CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION:

1.1. The Sangli District lies on the west of Deccan plateau between 16° and 18° North latitude and 73° and 75° East longitude. The district is to the extreme South East corner of the Maharashtra State and is close to the border of Mysore State, it extends to East to Bijapur District of Mysore State, to the West to Ratnagiri District. On the South are Kolhapur and Belgaum Districts and on the North, Satara and Sholapur district. It measures Eastwest, about 200 Km. and North South, about 90 Km. The river Warna flowing to the South of Sangli District demarcates the southern boundary of this district.

The district may be divided into four zones according to the topography of the lands as follows:-

- 1) Western zone comprising of offshoots of Sahyadri
- 2) Fertile zone on the banks of Krishna River
- 3) Hilly tract of Medium soil
- 4) Eastern zone of Mal land

1) WESTERN ZONE:

The entire Shirala Mahal is covered under this zone. This zone gets the maximum rainfall in the district ranging between 1140 mm. to 1400 mm. the average being 1200 mm. The soil is hard and less fertile and the important crops grown in this zone are gram, paddy and ragi. The Warna river flows to the south of this zone and river Morna through this zone meeting Warna at the border.

2) FERTILE ZONE:

The Krishna, Warna and Yerla rivers flowing through the Miraj, Tasgaon and Walwa talukas have enriched the soil fertility of this zone. The soil is of deep black type and the rainfall in between 770 mm. to 1140 mm. The average rainfall is less; but its impact on the agricultural production is not deterrent as ample irrigation facilities are available in this zone. Jowar is the main cereal crop of this zone.

3) HILLY TRACT :

This comprises of major portion of Khanapur taluka and also of Tasgaon and Miraj Taluka. The soil is of medium type and the rainfall is also low, ranging between 380 mm. to 89 mm. The rivers Agrani, Nanni and Yerla are flowing through this tract. The main crop of this tract are Jowar and Bajra.

4) EASTERN ZONE OF MAL LAND:

The zone comprises of Jath taluka and eastern part of Khanapur taluka. The soil of this land is of poor quality in general and the rainfall is also very low, ranging between 250 mm. to 750 mm. The Manganga river flows across the North East border of this zone. All the rivers and their tributaries go almost dry during summer season. Bajra is the main crop of this zone.

S O I L :

The soil of this district falls under three categories viz. black, grey and red.

Western zone comprising of Shirala Mahal is a hilly tract with red laterite soil mixed with hard murum. The depth of the soil is very much less extending to 2 cm. As this zone lies on the slopes of the hills, the rainwater flows away and therefore to stop this runoff the areas are bunded which helps in retaining the moisture in the soil. This zone grows paddy of ordinary variety. Crops such as Nachani, Vari, Sava are also grown. Soil in the fertile zone consisting of Walwa taluka and eastern part of Tasgaon and Miraj taluka is deep black. The depth of the soil varies from 90 cm. to 150 cm. This soil has got good absorption power for water. This zone is good for irrigated crops also and hence it gives excellent yield of Chillies, Cotton, Sugarcane and Turmeric. This zone grows Jawar, wheat & gram with good yield rate.

Lastly, the grey soil can further be subdivided into two categories according to fertility, one with poor fertility and the other with medium fertility. The 'mal' land which prevails in the Jath taluka and eastern part of Khanapur taluka is very poor in fertility. This soil has low capacity for retaining moisture and low depth, hence ploughing is essential every year. Bajra, an important crop in this region is grown on Mal land with less rainfall. Next to Bajra other crops such as Jowar, Maize, Tur are also grown.

The grey soil found in the hilly tract which includes portion of Miraj and Tasgaon and western part of Khanapur taluka has soil of medium fertility. This is not as fertile as black soil and not poor as Mal land. This zone grows Jowar groundnut and Bajri.

R I V E R :

The principal river of this district is the river Krishna which enters from Satara district and flows through Walwa, Tasgaon and Miraj talukas. Sangli is situated on the banks of this river. Lands on both the sides of the river are submerged during floods. It's length in this district is approximately 50 to 60 Km. Haripur, a place of religious importance near Sangli is situated on the confluence of Krishna and Warna river. Warna with it's chief tributary Morna is next important river running south of Shirala and Walwa taluka. It's approximate length in this district is 60 to 65 Km.

Yerala, the principal tributary of Krishna flows through Khanapur and also Tasgaon Taluka. It meets river Nanni in Khanapur taluka and river Karpoor in Tasgaon taluka.

Agrani rising in Khanapur runs across Tasgaon taluka. Manganga running across the north east of Khanapur taluka goes dry in summer. River Bor flowing to the eastern side of Jath taluka also goes dry during summer season.

MINERALS:

Departmental survey has shown that limestone deposits occur around Miraj at Narwad, Waddi, Bedag, Arag, Belunki, Kanadwadi, Savali, Tanang, Kalambi, Kupwad, Erandoli, Salgare etc. The limestone is associated with trap formation and the quality is not uniform. The reserves are indicated at a few million tons and do not seem to be useful for cement industry. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the banks of the rivers. No other mineral of importance is known to occur in any part of the district.

1.2 For administrative convenience the district is divided into two prants consisting of 5 talukas and 3 Mahals. The Miraj prant consists of Miraj taluka, Kavathe Mahankal Mahanl Tasgaon and Jath taluka whereas the Walwa Prant consists of Walwa and Khanapur taluka, Atpadi and Shirala Mahal. The table that follows will depict the talukawise picture of area, population, no.of villages, no.of towns and their headquarters.

In the case of lands irrigated by wells and small bandhara the land revenue is intergrated and is inclusive of the charge for water supplied. For lands irrigated under Govt. canals, the land revenue at dry land rates is recovered by the Revenue Department while the water rates determined annually on the basis of actual crops raised are assessed by the Irrigation Department and recovered by the Revenue Department.

Assembly and Parliamentary Constituencies:

Since 1957, Sangli district has 8 Assembly seats. In 1957, Vite constituency had two seats of which one was reserved for scheduled castes. After abolition of the double member constituencies in 1961 the seat from Vite, is reserved for schedule castes. The constituencies were, Jath, Miraj, Sangli Tasgaon, Khanapur, Vite, Walwa, Shirala and the total number of voters on roll were 6,15,999.

In the 1962 General Elections the Assembly constituencies, viz. Jath Miraj, Sangli Tasgaon, Khanapur and Vite together made one Parliamentary constituency called Miraj Constituency and the remaining Assembly constituencies Walwa and Shirala combined with Assembly constituencies Karad North Karad South, Patan and Jeoli from Satara district made another Parliamentary constituency called Karad constituency.

Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti Administration:

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and to secure greater measure of participation by the people in Development Plans and in local and Governmental affairs by decentralisation of powers and functions, a Zilla Parishad and 6 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district in 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1962. The number of Panchayat Samities has been now increased to 8. The additional two Panchayat Samities are Atpadi and Kavathe Mahankal. The remaining 6 Panchayat Samities are Jath, Shirala, Khanapur, Miraj, Tasgaon and Walwa. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries except in the case of municipal towns which are not covered by them. The Zilla Parishad covers 96.7 per cent of the area and 84.4 per cent of the total population of the district. The population covered includes total rural population of the district in 1961.

