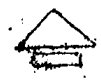

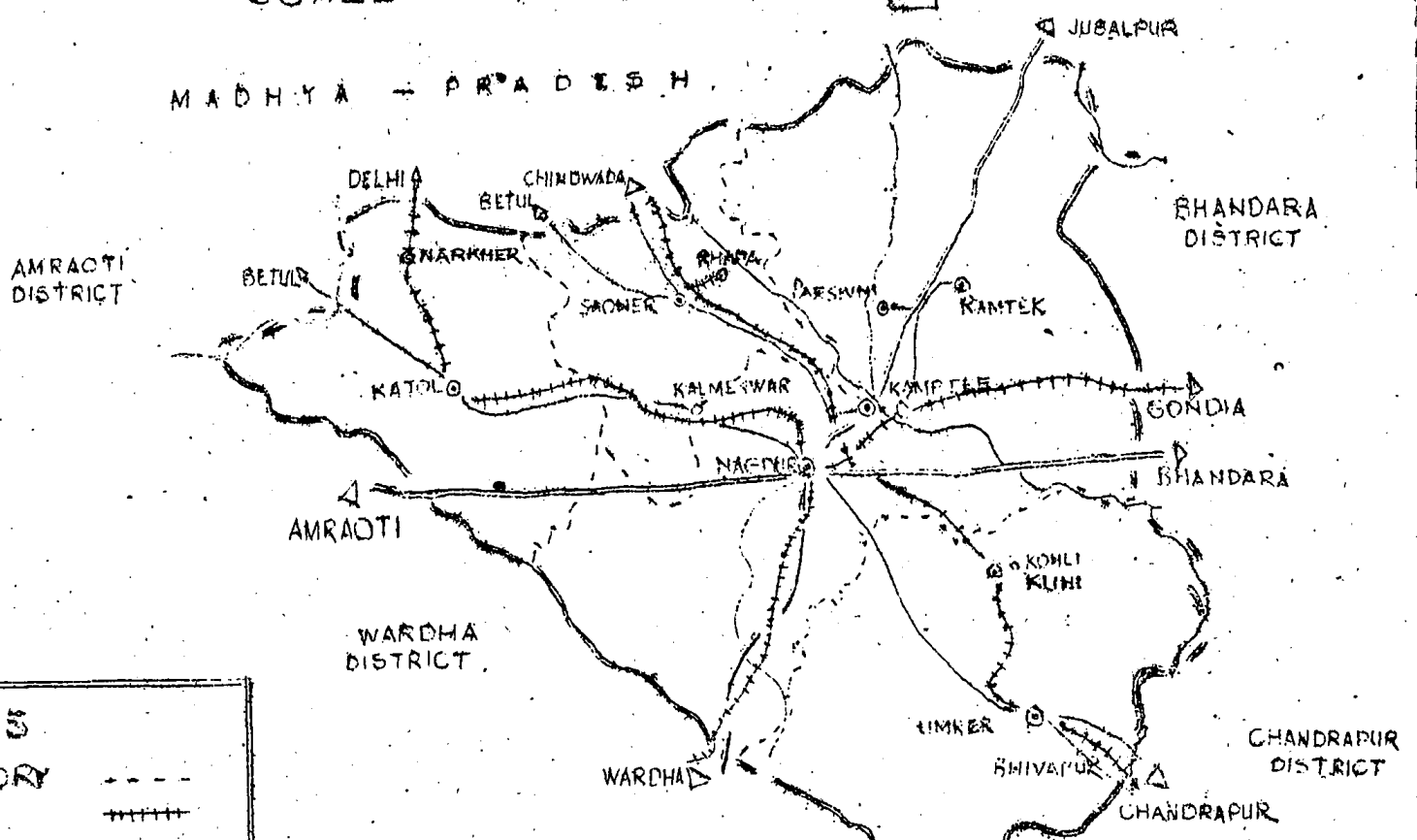

C H A P T E R - I.

I N T R O D U C T I O N .

1.1 Introduction and Location :-

Nagpur district was one of the Districts of Ex-Madhya Pradesh till the reorganisation of States in 1956 when along-with the other seven districts of Vidarbha region it formed a part of the bilingual state of Bombay. The State of Maharashtra came in-to existence in 1960, with Nagpur District as one of its twenty six districts. Nagpur district is one of the important district of the four C.P.districts . The head quarters of the district is at Nagpur which was the capital of Ex-Madhya Pradesh state now enjoys the status of second capital of Maharashtra .

This district lies between  $20^{\circ}35'$  and  $21^{\circ}44'$  North Latitudes and  $78^{\circ}15'$  and  $79^{\circ}40'$  East Longitudes and it is triangular in shape .

1.2 Boundaries :-

This district is bounded on the north by the Chhindwada and Seoni districts of the Madhya - Pradesh, on the East by Bhandara, on the South and West by Chandrapur and Wardha districts respectively , with a small strip on the north west by the Amraoti district of Maharashtra.

The area of the district is 9930 square Kilo Metres ( 3,834,) farming 3.34 percent of the total area of Maharashtra up-to 1969-70 when 10 villages measuring an area of 4,094 hectares or 24.56 Kilometres transferred to Bhandara district.

The Population of the district according to 1961 Census is 15,12,307 forming 3.62 percent of the total Population of the Maharashtra . According to 1971 census the provisional Population of the district is 19,42,683.

1.3 Administrative Set Up :-

For administrative convenience the district is divided into 5 Sub-division or Talukas Viz. ,Nagpur, Ramtek ,Umred ,Katol and Saoner . The Collector is the head of the district administration and in so far as the need and exigencies of the district administration are concerned, he is expected to supervise the working of other departments also . He is also district Magistrate . The Collector being incharge of the district , he is entrusted with the duties regarding general administration , Law and order , Land Revenue and Civil Supplies . He is also assigned with the work of watching the progress of Five Year Plan Schemes implemented in the district under State and Local Sectors. He has also to look after the work of Collection of small Savings and Family Planning, the most important subjects of the present day with the Co-operation of various departments and elected bodies in the district .

The Collector is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and Deputy Collectors attached to the Collectorate in the working of Revenue administration. A Sub-Divisional Officer of a rank of Deputy Collector is put in charge of each Sub-Division. A Tahsildar (Mamlatdar) is in charge of every Taluka Office.

Each Tahsil is sub-divided into 4 to 5 revenue circles and revenue circles are further divided into Patwari Halakas for administrative convenience. There are in all 21 Revenue Circles and 373 Patwari Halakas in 5 Tahsils of Nagpur District.

The District and Sessions Judge, Nagpur is the head of the Judicial Department in the district. The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive. The separation of the judiciary from the executive has been brought about in the district in 1959. The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by one Assistant and Additional Sessions Judge and two Extra-Assistant and Additional Sessions Judges. They have Jurisdiction over the entire revenue district.

Besides Judicial and Revenue administration, There are district and divisional Officers of other departments with different administrative set up. Nagpur city, being the divisional Head Quarters of one of the four Revenue divisions of Maharashtra State, has an office of Divisional Commissioner acting as a co-ordinating agency in between Divisional Offices, Zilla Parishads and the State Government.

