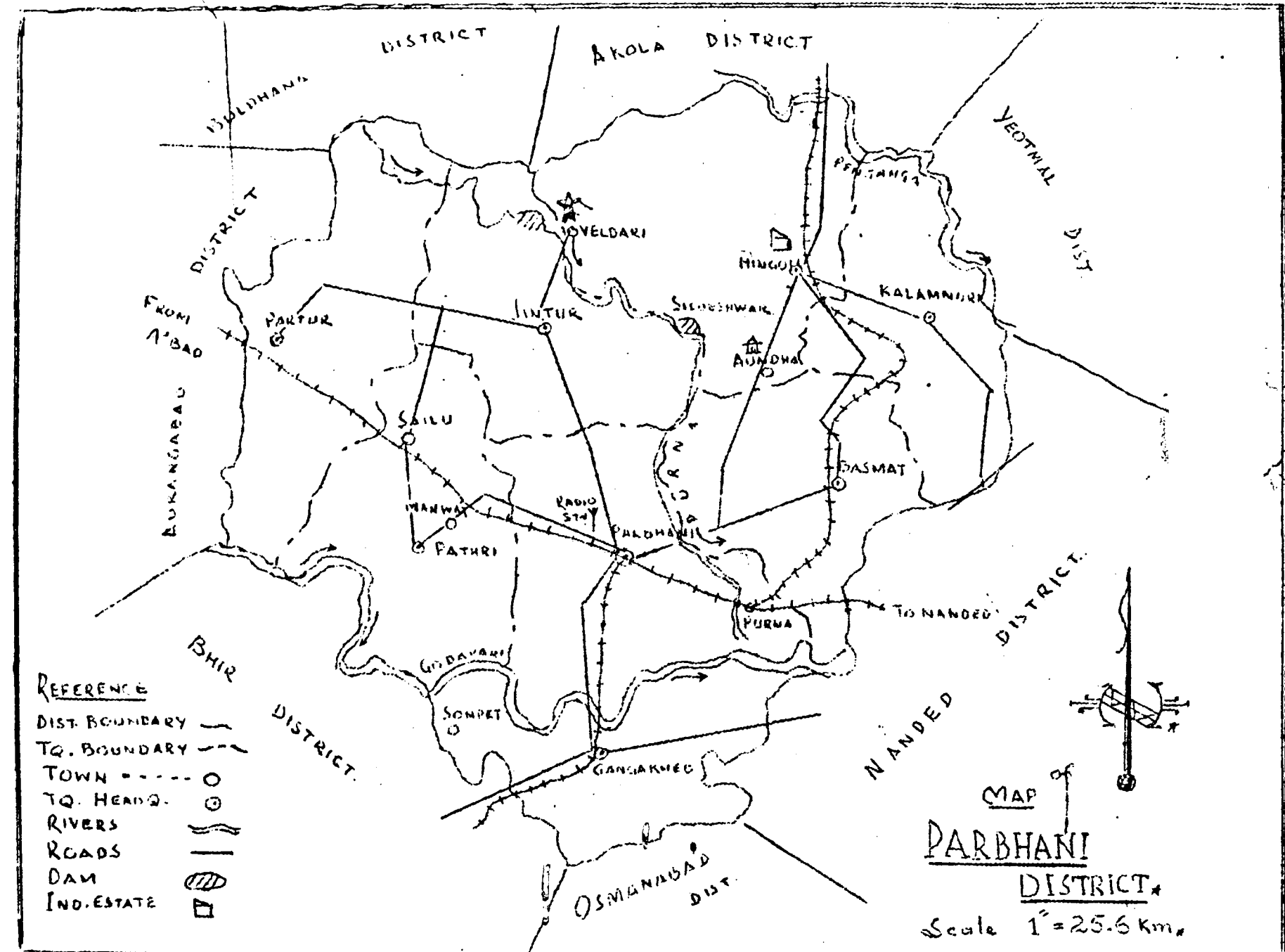

CHAPTER No. I

INTRODUCTION

1.1(1) Introduction and Location:- In ancient times the town Parbhani was known as Prabhavati on account of the existence of a beautiful and massive temple of goddess Prabhavati. Out of the twelve Jotirlingas in the country and 3 in Marathwada region, the district is sanctified by the existence of Jotirling namely Lord Nagnath at Aundha village in Hingoli taluka.

1.1(2) Parbhani district with an east-west of 128.72 km. (80 miles) and north-south extension of 104.58 km (65 miles), stretches between $18^{\circ}58'$ and $20^{\circ}2'$ north latitude and between $76^{\circ}4'$ and $77^{\circ}4'$ east longitude. The district as a whole belongs to the Godavari peninsular basin situated on the northern side of Marathwada region. The Godavari has converted southern portion of the district comprising Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed talukas into a very fertile valley. The Purna which is a tributary of the Godavari and the Dudh-ana which is a tributary of the Purna drain the talukas of Jintur and Basmath.

1.2 Boundaries:- In shape, Parbhani is a compact district. It has natural boundaries of the Penganga river with a stretch of 160.93 km. in the north-east and of the Godavari river with a stretch of 64.37 km. in the south-west. Administratively it is bounded on the north by Buldhana, Akola and Yestmal districts of Vidarbha region and on the east by Nanded district on the south it is surrounded by Osmanabad and Bhir districts and on the west by Aurangabad district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up

1.3(1) The district consists of eight talukas namely, Partur, Jintur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri, Pathri, Parbhani, Basmath and Gangakhed. Of these, Parbhani taluka is in the centre with Gangakhed on the south, Pathri and Partur on the west, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri on the north and Basmath on the east.

1.3(2) For administrative convenience the district has been divided into two sub-divisions, namely, Sailu and Hingoli each covering four talukas. While Parbhani, Gangakhed, Pathri and Partur talukas fall under the jurisdiction of Sailu sub-division, the remaining four form part of the Hingoli sub-division. The Collector and Tahsildars are the heads of the general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies in the district and talukas respectively. The Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis execute developmental and administrative functions to the extent of subjects transferred to them including Community Development Programme since the advent of Panchayat Raj on 1-5-1962 in the State.

1.3(3) There are in all 1,577 villages in the district of which 60 are un-inhabited. It is also worth mentioning that in this district there are 12 towns administered by the Municipal Councils. Out of the 12 towns three are in Pathri taluka, two each in Gangakhed & Parbhani talukas and one each all being taluka headquarters, in the remaining 5 talukas. In all population of 1,66,702 persons live in the 1,577 villages. 12 towns whereas 10,39,534 persons in the 1,577 villages.

1.4 Area

1.4(1) Parbhani District stretches over an area of 12,552.9 square kilometres (4,846.7 sq. miles) of which 12,321.9 sq. kilometres (4,757.5 miles) is rural and the remaining 231.0 square kilometres (89.2 sq. miles) urban. In terms of area and population respectively it is the eleventh and nineteenth largest district in Maharashtra State. The district accounts for 4.1% and 3.0% of the State's area and population respectively according to 1961 census.

1.4(2) Territorial changes:- During 1905, the northern villages of Nanded taluka of Nanded district were added to Kalamnuri taluka of this district. Besides, eight villages from Ambal taluka of Aurangabad district were transferred to Pathri taluka of this district in exchange of six villages of Pathri taluka transferred to Ambal taluka of Aurangabad district. Thereafter there were no territorial changes till the end of 1955. Consequent upon the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956, the district was transferred to the then Bombay State. Since 1st May, 1960 it forms part of Maharashtra State and Aurangabad revenue division.

1.5 Topography:- As a part of the Deccan plateau, the land of the district has a general elevation of about 457.60 metres (1,500 ft) above the sea level, its highest and lowest levels being 579.73 metres (1902 ft) in the Jintur range, about 12.87 km (8 miles) north of Charthana village and lowest level being around 366.0 metres (1200 ft.) above sea level on the Golavari bank near the point where the river crosses over the district boundary. The talukas of Pathri, Jintur (except northern part), Gangakhed and Parbhani are

plain topographically, while the talukas of Jintur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri and northern parts of Basmath and Partur tahsils are all hilly and mountainous in nature.

