CHAPTER : I.

LOCATION, TOPOGRAPHY, DEMOGRAPHY AND SPECIAL FEATURES.

1.1 LOCATION - Sangli district is one of the parts of the famous "Deccan Plateau". It lies between 16°-45' and 17°-33' North Latitudes and 73°-42' and 75°-40' East Longitudes. This district is bounded on East by Bijapur district in Karnataka State, on the West by the - district Ratnagiri, on the South by the district of Kolhapur and Belgaum district of Karnataka State. The districts Satara and Solapur lies on the North boundaries of this district.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY -

This district falls partly in Krishna basin and partly in Bhima basin. Consequently, it is divided into different drain systems. The whole district can also be divided into three different parts on the basis of topography, climatology and rainfall. viz.

- i) Western hilly area of Shirala tahsil with heavy rainfall.
- ii) The basic area of Krishna, Warna and Yerla comprising of Walwa tahsil, Eastern part of Shirala tahsil and Western parts of Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils.
- iii) Eastern draught prone areas which comprises eastern parts of Miraj and Tasgaon tahsils, North-Eastern part of Khanapur and whole of Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal and Jath tahsils.

1.3 HILL RANGES -

There are two main systems of hills, viz. i) Sahyadri ranges, and its offshoots, (ii) Offshoots of Mahimangad-Panhala ranges.

1.3.1 The western part of Shirala tahsil is covered by Sahyadri hill ranges covering Bhairavgarh offshoots. These ranges rise to a height of 915 metres above mean sea level at the extreme west and drops down to 610 metres at the eastern borders of Shirala tahsil. The Machindragarh hill ranges is the offshoot of main

Mahadev range running along the common boundaries of Walwa, Tasgaon and Khanapur tahsils. It is to the north of Krishna river and rises sharply to a height of 762 metres above mean sea level with table lands on the top.

1.3.2 Another Spur of Mahadeo range known as Mahimangad-Panhala spur stretches upto Khanapur. At Khanapur, it splits into two parts. one branch passes 32 kms. in the south till it ends in the old Panhala fort 10 kms. from Kolhapur city. The other branch stretches south east to Bilur about 8 kms. south-west of Jath. This range divides the district between Krishna and Bhima basins. It forms water dividing line and rises in three steps covered with terraces. The heights sealed by these ranges found to be between 636 to 838 metres above mean sea level.

1.4 RIVER SYSTEMS-

Krishna, with its Warna and Yerela tributaries, flows through the western part of the district. Warna flows from West to East along the southern boundaries of the district and joins Krishna river at Haripur near Sangli City. Yerela flows from north-west to south-east and after traversing the western parts of Khanapur and Tasgaon tahsils, joins Krishna near Brahmanal. All these rivers are the lifelines of the western half of the district and serve as a source for large irrigation schemes.

Agrani, Man, and Bor rivers constitute the drain system for the eastern part of the district. The water resources from these rivers are very limited and these rivers remain dry for the major part of the year.

1.5 SOILS -

The type and nature of soil is one of the important factors influencing the cropping pattern in the area. The fertility of the land depends on the type of soil, its depth, slope, its chemical composition and the drain system. The soils of varied texture and structure are observed in Sangli district.

1.5.1 The soil in the western part of the district, comprising area from Shirala tahsil, is formed from red laterite mixed with hard murum due to the hilly nature of the zone. This type of soil contains iron compounds and has a good property of drainage.

1.5.2 The central portion of the district which covers areas of Walwa, Tasgaon(Part) and Miraj(Part) tahsils has deep black soils capable of yielding bumper kharip crops. These soils which are highly retentive of moisture also grow rabbi jowar, wheat, gram and cash crops like sugarcane, turmeric, chillies, grapes etc. This central portion is thus the rich agricultural tract of the district.

1.5.3 The rest eastern part of the district comprising Miraj (part), Tasgaon(part), Khanapur(part) and whole of Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal and Jath tahsils has a shallow poor grey soils, is a well known. scarcity tract. Bajra, cotton, jowar are the main crops of this zone.

1.6 CLIMATE. WINDS AND RAINFALL :

1.6.1 The district broadly can be divided into three agro climate zones as under.

i) Western part of Shirala tahsil

ii) Tahsils of Shirala (East), Walwa, Miraj (West), Tasgaon (West) and Khanapur (south-West)

iii) Tahsils of Khanapur, Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal, Jath, Miraj (East) and Tasgaon (East). The climate gets hotter and drier towards the east and humidity goes on increasing towards the west. The maximum temperature ranges between 31.1°C in July to 41.5°C in April. Similarly, the minimum temperature ranges from 10.3°C in December to 21.5°C from April to June. The percentage of humidity at 3.30 hours varies from 54 percent in March to 87 percent in August. Similarly, percentage of humidity at 17.30 hours varies from 30 percent in April to 79 percent in July. The climate in the district is fairly

tolerable throughout the year. The winter is pleasant from December to February. The summer season starts from mid-February to the end of May. June to September are the months of normal rainy season.

1.6.2 Generally, the winds blow moderate. In the rainy season their velocity is high and the direction is from south-west to north-east, more frequently towards east. In the post monsoon periods, the winds are predominantly blow from north-east or east. By February the winds blow in west and north-west directions. This is a predominant feature of summer. Thunder storms occur in the hot and in the post monsoon seasons. The beginning and the end of the rainy season is generally marked by the rainfall often associated with thunders.

1.6.3 The rain starts sometimes in the middle of June and lasts till the end of September in the district. Major portion of the rainfall in the district is received between July and September. During the first half of the season, most of the days are cloudy with drizzling rains, whereas during the latter half it rains torrentially.

The western portion of Shirala tahsil gets heavy rainfall on an average over 2000 mm in a year. The central and eastern portion receive annual rainfall measuring about 750 mms. The north-eastern portion received the lowest rainfall in the district averaging about 500 mms. in a year.

The fact finding committee, appointed by Govt. of Maharashtra in 1973 has declared that there are six tahsils, namely Atpadi, Jath, Kavathe-Mahankal, Miraj (East), Tasgaon (East) and Khanapur (East) which fall in the broad drought zone. Although the Sangli district was one of the nine severely scarcity affected districts of Maharashtra State in the year 1972-73, there were no scarcity or akin to scarcity condition in the district after 1972-73 except some revenue circles of Jath and Kavathe-

Mahankal tahsils were scarcity affected in the year 1978-79.