#### 1.4 Police :-

The Nagpur City, being one of the biggest cities and second Capital of the State, has got a Commissioner of Police to look after the functions such as maintenance of Law and Order, Security to Life and Property of Citizens, to obtain intelligence concerning the Commission of cognizable offences, enforcement of Police regulations for preventing breach of peace etc.

In addition to above there are offices of Superintendent of Police for Rural areas, and city, Superintendent of Railway Police and Commandant of Police Force (Reserve). There were 3 Deputy Superintendents of Police, 4 Assistant Commissioners of Police, 2 Superintendents of Police, 2 Asstt. Supdt. of Police, 3 Deputy Supdt. of Police and 39 Inspectors of Police, in Nagpur District during the year - 1971-72.

There is also a Police Constables Training School at Nagpur which caters to the training of unarmed constabulary of the districts in the Nagpur Range. It functions on regional basis and is in charge of a Superintendent of the rank of the Deputy Superintendent of Police. He is assisted by the necessary staff of Instructors.

Zilla Parishad :-

With a view to promote democratic decentralisation and to secure greater participation of the people in the developmental activities, a district level body, known as "Zilla Parishad" constituted with councillors, chosen by election from electoral divisions with 44 councillors is functioning in the district since 1st of May-1962. There are 13 Panchayat Samities at Block Level and the Chairman of 6 Panchayat Samities are the ex-officio members of the Zilla Parishad. Chairman of 5 Federal Co-operative Societies are also working as the associate members. The nominated members and the associated members have no right of voting while the ex-officio members and co-opted members have full rights of the elected members. Two women members are co-opted and 10 more members are nominated by Zilla Parishad.

The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad is the entire district area, excluding Cantonment, and Nagpur Corporation area. The area under the jurisdiction of a Panchayat Samiti corresponds to the Block area.

The work of the Zilla Parishad is carried out through 7 subject committees viz, Standing Committee, Agricultural Committee, Work Committee, and Health Committee, Co-operation Committee, Finance Committee, Education Committee. The Chief Executive Officer is the Head of the administrative machinery in Zilla Parishad. He has been vested with full administrative powers for executing the provisions of the Zilla Parishad Act. He is assisted by officers of various departments. The Finance Branch of the Zilla Parishad is controlled by the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer generally taken on deputation from the Accounts and Treasuries Department and this branch works on the lines of the Finance Department of the State Government.

The provisional population figures for 1971 census which are available shows that the population of the district has been increased to 19,42,688 of which 10,55,357 is in Urban areas and 8,87,331 in rural areas. There are 10,10,911 males and 9,31,777 females. The percentage increase in Population of 1971 census over 1961 Census is 28.68 percent. According to 1971 Census Population, the District ranks first in Vidarbha region and tenth in the Maharashtra State. The total number of workers in 6,89,276 of which 3,45,370 are engaged in Agriculture cultivators and Agricultural Labourers, as per the provisional figures of 1971 Census. The percentage of workers in the district to the total population is 36.00.

1.5 Topography :-

The district has an average elevation between 274.56 and 305 metres ( 900 and 1,000 Feet) above sea level and its relief features are characterised, by and large, by the residual hill <sup>ranges</sup> of the Satpudas and their detached members enclosing, between them undulating black soil valleys. Much of the topography is typically one of the Deccan Trap having flat-topped and terraced features, Low buttressed side and isolated Knolls . Eastwards and north-eastwards, the Candscape Change in an interesting manner due to the change in the underlying rocks . The rocks of Gondwana Series are not only important because of their Coal and manganese deposits, but in their surface, expression they present a low rolling topography within a poor soil cover and vegetation.

The greater part of the district is an undulating plateau with a variation in height between 652.70 metres ( 2,140 feet) above sea level on the upland ridges in the north and about 274.50 metres ( 900 feet) near the Kanhan river. This plateau surface of the district falls into three District drainage basins. In the North, the upland ranges are an extension of the Satpuda ranges, they are narrow in the west but widen to a breadth of about 19 Kms. ( 12 miles) towards the east. Immediately south of these upland ranges, strately the Ambagad Hills, the western extremity of which lies in the Nagpur district. The historic temple of Ramtek is situated on a spur of this range signifying the Hill of Rama also know formely as " Sundergiri" Vermilion Mount "Tapogiri" (Hill of Penance.) These isolated hills or knolls attain no great altitude.

#### 1.6 Hills, Rivers and Soils :-

The main system of hills is the Satpuda and its offshoots. The northern range of hills extends along the whole border, being pierced only in two places where the Kanhan and the Pench rivers have broken through. On the west it consists merely of the Outlaying foothills of the Satpudas, the plateau proper lying behind them in Chhindwada. But from the Kanhan to the Pench, it is the major range of the Satpudas themselves which dominates the landscapes, and the ascent of the Khamarpani Plateau is made in Nagpur. Along this length the hills are well wooded and picturesque and there is some striking Scenery on the Penche river. The old Con d fort of Bhivagad stands on this range. Government managed forests in this district mainly belong to these hills between the Kanhan and the Bawanthari.

A few miles to the south of the main Satpuda range are two minor lines of hills to the west and east of the pench. Those to the west lie between Bhivagad and Parashioni terminating in the peak of Tekadi 508.34 metres (1,669 feet). Each of the Pench are the mansar hills, both these and the western range being now denuded of trees, and, after a gap of a few miles, come the well-known Ramtek hills, rising to 427 metres ( 1,400 feet ) at Ramtek Proper. Timely measures by the Government have helped retaining the wooded character of this range.

Minor Hills :-

The second main hill tract extends along the south-east of the district from Khargad on the Wardha river, where there are some fine waterfalls, to the junction of Wardha and Chandrapur with Nagpur. They separate the valley of the Kar, from that the Jam up to Kondhali and further south-east from the water shed between the latter river and the Esc., Near Bori, they become the Kauras Plateau and here terminate to afford a passage for the Wardha river, continuing afterwards south-eastwards and dividing the valley of the Nand from the Wainganga Plain. West of the Wunna the range is mostly well covered with picturesque valleys and ravines, among which are narrow strips of rich well-irrigated land of great fertility. But to the east towards Umred the range has lower levels and is uninteresting. It consists of low bare hills which are grass-covered and boulder-strewn, except where, overlooking the Nand-valley, some excellent teak is grown.

The third main range runs northwards through the Katol Tahsil from Kondhali to Kelod, separating the Wardha and Wainganga Valleys. The highest peak of it is at Pilkapar.

River :-

The Wardha and the Wainganga are the main rivers of the district. The Wardha flows along the part of the Western border and controls the drainage system of the Western part of the district. The principal tributaries of the Wardha are the Bor, the Wunna, the Jam and the Kar. The Bor rises in the hills near Bazargan and rushes down a winding and rocky Channel between Kondhali uplands and the Kauras Plateau passing in to the Wardha to join the Wunna. Its narrow valley is very fertile and the high well-wooded cliffs on either sides render it a wild and beautiful spot in the whole of the district.

