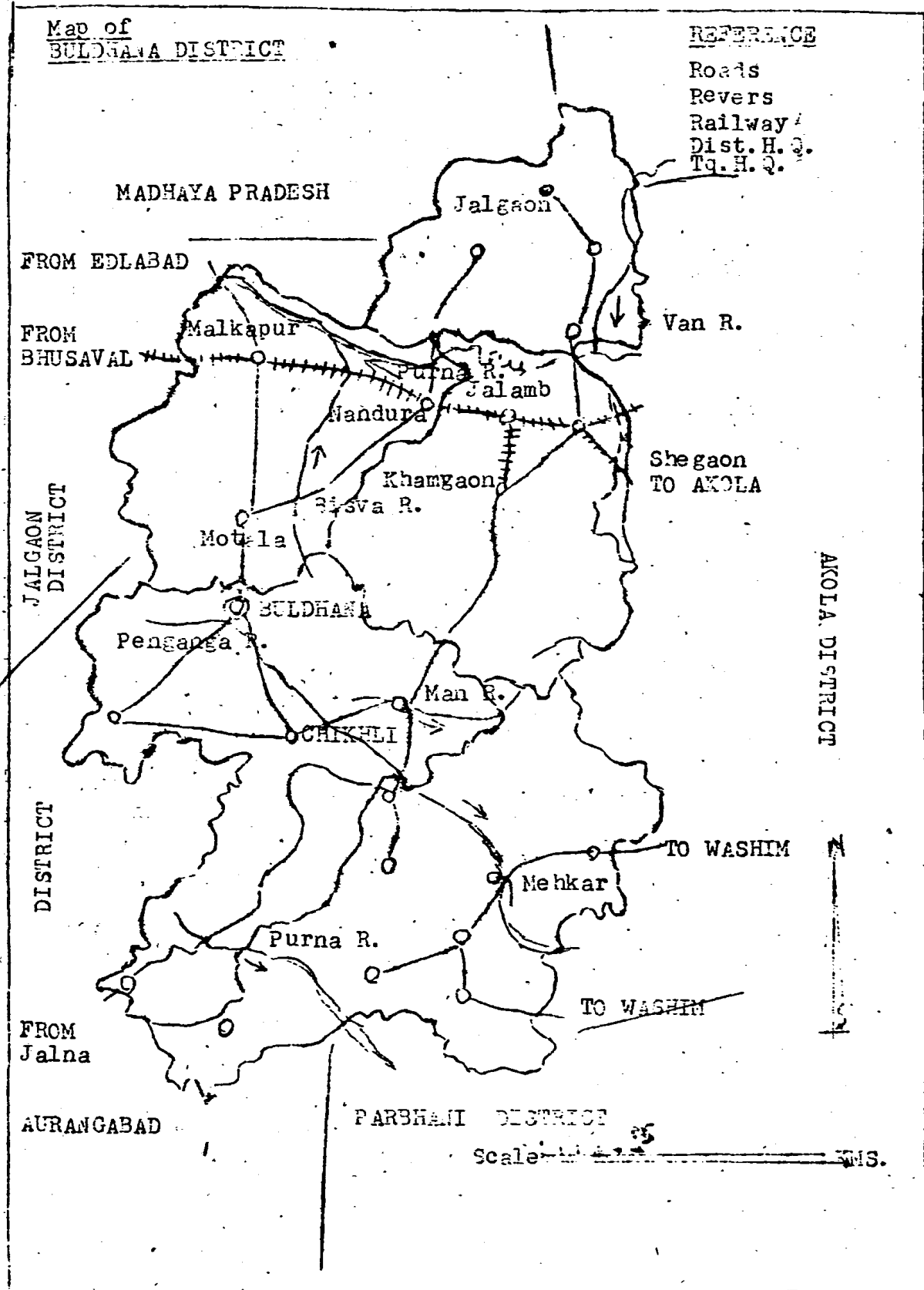

## CHAPTER - I

### Introduction

#### 1.1 - Location

Buldhana district has been named after Buldhana town which is the district head quarter since the year 1867. It is partly in the Tapi basin and partly in the Godavari basin. The northern half of the district - broadly called 'Payanghat' is drained by the Purna river which is a tributary of the Tapi. The southern half known as the 'Balaghat' is drained by the Penganga and the Kateswari rivers which are tributaries of the Godavari.

#### 1.2 - Boundaries

The district lies between  $19^{\circ}51'$  and  $21^{\circ}17'$  North latitudes and  $75^{\circ}57'$  and  $76^{\circ}49'$  East longitudes. It is bounded on the north by the Nimar district of Madhya Pradesh, on the east by Akola district, on the south by Parbhani district, on the west by Aurangabad and Jalgaon districts and on the north east by Amravati district. The district covers an area of 9754 square kilometers.

#### 1.3 - History and Administrative set up

Upto 1863, Buldhana was a part of West Bezar district. Tahsils of Malkapur, Chikhli (Formerly Deulghat) and Mehkar were separated from West Bezar district in 1864, to make what was at first called -

south-west Berar district and later as Mehkar district. The district headquarters were shifted to Buldhana in 1867 and the district was renamed as Buldhana district. Khamgaon tahsil had been formed in 1870 by separating some villages from Balapur tahsil of Akola district.

Consequent upon the re-constitution of district boundaries of Berar districts in 1905, Khamgaon and Jalgaon tahsils of Akola district were transferred to Buldhana district.

There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district between 1911 and 1955, with the reorganisation of states in 1956, the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh to Bombay State. The district forms a part of Maharashtra since 1st May 1960.

