

CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

1.1. Location

Yavatmal district is one of the eight districts of Nagpur Division lying between 19° 26' and 20° 42' North latitude and 77° 18' and 79° 9' East longitude. Most of the district belongs to the Balaghat i.e. southern plateau of Berar.

1.2 Boundaries

It is surrounded by Amaravati district in the North, Akola and Parbhani districts in the west, Nanded and Adilabad (Andhra Pradesh) districts in the south, Chandrapur and Wardha districts in the East. The district is quite extensive in size, ranking second in Nagpur Division while 8th in the State.

The district has natural boundary in the East and South. The Wardha river separates the district from Wardha and Chandrapur districts in the East, while in the south Painganga river separates it from Nanded district and Adilabad district of Andhra Pradesh.

1.3 Local Bodies, Panchayat Samitis and Zilla Parishad

The Zilla Parishad and fourteen panchayat Samitis have been formed in the district on 1st May, 1962. The Zilla Parishad is responsible for the development of the entire area in the district excluding municipal areas. The Panchayat Samiti covers the area of community development blocks. There are eight municipal councils to look after the

development of urban areas. There are 49 directly elected councillors in the Zilla Parishad. Out of these two seats are reserved for scheduled Castes and seven seats for Scheduled Tribes. In addition, there are five associated members, who are the presidents of the five different Co-operative societies. An elected chairman of each panchayat sa-iti is also ex-officio Councillor of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad is headed by president assisted by vice-president, both of them are elected from the elected councillors. The Chief Executive Officer looks after the administration of the Zilla Parishad. For the administrative purpose, there are various departments of the Zilla Parishad carrying out different functions. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer works as Secretary to Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad functions through a standing committee, presided over by the president and six sub-subject committees viz. Finance, Works, Agriculture and Co-operation, Education, Health and Social Welfare.

The Panchayat Sa-iti consists of elected and co-opted councillors from the area of the Panchayat Sa-iti. The Panchayat Sa-iti has elected chairman and Vice-chairman. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to Panchayat Sa-iti.

There are 1,119 village panchayats in the district. There is a Sarpanch for village panchayat who is elected from the elected members from the village or group of villages in that village panchayat. The Sarpanch and in his absence Up-Sarpanch looks after the development activities at village level.

1.4 Area and Territorial changes -

The area of the district is 13,925 sq.k.m.s. which forms 14.28% of the area of the Nagpur Division and 4.53% of the area of the State. Its maximum length from East to West is 192 k.m.s. Whereas its maximum breadth from North to South is 160 k.m.s. Out of the total area, about 94.34% (13,833.2 sq.k.m.s.) area belongs to rural part of the district.

Yavatmal district is among the four districts of the Old Berar, handed over by the Nizam to the Govt. of India in 1853 A.D. It was a part of East Berar District upto 1863 A.D. A new Wun (Wani) district was formed by separating Yavatmal, Kelapur, Wani, Darwha talukas from East Berar district in 1st 1864 A.D. Pusad taluka of Basi district was transferred to this Wun district in 1905 and Yavatmal district was newly constituted in that year. There were no major changes in the constituents of the district till 1955, when the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh State to the then bilingual Bombay State w.e.f. 30-11-1956 due to State Reorganisation. At present, it is a part of Nagpur Division of the Maharashtra State since 1st May 1960.

1.5 Topography

The district has an undulating topography. The whole district is covered by the Ajantha ranges broken by broad river valleys and partially surrounded by plains. The central portion of the district is a plateau with steep ghats with an elevation of 300 to 500 metres (1000' to 1500') above mean sea level. Both Painganga and Wardha rivers with their tributaries, provide strips of plains in many parts along their

course. The width of these plains varies from 5 to 15 k.m.s.

1.6 Hills, River System, Soil etc.

The whole district is covered by small east-west ranges of the Ajantha mountains. The offshoots of the Ajantha ranges are, at places, broken by the broad valleys of the tributaries of Painganga and Wardha rivers.

Wardha and Painganga are the main rivers in the district, both of which flow along North-Eastern and Southern boundaries of the district respectively. They have numerous tributaries traversing in the middle of the district. The bed of the Wardha river is broad and deep, still the banks suffer from floods many a times. Wardha has two tributaries viz. Beemla and Nirguda. Nirguda has its entire course in Wanitahsil, while the Beemla flows across the north of Yavatmal tahsil below the ghats. The other river Painganga has six important tributaries viz. Pus, Arunavati, Adan, Waghadi, Khuni and Vidarbha. Pus flows through Pusad tahsil, Arunavati and Adan through Darwha tahsil and Vidarbha flows through Wanitahsil. All the rivers with their tributaries maintain their flow for a greater part of the year and assist drainage system of the soil.

The soils in the district as a whole are uniformly good in texture, but vary in colour from black to dark brown. They are, however, slightly inferior in fertility to those in Akola and Amaravati districts. The soils of the district mainly suffer from the mixture of pieces of Chunkhadi (Limestone), sloping surfaces and excessive admixture of sand. However, the soil varies from very fertile alluvial tracts in the valleys to hills and hard parts on the plateaus.

In Wani taluka the soil is uniform but coarse in texture and of a reddish colour. In Kelapur tahsil and central and southern parts of Yavatmal tahsil and hilly parts of Pusad tahsil, the soils are coarse gravelly or loose friable texture and of a colour varying from light brown to grey. The rich fertile alluvial soils are found in western parts of Yavatmal tahsil and in middle of Darwaha and Pusad tahsils.

The district can be divided into three natural zones, viz. 1) the Beembra Wardha basin in the North 2) the plateau portion at the central and in the southwest part of the district and 3) the plain fertile lands of the Pus Painganga basin in the south.

1.7 Minerals

Limestones and coal are the only important minerals found in the district. The limestone in cement grade variety is found near Chanakha in Kelapur tahsil. The estimated reserves are about 39 million tonnes. There is only one coal field near Pisgaon in Wani tahsil, extending over 31.08 sq.kms. As regards coal, the reserves are estimated at 240 million tonnes and there is one colliery at Rajur exploiting coal.

1.8 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall

The climate of the district is in general hot and dry. The temperature ranges from 7°C to 34°C . in Winter and 18°.4 C to 44°.4 C in summer during 1975.

The south west monsoon brings rains to the district. The rainy season lasts from June to October. The intensity of rainfall is highest in the month of August. The normal rainfall varies from 910 mm (31.5 inches) to 1260 mm (49.5 inches).