1.7 MINERAL RESOURCES -

The geological formation of the district is the Deccan trap of "Plateau-Basalt", some deposits of calcium carbonate and bauxite containing high percentage of alumina are observed in this district. The bauxite deposits are found on the plateaus in extreme western part of Shirala tahsil, the same being not economically exploitable at present. The other minerals are building stone, clay, slit, sand and limestone. A good clay for brick and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers, particularly on the banks of Krishna, Warna and Yerla.

1.8 FOREST -

The total area under forests in this district according to the Statistician, Forest department is 46,994 hectares in the year 1978-79 which is nearly 5.45 percent of the total geographical area of the district. The dense forest is observed in extreme west boundaries of Shirala tahsil only.

1.9 AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY -

1.9.1 Sangli district has an area of 8563 sq.kms. The population of the district was 15,39,820 and 13,26,178 as per 1971 and 1981 census respectively. The urban population of the district was 18.63 and 21.53 as per 1971 and 1981 census respectively. The rest of the population lived in rural areas. The density of population was observed to be 180 and 273 for district as a whole for 1971 and 1981 census respectively. The density of population was 151 and 1027 persons per sq.km. for rural and urban areas respectively as per 1971 census.

1.9.2 The decennial increase of population as compared to 1961 census was 25.12 percent of total population and it was 49.09 percent in urban areas and 20.67 percent in rural areas. The decennial growth rate in 1971-81 census is 18.60 percent. The following table will give tahsilwise position in this respect.

1.9.3 The sex ratio (No. of females per 1000 males) was 949 and 971 as per 1971 and 1981 census respectively. Literary percentage of population in district was 37.5. It was 51.0 percent in males and 23.2 percent in females. The percentage of literacy was 46.34 in 1981 census. It was 59.06 and 33.02 percent for males and females respectively as per 1981 census. The population of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes was 1,72,923 and 7303 respectively in 1971 while in 1981 it reached to 2,04,352 & 15,535 respectively.

1.10 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT -

1.10.1 There are no major industries in this district which are based on mine deals owing to lack of important mineral deposits in the district as stated earlier.

1.10.2 The industrial development is observed mainly in Sangli-Miraj-Madhavnagar urban complex. Other industrial growth centres in the district are located at Kirloskarwadi and Vita. There are three sugar factories in the district run by co-operative located at Sangli Sakharale (Walwa) and Chikhali (Shirala) and two Khandasari sugar factories located at Kavathe-Mahankal and Jath. Textile industries are located at Madhavnagar, Sangli, Miraj and Kupwad only. The Screening Committee of Govt. of India has sanctioned the proposal of starting one sugar factory each in Walwa and Atpadi tahsils.

1.10.3 As per Economic Census 1977, there were 9702 establishments in the district out of which 3523 were found in urban areas. 67,312 out of total 73,155 usually employed workers were hired workers in these establishments. In urban areas, 33613 out of total 37,530 usually employed workers were hired workers.

1.10.4 Agro-oriented industries are very few in the district, generally are seasonal, for example gur industries. Sangli city is well known for "Vayade Bazar" in turmeric. Agriculturists in some of the tahsils of this district use quite modern developed scientific technology in Agriculture to produce bumper crops like sugarcane, seedless grapes, rose-grapes and mango grapes nurseries.

1.10.5 The dairy development has a notable share in the economy of this district. There is one Government Milk dairy having capacity of 1,20,000 liters of milk collection per day located at Miraj and other six cooperative dairy sanghs collecting milk from every corner of the district. There are two chilling plants at Kadegaon and Jath in Government sector one mini chilling plant at Karanjavade in Walwa tahsil started functioning. The dairy sanghs and Govt. dairy Miraj had collected over 3,45 lakh liters of milk in the year 1979-80.

1.11 SPECIAL FEATURES -

Sangli district is famous for the following special features

- i) Shetakari Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana, located at Sangli is one of the largest sugar factories in Asia with its daily crushing capacity of 5500 tonnes. Besides, there are two sugar factories located at Sakharale(Walwa) and Chikhali(Shirala), Walwa sugar factory has started its new acetone project.
- ii) Tasgaon chaman grapes(seedless thompson) are not only famous in India but in middle east countries also. There is more than 800 hectares of area under this crop in the district.
- iii) Miraj city is famous for sitar makers. It is a skilled hereditary occupation of specialised artisans of Miraj.
- iv) Sangli city is famous throughout India and abroad for its forwarding market centre in turmeric.
- v) Marathe Engineering Industries of Miraj is famous not only in India but in Western developed countries too for its highly sophisticated electrical and electronic controls mainly for textile industries. It is heartening to note that this industry has won the "Phonesia International Trade Trophy - 1978" from Malta.
- vi) Sangli district is famous for its milk products. Govt. dairy at Miraj with its daily capacity of 1.20 lakh liters is functioning with its full power.
- vii) Sangli and Miraj cities are well known for availabilities of best medical facilities. Number of well equipped medical institutions are located in and around these two cities. Miraj Mission Hospital is the biggest medical centre where eminent surgeons are renowned consultants render medical services.
- viii) Maharashtra State electricity Board, Sangli has electrified 485 villages in eight talukas of this district which contributes to 88 percent of electrification in the district by the end of Sept-1980.
- ix) A godown of 4000 tonnes capacity for storage of chemical fertilizers is under construction on behalf of Marketing Federation in the premises of M.D.D.C. Sangli.

x) A biggest major earthen irrigation project namely "Chandoli project" is under construction on the river Warna at Chandoli in Shirala tahsil. It will submerge 301 sq. kms. of area and will store 964 million cubic metre of water after its completion. This project will bring 49,150 hectares of area under irrigation by its left bank canal in Sangli district and by its right bank canal area of 36,275 hectares in Kolhapur district will be directly irrigated.

xi) Yeralwadi, Basappawadi, Siddhewadi, Morna, Doddanala are other medium irrigation projects in the district. These projects are constructed on Yerala, Kokalendla, Agrani, Morna and Doddanala rivers and nalas respectively.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1978-80. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co-operation' is for the Co-operative year (1st July to 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

District At a Glance :-

2.2 Certain essential data on important spheres, such as,

- i) Population
- ii) Agriculture
- iii) Animal husbandry
- iv) Industries
- v) Co-operation
- vi) Medical and Public Health.
- vii) Education
- viii) Transport and communication
- ix) Plan Expenditure etc.,

pertaining to the district is presented alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

District Statistical Abstract :-

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

Area and Population :-

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc., are presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variation during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non workers, population

of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, distribution of population according to age groups and religion are also given in these tables.

