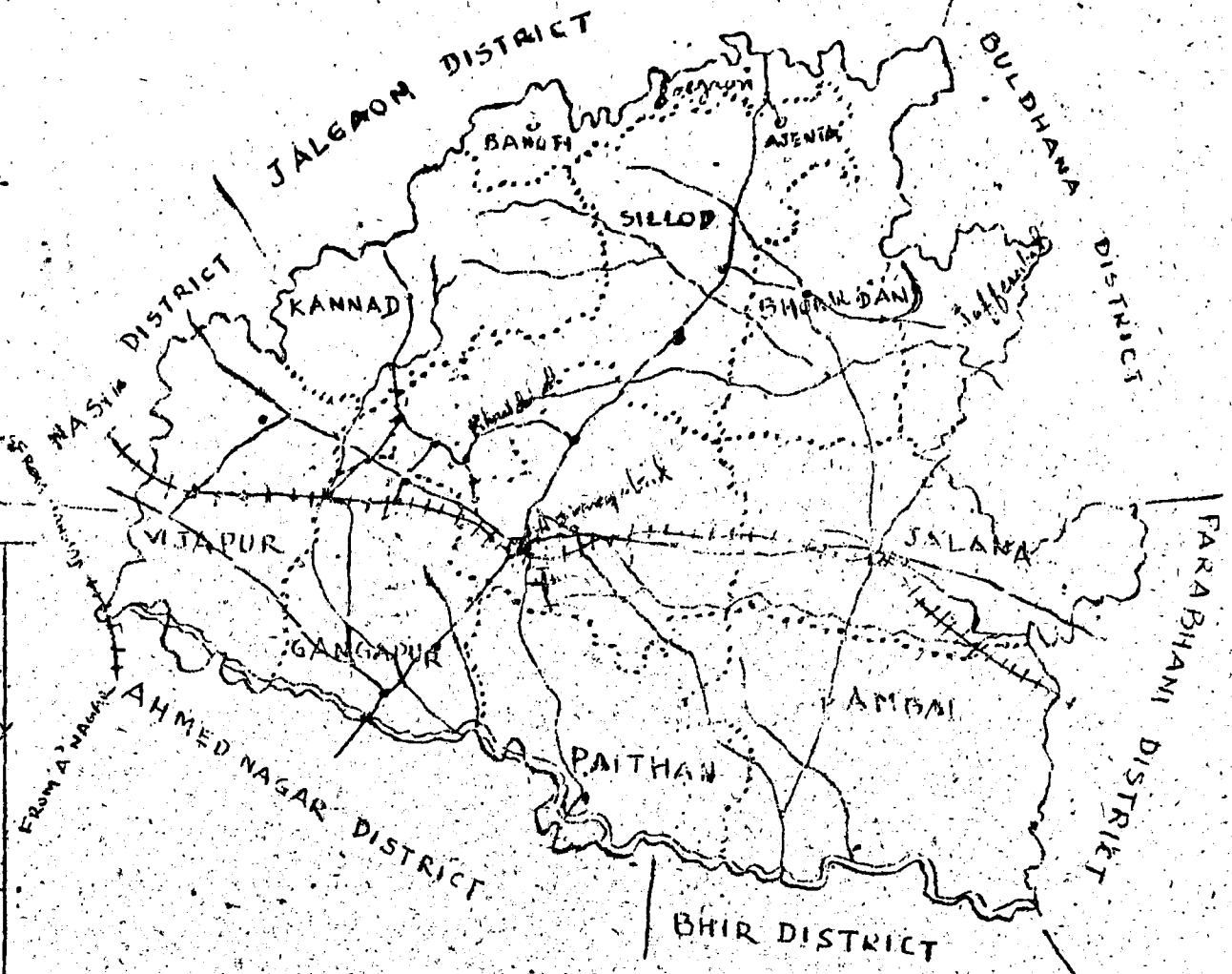
MAP OF AURANGABAD DISTRICT

CHAPTER-I

1.1 INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION:

The District of Aurangabad occupying an area of 16,718.2 Kms. is situated in upper Godawari basin and in the extreme north west of Marathwada with a population of 15,32,341 according to 1961 Census. The district was known as Mulka in different Vedic Epic and Puranic ages. The Royal edicts of Ashoka also refer indirectly to a city in Marathwada petenikas i.e. the people of Paithan. The articulate history of the Deccan begins with Satavahana power which in 2nd Century B.C. saw the emergence of the Marathwada as a seat of mighty empire of the Satavahanas with their capital at Pratishthana (Paithan).

The district of Aurangabad has a long chequered and hoary past. In addition to its legendary background it was ruled by Kolarians, Satavahanas, the Parthians of Gujarat, the Chalukyas, the Rashtrakutas and the Yadavas. Between 1318 and 1347 it was a part and parcel of Delhi sultanate under Muhammed Tughlaq. Subsequently it formed parts of the Bahamani Kingdom and Nizam Shahi Kingdom of Ahmednagar. From 1724 to 1956 it formed part of old Hyderabad State and since 1956 it is included in Maharashtra.

