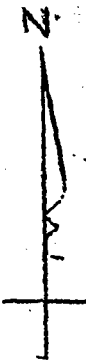

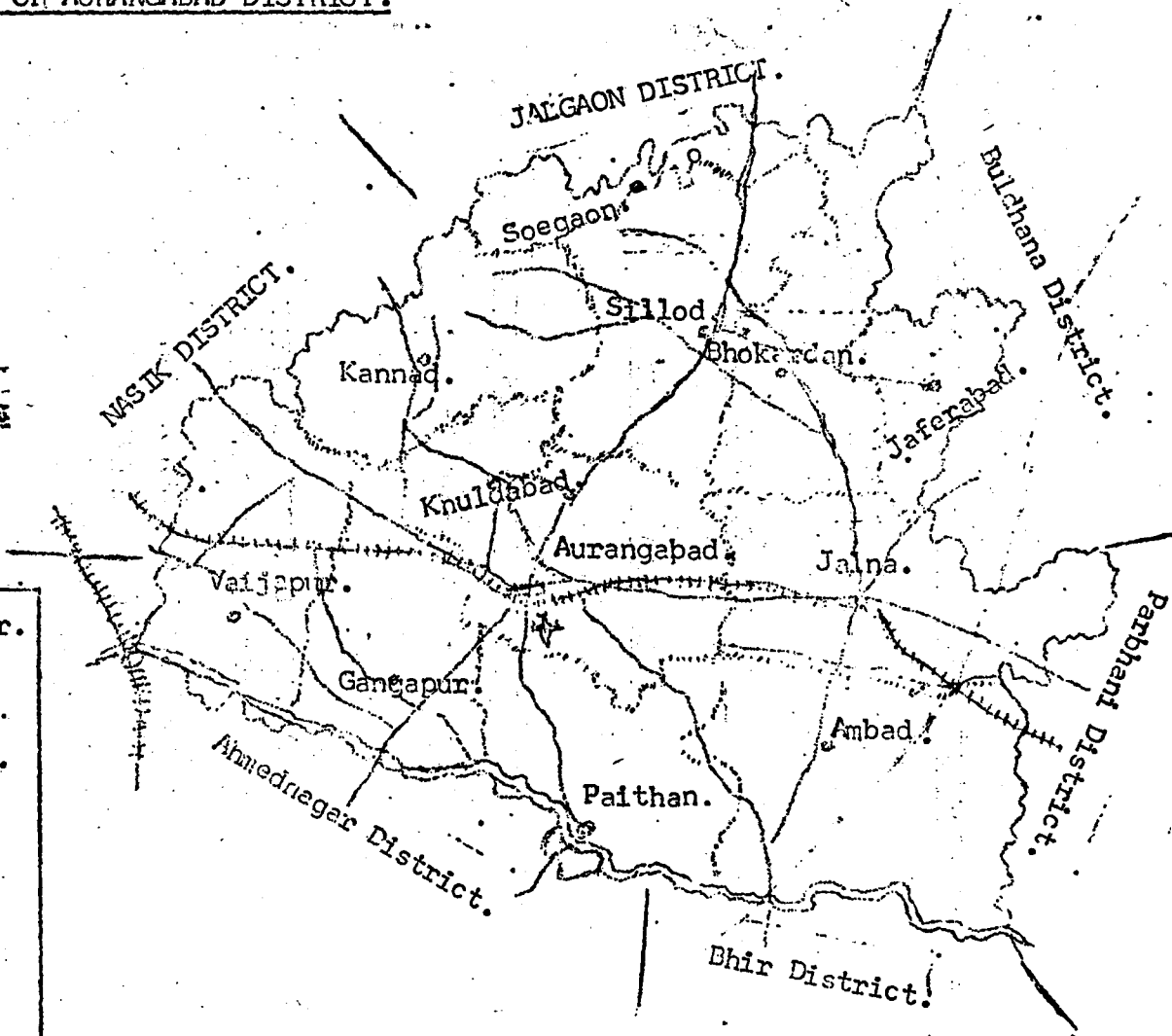
MAP OF AURANGABAD DISTRICT.

C H A P T E R - I .

1.1 INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION :-

The district of Aurangabad, now a part of the Maharashtra state, is situated in upper Godawari basin and in the extreme north west of Marathwada. It lies in between the parallels of  $19^{\circ}17'30''$  and  $20^{\circ}40'10''$  north latitude and between the meridians of  $74^{\circ}39'30''$  and  $76^{\circ}40'$  east longitude. According to 1971 Census it covers an area of 16,200 Sq. Kilometres.

The district forms 5.3% of the total area of the State & 3.91% of the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at the banks of the Godavari. In general, the district slopes down towards the south & south east.

1.2 BOUNDARIES .

It is bounded on the north by the districts of Jalgaon & Dhulia, on the south by Dhir district and a portion of Ahmednagar district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts and on the west by Nasik district and a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from north to south is about 161 Kms. and from east to west about 201 Kms.

1.3 AREA :-

The area of Aurangabad district as per 1971 population Census publications is 16,200 kilometres; the rural area covering 16,059.2 Kms. and the urban 140.8 Kms. The rural area forms 99.1 percent and the urban 0.9%.

The district or any of its talukas underwent no change in boundary during 1901 to 1941. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district and thus a change in boundary was effected.

Consequent upon the integration of jagirs, the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950 and the new mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad were created. Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 from Kannad taluka.

