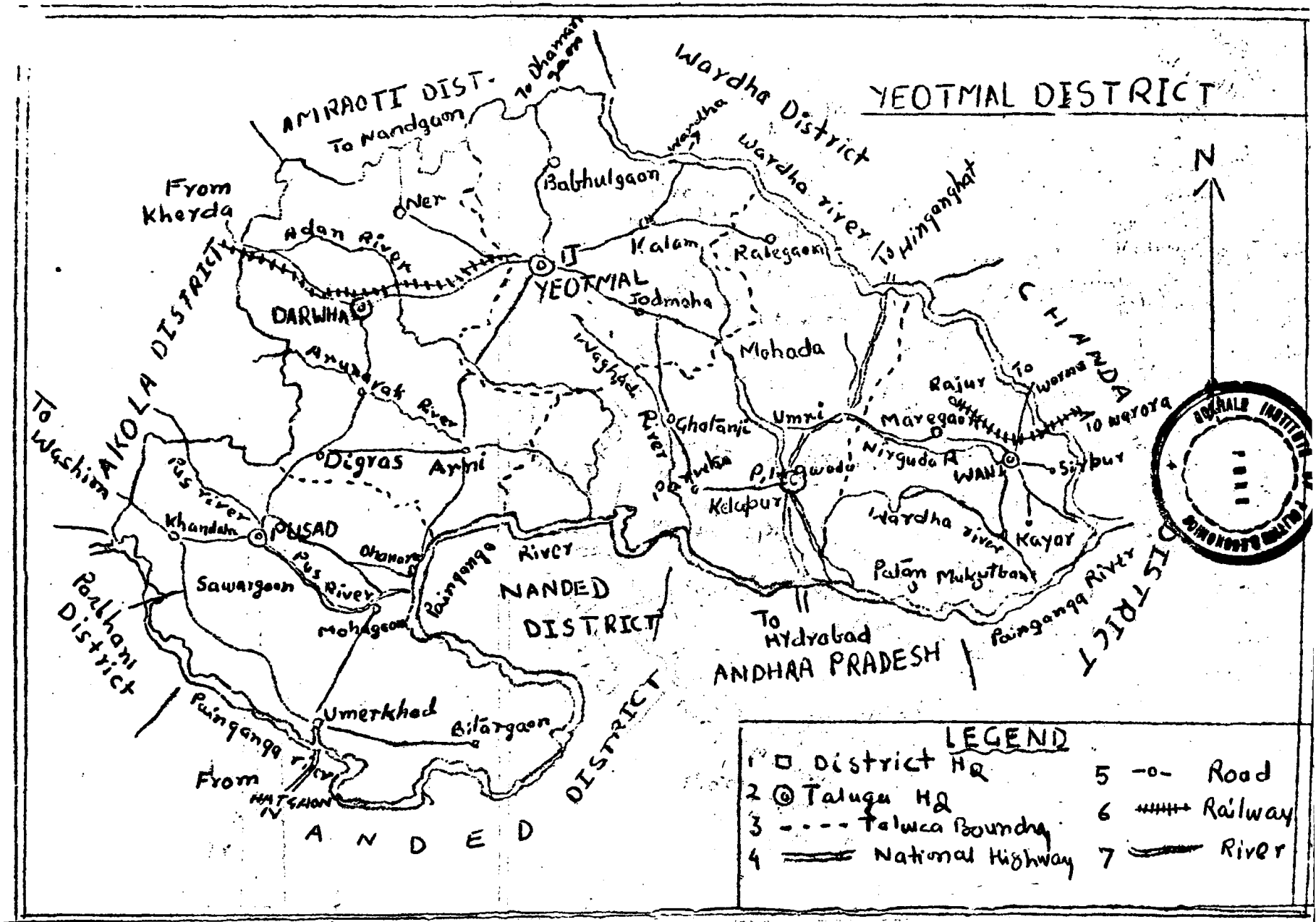

SOCIO ECONOMIC REVIEW OF YEOTMAL DISTRICT.

CHAPTER - I.

INTRODUCTION.

1.1 Location.

Yeotmal district is one of the eight districts of Nagpur Division lying between 19°26' and 20°42' North latitudes and 77°18' and 79°9' East longitudes. Most part of the district is covered by the Balaghats i.e. southern plateau of Berar.

1.2 Boundaries.

It is surrounded by Amraoti district in the North, Akola and Parbhani districts in the West, Nanded and Adilabad (Andhra Pradesh) districts in the South, and Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the East. The district is quite extensive in size, ranking 2nd in Nagpur Division while 8th in the State.

The district has natural boundary in the East and South. The Wardha river separates the district from Wardha and Chandrapur districts in the East, while in the South Painganga river separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

1.3 Administrative set up.

The district is divided into five talukas for administrative purpose at present. The Collector is incharge of the district so far as general administration, Law and order, land revenue, civil supplies and coordination among various offices are concerned. The Collector is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and four Deputy Collectors at headquarters and five Sub-Divisional Officers posted at Five Sub-divisions, viz. Tahasils. The Tahsildar assisted by a few Naib-Tahsildars is incharge of the Tahsil administration and assists the Sub-Divisional Officer in his functions.

