which rose to Rs. 312 in 1965-66, Rs. 439 in 1968-69 and Rs. 493 in 1969-70.

The loans advanced by Land Development Bank ^{have} also shown upward trend. Huge outstanding also ^{is} there due to the policy of advancing long-term loans for ^{Agril.} Development for which the recovery was spread up over a longer period.

3.9 Agril. Wage Rates :

Agril. Wage Rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. For each district, three centres are selected and from these selected Rural Centres, data on agril. wage rates are being collected.

As far as Sangli district is concerned, the selected centres are (1) Madhavanagar from Miraj Block (2) Jath from Jath Block and (3) Atpadi from Atpadi Block.

Generally, it is seen that wage rates in respect of male (un-skilled) at Madhavnagar centre are more in the years 1969 and 1970 due to the nearness of towns. The male field labourers get wages between Rs. 2 to 3.50 and female labourers get Rs. 0.75 to Rs. 2.28, skilled workers like Carpenters and Blacksmiths get wages of Rs. 4 to 5, whose services are still required for agril. sector of our economy.

It will be seen that due to the overall rise in prices, Agril. wage rates are also found to be increased during 1969 and 1970. The agril. wage rates within Poona Division have also shown upward trend.

3.10 Livestock :

In the year 1966, the 10th quinquennial livestock census was carried out throughout India. Animal Husbandry in India, from the point of view of its substantial contribution by way of providing income and drought power to farmers, subsidiary food to human population etc. has a great impact on our rural economy. The figures provided below in this respect are the indicators of development of our economy. The number of livestock, particularly Bovine and Ovine population in relation to per hectare cultivable land is one of them.

The number of livestock per 100 hectares of cultivable land in 1961 was 128 while it was 117 in 1966, in Sangli district. The figures for Poona Dn. are 124 and 116 in the years 1961 and 1966 respectively. The position of Sangli district appears to be good in both the years as compared to the figures of Poona Division.

Within the district, the tahsil of Atpadi is having largest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The No. of livestock per hectare cultivable land is more than the district average. The tahsils of Atpadi, Shirala, and Walwa have also the livestock more than the district average. The remaining tahsils have the livestock less than the district average, the lowest being the tahsil of Jath and Kavathe-Mahankal.

3.11 Poultry :

In 1961, total poultry in Sangli district was 4.92 lakhs while the same was 6.25 lakhs in 1966. The no. of poultry per 1000 population thus increased from 405 in 1961 to 509 in 1966. The rate of increase in poultry per 1000 human population in Sangli district is 26 percent from 1961 to 1966. The same is only 10 percent in respect of Poona Division. This comparison, however, is based on constant human population factor of 1961 for both the years 1961 and 1966.

3.12 Consumption of Electricity :

The per capita consumption of Electricity in Sangli district in 1961-62 was 15.32 KW, while in 1965-66 it rose to 36.53 KW and 63.49 KW in 1968-69 and 70.55 KW in 1969-70. There appears to be rapidly increasing trend in the consumption of electricity. This is mainly due to the huge programme of rural electrification in this district.

3.13 Enrolment at Employment Exchange and Vacancies notified.

Employment generation is no doubt the vital issue in the country like India. Our Planning is paying due attention in offering employment opportunities and reducing the unemployment.

The position of Sangli district as regards the registration in the employment exchange and the vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the figures supplied in the below table.

From the above figures, almost everywhere increase is noticed. Employment provided in private sector, not through the employment exchange, is also substantial one and hence it will not be appropriate to draw conclusions and comment upon them on the basis of employment exchange statistics, alone.

3.14 Increase in Indoor and Outdoor patients treated :

The increase can be seen from the following figures.

Both the indoor and outdoor patients treated has increased during 1968 and 1969. The increase is about 21 and 26 percent during 1968 and 1969 when the figures of 1968 and 1969 are compared with those of 1965.

3.15 Increase in No. of students of different categories. :

Education is the backbone of all sided development and social elevation. The percentage of pupils taking education either in Primary, Secondary or higher has increased during 1968-69. The figures supplied below will show the percentage increase in 1968-69 over 1967-68 in respect of different types of education.

The increase in respect of girls' students is notable for primary and secondary types noted above.