1.6 Hills:-

1.6(1) The main hill ranges of the district are Ajantha hills which emanate from the main Sahyadris. These run through Partur, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas. The crest line consists of flat tops with an average elevation of 534 metres (1750 ft.) above sea level.

1.6(2) Malhura Hills:- These are west-east hill ranges separating the Penganga valley from that of Kaidhu to its south. The tops record heights ranging between 542 metres (1775 ft.) in the west and 488 metres (1600 ft.) in the east.

1.6(3) Balaghat Hills:- A section of Balaghat range transverse member of Sahyadris, stretches over the southern portion of the district comprising Gangakhed taluka. Its general elevation is 534 metres (1750 ft.) with a few peaks, recording heights above 549 metres (1800 ft.).

1.6(4) Isolated Hills:- These stand mainly in the undulating black soil plain of the Golavari and the Purna rivers having an average height of 468 metres (1533 ft.).

1.6(5) River System:- (1) The Godavari is the most important river of the district. With its entrenched and meandering course it is the master stream that flows through Marathwada to enrich its economic resources, but at the same time impeding its communications. It winds its course into the district from west and after running a distance of about 180 km. (112 miles) through Gangakhed taluka, enters the adjoining district of Nanded.

The Purna rises from the Ajanta hills and enters the district from the north-west corner, makes its course in the south-eastern direction for major length through Jintur, Hingoli, Basmath and Parbhani talukas and then falls into the Godavari. The river Dudhna takes its rise in the amphitheatre of Khuldiabad-Mhaismal range runs into the district in the south-eastern direction like the Purna for nearly 161 km. (100 miles) to join it. The Penganga river also rises in the Ajanta hills a little to the south-west of Buldhana town and winds its course in the likewise manner. Its distinctive feature over other rivers is that all along its course of about 80 km. (50 miles) it acts as a district boundary. The river Kaidu popularly known as Kaidhu enters the Hingoli taluka after rising from the hills scraps south of Risod town in Akola district and covers a distance of about 113 km. (70 miles) in Hingoli and Kalamhari talukas.

(2) Besides, there are several minor streams in the district more important amongst which are the Karpara, the Kansur, the Wan, the Borna, the Macchili, the Galati, the Indrayanl and the Dhond all being the tributaries of the Godavari.

1.6(6) Soil :- The soil of the district is known as "Black Cotton" soil or "Regur" as it is popularly called and is formed by withering of the trap rock. The district is essentially a region of black soil gully erosion, uneven surface, furrowed by large and small streams and meandering water course. The uneven black soil plain is, however, interrupted by occasional basaltic knolls. The soil is rich in plant nutrients such as Lime, Magnesia, Iron, Alkalies. It swells and becomes sticky on wetting by rains and develops

several craks while becoming dry. It varies widely in texture and depth from place to place. In the hilly tracks in the north it is shallow and poor, while towards the south it is relatively richer and deeper. In the Godavari and the Purna valleys and especially along the courses of these rivers it is very deep and fertile making the central belt an economically well developed part of the district.

1.6(7) Minerals:- The district is devoid of any mineral wealth worth the name. Inferior quality of stone used for construction of buildings and other minor minerals are, however extracted in this district. Black asphalt and granite are available every where and are used for buildings and road metalling.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall:-

1.7(1) Climate:- The climate of the district is generally dry except during the south-west Monsoon season. The year is divided into 3 seasons, rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of September. It is followed by cool dry season from October to February and hot dry season from March to May.

1.7(2) Temperature:- The only meteorological observatory in the district is at Parbhani. The temperature and other meteorological data at this station may be taken as representative of the conditions over the district as a whole.

The mean maximum temperature during the hot season touched 44.6 centigrade in the month of June in the year 1968 and 42.3° centigrade in the month of May in the year 1969.

Mean minimum temperature for cool dry season during the year 1968 was 13.4° in the month of January whereas the same was 13.3° centigrade in the month of December.

The cold weather commences towards the end of November when temperature begins to fall. From February onwards the temperature starts rising till the commencement of rainy season. The table below gives the seasonwise mean maximum, mean minimum temperature at Parbhani station during the year 1968 and 1969.

17(3) Rainfall:- The rainfall is not uniform in all the parts of the district. The average rainfall gradually increases as we go from west to east. The rain starts about the first week of June and lasts till the end of September. The District gets the bulk of rainfall from the south-west Monsoons.

From mid October to December it usually receives rainfall through north-east monsoons. The normal rainfall in the district is 826.6 mm. The table below gives the talukawise rainfall and rainy days during the year 1968 and 1969.

During the year 1968 only Hingoli and Basmath received rainfall above the district normal whereas all talukas excepting Gangakhed and Partur received rainfall above the district normal in 1969. Rainfall is unevenly distributed in the various parts of the district. The western part, particularly Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas, receives maximum rainfall as compared to eastern part i.e Pathri and Partur talukas of the district. The maximum rainfall of 279.7^{mm} was received in the month of July in the year 1968, whereas the same was 340.0mm in the month of September in the year 1969. Both average number of rainy days and average rainfall were more in the year 1969 than in the year 1968.

CHAPTER-II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATISTICS IN THE STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

1. Purpose:- The Abstract part of the publication gives exhaustive statistics on important socio-economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important subjects are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Attempts have been made to present talukwise data as far as possible to enable the reader to know the stage of development reached in the various parts of the district. In the last publication data for 1967-68 was indicated with data for 1966-67 (already published) for comparison. Since the present Abstract is a combined one for two years viz. 1968-69 and 1969-70, data in most of the tables is appearing for the above two years for the first time. In a few cases such as population and livestock statistics data for the latest census and in respect of agriculture, and some tables on education data for 1968-69 and 1969-70 has been shown. As usual, the data is collected from officers concerned of the State Government, Central Government, Local Bodies and other agencies. The foot-notes shown below the tables indicate the source from which data has been collected.

District At-A-Glance:- This table gives data on all important items in order to have a birds-eye-view of the socio-economic indicators of the district compared to Aurangabad division. Items covered in the table are area and population, agriculture, animal husbandry, industries, electricity,

co-operation, medical and health, education, ~~transport and commu-~~nication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table. The contents of the tables in the Abstract part and the scope and limitations of the data presented therein are summarised below:-

1. Climate and Rainfall:- Table Nos.1 & 2 deal with number of rainy days and rainfall and monthly temperature at the selected centres in the district. Table No.1 shows monthly and annual rainfall and number of rainy days, for the years 1968 and 1969 as recorded at the 8 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters. The data reported by the tahsildars in the district is presented in the table. Separate annual rainfall is shown for each centre.

The table dealing with temperature indicates monthwise mean, mean-maximum and mean-minimum temperature at district headquarters Parbhani for the years 1968 and 1969. Mean maximum temperature denotes average of maximum daily temperature recorded in a month. Similarly, mean-minimum temperature stands for average of minimum temperature recorded on each day during a particular month. There is only one meteorological centre at Parbhani in this district.

2. Area and Population:- Table Nos.3 to 8 deal with talukawise rural and urban population, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers population according to age groups, mother-tongue and religion and scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population as enumerated during 1961 census, the reference for which was 1st March 1961.

