CHAPTER : I
INTRODUCTION

1.1 LOCATION :

The district of Sangli is a part of the famous Deccan plateau. It lies between 16° 45' and 17° 33' North latitude and 73° 42' and 75° 40' East longitude. It is bounded on the east by the district of Bijapur in Karnatak State, on the West by the Ratnagiri district, on the South by the districts of Kolhapur and Belgaum and on the north by the districts of Satara and Sholapur.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY : (1) SOIL :

The soils of varied texture and structure are met with in Sangli district. The soil in the district varies from the deep black in the river valleys to shallow murmad red or grey in the hilly areas.

1.3 The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from the tahsil of Shirala is formed from red laterite mixed with hard murum due to the hilly nature of the zone.

1.4 The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon (Part) and Miraj (Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper Kharif crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow Rabi Jowar, Wheat and Gram. They are also good for irrigated crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5 The hilly tract comprising parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils grows Jowar and Bajri, while the eastern zone comprising areas of Jath, Atpedi and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils with a very low rainfall and poor grey soils, is a well known scarcity tract.

1.6 (ii) RIVERS:

The Krishna and the Warna are the principal rivers of the district. The Yerla, the Morna, the Manganga, the Nanni, the Agrani and the Bor are the other small rivers flowing through this district. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during the dry part, they resume a slender course. These rivers go dry in summer season.

1.7 (iii) HILL RANGES:

There are two main systems of hills. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the off-shoots of Mahadev range. The Sahyadri system includes the main range of the Sahyadri which forms the western boundary of the district. One of the spurs of the Mahadev range known as Mahimangad Panhala spur stretches up to Khanapur. At Khanapur it splits in two branches, one branch passes 32 km. in the south till it ends in the old Panhala Fort, 24 km. from Athani road Railway station. The other branch stretches south east to Belur about 8 km. south west of Jath. It forms the water parting between the valley of the Yerla, a tributary of the Krishna on the right and the valley of the Man, a tributary of the Bhima on the left.

1.8 RAINFALL:

The rains start sometime in the middle of June and last till the end of September in the district. Major portion of rainfall in the district is received between July and September. During the first half of monsoon, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains a bit heavily.

1.9 Rainfall is the heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri. Western portion of Shirala tahsil on an average gets rainfall over 2,000 mm. in a year. The central and eastern portions receive annual rainfall measuring about 750 mm. The north eastern portion receives the lowest rainfall in the district averaging about 500 mm. in a year.

1.10 The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay in 1960 had reported that the rainfall in this area is not dependable and the area is likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years. The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has also recognised this fact. As per the report of this committee six tahsils of this district fall in the broad drought zone. These tahsils are Atpadi, Khanapur (Khanapur and Vita-circles), Tasgaon (Savalaj and Visapur circles), Jath, Kavathe Mahankal and Miraj (Malgaon circle).

1.11 Although Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year 1972-73 there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions in this district particularly in the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

1.12 MINERALS:

There are no important mineral deposits except building stones clay and limestones. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers.

1.13 FOREST:

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician Forest Department was 47994 hectares in 1974-75. The forest area formed hardly 5.6 percent of the geographical area of this district.

1.14 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY:

The district has an area of 8563.0 sq. km and population of 15,39,820 as per population census 1971. Out of this 2.86 lakh person (18.63 percent) were in urban areas and 12.53 lakh persons (81.37 percent) were in rural areas as compared to 31.17 percent urban and 68.83 percent rural population for the State.

1.15 The decennial increase of population compared to 1961 was 25.12 percent in total population, 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The following table will give tahsil-wise position in this respect.

(I) DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:

(i) State Govt. Administration.

1.16 The Collector of the district is in charge of General Administration, Law and order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies etc. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector and two Dy. Collectors who hold charges of the two Revenue Divisions and have their headquarters at Sangli and Miraj. For each of the eight tahsils a tahsildar is in charge of the respective tahsil.

(II) LOCAL BODIES :

1.17 Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act of 1962 the Zilla Parishad and eight panchayat samities have been established in the district with a view to promote and secure participation by the people in the developmental works by decentralisation of powers and functions.

1.18 At the Block(tahsil) level, the Panchayat Samiti consists of all elected and co-opted councillors from the area of the Block and a Chairman of a co-operative society conducting the business of purchase or sale of agricultural produce in the area of the Block as an associate member and a chairman of a co-operative society conducting the business in agriculture in the area of the Block as a co-opted member. Sarpanchas elected by members of village panchayats are also elected members of the panchayat samiti. Their number is at the rate of two for each electoral division in the area of the block.

1.19 The towns of Sangli, Miraj, Islampur, Ashta, Tasgaon and Vita are under the Municipal Administration, while the newly declared urban area of Madhavanagar is a non-municipal town. The areas under the jurisdiction of the zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti correspond to the district and tahsil boundaries except in the case of Municipal Towns. The Sangli Zilla Parishad covers 96.7 percent of district area and 81.95 percent of the total population of the district.

(III) BODIES ADMINISTRATION:

1.20 For rapid development of an area, the services of the State Transport and State Electricity Board are of vital interest. The office of the Divisional Controller, State Transport Division, Sangli, is functioning at Sangli for the Sangli district. The Offices of the Superintending Engineer and Executive Engineer of Maharashtra State Electricity Board are also located at Sangli. One more office of the Executive Engineer, of Maharashtra State Electricity Board is situated at Islampur. The branch offices of the Life Insurance Corporation are functioning in Sangli and - Tasgaon under their divisional office at Satara.

CHAPTER-II
EXPLANATORY NOTE.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE :

2.1 In this Abstract, comprehensive statistics are presented so as to provide necessary basic data for further studies in the Socio Economic aspects of the Sangli district. Wherever possible, tahsilwise position on different topics for the year 1974-75 is given in the Abstract.

2.2 The source of the data is shown at the end of each table. Besides, notes explaining the major limitations, if any, in the table are also given at the end of the concerned table.

2.3 In the following paras, the concepts of certain terms, sources and limitations etc. of the statistics presented in this Abstract are given.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

2.4 The table gives some general particulars about the Sangli district and Maharashtra State. Against each item, mention of the reference period is made. The data on location, population, area, no. of villages, towns, total workers and non-workers, literacy etc. are presented in this table alongwith other important information pertaining to agriculture, industry, animal husbandry, electricity, cooperation, education, transport and communication etc.

1. AREA AND POPULATION :

2.5 Final figures of 1971 population census are presented in this section in respect of area, houses, population, density of population, population variation, population breakup into urban and rural, villages and towns according to population ranges, -

total no. of workers and non-workers. The data in respect of distribution of population according to age-group and religion and S.C./S.T. and neo-budhist data are also presented as per 1971 census population.

2.6 For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for the 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under municipal council or a contonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs; the following empirical tests were applied (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (estimated for 1971); (b) a denisity of not less than 400 per km² (1,000 per sq. mile) ; (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture; (d) the place should have, according to the Director of Census Operations of the state, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

2.7 As far as a worker and non-worker is concerned, a person is classified as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc.; he has worked in the current or last working season for the greater part of the season (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceeding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

2.8 A person who was working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which he was enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifteen days due to illness or other causes has been treated as a worker. A person who had been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as a non-worker.

2.9 The 1971 census stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full-time scale, should be treated as non-workers in respect of their main activity.

2. CLIMATE :

2.10 The table no.8 gives monthly normal rainfall, number of rainy days and actual rainfall of 9 rain gauge stations viz. Atpadi, Vita, Shirala, Islampur, Tasgaon, Jat, Kavathe Mahankal, Miraj and Sangli in the Sangli district. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out by the Indian Meteorological Department on the basis of actual rainfall for the ... periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. In case of Atpadi and Kavathe Mahankal they are worked out by District Statistical Office on the basis of actual rainfall from 1965 to 1974. As regards rainy days, a day is treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

2.11 The table no.9 gives the maximum and minimum temperatures of Sangli . . . station. The data as supplied by Indian Meteorological Department is exhibited in this table.