The Wunna rises near the hill of Mahadagad in the Pilkapar range and flows along the northern base of the Kauras plateau past Hingna and Bori, where it is crossed by the Central railway. It leaves the district at Ashta. The small Krishna river joins it at Bori.

The Jam rises among the hills south of Kondhali and flowing northwards into the centre of the Katol Tahsil takes a westernly turn past Katol and Joins the Wardha at Jalalgheda. The Kar rises in the same range, but flows directly

south-west, separating the Wardha and Nagpur districts till it joins the Wardha river at Khar\_gad, the trijunction point of the two district with Berar. The Nand flows ~~across~~ across a small strip in the south of the district and joins the Wurna beyond the border of Wardha.

The Wainganga flows along the part of eastern border and controls the drainage system of the eastern and central portions of the district. It forms the district boundry with Bhandara district for some distance.

The Kanhan and PENCH are the most important tributaries of the Wainganga, both of which flow, from the Sat-puda range in the Chhindwada district and meet near Kamptee, where they are also joined by the Kolar. The Kanhan, entering the district near Borgaon, takes a south easterly course past Khapa to Kamptee, where it receives the PENCH and Kolar. In its subsequent course, it makes the boundary of Ramtek tahsil and after receiving the Nag river near the hills of Bhivakund, finally empties itself into the Wainganga. The Kanhan river provides drinking water to Nagpur city.

The Kolar rises in the north - east corner of the Katol tahsil and after passing through the rocky part of Langad in Pilkapar range, emerges into the fertile plain of Saoner and separates Nagpur from Ramtek tahsil until its place as a boundary river is taken by the Kanhan. Its bed is generally rocky. At Patansawangi, it receives the Chandrabhaga, which brings in the drainage of Kalmeshwar Plain.

The other rivers of some importance are the Bhawanthari, the Sur and the Gauthala sand, which draing the the easter half of Ramtek tahsil. The Sur is remarkable for its shallowness but its fertile properties produce sugarcane and garden crops.

#### Irrigation Projects :-

There were 6 (six) medium irrigation projects, of which 4 were completed and two incomplete in Nagpur District as on 30 th June -1972. Total estimated cost of the Projects in Rs. 444.00 Lakhs and gross commanded area is 57,313 hectares. An area of 19562 hectares will be irrigated by all these projects after these are fully completed.

A Pench Irrigation Project is being constructed in Ramtek Tahsil of Nagpur District at the cost of 7.00 cross. The Pench Multi-purpose Project comprises of two parts viz(i) construction of storage dam at Totaldoh which includes construction of a power House at the dam site and would be storing water mostly for irrigation purposes and (ii) construction of pick-up weirs at Kamptee-Kheori with erection of gate over its Kamptee-Kheori weir alone can store enough water after erecting gates over it to ensure a water supply of 100 M.g.d. i.e. 50 M.g.d. for super Thermal Station and 50 M.G.D. for water supply for water supply to Nagpur city. The water stored in the storage dam at Totaladch would be let out in the river and picked up at the pick-up-weir at Kamptee-Kheri from where irrigation canals as well as water supply canal would take off. The project will be a boon to Nagpur district for its rapid economic and industrial growth.

Power Generation :-

At present the power station at Khaperkheda some 15 Kilometres away from Nagpur city has got an installed capacity of 120 M.<sup>M.W.H.</sup>. In addition to this there are power generation stations of Paras, Ballarsha, Bhusawal, Bldari and Nasik. The power generated at these power stations will not be sufficient for the ever increasing future need of Maharashtra State. Specially the demand for power in Vidarbha is going to be much more. Therefore, a Thermal Power Station having an installed capacity of 1080 Mg. is being established at Koradi Near Khaparkheda. The work of the schemes has advanced to a great extent and the first generator at Koradi power station may possibly be commissioned up to 1973-74. After completion of this project, there will be no dearth of power in this district and region and a rapid industrialisation of the distt. can be achieved.

Soils :-

The main soils of the district are Kali (Medium deep black cotton), Morand (Comparatively light deep brown in colour) and Bardi (Red graver with boulders.)

Medium deep black soil is found around Kalmeshwar, and Saoner in the Wardha Valley and in the Nagpur and Kamptee Plains. The principal Soil of the district is Known as Morand. It is very suitable for cotton and Jowar and is found in almost all the talukas. In the part of Ramtek taluka especially in the valley of the Sur river.



The morand soil is of very light colour , the regular rice-land in the eastern part of the district. Bardi is found on the summits and slopes of hills , principally in the Katol tahsil.

#### 1.7 Climate , Temperature and Rainfall :-

##### Climate :-

The climate of the district is characterised by a hot summer, well distributed rainfall and dryness except in rainy season. The winter season sets in from December to February and is followed by the hot season from March to May. The south-west monsoon season is from June to September while the period October- November constitutes the post - Monsoon.

##### Temperature :-

The cold weather commence from November and with lasts till February. December is usually the coldest month with the mean daily minimum temperature at  $14^{\circ}$  C. ( $57.2$  F ). In the wake of western disturbances the district is sometimes affected by cold waves when the minimum temperature drops down to  $4^{\circ}$  c (  $39^{\circ}$  F ). Temperature begins to rise from march onwards. May is the hottest month with the mean daily maximum temperature at  $42.7^{\circ}$  c (  $108.0^{\circ}$  F ). Nights are comparatively cooler in summer season. The on set of the south west monsoon at about the second week of June brings welcome relief from the heat with a considerable drop in temperature. The temperature shows a slight increase in October and there after begins to fall.

Except during the monsoon season when the humidities are high , the weather is generally dry. The humidities go down to 20% or less in summer season.

##### Rainfall :-

The district gets rainfall from south -west monsoons originating from the Arabian seas . The average annus rainfall throughout the district amounts to 1016 mm. ( $40''$ ) and 1143 mm (  $45''$  ) , perhaps due to the hills and forests tracts in these areas. Rainy season usually starts in early June and lasts upto October . Occasional showers also are common. In the hot Season, the light showers are sometime followed by severe dust storms. The rainfall, during June to Sept. constitutes about 90 percent of the annual total rainfall.

( 11 )

The variation in the annual rainfall from year to year is not very large though the agricultural season is affected from year to year due to the vagaries of mansoons. On an average, there were 67 rainy days during 1971 as against 72 rainy days during 1970 ( i.e. days with rainfall of 2.5 mms-10 cents or more ) in nagpur district. The heaviest rainfall in 24 hours recorded in the district was 330.20 Mms.(13 inches ) at Umred on 14 th August - 1953, The year 1969-70 was the year of plenty of rainfall. The total average rainfall in the district during 1971 was 976.36 mms. as against 1384-34 mms during 1970.

Famine :-

The district has rarely suffered on account of shortage of rains after 1947. The Fact Finding Committee, appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 has opined that the district is free from the famine and scarcity conditions. However during 1971-72 many villages in the district had condition skin to scarcity because of untimely and short rainfall.