The table on talukawise rural and urban population indicates sexwise population of the district during 1951 and 1961 censuses. The variations in population over 1951 census is also given in percentages for rural, urban and total population. The population figures for the earlier census (1951) shown in the table have been adjusted for boundaries or areas of the district and the talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 census. The table dealing with classification of villages according to population ranges gives number of villages in population ranges 0-199, 200-499, 500-999, 1000-1999, 2000-4999, 5000-9999 and 10,000 and above population in each taluka of Parbhani district. The term village denotes a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. Table dealing urban areas indicates classification of town according to population ranges. A town or a urban area indicated in the table is a place which has a municipality or a population of 5000 or more persons and at least 75% of male population depending on "non-agricultural occupations". Rural area is the difference between the total area and the urban area. The table dealing with workers and non-workers in each taluka of the district shows number of workers and non-workers in rural and urban areas also. The classification of the worker is as per livelihood classes emphasising broadly the nature of their work. The workers as shown in the table according to livelihood classes are the persons who were at work for more than an hour a day throughout the greater part of the season in case of seasonal works like cultivation, livestock, dairying and household industries etc. and for any of the 15 days preceding the day of enumerators' visit to the

household in case of regular employment in trade, profession, service, business or commerce. A person who was working but was absent from his work during the 15 days preceding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of 15 days due to illness or other causes has been treated as worker. The non-workers shown in the table are persons who were not gainfully employed in any occupations or who have not participated in any productive work in any occupation. A person who had been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as non-worker. The table No.7 gives the distribution of population according to age-group, mother tongue and religion. This classification according to above 3 categories is shown for both rural and urban areas of the district. No talukawise figures are indicated in this table. The table on sex-wise population on scheduled castes and scheduled tribes indicates total, rural and urban population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the district.

3. Agriculture:- Table Nos.9 to 19 deal with land utilization statistics, area under different crops, yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops, area irrigated by different sources, area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells, number of minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects in the district, agricultural wage rates, agricultural implements and famine and scarcity data. The table on land utilization gives distribution of total geographical area in each taluka of the district according to various land uses for years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The major items constituting geographical area shown in the table are forests, area not available for cultivation, other un-cultivated area

excluding fallows and net area sown. The ~~gross sown area~~ and the area sown more than once are also indicated in the table. The table dealing with area under different crops indicates talukawise area under different crops grown in the district during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The grouping of the crops into food crops, non-food crops and also into cereals, pulses, condiments and spices, fibres, oil-seeds and drugs & narcotics is also made in the table. The total net cultivated area under different crops together with area cropped more than once and gross cropped area are also shown. The table dealing with yield and out-turn of principal crops in the district shows yield per hectare in kilogram and out-turn (in metric tonnes) of the principal crops of the district for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The table dealing with irrigated area gives talukawise irrigated area by different sources of irrigation for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. Talukawise net area irrigated and gross area irrigated is also shown in this table.

In another table dealing with irrigation, area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69 is shown.

Table No.14 deals with number of irrigation wells in use and not in use in each taluka of Parbhani district during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. Table No.15 and 16 deal with minor irrigation works and major and medium irrigation works respectively. The position of minor irrigation works as on 31st March 1969 are shown while for the major and medium irrigation works the position as on 31st March, 1970 is indicated in table No.15 and 16 respectively.

Minor irrigation works are shown according to administrative jurisdiction of the works such as Zilla Parishad, State sector, Private and Cooperative. The net area irrigated by these works is also indicated in the table. The table dealing with major and medium irrigation projects, however, gives project-wise details such as name, location, year of completion, height of the dam, length of the canal, storage capacity, area under command and area irrigated. There is only one major project namely "Purna Project" in this district. There is no medium project in the district. The table on agricultural wage rates gives monthwise agricultural wage rates of skilled and un-skilled agricultural labourers at the 3 selected centres viz. Palam, Mantha and Kanergaon Naka in the district for the years 1968 and 1969.

Table No.13 shows number of agricultural implements in each taluka of Parbhani district as per 1961 Livestock Census. Agricultural implements covered in the table are ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers, oil engines, electric pumps, Tractors, and oil Ghanis.

Table No.19 deals with famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data in Parbhani district for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

4. Animal Husbandry:- Table Nos.20 to 23 indicate livestock census data, veterinary statistics, disease wise livestock mortality and number of animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in Parbhani district. The table dealing with livestock census 1966 gives number of livestock in each taluka of Parbhani district by categories such as cattle,

buffaloes, sheep and goats etc. besides poultry population.

Sexwise and agegroup-wise classification of cattle and buffaloes is also indicated in the table.

The table on veterinary statistics depicts number of veterinary hospitals/dispensaries/aid-centres in each taluka of Parbhani district and animals treated therein during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Also shown in the table are number of artificial insemination centres and animals inseminated during 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The next table in this group indicates attacks and deaths due to important contagious and parasitic livestock diseases during 1968-69 and 1969-70 which have been classified into bovine diseases, diseases of sheep and goats and diseases of poultry.

The table on slaughter house statistics gives total number of animals slaughtered by categories in each of the 3 recognised slaughter-houses in the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70. Animals covered in the table are cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goats and pigs.

5. Forests and Fisheries:- Table Nos.24(a) and 24(b) deal with rangewise forest area in hectares and major and minor forest products respectively in Parbhani district.

The table dealing with rangewise forest area gives classification of forests into reserved, protected and unclassed for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. There is only one range namely Hingoli in this district. Classification of forest area according to administrative jurisdiction is also indicated in the table.

The table on major and minor forest ~~products shows quantity~~ and value of forest produce extracted in the district during 1963-69 and 1969-70. Major forest produce covered in the table are timber fuel and sandal wood while minor forest products covered in the table are bamboo and grass.

6. Employment and Industries:- Table Nos.25 to 32 deal with average daily employment in registered factories, industry-wise distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of days worked, employment exchange statistics, occupational distribution of registration and placements, volume of employment in different industries, census of Government employees.

Table dealing with average daily employment indicates strength of factories by categories for the year 1968. ^{and 1969} Sex-wise classification of workers in factories submitting returns is also indicated in the table. Similarly, number of man-days worked in each factory is also shown. The term of factory according to Factory Act 1948 denotes an establishment where 10 or more persons work with power or 20 or more without power.

Table dealing with industrywise distribution of working factories for the year: 1968 ^{and 1969} indicates such distribution for four major groups viz. processes allied to agriculture, food except beverages, wood and cork except furniture and transport equipment, according to working strength also.

Table on distribution of factories according to number of days worked during 1968 ^{and 1969} gives such distribution according to major categories of industries namely processes allied to agriculture, food except beverages and transport

equipments. The groups of number of days worked shown in the table are less than 60, 60-120, 121-180, 181-240, 241-300 and more than 300 days.

Table on employment exchange gives number of registrations vacancies notified and number of placements during 1963-69 and 1969-70. Classification of placements in public and private sectors and scheduled castes and scheduled tribes is also indicated in the table.

Table dealing with occupational distribution indicates registrations and placements according to national classification of occupations for the years 1963-69 and 1969-70.

Table on volume of employment indicates employment in important categories of industries as it stood at the end of March 1969 and 1970. Number of reporting establishments are also shown in this table with separate figures of employees in public and private sectors.

Table number 31 dealing with census of government employees conducted on 1-7-1966 indicates number of employees according to pay as well as emoluments ranges and their classification into gazetted class I and class II and non-gazetted class III and class IV categories.

Table No. 32 is another table pertaining to census of government employees 1966 which indicates number of employees in Parbhani district according to administrative departments.

7. Electricity:- Table Nos 33 and 34 deal with generation and consumption of electricity and number of towns and villages electrified in Parbhani district.

Table dealing with generation and ~~consumption of electrical~~ city gives details regarding electricity generated, purchased and consumption of electrical energy for various purposes separately for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Type of generation is also indicated in the table. Separate details of Hydro-electricity generated are not, however, shown in the table.

The table on towns and villages electrified indicates the number of towns and villages electrified as at the end of March 1961, 1966, 1969 and 1970. Population of the towns and villages electrified is also indicated in the table.

8. Co-operation:- Table Nos. 35 to 42 deal with cooperative statistics such as number of different types of cooperative societies, statistics of cooperative banks, primary agricultural credit societies, other cooperative societies, operations of primary cooperative marketing societies and the regulated markets and the statistics relating to money-lenders.