In the past few years the monsoon is very irregular and it is also not uniform in the district. Darwha tahsil gets lowest rains on an average of about 889 mms. (35 inches) while Wani tahsil gets maximum rains about 1125 mms. (45 inches). The central region covering Yavatmal tahsil gets on an average nearly 1099 mms (42 inches) of rains).

In the year 1975 Wani tahsil got about 1275.3 mms. of rains while Yavatmal tahsil got about 1252 mms. of rains.

In the remaining talukas rainfall varied from 916.9 to 1136.2 mms. during this year.

1.9 Demography

The total population of the district is 14,23,677 as per 1971 census. The percentage of increase in the population of the district works out to 29.61% in the last decade. The density of the population increased from 79 persons per sq.km. (210 per sq.mile) in 1961 to 102 persons per sq.km. (272 persons per sq.mile) in 1971. Similarly the literacy percentage also increased from 23.48% to 31.56% during the decade. The progress made in the literacy is outstanding in context to the large tribal population and a small (13.65% of the total population) proportion of urban population. As regards working force in the district it is seen that there were 43.32% workers enumerated in the total population of the district at 1971 census. Out of the total working population in the district 26.50% are engaged as cultivators, 57.52% as agricultural labourers and 15.98% in different services. The remaining 56.68% population of the district was non-workers including dependents.

1.10 Special features - Latest and important Development in the district.

Yavat-al is one of the industrially backward districts of Vidarbha Region which itself is an industrially under-developed region of the Maharashtra State. There is a large number of large sized industries which are almost entirely based on cotton and oil seeds in this district. The cottage and traditional village industries like smithy, carpentry, pottery, weaving, oil crushing, basketry, shoe-making, rope-making, bricks and tiles making are still existing. There are number of small scale industries like ginning and pressing, oil mills, saw mills, lime factories established mostly at taluka headquarters.

Major type of industries are agriculture based like oil and dal mills, cotton ginning and pressing and food processing constituting nearly 30% of the total units. The forest based industries like saw mills are seen mostly concentrated in Yavatmal, Darwha and Wani talukas and account for 20% of the total units. The lime manufacturing units are almost entirely concentrated in Wani taluka as it abounds in lime stone deposits. The building material units especially the brick kilns are also significant in Wani and Yavatmal talukas. The engineering-fabrication and structural industry mainly in the form of workshops including welding and other repairing units constitutes single largest group. These units seem to be located in semi urban areas of Yavat-al, Darwha and Pusad talukas. The oil mills and cotton processing units provide business to these workshops. The food processing and beverage units mostly include

manufacturing of Soda water, bakery and one cattle feed manufacturing unit. Nearly 40% of the total units are located at Yavatmal proper.

There was not a single large industry in this district till the end of the year 1969. Three large scale industries in cooperative sector have come up later. These are -

1. Yavatmal Zilla Sahakari Soot and Kapad Girni Maryadit, Pusad.
2. Vasant Sahakari Shetkari Soot and Kapad Girni Maryadit, Pandharkawada.
3. Vasant Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana, Phophali, Taluka- Pusad.

A fourth unit viz. a cement factory in the large scale sector is proposed to be set up at Chanakha in Wani taluka. Similarly a closed coalmine at Rajur in Wani taluka has been reopened under nationalisation programme of non-cooking coal industry.

The Vasant Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana at Phophali in Pusad taluka is running and created employment opportunities for about 300 workers. The membership of this factory was 5004 with paid up share capital of Rs. 113.84 lakhs in the year 1975-76. 57,675 M. tonnes of sugar was produced in the year 1975-76 in this factory.

Both the textile mills in cooperative sector are working and manufacturing mainly cotton yarn. The Yavatmal Zilla Sahakari Soot and Kapad Girni Pusad and Vasant Sahakari Shetkari Soot and Kapad Girni Pandharkawada had membership of 11,481 and 11,572 with paid up share capital of Rs. 119.12 lakhs and Rs. 119.23 lakhs respectively at the end of the year 1975-76. Cotton yarn costing about Rs. 205 lakhs was sold by these cooperative mills during the year 1975-76.

Twenty Ginning and pressing societies with their gins and presses were functioning in the year 1975-76 providing employment to 985 persons. 35,845 $\frac{1}{2}$ tonnes of raw cotton was ginned by these societies and 57,413 bales were pressed during the year 1975-76.

Very recently one industrial estate, having 26 members has come up near village Kuhara about 5 k.m.s from the district headquarter. This estate will provide opportunities for opening up of new industries in this district.

There were 603034 total workers in this district as per 1971 population census. Out of these workers 12000 workers were engaged in household industries. At the end of the year 1974 there were 89 registered factories having 5221 workers in this district. Out of these 89 factories, 69 factories were working and 20 factories were closed.

The forest area is spread in large patches over all talukas of the district. The total area under forest in the district is 253500 Hectares and accounts for nearly 29% of the geographical area of the district. The teak, ba-boo grass and fire wood are some of the important forest produce. There is a large scope for establishing forest based industries in this district.

There are in all 125 tanks in this district. Out of these 102 tanks are fit for Pisciculture. At the end of the year 1975-76 the number of tanks covered under pisciculture were 74 and the production of fish was 2.70 lakh kgs. Efforts are being made to cover all the tanks under pisciculture. The work of one Major irrigation project viz. Upper

Painganga project has been started during the year 1974-75.

The gross command area of this project is 1,69,078 hectares.

At the end of the year 1975-76 following nine medium irrigation projects were in position.

1. Saikheda project.
2. Nignoor project.
3. Pus project.
4. Takli project.
5. Goki project.
6. Waghadi project.
7. Lower Pus project.
8. Sakhali Nala project.
9. Adan project.

The works of Saikheda, Nignoor and Pus projects have been completed while works of other projects are in progress. The gross command area of these projects is 85,407 hectares.

CHAPTER II

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations
of the statistical data presented in the Part II (District
Statistical Abstract).

I. Purpose

The statistical abstract part of this publication contains exhaustive statistical data on important socio-economic aspects. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that this publication could serve as a reference book for various purposes. Panchayat Samitiwise and tahsilwise information has been furnished wherever possible for inter-panchayat samiti or inter-tahsil comparison. The data presented in this publication pertains to the year 1975-76 and 1974-75. The data for the latest available year have been given, where the data for the year 1975-76 could not be presented. The latest available data of population census 1971 and Live stock census 1972 have been indicated. Almost all data have been collected from the concerned State and Central Government offices, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot notes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance

This table gives information on important items relating to the Socio-economic Development in Yavatmal district and the State under different heads such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, health transport and communication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other relevant statistics at a glance.

III. Contents, scope and limitations

The statistical tables presented in the statistical abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data presented under each group are described here under -

i. Area and population

The data for 1971 census are indicated in all the tables. The reference period for the 1971 census was the sunrise of 1st March, 1971.