1.9 Nagpur city :-

The city of Nagur and its suburban extensions which now almost reaches upto the industrial nuclaus of Kanhan from the nerve centre not only of the district but also of Vidarbha. Originally, a vantage point of defence, Nagpur grew in to an urban centre under the Bhonsales of the Maratha confederacy. with the formation of the Central Provinces under the British regime the town aquired a new importance, as the administrative capital. Its growth coincided with the economic development of the surrounding region abounding in cotton crop. As in the case of larged cities, Nagur developed a complex structure based on administrative, economic and social forces, which finds expression in its urban and subarban areas. It draws a greater strength from the new industrilisation and rightly complete with Bombay and Poona in its economic and Social growth.

CHAPTER - II.Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the Statistical data Presented in the Part-II- Statistical Abstract:-

I. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive Statistical data on important Socio Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1971-72 have been indicated with data for 1970-71 or even for earlier years. In the tables wherein data for 1970-71 and 1971-72 could not be presented, the same for the latest years, for which they were available, have been shown. In case of, Livestock ( 1966 ) and Census of Government employees ( 1966 ), however, the data for latest Census have been presented. The population data have however been shown for 1961 Census and also provisional figures for 1971 census on certain items. All the data are collected from the state and Central Government Offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II - District at a Glance :-

This table presents a birds - eye-view of the Socio - Economic conditions of development in Nagpur District and Nagpur division, under different heads, such as area, Population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, Plan and C.D. Programme, Local bodies and other miscellaneous Statistics, Reference year of the data is also indicated in each Table.

III - Contents, Scope and Limitation :-

The Statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped to 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

(1) Area and Population :-

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos, 1 to 7 are included in this section. Data with Provisional figures for 1971 Census are also indicated in table No, 1,2,3,4,5, and 7 but in table no. 6 data is for 1961 Census.

Table No. 1 :- Indicates Area, No. of Houses and Population according to 1971 Census, in Rural and Urban areas of Nagpur District. Total area figures of the district as on 1st July, 1971 are as supplied by the Surveyor General of India which are provisional. Also the area figures of Urban areas are as supplied by Municipal Corporations of Councils.

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has .

'A' Municipality, a Cantonment or Civil lines or  
2(1) A' Population of 5,000 or over and .....

( II ) At least 3/4 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

The area figures in table No. 1 have given in Km.<sup>2</sup> . One Km<sup>2</sup> is equal to 0.386 square miles . Since talukawise information is not yet available , the district-wise figures are given .

Table No. 2 :- Indicates decadal variation in population since 1911 . The table No. 3 gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village i.e. (Rural area ) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised Village having well defined boundary and separate land records , Hamlet, wadies , or padas have , therefore, not been shown as separate villages.

Table No. 4 :- Gives population of Urban areas according to 1971 Census classified under occupied residential Houses, No. of Households institutional and Houseless Population ( Male and Female and Total ) with Population of Scheduled caste and Scheduled Tribes . This table also indicates the Population of literate and educated persons , Total workers and non-Workers . The emphasis is now on work and not on income or Economic dependence.

Table No. 5 :- Gives No. of workers and non-workers in Rural and Urban areas of the district according to 1971 Census , and their classification according to Standardized Livelihood classes. The Population according to livelihood classes is classified under rural and Urban classification with their further classification as male, Female and total workers and Non-workers .

Table No. 6 :- The table No. 6 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group (B) Mother Tongue and (c) Religion separately for Rural and Urban areas and for district as a whole according to 1961 Census . Here "Mother Tongue" is defined as a language spoken by the persons 'Mother or the persons in his childhood or mainly spoken in the House . Dialects, have been included in the main languages on the basis of Grierson's Classification.

Table No. 7 :- Gives districtwise details of total Population , literate and educated persons, scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes in Rural and Urban areas with the Population of Males and Females , Under above mentioned Categories according to 1971 Census, in Nagpur district.

No. caste is notified as Scheduled Tribe in Nagpur District .

2) Climate :-

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Nagpur District.

The table No. 8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the years 1971 . The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as " Rainy -Day" , if during the 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table " Normal Rainfall " is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No. 9 gives monthwise ' mean ' , ' Mean maximum ' % mean minimum ' and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year - 1971 . The data are supplied by the Government of India's Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature - denotes the average of Maximum and Minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the maximum and mean minimum temperature .

3. Agriculture :-

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 10 to 20-B are included in this section.

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise, figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of Land uses for the years- 1970-71 . Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown . Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land , cultivable wastes , permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous, tree crops not included in area sown , current fallows, other fallows

and lastly net area sown . Under ' Forests ' are included all actually forest areas of land classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private . If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be 'Land put to non-agricultural uses ' stands for all lands , Occupied by buildings , roads and Railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture ' .Barren and unculturable land ' covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc . Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as ' Barren and unculturable land ' Whether such land is in isolated or within cultivated holdings ., 'Culturable waste ' includes all land available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallows or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to <sup>any</sup> use. They may be assessed or not assessed any may lie in blocks or within cultivated holdings, ' Permanent Pastures ' and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are Permanent Pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head 'Land Under Miscellaneous tree crops etc, not included in the net area sown ' are included in cultivable land , which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use , Land under castor tree, thatching grass , bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuel etc. which are not included under ' Orchards ' are classed under the category ., ' Current fallows ' comprise cultivable areas. which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The ' net area sown ' consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The ' gross cropped area ' represents

the sub total of area under all crops . The difference between the total of gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

Table No. 11 shows the area under different crops in each taluka. It gives break up of the total gross cropped area according to major group of food and non-food crops . The table No. 12 gives yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops in the district . Table No. 13 depicts the picture of talukawise area irrigated by different sources where as table No. 14 shows an area irrigated under different crops in each taluka. Table No. 15 shows the talukawise number of irrigation wells in the district. A quinquennial census of irrigation wells takes place after every five years. For any intermediate years the village officers are instructed to note the number of new irrigated wells constructed or old wells which have gone out of use and thus bring up to date the earlier census figures of number of wells. The minor irrigation works are shown in table No. 16.

The Table No. 17 gives the information on Major and Medium Projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30 th June 1972 . The cost of Medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 Lakhs to Rs. 5 crores , where as that of a Major irrigation Project, it is Rs. 5 crores , where as that of a Major irrigation Project , it is Rs. 5/- crores and above.

Table No. 18 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1971 . This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural Centres in Nagpur Distt. viz (1)Mouda (2) Kuhi and (3)Dhapewada.

Table No. 19 deals with Agricultural implements in each Talukaa The implements are Wooden and Iron Ploughs, Carts , Sugarcane Crushers operated with power and Bullocks , Oil Engines with pumps for irrigation purpose, Electric Pumps for the irrigation purpose, Tractors and Oil Ghans ( Less than 5 Kg and above 5 Kg. )

Table No. 20 (A) deals with Famine Scarcity and akin to Scarcity data in the district for the year 1971-72.

Table No. 20 (B) indicates the position of precarious and other Scarcity areas in the district.

4) Animal Husbandry and Forest :-

a) Animal Husbandry :-

In all 6 tables i.e. table Nos. 21 to 25 -B- are included in this section.

