MAP OF NAGPUR DISTRICT

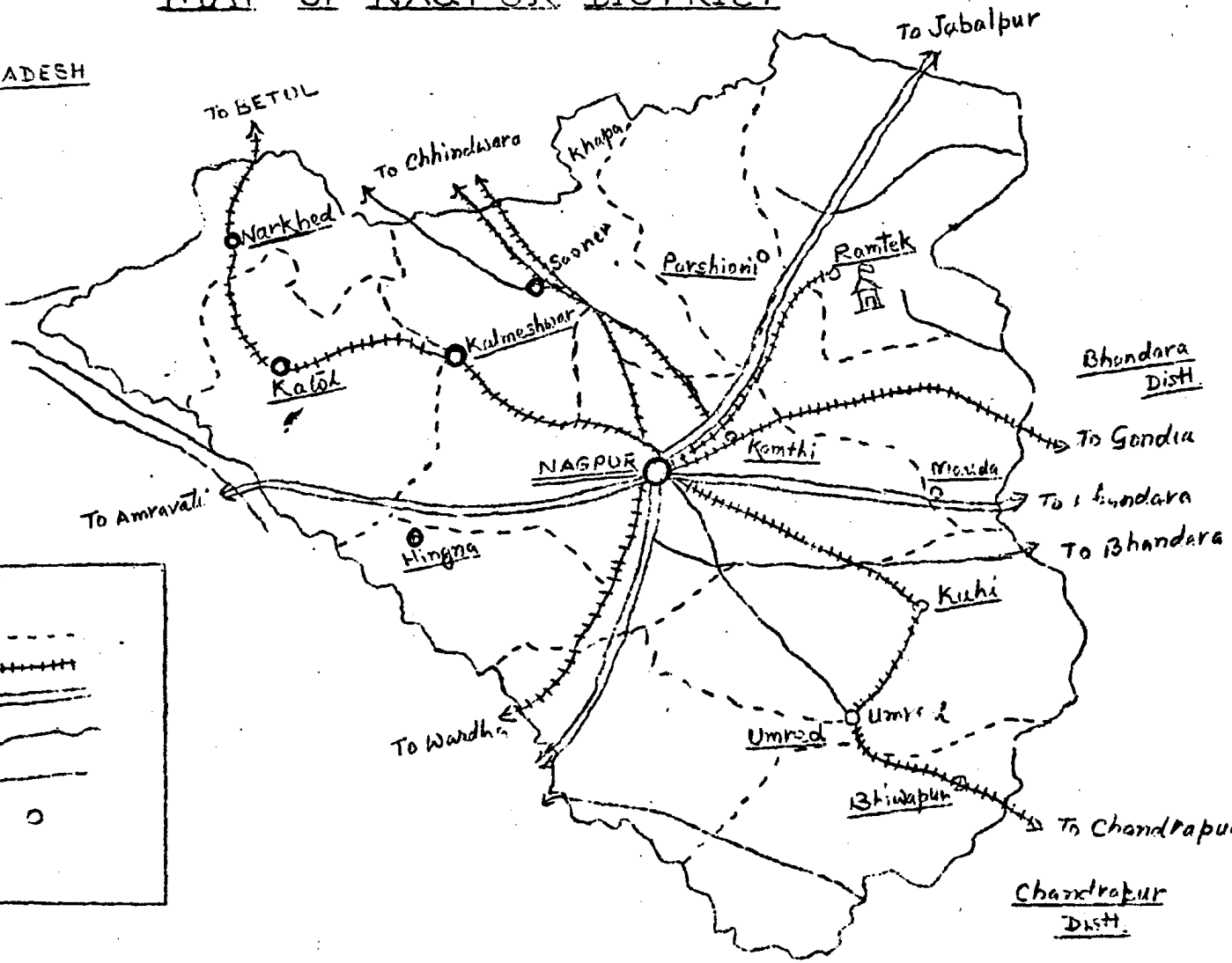

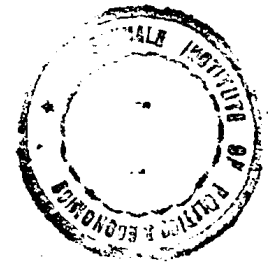

CHAPTER -I

1.1 Location :- Nagpur district was one of the Districts of Ex-Madhya Pradesh till the reorganisation of States in 1956, when along with the other eight districts of Vidarbha Region it formed part of the bilingual state of Bombay. The State of Maharashtra came into existence on 1st May, 1960 with Nagpur district as one of its twenty eight districts. Nagpur district was one of the important districts of the four C.P. districts Nagpur city; the head quarter of the district, which was the capital of Ex-Madhya Pradesh State and enjoys the status of the second capital of Maharashtra State.

This district lies between $20^{\circ} - 35^{\circ}$ and $21^{\circ} - 44$ North latitude and $78^{\circ} - 15$ and $79^{\circ} - 40^{\circ}$ East longitudes and it is triangular in shape.

1.2 Boundaries :- This district is bounded on the north by the Chhindwada and Seoni districts of the Madhya Pradesh on East by Bhandara, on the south and west by Chandrapur and Wardha districts respectively, with a small strip on the north-west by the Amravati district of Maharashtra State.

1.3 Highlight on development :-

1. Agriculture :- The programme of Agriculture development have brought about an area of 1,18,207 hectares under yielding Hybrid and improved varieties of various crops in the district, three Block were covered under integrated area development programme i.e. Panchayat Yojana. An area of 135126 and 7547 hectares was contour bunded and Terraced out of an area of 374701 hectares and 106955 hectares respectively available in the district.

2. Dairy :- The Govt. Milk scheme of Nagpur has ensured the regular supply of pure milk to the citizens. The milk is collected from the villages from Nagpur, Chandrapur, Wardha and Bhandara districts. The target of the milk collection per day for the year 1981-82 was about 96,000 liters of which the achievement was 57,713 liters. Due to good response to this milk scheme from the farmers, the Govt. of Maharashtra had decided to establish a powder plant at Nagpur. The estimated cost of the plant is Rs. 1-20 cores, with the production capacity of 5 Tons milk powder per day.

3. Irrigation :- The pench major irrigation project is under construction in Ramtek Tahsil of the district at the revised cost of Rs. 8902.57 lakhs. The project comprises of two parts viz. (1) construction of dam at Totaladoh which includes a powerhouse at the dam site and for storing water for irrigation purposes and (2) construction of pick up weir at Kamptee Khairi with erection of gate over it. The gross command area of this project is 109740 hectares and an area of 104476 hectares (101200 basic) will be brought under irrigation in the near future. As such this project would be the boom to this district for its rapid economic and industrial growth. In addition to the above medium irrigation projects named Ramtek, Wena pandharabodi, Umri, Makardhokada, Kesarnala Kanoli Mordhan and chandrabhaga have already been completed. The gross command area of these projects is 63637 hectares of which an area of about 19013 hectares had been brought under irrigation. The work of Mordhan, Rolar Khekaranala pandhari and Khumari are in progress. The gross command area of these medium irrigation project 21157 hectares and area of 14469 hectares will be brought under irrigation by all these projects after their completion. However at present much of area under cultivation is under irrigation by minor irrigation schemes such as tanks, wells etc.

4. Power :- As electricity is one of the basic infrastructure required for industrial, agricultural and other developments it is essential that adequate power stations will have to be built well in advance to carry through, the ambitious programme of industrialisation of backward area. As such the power generation programme has been drawn up with a view to take care of the above demand and for reducing power shortage as at present experienced. With this view though there was a power station at Khaparkheda 15 Kms. away from Nagpur city with an installed capacity of 120 M.W. the thermal power station at Koradi near Khaparkheda has been established with the installed capacity of 1100 M.W. In addition to the above the work of inter State (i.e. Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh) Hydro Electric Power station on Pench River with the installed capacity of 53 M.W. is in progress.

5. Industries :- There are two textile mills in Nagpur since long, of which Express mill is under private sector where as the management of Model Mill is under public sector. A-Cooperative spinning Mill and ginning and pressing units have also been established recently in the district.

Industrial estate at Hingna near Nagpur was planned with an intention to promote the growth of ancillary industries around them eventually providing considerable employment to the rural population. An industrial estate at Hingna has already been developed with the assistance of SICOM,VIDC, and M.F.C in to sizeable industrial complex with the sizeable potential for further growth.

Handloom weaving is the most important industry in the district as about 10% population of the district earn their livelihood in this industry. The Directorate of Handloom, Powerloom & Co.op. Textile has been established recently with the head quarter for the state at Nagpur to deal with the problems of handloom industry to improve economic conditions of weavers.

6. Medical :- There is a medical college Hospital having 1201 beds in Nagpur city which is supposed to be the biggest hospital in the state. Besides there is another Medical College in the city that is Indira Gandhi Medical College. Apart from these two allopathic Medical Colleges, there are two Ayurvedic and one Homeopathic college at Nagpur.