With the re-organisation of states on 1-11-1956 the district was transferred from the erstwhile Hyderabad State along with the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra.

#### 1.4. TOPOGRAPHY:

In general the district slopes down south and south east. The general elevation above the sea level varies from 2,000 to 2,200 feet on the north and 1,700 to 1,900 feet towards the south.

#### 1.5. HILLS AND RIVER SYSTEM SOILS :-

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valley of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat are a continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidarbha. There are important and noted hills in Aurangabad, namely, Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotsna hills. All these have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. Other hills of the district are Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kankura, Surpanth, Satmala Ajantha ghats and the Aurangabad hills. Their average height is about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in places they reach a height of about 3,000 feet also. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 203 Kilometres separating Aurangabad district from Ahmednagar and Bhir districts. Its tributaries are Purna, Shivana, Dhenda, Budhna, Dhamna, Kham (Ganda) (which passes through the heart of the Aurangabad town), Dheku, Khelna, Kundalika, Sauki, Sukhna, Koriwad, Katkali, Galathi & Jui.

The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga, Virbhadra, Kasner, Nalni, Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala, Hewra, Arnavati & Gulduth.

The soil of Aurangabad district is black cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weltering of the trap rock. The geological formation of the district is (i) Middle traps of the Deccan Tertiary (ii) Older alluvial deposits of Godavari and (iii) Modern alluvial deposits of Godavari and other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime, magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton & some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on weltering by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture & depth. In the hilly tracts in the north it is shallow and relatively poor, but in the south it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godavari valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

#### 1.6 (i) CLIMATE :

The climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons a moderately warm wet season from June to September, a cool dry season from October to February and hot dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below 17°C. and normally ranges between 21°C. to 36°C. The winter season is comparatively dry and starts from November and ends in February, January being the coldest month of the year. The maximum temperature in the month of May rises even as high as 41°C. Hot dry winds prevail occasionally in April and May. During summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. The climate of Aurangabad can thus be called pleasant and healthy.

1.6 (ii) TEMPERATURE:

At Aurangabad centre, the maximum temperature was in April, 1971 (39.7°C.). The same was highest in the year 1972. Chikalhana centre marked highest temperature in the month of April, 1971 (39.2°C.). Even though both the centres were coolest, i.e. temperature was minimum in the month of December, 1971, The minimum temperature of both the centres was in the month of February, 1972. The table No.1.1 indicates the average temperature in three seasons during the years 1971 and 1972 at both the centres of Aurangabad & Chikalhana.

It may be noted that due to difference in altitude and topography, rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of the district.

On the basis of the district normal rainfall according to variation in rainfall the district can be classified into three district tracts, namely (i) where the rainfall exceeds 750 millimetres, (ii) rather in-sufficient rainfall tract with rainfall ranges between 650 to 750 millimetres and (iii) poor rainfall tracts with rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The table No.1.2 below shows the talukawise normal rainfall (average of last 34 years from 1922-23 to 1955-56) for Aurangabad, Khuldabad, Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Jalna, Gangapur and Vaijapur and average of last ten years, (from 1961 to 1970) for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Ambad and Paithan as the data of normal rainfall from 1922-23 to 1955-56 i.e. for 34 years, is not available in the office of the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona.

From the above, it is seen that during the year 1971 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Jalna & Gangapur,

it ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Aurangabad, Khuldabad and Paithan talukas. The remaining talukas viz. Kannad, Coegaon, Sillod, Bhokardan, Jafferabad, Ambad and Vaijapur had rainfall below 650 millimetres. During the year 1971, among all the talukas of Aurangabad district, Gangapur recorded the highest rainfall of 924.6 millimetres while Jafferabad recorded the lowest i.e. 373.3 millimetres only.

The year 1972 was a drought year. Almost every taluka recorded rainfall between 200 to 300 millimetres during this year. As a result the whole district was declared as scarcity area during 1972.

1.7 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :

Aurangabad district is divided into three sub-divisions which are further sub-divided into talukas as given in the following table No.1.3.

**ZILLA PARISHAD:**

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and Government affairs, a Zilla Parishad and 12 Panchayat Samitis have been established in 1962. Subject to any alteration of boundaries which may be made in pursuance of the provision of Chapter XV of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad's and Panchayat Samitis Act, 1961, every local area formed or constituted into a district under the relevant code (but excluding therefrom the limits of a municipal corporation, Municipality a cantonment or a notified area committee, constituted or established by or under any law for the time being in force) shall be a District for the purpose of Z.P. The Panchayat Samitis correspond to the taluka boundaries excluding municipalities and cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 99.13 percent of the area and 84.15 percent of the total population of the district as per 1971 Census.

The number of villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti along with the number of councillors and co-opted members are as shown below in table No.1.4.

CHAPTER -II.

PURPOSE :-

Exhaustive statistics about important socio-economic indicators of the economy have been presented in this Abstract with a view to make the Abstract useful as a reference book. The talukawise figures which have been given in the Abstract will enable the reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :-

This table indicates the data on all important items in order to have a bird's-eye-view of the socio-economic indicators of the district as compared to Aurangabad division. Items covered in the table are Area and Population, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Industries, Electricity, Co-operation, Medical and Health, Education, Transport and Communication, Plan and Community Development Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous Statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table.

