CHAPTER : I
INTERODUCTION.

1.1 LOCATION :

The district of Sangli is part of the famous Deccan plateau. It lies between 16° 45' and 17° 33' North latitude and 73° 42' and 75° 40' East longitude. It is bounded on the east by the district of Bijapur in Karnatak State, on the West by the Ratnagiri district, on the south by the district of Kolhapur and Belgaum and on the north by the districts of Satara and Sholapur.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY : (1) SOIL :

The soils of varied texture and structure are met with in Sangli district. The soil in the district varies from the deep black in the river valleys to shallow murmad red or grey in the hilly areas.

1.3 The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from the tahsil of Shirala is formed from red laterite mixed with hard ^{murum} due to the hilly nature of the zone.

1.4 The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon (Part) and Miraj (Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper Kharif crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow Rabi Jowar, - Wheat and Gram. They are also good for irrigated crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5 The hilly tract comprising parts of Khanapur, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils ^{grows} Jowar and Bajri, while the eastern zone comprising areas of Jath, Atpadi and Kavathe Mahankal tahsils with a very low rainfall and poor grey soils, is a well known scarcity tract.

1.6 (ii) RIVERS :

The Krishna and the Warna are the principal rivers of the district. The Yerala, the Morna, the Manganga, the Nanni, the Agrani and the Bor are the other small rivers flowing through this district. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during the dry part, they resume a slender course. These rivers go dry in summer season.

1.7 (iii) HILL RANGES :

There are two main systems of hills. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the off-shoots of Mahadev range. The Sahyadri system includes the main range of the Sahyadri which forms the western boundary of the district. One of the spurs of the Mahadev range known as Mahimangad Panhala spur stretches up to Khanapur. At Khanapur it splits in two branches, one branch passes 32 km. in the South till it ends in the ^{old} Panhala Fort, 24 km. from Athani road Railway station. The other branch stretches south east to Belur about 8 km. south west of Jath. It forms the water parting between the valley of the Yerla, a tributary of the Krishna on the right and the valley of the Man, a tributary of the Bhima on the ~~xxxx~~ left.

1.8 RAINFALL:

The rains start sometime in the middle of June and last till the end of September in the district. Major portion of rainfall in the district is received between July and September. During the first half of monsoon, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains a big heavily.

1.9 Rainfall is the heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri Western portion of Shirala tahsil on an average gets rainfall over 2,000 mm. in a year. The central and eastern portions receive annual rainfall measuring about 750 mm. The north eastern portion receives the lowest rainfall in the district averaging about 500 mm. in a year.

1.10 The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay in 1960 had reported that the rainfall in this area is not dependable and the area is likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years. The fact finding committee appointed by the Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has also recognised this fact. As per the report of this committee six tahsils of this district fall in the broad drought zone. These tahsils are Atpadi, Khanapur (Khanapur and Vita circles), Tasgaon (Savalaj and Visapur circles), Jath, Kavathe Mahankal and Miraj (Malgaon circle).

1.11 Although Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year 1972-73 there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions in this district particularly in the year 1973-74, 1974-75 or 1975-76

1.12 MINERALS :

There are no important mineral deposits except building stones, clay and limestones. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. Good clay for bricks and ^{tiles} is found on the banks of the rivers.

1.13 FOREST :

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician Forest Department was 47994 hectares in 1974-75. The forest area formed hardly 5.6 percent of the geographical area of this district.

1.14 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY :

The district has an area of 8563.0 sq. km and population of 15,39,820 as per population census 1971. Out of this 2.86 lakh persons (18.63) percent) were in urban areas and 12.53 lakh persons (81.37 percent) were in rural areas as compared to 31.17 percent urban and 68.83 percent rural population for the State.

1.15 The decennial increase of population compared to 1961 was 25.12 percent in total population, 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The following table will give tahsilwise position in this respect.

(I) ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF SANGLI DISTRICT:

1.16 As indicated earlier in para 1.12, there are no important mineral deposits in this district and as such there are no industries based on mine deals in this district. The only scope for industries is of agro and allied industries and consumer in special features.

1.17 HISTORY OF INDUSTRIALISATION:

In Sangli district there are 141 factories upto the year 1974. Upto the year 1940 there are only 12 Registered factories. Real progress was made in the decade of 1960 to 1970 and as many as 74 new factories were established.

Following table will give the development of registered factories (industries in the district).

The above industries are mostly concentrated in Sangli(76), Miraj(25) and Madhavnagar(9) and only 31 industries are outside these towns.

70% of factories are having less than 50 employees, 13% of factories are having 50 to 99 employees, 13% of factories are having 100 to 499 employees and remaining 4% factories are having more than 500 employees.

Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation has acquired 559 Hect. land at Kupwad, Miraj and Sangli.

There are 3 Sugarfactories located in this district, which are in coop. sector. Out of 3 sugar factories, one of the biggest sugar factory in Maharashtra i.e. Shetakari Sahkari Sakhar Karkhana Ltd. at Sangli has daily capacity of sugarcane crushing with 5500 tons.

There are two dairies at Miraj viz. Krishna Khore Sangh and other Govt. Milk dairy. First is the collecting organization while other is processing unit. The capacity of Govt. Milk scheme Miraj is 1,20,000 litres daily. Other biproducts like butter, milk powder are also prepared in the dairy.

There are 9 oil mills in the district but are not functioning properly for want of raw materials.

1.18 SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES:

In the year 1962, so as to assist small scale industries Industries Deptt. started registering the Small Scale Industries & following information is available.

From the above table it is seen that the no. of small scale industries are increased in many fold and same is the case with No. of persons engaged in it.

Out of the above 1283 small scale units, 986 are in Sangli-Miraj-Madhapnagar complex. This ^{again} shows the concentration of industries in this area.

Out of these 1283 units in Sangli district 583 units are of textiles and 277 are engineering units, this constitutes about two third of total units.

1.19 The above information is in respect of Small Scale Units registered with industries office. In addition there ^{are} unregistered units like Bidi making, Cycle Repairing, Motor repairing etc. & the information of which is ^{not} collected.

1.20. Special Features of the District: -

Sangli district is famous for the following features -

(i) Shetakari Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana Sangli is one of the largest sugar factories in Asia with its daily sugarcane crushing capacity of 5500 tons. Besides there are two more sugar factories in the district - one at Chikhali Shirala Tahsil and other at Sakharale - Walwa tahsil.

(ii) Tasgaon Chaman grapes (Seedless Thomson) are famous not only in India but in Middle East also. About 500 tons of grapes are exported to Middle East annually.

(iii) Musical Instruments of Miraj, especially "SATAR" are famous throughout India. It is a hereditary occupation of small number of artisans possessing exceptional artistic skill and workmanship.

(iv) Sangli is famous throughout India and abroad for its forwarding market centre of Turmeric.