Table No.1

This table indicates panchayat samitiwise area, density of population per sq.km., number of villages and towns, number of occupied houses and house-holds and sex-wise rural, urban and total population. The area figures are given in sq. kms. (1 sq.km. = 0.386 sq.miles).

Table No.2

This table presents sex-wise rural, urban and / total population enumerated in 1951, 1961 and 1971 censuses alongwith the decadal percentage variations for the district as well as for each tahsil.

Table No.3

This table gives panchayat samitiwise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges in the district. The term village (i.e. rural areas) used in the table denotes a revenue village having well defined boundaries and a separate set of land records irrespective of the fact whether that defined area has any population or not. Hamlets, wadis, padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages. Similarly the revenue villages, which do not have any residential population are shown as 'un-inhabited villages'

The term village includes forest village comprising mostly of forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each population range is also shown in this table. The total number of inhabited and uninhabited villages are also indicated separately.

Table No.4

This table presents taluka-wise classification of towns in the district according to different population ranges with total population of the towns in each population range.

Table No.5

This table gives the panchayat samiti wise classification of population into workers and non-workers according to standard ^{livelhood} classes. A person is defined as a worker if (a) he has had some regular work for more than an hour for a day in greater part of the working season in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry etc. and (b) in case of regular employment in any trade, a professional service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of enumerators' visit to the household.

Beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty receivers, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income, but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and also persons who had been offered work but not joined the work, have been classified as non-workers.

Table No.6

This table indicates distribution of population according to (a) age group and (b) religion separately

for rural and urban areas and for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

Table No.7

This table presents the panchayat samitiwise data of Scheduled Castes/ Tribes notified and Neo-buddhists for this district in 1971 census.

The notified castes and tribes are as under:

2. Climate

Table No.8

This table indicates monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the five selected centres namely Yavatmal, Pandharkawada, Wani, Pusad and Darwha for the year 1975. The data is collected through revenue agencies. A day is treated as a 'rainy day' if during 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm of rainfall. 'Normal rainfall' is the average rainfall over a period ranging from fifty to eighty years.

Table No.9

This table gives monthwise Maximum and Minimum temperature and also annual temperature as recorded at the two selected centres namely Yavatmal and Pusad for the year 1975. The data are supplied by the Regional Meteorological centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded daily during the month. The annual maximum and minimum temperatures is the simple average of monthly maximum and minimum temperature.

3. Agriculture

Table No.10

This table gives taluka-wise figures of land utilisation for the year 1973-74 and 1974-75. Major groups in

which the area is classified are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, fallow land and area sown. All forest areas classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private, are included under forest. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. The areas occupied by buildings, roads and railways or area under water i.e., rivers and canals and other areas put to uses other than agriculture are included under land put to non-agricultural uses. Barren and unculturable land covers land under mountains, deserts etc. which may be brought under cultivation but at a high cost. Culturable wastes covers all land available for cultivation whether not taken for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, not cultivated during the current and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be fallows or areas covered with shrubs. Permanent pastures and other Grazing land included all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc. 'not included in net area sown' is the land under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc., which is included in cultivable land but not included in orchards. Current fallows comprise cultivable areas which are kept fallow during the current year. Other fallows include all land which are once taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation, for a period of not less

than one year and more than five years. The 'net area sown' consists of area sown under crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped area' represents the sum total of area under all crops.

Table No.11

This table gives taluka-wise area under different major crops for the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No.12

This table indicates outturn and yield rate per hectare of the principal crops in the district during the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No.13

This table furnishes the talukewise data of the area irrigated by different sources of irrigation during the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No.14

This table presents talukewise area irrigated under different crops during the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No.15

This table gives talukewise number of irrigation wells in use and not in use during the year 1973-74 and 1974-75.

Table No.16

This table gives the Panchayat Samitiwise data regarding availability of under ground water during the year 1975-76.

Table No.17

This table furnishes the Panchayat Samitiwise information regarding irrigation works (excluding irrigation wells) for the year 1974-75.

Table No.18

This table describes the major and medium irrigation projects (both completed and not completed) in the district as on 30th June, 1975. The cost of a medium irrigation project is between Rs.20 lakhs to 5 crores, whereas the cost of a major irrigation project is Rs.5 crores and above.

Table No.19

This table deals with the monthly average agricultural wage rates in 1975. This data is collected fortnightly through out the year from the three selected centres in this district namely (1) Ner, (2) Kalamb and (3) Maregaon.

Table No.20

This table presents data regarding Agricultural census operational holding 1970.

Table No.21

This table gives panchayat samitiwise data on agricultural implements as per Livestock census 1972.

Table No.22

The talukewise information regarding famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity for the year 1975-76 is furnished in this table.

Table No.23

This table furnishes the talukewise information regarding determination of precarious and other scarcity during the years 1970-71 to 1975-76.

4. Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries

(A) Animal Husbandry -

Table No.24

This table gives panchayat samitiwise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the

livestock census 1972, which was conducted through out the country on an uniform basis. Precaution was also taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The reference date and time of this livestock census was sunrise of 15th April, 1972. Sex and age-group wise classification of livestock is also given in this table.

Table No. 25, 26 and 27

These tables give panchayat samiti-wise veterinary statistics, disease wise livestock mortality and number of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered respectively, for the year 1975-76.

(B) Forests

Table No. 28(A)

The details of area under different types of forests in the district during the year 1975-76 are given in this table. The data regarding the forests under control of State Government both under Forest Department and Revenue Department are shown separately. The area under forest is classified according to legal status i.e. reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act XVI of 1927. The reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production, where in the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In case of protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. The unclassed forests refer to the inaccessible forests or un-occupied waste. The forest area shown in table No. 28(A) may not tally with the area under forests shown in the table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

(1) In the Indian Forest Statistics returns the whole area, including non-wooden area under the control of forest Department is considered as an area under forests, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

(2) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest area and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural Statistics.

(3) Forest Department returns relate to the financial year while Agricultural Statistics relate to the agricultural year.

Table No. 28 (B)

This table gives data regarding major and minor forest produce in the district for the year 1975-76.

(C) Fisheries

Table No. 29

This table presents talukewise data regarding inland fisheries for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity

The annual factory statistics for 1974 for the district is furnished in these tables which cover the following types of factories registered under the Factory Act 1948.

- (i) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power -Section 2(i).
- (ii) those employing 20 or more workers and working without the aid of power -Section 2(ii).

(3) those registered under section 85 of the Act under which the State Government make applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled.