Administration of Justice :

The District and Sessions Judge is the head of the Judicial Department in the district. The Judiciary is entirely separated from the Executive. The Collector continues to be the District Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Mamlatdars are vested with magisterial powers. But those powers are limited to executive matters and preventive measures such as recording confessions, prevention of riots, crimes etc. The separation of the Judiciary from the Executive has been brought about in the year 1953.

The District and Session Judge is assisted by one Assistant Judge and Additional Session Judge, He has jurisdiction over the entire district. He attends to Civil and Criminal work, both original and appellate.

The Civil Judge (Senior Division) attends to Civil Suit in the whole district. There are 10 Civil Judges (Jr. Division) and Judicial Magistrates (First Class) with Headquarters at different taluka places. They deal with civil and criminal suits.

TERRITORIAL CHANGES:

Consequent upon the merger of the former Princely States in the Deccan namely Sangli, Miraj, Budghagaon, Jath and Aundh and their inclusion in the Satara district, the district Satara was bifurcated on 1st August 1949 to form two districts North and South Satara. The North Satara district comprised of the former Satara district with Headquarters at Satara and the South Satara district comprised of the merged States with Sangli as its Headquarters, the former capital of Sangli State. These North and South Satara districts were renamed as Satara and Sangli districts respectively on 18th October 1960. Thus Sangli is a newly formed district with an area of 8591.29 Sq.KM. with a population of 12,30,716 and comprises of the following areas, Khanapur and Tasgaon talukas and Shirala Peta of former Satara district, 41 villages of the former Aundh State, 94 villages of the former Jath State, 2 villages from the Shirol Taluka of Kolhapur district, 1 village of the former Kurundwad State (Senior), 29 villages of the former Miraj State (Senior), 15 villages of the Miraj State (Junior), 64 villages of the former Sangli State, 1 village of the former Wadi State, 2 villages from Athani Taluka of Belgaum district and 3 villages from Bijapur taluka of Bijapur district.

CLIMATE :

The climate of Sangli district is very dry and vigorous, good for health throughout the year. The district experiences three clear cut seasons winter, summer and rainy season. The summer falls between March and May, the rainy season from June to October and the winter from November to February. The temperature reaches its maximum in April and May and minimum during December.

The climate of any place is determined on the factors such as height of land, rainfall, humidity and temperature above Mean Sea level. The height of this district is between 300 to 600 metres high above mean sea level (except-Jath). Shirala Mahal is on a higher altitude being close to Sahyadri. The district also enjoys westerly winds which helps to keep temperature low even during summer season.

RAINFALL:

The average rainfall of Sangli district is round about 750 mm. approx. It is maximum in the western part of the district and minimum in the east. Shirala mahal which is in the west records rainfall between 1000 to 1400 mm. The most of the rainfall is during the months June to October and mainly on account of south west monsoons. By the Indian calendar monsoons ~~rain~~ are said to set in with Mrig Nakshtra.

TEMPERATURE:

The months of April and May record the highest temperature and it can be easily seen that the highest temperature centres round about 40 centigrades. The mean maximum temperature over these months is found to fluctuate between 35 c to 39 c. The lowest temperature is recorded during the months, December and January.

HUMIDITY: The factor of humidity depends much upon the temperature and closeness of the place to sea. The Humidity in Sangli district is found to fluctuate between 47 per cent and 72 per cent on the average. It is found more in the months of June to September and minimum during January, February and March.

CHAPTER II

: THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN PROGRESS :

1. Introduction :

The Third plan has been directed towards strengthening the agricultural economy, developing industry, power and transport and hastening the process of industrial and technological change, achieving marked progress towards equality of opportunity and the socialist pattern of society and providing employment for the entire addition to the labour force.

2. Size of the State Plan:

The plan outlay is fixed at Rs. 390 crores comprising of Rs. 224 crores to be found by State Govt. and Rs. 166 crores of central assistance. The size of the Third Five Year Plan is practically double the size of the Second Five Year Plan. The per capita plan outlay has gone up from Rs. 57.74 in the Second plan period to Rs. 98.72 during the Third Five Year Plan.

3. Besides this the complementary outlay of the other agencies has also to be taken in to consideration. The total of the complementary outlays of the agencies like Reserve Bank of India, All India commodity Committees, Industrial Board Land Development Banks, Finance corporation and above all, the Govt. of India is of the order of Rs. 125 crores.

4. Sangli district plan allocations:

The plan schemes have been classified according to whether the benefits of the scheme extends to particular district, more than one district in a division or many districts irrespective of the division. Thus, the schemes may be district level, division level or State level.

5. According to above criteria, the revised allocation for the district level plan schemes in the Maharashtra State is Rs. 178.39 crores of which the allocation for Poona Division is Rs. 44.53 crores. This works out to about 25 per cent of the allocation for district level schemes for the State as a whole.

The revised allocation of District level plan schemes outlay for Sangli district is Rs. 5.91 crore which forms about 13.27 per cent of the district level schemes plan outlay for Poona Division and 3.3 per cent of that for the State. Benefits are also accruing to the districts under the divisional and State level schemes and as such the total allocation of plan outlays for a district are in actual, more. For the purpose of the review however, only the district level plan schemes are taken in to account here.

6. Plan allocation over Major heads :

The revised plan allocation over major Heads of development in Sangli district is as follows:

7. It will be seen that more than half of the plan outlay on district level schemes in Sangli district is on Agricultural development. Of the plan outlay of Rs. 318.83 lakhs on Agricultural development, outlay for the schemes on Soil conservation is the highest (Rs. 153.30 lakhs). Next to this is the outlay of Rs. 101.96 lakhs for Minor Irrigation works. Rs. 34.46 lakhs have been provided for Agricultural production and Rs. 21.54 lakhs for Dairy Development. The remaining outlay is distributed over Animal husbandry Forests, Fisheries and Warehousing and Marketing. No provision is made for land development.

8. The plan provisions on other Major heads namely co-operation and community Development, Transport and Communication and Social Services form 16.2, 12.0 and 16.8 per cent respectively of the total district plan outlay of Rs. 591.19 lakhs. The outlay for co-operation is Rs. 17.63 lakhs and that for C.D. is Rs. 77.90 lakhs. Under the Major head Transport and Communication, the entire outlay of Rs. 70.90 lakhs is on road development head alone. Plan outlay for Social Services is of the order of Rs. 99.60 lakhs. Looking to the break up of plan provision under Social Services it is observed that more weightage is given to Public Health, General Education, Medical and Nursing and Housing.

9. The plan provision for the Head Industry and Mining is very small Rs. 6.33 lakhs which forms only 1.1 per cent of the total district plan outlay of District level schemes.

10. Per Capita Plan Provision :

According to 1961 population Census, the population of Sangli district is 12.31 lakh. The plan outlay for the district level schemes as revised is Rs. 591.19 lakhs. The per capita plan outlay for the Third Five Year Plan period, in Sangli district works out to Rs. 48.03 . As regards ranking of per capita plan provision, Sangli stands second in Poona Division .