(v) Leather goods mostly Kapashi and Kolhapur Type Chappals are manufactured and exported to countries like U.S.A. U.S.S.R. and other western countries.

(vi) Marathe Engineering of Miraj is famous not only in India but in Western and developed countries too for its highly sophisticated electrical and electronic controls mainly for textile industry. The industry has produced some machinery first time in India and acquired many prizes in exhibitions held in highly developed countries. This is the only industry participated in exhibitions held abroad.

(vii) Steel fabricators, Sangli is a small scale industrial unit but is famous for its machinery production required in the erection of Sugar Factories.

(viii) Shiyasdan Cooperative Housing Society is engaged in the production of Prefabricated Houses and is a unique industry.

(ix) Sangli district is famous for its milk products. Govt. dairy at Miraj with its daily capacity of 1.20 lakhs litres is functioning with its full capacity. Besides there is one private dairy viz. Chitale Dairy at Bhilwadi is famous for its modern machinery and is also working very efficiently.

(x) Sangli and Miraj are well known for availability of the best medical facilities. Number of well equipped medical institutions are located in and around these two cities. Miraj Mission Hospital is the biggest medical centre where eminent surgeons and renowned consultants render medical services. It is worth mentioning that people from other states in India as well as from Arab countries also come for receiving medical treatment in this Hospital.

(xi) On 10th January 1977, the then Hon. Chief Minister Shri Shankarao Chavan laid the foundation stone of one of the biggest irrigation project in this area viz. Warna Project. The Dam is to be constructed at Chandoli Tal. Shirala on Warna River. It will submerge 301 Sq. km. area and will store 964 million cubic metre of water. After completion of the dam, irrigation water by lift will be available to area of 49150 hect. in Sangli district and 36275 hect. in Kolhapur district.

Besides, the following medium irrigation projects are under construction viz. (1) Yeralwadi (2) Sidhewadi (3) Morna and (4) Doddanala. Although the location of Yeralwadi is in Satara district, it will irrigate about 850 hect. of land of Sangli district. Sidhewadi is on Agrani river and will irrigate about 922 hectares of land.

Doddanala project is in Jath tahsil while Morna project is on Morna river and its location is in Shirala tahsil. These two projects are just started.

CHAPTER-II
EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1976-77. In case the data for the year 1976-77 is not available the data for the latest available year are presented. Inmost of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co operation' is for the co-operative year (1st July to - 30th June). The data on other important itens like rainfall, tempera- ture, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calender year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparisson.

District at a glance -

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres, such as,

- i) Population
- ii) agriculture
- iii) animal husbandry
- iv) industries
- v) co-operation
- vi) medical and public health
- vii) education
- viii) transport and communication
- ix) plan expenditure etc.,

pertaining to the district is presented alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

District Statistical Abstract -

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited - wherever necessary.

Area and Population -

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc, are presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to - population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population of schedule castes and schedule tribes, distribution of population - according to age group and religion are also given in these tables.

2.5 (a) Urban Area -

The following places have been treated as 'Urban areas' (towns)-

1) every place having a municipality or contonment board irrespective of its population.

2) every other places which satisfies following three conditions-

- i) a population of at least 5,000;
- ii) at least these fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits; and
- iii) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.

3) any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being a project area or a - developing township.

b) Rural area - Those areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called - 'Rural areas'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

(c) Worker - A worker is 'defined as' a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or political worker actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, livestock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year, even if he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

(d) Non-worker - Non-workers are 'those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work.'

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

Climate -

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table no.8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1976 for the selected eight centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five year and a maximum of 30 years. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty-four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table no.9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1976 in respect of one centre in Sangli district.

Agriculture-

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i) land utilisation
- ii) area under different crops
- iii) yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops
- iv) irrigated area under different crops
- v) sourcewise irrigated area, and
- vi) data on irrigation etc.

are given in tables 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below

a) Geographical area- It is, according to village papers, calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor General.

b) Forests - It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

- c. Land put to non-agricultural uses-
It stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other land put to uses other than agricultural.
- d) Barron and unculturable land - It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, deserts etc. is classified under this category.
- e. Permanent pastures and other grazing land- It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands - within forest area are included under this head.
- f. Culturable waste land- These may be either 'fallow' or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.
- g. Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown.
This category includes all cultivable land which is not included in net area sown but put to some agricultural use.
- h. Current fallow lands - These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow'.
- i. Other fallows - All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.
- j. Net area sown- This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.
- k. Gross cropped area - Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area.'

Cultivable area is a sum of areas under :-

- a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown,
- b) Current fallows
- c) Other fallows
- d) Culturable waste land, and
- e) Net area sown.

2.9 Important irrigation statistics regarding :-

- i) Number of irrigation wells
- ii) activities of ground water survey and Development Agency.
- iii) minor irrigation works
- iv) major and medium irrigation projects, and
- v) area irrigated under major and medium projects

- i) Atpadi (taluka- Atpadi)
- ii) Jath (taluka- Jath)
- iii) Mhaisál (taluka- Miraj)

collected by the District Statistical Officer through the Block Statistical Assistants are given in table no. 19. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census- 1970 are given in table no. 20. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the eleventh livestock census are given in table no. 21. The tahsil-wise data on 'famine and scarcity' are given in table no. 22 & 23 for the year 1976-77.

2.11 Animal Husbandry and Forests -

2.11 Population of livestock and poultry as per livestock census, 1972 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table no. 24. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of livestock are given in table nos. 25 & 26. Table no. 27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in a recognised slaughter house in the district.

2.12 The data on 'area under forests' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1976-77 have been shown in tables 28(a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into

i) reserved,
ii) protected, and
iii) unclassified forests under the control of State Revenue department and under State Forests Department, has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table no.10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitations and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to 'inaccessible forests' or 'unoccupied waste'.

Inland fisheries

2.13 The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and ~~reservoirs~~ reservoirs; area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in table no. 29(A).

Employment, Industry and Electricity

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, man-days worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the year 1975 and 1976 in table nos.30,31 and 32. The term factory includes -
a) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power
b) those employing 20 or more workers working without aid of power and
c) those registered under the Factory Act 1948, even though the above conditions are fulfilled, the Defence Factories are excluded. Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year is given in table no.33. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register-

at the end of the month, occupation-wise and sectorial, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table no.34,35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee scheme works is also given in table no.36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1976-77 is given in table no.38 and no.of towns and villages electrified during * and upto end of selected years are shown in table no.39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric Supply Companies and Sugar - factories in the district.

Co-operation-

2.16 Statistical information on the co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1976-77 on the following items.

- i. Loan advanced by Cooperative banks and primary agricultural credit societies- different types of societies, their - membership.
- ii) Total value of purchase and sales by the central and primary co-operative marketing societies, and
- iii) Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of Sangli district in tables 40 to 46. Tahsilwise data regarding no.of members, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered etc. have also been given.