2.5 (a) Urban Area :-

The following places have been treated as 'Urban Areas' (towns)--

1) every place having a municipality or contonment board irrespective of its population

2) every other place which satisfies following three conditions :---

I) a population of at least 5,000;

II) at least three fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agriculture pursuits; and

III) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.

3) any other place not falling under above two categories) which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being project area or a developing township.

(b) Rural Area :-

Those areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called 'Rural Areas'

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of Land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

(c) Worker :-

A worker is defined as a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work of political worker actively engaged

in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'Worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, Live-stock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'Worker' by ascertaining whether he has participated any time during the last one year, even if he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'Worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been retained as his main activity.

(d) Non-worker :-

Non-workers are 'those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work'

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

Climate :

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No.8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1979 for the selected eight centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five year to a maximum of 30 years. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty-four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table No.9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of calendar year 1980 in respect of one centre in Sangli district.

Agriculture :-

2.7. Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i) Land Utilisation.
- ii) Area under different crops.

- iii) Yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops
 - iv) Irrigated area under different crops
 - v) Sourcewise irrigated area, and
 - vi) Data on irrigation Wells etc.
- are given in tables 10 to 15.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below -

a) Geographical area - It is, according to village papers, calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor-General.

b) Forests - It includes all actually forested areas or Lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any Legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such Land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultueal use that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

c) Land put to non-agricultueal Uses - It stands for all Lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals ect. and other Land put to uses other than agriculture.

d) Barren and unculturable Land - It covers Land which cannot be crought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, desert etc. is classified under this category.

e) Permanent pastures and other grazing Land - It covers ALL grazing lands. Village common grazing Lands and grazing Lands withing forest area are included under this head.

f) Culturable Waste Land - These may be either 'fallow' or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and include all Lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the Last five x years or more in succession.

g) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area shown.

This category includes all cultivable Lands which are

Contd...

is not included in net area shown but put to some agricultural use.

h) Current fallow Lands - These are Lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow'

i) Other fallows - All Lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'Other Fallow'

j) Net area sown - It consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.

k) Gross cropped area - Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'.

l) Cultivable area is a sum of areas under -

- a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves net included in the net area sown,
- b) Current fallows
- c) Other fallows
- d) Culturable waste Land, and
- e) Net area sown.

Animal Husbandry and Forests -

2.11 Population of Livestock and poultry as per livestock census 1978 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table No. 24. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of Livestock are given in table Nos. 25 & 26. Table No. 27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.15 The data on 'area under forests' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1979-80 have been shown in tables 28(a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into--

i) Reserved

ii) Protected, and

iii) Unclassed forests under the control of state Revenue department and under State Forests Department, has been shown.

These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table No.10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitations and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to 'inaccessible forests' or 'Unoccupied Waste'.

Inland fisheries -

2.13. The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in table No. 29 (1)

Employment, Industry and Electricity.

2.14. The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, man-days working, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the year 1979 and 1980 in table Nos. 30,31 and 32. The term factory includes.

- a) those employing ten or more working with the aid of power.
- b) those employing 20 or more workers working without aid of power &
- c) those registered under the Factory Act 1943, even though the above.

conditions are fulfilled, the Defence Factories are excluded.

Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1978-79 & 1979-80 are given in table No. 33. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the Month, occupation wise and sectorwise, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table No.34,35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is also given in table No. 36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1980-81 are given in table No.38 and No. of towns and villages electrified during and upto end of selected years are shown in table No. 39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric Supply Companies Sugar Factories in the district.

Co-operation -

2.16 Statistical information on the Co-operative institutions and their activities have been for the year 1980-81 of the following items.

- i. Loans advanced by Co-operative Banks and primary agric. credit societies different types of societies, their membership.
- ii) Total value of purchases and sales by the central and

primary Co-operative marketing societies, and

iii) Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of Sangli district in table No.46. Tahsilwise data regarding No., of members, capital structure, Loans advanced and recovered etc. have also been given in Table in Table No. 40 to 45.

Working Capital -

It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstanding in respect of Loans, each credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. or instalments which was due for collection but which was not Overdues refer to the amount of Loans actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money Lenders and Loans advanced by them is given in table number 47.

The main function of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sale of the agricultural produce.

2.17 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.18 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban Credit Co-operative societies and salery earners Co-operative societies to promote the qualities of economy and co-operation among the members and also to make them industries. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give Loans to the members on the securities

contd...

~~like gold, immovable property~~, Government securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provided loans to the citizens and small traders.

2.19 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purpose, to run montessories, Primary Schools and Educational Institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or co-operative societies in its area of operation.

Medical & Public Health -

2.20 In this section, data on medical and public health for the year 1980 are given. Table No. 48 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on Vita 'Statistics' e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1978 and 1979 with break-up into male and female are given in table No.49. The data on No. of deaths due to important causes, for the years 1971 to 1980 is given in table No. 50. Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1980 is given in table No. 51. Table No. 52 gives statistics on family planning during the year 1980.81.

Education -

2.21 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table No. 53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table Nos. 54 to 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with No. of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in table No. 56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and paln grants on primary

education in the district is shown in table Nos.57 to 59.

Transport and communication

2.22 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in table No. 60. The table No. 61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by Municipal Councils/Contonment Boards are also shown separately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Kolhapur Region covering Satara, sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in table No. 62 (districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to sangli division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation is given in table No. 63. Results of traffic census conducted in May & Dec. 1930 important roads in Sangli district are given in table No. 64. statistics on Postal, Telephons and Telegraphs facilities and on rural broadcasting is depicted in the table Nos. 65 and 66 respectively.

2.23. Local Bodies -

The financial position of village panchayats, Municipal councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1930-31.

2.24. The number of village panchayats include number of independent Village panchayats as also group village Panchayats. Income and expenditure of village panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances of income and expenditure. respectively. grants include grants from Government as well as from X Zilla Parishad and fr Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Govt. grants to village panchayats are mainly Land revenue grants, equalisatioj grants and local cess grants. govt. grants in respect of Municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purpose, for Medical purpose and on account of percentage in Land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz.

i) Self raised resources.

ii) Government grants.

iii) Grants for Agency Scheme and

iv) Debt. Section.

The expenditure is shown under two heads i.e. Revenue Expenditure and Debt. Section.

2.25 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, and Sangli and all the Municipal Councils in Sangli district.

2.26 Plan and Community Development.

Data on Plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1979-80 and 1980-81 are given respectively in table Nos.71 & 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of Community Development Programme Stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community Development Programme are shown in table Nos. 73 to 75. The tables 73 to 75 on C. D. Statistics are repeated from previous issue since C.D. Schemes are discontinued. These tables are proposed to be dropped from next issue.