11. Progress of Plan Schemes:

With the formation of Zilla Parishads a number of schemes have been transferred to the Zilla Parishads for implementation. These schemes are termed as Local Sector schemes. There are some schemes which are a part of the State sector schemes but implemented by the Zilla Parishads on Agency basis. Presently there are in all 68 district level plan schemes in operation in Sangli district of which 24 schemes are Local Sector schemes and 44 State sector schemes. Out of these 44, 5 schemes are actually implemented by the Sangli Zilla Parishad on Agency basis alongwith the 24 local sector schemes transferred to Zilla Parishad.

12. The Major headwise progress of expenditure under various plan schemes is detailed below:

Out of the plan provision of Rs. 318.83 lakhs for Agricultural programme expenditure incurred by the end of the 4th ~~Five~~ year (1964-65) of the plan is Rs. 155.69 lakhs which indicates that only 48.83 per cent of the outlay has been spent leaving the balance of nearly 52 per cent to be covered in the last year (1965-66) of the Third Five Year Plan. This appears to be difficult to achieve with in so short a span of time as one year. As between the State and Local sectors, progress is observed to be comparatively better in the State sector in which 50.37 per cent of the outlay for schemes under Agril. Programme under State sector has been spent as against 43.04 per cent of the outlay in local sector. The actual expenditures figures are Rs. 126.81 lakh out of Rs. 251.76 lakhs in State sector and Rs. 28.88 lakhs out of Rs. 67.07 lakhs in the local sector. There is saving of Rs. 38.19 lakhs in local sector and Rs. 124.95 lakhs in State sector that ~~are~~ needs to be spent in the last year of the plan i.e. 1965-66.

13. The plan outlay for C.D. and Co-operation for the 5 years of the 3rd Five Year Plan is Rs. 95.53. Expenditure incurred in the 1st four years of the plan period amount to Rs. 105.51 lakhs exceeding the plan provision by Rs. 9.98 lakhs. This shows that the plan provision has been exceeded in respect of C.D. & Co-operation and will need additional provision for the remaining year of the 3rd Five Year Plan to maintain the speed of progress. As between state and local sectors progress in State sector has excelled that in local sector. The percentage of expenditure for the first 4 years in State sector is observed to have gone up to 168.58 as against 97.60 in local sector. The actual expenditure figures are Rs. 30.31 lakhs as against the plan provision of Rs. 17.98 lakhs in State sector, and Rs. 75.20 lakhs out of provision of Rs. 77.55 lakhs in local sector leaving a balance of Rs. 2.35 to be spent in the last year of the plan.

14. Under the Head Industry and Mining 53.40 per cent of the plan provision of Rs. 6.33 lakhs have been spent in the 1st four years leaving the balance of 46.60 per cent to be covered in the last one year, i.e. 1965-66. The plan provision of Rs. 6.33 lakhs is distributed as Rs. 2.57 lakhs for local sector and Rs. 3.76 lakhs for State sector schemes. Out of Rs. 2.57 lakhs Rs. 2.11 lakhs have been spent in local sector. This is 82.05 per cent of the outlay for local sector as against this Rs. 1.27 lakhs have been spent in State sector out of plan outlay of Rs. 3.76 lakhs, forming only 33.77 per cent of the plan outlay.

Thus it will be seen that progress of expenditure in local sector is upto the expected mark whereas that in State sector is below the expected norm. There appears a savings of Rs. 2.95 lakhs to be spent in the last year of the plan of which major portion (Rs. 2.49 lakhs) are to be spent in State sector alone.

15. The plan outlay for schemes under Transport and Communication head is of the order of Rs. 70.90 lakhs and this is entirely in the local sector. During the 4 years, 1961-62 to 1964-65, Rs. 39.12 lakhs have been spent out of the plan outlay. This is 55.17 per cent of the plan outlay leaving a balance of Rs. 31.78 lakhs to be spent in the last year of the 3rd Five Year Plan.

16. For Social Services the plan provision is Rs. 99.60 lakhs of which Rs. 36.70 lakhs are to be spent in local sector and Rs. 62.90 lakhs in State sector, in the 5 years of the 3rd Five Year Plan. By the end of the 4th year of the plan i.e. 1964-65 Rs. 73.75 lakhs have been spent which makes 74.06 per cent of the plan provision. As between State and local sector, progress of expenditure is comparatively better in State sector 77.99 per cent as against 66.51 per cent in local sector. The savings is comparatively less in State sector (Rs. 13.80 lakhs) as against (Rs. 12.05) in local sector.

17. The schemes which have shown performance as expected during a span of four years are:

- AGR-21 : Establishment of new agricultural school.
- AH -2 : Construction of building for establishment of Veterinary Dispensaries and Veterinary aid centres.
- AH -8 : District premium bull scheme (excelled the plan outlay by 22.12- per cent)
- CD -1 : Community Development Projects.
- T&C-6 : Roads in sugarcane areas
- GE -1 : Normal expansion of primary Education.
- GE -18 : Scholarships in secondary schools (Excelled the plan outlay)
- WS- 5 : Village well water supply scheme (excelled the plan outlay)

The above schemes were from the local sector. From State sector schemes which have shown satisfactory progress are as below:

- AGR -31 : General Horticulture Development
- COP -1 : Extension of Agricultural credit
- COP- 3 : Development of Co-operative Marketing.
- COP -11 : Co-operative farming scheme in pilot areas.
- COP- 12 : Co-operative farming outside the pilot areas.
- CD -9 : Financial Assistance to village Panchayats.
- SSI- 11 : Industrial Co-operatives including Co-operatives of handicrafts workers.
- MED-1 : Construction of building for District and Cottage Hospital.
- PH -4 : B.C.G. vaccination for T.B.control.
- PH -7 : Strengthening of the Establishment for vaccination against small pox.
- HSG-1 : Subsidised Industrial Housing scheme.
- SW -11 : Welfare extension projects
- LAB- 6 : Collection of Employment Market Information.
- MLK- 3 : Incentives to Milk production in selected areas
- MLK-3A : Loans for purchase of cattle.

18. Summary of Physical Achievements:

The following paragraphs will give in a nutshell an account of the physical achievements under the Major heads of development achieved during the first four years of the 3rd Five Year Plan.

19. Agricultural Programmes:

1) Facility for agricultural training At Digraj 112 students are admitted for Agril. diploma course of 2 years. The excavation of lift irrigation scheme completed and V.C.R. Masonry work, intake pipe work and raising work completed. So also the dairy building is completed.

2) Taluka seed farms set : 5 taluka seed farms have been established to serve as a nucleus for production and multiplication of pure improved seed of principal food crops.

3. Consolidation of holdings - 90001 scattered holdings blocked with a view to economising on the cultivation cost and to induce cultivators to take up improvements on their lands. The work has been done in 96 villages of this district.

4. Contour bunding - The bunding operation has been extended to a total of 1.56 lakhs of acres during 4 years of time as against the target of 3 lakh acres.

5. Minor Irrigation - Financial assistance for construction of 580 new wells has been given to increase irrigation potential. The achievement is far short of the plan target fixed. As regards financial assistance to cultivators for purchase of oil Engines or electric motors for irrigation purpose assistance to purchase 639 pump sets have been given against the plan target of 1500 which also is not upto the mark.