Amongst the notable Hindu writers of the District mention may be made of Salivahana Mukund Raja, Dhanoba, Hemad Pant Atmanayaka, Janardhan Pant, Ekmath, Rendas Swami, Mukteshwar, Amritrao and Mahipati.

Aurangabad which was a great city in the past was founded on the site of Village Khirki by Malik Akbar, the Prime Minister of Murtaza Nizam Shah.

The district forms 5.5% of the total area of the state and 3.87% of the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north-west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at banks of the Godawari. In general the district slopes down towards the south and south-east. The district lies between the parallels of $19^{\circ} 17' 30''$ and $20^{\circ} 40' 10''$ north latitude and between $74^{\circ} 40'$ and $76^{\circ} 40'$ east longitude.

1.2. BOUNDARIES.

It is bounded on the north by Jalgaon district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts, and on the south by Bhir district, and a portion of Ahmednagar district and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from the north to the south is about 161 Kms. and from east to west about 201 Kms.

1.3 ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP.

Aurangabad district is divided into three subdivisions which are further subdivided into talukas as given in table No.1.1.

ZILLA PARISHAD:

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and Government affairs a Zilla Parishad and 12 Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively. The Municipal towns are however not covered by them including the area of Aurangabad Cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 93.7% of the area and 85.56% of the total population of the district.

The number of villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti alongwith the number of councillors and co-opted members are shown in table No. 1.2.

Two Subject Committees are presided over by the Vice-President and four by two Chairman elected by the Zilla Parishad to preside over two specified Subject Committees each. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary of the Standing Committees while the District Heads of Departments work as Secretaries to the Subject Committees concerned. The co-ordination between the Subject Committees is achieved through Standing Committee which includes the Chairman of all the Subject Committees. The Panchayat Samities consist of all the councillors who are elected from the electoral divisions including the Block co-opted councillors and associated members. It is presided over by the Chairman who is elected by the Panchayat Samiti from amongst its members.

The Block Development Officer work as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

The Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad and Block Development Officer look after the development work in their jurisdictions.

1.4. Area.

The district of Aurangabad covers an area of 16,353 Sq. Kilometers according to the figures supplied by the Surveyor General of India and 16,718 Sq. kilometres according to figures supplied by State Land Records and Survey Departments. The rural area of district covers 16,447.9 Sq. Kilometres as per figures of State Land Records and Survey Departments. The urban area of the District covers 270.3 Sq. Kms. Rural areas forms 98.4% and urban area in the district accounts for 1.6% of its total area.

During the period 1901 to 1941 the district or its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950, and the new mahals of Muldabad and Jafferabad were created. Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953, by transferring 37 villages from Silled taluka and 30 from Kannad Taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1.11.56 the district was transferred from the erst while Hyderabad State alongwith the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra.

1.5 TOPOGRAPHY.

In general the district slopes down south and south east. The general elevation above sea level varies from 2,000 to 2,200 feet on the north and 1,700 to 1,900 feet towards the south.

1.6 HILLS AND RIVER SYSTEM SOILS.

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valley of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat are a continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidharbha. There are important and noted hills projections like Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka & Jyotsna. All these hills in the district have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. The hills of the district comprise Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kunkura, Sureanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghats and Aurangabad Hills. Their average height about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in places they also reach a height of about 3,000 feet. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is the Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 127 miles separating Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir districts and its tributaries are Shivna rising in the Kannad hills. the Dhenda rising near Daulatabad, Dudhana flowing from the hills east of Aurangabad, Khan which rises near Khuldabad and passes through the heart of Aurangabad town and Dheku which passes through Vaijapur taluka. The Virbhadrā flows through Paithan taluka and the passes through Ambad taluka. The river Purna which is the biggest tributary of the Godavari rises from the Kannad

hills and flows through the northern talukas of the district.

The Jui passes through Bhokardan taluka. The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga, Virbhadra, Kasner, Nalni Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala, Hewra, Arnavati and Gulduth.

The prevailing soil of Aurangabad district is black cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weltering of the Trap rock. The geological formation of the district are 1. Middle traps of Deccan Territory, 2. The older Alluvial deposits of the Godavari and 3. The modern alluvial deposits of the Godavari and the other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime-magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on weltering by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture & depth. In the hilly tracks in the north it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godavari valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

1.7 (1) CLIMATE:

The climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons a moderately warm wet season from June to September, a cool dry Season from October to February and a dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below 17° and normally ranges between 21° c. to 36° c. The winter season is comparatively dry and starts from November to ends February, January is the coldest month of the year.