7. Water Supply :- There are 16 towns in the district. In urban the water supply scheme are i) Water supply to Nagpur city from Pench Project. ii) Govt. Water Supply Scheme Rantek and Narkhed iii) Municipal Water Supply Scheme, Mohapa, Saoner, Khapa, Unrer, Kalneshwar are already completed. The water supply scheme Mowar is in progress. Thus all towns and cities of Nagpur district are covered totally by pipe water supply scheme. The works of 36 rural pipe supply schemes have been completed and 22 works are in progress in the district.

8. Employment Guarantee Scheme :- Under this scheme 2256 works have been sanctioned out of this works 964 were completed and 446 works are in progress.

9. Construction of huts for landless labours :- To provide huts to the landless labour/in the rural area the state implements the scheme construction of huts in rural area under which 322 huts have been constructed during 1981-82.

10. Small Saving Scheme :- The district industrially advanced amongst all the districts of vidarbha Region remains in top as far as small saving is concerned.

The district was allotted a target of Rs.5.50 cores for 1981-82 which had been fulfilled by collecting a net amount of Rs.7.57 cores. The employees of Govt. Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils have been covered 80% under Pay Roll Saving Scheme.

1.4 Area :- Nagpur district stretches over an area of 9928 Sq.Kms and its population according to 1971 census is 1942688. In terms of area and population it constitute 3.24 and 3.65 percent of area and population respectively of Maharashtra excluding Greater Bombay. The district stands first in vidarbha and eleventh in Maharashtra in terms of population. The length of district in East West Extension is 156 Kms and its breadth in North South extension is 150 Kms. There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district since 1911. In 1971 census 10 villages of this district were transferred to Bhandara district measuring an area of 24.56 Sq.Kms.

1.5 Topography :- The district has an average elevation between 274.50 and 3.5 metres. (900 and 1,000 feet) above sea-level and its relief features are characterised, by and large, by the residual hill ranges of the satpudas and their detached, hillocks enclosing them undulating black soil valleys. Much of the topography is typically one of the deccan Trap having flat topped and terraced features low but treased side and isolated knolls. Eastwards and north eastwards, the land scape changes in an interesting manner due to the changes in the underlying rocks. The rocks of Gondwana series are not only important because of their coal and manganese^{ore} deposits but in their surface expression, they presents a low rolling topography with a poor soil cover and vegetation.

The greater part of the district is an undulating Plateau with a variation in height between 652.70 meters (2,140 feet) above sea level on the up land ridges in the north and about 247.50 meters (900 feet) near the Kanhan river. This plateau surface of the district falls into three distinct drainage basins. In the north the up land ranges are in extension of the Satpuda ranges, they are narrow in the west but widened to a breadth of about 19 Kms. (12 Miles) towards the east. Immediately south of these upland ranges, stretches the Ambagad Hills the western extremity of which lies in the Nagpur district. The historic temple of Rantek is situated on a spur of this range signifying the hill of Ram also known formerly as 'Sundargiri' Vermillion Mound. 'Topogiri' (Hill of Penance) These isolated hills or Knolls attain no great altitude.

1.6 Hills Rivers and Sills :-

1. Hills :- The main system of hills is the Satpuda and its offshoots. The northern range of hills extends along the whole border, being pieced only in places where the Kanhan and the Pench rivers have broken through. On the west, it consists merely of the outlying foot hills of the Satpuda, the plateau preparilyng behind then in Chindwara. But from the Kanhan to the Pench it is the major range of the Satpuda themselves which dominates the landscape and the ascent of.

The Khanarapani Plateau is made in Nagpur, Along this length the hills are well wooded and picturesque and there is some striking scenery on the Pench river. The old Gond Fort of Bhiwagad stands in this range. Govt. Managed forests in this district mainly belong to these hills between the Kanhan and the Bawanthari.

A few miles to the south of the main Satpuda range are two minor lines of hills, to the West and the east of Pench. These two the west lie between Bhiwagad and Parshioni Terminating in the peak of Tekadi 500.34 meters (1669 feet) while to East of the Pench are the Mansar hills both these and the western range being now denuded of trees, and after a gap of a few miles, come well known Rantek Hills, rising to 427 metres (1400 feet) at Rantek Proper. Timely measures by the Government have helped retaining the wooded character of this range.

1. Minor Hills :- The second main hill track extends along the south east of the district from Khorgad on the Wardha River where there are some fine water falls at the junction of Wardha and Chandrapur with Nagpur, The separate the vally of ^{Kas} ~~the~~ from

that of the Jam up to Kondhali and further south east from the water shed between the latter river and the Bor. Near Bori it becomes the Kauras Plateau and terminate to afford a passage for the Wardha River. Containing afterwards south east wards and dividing the vally of Nand from the wainganga Plain. West of the Wanna the range is mostly well covered with picturesque valley and ravnes, among which are narrow strips of rich well irrigated land of great fertility. But to the east towards unner the range has lower levels and is unintersting. It consists of low bare hills which are grass covered and Boulder strewn, except where-ever looking the nand valley some excellent teak is grown.

The third main range runs northwards through Katol Tahsil from Kondhali to Kelga. separating the Wardha and Wainganga valleys. The highest peak of it is pilkapar.

2. River :- The Wardha and Vainganga are the main rivers of the district. The Wardha flows along the part of the Western border and control the drainege system of the western part of the district. The principal tributaries of the Wardha river are the Bor, the Wanna, the Jan, the kar, The Bor rises in the hills near Bazargaon and rushes down a winding and rackey channel between Kondali upland and the Kauras plateau passing into the Wardha to join the Wanna. Its narrow valley is very fertile and the high well wooded cliffs on either sides render, it a wild and beautiful spot in the whole of the district.

The wanna rises near the hills of Mahadagad in the Pilkapar range and flows along the northern base of the Kauras Plateau past Hingna and Bori; where it is crossed by the central Railways. It leaves the district as Ashta. The Small Krishana river joins it at Bori.

The rises among the hills south of Kondhali and following northwards into the centre of the Katol Tahsil takes a westerly turn pass Katol and joins the Wardha at Jalalkheda. The kar rises in the same range but flows directly south West separating the Wardha and Nagpur district till it joins the Wardha river at Khargad the trijunction point of the three district with Berar. The nand flows across a small strip in the south of the district and joins Wanna beyond the border of Wardha. The wainganga flows along the part of eastern border and controls the drainage system of the western and central portion of the district. It forms the

district boundary with Bhandara district for some distance. Vainganga and the Pench are the most important tributaries of the Kanhan. The Kanhan, both of which flow, from the Satpura range in the Chindwara district and meet near Kamptee, where they are joined by the Kolar. The Kanhan entering the district near Borgaon takes a south easterly course pass Khapa to Kamptee where it receives the Pench Rantek tahsil and after receiving the Nag river near hills of Bhivkunda, finally empties into the vainganga. The Kanhan river provides drinking water to Nagpur city.

The Kolar rises in the northeast corner of the Katol Tahsil and after passing through the rocky part of Lohgad in Pilkapar range emerges into the fertile plain of Saoner and separates Nagpur from Rantek Tahsil until its place as boundary river is taken by the Kanhan. Its bed is generally rocky. At Patansawangi, it receives the Chandrabhaga, which brings in the drainage of Kalmeshwar Plain.

The other rivers of some importance are the Bawanthari, the Sur and the Gaotala sand which drains the eastern half of Rantek Tahsil. The sur is remarkable for its shallowness but its fertile properties produce sugarcane and garden crop of the land.

3. Soil :- The main soils of the district are Kali (Medium deep Black cotton) Morand (Comparatively light deep brown in colour and Baradi (Red graver with boulders.)

Medium deep black soil is found around Kalmeshwar and Saoner in the Wardha valley and in the Nagpur Kamptee Plains. The principal soil of the district is known as morand. It is very suitable for cotton and Jowar and is found in almost all the talukas, in the northern part of Rantek Taluka and especially in the valley of the Sur river. The morand soil is of very light colour, Khardi is the regular rice land in the eastern part of the district. Baradi is found on the summits and slopes of hills principally in Katol Tahsil.

1.7 Climate, Temperature, and Rainfall :-

1. Climate :- Since the district is away from the sea, were the climate of the district is uneven and as such there is large variation in hot and cold seasons of the year. The climate of the district characterised by a hot summer well distributed rainfall and dryness except in rainy seasons. The winter season sets in from December to February and January is the coldest month.

is followed by the hot season from March to May, May being the hottest in the year. The south West monsoon starts from June to September while the period from October to November constitutes the post monsoon.

2. Temperature :- The temperature data for Nagpur district is available for two centres named Nagpur Aerodrome and Nagpur city. The temperature was highest in June, 1981 at 46.3° centigrade as against the lowest in January 1981 at 7.8 centigrade. In general it can be said that temperature begins to rise from February and reaches peak level in May or June on set of the south west monsoon in the second week of June brings welcome relief from the heat with a considerable drop in temperature. The temperature shows slight increase in October and there after begins to fall.

Except during the monsoon season, when the humidity is high the weather is generally dry. The humidities go down to 20% or less in summer season.