6. Animal Husbandry : Construction of buildings for establishment of veterinary dispensaries and aid centres at Ashta, Jath, Shirala practically completed and work at Kavathe Mahankal in progress. Progress was slow on account of cement shortage. 63 premium bulls have been located to improve the quality of village cattle.

7. Dairy development : Sangli district has high potentialities of milk production. A by-product milk factory at Miraj has been set up as envisaged in the plan and installation of machinery and plant is in progress. Loans for purchase of cattle have also been distributed.

8. Co-operation and Community Development:

1) Under the scheme of strengthening of co-operative credit structure, so far during III Five Year Plan period 4 branches of land development- Bank have been opened. During the above reference period plan target of increasing membership in Agriculture primaries also has been achieved in excess a year in advance, by enrolling 1413 members more.

ii) Target fixed $3\frac{1}{2}$ blocks of C.P.A. size for coverage of blocks under C.D. Programme have already been achieved ahead of schedule with the result that now all the district has been covered under the C.D. Programme.

9) Social Services :

1) Under the scheme of expansion of primary education 719 teachers as against the target 130 have been appointed.

2) 77 rooms of school buildings are in progress under the scheme of construction of primary school buildings.

3) Construction work of Civil Hospital at Sangli has already been completed.

4) Under scheme PH-1, 3 Const. works of P.H. centres are in progress.

One mobile vasectomy unit established under scheme of Family Planning and so far 5392 operation have been carried out.

Under village well water supply scheme 51 wells as against the plan target of 40 have so far been dug and 1 work was in progress under V.P. water supply and drainage scheme.

Out of target 100 tenaments, 68 were completed and 32 in progress under the scheme of HSG-1.

41 works are in progress under village Housing Projects scheme and 3 villages with 79 acres of additional space covered under scheme of extension of gaathan.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. RAINFALL & TEMPERATURE:

Table No. 1.1 :-

This table presents the data on rainfall for 7 centres in Sangli District. The monthwise data for two years 1963 and 1964 is given separately. The information on Normal rainfall is collected from Govt. Gazette. It is observed that in the year 1964 there was more rainfall as compared to the year 1963.

Table No. 1.2 :

The information collected from Metrological Department, on Mean, Minimum and Maximum Temperature is displayed here. The information for the year 1963 and 1964 and for each month separately.

2. AREA AND POPULATION:

Table No. 2.1 : This table gives the figures of population density of population, variation in population and rural urban break up of each taluka of Sangli district. Atpadi and Kavathe-Mahankal taluka were formed out of Khanapur and Miraj Taluka respectively on 1-8-1964. The Census figures for these newly formed talukas are derived from villagewise data given in 1961 Census Hand Book. The territorial changes in this district also are accounted for in the table. The figures of 1951 are therefore adjusted so as to depict comparative information for all the 8 talukas at one place.

Table No. 2.2:

This table gives the classification of different inhabited villages according to population ranges. The data for the two newly created talukas is also given separately. It is seen a large number of villages fall under population ranges 1000-1999, 2000 to 4999 and 500-999. Villages with population more than 10,000 are only 5 in the district.

Table No. 2.3:

The table is on the same lines that of 2.2. The classification of towns according to population ranges is given in this table. There are only two towns having population more than 50,000 in this district.

Table No. 2.4

This table shows the total no. of workers in each livelihood class of working population for each taluka of the district separately. For purpose of easy comparison the classification is given for rural and urban areas separately. The population under categories I, II and III is classified as Agricultural population while that under category IV to IX as non-agricultural population. Obviously the proportion of agricultural population is more in rural areas than that in urban areas. As regards non-agricultural population the situation is exactly inverse.

Table No. 2.5 :

The classification of non working population is given in this table for 6 talukas of the district. Though the total no. of non-workers for newly formed talukas is available, its break up in different categories at Sr.No. 1 to 7 in this table is not available.

Similarly the talukawise break up of urban non working population is also not available, and hence not given. It is seen that most of nonworking persons are dependants and disabled persons. Below them rank persons engaged in household industry and students.

Table No. 2.6:

The information on the talukawise population of schedule castes and schedule tribes is given in this table. The majority of schedule caste population is in Miraj taluka while that of schedule tribes is in Jath taluka. The castes of these categories are given in table No.13.

Table No. 2.7:

This table details out urban population and its break up according to sex.

3. AGRICULTURE:

Data on land utilisation and crop statistics are primarily collected by village officials of the Revenue Department. They are subsequently consolidated by the Agricultural Department.

The series of tables on Agriculture under Sr.No.3 present talukawise statistical data for two years, 1962-63 and 1963-64 on the following topics:

- 1) Land Utilisation
- 2) Area under different crops
- 3) Out turn of principal crops
- 4) Irrigation by sources
- 5) Area irrigated under different crops
- 6) Irrigation wells
- 7) Irrigation works
- 8) Distribution of households engaged in cultivation classified by interest in land and size of land cultivated.
- 9) Agricultural wage rates
- 10) Agricultural implements in each taluka
- 11) Famines, scarcity data
- 12) Soil conservation and land reclamation.

Table No. 3.1:

The table shows the utilization of land areas under various crops for two year 1962-63 and 1963-64. The terms used in the table are explained below:

1) Geographical area:-

This area represents the total land area and is worked out from the records of survey and settlement.

2) Forests:

This category includes all area actually under forests whether state owned or private and classed or administered as forest.

3) Barren and unculturable land:

This includes barren and unculturable lands like mountains, riverbeds etc.

4) Culturable waste:-

This includes lands which can be brought under cultivation but which have not been, or having been cultivated for some time, have not been cultivated successively for five years.

5) Permanent pastures and grazing grounds:-

This includes all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.

6) Miscellaneous trees, crops and graves not included in the area shown:

This category includes lands under thatching grass, bamboo bushes or other trees used for fuel.

7) Current fallows:

This includes lands which are left fallow during the current year only.

8) Other fallow lands:

All lands which have been cultivated but which are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

9) Net area sown:

The net area sown is the actual area under crops counting areas sown more than once in the same year only once.

10) Gross cropped area:

This is the sum of area under all crops and represents the sum of net area sown and area sown more than once.

In the year 1963-64 both net area sown and gross cropped area show a marked increase over the corresponding areas in the previous year 1962-63. The rise in net area sown is denoted in Shirala, Walwa, Tasgaon and Jath talukas and that in Gross cropped area in Shirala, Walwa, Tasgaon and Miraj talukas. Area under fallow land, Culturable waste, Permanent pastures appears to have reduced considerably in 1963-64 when compared with corresponding figures in the year 1962-63.

Table No. 3.2:

This table presents the details of areas under different crops. The crops are classified in two main groups viz. Food-crops and nonfoodcrops. Foodcrops are further grouped by 'cereals, pulses and others' Nonfood crops are similarly shown under Fibres, oilseeds, drugs and narcotics etc. The information for two years 1962-63 and 1963-64 for 6 talukas is presented here. Data of the year 1963-64 when compared with that of 1962-63 the following observations can be noticed.

1) Area under total food crops in 1963-64 has fallen slightly in comparison with that in the previous year and area under non food crops has increased considerably.

