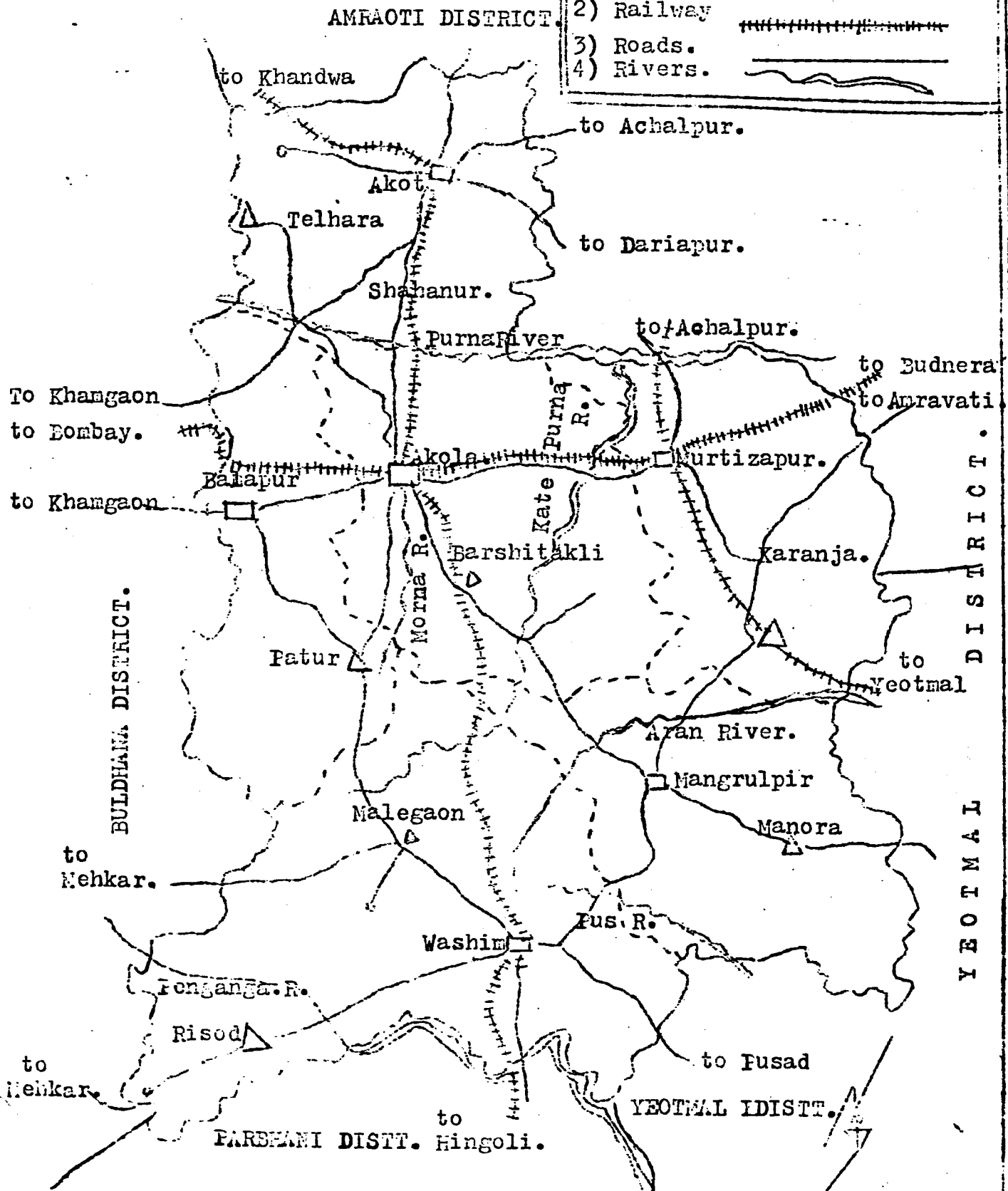

Chapter -I.

I N T R O D U C T I O N .

Location

Akola district located roughly at south west part of Nagpur division and lies between latitudes 21°16 North and 19°51 South and longitudes 77°44 East and 76°36 West. It has an area of 10595.7 K.m. or 4091 square miles of which rural and urban area account for 4014.6 and 76.4 miles respectively. According to village papers the geographical area is 10560 Hects. Akola district is fourth in regard of size and fifth in population among the districts of vidarbha region. The total population of the district as per 1961 Census is 1189354 i.e. 112 per Sq. K.m. or 291 per ^{per} Square mile. The total population of the district forms 3.01 % of the total population of Maharashtra, while its area accounts for 3.46 percent of the total area of the state. There are 1507 inhabited villages, 205 deserted villages and 9 towns in the district. Out of the total population of the district 22.09 percent lives in urban areas of the district. Out of the total population of 1189354 in the district, only 585261 (49.20 %) are workers.

Boundaries:

The district is bounded on the north by Melghat taluka of Amroti district, on the east are Daryapur, Amraoti and Chandur talukas of Amraoti district, and Darwha and ~~Dura~~ Pusad taluka of Yeotmal district. Parbhani district of Mahathwadaregion, lies to the south while Buldana district forms of Western boundary.

Administrative Set-up:

For administrative purposes the district is devided into six talukas viz. Akola, Akot, Balapur, Mangrulpir, Murtizapur and Washim talukas on the East, Akola taluka occupies the central part of the district and Akot taluka lies on the North, Murtizapur, Balapur on the west and Mangrulpir and Washim on the South. Details about the number of villages, towns and population covered by each taluka are given in the table below.