The mean maximum temperature in the month of May rises high even as as 41° c. Occassionally hot dry winds prevail in April and May. During Summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. Thus the climate of Aurangabad is pleasant, charming and healthy.

ii) TEMPERATURE:

At Aurangabad centre the mean maximum temper was highest in May (39.8° c.) in the year 1968. The same was highest in the May 40.3° c.) in the year. 1969. The Chikalhana centre has indicated highest temperature in the month of May (39.5° c. & 39.9° c.) For the years 1968 and 1969 respectively. As regards mean minimum temperature in the months of January and December was coolest at Chikalhana centre in 1968 and at Aurangabad Centre in January, 1968 whereas the mean minimum temperature was the coolest in January, 1969 at both the centres.

The table No.1.3 indicates the average temperature in three seasons of the years 1968 and 1969 for both the centres of Chikalhana and Aurangabad.

It may be noted that due to difference altitude and topography rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of the district. On the basis of the district normal rainfall according to variation in rainfall, the district can be classified into three distinct tracts namely (i) where the rainfall excess 750 millimetres (ii) rather in sufficient rainfall tract with rainfall ranges between 650 to 750 millimetres and (iii) poor rainfall tract with rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The table No.1.4 gives the talukwise normal rainfall (average of last 34 years between 1922-23 to 1955-56) for Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna, and average of last ten years for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambadas as the data of normal rainfall i.e. average between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available in the office of the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona.

From the table above it is evident that during 1968 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Kannad, Khuldabad, Paithan and Ambad. It ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Jafferabad, Aurangabad and Jalna whereas it was below 650 millimetres in Sillod, Soegaon, Bhokardan, Vaijapur and Gangapur. In the year 1969 there was no taluka had rainfall below 650 millimetres, three talukas viz. Bhokardan, Khuldabad and Gangapur had rainfall between 650 to 750 millimetres and all other 9 talukas had rainfall above 750 millimetres. Among all talukas Bhokardan had the lowest rainfall of 690.7 millimetres and Jalna had a highest rainfall of 1,071.9 millimetres in 1969 in the district.

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas which likely to be effected by scarcity conditions as follows.

<u>Area</u>	<u>Estimated frequency</u>
1) Vaijapur Taluka	Once in ten years
2) Gangapur Taluka	Once in ten years.

Thus the south western Region of the district generally recording poor rainfall is more susceptible to crop failures due to in-adequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes to scarcity conditions.

CHAPTER-II

Explanatory note on scope and limitations of Statistics presented in Statistical Abstract.

---oo---

PURPOSE.

In this Abstract exhaustive statistics about important Socio-Economic indicators of the economy have been presented. Statistical information on as many topics as possible has been furnished so as to make it useful as a reference book. The talukawise figures will enable reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

District at a glance:-

In this table salient features and district indicators under various heads like population, agriculture etc., are presented.

The scope and limitations of the information in the Abstract is discussed in the following paragraphs.

1) Climate and Rainfall.

The monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at selected centres in the district, during 1968 & 1969 is given in table No.1. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna centres and the same recorded in the table for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambad centres is the average rainfall of last 10 years as the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available, with the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona. The table No.2 gives monthly maximum, minimum and average temperature at two ^{selected} centres in the district during 1968 & 1969.

II) Area & Population.

The data of 1951 population Census and 1961 population Census are presented in tables 3 to 8. The district Census Hand Book of Aurangabad district has been used for preparing these tables.

The table No.3 gives talukawise rural & urban population according to 1961 Census and variations with 1951 Census. CHAPTER-III

The Chapter deals with important selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important selected sectors of economy.

INDICATOR NO.1:-

Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown for the years
1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. Double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. It is observed in table No.10 of the Abstract that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area of the district has slightly increased from 105.10 in the year 1967-68 to 105.84 in 1968-69.

It is observed that during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69 percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was highest in Jalna taluka, being 107.08 during 1967-68 and in Kannad taluka being 108.62 in 1968-69 while the minimum was found in Soegaon taluka during both the years. Thus the range variation comes to 101.44 to 107.08 during 1967-68 and 102.27 to 108.62 during 1968-69.

The comparison of data in 1968-69 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there was an increase of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of all talukas of the district except three, while in the case of Jafferabad taluka the percentage is unchanged.

INDICATOR NO.2.

Productivity of Important Crops.

In this indicator, productivity of important crops in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1967-68 & 1968-69 has been discussed. There is a separate table in the Abstract part denoting, the yield rates of different crops per hectare. In the following table, yield rates of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69 have been indicated.

It is observed from the above table that yield rate per hectare increased in the year 1968-69 as compared to that 1967-68 in rice, bajra, gram, chillies, cotton and sugarcane. The comparison of yield rates during 1968-69 with that during 1961-62 reveals an increase in yield rate only in case of bajra, gram and sugarcane.

INDICATOR NO.3.

Gross value of Agricultural Production.

In this indicator, efforts are made to discuss the gross value of important agricultural products in Aurangabad district. The gross value of particular commodity has been arrived at by multiplying total outturn by the prices prevailing during the harvest season of the commodity.