3.16 Increase in road length per 100 Sq.Km.

Roads of any kind have great significance in the social life of a nation. This is more true in respect of the State of Maharashtra. The road facilities available in Sangli district could better be judged by working out road length per 100 Sq. Km.

In Sangli district, the road length per 100 Sq. Km. was 39.00 Kms. in 1960-61, while in 1968-69 the same was 45.97 km. and in 1969-70 it was 46.71 km. In 1960-61 the total road length was 3350.92 km. The same has been increased by 662.19 km. in 1969-70.

3.17 Increase in Banking facilities in Proportion to Population .:

In modern days of complex economy the emergence of Banking facilities is inevitable. In 1961 there were 34 banks of different types in Sangli district. The same rose to 73 and 79 at the beginning of 1968 and 1969 respectively. That means in 1961, there were 3 Bank Offices per lakh of population in Sangli district. At present the same has increased to 6. This indicates that day by day people are taking advantages of banking facilities both in urban and rural areas of the district.

3.18 Prices :

Price phenomenon is a matter of pivotal importance in every day life. This has greatly been felt since November, 1962.

As it is the case, the work of collection of prices at each district head quarter in Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. From this data, changes in the prices of important commodities during 1968 and 1969 can broadly be seen. The price trends in retail prices have thumping impact on the masses at large.

The price trend for the items like cereals and pulses under Food, Sugar, Gur and edible and other oils, Condiments and Spices, Vegetables and such other items of daily consumption, Shirting, Sarees, Dhotis etc. under Clothing, Kerosene, Charcoal, Match box, Firewood etc. under Fuel, Tea and Coffee under Beverages, and washing soap, Pan, Supari, Tobacco, Cigarettes, Bidi, Hair Oils, Penicillin, etc. under miscellaneous articles has a tendency to rise in an upward direction since 1962.

The consumer Price Index for Sholapur Centre is applicable to Sangli district. The General Index Numbers of Sholapur district for 1968-69 and 1969-70 were 157 and 176 respectively.

It will be seen that there was an increase in prices during 1969 and 1970, too.

CHAPTER - IV
ANNUAL - PLAN
1968-69 & 1969-70

INTRODUCTORY :

4.1 GENERAL :

Since the expiry of the Third Five Year Plan period on 31-3-1966, Annual Plans are being implemented in the State of Maharashtra, as elsewhere in India, without departing from the basic objectives or fundamental aims of our five year planning. The schemes in the Annual Plan were implemented practically on the same lines of the schemes in the Third Plan with a few modifications.

The year 1968-69 is the last year in the series of Annual Plans, while the year 1969-70 is the first year of the Fourth Five Year Plan.

4.2 Progress of the Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 can be viewed in comparison with the progress of district level plan schemes implemented during the Third Five Year plan period and also the Annual Plans 1966-67 and 1967-68 in Sangli district as is shown in the table below.

The above table depicts the details of expenditure under various major heads of development for 4 Annual Plans and Third Five Year Plan period. It can be seen from this table that the space of total expenditure incurred during the years 1966-67, 1967-68, and 1969-70, showed decreasing trend; but when compared with average annual expenditure during Third Five Year Plan period, there was increase in the expenditure of subsequent annual plans. During Third Five Year Plan period, the average annual expenditure comes to Rs. 137.57 lakhs while during the Annual Plan 1966-67 the expenditure was amounted to Rs. 346.64 lakhs i.e. 151.97 % increase over the annual average expenditure of Third Five Year Plan period. However this speed in expenditure had not been seen during subsequent years of Annual Plans. On the contrary, there is continuous decrease in expenditure during 1967-68, 1968-69 and 1969-70 due to the financial and foreign aid difficulties etc. in formulating the Fourth Five Year Plan. The percentage of decrease over the expenditure of previous year comes to 19.62 during 1967-68 and 28.17 during 1969-70. Though there is increase in expenditure during 1968-69, by 3.77% over 1967-68, this expenditure is also less than that for 1966-67 by 16.59%. Since there is decrease in total expenditure, the per capita expenditure also indicates decreasing trend over the expenditure during 1966-67 although there is a increasing trend as compared to the average annual expenditure of Third Five Year Plan period. The per capita expenditure during Third Five Year (based on average annual expenditure) was Rs. 12 and it was Rs. 28, 23, and 17 during Annual Plans for 1966-67, 1967-68, 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

It is interesting to note that the pace of expenditure during first Annual Plan i.e. 1966-67 was exceptionally good, while for subsequent years this could not be maintained due to the difficulties mentioned earlier.