The Collector of the district as in other parts of the state is incharge of the general administration, Law and order, land revenue and Civil supplies. He is assisted by a few Dy.Collectors. As per Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samittee Act of 1962, a Paralled set up of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samittees came into existance which works through various committees formed for different developmental activities with their jurisdiction over the entire district excluding Municipal towns.

Administrative History.

At the time of complete overhauling of the districts of Berar in 1905, the district in its present form came into existance and there were no major changes in its boundaries, since 1911 till today. Prior to the re-organisation of States, the district was a part of Madhya Pradesh and since 1st May 1960, it is a part of Maharashtra state without any changes in the territorial boundaries of the district.

Area and Population.

Akola district has an area of 10595.7 K.m. and measures nearly 1448.10 K.m. length from north to south. Among the eight districts of Vidarbha, the district ranks fourth in respect of area and fifth in case of population as per 1961 Census. The district accounts for 3.46 percent and 3.01 percent of the state area and population respectively. It has as per 1961 Census a population of 11.89 lakhs which is $1\frac{1}{2}$ times more than it was in 1911 when its population was 7.89 lakhs. There are 205 deserted villages in the district out of a total of 1712 villages. The total number of deserted villages in Maharashtra is 3016. Thus 6.80 percent of the total number of deserted villages in Maharashtra, is in Akola district. The urban population of the towns as distributed among the different population ranges is as follows.

Thus the percentage of urban population to the total district population is 22.09. Out of the total geographical area in the district 84,880 hectares is under Forests and cultivable land accounted for 9.04 lakhs hectares in 1969-70. The district is famous for its cotton trade in Maharashtra State. There were 13 - Panchayat Samitees and 921 Gram Panchayats in the district during the year 1970-71.

Topography.

The northern part of the district lies in Purna vally which is itself a part of the river Tapi basin. The river Purna has formed a fertile basin in the talukas of Akot, Balapur, Akola and Murtizapur and this portion is called Payanghat, where as the southern part is ^{known} as Balaghat which is drained by river Penganga. The Balaghat plateau forms one of the great water sheds in the district.

Hills, Rivers and Soils.

There are no mountains in the district. The Satpura plateau lies on the northern border of the district and a range of steep hills of Ajanta mountains run across the middle of the southern part forming a plateau known as Balaghat.

The chief river of the district is the Purna which flows all the year round. It rises from Amraoti district and flows through Murtizapur, Akot and Akola talukas of the district and then to Buldana district. Its tributaries are the pendhi, the Katepurna, the Morna, Nirguna and the Man. For constructing irrigation projects Mo-rna, Katepurna and the Nirguna rivers have been selected in the district.

The other important river in the district is the Penganga which flows accross Washim taluka and the river Pus, the Adan and and the Arnavati are its tributaries.

The northern part consisting of Akot taluka and part of Balapur is almost plain and has a deep black soil. Murtizapur taluka is also plain having rich black cotton soil. The southern part comprises of Mangrul and Washim talukas with shallow and inferior soils. The western part, particularly the south of Balapur taluka is undulating and has light and inferior type of soil. Similarly, the southern part of Akola taluka, to same extent, is undulating and has black soil at a few places.

Climate, and rainfall.

Being far away from the sea, the district has extremes of climate. The weather during summer is invariably hot in day time and some what tolerable and cool during nights. The temperature during the month of May is generally above 48.3°C (110° F) and ~~starts from middle of June~~ reaches to a maximum about 53.3°C (118°F) in some seasons. The monsoon starts from middle of June and continues upto middle of October.

Normally the maximum amount of rains are received in the month of July and August in the district. The average rainfall of the district is from 750 mm. to 800 mm or from 30" to 36" inches. An average annual temperature of the district is 27.1 degree centigrade. During the year 1970 the average rainfall was 1123.7 mm. During the year under review Washim taluka got more rains than the other talukas of the district. Cultivation in the district is completely dependent on monsoon rains and the cropping pattern to total land is more or less uniform. The percentage of cultivable land in the district is 85.61 and Jowar is the main staple food crop accounting for 31.31 % of the total gross cropped area, Among nonfood crops, cotton is an important commercial crop of the district and occupies about 42.31 % of the total gross cropped area.

The district has suffered from scarcity during 1970-71 due to heavy and untimely rains and floods causing damages to the standing Kharif crops at various places in the district. During the year under review the whole district was declared as scarcity area and relief works both under state sector and local ^{sector} were started in the district. The total allotment and expenditure on scarcity relief works during 1970-71 in the district was Rs.22.16 and 22.33 lakhs respectively. The relief work was continued in the next year with an additional allotment of Rs.55.00 lakhs from Government.

The places of interest in the district are the hill fort of Narnala in Akot taluka, the fort at Balapur and two "Viharas cut" in a rocky hill at Fatur in Balapur taluka and various Hemadpanthi temples, the best of which is at Barshitakli in Akola taluka. In addition, there are a number of temples which include the famous Balajee temple at Washim, Narsing Maharaj at Akot, Narsing-Saraswati at Karanja and a Jain temple at Sirpur village in Washim taluka where great fair is held every year and devotees from all parts of the country visit the places.

Chapter-II.

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical data presented in the part-II (Statistical Abstract).