In the table below, gross value of important agricultural commodities for the year 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69 is given in crores of rupees.

It will be seen from the above table that as compared to gross value of agricultural products during 1967-68, gross value of corresponding commodities in 1968-69 recorded on all round decrease except that of rice, bajra and other cereals. The decrease in the value of product during 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68 is due to less production as well as decrease in the prices in 1968-69 as compared to last year. It is evident from the above table that the total value of rice, bajra and other cereals increased mainly due to increase in production during 1968-69 as compared to last year. Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1968-69 reveals that except in case of jowar, other cereals and groundnut increase is observed in the gross value of other agricultural products but this increase in the gross value can be attributed to increase in prices as well as production both.

INDICATOR NO.4.

Percentage of Irrigated Area.

This indicator denotes the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area during the year 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area increased in all the talukas except Soegaon and Vaijapur in the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1967-68. The percentage in taluka Vaijapur had decreased due to increase in the net area sown. The area irrigated by tanks had decreased in Soegaon resulting in the decrease in percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown.

However, as compared to the net irrigated area during 1961-62, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown increased in all the talukas during 1968-69 resulting in increase in the irrigation sources i.e. Government Canals, wells and pumps.

INDICATOR NO.5.

Change in the Crop Pattern

This indicator deals with the changes in crop pattern in Aurangabad district during the year 1968-69 as compared to the same in the years 1961-62 and 1967-68.

It is evident from the above table that the area under total food crops is the same during the year 1967-68 and 1968-69. Area of total non-food crops increased during the year 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area decreased, whereas the same increased in case of total non-food crops during the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1967-68.

Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1968-69 reveals that the area under total food crops increased during the year 1968-69 as compared to 1961-62, whereas the area under total non-food crops slightly decreased during the year 1968-69 as compared to 1961-62. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area increased whereas the same decreased in case of non-food crops during the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1961-62.

It is observed from the above table that the area under total cereals during the year 1968-69 declined over 1967-68 whereas the same increased under total pulses during the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1967-68. Percentage of total cereals to gross cropped area in 1967-68 and 1968-69, was 51.76 and 50.50 respectively. The same has decreased during 1968-69 as compared to last year due to increase in the area of pulses and non-food crops during 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68.

Similar comparison between the years 1961-62 and 1968-69 reveals that the area under total cereals, total pulses and percentage of total cereals, total pulses to gross cropped area increased during the year 1968-69 as compared to the same during the year 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.6

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of Agricultural Production.

This indicator points out the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of Co-operative societies provide all types of facilities needed by agriculturist to improve their financial condition and production. During the year 1968-69 there were 1,172 primary agricultural credit societies in the district, whereas the same decreased by 2 in succeeding years but the membership increased from 1,25,518 to 1,30,487 due to increase in membership campaign.

It may be observed from the above table that the amount of advances during the year 1969-70 increased considerably as compared to the figure of 1961-62 in the district. The corresponding percentage increase is also noticed in case of outstanding dues during the year 1969-70 in comparison to 1961-62.

However, the amount of advances during the year 1969-70 decreased as compared to the figure of 1968-69.

INDICATOR NO. 7.

Agricultural Wage Rates.

This indicator deals with the agricultural wage rates of three selected centres in Aurangabad district during the year 1968 and 1969 namely (i) Ajantha in Sillod Taluka (ii) Bidkin in Paithan taluka (iii) Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka.

Table No. 17 of the Abstract deals with the agricultural wage rates of the selected centres of the district in the year 1968 and 1969. From this it is evident that average wage rates of carpenters of Ajantha centre in Sillod taluka was the highest i.e. Rs. 4=50 and Rs. 4.69 as compared to the average rate of carpenters of Bidkin in Paithan taluka and Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka in the year 1968 as well as 1969, respectively. The average wage rate of blacksmith at Ajantha centre was also higher than other two remaining centres of the district i.e. Rs. 3=62 and Rs. 4=37 for the years 1968 and 1969, respectively.

The average wage rates of unskilled male field labourer at Ajantha, Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres in the district were Rs. 1.80, Rs. 2.52 and Rs. 2.34, respectively, in the year 1968.

As such, the average wage rates in Mahalgaon centre was highest as compared to the remaining two centres. During the year 1969, the average wage rates of the same centres were Rs. 2.50, Rs. 2.79 and Rs. 2.43, respectively. The tendency of the wage rates marked towards an increase.

INDICATOR NO.8.

Livestock per hectare of land.

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Aurangabad district as per 1961 Census and 1966 Census.

In an agricultural country like India, the importance of working cattle can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an important bearing on the total output of agricultural production. As agriculture is a non-mechanised industry in India, the cattle supply is the most important motive power for almost all agricultural operations, such as ploughing, lifting of water and transport of produce to the market.