Table No. 30

This table gives the data regarding number of factories and average daily employment of workers in the factories in the district for the year 1974.

Table No. 31

This table indicates industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength in the district for the year 1974.

Table No. 32

The distribution of factories according to number of working days during the year 1974 is given in this table for the district.

Table No. 33

This table presents statistics relating to annual survey of industries.

Table No. 34

This table deals with registrations, vacancies notified and placements during the year 1975-76 with the employment exchange in this district.

Table No. 35

This table gives occupational distribution of total registrations, placements in the employment exchange during the year 1975-76 in the district according to standard National classifications.

Table No. 36

This table gives talukewise data regarding works undertaken in Employment Guarantee Scheme during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 37

The volume of employment in different industries in the district as on 31st March, 1976 is indicated in this table.

Table No. 38 and 39

These tables furnish data regarding consumption of electricity for different purposes during the year 1975-76 and the data pertaining to the towns and villages electrified upto 31st March 1976 respectively.

6. Co-operation

Table No. 40

This table gives the Panchayat Samitiwise total number of different types of co-operative societies functioning in the district during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 41

This table presents the position of co-operative banks with regard to structure and business in the district for the year 1975-76.

Table No. 42

This table gives panchayat samitiwise number of the primary agricultural credit societies, service societies their membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital, loan advanced and recovered, loan outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to total loans advanced during the year 1975-76. The term 'working capital'

includes paid up share capital, deposits and borrowings. 'Loan outstanding' covers outstanding in respect of loans, cash credit and over drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. 'Overdues' refer to an amount of loan or instalments, which are due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority.

Table No. 43

The data pertaining to other different types of co-operative societies except primary agricultural credit societies and banks in the district is furnished in this table for the year 1975-76.

Table No. 44

The Panchayat Samitiwise operational data of central and primary co-operative marketing societies for the year 1975-76 is presented in this table.

Table No. 45

The operational data of other co-operative societies of different types for the year 1975-76 is furnished in this table for the district.

Table No. 46

This table gives panchayat samitiwise data regarding operations of regulated markets in the district during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 47

This table presents panchayat samitiwise number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them during the year 1975-76. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are shown in this table. The

transactions of money lending in the State are regulated under the provisions of Bombay Money Lenders Act 1946. As per provisions in the Act, no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in the area for which the licence is granted to him and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and public Health

Table No. 48

This table indicates the panchayat samitiwise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, Vaidyas, nurses and the total number of indoor and outdoor patients treated during the year 1975. All the State Government medical institutions as well as the institutions run by the municipal councils and other local bodies are included. The private clinics, hospitals run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in this table.

Table No. 49

This table presents talukewise vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths and infant deaths in the district during the year 1975.

Table No. 50

This table gives data regarding number of deaths due to important causes in the district during the years 1971 to 1975.

Table No. 51

This table presents Panchayat Samitiwise vaccination statistics for the year 1975.

Table No.52

This table presents Panchayat samitiwise number of family planning centres in the district as on 31st March, 1976 and the number of sterilisation operations undertaken in these centres during the year 1975-76.

8. Education

Table No. 53

This table gives Sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each tahsil according to 1971 census. A person was classified as a literate, if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No.54 and 55

Since the data regarding the distribution of literates according to educational standards in rural and urban areas as per 1971 census is not available, the data for these two tables on this subject are given for 1961 census.

Table No.56

This table indicates the number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also given in this table. The classification of institutions according to 'Types' given in this table is slightly different from stage of education. There are, at present, many secondary schools which also impart education in primary courses, the entire pupil enrolment of students is included under 'Secondary' education. Primary institutions provide education

for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The Secondary institutions coach the students for standards VIII to X or XI with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination which leads to a degree examination.

Table No.57

This table gives the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in different types of educational institutions during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. The pupils who get concession of either types such as scholarships, free ships etc. are treated as beneficiaries.

Table No.58

This table indicates the number of beneficiaries under economically backward class concessions and the amount of concessions granted during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Table No.59

This table gives the information regarding expenditure incurred on primary education by different agencies like Zilla Parishad, Municipal councils etc. during the year 1975-76. Plan and non-plan expenditure is shown separately.

9. Transport and communications

Table No.60

This table gives total railway length in the district as on 31st March, 1976 according to types of routes i.e. broad guage, metre guage and narrow guage. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore approximate and not accurate.

Table No.61

This table indicates the road length in the district according to category of roads and surface classification as on 31st March, 1976.

Table No.62

This table gives the number of motor vehicles in operation as on 31st March, 1976 in Amaravati Region in which this district is also included.

Table No.63

This table deals with the operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Yavatmal Division as on 31.3.1976. The State Transport Division Yavatmal comprises of Yavatmal district and Wardha depots.

Table No.64

This table presents the results of traffic census of important roads conducted by buildings and communication Department, Government of Maharashtra as on May, 1974. The data regarding the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of count posts.

Table No.65

The information regarding number of post offices, telegraphs offices, letter boxes, postmen, Telephones and radio licences issued and renewed in the district during the year 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71 to 1975-76 is furnished in this table.

Table No.66

This table gives panchayat samiti-wise data regarding the number of villages in which receiving sets are installed, rural population covered and total number of radio farm forums as on 31-3-1976.

10. Local Bodies

Table No.67

This table gives an abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Zilla Parishad, Municipal councils and Village Panchayats for the financial year 1965-66, 1968-69 to 1975-76. An independent as well as group village panchayats are included in the number of village panchayats.

Table No.68

This table indicates headwise income and expenditure of village panchayats in each panchayat samiti during the year 1975-76 excluding opening and closing balances.

Table No.69

This table is divided into three parts viz, (A), (B) and (C). The table No.69 (A) gives the total receipts of Zilla Parishad derived from self raised resources, Government grants, loans and advances, deposits and remittances. The table No.69 (B) indicates the receipts of Zilla Parishad from different Government grants, while Table No.69 (C) gives the total expenditure incurred by Zilla Parishad. The expenditure is further divided into two parts i.e. (1) Revenue expenditure and (2) debt section including remittances. Data regarding actuals for the year 1974-75, revised estimates for 1975-76 and estimates for 1976-77 are given in this table.

Table No.70

This table indicates income and expenditure of Municipal councils in the district during the year 1975-76. The opening and closing balances are however not considered while giving income and expenditure figures for the said year.

11. Plan and community Development

Table No.71

This table presents data regarding plan expenditure during Fourth Five Year Plan, Annual Plan 1974-75 and Annual Plan 1975-76 according to sub-head of development.