2) Among food crops area under cereals show increase in 1963-64 over that in 1962-63 whereas in case of pulses area has been found to be reduced in 1963-64.

3) Area under sugarcane has slightly decreased in 1963-64 whereas there is a increase in area under condiments and spices and fruits and vegetables in 1963-64 over that in 1962-63.

4) Under non-food crops there is sharp increase in area under miscellaneous non food crops and Groundnut in 63-64.

Table No. 3.3 :

This table presents the out-turn and average yield per hectare of principal crops in the district. The data are exhibited for food crops like rice wheat Jowar bajara maize etc. and nonfood crops like groundnut cotton tobacco etc. The outturn figures are in '00' tonnes and average yield is shown in Kg. per hectare. With the increase in area under cereal crops in 1963-64 it is observed that out turn of cereals has increased correspondingly, particularly in respect of Jowar and Rice. The out turn of other cereal crops show a decline in 1963-64 when compared to outturn in 1962-63.

Production of pulses too show a small decline, particularly gram in 1963-64. Tur and other pulses however record rise in outturn in 1963-64.

Outturn of Gur has declined in 1963-64 in comparison with that of 1962-63. The fall in acreage under sugarcane accounts for this decline. Cotton, Groundnut outturn figures denote fall in 1963-64.

Table No. 3.4:

This table presents gross and net irrigated areas and the distribution of net irrigated areas by sources of irrigation viz. canals, wells, tanks and other. The data is presented for two year 1962-63 and 1963-64 and separately for each taluka. Both Gross and net area under irrigation by all sources indicate rise in 1963-64 over those in 1962-63 the bulk however arising out of well irrigation. A sudden drop in irrigation by Govt. canals is apparent in Khanapur taluka.

Table No. 3.5

This table shows the acreage of various crops under irrigation for two years 1962-63 and 1963-64. The material is presented for the district as a whole and for each taluka separately. When acreage of crops under irrigation for 1963-64 is compared to that of 1962-63 the following points are noticed.

1) Area under total food crops under irrigation has declined considerably in 1963-64 whereas area under total nonfood crops under irrigation has gone up.

2) Among food crops area under total cereals under irrigation has declined in 1963-64, while that under pulses increased.

3) Area under sugarcane increased in 1963-64.

4) Under nonfood crops group, area under cotton, tobacco and other miscellaneous crops, under irrigation show a rise in 1963-64 over that in 1962-63.

Table No. 3.6(a):

This table presents data on wells. It gives total no. of wells, and further breakup as wells in use and wells not in use. The talukawise figures relate to years 1962-63 and 1963-64.

Table No. 3.6(b):

The information on no. of minor irrigation works completed upto 31-3-1965 and allied information regarding irrigation is presented in this table. The information for Zilla Parishad, Co-operation and State sector is given separately.

Table No. 3.6(c):

The information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works is presented in this table. The same is collected from Executive Engineer, Irrigation Division.

Table No. 3.7:

This is an important table. It shows the distribution of sample households engaged in cultivation classified by size of land and interest in land cultivated. Ten size groups are shown horizontally while the interests in land are classified in three groups.

- Viz. 1) Entirely owned or held from Govt.
2) Entirely held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share.
3) Partly held from Govt. and partly from private persons or institutions for payment in money kind or share.

The material is presented for total, rural and urban areas of the district separately and only for rural areas of each taluka.

Table No. 3.8:

The District Statistical Officer is collecting the data on wage rates of different categories of agricultural labour for each fortnight. The monthly averages for two year 1964 and 1965 for each of the three centres is shown in this table separately. The skilled workers include, carpenter, Blacksmith and cobbler while unskilled category includes field labour and herdsman.

Table No. 3.9:

This table presents the figures of Agricultural implements enumerated in the 9th Livestock Census in 1961. The figures for carts shown in the table are in respect of carts used for agriculture purpose only. The number of tractors is inclusive of those owned by private persons and by Govt.

Table No. 3.10 :

This table is to depict data on famines & scarcity. The information is reported to be NIL for the year 1964-65 by the Collector, Sangli.

Table No. 3.11: The information about progress of soil conservation is presented in this table. The progress of work of area bunding and counter bunding appears to be slack in 1964-1965 when compared to that in the previous year.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST AND FISHERIES:

Table No. 4.1: The summary of the district population figures of Livestock Census conducted in 1961 for each category of Animal and poultry is given in this table. For comparison, figures of livestock and poultry of 1956 Census are also shown. It will be seen from the Table that there has been a good increase in both the Livestock number and poultry in 1961, over a period of 5 years. The rise in number is found in almost all categories of livestock viz. cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goat, donkeys and pigs etc.

Table No. 4.2: The talukawise breakup of the livestock figures given in Table No. 4.1 is shown in this table. Kavathe Mahankal and Atpadi taluka were not in existence at the time of Census and hence the figures for these talukas are not available separately.

Table No. 4.3: The medical facilities available to the livestock population in this district during the financial years 1963-64 and 1964-65 and the no. of animals treated in dispensaries and different aid centres is exhibited in this table. The name of the centres for insemination and no. of animals inseminated is also given. There is one hospital, six dispensaries, twenty one aid centre and 4 centres of insemination in this district. The information is collected from Animal Husbandry Officer Sangli Zilla Parishad Sangli. There has been an overall progress in the veterinary facilities extended in the district in the year 1964-65 as compared to that in the previous year. The increase in the number of animals treated by the various centres is an indicator of this progress. In respect of artificial insemination of animals there is however a fall in the number in 1964-65 though the number of centres functioning for this work remained the same as in the previous year.

Table No. 4.4: The information regarding attacks of diseases and livestock mortality due to some important diseases of cattle and Bovine, sheep and goats, dogs, camels and poultry is presented in this table for the years 1963-64 and 1964-65. The No. of livestock and poultry mortality in 1964-65 has been found to be significantly low when compared to the no. of livestock and poultry mortality in 1963-64. The No. of livestock and poultry attacked by numerous diseases has been on the decline in 1964-65.

Table No. 4.5: As the title itself suggests the information presented here relates to slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the district. The no. of slaughter houses for Bovine and sheep and goat is given separately. Though the table displays data on animals slaughtered for the district as such, the limitation of the data is full coverage is not ensured as data on animals slaughtered in non recognised animal slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available.

Table No. 4.6: This table gives rangewise figures of area under forest in this district. Though some of areas of this district is included in Karad and Dhebewadi ranges of Satara district, the information given against these ranges pertain to this district only. The classification is indicated in two-way

- 1) Forest area according to protected, Reserved and Unclassed and
- 2) Administrative control by Revenue and Forest Department.

Table No. 4.7 : The information regarding production and value of major and minor forest products is displayed in this table. The information pertains to Sangli, Satara and Sholapur district as the ~~xxxx~~ districtwise break-up is not available.

Table No. 4.8: Information on fish production, its marketing working capital involved and allied fishery items is given in this table.

