ABSTRACT 1964-65

I Introduction

1.1 Physical features

1.11 Location

Wardha District deriving its name from the river Wardha lies between 20.18' to 21.21' north latitude and 78.30' to 99.15' longitude. It occupies the western portion of the Nagpur plain and ^{lies} fits at the foot of Satpura hills adjoining Amraoti District. The District consists of a long strip of land in the Wardha river valley, running from North-west to south-East along the right bank of the Wardha river, very narrow at the northern extremity and gradually extends in width to the south.

1.12 Boundaries

The District is surrounded by four Districts of the Maharashtra state, having Nagpur District at the East, Chanda District at the South, Yeotmal at the South-West and Amraoti at the West, North-West and the North. The river Wardha separates the District all along the western border from Amraoti and Yeotmal Districts.

1.13 Topography.

Wardha District naturally divides itself into two parts, the North being hilly from an inlying spur of Satpura, while to the South lies an undulating Plain intersected by streams, and broken here and there by isolated hills rising abruptly from its surface. No peak in the range exceeds 2000 feet and the average height of their summits is not more than 1300 feet or 1400 feet above the level of the Plain. The length of the hill tract from North-West to South-East is 50 miles and its greatest width is under 20 miles. It occupies about one fourth of the Whole area of the District.

1.14 Soil

To the south of large villages of Anji and Hingani and slightly to the north of Nagpur-Bombay Road, the hills lie out and the remainder of the Wardha and Hinganghat Tahsil is fertile plain, with the exception of some low foot hills running along the northern boundary of the Wardha Tahsil and of few small hills in the south-east of Hinganghat. But this description does not include the level portion of the Arvi Tahsil in the north which is the most fertile part of the District and consists of a strip of land lying ^{between} the hills and the Wardha river. The soil here is formed of the detritus brought down from the hills and is highly productive growing singularly fine crop of cotton. The plain of Wardha and Hinganghat Thasils is not so renowned for fertility, but it is covered over most of its surface with a coating of fertile black or brown soil of varying depth above the basaltic rock. The Black cotton soil which covers the trap is believed to be formed by the denudation of basalt combined with the deposit of vegetable matters. The thickness of the soil in the district varies from 10 feet to few inches, the average thickness being about 2 feet. The soil is generally found intermixed with calcareous tufa or 'kankar'. The types of soil that are met with in the district are Kali I, Kali II, Morand and Khardi Bhardi. The Black soil occupies nearly 84 % of the area of the District. These soils are mostly originated from Deccan trap. The Black soil contracts in summer and becomes fissured with cracks.

1.15 Rivers

Wardha river is the only important river of the District which rises from the Multai plateau on the Satpura range and flows all along the northern and Western borders dividing the District from old Berar. It meets Wainganga river near village Seone in Chanda District. The main tributaries of Wardha river are Yes^hoda, Wana and

Bakli. The other notable rivers in the District are Bhadadi, Dham, Bor and Pothara. Although these rivers pose great threat and danger to the villages situated on their banks, when they are in spate in Monsoon, there is hardly any water in summer. Secondly the beds of these rivers are too deep to make them fit for canal irrigation. The river Bor is harnessed for irrigation purposes by constructing a dam across the river.

1.16 Hills

The highest points in the District are the peaks of ^a Gramsur (1976 feet), Nandgaon and Malegaon in the hills of Arvi Tahsil. The trigonometrical survey station is near Nachangaon 1227 feet and that near Kelzar, 1132 feet. The elevation of the Plain country is between 700 & 950 feet decreasing to the south.

1.17 Minerals

No minerals are found in the District.

1.2 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

1.21 Revenue Division

The District is administratively divided into three Revenue Sub-Divisions each comprising of one Tahsil or Taluka. Tahsil in Vidarbha Region is a fairly big unit having about 400 villages and nearly 3 to 4 times larger than tahsils of Western Maharashtra Districts. The Tahsils are further Sub-divided into Revenue circles. There are 14 Revenue circles in the District which in turn are divided into groups of villages called 'Patwari Halka' being looked after by the Patwari. Village is the smallest in the administrative set up. The collector is responsible for maintenance of law and order besides his being the head of office for the Revenue Department. He is also the District Magistrate and the District Registrar. The Collector is assisted by the Deputy Collectors. At the Tahsil, the Sub-Divisional Officer looks after the Tahsil administration.

with the assistance of Tahsildar and a few Naib-Tahsildars. The Revenue circle is in the charge of the Revenue Inspectors.