I. Purpose.

The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive Statistical data on important socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables of most of the important topics are presented in this book, so that this publication shall be able to serve as a reference book. Talukawise data has been presented for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 for comparison. In most of the tables the data for the year 1970-71 has been presented however the latest data on Agriculture pertains to 1969-70. In case of population 1961 data has been considered. The data for livestock has been presented for the year 1966 while that of census of Government employees 1966 data has been presented. However an utmost effort has been made to present the latest data. The data has been collected from various State Government Offices and local bodies like Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils. Similarly the data has been collected from M.S.E.B. The source from which the data has been collected has been mentioned just below the table.

II. District at a Glance:

This table presents a birds-eye-view of the Socio-Economic indicators of development in the district and Nagpur division, under different heads, such as, area, population, agriculture, animal-husbandry, education, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. Contents, Scope and Limitations.

The statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below:

1. Climate.

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Akola district. The table No.1 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1969 and 1970. The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as a 'rainy day' if during the 24 hours the rain-gauge recorded a

minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. "Normal rain-fall" is the average rainfall over a period ranging from five to eighty year.

The table No.2 gives monthwise "mean" meanmaximum and mean minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at the selected centres for the years 1969 and 1970. The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature.

2. Area and Population :

In all 6 tables i.e. table Nos. 3 to 8 are included in this section. Data for 1961 Census are indicated in all the tables except table No. 3 wherein data for both the 1951 and 1961 Censuses are shown as reference period of the 1961 Census was sunrise of 1st March 1961.

The table No.3 indicates sexwise rural and urban population enumerated in 1951 and 1961 Censuses, alongwith variation in between the two censuses. The population figures for 1951 Census shown in the table have been adjusted to cover the boundaries or areas of the district and talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 Census. According to 1961 Census, the term urban area as used in col. 3 of the table was defined as under :

1. A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has.

1. A Municipality, a cantonment or Civil lines or

2. i) A population of 5,000 or over and -

ii) Atleast 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

An additional table 3-A has been introduced during this year. This table shows the provisional population as per 1971 Census of this district. The classification of population as Rural and Urban population, litrate, workers etc. has been shown. As the data so far published pertains to the district as a whole, talukawise data could not be presented.

Table No. 4 gives talukawise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denote a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records.

Hamlets, Wadies or Fadas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as Uninhabited villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

The table No.6 gives number of workers and non-workers in each taluka of Akola district according to 1961 Census, and they are classified according to ~~skan~~ standard-livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is shown separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1961 Census. Instead, the population is classified into workers and non-workers. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season; and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, a profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

Person like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation, a person who had been offered work, but, who had not actually joined has been classified a non-worker.

The table No.7 gives distribution of population according to (a) Age group (B) Mother-tongue and (c) Religion, separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole. Here 'Mother-tongue' is defined as a language spoken by the person's mother to the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the house. Dialects have been included in the main languages on the basis of Griersons classification.

The table No.8 gives talukawise details of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole. The scheduled castes notified for this district are as follows.

Scheduled tribes:

There are no scheduled tribes in the district which any one was returned in the district in 1961.

3. Agriculture:

In all 11 tables, i.e. table nos. 9 to 19 are included in this section.

The table no. 9 indicates talukawise figures of Land utilisation under the standard head of land uses for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable wastes permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other ^{fallows} and lastly net area sown, ~~xxxxxx~~ Under "Forests" are included all actually forest areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be, "land put to non-agricultural uses" stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture.

Barren and uncultivable land - continued on page 9

Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountain, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as barren and unculturable land whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. "Culturable waste" includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up to cultivation once, but, not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. "Permanent pastures" and other grazing lands cover all lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Villages' common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the net area sown are included all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under "orchards" are classed under the category. "Current fallows" comprise cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. "Other fallows" land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The "Net area sown" consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once ~~be~~ being counted only once. The gross cropped area represent the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.16 gives the information on Major and Medium Projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 31st March 1971. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs.20 lakhs to Rs.5 crores. Whereas that of a major irrigation project, it is Rs.5/-crores and above.

. . The table No. 17 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1969 and 1970. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected rural centres viz. 1. Borgaon, 2. Chohatta and 3. Ansing.

4. Animal Husbandry and Forest.

A. Animal Husbandry.

In all 5 tables, i.e. table Nos. 20. to 24-B are included in this section.

Table No.20 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock Census, 1966, The Census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. During the livestock Census operation, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animal in transit. Sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

B. Forest.

The table No.24-A gives details of area in different types of forests during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government's Revenue department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forest. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from Local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are classed as leased forests. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such but in Nagpur division some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forest area shown in the table No.24-A may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No.9. The two sets of figure differ due to the following reasons :-

1. In the Indian Forest statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forests, while in agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation (II) The forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under agricultural statistics. (III) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural statistics relates to the agricultural year.

5. Employment, Industry and Electricity.

In all 10 tables i.e. table Nos. 25 to 34 are included in this section.

The Factory statistics shown in table No.25, 26 and 27 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act 1948.

1. Those Employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (section 2 -i)
2. Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (section-2(ii) and
3. Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

The table no. 28 gives the employment exchange statistics for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71. The data has been presented for No. of vacancies notified, placements, registration etc.

The table No.29 gives occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 according to the Standard National classification. Table no.30 presents the volume of employment in different Industries as on 31-3-70 and 31-3-71 classified under major description like quarrying, manufacturing, Trade and commerce, services etc.