3. AGRICULTURE:

2.12 Under this section data regarding land utilisation, area under different crops, irrigated area, yield rate and production, minor, medium and major irrigation projects and famine and scarcity condition etc. are presented.

2.13 The table no.10 gives tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of utilisation. Against each tahsil, the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to the village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes. There are differences between the figures of total area according to the surveyer general and according to the village paper because the latter is calculated by totalling up village returns while the former is calculated in blocks. Under 'forests' area includes all actually forested area or lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways, etc. and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains deserted etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under "miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown", is included all cultivable -

land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Lands under ceasurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other trees for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more, in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs. Current fallows comprise cropped area which is kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once on the same land during the same year with the same or different crops.

2.14 The table no.12 presents the outturn and average yield per hectare of principal crops in the district. The estimates of outturn are based partly on the results of crop-cutting surveys and partly on "anawari" method. The table no.16 gives the information on number of minor irrigation works completed and allied information regarding irrigation in Sangli district. The table no.17 gives the information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works in Sangli district. The table no.19 presents the figures of

Agricultural implements enumerated in the 11th livestock census, 1972. The table no.20 gives the data about famine and scarcity hit area while table no.21 exhibits the history of famine and scarcity during the preceding years.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FORESTS :

2.15 Under this section data regarding Livestock, Veterinary statistics, livestock mortality, slaughter houses and animals slaughtered, forest area and major and minor forest products are presented.

2.16 The table no.22 gives the number of various types of livestock, poultry etc. as enumerated at the time of 1972 Livestock Census. In this census, all the livestock was enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The table no.25 shows the information regarding slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter house in the district. The information regarding animals slaughtered in non-recognised slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available. The table no.26(A) gives figures of area under forest in the district. The forest area figures in this table are different from the figures in the table on land utilisation. The concepts of classifying areas by the two departments are different.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY :

2.17 The statistics regarding factories and factory workers, employment exchange activities, consumption of electricity, and electrification of towns and villages are shown under this section.

2.18 In this section, statistics regarding employment in industries is given. The table no.27 gives average daily employment and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed return under the Act. The table no.28 throws light on another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted. The table no. 29 gives the classification of factories according to no.of days worked during the year. Table no.30 is designed to depict the position of registered factories as collected in the Annual - Survey of Industries. In this table data regarding no.of factories, their employment and their financial position is presented. Table no.31,32 and 33 give data about registrations, vacancies notified, placement made; occupational distribution of registration and placement; and industrywise employment respectively. The table no.34 gives information regarding consumption of electricity in the district. The table no.35 gives progress of electrification in the district. The table includes villages and towns(alongwith their 1971 census population) which are electrified by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and Private electric agencies viz. (1) Jubilee Electric Works, Sangli(2) the Co.op electric supply society ltd. Vita(3) the Tasgaon Electricity General Coop. society ltd. Tasgaon (4) Miraj Electricity Supply co. ltd. Miraj and (5) Madhavnagar electric supply company.

6. CO-OPERATION :

2.19 This section depicts the major activities of co-operative movement such as categorywise organisation of societies, activities of cooperative Banks, Primary Agril. credit societies, marketing societies, other co-operative societies of different types, Agril. Produce Market Committees and money lending activity in the district.

2.20 The main functions of Agril. credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, Agril.improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the Agril. produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Banks, urban credit cooperative societies and salary earners co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy, and co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Govt. securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of Non-Agril. Non credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes, to run Montessories Primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

2.24 This section includes five tables containing the data regarding medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies, births and deaths, infant deaths, deaths due to principal causes, vaccination and cholera inoculations and family planning. The statistics on medical facilities do not cover the facilities available through private institutions run by individuals or associations.

8. EDUCATION :

2.25 There are seven tables under this section which enumerate the data regarding sexwise literacy, educational institutions alongwith their strength, educational concessions to Backward class and Economically Backward class students and expenditure on Primary Education in this district. The no.of educational institutions relates to the academic year ending June while the no.of pupils is as on 31st March .

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

2.26 In this section, statistical information relating to various modes of transport is given. The table no.56 gives information on length of railway route in the district. There are three gauges viz. Broad, meter and narrow gauge in this district.

Rail length in this district has been calculated by referring to Railway time table and the district map showing rail routes therein. In table no.57, figures of road length as at the end of the reference year is shown. Roads maintained by municipal authorities are given separately. The table no.58 presents data about motor vehicles in the Kolhapur Region. The data is presented for Satara, Kolhapur and Sangli districts together as separate figures for Sangli district are not available. The table no.59 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. A separate S.T. division opened at the fag end of the year 1969-70 is functioning for this district as full fledged division. The Divisional Controller, Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, Sangli division, Sangli has supplied the information for Sangli district. In table no.60 the data of traffic census is given. The table no.61 gives information about post offices, telephones, and radio licences etc. The table no.62 gives statistics on rural broadcasting in this district.

10. LOCAL BODIES :

2.27 Statistics regarding village panchayats, municipalities and Zilla Parishad are shown in this section. The table no.63 presents material on income and expenditure of village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. It is a summary table of table nos. 64,65 A,B,C and 66. In table no.64 the break up of the information on income and expenditure of Village Panchayats is given. This break-up is in two way. On the one hand the information for V.P. under each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand, total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads such as income from taxes, fees, donations, contributions and expenditure on administration, public works, sanitation etc.

The table no.65(A) and 65(C) give particulars of income and expenditure of Sangli Zilla Parishad. The receipts are sub-divided into self raised resources, Govt. grants and debt section. Table no.65(B) shows purposewise details of grant. The expenditure is likewise divided into many sub-heads of development. The table no.66 gives information on income and expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of Municipalities. Under income, information is seperately shown under grants, taxes and other income. Under expenditure, further break up into general administration, public safety, public works etc. is shown.

11. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

2.28 Statistics regarding expenditure and achievement under 4th Plan and Annual Plan 1974-75, Community Development Programme etc. are given. The table no.67 gives plan expenditure under different development sub-heads in Sangli district. In table no. 68 the details regarding important physical achievements during 4th plan and 1974-75 are shown.

2.29 The table no.69 shown the position of Community Development Programme in the district. The information regarding no. of blocks of community Project Administration pattern in each stage, the population covered etc. is given. Each C.P.A. pattern Block covers an area having 80,000 population. The table no.70 gives information about the expenditure incurred according to stages for the period upto 31-3-1975 and also for the year 1974-75. The table no.71 gives information on important physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks in Sangli Dist.

12. PRICES :

2.30 The table no.72 gives monthly average of wholesale prices of Agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.31 The table no.73 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at Sangli Headquarter during 1974. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district headquarter, the average shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table no.74 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Poona centres for the year 1974-75. For the calculation of Index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as base years, for Sholapur and Poona centres respectively.

14. MISCELLANEOUS :

2.32 In this section, statistics regarding miscellaneous subjects like police, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, small saving, cinema theatres, land revenue collection exclusive of local fund cess, printing presses, news papers, and periodicals, is presented.

2.33 Moreover, important indicators in the fields of development such as agriculture, livestock, industry, education, health etc. are indicated for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1973-74 and 1974-75. These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

CHAPTER - III

An Analytical Review of Sectorial Trends

1973-74

3.1 An analytical review of the facts and figures regarding various socio economic features of the Sangli district, which occurred as a result of the developmental activities can be visualised more accurately from the progress made in the fields of agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electricity consumption, extent of credit and banking facilities etc. The nature of progress achieved in these fields is considered for this purpose.

Agriculture:

3.2 Agricultural backwardness is one of the prominent features of our Agro-Economy even today. The State of Maharashtra and the district of Sangli are no exception to this. In fact, in this area it is more pronounced. Hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scarcity and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, inadequate irrigational facilities, poor use of chemical fertilisers, all these have marred the productivity of the soil.

3.3 The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on important aspects of agriculture in Sangli district.

Percentage gross sown area.

3.4 The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown i.e. the extent of double cropping can be assessed from the table given below :

3.5 From the above figures it will be seen that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown for the district as a whole was constant during the years 1965-66 and 1971-72 but the same was found to be decreased in 1972-73. In 1973-74, the same was constant at 1972-73 level.