5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY:

Table No. 5.1: Factory statistics of the district is given in tables No. 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3. The Factories are classified into 29 Industry groups and the tables depict information for calendar years 1963 and 1964. Table No. 5.1 gives average daily employment of Adults, Adolescents and Children sexwise and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed returns under the Act. The average daily employment for factories not submitting returns is also estimated and given in the table. It is observed that though the no. of factories has decreased in the year 1964, the no. of mandays worked and average daily employment has increased considerably.

Table No. 5.2: This table throws light on another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted in this table. There is not much variation in the classification of factories for both the years.

Table No. 5.3: The classification of factories according to number of days worked in the years 1963 and 1964 is shown in this table. The number of factories working for more than 300 days has increased to 56 in the year 1964.

Table No. 5.4: This table presents data of production of cotton yarns, cotton cloth, sugar and soap in the year 1963-64 and 1964-65. The source of the information is Superintendent of Central Excise. The production of all the commodities is increased in 1964-65 as compared to previous year.

Table No. 5.5: The no. of handlooms and powerlooms, their production and average daily employment in each centre of this district is given in this table. The information on production and average daily employment on powerlooms under the control of central excise is not available and hence not incorporated. There is not much variation in the no. of looms for both the years. However the increase in the production in the year 1964 is notable.

Table No. 5.6: Table No. 5.6, 5.7 and 5.8 exhibit information relating to employment exchange and volume of employment. The information is collected from District Employment Officer. Table No. 5.6 gives monthwise figures of registration, vacancies, notified, placements done in public and private sector and live register at the end of each month. The information on placement of scheduled caste, and scheduled tribes candidate however not being available monthwise is given for each six months ending Sept. and March.

Table No. 5.7: The further break up of total no. of registration during 1963-64 and 1964-65 under subheads, Industrial, Skilled, Clerical, Educational and unskilled is given in this table alongwith total no. of vacancies notified, placements made and Live register. The no. of person registering their names decreased in 1964-65. The no. of vacancies notified increased as against reduction in placement made.

Table No. 5.8: This table gives an idea about changes in the volume of employment in three months from December 1964 to March 1965. The data is given for 8 different industries group. The absolute change can be viewed from col.8. The relative changes can be seen from the percentages of total employment in a specific group of industry to total employment as on 31st December 1965 and 31st March 1965. There is an increase in percentage of person employed in construction group.

Table No. 5.9 : The information regarding employment capital production and value of production, collected through Annual Survey of Industries in the year 1959, 1960 and 1961 is compiled in this table. The data pertains to those industries which are covered in the survey. The total no. of workers is constantly increasing. As a consequence the value of production also increased in the year 1960 and 1961.

Table No. 5.10: Table No. 5.10, 5.11 and 5.12 deal with electricity. The information in these table is collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and all electric companies in the district.

Table No. 5.10 gives information about generation and consumption of electricity in Sangli District. Since the private companies are purchasing bulk supplies of electricity the generation of electricity in the district is reduced year by year. Generation of electricity is resorted to only in the time of emergency. The consumption is given purposewise in this table which will help to know the share of industries in purchase of electricity as a motive power. There is a considerable increase in the consumption of electricity in the year 1964-65. However the increase is evenly distributed in three purposes namely domestic consumption, commercial consumption and industrial consumption.

Table No. 5.11: This table gives the total no. of towns and villages electrified in the district as on 31-3-1964 and 1965. The break up of no. of villages and towns as electrified by private companies and by Maharashtra State Electricity Board is also given. There are 141 villages and all the 6 towns electrified in this district.

Table No. 5.12: The table gives us the information about the installed capacity and generation of electricity in the district for 2 years 1963-64 and 1964-65.

6. CO-OPERATION :

Table No. 6.1:- The information regarding the co-operative banks is presented in this table. There is no industrial co-operative bank. The data pertaining to number of branches, number of members individual as well as societies, capital structure and loan advanced of all types is compiled for District Central Co-operative Bank and District Land Development Bank of this district. Both the Banks, it is seen from the table, are making progress and there is a good deal of increase in share capital and loan operations alongwith working capital.

Table No. 6.2 : This table gives information about all types of co-operative societies, regarding their number, membership, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered and loans overdue and outstanding for two years 1963-64 and 1964-65. The No. of co-operative societies increased from 963 to 996 in the year 1964-65. The working capital increased from Rs. 15.86 crores to Rs. 20.88 crores in the span of one year. Compared to this there is not much increase in the amount of loan advanced,

Table No. 6.3: The data pertaining to agricultural credit societies only is given in this table for all the items covered in table No. 6.2. However the information is given for each taluka separately. The term agricultural credit societies includes agricultural credit societies, thrift societies, urban credit societies. Grain Banks, Seva societies and Multipurpose societies. It is observed that Khanapur, Miraj and Tasgaon talukas cover more than 50% of total no. of credit societies.

Table No. 6.4: This table displays the information of agricultural marketing societies for the same two years. District total for primary marketing societies and central primary societies is given separately. The talukawise information presented here covers information on value of purchase, value of sales of Agricultural produce and agricultural requisities, The sale proceeds as owners and agents as well as cash sales and credit sales is given separately. One more salient feature of this table is that the information on different items under head agricultural produce viz. Paddy Jowar etc. and under head agricultural requisites viz. Fertilisers, seeds, implements etc. is given separately.

Table No. 6.5: The information regarding money lenders, and their loan activities is given in this table. As regards the talukawise break up of loans advanced, the same is not given as it is not available.

The information in all the tables under co-operative fold is collected from District Deputy Registrar of Co-op. Societies Sangli.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

Table No. 7.1: This table is adopted from Table B V of the Census Hand Book of Sangli District (1961). This two way table gives the information on number of physicians, Surgeons, Dentists, nurses and other medical health technicians. The sexwise classification and classification according to rural and urban areas is also given.

Table No. 7.2: This table shows the medical facilities available in the district. The material is presented for two year 1963 and 1964 and shows the number of hospitals, maternity homes, dispensaries, primary health centres, doctors, nurses, beds, and indoor and outdoor patients treated.

The information is presented for each taluka separately. The material includes only public and public aided institutions. There is noticeable increase in no. of out-door patients of both sex. However the no. of Hospitals etc. is constant. The no. of deaths due to cholera has increased to some extent. However, the no. of deaths due to Diarrhoea has decreased considerably. The total no. of deaths has increased slightly in the year 1964.

Table No. 7.3: The break of the District totals of indoor and out-door patients treated during both the year 1963 and 1964 (shown in table No. 7.2) in 25 diseases is available in this table. The information of surgical operations is given against item 26. The total at item 27 is total of item 1 to 25.

Table No. 7.4: This table shows data about births, deaths and infant deaths for the year 1963 and 1964. The figures for 6 former talukas is given separately. The figure of infants deaths relates to deaths of children below one year. The information is collected from Assistant Director of Public Health. Though there is decrease in no. of births and deaths too, the decrease is more in no. of births. The decrease in deaths is effect of good facilities of public health.

Table No. 7.5: This table shows the number of deaths due to principal causes in the district during 1963 and 1964. The causes of deaths shown are cholera, small pox, plague, fever, dysentery, diarrhoeas, penibaratory ~~xxxxx~~ diseases, suicide and other causes. Other causes include diphtheria, chicken pox poliomyelitis, leprocy, cancer, deaths from child birth etc.