The table No.31 presents the results of the Census of Government employees as on 1-7-1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. The data presented in these tables are restricted to the Class I, II, III and IV employees of the State Government and do not cover any other category such as work-charged persons, Class IV employees paid from contingencies,

daily rated workers, part-time workers or honorary workers. The distribution of employees according to specified basic pay/ emoluments ranges is shown separately in respect of Class I, II, III, and IV employees. The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emoluments ranges has also been shown in this table

The data in table 33 gives the registered No. of Factories, their productive capital, Employment, Gross output and value added by manufacture. However, these figures are based on the actuals of the reporting of Census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories. A detailed note about the limitations has been given just below the table.

The Generation and consumption of electricity in Akola district has been presented in table No. 34 for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71, while table No. 35 gives the number of towns and villages electrified as on 31st March 1961, 1966, 1969, 1970 and 1971.

6. Co-operation.

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 36 to 43 are included in this section. The table no. 38 gives talukawise number of primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced and recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan advanced for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. 'Working capital' includes paid up capital, Reserve and other funds, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The table No. 43 gives talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions in money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay money lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted licence, and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and Public Health.

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 44 to 47 are included in this section.

The table No. 44 given in this section indicates taluka-wise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and primary health centres, doctors, nurses, vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and out-door patients treated as well as for the years 1969 and 1970. The table covers all the State and Central Government medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities.

Private Clinics run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in the table.

The table No.45 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district, sexwise classification of births deaths and infant deaths for 1969 and 1970 has been made available for each taluka in this table. Table No.46 presents the cases of deaths due to some important diseases like cholera, small pox, malarial etc.

8. Education :

In all 8 tables i.e. table No.48 to 55 are included in this section.

The table No.48 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1961 population Census. As per 1961 Census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

The table No.51 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Sex-wise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'type' is slightly different from stage of education.

There are at present many Secondary Schools, which also impart education in primary course. Never the less, the entire enrollment of students is included under 'Secondary' education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less according to the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions coach students for standard

VIII to or XI/XII with or without lower standards. Higher education is ^{an} education after passing Secondary School, Certificate examination, which leads to a Degree examination.

The table No.52 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste, Schedule tribes and other backward classes for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc.

The table No.55 gives number of villages without primary schools or schooling facilities according to population ranges as on 31st March 1970 and 31st March 1971. Villages with schooling facilities include smaller villages (generally below population of 300 persons) which cannot be given independent school for economic reasons, and are, therefore, attached for school facilities to bigger villages or urban areas within 'walking distance' of one mile from them. The deserted villages as per 1961 Census are also included in the population range 0-199.

9. Transport and Communication.

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 56 to 62 are included in this section. a

The table No.56 gives total railway length as on 31st March 1970 and 31st March 1971 according to type of routes, Broad gauge, Metre Gauge and Narrow gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate, and not accurate.

Table No.57 gives the data of categorywise extra Municipal Roads. So also Municipal road length.

The table No.59 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Akola division. For this table, the S.T.Division comprises of Akola, and Buldana districts of Nagpur region.

Table No.60 presents the results of the traffic Census on important roads conducted in Building and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra during 1969.

Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tones per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10. Local Bodies.

In all 4 tables i.e. tables Nos. 63 to 66 are included in this section. The table No. 63 gives Abstract of Income and expenditure of local bodies such as village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the Financial year 1969-70 and 1970-71. The number of village panchayats includes number of independent village panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

11. Plan and Community Development.

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 67 to 71 are included in this section.

12. Prices.

Only 2 tables i.e. tables Nos. 72 and 73 included in this section.

The table No. 72 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district headquarter Akola. The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the years 1969 and 1970 along with units and varieties of Commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Office, every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at district headquarter, the average price for individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

The table No. 73 gives consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class of Nagpur Centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Month-wise data for the year 1970-71 commencing from April and also average for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71, have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (new series) is 1960. The index numbers of wholesale prices are published by the Economic Advisor to the Government of

India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index number of wholesale price in India revised series (1965) issued by the office of the Economic Advisor to Government of India. The equivalent of old index numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as Multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous:

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 74 to 85 are included in this section.

The table No.77 gives talukawise Cinema Statistics for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Number of permanent, Semi-permanent and touring theatres and their seating capacity per show has been indicated in the table. Small savings statistics has also been presented for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 in table no. 81. The data on joint stock companies and the Insurance policies issued by the Akola Branch of the Life Insurance Corporation of India, has also been presented in table no. 79 and 80 respectively. Statistics like Police force, Crime, cases disposed of by the civil and Criminal courts etc. has also been presented in this abstract.

Table no. 85 gives the data of important indicators in the district.

Chapter- III

In this chapter an attempt has been made to bring out economy of the district. Tahsilwise comparative data wherever possible for the last decade have been given to compare the pace of development.

Indicators No.1.Percentage of Gross sown area to net sown area.

The following table gives percentage of gross area sown to net area sown in the district.

It will be seen from the above table that the percentage of gross cropped area has increased from 100.40 in 1960-61 to 101.26 in 1969-70. However this percentage increase, negligible. One of the major reasons of this low percentage is non-availability of irrigation facilities. It can also be seen from the above data that the Washim taluka ranked first in the district followed by Akot taluka.

Indicator No.2.Productivity of Important Crops.

The productivity of the crops generally depends upon the timely rains, its adequacy and so also the equitable distribution. Major food crops of this district are Juar, Wheat, Bajra, Tur and Gram. Cotton and Groundnut are the main non-food crops. The following table gives the outturn of some principal food and non-food crops for the years 1960-61 and 1969-70.