Table No.72

This table gives sub-head-wise physical achievements in important items during Fourth Five Year Plan, Annual Plan 1974-75 and Annual Plan 1975-76.

Table No. 73, 74 and 75

The statistics relating to Community Development programme are presented in these tables. The position of Community Development blocks as on 31st March, 1976 is shown in table No.73 while the expenditure incurred under different stages of blocks upto end of 1975-76 is given in table No.74. The table No.75 gives blockwise physical achievements on selected items during the year 1975-76.

12. Prices

Table No.76

This table deals with the monthly wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities at regulated market centres in the district during the year 1975. Price averages for the year are worked out by simple arithmetic mean.

Table No.77

Monthly average retail prices of various commodities for the month of January to December 1975 are given in this table alongwith varieties. The average prices for the year are also given in this table for all the commodities. As the data collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one shop at District Headquarter, the average price of each

individual commodity can not be said to be fully representative but this data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend of changes in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No.78

This table gives data regarding consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class (for the year 1960) of Nagpur Centre published by the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay for the year 1975-76. The averages for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 are also given.

13. Miscellaneous

Table No.79 and 80

These tables present the data regarding strength of Police Force and Crime Statistics for the district during the year 1975 respectively.

Table No.81

This table gives data regarding work disposed of in Civil and Criminal courts in the district during the year 1975.

Table No.82

This table gives panchayat samitiwise cinema statistics for the year 1975-76.

Table No.83

The data pertaining to banking facilities in the district is given in this table.

Table No.84

The data relating to Scheduled Bank etc. is furnished in this table.

Table No. 85

The statistics regarding Joint Stock Companies is presented in this table.

Table No. 86

This table gives Life Insurance Statistics in the district for the year 1975-76.

Table No. 87

This table furnishes the data regarding small saving collections in the district during the year 1975-76. Targets, gross collections, withdrawals and net collections during the year 1975-76 under different kinds of savings are also given in this table.

Table No. 88

This table indicates talukewise land revenue collections during the year 1975-76.

Table No. 89

This table gives panchayat Saritiwise number of presses and number of news papers and periodicals published in the district as on 31st March 1976.

CHAPTER III

INDICATORS OF DEVELOPMENT

Indicators are built up to measure the level of development of the district under various sectors. For the purposes of review, the indicators showing level of development under important sectors have been built up and are discussed in the following paragraphs.

Indicator No.1

Percentage of gross sown area

The table below indicates the percentage of gross sown areas to respective net sown areas for the years 1960-61 and 1974-75.

It is seen from the above table that there have been marginal increases in the percentages of gross sown areas to respective net sown areas in case of all the talukas. The increase in such percentage for the district is from 100.72 in 1960-61 to 101.66 in 1974-75. There has been remarkable increase in the double cropped area.

The food crops Jowar and Tur have suffered shortfall in production during 1974-75 as against the levels of 1960-61. The production of wheat increased significantly as there is 110.59% rise in the out-turn over the out-turn in 1960-61. The sugarcane production is tremendously increased in 1974-75 when compared to the production in 1960-61 mainly because the irrigation facilities were made available in Pusad taluka and the sugarcane area was also increased due to establishment of sugar Factory at Pophali in Pusad taluka. The production of crops viz. Rice and Gram has shown slight improvement. The decrease in the production of Jowar, Tur, Sesamum and Chillies was due to failure of crops. There is a significant increase in the production of cotton as compared to the year 1960-61.

Indicator No.3Gross value of agricultural production

As the farm harvest prices of various commodities are not available, this indicator could not be worked out.

Indicator No.4Percentage of area irrigated

The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area and the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area are given in the following table -

The above table shows that the irrigation in the district is too low. Only 1.37 percent of the total net sown area of the district is irrigated during 1974-75. These percentages of irrigation is rather higher in Pusad taluka. The percentages of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area are shown in last two columns, which indicate that there was considerably larger area under double irrigation in all talukas except Wani taluka during the year 1974-75.

Changes in the crop pattern

The following table gives percentages of area under food crops to total gross cropped area and percentages of area under non-food crops to total gross cropped area.

It is seen from the above table that the proportion of areas under food and non-food crops has actually been reversed during the course of the period. The area under food crops has been reduced to 49.90% in 1974-75 as against 54.77% in 1960-61. Consequently, the area under non-food crops has been increased to 50.10% in 1974-75 as against 45.23 in 1960-61.

Indicator No.6

Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues

The primary Agricultural credit societies have come to the rescue of small cultivators. These societies provide financial assistance in the form of short term loans to the cultivators. This helps the cultivators financially in purchase of improved seeds fertilisers, pesticides etc. The following table indicates the level of credit advanced by the societies on short term during 1960-61 and 1975-76.

It is clear from the above table that there is no significant change in number of societies during the period 1960-61 to 1975-76. The level of advancement of loan has however, gone up viz. from Rs.1.07 crores in 1960-61 to 9.94 crores in 1975-76. The advancing of loan was quite high in Pusad, Kelapur and Yavatmal talukas while in Wani and Darwha taluka it was comparatively low. The amount of outstanding loan was also reported as high as Rs.11.99 crores for 1975-76.

Indicator No.7

Agricultural wage rates

The three centres viz. Ner, Kalamb and Varegaon are selected for collection of wage rates for agricultural operations in the district and the average rates worked out are taken as representative for the district. The average rates worked out for the year 1963 and 1975 are shown below:-

The total consumption of electricity during 1975-76 in the district was reported as 35,121 thousand KWH of which 6361 thousand KWH was for domestic consumption, 3,458 thousand KWH for commercial light and small power, 14,187 thousand KWH for industrial consumption, 1,333 thousand KWH for public lighting while 8,964 thousand KWH was for agricultural purposes and 818 thousand KWH for other purposes.

At the end of 1975, the hospitals and dispensaries have reached the level of 6 per lakh population in the district as against 4 in 1961.

Similarly number of beds per lakh population in the district was 34 in 1975 as against 26 in 1961. With the opening of large number of primary schools under the Five Year Plan programme, the enrolment in primary schools has gone up upto 1.77 lakhs in 1975-76 against 0.83 lakhs of 1960-61. Similar was the case with the enrolment in secondary schools, the number of enrolment has gone up upto 52,524 in 1975-76 as against 17,660 in 1960-61. The strength of higher education also showed tremendous increase, the enrolment being reported as 5,964 during 1975-76 as against 1,183 during 1960-61.