Table No. 7.6: The talukawise data presented here give information on no. of primary vaccination, revaccination and cholera inoculation during the year 1963 and 1964.

Table No. 7.7: This table shows information on B.C.G. vaccination. The same is given for two year 1963-64 and 1964-65. The information to total tested, total not tested, absents, vaccinated and not vaccinated.

Table No. 7.8: The information on hygenic drinking water supply is available in this table. The items covered are no. of villages without any drinking water source and with inadequate supply. Presuming that all the remaining villages have the hygenic source of water, no. of pumps, tube wells, hand pumps, wells and conserved tanks is given. The information is given for 6 former talukas. The information is as on 1-6-64. 18% of the villages, have no drinking water facilities and 42 percent villages have inadequate water supply.

8. E D U C A T I O N :

Table No. 8.1: This table gives data of literacy in each taluka of Sangli district according to 1961 Census. The number of literates sex-wise is given for rural and urban areas separately. Side by side with this, the percentage of literacy for each taluka for urban area and rural area and for males and females separately is given in this table.

Table No. 8.2 : This table gives information for rural population only. The total no. of illiterates, and literates with different levels of education is given sexwise. Atpadi and Katha Mahankal taluka were not formed at the time of census and village wise data on these items is not available and hence the information for these talukas could not be incorporated.

Table No. 8.3: The table is on the same pattern that of 8.2. However two educational levels, technical and non-technical are added. The information pertains to urban areas only. The talukawise position could not be shown on account of non-availability of data.

Table No. 8.4: This table shows the number of different types of educational institutions and the total number of pupils (boys and girls) and teachers (trained and untrained) for each type of institutions in the year 1963-64 and 1964-65. The material is presented for the district as a whole. The information pertains to academic year. The no. of primary institutions and secondary institutions has increased. The no. of students also increased considerably. However the no. of teachers did not increase to that extent.

Table No. 8.5 : This table shows the number of backward class students and concession given to them at each level of education, preprimary to special. The other backward class students include economically backward class students also. The information pertains to academic years 1964-65.

Table No. 8.6 : Total no. of students taking benefits under the scheme of free studentship to economically backward class students and total value of such concessions for all educational levels for the district as a whole is shown in this table. The term economically backward class covers those persons whose annual income is below Rs. 1200/-. Those State Government employees whose annual income is below Rs. 1800/- are also included in this.

Table No. 8.7 : Every year the State Govt. is giving grants to Zilla Parishad's and municipalities for recovering some percentage of expenditure incurred by them on primary education. This table gives information about actual amount of such grants to local bodies in this district during the academic year 1964-65.

Table No. 8.8 : This table shows total no. of villages having schools and those without schools. Further break up of villages without primary school is given in different population ranges. The information is collected from Director of Education. It is creditable to note that there are only 7 villages without primary school.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

Table No. 9.1 : This table gives information on length of railway in this district. There are two gauges namely narrow and meter. Separate information for them is given.

Table No. 9.2A & 9.2B : These two tables give us an idea about the length of roads of various types and category in the district as on 31st March 1964 and 1965. Table No. 9.2A gives information for roads under Zilla Parishad and Building and Communication department. The classification into different category as N.H. S.H. O.D.R. and classification according to type of surface cement concrete B.T. W.B.M. is also given.

In table No. 9.2B the information on length of roads under municipal control only is given. The information is given for each municipality separately.

Table No. 9.3 : This table presents data about motor vehicles in the Kolhapur sub-region. The term motor vehicles include motor-cycles, cars, Taxies, Rikshaws, stage carriages lorries ambulances, school buses tractors etc. This information is not available for each district separately and hence the data for Kolhapur sub-region is presented. The reference date is 31-3-1964 and 31-3-1965. The No. of motorcycles and cars have increased thereby increasing the total by 600 vehicles.

Table No. 9.4 : The data presented here relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The information on no. of routes, distance, vehicles per day, no. of Fleets and earnings is given as on 31-3-64, and 1965. This district comes under Kolhapur Division of State transport. Separate data could not be made available for this district only and as such data for division is presented. The no. of routs have increased from 230 to 260 while the no. of passengers travelled per day increased by nearly 9000 persons. As a result of this the daily earnings also have increased by Rs. 9000 within one year.

Table No. 9.5 : Every year in March and November B & C Dept. (State and Z.P.) is conducting a traffic Census on different roads. The results of one of such traffic census (Conducted in March 1964) are given in the table. The table gives information regarding no. of vehicles, light motor vehicles, medium heavy motor vehicles and slow moving vehicles and total traffic intensity in 24 hours.

Table No. 9.6: This table gives the information on no. of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, postmen, telephones and Radio licences issued. The information is as on the last day of the financial year. The increase in 1964-65 in no. of post boxes, telephones and Radio licences is considerable. No. of Radio licences issued increased from 6842 to 12485.

Table No. 9.7 : The classification of all villages in the district according to distance from the post office is presented here. The information is presented for each taluka separately. It will be seen that there are 292 villages having post offices. Persons in 52 villages only have to walk a distance of more than 6 Kms. for a post office.

Table No. 9.8: The material presented here pertains to rural broadcasting. It gives the no. of radio sets and villages where radio sets are installed. The population covered also is included. This talukawise information is the position as on 31-3-1964 and 31-3-1965. Tasgaon taluka is covered completely. The progress in Khanapur and Miraj is significant.

10. LOCAL BODIES :

Table No. 10.1 : This table presents material on income and expenditure of local bodies. The local bodies covered under this table are Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and local bodies. The information is for years 1962-63, 1963-64 and 1964-65. The No. of village panchayats increased from 447 to 480. There is a considerable increase in the expenditure of V.P.s and municipalities in the year 1964-65 though the income is more or less constant. The expenditure of municipalities is increased due to the fact that Sangli Municipality has taken the primary education in Sangli town under municipal control.

Table No. 10.2: The break up of the information on income and expenditure of village Panchayats is given in this table. This break up is two-way. On the one hand the information for each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand the total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads as income from taxes fees, donations, contributions and expenditure on Administration, Public works, Sanitation etc. However the information for only two years (and not three as in the case of 10.1) 1962-63 and 1963-64 is given. The income of V.P.s has increased by 18 lakhs of rupees in 1963-64 while expenditure increased by 7 lakh rupees.

Table No. 10.3 A and 10.3 B: This table is on the same lines that of 10.2. The break up of income and expenditure of Zilla Parishad in 1963-64 and 1964-65 in different sub-heads is given in these two tables. Both the income and expenditure of Z.P. has increased in the year 1963-64. Income has increased on account of more Govt. grants. Expenditure increased due to added expenditure under Head General Administration C.D.P. etc.

Table No. 10.4 : This table deals exclusively with the constitution of the municipalities in this district. It presents information on no. of councillors, names of and number of members of different committees, jurisdiction and population covered under the respective municipality.

Table No. 10.5: The information on income from and expenditure on different subheads (of the municipality) is displayed here. The information for each municipality is given separately. The reference years are 1963-64 and 1964-65.

11. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING :

Table No. 11.1 & 11.2: Schemes in III Five Year Plan have been classified into district, divisional or State level according to whether benefits, accruing due to implementation of the schemes, extend to district, division or State. According to this criteria, the revised plan allocation for the district level plan schemes in Sangli district comes to Rs. 6.26 crores which comes to about 13.72 per cent of district level plan schemes in Poona Division and 3.3 per cent of Maharashtra State.

Table No. 11.3: Tables 11.3 to 11.5 give information about the community development blocks in the district. This table gives the general information about the no. of blocks of C.P.A. Pattern in each stage, the population covered under these blocks and inhabited and deserted villages. The total no. of C.P.A. Pattern blocks is 13½ covering an area of 8304.2 Sq. Km. 10,38,286 persons in 526 villages are covered by these blocks.

Table No. 11.4: This table gives information about the expenditure by the blocks upto 31-3-1964, expenditure during 1964-65 and total expenditure since the beginning of the particular stages in which these blocks stood as on 31-3-1965. 3 blocks covering 5 C.P.A. Pattern blocks are in stage I (Shirala, Walwa and Jath.) Two blocks (Tasgaon and Miraj) are in stage II and cover 6 C.P.A. Pattern blocks and Khanapur in Stage III covers 2.5 C.P.A. Pattern block. Khanapur block entered III stage in 1964-65. The information presented here is collected from Bureau of Economics and Statistics Bombay.

Table No. 11.5 :

This table presents the information on actual achievements of the blocks during the two years 1963-64 and 1964-65 on selected items.

Table No. 11.6: The blocks are submitting their quarterly progress reports to this office. Index on physical achievement under items covered in the last table is prepared after giving due weight. In this table the information on the class and the index during the two years is given for each block. So also the expenditure class wherever possible is given. Walwa block entered stage I in 1963-64 and as such it completed only 4 quarters as on 31-3-1964 and hence index No.s for that block for 1963-64 are not worked out.

12. PRICES :

Since the aggression on our Northern Frontier the price problem became of special importance. Bureau of Economics and Statistics through its district agency of the district Statistical Officer is collecting the wholesale as well as retail prices of more than 75 commodities every Friday. This table unfolds the monthly averages of prices of some important commodities from January 1964 to December 1964. The averages worked out are arithmetic averages of prices prevailing at district Headquarters in the respective months. The prices cannot however be taken to meanfully representative for the whole district as they have certain limitations such as single quotation from selected shops at District Headquarters only.

Table No. 12.2: Regulated markets has become the necessity of to-day. There are 4 regulated markets (with submarkets) at Sangli, Vita, Takari and Tasgaon. The information regarding the area under each regulated market alongwith arrivals and value of sales for each regulated commodity is given in this table. The information for each regulated market is given separately.

Table No. 12.3: As far as common man is concerned the retail prices are of immense importance. The Commissioner of Labour prepares index No. called consumers price index no.s at certain selected centres. Sangli district comes under pervue of Sholapur centre. The consumer's price index numbers based on prices prevailing from Feb. 26 to Jan.27 are published in Quarterly Bulletins of Bureau of Economics and Statistics Bombay. The same for years 1949, 1951, 1956, 1960, 1961, 1962, 1963 and for each months from January 1964 onwards to March 1965 are reproduced in this table. There are 5 groups namely fuel and lightning, food clothing, house rent and Miscellaneous. Index no. for these groups are given separately. The combined index no. calculated after giving due weight to each group is also given in the last column. The index numbers are worked out as per principles laid down by Lakadawala Committee. The General index increased by 76 per cent in year only from 380 in 1963 to 456. Thereby indicating the increase in level of prices.

13. MISCELLANEOUS :

All the other tables that cannot be included in any earlier section of the chapter are included in this section.

Table No. 13.1: This table presents information on police strength and crimes in the year 1963 and 1964. There are two parts of the table. First of it relate to strength of police and gives information about no.of superintendents, inspectors and constables. They are further divided in permanent and temporary cadre. The second part relates to strength of police force and gives information on no.of out post, police stations, cognizable and non-cognizable crimes etc. Though the reference year for this table is calender year the information of total cost of the police force is given for financial years 1963-64 and 1964-65.

Table No. 13.2: The material presented here relates to cases decided by courts in this district. The information is given for two year 1963- and 1964. The break up of cases, into civil and criminal in the 1st place, into original and appellate in the 2nd place and lastly into Regular and miscellaneous is given.

The figures however do not include the cases decided by the District Magistrate and executive magistrate.

Table No. 13.3 : The information about cinema theatres is given in this table. The information pertains to permanent theatres only. That for semi movement and touring talkies is not available.

Table No. 13.4 : Bureau of Economics and Statistics has conducted a Census of employees in public sector. The results of the same are displayed here. The no. of persons according to pay ranges with their total emoluments is given. There were in all 3935 persons. The classwise figures are class I-9, Class II- 90, Class III- 3181 and Class IV - 655.

Table No. 13.5 : The table is very well self explanatory. No. of banks and the population covered by them in the year 1964-65 is given in this table.

Table No. 13.6: This table gives information about joint stock companies. They are classified as companies limited by shares and companies limited by guarantees and associations not for profit. Their further break up into public and private is given. The information is collected from Bureau of Economics and Statistics Bombay.

Table No. 13.7: With a view to judge the achievements of life insurance corporation, the comparative data for two successive years 1963-64 and 1964-65 is presented here. It gives total number of policies issued and the amount insured side by side.

Table No. 13.8: Small savings are of crucial importance from the view point of conserving funds for development purpose. As such the data as regards targets, Gross and net collections under different schemes of small savings is presented in this table. The data for schemes ND certificate, 10 year Def. certificate, 15 year Annuity certificate Post office savings bank C.T.D. and others is given separately.

Table No. 13.9 : Land revenue forms the one of main sources of revenue of the State. The talukawise information about the arrears in the previous years, Demand for the year, collection during the year and arrears for next year is given. The data is presented for the years 1963-64 and 1964-65. Walwa, Khanapur, Shirala and Atpadi Mahal has no arrears at the end of year 1964-65.

Table No. 13.10: The table is self explanatory. The collection of Excise revenue, Sales Tax and entertainment tax during the two years 1963-64 and 1964-65 is shown in this table. The figures of sales tax relate to State Sales Tax only.

Table No. 13.11 : The information about registration of documents is given in this table. The information is given separately for each taluka. The material covers the item net income from registration, Documents registered and value of property transferred.

Table No. 13.12 : The results of the 1962 general elections are presented here in two parts. The 1st part deals with the results of Assembly constituencies the other with parliamentary constituencies. It gives the no. of total votes polled, its percentage to total voters and no. of polling stations. For assembly seats the per cent varied from 53.40 to 81.00. The same was 18.3 for parliamentary constituencies. There are 8 assembly constituencies and 1 parliamentary constituency.

Table No. 13.13:

This table presents the distribution of sample households classified by the number of rooms occupied. For each class of households the total number of members is shown by males and females separately. This will help measure congestion particularly in urban areas.

This table is prepared from the houselists on a 20 percent sample. The material is presented for each taluka and for rural and urban areas separately. Hotel, boardings, etc, are not included only family households are considered.