The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive departments and the District and Session Judge is the head of Judicial Department in the District. However, the Collector continues to be the District Magist-

-rate, whose powers are limited to security, Law and order . The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by a Civil Judge (Senior Division), five Civil Judges (Junior Division) and first class Judicial Magistrates at tahsil head-quarters.

The Police force in the district functions under the Superintendent of Police at district head-quarter . The Civil Surgeon is incharge of the Government Hospital and other medical facilities in the district. In addition, there are other district heads of offices under various departments for respective functions.

1.4 Local Bodies, Panchayat Samities and Zilla Parishad.

The Zilla Parishad and fourteen Panchayat Samities have been formed in the district on 1 st May, 1962. The Zilla Parishad is responsible for the development of the entire area in the district excluding municipal areas. The Panchayat Samiti covers the area of Community Development Blocks. There are eight municipal Councils to look after the development of urban areas. For Zilla Parishad, there are 49 directly elected Councillors , out of which two seats are reserved for scheduled castes and seven seats for scheduled tribes . In addition, there are five associated members, who are the Presidents of the five different cooperative societies .An elected Chairman of each Panchayat Samiti is also Ex-Officio Councillor of the Zilla Parishad . The Zilla Parishad is headed by the President assisted by Vice-President, both of whom are elected from the elected councillors. The Chief Executive Officer looks after the administration of the Zilla Parishad . For the administrative purpose there are various departments carrying out respective functions of the department. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee, presided over by the president and six subject committees viz, Finance, works, Agriculture and Cooperation, Education, Health and Social Welfare.

The Panchayat Samiti consists of elected and coopted councillors from the area of the Panchayat Samiti. The Panchayat Samiti has elected Chairman and vice Chairman. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

There are 1119 village panchayats in the district. There is Sarpanch for Village Panchayat who is elected from the elected members from the village or group of villages in that village panchayat. The Sarpanch and in his absence Up-Sarpanch looks after the development activities at village level.

1.5 Area and Territorial changes .

The area of the district is 13,925 sq.kms. which forms 14.28% of the area of the Nagpur Division and 4.53% of the area of the State. Its maximum length from East to West is 192 kms. Whereas its maximum breadth from North to South is 160 kms. Out of the total area, about 94.34 % (13833.2 sq.kms.) area belongs to rural part of the district.

Yeotmal district is among the four districts of Old Berar, handed over by the Nizam to the Government of India in 1853. It was a part of East Berar District upto 1863 . A new Wun (Wani) district was formed by separating Yeotmal, Darwha, Kelapur and Wani Talukas from East Berar district in 1864. Fusad taluka of Basim district was transferred to this Wun district in 1905 and Yeotmal district was newly constituted in that year. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1955, when the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh State to the then bilingual Bombay State due to State Re-organisation. At present, it is a part of Nagpur Division of the Maharashtra State, since May 1 st , 1960.

1.6 Topography.

The district has an undulating topography. The whole district is covered by the Ajantha ranges broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by Plains.

The central portion of the district is a Plateau with steep ghats with an elevation of 300 to 500 metres (1000' to 1500') above mean sea level. Both, Painganga and Wardha rivers, with their tributaries, provide strips of plains in many parts along their course. The width of these plains varies from 5 to 15 kms.

1.7 Hills, River System, Soil etc.

The whole district is covered by small east-west ranges of the Ajantha mountains. The off shoots of the Ajantha ranges are, at Places, broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of Painganga and Wardha rivers.

Wardha and Painganga are ^{the} main rivers in the district, both of which flow along North-Eastern and Southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries, traversing in the middle of the district. The bed of the Wardha river is broad and deep, still the banks suffer from by floods many a times. Wardha has two big tributaries viz. Bembla and Nirguda. Nirguda has its entire course in Wani tahsil, while the Bembla flows across the North of Yeotmal tahsil below the ghats. The other river Painganga has six important tributaries viz. Pus, Arunawati, Adan, Waghadi, Khuni and Vidarbha. Pus flows through Pusad tahsil, Arunawati and Adan through Darwaha tahsil, and Vidarbha flows through Wani tahsil. All these rivers with their tributaries maintain their flow for a greater part of the year and assist drainage system of the soil.

The soils in the district as a whole are uniformly good in texture, but vary in colour from black to dark brown. They are, however, slightly inferior in fertility to those in Akola and Amravati districts. The soils of the district, mainly suffer from the mixture of pieces of chunkhadi (limestone), sloping surfaces and excessive admixture of sand. However, the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tracts in the valleys to hills and hard parts on the plateaus.

In Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a redish colour. In Kēpapur tahsil and central and southern parts of Yeotmal tahsil and hilly parts of Pusad tahsil, the soils are coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey. The rich fertile alluvial soils are found in western parts of Yeotmal tahsil and in middle of Darwaha and Pusad Tahsils.