Table No. 21 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and Poultry as enumerated in the district in the livestock Census, 1966. The Census is conducted throughout the country on a uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. During the Livestock Census Operations, the Livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house particular care was taken to enumerate Livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

The Table Nos. 22, 23 and 24 give talukawise veterinary Statistics, diseasewise Livestock mortality and No. of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them for the year 1971-72.

B. Forest :-

The Table No. 25 (A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1971-72. Data regarding forests under the control of the State Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals



for management on lease basis are called 'leased forests'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such but in Nagpur division, some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forest area shown in the Table No. 25 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in Table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(i) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forest, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.

(iii) The forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural Statistics relate to the agricultural year.

#### 5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity :-

In all 11 tables i.e. Table Nos. 26 to 36 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in Table No. 26, 27 and 28 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act - 1948:-

- 1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 m (i))
- 2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2 (ii) and .
- 3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act. Under which the State Government makes applicable the Provisions of the Act, even - though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However Statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

Table No. 29 shows the registration, vacancies notified and placements during 1971-72.

Table No. 30 gives occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange for the years 1971-72 according to Standard National Classification. Table No. 31 gives the volume of employment in different industries as on 31 st March - 1972.

The table Nos. 32 and 33 present the results of the census of Government employees as on 1 st July 1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. The data presented in these tables are restricted to the Class, I, II, III and IV employees.

The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emolument ranges is shown in table No. 32 .

Table No. 34 deals within the results of the annual survey of industries indicating industrywise working and reporting factories employment, fixed, working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1966. This survey is carried out by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay, annually.

Table No. 35 gives the figures of (i) installed capacity (2) Out-put (3) Consumption of Electricity during 1971-72 and Table No. 36 gives progress of electrification of Towns and Villages and Population covered in the district during last decade .

6 - Co-Operation :-

In all a tables i.e. table Nos. 37 to 44 are included in this section.

Table No. 37 gives the no. of Co-operative credit and non-credit societies of different types during the year 1971-72 as on 30 th June - 1972 in Nagpur District.

Table No. 38 presents data of central Co-operative Banks, Land Development Banks and Urban Banks in the District.

Table No. 39 gives talukawise number of Primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, Loans advanced.

and recovered , loans outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loan - advanced for the year 1971-72. Working Capital ' includes paid up capital , deposits , reserved and other funds and borrowings Loans Outstanding includes outstanding in respect of loans , cash credit and over-drafts and the amount of outstanding bills Purchased or discounted . 'Overdues ' refer to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority .

The Table No. 40 presents the No. of Societies , their membership , Share Capital , working Capital and operation respectively for each type of Co-operative Societies .

The Table No. 41 shows the operation of Centrall and Primary Co-operative marketing societies in the district , during the year - 1971-72.

The Table No. 42 gives data regarding operation and other co-operative Societies of different types in the district.

Table No. 43 :- Given the Value of purchases and sales of Agril. produce through regulated markets in the district.

Table No. 44 gives talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced by them during 1971-72 . Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished in the table . The transactions of money leading in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act., No money lender shall carry on the business of money leading except in the area for which he has been granted a licence and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

#### 7. Medical and Public Health :-

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos. 48 to 49 are included in this section.

The table No. 45 given in this section indicates number of hospitals , dispensaries, maternity homes and medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in this District with the member of Health Centres and Primary Health Centres , doctors, nurses Vaidyasm beds and

and Primary total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated as well for the year 1971. The table does not include all the Central Government Medical Institutions, and also other private institutions engaged in providing medical facilities, Private clinics run by Private bodies or ~~indi~~ individuals are, However, not included in the table.

The table No. 46 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district. Sexwise classification of births, deaths and infant deaths for 1971 is also given talukawise in the ~~district~~ district inclusive of the vital statistics.

The Table No. 47 gives No. of Deaths due to important causes in Nagpur district during 1971. Table No. 48 gives talukawise statistics of vaccination and revaccination for small pox and cholera Inoculation during 1971.

Table No. 49 indicates talukawise number of sterilisation operations done under vasectomy and Tubectomy with number of I.U.C.D. insertions performed during the year 1971-72 in this District.

8. Education :- In all 7 tables i.e. Table Nos 50 to 56 are included in this section.

The data in table No's 50,51, and 52 are according to provisional figures of 1971 Census.

The Table No. 50 gives sexwise number of literate and percentage of literacy separately for rural and Urban areas of this district according to 1971 Population Census. As per 1971 Census definition a person was classification as a literate if he was able to read, or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 51 and 52 presents sex-wise and educational levelwise statistics in rural and urban areas respectively of Nagpur district according to 1971 Census.

Table No. 53 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the latest available years i.e. 1969-70 and 1970-71. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teacher in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'Type' is slightly different from stage of education. There were at present

many Secondary Schools , which also impart education in Primary course . Never the less , the entire enrolment of students included under ' Secondary ' education . Primary institutions provided education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/ VIII or less and teach with the curriculum approved by the Education Department . The Secondary institutions coach students for Standard VIII to X or XI with or without lower standards . Higher education is education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination, which reads to a Degree Examination.

The Table No. 54 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste , scheduled - tribes and other backward classes for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 . Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships , freeships etc.

Table No. 55 gives number of beneficiaries and financial concession granted to the Economically backward class / <sup>in respect of</sup> Pre-Primary , Secondary and Higher Institutions in the District during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 and 1971-72.

Table No. 56 gives data regarding recurring and Non-Recurring expenditure under Normal, and Plan heads by different agencies viz , Zilla Parishad , Municipal Councils , Corporations, Cantonment Boards etc, during the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 and 1971-72 in this District.

#### 9. Transport and Communication :-

In all 7 tables i.e. Table Nos. 57 to 63 are included in this section.

Table No. 57 gives total railway length as on 31-st March - 1972 according to type of routes . Broad Guage , Metre. Guage and Narrow Guage. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are , therefore , approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 58 gives road length according to different categories and surfacewise for the roads of Zilla Parishad and B and C. Departments as 31/3/1972.

The table No. 59 gives the motor vehicles in operation in Nagpur division as on 31 st March- 1972.

The table No. 60 deals with operational Statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Nagpur division as on 31 st March - 1970. For this table, the S.T.Division comprises of (1) Nagpur (2) Wardha (3) Bhandara and (4) Chandrapur Districts of Nagpur region.

The Table No. 61 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted in Buildings and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra, Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-post. Type of surface carriage way, No. of light Medium and heavy motor Vehicles and total traffic intensity in towns per 24 hours are also indicated in the table based on 1970 traffic Census.

Table No. 62 relates to communication system. No. of Post Offices, telegraph offices, No. of letter Boxes, Telephone numbers, Radio Licence renewed during the year 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

The Table No. 63 relates to Rural Broad - Casting statistics as on 31 st March - 1972 in Nagpur District.

10. Local Bodies :-

12. Prices :-

Only 3 tables i.e. table Nos. 73, 74 and 75 are included in this section.

Table No. 73 gives monthly average wholesale prices of certain Agricultural Commodities at regulated markets during the years 1971 in Nagpur District.

