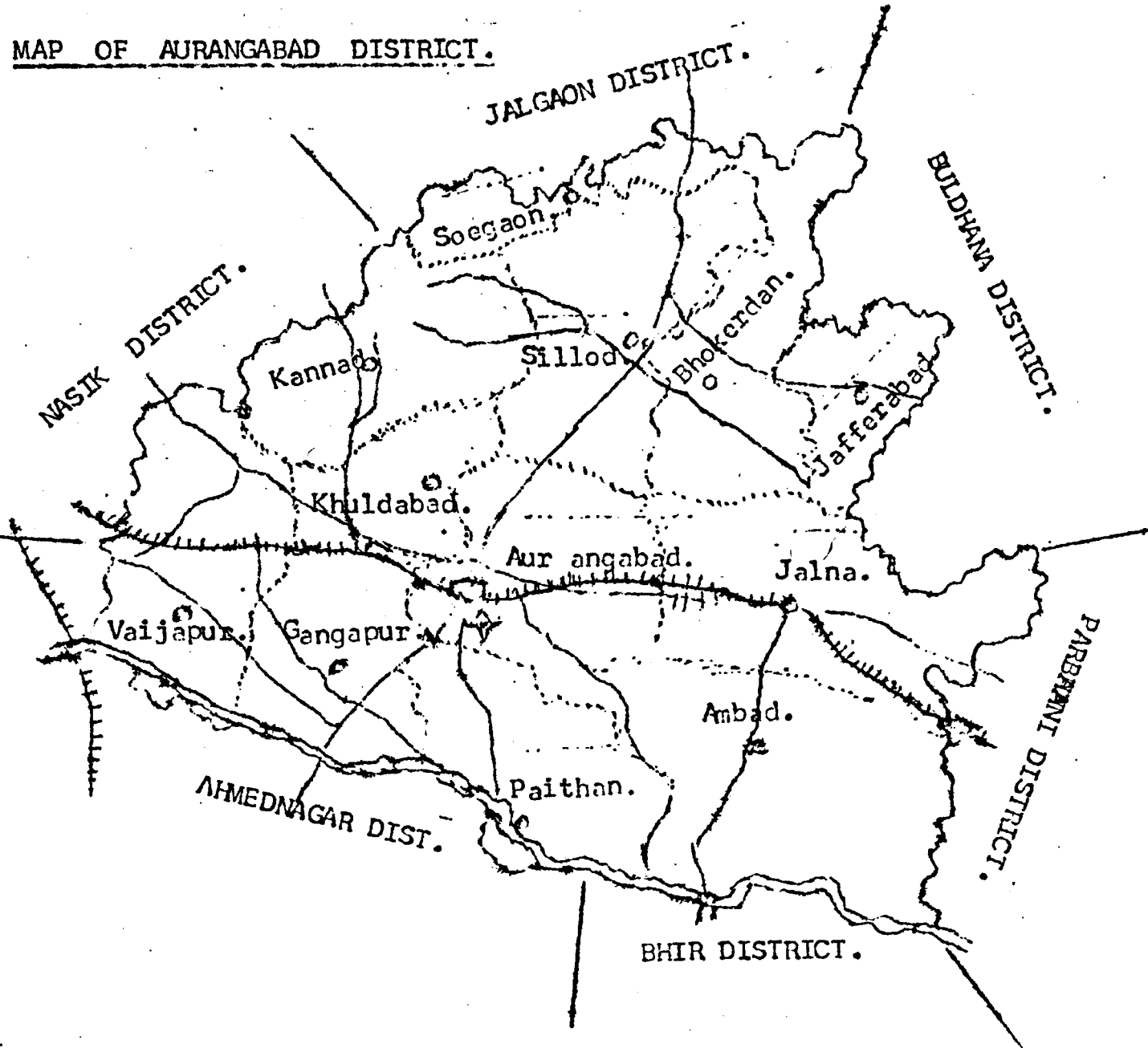
MAP OF AURANGABAD DISTRICT.