3.6 Within the district, decrease was observed in Atpadi, Walwa, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils; in the year 1973-74 as compared to the previous year. In Kavathe Mahankal tahsil there was increase in percentage of double cropped area. Khanapur and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils have better percentage of double cropped area in the district in 1973-74.

Productivity of important crops:

3.7 The principal crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra, Rice, Wheat, gram, tur, groundnut and Sugarcane. The following table furnishes the information about yields per hectare.

3.8 From the above table it is seen that yield rates in 1965-66 in general decreased as compared to 1960-61, due to scarcity conditions in Sangli district. There was some improvement in the later years and the yield rates of 1971-72 were in fact higher than those for 1965-66 in respect of crops Bajra, rice, gram, tur, groundnut. The yield rate of sugarcane during the year 1971-72 however, was still below its level in 1960-61 and 1965-66 and it further declined in 1972-73. During the year 1972-73, the yield rates of Jowar, Rice, Gram and groundnut were found to be decreased too much due to severe scarcity conditions, scanty and untimely rains.

As compared to 1972-73, the yield rates of 1973-74 have shown a positive upward trend and the rates for Bajra, Rice, Tur, groundnut were higher than those in previous years. However the yield rate of Jowar, Wheat, sugarcane tobacco etc. were still below the 1960-61 level.

Irrigation:

3.9 The percentage of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated in Sangli district was only 113 in 1960-61. In 1971-72, it rose to 118. In 1972-73 however, there was sudden fall to 110 due to scarcity conditions. The position in the tahsils also show ups and downs in the double irrigated area over these years. The tahsilwise position is given below:

The above table shows that in 1973-74, the double irrigated area recorded a rise of 2 percent over the 1972-73 figure. The significant achievement was in Khanapur, Miraj, Tasgaon and Atpadi tahsils. However there was sudden down fall in percentage of double irrigated area in Shirala tahsils. From the level of 120 percent in 1972-73 to 100 percent 1973-74.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area which was 113 percent in 1960-61 is still not achieved in 1973-74 which was still at 112 percent.

3.10 The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area can be seen from the table given below.

3.11 The percentage increased in the year 1973-74 as compared to the year 1972-73 in Khanapur, Shirala, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils only. In the remaining tahsils the same was found to have been decreased. As a result, the percentage for the district as a whole, also decreased.

3.12 The percentage of net irrigated to net cropped area was highest in Walwa tahsil during 1973-74, Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils occupied second and third position. Khanapur stood last in the rank.

Changes in the cropping pattern.

3.13 The table given below depicts the picture of share of different crops in gross cropped area and thereby throws light on changes in the cropping pattern.

3.14 There was a basic change in the cropping pattern in the year 1971-72. From 1960-61 to 1970-71, the percentage of area under ^{non} food crops was increasing at the expense of percentage of area under food crops. This trend was reversed in 1971-72 and was continued in subsequent years also. The percentage of area under Bajra wheat and pulses and cotton etc. increased while that under rice, jowar, sugarcane and groundnut decreased during 1973-74 as compared to the previous year.

Agricultural credit and outstanding dues -

3.15 Agricultural credit is the vital need of our agro-economy. The figures presented below show the extent of agricultural credit facilities made available by agricultural cooperative credit societies in the year 1960-61, 1965-66, 1973-74 and 1974-75.

3.15 It is apparent from the above table that the loans advanced to primary agricultural cooperative credit societies increased by 148 percent during 1965-66, by 477 percent during 1973-74 and by 519 percent during 1974-75 as compared to 1960-61. The figures of loan per member for 4 years under consideration were Rs. 139, Rs. 312, Rs. 565 and Rs. 539 respectively. The position of loans outstanding and the loans overdue in the year 1973-74 was the result of the scarcity conditions prevailing in the district for the last three years. These amounts are found to have increased further during 1974-75.

Agricultural Wage rates-

3.17 Agricultural wage rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. From each district, three rural centres were selected and from these selected rural centres data on agricultural wage rates were collected. In Sangli district the selected centres were 1) Mhaisal in Miraj tahsil 2) Jat in Jat tahsil and 3) Atpadi in Atpadi tahsil. During the year ¹⁹⁷⁴ the wage rates for males (field labour) ranged between Rs.2.50 to Rs.3.50 and that for female labourers between Rs.1.00 to Rs.2.50. The wages of carpenter, blacksmith and Mochi varied between Rs.3.80 to Rs.7.00.

Livestock.

3.18 Animal husbandry in India, from the view point of its substantial contribution in providing income and drought power to farmers and subsidiary food to human population, assumes great importance in the rural economy, even today. The eleventh quinquennial livestock census was conducted in 1972 throughout India to gauge the magnitude of this wealth.

3.19 The no. of livestock per 100 hectare of cultivable area was 128 in 1961 and 117 in 1968 in Sangli district. However, it again increased to 128 in 1972. The number of bullocks used for working decreased in 1972 as compared to 1966. Gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks was 9.03 hectares in 1961 and 9.30 hectares in 1966 which rose to 9.46 hectares in 1972.

3.20 Within the district, the tahsil of Walwa has the largest No. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The tahsils of Atpadi, Shirala and Tasgaon also have the livestock more than the district average. The Jat tahsil has the lowest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land.

Poultry-

3.21 During the years 1961, 1966 and 1972 a gradual increase in no. of poultry was observed in this district. In 1961, it was 4.98 lakhs. The same increased to 6.25 lakhs in 1966 and to 6.47 lakhs in 1972. In the year 1961 the number of poultry per thousand population was 405. The same increased to 420 in 1972. This means that increase in poultry population was faster than the increase in human population.

Consumption of Electricity -

3.22 The per capita consumption of electricity in Sangli district was 15.32 kwh in 1961-62 which rose to 36.53 kwh in 1965-66. The figures for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 and 1973-74 were 63.05 kwh and 60.55 kw. and 77.55^{kwh} respectively. During the year 1974-75, the per capita consumption, increased to 94.69 kwh. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1974-75 was increased to 6 times as compared to figures in 1961-62.

Enrolment in employment exchange and vacancies notified-

3.23 Employment generation is one of the most important aims of planning in a very overpopulated country like India. Employment - Exchange statistics give an indication of the magnitude of the unemployment problem though to a very limited extent, because the majority of unemployed persons do not avail of the facilities provided by the employment exchange.

3.24 The position of Sangli district regarding registration and vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the table given below.

3.25 It is seen from the table no.7 that there was a substantial decrease in the registration and vacancies notified for the year 1974-75. However, employment provided by private sector, but not through the employment exchange is much more significant and hence it will not be correct to draw final conclusions regarding the unemployment problem on the basis of employment exchange statistics alone. But the figures no doubt help to indicate the severity of the unemployment problem in the district.

Increase in outdoor and indoor patients -

3.26 The comparative position can be seen from the table given below-

3.27 As compared to 1965, the increase in no. of patients in 1972 was 55 percent. The no. of outdoor patients treated was high ^{in 1972} because the medical officers visited different scarcity hit areas and treated patients. This was not the position during 1973 and 1974. There were 77 doctors in 1974, who were working in public and public aided bodies. The no. of doctors per lakh of population in 1973 and 1974 works to 4.61 and 5.00 respectively. The no. of nurses per lakh of population recorded an increase because total no. of nurses increased from 145 to 154. The position given above is not quite representative as the statistics regarding doctors and nurses in private sector are not considered here.

Increase in no. of students of different categories-

3.28 Education is the backbone of socio-economic development. The percentage of pupils taking education in Primary, Secondary and Higher institutions has increased during 1973-74. The following table shows the percentage increase or decrease in no. of students in respect of different types of education.

3.29 The increase in no. of boys and girls students was notable in respect of secondary schools. As regards no. of students per teacher the position in respect of primary education was improved in 1973-74 significantly.

Increase in road length per 100 sq. km.

3.30 Roads constitute one of the important items in the infrastructure of a country's economy. The extent of road facilities available can be judged by working out road length per 100 sq. km.