The district comprises of five sub-divisions or tahsils viz. 1) Jalgaon-Jamod 2) Malkapur 3) Khamgaon 4) Chikhli and 5) Mehkar. The Collector of the district is in-charge of General Administration, Law and order, Land Revenue and Civil supplies. He is also a District Magistrate and District Registrar. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office and other Deputy Collectors who look after different branches. A Sub-Divisional Officer of the rank of Deputy Collector has been put in-charge of the administration of each of the five tahsils. He is assisted by a Tahsildar and Naib-tahsildar. The tahsil has further been divided

into revenue circles each in-charge of a Revenue Inspector, assisted by a number of Patwaris, whose number in each circle is determined by the size and volume of work therein.

Offices of the other Government departments and quasi Government institutions are also located at the district headquarter for facilitating the smooth and co-ordinated working of the administration at the district level.

#### Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act, 1961 a three tier structure was established embodying the Zilla Parishad at the apex, the Village Panchayat at the base and the Panchayat Samiti at the intermediate level. The Zilla Parishad and Village Panchayats are both local bodies directly elected by universal suffrage at the district and village level.

The Panchayat Samiti is however is a body at the block level constituted by indirect elections. Each of these bodies has been given a clearly defined sphere of activities with major part of the funds transferred to it with the executive staff required for discharging its responsibilities.

The administration headed by the Chief Executive Officer, is statutorily responsible for executing the decisions of non-official bodies at

various levels. This administration being independent and yet responsible to the Government, ensures that the decisions are executed within the frame work. The local leadership can determine priorities within the overall frame work of Government rules and development policies.

The Zilla Parishad, Buldhana, comprises of '59' members, of which 47 are elected from the constituencies with an average electorate of '35000' while the remaining 12 members are co-opted as representatives of various institutions such as co-operative societies, Banks, Ladies representatives, Panchayat Samitis etc. From among these members, the Zilla Parishad elects a president, a Vice President and three Chairmen of standing committees, all of whom have certain executive functions and are the Chairmen of subject committees with supervisory powers in relation to certain subjects.

The spheres of development of district importance relating to agricultural, animal husbandry, Minor Irrigation, Community Development, Public Health, Public Works, Co-operation and Industries, Education etc. have been transferred to the Zilla Parishad.

Thirteen Panchayat Samitis have been established in the district each having a Chairman with certain statutory functions, with a budget annually varying according to the stage of the Block Panchayat Samiti. The Samitis have limited powers of administrative



sanction pertaining to the existing schemes implemented within their jurisdiction. The Panchayat Samiti is essentially responsible for granting financial aid to the Village Panchayats, which in turn provide basic amenities at the village level. The Panchayat Samiti is also responsible for providing technical guidance to the village level staff in educating the village in modern methods of agriculture, animal husbandry etc. Finally it is responsible for supervising the overall administration of the Village Panchayats in the district.

The co-ordination with this elaborate three tier structure is essential in two ways. The Panchayat Samiti consists of the persons elected by the members of the Village Panchayat and also of the Zilla Parishad members elected from within its jurisdiction. The Chairman of the Panchayat Samiti is also co-opted member of the Zilla Parishad.

Out of a total of 1262978 for the district in 1971, 1041170 persons or 82.4 percent and 221808 persons or 17.6 percent reside in the rural and urban areas respectively. The area of the district is 9754 square kilometers (3766 Sq. Miles) as per the 1971 census which accounted for 9.98 percent and 3.13 percent of the total area of Vidarbha and Maharashtra respectively in 1971.

#### 1.5 - Topography

Out of the five tahsils now forming the district, the tahsils of Chikhli and Mehkar lie on the Balaghat Plateau, while rest of the threetahsils of Malkapur, Khangaon and Jalgaon are in the great plain below known as the Pavanghat. These are the two natural sub-divisions, which correspond closely to the administrative sub-divisions of the district. The edge of the plateau where it falls abruptly into the valley is intersected by numerous deep ravines.

The land scape is of varied character, fertile villases alternating with barren hillsides and deep ravines. Below the ghats, the land is flat, except where it is broken by spurs of hills putting out into a plain. The general slope of the district above the ghat is from north to south.

### 1.6 - Hills, Rivers System, Soils etc.

The main system of hills is the Ajanta range which has formed a plateau called the Balaghat. It covers the southern portion of the district, comprising Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils. A ridge of low hills running from north-west to south-east through the Balaghat forms the water shed between the valleys of the Penganga and the Kate Purna. The main Ajanta range forms the northern wall of the Deccan table land and the water shed between the Godavari and Tapi valleys.

There is also a branch of Satpura range in the north of Jalgaon tahsil, which separates the district from the state of Madhya Pradesh.

The general slope of the district above the ghats is from north to south.

The elevation of the three plain tahsils of Malkapur, Khangaon and Jalgaon varies from 264 to 278 meters above sealevel. The elevation of Chikhli and Mehkar table land varies from 529 to 737 meters above sea level. Buldhana town the district headquarter, is situated at an elevation of 668 meters.

The principal river in the district is the Penganga. The other important rivers are the Purna the Kate purna, the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga, the Gyan-ganga and the Banganga.

The Penganga rises in the hills near Deul-ghat, runs, in a south-easterly direction past Mehkar, and then enters the Akola district. The portion of the river which lies in the district is almost dry in the hot weather.