There was neither increasing nor decreasing trend in the expenditure incurred under various major heads, during four Annual Plans, but there were ups and downs in the flow of expenditure incurred during subsequent years of the Annual Plans, under various major heads.

4.3 During last 2 Annual Plans i.e. 1968-69 and 1969-70, there was 28.17% decrease in total expenditure of 1969-70 as compared to the expenditure incurred during 1968-69. This short fall in expenditure was prominently visible under Co-operation and Community Development, Power, Industry and Social services, while an increase in expenditure was noticed under Agriculture and Transport and Communication. The decrease in expenditure under co-operation and Community Development can be attributed to conversion of C.D.Blocks into Post Stage II blocks having no budget under plan, and under power, due to paucity of funds.

During 1968-69, the total expenditure was Rs. 289.14 lakhs. The spread over of this expenditure amongst various major heads is as shown below in percentages :

During 1968-69, the percentage of expenditure under State and Local sectors was 75.55 and 24.45 respectively. This percentage during 1969-70 was 62.84 and 37.16.

4.4 In the following paras, the progress of the schemes according to sub-heads of development has been elucidated.

I - AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

A - Agricultural production including land development :

In all 4 local sector schemes and 5 State sector schemes were implemented during 1968-69 under this sub-head. Total provision for 1968-69 was Rs. 14.30 lakhs, out of which 12.86 lakhs were spent. During 1968-69 the progress under the scheme of Agril. school at Digraj, --- ...

General Horticultural Development and scheme for small holders from local sector and under the scheme Town compost, Hybrid seed production, Taluka seed farm, scheme of maximisation of production of groundnut for export promotion, from State sector was good and more than 75% budget provision was utilised. Under maximization of production of groundnut, 1.05 lakhs acres against the target of 1.50 lakhs acres, were covered by improved seeds. By advancing subsidy of Rs. 0.03 lakhs the compost of 11,406 tonnes had been prepared. Under Hybrid seed production scheme, 1,227 quintals of seed were produced. The target for this was 1,500 quintals. An area of 121 acres by new plantation and 94 acres by rejuvenation was covered under the General Horticulture Development Scheme. Scheme for small holders popularly known as "Pase Scheme" had been implemented in Tasgaon tahsil and the progress of the scheme was on schedule. During 1968-69, bunding in 9,304 acres was under-taken, 551 irrigation wells were constructed, 332 oil engines were distributed to the small holders under this scheme. Under Agricultural school at Digraj, electrification to the existing buildings was in progress. Progress of the scheme of distribution of seeds for green manuring, Intensive cultivation of food crops under local sector was low. Expenditure of Rs. 0.54 lakhs under taluka seed farm had exceeded the provision of Rs. 0.25 lakhs for erecting the building on seed farms.

During 1969-70, 7 schemes were implemented under this sub-head; out of which 5 schemes were executed under local sector while the remaining 2 under State sector. Total expenditure under this sub-head was Rs. 14.85 lakhs as against....

the budget provision of Rs. 15.05 lakhs. Progress under Agril. school at Digraj, General Horticultural Development, scheme for Small Holders, Taluka seed godown at Islampur from Local sector and Taluka seed farm from State sector was satisfactory. Progress under Town compost from State sector and multipurpose demonstration scheme from local sector was poor. From 1969-70 the scheme for small holders has been transferred from State sector to Local sector. Under the scheme of Agril. school, work of electrification in the building is still in progress. Under General Horticultural Development scheme, new plantation and rejuvenation was carried out in 107 acres and in 135 acres respectively. Construction of godown at Islampur is in progress under the scheme of taluka seed Godown scheme. The programme of bunding, construction of wells, distribution of oil engines was carried out as per schedule under scheme for Small Holders. Construction of building was undertaken under the scheme of Taluka seed farm. Compost of 13,252 tonnes had been prepared as against the target 19,000 tonnes by spending an amount of Rs. 0.03 lakhs under the scheme of Town Compost. 5 demonstration plots were arranged under the multicrop demonstration scheme with expenditure of Rs. 0.02 lakhs.