1.22 Zilla Parishad.

1st May 1962 is the landmark in the history of Maharashtra State when the system of Panchayat Raj, aiming at Democratic Decentralisation, has been brought in to force by establishing an autonomous body of Zilla Parishad at the District level and Panchayat Sanities at the Block level. The Institution of Zilla Parishad is a democratic set up of local self Govt. with wider powers and scope of work. Hence all the former local bodies like Janpad Sabhas, District Development Board and District Panchayat Board have been abolished and their functions are transferred to the Zilla Parishad. An elected President is the Head of the Zilla Parishad comprising of elected members. A Government Officer designated as chief Executive Officer has been appointed to execute the powers, functions and duties as per the directions and duties of Zilla Parishad. The elected parishad forms different subject committees. These subject committees deal with the different subjects under power and scope of Zilla Parishad.

The District is further divided in to Panchayat Sanities having elected chairman and members. The Block Development Officer assists the Panchayat Saniti in executing the work. The jurisdiction of the Panchayat Saniti is identical to C.D. Block.

At the village level, the Gran Panchayat is the elected body responsible for the developmental activities of the village.

The Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Saniti in the Wardha District have started functioning since May, 62. There are in all 7 Panchayat Sanities in the District.

TERRITORIAL CHANGES

1.31 The territory now making Wardha District was a part of Nagpur District untill 1862, when it was made a seperate District on the ground that Nagpur was too large a District and that the interests of the very valuable cotton industry in this part of the Wardha valley needed special supervision.

There were no major changes in the boundaries of the District or its administrative divisions since 1911 though it formed part of different States of Madhya Pradesh and Bombay due to States Reorganisation. Since 1st May, 1960, the District forms part of Maharashtra State when the new state of Maharashtra was brought in to existance bifurcating the Bombay state.

The District is the smallest District in the Maharashtra State apart from Greater Bombay, having an area of 2434 square miles or 630401 Sq. K. Ms. The District Head quarter was first located at Kaotha, a village near Pulgaon, but was subsequently transferred to the present site, which was then a village Palakwadi and which was named as Wardha after the name of the river Wardha. The greatest length of the District is about Eighty miles and the breadth at the Southern extremity about 36 miles.

CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL.

Climate and Temperature

1.41 The climate of the District is hot and dry and somewhat cooler than Nagpur. The days are hot and nights cool. The climate is extreme in nature as both summer and winter are severe. The heat of the mid-day in summer is little below than that of the hottest parts in India. The summer sets in roughly from the middle of February and continues up to the middle of June or till monsoon sets in. The winter usually starts from the middle of October and ends by February

middle though the night in February continues to be quite cold.

There is no observatory in the District for recording temperature and weather data but as the District is close to Nagpur District and bears the same climate as that of Nagpur, Temperature record of Nagpur centre is taken for reviewing the climatic condition of the District. The temperature record shows that the month of May is the hottest month of the year while the month of January is considered to be the coldest month of the year.

RAINFALL.

1.42 Over the whole District the Chief supply of rain is from the south-west Monsoon which sets in about the middle of June and lasts till the end of October. The rainfall data is recorded at three centres viz Wardha Arvi and Hinganghat i.e. the Taluka Headquarters of the District. The average rainfall of the District is 43 inches or 1082 m.m. and average number of rainy days is 58. During the wet period the month of August is usually having the greatest intensity of rains followed by July.

Among the talukas the average rainfall is more or less the same level, but the average decreases when one proceeds from North to South.

CHAPTER - II

1. POPULATION:- The population of the District constitutes 1.6 percent of the population of Maharashtra state. The population growth rate in Maharashtra state over a period of last sixty years i.e. between 1901 to 1961 is 103.97 percent while this growth rate for Wardha District for this period is 64.32 percent.

Wardha District is comparatively less urbanised than the Maharashtra state as the percentage of urban population to total population in 1961 Census is 19.20 as against the state percentage of 28.22. As per the change in the definition of urban areas in 1961 population census, one town viz Ashti, classified as urban area in 1951, is declassified as rural area in 1961. The net growth in urban population of the District over 1901 is 245.22 percent as against 246.96 percent for the State. The trend of variation in proportion of urban population is one of continuous increase. The net increase in the rural population of the District since 1901 has been 41.37 percent. The corresponding figure for Maharashtra state is 75.53 percent. The percentage of rural population to the total population has been decreasing continuously since since 1901. This percentage was 88.74 in 1901 and 76.35 in 1961.

Average population per village according to 1961 Census is 498 in the District as against state average of 792 per village. About 88.79 percent of the total villages in the District are having population less than 1000 persons. It can also be seen that about 28.83 percent of the total rural population is living in villages having less than 500 population while 32.67 percent of the total rural population is covered by the villages of population size 500 to 999. The percentage of rural population living in villages of above 1000 population is 38.50.