3. Rainfall :- The district gets rainfall from south west monsoon originating from the Arabian sea. The average annual rainfall throughout the district amounts to 1401 mm (56") and 1543 mm (62") perhaps due to the hills and forest trees in the area. The rainy season usually starts in early June and last up to October. In the severe hot season the light showers are some times followed by severe dust storms. The rainfall during June to Oct. constitutes about 93% of annual rainfall. The variation in the annual rainfall year to year is not large though the agricultural season is affected from year to year due to vagaries of monsoon. The heaviest rainfall in 24 hours recorded in the district was 330.20 mm (13") at Unrer on 14-8-53.

The rainfall during the year 1981 for Nagpur, Katol, Saoner, Bantek and Unrer was 1543, 1494, 1076, 1431, 1461 mms. respectively.

1.3 Population :- The 1971 population of the district showed an increase of 23.68% over the year 1961 as against 27.5% for Maharashtra. The urban and Rural population form 54.52 and 45.48 percent as against 15.07 percent and 47.93 percent respectively in the year 1961. The density of population is 196 per Sq. Km. as compared to 164 for Maharashtra and 178 for India as per 1971 census. The sex ratio i.e. per 1000 males is 922 females for

the district as against 930 for Maharashtra in 1971. The literacy rate for the district is of 45.26 percent as compared to the rate of 39.18 percent for Maharashtra in 1971.

The percentage of schedule caste in the district in the 4.15 percent in 1971, against 3.60 in 1961. Out of the total population of the district 35.60 percent are workers of which 21.91%, 23.19% and 16.95% are reported as cultivators, agricultural labours and in household industry respectively in the year 1971. The persons engaged in remaining services are reported 32.95% of the total workers according to 1971 census.

i) Nagpur city :- The city of Nagpur and its sub-urban extensions which now almost reached up to the industrial nucleus of Kahan from the nerve centre not only of the district but also of Vidarbha. Originally being advantageous from the point of view of defence. Nagpur had grown up into an urban centre under the Bhosales of the Maharashtra conderency with the formation of central provinces under the British regime. The town has acquired a new importance as the administrative capital its growth consided with the economic development of the surrounding region abounding in cotton crop. As in case of large city. Nagpur developed a complex structure based on administative economic and social forces, which finds experssion in its urban and sub-urban areas. It draws a greater strength from the new industrilisation and rightly complete with Bombay and Pune in its economic and social growth.

CHAPTER -II

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the statistical data presented in the part-II of Statistical Abstract.

I. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives an exhaustive statistical data on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukewise and even blockwise data has been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka as well as Block comparison. In most of the tables data for 1981-82 has been indicated with data for 1980-81 or even for earlier years. In the tables where in the data for 1981-82 could not be presented, the same for the latest years for which they were available has been shown. In case of livestock census, the data for latest census 1973 has been presented. The population data has been shown for 1971 census. All the data has been collected from the state and central Govt. Offices, Local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot note below each table indicates source from which the data has been collected.

II. District At a Glance :- The table presents a birds eye view of the Socio Economic Indicators of development in Nagpur district and Maharashtra State under different heads such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandary, education, transport and communication, plan C.D. Programme, Local Bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the data is also indicated in the table.

III. Contents, Scope and limitation :- The statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 15 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitation of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1. Area and population :- In all 9 tables i.e. table Nos. 1.1 to 1.9 are included in this section. The data for 1971 census has also been indicated in all the tables except table No. 1.2 where in the data for 1951, 1961 and 1971 census has been shown with decadal percentage variation. The reference period for 1971 census was sunrise of the 1st, April 1971.

Table No. 1.1 :- Indicates panchayat sanitiwise are number of houses and population according to 1971 census in Rural Area of Nagpur district. The total area figures of the district as on 1st July, 1971 are as supplied by the surveyor General of India. Also the area figures of the urban area are as supplied by municipal Corporation or councils. For any place to be recognised as an urban area (Town) for 1971 census, it was to have a Municipal Corporation or an area under a Municipal Council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied (a) a minimum population of 5000 (estimated for 1971) (b) a density of not less than 400 per Sq.km. (1000) per square mile (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupation falling outside agriculture (d) the place should have according to the Director of census operations of the state a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities. The area figures in table 1.1 have been given in square kilometers. One square kilometre is equal to 0.386 Sq. Miles.

Table No. 1.2 :- It indicates decadal variations in population since 1951 to 1971.

Table No. 1.3 :- It gives Tahsilwise/Panchayat Sanitiwise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village i.e. (Rural area) uses in the table denotes a statutorily recognised villages having well defined boundary and separate land records, Hamlets, wadis or padas have therefore not been shown as separate villages.

Table No. 1.4 :- It gives Tahsilwise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1971 census.

Table No. 1.5 :- It gives number of workers and non workers in Rural and Urban areas of the district according to 1971 census and their classification according to standard livelihood classes. The concept of dependency has ^{been} abandoned for economic classification in 1971 census. The emphasis is now on work and net on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (A) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry etc. He had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and (B) in case of regular employment in any trade, profession, services, business or commerce, he was employed

during any of the 7 days preceeding the day of enumerator's visit to the household and the work has been returned as his main activity. The person like beggars, pensioners agriculture or non agriculture royalty rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn on income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation have been classification non-Workers.

Table No. 1.6 :- It gives distribution of population according to (A) age group and (B) Religion, seperately for Rural and Urban areas and for district as a whole according to 1971 Census.

Table No. 1.7 :- It gives panchayat samitiwise and Tahsilwise details of total population of scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and non-Budhist in Rural and Urban areas with the population of Males, Females, Under above mentioned categories according to 1971 census to Nagpur district. The scheduled caste notified for this district according to 1971 census area as follows. :-
1. Mahar (2) rang (3) Bhanri (4) Chanbhar, Chamari/Mochi, Nana & Bohidas (5) Dhor (6) Khatik (7) Bhana (8) Bhallar (9) Basar (10) Don (11) Ganda or Gandi (12) Ghasi or Ghasia (13) Kawikadi (14) Katia (15) Madgi (16) Balai/Burud/Bansar or Bansodi, Sansi.

Scheduled Tribes :- No caste is notified as scheduled tribes in Nagpur district.

Table No. 8 :- It gives distribution of houses by material used for walls/roofs for rural and Urban areas and for a district as a whole.

Table No. 1.9 :- It gives household according to size and status of tenure in Rural and Urban area for district according to 1971 census.

2. Climate :- Only two tables are included and this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Nagpur district.

Table No. 2.1 :- It gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1981- The data has been collected through Revenue Agency. A day is treated as 'Rainy day' if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.M. of rain fall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the tables. 'Normal Rainfall' is the average rainfall ever a period ranging from minimum five years to maximum eighty years.

Table No. 2.2 :- It gives monthwise maximum, minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at selected centres for the year 1960 and 1981. The data has been supplied by the Govt. of India's Regional meteorological centre at Nagpur. The maximum and minimum temperature denotes the maximum and minimum temperature on any day during the month.

3. Agriculture :- In all 13 tables i.e. tables No. 3.1 to 3.13 are included in this section.

Table No. 3.1 : Indicates talukewise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1960-61, 1978-79, 1979-80 and 1980-81. Against each Taluka, the breakup of total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the geographical area are forests, land put to non agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land, cultivable waste, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous crops, trees, crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown.

Under 'Forest' are included all actual forest areas of land classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded, but is put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. Land put to non agricultural uses, stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture purpose. Barren and uncultivable land covers all barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classified as barren and uncultivable land, whether such land in isolated blocks or within cultivated/during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such land may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles, which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie in blocks or within cultivated holdings permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands whether they / holding cultivable waste include all land available for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated

are permanent pasture and meadows or net. Village common and grazing lands whether in forest areas are included under this head. Land under miscellaneous trees crops etc. ~~not~~ included in the net area sown. All cultivable land which is not included under net sown but it put to some agricultural use. Land under casuring tree thatching grass, bamboo, bushes and other groves used for fuel etc. which are net included under orchards are classed under / comprise of cultivable areas which are kept fallow / this category, current fallow / during the current year, other fallow land included - all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for period of not less than one year or more than five years. The net area sown consists of area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sub-Total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same of different crops.

Table No. 3.2 :- It shows the area under different crops in each taluka. It gives break-up of the total gross cropped, area according to major group of food and non food crops.

Table No. 3.3 :- It gives yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops in the district.

Table No. 3.4 :- Depicts the picture of talukawise area irrigated by different sources.

Table No. 3.5 :- Shows the area irrigated under different crops in each taluka.

Table No. 3.6 :- It shows the talukawise number of irrigation wells in use and not in use and other wells in the district. A quinquennial census of irrigation wells takes place after every five years. For any intermediate years the village officers are instructed to note the number of wells.

Table No. 3.7 :- It indicates panchayat samitiwise as well as talukawise minor irrigation works for the year 1960-61 and 1980-81.

Table No. 3.8 :- It gives the information on major and medium irrigation projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is given as it was on 30th June, 1981. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 lakhs to Rs. 5 crores & above whereas that of major irrigation projects it is Rs. 5 crores & above.