Table No. 74 gives Monthly average retail prices of various Commodities at District Head Quarters during the years 1971-72 in Nagpur District.

The average prices under each commodity are shown from the month of January to December for the year 1971 alongwith units and varieties of Commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Office, every week on Friday by visiting the ~~selected~~ selected shops. The average prices of each commodities for the the year is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Head Quarters, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

The table No. 75 gives consumer price index number ( revised series ) for working class of Nagpur Centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour Bombay. Monthwise data for the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 commencing from April and also averages for the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price Index ( New series ) in 1960-. The Index numbers of wholesale prices are issued by the <sup>Economic</sup> /Advisor to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of Construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index Numbers of ~~wholesale~~ wholesale prices in India revised ~~series~~ series ( 1956) issued by the office of the Economics Advisor to Government of India. The equivalent of old India Numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as Multiplier.

CHAPTER - III.

This chapter deals with the stage of development in respect of different indicators during 1970-71 as compared ~~the~~ to the stage of development during 1960-61. Wherever the position during 1960-61 is not available, the data during the year nearer to 1960-61 has been utilised for the purpose of comparison. The talukawise position has been depicted wherever possible and in case it is not possible, district position has been shown. The data on Agricultural Statistics have been presented, for the year 1970-71.

Indicator No. 1 :- Percentage of Gross Sown area to net Sown area.

The following table indicates the talukawise comparative percentage of gross sown area to net sown area during the year 1960-61 and 1970-71.

The percentage of gross sown area to net sown area increased during 1970-71 to 102.53 as compared to 101.43 during the year 1960-61. The increase is also noted during the year 1970-71 as compared to the previous year also when the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area was 102.11. The increase is noticed in all the tahsils except in Nagpur Tahsil. The percentage increase is however negligible. This is due to the fact that the high quality fertile land is less in the district as also the irrigation facilities to grow the double crop are also limited.

Indicator No. 2 :- Productivity of agricultural Crops.

Timely and sufficient rainfall or assured irrigation are the necessary prerequisites for good crops.

The year 1960-61 was quite good and had brought in bumper crops . The agricultural year of 1970-71 proved to be of excessive rains in this district. Comparative figures of outturn of crops in Metric tonnes during 1960-61 and 1970-71 and the percentage increase (+) or decrease (-) of outturn during 1970-71 over 1960-61 has been given in the following table .

The above table shows that though outturn of Rice increased during 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61, overall outturn of total cereals, and total pulses has decreased resulting in a decrease of 48.1% in outturn of total food grains. The outturn of Ground-nut has shown an increase 59.5% during 1970-71 over 1960-61.

In general, the overall production of crops during 1970-71 was found to be less than the production of crops during 1960-61.

Indicator No. 3 :- Gross Value of Agricultural Products.

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, the indicator has not been worked out.

Indicator No. 4 :- Percentage of Irrigated area :-

The talukawise percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown and the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area during the years 1960-61 and 1970-71 in this district has been indicated in the following table.

The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown in Nagpur District was 5.17 during 1960-61 which is increased to 7.15 during 1970-71. Low percentage of net irrigated area to area sown indicates that the irrigation facilities are very meagre in the district and needs to be improved. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has increased during 1970-71 as compared to the figures of previous year for the district as a whole and in talukas excepting Saoner and Umred. There was slight increase in percentages of net irrigated area to net area sown in all the talukas during 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61. The increase was larger in Katol and Ramtek tahsils than it was in Saoner and Nagpur tahsils.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in the district has increased to 102.53 during 1970-71 over 1960-61 when it was 102.0. The percentage increase was negligible and was mainly in Katol and Umred tahsils. There is no change in percentage of gross irrigated area in Ramtek Tahsil while a slight increase was noticed in Nagpur tahsil. There is a decrease in Saoner tahsil.

Indicator No. 5 :- Changes of Crop Pattern.

Two ~~-----~~ cropping patterns followed bifurcate the district in two parts. The first part comprises of Katol and Saoner tahsils and part of Nagpur tahsil where mainly Kharif Jowar and Cotton crops are grown. The other part consists of Ramtek and Umred tahsils and part of Nagpur taluka where paddy, rabi - Jowar, Wheat and linseed crops are predominantly grown.

The table below shows the percentage of food and non-food crops to gross cropped area in each taluka during the years 1960-61 and 1970-71.

During 1960-61 the area under food crops was approximately four times the areas under non-food crops in the district. The areas under food crops during 1970-71 show decrease as compared to the area under food crops during 1960-61 in all talukas of the district. Reverse is the case with the area under non-food crops. The change is due to tendency of cultivators to grow more cash crops.

Under food crops, areas under oranges, chillies and vegetables have been increased as these are cash-crops. Areas under cotton, Oil-seeds have also increased under non-food crops. These are also cash crops. The decrease in areas under food crops during the year 1970-71 over 1960-61 was mainly due to the increasing tendency on the part of the cultivators to cultivate cash crops in general.

is grown more than 30 % while it is limited to 21 % in the Tahsil of Ramtek and Umred where Paddy is the main crop. This can be proved from the fact that the area under non-food crops in the tahsils of Katol, Nagpur and Saoner where paddy is the main crop. The area under food crops was therefore approximately three times the area under non-food crop during 1970-71 .

It is seen that during the year 1960-61 almost all irrigated area was under food crops except 2.44 percent of it which was under irrigated non-food crops. The area under irrigated food crops in 1970-71 decreased slightly to 94.95 percent, while the area under irrigated non-food crops increased to 5.05 percent as compared with corresponding figures for 1960-61 . The increase was greatest in Katol tahsil while it was lowest in Ramtek Tahsil.

Indicator No. 6 :- Increase in Agricultural Credit and Outstanding dues.

Agricultural credit is the backbone of the Co-operative movement even though its sphere has been enlarged to marketing, processing, Industry, Labour etc. There were 1932 Co-operative Societies in Nagpur district during the year 1971-72 out of which 641 were agricultural credit societies.

The agricultural credit facilities given by the agricultural credit societies play a vital role and a way

to bring rapid development in the rural economy. The following table shows the position of loans advanced and outstandings of loan during 1961-62 and 1971-72 in Nagpur District.

The average wage rates both for males & Females in the district have increased during 1971 as compared with the wage rates during 1963 and also as compared to the wage rates ~~existing~~ in the previous year. The increase in average wage rates of ~~xxx~~ males and females is 77.3 and 150.0 percent respectively. The average wage rates in all the three centres have been increased during 1971 as compared to average wage rates during 1963.

The practice of utilising the services of carpenters, Blacksmiths, Cobblers and ~~Heardsman~~ for all the whole year on annual payment in kind called 'Paluta' at the time of harvesting is still followed in the centres selected from this district. The daily cash wage rates of these categories of persons were, therefore, not available.

Indicator No. 8 :- Live Stock per hectare of Land.