The district can be divided into three natural zones, viz. (1) the Bembla, Wardha basin in the North, (2) the plateau portion at the central and in the southwest part of the district, and (3) the plain fertile lands of the Pus, Painganga basin in the South.

1.8 Minerals:-

Limestone and coal are the only important minerals found in the district. The Limestone found in cement grade variety found near Chanakha in Kelapur tahsil. The estimated reserves are about 39 million tonne. There is only one coal field near Pisgaon in Wani tahsil, extending over 12 sq. miles. As regards coal, the reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes, and there is one colliery at Rajur exploiting coal.

1.9 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall.

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. The temperature ranges from 77.0° C to 31.7° C in Winter and 20.7° C to 44.2° C in Summer during 1973.

The south-west monsoon brings rains to the district. The rainy season lasts from June to October. The intensity of rainfall is highest in the month of August. The normal rainfall varies from 910 mm (31.5 inches) to 1260 mm (49.5 inches). In the past few years the monsoon is very irregular and it is also not uniform in the district. Darwaha tahsil gets lowest rains on an average of about 889 mms. (35 inches), while Wani tahsil gets maximum rains about 1125 mms. (45 inches). The central region covering Yeotmal tahsil gets on an average nearly 1099 mms (42 inches) of rains.

In 1973 Wani tahsil ~~got~~ got about 1260 mms. of rains, while Pusad tahsil got about 1030 mms. of rains. In the remaining talukas, rainfall varied from 942 mms. to 1000 mms. during this year.

1.10 Demography.

The total population of the district was 14,23,677 as per 1971 census. The percentage of increase in the population of the district works out to 29.61 %, in the last decade. The density of Population increased from 79 persons per sq.km. (210 per sq.miles) in 1961 to 102 persons per sq.km. (272 persons per sq miles) in 1971. Similary the literacy percentage also increased from 23.48% to 31.56 % during the decade. The progress made in the literacy is outstanding in contaxt of the large tribal population and a small (13.65 % of the total Population) proportion of urban population.

As regards working force in the district, it is seen that there were 43.32 % workers enumerated in the total population of the district at 1971 census. Out of the total working population in the district 26.50% are engaged as cultivators, 57.52 % as agricultural labourers, and 15.98 % in different services. The remaining 36.68% population of the district was non-workers including dependents.

CHAPTER - II.Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations
of the Statistical data presented in the Part-II
(Statistical Abstract)I. Purpose :-

The statistical abstract part of this publication presents exhaustive statistical data on various subjects, emphasising the important socio economic indicators of development .All the important topics both social and economic are presented with a view that the publication could serve as a reference book. Tahsilwise information has been furnished wherever possible for the purpose of inter tahsil comparison . The data presented pertains to the year 1973-74 and for 1972-73. Where the data for the year 1973-74 could not be presented , the same for the latest available year have been included in this part. The data for latest census viz. Population census 1971, Livestock Census 1972 have been indicated. Almost all data are collected from the concerned State and Central Government Officers, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The footnotes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected .

II- District at a Glance :-

It covers important items relating to the Socio Economic development in Yeotmal district and the State under different heads such as areas, Population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, health, transport and communication, Plan and Community development programme, local bodies and other relevant statistics.

III - Contents, Scope and Limitations.

The statistical tables presented in the Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are explained in brief below.

1. Area and Population :-

The data for 1971 census are indicated in all the tables. The reference period for the 1971 census was the sunrise of 1 st March 1971.

Table No.1 :-

It gives area, density of population per Sq.km., number of villages and towns, no. of occupied houses and households and sexwise rural and urban and total population. The area figures are given in sq.kms. (1 sq.km = 0.386 Sq.miles).

Table No.2 :-

It indicates sexwise rural, urban and total population enumerated in 1951 and 1971 censuses alongwith decadal percentage variations for the district as well as eacha tahsil.

Table No. 3 :-

It presents classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges in the district. The term village (i.e. rural areas) used in the table denotes a revenue village having well defined boundaries and a separate set of land records, irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not. Hamlets, Wadies, Padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, the revenue villages which do not have any residential population are also shown as 'Uninhabited villages'. The term village also includes the forest village comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families. Total Population of the villages in each population range is also shown in this table. The total number of inhabited villages are also separately indicated.

Table No. 4 :-

It gives talukawise classification of town in the district according to different population ranges with total population of the towns in each population range.

Table No. 5 :-

Table No. 5 :-

It presents the classification of population into workers and non-workers according to standard livelihood classes. A person is defined as a worker if (a) he has had some regular work of more than an hour a day through out the greater part of the working season in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc. and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, a professional service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of enumerators visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non. agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and also persons who had been offered work but not joined the work have been classified as non-workers.

Table No. 6 :-

It gives distribution of population according to (a) age-group and (b) religion separately for rural and urban area and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

2. Climate :-Table No. 8 :-

Monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1973 are presented in this table. The data is collected through revenue agencies. A day is treated as a 'rainy day', if during the 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. 'Normal rainfall'

is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No. 9 :-

It shows monthwise maximum and minimum temperature and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1973. The data are supplied by the Regional Meteorological Centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The annual maximum and minimum temperature is the simple average of monthly maximum temperature.