The scope and limitations of the information in the Abstract are discussed in the following paragraphs.

1. AREA AND POPULATION:-

The data of 1971 population census are presented in tables No.1 to 7. In table No.2, data of 1951, 1961 and 1971 population census are presented.

The table No.1 gives rural and urban area, population per sq.km., No. of villages inhabited and un-inhabited, No. of towns, No. of occupied residential houses, No. of households and male and female population in Aurangabad district, according to 1971 Census. The table No.2 shows decadal percentage variations in total, rural and urban population since 1951 with the population and population per sq.km. for total, rural and urban of Aurangabad/<sup>district</sup> for 1951, 1961 and 1971 Censuses.

The table No.3 showing talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 Census gives No. of villages in population ranges of less than 200, 200-499, 500-999, 1,000-1,999, 2,000-4,999, 5,000-9,999 & 10,000 & above population in Aurangabad district. The table No.4 shows talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 Census in Aurangabad district. The table No.5 indicates the number of workers and non-workers according to livelihood classes in each taluka of Aurangabad district according to 1971 Census. The table No.6 presents the data of distribution of total, rural and urban population according to (A) age group and (B) religion in the district as per 1971 Census. The table No.7 gives information pertaining to talukawise total, rural and urban population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the district at the time of 1971 Census.

## II. CLIMATE AND RAINFALL.

Table Nos. 8 and 9 deal with number of rainy days and rainfall & monthly temperature at the selected centres in the district. The monthwise information regarding rainy days & total rainfall at selected centres in the district during 1972 is given in table number 8, as recorded at the 13 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters except one i.e. Chikalhana. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Silled, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna centres, the same recorded in the table for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambad centres is the average rainfall of last ten years i.e. 1961 to 1970 & for Chikalhana the average rainfall for 9 years i.e. from 1963 to 1971 as the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available with

Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona. The table No. 9 gives monthly maximum, and minimum temperature at two selected centres in the district during 1972.

III. AGRICULTURE:-

The yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops in the district during 1970-71 and 1971-72 is furnished in table No. 12. The data regarding the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district during 1970-71 and 1971-72 is displayed in table No. 13. The area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1970-71 and 1971-72 is given in table No. 14. The information regarding talukawise number of irrigation wells during 1970-71 and 1971-72 and number of minor irrigation works during 1971-72 & major and medium projects as on 30-6-1972 is furnished in table Nos. 15, 16 and 17, respectively. The table No. 18 deals with agricultural wage rates during 1972 and table No. 19 gives information about agricultural implements as per 1972

**Livestock Census.** The information about famine & scarcity conditions in each taluka for the year 1972-73 is furnished in table No.20. CHAPTER III.

This chapter deals with a few selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important sectors of economy in the district.

INDICATOR No.1.

Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. Double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. It is observed in table No.10 of this Abstract that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area in the district has decreased from 107.14 in the year 1970-71 to 105.57 in 1971-72 due to scarcity of rains.

It is observed from the above table that percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was highest in Sillod taluka being 113.67 during 1970-71 and in Jalna taluka being 112.99 in 1971-72 while the minimum was found in Jafferabad taluka being 102.22 during 1970-71 and in Gangapur taluka being 100.82 during 1971-72. Thus the range-variation comes to 102.22 to 113.67 during 1970-71 and 100.82 to 112.99 during 1971-72.

The comparison of data in 1971-72 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there was an increase of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of talukas of the district except Khuldabad, Soegaon, Jafferabad, Ambad, Paithan and Gangapur.

The comparison of data in 1971-72 with that in 1965-66 indicates that there was a decrease of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of all talukas of the district except Kannad, Soegaon, Sillod, Bhokardan & Jalna.

INDICATOR NO.2.

Productivity of Important Crops.

Productivity of important crops in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72 has been discussed in this indicator. There is a separate table in the Abstract part denoting the yield rates of different crops per hectare. In the following table, yield rates of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 & 1971-72 have been indicated.

It is observed from the above table that yield rate per hectare decreased in the year 1971-72 as compared to that in 1970-71 in all the crops except Wheat, Gram, Tur, Chillies, Cotton and Sugarcane. A similar comparison of yield rates per hectare during 1971-72 with that in 1961-62 reveals considerable decrease in all the crops except gram, Tur and Sugarcane. This decrease is due to scarcity conditions prevailing in 1,971 villages of the district during 1971-72.

INDICATOR NO.3.

Gross value of agricultural production.

In this indicator, efforts are made to discuss the gross value of important agricultural products in the district. The gross value of a particular commodity has been arrived at by multiplying total out-turn by the prices prevailing during the harvest season.

In the table below, gross value of important agricultural commodities for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72 are given in crores of rupees.

It is seen from the above table that as compared to gross value of agricultural products during 1970-71, gross value of corresponding commodities in 1971-72 recorded an all round decrease except that of Wheat, Gram and Sugarcane (in terms of Gur) due to less production. The increase in the value of products of Wheat, Gram and Sugarcane (in terms of gur) during 1971-72 as compared to 1970-71 is due to increase in prices. Similar comparison between the years 1961-62 and 1971-72 reveals that except in case of Wheat, gram, tur and sugarcane (in terms of gur), decrease is observed in the gross value of all products. This decrease was due to less production. The increase in the value of wheat, gram, tur and sugarcane (in terms of gur) during 1971-72 as compared to 1961-62 was more due to increase in prices.