2.27 Price -

The table No. 76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.28 The table No.77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities of Sangli head-quarter during 1979. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district head-quarter, the average shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No.78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Solapur and Pune centres for the year 1930-31. For the calculation of index, the year 1960 and 1961 are taken as

'base year' for Solapur and pune centres respectively.

Miscellaneous -

2.29 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed off in civil and criminal courts, cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres No. of Banking Offices, No. of scheduled Banks, their deposits and advances and No. of Joint Stock Companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, Land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published etc. are given in the table Nos. 79 to 89. Table No. 90 gives information about the quantity of Rice, Wheat and Sugar issued to fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Sangli district are indicated in table No. 91. Statistics relating to General Election of Assembly 1980 and Lok Sabha 1980 are presented in table No. 92.

2.30 A table showing trends of selected indicators in the fields of development, such as -

- i) Agriculture
- ii) Livestock
- iii) Industry
- iv) Education
- v) Health, ect.

is appended at the end.

These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS - 1930 - 81.

3.1 The trends observed in various Socio-Economic Sectors during 1980-81 in Sangli district are analysed in this chapter. The data for the year 1930-31 is compared with past data for the years 1960-61 and 1970-71 which will indicate changes over the period. The Statistical data presented in Part II of this issue has been utilised as a base for reviewing the sectorial trends.

3.2 AGRICULTURE

Agriculture is the backbone of our economy. Rural life is mainly dependent on agriculture. Agricultural backwardness is one of the problems of our economy even to-day. The state of Maharashtra and also Sangli district is no exception to this. In fact, in this area it is more pronounced. Hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scarcity and uncertain rains in the eastern zone, inadequate irrigational facilities, poor use of chemical fertilizers all these have barred the productivity of agriculture.

3.3 The development in the field of agriculture can be assessed from three main indicators, they are --

- i) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown,
- ii) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown,
- and,
- iii) Productivity of important crops.

Following table gives tahsilwise percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown during 1960 - 61, 1970 - 71, 1972 - 73, 1973 - 79 and 1979 - 80.

3.4 The figures of area cropped more than once during the years 1960-61, 1970-71, 1977-78 and 1978-79 were respectively as 26, 17, 53 and 56 thousand hectares. The provisional figures of area cropped more than once during 1979-80 is 33 thousand hectares. The area cropped more than once largely depends on favourable conditions of weather and irrigation facilities. The area brought under double cropping is increased in all the tahsils during last 20 years.

CHANGES IN CROPPING PATTERN.

3.5 The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in the district, in last two decades.

The cropping pattern of the district does not show any considerable change over the period of years. There is, however increasing trend in the area sown under Rice & Sugar cane and decreasing trend in area sown under groundnut. Jawar is the principal crop of this district which covers about 35 to 36 per cent of gross cropped area.

3.6. The agricultural production depends on various factors such as natural conditions, input factors, irrigation facilities etc. The following table gives the yield rates and outturn of

principal crops in Sangli district for the years 1960-61, 1970-71, 1978-79 and 1979-80.

It is evident from the above figures that the irrigation in Sangli district mainly rely on wells. Nearly three fourth of the irrigation land is covered by well irrigation.

CO-OPERATION.

3.10 Agricultural credit and outstanding dues.

In order to increase agricultural production, substantial investment on large scale is quite essential. But due to poor conditions of farmers, investment from their own resources is not possible. In turn, the inputs in agriculture suffer and ultimately returns from agriculture gets affected. So as to increase the investment in agriculture, Agricultural credit societies were formed. All the villages in this district have facility of Agricultural credit society. The following table will give the position of agricultural credit societies in the district for 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1980-81

3.11 Although the no. of agricultural credit societies has more or less remained the same during last 20 years there has been substantial increase in the membership since 1960-61. It is however discouraging to note that the amount of overdues also swelled from Rs. 165.94 lakhs in 1970-71 to Rs. 373.33 lakh in 1980-81.

3.12 AGRICULTURAL WAGE RATES

The data of agricultural wage rates is collected from three rural centres of this district, viz. Atpadi, Jath and Mhaisal in Miraj tahsil. The monthwise data of agricultural wage rates for all these centres for the year 1980 are given in table No. 19 of Part II. The daily wage rates for field workers range from Rs. 3.50 to 5.00 for a male worker and Rs. 2.00 to Rs. 4.00 for female workers. The carpentars, cobblers and blacksmiths generally do not work on daily wages. Their average daily earnings during the reference period range from Rs. 6.00 to Rs. 15.00 for carpenters, from Rs. 5.00 to Rs. 6.00 for cobblers and from Rs. 5.00 to 12.00 for blacksmiths.

3.13 LIVESTOCK.

Animal husbandry in India from the view point of its substantial contribution in providing income and draught power to farmers and subsidiary food to human population, assumes great importance in the rural economy even to-day. The twelfth livestock census was conducted in 1978. The final figures of this census are available and the data for 1978 census is analysed below.

3.14 The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land as per 1978 livestock census works out to be 150 for the district. The ratio for Tasgaon, Atpadi, Kavathe Mahankal, Walwa and Shirala is higher than the district ratio.

CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

3.15 473 villages in the district are electrified at the end of March 1981. The percentage of villages electrified to total villages (as per 1971 census) was observed to be 33. All the towns in the district are electrified. Tahsilwise distribution of villages electrified as on 31.3.81 alongwith number of agricultural pumpsets energised in each tahsil is given in the following table.

From the above table it is seen that out of 61 villages which are remained to be covered under electrification programme,

as many as 30 villages are from shirala tahsil which are located in hilly tract. They might have remained so because of peculiar topographical situation of these villages. out of these 30 villages in the extreme western part of Shirala tahsil, nearly 13 villages are going to be submerged under Warana Dam. With the expansion of Rural Electrification programme, activities, use of electric pumpsets for irrigation purpose is on increase. The increase in electric pumpsets for irrigation purpose in 1978 census is noteworthy when compared with 1972 census. The no. of electric pumpsets is nearly doubled that of 1972 census. Out of 24593 pumpsets working till March 1981 in the district nearly 75 percent pumpsets were installed in Miraj, Tasgaon and Watwa tahsils.

With the establishment of more and more number of Secondary Schools the ratio of Secondary to primary is reduced from 9 in 1961-62 to 6 in 1980-81.

It is heartning to note that there is considerable decline in drop-outs from primary to secondary which is reflected from the enrolment figures of Secondary and primary schools during different reference years.

The teacher/pupil ratios for different categories of institutions also reveal that the staffing strength is maintained nearly about the standard norms prescribed.