The Kate or lower Purna rises in the Ajanta hills to the west of the district, which enters a little to the north of Deulgaon-Raja and traverse the tahsil of Mehkar in a south easterly direction for a distance of about 48 kilometers, its course running parallel to, and south of that of the Penganga. It is dry in summer. Both the Penganga and the Kate purna are important rivers of the Godavari basin, but they do not acquire their importance till they come out of the district.

The Purna rises in the lower slopes of the Gawilgad hills in the Amravati district and runs westward until it leaves the district at the northern most corner of Malkapur tahsil. Its principal tributaries within the district are the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga and the Gyanganga from the south, and the Banganga from the north. There are two medium irrigation projects on the rivers of Nalganga and Gyanganga in this district.

The soils are derived from trap rock of volcanic origin. There are three main categories of soils in the district viz. i) Barkali, which is deep black soil of very fine texture and very retentive of moisture, ii) Morand, which is black cotton soil containing lime and is less fertile than pure black cotton soil, and iii) Barad which is the shallow soil of the higher lands of the plateau and of black, brown or reddish colour.

The soils in the northern tahsils viz. Jalgaon, Malkapur and Khamgaon are generally deep black formed by transported material washed from the higher lands. Cotton and kharif jowar are the main crops. The largest stretches of such heavy soils are formed in strips of about thirteen kilometers on either side of the Purna river.

The belt lying between the railway mainline and the Purna river comprises some of the most fertile lands in Vidarbha.

To wards the south, the soil is light and stony but pockets and belts of rich soil are found right upto the hills, particularly in Malkapur tahsil.

On the plateau, i.e. in Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils there are considerable areas of medium black soil interspersed amidst the light and shallow soils which grow cotton, jowar, pulses and bajari. The Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils are well known for their wheat which is grown in the low lands between the plateau. These soils have a murum sub-stratum and are, therefore, well drained. The existence of rock sub soil is also not uncommon and the soils formed on such rocky basis suffer both, during scanty and heavy rains.

The district is not known to have any mineral of outstanding importance, except some saline deposits and lead in the lake of Lonar. These saline deposits were exploited for some time past, but subsequently found unprofitable and hence further exploitation of

these deposits was abandoned. However, the agates, cornelians and calcite formed in the trap in southern part of the district have some utility, the first two for ornamental purposes and the last for optical purposes.

#### 1.7 - Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is dry and hot in general and considered to be generally healthy. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature at Buldhana during 1971 was 30.9 centigrades and 19.9 centigrades respectively. After May, the temperature rapidly falls down. Then after June with the arrivals of monsoons, starts the rainy season and lasts upto the end of September. It is followed by winter season, which is quite pleasant.

The above temperature figures are typical of the Balaghat plateau (i.e. Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils) where the hot season sets in late and the heat is not intense. The rainy season is pleasant and the winter is invigorating. Buldhana town itself is the coldest and the most pleasant District Headquarters in Vidarbha. The climate of the Pavnaghat i.e. Malkapur, Jalgaon and Khamgaon tahsils affords a great contrast. There the heat is intense and specially in the months of March to May, it is perhaps as intense as in the hottest part of the country. The strong western winds, which then prevail become intensely heated and exercise their influence.

The rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It is highest at Buldhana with an average of about 273 mms. as against the average of 715 mms.

at Malkapur. If rains come in time and are equitably spread over the entire monsoon period properly the average rainfall in the district proves to be adequate for good crops. The district gets rain from the south-west monsoons during the period from June to September.

#### 1.8 - General

##### Family Planning Programme

The district has done remarkable work in the field of National Family Programme during the year 1971-72. The district has performed 8336 vasectomy and 1196 tubectomy operations making the total of 10032 operations as against the target of ten thousand operations for the year 1971-72. There were 18 family planning centres in the district during the year 1971-72.

##### Small Savings

The district has participated in the country-wide programme of small savings in the National Emergency period during the 1971-72. The district has collected gross amount of Rs. 193.35 lakhs and net collections were Rs. 29.79 lakhs.

CHAPTER-IIExplanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical data presented in the part-II (Statistical abstract)I-Purpose:

The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio- Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Tahsilwise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter tahsil comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1971-72 have been indicated with data for 1970-71 in some tables. In the tables wherein data for 1971-72 could not be presented the same for the latest year, for which they were available, have been shown. In case of population 1961 and 1971, livestock (1966), and census of Government employess (1966), however the data for latest census have been presented. All the data are collected from the state and Central Government Offices, local Bodies and other relevent agencies. The foot notes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance

This table presents a birds-eye-view of the Socio- Economic indicators of development in Buldhana district and Nagpur Division, under different heads, such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry,



Education, transport and communication, plan and C.D. programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the table is also indicated in the table.

### III. Contents, Scope and Limitation

The Statistical tables presents in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped in 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

#### 1. Area and Population

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 census are indicated in all tables except table No.2 where in data for 1901, 1951 and 1971 censuses are shown with decadal percentage variation. The reference period for 1971 census was sunrise of 1st April 1971. The table No.1 gives area, density of population, number of villages and towns, number of occupied residential houses and house holds and sexwise population separately for rural and urban areas. According to 1971 census -

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has -

1. A Municipality, a cantonment or civil lines or
2. i) A population of 5,000 or over and -
  - ii) Atlest 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

The term village (i.e. rural area) used denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundry and separate land records. Hamlets, wadis or padas have therefore, not been shown separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

Table NO. 3 gives classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 census.

Table No. 4 gives NO. of towns according to 1971 census alongwith population.