3.31 In Sangli district, the road length per 100 sq. km. was 26.04 km. in 1960-61 which increased to 77.53 km. in 1974-75. The same was 46.87 in 1972-73. The sizable increase was possible due to roads constructed during the scarcity period.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population-

3.32 In 1961, there were 34 banking offices of different types in Sangli district. The same rose to 138 as on 31st March 1974. In 1961, there were 3 bank offices per lakh of population. As at the end of 31st March 1974, the same increased to 9 offices.

Prices

3.33 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at district headquarter in the Maharashtra State, was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. From the collected data, the trend of the prices of important commodities during 1974 can be ascertained.

3.34 The prices in respect of items like cereals and pulses under food, sugar, gur, edible oil and vanspati, condiments and spices; vegetables; clothing; charcoal; match box; firewood etc. under fuel; tea and coffee under beverages; and washing soap, pan, supari, tobacco, cigarettes, hair oil etc. under miscellaneous articles; have shown rising trend since 1962.

3.35 The General Index Number of Sholapur and Poona centres for 1974-75 were 325 and 281 respectively.

CHAPTER NO. IV.

ANNUAL PLAN

1974-75

INTRODUCTION :

4.1 The year 1974-75 was the first year of Fifth year Plan. From this year onwards the basic concept of Planning has undergone important fundamental changes. The past experience in the field of planning revealed that the approach of directing development in the states on the lines of state priorities decided by centre, has not only distorted the state priorities but it was implemented everywhere without due regard to the variety of conditions existing within the states.

4.2 From the point of view of (1) levelling the wide disparities between different regions (2) making fuller utilization of already available natural resources, infrastructural facilities and productive capacities and (3) avoiding inefficient utilization of physical and financial resources, the concept of district planning provides with a new approach towards planned development. It paved the way, in reality, for peoples participation in formulation of their own plan --

which is one of the prerequisites for successful and realistic planning.

4.3 Accordingly the Government appointed a District Planning Board and District Planning Consultative Committee which subsequently were amalgamated into one body viz. - District Planning and Development Council. The Government indicated the share of funds to be allotted to each district for a period of 5 years. These amounts were worked out on certain definite principles.

4.4 The share of Sangli district for 5 years was Rs.33.21 crores. The draft 5th Five Year Plan and the Annual Plan 1974-75 were prepared by the District Planning Board. The Annual Plan for 1974-75 was approved by Government with some modifications.

4.5 The performance in various fields during this year following is reviewed in paras. For this purpose a Table giving the details of budget allocations and expenditure during Fourth Plan and during 1974-75 is given on next page.

It can be seen that budget was not fully utilised during both periods. However there was an improvement during the year under review. The percentage of expenditure on social services and other programmes has affected the percentage during 4th plan period as well as during the year 1974-75. The percentage of expenditure on Agril. programmes was also not satisfactory during 1974-75.

STATE PLAN SCHEMES

4.7 The major expenditure during this year was on Agril. development, major irrigation projects, Employment Guarantee scheme and Social services (General education and water supply-schemes.) The following table gives comparative position of expenditure under different heads during 4th plan and the year 1974-75.

4.8 There seems wide disparities in some sectors in pattern of expenditure. The main reason for this is that there are no more divisional level schemes. Owing to this some schemes like the major irrigation projects are now included as district level schemes. Another important feature is that Employment Gurantee Schemes is implemented on a large scale during the year 1974-75. The schemewise review is given below.

I- AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

(a) Agricultural Production :

4.9 Under this head 6 schemes were implemented during the year. Out of these six schemes 3 were staff schemes. Under the scheme of local manuerial resource 23873 tons of town compost was prepared. New plantation was undertaken in 306 hectares and rejuvenation was undertaken in 256 hectares under the scheme of horticultural development. Ten pumps were installed and 10 community wells were completed under the scheme of intergrated area development. The budget provision was however not fully utilized because some budget provision was received very late and some proposals were not sanctioned by higher authorities in time.

(b) MINOR IRRIGATION :

4.10 An expenditure of Rs.46.37 lakh was incurred on 5 schemes as against the budget provision of Rs.47.00 lakh. The remaining amount could not be spent as the subsidy cases in respect of wells and pumpsets were not finalized by land development bank in time. During the year a significant achievement was that 19 minor irrigation tanks were physically completed. The subsidy cases in respect of 269 wells and 293 pump sets were finalised and the amounts were distributed during the year to the tune of Rs.3.20 lakh. Three bandharas and 22 percolation tanks were also completed in local sector.

(c) SOIL CONSERVATION:

4.11 The achievement under the scheme of contour bunding as compared to the target was plausible. Against the target of 3000 hectares, area measuring 12861 hectares was contour bunded. The nala bunding in 304 hectares was also done during this year. These achievements are those excluding under D.P.A.P. New plantation and pre-monsoon work in 70 hectares and 40 hectares respectively was carried out under the scheme of afforestation for soil conservation. The terracing scheme was not implemented as the survey work is yet to be completed.

(d) DROUGHT PRONE AREA PROGRAMME:

4.12 This was the first year of the new approach in respect of Drought Prone areas. 6 water sheds are selected in drought prone areas and intensive efforts to develop these areas will be done. This will serve both as a demonstration as well as a flow for self stimulating development of these areas. However the grants were received very late and as such the staff required for the scheme was not appointed. An expenditure of Rs.25.34 lakh only by way of reappropriation from expenditure under normal plan schemes was incurred during this year. Five irrigation tanks were completed and contour bunding in 951 hectares was done. Nearly Rs.3.50 lakhs were unutilized due to late receipt of grants.

(e) ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

4.13 Only two schemes were implemented. The construction work of Khillar Cattle breeding farm Jat and residential and non residential quarters at Ranjani was in progress. The scheme were not implemented satisfactorily as only Rs.0.32 lakh against the provision of Rs.2.00 lakh were spent.

(f) DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

4.14 The physical achievement under the scheme of Town Milk Supply were commendable. As against the target of 31100 litres of handling of milk, the achievement was 60495 litres. Under the other scheme under this sub head 52 societies were given managerial subsidy amounting to Rs.41000.

(g) FOREST

4.15 In all 4 schemes were implemented during the year and plantation in 125 hectares and premonsoon works in 105 hectares was completed. Under the scheme of wild life preservation, premonsoon and plantation work was done in 14 hectares and the fencing was also completed.

(h) FISHERIES :

4.16 Out of 3 schemes implemented under this sub-head, no expenditure could be incurred under the scheme of loans to fishermen. At the expense of Rs.12000, 299400 fingerlings were supplied. One hundred twenty five kg. of Mylon twin was also supplied to fishermen under the scheme of supply of fishery requisites.

(1) WARE HOUSING AND MARKETING :

4.17 Four A.P.M.C. were assisted with subsidy during the year under review.

II. COOPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

(a) CO-OPERATION :

4.18 Only 5 schemes were implemented during the year. 45 societies and 1 bank were given subsidy for creating ^{had} debt reserves. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs.26000. One marketing society and 1 farming society federation was also assisted during this year. One urban coop. consumer stores was assisted with Rs.1.54 lakh.

(b) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

4.19 Rs.3.50 lakh were spent and 49 schools rooms were constructed under the scheme of C.D. project. Roads measuring 10 km, 8 C.D. works, 11 panchayat ghars etc. are other important achievements of this scheme. 200 latrines were also supplied under the scheme of Gram safai programme.

III. IRRIGATION AND POWER PROJECT :

(a) Irrigation projects :

4.20 The major and medium projects were classified as district level plan schemes for the first time. The total expenditure on 2 major projects and 2 medium projects was Rs.77.46 lakhs. The expenditure on Warna project was less as the final decision about site was not taken.

(b) Power projects :

4.21 As against the budget provision of Rs.16.00 lakh, an expenditure of Rs.30.34 lakhs was incurred on 2 schemes namely normal development and rural electrification. Under both the schemes taken together 2 villages were electrified and 1270 Agrl. pumps were energised during this year.