Indicator No. 14Increase in road length per 100 sq.kms. areas

This being a hilly district suffers from insufficient road mileage. The roads have to cope up with the traffic in the district as the railways' share very small part in the traffic of the district. There is a narrow gauge line linking Yavatmal to Nagpur-Bombay line at Murtizapur and one broad gauge line linking Wani and Rajur to Majari on Nagpur-Hyderabad line. The total railway route is of 82 kms. length.

The total road length in the district was reported as 5,185.20 kms. as on 31.3.1976, out of which 664.61 kms. road length was under National Highways and State Highways, while the road length of major district roads, other district roads and village roads was 4,329.64 kms. Besides there exist municipal roads of the length of 190.95 kms. in the district.

Banking facilities are very important from the point of view of economic development of the area. There has been a programme of opening new branches of banks in rural

areas. The number of branches of scheduled banks increased to 33 in 1975 as against 12 in 1961. Similarly the number of banks in co-operative sector increased to 37 in 1975 as against 12 in 1961. Thus in 1975 the total number of branches of all the banks in the district increased to 70 as against 24 in 1961. The percentage of population covered by the banking offices to total population of the district works out to 20.5

It is seen that the prices of all the commodities have tremendously gone up during the period 1963 to 1975. The increase in the prices are 100% to 430 percent in case of foodgrains, 284% in case of sugar, 302% in case of groundnut oil, 158% in case of tea, 160% in case of kerosene and 116% in case of washing soap.

CHAPTER IV

ANNUAL PLAN 1975-76

4.1 Planning plays an important role in phasing out the development programmes by providing various schemes with a view to improve the living conditions of the people. It also helps in improving Socio-economic conditions of the weaker section of the society and in building up sound and stable economy of the nation.

The Fourth Five Year Plan was deemed to be started from the year 1969-70. However, the Annual Plans which were visualised as a part of the Fourth Plan were actually implemented and the Annual Plan 1973-74 was the last part of the Fourth Five Year Plan. The following table presents the head wise details of expenditure incurred on district level schemes implemented in this district during the Fourth Five Year Plan.

It is clear from the above table that the emphasis was given on Agricultural Programme (32.97%), Irrigation and Power (26.29%) and Social services (24.80%) during the Fourth

Five Year Plan. The expenditure on 'Co-operation and Community Development' and 'Transport and Communication' was 8.91% and 6.35% respectively. The expenditure on Industry and Mining (0.55%) and Miscellaneous (0.13%) was very meagre.

The National Development Council endorsed the Fifth Five Year Plan in Dec. 1973, but on account of some unforeseen factors, it has not yet been finalised. Maharashtra's Fifth Five Year Plan which was formulated on the basis of National and State Policies has also not been finalised. In the formulation of the Fifth Plan, Maharashtra State has given a practical shape to the concept of District planning. The District was adopted as the unit of Planning and District Planning Bodies were constituted for each district. The objectives of the District Plan, the State plan and the National Plan should be broadly identical but the programmatic contents of the various district plans may differ on the basis of their resource endowments and their need-based priorities.

Annual Plan 1974-75 was the first part and Annual Plan 1975-76 was the second part of the Fifth Five Year Plan. In the Annual Plan 1974-75 and Annual Plan 1975-76 emphasis was given on the development of core sectors viz. Agriculture Irrigation and Power which have a long term impact on the economy. The emphasis was also given on Employment Guarantee scheme in Annual Plan 1974-75 and Annual Plan 1975-76.

4.2 The following table presents headwise 'Budget provisions' received during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 for implementing all the district level schemes in the district.

It may be seen from the above table that the major portion of the budget was provided for implementation of Agricultural Programme in both the years i.e. 25.87% in 1974-75 and 27.53% in 1975-76 with a view to increase the agricultural production in the district. Social Services accounted for 24.07% and 28.02% of the total budget provision in the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively for providing facilities viz. education, medical facilities, water supply, housing, backward class welfare, labour welfare etc. Irrigation and Power was provided 20.39% in 1974-75 and 20.74% in 1975-76. Miscellaneous (including Employment Guarantee Scheme) was provided 13.45% in 1974-75 and 12.15% in 1975-76. Transport and communications was provided 7.39% in 1974-75 and 8.58% in 1975-76. 6.84 of the total budget

was provided for Industry and Mining in 1974-75; while only 1.44% was provided for this head of development in 1975-76.

The Co-operation and Community Development was provided only 1.99% in 1974-75 and 1.54% in 1975-76 for development activities.

4.3 Out of the total budget provision of Rs.379.719 lakhs the expenditure of Rs.330.320 lakhs was incurred on all the level schemes implemented in the district during the year 1974-75. The percentage of expenditure to the budget provision works out to 86.99%. Similarly during the year 1975-76, the expenditure of Rs.461.090 lakhs was incurred on all the district level schemes against the total budget provision of Rs.478.970 lakhs and the percentage of expenditure to the total budget provision was 96.27%. The details of major headwise expenditure and its percentage to respective budget provisions during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 are indicated in the table given below -

It is evident from the above table that there was a short-fall in expenditure under Irrigation and Power (43.08%), Miscellaneous (including Employment Guarantee Scheme) (66.03%) and Co-operation and Community Development (72.33%) owing to delay in executing the works for want of funds, sanction etc. during the year 1974-75. Under all other heads the progress of expenditure was upto the mark.

During the year 1975-76, there was a short fall in expenditure under Social Services (88.18%), Irrigation and Power (90.36%) and Industry and Mining (94.07%). The progress of expenditure incurred on other heads of development was quite satisfactory.

4.4 Agricultural Programme

The Agricultural and allied activities are the main source of livelihood of more than 70 percent population of the district. The schemes pertaining to soil conservation through on water shed, land development, minor irrigation wells, tanks and bandharas, intensive cultivation of food crops by adopting improved practices, forest, fisheries, dairy development, ware-housing and marketing were included under Agricultural programme. The table below gives sub-headwise expenditure incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan, during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76.

It is clear from the above table that the schemes pertaining to minor irrigation and soil conservation were given more importance for increasing agricultural production. The sann seed weighing 206 quintals was distributed for green manuring during Fourth Five Year Plan. It was however not distributed during 1974-75 and 1975-76. 2,16,790 metric tonnes town compost was produced during 1974-75, as against 5,50,680 metric tonnes during Fourth Five Year Plan. The town compost was not produced during the year 1975-76. Fruit trees were planted in 357 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan and in 82 hectares during 1974-75. The fruit trees were not planted during 1975-76. During Fourth Five Year Plan, intensive cultivation was undertaken in 26,479 hectares while in 1974-75 this programme was undertaken in 7,806 hectares. No such programme was taken up during 1975-76. One small holders block was started during Fourth Five Year Plan and the same was continued during 1974-75. During 1975-76, 5 small holders blocks were started. Under-resettlement of landless agricultural workers, 3,252 hectares area was reclaimed during Fourth Five Year Plan. The area of 465 hectares and 208 hectares was reclaimed during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. Similarly 1068

families were settled during Fourth Year Plan, 253 families were settled during 1974-75 and 122 families were settled during 1975-76. Under agricultural labourers model colonisation, 305 houses were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan and no house was constructed during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Subsidy was given to small holders for 301 wells during Fourth Five Year Plan, for 150 wells during 1974-75, and for 20 wells during 1975-76. Subsidy was also given to small holders for 207 pump sets during Fourth Five Year Plan, for 57 pump sets during 1974-75 and for 27 pump sets during 1975-76.