A net work of banking offices is spread over in rural area of the district. As a result the ratio of one bank to no. of households has decreased from 6550 in 1960-61 to 1196 in 1979.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION.

3.22 Roads constitute one of the important items in the infrastructure of a country's economy. The extent of road facilities available can be judged by working out road length per 100 sq.km. of area. The road length per 100 sq.kms was 26.04 kms. in 1960-61. The same was 91.40 kms. in 1980-81. The marginal decrease is observed during this year on account of transper of 25 km. length to Satara district.

PRICES

3.23 Since November 1962, the work of collection of prices at district headquarters in Maharashtra state was entrusted to the District Statistical Officer of the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. The above table reflects that the prices of all commodities have increased frightfully during last 20 years.

Price index is worked out by the commissioner of labour. The consumer price index for working class for Pune Centre has reached the mark of 375 in 1980-81 with 1961 as the base year.

CHAPTER NO. IV.

4.1 With a view to ensure full and efficient use of local resources and to provide a firm base to the process of planning as also to achieve balanced economic growth, an idea of formulation of the plan at the district level has been adopted since 1974-75. In the process, 'District' has been adopted as a unit and importance has been attached to the District Planning. The District Planning Boards have been constituted to debate and decide development plans to be implemented in the district. This body was subsequently enlarged to accommodate as many as peoples representatives as possible and the same is renamed as District Planning and Development Council headed by the designated Minister of the District as the Chairman and the Collector as the Member-Secretary. Other minister who held from the district and Divisional Commissioner are the Vice Chairman of the District Planning and development Council. The other members of the Council include all the seating MLAs, MLCs, MPs, President of Zilla Parishad, Mayor of the municipal corporations, if any, and one president each from the 'A', 'B', & 'C' class municipal councils, The Chairman of the District Central Co-operative Bank, Director of Land Development Bank, Chief Executive Officer of Z. P. and nine non-official members appointed by Government.

4.2 The Council is supposed to meet twice a year for formulation of the Plan and to ensure co-ordination amongst different implementing agencies.

4.3 To assist the council in its day to day work, the Executive committee is constituted at the District Level. The Chairman and vice-Chairman of the committee are the same as those of the council. The Member/Secretary is, however, the District Planning Officer, The committee meets regularly to Plan programmes and suggest ways and means for its effective implementation.

4.4 The year 1980-81 was the first of Sixth five year plan (i.e. 1980-81 to 1984-85). After the Fifth Plan period two annual

plans i.e. 78-79 and 1979-80 were implemented. Government then formulated the Sixth Five Year Plan for the period from 1980-81 to 1984-85. This chapter takes review of the first year of Sixth Five Year Plan i.e. 1980-81.

4.5 The following table gives the consolidated information about the budget and expenditure figures under the State Plan and the centrally sponsored plan schemes for the Annual Plan 1979-80 and for the first year of the sixth Plan i.e. 1980-81.

From the above table it will be seen that the total expenditure during the year 1979-80 was Rs. 798.97 lakhs, which was 95.53 percent of total budget provision. While in the year 1980-81 it was Rs. 867.35 lakhs which was 104.55 percent of the total budget provision. The total expenditure was less in the year 1979-80 as the budget provision of centrally sponsored schemes was less.

4.6 The performance of the state Plan Schemes and the centrally sponsored schemes during the year 1979-80 and 1980-81 is reviewed separately in the following paragraphs.

I. State Plan Schemes.

4.7 As could be seen from the above mentioned table budget provision during the year 1979-80 was utilised to the extent of 94.30 per cent. In 1980-81, however, expenditure exceeded the provision. In consonance with the Government policy, in 1979-80 Agricultural Programme received the highest importance and next in order was 'Social Welfare'. The percentage of budgetary provision was 32.25 and 20.81 respectively. However, in 1980-81 the highest importance was given to Social Welfare and next in order was Agriculture. The percentage of budgetary provision was 31.25 and 24.85 respectively.

In both the annual plans next in order was 'Irrigation & Power'. The respective percentages of budget provisions to the total budget provision for the Annual Plan as a whole for the year 1979-80 and 1980-81 were 19.41% and 17.28%.

'Co-operation and Community Development' received the last priority as could be ascertained from the meagre amount of budget provision made.

In general, budget utilisation was 94.30 % for all major heads during 1979-80 while it was 102.45 % during 1980-81.

From the above table it is seen that there was no much variation in percentage distribution in case of major heads II, III and V during the year 1979-80 and 1980-81. During the year 1980-81 the highest expenditure (31.30 percent) was incurred on Social Services followed by Agricultural Programme (22.90 percent). This position was reverse in 1979-80.

II. PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENT : STATE PLAN SCHEME.

4.9 The details of physical achievements under different schemes are given in table No. 72 of part - II of this publication. However, a brief review of the important achievements under each sub-head of development is taken in the following paragraphs.

I) Agricultural Programme.

4.10 This major head covers important programme, viz., Agricultural production, Soil conservation, Animal Husbandry, Minor Irrigation, D.P.A.P, Forest, Fisheries etc.

a) Agricultural Production.-

4.11 In all there were ten schemes implemented under this Sub-head. Under the scheme of distribution of pesticides and reticides 3,050 small holders were benefitted. 29,000 fruit plants were distributed on subsidy. With a view to maximise production of groundnut, seed to the tune of 50 quintals was distributed to small holders. The State Government is very keen to increase the production of pulses and oil seeds also. As a part of this programme 54 demonstration were organised.

b) Soil Conservation- / Programme

4.12 The scheme of bunding the terracing/ mainly covers the expenditure on staff. Under the scheme of land development through the soil conservation, bunding and terracing programme work in 690 hectorgs was completed. Due to less expenditure on rectification works of bunding the budget provision of Rs. 16.23 lakhs was not dully utilised during 1980-81. The expenditure was Rs. 15.66 lakhs.

c) Minor Irrigation-

4.13 The important scheme of minor irrigation works in the local and state sector covers major portion of the expenditure under this head. 25 Minor Irrigation Tanks were in progress during the year 1980-81 and an amount of Rs. 39.96 lakhs was spent. The work of five percolation tanks was in progress. An amount of Rs. 20.48 lakhs was spent. A subsidy to small and marginal farmers @ 25 % and 33½ % limited to Rs. 500/- and Rs.800/- respectively under the scheme of construction of wells and installation of pumpsets was available. 405 persons were benefitted under the centrally assisted scheme for grant of subsidy for minor irrigation works to farmers not eligible for subsidy

under other special schemes.

d) Drought Prone Area Programme.