INDICATOR NO.4.

Percentage of irrigated area.

This indicator denotes the percentages of net irrigated area to net cropped area during the year 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area decreased in all the talukas except Aurangabad, Jalna and Ambad talukas in the year 1971-72 as compared to the year 1970-71. The area irrigated by wells had decreased in all the talukas in the district except Aurangabad and Jalna talukas resulting in the decrease in percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown. The percentage in taluka Ambad had increased due to decrease in the net area sown.

However, as compared to the net irrigated area during 1961-62, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown increased in all the talukas except Khuldabad, Jafferabad and Gangapur during 1971-72 as a result of increase in the irrigation sources i.e. Government canals and Wells.

INDICATOR NO.5.

Change in crop Pattern.

This indicator deals with the changes in crop pattern in Aurangabad district during the year 1971-72 as compared to the same in the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71.

It is evident from the above table that the area under total food crops as well as non-food crops decreased during the year 1971-72 as compared to that in 1970-71 and in 1961-62 due to famine and chronic scarcity conditions in the district during the year under review. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area decreased, whereas the same increased in case of total non-food crops during the year 1971-72 as against 1970-71. Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1971-72 reveals that the percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area increased, whereas the same decreased in case of non-food crops during the year 1971-72 as against 1961-62.

It is observed from the above table that the areas under total cereals and total pulses during the year 1971-72 declined over 1970-71 and also over 1961-62. Percentage of total cereals to gross cropped area in 1970-71 and 1971-72, was 50.46 and 54.61 respectively. The same has increased during 1971-72 as compared to 1970-71 due to decrease in the area of pulses, non-food crops and gross cropped area during 1971-72 as compared to 1970-71.

Similar comparison between the years 1961-62 and 1971-72 reveals that the percentage of total cereals to gross cropped area increased during 1971-72 as compared to 1961-62 due to decrease in the area of total pulses and gross cropped area.

INDICATOR NO.6.

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production.

This indicator points out the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of co-operative societies provide all types of facilities needed by agriculturists to improve their financial condition and agricultural production. During the year 1971-72, there were 1,163 primary agricultural credit societies in the district, whereas the same decreased by two in succeeding year but the membership increased from 1,38,561 to 1,50,565 due to membership campaign.

It may be observed from the above table that the amount of advances during the year 1972-73 increased considerably as compared to the figures of 1961-62 in the district. The corresponding percentage increase is also noticed in case of outstanding dues during the year 1972-73 in comparison to 1961-62. Similar increase is also noticed as compared to the years 1965-66 and 1971-72.



Agricultural Wage Rates:-

This indicator deals with the agricultural wage rates of three selected rural centres in Aurangabad district namely (i) Bidkin in Paithan taluka, (ii) Ajantha in Sillod taluka & (iii) Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka during the year 1963, 1971 and 1972. It is observed from the above table that average wage rate of carpenters of Ajantha centre in Sillod taluka was the highest i.e. Rs. 6.00 as compared to the average wage rate of carpenters of Bidkin centre in Paithan taluka and Mahalgaon centre in Vaijapur taluka in the year 1972. The average wage rate of carpenters of Ajantha centre in Sillod taluka was the highest i.e. Rs. 5.67 as compared to the average wage rate of the carpenters of Bidkin centre in Paithan taluka and of Mahalgaon centre in Vaijapur taluka in the year 1971. The average wage rate of carpenters of Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres was the highest i.e. Rs. 3.00 as compared to the average wage rate of carpenters of Bidkin centre in June, 1963. The percentage increase in average wage rates of carpenters in 1971 over June, 1963 were 100% in Bidkin, 89.00% in Ajantha and 43.67% in Mahalgaon centres and the same were 100.00%, 100.00% and 66.67% during 1972 over 1963, respectively.

The average wage rate of blacksmiths at Ajantha centre was also higher than the remaining two centres of the

district i.e. Rs. 6.00, Rs. 5.67 and Rs. 6.00 in 1963, 1971 & 1972, respectively. The percentage increase in average wage rates of blacksmiths in 1971 over 1963 was 100.00 and 48.67 in Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres and the percentage decrease in Ajantha centre for the same years was 5.5, respectively. The percentage in average wage rates of blacksmiths in 1972 over 1963 has also increased, which was 100.00 and 55.67 in Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres, respectively and there was no change in average wage rates for Ajantha centre for both the years, 1963 and 1972.

The average wage rate of cobblers at Bidkin centre in Paithan taluka and at Mahalgaon centre in Valjapur taluka was the highest i.e. Rs. 5.00 as compared to the average wage rate of cobblers of Ajantha centre, during the year 1972. The average wage rate of cobblers at Bidkin centre was also higher than the remaining two centres of the district i.e. Rs. 5.00, during 1971. The average wage rates of cobblers of all the three selected centres in the district remained the same i.e. Rs. 1.50 in June, 1963. The percentage increase in average wage rate of cobblers in 1971 over 1963 was 233.33, 38.67 and 184.67 in Bidkin, Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres, respectively. The percentage in average wage rate of cobblers in 1972 over 1963 has also increased which was 233.33, 100.00, and 233.33 in Bidkin, Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres, respectively.