Working capital - It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table number 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the agricultural produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban credit cooperative societies and salary earners cooperative societies is to promote the qualities of economy, and co-operation among the members and also to make them industries. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily - available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purpose, to run Montessories, primary schools and educational institutions for - educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or co-operative societies in its area of operation.

Medical & Public Health -

2.24 In this section, data on medical and Public Health for the year 1976 is given. Table no.48 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith infor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'vital statistics' e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1976 with break-up into male and female and no.of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1971 to 1976 gives in - tables no.49 and 50 respectively. Vaccination statistics and Cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1976 is given in table no.51. Table no.52 gives statistics on family planning during the year 1976-77.

Education-

2.25 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table no.53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table nos. 54 and 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with no.of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in table no.56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table nos. 57 to 59.

Transport and Communication-

2.26 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in table no.60 The table no.61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal councils/contonment ~~xxx~~ boards are also shown seperately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in -

Kolhapur region covering Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in table no.62.(districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to Pune division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are - given in table no.63(Maharashtra State Transport division comprises of Sangli district). Results of traffic census conducted in December 1975 on important roads in Sangli district are given in table no.64 Statistics on Postal, Telegraphs and telephones - facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in the table nos. 65 and 66 respectively.

Local bodies -

2.27 The financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1976-77.

2.28 The number of village panchayats include number of independent Village Panchayats as also group village panchayats, income and expenditure of village panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and panchayat samities for developmental activities. Government grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants; Government grants in respect of municipal - councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purpose, for medical purpose and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of zilla parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz. -

- i. self raised resources
- ii) Government grants
- iii) grants for agency scheme and
- iv) Debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads-

Revenue expenditure and Debt section.

2.29 The data are collected from the zilla parishad, Sangli and all the municipal councils in Sangli district.

Plan and Community Development -

2.30 Data on Plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1976-77 are given respectively in table nos. 71 and 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme, stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in table nos. 73 to 75.

Prices -

2.31 The table no.76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.32 The table no.77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities of Sangli head-quarter during 1976. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district headquarter, the averages shown ~~are~~ for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table no.78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Solapur and Pune centres for the year 1976-77. For the calculation of index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as 'base year' for Solapur and Pune centres respectively.

Miscellaneous -

2.33 Statistical data, pertaining to ~~the~~ police force, crime statistics, cases disposed of in civil and criminal courts, - cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres, no.of banking offices, no.of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and no.of joint stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published etc. are given in the table nos. 79 to 89. Table no.90 gives information about the quantity of Rice, Wheat and Sugar issued ~~to~~ fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Sangli district are indicated in table no.91. Statistics relating to General Elections of Assembly 1972 and Loksabha 1977 are presented in table no.92.

2.34 A table showing trend in selected indicators in the fields of development, such as -

- i) agriculture
 - ii) livestock
 - iii) industry
 - iv) education
 - v) health, etc.
- is appended at the end.

These collected indicators are very useful for assessing - progress in various fields over important periods in the - recent past.

CHAPTER-III
AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS
1975-76.

3.1 Aim of this Chapter is to analyse the trends observed in Sangli district and tahsils in it in various socio economic sectors during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 in comparison with the past period. The statistical data presented in part II of this issue has been utilized as a base for reviewing the sectorial trends presented in this chapter.

3.2 Agriculture -

Agriculture is the backbone of our economy. Rural life in in mainly dependent of Agriculture and hence agricultural backwardness is one and the prominent problem of our economy even today. The State of Maharashtra and the Sangli district, are no exception to this. In fact, in this area it is more pronounced. Hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scarcity and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, in-adequate irrigational facilities, poor use of chemical fertilizers, all those have marred the productivity of the agriculture.

3.3 Percentage of gross area sown -

During the year 1975-76, out of the total geographical area of 861100 hectares of this district, 715800 hectares of land (i.e. 83.12 %) was cultivable. Out of this cultivable area, an area of 607600 hectares was net cropped area giving a percentage of 83.34 in 1975-76. This percentage was 86.46 in 1974-75. The following table will give tahsilwise percentage of net cropped area to total cultivable area for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

3.4 From the table it is observed that the percentage of net area sown to total cultivable area is decreased in 1975-76 to that of 1974-75. This is because of some unfavourable weather conditions prevailed in the year 1975-75 and as such some area remained fallow. While seeing the figure of 1975-76 it is observed that the percentage is higher in Shirala with 96.99 followed by Khanapur with 96.73 per cent. The lowest percentage 77.17 is observed in Kavathe Mahankal tahsil.

3.5 The percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown in each tahsil of Sangli district is shown in following table -

3.6 The percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area mostly depends on favourable weather conditions i.e. sufficient timely rain. If rain fails the prospect of second crop also become bleak. During the year 1975-76 the weather conditions were not so favourable and hence double crop also less as compared to 1974-75 figures. The district percentage decreased from 104 to 103. The decrease in percentage is observed in 5 out of 7 tahsils. Only in two tahsils viz. Jath and Kavathe Mahankal it is more than that of 1974-75 figures.

3.8 More than two third of the total working population of this district is dependent on agriculture and as such rate of major portion of the total population is closely related to the condition of agricultural activities. The table above will give -

tahsilwise net area sown per agricultural worker. The net area per worker is decreased from 1.80 hect. in 1974-75 to 1.74 hectares in 1975-76. In tahsils, the highest net area per worker in 1975-76 is available in Atpadi tahsil as 3.66 and lowest is 1.07 hectare in Walwa tahsil.

Productivity of important crops -

3.9 The principal crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra, Rice, Wheat, Gram, Tur, Groundnut and Sugarcane. The following table furnishes the information about ~~mixcrop~~ yield per hectare.

3.10 From the table it is seen that the yield rates of all crops have increased except that of Tur for the year 1975-76 over 1974-75. The comparisons of the figure of 1961-62 to 1975-76, shows that the yield rates, except those of cotton and tobacco & jowar have increased considerably in 1975-76. The years 1976-66 and 1971-72 were affected by some scarcity conditions and hence yield rates are not comparable. The increase in the yield rates can be attributed to the use of improved agricultural practices.

Irrigation -

3.11. The percentage of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated in Sangli district was only 113 in 1960-61. In 1971-72 it rose to 118. In 1972-73, however, there was sudden fall to 110 due to scarcity conditions. The position in the tahsils also show ups and downs in the double irrigated area over these years.

3.13. The above table shows that in 1973-74, the double irrigated area recorded a rise of 2 percent over the 1972-73 figure. The significant achievement was in Khanapur, Miraj, Tasgaon and Atpadi tahsils. However, there was sudden down fall in percentage of double irrigated area in Shirala tahsil. From the level of 120 percent to 100 percent in 1973-74.