Table No. 5 gives number of workers and non-workers in Buldhana district according to 1971 census, and they are classified according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood class is shown separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification of the 1971 census. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or on economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season, and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, a profession service, business or commerce he was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the day of the enumerators visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and also person who has been offered work, but who had not actually joined have been classified as non-worker.

The table No. 6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group, (B) Mother tongue and (C) Religion, separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole as per the 1961 census.

Here 'Mother tongue' is defined as a language spoken by the person's mother to the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the house. Dialects have been included in the main languages on the basis of Grierson's classification.

The table No.7 gives tahsilwise details of literate persons scheduled caste and scheduled tribes separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole according to 1971 census.

The scheduled casts for which no one was returned in the district in 1971 are (1) Bahana 2) Khangar 3) Madagi & 4) Sansi.

### Scheduled Tribes

There are no scheduled tribes notified for this district in 1971.

### 2. Climate

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Buldhana district.

The table No. 8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1971. The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as a "rainy day" if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded minimum of 2.5 m.m. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. "Normal rainfall" is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

The table No. 9 gives monthwise mean maximum and mean minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at Buldhana for the year 1971. The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month.

### 3- Agriculture

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 10 to 20-B are included in this section.

The table No. 10 indicates tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Against each tahsil, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the geographical area are forest, land put to non agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and net area sown. Under 'Forests' are included all actually forest area of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. 'Land put to non-agricultural uses' stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. 'Barren and unculturable land' covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classed as 'barren and unculturable land whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivable holdings. 'Culturable waste' includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not

cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. 'land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. not included in the area sown are included all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casuring tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under orchards are classed under the category. 'Current fallows comprise cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards. area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped' area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or the gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No. 17 gives the information on major and medium projects in this district. Both completed and incompletd projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30th June 1972. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 lakhs to 5 crores, whereas that of a major irrigation project it is Rs. 5 crores and above.

Table No. 18 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1970 and 1971. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural centres in Buldana district viz. 1) Asalgaon 2) Deulghat & 3) Dongaon, only one centre is selected from a tahsil.

#### 4) Animal Husbandry and Forest

A-Animal Husbandry :- In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 21 to 24 are included in this section. Table No. 21 gives tahsilwise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock census 1966. The census conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in '5' years. During the livestock census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and Age-groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

Table number 22, 23 and 24 gives tahsilwise veterinary statistics, disease-wise livestock mortality and number of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them for the year 1971-72.

B-Forest- The table number 25(A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1971-72. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Government's Forest Department and those under the control of State Governments Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, where-in the rights of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called 'leased forest'. There is no classification of expropriatory forests as such but in Nagpur Division, some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as expropriatory. The forest area shown in table No. 25 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in



table No.10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons:

i) In the Indian forest statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forest, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation. (ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural statistics. iii) The Forest Department returns relate to Financial year and Agricultural statistics relate to the agricultural year.

#### 5) Employment, Industry and Electricity -

In all 11 tables i.e. table Nos. 26 to 36 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in table Nos. 26, 27 & 28 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act, 1948 :-

- 1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 m(i).
- 2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2 m (ii) and

3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

The table No. 30 gives occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange for the year 1971-72 according to standard National classification. The table No. 32 & 33 presents the results of the census of Government employees as on 1.7.66, conducted by the Bureau of Economics & Statistics, Bombay. The data presented in these tables are restricted to class I, II, III & IV employees of the State Government and do not cover any other category such as worked charged personal, Class-IV employees paid from contingencies, daily rated workers, part time workers or honorary workers. The distribution of employees according to specified basic pay/ emoluments ranges is shown separately in respect of class-I, II, III & IV employees.

The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emoluments ranges is shown in table No. 32.

Table No. 34 deals with the results of the annual survey of industries indicating industrywise working and reporting factories employment, fixed working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1966. This survey is carried out by the Bureau of Economics & Statistics, Bombay annually.

#### 6. Co-Operation

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 37 to 44 are included in this section.

The table No. 39 gives tahsilwise number of primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, loans advanced and recovered, loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to loan advanced for the year 1971-72. 'Working Capital' includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstanding in respect of loans, cash credits and over drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted 'Overdues' refer to amounts of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

The table No.44 gives tahsilwise number of registered money lenders in each tahsil and loans advanced by them during 1971-72. Separate figures of

loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table. The transactions of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which ~~xxx~~ he has been granted a licence, and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

#### 7. Medical and Public Health

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 45 to 49 are included in this section.

The table No. 45 given in this section indicates tahsilwise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, health centres and primary health centres doctors, nurses, Vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and out door patients treated for the year 1971. The table cover all the State and Central Government medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are however, not included in the table.

The table No. 47 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district.

#### 8. Education

In all 7 tables i.e. table No. 50 to 56 are included in this section.

The table No. 50 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each tahsil according to 1971 population census. As per 1971 census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. The table No. 53 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1970-71. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to type is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in primary courses. Never the less, the entire enrolment of students is included under secondary education. Primary institutions provide education for students 1 to 4 or standards 1 to 7/8 or less and teaches the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions teach students for standards 8 to 10 or 11/12 with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing secondary school certificate Examination which leads to a degree examination.

The table No. 54 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other backward classes for the year 1970-71. Beneficiaries for this

table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, free ships etc.

Table . 55 presents data on concessions to the economically backward classes. The concessions of free education and amount incurred is given in this table for the year 1970-71. Under the category of 'economically backward' students whose parents, guardians income is less than Rs.2400 are covered.