It is noticed that the Live-Stock Population per hectare of cultivable land has increased in all the tahsils during 1970-71 over 1960-61. The Live-stock Population per hectare of cultivable land was highest in Umred and Ramtek talukas during 1960-61 and 1970-71 and it was lowest in Katol and Nagpur talukas during the years 1960-61 and 1970-71 respectively. It indicates that the cultivable land in Umred tahsil has increased more in 1960-61

In Nagpur district, Electricity is generated in thermal Power Station at Khaparkheda from where it is distributed to Nagpur City, Nagpur district and Other districts of Nagpur region also. As a consequence of rapid development in rural electrification, the per capita consumption of electricity has increased considerably in the district as is seen from the table given below :-

The consumption of electricity has more than tripled during 1971-72, as compared to during 1961-62. The number of villages electrified increased from 216 during 1960-61 to 708 at the end of the year 1971-72. The percentage of Villages electrified to total number of inhabited villages in the district works out to 42.83. There is still much scope for the progress to be made in rural electrification. To fulfill this need of the district, as well as the demand from this region, one more thermal power station, with generating capacity of 1080 MW. is being set up at Koradi and the work of this project has made considerable progress during the year under review.

The above data shows that prices of all commodities have been considerably increased during the period from 1963 to 1971. Out of the 22 commodities the percentage increase in prices is more than 100 in the case of 7 commodities i.e. Rice, Gramdal, Arhar, Groundnut-Oil, Vanaspati (Dalda), Charcoal and Brass. The percentage increase between 60 to 100 percent is in case of 8 more commodities i.e. .... Wheat, Jowar, Sugar, Goat Meet, Eggs, Dry Chillies, Potatoes and Dhoti. The percentage increase between 30 to 59 percent is in case of remaining 7 commodities viz, Gur, Tea-leaf, Kerosine Oil, Washing Soap, Bidi, Pan and Supari.

CHAPTER - IV.Progress of Plan Scheme during 1971 - 72.

The basic goal of Planning is improvement in the living conditions of the people. The stable and progressive economy could only satisfy the requirement of rapid development. Planning pays good result if all the conditions remained unchanged. Unfortunately the economy of the Maharashtra State has been affected by two successive scarcity years. An unfavourable monsons in 1971-72 have already adversely affected Agricultural Production in the State and in the District also. Development of the State can be judged from the increased in per capita income. In order to increase per capita income, growth rate of gross national product should be faster than the rate of increase of population.

The Government of India has given high priority by giving more weightage to the programme of Family Planning out of necessity for checking the rapid birth rate. The experts of the Planning have pointed out the fact that achievements and the developments of the Planning have been curbed due <sup>to</sup> constant growth of Population. It is therefore, essential to check up the growth of population and to arrange proper exploitation of the resources for increase in production and set up the tempo of economic activities in general and industrial Development in particular to the maximum possible extent. In the present circumstances the Planning Organisation has to plan the economic activities based on resources and not on requirements. It is, therefore, seen that in the present Planning all the schemes have been introduced on the Priority of necessity and urgency, tuning with the resources available. The State Government has decided looking to the need of the day, that the Planning should be framed at district level according to the requirements of district with a view of balanced development. The progress achieved under Plan Schemes during the year 1971-72 in Nandur district has been reviewed in the following paragraphs.

In all, 131 schemes have been implemented in Nandur District during 1971-72 as District Level Schemes. Total Financial Out-Lay of Annual Plan 1971-72 for Nandur District

is Rs. 279.83 Lakhs on District Level Schemes, Out of which Rs. 184.45 lakhs were for State Sector Schemes and Rs. 95.38 lakhs were for Local Sector Schemes.

The percentage of financial outlay on State Sector and Local Sector Plan Schemes was 65.49 and 34.51 respectively. The Budget Outlay shown in the above table in the original outlay given at the time of second quarter of the year. The total expenditure during 1971-72 on all the plan Schemes stood at Rs. 280.78 lakhs. The Percentage of expenditure to budget outlay works out to 100.3 percent. No regular budget provision was made for the schemes under the head 'power'. The M.S.E.B. Bombay spent Rs. 8.20 lakhs on the Schemes of rural electrification in Nagpur District during 1971-72. The percentage of expenditure to the budget outlay under (Agricultural Programme, 'Co-operation and Community Development, and 'Mining and Industry was 105, 522, 37, 368 respectively.

Agricultural Programme :-

This head of development includes the important sub-heads of Plan such as, Soil Conservation, Minor Irrigation, Agricultural Production etc.

Agriculture in the State greatly depends upon nature. The underground and flow irrigation potential being limited, nearly 75 percent of the cultivated land comes under dry farming methods. In Nagpur district gross cropped area was 5,58,170 hectares out of this only 34,602 hectares was irrigated during 1969-70 which comes to 6.19 percent. To bring maximum land under irrigation the Government of Maharashtra has introduced various methods of irrigation, i.e. Irrigation from wells, Tube wells, Lift Irrigation, and tank Irrigation. The irrigation tanks have been classified, according to the expenditure viz, construction of <sup>Minor</sup> Irrigation Tank means construction work up to Rs. 25 lakhs and an irrigation capacity up to 250 acres or 101 hectares. The medium Irrigation projects are those which are in the range of cost above Rs. 25 lakhs to Rs. 2 crores. The projects costing more than 2 crores., come under Major Irrigation projects. The major irrigation projects are implemented as State Level Schemes, The medium irrigation projects are implemented as divisional level, while the minor irrigation projects are implemented as district level schemes. Development of District Level Plan Schemes is narrated in the following paragraphs of the Chapter III.

Under the sub-head Agril. Production there were seven schemes in this district . Out of the seven schemes five Schemes were under local sector and the same were implemented by the Zilla Parishad ,Nagpur , and the remaining two schemes were under the State Sector. These two schemes were under the State Sector. ~~These~~ were being implemented through the Divisional Soil Conservation Office, Nagpur . Budget Provision for these 7 schemes was Rs. <sup>14.32</sup> 14.32 lakhs ( Rs. 0.13 lakhs under State sector and 14.19 lakhs under local sector against which an expenditure is of Rs. 12.65 lakhs . In State sector Rs. 10,000 have been spent for establishment of Seed farm and Rs. 2,000 as subsidy to Municipal Councils for transportation of Town compost against the Budget provision of Rs. 3,000 . Target of handling of town compost was 62,000 tonnes against which achievement is 50,002 tonnes only. In Local sector an area of 51194 Hectares has been brought under cultivation against the target of 65,714 Hectares. Under the scheme Construction of one Agril. School building at Sawangi was in Progress . 10 demonstrations of multi-crop production have been undertaken by the Zilla Parishad, Nagpur under the scheme of Multi crop demonstrations. The programme of Horticultural Development was undertaken by the Zilla Parishad and an amount of Rs. 2.96 lakhs was spent during the year under review. An amount of Rs. 7.61 lakhs was provided for " Integrated area development Schemes" for small holders against which an expenditure of Rs. 7.44 lakhs has been booked . The amount spent was financial aid for construction of community wells (7) Purchase and development of Land (169) Hectares and purchase of Plant protection appliances(4).

Minor Irrigation :- Budget provisions of Rs. 14.45 lakhs were allotted for the schemes under local sector and Rs. 32.45 lakhs to the schemes under State sector. In local sector an expenditure of Rs. 15.17 lakhs ., more than the budget ~~provision~~ provision has been incurred . The physical achievement under local sector was as below .