3.15 The percentage increased in the year 1973-74 as compared to the year 1972-73 in Khanapur, Shirala, Tasgaon and Miraj tahsils only. In the remaining tahsils the same was found to have been decreased. As a result, the percentage for the district as a whole, also decreased.

3.16 The percentage of net irrigated to net cropped area was highest in Walwa tahsil during 1973-74. Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils occupied second and third position. Khanapur stood last in the rank.

Changes in the cropping pattern -

3.17 The table given below depicts the picture of share of different crops in gross cropped area and thereby throws light on changes in the cropping pattern.

3.13 From the above table it is observed that during the 15 years span the area under total food crops is decreasing while that of non food crop is increasing. The area under food crops was 78.13 percent in 1960-61, became 75.36 percent, in 1971-72 and remained same 75.36 percent in 1975-76. Under food crops also percentage of cereals decreased from 63.95 in 1960-61 to 56.67 percent in 1975-76. Percentage decreased in Jowar is prominent, it is decreased from 33.99 percent in 1960-61 to 33.81 percent in 1975-76, while the percentage of rice and wheat shown some improvement in 1975-76 over 1960-61. The percentage of sugarcane which was 1.36 percent in 1960-61 increased considerably and reached 3.94 percent in 1975-76. In case of non food crops the percentage which was 21.87 in 1960-61 increased to 24.65 percent in 1975-76.

3.19 Agricultural Credit and Outstanding dues-

In order to increase agricultural production substantially, investment on large scale is quite essential. But due to poor conditions of farmers, investment from their own resources is not possible. In turn the inputs in agriculture suffers and ultimately returns from agriculture gets affected. So as to increase the investment in agriculture, agricultural credit societies were formed. All the villages in this district are covered under cooperation. The following table will give the position of agricultural credit societies in the district for 1960-61, 1965-66, 1975-76 and 1976-77.

3.20 The above table reveals that the no. of societies which were 511 in 1960-61 increased to 519 in 1976-77 and membership from 86000 to 188886 in 1976-77. This is 119.63 percent increase over 1960-61 figure. In case of loans advanced also it is increased fourfold for Rs. 162.59 lakhs to 656.20 lakh in 1976-77. Most alarming thing is that the overdues also increased from nearly 7.50 lakhs in 1965-66 to 560.07 lakhs in 1976-77.

Agricultural Wage Rates

3.21 The data of agricultural wage rates are collected from three rural centres of this district viz. Atpadi; Jath and Mhaisal in Miraj tahsil. The following table gives average wages paid to unskilled field labour in three selected centres.

Due to operation of Employment Guarantee Scheme, the wages of field workers are substantially increased and stabilized.

Livestock -

3.22 Animal husbandry in India from the view point of its substantial contribution in providing income and draught power to farmers and subsidiary food to human population, assumes great importance in the rural economy even today. The eleventh live stock census was conducted in 1972 throughout India to gauge the magnitude of this wealth.

The following table gives 1966 and 1972 livestock figures.

3.23 From the above table it is seen that cattle, sheep population is decreased while that of Buffaloes and Goats, is increased when compared with figure of 1972 to 1966. The Buffaloes and Goats were less affected by scarcity conditions prevailed in the district during 1971 to 1973. The poultry is also increasing gradually in the district. In 1961, it was 4.98 lakhs while it rose 6.25 lakhs in 1966 and to 6.46 lakhs in 1972. In the year 1961 the no. of poultry per thousand population was 405. The same is increased to 420 in 1972.

3.24 The no. of livestock per 100 hectare of cultivable area was 123 in 1961 and 117 in 1968 in Sangli district. However, it again increased to 123 in 1972. The number of bullocks, used for working, decreased in 1972 as compared to 1966. Gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks was 9.08 hectares in 1961, 9.30 hectares in 1966 and 9.46 hectares in 1972. This reveals the decrease in number of working bullocks.

3.25 Within the district, the tahsil of Walwa has the largest no. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The tahsils of Atpadi, Shirala and Tasgaon also have the livestock more than the district average. The Jath tahsil has the lowest number of livestock per hectare of cultivable land.

Consumption of Electricity -

3.26 ~~THE PER CAPITA CONSUMPTION~~ The consumption of electricity is also one important indicator of economic development. The per capita consumption of electricity in Sangli district was 15.32 KWH in 1961-62 which rose to 36.53 Kwh in 1965-66. The figure for the year 1971-72 was 68.05. The per capita consumption of electricity increased to 120.44 Kwh in 1976-77. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1976-77 increased to 8 times as compared to figures of 1961-62.

Enrolment in employment exchange and vacancies notified

3.27 Employment generation is one of the most important aims of planning in a overpopulated country like India. Employment Exchange statistics give an indication of the magnitude of the unemployment problem though to a very limited extent, because the majority of unemployed persons do not avail of the facilities provided by the employment exchange.

3.28 The position of Sangli district regarding registration and vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the table given below.

3.29 During the year 1976-77 the enrolment is 11468 while it was 13531 in 1975-76 i.e. 15.25 percent decrease in 1976-77 over the figure of 1975-76. The same is the case with vacancies notified and placement of candidates. During the year 1975-76 & 1976-77 the vacancies notified were 1967 and 1402 respectively, while placement of candidate is 765 and 584 respectively. The persons on live register were 17965 in 1975-76 and the number increased to 19709 in 1976-77.

3.35 The Boys and Girls in the primary schools increased respectively by 1.76 percent and 2.39 percent in 1976-77 as compared to the figures of ¹⁹⁷⁵⁻⁷⁶ -77. As regards secondary schools, the strength of boys and girls increased by 6.54 and 6.34 percent respectively in 1976-77 over 1975-76.

Transport and Communication -

3.36 Roads constitute one of the important items in the infrastructure of a country's economy. The extent of road facilities available can be judged by working out road length per 100 sq. km of area. In Sangli district, the road length per 100 km. area was 26.04 km, in 1960-61, which increased to 78.96 km. in 1975-76. It further increased to 90.55 km. in 1976-77. The sizable increase occurred in 1976-77 was due to completion of other type of roads which were under construction in scarcity.

Banking Facilities -

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to Population

3.37 In 1961, there were 34 banking offices of different types in Sangli district. The same rose to 136 as on 31st December 1976. In 1961, there were 3 bank offices per lakh of population and at the end of 31st December 1976, the same increased to 12 offices.

Prices -

3.38 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at district headquarter in the Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. From the collected data, the trend of the prices of important commodities during 1976 can be ascertained.

3.39 The prices in respect of items like cereals and pulses under food, sugar, gur, edible oil and vanaspati, condiments and spices; vegetables; clothing; charcoal; match box; firewood etc. under kerosene fuel, tea and coffee under beverages; and washing soap, pan, supari, tobacco, cigarettes, hair oil etc., under miscellaneous articles, have shown rising trend since 1962.