## CHAPTER-I

### 1.1 INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION:

The district of Aurangabad, now, a part of the Maharashtra State, is situated in upper Godavari basin and in the extreme north west of Marathwada. It lies in between the parallels of  $19^{\circ}17'30''$  and  $20^{\circ}40'10''$  north latitude and between the meridians of  $74^{\circ}39'30''$  and  $76^{\circ}40'$  east Longitude. According to 1971 Census it covers an area of 16,200 Sq. Kilometres.

The district forms 5.3% of the total area of the State and 3.91% of the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at the banks of the Godavari. In general, the district slopes down towards the south and south-east.

### 1.2 BOUNDARIES.

It is bounded on the north by the districts of Jalgaon and Dhulia, on the south by Bhir district and a portion of Ahmednagar district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from north to south is about 161 kms. and from east to west about 201 Kms.

### 1.3 AREA:

The area of Aurangabad district as per 1971 population Census publications is 16,200 kilometres, the rural area covering 16,059.2 Sq. Kilometres and the urban area 140.8 Sq. Kms. The rural area forms 99.1% and the urban area 0.9%.

The district or any of its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries during 1901 to 1941. In 1950 twenty-five enclave villages of Nasik East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district and thus a change in boundary was effected. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs, the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 50 and the new mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad were created.

Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 villages from Kannad Taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956 the district was transferred from the erstwhile Hyderabad State along with the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra State.

#### 1.4 TOPOGRAPHY:-

In general the district slopes down towards south and south east. The general elevation above the sea level varies from 2,000 to 2,200 feet on the north and 1,700 to 1,900 feet towards the south.

#### 1.5 HILLS, REVERS AND SOILS.

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valley of the Godavari. The hills of Balaghat are a continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidarbha. There are important and noted hills in Aurangabad, namely, Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotsna hills. All these have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. Other hills of the district are Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kankura, Surpanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghats and the Aurangabad hills. Their average height is about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in some places they reach a height of about 3,000 feet also. These hills consist mostly of trap rock with nodular limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is Godavari which runs along the southern boundary for about 203 kilometres separating Aurangabad district from Ahmednagar and Bhir districts. Its tributaries are Purna, Shivana, Dhenda, Dhudhna, Dhamna, Kham (Ganda) (which passes through the heart of the Aurangabad town), Dheku, Khelna, Kundalika, Seuki, Sukhna, Koriwad, Katkali, Galathi and Jui.

The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga, Virbhadra, Kasner, Nalni, Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala, Hewra, Arnavati and Gulduth.

The soil of Aurangabad district is black cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weathering of the trap rock. The geological formation of the district is (i) Middle traps of the Deccan tertiary (ii) Older alluvial deposits of Godavari and (iii) modern alluvial deposits of Godavari and other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime, magnesia, iron and alkalis on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on wetting by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture and depth. In the hilly tracts in the north it is shallow and relatively poor, but in the south it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godavari valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

#### 1.6 (i) CLIMATE:

The climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons (i) a moderately warm wet season from June to September, (ii) a cool dry season from October to February and (iii) hot dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below  $17^{\circ}\text{C}$ . and normally ranges between  $21^{\circ}\text{C}$ . to  $36^{\circ}\text{C}$ . The winter season is comparatively dry and starts from November and ends in February, January being the coldest month of the year. The maximum temperature in the month of May rises even as high as  $41^{\circ}$ . Hot dry winds prevail occasionally in April and May. During summer, the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. The climate of Aurangabad can thus be called pleasant and healthy.

During the hot season in 1973, the maximum temperature  $43.6^{\circ}$  centigrade and  $43.6^{\circ}$  centigrade were recorded in May, 1973, at Aurangabad and Chikalhana centres respectively whereas the maximum temperatures recorded in May, 1972 at Aurangabad and Chikalhana centre were  $42.8^{\circ}$  and  $42.2^{\circ}$  centigrade respectively.