IV. INDUSTRY AND MINING :

4.22 Under the scheme of package incentives, incentives worth Rs.10.75 lakh were given to eligible entrepreneurs on the basis of actual performance. The scheme is implemented with a view to diversify these industries to industrially backward areas and the incentives are in the form of refund of sales tax, refund of octroi, subsidy in electricity consumption etc. The spinning mill at Vita was given Rs.5.24 lakhs as matching share contribution.

4.23 287 small scale units were given subsidy on consumption of electricity under the scheme of subsidy and the expenditure was Rs.3.36 lakhs. The assistance to industrial estates amounted to Rs.2.76 lakhs. In all 33 societies, were assisted ⁱⁿ in different ways under 3 different schemes in coop. sector. An exhibition was also held to promote the sales of handicraft goods. The expenditure under this major head was more than the budget provision.

V. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNITATION :

4.24 From the view point of financial as well as physical achievement the performance under this head of development was good. Out of Rs.17.67 lakhs, Rs.17.55 lakh were spent. Roads measuring 12.60 km. were newly constructed and 10.40 km roads were improved. 2 bridges and 3 C.D. work were also constructed during this year.

VI. SOCIAL SERVICES :

(a) General Education -

4.25 In all 21 schemes were implemented in local and state sectors. Under the new programme of attaching standares V to VII to secondary schools 119 divisions were transferred to secondary schools. The expenditure was Rs.6.01 lakhs. The Sangli municipal

Council was given grant in aid amounting to Rs.96000. Due to adoption of new pattern of education, subjectwise summer institute courses were arranged and 126 teachers were trained. Under the scheme of Free education to Sons and Daughters of primary teachers and E B C concessions 705 students and 11518 students were benefited. The equipment worth Rs.9000 was supplied to 31 balwadies. The construction of 19 class rooms was in progress and an amount of Rs.0.76 lakhs was spent for this purpose during this year.

(b) Technical Education -

4.26 Rs.1.35 lakh were paid as grant in aid to Walchand College of Engineering.

(c) Health :

4.27 The budget provision under this subhead was fully utilised. Rs.43000 were spent on construction and medicines worth Rs.35000 - were purchased during the year.

(d) Nutrition Programme :

4.28 Only Rs.0.23 lakh out of budget provision of Rs.0.47 lakh were spent in the year 1974-75.

(e) Water Supply and Drainage:

4.29 The Drainage scheme of Sangli municipal council and water supply schemes of 4 municipal councils (except Islampur and Miraj) were in progress during the year however the expenditure was not substantive. Under the scheme of rural piped water supply Rs.20.43 lakh were spent on 38 schemes out of which 3 were completed during

the year. Since the provision was meagre only 19 bore wells were dug by G.S.D.A. during this year. The target was 150 bores. Under simple measures 70 bore wells and 57 wells were constructed during the year.

(f) Housing :

4.30 One village was covered under the scheme of extension of village gaathan. Under the programme of construction of huts for landless labourers, 1000 huts were constructed by May 1975. Rs.25000 were spent for providing tiles for roofs.

(g) Welfare of Backward Class :

4.31 3 schemes which were classified as district level schemes now, have recorded good achievement. One hundred twenty trainees pertaining to B.C. were given stipend amounting to Rs.25000. Sixty seven tenements were newly constructed and 530 students were given scholarships during this year. An amount of Rs.0.62 lakh was distributed to 234 persons as subsidy cum loan for developing cottage industries. Four societies were given assistance for construction of 24 houses under the scheme of financial assistance to individual and group housing.

(h) Labour and labour welfare :

4.32 The deficiency in equipment in I.T.I. Sangli was made good by purchasing equipment worth Rs.13000. Since accommodation for housing dispensary at Madhavnagar was not available,

the amount earmarked for this purpose could not be spent.

VII- OTHER PROGRAMMES :

4.33 Only 2 schemes were implemented during the year. 23 Radio sets were installed during the year. The important scheme implemented under this subhead was Employment Gurantee scheme. As against the budget provision of Rs.67.00 lakhs only Rs.55.91 lakh were spent during the year. Nine percollation tanks and 46 village tanks were constructed under this scheme under Employment Gurantee Scheme.

CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES :

4.34 Besides the state plan schemes, there were some centrally sponsored scheme implemented under heads Agrl. programme, social services other programmes etc. The percentage of expdr. on these schemes to their budget provision was lower as compared to state plan scheme.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

a) Agrl. production-

4.35 Out of 6 schemes implemented during this year 4 schemes were staff schemes. Under the other schemes 1201 farmers were trained in programme of "high yielding varieties of crops" in 24 camps.

SOCIAL SERVICES :

Health -

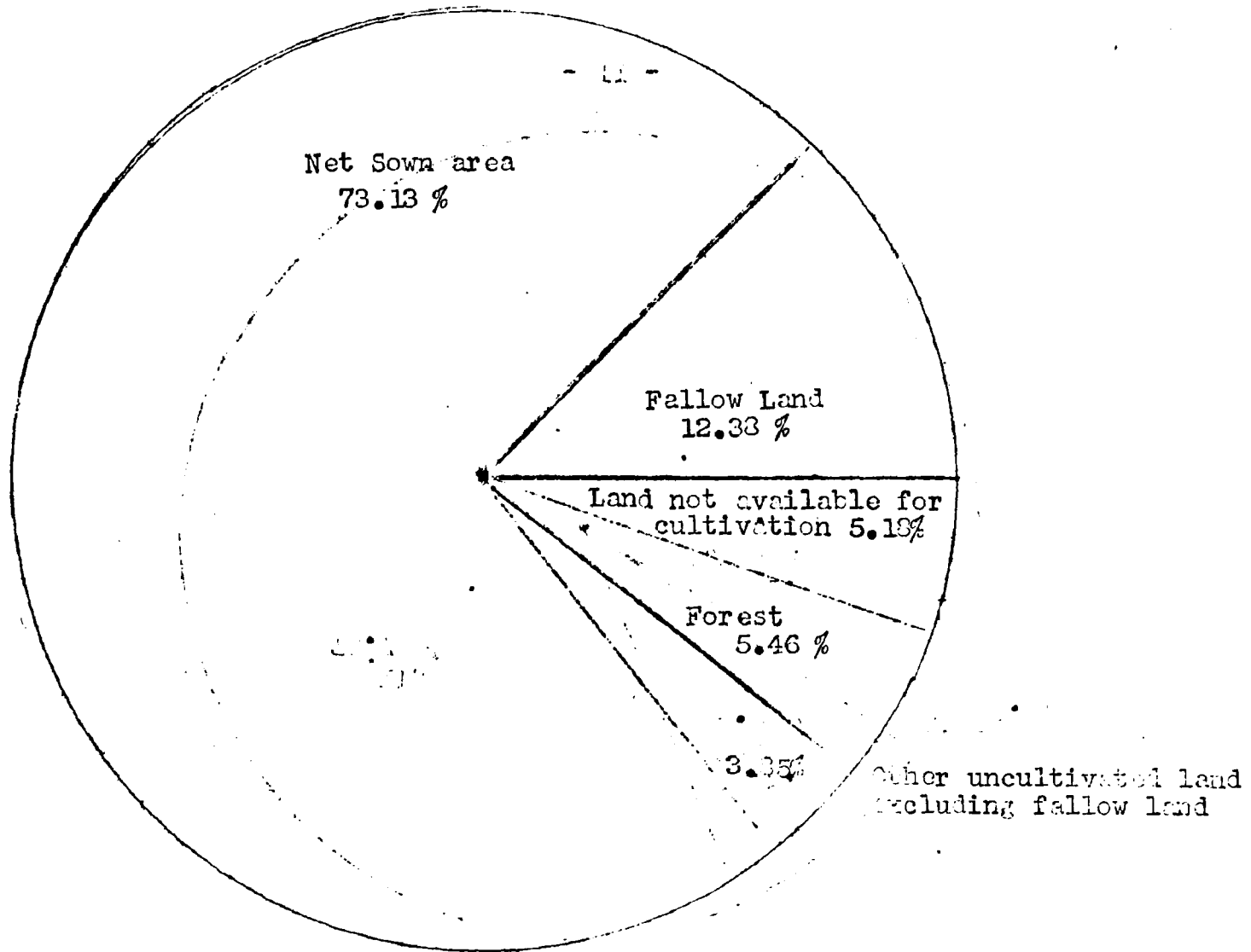
4.36 Under the scheme of National Malaria Eradication, 67998 blood smeers were collected and examined. 11527 sterilization operations were performed during this year, 53 loops were also inserted. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs.11.65 lakh.