Table No. 3.9 :- It deals with monthly agriculture wage rates in 1981. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from the selected rural centres in Nagpur District viz. 1) Houda 2) Kuhi. 3) Dhapewada.

Table No. 3.10 :- It shows information on agricultural census holdings for the year 1981-82.

Table No. 3.11 :- It deals with agricultural implements in each block within the taluka. The implements are wooden and iron ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers operated with power and bullocks, oil engines with pumps for irrigation purpose, electric pumps for irrigation purpose; tractors and oil ghani (less than 5 kg. and above 5 Kg.) according to 1978 census.

Table No. 3.12 :- It deals with farming scarcity and skin to scarcity data in this district for the year 1981-82.

4. Table No. 3.13 :- It gives the position of determination of precarious and other scarcity area according to the history of scarcity in the district from 1971-72 to 1981-82.

4. Animal Husbandary Forestry and Fisheries :-

A. Animal Husbandary :- In all 8 tables i.e. 4.1 to 4.8 are included in this section.

T. No. 4.1 It gives provisionally panchayat samitiwise and taluka wise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in district in the livestock census 1978. The census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. Precaution was also taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals in transit, sex and age groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

Table No. 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5 :- It gives panchayat samitiwise and talukawise veterinary statistics, tahsilwise No. of mobile veterinary units diseasewise livestock mortality and number of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them for the year 1960-61 and 1981-82.

Table No. 4.6 :- (A) Gives details of areas under different type of forests during the year 1960-61 and 1981-82. Data regarding forests under the control of the state Govt. Forest Department and these under the control of the state Government Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are

classified according to legal status refer to the classification of forests under Indian Forest Act XVI of 1927.

Reserved forest are those which are intended mainly for timber production where in the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests the restrictions are not so rigid. The right of grazing and cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions imposed. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or on occupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from Local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called leased forest. There is no classification of expropriatory forest as such but in Nagpur division. Some private lands containing valuable forest are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forest Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are named as ex-proprietor. The forest area shown in table No. 4.6 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table 3.1. The two sets of figures differ, due to the following reasons:-

1. In the Indian Forest Statistics returns the whole area, including non wooden area under the controls of forest department is taken as area under forest, while in Agriculture Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.
2. The forest department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view, of Forest Department as it is in the land utilisation statistics under Agricultural statistics.
3. The forest department returns relate to financial year and agricultural statistics relate to the Agricultural year.

Table No. 4.7 (B):- It gives the information on major and minor forest produce in the district during the year 1960-61 and 1981-82.

Table No. 4.8 :- It gives talukwise data on inland fisheries for the year 1960-61 and 1981-82.

5. Employment Industry mining and Electricity :-

In all 11 tables i.e. tables No. 5.1 to 5.11 are included in this section. The factory statistics shown in Table No. 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3 cover following types of factories registered under the factory Act 1948.

1. These employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power section 2(i).

2. Those employing twenty or more workers working without the aid of power (section 2 (ii) and 3). Those registered under Section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the defence factories are excluded.

Table No. 5.4 :- Deals with the information pertaining to Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1979-80 and 1980-81.

Table No. 5.5 :- Shows the employment exchange statistics by the employment categorywise and occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchange for the year 1960, 1970, 1975, 1981 and 1982. according to standard national classification.

Table No. 5.6 :- It gives the information about vocational guidance programme in the district for the years 1960-61, 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 5.7 :- It shows works undertaken under the employment guarantee scheme, employment generated and expenditure incurred during 80-81, 81-82 (monthwise).

Table No. 5.8 :- It gives the figures of volume of employment in different industries as on 31-3-82.

Table No. 5.9 :- It gives progress of electrification of towns and villages and their population covered in the district for 1981-82 for the years 1961, 1966, 1970, 1975 and 1980, 1981 and 1982.

Table No. 5.10 :- It gives the figures of consumption of electricity and No. of connections in the district for the years 1960-61 and 1981-82.

6. Co-operation :- In all 12 tables i.e. table No. 6.1 to 6.12 are included in this section.

Table No. 6.1 :- It gives the number of co-operative credit and non-credit societies of different types in the district as on 30th June, 1961 and 1982 in Nagpur district.

Table No. 6.2 :- It gives the selected data of all the types of societies in the district for the year ending as on 30-6-1981 and for the year ending as on 30-6-1982.

Table No. 6.3 :- It gives the Audit classification of all types of societies allotted during the year ending as on 30-6-82.

Table No. 6.4 :- Presents data on cooperative Banks and Urban banks in district for the year ending 30th June, 1982.

Table No. 6.5 :- Gives Panchayat Sanitiwise and Talukawise number of primary agricultural credit societies, their membership, share capital Reserve and other funds. Working capital loan advanced, loans outstanding, loan overdues. Working capital includes paid up share capital deposits, reserved and other funds and borrowing loans cash credit and over drafts and the amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Over dues refer to amount of loans or instalments which are due for collection but were not actually collected and for the payment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

Table No. 6.6.1 to 6.6.3 :- It gives the information about crop loans advanced by primary Agricultural credit societies, Farmers services societies and Adiwasi Co-operative Societies in the district during the year ending 30-6-1982.

Table No. 6.7 :- Shows data panchayat sanitiwise regarding operation of primary cooperative marketing societies in the district during the year ending 30-6-82.

Table No. 6.8 :- Presents the other co-operative Societies of different types i.e. called non agricultural credit societies and its operations for the year ending 30th June, 1982.

Table No. 6.9 :- It gives No. of productive enterprises their membership, share capital reserve and other funds and working capital of individual productive enterprises for the year ending 30-6-1982.

Table No. 6.10 :- Gives the value of purchases and sales of agriculture produce through regulated markets panchayat sanitiwise in the district.

Table No. 6.11 :- Gives the data regarding operation of other cooperative societies of different types in the district, for the year ending 30th June, 1982.

Table No. 6.12 :- Gives Panchayat Sanitiwise and talukawise number of registered money lenders in each taluka and Loan advanced by them during the year ending 30-6-82. Separate figures of Loans advanced to traders and non traders have been furnished in this

table., The transaction of money lending in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay money lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act. no money lender shall carry on the business of money lending except in area for which the licence has been granted a licence and except in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence.

7. Medical and Public Health :- In all 5 tables i.e. table No. 7.1 to 7.5 are included in this section.

Table No. 7.1 :- It indicates parichayat samitiwise and talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes and medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in this district alongwith the number of primary health centres Doctors,

Nurses, Vaidyas, Beds and total number of in door and out-door patients treated for the year 1981. The table covers all the state, Central Govt, medical institutions and also institutions owned by Municipalities, local bodies engaged in providing Medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are however not included in this table.

Table No. 7.2 :- It gives vital statistics such as number of Registered births and deaths in the district sexwise classification of registered births and deaths and infant deaths for 1981 and rural and urban break up is also given.

Table No. 7.3 :- Gives number of deaths due to important causes in Nagpur district during 1971, 1975, 1980, 1981.

Table No. 7.4 :- It gives talukawise statistics of vaccination and revaccination for small-pox and cholera inoculation etc. for 1981.

Table No. 7.5 :- Indicates number of sterilisation operations done under vasectomy and tubectomy with number of I.U.C.D. insertions performed during the year 1981-82 and family planning centre in the district and the number of eligibles couple, are also given.

Table No. 8. Education:- In all eleven tables i.e. table No. 8.1 to 8.11 are included in this section. The data in this table No. 8.1 is according to 1971 census.

Table No. 8.1 :- It gives sexwise number of literate and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban area of this district according to 1971 population census. As per 1971 census

definition a person was classified as literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

Table No. 3.2 :- Gives the sexwise education statistics in rural areas according to 1961 census in Nagpur district.

Table No. 3.3 :- Gives the sexwise education statistics in urban area according to 1961 census.

Table No. 3.4 :- It gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types, for the year 1979-80, 1980-81, 1981-82, sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to types is slightly different from stage of education. There were at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in primary course. Nevertheless the entire enrolment of students included under secondary education primary institutions provided education for standard I and VIII or less, and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions coach students for standard VIII to X standard with or without lower standards. Higher education is the education after passing secondary school certificate examination which leads to a Degree examination.

Table No. 3.5 :- It presents data for the number of beneficiaries among backward classes. Such as scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and other backward classes for the year 1981-82. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concession of either type such as scholarship, freeship, etc.

Table No. 3.6 :- It gives the information regarding the number of other types of educational institutions according to types such as bachelor of education, Bachelor of Law, Medical college etc. for the year 1980-81 and 1981-82, and the numbers of pupils there in according to scheduled caste, scheduled tribe, O.B.C. and Non-O.B.C. by sexwise number of teachers according to sex is also given in this table.

Table No. 3.7 :- Gives number of beneficiaries under the Economically backward class concessions in respect of primary secondary and higher institution in the district during 1981-82.