4.14 Sangli district is one of the centrally assisted district. however upto 1979-80 the assistance was 50 % of the total expenditure. Since 1979-80 the assistance in respect of only centrally approved blocks of Jath and Atpadi was given to the tune of 50 % of the total expenditure of block or 7.50 lakh per block whichever was less. The programme in four State approved blocks was entirely borne by the State Government. The subsectorwise budget and expenditure during 1980-81 is as follows.

e) Animal Husbandry -

4.16 The total budget provision for 13 schemes under this sub sector was Rs. 13.01 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs. 12.16 lakhs. The major portion of expenditure was on establishment, construction of veterinary polyclinic, building and construction of residential and non residential building at Intensive Poultry development block. Under the individual beneficiary scheme of distribution of cockerels and the special livestock production programme 300 cockerels and 300 units of sheep (1 male and 20 females) were given on subsidy against loan from banks.

f) Dairy Development.

4.17 The managerial subsidy amounting to Rs. 0.68 lakhs was given to 78 Dairy co-operative societies. The handling of milk per day was 1,23,874 litres as against the targeted figure of 160000 litres. An amount of Rs. 0.40 lakhs was spent for purchase of dairy machinery. The total budget provision for this sector was 16.45 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs. 19.34 lakhs.

g) Fisheries -

4.18 The netting and stocking are the main activities under this sub-head, 80 tonnes of fish were netted during the financial year 1980-81. 5.87 lakhs fingerlings were stocked. As an assistance to the fisherman 54.00 kg. nylon twine was also distributed.

h) Forest -

4.19 Only seven schemes with budget provision of Rs. 10.01 lakhs were implemented and the budget was not fully utilised. The work of nature conservation and beautification of Sagarswar and Dandoba was executed and an amount of Rs. 4.65 lakh was spent for this purpose.

i) Integrated Rural Development Programme.

4.20 This is an important centrally assisted programme where individual beneficiary schemes are executed with 50 % central

assistance. As per the instructions from the Government, one block from D.P.A.P. namely Atpadi and one block from C.A.D.A. namely Walwa was selected for the purpose. The total expenditure in the year 1980-81 was Rs. 26.44 lakh. The important physical achievements were as given below.

II) Co-operation -

4.21 The two schemes viz; subsidy for construction of godowns and assistance to farmers' service credit societies were not implemented during this year. 172 beneficiaries were given subsidy amounting to Rs. 0.57 lakh as an interest subsidy on short term loans to small farmers. The other six schemes were of routine nature. In all 88 societies were assisted in the form of subsidy loan, share capital etc. The total expenditure under this sector was Rs. 2.37 lakhs and the entire budget was utilised.

III) IRRIGATION AND POWER :

1) Medium Irrigation Projects.

4.22 The work of five medium projects namely Basappawadi, Doddanala and Senkha in Jath tahsil, Siddhewadi in Tasgaon tahsil and Morna in Shirala tahsil were in progress in this district. The total budget provision for these five works was Rs. 74.00 lakhs, out of which Rs. 34.01 lakhs were spent.

2) Power Project -

4.23 The total provision for the three schemes was Rs. 58.00 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs. 62.24 lakhs. 13 Gaothans were electrified and 230 agricultural pump sets were energised during 1980-81.

IV) Industry and Mining -

4.24 With a view to provide all facilities at one place only, the new offices centralising all the processing required for development of an industry were opened during 1979-80. The Provision of Rs. 2.25 lakhs to start District Industry Centre during 1980-81 was made in the annual plan. The other schemes were of routine nature. The total budget provision was Rs. 35.71 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs. 25.19 lakhs.

4.25 Under the scheme of Financial Assistance to small Scale Industries under S.A.I. rules, 394 small scale industries were given interest subsidy of Rs. 0.65 lakhs, 275 educated unemployed were given seed money assistance of Rs. 17.00 lakhs for starting new ventures. 239 persons were sponsored under E.P.P. programme for obtaining practical experience. Eight Balutedar societies were given share capital of Rs. 1.75 lakhs.

V) Transport and Communication -

4.26 The total budget provision of Rs. 98.82 lakhs was made under this head of development as against which an expenditure of Rs. 107.20 lakhs was recorded. The targets and achievements in respect of four schemes implemented under this head were as follows

4.27 The major head 'Social Services' covers sub-heads like General Education, Health, Water supply, Housing, Urban Development, Labour and Labour Welfare, Welfare of Backward Classes etc. The head wise data of the budget and expenditure is given below.

In the following paragraphs, important physical achievements under each sub-head are explained.

a) General Education.

4.28 Under this sub-head, as many as 34 schemes were implemented in this district. Under the scheme of attaching standards V to VIII to secondary schools, 2 divisions in the year 1980-81 were created. Under the scheme of educational concessions to economically backward class students, as many as 14000 students were benefitted in year 1980-81. 36 kit boxes were

also distributed under UNICEF aided programme of science kit boxes. In all 630 students belonging to SC/ST were given special benefits.

b) Health-

4.29 Under this sub-head 12 schemes were implemented. An amount of Rs. 3.63 lakhs was spent on construction of Primary Health centres and sub-centres. Under another schemes viz. Malaria control an amount of Rs. 4.11 lakhs was spent on equipments.

c) Nutrition-

4.30 The scheme of midday meals to school going children in Prougnt Prone Areas was implemented benefitting 10,500 students. The expenditure was Rs. 2.89 lakhs. The other schemes were ANP and special nutrition programme in urban slums.

d) Water supply and Drainage-

4.31 The scheme of boring operation of G.S.D.A. was implemented in the year 1980-81 and 311 bore wells were drilled at the cost of Rs. 50.81 lakhs. Besides this scheme, seven other schemes were implemented in the year 1980-81. One dug well was constructed during this year. 218 bore wells were fitted with electric pumps. 32 piped water supply scheme works were in progress as at the end of year. As against the provision for Rs. 126.22 lakhs, Rs. 141.89 lakhs were spent.

e) Housing-

The provision of house sites to landless labourers was the only important scheme. 941 huts were constructed with the expenditure of Rs. 15.00 lakhs.

f) Urban Development.

4.32 The only scheme implemented under this sub-head was to help the implementation of development plan of municipal councils, which recorded an expenditure of Rs. 10.05 lakhs in 1980-81.

g) Welfare of Backward Classes-

4.33 In all 16 schemes were implemented under this sub-head. The achievements are as follows.

378 students were given tuition fees. Three co-operative housing societies were assisted. The schemes of irrigation wells, development of land etc. could not be implemented for want of sanction. The provision was Rs. 6.11 lakhs and the expenditure was Rs. 5.57 lakhs.

h) Labour and Labour Welfare-

4.34 All the expenditure under this head was booked on expansion of I.T.I. and the staff scheme of the employment exchange.