The first table concerning the subject gives summary of the cooperative institutions in the district as on 31st March 1970. The cooperative societies have been first classified into four broad categories. First two types are agricultural credit and non-agricultural credit under credit sector and the other two are non-agricultural credit and non-agricultural non-credit under non-credit sector. Under each category number of individual type of societies have been shown.

Table dealing with statistics of cooperative banks gives number of branches of District Central Co-operative Banks, District Industrial Co-operative Banks, District Development Bank and Urban Bank alongwith particulars of memberships, share capital, working capital, reserved and other funds and also

the loans advanced by them during 1968-69 and 1969-70. Table dealing with primary agricultural credit societies gives talukawise number of such societies and their memberships during 1968-69 and 1969-70. The amount of share capital, reserve and other funds and working capital of these societies is also indicated in the table. Loans advanced by these societies and loans recovered, outstanding and over due are also shown separately.

In table No.33 operations of cooperative societies other than primary agricultural credit and banks are shown. The table gives number of such societies by categories for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Data relating to membership, share capital and reserve funds and working capital of the societies is also indicated in the table.

Table on operations of primary cooperative societies shows value of purchases and sales of cooperative marketing Societies in each taluka of Parbhani district alongwith separate figures for district level cooperative marketing societies for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Agricultural produce, agricultural requisites and consumers' goods are the constituents of the purchases by the cooperative marketing societies. Separate figures for value of sales as owner and as agents are also furnished in this table.

Table No.40 deals with operations of other cooperative societies, indicating societywise achievements under important items during 1968-69 and 1969-70 in the district.

Table dealing with operations of regulated markets reveals arrivals in metric tonnes and value in thousands rupees at

the 12 regulated markets in Parbhani district ~~during 1968-69~~ and 1969-70. All important crops marketed at the regulated markets are covered in this table.

The last table in this group gives number of registered money lenders in each taluka of Parbhani district and loans advanced by them during 1963-69 and 1969-70. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are also furnished in this table.

9. Medical & Public Health:- Table Nos.43,44,45 and 46 deal with medical facilities available in the district, vital statistics relating to births and deaths and infant mortality, number of deaths due to important causes and vaccination statistics.

Table on medical facilities gives number of hospitals/dispensaries/Primary Health Centres and other types of dispensaries in each taluka of Parbhani district and indoor and outdoor patients treated in them during 1968 and 1969. Data relating to number of beds, doctors and nurses is also indicated in the table.

Table regarding vital statistics indicates talukawise figures of births and deaths, infant deaths registered in Parbhani district during 1968 and 1969 sex-wise details for talukas is also indicated for the year 1969. Table on deaths due to important causes shows the distribution of deaths registered in the district due to important diseases/causes during 1968 and 1969. Talukawise details are not given in this table.

Table No.46 provides figures of vaccinations, re-vaccinations and cholera inoculations in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1968 and 1969.

Separate figures for primary vaccinations below ~~one year~~ and above one year are also given in the table.

10. Education:- Table Nos.47 to 54 cover data on literacy, education in rural areas and urban areas, educational institutions with strength of pupils and teachers therein, beneficiaries from backward classes, expenditure on primary education and classification of villages without school.

Table dealing with literacy gives number of literates and also percentages of literacy in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1961 census. As per 1961 census definition, a person was classified as literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. Separate sexwise figures for rural and urban areas are shown in the table.

Table on education in rural areas gives talukawise details of literacy in rural areas according to various educational standards as per 1961 census. Sex-wise data is indicated for each categories of educational level.

Table on education in urban areas gives classification of literates in urban areas according to various educational levels as per 1961 census. Data on the number of persons holding various technical qualifications is also indicated in the table separately. No talukawise figures are given in this table. The next table on the subject gives talukawise number of various educational institutions, number of pupils(boys & girls) and number of teachers(trained and un-trained) in the district during 1967-68 and 1968-69.

Table dealing with beneficiaries amongst backward classes indicates such number for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69

according to various levels of education ~~for Parbhani district~~ as a whole. Figures for boys and girls are given separately for scheduled castes, ~~scheduled tribes and other backward~~ classes.

Table on concessions to economically backward classes gives number of beneficiaries and the amount of concessions separately for primary, secondary and higher institutions for the years 1961-62, 1966-67, 1967-68 and 1968-69. Classification of beneficiaries from higher institutions according to various courses is also indicated in the table. No taluka-wise data is given in the table.

Table on expenditure on primary education gives the agencywise expenditure for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Break up of normal and plan expenditure are shown separately along with details of recurring and non-recurring expenditure. No talukawise data is indicated in this table.

The last table on education provides number of villages without schools or schooling facilities in each taluka of Parbhani district as at the end of 1968-69 and 1969-70. Villages without schools have been shown according to population groups.

11. Transport and Communication :- Table Nos 55 to 61 deal with railway length, road length, motor vehicles in operation statistics on nationalised road transport, traffic census data, postal statistics and rural broadcasting statistics.

Table on length of railway routes gives such length as at the end of 1968-69 and 1969-70 according to categories.

Only meter gauge line exists in Parbhani district.

Table on motor vehicles in operation gives figures of motor vehicles according to various categories for Aurangabad region as a whole for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Separate figures for the district are not available.

Table on nationalised transport indicates the number of state transport routes, route distance, vehicles on road per day, average daily earnings and number of passengers travelled per day as at the end of 1963-69 and 1969-70. Important averages such as average routes distance, service distance, earnings per vehicle per day are also indicated in the table. The table on traffic census gives number of vehicles according to categories enumerated on important roads along with location of the count post. Type of surface and the total traffic intensity in ^{tone} ~~tonnes~~ per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

Table dealing with postal statistics provides data on number of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, postmen, telephone connections and number of radio licenses issued and renewed in Parbhani district as a whole in the years 1961-62, 1963-64 and 1969-70.

The last table in the group bearing number 61 indicates talukwise data relating to number of villages provided with rural radio sets with population covered by the facility for the year 1963-69 and 1969-70. The number of radio farm forums is also indicated in the table.

12. Local Bodies:- Table Nos 62 to 65 deal with income and expenditure of local bodies.

Table No.62 gives abstract of income and expenditure of the 3 types of local bodies viz. Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The number of village panchayats and municipalities is also indicated in the table.

The next table in the group gives figures of talukawise income and expenditure of village panchayats according to sources of income and important items of expenditure for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Table on receipts of Zilla Parishad, Parbhani during 1968-69 and 1969-70 gives figures of revenue and debt section separately. Grants from Government for different purposes have been shown separately. Table on expenditure side of the Zilla Parishad indicates figures of expenditure for revenue and debt section separately for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Break-up of revenue expenditure on important heads is also indicated in this table.

13. Plan and Community Development Programme:- This group has been covered in table Nos.66 to 70. These tables indicate expenditure and physical achievements under annual plans of 1968-69 and 1969-70 and also under the community development programme. Each table deals with expenditure and physical achievements separately in respect of both the above programmes. The first table of the group deals with sub-headwise expenditure incurred in the annual plan 1968-69 and 1969-70 in Parbhani district indicating separate figures for state and local sectors.

The next table shows physical achievements under important items of development during the period 1968-69 and 1969-70 separately.

Table on Community Development Programme gives number of villages with area and population covered by various types of blocks such as Stage I, Stage II, and Post-stage II etc. The number of C.P.A pattern is also indicated in the table. The C.P.A pattern denotes size of the block.

Table on expenditure under community development programme gives stagewise expenditure for each block upto 31st March 1968 during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 and upto the end of 31st March 1970.

Table on physical achievements indicates blockwise important achievements under community development programme for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

14. Prices:- Table No 71, 72-A and 72-B deal with average retail prices and consumer price indices for working class in Aurangabad and Nanded centres.