Table No. 8.8 :- Gives data regarding recurring and non recurring expenditure under normal plan heads by different agencies viz. Z.P., Municipal councils, Corporations, Cantonment Board etc. during the year 1960-61 and 1981-82.

Table No. 8.9 :- It gives the information regarding the number of vocational and technical schools in Nagpur district and enrollment by boys and girls and expenditure incurred by them for the year 1979-80, 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 8.10 :- Gives the number of adult education centres in the district for the year 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 8.11 :- It gives the number of teachers training institutions at degree level, under graduate level, schools and enrolment on the same level is also given for the year 1960-61, 1980-81 and 1981-82. The expenditure incurred thereon in this table.

Transport and Communication :- In all 7 Tables i.e. table No. 9.1 to 9.7 are included in this section.

Table No. 9.1 :- Gives total railway length as on 31st March 1961 and 1982 according to type of routes, Broad gauge metre-gauge and Narrow gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are therefore approximate and not accurate.

Table No. 9.2 :- Gives road length according to different categories and surface classification roads of Zilla Parishad, Building and Communication Department as on 31st March, 1961 and 1982.

Table No. 9.3 :- Gives the motor vehicles in operation in Nagpur Region as on 31st March, 1961 and 1982.

Table No. 9.4 :- Deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Nagpur Division during the year 1960-61, 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 9.5 :- Presents the result of the traffic census as on December 1981 on important roads conducted by Building and Communication Department; Govt of Maharashtra, Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and locating of count post. Type of surface carriage width No. of light, Medium

and Heavy motor vehicles and total traffic intensity in tonnes per 24 hours are also given in this table.

Table No. 9.6 :- Relates to communication system, number of Post Offices Telegraphs Offices No. of Letter Boxes, Telephone and Radio Licences renewed during the year 1960-61, 1965-66, 1970-71, 1975-76, 1980-81 and 1981-82 have been shown in this table.

Table No. 9.7 :- Relates to Rural Broad Casting statistics as on 31st March, 1982 for each panchayat samiti in Nagpur district.

Table No. 10 :- Local Bodies :- In all 4 tables i.e. 10.1 to 10.4 are included in this section.

Table No. 10.1 :- Gives abstract of income and expenditure of Local Bodies such as Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the financial year 1965-66 1970-71, 1975-76, 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 10.2 :- Indicates Income and Expenditure of Village Panchayats for 1981-82.

Table No. 10.3 :- A.B.C. Gives Headwise receipt and expenditure of Zilla Parishad for financial year 1962-63, 1979-80, 1980-81 (Actual) 1981-82 (Revised) and 1982-83 (estimated).

Table No. 10.4 :- Indicates income and expenditure of Municipal Councils, Corporation and Contonment Board for the year 1981-82.

Table No. 11 :- PLAN :- In two tables i.e. 11.1 to 11.2 are included in this section.

Table No. 11.1 :- Deals with the heads and sub-headwise expenditure on Plan scheme in the district for the year 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 11.2 :- Presents in short the physical achievements under the plan schemes for 1980-81 and 1981-82.

Table No. 12 :- Prices and Index Nos. :- In all three tables i.e. table No. 12.1 to 12.3 are included in this section.

Table No. 12.1 :- Gives monthly average wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at regulated markets during the year 1961, 1980 and 1981 in Nagpur district.

Table No. 12.2 :- Gives Monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district head quarter during the year 1981. The average prices under each commodities are shown from the month of January to December, for the year 1981, alongwith units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data is regularly collected by the district statistical office every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The averages prices of each commodities for the year 1981 is also shown in the table. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from the selected shop at District Head Quarter; the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative. But the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the changing trend in retail prices over the period of time.

Table No. 12.3 :- Gives consumer price index number (revised) series for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour Bombay. Monthwise data for the year 1981-82 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (New Series) is 1960.

13. Judicial and Administration :- In all five tables i.e. 13.1 to 13.5 are included in this section.

Table No. 13.1 :- Gives the strength of Police Force in Nagpur district during the year 1961, 1980 and 1981.

Table No. 13.2 :- Indicates crime statistics giving classification of offences under cognizable offences and non cognizable offences with the details of No. of offenders persons, tried persons, convicted and persons acquitted under above categories during the year 1981.

Table No. 13.3 :- Gives the number of prisoners hold due to various causes in district during the year 1979, 1980 and 1981.

Table No. 13.4 :- It gives the information regarding convict by age and sex in district during the year 1979, 1980 and 1981.

Table No. 13.5 :- Gives statistics regarding work disposed off in civil and criminal courts in Nagpur district during the year 1961 and 1981. The cases decided by the District Magistrate & Executive Magistrate are not included, in this table.

14. Banking and Insurance :- In all three table 14.1 to 14.3 are included in this section.

Table No. 14.1 :- Gives number of towns and villages having banking offices, population covered with number of scheduled banks, Co-Operative Banks, number of banking offices, Deposits of scheduled Bank, advances of scheduled banks during the year 1960-61, 1980-81, 1981-82

Table No. 14.2 :- Deals with Joint Stock companies in the district for the year 1960-61 1980-81 and 1981-82.

CHAPTER-III

An Analytical review of sectorial trends :-

In this chapter the progress of development has been reviewed by presenting Tahsilwise sectorial Trends based on certain important developments. The base year to compare the present position is 1960-61. The position of earlier decade has also been presented while giving the position of the year 1970-71 to compare the progress of the present. An attempt has been made to give the Tahsilwise position but in absence of it, the district position is reported. Since the base year is considered 1960-61, the data for the base year has been reported, but in absence if the data available for the year nearer to 1960-61 has been utilised for the purpose of comparison.

To review the present position the indicators exhibiting the the position of developments under Agriculture, Co-Operation, Live-Stock, Electricity, Employment, Banking, Prices etc. during the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1981-82 have been worked out and presented below.

1. Agriculture

Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown.

Agriculture has been the mainstay of the district economy. The extent of double cropping is solely related to the availability of irrigation facilities and soil capacity to retain the moisture after the monsoons. The district accounts for the low percentage of the area sown more than once to the net area sown as compared to Maharashtra State.

In 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1980-81 the percentage of gross cropped area to the total geographical area in the district was 54%, 61% and 57 % respectively. The district accounted for 1% ,1% and 4% respectively of the area sown more than once to net area sown during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1980-81

The following tables gives the percentage of gross cropped area sown in Nagpur district in the year 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1980-81.

It seems from the above table that the gross cropped area of the district has increased by 6 % in year 1970-71, compared the position in 1960-61. But it has decreased by 3 % subsequently in the year 1980-81 as compared to 1970-71. However there is an addition of 3 % in 1980-81, over the situation in 1960-61.

The similar trend of increase in gross cropping during the period from 1960-61 to 1970-71 is maintained at all talukas in the district.

Percentage distribution of area under important crops to total gross cropped area

The productivity of crops, by and large depends upon the timely and even distribution of rains over a period of season and also upon the adoption of high yielding varieties of seeds and use of chemical fertilizers.

Rice, wheat jowar, gram, tur, are the main food crops, while chillies, cotton, groundnut, sesamum, linseed etc. are the prominent cash crop of the district.

The following table broadly indicates cropping pattern and gives percentage distribution of the area under important crops, to the total gross cropped area in the district.

The above table broadly indicates the cropping pattern of the district. It will be seen from the table that the percentage of gross sown area under rice, gram, chillies, condiments and spices oil seeds etc. has increased while there seems a decreasing trend in case of wheat and jowar crops. In other words there appears, to be decreasing trend in the food grains in the district. Gross sown area has increased under the non food crops over a period from 1960-61 to 1970-71 and it has again declined up to 25.19 % in 1980-81.

The above table indicates that the production of all crops, excepting pulses has been increased during the year 1980-81 compared to the year 1960-61. The production of pulses has been decreased during the year 1970-71 and also in 1980-81. There is an increasing trend of yield per hectare in case of cereals. Yield per hectare of pulses has gone down during 1980-81 compared to the year 1960-61. Oil seeds have also marked a downward trend during 1980-81, compared to 1960-61.

It will be seen from the above table that the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area has been gradually increasing in all the talukas of the district excepting Ramtek taluka. The percentage was however highest at 14.06 % in Ramtek taluka in 1970-71 and it is at 12.04 % during the year 1980-81. Katol taluka ranks second at 10.02 % during 1980-81. The percentage is lowest at 4.87% in Umrer taluka during 1980-81. The district percentage is also gradually increasing from 5.17 % in 1960-61 to 7.15 % in 1970-71 and 8.06 % in 1980-81. The percentage have almost doubled in Nagpur and Savner, talukas in 1980-81 over the year 1960-61.

The percentage of area irrigated to gross irrigated area has substantially increased under wheat, Jowar, & gram during

the year 1970-71 and 1980-81, while the percentages under rice, chillies cotton has substantially decreased from 1960-61 to 1970-71 and 1980-81. There appears a rising trend of percentage area under the cereals and pulses. There is a steep decline of percentage area irrigated under the non-food crop. The percentage of area irrigated under wheat crops has rose to 34.05 % in 1980-81 from that at 11.70 in the year 1960-61. Area irrigated under cotton crop has also been dropped down to 1.51 % in 1980-81 from that at 2.04 % in the year 1960-61. The percentage of irrigated area under chillies have been decreased to 2.64 % in 1980-81 from 5.17% in 1960-61.