It is seen from the above table that the production of all the crops except that of sugarcane and Juar has decreased to a great extent in 1969-70. The production of Rice, Wheat, Juar, Gram, Cotton and Groundnut has come down. The production of Bajra has ^(gone down) during 1969-70 as compared to its outturn during 1960-61, and a considerable increase was found in the production of Sugarcane.

The production of various crops during the decade has considerably changed. The production of wheat has decreased by 37 percent during 1969-70 as compared to the production of 1960-61. In case of Bajra, Gram and Tur the production has gone down by 49, 56, 46 respectively. However, the production of Juar has increased by 17 percent over 1960-61. The production of sugarcane (gur) however has increased abnormally and has recorded about 11 times (1,020 % over 1960-61) of the production of 1960-61.

Indicator No1-3.

Gross value of Agricultural Production.

The Gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated for this district as the relevant price statistics required is not available.

Indicator No.-4.Percentage of Irrigated area.

The following table shows the percentage of irrigated area to the net sown area and the percentage of Gross irrigated area. The Tahsilwise data are given below.

It is seen from the above table that the percentages of net area irrigated to net area sown in the district, had increased from 0.43 in 1960-61 to 1.16 in 1969-70. During the year 1969-70 the percentage of gross irrigated area remained 100 as no area was irrigated more than once.

Indicator No. 5.Changes in Crop Pattern.

In Akola district, a major part of the cultivable land is occupied by Kharif crops. Due to less irrigation facilities and less rainfall Rabi crops are grown to a lesser extent in the district. The following tables will give the idea of cropping pattern adopted in various years.

It will be seen from the above table that during the year 1960-61 there was 51.57 percent of area under food crops to gross cropped area which rose to 53.49 in 1969-70. Due to this increase under food crops the percentage of area under non-food crops was decreased from 48.13 percent in 1960-61 to 46.51 in 1969-70. Due to increase in the irrigation facilities, the percentage of irrigated area under food crops showed a significant increase in the district. The percentage of irrigated area under food crops has rose by 2.38 in the year 1969-70 over the year 1960-61. Similarly the percentage of irrigated area under non-food crops to gross irrigated area

has decreased to 6.67 percent in the year 1969-70, Indicator No.-6.

Increase in Agricultural credit and outstanding dues.

The primary agricultural credit societies which constitutes the base of the cooperative credit structure in the state numbered 835 with a membership of 71,635 in the district. However although the no. of societies was decreased upto 833 in 70-71 the membership has increased to the tune of 1,19,457.

Following table gives the idea of no. of societies, their membership and loans advanced etc, for the year 1961-62 and 1970-71.

It will be seen from the above table that the no. of societies has slightly increased in Akot, Murtizapur and Balapur talukas while the Washim, Akola and Mangrulpir talukas show a decrease. The loan advanced in the year 1970-71 has increased by 209 percent of what was advanced in the year 1961-62. The outstandings have also increased to a great extent. The outstandings have increased abnormally i.e. more than 3 times. The percentage of outstanding loans was larger in Washim, Murtizapur and Akola talukas as compared to others.

Indicator No.7.

Agricultural Wage rates

Agricultural labour plays a vital role in the rural

Economy of our nation. 23.22 percent of the district population is engaged as Agricultural labour.

A comparative study of wage rates of some of the important labour is given below for the last a few years.

It will be seen from the above table that a significant rise has been observed in the wage rates of 1964 and those prevailing during the year 1970.

The wages of carpenter have increased from Rs.3.45 in 1964 to Rs.5.50 in 1970, at village Ansing. Upward trend was also observed in the wages of Black-smith and cobbler. The wages of these two types of labour have also increased from Rs.2.69 and Rs.2.06 in 1964 to Rs.4.33 and Rs.4.00 in 1970 respectively at village Borgaon.

The wage rates of Field labour and of herdsmen are also found rising since 1964. The wages of Male Field labour and Female field labour were Rs.1.35 and Rs.0.82 respectively, in 1964, at village Chohatta. The same have been gone up to Rs.1.70 in 1970 for male worker at Chohatta.

The herdsmen's wages have also risen from Rs.1.00 (1964) to Rs.1.66 in 1970 at village Ansing.

Indicator No. 8.Livestock per hectare of cultivable land.

According to 1966 livestock Census, there were 8, 59, 994 heads of livestock in the district of which 5, 62, 982 were cattle, 90, 941 were buffaloes and the remaining were other livestock. The following table indicates the livestock population (ovines and Bovines) per hectare of cultivable land in the district.

It will be seen from the above figures that livestock per hectare of cultivable land in the district remained the same in 1961 and in 1966, The livestock per hectare of cultivable land slightly increased in 1966 in all talukas of the district excepting the talukas of Balapur, Washim and Mangrulpir.

Indicator No. 9Poultry as compared to population.

Poultry includes of domestic birds like fowl, ducks, improved fowls and gease, Of these fowls form the major category. Poultry in general gives an additional income as a subsidiary occupation to cultivators and food by way of eggs and meat. During 1966, the number of poultry birds decreased by about 39 thousand over the year 1961 in the district.

The following table shows the number of poultry birds per person in each taluka of the district during 1961 and 1966.