Table on average retail prices gives monthly average prices of 49 important commodities of day-to-day consumption for the years 1968 and 1969. The varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted have also been indicated in the table.

Table Nos. 72-A and 72-B on consumer price index of working class at Aurangabad and Nanded centres gives monthly indices for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 alongwith average for the preceding year i.e 1967-68 for facilitating comparison. Separate indices are shown for food, fuel and light and clothing.

15. Judicial and Administrative:- Table Nos.73 to 75 deal with police force and crime statistics and statistics relating to civil and criminal courts.

Table No.73 indicates strength of police force by categories for the years 1968 and 1969. Table provides separate figures for permanent and temporary staff.

Table on crime statistics gives number of persons tried, convicted and acquitted under various categories of offences for the years 1968 and 1969. Data for cognizable and non-cognizable offences are separately indicated.

Table dealing with court statistics gives the number of civil and criminal cases original and appellate nature decided in the various courts in Parbhani district during 1968 and 1969. Separate figures for regular and miscellaneous type of cases are also indicated in the table.

16. Miscellaneous:- Table Nos.76 to 84 deal with statistics relating to Banking, Joint Stock Companies, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue collections, Presses and journals, general election and trends in selected indicators.

Table dealing with statistics pertaining to cinemas, indicates number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1968-69 and 1969-70. The table also provides information on seating capacity of the theatres.

Table on banks gives total number of towns and villages having banking offices and population covered by them as at the beginning of 1969. Classification of banks into scheduled, cooperative and others is also indicated in the table. The next table pertains to Joint Stock Companies which gives

number of Joint Stock Companies by types as on 31-3-1969

The table on insurance gives data on number of policies issued and amount insured thereof during the years 1968-69 & 1969-70.

Table on investment under small savings gives figures of gross collection and net collection alongwith withdrawals under various small savings schemes during the years 1963-69 & 1969-70. The target fixed for the district under all the schemes of small savings is also shown in the table. No talukawise data is indicated in this table.

Table on land revenue gives figures of demand and collection for each taluka of Parbhani district for the years 1963-69 and 1969-70. Arrears at the beginning and at the end of the years are also shown.

Table on presses and journals gives talukawise number of printing presses, daily weekly and monthly news-papers and periodicals published in Parbhani district as at the end of the years 1963-69 and 1969-70. Language wise classifications of the news-papers and periodicals are indicated in the table. The next table in the group deals with the data on general election 1967 in the district. It gives constituencywise number of electorates, electors who voted and percentage of votes polled for Parliamentary and Assembly Elections separately. Sex-wise break-up of electors who voted and partywise votes polled are also shown in the table.

The last table of this group deals with trends in selected important indicators of development. Achievements under 13 important items sub-divided into many sub-items are indicated in this table for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 and 1969-70 for facilitating easy appraisal of the achievements under the five year plans and subsequent annual plans. The data for population relates to 1951 and 1961 censuses while livestock data pertains to 1956, 1961 and 1966 livestock censuses. Rest of the data is extracted from relevant tables of the Abstract.

Indicator No.1

Percentage of Gross cropped area to net area sown.

1.1 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates the extent of double cropping. During the year 1968-69 the percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown was 108.8, while during 1960-61 it was 104.2. Thus the percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown had increased by 4.4% during 1968-69, in Parbhani district.

1.2 The table below shows the percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in different talukas of the district.

1.3 The figures in the above table indicate that during the year 1968-69 the double cropped area increased by 6.8%, 5.5%, 2.1%, 2.5%, 3.6% and 2.2% in Partur, Jintur, Kalamnuri, Pathri,

Basmath and Gangakhed talukas respectively, as compared to the year 1960-61 while, in Hingoli taluka the area under double crops decreased.

1.4 It is evident that the area put under double crop varies from one taluka to another in the district.

1.5 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown was highest in Parbhani taluka i.e 113.4% and lowest in Hingoli taluka i.e 103.3% during the year 1968-69, whereas in 1960-61 the highest percentage was in Jintur taluka and lowest in Basmath taluka.

Indicator No.2

Productivity of important crops

2.1 Productivity of crops depend upon number of factors important among them are the nature of soil, balanced rainfall, availability of irrigational facilities and the agricultural methods that are followed by the agriculturists. In Parbhani district the productivity of crops is very much influenced by the natural rainfall i.e in general crops are said to be good when there are on the whole fairly proportionate and evenly distributed rains in the district.

2.2 In Parbhani district the out-turn of total cereals increased by 10.8% during the year 1968-69 over the agricultural year 1961-62. The out-turn and yield per hectare of individual crops like rice and bajra increased by 2.2% and 30.1% and 39.0% and 31.8% respectively in the year 1968-69 over 1961-62, whereas the yield per hectare of jowar increased 14.4% but the outturn has decreased by 53.2% during the same period.

The table below shows the yield per hectare and outturn of important crops in this district.

2.3 From the above table it may be seen that the yield per hectare of rice, jowar and bajra has increased by 39.0%, 14.4% & 31.8% respectively during the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. Whereas the yield per hectare of wheat decreased by 14.4% over the same period. The yield per hectare of cereals in the year 1968-69 increased by 9.9% over the year 1961-62. The yield per hectare of some pulses like tur increased by 50.2% during 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. The yield per hectare of total pulses increased by 36.5% over the same period.

Among other crops the outturn of sugarcane (in terms of gur) increased remarkably i.e. by 96.8% and the yield per hectare increased by 106.4% during the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. The yield per hectare of cotton and groundnut increased by 117.1% and 29.1% respectively during 1968-69 over the year 1961-62.

2.4 Among cereals with the exception of rice and Bajra the outturn of other cereals has decreased in the year 1968-69 over 1961-62. However, the total production of cereals increased by 1.3% in the same year. Total outturn of pulses in 1968-69 was 57.9% above the level of production of pulses in the year 1961-62. Among the non-food crops the outturn of cotton and groundnut both decreased by 56.7% and 68.4% respectively in 1968-69 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No.3

Gross value of agricultural production

3.1 The value of agricultural production is the major constituent of the total income of the district. The changes in the gross value of agricultural production influences the economy of the district greatly.

3.2 The gross value of agricultural production in Parbhani district decreased from Rs.3,164.45 lakhs in the year 1967-68 to Rs.2,871.90 lakhs in the year 1968-69 indicating a decline of the order of 9.2%. However as compared to gross value of agricultural production for the year 1960-61 i.e. 2,026.69 lakhs the gross value of agricultural production indicates 41.7% increase in the year 1968-69.

The decrease in 1968-69 was due to sharp fall in production of jowar and to some extent of cotton and groundnut.

3.3 The commoditywise increases&decreases in the gross value of production have been indicated in the table given below:-

* The figures in respect of individual crops are not available hence the comparison of 1961-62 figures have not been made with the 1968-69.

3.4 ~~It may be seen from the above table that among cereals~~ the gross value of production, of rice, wheat and bajra has increased during 1968-69 over the year 1967-68. Among pulses the gross value of all the pulses have decreased in the year 1968-69 over the year 1967-68. This was partly the result of the fall in the prices of pulses and partly due to the slight decline in the production of urid and masur. The gross value of sugarcane, increased significantly indicating a rise of the order of 126.9% during 1968-69 over the year 1967-68. This was due to rise in both the production as well as the prices of sugarcane (gur). The gross value of produce such as cotton, groundnut, chillies and sesamum have gone down in the year 1968-69 over the year 1967-68. The decline in the gross value of produce of these commodities was owing to decline in the production of cotton, groundnut sesamum and due to decline in prices in case of chillies in the year 1968-69 over the year 1967-68.

Indicator No.4

Percentage of irrigated area:-

4.1 Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area and the percentage of net irrigated ^{area} to net area sown indicate the extent of double irrigation and the ratio of net irrigated area to net area sown.