It will be seen from the above table that the area irrigated in the district has been decreased to a lot during the years 1970-71 and also in 1980-81 as compared to the year 1960-61. Out of the total net area irrigated of 67,720 hectares in 1960-61, and an area of 35,032* was irrigated by wells. The percentage comes to 51.73% of 35,032* in the year 1970-71, 41.03 % of area was irrigated by well irrigation and in 1980-81 the percentage comes to 56.67. There is a slight increase of gross irrigated area, of about 12000 hectares in 1980-81 over the year 1970-71. The percentage of gross area irrigated to net area irrigated during 1980-81 comes to 132.95 %.

2. Agriculture credit. :-

The co-operative societies play an important role in the field of agricultural developments by extending the credit facilities on an extensive scale. Moreover it replaces money lending business in rural areas. The progress of credit facilities given by agricultural credit societies during the year 1960-61 & 1970-71 and 1980-82 is shown in the following table.

From the above table it will be seen that the no. of primary agricultural credit societies has decreased from 649 in 1960-61 to 641 in 1970-71 and further decreased to 606 in 1980-81. However the number of members has increased to 1,43,547 in 1980-81 from these 70,576 members in 1970-71. The position of loan advanced, loan overdues has also increased during the year 1980-81. The amount of out-standing loans has increased by more than twice compared to the position in 1970-71.

3. Wage rates. :-

The data on agricultural wage rates in rural area is being collected from selected cultivators at three selected rural centres in Nagpur district, since June 1963. These centres are Kuhl, Mouda & Dhapewada from Umrer, Ramtek and Savner taluka (old) respectively.

These wage rates are collected fortnightly. As these centres do not represent the district position very correctly these wage rates may be taken as broad indicator of wage level in the district. The following table gives average wage rates at selected centres for the year 1963 and 1981, in Nagpur district.

From the above table it is seen that the agricultural wage rates were higher at Dhapewada centre for male and lower for female for the reference year. The agricultural wage rate have increased by 406.66 % in case of male and by 562.71 % in case of female in 1981 as compared to wage rates in 1963 in the district.

4. Livestock.

In Indian economy livestock keeps an important power in agricultural operations. It also provides manure to retain the fertility of land. To have up to date data the livestock census is conducted in the state after a quinquennial period. The latest 12th livestock census has been conducted in the year 1978. The census figures are now finalised.

From the above table it is seen that the indicator in Umred Tahsil is lowest. It is below the district average in Katol & Rantek Tahsils. It is higher than the district average in Nagpur & Savner talukas.

The poultry population in the district in 1978 was 3,32,759 against 59,700 in 1961 and 1,76,899 in 1966. The human population according to 1971 census for district was 19,42,688.

The poultry population per 100 persons was 4 in 1961 and 12 in 1966 and 22 in 1978.

5. Consumption of Electricity.

Power development programme has been given the highest priority in view of the importance in the economic development of the state.

Up to the year 1960-61 there were only 11 towns and 227 villages electrified in the district while 13 towns and 1531 villages have been electrified as on 31-3-1982. The percentage of electrified villages to total number of inhabited villages worked out to 94.22% whereas 100% towns have been electrified. Per capita consumption of electricity, in 1981-82 has been increased up to 291.59 Kws. from 52.03 Kws in 1960-61.

Accordingly appreciable progress in providing curative as well as preventive health measures have been made in the previous years.

The above table shows that the number of indoor patients treated has increased during the year 1981-82 in comparison to the year 1961. The outdoor patients have also increased to 55,39,000 in 1981-82 as compared to 17,86,000 in 1961. This increase is mainly due to increase in medical facilities in the district.

8. Education :-

Increase in the number of students in different categories.

Education helps to make people aware of the needs of development and equips them with specific skill to participate in the process of development. The quantitative expansion in primary, secondary and higher education has been achieved during the plan periods.

In case of primary education, there was an addition of 732 institutions and 247.00 percent increase in enrolment during the period from 1960-61 to 7540 in 1981-82. The number of secondary institutions has increased from 151 in 1960-61 to 303 in 1981-82 and the enrolment has also increased from 64,122 to 2,05,000 in 1981-82 and the number of teachers increased from 2,637 to 6,591 in the same period.

In case of higher education the number of institutions have almost doubled during 1981-82 as compared to the base year 1960-61. The enrolment has also increased from 29,531 to 45,543 in 1981-82.

9. Increase in commercial Banking. :-

10. Roads. :- Increase in Roads. :-

Nagpur is an important junction of central and south eastern Railway routes. It is also an important station on the routes of all super and fast trains running towards Bombay, Delhi, Calcutta and Madras. The District head quarter is connected with internal Air service being an important Aerodrom on National Route.

It was aimed to provide road facilities to rural areas and accordingly a criteria was fixed under Nagpur Plan, that no village should remain more than 4 miles away from metal road and more than 1½ miles away from any type of Road. The below table indicates Road length per 100 Sq. Km. in the district during 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1981-82.

Chapter IV
Annual Plan 1981-82

4.1 (a) Principal of decentralised implementation of Plan.

In accordance with the policy of decentralisation of planning efforts, the Govt. of Maharashtra has adopted the principal of district planning since the commencement of the Fifty Five Year Plan 1974-79. In order to maintain the tempo of growth, it is necessary to ensure the participation of a large segment of the population in the development process. In conformity with this objectives, the 5th Plan of the state of Maharashtra seeks to achieve the following.

1. Acceleration of the growth rate of state income.
2. Promotion of appropriate technologies in agriculture and rural industries with a view to increase employment opportunities.
3. Creating conditions favourable for the most vulnerable sections of the population in the benefits of the plan.
4. A guarantee of employment in manual work to all able bodied adults who are willing to work.
5. Provision of basic minimum needs of life to people.
6. Removal of imbalances of development between district and areas within districts.

Decentralised implementation of District Plans at District level has been principally followed accordingly. Necessary powers have been delegated to District level officers in order ^{to} implement the plan effectively for the benefits of weaker sections.

(b) Adoption of District as a unit of planning during the Fifth Plan.

During and up to the end of fourth five year plan, the progress in the implementation of the plans were reviewed at the district level by advisory committees appointed under Govt. Circular Co-Operation and Rural Development Deptt. dated 5th August, 1965 and at the Divisional level by the Divisional Advisory committee constituted under Govt. Circular Finance Department dated 13th December, 1965. Govt. has since decided that the District should be adopted as unit of Planning during fifth plan and that prospective five years and annual plans should be formulated for each district so that imbalances in development between district and the areas within the same district are steadily removed to the extent possible and all the districts are given an opportunity to attain full development having regard to their

potential, available manpower and other resources.

The very basic idea about district planning is that every district shall get certain plan allocation worked out on the basis of certain parameters and broad cross section of the representatives should have a definite say as to how this allocation should be spent in the best possible way.

c) Objects of District Planning :-

The main object of the District Planning is to take into account the local resources, manpower, institutional funds and after careful consideration, formulate the District Plans in accordance with the requirements of the District and also to solve the various pressing problems of the District on priority basis, wherever required by providing adequate funds to that effect. While formulating the District Plan, it is ensured that active public participation is a must. (i.e. people's active Co-Operation). It is desired by district planning to achieve the rational utilisation of resources, removal of inter tahsil imbalances as well as proper co-ordination and full utilisation on development programmes.

4.2 :- Organisation of Machinery set up in the district for formulation, monitoring and over seeing of District Plans. :-

It has been decided by the Govt. of Maharashtra that there should be a agency or machinery at District level for formulation Monitoring, overseeing of District Plans, and accordingly as per Govt. Reselution, General Administration Department No. FD-SPM 1072/P-1 dated 20th Oct. 1972, District Planning Board was constituted. The main function of the District planning was to ensure

Co-ordinated action by various implementing agencies including the Zilla Parishads and to give guidelines to various implementing agencies in formulation and implementation of prospective Five Years Plans.

a) In the District Planning Board, there were in all 12 members out of which 3 were non officials. To assist the District Planning Board a District Planning team consisting of eight members was also constituted where in Collector was appointed as Chairman and Planning Officer as member secretary.

In order to associate the elected representatives of the people in Parliament and state Legislature and the representatives of various interests, such as industries, trade, commerce, universities

and social welfare institutions in the district with the planning process, Govt, under its Resolution No. DDC/1973/P/1/(A) dated 20- has set up a District Development Council in each district which would serve as a forum for ascertaining the views of the people in the matter of development of the district and their needs for periodical review of the District Plans.

(b) After reviewing the working of the District Planning Board and District Development Councils, Govt. has taken the decision to associate the elected representatives of the people more directly with the planning process. In view of the above decision Govt. has decided to amalgamate these planning bodies at the district level with immediate effect under its Resolution No. DDC/1074/P-I dated 1-10-1974. The functions of the district planning and development council are the same of that of district planning board, mentioned in para 4.2(a) above.