4) MINOR IRRIGATION :

Under this sub-head, 5 schemes were implemented during 1968-69 and 1969-70; out of which 3 schemes were under State sector, one under local sector and the remaining one under both State and local sectors. During 1968-69 the total provision was Rs. 52.03 lakhs and total expenditure was Rs. 49.12 lakhs. The progress under all these schemes was satisfactory.

Under this programme 793 irrigation wells were constructed, 833 oil engines were distributed, 1,542 acres of land were brought under irrigation through lift irrigation schemes. Construction of 119 community wells was undertaken and these works are in progress. So far, an amount of Rs. 4.24 lakhs was spent on community wells during the year. The scheme of Minor Irrigation works was executed under both the State and Local sectors. Under State sector, Rs. 16.70 ^{lakhs} were spent on bandharas and tanks and now 8 bandharas and 2 tank works are in progress. Work of excavation of canal was also undertaken at Narsingpur and it is in progress. During the year, Rs. 0.31 lakhs were spent for this scheme. Zilla Parishad had also incurred an expenditure of Rs. 13.76 lakhs on bandharas, budki wells, percolation tanks and vasant bandharas. At present, works of 41 bandharas, 300 Budki wells, 19 percolation tanks and 15 vasant bandharas are in progress.

During 1969-70, total expenditure was Rs. 51.11 lakhs as against allocation of Rs. 52.67. Thus, the expenditure was satisfactory. By way of spending Rs. 2.04 lakhs and Rs. 2.76 lakhs, 415 wells were constructed and 403 oil engines were distributed respectively. By spending whole provision of Rs. 4.36 lakhs, 4,940 acres of land were brought under irrigation through lift irrigation schemes. Out of Rs. 1.00 lakh, Rs. 0.78 lakhs were spent for 119 community wells which are already in progress. Progress under minor irrigation was very good as the expenditure amounting to Rs. 41.17 lakhs had exceeded the budget provision of Rs. 40.27 lakhs. Out of 9 bandharas and 2 tanks, 3 bandharas and one tank were completed. Canals of 1,725 rft. were excavated and 55 bandharas, 315 Budki wells, 26 percolation tanks and 26 vasant bandharas, undertaken by Zilla Parishad, are in progress.

c) SOIL CONSERVATION :

During 1968-69 and 1969-70, 4 schemes were implemented under this sub-head and these schemes pertain to State sector. Expenditure under contour Bunding, Terracing of land and Afforestation of Soil conservation during 1968-69 and 1969-70 was good. There was no provision for terracing during 1969-70. For the scheme of Reclamation of Saline and Alkaline, 50% expenditure was incurred during 1968-69 and 100% during 1969-70. Bunding was undertaken in 55,611 acres during 1968-69 and in 46,712 acres during 1969-70. During both the years the target was exceeded. During 1968-69 terracing was done in 13 acres only, in Shirala tahsil. Under Reclamation of Saline and Alkaline lands, an area of 29 acres during 1968-69 and 69 acres during 1969-70 was covered. Under Afforestation, plantation in 105 acres and rejuvenation in 70 acres during 1968-69 and only rejuvenation in 20 acres during 1969-70 were carried out.

d) ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

All the schemes under this sub-head pertain to local sector. 7 schemes were implemented during 1968-69 and 2 schemes in 1969-70. During 1968-69 the progress was good as almost all provision was spent; while during 1969-70 the progress was fairly good.

e) DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

There were 3 schemes under this head and all these were implemented under State sector. Progress under the scheme Loans for purchase of cattle and co-operative milk societies and federation was good for both the years; while it was not upto the mark in respect of Town Milk supply scheme

for both years as the construction of building etc. is in progress. Under this scheme, the procurement of milk was reached upto 22,040 litres per day during 1968-69 and 22,788 litres per day during 1969-70.