The average wage rates of skilled male field labourer at Bidkin, Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres in the district were Rs. 1.50, Rs. 2.00 and Rs. 1.75, respectively in June, 1963. The same were Rs. 3.00, 2.92 and 2.80 in 1971 and Rs. 3.00, 2.50 and 2.92 in 1972. The percentage increase in average wage rate of cobblers in 1971 over 1963 which was 100.00, 46.00 and 60.00 and in 1972 over 1963, 100.00, 25.00 and 66.86 in Bidkin, Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres, respectively.

INDICATOR NO.8.

Livestock per hectare of land.

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Aurangabad district as per 1961, 1966 and 1972 livestock Censuses.

The number of working bullocks in the district decreased from 4.24 lakhs in 1966 to 3.58 lakhs in 1972 census. The same declined from 3.80 lakhs in 1961 to 3.58 lakhs in 1972 due to famine and chronic scarcity condition in the district and scarcity of fodder and water in 1972. The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1966 census and 1972 census comes to 6.59 and 7.80 hectares per pair of working bullocks during 1970-71 and 1971-72, respectively. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks during 1971-72 as per 1972 livestock census is found to be the highest in Soegaon taluka and the lowest in Aurangabad taluka. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks varies between 5.46 to 9.95 hectares

The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks varies between 5.46 to 9.28 and 5.60 to 9.95 hectares during 1970-71 & 1971-72, respectively. As against the total cultivable area of 13.97 lakhs hectares, the total bovine and ovine population in 1972 census was 12.29 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to be 88.

The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1961 census comes to 7.37 hectares per pair of working bullocks during 1961-62. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks during 1961-62 as per 1961 census is found to be highest in Ambad taluka and the lowest in Kannad taluka. During the year 1961-62, the cultivable area per pair of working bullocks as per 1961 census varies between 5.73 to 10.42 hectares. As against total cultivable area of 14.01 lakh hectares during 1961-62, the total bovine and ovine population in 1961 was 13.47 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population as per 1961 census per 100 hectares of cultivable land during 1961-62 works out to 96.

INDICATOR NO.9.

Poultry as compared to population.

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad district.

During the Third Five Year Plan period, special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry, breeding and supply of improved birds and advancing of loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the census of 1972, total number of poultry was 2.22 lakhs as against 2.01 lakhs during the year 1966. This indicates an increase of poultry by 0.21 lakhs over the year 1966.

The comparison of data in 1972 census with those in 1961 census indicates that total number of poultry in Aurangabad district was 2.23 lakhs as per 1961 census whereas the same was 2.22 lakhs as per 1972 census. This indicates a slight decrease of 0.01 lakhs over the year 1961.

-It may be observed from the above table, that the ratio of poultry to the 1971 population as per 1972 livestock census was the highest in Jafferabad taluka while the same was the lowest in Vaijapur taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 216 while the minimum was 70 only.

**INDICATOR NO.10.**

**Per capita consumption of electricity.**

This indicator denotes per capita consumption of electricity in Aurangabad district during the year 1962-63, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73.

The total electricity consumption during the years 1962-63, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73 was 33.19, 111.88, 409.94 and 498.32 lakhs<sup>of</sup> K.W.H., respectively. The percentage increase in the consumption of electricity during 1972-73 over 1962-63 comes to 1400.96, over 1965-66 comes to 345.40 and over 1971-72 comes to 21.56. The per-capita consumption of total electricity in the district during the years 1962-63, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73 works out to 2.16 K.W.H., 7.30 K.W.H., 20.80 K.W.H., and 25.28 K.W.H., respectively.

It may be observed from the above table that there is a tremendous increase in consumption of electricity mainly in the field of other purposes and industrial power.

INDICATOR NO.11.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

This indicator denotes the increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified in Aurangabad district during the year 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73.

Continuous increase in un-employment inspite of various efforts made for creation of employment opportunities is still a problem to be solved. Un-employment is observed not only in skilled and un-skilled workers but also in educated class having degrees and diplomas in various university courses.

From the statistics maintained in the Employment Exchange, it is observed that there is a continuous rise in the vacancies notified, while the number of registrations decreased from 15,737 during 1971-72 to 13,996 during 1972-73 in the district. The table below indicates the number of registrations and vacancies notified during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73.

It will be seen that the number of candidates registered had increased by 1,835 during the year 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62 while during the period of 6 years (i.e. 1965-66 to 1971-72) the same increased by 3,233 during the year 1971-72. The number of candidates registered had decreased by 1,741 during the year 1972-73 as compared to 1971-72.



It may be observed from the above table that the number of vacancies notified increased by 413 during the year 1965-66 as compared to 1961-62 while during the period of 6 years (i.e. 1965-66 to 1971-72) the same increased by 491 during the year 1971-72. The number of vacancies notified increased by 256 during the year 1972-73 as compared to last year.

INDICATOR NO. 12.

Increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in Hospitals.

This indicator denotes the increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in hospitals in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73. The table No. 46 of the Abstract deals with the medical facilities available in each taluka of Aurangabad district for the year 1972.

It is evident that the number of in-door patients treated during 1972 increased in all the talukas except Sillod and Vaijapur as compared to 1961 and the same increased during 1972 in all talukas except Aurangabad, Soegaon, Dhokardan,

Jafferabad and Paithan as compared to 1971. Aurangabad and Jalna accounted for the highest number of in-door patients treated where better medical facilities are available due to location of Medical College Hospital at Aurangabad and Cottage Hospital at Jalna.