It is seen that as much as 77.3 percent of the total workers of the district are engaged in agriculture as cultivators or agricultural labour while 7.5 percent of the total workers are working in household or other Industries. Services Sector has absorbed 8 percent of the total workers while 3 percent of the workers are engaged in trade and commerce.

Among Non-workers 98.3 percent are students (26.0 %) persons engaged only in household duties (19.5 %) and infants & children not attending schools and disabled persons (52.8 %), Rest of the categories of non-workers liker beggars, rent receivers, inmate of prisons & charitable institutions and unemployed persons constitute 1.7 percent of the total non-workers.

No Scheduled tribes are enumerated in the District in 1961 census. The scheduled caste population as enumerated in 1961 census is 2.4 percent of the total District population. The 1951 Census had returned 92,545 persons or 17.1 percent of the total district population as belonging to Scheduled Caste. The sharp decline in the percentage and even in the number of persons belonging to scheduled caste is due to mass conversion of Scheduled caste persons in to New-Budhism. Persons thus converted themselves were not treated as scheduled caste in 1961 population census.

2. AGRICULTURE.

Agriculture is the most important activity in the District as it engages 77.3 percent of the working population in the District. The data presented in this section on agriculture deals with Land utilisation, area and production under different important crops, area under irrigation and irrigation facilities available in the District. Ancillary statistics on agricultural wages, number of agricultural implements in use, land brought

brought under soil conservation methods is also presented in the last four tables.

The District as per the Land utilisation Statistics for 63-64 has a geographical area of 6289.28 hectares. There is a slight change in total geographical area as till 1962-63 it was reported as 6287.59 hectares. The pattern of Land utilisation if seen over a period of last ten years, seems to have not changed categorically. Thus during 1963-64 out of the total area of the district the area not available for cultivation, consisting of area under forest, barren and uncultivable land, Land put to non-agricultural uses, land under trees and permanent pastures is 27.1 percent. This percentage in the year 1950-51 was 24.3. The area under forest has increased from 8.2 percent of the total area of the district in 1950-51 to 10.5 percent. The area available for cultivation consisting of culturable waste, fallows and net area sown formed 72.9 percent in the year 1963-64 of the total area of the district as against 75.7 percent in 1950-51. The percentage of culturable waste and current fallows has decreased in 1963-64 to 4.3 and 3.2 from 12.3 and 5.8 in 1950-51 respectively. Net area sown has increased from 57.6 percent of the total area in 1950-51 to 65.4 in 1963-64.

Jowar, cotton, Tur and wheat are the important crops of the district. These crops covered - 85.9 percent of the total gross cropped area during the year 1963-64. It can be seen that during the year 1963-64 about 57.8 percent of the gross cropped area was under food crops while 42.2 percent area was under non-food crops. It is striking to note that the percentage of area under food crops decreased from the level of 1950-51, the percentage being 63.1. The main reason for this decrease is due to shifting to production of cotton for its high prices. Accordingly a corresponding increase in area of cotton is observed, the percentage moving from 27.9 in 1950-51 to 37.3 in 1963-64. Among food crops Jowar occupies greater portion of area sown, its percentage of area sown to gross cropped area

area being 32.4 in 63 1963-64. The increase in area of cotton also resulted in decrease in area under Jowar as the percentage of area under Jowar to total area under crops went down from 39.1 in 1950-51 to 32.4 in 1963-64.

The District lacks in irrigation facilities. The major source of irrigation is the wells as the total area irrigated by wells is 97.7 percent while the gross area irrigated is only one percent of the gross cropped area of the district during 1963-64. It is striking to note that out of the total net area irrigated during 1963-64 highest percentage of area under irrigation i.e. 46.8 was under Wardha Tahsil followed by Arvi Tahsil i.e. 41.6 percent. Hinganghat Tahsil has the lowest percentage of area under irrigation, it being 11.6 percent of the total area irrigated in the district. It is because the number of irrigation wells in Hinganghat Tahsil is less as compared to rest of the two Tahsil. Among the crops, wheat, condiments & spices and miscellaneous food crops (chillies) under food crops and cotton under non-food crops occupy greater percentages of total area under irrigation. The number of irrigation wells in use are only 40.1 percent of the number of wells in existence. Thus the ratio of irrigation wells per Hectre is only 0.017 or for every 57 hectares there is only one well. This ratio is too less. The irrigation by way of Major, medium or minor irrigation works, at present is very negligible. The major Bor irrigation project is under completion and one minor irrigation tank at Ashti with an irrigation potential of 900 acres is completed. Only 41 percent of the total cultivating households have less than 10 acres land size under cultivation and 85 percent have less than 30 acres of land size under cultivation.