F) FOREST :

Only one scheme of Farm Forestry was implemented under State sector during 1968-69 and the whole provision of Rs. 0.59 lakhs was spent. During 1969-70 two schemes viz. Farm Forestry and Development of minor forest produce were implemented satisfactorily. Total provision under these 2 schemes was Rs. 0.71 lakhs and expenditure was Rs. 0.67 lakhs.

G) FISHERIES :

All the 3 schemes during 1968-69 and 2 schemes during 1969-70 were implemented as State sector schemes. Expenditure incurred during both the years was satisfactory, as all the provision had been utilised. 29,000 and 16,000 fingerlings were stocked during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively and 14,500 kg. and 848 kg. fish were netted in the respective years as mentioned above. Fishery requisites i.e. Nylon and Cotton amounting to 136 kg. and 356 kg. were distributed during 1968-69 and 280 kg. and 315 kg. during 1969-70 respectively.

H) WAREHOUSING & MARKETING :

Development of agricultural marketing was the only State sector scheme implemented under this head. The whole budget provision of Rs. 0.02 lakhs and Rs. 0.28 lakhs was spent by way of subsidy and loans to A.P.M.Cs. during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

II - CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A) CO-OPERATION :

There were 6 State sector schemes under this sub-head. During the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 the progress in respect of expenditure was good. Under this programme, during 1969-70, 139 societies were assisted by way of subsidy, 5 new branches of D.C.Banks were opened, 3,013 membership were added to agric. credit societies, share capital was given to two marketing societies, assistance was rendered to 7 labour contract societies, 3 co-operative farming societies were assisted with funds. To run consumers stores, 4 societies were assisted and for distribution of consumer articles, 3 marketing societies were assisted. During 1968-69, 135 societies were assisted with subsidy, 7 new branches of D.C. Banks were opened. 2,950 members were added. Loans and subsidy for construction of godowns were granted to 11 marketing societies. Five labour contract societies were assisted. One co-op. farming society was organized and existing 8 societies were assisted. One society was assisted for Consumers stores and 3 marketing societies for distribution of consumers articles.

B) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

There were 3 schemes during 1968-69 and 2 during 1969-70. All these schemes were local sector schemes. Progress of C.D. Programme scheme for both the years was good as the provision was totally spent. Expenditure under rural works programme was Rs. 3.40 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 3.50 lakhs during 1968-69. Under the scheme, 10 bandharas, 4 tanks, one community well and 11 roads were completed. This scheme was discontinued during 1969-70.

Under Applied Nutrition Programme Rs. 0.84 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 1.29 lakhs and Rs. 0.83 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 1.02 lakhs were spent during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

III- IRRIGATION AND POWER :

A) Rural Electrification:

The programme of domestic lighting and connecting agricultural pumps in rural areas was undertaken by M.S.E.B. By spending Rs. 85.36 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 73.20 lakhs, 1931 pumps were energised and 44 villages were electrified. During 1969-70, due to paucity of funds, the budget provision was Rs. 4.66 lakhs only. However expenditure was Rs. 9.86 lakhs. During 1969-70 no village was electrified. However 1,577 agricultural pumpsets were energised.

IV - INDUSTRY AND MINING :

A) Development of Small Scale Industries:

Progress of all the schemes was satisfactory as almost all the provision was spent. There were 3 schemes under this head. One scheme each was implemented under State and Local sector and one scheme was executed in both the sectors. Under S.A.I Rules-loans amounting to Rs. 1.82 lakhs were disbursed to 134 loanees and Rs. 1.90 lakhs to 147 loanees during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Besides, 9 handicraft societies and 6 handloom societies during 1968-69 and 1 handicraft society and 6 handloom societies during 1969-70 were assisted.

V - TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

A) Road Development :

There were 5 schemes, out of which 3 were implemented under local, one under State and 1 under both the sectors. Total expenditure under this head was Rs. 8.12 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 15.81 lakhs during 1968-69. During 1969-70, expenditure amounting to Rs. 17.93 lakhs had exceeded the budget provision of Rs. 15.20 lakhs. During 1968-69 road of 3 miles under the scheme of Roads in sugarcane area and one bridge under the scheme of Roads of Economic importance, were constructed. During 1969-70, 2 bridges under District Road scheme, road of 2 miles under roads in sugarcane area, 12 miles village roads and 6 miles roads in hilly areas were constructed.