OTHER PROGRAMMES

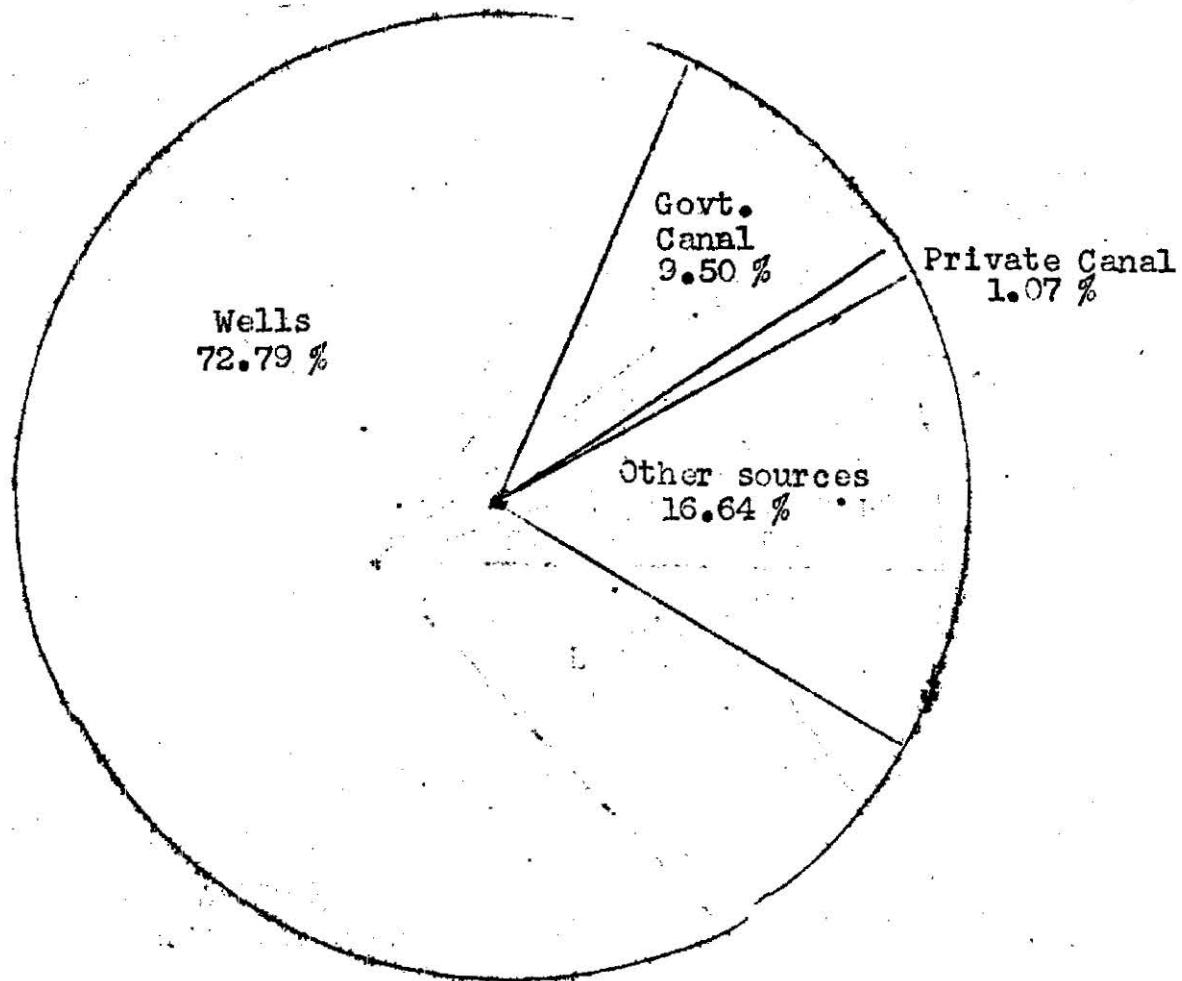
Out of 3 schemes implomented during the year 2 schemes were staff schemes and under the scheme of production of pulses crops Rs.31000 wore spent for demonstrations.

GRAPH NO.1 - LAND UTILIZATION IN SINGLI DISTRICT - 1971-72.

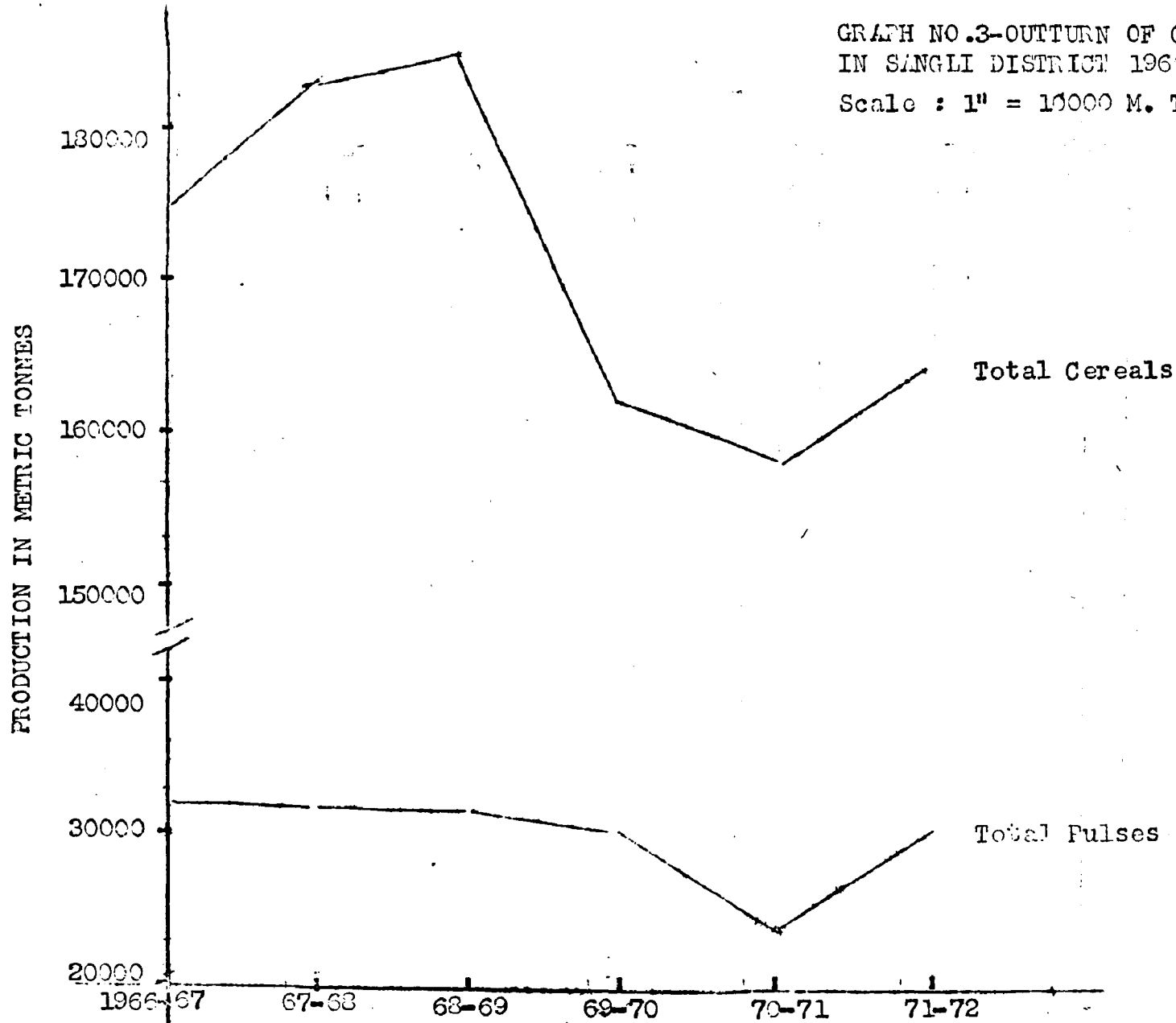


GRAPH NO. 2- SOURCEWISE IRRIGATION IN SANGLI DISTRICT 1971-72.