3. Agriculture :-

Table No. 10 :-

It gives talukawise figures of land utilisation for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73. Major groups in which the area is classified are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, cultural wastes, permanent pastures land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown fallow land and area sown. All forest areas classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private, are included under 'forest'. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. The areas occupied by buildings, roads and railways, or area under water i.e. rivers and canals and other areas put to uses other than agriculture are included under 'Land put to non-agricultural uses', Barren and unculturable Land' covers land under mountains, deserts etc, which may be brought under cultivation but at a high cost. 'Culturable land' covers all land available for cultivation whether not taken for cultivation or taken up ^{for} cultivation once not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession, Such lands may either be fallows or areas covered with shrubs. 'Permanent pastures and meadows or not.' Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc, not included in the net area sown is the land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and

other for fuel etc. which is included in cultivable land but are not included under orchards. 'Current fallows' comprise cultivable areas which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallows' include all land which are taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. Lastly the net area sown consists of area sown under crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped area' represents the sum total of area under all crops.

Table No. 11 :-

This indicates talukawise area under different major crops for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73.

Table No. 12 :-

This represents the outturn and yield rate per hectare of the principle crops during the years.

Table No. 13 :-

It furnish the, talukawise data of area irrigated by different sources of irrigation.

Table No. 14 :-

It presents talukawise area irrigated under different crops during the years.

Table No. 15 :-

It gives talukawise number of irrigation wells in use and not in use.

Table No. 16 :-

This gives irrigation works excluding irrigation wells in the district.

Table No. 17 :-

It describes the major and medium irrigation projects (both completed and not completed) in this district as on 30 th June 1973. The cost of medium irrigation projects between Rs. 20 lakhs to Rs. 5 crores whereas that of major irrigation project, the cost is Rs. 5 crores and above.

Table No. 18 :-

It deals with the monthly average agricultural wage rates in 1973. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from the selected three

rural centres in this district viz., (1) Ner, (2) Kalamb and (3) Maregaon.

Table No. 19 :-

It gives the data on agricultural implements collected in the livestock census 1972.

Table No. 20 :-

The information regarding famine, scarcity and skin to scarcity for the year 1973-74 is furnished in this table.

Table No. 21 :-

The data on scarcity for the last five years is indicated in the table.

4. Animal Husbandry and Forest :-

A) Animal Husbandry :-

Table No. 22 :-

It gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock Census 1972, which was conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis. Precaution was also taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The reference date and time of this livestock census was sunrise of 15th April 1972. Sex and age-groupwise classification of livestock is also furnished in this table.

Table No. 23, 24, and 25 :-

These give talukawise veterinary statistics, disease-wise livestock mortality and slaughter houses and animals slaughtered for the year 1973-74 respectively.

B) Forest :-

Table No. 26 (A) :-

It gives details of area under different types of forest during the year 1973-74. The data regarding the forest under the control of State Government both under Forest Department and Revenue Department are shown separately. The area under forest is classified according to legal status i.e. reserved forest, protected

forests and unclassified forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. The reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production, wherein the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The unclassified forests refer to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forest area shown in table No. 26(A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons—(i) In the Indian Forest Statistics returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is considered as an area under forests, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(2) The forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department as it is in the land utilisation Statistics under agricultural statistics.

(3) Forest Department returns relate to financial year while Agricultural Statistics relate to the agriculture year.

Table No. 26 (B):-

The information regarding major and minor forest produce is indicated in this table.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:-

The annual factory statistics for 1973 is furnished in these tables which cover the following types of factories registered under the Factory Act, 1948.

- (1) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (section 2 (i)).
- (2) those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power (section 2(ii)).
- (3) those registered under section 85 of the Act under which the State Government make applicable the provisions of the act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled.

Table No. 27 :- It deals with the average daily employment of workers in the factories for the year 1973.

Table No. 28 :-

It gives industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength for 1973.

Table No. 29 :-

The distribution of factories according to working days is reported in table for the year 1973.

Table No. 30 :-

The Statistics relating to annual survey of industries 1971 is presented in table for nine types of industries.

Table No. 31 :-

It deals with registrations, vacancies notified and placements during the year 1973-74 with the Employment Exchange in this district.

Table No. 32 :-

The occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchanges according to standard National classifications for the year 1973-74 is given in table.

Table No. 33 :-

It gives the volume of employment in different industries as on 31 st March 1974.

Table No. 34 and 35 :-

These tables are devoted to furnish the data regarding the consumption of electricity for different purposes during the year 1973-74 and the data pertaining the towns and villages electrified upto 31/3/1974 respectively.

6 - Cooperation :-

Table No. 36 :-

It gives the total number of cooperative societies by types functioning in the district.

~~Table No.~~

Table No. 37 :-

It presents the position of Cooperative banks with report to structure and business for the year 1973-74.