3.40 The General Index Number of Sholapur and Pune centres for 1976-77 were 308 and 237 respectively.

CHAPTER-IV
ANNUAL PLAN- 1976-77

4.1 The year 1976-77 is the third year of the Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-79. In accordance with the Government decision that district should be treated as an 'unit' for Planning from the year 1974-75, the idea of Plan from below was started operating and basic concept of planning, undergone important, fundamental changes. The past experience in the field of planning revealed that the approach of directing - development in the State from above had not only distorted the state priorities but it had not given due regard to the variety of conditions exististing within the different areas.

4.2 The process of district planning required a sharper edge, a better technical base and a greater sophistication. The financial ceilings were communicated by the Maharashtra Government to each district on the basis of the requirement of the various programmes for continuation activities. The District Planning and Development Council formulated the district plan and submitted it to the Govt. for approval. The Govt. of Maharashtra approved the plan and the said plan became a part and parcel of the state plan.

4.3 The budget was Rs.4.90 crores for Annual Plan 1976-77. The same was Rs.3.67 crores in 1975-76. The major headwise breakup of the same is as follows -

4.4 The table reveals that the total provision for all district level schemes taken together was more by 33.69 percent in 1976-77 as compared to 1975-76. However there was change in only two major heads. Though in absolute terms the provision for Agrl. programme increased from Rs.142.69 lakhs to Rs.144.88 lakhs, the relative share in total amount decreased from 38.94 percent to 29.56 percent. In respect of Social Services the absolute and relative change was considerable. In respect of other major heads the relative changes were of less ~~sign~~ significance.

4.5 Special features of the budget-

A total outlay of Rs.144.88 lakhs was provided for agricultural programmes which included Rs.80.95 lakhs for Minor Irrigation works and Rs.40 lakhs for D.P.A.P. A equivalent central assistance was anticipated for D.P.A.P. from the Govt. of India.

4.6 Under Dairy Development Rs.6.00 lakhs were provided for a chilling plant under the Town milk supply scheme.

4.7 For medium irrigation projects an amount of Rs.53.01 lakhs was provided which include Rs.20.00 lakhs for Yeralwadi project Rs.26.76 lakhs for Sidhewadi project and Rs.6.25 lakhs for Morna. A total provision of Rs.7.55 lakhs was made for rural electrification and normal development.

4.8 For General Education Rs.51.75 lakhs were released while for water supply and drainage Rs.69.35 lakhs were provided.

4.9 An amount of Rs.60.00 lakhs was provided for Employment Gurantee Scheme.

The following table will give subheadwise expenditure and percentage to the total expenditure during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 under state ~~xxx~~ plan schemes.

4.10 Table No.2 reveals that the pattern of expenditure on different subheads during 1975-76 and 1976-77 was nearly the same. Though there was a good deal of increase in expenditure in almost all sectors, the relative share of Agril. programme, Industry and other programmes is reduced while that of social services, Transport and communications and Irrigation and power is increased. The total increase in the plan expenditure is due to vigorous implementation of certain existing schemes and starting of new schemes as discussed in following paragraphs.

4.11 The following table will give subheadwise percentage of expenditure to budget provision during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 under state plan.

4.13 The first is a staff scheme while the second is famous Page scheme. Under the Page scheme 10 multi crop demonstrations, 2465 horticultural plants, and boring blasting of 19 wells were carried out. Besides 25 pumps, and 128 bores were supplied on subsidy basis. Under the third scheme viz. subsidies for insecticides etc. 148 hectares of white grub and 12000 hectares of rat control measures were undertaken.

4.14 b) Soil Conservation- The budget for the scheme was - Rs.8.26 lakhs as against which the expenditure of Rs.8.25 lakhs was incurred. Two scheme viz. Bunding and Terracing and Afforestation for Soil Conservation were implemented. Under first scheme bunding in 8390 hectare were carriedout while under second scheme afforestation in 146 hectares was started.

c) Drought Prone Area Programme-

4.15 Sangli district is very often affected by scarcity conditions. This district is one of the six centrally assisted districts. Out of the total budget 50% share comes from Central Government. During the year 1976-77 Rs.^{80.00}20.00 lakhs were provided in the budget i.e. including Central share of Rs.40.00 lakhs and out of these Rs.61.56 lakhs were spent (State's share was Rs.30.78 lakhs).

f) Dairy Development -

4.23 The two schemes viz. Town Milk Supply scheme and Organisation of Coop. Milk societies are implemented under this sub-head.

The Budget provisions under these two schemes were respectively Rs.6.06 lakhs and 0.70 lakhs, out of these Rs.4.19 lakhs and Rs.0.70 lakhs were expended respectively. 4.30 a) Irrigation- Three medium irrigation projects viz. Yeralwadi, Sidhewadi and Morna were taken up during 1976-77. On Yeralwadi project Rs.20.00 lakhs were spent while on Sidhewadi project an amount of Rs.27.03 lakhs was spent during the year. On Morna project an expenditure of Rs.10.14 lakhs was incurred. All the three works are in progress.

4.31 b) Power Project- Under this sub-head two schemes viz. Rural Electrification and Normal Development were implemented. Under rural electrification an amount of Rs.1.35 lakhs was spent and one village was electrified while under second scheme of Normal Development, an amount of Rs.6.13 lakhs was spent and 236 agricultural pumps were energised during the year 1976-77.

4.33 The first first scheme is implemented through SICOM Bombay. During the year, 4 industries were given assistance in this district. Under Second scheme an amount of Rs.11.25 lakhs was advanced as share capital contribution and assistance, to one spinning mill, already established in the district. Under third scheme of Financial Assistance under State Aid to Industries Rules, 158 industries were given assistance. Under Dev. of handloom Industries, 2 societies and 250 individual beneficiaries were assisted. Under Industrial Estate scheme, Rs.1.86 lakh were spent for expansion of Industrial Estate at Miraj. The seed money assistance scheme is implemented in collaboration with commercial banks, and through Western Maharashtra Dev. Corporation. Under this scheme 956 educated unemployed persons were given assistance to start their own business in 1976-77. Under the scheme of assistance to industrial cooperatives, 7 societies were given assistance while under last scheme 8 block level artizans societies were given assistance.

V) Transport and Communication-

4.34 During the year an amount of Rs.44.25 lakhs was spent on this sub-head. The expenditure was incurred on ~~expended~~ completion of one bridge, 54 C.D. works, construction of one km. new road and improvement of 19 km roads.