*The number of working bullocks in the district rose from 3.80 lakhs in 1961 to 3.85 lakhs in 1966 Census. The cultivable

hectares per pair of working bullocks, The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks as per 1966 Census is found to be the highest in Ambad taluka and the lowest in Paithan taluka. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks varies between 5.40 and 9.61 hectares. As against total cultivable area of 13.80 lakhs hectares, the total bovine and ovine population in 1966 was 12.77 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to be 92.

INDICATOR NO.9
Poultry as compared to population.

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad district.

During the Third Five Year Plan period, special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry, breeding and supply of improved poultry and advancing of loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the Census of 1966, total number of poultry in Aurangabad district was 2.01 lakhs as against 2.23 lakhs during the year 1961. This indicates a decrease of 0.22 lakhs over the period 1961.

It may be observed from the above table, that the ratio of poultry to the population as per 1966 Census was highest in Soegaon taluka while the same was lowest in Ambad taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide, as the maximum ratio was 218 while the minimum was 95 only.

INDICATOR NO. 10:-

Per Capita consumption of Electricity.

This indicator denotes per capita consumption of electricity in Aurangabad district during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The total electricity consumption during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 was 245.10 and 282.47 lakhs of K.W.H. respectively. As such the percentage increase of consumption of electricity was 15.25 K.W.H. in the year 1969-70, over 1968-69. The per capita consumption of total electricity in the district during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 works out to be 16.00 K.W.H. and 18.43 K.W.H. respectively.

It may be observed from the above table that there is a tremendous increase in consumption of electricity mainly in the field of industries and for domestic purposes.

INDICATOR NO.11.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

This indicator denotes the increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The table No.28 of the Abstract furnishes the information regarding candidates enrolled and vacancies notified during the the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 and it is observed that continuous increase in un-employment inspite of various efforts made for creation of employment opportunities is still the burning problem to be solved. Un-employment is observed not only in skilled and un-skilled workers but also in educated classes having degrees and diplomas in various university courses.

From the statistics maintained in Employment Exchange, it is observed that there is a continuous rise in the registrations and also in the vacancies notified, except the number of vacancies notified during 1968-69, which has decreased in the year 1968-69 over 1961-62.

It will be seen that, over the period of 7 years the number of candidates registered had increased by 2,550 during the year 1968-69 while during the period of one year the same increased by 176. It may be observed from the above table that the number of vacancies notified over the period of 7 years decreased by 393 during the year 1968-69 but in the succeeding year i.e. 1969-70, the same had increased.

It is evident that the number of in-door patients treated increased in all the talukas except Gangapur and Paithan. Aurangabad and Jalna accounted for the highest number of in-door patients treated where better medical facilities are available due to location of Medical College Hospital at Aurangabad and Cottage Hospital at Jalna.

The number of primary schools in Aurangabad district rose from 1,308 in 1960-61 to 1,976 in the year 1968-69 and the number of pupils also increased by 79.21% in the year 1968-69 over 1960-61.

The number of secondary institutions in the district increased from 71 in 1960-61 to 164 in the year 1968-69 and the number of students attending these institutions also increased tremendously by 200.91% in the year 1968-69 as compared to 1960-61.

As regards higher education, the number of institutions in the district increased from 11 in 1960-61 to 17 in the year 1968-69 and the number of students attending these institutions also increased by 272.70% in the year 1968-69 in comparison to the same during 1960-61.

INDICATOR NO.14.

Increase in road length per hundred square kilometre.

The indicator furnishes the information regarding increase in road length per 100 sq.kilometres in Aurangabad district for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The road length per 100 square kilometres in the district rose from 11.33 in the year 1968-69 to 11.83 in the year 1969-70.

The total road length in the district under all categories increased by 103.89 percent during the year 1968-70 was compared to the total length during 1961-62.

This increase was more prominent in case of village roads.

INDICATOR NO. 15.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to Population.

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Aurangabad district at the end of March, 1969.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of industry and agriculture. In the year 1960-61, there were 8 scheduled banks in the district. At the beginning of 1968 there were 16 scheduled banks and the number of the same was 18 at the end of March, 1969. As such 2 new offices were opened in the year 1968-69.

The District Central Co-operative Bank plays an important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 51 branches of Co-operative bank in the district as at the end of June, 1969, while there were only 20 branches at the end of March, 1961. As such during the period of 8 years 31 new branches were opened.

The district population as per 1961 Census was 15,22,341 and the number of branches of the bank was 69. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 22,208.

PRICES.

The trends in prices prevailing at district head quarter, Aurangabad during the year 1963, 1968 and 1969 have been discussed in this indicator.

It is observed from this table that the rise in the average prices was maximum in 1968 and 1969 as compared to 1963 and increasing trends were at its peak. The rise in prices was observed in all the consumption articles.

The fall in average prices was observed in all the articles of consumption except sweet oil, vanaspati (Dalda) and mutton (goat), during 1969 as compared to 1968. There was slight increase in the prices of mutton (goat).