Table No. 38 :-

It gives talukawise number of the primary agricultural credit societies service societies, their membership share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loan advanced and recovered, loan outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loans advanced during the year 1973-74. The term 'working capital' included paid up share capital, deposits, and borrowings. (Loan Outstanding ' covers outstandings in respect of loans, cash credit and overdrafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchases or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to an amount of loan or instalments which are due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

Table No. 39 :-

The data pertaining to other different types of cooperative societies except primary Agricultural credit societies and banks is furnished in table.

Table No. 40 and 41 :-

The operational data of Central and Primary Cooperative marketing societies and other different types of cooperative societies is furnished in tables respectively.

Table No. 42 :-

It gives the operations of regulated markets in the district during the 1973-74.

Table No. 43 :-

It indicates talukawise number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them during 1973-74. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are shown in this table. The transaction of money lending in the State are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act 1946. As per provisions in Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which he has been granted a licence and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and Public Health :-

Table No. 44 :-

This gives talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, vaidyas, nurses and the total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the year 1973. All the State Government and Central Government medical institutions as well as the institutions run by Municipal councils and other local bodies are included. The private clinics hospitals run by private bodies or individuals are however not covered in this table.

Table No. 45 :-

It gives talukawise data of vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths and infant deaths in the district during the year 1973.

Table No. 46 :-

It deals with data regarding deaths due to important causes during 1969, 1970, 1971, 1972 and 1973.

Table No. 47 :-

Talukawise vaccination statistics for the year 1973 is given in table.

Table No. 48 :-

It gives number of family planning centres in each taluka in the district as on 31st March 1974 and number of sterilisation operations undertaken in these centres during the year 1973-74.

8. Education :-

Table No. 49 :-

It gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and Urban areas according to 1971 census. A person was classified as a literate, if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 50 and 51 :-

Data on education in rural and urban areas for giving the distribution of literates according to educational standards, as per 1971 Census, are not available.

As such two tables of this subject are dropped this year.

Table No. 52 :-

The information regarding the number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 is given in the table. Sexwise enrollment and number of trained and un-trained teachers in these institutions is also given. The classification of institutions according to 'Types' in this table is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools which also impart education in primary courses nevertheless, the entire pupil enrolment of students is included under 'secondary' education. Primary institutions provide education for standard I to IV or standards I to VII / VIII or less and teaches the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach students for standards VIII to X or XI with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education after passing secondary school certificate Examination which leads to a degree examination.

Table No. 53 :-

It presents the data regarding the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in the different types of educational institutions in the year 1972-73 and 1973-74. The pupils who get educational concession of either types such as scholarships, freeships etc. are treated as beneficiaries for this table.

Table No. 54 :-

It refers to the number of beneficiaries under economically backward class concessions and the amount of concessions granted during the year 1972-73, and 1973-74.

Table No. 55 :-

It deals with the expenditure incurred on primary education during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 by different agencies like Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils etc. Plan and non-plan expenditure is shown separately.

9. Transport and Communications :-

Table No. 56 :-

It gives total railway length as on 31 st March 1974 according to types of routes i.e. broad guage, metre guate and narrow guage. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore approximate and not accurate .

Table No. 57 :-

It gives road length according to category of roads and surface classification as on 31 st March 1974.

Table No. 58 :-

It indicates the number of motor vehicles in operations as on 31 st March 1974 in Amravati Region which includes the district.

Table No. 59 :-

It deals with the operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Yeotmal Division for the year 1973-74 . The State Transport Division Yeotmal comprises of Yeotmal district and Wardha depots.

Table No. 60 :-

It depicts the results of traffic census of important roads conducted by Building and Communication Department of Government of Maharashtra. The data regarding the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count-posts.

Table No. 61 :-

The postal statistics for the year 1961-62 1965-66 , 1970-71 to 1973-74 is furnished in table.

Table No. 62 :-

The rural broadcasting statistics as on 31-3-1974 are covered in table.

10. Local Bodies :-

Table No. 63 :-

It gives an abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Zilla Parishad , Municipal Councils and Village Panchayats for the financial year 1965-66 to 1973-74. An independent as well as group

village panchayats are included in the number of village panchayats.

Table No. 64 :-

The headwise income and expenditure of village panchayats in each Panchayat Samiti for the year 1973-74 excluding opening and closing balances are given in the table.

Table No. 65 :-

This table is divided in three parts viz. (A), (B), (C). The table No. 65(A) gives the total receipt of Zilla Parishad, derived from self raised resources, Government grants, Loans and advances, deposits and remittances. The table No. 65 (B) indicates the receipts of Zilla Parishad from different Government grants, while the table No. 65 (C) gives the total expenditure incurred by Zilla Parishad. The expenditure is further divided into two parts i.e. (1) Revenue expenditure and (2) debt section including remittances. Data regarding actual for the year 1972-73 revised estimates for 1973-74 and estimates for 1974-75 are given in this table.