VI) Social Services-

4.35 The major head Social services covers sub heads, General Education, Health, Water supply, Housing, Urban Development, Labour and Labour welfare, welfare of backward classes etc, Subheadwise expenditure is given below -

4.36 In the following paragraphs, important physical achievements under each subhead are indicated.

4.37 General Education- Under this sub-head, as many as 20 schemes are implemented in this district. Important achievements under these schemes are as follows -

4.38 An amount of Rs.0.92 lakhs was spent under Book bank scheme and one bank has been established. An amount of Rs.1.42 lakhs was given as assistance to one 'A' class municipal council. Maintenance grant of Rs.4.00 lakhs was given to 4 colleges in the district. During the year 176 primary classes from Vth to VIIth standard were attached to secondary schools and an amount of Rs.11.10 lakhs was spent on the scheme. With a view to cope up with increasing strength of students in secondary schools, 85 new classes in private secondary schools were opened and an amount of Rs.10.03 lakhs was spent Rs.14.25 lakhs were expended to assist 63 secondary schools for higher education. During the year 25009 students under Economically Backward class, were given concessions and an amount of Rs.6.98 lakhs was spent. A grant of Rs.1.49 lakhs was given to Zilla Parishad for construction of school buildings and 85 rooms were constructed during the year. Under UNISEF aided -

programme 254 kit boxes were supplied and an expenditure of Rs.0.80 lakhs was incurred on this programme. In addition to above, 3 summer courses were conducted in which 90 secondary teachers were trained, 532 primary teachers were given inservice training, 554 childrens of primary teachers were given free education.

4.39 b) Health - Under this subhead 4 schemes were implemented. Out of these, three are regarding primary health centre like construction of staff quarter, increasing medicinal supply and grant for primary health centres. Fourth scheme is about increasing facilities in Ayurvedic Dispensaries. Out of the allotted amount of Rs.5.49 lakhs, the expenditure of Rs.4.24 ^{lakhs} was incurred on these schemes.

4.40 c) Nutrition Programme- Rs.0.10 lakhs were spent on Nutrition programme in one selected block viz. Vita.

4.41 d) Water supply and Drainage- The scheme viz. Govt. water supply scheme, Rural water supply, Dry latrines and GSDA - programme were implemented. Under first scheme, an amount of - Rs.13.63 lakhs was spent on work of Miraj water supply scheme. Under second scheme, Rs.0.22 were spent and two water supply - schemes were completed. In state sector, an amount of Rs.25.89 lakhs was spent and two schemes were completed while 13 were in progress. Under Dry latrine schemes an amount of Rs.0.32 lakhs was spent and 42 latrines were constructed. Under GSDA scheme Rs.3.00 lakhs were expended and 19 hores were constructed. - Rs.0.85 lakhs were spent for constructing 35 wells.

4.42 e) Housing- Under this sub-head an amount of Rs.4.94 lakhs was spent and 5 schemes were implemented as follows. Under the scheme of provision of house sites and construction of huts,

Rs.0.51 lakhs were spent and 234 huts were constructed. Under second scheme of extension of Gaothan, an amount of Rs.0.06 lakhs was spent for 1 village. Under the scheme of tiling the roofs of huts, an amount of Rs.1.00 lakhs was spent and 175 huts were renovated with tiles. In one Zopadapatti (slum) basic amenities were supplied at the cost of Rs.0.54 lakhs. Under the last scheme viz. Rural Housing Rs.2.83 lakhs were spent and 130 houses were constructed.

4.43 f) Urban Development - The only scheme of Financial Assistant to Municipal council for the implementation of Dev. plans, was implemented and an amount of Rs.2.15 lakhs was given an assistance to 6 municipalities for the same.

g) Welfare of Backward classes

4.44 Under this subhead as many as 11 schemes were implemented. The details of important schemes implemented areas follows- An amount of Rs.0.21 lakhs was given as stipend to 92 backward class students in Industrial Training Institute. Rs.2.43 lakhs were expended for giving scholarships to 335 (post S.S.C.) backward class students. Financial Assistance to the tune of Rs.0.67 lakhs expended to B.C. housing societies and 85 houses were constructed. Rs.0.40 lakhs were given as grant of tuition fees to 1010 students. An amount of Rs.1.08 lakhs was given as grant to B.C. hostels with 294 students. One Harijan colony was improved at the cost of Rs.0.50 lakhs. Grant to the tune of Rs.0.57 lakhs was given to 3 Ashram Schools.

h) Labour and Labour Welfare

4.45 Under this sub head three schemes are implemented. Under first scheme of inservice training to industrial labourers, machinery worth Rs.1.00 lakhs was purchased, while under second scheme of Apprentiship Rs.0.27 lakhs were spent. Under third

scheme of E.S.I., an amount of Rs.0.19 lakhs was spent, for salary of the staff of dispensary at Madhavnagar.

4.46 Other Schemes - Under this broad head the very - important scheme, 'Employment Gurantee Scheme' and Community Radio scheme are included.

a) Employment Gurantee Scheme -

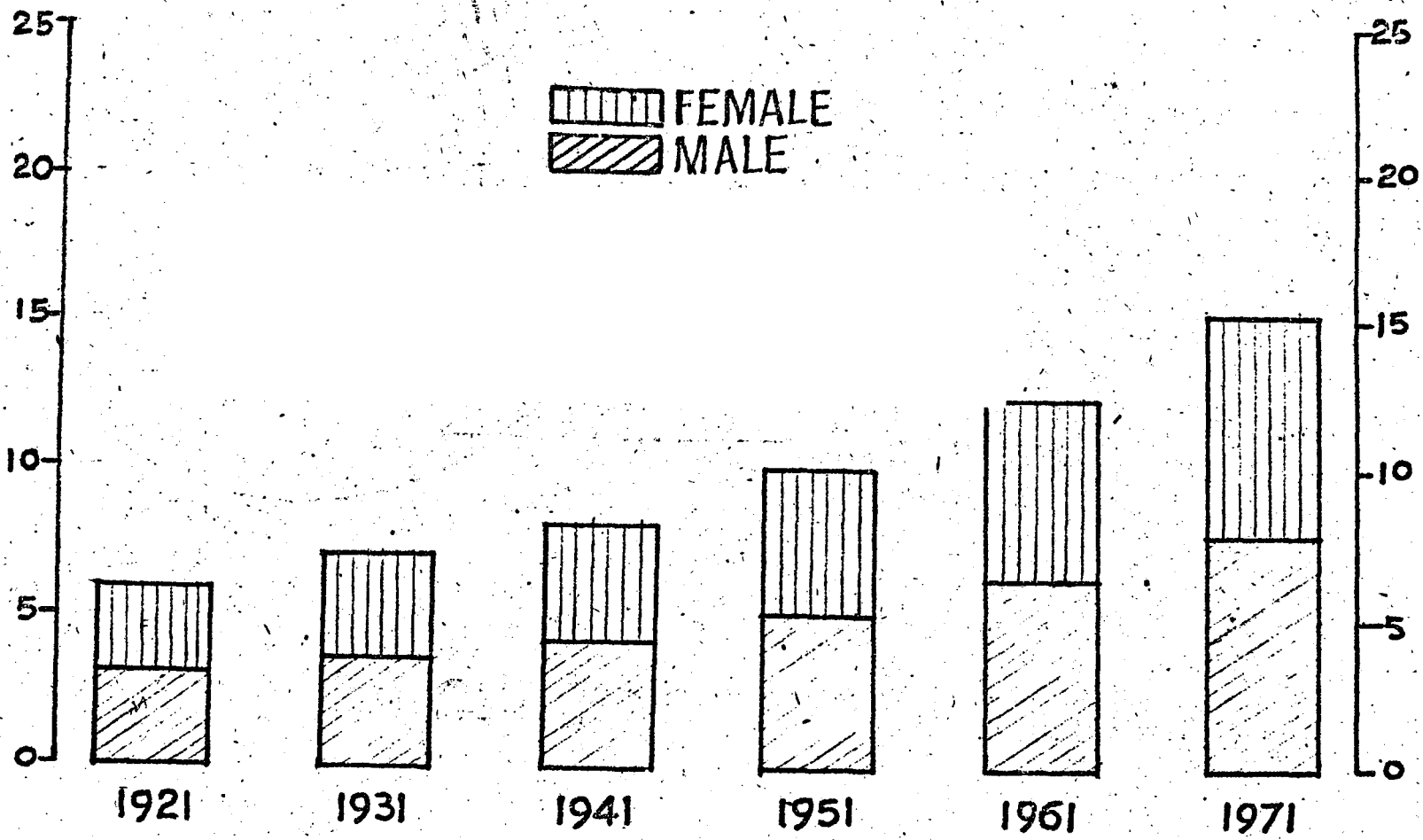
4.47 The main object of the scheme is to provide gainful and productive employment, (gainful to the individual and - productive to the economy), on approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the area of 'C' class municipal councils, who are in need of work and are willing to do manual labour. The guarantee is for unskilled work and work will be given at panchayat samiti level. The budgetory provisions for this scheme, is ~~xx~~ of supplementary nature in as much as the works which are not being accommodated in plan or non-plan funds are taken up under E.G.S. The scheme is being implemented since 1972-73.