The minimum temperatures during the cool-dry season of 1973 were recorded as 10.60 centigrade at Aurangabad centre, in the month of November, 1973 and 3.8° centigrade at Chikalthana centre in the month of January, 1973, where as in 1972 the minimum temperatures were recorded in the month of February, 1972 as 8.2° centigrade and 1.9° centigrade at Aurangabad centre and Chikalthana centre, respectively.

The minimum temperature at Aurangabad centre for the month of December, 1973 was rejected by the Director, Meteorological Department, Government of India, Bombay hence it was shown as nil in the respective column.

The table below indicates the maximum and minimum average temperature recorded during the year 1972 and 1973 at Aurangabad and Chikalthana centres in Aurangabad Dist.

1.7 RAINFALL.

It may be noted that rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of the district. According to variation in rainfall, the district can be classified into three tracts, namely (i) Tracts where the rainfall exceeds 750 millimetres (ii) Rather insufficient rainfall tracts with rainfall ranging between 650 to 750 millimetres and (iii) poor rainfall tracts with rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The normal rainfall is shown taking average of 34 years from 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Aurangabad, Khuldabad, Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Jalna, Gangapur and Vaijapur and average of ten years from 1961 to 1970 for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Ambad and Paithan. From the above it is evident that during 1972 every taluka recorded rainfall between 205.6 to 535.4 millimetres as the year 1972 was a drought year. As a result, the whole district was declared as scarcity area during 1972.

In the year 1973, rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Khuldabad, Soegaon and Sillod. It ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Aurangabad, Kannad, Bhokardan, Ambad and Gangapur. The remaining talukas viz. Jafferabad, Jalna, Paithan and Vaijapur had rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The Fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas which are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions :-

<u>Area</u>	<u>Estimated Frequency</u>
1. Vaijapur Taluka	Once in Ten years.
2. Gangapur Taluka	Once in Ten years.

Thus the south western region of the district generally recording poor rainfall is more susceptible to failure of crops due to in-adequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes to scarcity conditions.

#### 1.8 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP:

Aurangabad district is divided into three revenue sub-divisions which are further sub-divided into talukas as given in the following table No.1.3.

ZILLA PARISHAD:

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and Government affairs, a Zilla Parishad and 12 Panchayat Samitis have been established in 1962. The Panchayat Samities jurisdiction correspond to the taluka boundaries excluding municipalities and cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 99.13 percent of the area and 84.15 percent of the total population of the district as per 1971 Census.

The number of villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti along with the number of councillors and co-opted members are shown below in table No. 1.4.

PURPOSE :-

Exhaustive statistics about important Socio-Economic indicators have been presented in this Abstract with a view to make the Abstract useful as a reference book, The talukawise figures which have been given in the Abstract will enable the reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE:-

This table indicates the data on all important items in order to have a birds-eye-view of the socio-economic indicators of the district as compared to that of Maharashtra State. Items covered in the table are: Area and Population, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Industries, Electricity, Co-operation, Medical and Health, Education, Transport and Communication, Plan and Community Development Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table.

The scope and limitations of the information in the Abstract are discussed in the following paragraphs.

1. AREA AND POPULATION:-

The data of 1971 population census are presented in table Nos. 1 to 7.

The table No.1 gives rural and urban area, population per sq.Km., No. of villages inhabited and un-inhabited, No. of towns, No. of occupied residential houses, No. of households and male and female population in Aurangabad district, according to 1971-Census. The table No.2 shows decadal percentage variations in total, rural and urban population since 1951 with the population per sq.km. for total, rural and urban of Aurangabad Dist. for 1951, 1961 and 1971 censuses.

The table No.3 showing talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 Census gives No. of villages in population ranges of less than 200, 200-499, 500-999, 1,000-1,999, 2,000-4,999, 5,000-9,999 and 10,000 and above population in Aurangabad district. The table No.4 shows talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 Census in Aurangabad district. The table No. 5 indicates the number of workers and non-workers according to livelihood classes in each taluka of Aurangabad district according to 1971 Census.

The table No.6 presents the data of distribution of total, rural and urban population according to (A) age group and (B) religion in the district as per 1971 Census. The table No.7 gives information pertaining to talukawise total, rural and urban population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the district at the time of 1971 Census.