Table No. 66 :-

The income and expenditure statistics of each municipal council in the district for the year 1973-74 is reported in table. The opening balances and closing balances are however not considered while income and expenditure figures for the said year.

11. Plan and community Development :-

Table No. 67 :-

The data regarding plan expenditure during the year 1973-74 is included in table.

Table No. 68 :-

It gives the data on important physical achievements under Annual Plan 1973-74.

Table No. 69 and 71.

The statistics pertaining to community development programme are given in these tables. The position of Community Development blocks in the district as on 31 st March 1974 is explained in table 69 while the expenditure incurred under different stages of blocks up to the

the end of 1973-74 is given in table No. 70. The table No. 71 gives important physical achievements in C.D. blocks during the year 1973-74 .

12. Prices :-

Table No. 72 :-

It deals with the monthly wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities at regulated market centres in the district during the year 1973. Price averages for the year are worked out by simple arithmetic mean.

Table No. 73 :-

It gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities are given for the months of January to December 1973 , alongwith the varieties .The average prices of all the commodities for the year 1973 are also mentioned in this table. As the data collected for the the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop at District head-quarter, the average price of each individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative, but this data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of changes in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No. 74 :-

The data regarding consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class (for the year 1960) of Nagpur centre published by the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay for the year 1973-74 is furnished in table. The averages for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 are also shown.

13. Miscellaneous :-

Table No. 75 and 76 :-

These give the data regarding strength of police Force and the crime statistics for the district for the year 1973 respectively.

Table No. 77 :-

The data regarding the working of civil and criminal courts of the district for the year 1973 is given in table.

Table No. 78 :-

It gives talukawise cinema statistics for the year 1973-74.

Table No. 79 :-

The data pertaining to banking facilities in the district as at the beginning of 1972.

Table No. 80 :-

It presents the statistics regarding joint stock companies as on 31-3-1974.

Table No. 81 :-

It gives the volume of business of insurances during 1973-74 in the district.

Table No. 82 :-

It indicates the data regarding small saving collections during the year 1973-74 in the district. Targets, gross collections, withdrawals and net collections during the year 1973-74 under different kinds of savings are also mentioned.

Table No. 83 :-

Talukawise land revenue collections during the year 1973-74 are mentioned in table.

Table No. 84 :-

The Statistics regarding no. of printing presses, newspapers and periodicals published in the district as on 31-3-1974 is furnished in the table.

Table No. 85 :-

It brings out the trends in selected indicators for the year 1950-51, 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74 in the district.

The pace of development of the district under various sectors is reviewed in this chapter. For the purpose of review, indicators showing development under important sectors have been built up and are discussed in the following paragraphs.

Indicator No. 1 :-

Percentage of gross sown area :-

From the above table, it is seen that there have been marginal increases in the percentages of gross sown area to respective net sown areas in case of all the talukas except Wani. The increase in such percentage for the district is from 100.72 in 1960-61 to 101.40 in 1972-73. There has been remarkable increase in the double cropped area.

All the Food crops i.e. Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Gram, Tur etc have suffered shortfall in production during 1972-73, as against the levels of 1960-61 which is mainly owing to insufficient rains during the year. The position of Cotton however seems slightly improved, as there is about 6 % rise in the outturn against outturn in 1960-61. The level of sugarcane production has trippled during the courses of the period and is mainly because of the irrigation facilities made available. But the decrease in the production of Groundnut, Sesamum and chillies is due to failure of crops in comparison to 1960-61 crop condition in the district.

Indicator No. 3 :-

Gross value of agriculture production :-

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, this indicator could not be worked out.

Indicator No. 4 :-

Percentage of area irrigated :-

The table below presents the percentages of net area irrigated to net area sown and of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

The irrigation in the district is too low, as it is seen that just 1.65 percent of the total sown area is irrigated. The irrigation is rather higher in Pusad and Darwaha talukas. The proportion of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area sown in last two columns indicate that during 1972-73, there has not been area under double irrigation in any of talukas.

Indicator No. 5 :-

Change in the Crop Patter :-

There has been total area of 8.30 lakhs hectares under crops, both food and non-food during the year 1972-73. The percentage of area under food crops and non-food crops is shown in the table below.

From the above it is seen that the proportion of areas under food and non food crops has actually been reversed during the course of the period. The area under food crops has actually been reduced and was 49.88 % in 1972-73/against 54.7% in 1960-61. Consequently, the areas under non food crops, such as Cotton, Chillies, Sugarcane etc have been raised as is seen from the fact that the total area under non-food crops has actually gone up to 50.12 % of the total gross cropped area.

Indicator No. 6 :-

Increase in agricultural credit and Outstanding dues :-

It is true that the primary agricultural credit societies have come up to the rescue of small cultivators with financial help to the cultivators. This has made possible the purchase of improved seeds, fertilizers, pesticides etc. by the cultivators. The following table would show the level of credit advanced by the societies on short term basis during 1960-61 and 1973-74 .