VII) Other Programme -

4.35 Under this major head, the important scheme viz/ Employment Gaurantee Scheme was implemented during the period under reference.

Employment Gaurantee Scheme -

4.36 The main object of the scheme is to provide gainful and productive employment (gainful to the individual and productive to the economy) on approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the area of 'C' class municipal councils, who are in need of work and are willing to do manual labour. The Gaurantee is for unskilled work and work will be given at Panchyat Samiti level. The budgetary provision for this scheme was of supplementary nature in which as much as the work which are not being accommodated in plan or non-plan funds are taken up under the E.G.S. The scheme is being implemented since 1972-73.

4.37 During the year 1980-81 an amount of Rs. 66.36 lakhs was provided and the expenditure incurred during this year was Rs. 127.33 lakhs. The workwise achievement for the year 1980-81 is given below.

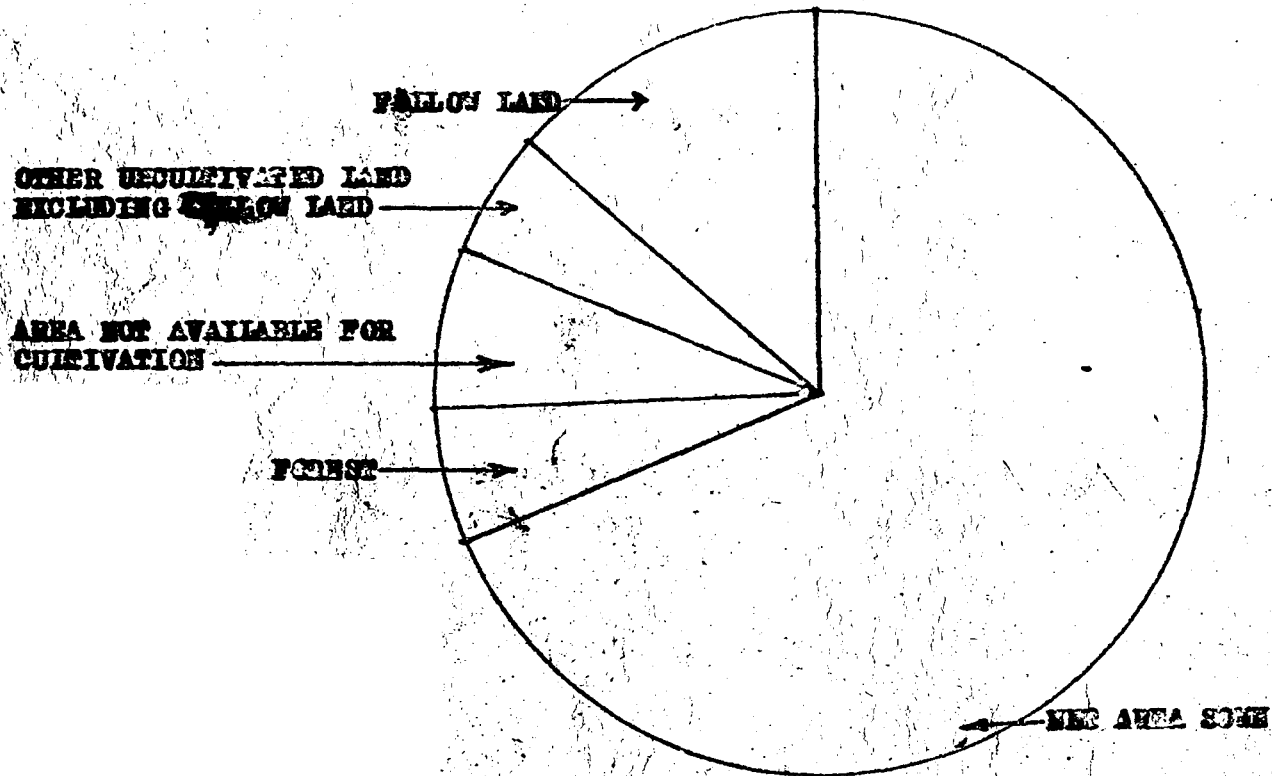
4.39 During the year 1979-80 and 1980-81 the major portion of the expenditure on the centrally sponsored schemes was under social and Community Services i.e. health and Agril. Programme under Drought Prone Area Programme.

4.40 As regards the expenditure under Social Services i.e. implementation of medical and health programme, blood smers collection under the Malaria Eradication scheme and Welfare of backward class students for scholar-ships.

4.41 Under the Agricultural Programme the expenditure was mainly on Drought Prone Area Programme. and Integrated Rural Development Programmes during the year 1980-81.

Under the Agricultural Programme, the schemes like All India Agro Experiments, subsidy for pesticides and recticides intensive programme for oil seed production, demonstration plots on pulses crops were carried out. Under the Animal Husbandry Programme 276 Sheep units were distributed in 1980-81.