#### 9) Transport and Communication

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 57 to 63 are included in this section.

The table No. 57 gives total railway length as on 31st March 1972 according to the type of routes, Broad Gauge, Meter Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and are not accurate.

The table No. 60 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Akola division. For this table, the S.T. Division comprises Akola and Buldhana Districts of Nagpur region.

Table No.61 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted by Building and -

Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count post. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

#### 10- Local Bodies

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 64 to 67 are included in this section.

The table No. 63 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Village Panchayat, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the years 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1971-72. The number of village panchayats includes number of independent village panchayats as well as group village panchayats.

#### 11- Plan and Community Development

In all 5 tables i.e. table No. 68 to 72 are included in this section. These tables presents data on sub-headwise expenditure incurred on district level plan schemes and C.D. blocks and physical achievements during the year 1971-72.

#### 12- Prices

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 73 to 75 are included in this section.

Table No. 73 presents data on monthly wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities -

in the district. These prices are collected from the Market Committees in the district and hence they are limited to certain commodities marketed by these Market committees.

The table No. 74 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district headquarter Buldhana. The average monthly prices of each commodity are shown in this table for the year 1971 alongwith units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Officer every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average prices of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Headquarter, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

The table No. 75 gives consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1971-72 commencing from April and also average for the year 1970-71 have been given in this table. The base year

for calculating price index (new series) is 1960.

13) Miscellaneous

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 76 to 87 are included in this section. Table Nos. 76 to 86 presents data on various subjects such as police & crime statistics, Cinema statistics, Banking, Joint stock companies, L.I.C. Small saving etc. Table No. 87 gives trends in selected indicators for the year 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1969-70, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

C H A P T E R - I I IIndicators of Development

In this chapter the progress of development covering the period at the end of Second Five Year Plan and the Annual plans 1970-71 or 1971-72 has been reviewed by presenting tahsilwise sectorial trends based on certain important indicators of development. Comparative tahsilwise figures, wherever available for 1960-61 and 1970-71 or 1971-72, as the case may be, have also presented to bring out the pace of development.

Indicator NO.1- Percentage of gross sown area

The extent of double cropping is solely related to availability of irrigational facilities and soils capable of retention of moisture after mansoons. The district accounted for a very low percentage of area sown more than once to the net area sown as compared to Maharashtra State.

The following table gives the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in 1960-61 and 1970-71 in each tahsil.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage of gross cropped area has increased from 102.57 in 1960-61 to 104.37 in 1970-71. The percentage of double cropped area was highest in Chikhali tahsil followed by Mehkar tahsil. In other three tahsils the proportion was less than the district average. The proportion of double cropped area in Chikhali and Mehkar tahsils is higher as most of the cultivators grow Mung, Urid, Hybrid jowar groundnut etc. in kharif season and then in rabi season grow crops like Wheat, Safflower etc. as second crop. In Malkapur tahsil though the area under irrigation is comparatively higher, the cultivators grow crops like Bananas, cotton etc. which do not give scope of double cropping.

Indicator No.2 :- Productivity of important Crops

The productivity of crops depends upon equitable distribution of rains in absence of adequate irrigation facilities. Concerted attempts have been made in the district to stimulate agricultural production in the past. The following table gives the figures of outturn of important crops in the year 1960-61 and 1970-71.

From the above table it is seen that the production of all crops except rice and tur has been decreased in the year 1970-71 as compared to the production in 1960-61. The production in 1970-71 has mainly decreased due to natural calamities such as inadequate rains, diseases etc. So also the year 1960-61 was supposed to be the best agricultural year with which the present figures have been compared. The decrease in the production of groundnut is mainly due to decrease in the area under that crop.

Indicator No. 3 - Gross value of agricultural production

As relevant price data required are not available, gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated.

Indicator No. 4 - Percentage of irrigated area

The district Buldhana is mainly dependent on well irrigation except the Nalganga project located in Malkapur tahsil and some minor irrigation tanks and Bandhanas located in different parts of the district. The percentage of irrigated area is very low as compared to other district of Maharashtra.

The following table shows the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in 1960-61 & 1970-71.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of gross irrigated area has increased from 101.15% in 1960-61 to 102.87% in 1970-71. The increase was remarkable in Malkapur tahsil while the percentage has decreased in Mehkar tahsil in 1970-71.

The following table shows the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area in 1960-61 and 1970-71.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has increased from 1.85 in 1960-61 to 2.38 in 1970-71. Except in Mehkar tahsil the percentage has increased while in Mehkar it has decreased in 1970-71. The % of area irrigated was highest in Chikhli tahsil followed by Malkapur tahsil. In other tahsils the percentage was below the district average.

Indicator No.5 - Changes in the Crop pattern  
(Total and irrigated)

The major crops in the district are cotton and jowar which accounted for 36.6 % and 34.9 % of the gross cropped area in the year 1970.71. The district

also grows wheat and safflower in rabi season and Mung and Urid in kharif season on large scale. The district had 56.95% of the gross cropped area under food crops in 1970-71 in the district.

The following table gives the % of area under food and non-food crops to gross cropped area in 1960-61 and 1970-71 in the district.

From the above table it is seen that the proportion of area under food crops was slightly decreased in 1970-71 as compared to the area in 1960-61. The decrease is in all the tahsils except in Khamgaon tahsil. The percentage of area under food crops was highest in Chikhali tahsil followed by Mehkar tahsil. In other tahsil the percentage was below the district average.