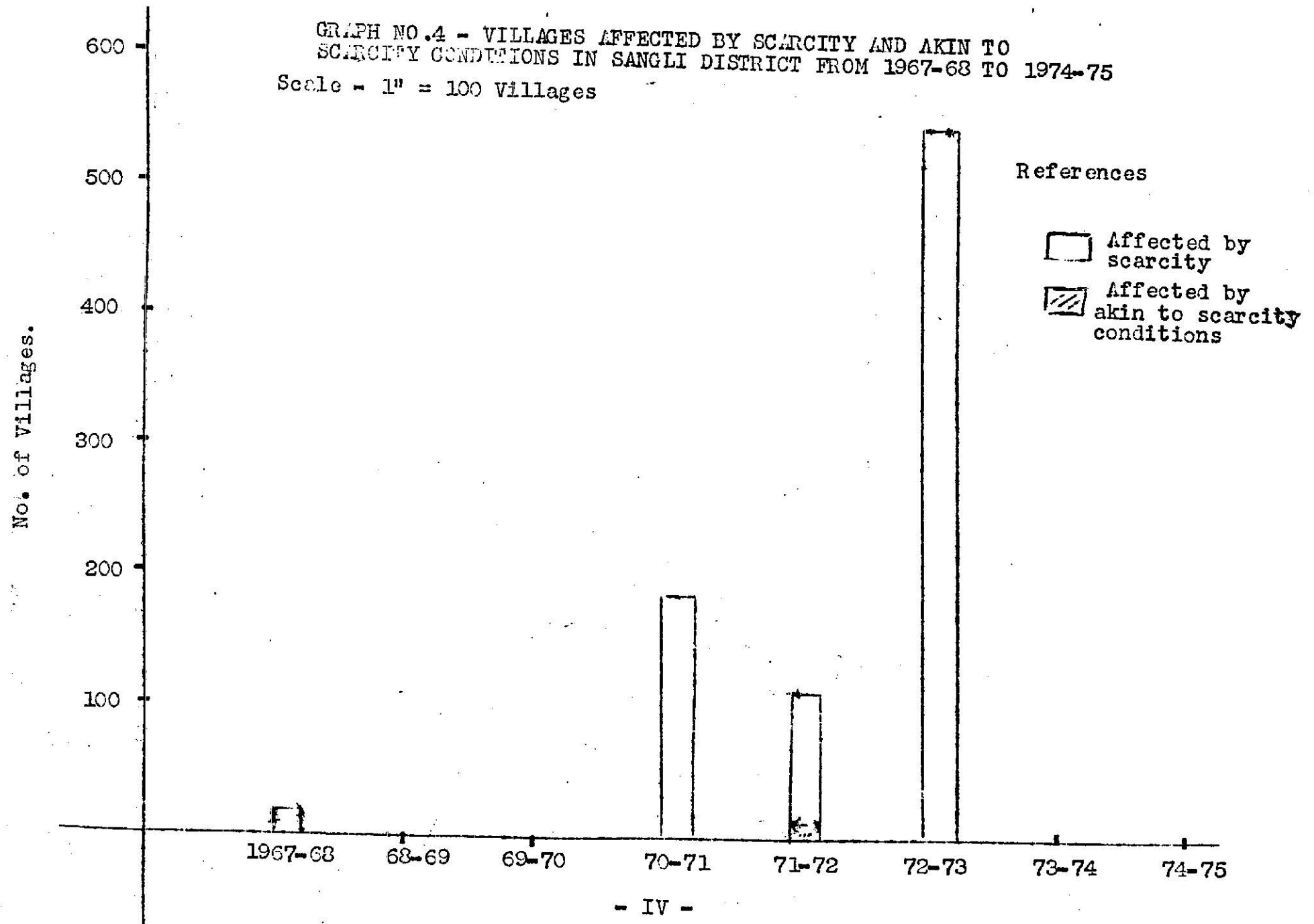


GRAPH NO.3-OUTTURN OF CEREALS AND PULSES
IN SANGLI DISTRICT 1966-67 TO 1971-72.