Budget Provision of Rs. 35.95 lakhs was made for the schemes under state sector for the purpose of development of irrigation resources. The expenditure actually incurred was Rs. 36.96 lakhs. The physical achievement under State sector was subsidy on New Wells ( 546 ) and ( 200 ) pump sets. The work of 16 minor irrigation tanks was in progress during the year.

Soil Conservation is one of the most important programmes in modern Agril. Deptt. levelling of land / Contour Bunding. Afforestation for Soil Conservation and Reclamation of Land have been done under this programme. To retain the productivity of land and to control the Soil erosion the State Government provided an amount of Rs. 22.26 lakhs during 1971-72, against which an expenditure of Rs. 20.10 lakhs has been incurred. An area of 1713/2 Hectares was to be bunded under the Schemes of "Bunding " and an area of 292 hectares was to be covered under schemes of Terracing of Land for Paddy Crop. Against this target the achievement is 31043 acres or 8516 hectares and 1,656 acres or 670 Hectares respectively, which is more than the given target. The Divisional Forest Officer is the implementing authority for the Scheme viz, " Afforestation for Soil Conservation Conservation" Under this scheme an area of 58 Hectares has been brought under afforestation under the town Milk Supply schemes. 23,000 litres of milk has been supplied against the given target of 18,000 litres by the Nagpur Town milk Schemes

6/- 6 Kilometres of forest road have been constructed. 12 Hectares of land has been brought under Farm Forestry and an area of 25 Hectares has been brought under Plantation of General Utility Timber. An area of 24 Hectares is under Third Year Operations and an area of 60 Hectares under Second Year Operation of new Plantation Programmes.

Co-operation and Community Development :-

The expenditure under this head of development was Rs. 31.39 lakhs due to additional allotment for the schemes of Strengthening of Co-operative Societies at all level. The expenditure under Community Development Programme is almost cent percent. Under the Sub-head Co-operation no financial assistance to Market Committees could be advanced as these co-operative societies did not fulfil the criteria for grant of financial assistance.

Irrigation and Power :-

The schemes of rural electrification has been implemented under this sub-head by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board . The expenditure incurred on this scheme was from the two resources, one from the State Government aid and another Agricultural refinance corporation. The expenditure under the Rural Electrification scheme is Rs. 8.20 lakhs against budget provision of Rs. 22.00 lakhs.. Only 5 villages were electrified according to the records during the year under review.

Industry and Mining :-

An amount of Rs. 43.50 lakhs has been spent against budget provision of Rs. 11.81 lakhs. This increase is due to an additional allocation to the Handloom societies. It was the hard time for Handloom Industry and the lakhs of Weavers in this household industry were in financial crises. An additional amount of Rs. 30.81 lakhs was, therefore, released by the Government. 222 Societies were assisted during the year .

Transport and Communication :-

Five schemes were implemented under this sub-head during 1971-72 . An expenditure of Rs. 14.28 lakhs was incurred during 1971-72 against the budget provision of Rs. 17.31 lakhs. District Roads, Roads in Hilly and Forest area, Village Approach Roads and Roads of Economic Importance were taken for constructions during the year. The special addition in this year was the Programme of rural employment Guarantee schemes which was linked with other Plan Schemes.

Social Services :-

Rs. 81.73 lakhs have been spent during the year 1971-72 under the head " Social Services. The following table gives the break-up of expenditure under this head according to different sub-heads of development.

General Education :-

In general education 75 teachers were continued under the scheme of Normal . . . . . Expansion of Primary Schools during this year. The stress was given on Primary education. 122 students got benefit of Scholarships in Government Secondary Schools. Sixteen Schools were assisted under the schemes of Development and expansion Non-Government Secondary Schools in Vidarbha. 26,515 Students have been benefitted under the Scheme of Educational Concessions to students of Economically backward Class People. Concessions were given to 1651 Children of Primary schools teachers. 18 new rooms were constructed during the year. Under the scheme of strengthening of inspecting staff for inspection of record, 4 ADIS were appointed. 3 additional sections of High Schools and middle schools were opened. One teacher was appointed and 31 students got admission during the year 1971-72. 244 teachers were trained during the year. Out of these 88 teachers were trained under the schemes of basis Training to Pre-Primary Teachers, and 156 under Elementary Teachers Training. Loan of Rs. 0.50 Lakhs was granted to Voluntary Societies for construction of School buildings the work of 8 schools was in progress. 10 posts of trained Graduate Head Masters in Primary Schools were filled-in.

Technical Education :-

Two schemes pertaining to establishment of new polytechnic and expansion of existing polytechnic were implemented under the sub-head " Technical Education during the year 1970-71.

Medical and Nursing :-

Schemes regarding installation of Kidney Unit in the Medical College Hospital, Nagpur has been implemented during the year 1971-72 in Nagpur District.

Water Supply and Drainage :-

The budget provision for the schemes under sub-head was Rs. 17.94 lakhs. 6 Water supply schemes for urban areas and 17 Rural drinking water supply schemes were in progress at the beginning of 1971-72. One more Rural drinking water supply scheme has been added during the year.

Housing :-

Budget provision of Rs. 56.14 lakhs was year-marked for 5 housing Schemes with intention to provide accommodation on rented basis and hired purchase ~~basis~~ basis to the Industrial workers, Low Income Group, Middle Income Group, Economically Weaker Sections and also for ~~Land~~ Land acquisition and development schemes. An amount of Rs. 12.27 has been spent on these schemes. The construction work of houses under those schemes was in progress.

Welfare of Backward Classes:-

Exemption from payment of tuition fees, examination fees, award of scholar-ships had been given to 2,756 scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other backward class students under this sub-head during 1971-72 in Nagpur District. Rs. 0.08 lakhs have been spent for loan cum-subsidy to the cottage industries and professions, under which 23 societies were benefitted during the year. Building grants were given to 1 Hostel for scheduled caste, 7 wells were constructed, 7 acres of Land was to be developed and 25 Houses were to be constructed. 3 Co-operative Societies were assisted under the different schemes under this sub-head during the year 1971-72, Expenditure incurred on this subhead was Rs. 1.09 lakhs.

Labour and Labour Welfare :-

One Scheme for craftsman training was implemented under this sub-head.

Rural Broad-Casting :-

97 Radio Sets were installed during this year in Nagpur District, as against the target of 100 radio sets to be installed. The achievement is <sup>not</sup> cent percent for the reason that the village Gram Panchayats could not contribute their share.

Centrally Sponsored Schemes :-

In addition to above schemes 4 Centrally Sponsored schemes were also implemented in the district during 1971-72. The budget provision for these schemes was Rs. 18.95 lakhs and expenditure incurred was Rs. 17.32 lakhs which is 91 per cent of the budget.

The schemes include, Applied Nutrition programme, Grant of tuition fees, examination fees to students of Vinukta Jatis under welfare of Backward Classes and two schemes viz, Family Planning and Malaria Eradication of Public Health Department.