### II. RAINFALL AND CLIMATE:-

Table Nos. 8 and 9 deal with number of rainy days and rainfall and monthly temperature at the selected centres in the district. The monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at selected centres in the district during 1973 is given in table number 8, as recorded at the 13 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters except one i.e. Chikalhana. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Silled, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vainapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna centres, the same recorded in the table for Soegaon, Jafferabad Paithan and Ambad centres is the average rainfall of ten years i.e. 1961 to 1970 and for Chikalhana the average for ten years i.e. from 1963 to 1972 as the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available with the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona. The table No.9 gives monthly maximum and minimum temperature at two selected centres in the district during 1973.

### III. AGRICULTURE:

Table Nos. 10 to 21 deal with land utilisation, talukawise area under different crops, yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops, talukawise area irrigated by different sources talukawise area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells in each taluka, number of minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects in the district, agricultural wage rates, agricultural implements in each taluka, famine scarcity and akin to scarcity data and determination of precarious and other scarcity areas.

The table No.10 gives information about talukawise land utilisation in the district during 1971-72 and 1972-73. The area under different crops in each taluka of the district for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73 is given in table No.11.

The yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops in the district during 1971-72 and 1972-73 is furnished in table No.12. The data regarding the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district during 1971-72 and 1972-73 is displayed in table No.13. The area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1971-72 and 1972-73 is given in table No.14. This chapter deals with a few selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important sectors of economy in the district.

INDICATOR NO.1.

Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73.

The percentage of gross cropped-area to net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. Double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. Following table indicates the position of gross cropped area to net cropped area in the district.

It is evident from the above table that the percentage of double cropped area in the district more or less remained constant during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1971-72: In the year 1972-73 this percentage has gone down from 5.57 to 3.18.

The reason for decrease in the percentage is the incidence of drought conditions in the district, in the year 1972-73. The talukas which are hard hit by the drought are Aurangabad, Kannad, Gangapur and Vaijaour.

INDICATOR NO.2.

Productivity of Important Crops.

Productivity of important crops in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73 has been discussed in this indicator. There is a separate table in the Abstract part denoting the yield rates of different crops per hectare. In the following table, yield rates of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73 have been indicated.

The details in above table show that the yield of almost all the crops has remarkably decreased in the years 1972-73. The main reason for this decrease in yield rate is insufficient rains and the consequent severe drought conditions in the district in the year 1972-73. Particularly the yield rates of crops requiring more water such as Rice, Groundnut etc. have been seriously affected.

INDICATOR No.3.

Gross value of Agricultural Production:

The gross value of total Agricultural produce is the better indicator of the economic conditions in the district, because of the dependence of population on Agriculture for their livelihood.

The gross value of a particular commodity is calculated on the basis of total produce of the particular commodity multiplied by the existing harvest price prevailing in that year.

In the table below, gross values of important agricultural commodities for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1971-72 and 1972-73 are given in crores of rupees.

It is evident from the above table that the gross value of agricultural produce in the district has been showing a decreasing trend. Particularly the reasons for the decrease in the value of Agricultural produce in the year 1972-73 are the low yields of almost all the crops due to meagre rainfall in the year 1972-73.

It is evident from the above table that the area under total food crops and non-food crops decreased during the year 1972-73 as compared to that in 1971-72, 1970-71, 1965-66 and 1961-62. The <sup>Reasons</sup> for decrease in the area are the prevalence of scarcity conditions during the year 1972-73.

The percentage of gross cropped area of food crops however improved in the year 1972-73 as compared to the previous years and that of non-food crops decreased to a certain extent . The position of the area under cereals and pulses together with their percentages is indicated in the following table.

It is evident from the table that the percentages of both cereals and pulses have increased in the year 1972-73 as compared to the previous years owing to increase in gross cropped area of food crops to non-food crops.

INDICATOR NO.6

\*. Increase in Agricultural Credit Outstanding dues and Gross value of Agricultural Production.

This indicator points out the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of co-operative societies provide all types of facilities needed by agriculturists to improve their financial condition and agricultural production.