Jowar was not available in the open market during both the years i.e. 1968 and 1969. The supply of Jowar was made on Fair Price shops only and here too an increasing trends in prices was observed.

It is to be noted from this table that prices during 1963, 1968 and 1969 cannot be compared mainly because changes in varieties were effected. The ups and downs in prices is mainly due to changed in varieties. However, the increasing trends continued in case of these items during 1969 as compared to 1968.

CHAPTER-IV
PLANNING-PART-I (EXPENDITURE)

Each plan has had a distinctive objective. While the First Plan emphasised "Self sufficiency in food grains" the Second Plan aimed at "Socialistic Pattern" the Third sought to create a "Self-generating economy" and the Fourth Plan has as its goal "Self-reliance in economy".

As the IVthe Five Year Plan was yet to be formulated, Annual Plans were implemented since 1966-67. The Annual Plan for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, constituted the third and fourth Annual Plans in the district for which the total budgetary provisions were made to the tune of Rs. 268.81 lakhs and 177.42 lakhs, respectively. The total expenditure in the Annual Plans period for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 amounted to Rs. 255.17 lakhs and Rs. 181.04 lakhs respectively, the percentage to the total budget provision for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 being 94.93 and 102.04 respectively.

The headwise expenditure in the Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 in the district is given in the following table:

It is observed that the total expenditure under different heads of development, incurred during the year 1968-69 & 1969-70, constituted 94.93 and 102.04 percent, respectively to the budget provisions of the respective years. The headwise expenditure given in the above table denotes that the Agricultural Programmes consumed the largest share of 49.96% and 59.08% of the total expenditure during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. In the order of priority, the Agricultural Programmes were followed by the Social Services which shared 26.59 percent during 1968-69 and 18.18 percent during 1969-70 of the total expenditure. The expenditure incurred on Co-operation and Community Development was only 10.58 percent during 1968-69 and 6.02 percent during 1969-70 of the total expenditure. The expenditure on Transport and Communications was 11.89 percent during 1968-69 and 15.96 percent during 1969-70 of the total expenditure. The percentage of expenditure on Industries were very low that are, only 0.73 percent during 1968-69 and 0.67 percent during 1969-70 to total expenditure. The percentages of expenditure on Miscellaneous were lowest that is, only 0.25 percent during 1968-69 and 0.09 percent during 1969-70 to the total expenditure.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES.

The Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority, and the percent of expenditure incurred were the highest among the different heads of development during both the years under review. The sub-headwise expenditure incurred under Agricultural Programmes during the Annual Plan of 1968-69 and 1969-70 in the district is given in the following table.

It is seen that among the sub-heads of development, soil conservation accounted for the highest expenditure denoting 47.61 percent and 59.20 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes during 1968-69 and 1969-70. Next in order of priority Minor Irrigation consumed the major portion of expenditure amounting to 43.36 percent and 31.58 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes during 1968-69 and 1969-70. The expenditure during 1968-69 and 1969-70 under sub-heads, Agricultural Production constituted only 5.38 percent and 5.32 percent, respectively of the total expenditure. The expenditure under Sub-heads Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, Fisheries and Ware housing and Marketing was very low during 1968-69 and 1969-70, that is 0.28 percent, 0.10 percent, 0.41 percent, 1.02 percent, 0.26 percent, 0.52 percent and 0.71 percent, 0.45 percent respectively. The expenditure under sub-head Forest, accounted for 1.99 percent and 1.71 percent to the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes during 1968.69 and 1969-70 respectively.

II. CO OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Out of total expenditure of Rs. 27.00 and 10.89 lakhs during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively for Co-operation and Community Development, the expenditure incurred by Co-operation amounted to Rs. 15.02 and 2.76 lakhs, while the expenditure booked on Community Development was Rs. 11.98 and 8.13 lakhs, during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

III. INDUSTRY AND MINING.

The percentage of expenditure on Small Scale Industries and Mining was very low during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, that is, only 0.73 percent and 0.67 percent respectively of the total expenditure, which mainly constituted assistance to Industrial Co-operatives and Federations for the development of handlooms.

IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION.

The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs. 30.33 lakhs while the budget provision was Rs. 30.55 lakhs during 1968-69. The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs. 28.89 lakhs exceeding the budget provision of Rs. 27.09 lakhs during 1969-70.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES.

Next to the Agricultural Programmes, Social Services received the largest share of budget provision for 1968-69 and 1969-70, as shown in Table No.1. The expenditure incurred under Social Services constituted 26.59 percent and 18.18 percent to the total expenditure during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. The sub-headwise expenditure under Social Services during the Annual Plans of 1968-69 and 1969-70, in the District is given in the following table.