The following table gives the percentage of irrigated area under food crops and non-food crops to total gross irrigated area in 1960-61 and 1970-71.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of area under irrigated food crops to gross irrigated area has decrease from 92.1 % in 1960-61 to 86.4% in 1970-71. The percentage has however seem to be increased in Khamgaon and Mehkar tahsils while it has decreased in other tahsils. The percentage of irrigated food crops to gross irrigated area was highest in Mehkar tahsil followed by Khamgaon and Malkapur tahsils. The percentage was below district average in Jalgaon & Chikhali tahsils. Among the non-food crops cotton is the main irrigated crop grown while wheat, sugarcane, banan, as & other fruits and vegetables and chillis are the main irrigated food crops.

Indicator No.6 - Increase in agricultural credit and out standing dues

The co-operative credit structure has been developed for financing the agriculturists according to their needs. Special facilities are also being made available to the agriculturists through the co-operative credit structure for participating in the schemes implemented by Government through the Five Year Plans. The short term and medium term loans are given by the District Central Co-operative Banks through the primary agricultural credit societies and service co-operatives. Long term finance is however advanced by the District Land Development Bank through its branches.

The following table shows tahsilwise primary agricultural societies, amount of loan advanced and loan out-standing in 1963-64 and 1971-72.

The above table shows that the number of credit societies decreased during 1971-72 over the number during, 1963-64. The total amount of loan advanced has -



however increased by 27.2 percent in 1971-72, over the corresponding figure in 1963-64. The amount of loan -  
-outstanding has also increased by 120.2 percent in 1971-72 as compared with the amount of loan outstanding in 1963-64. The increase in the amount of loan advanced was mainly due to the scarcity conditions in the district in the last two years.

Indicator No.7 - Agricultural Wage rates

The agricultural wage rates are collected from selected cultivators in selected centres viz. Dongaon, Deulghat and Asalgaon in Mehkar, Chikhli and Jalgaon tahsils respectively. Generally the skilled workers like carpenters, Black-Smiths, Cobblers etc. are not employed on daily wages and hence wage rates for these categories are not available. The wage rates are collected fortnightly. As these centres cannot represent the district position very correctly, these wage rates may be taken as a broad indicator of wage level in the district. The following table gives average wage rates at above selected centres for the year 1963-64 and 1970-71 as the work of collection of these wage rates was started from June 1963.

The agricultural wage rates were highest at Deulghat for males and females both in 1970-71 while they were lowest at Asalgaon in case of males and at Dongaon in case of females. The agricultural wage rates have increased by 76.4 percent in case of males and by 61.2 percent in case of females in 1970-71 as compared to the wage rates in 1963-64.

Indicator No.3 - Live stock per hectare of cultivable Land

Animals besides providing most of the draught power required for agricultural operations are an important source of organic manure and raw material. The following table gives the live-stock population (Ovine and bovine) per hectare of cultivable land in 1960-61 and 1970-71.

From the above table it is seen that the live-stock per hectare of land has decreased from 1.05 in 1960-61 to 0.96 in 1970-71. The decrease has observed in all the tahsils as the livestock in 1966 has decreased<sup>as</sup> compared to the livestock in 1961. The cultivable area has also increased in 1970-71 as compared to the cultivable area in 1960-61. The livestock per hectare of land is highest in Chikhali followed by Mehkar tahsil. In other tahsils it was below the district average.

Indicator NO.9 -Poultry as compared to population

The total poultry population in the district according to 1966 live-stock census was 1,01,643 which decreased by about 33.5 percent as compared to the corresponding number as per 1961 live-stock census. The following table gives tahsilwise poultry population per 100 persons in Buldhana district.

The poultry population in the district has decreased by 33.5 percent during 1966 as compared to

the poultry population in 1961. This decrease has been observed in all tahsils of the district. The poultry per 100 persons was found to be above the district average in Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils while it was below the district average in other tahsils of the district in 1966. It was highest in Chikhli tahsil and lowest in Bhargaoon tahsil. The district ranked 6th in Vidaroha and 23rd in Maharashtra in 1961 in respect of poultry population.

Indicator No.10 - Per capita consumption of electricity

The demand for electricity in the district is growing rapidly especially for agricultural pump sets for boosting up the agricultural production. In all 427 villages and 19 towns were electrified by the end of the year 1971-72.

It is seen from the above table that the per capita consumption of electricity in 1971-72 has increased by 203.1 percent over the corresponding consumption in 1961-62. The per capita consumption has increased mainly due to the increase in number of villages electrified under the Rural Electrification Programme up to 1971-72. The per capita consumption has rapidly increased in the consumption classified under other purposes due to increase in electric pump sets for agriculture. Industrial and domestic consumption has also shown remarkable increase in 1971-72 over the year 1961-62.

Indicator No. 11 - Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified

The following table gives the number of 1) Registrations, 2) Vacancies notified and 3) Placements in the district in 1960-61 and 1971-72.

It is seen from the above table that the number of registrations has increased by 29.9 percent in 1971-72 as compared to the registrations in 1960-61, while the vacancies notified and placements decreased by 28.2 and 37.2 percent respectively. The number on live-register in 1960-61 and 1971-72 was 2049 and 6358 respectively.

The percentage of vacancies notified to the registars was 29.91 and 8.76 respectively during 1960-61 and 1971-72. The percentage of placements to the vacancies notified during the year 1960-61 and 1971-72 was 56.23 and 50.83 respectively.