It will be seen from the above table that the number of poultry birds per person in 1961 worked out to 0.14 and dropped down to 0.11 in 1966. Similarly, the percentage of poultry per hundred persons decreased from 147.1 in 1961 to 114.4 in 1966. Amongst talukas, the poultry per person increased in Murtizapur and Mangrulpir in 1966 over 1961 and the percentage of poultry per 100 persons also increased from 144.4 in 1961 to 160.5 in 1966 and 189.8 to 200.0 in these two talukas. Mangrulpir taluka ranked first followed by Murtizapur in this regard as compared to the position of other talukas. The number of poultry birds per lakh of population worked out to 11,433 in 1966 and the average number of poultry birds per hundred households worked out to 55 in the same year as against 69.03 in 1961. The percentage of improved fowls to total fowls in the district in 1966 was 7.52 as against 1.37 estimated in 1961. Similarly, the average number of eggs during 1961, per annum per hen worked out to 84 for Akola as per data collected by the Bureau of Economics & Statistics, Government Of Maharashtra, just after the 1961 livestock Census.

Indicator No. 10.Per Capita Consumption of Electricity.

The use of Electricity in the district showed an :

increasing trend during the last decade. The increasing usage of the Electricity can be seen from the following table.

It is seen from the above figures, the per capita usage of Electricity has increased from 15.48 in 1960-61 to 32.50 in 1969-70 and further increased to 32.93 in the year 1970-71. The percentage of per capita consumption has also increased by 212.72 in 1970-71 over the year 1960-61. Due to Industrial expansion and installation of Electric pumps for agricultural purposes the demand for the Electricity in this district has increased rapidly. Prior to 1961 March, there were only 61 villages and towns electrified in this district where as the same has increased to 497 as on 31-3-1971.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled and Vacancies notified in Employment Exchange.

There has been a considerable improvement in the health standards of people due to expansion of institutional health services and curative facilities in the district. Campaigns for the eradication of a number of fatal diseases were also undertaken due to which the health standard has improved and the death rate has decreased considerably.

It will be seen that the number of indoor and outdoor patients treated in 1970 in the district increased by 96 percent and 39 percent respectively as compared to the corresponding figures in 1960.

The district as a whole, showed significant increase in the number of indoor and outdoor patients in 1970 due to increase in the number of health centres and curative facilities made available in 1970. The number of indoor patients declined in Akot and Balapur talukas by 43 percent and 24 percent respectively over the figures in 1960 whereas it has increased in other talukas. The highest increase was in Akola taluka in both indoor and outdoor patient treated and it is due to availability of more medical facilities -

in the civil hospital of Akola city . The following table indicates the number of hospitals and dispensaries and the number of beds per lakh of population in the district.

It is seen from the above figures that the number of hospitals in the district per lakh of population was 3 in 1960 which rose to 13 in 1970 showing an increase of 333 percent. Similarly the number of beds in hospitals per lakh of population in the district during 1960 and 1970, increased from 41 to 69. The Washim tahsil showed the highest increase in number of hospitals and dispensaries.

Indicator No. 13.

Increase in number of students in different type of institutions.

For social and Economic betterment, education is the only effective measure which can be adopted in country like ours. The importance of education was also realised in this district and a considerable progress in the spread of schooling facilities so also in the enrolment of students was achieved during the decade. There was an increase year by year in this sector. The number of Primary Schools has increased to 1501 in 1969-70, if compared to 1,230 in 1960-61. The implementation of the schemes like educational concessions to Economically backward class students, free education to

to the sons & daughters of Primary School teachers etc; the number of school going children has increased to a large extent when compared with the figures in 1960-61. The no. of secondary schools rose to 148 in 1969-70 from 65 in 1960-61. There was a great increase in secondary so also in higher education facilities in the last decade. Secondary Schools have been opened in rural areas and almost all the towns have now colleges of Arts and Commerce faculties. The following table gives the no. of male and female pupils in broad 3. type of educational institutions in 1960-61 and 1969-70 with percentage increase.

It will be seen from the above table that the no. of students in secondary schools has doubled in 1969-70 as compared to enrolment of 1960-61 while the number of students of higher type of educational institutions has increased by more than 3 times of what was in 1961-62. The rising trend in the enrolment of girls will also be seen in all types of education and in particular in secondary and higher studies because of the opening of secondary schools and colleges in rural areas and in almost all towns respectively and an introduction of scheme of E.B.C concessions. If the percentages are concerned, the number of students in primary schools increased by 48 percent, in secondary schools by 104 percent and in higher institutions by 245 percent over 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14.Increase in Road length per 100 Sq.Km. of Area.

Roads are supposed to be the nerves of the nation for its industrial, economic and social development. The road length recorded as on 31-3-1971 has an increase in the M.D.R. type of roads in the district as can be seen from the following table.

It will be seen that the total road length in the KMR district per 100 sq.km. of area has increased from 5.00 km. to 16.52 km. in 1969-70 and further to 16.65 in 1970-71 connecting the district with all the important cities like Bombay, Aurangabad, Nagpur and Poona etc. The variation observed in 1970-71 figures is because of the conversion of G.D.R. in to M.D.Rs. and village Roads in to O.D.Rs.

Indicator No. 15.Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population.

Economic prosperity of the nation can only be gauged by the savings of the people for which banking institutions provide the largest facilities. The following table gives information regarding increase in banking facilities and banking Offices per lakh of population.

It will be seen from the above table that there were 24 Banking offices in this district in 1960 providing facility to 50,000 population per office. The number of these institutions has increased exactly double in 1970. There were 48 offices in this district in 1970. The rates per lakh of population was 4.04 during the year. This increase is because of the opening of branches of the co-operative Central Bank and the commercial Banks now nationalised by the Central Government.

Indicator No. 16. Prices.

Since 1962, prices of some important commodities are collected on weekly basis in this district to compare the average prices prevailing at the district headquarter during 1963 and 1970. 18 commodities of daily consumption have been selected and are shown in the following table, with percentages of their increase or decrease.