4.2 During the year 1961-62 there was no double irrigated area in this district. In 1968-69 ^{the} area irrigated more than once in Parbhani district was 105 hectares, whereas during 1967-68 the area under double irrigation was only 68 hectares of land. This means that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area increased by 0.2% in the year 1968-69 over the 1967-68.

Only Partur and Kalamnuri talukas of this district have shown an increase in the area irrigated more than once. In remaining talukas no area was put under double irrigation.

4.3 The practice of double irrigation does not appear to have taken roots in the district.

4.4 During the year 1961-62 the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 1.22%. However, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 2.27% during the year 1968-69 as against 2.03% during 1967-68. Thus there was an increase of 1.05% in the net area irrigated in 1968-69 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No.5

Changes in the cropping pattern

5.1 The cropping pattern in the district is very much influenced by the availability of irrigational facilities and also by the agricultural methods that are followed by the cultivators. The agricultural progress can be adjudged by the cropping pattern prevailing in a particular area. Cropping pattern is said to be rich when the cash crops are grown on a larger scale.

5.2 In Parbhani district the percentage of total food crops was 65.2% in 1961-62 and 64.5% in 1968-69, while the percentage of non-food crops was 34.7% and 35.4% during the respective years. It is evident from these figures that the cropping pattern in the district is poor, because the food crops dominate the area under agriculture. The table below shows the percentage of area under important food crops and also the percentages of irrigated area under food crops and non-food crops.

5.3 The above figures indicate that the percentage of irrigated area under food crops increased from 1.1% in 1961-62 to 2.0% in 1968-69. Similarly, percentage of irrigated area under non-food crops had also increased from 0.01% in 1961-62 to 0.06% in 1968-69. There is a general tendency among the cultivators to grow more food crops than the non-food crops even when the irrigational facilities are made available. It may, therefore, be concluded that the food crops dominate the cropping pattern in this district and there has been no major change in the cropping pattern in 1968-69 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No.6

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production.

6.1 The agricultural credit helps in increasing the agricultural production. The volume of agricultural credit influences the gross value of agricultural production to a certain extent. The credit needs of agriculturists are mainly met by the District Central Co-operative Bank, Land Development Bank and the

Primary Agricultural Societies, in the district.

6.2 The total amount of credit advanced in the district increased to Rs.785.17 lakhs during 1968-69 from Rs.297.97 lakhs in the year 1961-62 indicating an increase of the order of 163.5% over the year 1961-62.

6.3 The loans advanced by the District Land Development Bank and Primary Agricultural Credit societies showed an increase of the order of Rs.434.7% and 162.6% respectively in the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. The loans advanced by the District Central Co-operative Bank also increased by 136.5% during 1968-69 as compared to the year 1961-62.

6.4 The following table shows the total volume of loans advanced by the credit agencies of the district, outstanding dues and the gross values of agricultural production in the district during 1961-62 and 1968-69.

6. From the above figures it is seen that the agricultural credit formed 27.3% of the gross value of agricultural production in the year 1968-69, whereas it was of the order of 14.7% during 1961-62.

Similarly, the outstanding dues also indicate an increase of the order of 234.4% in the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No.7

Agricultural wage rates

7.1 The agricultural wage rates are collected from three selected centres in this district namely from Palam in Gangakhed taluka, Kanergaon Naka in Hingoli taluka and Mantha in Partur taluka.

7.2 The following table shows the average wage rates of different categories of agricultural labour during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 collected from the above centres and also the percentage increase or decrease in the wage rates.

7.3 It may be seen from the above table that the wage rates of skilled labourers indicate considerable variations during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The wage rates of the carpenters decreased by 13.4% at Kanergaon Naka.

Similarly, at Palam the wages of blacksmiths went down by 32.4%. Whereas the wage rates of cobblers at Kanergaon Naka went up by 19.2%. At Palam there has been 100% increase in the wages of skilled labourers.

7.4 Among the three selected centres the increase in wage rates of field and agricultural labourers has been considerably high at Palam centre in Gangakhed taluka as compared to other centres in Hingoli and Partur talukas. It can be inferred from the above table that on an average the agricultural labourers at Palam in Gangakhed taluka are better paid than their counter parts in other centres of Hingoli and Partur talukas.

Indicator No.8

Bovine and Ovine population compared to cultivable area

8.1 Bovine and ovine population constitute a major part of livestock in this district and is a very important source of power to an agriculturist and, therefore, the comparison of bovine and ovine population with the cultivable area indicates its extent of usefulness to the farmers. The following table shows the ratio of bovine and ovine population per hectare of cultivable area.

8.1. From the above table it is evident that during both the years i.e 1967-68 and 1968-69 the ratio of bovine and ovine population to per hectare of cultivable area ^{was} highest in Hingoli taluka i.e 0.80 and 0.82 respectively and lowest in Pathri taluka i.e 0.60 and 0.60 during both the years.

8.3 The percentage increase in the ratio of bovine and ovine population compared to cultivable area noticed during the year 1968-69 ^{was} highest in Jintur taluka and lowest in Basmath taluka i.e 0.51% and 0.12% respectively over the year 1967-68. There has not been any change in the ratio of the bovine and ovine population in Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed talukas during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69.

8.4 The increase in the bovine and ovine population in Hingoli, Jintur, Kalannuri and Basmath talukas ^{was} due to the decrease in the cultivable area during the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1967-68. In other talukas of the district the proportion of (bovine and ovine) remained constant, since the cultivable area remained almost unchanged in those talukas.

Indicator No.9

Poultry compared to population.

9.1 The use of poultry products have a great impact upon the physique of the people because of their high nutritional values and hence the comparison of the poultry population with the persons seems necessary.

9.2 The following table shows the availability of poultry compared with the population of different talukas in this district. Since no latest data for poultry is available for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 the reference has been ^{made} to the census data for the years 1961-66 and 1966 for the purpose of comparison.

9.3 The above table indicates the decrease in the ratio of poultry to per 1000 population in all the talukas of this district barring Kalamnuri taluka as compared to the year 1961. The Kalamnuri taluka had highest poultry ratio of 143 per thousand while Basmath taluka had the lowest ratio of 58 in the year 1966. Whereas in the year 1961 the ratio of poultry per thousand was highest in Gangakhed and the lowest (118) in Kalamnuri. Improvement in the ratio of poultry in Kalamnuri taluka in 1966 appears to be due to ^{the} increase in poultry population in that taluka.

9.4 In general the ratio of poultry per 1000 has decreased from 168 in 1961 to 98 in 1966 due to comparable low growth rate of poultry to the population.

Indicator No.10

Per capita consumption of electricity

10.1 The use of electricity in the area is a symbol of progress and its distribution for the different purposes indicates its nature of consumption and the level of progress made in the district.

10.2 Per capita consumption of electricity in Parbhani district increased from 0.29 KWH in the year 1960-61 to 12.51KWH in the year 1969-70.

10.3 Consumption of electrical power for industrial use amounted to 27.0% of the total consumption of electricity in the district. The use of electricity for agricultural purposes i.e for pumping sets etc. amounted to 42.9%. Thus in the district the rate of consumption of electricity for agricultural purposes was higher than the rate of consumption for industrial use. This means the electrical energy is being extensively utilised for agricultural purposes in the district and indicates the progress of agriculture in the district.

Indicator No.11

Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in the Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

11.1 Employment Exchange plays a vital role as a media for providing employment to the job hunters and by providing different type of suitable labourers to the needy employers. It has been made obligatory upon the employers by the Government to notify the vacancies to the Employment Exchanges of the districts. Therefore the data regarding enrolment of candidates and the vacancies notified to the Employment Exchange give a fairly good idea about the employment potential and the available labour force in the district.

11.2 In Parbhani District the number of registrations made during the year 1969-70 was 5,604 whereas in the year 1960-61 the number was 2,005. This means there was a considerable increase in the number of registrations in 1969-70, as compared to the year 1960-61.