It is evident from the above table that the advances have considerably increased in 1973-74 when compared to the advances of 1961-62. However when compared to advances in the year 1972-73 the quantum of advances 1973-74 has been less probably due to less recovery. Regarding outstanding dues it may be noted that there is continuous increase in the outstanding dues from the year 1961-62. In fact the volume of outstanding dues in the years 1972-73 and 1973-74 has remarkably increased. The reason for the same appear to be the effect of scarcity conditions in the district.

The value of Agricultural Produce of principal crops in the year 1972-73 also indicate a decreasing trend due to scarcity conditions.

INDICATOR NO.7.

Agricultural Wage Rates.

The wage rates of different categories of agriculture labourers are collected from 3 different rural centres namely Bidkin in Paithan taluka, Ajantha in Sillod taluka and Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka of Aurangabad district. From the above table it is evident that in case of skilled labour there are no considerable variations about the wage rates of carpenters and Blacksmiths between the centres as well as in the year 1972 and 1973. However in case of cobbler the wage rate of Ajantha centre is considerably lower in both the years 1972 and 1973, as compared to wage rates at Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres. In case of agricultural labourers and their wage rates there is no considerable variation between the centres in the district in the years 1972 and 1973 except in case of Herdsman. The wage rates of Herdsman at Ajantha centre are considerably higher than the wage rates at other centres in both the years 1972 and 1973.

INDICATOR NO.8

Livestock per Hectare of Land.

The livestock is the major source of power to the agriculturists and the comparison of the livestock population (bovine and ovine) with the cultivable area in the district indicates the ratio of livestock population per hectare of cultivable area.

The ratio of livestock population per hectare of cultivable area in Aurangabad district as a whole was 0.90 in 1972-73 whereas during the year 1965-66 the same was 0.93. The slight decrease in the No. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land in the year 1972-73 appears to be due to decrease in the livestock population in 1972 Census as a result of severe drought conditions in the district in that year.

INDICATOR NO.9.

Poultry as compared to Population:

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad District.

During the Third Five Year Plan period special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry breeding and supply of improved birds and advancing of loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the census of 1972, total number of poultry was 2.22 lakhs as against 2.01 lakhs during the year 1966. This indicates an increase of poultry by 0.21 lakhs over the year 1966.

It may be observed from the above table that the ratio of poultry to population in 1971 as per 1972 Livestock Census was the highest in Jafferabad taluka while the same was the lowest in Vaijapur taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 216 while the minimum was 70 only.

INDICATOR NO.10.

Per Capital consumption of Electricity:

Electricity is the most powerful means of achieving Economic growth and its per capita consumption indicates the general level of Economic growth in the district.

The per capita consumption of Electricity rose from 25.2 (KWH) in 1972-73 to 36.8 (KWH) in 1973-74. The percentage consumption of electricity on different items of use also indicate variations in the years 1972-73 and 1973-74 which are shown in the table below.

Out of the total consumption of electricity in 1973-74 consumption for industrial and agricultural purposes accounted for 42.30% and 32.33% respectively as against 31.84% and 37.34% in the year 1972-73. This indicates that the consumption of energy for industrial purposes has registered a significant increase during 1973-74 in Aurangabad District.

The total No. of villages electrified in Aurangabad district also rose from 811 in 1972-73 to 907 in 1973-74.

INDICATOR NO.11.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

The number of candidates enrolled at the Employment Exchange, Aurangabad and the vacancies notified to the Employment Exchange, Aurangabad indicate the availability of Employment potential and job opportunities in the district.

The number of candidates enrolled at the Employment Exchange, Aurangabad increased from 10,619 in 1961-62 to 14,748 in the year 1973-74 denoting 39% increase in the year 1973-74 over the year 1961-62.

The number of vacancies notified at the Employment Exchange, Aurangabad during the year 1973-74 also rose to 2,158 from 2,005 in the year 1961-62, indicating 8% increase in the year 1973-74 over the year 1961-62.

Increase in in-door and out-door Patients treated in Hospitals.