It is observed from the above table that the number of out-door patients treated increased in all the talukas in the district except Ambad and Paithan during the year 1972 as compared to 1961. The number of primary schools in Aurangabad district rose from 1,313 in 1961-62 to 1,885 in 1965-66, 2,002 in 1970-71 and 2,032 in 1971-72. The number of pupils also increased by 47.49%, 69.38% and 73.22% during the years 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72, respectively, as compared to 1961-62.

The number of secondary schools in the district increased from 76 in 1961-62 to 128 in 1965-66, 184 in 1970-71 and 204 in 1971-72. The number of students attending these institutions also increased tremendously by 97.07%, 186.72% and 209.62% in the years 1965-66, 1970-71 and 1971-72, respectively, as compared to that in 1961-62.

As regards higher education, the number of institutions in the district increased from 17 in 1965-66 to 23 in the year 1970-71 and 24 in 1971-72. The number of students attending the higher institutions also increased by 108.86% and 104.97% in the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 in comparison to the same during 1965-66.

The number of institutions in special education also increased. The number of special institutions rose from 7 in 1961-62 to 20 in 1965-66. The number of students attending special institutions also increased tremendously by 195.22% in 1965-66 as compared to that in 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.14.

Increase in road length per 100 square kilometres.

This indicator denotes the increase in road length per 100 square kilometres in Aurangabad district for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73. The road length per 100 square kilometres in the district rose from 6.18 kilometres in 1961-62 to 7.30 kilometres in 1965-66, 24.44 kilometres in 1971-72 and 28.22 kilometres in 1972-73.

The total road length in the district under all categories increased by 17.96%, 282.84% and 342.13% during the years 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively as compared to the total road length during 1961-62. This increase was more prominent in case of village roads, viz. 64 Kms., during 1961-62 and 114.60 Kms., 1,290.53 Kms. and 1,714.89 Kms. during the years 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. The increase in other district roads, major district roads and state highways being 1,532.21%, 145.09% and 59.19% respectively, during 1972-73 as compared to that in 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.15.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to Population.

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Aurangabad district at the end of March, 1961, 1966, 1971 and 1972.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of Agriculture and Industry. In the year 1960-61, there were 8 scheduled banks in the district. At the end of March, 1966, 1971 and 1972 there were 11, 37 and 47 scheduled banks, respectively.

The district Central Co-operative Bank plays an important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 65 branches of the District Central Co-operative Bank in the district as at the end of June, 1971, while there were 20, 32 and 62 branches at the end of March, 1966, 1971 and 1972, respectively.

The district population as per 1971 census was 19,71,006 and the number of branches of all the banks was 112. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 17,598.

INDICATOR NO.16. Prices.

The trends in prices prevailing at the district headquarters Aurangabad during the year 1963, 1966, 1971 & 1972 have been discussed in this indicator.

It is observed from this table that the average... prices of all the consumption articles had shot up in 1966, 1971 and 1972 as compared to 1963.

The rise in average prices was also observed in all the articles of consumption except Sweet oil (groundnut-oil) and vanaspati (dalda) during 1972 as compared to 1971. There was slight decrease in the prices of sweet oil and vanaspati during 1972 as compared to 1971. The rice was not available in the open market during the year 1972. The supply of rice was made through Fair Price Shops only and here too an increased trend in prices was observed.

It is seen from the above table that the average prices during 1963, 1966, 1971 and 1972 can not be compared mainly because of changes in varieties. However, increasing trends continued in case of these items during 1972 as compared to 1963 and 1971.

CHAPTER IV.  
P L A N N I N G.

The main objective of the Fourth Plan was self-reliance in economy. The Annual Plans for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, constituted the Fourth Plan in the district for which the total budgetary provisions were made to the tune of Rs. 220.64 lakhs and 366.85 lakhs, respectively. The total expenditure in the Annual Plans period for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 amounted to Rs. 259.66 lakhs and 386.25 lakhs, respectively. The percentage of expenditure to the total budget provisions for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 was 117.63 and 105.29, respectively.

The major headwise expenditure in the Annual Plans 1971-72 and 1972-73 in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the total expenditure under different heads of development incurred during the years 1971-72 & 1972-73 constituted 117.68% and 105.29%, respectively, of the Budget provisions of the respective years.

The headwise expenditure given in the above table denotes that the "Agricultural Programme" received the top priority and consumed the largest share of 46.04% and 41.61% of the total expenditure during 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. In the order of priority, the Agricultural Programmes were followed by the Social Services which shared 38.19% and 48.28% during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. The expenditure incurred on Transport and Communication was 11.76% during 1971-72 and 6.73% during 1972-73 of the total expenditure. The expenditure incurred on cooperation and Community Development was only 3.11% during 1971-72 and 2.29% during 1972-73. The percentage of expenditure on Industry and Mining was very low during both the years under review, being 0.68% in 1971-72 and 0.88% in 1972-73. As compared to the year 1971-72, the percentage of expenditure incurred towards Industry and Mining has increased by about 92.66% during 1972-73. The lowest expenditure incurred was on Miscellaneous (Information and Publicity) only. The percentage of total expenditure on this item was 0.22 during 1971-72 and 0.21 during 1972-73.

The sub-headwise expenditure incurred under the Agricultural Programme for the Annual Plans of 1971-72 & 1972-73 in Aurangabad District is given in the following table.