VI - SOCIAL SERVICES :

A) General Education and Technical Education :

All the schemes except the scheme of opening and Development of Technical school, were implemented under local sector. The progress under all the schemes for both the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 was satisfactory as almost all the budget provision was utilised.

B) Public Health and Family Planning: including Medical and nursing :

There were 5 schemes under this head. Out of which 2 were under State sector and 3 under Local sector. The expenditure for both the years was not upto the mark. Progress under National Malaria Eradication Programme was satisfactory for both the years. Under this scheme, blood smears collected and examined were amounted to 1,56,167 and 1,75,472 during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

Insertion of loops and sterilization were amounted to 159 and 9,578 during 1968-69 and 131 and 12,269 during 1969-70 respectively, under the scheme of Family Planning.

C) Water Supply :

Government water supply scheme at Miraj was implemented and completed during 1968-69 under State sector. Further, municipal water supply and drainage schemes were under taken in Sangli, Miraj, Vita, Ashta and Tasgaon Towns during both the years and these works are in progress. The expenditure under these works was satisfactory as more than 75% provision was utilised. Rural water supply scheme as a simple measures (wells) and piped water supply scheme were implemented by the Zilla Parishad. The expenditure was also good. Under piped water supply, 7 schemes are in progress and under simple measures, 101 wells during 1968-69 and 193 wells and 163 bores during 1969-70 were completed. Total expenditure under this head was Rs. 9.09 lakhs during 1968-69 and Rs. 18.36 lakhs during 1969-70.

D) Housing :

There were 4 schemes under this head; of which 3 were implemented under State sector and one under local sector. During 1968-69 progress under Low Income Group Housing Scheme, Extension of Village Gaothan Scheme and Village Housing Project scheme was satisfactory. Under Extension of Village Gaothan 14 villages were covered and 3 tenaments were completed under Low Income Group Housing Scheme. Progress under Subsidised Industrial Housing Scheme was not satisfactory. During 1969-70, expenditure under all the schemes was satisfactory. Under the scheme of Low Income

Group Housing 2 tenements were completed and 5 villages were covered under Extension of Village Gaothan. Village Housing Project scheme had also covered 4 villages.

E) Urban Development :

During both the years one municipality had received financial assistance for implementing development plan. Expenditure for both the years was satisfactory. This scheme was implemented as State sector scheme.

F) Welfare of Backward Class :

There were 11 schemes during 1968-69 while in 1969-70 only 5 schemes were implemented under this sub-head. The scheme of Backward class housing was treated as State sector scheme in 1968-69 while the same was treated as local sector scheme in 1969-70. Expenditure under all the schemes was satisfactory in both the years. Under this programme of welfare of backward classes, various types of facilities such as grants for irrigation wells, for development of lands, for hostel etc. were made available to the backward class community.

G) Social Welfare :

A- Welfare extension programme :

Total expenditure during 1968-69 and 1969-70 was Rs. 0.28 lakhs and Rs. 0.88 lakhs respectively. During 1968-69, 12 and during 1969-70, 17 institutions were benefited under this scheme.

H) Labour and Labour Welfare :

A) Technical and Vocational Training :

The funds were placed with the Industrial Training Institute Sangli, for construction of building and providing additional seats. Work of construction is in progress and target of filling the seats was achieved fully. During the respective years, 440 seats were filled in. Expenditure during both the years was satisfactory.

I) Information and Publicity :

A) Rural Broadcasting :

Installation of radio sets in rural areas was undertaken under this programme. During 1968-69, 34 radio sets and during 1969-70, 104 radio sets were installed. Expenditure during 1968-69 was Rs. 0.10 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 0.40 lakhs and during 1969-70 it was Rs. 0.06 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 0.10 lakhs.

4.5 It will be seen from the foregoing facts and figures that the progress of schemes under State sector was comparatively good in 1968-69 and the progress of the schemes under Local Sectors was good in the year 1969-70. This is mainly due to the non-availability of sufficient funds for rural electrification programme under State sector and the transfer of scheme for small holders from State to Local sector in the year 1969-70.