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under General Education was the highest, that is, 33.28 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services, followed by Water Supply and Drainage and Public Health, that is, 26.41 percent & 24.45 percent respectively during 1968-69 while the expenditure incurred under Water Supply and Drainage was the highest, that is, 49.06 percent to the total expenditure, under Social Services, followed by General Education and Technical Education, that is, 32.72 percent and 8.38 percent respectively during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Technical Education was 4.69 percent during 1968-69. The expenditure incurred under Public Health was the least 0.46 percent during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Housing was 3.54 percent and 3.68 percent during 1968-69 & 1969-70 respectively. The expenditure incurred under Welfare of Backward classes was only 2.52 percent and only 0.88 percent during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. The expenditure incurred on Social Welfare was the least, that is, 0.34 percent during 1968-69, while the same was 2.06 percent during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Labour and Labour Welfare was 4.77 percent and 2.76 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS:

The main object of Planning in the process of economic development is to arrange available resources in such a manner as to achieve pre-determined targets in the prescribed time limit. The physical achievements of various developmental schemes during the Annual Plans of 1968-69 and 1969-70 in the district are discussed in the following paragraphs.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES.

As already discussed elsewhere, Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority in the Annual Plans of 1968-69 and 1969-70. The activities under the Agricultural Programmes are discussed under the different sub-heads as below.

(a) AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION.

Under the sub-head Agricultural Production, schemes directly relating to intensive cultivation of food crops were included and 2.03 lakhs and 2.10 lakhs of acres were brought under intensive cultivation during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Under the scheme of "Cotton Development", 4,998 hectares and 9,823 hectares of area have been covered under improved seed of cotton which were distributed during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under the scheme "Manures and Fertilizers" 20,487 and 6,428 tonnes of manures and fertilizers were distributed during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Under the Plant protection scheme 49,155 acres and 15,232 acres of crops were dusted during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under the Horticultural development scheme 1,111 acres and 478 acres were brought under plantation of fruit trees during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively and 58 acres under rejuvenation and 150 acres were renovated during the Annual Plan period for 1968-69. There were no fruit trees rejuvenation and renovation during 1969-70.

(ii) SOIL CONSERVATION:

Under the scheme of Contour Bunding 1.02 and 0.78 lakhs of acres were banded against the target of 1.02 and 0.67 lakhs of acres during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

(iii) MINOR IRRIGATION:

Under this programme, 2,686 and 1,338 new wells were constructed and 1,609 and 285 pump-sers were distributed during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under Minor Irrigation, work of 12 Bandharas, 3 percolation tanks and 9 lift irrigation works were nearing completion during 1968-69 and 5 bandharas were completed during 1969-70 under the local sector schemes, work of 5 bandharas completed and work of 8 bandharas was in progress under State sector scheme during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Under the scheme of prefabricated bandharas, 2 bandharas were completed during 1968-69. The scheme of prefabricated bandharas was not implemented during the year 1969-70.

(iv) ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Repair works were done in 4 dispensaries and 2 Aid centres were continued during the year 1968-69. Minor repairs were done in one dispensary and 2 Aid Centres were continued during the year 1969-70. Ten premium bulls were located in the existing breeding centres and 8 breeding bulls were supplied during 1968-69. Under the "Poultry Development Scheme" loans were granted to 7 persons amounting to Rs. 7,000/- for starting poultry business during 1968-69. The scheme of supply of premium bulls and Poultry Development Scheme was not implemented during the year 1969-70.

(v) DAIRY DEVELOPMENT

Under the town milk Supply Scheme, 3,072 and 2,870 litres of milk was handled per day during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Five units were assisted under the scheme of "Assistance to Milk Societies" during both the years under review.

(vi) FORESTS:

Under the scheme "Farm Forestry" plantation including pre-monsoon were done on 80 hectares and 200 hectares during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. During the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, under the scheme Extension of Forestry plantation including pre-monsoon was done on the road of 161 and 77 Kms. respectively. The central nurseries, already established upto the year 1967-68, were maintained in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Under the scheme Roshia Grass including plantation and pre-monsoon 40 and 35 hectares were covered during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. 2nd year and 3rd year operation of fuel wood and Bamboo was done over on area of 140 hectares and 135 hectares, respectively during the year 1968-69. The scheme was discontinued in the year 1969-70. The plantation including pre-monsoon work and 2nd and 3rd year operations in connection with Afforestation for Soil Conservation was effected in an area of 286 and 160 hectares during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Under the development of pastures and fodder resources 100 hectares and 163 hectares was covered including pre-monsoon work during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. One Forest Park was established at Ajantha Caves during the year 1969-70.

(vii) FISHERIES.

Under Fish farming in impounded water scheme, 6.60 and 6.74 lakhs of fish (fingerlings) were stocked in tanks and 0.53 lakhs Kg. and 1.51 lakhs Kg. fish was netted out during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. For the supply of fishery requisites, 186 and 339 Kg. Nylon twine was supplied to fishermen.

(viii) WAREHOUSING AND MARKETING.