Information about agricultural wages collected from the selected cultivators from three rural centres of the district is presented in table 3.8. The monthly wage rates shown are the averages of two fortnights for which the data is collected. The selected cultivators are being approached every fortnight

fortnight and the wages paid by them to the agricultural labourers employed by them during the preceeding week are noted.

The data on agricultural implements shown in table 3.9 is obtained from the Live Stock Census held in 1961. There are only 4587 iron ploughs which shows that per hectre there is 0.01 plough or for every 90 hectres there is only one iron plough.

Soil conservation measures are being carried out extensively in this district and by end of March,65 area of about 26.80 thousand hectres was bunded which is 6.4 percent of the gross cropped area for the year 1963-64.

3 ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST AND FISHERIES.

Livestock raising is one of the oldest calling of the people in this district and is carried out side by side agriculture. The total Livestock as per 1961 Census is 4.91 lakhs. This makes 49 Livestock per 100 acres of cultivated area. The corresponding figure for the state is 139. The total bovine population in the district in 1961 is 81.86 percent of the total livestock. The number of male bovine over 3 years are 1.22 lakhs. The area cultivated per pair of male bovines over 3 years is thus 16.50 acres as against 5.84 acres for Maharashtra. There are 1.42 lakhs female bovines over 3 years in the district. That makes 224 female bovines over 3 years per 1000 population in this district as against the state average of 158.

The cattle population of Wardha District has grown from 3.49 lakhs in 1956 to 3.61 lakhs in 1961. Thus the rate of growth over a period of 5 years is 3.3 percent.

The total buffalo population as per 1961 Livestock Census is 40,732 of which 2.5 percent are males over 3 years, 54.1 percent are females over 3 years and 43.4 percent are youngstock below 3 years. The buffalo population in 1961 decreased by 2.4 percent over the buffalo population of 1956. The percentage decrease in male buffaloes in 1961 is 12.9

12.9 while that in she buffaloes is 6.6. The young stock however, showed an increase of 4.0 percent. Arvi Tahsil is famous for its milk and ^{its} products and has more buffaloes population as compared to other Tahsils.

Wardha District in general and Arvi Tahsil in particular has earned a great name for its very famous 'Gaclao' cattle breed. There is one cattle breeding farm at Hotikundi in Karanja Block, Arvi Tahsil, where a herd of pure Gaclao breed is maintained.

The total sheep population in 1961 has decreased by 38.4 percent over 1956 sheep population while the Goat population has increased by 4.00 percent. Significant increase of about 76 percent in the poultry population is found during the last decade as the poultry increased from 76,982 in 1951 to 135,929 in 1961. The increase during two census of 56 & 61 is 17.4 percent.

Attacks of various diseases and deaths due to them can be seen from table 4.4. It can be seen that among cattles, Foot and mouth disease has very high percentage among the total animals affected by diseases i.e. 97 percent. At the same time there is no death by this disease.

Slaughter house facilities are available in only six towns of the district and at Ashti, a big village. In no other village the slaughter house facility is available.

Forests are National wealth and play important role in building National Economy. The data relating to forest is given in tables 4.6 & 4.7. The total Geographical area in charge of the Forest Dept. is 12.2 percent of the total Geographical area of the district. The Forests Division Wardha is also in charge of 247.67 hectares ^{area} pertaining to Katol Tahsil of Nagpur district of the total area under forest in Wardha Division 15.2 percent is under Revenue Dept. and the rest with the Forest Deptt. The Reserved Forest which was under the control of forest deptt. since the beginning is well maintained and constitutes 51.02 percent while the protected forest

forest consisting of area under forest transferred to forest dept. consequent upon abolition of Malignzari system is 33.8 percent. The rest of the forest is classified as unclassified and is with the Revenue Dept. Fuel are the main forest produce. There is limited scope of development of fisheries in the district as the no tanks suitable for fishculture are very few. After the completion of Bor Project the fishculture will be more.

4 EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY.

The Wardha district is not much industrialized as only 9.1 % ^{is} by the working population engaged in industrial activities. However by virtue of the 3 textile mills and 2 Oil mills the district acquires a predominant place in industrial sector. Judged from the number of factory workers per lakh of population, the position of the District is second in Vidarbha Division after Nagpur, having in 1961 about 1169 workers per lakh population and sixth in the whole state.

It may be noted here that the number of factories in the District has shown considerable decline in the last seven years as the number of factories registered under the factories act has come down from 52 in 1956 to 36 in 1964, showing a decrease of about 29 percent. The greatest decrease is found in Ginning & Bailing group of Industries as the number of working factories reduced from 30 in 1956 to 17 in 1964. Out of 36 factories registered under factories act in 1964 about 50 % are large scale factories employing on an average more than 50 workers per day but only 3 textile mills & 3 Oil mills are worth mentioning. These 6 factories have absorbed in 1964 about 78.5 percent of the total factory workers. It may also be seen that about 75 percent of the total factories in the district do not work through out the year and their number of working days during 1964 are below 240 days.