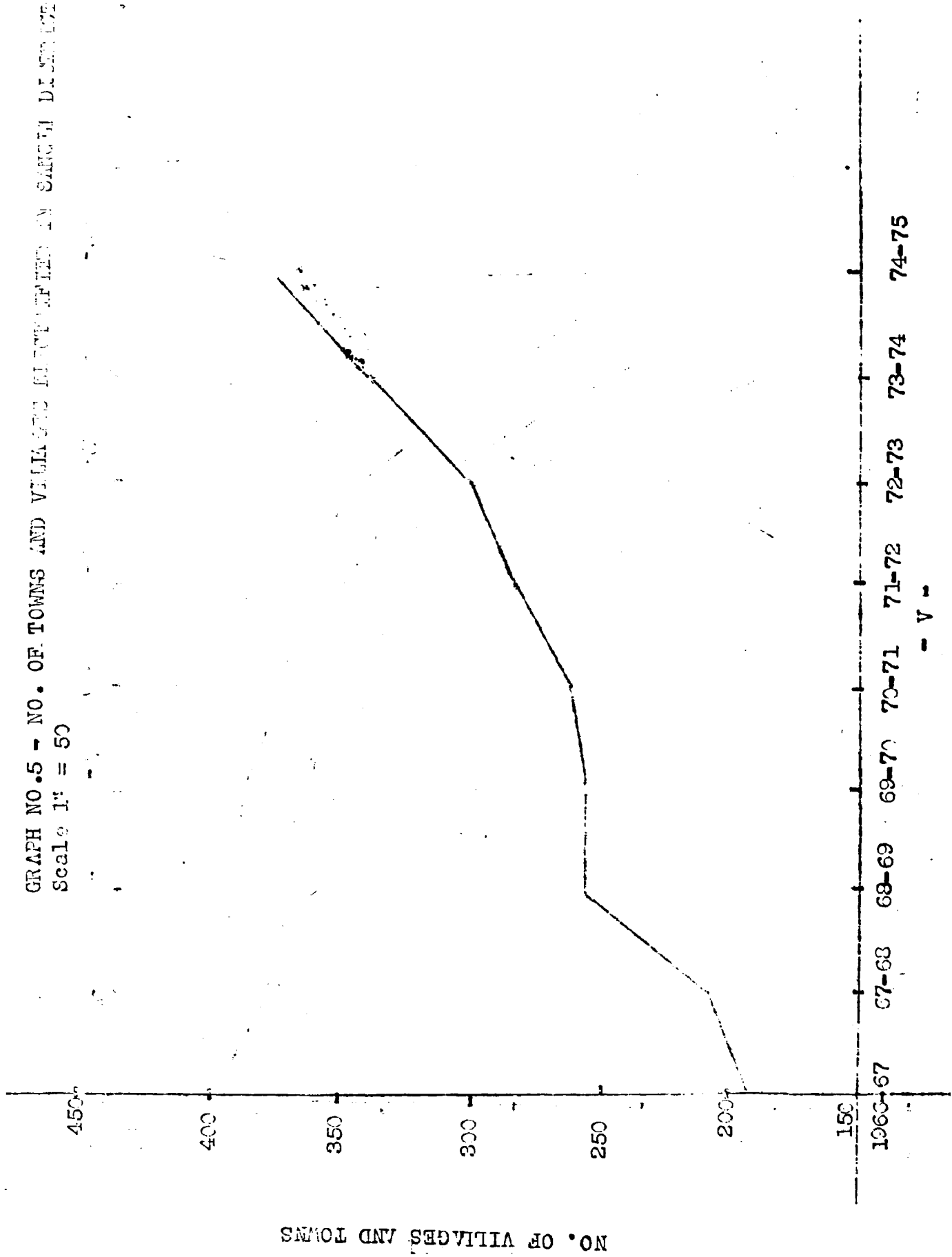

 Scale 1" = 50

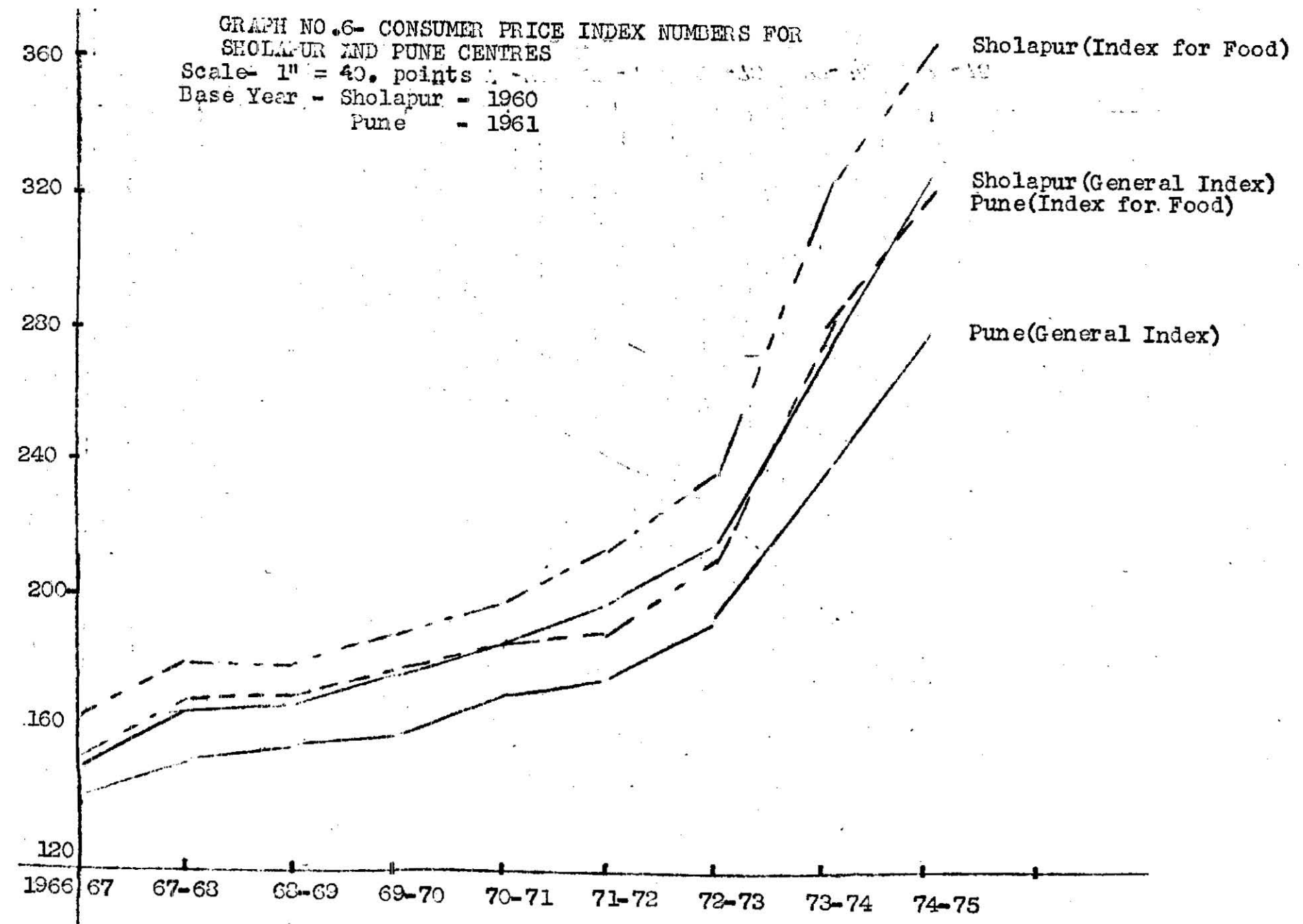

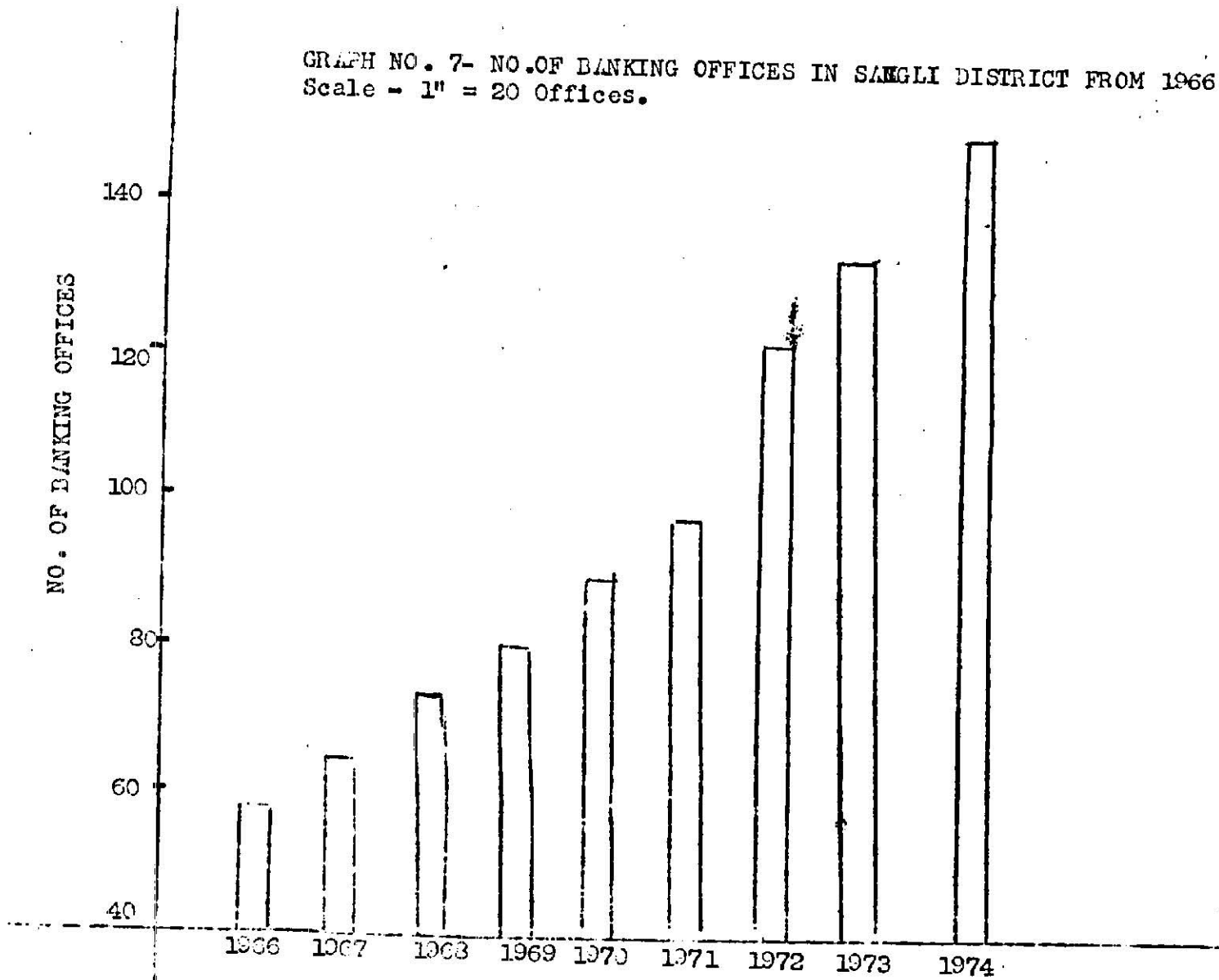