The number of societies do not seem to have changed much during the period 1960-61 to 1972-73. The level of advancement of loan has, however significantly gone up viz. from Rs. 1.07 Crores in 1960-61 to Rs. 5.80 Crores in 1973-74. The advancing of loan was quite high in Darwha, Pusad, Yeotmal and Kelapur talukas, while in Wani taluka it was comparatively low. The amount of outstanding loan was also reported as high as Rs. 7.11 Crores.

Agricultural Wage Rates :-

For collection of wage rates for agricultural operations, 3 centres viz, Ner, Kalamb, Maregaon are selected in the district and the average rates worked out are taken as representative for the district. The average rates worked out for the year 1963 and 1973 are shown below.

With the opening of large number of primary schools under the Five Year Plan Programme, the enrolment in primary schools has gone upto 1.38 lakhs, against 0.33 lakhs of 1960-61. Such was also the case with the enrolment of secondary, the no. of which has gone upto 40,956 in 1972-73 as against 17,660 as at 1960-61. The strength of higher education also showed tremendous increase, the enrolments being reported as 7,363 during 1972-73 as against 1,183 for 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14 :-

Increase in road length per 100 Sq.Kms.area:-

The district being hilly, it suffers from insufficient road mileage. The roads have only have to cope up with the traffic in the district, as the railways share very small part in the traffic of the district. There is one narrow guage railway line linking Yeotmal to Nagpur Bombay line at Murtizapur and one broad guage line linking Wani and Rajur to Majari on Nagpur Hyderabad line, the total railways route being of 82 kms.Length.

The total road length in the district was reported as 4,019.65 Km.as on 31-3-1974, of which length of 650.41 was under National Highway and State Highways, while lengths 3,223.37 kms was under major district roads, other district roads and village roads. Besides, there exist municipal roads of length 146 kms in the district.

The increase in the prices are 100 to 400 percent in case of foodgrains, 213 % in case of sugar, 293 % in case of oil 79 % in case of tea, 55 % in case of kerosene and 54 % in case washing soap.

C H A P T E R - IV.

4.1 The Fourth Five Year Plan was deemed to be started from 1-4-1969. However the Annual Plans which are visualised as Part of Fourth Plan were actually implemented and the Annual Plan 1973-74 is the last part of Fourth Five Year Plan. The schemes, the benefit of which was accrued by the district alone were termed as district level schemes and were implemented by the heads of offices in State /Local sector in this district.

4.2 An amount of Rs. 975.327 lakhs was provided for the district's Annual Plan 1973-74. The following table presents the headwise allocations of the total outlay of the district for 1973-74.

It is observed from the above table major portion of the outlay was provided for the development of 'Irrigation and Power (68.20%) which included the rural electrification programme and energizing of agricultural pumps in the district in order to assist the increase of agricultural production in the district. Agricultural Programme and Social Services accounted for 14.69% and 10.26 % of the total budget provision respectively. The Cooperation and Community Development Programme was provided for the 4.49 % of the allotment while the remaining provision was allocated amongst

Transport and Communication (2.07 %), Industry and Mining (0.27%) and miscellaneous (0.02 %).

4.3 Of the total outlay an amount of Rs.564.288 lakhs was actually used in the district on the district level schemes during the year 1973-74. The percentage of expenditure is 57.85% to the total provision. The details regarding major headwise expenditure and the percentage of expenditure as compared to provisions is indicated below-

It is seen that there was a shortfall in the programme under Irrigation and Power as just 46 % of allotment was reported to be actually utilised during the period which is owing to delay in executing the works for want of sanctions etc. Under all the other heads, the progress of expenditure was as per target.

4.4 Agricultural Programme :-

An agricultural and allied activities are the main source of livelihood of more than 70 percent population of the district. The schemes pertaining to Soil Conservation on water shed area, land development, minor irrigation through wells, tanks and bandharas intensive cultivation of food crops through adoption of improved pack-

package practices, forest, fisheries dairy development warehousing and marketing were included under Agricultural Programme. The table below gives the reported expenditure under these programmes during 1973-74.

It is observed from the above table that schemes relating to minor irrigation and soil conservation etc. were given more importance in the district in order to help increase the production of foodcrops. The district has an undulating topography and hence soil erosion is a problem in this district. As a measure of soil conservation, bunding works were undertaken in 13,972 hectares of cultivable land, plantation of forest was done on 10 hectares as a measure of soil conservation, land development works in 2694 hectares of the commanded area under medium irrigation projects were undertaken. over 10,000 metric tonnes of town compost was produced in the district. Under the programme of resettlement of landless labourer 968 families were resettled.

In order to increase irrigation facilities in the district, the construction work

of 68 community wells was undertaken. The construction of 22 minor irrigation tanks and 21 percolation tanks was undertaken.