It will be seen from the above statement that major portion of expenditure was incurred on the schemes of Minor Irrigation (46.63%), Soil Conservation (37.15) and Agricultural Production (9.22%) during the year 1971-72. For the year 1972-73, Maximum part of the expenditure was incurred on the schemes of Minor Irrigation (57.80%), Soil Conservation (18.67%), Ayacut Development (13.12%) and Agricultural production (7.85%). The expenditure under Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Ware Housing and Marketing was very low. during 1971-72 and 1972-73, that is 0.22% and 0.19%, 0.59% and 0.59% and 0.60% and 0.09% respectively of the total expenditure under Agricultural programme.

The expenditure under minor heads of Dairy Development and Forests accounted for 3.11% and 0.86% and 2.48% and 0.83% to the total expenditure under Agricultural programme during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the sub-head Agricultural production, schemes directly relating to Development of Local Manurial Resources were included and 19,919 and 16,538 tonnes of local manures were produced and distributed during 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. Under the Plant protection scheme 1,00,055 and 3,38,272 hectares of crops were dusted and sprayed during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Under the Horticultural Development scheme 35 and 36 hectares were brought under plantation of fruit trees during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Fruit trees rejuvenation and renovation were done in 337 and 250 hectares during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. About 1.01 lakhs and 2.10 lakhs hectares were brought under intensive cultivation during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. There was no progress under Ayacut development during 1971-72. However during 1972-73 land levelling, land shapping and bunding, etc. work was done in 4,814 hectares, under Ayacut development.

Under the schemes of minor irrigation, 1,473 and 101 subsidy cases of construction of new wells and 940 and 46 subsidy cases of installation of pumping sets were adjusted during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Under minor irrigation works 2 percolation tanks and 2 lift irrigation schemes were completed during 1971-72 under local sector.

The work of 12 tanks and 5<sup>(42)</sup> percolation tanks were in progress during 1972-73 under local sector. Similarly the works of 5 bandharas were completed during 1971-72 under state sector.

Works of 4 tanks were completed and works of 14 tanks were in progress under state sector during 1972-73.

Under the scheme of contour bunding 0.79 and 1.65 lakhs of hectares were bunded against the target of 0.35 and 0.34 lakhs of hectares during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the scheme of Animal Husbandry, four dispensaries and 2 Aid Centres were continued during both the years under review.

Under the town milk supply scheme 3,823 and 5,278 litres of milk was handled per day during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Four units were assisted under the scheme "Assistance to milk Societies" during the year 1971-72 but the 7 new units and 4 existing units were assisted during the year 1972-73.

Under the scheme "Farm Forestry", plantation including pre-monsoon was done on 110 and 114 hectares during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. The Central nurseries already established were maintained in both the years under review. Under the scheme "Roshia Grass" including plantation and pre-monsoon, 172 and 130 hectares were covered during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. The plantation including pre-monsoon work and 2nd year and 3rd year operations in connection with "Afforestation for Soil Conservation" was effected in an area of 787 and 865 hectares during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the development of pastures and fodder resources, 60 and 30 hectares were covered including pre-monsoon work during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. One Forest park which was established at Ajantha caves was continued during both the years under review.

Under the Fish farming in impounded waters scheme 18.58 and 15.94 lakhs of fish (fingerlings) were stocked in tanks and 3.25 lakhs Kg. and 2.72 lakhs Kg. fish was netted out during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Rs.1,000/- were distributed towards loan among the fishermen and to cooperative societies of fishermen during 1971-72. The same scheme was not implemented during the year 1972-73. For the supply of fishery requisites, 400 Kg. nylon twine was supplied to fishermen during 1971-72. The same scheme was not implemented during 1972-73. Under the scheme of Fish Seed Production, 7.66 lakhs of fish seed were produced in the year 1972-73. Rs.8,000/- were given as subsidy to 9 existing fisheries cooperative societies during the year 1972-73.

Managerial subsidy to 2 new societies and 3 existing societies was distributed during 1971-72. Under the scheme of warehousing and marketing Rs.14,000/- were distributed for the adjustment of subsidy of one godown and for managerial subsidy to 1 new society during 1972-73.

## II. COOPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Out of the total expenditure of Rs.8.07 lakhs and Rs.8.85 lakhs during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively for Cooperation and Community Development; the expenditure incurred by cooperation amounted to Rs. 1.01 lakhs and 0.85 lakhs while the expenditure booked on Community Development was Rs.7.06 lakhs and Rs.8.00 lakhs, during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Membership of cooperative societies was increased by 20,545 and 12,004 during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively for strengthening of the cooperative structure from district level to village level. Loan was not granted for construction of godowns during both the years under review. Subsidy was granted to 7 urban consumers cooperative stores during the year 1972-73. Eight labour contract societies were organised during 1972-73. Loan and financial assistance was granted to 11 labour contract societies during 1972-73.

Seventeen community development blocks comprising of 20½ C.P.A. pattern blocks were continued during both the Annual Plan periods under review. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in 4 blocks i.e. Sillod, Khuldabad, Jalna and Soegaon during both the years under review. The scheme under composite programme for women and children was also implemented in 5 blocks during both the years under review.

### III. INDUSTRY AND MINING :

The percentage of expenditure on Small Scale Industries and Mining was very low during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 that is only 0.68 and 0.88 percent respectively of the total expenditure which mainly constituted assistance to Industrial Cooperative Societies and Federations for the development of handlooms.