4.48 During the year 1976-77, an amount of Rs.116.23 lakhs was incurred on this scheme. Table No.36 gives the factual data. Till the year under report, the following works were completed.

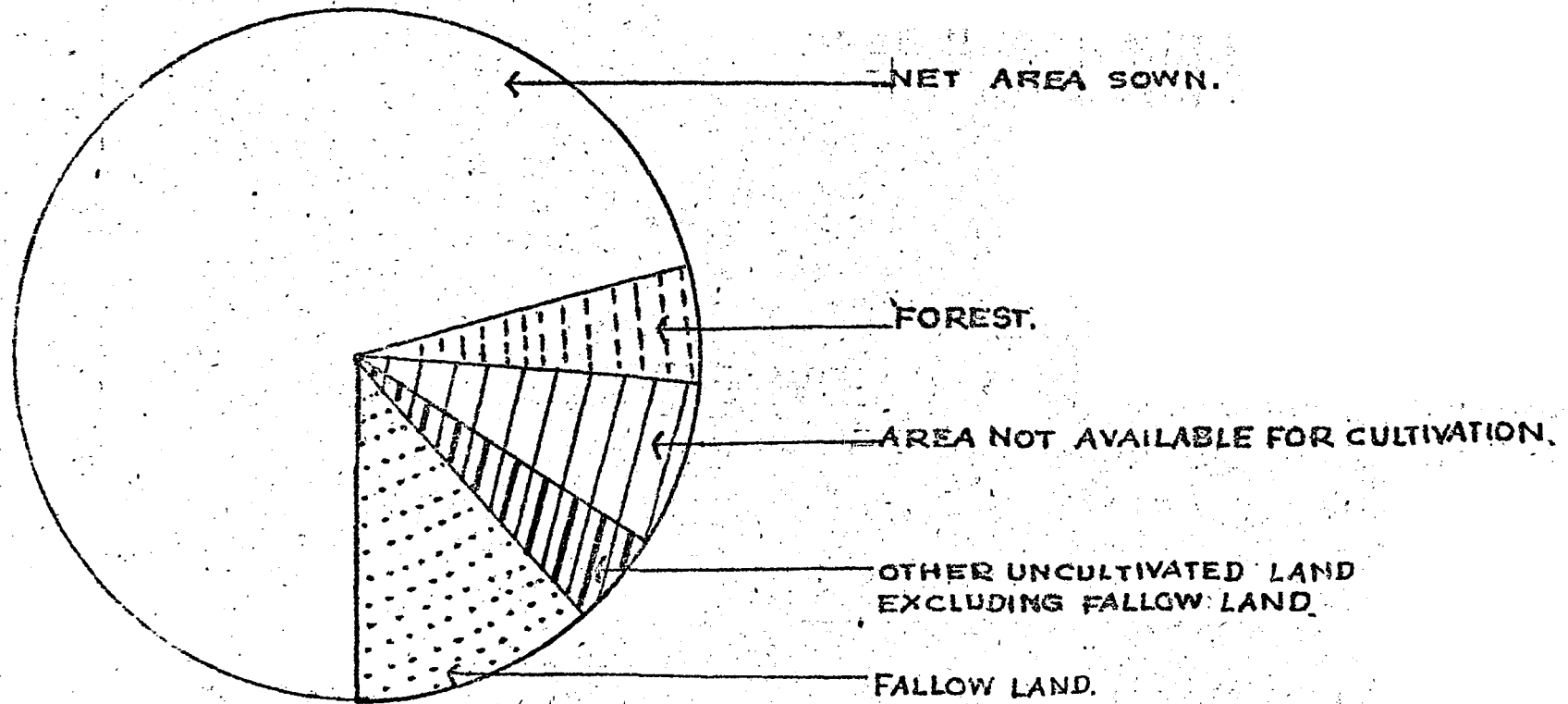