This indicator denotes the increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in hospitals in Aurangabad district during the year 1965-66, 1972-73 and 1973-74. The table No.46 of the Abstract deals with the medical facilities available in each taluka of Aurangabad district for the year 1973.

The in-door patients treated in the year 1973 appear to be considerably less when compared to the in-door patients treated in 1965 and 1972. The difference is mainly because of the reporting of admissions only in the year 1973 and omission of the figures of the remaining with admissions which have been considered in the years 1965- and 1972. Aurangabad and Jalna accounted for the highest number of in-door patients treated where better medical facilities are available due to location of Medical College Hospital, Aurangabad and Cottage Hospital at Jalna.

The number of primary schools including pre-primary rose from 1313 in 1961-62 to 1885 in 1965-66 and 2048 in 1972-73. Similarly the number of students also increased from 1,03,870 in 1961-62 to 1,53,203 in 1965-66 and 1,86,635 in 1972-73.

There have been continuous increase in the number of institutions as well as in number of students both in case of Secondary and higher education institutions in the district.

INDICATOR NO.14.

Increase in Road length per 100 Sq. Kilometres.

This indicator denotes the increase in road length per 100 square kilometres in Aurangabad district for the years 1961-62,1965-66,1971-72,1972-73 and 1973-74.

The road length per 100 square kilometres in the district rose from 6.18 kilometres in 1961-62 to 7.30 kilometres in 1965-66 and 29.18 in 1973-74.

INDICATOR NO.15.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to Population.

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Aurangabad district at the end of March, 1961, 1966, 1971, 1972 and 1973.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of Agriculture and Industry. In the year 1960-61 there were 8 scheduled banks in the district. At the end of March, 1966, 1971 and 1972 there were 11, 37, 47 and 53 scheduled banks, respectively.

The district population as per 1971 Census was 19,71,006. The number of branches of all the banks was 120. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 16,425.

The district Central Co-operative Bank plays an important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 67 branches of the District Central Co-operative Bank in the district as at the end of June, 1972 while there were 20, 32, 62 and 65 branches at the end of March, 1961, 1966, 1970 and 1971, respectively.

It is evident from the above table that the price index of almost all the commodities (except Supari) has increased during 1973 as compared to the year-1966. The increasing trend in price level in the district appears to be the result of scarcity conditions in 1973 on the one hand and the overall impact of inflationary trends on the other.

CHAPTER -IV

P\_L\_A\_N\_N\_I\_N\_G

This chapter deals with the Annual Plan review for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74. 1973-74 is the fifth year of IV Five Year Plan. The Fourth Five Year Plan of the State covering a period of 1969-70 to 1973-74, was formulated keeping in view the object of creating self-reliant and self-generating economy. Together with the promotion of Agricultural Development and allied sectors responsible for agricultural development, the promotion and growth of Social justice was also aimed at while planning the Fourth Plan. Main features of the Fourth Plan therefore included key elements of Agricultural Programmes such as expansion of Irrigation facilities, reorientation of Irrigation Practices, optimum use of water (ground and surface) through special programmes for increasing the intensity of cropping and Land Development measures having a direct bearing on Agricultural productivity. The sector which helped the promotion of social justice, included the programmes such as generation of additional employment opportunities specially in rural areas and for expansion of facilities for weaker sections of the Community, unutilized unemployed, removal of deficiencies in backward areas and consolidation in other areas, opening of Ashram Shala-based complexes for the Adivasies and Vimukta Jatis etc. The total budgetary provisions for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 were made to the tune of Rs. 366.85 Lakhs and 496.98 Lakhs, respectively. The total expenditure in the Annual Plan periods of 1972-73 and 1973-74 amounted to Rs. 386.25 Lakhs and 483.30 Lakhs respectively. The percentage of expenditure to the total budget provisions for the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 was 105.29 and 97.25 respectively.

The major headwise expenditure in the Annual Plan 1972-73 and 1973-74 in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the total expenditure under different heads of development incurred during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74 constituted 105.29% and 97.25%, respectively, of the budget provisions of the respective years.