(Note: As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at district Headquarter, the average shown above may not be taken as fully representative. However, it will give a general trend in the changes in retail prices over the period of time.)

It will be seen from the above figures that prices of all the commodities have showed rising trend over 1963 prices. The increase in the prices of sugar, Groundnut oil, Gramdal, Rice, Vanaspati Ghee, Potato was significant as compared to some of the other commodities. The groundnut oil has showed a rise of 164 percent over the year 1963 prices. Same is the case with other commodities like sugar (59 % over 1963), Rice (168 % over 1963), vanaspati (124% over 1963) Gramdal (141 % over 1963). There were restrictions over the trading of juar, sugar and rice during the year 1970.

C H A P T E R - I VANNUAL PLAN REVIEW 1970-71

4. From the closure of the III Five year Plan in 1965-66, Annual Plans are being implemented. During the year 1970-71, an out-lay of Rs.225.68 lakhs was allotted for this district. An amount of Rs.149.26 lakhs was earmarked under state sector schemes.

4.1 - The percentage of expenditure during the year under review was 97 for all the district level schemes including state as well as local sector. The individual percentage under state sector was 93 as against 105 of the local sector.

The following table gives the idea of the expenditure and Budget provision for the district for the Annual Plan 1970-71.

4.2 - With a view to achieve the selfsufficiency in Agricultural production, an emphasis was given on the items like Irrigation and Soil Conservation. The total Budget for the Agriculture programme was Rs.87.04 lakhs out of the Aggregate provision of Rs.225.68 lakhs. 98 % amount so budgetted was spent during the year under review. The details in brief are given below to measure the progress.

4.3 - Agricultural Programme.

Under this major head of development Rs.87.04 lakhs of Rupees were provided under various sub-heads like Agricultural production, soil conservation, minor irrigation and animal Husbandry etc.

Out of this total provision of Rs.87.04 lakhs, an amount of Rs.85.44 lakhs, was spent during the year under review. The percentage of this expenditure works out to 98%. However, the percentage of expenditure to the budget provision under local sector was 100 while that for state sector it was 98.

4.4 - Agricultural Production-

Under this sub-head, an amount of Rs.2.91 lakhs was provided under local sector and Rs.0.64 lakhs under state sector. The expenditure under local sector was 2.89 lakhs of rupees while an amount of Rs.28 thousands was spent in state sector.

As far as the percentages are concerned, 99 % of outlay was consumed by the local sector as against the 44 % of *by State Sector. The less percentage of expenditure under*

state sector is because of the non-implementation of Trial-cum-Demonstration farm scheme.

The important physical achievement under this sub-head was the bringing of area under various improved and high yielding varieties of food crops like Jowar, Bajra, Maize, Wheat as well as non-food crops such as Cotton and Groundnut. This important scheme was implemented by Zilla-Tarishad. 5896 acres of land was brought under hybrid Jowar. The other high yielding crops of Hybrid Bajra, Lady, Wheat and Gram were sown in 214, 34, 1308 and 1176 acres respectively. 14550 tonnes of compost was prepared during the year under review.

4.5- Land Development

Irryicut development programme was implemented in this district. The total expenditure under the year under report was Rs.7.97 lakhs (108 %) against the total provision of Rs.7.38 lakhs only.

4.6.- Soil Conservation

There were two soil conservation divisions working in this district during the year 1970-71. An outlay of Rs.43.75 lakhs was provided for the schemes under this sub-head. The total expenditure was to the tune of 97 % i.e. Rs.42.53 lakhs benefitting the area of 16659 hectares.

4.7 - Minor Irrigation.

The Schemes under this sub-head were implemented by the Agricultural department with the help of land development Bank, irrigation department of state Government and Zilla-Tarishad. The construction of tanks, Bandharas was undertaken by Irrigation Deptt. and Zilla Tarishad. An amount of Rs.24.52 lakhs was provided under this head of which the share of local sector was Rs.12.00 lakhs. The expenditure

as against the expenditure of Rs. 12.74 lakhs. (102 %) of the provision under the state sector. 1132 wells were constructed and 267 pump sets were installed during the year under review.

4.8 - Animal Husbandry.

An amount of Rs. 2.58 lakhs. was provided under state-sector while that of Rs. 0.16 lakhs in local sector. The State sector has spent Rs. 2.56 lakhs and local sector Rs. 0.08 lakhs. The percentage of expenditure to the amount budgetted was 50 and 99 under local and state sector respectively. A scheme of intensive poultry development Block was implemented in the district in state sector.

4.9 - Dairy Development.

No scheme under this head was impleted by the Zilla-parishad. The Schemes, which, involved budget provision of Rs. 3.52 lakhs and expenditure of Rs. 1.94 lakhs were implemented in state sector. The percentage of the expenditure to the budget provision was 55 during the period under review.

4.10 - Forests.

During the year 1970-71, budget provision of Rs. 78 thousands was placed at the disposal of the officers of the forest department for the development of forests. An amount of Rs. 59 thousands was spent during the year, the percentage to the total budget being 76 %. Schemes under this sub-head were implemented in the state sector.

4.11 - Fishery Development

An amount of Rs. 13000 was spent under this sub-head as against the total provision of Rs. seven thousands.

6.58 lakhs fingerlings were stocked during the year 1970-71 while 70 thousands Kg. of fish was netted. All schemes were implemented in state sector, only.