The loans of Rs. 8,000 were granted to 9 persons for starting poultry business under the intensive poultry Development Programme. The plantation of teak wood was undertaken in 100 hectares, Bamboo Plantation in 30 hectares, fodder plantation in 10 hectares, fast growing species in 20 hectares, were also undertaken in the year 1973-74. Under fisheries programme 25.75 lakhs spawn were produced and stocking of 17.52 lakhs carp fry was undertaken in the newly constructed irrigation tanks during the year 1973-74 and netting of 1.58 lakhs kgs. of fish was done. About 47 khs nylon twine was distributed to fisherman and their cooperatives on subsidised rates. Loans to 4 agricultural marketing societies were granted for development of market yards.

4.5 Co-operation and Community Development :-

An amount of Rs. 40.128 lakhs was spent under this major head during the year 1973-74. Under the sub-head 'Co-Operation' an amount of Rs. 10.lakhs was granted to the Co-operative Sugar Factory, Pusad as Govt. share capital. Government share capital worth Rs. 16.74 lakhs was also granted to 13 Co-operative ginning societies in the district. Government Share Capital, Loans and Subsidy for different purposes were granted to different societies under the various schemes under this Sub-head during the year 1973-74.

Under the programme of 'Community Development' the existing Community Development Blocks were continued. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme was also continued in three existing blocks.

The activities like kitchen gardens and feeding programme in school going children were undertaken in 30 villages from 3 blocks. The total expenditure on the community development programme was Rs. 6.81 lakhs.

4.6 Irrigation and Power:-

Under this major head, the schemes pertaining to rural electrification and energizing of electric pumps were mainly undertaken. Under the programme, the lines laid of 66 K.W. were of 63 kms. and of 11 K.V. of 177 Kms. Further during the year 107 villages were electrified and 1290 pumps were energized. By the end of the year 1973-74, 750 villages in the district were electrified and 9080 electric pump sets were energized. One harijan basti was also electrified on priority basis.

4.7 Industry and Mining :-

The programme of large and medium industries included organisation of Cooperative Processing industries, while the programme of small scale industries included financial assistance viz, share and loan to Co-operative industrial societies. The total expenditure on the programme was 2.63 lakhs.

4.8 Transport and Communication :-

Road transport has significant importance in the development of the district as the district is not well served with railways. During the year 1973-74, 35.70 kms. of pucca roads and 9.00 kms. of kacha roads were constructed. One bridge and 33 cross drainage works on the existing roads were also constructed. Black topping of 10.20 kms. was completed during the said period.

4.9 Social Services :-

An amount of Rs. 100.654 lakhs was spent under this head during the year 1973-74 in order to improve economic conditions of weaker section of the society and to help Socio-economic development of the district.

Primary education is laid with more importance and the construction of school building for primary schools was undertaken during the year 1973-74 and such 16 rooms were constructed during the year. During the year 1973-74, loan scholarships to 30 primary teachers and stipend to 40 Primary Teachers -ers /under training were given. One Secondary School was constructed during the year . Educational concessions to economically backward classes were granted to 1260 students, while 352 children of primary teachers were provided educational concessions. Over 18 thousand adults were made literate under eradication of illiteracy programme during the year.

The construction of staff quarters and hostel building for Government Polytechnic at Yeotmal which was in Progress last year was also in progress during the year 1973-74 and the work was nearly completed. The construction work of 252 bedded civil hospital at Ye-

Yeotmal was in Progress. One Primary health sub-centre building was constructed during the year. D.D.T. spraying was organised as control measure in the district and about 9 lakh houses were sprayed during the year malaria eradication programme. Over 2 thousand family planning operations were performed during the year 1973-74 in this district while 58 I.U.C.D. insertions were also performed.

Providing of drinking water is one of the important programme under plan of the State Government. The Government water supply scheme was executed for Yeotmal town. Municipal Water supply schemes for three Municipal areas, Umerkhed, Darwaha and Pandharkaoda were completed during the year while one more at Digras was in progress. The drainage scheme for Wani Municipal area was also nearly completed. Rural water supply schemes at Arni, Lakhi were completed and Pahoor in progress during the year. The rural water supply schemes for groups of villages were undertaken for 6 villages in Babhulgaon, 12 villages in Ralegaon, 8 villages in Mahagaon and Umerkhed blocks, 13 villages in Digras and Yeotmal blocks and 25 villages in Pusad taluka and they were in Progress. Individual piped water supply schemes for rural areas were also executed by Zilla Parishad. About 300 new drinking water wells and 8 tube wells were constructed and 210 old wells were renovated in order to provide additional drinking water facilities in the district.

Housing sites were provided to 9 developing villages as a measure of goathan extension and financial assistance was granted to 108 households for tiling the roofs of their huts during the year 1973-74.

An amount of Rs. 1.66 lakhs was spent on Backward class welfare schemes during the year 1973-74 by providing various socio-economic and agro-industrial amenities to them. The technical certificate

and diploma courses are being taught at Industrial Training Institute at Yeotmal under labour and labour welfare programme. Two units of family and child welfare project at Digras and Ghatanji were functioning in the district during the year 1973-74.

4.10 Miscellaneous :-

Under this major head of development rural broadcasting facilities were provided to 21 villages by spending Rs. 18,000 towards the cost of radio sets etc.