Indicator No. 12 - Increase in indoor and out-door patients treated in Hospitals

The general aim of the health programme is to expand the existing health services to bring them within the reach of the people and to promote a progressive improvement in the level of natural health. The provision of adequate institutional facilities for organising health services, control of communicable diseases, family planning, improvement of environmental hygiene comprising of better sanitation and protected water supply, training facilities for medical and health personnel were some of the main health programmes implemented during the Annual Plan 1971-72 for improving the health standard.

The following table gives number of indoor and outdoor patients treated in each tahsil of the district during 1960-61 and 1971-72 in the medical institutions available there.

From the above table, it is seen that the indoor patients treated in various public institutions has increased by about 1179 percent in 1971 as compared to the indoor patients treated in the year 1960. The increase is mainly, due to the increase in the number of institutions (Primary Health Centres) treating indoor patients in rural areas. The number of outdoor patients treated in the public institutions has also increased in the year 1971 as compared to the year 1960. The increase in out-door patients treated is 62.3 percent in 1971 as compared to the patients treated in 1960.

Indicator No.13 - Increase in the number of students in different categories

According to 1971 population census, 37.3 % (51.3% males and 22.7% females) of the population of this district <sup>was</sup> literate as against the provisional literacy percentage of 37.2% (49.5 % males and 24.3% females) and 39.1% (51.3% males and 26.0% females) of Vidarbha and Maharashtra respectively.

In this district, the compulsory primary education was governed by Primary Education Act of 1950 and amended Act of 1956 of the EX.M.P. Government. In 1955 compulsion was introduced in Vidarbha for age group under the Education Act of the Region. Due to this compulsion the number of schools and enrolment in them rose very rapidly in all tahsils. At the end of the year 1971-72 every village in the district was within the vicinity of a primary school or had a primary school.

From the above table it is seen that enrolment in primary schools, secondary schools and higher institutions had increased by 62.4%, 94.8 % and 317.7% respectively in 1970-71 as compared to the enrolment in 1960-61. The increase in enrolment of girls was however more for all categories due to increase in educational institutions in rural areas as also in all parts of the district and due to change in the outlook of people to wards the female education.

Indicator No.14 - Increase in Road length per 100 Sq. Kms.

The Road Development programme for Third Five Year Plan and the yearly plans from 1966-67 to 1971-72 has been formulated in accordance with the broad objectives laid down in the "Nagpur Road Development Plan" 1961-61". The broad objectives of this plan were -



that no village in a developed and agricultural area should remain more than four miles away from a metal road and more than 1½ miles away from any type of road. The following table indicates road length per 100 square kilometers and per lakh of population in the district during 1960-61 and 1971-72.

The road length per 100 Sq. Kms. has increased from 9.56 kms. in 1960-61 to 21.36 in 1971-72, while road length per lakh of population increased from 87.95 kms. in 1960-61 to 165.21 kms in 1971-72. The road length has shown considerable increase in the last decade.

Indicator No. 15. - Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

Since the nationalisation of the Banking Business, the various banking companies have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operational fold and are advancing loans to the agriculturists and small units of industries. The co-operative banks also made a remarkable progress in expanding their business in rural areas. There were 10 scheduled banks and 12 co-operative banks functioning in this district during 1960-61. at the beginning of the year -

1971 the number of scheduled banks rose to 117 while there were 138 co-operative banks in the district. The following table gives the number of banks and population per banking office during the year 1960-61 and 1970-71.

From the above table, it is seen that the number of banking offices per lakh of population increased from 2.03 in 1960-61 to 4.20 in 1970-71. During 1970-71 a banking office could cater to the needs of 23,330 persons as against 43,163 persons in 1960-61. The banking facilities were available at 53 places in various parts of the district covering a population of 3,17,337 (1971 census) in 1970-71.

#### Indicator No.16 - Prices

Since the declaration of the emergency in the country in 1962, price quotations for some important commodities from all district head quarters are collected on weekly basis by the District Statistical Office. The prices of different commodities are collected from selected shops and for selected varieties on each Friday and therefore do not fully represent the district position but the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices.

From the above table, it will be seen that prices of all commodities except onions have increased upto 1970 as compared to the prices in 1963. The increase is remarkable in almost all the commodities and particularly in all food grains, Sugar, groundnut oil, chillies, potato, plaintains, tea leaf, fire wood, cigarettes etc.

C H A P T E R - I VAnnual Plan 1971-72

The year 1970-71 is known for its excessive or untimely rains resulted in severe scarcity conditions in some parts of the district. It is against this background, the annual plan for the year 1971-72 was formulated keeping in view the urgent needs of the economy and the social needs of the population. However the main object of the plan being securing of allround economic development and economic and social justice to the people, Various schemes in different aspects were implemented in this district details of which are grouped in following paragraphs.

An amount of Rs.161.91 kms were spent during the year under review out of which an amount of Rs. 110.22 lakhs were spent in the state sector and remaining amount i.e. Rs.51.69 lakhs was spent in the local sector.

The table below gives the amount of expenditure incurred under each head of development for all district level schemes implemented in the district during the year under review for state and local sectors separately.

an emphasis being on Agricultural programmes as much as 52.2 percent of the total expenditure was incurred on this programme followed by Social services, Transport and communication, Irrigation and Power, Co-operation and Community Development, Miscellaneous Programmes and Industry and Mining.

#### Agricultural Programme

The schemes included under Agril. programmes aim at mechanisation of farming technology, intensification of cultivation of hybrid and high yielding varieties in assured rainfall areas etc. Therefore, all the schemes included here were production oriented.