11.3 The number of vacancies notified during the period of 1969-70 was 977 while the number of notified vacancies during the year 1960-61 was 335. Thus there was an increase in the number of vacancies by 191.6% in the year 1969-70 over the year 1960-61.

11.4 The increase in the number of vacancies notified at the employment exchange due to the creation of employment potential in various sectors in the district.

Indicator No.12

Increase in the number of indoor and outdoor patients treated in Hospitals/Dispensaries etc.

12.1 The existence of Hospitals and Dispensaries in the district is very important for the preservation of public health. The number of patients treated both as indoor and outdoor indicates the number of people availing medical facilities at the hospitals, dispensaries and primary health centres etc. and also indicate the success of these institutions in providing medical facilities to the people.

12.2 In Parbhani district the total number of outdoor patients treated in hospitals and dispensaries increased from 3,50,826 in the year 1960 to 6,97,540 in the year 1969, indicating 98.8% increase i.e the number was almost doubled. Whereas the number of indoor patients treated in the year 1969 rose to 8,949 from 3,388 in the year 1960 indicating ^{the} 164.1% increase.

12.3 The number of outdoor patients treated in Parbhani taluka was highest i.e 28.9% compared with the other talukas of the Parbhani district in the year 1969, whereas during 1960 this was 138.7% in Parbhani district. The lowest percentage of persons treated i.e 6.2% was in the talukas of Jintur and Kalamnuri during the year 1969 as against the lowest percentage of

persons treated during 1960 was 4.7% in Partur taluka. Next to Parbhani taluka the percentage of persons treated in Pathri taluka was 21.9% during 1969 as against 19.5% during 1960. In the remaining talukas except Basmath taluka significant change in the number of patients treated was noticed during the year 1969 over the year 1960.

Indicator No. 13

Increase in the number of students in different categories.

13.1 The level of education is judged by the number of students, who receive their education in different types of educational institutions in the district. From the strength of the students the progress of the district in the educational field is also indicated.

13.2 In Parbhani district the total strength of students increased from 88,755 to 1,61,042 indicating an increase of 81.4% in the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. The number of students studying in colleges has increased from 316 to 2,256 in the year 1968-69 indicating an increase of 613.9% over the year 1961-62. Similarly, the strength of students in primary and secondary schools has registered an increase during the year 1968-69 over the year 1961-62 indicating an increase of 79.3%. The number of students receiving education in special institutions has decreased by 17.1% during 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. The following table shows the number of students (sexwise) studying in different categories of institutions in this district.

1.3 From the above table it may be seen that the number of students in pre-primary schools was 203 during 1968-69 whereas this number was 'NIL' during 1961-62. In primary and secondary schools and also in colleges the number of students both male and female has increased during 1968-69 over the year 1961-62. In special institutions the number of male students has declined by 26.9% in 1968-69 over the year 1961-62, whereas the number of girls receiving education in these institutions has increased by 45.9% during the same period.

Indicator No.14

Increase in road length per 100 square kilometre.

14.1 Existence of roads is vital for the quick growth of the economy of the district and the road length per 100 square kilometre indicates the comparative position of roads in the district.

14.2 In Parbhani district the total road length increased from 1,379.67 km in 1968-69 to 1,422.67 km. in 1969-70 indicating an increase of 3.1% over the year 1968-69. The road length per 100 square kilometre increased to 11.33 in 1969-70 as against 10.99 in the year 1968-69. The table below shows road-length per 100 square kilometre in different talukas of the District.

14.3 It may be seen from the above table that the taluka Parbhani has the highest road per 100 square kilometre in the district whereas the lowest is in Jintur taluka. Partur, Hingoli, Pathri and Parbhani has the higher road length per 100 square kilometre than the district average. The percentage increase in the road length is highest i.e 4.6% in Jintur taluka in 1969-70 over the year 1968-69.

Jintur taluka was followed by Kalamnuri, Gangakhed, Rasmath and Partur talukas indicating percentage road increase of 3.5%, 3.3%, 3.1% and 3.0% respectively during 1969-70 over the year 1968-69. It may be inferred from the above figures that the road length is not uniformly spread over in all the talukas of the district.

Indicator No.15

Increase in the Banking facilities in proportion to population

15.1 Banking institutions play a vital role in the economy of the district by providing credit facilities to the needy people on the one hand and by encouraging saving habits among the people on the other. The comparison of banking offices with the population indicates the coverage of average population by each banking office in the area.

15.2 In Parbhani district the total number of banking offices increased from 14 during the year 1961 to 43 during the year 1969 indicating 207.1% increase. Average population served by each bank in the district during the year 1969 was 28,052 as against 86,159 during the year 1961. The table below shows the number of branches of scheduled and co-operative banks functioning and average population covered by them in different talukas of the district.

15.3 From the above table it can be seen that in the year 1969 the average population covered by a bank was higher in Gangakhed and Hingoli talukas than the district average. In remaining talukas the average number of population was less than the average population covered in the district.

Indicator No.16

P r i c e s

16.1 Price variations indicate the extent of the stability of marketable commodities. The study of price trends assumes importance as the variation in prices affect all individuals in one way or the other.

Retail prices were for the first time collected in the year 1963 for all the 12 months in Parbhani district. For the study of retail price trends price relatives for about 47 commodities have been worked out for the year 1968 and 1969 taking the year 1963 as base.

16.2 The following is the table showing the price relatives or simple indices for different commodities in the district.

16.3 From the above table it may be seen that under cereals the prices of rice and jowar indicate upward trend in the year 1969 over the year 1968, whereas the wheat and bajra

have shown downward trend over the same period. Among pulses the prices of about all the pulses have fallen in the year 1969 over the year 1968. In respect of edible oils there has been considerable increase in the prices of these commodities in the year 1969. Similarly, the prices of condiments & spice such as turmeric, dry chillies etc. have shown increasing trend in the year 1969. The vegetable prices, however, indicated slightly downward trend in 1969. Among beverages the price of coffee powder has shown slight increase. Almost all of tea leaf remained almost constant, whereas the items under fuel, power, light and lubricants such as kerosene oil, charcoal, firewood etc. have registered an increasing trend in the year 1969 over the year 1968. Except dhoti, coating and blouse prices the price of other items of clothing have also gone up in the year 1969 over 1968. Among utensils the prices of brass utensils have also shot up.

16.4 Under the items of miscellaneous consumption the prices of washing soap, supari, cigarette, bidi, hair oil have gone up in the year 1969 whereas the prices of pan and tobacco leaf have remained constant. In general, the prices in the year 1969 have indicated an upward trend.

CHAPTER IV
P L A N N I N G

The five year plans aim at the rapid economic development to raise the levels of living, full employment opportunities, optimum utilization of man-power and national resources available. As the fourth five year plan was not finalised, Annual plans were launched since 1966-67. In the Annual plans 1963-69 and 1969-70 most of the schemes from Annual plan 1967-68 were continued and some of the new schemes were introduced. In the following paragraphs an attempt is made to indicate the progress of the district level schemes implemented in this district. The total expenditure on the district level schemes in Parbhani district was Rs.200.352 lakhs and Rs.220.363 lakhs respectively during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The total expenditure on different heads of development on district level schemes in Parbhani district during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 was as under:-

Out of the total expenditure in the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 59.54% and 68.77% expenditure respectively was incurred on the schemes in the State sector whereas 40.46% and 31.23% expenditure was ^{incurrd} respectively on schemes in local sector.

The agricultural programme covered highest per-centage of expenditure i.e 41.83 and 42.37 in both the years whereas the industries and mining covered the least. Agricultural programme received highest priority in the Annual plans 1968-69 and 1969-70.

I. Agricultural Programme:- The agricultural programme includes the following sub-heads of development. The sub-headwise expenditure under this head during 1968-69 and 1969-70 is shown with percentage (bracketted) to the total expenditure under agricultural programme in the following table.