With a view to provide more irrigation facilities, the construction of 183 community wells was taken up during Fourth Five Year Plan and the work of 46 community wells was in progress. 12 community wells were completed during 1974-75. No community well was completed during 1975-76. The construction of 61 minor irrigation tanks was taken up during Fourth Five Year Plan and the work of 20 tanks was in progress. During the year 1974-75, the construction work of 9 minor irrigation tanks was in progress. During the year 1975-76, the construction work of 29 minor irrigation tanks was in progress. 31 percolation tanks were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan and the construction of 22 percolation tanks was in progress during the year 1974-75. The construction of 9 percolation tanks was in progress during 1975-76. 15 co-operative lift irrigation societies were organised in the district during Fourth Five Year Plan and no such society was organised during 1974-75 and 1975-76.

This district has an undulating topography and hence soil erosion is a problem in this district. As a measure of soil conservation, bunding works were undertaken in 64,394 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan, in 10,709 hectares during 1974-75 and in 19,853 hectares during 1975-76. The programme of afforestation for soil conservation was taken up in 110 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan, whereas no such programme was taken up during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

An area of 7,351 hectares under ayacut was developed during Fourth Five Year Plan and the area of 1,493 hectares was developed during 1974-75. During 1975-76, an area of 2,327 hectares under ayacut was developed.

Under animal husbandry, loan was granted to 46 landless persons for starting poultry during Fourth Five Year Plan. No such loan was granted during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Under forests, plantation of Teak wood was undertaken in 910 hectares, Bamboo in 140 hectares, fodder plantation in 120 hectares and fast growing species in 80 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan. 10 drinking water wells were also constructed for forest labourers during Fourth Five Year Plan. During 1974-75, plantation of Teak wood was undertaken in 15 hectares, Bamboo in 15 hectares, fodder plantation in 15 hectares and fast growing species in 20 hectares. No well was constructed for forest labourers during the year 1974-75.

During the year 1975-76, plantation of Teak wood was undertaken in 15 hectares, Bamboo in 15 hectares, fodder plantation in 15 hectares and fast growing species in 20 hectares. 2 drinking water wells were also constructed for the forest

labourers during the year 1975-76.

Under the fisheries development programme, fish seed farm was constructed in 1.74 hectares during Fourth Five Year Plan only and no fish seed farm was constructed during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. The number of spawns produced during Fourth Five Year Plan was 62.00 lakhs while it was 27.00 lakhs during 1974-75 and 101.50 lakhs during 1975-76. The number of carp fry supplied for stocking was 55,50,900 during Fourth Five Year Plan while it was 18,89,500 during 1974-75 and 23,54,000 during 1975-76. The fish production was 6,01,502 kgs. during Fourth Five Year Plan, while it was 1,64,651 kgs. during 1974-75 and 2,67,484 kgs. during 1975-76. The nylon twine weighing 557 kgs. was supplied to the fishermen and their co-operatives on subsidised rates during Fourth Five Year Plan and the nylon twine weighing 264 kgs. and 166 kgs. was supplied during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively.

Under warehousing and marketing loan and subsidy both were granted to 11 agricultural marketing societies during Fourth Five Year Plan while during 1974-75 loan was given to one society and subsidy was granted to 10 societies only. During 1975-76, only subsidy was granted to 11 agricultural marketing societies for propaganda.

4.5 Co-operation and Community Development

The expenditure of Rs.137.219 lakhs, Rs.5.454 lakhs and Rs.7.370 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively on all the district level schemes implemented in the district under this head of development.

Under Co-operation programme, Share capital was given to 12 co-operative marketing societies during Fourth Five Year Plan and to one society during 1974-75. Share capital was not given to any of the marketing societies during 1975-76. Share capital was given to 14, 2 and 2 co-operative ginning and pressing societies during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. Share capital was also given to one Co-operative sugar factory during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75. Share capital was not given to the Co-operative sugar factory during 1975-76. Under Co-operative farming societies, share capital was given to 7 societies and land development loan was given to 113 societies and management subsidy was granted to 33 societies during Fourth Five Year Plan. Management subsidy was only granted to one co-operative farming society during 1974-75. No Co-operative farming society was assisted by giving share capital, land development loan or management subsidy during 1975-76. Subsidy was granted to 14 consumers co-operative stores and financial assistance was given to 8 labour contract societies and to 14 co-operative supervising unions during Fourth Five Year Plan. These consumers stores and societies were not assisted during 1974-75 and 1975-76.

Under Community Development programme, financial assistance was given to 14 existing blocks during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76.

4.6 Irrigation and Power

The expenditure of Rs.404.860 lakhs, Rs.33,350 lakhs and Rs.89.750 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively on all the

district level scheme implemented in the district under this head of development.

Under electrification programme, 63.53 kms. of 66 KV lines and 854.00 kms. of 11 KV lines were laid in the district, 320 villages were electrified, 4806 pump sets were connected and 2 harijan basties were electrified during Fourth Five Year Plan. During 1974-75, 247 villages were electrified, 483 pump sets were connected and one harijan basti was electrified. During 1975-76, 13 villages were electrified and 125 pump sets were connected.

4.7 Industry and Mining.

The expenditure of Rs.8.407 lakhs, Rs.25.150 lakhs and Rs.6.500 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76, respectively on all the district level schemes implemented in the district under this head of development.

Under small scale industries development, loans were given to 283 village artisans and 5 industrial societies were assisted during Fourth Five Year Plan only. Share capital and subsidy both were given to 14 Balutedars societies during Fourth Five Year Plan and also during 1974-75 and 1975-76.

4.8 Transport and Communications

The expenditure of Rs.97.836 lakhs, Rs.27.010 lakhs and Rs.41.420 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively on all the district level schemes implemented in the district under this head of development.