There are no industrial products worth mentioning except the textile products. The cloth produced by 3 textile mills in the district is roughly 2.3 percent of the

the total production of cloth in Maharashtra State. Handloom cloth industry is concentrated around Arvi, Virul, Karanja, Seloo, Sindi, Shegaon, and Hinganghat. There is no source to supply handloom cloth produced. However the value of cloth produced as available in the Annual Administration Report of cooperative Societies is given. The handloom industry seems to be better off at Hinganghat and Seloo centres as the value of production in these two centres is 50.2 and 29.4 percent respectively of the total value of handloom production in the district during 1964-65. The handloom industry is facing difficulties due to increase in the rates of yarn and non-availability of yarn as and when needed. Hence the value of cloth produced decreased by 41.3 percent during 1964-65 over the level of 1963-64.

An Employment Exchange is functioning at Wardha as a recruiting agency to employers in Govt. and non-Govt. offices and undertakings.

The year 1963-64 seemed to have provided more chances for employment as 1380 notifications were referred in that year as against 638 vacancies notified in 1962-63. This may be because of more employment avenues opened under different plan schemes in that year. The figure of vacancies notified has however lowered down in 1964-65 to 1204. The parity between number of vacancies notified and number of candidates placed for employment is quite high as the percentage of candidates placed for employment is 41.9 percent of the total vacancies notified. Out of the total number of candidates registered during 1964-65 about 32.2 percent had registered themselves for clerical jobs while 57.3 percent were unskilled job seekers.

The volume of employment as can be seen from table 5.8 is at an increase in all industries except manufacturing industries where the volume of employment reduced due to closure of one textile mill at Hinganghat.

The electric consumption has increased by about 7 percent. The consumption of electricity for industrial &

industrial & power purposes is 75.7 percent of the total electricity consumption.

During the recent years and specially in Third Plan stress is given to supply of electricity to Rural areas so that electric power can be easily harnessed for irrigation purposes, aiming at development of agriculture in addition to provide power facilities for setting up industries in rural areas. There were only 73 villages & towns electrified by end of March, 61 while at the end of March, 1965 this number has increased to 167 percentage increase being 128.7. The population covered by towns & villages electrified by end of March, 1965 is 50.5 percent of the total population of the district.

-: 5 Cooperation :-

The growth of cooperation and agricultural development are co-related and the primary motive in the beginning, under cooperative movement, was to provide easy credit facilities to cultivators. This object, at present is accomplished by 1) District Central Cooperative Bank, functioning as a central Financing agency to provide credit facilities to primary credit societies, 2) Land Development Bank, financing individuals to undertake land development activities and 3) Primary agricultural credit Societies, which are providing short term credit to farmers.

The District Cooperative Central Bank, with its 10 branches, has expanded its business considerably since 1961. Its share capital has increased by 244.3 percent over 1961 while the percentage increase of its reserve fund and working capital is 135.1 and 511.1 respectively. The bank has provided credit of Rs. 215.52 lakhs during the year 1964-65 which is more by 369.8 percent over the loans advanced in 1961.

The District Land Development Bank, which was facing financial difficulties in the early stages, was strengthened considerably when Govt. started providing loans

loans for construction and repairs to irrigation wells through this bank. Thus the share capital of the bank increased by 443.4 percent by end of 1964-65 over 1961-62 while the Reserve fund and working capital of the bank increased by 233.3 and 196.3 respectively. The percentage increase of the loans advanced is 117.4.

By end of 1964-65 there are 400 primary agricultural credit societies with about 40,000 members covering ^{all} the villages of the district. The share-capital of these societies roughly increased by 3 times by end of 1964-65 over 1961-62 while the working capital has increased by 96 percent. These Societies ^{have} provided loans to the tune of 140.66 lakhs during 1964-65 being 116 percent higher than the loans advanced during 1961-62.

Out of the total societies functioning by end of 1964-65 about 56 percent are agricultural societies. Karanja block is taken as a pilot project for coop. joint and collective farming. The other societies worth mentioning are consumers Societies, Housing Societies, Industrial Societies and Labour contract Societies.

The seven Agricultural marketing Societies, one at each block headquarter, are making purchases and sales of Jowar under the scheme of monopoly procurement. Hence the share capital of these societies, increased by about 4 times by end of 1964-65 over last year, while the working capital has gone up from Rs. 6.36 lakhs by end of 1963-64 to Rs. 49.07 lakhs by end of 1964-65.