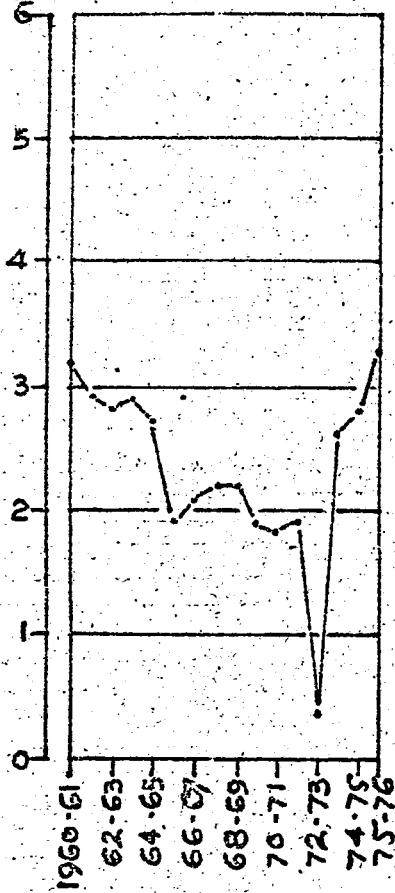

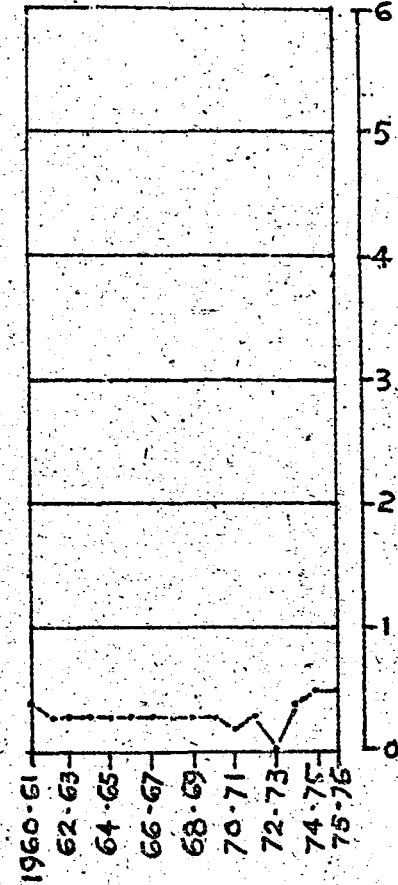

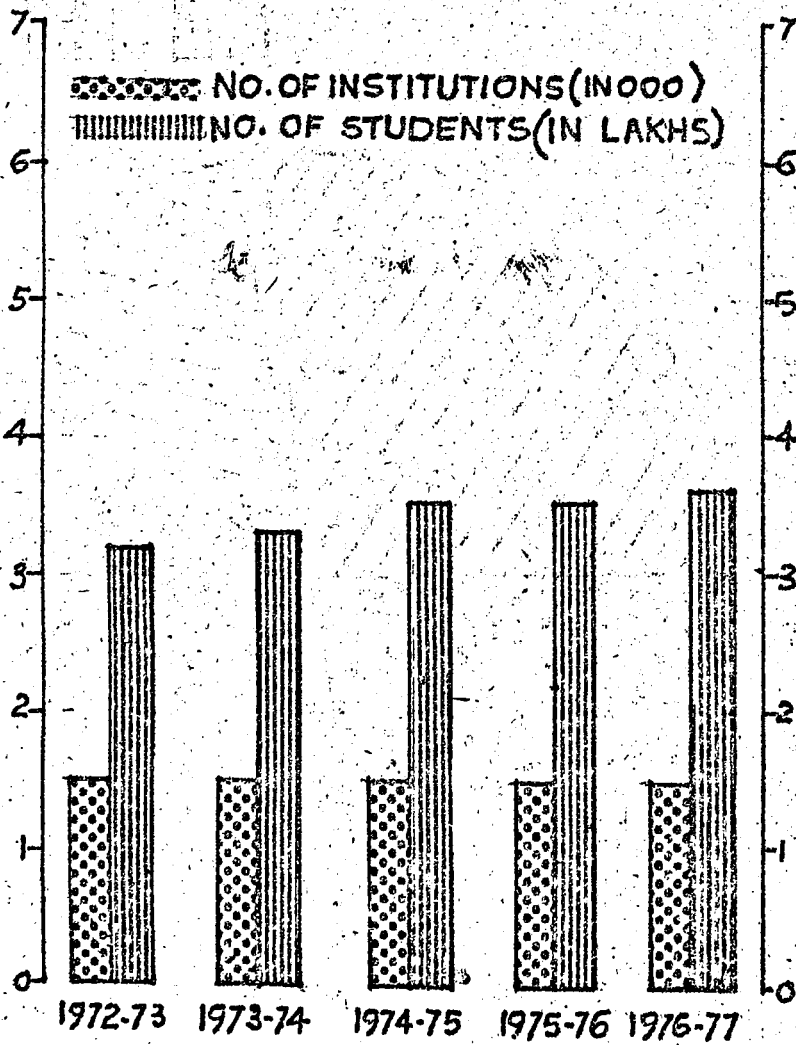

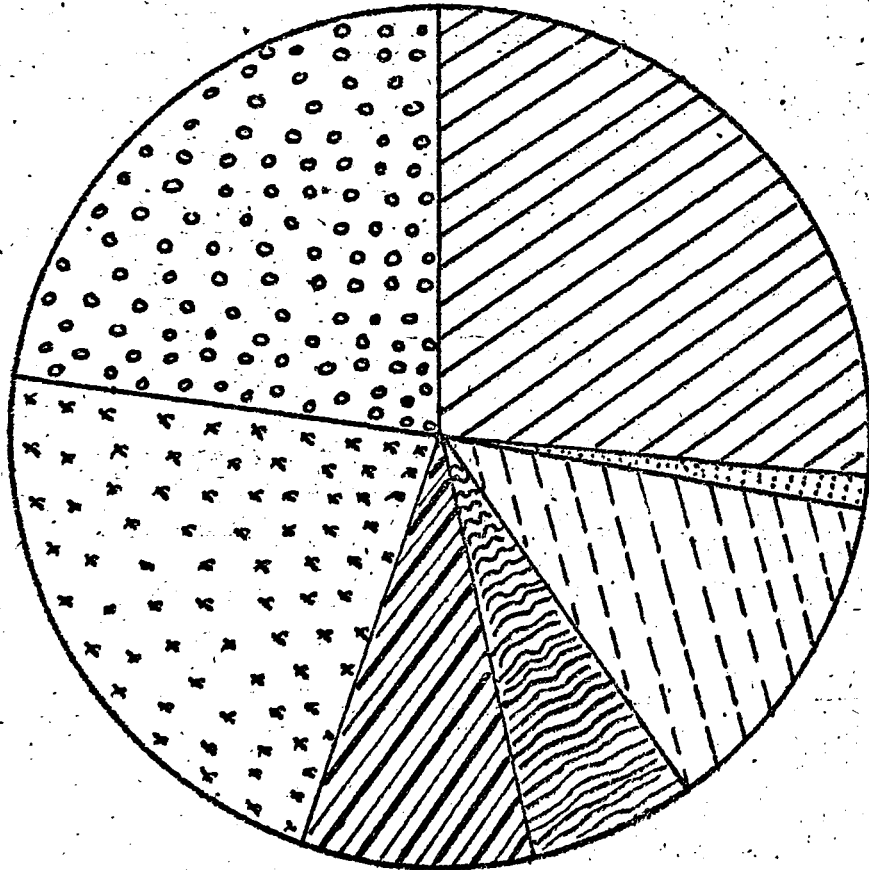
GROWTH OF CO-OPERATION GANGLI DISTRICT