Road transport has significant importance in the development of this district, as the district is not well

served with railways. Under road development programme, 209.80 kms. of pacca roads and 23.40 kms. of kacha roads were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan, while during 1974-75, 46.86 kms. of pacca roads and 2.90 kms. of kacha roads were constructed. During 1975-76, 30.33 kms. of pacca roads and 13.35 kms. of kacha roads were constructed. Black topping was done on 44.12 kms. of roads during Fourth Five Year Plan, on 10.50 kms. of roads during 1974-75 and on 8.60 kms. of roads during 1975-76. The construction of 3 bridges was completed and the construction of 4 bridges was in progress and 153 cross drainages were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan. During the year 1974-75, construction of 2 bridges and one cross drainage was completed. During the year 1975-76, the construction of 2 bridges and 16 cross drainages was completed and the construction of 4 bridges and 4 cross drainages was in progress.

4.9 Social Services

The expenditure of Rs.381.979 lakhs, Rs.110.556 lakhs and Rs.126.300 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively on all the district level schemes implemented in the district under this head of development. The sub-headwise break-up of this expenditure is indicated in the table given below.

Under general education, primary education was given more importance. 39 new primary schools were started during Fourth Five Year Plan and 18 and 10 new primary schools were started during the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively.

During Fourth Five Year Plan, 149 rooms in primary school buildings were constructed while during 1974-75, 15 school rooms were constructed. During 1975-76, 41 school rooms were constructed. 8 rooms of secondary school buildings were constructed during Fourth Five Year Plan only. 360 and 2 additional sets of scholarships in secondary schools were granted during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. No such additional set of scholarship in secondary schools was granted during 1975-76. 25 new classes were started in Government multipurpose secondary schools during Fourth Five Year Plan only. Educational concessions were given to 17,069 economically backward class students during Fourth Five Year Plan, to 510 such students during 1974-75 and to 9,936 such students during 1975-76. Similarly educational concessions were given to 2,432 children of primary teachers during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 1,099

and 529 such children during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. Loan scholarships were given to 400 primary teachers under training during Fourth Five Year Plan and to 8 such primary teachers during 1974-75 only. Stipend was also given to 222 primary/pre-primary teachers under training during Fourth Five Year Plan only. 1,18,134 adults were made literate during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

Under technical education, construction of 4 staff quarters at Government Polytechnic, Yavatmal was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan only. The construction of hostel building at Government Polytechnic, Yavatmal, which was in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75, was completed during the year 1975-76.

Under health, the construction of one 252 beded Civil Hospital was nearing completion during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 and the same was completed during 1975-76. The construction of 9 primary health centres/sub-centres buildings was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and construction of one building were completed during 1974-75. During 1975-76, the construction of 17 primary health centres/sub-centres buildings was completed. Spraying of D.D.T. was done in 16,80,079 houses, in 9,42,531 houses and in 1,83,421 houses during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. Family planning operations were performed on 49,081 persons, on 3,683 persons and on 16,651 persons during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. Similarly 182, 44 and 62 I.U.C.D. insertion cases were covered during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively.

The construction of 35 family planning centres/sub-centres buildings was completed during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

Under water supply and drainage, one Government water supply scheme at Yavatmal and 2 Municipal water supply schemes were completed during Fourth Five Year Plan. Three municipal water supply schemes were completed and two were in progress during the year 1974-75 and 4 works were in progress during 1975-76. One drainage scheme at Wani was in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76. 3, 3 and 4 rural water supply schemes for individual villages were completed and 3 rural water supply schemes for individual villages were in progress during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. 5 and 9 rural water supply supply schemes for groups of villages were completed during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. 11 rural water supply schemes for groups of villages were in progress during 1975-76. During Fourth Five Year Plan 1,118 new drinking water wells were constructed, whereas 167 and 129 new drinking water wells were constructed during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. Similarly construction of 8 tube wells 48 tube wells and 59 tube wells completed during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. 583 old drinking water wells were renovated during Fourth Five Year Plan and 163 such wells were renovated during 1974-75 only.

Under the housing programme, the house sites were provided for 114, 35 and 31 developing villages during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. The financial assistance was given for tiling of roofs to 207 persons, 110 persons and 23 persons of Scheduled Tribes during

Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively.

Under welfare of backward classes, scholarships were given to 8,173, 938 and 210 SC/ST/OBC students during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. The building grants were given to 19 backward class hostels during Fourth Five Year Plan, to 5 such hostels during 1974-75 and to one hostel during 1975-76. The grants were also given to 257 backward class hostels during Fourth Five Year Plan, to 2 such hostels during 1974-75 and to 4 hostels during 1975-76. The housing aid was given to 133 and 64 persons of backward classes during Fourth Five Year Plan and during 1974-75 respectively. The financial assistance was given to 122, 246 and 150 persons of backward classes during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively. The scholarships were granted to 1,740 students of Vimukta Jatis during Fourth Five Year Plan, to 107 such students during 1974-75 and to 490 such students during 1975-76. The financial assistance was given to 9 forest labourers co-operative societies of SC/ST/OBC during Fourth Five Year Plan only.

The technical courses were taught in the Industrial Training Institute at Yavatmal under labour and labour welfare programme during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76.

4.10 Miscellaneous

The expenditure of Rs.1.969 lakhs, Rs.33,730 lakhs, and Rs.58,200 lakhs was incurred during Fourth Five Year Plan, during 1974-75 and during 1975-76 respectively on all the distric

level schemes (including Employment Guarantee Scheme) implemented in the district under this head of development.

Under the sub-head information and publicity, rural broadcasting facilities were provided and radio sets were installed in 263 villages during Fourth Five Year Plan and in 43 villages during the year 1974-75 only.

Vital importance was given to the Employment Guarantee Scheme in Annual Plan 1974-75 and Annual Plan 1975-76 with a view to provide gainful and productive employment to all unskilled persons in rural areas, who need work and are prepared to do manual work but/not find it anywhere. The objective of the scheme is that the works undertaken should produce durable community assets in the area and that wages paid to the workers should be linked with the quality and quantity of out^{put} work. Only productive works of labour intensive nature like minor irrigation, soil conservation, nalla bunding, canal excavation, land development, afforestation etc. are undertaken. The works are implemented departmentally and not through contractors, so that at least 60 percent of the works expenditure is incurred in wages to the workers. The significance of providing a guarantee of work lies in the fact that it is one of the most effective instruments of creating a work consciousness among the poor and that it inculcates in them a feeling of self-reliance and self respect and also a feeling of active participation in the programme of rural construction. The expenditure of Rs.33,620 lakhs was incurred on Employment Guarantee Scheme during the year 1974-75 and the expenditure of Rs.58,200 lakhs was incurred on this scheme during the year 1975-76.