The position of recovery of amounts advanced by the Societies seemed to have improved during 1964-65 as the percentage of loans over due to loans outstanding of all societies by end of 1964-65 decreased to 11.9 from 19.6 by end of 1963-64.

6 MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH

Proper attention on medical & Public health has been paid in the post independence period specially during the Plan periods and different programmes of curative and preventive

preventive measures have been undertaken, resulting in expansion of medical facilities in the district and elimination of certain diseases like malaria. Hospital facilities at present is available in 4 out of Six towns. In addition a full fledged hospital at Sewagram caters to the hospital needs of rural areas. The Primary Health Centres numbering 8 are providing best possible medical assistance in rural areas where facility of treating indoor patients is also provided in emergency cases. The dispensary facility is available at present in 30 villages when no such facility was available prior to 1951. It is striking to note that Arvi Thasil still has not got hospital facility and also that out of 7 hospitals 6 are in Wardha Tahsil. To provide the facility of indoor treatment number of beds have been nearly doubled since 1951 and by end of 1964 there are 86 beds per lakh of population.

However the need of further expansion of medical facilities can not be denied as from data on the number of persons engaged in medical profession given in table 7.1 it is found that in 1961 there was one Doctor for every 1707 persons and for 4097 females only one lady Doctor was available. The ratio of population covered by doctors in rural areas was 2736 persons per doctor.

As per the survey of slum areas of Wardha Towns and Sewagram, the incidence of leprosy in Wardha District is about 2 to 2.5 percent and hence the district is considered as endemic area. In the control of leprosy the names Ganhi Memorial leprosy foundation, and Dattapur leprosy colony are worth mentioning, which are doing considerable work.

The number of births exceed deaths causing increase in population. The birth rate calculated on the basis of midyear population of 64 works out to 39 per 1000 while the death rate comes to 16.8 per 1000. The percentage of deaths due to fever, diarriha and respiratory causes to the total registered deaths is quite high i.e. 28.9, 10.6 and 12.9 respectively during the year 1964.

The B.C.G. vaccination programme was carried out intensively and complete population was covered under the programme of testing and vaccination. Similarly the programme of eradication of Malaria has been completed and has entered now in consolidation phase.

7 EDUCATION.

The problem of eradication of illiteracy and expansion of education facilities is one of the foremost social problems. Hectic efforts were therefore made in the Plan periods to solve this problem, which can be well judged from the rise in percentage of literacy and growth of educational institutions since 1951. The literacy percentage in the total population thus rose from 19.4 in 1951 to 30.4 in 1961. The literacy percentage has however, increased by about eight times during the last sixty years.

The percentage of literacy among males is higher than among females, However, it can be seen that percentage of literacy among females has nearly doubled during 1951-61 decade. As regards literacy percentage the Wardha district stands third in Vidarbha. Wardha Tahsil having greater education facilities and due to its four towns, has the highest literacy percentage as compared to other two thasils. The percentage of literacy in rural areas, as per 1961 Census figures, is nearly half of the urban percentage, however the expanded educational facilities are giving rise to literacy percentage in rural areas also as the rate of growth in literacy percentage in rural areas during 1951-61 decade was equal to the rate found in urban areas.

The percentage of literates in rural areas having primary standard education is 9.9 of the total rural population while the percentage of those who have attained education up to matriculation level or above is as low as 0.4. These two percentages for urban areas are 26.8 and 3.4 respectively.

Considerable expansion of Primary and Secondary education took place since 1950-61 as emphatic stress on promotion of education was given in the three Plans. The percentage

percentage increase in number of primary Schools, number of pupils and number of teachers by end of 1964-65 over 1950-51 thus comes to 123.7, 249.2 & 235.4 respectively. The scheme for free education to children of age group 6-11 is implemented since 1964-65 in this district. The expansion of Secondary education can well be judged by rise in the number of Secondary Schools and pupils. The percentage increase of number of secondary Schools by end of 1964-65 over 1950-51 is thus 394.4 while the strength of students increased by 443.1 percent.

The expansion of Colleges for higher education was also noteworthy as the number of Colleges rose from 1 in 1950-51 to 8 in 1964-65. The number of students attending Colleges nearly doubled during 1964-65 as compared to 1960-61.

The schooling facilities have been extended to all the villages having population above 200. Only 27.9 percent of the total populated villages & towns (978) have no education facility.

8 TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION.

A good transport and communication is the Pre-requisite of all sided development of National Economy. The development of Agriculture and industry mainly depends on better transport and communication facilities. The District is well served by railways as all the Thasil places are linked with the district headquarter by rail. In addition the Bombay-Howrah and Delhi Madras Railway lines intercepts at Wardha junction thus connecting the district headquarter with important cities like Bombay, Calcutta, Madras and Delhi. The existing railway length (about 137 K.M.) is 2.17 Kilo metre per area of 100 Sq. Kilo metres, against 1.64 K.M. per 100 Sq. kilo metres in the State.