Table number 68 in part-II of this booklet gives the distribution of expenditure under different sub-heads of development. The achievements under different sub-heads of development are summarised below.

i) Agricultural Production

Under this sub-head, expenditure was booked on schemes relating to Establishment of taluka seed farms, seed processing plants, development of local manurial resources. Horticultural development, intensive cultivation of food crops and applied nutrition programme.

ii) Minor Irrigation

Minor irrigation schemes have been assigned high priority as water input plays an important role in new technology in farming towards securing maximum yields, further such schemes are proved helpful as they make quick irrigation possible. During the year 1971-72, 110 new wells and 201 pumps sets were subsidised, 17 units for boring and 10 machines of air compressor and blasting were on move to deepen the existing wells, 495 electric pumps were also energised under the A.F.C.I. 9 banduaras and 7 tanks were under construction for increasing potential of flow irrigation.

iii) Soil Conservation

Due to scarcity and inadequate rainfall frequently faced, soil and water conservation measures assume vital importance. The measures under taken under this sub-head are contour bunding in the district.

During the year 1971-72 17,132 hectares of land were bunded and 25 hectares of land were brought under afforestation for soil conservation.

#### iv) Ayacut Development

To promote utilisation of irrigation potential already created, schemes of ayacut development were introduced. Accordingly 3365 hectares of area were now brought under irrigation alongwith development of 653 hectares.

#### v) Animal Husbandry

An efficient and adequate set-up of Veterinary aid is essential for any programme of Animal Husbandry. Accordingly one veterinary aid centre has been established utilising Rs.0.20 lakhs during the year 1971-72.

#### vi) Dairy Development

The Dairy Development programme in this district is yet in very preliminary stage. The managerial subsidy is only released to one Dairy co-operative society during the year under report.

#### vii) Forests

Forestry occupies an important place in agricultural development and industry. The plantations in 25 hectares under farm forestry, 70 hectares under general utility timber, 20 hectares under quick growing species and 15 hectares under fodder resources which have been completed during the year apart from the first, second and third year activities.



viii) Fisheries

Feasible tanks for a fish farming being very limited in this district. The programme under this sub-head has achieved stocking of 3.00 lakhs carp fry, fishing of 55000 kg. and releasing fishery requisites to fishermen weighing 39 kgs.

ix) Ware Housing and Marketing

For enabling the agriculturists to fetch good price for his produce, agricultural marketing societies which are mainly regulated are being assisted in various forms. Rs. 0.29 lakhs were released during the year for subsidy to the agricultural produce market committees in this district.

II. Co-operation and Community Development

i) Co-operation - The co-operative movement has grown considerably and has made remarkable progress in various directions in this district also. The programme included under this sub-head is aimed at putting sound footing for credit structure, promotion of co-operative marketing and agricultural processing, organisation and regulation of co-operative farming, co-operative consumer stores. The amount of expenditure is mainly incurred on various subsidies to the eligible societies.

ii) Community Development Programme

The main object of the programme is to foster intergrated development of the rural community by involving the people in local sector schemes.

The entire rural area is covered under this programme in this district. Rs. 3.66 lakhs were expended on C.D. projects while Rs. 3.39 lakhs were expended from Pilla Parishad funds for Local Development Works.

### III. Irrigation and Power

Rural Electrification :- Under this programme 10 villages were electrified and 641 pump sets were energised by utilising Rs.15.06 lakhs under normal development during the year 1971-72.

### IV. Industry and Mining

The development of small scale industries particularly handloom industry has been contemplated under this head, Rs. 0.06 lakhs were utilised against rebate of 3 co-operative societies and Rs.0.24 lakhs were released as share capital contribution to 3 co-operative societies during the year.

### V. Transport and Communications

Keeping in mind the Nagpur Road-Plan the construction of new roads were undertaken during the year 1971-72. During this year nearly 30 Kilometer roads were under taken for construction, 23 C.D. works, were also completed in the year 1971-72.

### VI) Social Services

Education is the most effective means for progress as it provides equal opportunities to individuals for their social and economic betterment. General education included elementary as well as secondary

education. Rs. 12.82 lakhs in state sector and Rs. 5.03 lakhs were utilised in local sector for betterment of general education during the year 1971-72.

Rs. 0.25 lakhs were incurred on Government Polytechnic at Khamgaon under the sub-head Technical Education during the year 1971-72.

Water supply and drainage programme included care taking of urban water supply schemes at Deulgaon-Raja and Malkapur which mostly completed and to undertake new scheme for Chikhli town. Rs. 1.91 lakhs were utilised for urban water supply schemes. For rural areas water supply schemes for villages Datala, Awar, Chinchpur, Rohinkhad, Kinholi, Dongarsheyli and Tiwan and for the group of villages head works at Warvant Khanderao were undertaken in this district, for which Rs. 7.46 lakhs were spent during the year. In local sector Rs. 1.26 lakhs for water supply by simple measures and Rs. 2.15 lakhs for water supply by special measures were incurred against 69 wells and 171 water supply schemes.

The Vidarbha Housing Board has undertaken two schemes in this district for which land acquisition proceedings were in progress. Rs. 1.31 lakhs were incurred for extension of gaathans in 10 villages under which 49.36 acres of land was provided for housing sites.

In order to raise the social, educational and economic standards of the backward classes special programmes were designed and implemented by utilising Rs. 0.48 lakhs during the year 1971-72.

Rs. 0.53 lakhs were incurred under labour and labour welfare for apprenticeships schemes and Vocational training.

Under the programme Rural Broad casting 20 30 radio sets were installed by expending Rs. 1.01 lakhs during the year 1971-72.