The head-wise expenditure given in the above table denotes that the "Social Services" received the top-priority in both the years i.e. in 1972-73 and 1973-74 and consumed the largest share of 48.28% and 63.09% of the total expenditure during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively. In order of priority the Social Services were followed by Agricultural Programme, Transport and Communications, Co-operation and Community Development, Industry and Mining and Miscellaneous during 1972-73, whereas during 1973-74, in order of priority Social Services were followed by Agricultural programme, Co-operation and Community Development, Transport and Communications, Industry and Mining, & Miscellaneous.

It will be seen from the above statement that the major portion of expenditure was incurred on the schemes of Minor irrigation (57.80%), Soil Conservation (18.67%), Ayacut Development (13.12%) and Agricultural production (7.85%) during the year 1972-73. For the year 1973-74 maximum part of expenditure was incurred on the schemes of minor Irrigation (41.16%), Ayacut Development (25.29%), Soil Conservation (24.64%) and Agricultural production (6.41%). The expenditure under Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, Forests, Fisheries and Ware-housing and Marketing was very low during both the years.

Under the Sub-Head of Agricultural Production the schemes directly relating to Development of local manurial resources were included and 16538 and 93702 tonnes of local manures were produced and distributed during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively. Under the Horticultural Development Scheme 36 and 23 hectares were brought under plantation of fruit trees respectively during 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Fruit trees rejuvenation and renovation were done in 250 and 350 hectares during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Fruit trees rejuvenation and renovation were done in 250 and 350 hectares during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74 respectively, about 2.10 lakhs and 1.49 lakhs hectares were brought under intensive cultivation during the year 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Under Ayacut Development scheme 4814 and 5071 hectares of land levelling, land shapping and bunding, were done during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively in the command area of Jayakwadi Project. Under the schemes of minor irrigation, 101 and 99 subsidy cases of construction of new wells and 46 and 76 subsidy cases of installation of pumping sets were adjusted respectively during 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Under the scheme of contour bunding 1.65 and 0.93 lakhs hectare were bunded respectively during 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Under the scheme of Animal Husbandry, four dispensaries and 2 Aid Centres were continued in both the years under review.

Under the Town Milk Supply Scheme 5,278 and 5,251 litres of milk was handled per day during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Under the scheme "Farm Forestry" plantation including pre-monsoon was done on 114 and 121 hectares respectively during 1972-73 and 1973-74. The Central nurseries already established were maintained in both the years under review. Under the scheme "Roshia Grass" 130 hectares and 89 hectares were covered during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

The scheme "Afforestation for Soil Conservation" covered an area of 865 hectares and 290 hectares, during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively. Whereas the scheme of Development of pastures was extended over 30 hectares during each year 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Under the scheme of Fish Farming in impounded waters 15.94 and 20.72 lakhs of fingerlings were stocked in tanks and 2.72 and 1.25 lakhs Kg. fish was netted-out respectively during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74. Under supply of fishery requisites during 1973-74, 496 Kg. nylon twine was supplied to fishermen.

Under the scheme of "Ware housing and Marketing" Rs.14000/- and Rs.12000/- were distributed during 1972-73 and 1973-74 to the Market Committees for construction of godowns.

## II. CO OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 8.85 lakhs and 25.52 lakhs during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively, on sub-head of co-operation and Community development. the expenditure

incurred on co-operation amounted to Rs.0.85 lakhs and 17.60 lakhs; while the expenditure booked on Community Development was 8.00 lakhs and 7.92 lakhs during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Membership of co-operative societies was increased by 12004 in 1972-73 and 2171 during the year 1973-74. For strengthening of the cooperative structure from district level to village level, eight Industrial Co-operative societies were organised during 1973-74 with a membership of 104.

Seventeen Community Development blocks comprising of 20½ C.P.A. pattern blocks were continued during both the years under review. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in 4 blocks viz. Sillod, Khuldabad Jalna and Soegaon during both the years under review.