LAND UTILISATION IN SANGLI DISTRICT 1979-80

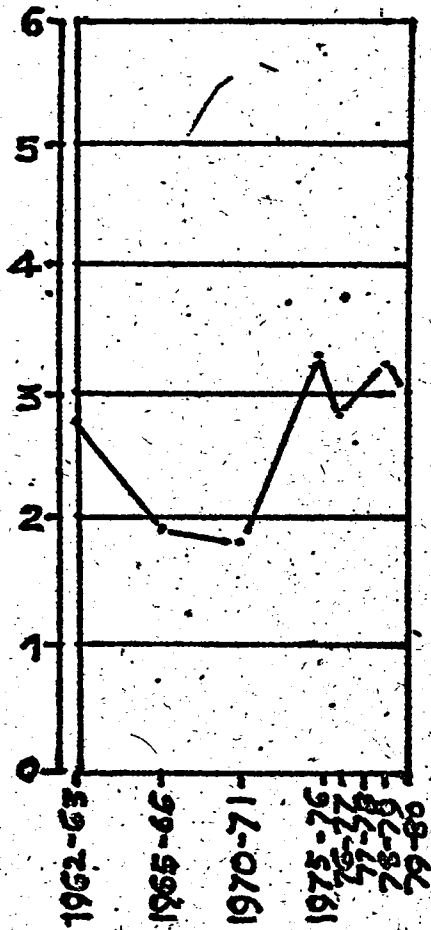


FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION

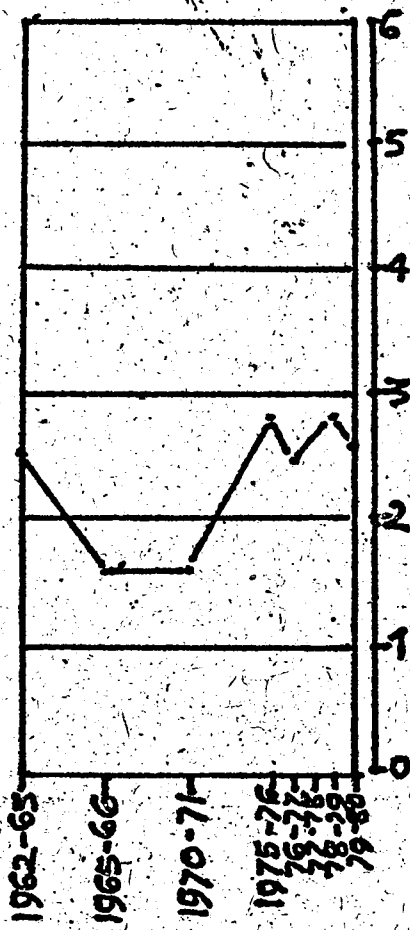

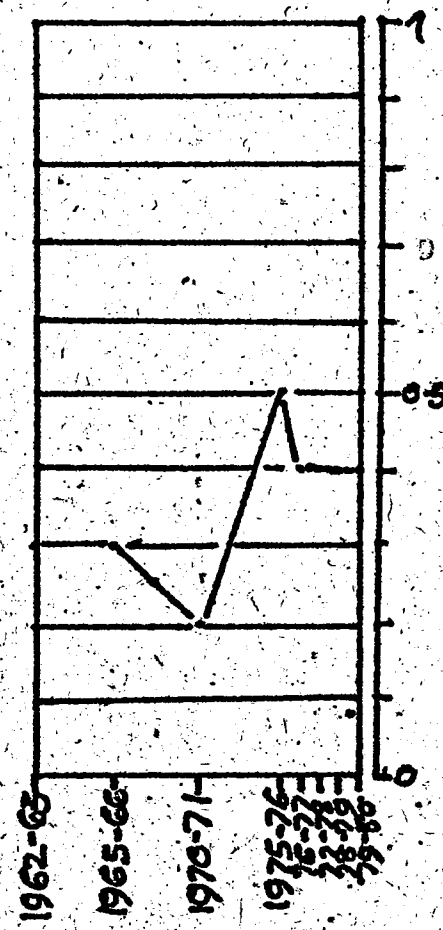

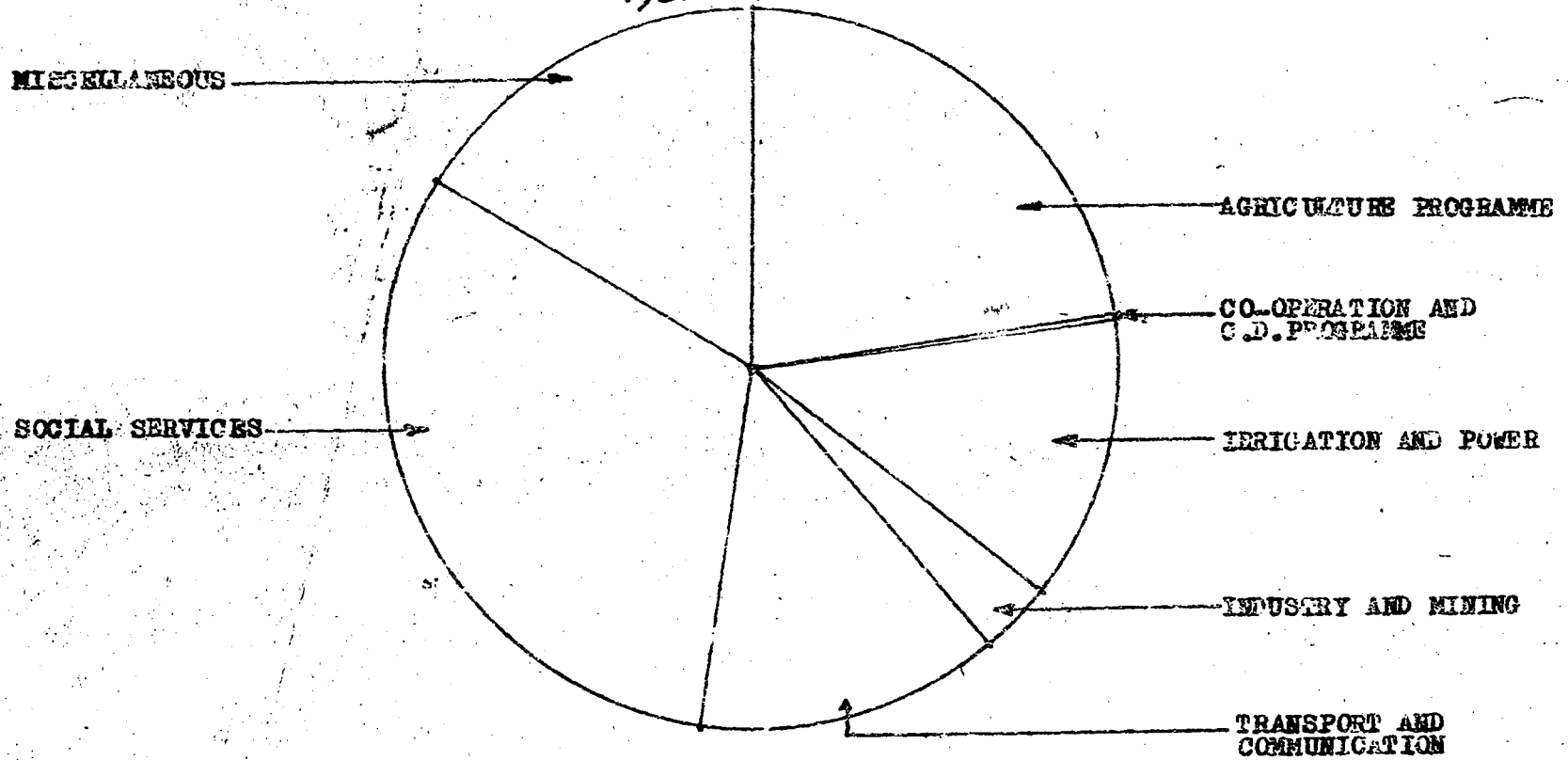