To assist the District Planning and development councils in the day to day planning and development activities, Govt. in Planning Department under the said resolution has constituted a small executive committee of the council of 9 members, who were the member of the D.P. and D.C. The designated Minister of the district worked as a chairman, where as the Dy. C.E. (Planning) would work as secretary of this small executive committee of the D.P.D.C. The Executive Committee can meet as often as required but at least once in two months.

(c) Organisational set up for D.P.&D.C. and Executive Committee.

In supersession of all previous orders issued so far, Govt. in Planning Department under its Resolution No. DPC/1079/PRG-B dated 21-6-1979, has fixed the composition of the D.P.D.C. as follows.

It is one of the main function of the district Planning and Development Council to give guide-lines to the various implementing agencies at district level regarding preparation of Plan with in the Board frame of National and State Polices and its meaningful implementing agencies at district level, and also to ensure effective Co.-Ordination between various implementing agencies. at district level including Zill Parishad. To fulfil the said object executive committee of DP.D.C. generally meets in every month with a view to monitoring and overseeing the implementing of district plan and to adopt timely remedial measures, if necessary in implementing on the formulated plan at district level.

4.3 As the fifth plan period which was originally to run till 31st March 1979 was curtailed by one year and it was decided to treat 1978-79 as the last year of the Vth Five Year Plan and 1st year of Sixth Five Year Plan 1978-85. According to the year 1979-80 was treated as the 2nd Year of Sixth Five Year Plan (1978-85) due to change in Govt. policy. However, the sixth Five Year Plan was refinalised by the Govt. for the year 1980-85 and hence the Annual Plan 1979-80 was to be treated as independent Annual Plan and not as part of either the fifth year plan of the sixth five year plan.

The Annual Plan of Nagpur district for 1981-82 involves a total budgeted outlay of Rs. 1358.42 Lakhs.

During the year 1981-82 the highest share of budget provision was earmarked to the Sector "Social Services" i.e. 33.85 % (459.89 Lakhs) followed by Agriculture Programme and irrigation & power i.e. Rs. 308.47 Lakhs and 240.50 Lakhs respectively.

Budget provision for the sector, except transport and communication, was not sufficient for the year 1981-82.

As regards the Tribal Sub-Plan the total expenditure 142.05 lakhs which was more as compared to budgeted provision. Total budget provision for Tribal Sub-Plan also was not sufficient for the year, 1981-82.

This programme included in all 13 different sub-sector of development.

1) Crops Husbandary :- A Provision of Rs.21.15 lakhs was made for crop husbandary under non-tribal sub-plan, against which Rs. 9.05 lakhs were utilised.

Similarly Rs. 3.63 lakhs were sanctioned for Crop Husbandary under Tribal Sub-Plan against which the expenditure was Rs.1.43 lakhs.

2. Minor Irrigation :-

Taking in to consideration the role of minor irrigation in agricultural development total provision of Rs.121 Lakhs for both Tribal and non-tribal areas was made. But the actual expenditure was Rs 132.01 lakhs which was more as against the budgeted outlay by Sub-sidy was given to 82 irrigation wells including tribal and non-tribal sub-plan. 53 Minor Irrigation works in which subsidy is adjusted for the year 1981-82. At the same time, in local sector 20 minor irrigation works were completed and one was in progress.

3) Soil Conservation :- In the Annual Plan 1981-82 Provision 3.17 lakhs for non tribal plan was made and the expenditure incurred was of Rs. 3.17 lakhs as against the budget provision. There was no such provision for the tribal sub-Plan for the year 1981-82.

The expenditure of Rs. 3.17 lakhs was incurred on 160 nala bunding works under 2014 hectares of land.

4) C.A.D.A :- In the Annual Plan 1981-82 provision of Rs.13.81 lakhs for non tribal sub-Plan was made and the expenditure was incurred to the tune of Rs. 12.27 lakhs which was less as against the budgeted provision. There was no provision under the tribal sub-plan for the year 1981-82.

5. I.R.D.F. :- This programme has introduced in all 13 blocks in the district and for which 58.49 lakhs has been incurred as against the budgeted provision of Rs.39.00 lakhs . There was no special provision under the tribal sub-Plan for the year 1981-82.

6. Animal Husbandary :- Rs. 12.40 lakhs against the provision of Rs. 11.91 lakhs and Rs. 2.80 lakhs against the provision of Rs. 2.94 lakhs was incurred on this programme under the non-tribal and tribal sub-plan respectively during the year 1981-82.

Under the Animal Husbandary programme viz. 1) Control of foot and mouth diseases 2) Establishment and expansion of D.M.C. centres and construction of bull sheds 3) Supply of milch cows to weaker sections 4) special livestock production programme etc.

7) Dairy Development :-

The share of expenditure on non-tribal and tribal sub-Plan was Rs- 13.60 and 0.81 lakhs respectively.

Resides under tribal sub-Plan 93 oneyear buffelows were distributed to tribals and subsidy of Rs. 27300 has also been given to tribals for buffelows.

8.) Fisheries :- The expenditure of Rs. 21.16 lakhs and 1.37 lakhs has been incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 19.17 lakhs and 0.32 lakhs under non tribal and tribal sub-plan respectively. The budget provision was less as compared to expenditure incurred during the year 1981-82. The main activities which were under taken during the year 1981-82 were as under, :-

1. Establishment of fish seed production farms.
2. Fish farming in impounded water.
3. Assistance for purchase of fisheries requisites and grants of subsidy.
4. Establishment of Training centre.

9. Forest :- Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 38.47 lakhs was incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 45.93 Lakhs. Under this subhead various schemes have been implemented such as plantation of various types of trees, Sowing of quick growing trees. The plantation of trees of general utility timber etc. In addition to this silewada, Pategaon, Kothara, Impādor forest road and Rambodi and loha somkadi bridges were also constructed with a view to provide easy transportation of forest produce.

10. Social Forestry :- Under this subhead an expenditure of Rs. 3.26 lakhs was incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 3.39 lakhs. This provision was made for tribal sub-plan only and not for non tribal sub-plan during the year 1981-82.

11. Ware housing and Marketing :- Under this sub-head loans of Rs. 0.50 lakhs was given to Marketing federation of District for construction of Market yards.

With view to strength the co-operative sector to provide maximum facilities of marketing to rural population an expenditure of Rs. 4.54 lakhs was incurred during the year 1981-82. The actual expenditure incurred on tribal sub-Plan scheme was Rs. 1.39 lakhs. The schemes such as financial assistance to the societies in the tribal area for construction of ~~etc.~~ financial assistance in the form of share, Capital etc. were implemented during the year 1981-82.

III. Irrigation and Power :- Scheme like construction of medium projects and normal development programme of electrification in urban and Rural areas were implemented under this head on which Rs. 251.25 ^{lakhs} were spent. The work of eight medium irrigation projects were in progress out of which Mordhan and Kesharnala and Chandra-bhaga were near about completion where as the work of Mokardhe-kada, Kolar, Paedhari, Kanholi were in progress.

Out of 1635 villages in this district 1515 villages have been electrified by the end of March, 1982. The percentage of electrified villages comes to 93 %.

IV. Industry and Mining :-

The expenditure on this head was Rs. 64.81 lakhs during the year 1981-82 and its percentage to the revised Budget provision comes to 102.98 ^{lakhs}. The major activity under this scheme was to promote employment under the scheme of employment Guarantee, to the educated un-employed, Under which training was imparted to 412 educated unemployed during the year under review.

The interest subsidy was also given to 498 enterprises. Under S.A.I Rules 323 educated unemployed were given a loan in the form of seed money, under employment promotion programme. Training under master craftsman has been given to persons. The financial assistance in the form of thrift fund have been given to 2 societies. Interest subsidy to 2 societies for establishment of sale department and 12 societies were given assistance in the form of share capital. Subsidy provided to 8 Balutdar societies in Rural areas.

V. Transport and Communication :- During the year 1981-82 crash programme of Rural Road was implemented against which an expenditure of Rs. 152.39 lakhs was incurred. During the reference year Roads of 150 Kms. were constructed under various road programme and 22 C.D. works have also been under taken during the year under the crash programme. The expenditure on this head in tribal area was 22.06 lakhs under road development.

Difficulties and bottlenecks experienced in the implementation of various schemes during the year 1981-82.

1. The budget provision under most of schemes were received late. In case of new works items schemes the provision as proposed by the district planning and development council were remained unbudgeted for want of administrative and technical sanction.
2. In case of continued schemes the administrative approval and orders to continue the scheme were abnormally delayed by various heads of the Departments. Even in case of budgetted schemes, order to release budget grants were considerably delayed by the head of the Departments resulting in failure to achieve the target in the plan year.
3. The schemes were formulated without any study or survey on the basis of the schemes implemented in other district and without studying the feasibility of the scheme in the district.
4. Roads were proposed without studying whether the land would have to be acquired or not. Normally the land acquisition programme takes its own time. The provision under such works remained unspent under such circumstances.
5. The preliminary work required to be completed before implementation of such programme were never completed before hand and these steps were taken after a major period was lapsed.
6. Planning programme in most of the schemes was not done which resulted in not achieving the desired targets.