### III. INDUSTRY AND MINING:

The percentage of expenditure on Small Scale Industries and mining was very low during 1972-73 and 1973-74 i.e. only 0.88 and 0.07 percent respectively, of the total expenditure which mainly constituted assistance to Industrial Co-operative societies and federations for the development of handlooms. Under the scheme of Development of Small Scale Industries (Handloom) rebates of Rs.58,000 in 1972-73 and Rs.4,000 in 1973-74 were given.

### IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

Transport and Communication facilities are the most important pre-requisites of economic development. The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs.26.00 lakhs and 20.18 lakhs during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Under the scheme of district roads, the work of construction of new roads was completed to the extent of 6 Kms. in 1972-73 and 2 Kms. in 1973-74 in state sector whereas 18.64 Kms. and 25 Kms. of road were completed respectively during 1972-73 and 1973-74 in local sector.

Under the scheme of roads under public participation amounts of Rs.1.23 lakhs and Rs.1.19 lakhs were spent during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively. Under the scheme of "Roads in Hilly and in-accessible areas" construction of new roads to the extent of 19.07 kilometres and 26.83 kilometres were completed in 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

The roads to the length of 1.51 kilometres and 9 kilometres were completed during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively under the scheme of Black topping of roads in local sector.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES.

Social Services sector received in the Annual Plan the largest share of provision during the years 1972-73 and 1973-74. The expenditure incurred under social services constituted 48.28% and 63.09% of the total expenditure during 1972-73 and 1973-74 respectively. The sub-headwise expenditure under Social Services during the Annual Plan 1972-73 in the district is given in the following table :-

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under water supply and Drainage during 1972-73 and 1973-74 was the highest that is 51.21% and 58.48% respectively of the total expenditure under Social Services.

Under the rural water supply scheme 26 drinking water wells were constructed during 1972-73 and 29 in 1973-74. 91 Drinking water wells renovated during 1972-73 and 15 in 1973-74. The work of Municipal piped water supply scheme was completed at Patthan in 1972-73 and two works were in progress in 1973-74.

The piped water supply schemes at 6 villages and 3 villages were completed during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively, under Rural piped water supply scheme.

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under General Education was second in expenditure in both the years that is in 1972-73 and 1973-74 to the total expenditure under Social Services. Under the scheme expansion of primary education 211 and 225 teachers were appointed and as many as 440 and 739 teachers were imparted basic training during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively. 107 rooms in 1972-73 and 15 rooms in 1973-74 for the schools were constructed. Educational concessions were given to 8505 students in 1972-73 and 26854 students in 1973-74 to the economically backward classes. Educational concessions were given to 175 and 685 eligible children of primary teachers during 1972-73 and 1973-74.

Under the sub-head Technical Education expenditures of Rs. 0.69 lakhs and 0.37 lakhs were incurred during 1972-73 and 1973-74 respectively.

Under the scheme Extension of village goathans and provision of house sites the expenditures of Rs. 0.09 lakhs and 0.06 lakhs were incurred during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

The total expenditure under Urban Development was Rs.6.17 lakhs in 1973-74. Two Municipal Councils were assisted financially by giving them loan and grant-in-aid during 1973-74 as financial assistance for Development Plans of Municipal Councils.

The expenditure incurred under welfare of Backward classes was 0.33 percent and 0.85 percent of the total expenditure under Social Services respectively during 1972-73, 1973-74. Grants of Scholarship-tuition fees and examination fees were given to 2469 and 1735 pupils during 1972-73 and 1973-74 respectively. Grants were awarded to 60 inmates in 1972-73 and 88 inmates in 1973-74 of backward class hostels. Rs.2000 in 1972-73 and Rs.6000 in 1973-74 were distributed among cultivators for the Development of their lands. Rs.6000 and Rs.5000 were distributed among cultivators of Backward classes for construction of new wells and repairs to old wells during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.

Rs.15,000 among 20 beneficiaries of backward class under the scheme "Housing Aid to Backward Classes" were distributed for construction of houses during both the years under review.

Under Rural Broadcasting scheme 57 and 110 radio sets were installed in different villages during 1972-73 and 1973-74, respectively.