Under the scheme of Development of Small Scale Industries (Handloom) rebate of Rs. 17,000 was distributed during the year 1971-72 and Rs.58,000 in 1972-73.

Twenty seven Industrial Cooperative Societies in 1971-72 and 26 in 1972-73 were assisted under financial assistance to Industrial Cooperatives and Federations. Loans of Rs. 85,000/- and 1,50,000/- under S.A.I. Rules were granted to 287 and 490 artisans during the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively.

#### IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS.

Transport and Communications is one of the most important pre-requisites of economic development. The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs. 30.53 lakhs and Rs. 26.00 lakhs exceeding the budget provision of Rs. 2.09 lakhs and 5.00 lakhs during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the scheme of district roads, the work of constructions of new roads was completed to the extent of 12 kilometres in 1971-72 and 6 kilometres in 1972-73 in the state sector and the work of 32.85 kilometres in 1971-72 and 18.64 kilometres in 1972-73 was completed in local sector. 50.06 kilometres earthwork and metal collection of 17.36 kilometres and construction of 7 culverts were completed during the year 1972-73 in local sector. Two C.D. works and repairs of roads of 5 kilometres were completed in 1972-73 in state sector. Under the scheme of Roads under public participation an amount of Rs. 2.57 lakhs and Rs. 1.23 lakhs were spent during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Under the scheme of "Roads in Hilly and in-accessible areas" construction of new road to the extent of 3.30 kilometres and 19.07 kilometres was completed in 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Earth work of 12.75 kilometres, metal collection

of 25.28 kilometres was completed during the year 1972-73. Four culverts were completed during the year 1971-72 and (4) culverts also were completed during 1972-73. The road to the length of 1.51 kilometres was completed under the scheme of Black topping of roads in year 1972-73 in local sector.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES.

Next to the Agriculture Programme, Social Services received the largest share of provision during 1971-72 and 1972-73. The expenditure incurred under the Social Services constituted 38.19 percent and 48.28 percent to total expenditure during 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. The sub-headwise expenditure under Social Services during the Annual Plans 1971-72 and 1972-73 in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under general education was the highest that is 54.34 percent to the total expenditure under social services during 1971-72 but general education was second in expenditure in year 1972-73 that is 43.48 percent to the total expenditure under social services. Under the scheme expansion of primary education 255 and 211 teachers were appointed and as many as 305 and 440 teachers were imparted basic training during 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. Fifty four rooms during 1971-72 and 107 rooms for schools during 1972-73 were constructed. Under the scheme "Development and expansion of non-government secondary schools" 8 and 10 non-Govt. secondary schools were given aid for their development and expansion during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Under the scheme of opening of additional classes sections in government secondary schools 250 teachers were appointed during 1971-72 and 38 during 1972-73. Educational concessions were given to 15,300 and 8,505 students of economically backward classes, during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Educational concessions were given to 97 and 175 eligible children of primary teachers during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the sub-head Technical Education an expenditure of Rs. 0.69 lakhs was incurred during 1972-73. The construction work of building and hostel of Government Engineering College and Government Polytechnic at Aurangabad was in progress during the period 1972-73.

Under the Family Planning Scheme, as many as 28,725 and 3,963 vesectomy operations were done during 1971-72 and 1972-73 respectively. In all 252 and 149 loop cases were handled during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.



The expenditure incurred under water supply & Drainage was 37.45 percent during 1971-72 but the same was highest that is 51.21 percent during 1972-73 to the total expenditure under Social Services. Under the rural water supply scheme, 14 drinking water wells were constructed during 1971-72 and 26 in 1972-73. In addition, 91 drinking water wells were also renovated during 1972-73. The work of municipal pipe water supply scheme was completed at 3 places i.e. Khuldabad, Gangapur and Bhokardan during 1971-72 and the work of Paithan was completed during 1972-73. The work of 6 schemes of piped water supply was in progress during 1972-73. The piped water supply schemes at 5 villages and 6 villages were completed during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

The scheme of village housing project was not implemented during both the years under review.

The total expenditure under Urban Development was Rs. 6.30 lakhs in 1972-73. Three Municipal Councils were assisted financially by giving them loan and grant-in-aid during 1972-73.

The expenditure incurred under Welfare of Backward classes was 0.85 percent and 0.33 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Grant of Scholarship, tuition fees and examination fees were given to 1203 and 2469 pupils during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Grants were awarded to 60 inmates of backward class hostels during both the years under review. Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 2,000 were distributed among 3 and 2 cultivators of scheduled castes for the development of their land in year 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Rs. 8,000 among 3 and Rs. 6,000 among 8 cultivators of scheduled castes were distributed for construction of new wells and repairs to old wells during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Rs.19,000 among 25 beneficiaries and Rs. 15,000 among 20 beneficiaries of scheduled castes under the scheme "Housing Aid to Backward Classes" were distributed for construction of houses during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively. Under the scheme grant of loan cum-subsidy for Industries and professions Rs. 12,000 among 48 beneficiaries and Rs. 7,000 among 35 beneficiaries were distributed during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.

Under the scheme Welfare Extension Project 2 griha kalyan kendras and 12 balwikas kendras were continued during both the years under review.

Under the technical and vocational training scheme, 2 members of staff were continued during both the years under review.

Under Rural Broadcasting scheme, 46 and 57 radio sets were installed in different villages during 1971-72 and 1972-73, respectively.