Communication by road is also substantial in the district as the district headquarter is not only connected with its Tahsil places by roads but it is well connected by road with adjoining districts of Nagpur, Amraoti, Yotmal and

and Chanda. The Delhi - Nagpur - Hyderabad and Bombay - Nagpur - Calcutta National Highways pass through the district. The total road length of the district has recorded a sizable increase from 502 K.M. in 1950-51 to 707 K.M. in 1964-65. However this length is also below the target of 1526 K.M. fixed for this district under Nagpur Road Development Plan.

The percentage of National Highways to total road length by end of 1964-65 is about 15.1 while State Highways constitute 46.0 percent of the total road length. The Major District Roads, other District Roads and village Roads are 23.3, 8.9 and 6.5 percent respectively. There is an increase of 16 K.M. in road length during 1964 - 65 which is found to be in major district roads.

There are no cement concrete roads in the district and the percentage of Black topped roads and W.B. M. roads to total road length is 33.5 and 62.3 percent respectively. Thus 95.8 percent of the roadlength is metalled one.

The total length of municipal roads is 114.83 K.M. Hinganghat municipal council has the highest percentage i.e. 34 followed by Wardha municipal Council (29 percent).

Passenger motor traffic was nationalised in the district by M.P. Govt. and all the important routes joining headquarter of the district are being operated by the State owned Motor Transport. Since there is no independent depot in the district the route mileages covered by the Nagpur Depot are given in table 9.4.

The posts and telegraph facilities are being expanded to provide better means of Communication to facilitate promotion of trade & commerce. The number of post offices thus increased from 86 in 1950-51 to 134 in 1964-65. Yet there is a great need of further expansion as at present only 123 villages and towns have postal facility within the area and one third of the total villages have postal facility within 3 K.M. distance. The rest of the villages have the postal facility beyond 6 K.M. distance.

9 LOCAL BODIES.

The Democratic decentralisation effected from 1st May, 1962 introduced a 3 tier system of autonomous local government with Zilla Parishad at the District level, Panchayat Samities at Block level and the village Panchayats at the village level. In addition the municipal Committees at the six towns are functioning as a form of local self government, area of their Jurisdiction limited to town area.

The number of village Panchayats rose from 137 covering 140 villages to before First Plan to 452 village Panchayats covering all the villages by end of Second Plan. The income of Village Panchayats, number being the same, by end of 1964-65 has risen by 146.3 percent. Same is the case with expenditure. The rise in per Village Panchayats income & expenditure by end of March, 1965 when compared with 1962-63 is 168.3 and 203.5 percent respectively. The major source of income of Village panchayats is grant-in-aid which constitutes 58.0 percent of the total income during 1963-64 while the income by taxes is 18.8 percent of the total income. About 49.5 percent of the total expenditure during 1963-64 is spent on public works while the expenditure on welfare, Health & Sanitation and administration is 19.7, 7.2 and 9.7 percent of the total expenditure respectively.

The main source of income for Zilla Parishad at present is by way of grant-in-aid which constitutes 72.2 percent of the total income during the year 1964-65. The income derived from debt section is 12.1 percent while revenue from self raised resources is 6.4 percent only. Since 1962-63 to the end of 1964-65 the rise in the income of Zilla Parishad is 188.7 percent.

The analysis of expenditure reveals that 84.9 percent of the total expenditure is revenue expenditure while expenditure under debt section from 14.6 percent of the total expenditure during 1964-65.

The Municipal Committees derive major portion of their income from rates and taxes the percentage to total income during 1964-65 under this head is 47.6 . Grants-in-aid are forming 32.5 percent of the total income. Their rise in the income of municipalities is 133.0 percent during 1964-65 over 1961-62 . The expenditure by M.Cs on public health & public instructions form greater portion of the total expenditure. Thus during 1964-65, the percentage of expenditure under these heads is found to be 25.7 & 32.3 respectively. The rise in expenditure of Municipal Committees during 1964-65 is 148.3 percent over 1961-62 level.

10. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The Third Five Year Plan of Maharashtra State is implemented through State level, Divisional level and District level schemes. The plan outlay for the district level schemes for Wardha District is 341.34 lakhs. The district plan essentially gives stress on development of agriculture by providing Rs. 136.47 lakhs being 39.9 percent of the total plan outlay. The outlay on Social Services, covering education, health etc, constitutes 27.9 percent of the total district outlay. The percentages of outlays on the other three heads of development viz Cooperation & Community Development, small industries, and transport and Communications to total outlay are 18.1, 1.8 and 12.1 respectively.