4.12. - Warehousing and Marketing

Development of Agricultural marketing was also given due attendance under the plan during the year. As against the total provision of Rs. 73 thousands, Rs. 1.65 lakhs were spent thereby forming a percentage of 226 percent of expenditure to total budget provision.

4.13 - Cooperation and Community Development.

All the schemes under the sub-head cooperation were implemented in state sector while all the schemes under the -

sub-head community development programme by Zilla Parishad i.c. in local sector 98 thousands of Rupees were provided in the sub-head-cooperation and an amount of Rs.14.04 lakhs was spent on various schemes. 98 % of the provision was spent by Zilla Parishad under the sub-head-community development programme. The whole district was covered under this programme. Out of the total provision of Rs.4.52 lakhs, an amount of Rs.4.45 lakhs was spent.

4.14 - Irrigation and Power.

The only scheme of Rural Electrification programme was implemented by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. Out of the total provision of Rs.9.53 lakhs, an amount to the tune of Rs.8.78 lakhs was spent achieving a percentage of 92%. Electrification of Rural area and connections to Irrigation pumping sets has been achieved against this expenditure. 1075 single phase and 77 three phase connections were given during the year under review.

The schemes like Katepurna River Project, Morna River Project etc. were also implemented in this district. As these are the major and medium irrigation project outside the ^{per view} ~~per view~~ of district level schemes, these project are not included in the review.

4.15 - Industries and Mining.

Under this major head, schemes included under cottage and Small Scale Industries programme only were implemented. An amount of Rs 17 thousands was provided for the year, out of which 14 thousands were of local sector schemes. Both the sectors have completely spent the provisions-achieving the percentage of expenditure as 100 %. A rebate was given to 3 Handloom societies under state sector while 6 societies were assisted by Zilla Parishad from its fund.

4.16 - Transport and Communication.

Under this head of development, an expenditure of Rs. 24.62 lakhs was incurred in local sector as against the provision of Rs. 24.97 lakhs. The percentage of expenditure to the provision was 99%. As regards the local sector, an expenditure of Rs.12.65 lakhs. ^{Rs 14.04 lakhs was incurred against the provision of}

21 Km. of New roads were constructed while 16 Km. of Road was modernised. The construction of rural roads was also undertaken under local sector. 32 km. of rural roads were constructed during the year under review.

4.17 - General Education.

Various schemes were implemented by Zilla Parishad under this sub-head. A total provision of Rs.10.98 lakhs was made under local sector however, the expenditure incurred was Rs.15.15 lakhs. The provision of Rs.63 thousand was made under state sector. The expenditure incurred was 25 thousands. The percentage of the expenditure incurred was 40 during the year under review. Number of schemes were implemented under local sector. The expenditure under normal expansion of primary education was Rs.1.982 lakhs which was spent on the payment of teachers. 75 thousands of rupees were released as grants to local bodies for construction of primary School Buildings. 25 Buildings were constructed out of this fund. A huge amount of Rs.5.998 lakhs was also spent for development and expansion of Non-Government secondary schools benefitting 22 institutions. One I.E.M. School was also upgraded during the year 1970-71. 80 scholarships were given to secondary school pupils. Grant of educational concessions to pupils was also a main programme. 10250 pupils were benefitted by this schemes on which an amount of Rs.4.916 lakhs was spent. Schemes like eradication of literacy, concessions to the children of primary school, ^{teachers} loan scholarships to primary teachers etc. were also implemented under this subhead.

4.18 - Public Health.

The entire provision of this sub-head is from the local sector. Out of the total provision of Rs.12.14 lakhs, 99 % of the provision was spent. Building of 1 primary Health Centre was completed during the year under review. 10 family planning sub-centres are under constructions while 7613 sterilization operations were performed during the year.

4.19 - Medical and Nursing.

Out of the total provision of Rs.1.74 lakhs, an amount of Rs.22 thousand was spent during the year under review. The percentage of this expenditure comes to 13 %. The preliminary work of plans and estimates of various schemes for which the budget provision was made was in ^{progress}.

3.20 - Water Supply and Drainage.

The schemes of rural drinking water supply were implemented during the year under review. A budget provision of Rs.36.90 lakhs was made under this sub-head of which the portion of state sector was Rs.29.88 lakhs. An expenditure of Rs.30.69 lakhs was incurred in state sector. 102 % of budget provision was spent during the year under review. 121 Drinking water wells were constructed during the year. 9 piped water supply schemes were implemented by Zilla Parishad beside the schemes of piped water supply to rural area undertaken by the Public Health Works division under state sector.

4.21 - Other Schemes .

Under the village housing project scheme, an amount of Rs.31000 was spent by the local sector on the spill over works. The scheme of extension of village Goathan was also implemented during the year. Thus Rs.84 thousand were spent during the year under this housing sub-head. Most of the schemes of the Backward class welfare were implemented in local sector. Out of the total provision of Rs.1.28 lakhs, the share of the local sector was Rs.1.27 lakhs. Entire amount was spent in local as well as state sector.

The scheme of Rural Broadcasting is being implemented under sub-head miscellaneous. The entire provision of Rs.56 thousand was spent during the year under review.

Beside the state plan Schemes, some centrally Sponsored Schemes like Applied Nutrition Programme, Mass training to farmers, Timely reporting agricultural intelligence etc. were implemented during the year. Out of the total budget provision of Rs.11.01 lakhs, an amount of Rs.10.37 lakhs was spent. The budget provision under local sector was 2.64 lakhs while the expenditure was 2.66 lakhs, i.e. 101 % of the provision.