1980-81

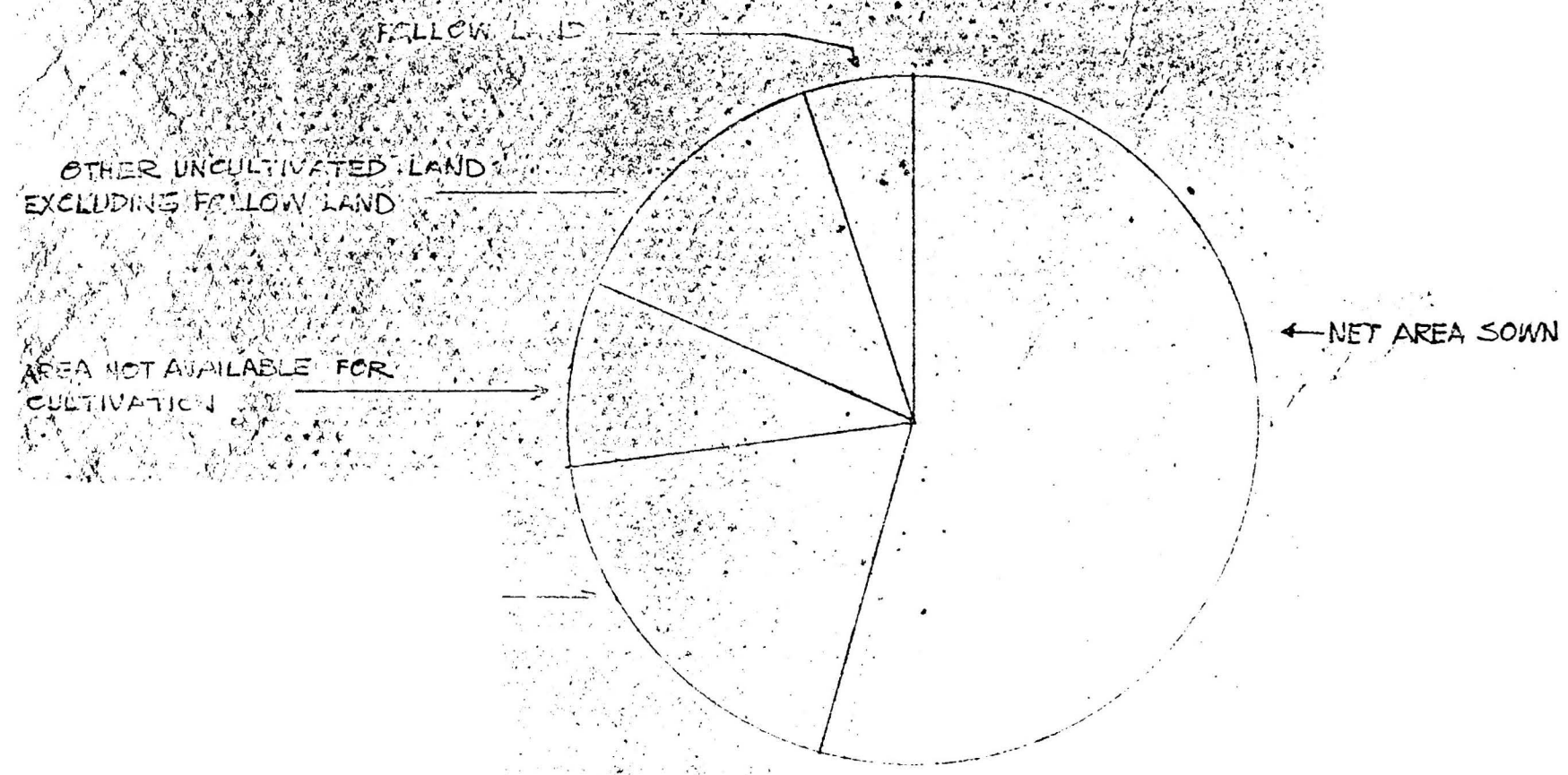

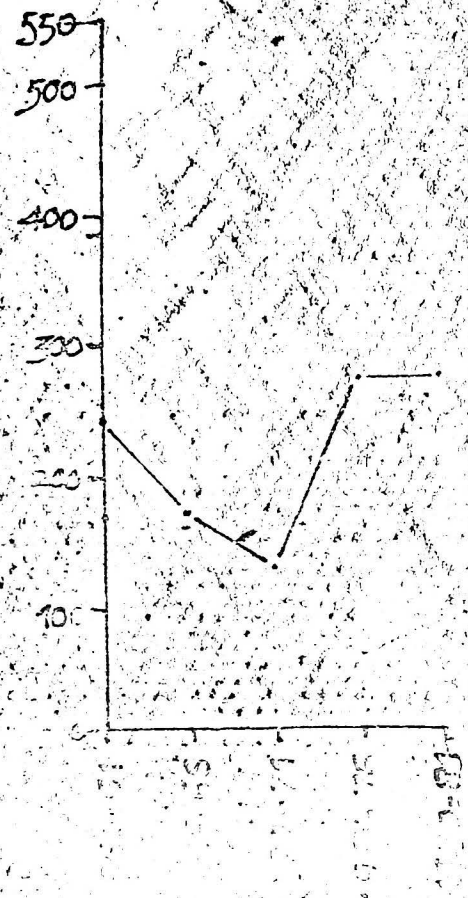

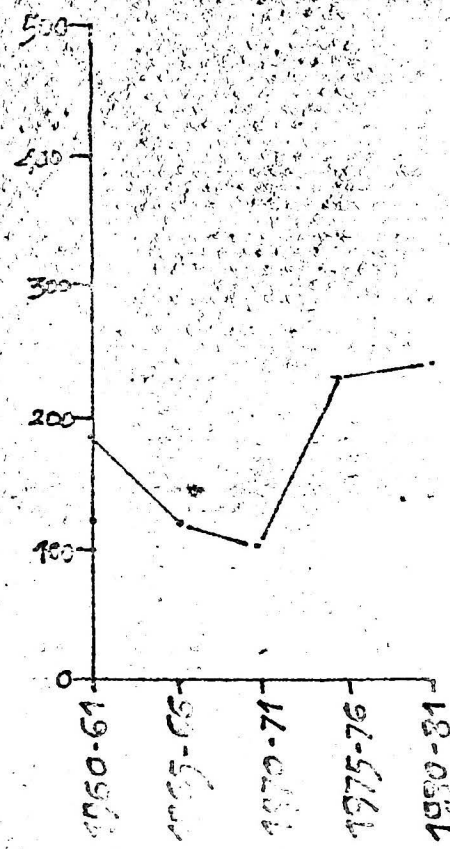

ALL PULSES

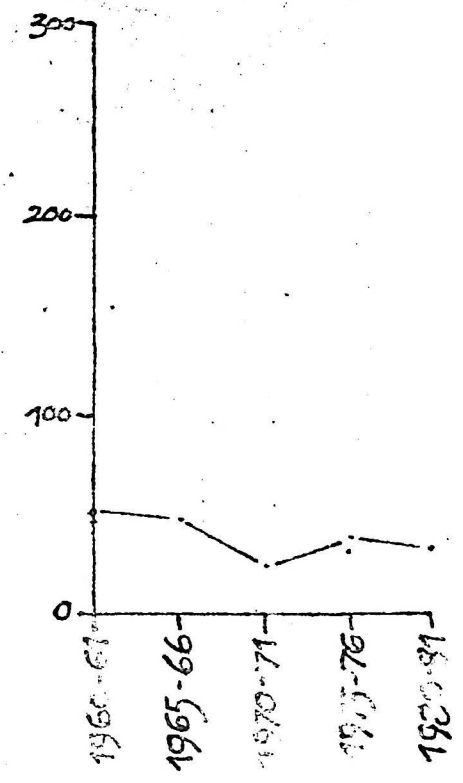

LAND REVENUE IN NAGPUR DISTRICT.

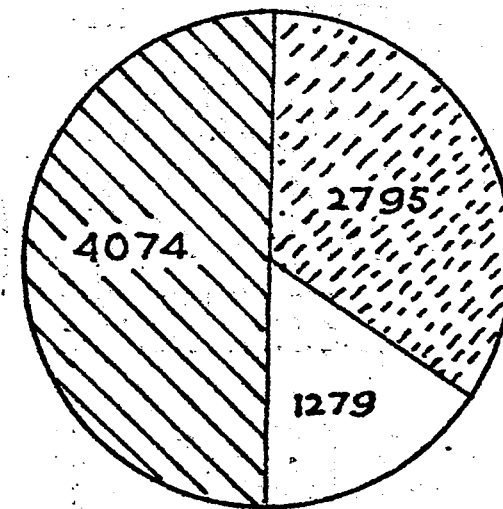