By end of 1964-65 the total plan expenditure on all the plan schemes is Rs. 184.63 lakhs which is 54.1 percent of the total outlay. The expenditure on agricultural programmes is 46.5 percent of the outlay for that head while the percentage of expenditure to total outlays for the heads of development, Cooperation & Community Development, Industries, Transport & Communication and Social Services is 90.1, 30.2, 47.5 and 45.9 respectively. Much shortfall in utilisation of plan provision is noted in the sub-heads agricultural production, Minor irrigation, cooperation, small industries,

industries, Transport & Communication, Education, Health, & Housing. However the shortfall in expenditure under agriculture production is proposed to be utilised for special Kharif and Rabi campaign to give impetus to agricultural production. Since the different minor irrigation works were under investigation and survey stage the provision under this head remained mostly unutilised. Substantial progress has however been made in soil conservation where intensive work of bunding is done during plan period. Important Physical achievement during the Plan are given in table 11.2.

The Community Development Programme was started in the district in the year 1953. The district is delimited into seven blocks which have been covered under a phased programme. By April, 61 all the blocks were covered under the Programme. Thus entire rural population is covered by this date. The Seven Blocks have 8.5 C.P.A. units.

11 PRICES

The Foreign invasion combined with ^{failure} failure of crops in 1961-62 had caused rise in prices. It is therefore marked that the prices are more fluctuating continuously and rapidly moving upward since 1961-62, causing a great concern to the low income group consumers. The price movement is therefore watched by collecting retail prices at the district head-quarter and also from 3 rural centres. The prices at the district headquarter are found to be high in November, 62 since when the price collection work was started. However downward trend in prices is marked for a short period between Jan, 63 to July, 63. The prices again have started moving up since July, 63. The rise is specially found in foodgrains pulses, edible oils and clothing.

The prices of rice (medium), wheat (medium) Jawar (yellow) and Bajra in the cereal group have risen by end of December, 64 by 27, 98, 119 and 75 percent respectively over July, 63 prices. The price in pulses is very high specially in gram and whose movement from adjoining state was banned. The

The gramdal and a ~~chana~~ dal prices thus rose by 160 & 72 percent respectively over July, 63, while percentage increase in prices of moong, udil, and masur is 69, 14 and 183 respectively.

The shorts supply of Sugar resulted in increase in prices of substitute Commodity of Gur which is costlier by 51 percent by end of December, 64 over June, 63 prices.

Among edible oils the prices of groundnut oil has risen from Rs. 2.08 per kilo in June, 63 to Rs. 3.25 in Sept, 64, the price rise being, 63 percent. Similar trend is marked in prices of V. naspati, and Linseed oil. In short there is a general upward trend in prices during the year, 1964.

There are ten regulated markets, one each of Cotton and agricultural produce at five urban Centres of Arvi, Wardha, Pulgaon, Sindhi & Hinganghat. Deoli town not yet has the facility of regulated market. Cotton transaction is more in Arvi Cotton market as compared to other cotton markets due to more cotton production in Arvi tahsil while wheat transaction is found to be high in Hinganghat market.

12 MISCELLANEOUS.

Tables on various miscellaneous subjects are grouped in this section. The review is therefore made of some of the important tables.

Police force, responsible for maintenance of law and order remained unchanged during 1964 as compared with the earlier year. However a reduction in Cognizable and non-cognizable crimes reported can be noted.

Results of Census of Govt. Employees conducted in 1961 is given in table 13.4. It can be seen that there are 3081 employees in State Govt. Service working in this district during 1961 of which 19.5 percent are class IV employees while 78.3 percent are class III. The percentage of class II & Class I employees to total employees is 1.9 and 0.2 respectively. As regards the pay range it is interesting to note that about

about 91.8 percent of the total employees are getting less than Rs. 250 per month, of these 55.2 percent get less than Rs. 100/- as pay while 36.6 percent get pay between Rs. 100 & Rs. 250.

In the field of small Savings the district has done some commendable work by ^{ee}exceeding the target for collection fixed for the year, 1963-64 & 1964-65. The excess collection done is 31.8 percent of the target for the year 1964-65.

Land Revenue collection during 1964-65 is Rs. 13.30 lakhs which is 91.5 percent of the demand fixed for the year. However the ^{arears}arears amounting to Rs. 12.01 lakhs still remained uncollected by end of 1964-65

The housing condition in the district can be studied from the distribution of Sample households according to number of rooms occupied. About 3.5 percent of the households are not having regular rooms to live in, while 58.6 percent live in single room houses. Nearly 26.5 percent are living in double room houses.