The above table indicates that in the year ~~1968-69, 78.56%~~ expenditure was incurred on State sector schemes and 21.44 on local sector schemes, whereas in the year 1969-70 the percentage of expenditure on State sector and local sector schemes was respectively 82.33 and 17.62%. Major portion of expenditure was incurred on the schemes of minor irrigation (29.62% & 31.21%), soil conservation (45.69% and 40.83%) and ayacut development (14.50% and 17.93%).

The schemes under agricultural production mostly aim at popularizing improved methods for increasing agricultural production. With a view to propagate improved agricultural practices intensive and extensive programme of cultivation was undertaken. The programme of soil conservation was undertaken with a view to stop soil erosion for maintaining natural fertility of soil. During the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 area of 49,733 and 40,123 acres respectively in completed bunding units was banded. The scheme of development of local manurial resources was undertaken during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 and 203 and 1,095 acres area respectively was brought under green manuring. Plant protection measures were undertaken with a view to protect the crops against various pests and diseases. For providing quick irrigation facilities to the cultivators the minor irrigation programme was undertaken in the district. Under this programme loans were advanced for construction of wells and installation of pumping sets. 403 and 254 wells were constructed during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

Co-operation and Community Development:- Under this head two sub-heads namely co-operation and community development are

included. The expenditure on these sub-heads is shown with percentage to the total expenditure under this head in the following table.

Major portion of expenditure was covered by community development i.e 85.24% and 87.84% respectively in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The community development programme provided scope for socio-economic development of rural population of the district. All the schemes under sub-head co-operation were implemented in the state sector whereas all the schemes under sub-head community development were in local sector; 15 C.P.A size blocks were continued during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The schemes under co-operation were implemented with a view to strengthen the cooperative structure in the district to provide easy credit availability and marketing facilities to the agriculturists.

Irrigation and Power:- No district level scheme under sub-head irrigation was implemented in Parbhani district. Only one scheme of rural electrification was implemented in this district from sub-head of power projects. The total expenditure of Rs.35.620 lakhs was incurred on the scheme of rural electrification programme during the year 1968-69, and Rs.59.920 lakhs in the year 1969-70. Under the scheme of rural electrification programme 64 and 52 villages were electrified and 1,203 and 1,537 pumping sets were installed respectively during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 with a view to provide better irrigation facilities to the agriculturists.

Industries and Mining:- The above head was divided into two sub-heads:-(1) Large and medium industries and(2) Small scale industries.

No district level scheme was implemented under the sub-head large and medium industries in this district. Two schemes namely(1) Development of handloom industry and(2) Financial assistance to industrial co-operative under small scale industries were implemented. The expenditure of Rs.0.327 and Rs.0.163 lakhs were respectively incurred on state sector scheme during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 and the expenditure of Rs.0.213 and 0.252^{Lakhs} was respectively incurred in the local sector scheme in the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. These schemes provided financial assistance to small scale industries and cottage industries for running their industrial units.

Transport and Communication:- The schemes under road development programme were implemented for providing communication facilities in the district. The total expenditure of Rs.10.620 lakhs was incurred in local sector during the year

1968-69 whereas the same was Rs.18.461 lakhs during the year 1969-70. Under this scheme the works of modernisation of roads, construction of culverts and bridges and extension of new roads were undertaken.

Social Services:- Under social services multifarious programmes were taken-up in the district to educate the masses and to provide them better facilities for bringing them upto the required standard. The following sub-heads were included under social services programme during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The figures of expenditure with percentage to total expenditure under this head are shown below:- (Rs. in lakhs)

Out of the total expenditure of Rs.53.688 lakhs and Rs.40.224 lakhs on this head in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively the state sector schemes covered Rs.15.128 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.13.563 lakhs in the year 1969-70, whereas the local sector schemes accounted for Rs.33.560 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.26.661 lakhs in the year 1969-70. It is evident from the above table that the major portion of the expenditure was covered by the sub-head "general education" (37.24 and 29.81) and water supply and drainage (24.90 and 39.23). In view of the percentages of expenditure under this head covered by different sub-heads, the general education stands at the top (37.24) during the Annual plan 1968-69 and water supply and drainage (39.23) during the Annual plan 1969-70. Provision of additional teachers, opening of new classes, construction of school buildings, training of teachers and financial assistance to school etc. were important achievements under general education.

Provision of additional beds, construction of primary health centres buildings, running of family planning centres, provision of public health and medical facilities, eradication of cholera, malaria and small-pox etc. were important achievements under medical and public health.

Under rural water supply schemes 60 open drinking water wells were constructed in the year 1968-69 and 103 wells were constructed in the year 1969-70. Piped water supply schemes were started in urban areas and in selected villages. Under housing scheme the provision of extension of gaathan, was made and financial assistance to the villagers under village housing scheme was made available. The schemes under the sub-head social welfare and welfare of backward classes were undertaken with a view to provide financial assistance to the persons belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes for development of agriculture, industries, education etc.

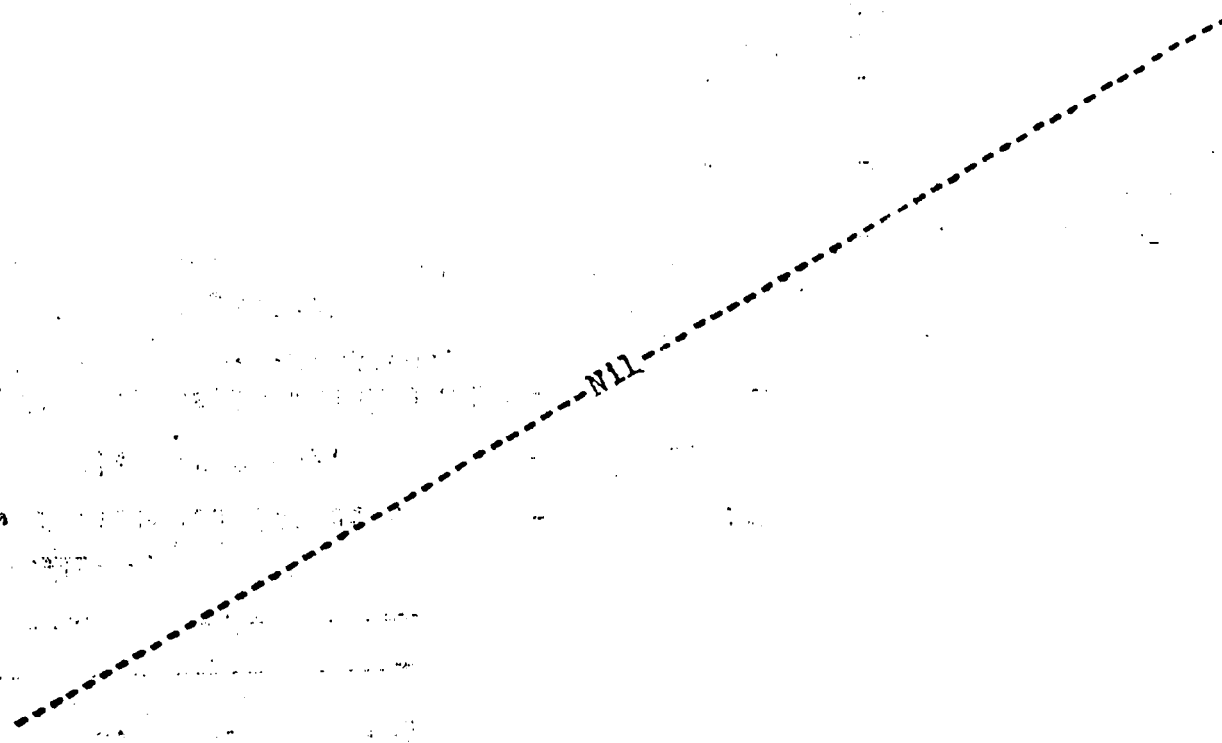