Under the scheme of development of Agricultural Marketing 2 new markets were established during the year 1969-70 and one new market was regulated and under the development of grading scheme, 9 societies were assisted by giving subsidy and loan during 1968-69.

II. CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

(i) Co-operation:-

Under the scheme of Strengthening of the Co-operative structure from district level and below, membership was increased by 11,750 and 8,928 during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Towards the development of Co-operative marketing, subsidies were granted to 9 godowns during 1968-69 and 3 godowns in 1969-70 to increase storage capacity. For the development of co-operative farming loans to the extent of Rs. 0.26 lakhs in 1968-69 and 0.05 lakhs in 1969-70 were advanced.

(ii) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

The whole district was already covered by 17 Community Development Blocks comprising of 20½ C.P.A. pattern by the end of Third Plan period. The same blocks were continued during the Annual Plan periods of 1968-69 and 1969-70. The schemes under Rural Work Programme was discontinued during 1968-69. The scheme under Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in Khuldabad, Soegaon and Jalna Blocks during 1968-69 and the same was implemented in Sillod, Khuldabad, Jalna and Soegaon Blocks during 1969-70.

III. INDUSTRIES:

Under the scheme of Development of Small Scale Industries (Handloom) rebate of Rs. 8 thousands was distributed during the year 1968-69 and Rs. 5,000 in 1969-70. Fifteen Industrial Co-operatives in 1968-69 and such societies in 1969-70 were assisted under financial assistance to Industrial Co-operative and Federations.

IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

The work of construction of new roads was completed to the extent of 17 Kilometres in 1968-69 and 7 Kms. in 1969-70 in the State sector and the work of 38 Kms. in 1968-69 and 35.15 Kms. in 1969-70 in local sector.

2 C.D. works were completed in the State sector and 51 C.D. works were completed in the local sector during 1968-69. The earth work of 45.20 Kilometres was completed in the local sector during 1968-69. Further 2 bridges and 61 culverts were completed in the local sector while 14 culverts were completed in the State sector during the year 1969-70. Under the scheme of Roads under Public participation, an amount of Rs. 2.02 lakhs was spent during the year 1968-69 and Rs. 2.14 lakhs were spent in 1969-70. Under the scheme "Road of Economic Importance", the earth work was completed to the extent of 18 Kms. in 1968-69 and 8.51 Kms. in 1969-70 metal collection was done to the extent of 9 Kms. in 1968-69 and 4.50 Kms. in 1969-70. The consolidation work of 2.40 Kms. was completed during the year 1969-70. Under the scheme of Roads in Hilly and inaccessible areas, the earth work was completed to the extent of 14.20 Kms. and 3.00 Kms. during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Metal collection/ was done in 11.20 Kms. and 3.50 Kms. during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Consolidation was done in 9.50 Kms. during the year 1969-70.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES.

(i) GENERAL EDUCATION.

Under the programme of expansion of primary education 53 and 75 teachers were appointed and as many as 552 and 217 teachers were imparted basic training during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Towards the development of Non-Government schools, 7 secondary schools were started during each year under review. Under the scheme of opening of additional classes/sections in Government Secondary Schools, 23 teachers were appointed during 1968-69 and 27 in 1969-70. Educational concessions were given to 322 and 5,702 students of economically backward classes, during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Educational concessions were given to 364 eligible children of primary teachers during 1969-70.

(ii) PUBLIC HEALTH:

Construction work of the building of two primary health centres was completed during 1968-69. Under the family planning scheme, as many as 7,627 and 9,736 vesectomy operations were done during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively.

(iii) WATER SUPPLY AND DRINKING.

Under the rural water supply scheme, 183 and 139 drinking water wells were constructed during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively.

(iv) HOUSING.

Under the village housing project, the scheme was continued in 17 villages during both the years under review.

(v) WELFARE AND BACKWARD CLASSES.

Grant of scholarships, tuition fees and examination fees were given to 417 and 217 pupils during 1968-69 and 1969-70, respectively. Grants were awarded to 100 inmates of B.C. hostels during 1968-69 and grants were awarded to two backward class hostels during 1969-70. One hundred implements were distributed under the scheme of Propagation of improved agricultural implements among scheduled castes and scheduled tribes during 1968-69. During the year 1969-70. Rs. 5,000 were distributed among 5 cultivators of scheduled castes for the development of their land. Financial assistance was given to one industrial society of backward classes, during 1969-70.

(vi) SOCIAL WELFARE.

Under the scheme of welfare Extension Projects 15 balwadies, 7 literacy centres, 8 maternity centres and 5 arts and crafts classes were started during 1968-69 and 12 balwadies, 5 literacy centres, 4 maternity centres and 2 arts and craft classes were started during 1969-70.

(vii) LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE.

Under the Technical and vocational Training scheme 2 members of staff were appointed during each year under review.

VIII INFORMATION AND PUBLICITY.

Under Rural Broadcasting scheme 198 and 234 radio sets were installed in different villages during 1968-69 and 1969-70
