CHAPTER - I

I N T R O D U C T I O N

The district is a part of Vidarbha, which according to the "MAHABHARAT" was the Kingdom of Dmayanti who was married to Nal. This place also has a mention in "MAHABHASYA", "YOGINITANTRA", "BHAGWAT PURAN" and "BRIHATSAMHITA".

According to the Historical records, the area was ruled by Gonds from the seat at Deogarh in Chhindwarha district. In 1702, Bhakt Buland of Gond dynasty founded the city of Nagpur. Burhan Shan was probably the last of the Gond Rulers, after which the area passed into the hands of Bhonsale Marathas. The Bhonsale Empire ruled till 1853, when after it was annexed by lord Dalhausie. The district, as at present, was formed in 1854. In 1861, the country with Saugar and Narbada territories was formed into the Central Provinces by Lord Canning, with Nagpur as the Capital.

The district lies between $20^{\circ}-36'$ and $21^{\circ}-43'$ North latitudes and $78^{\circ}-15'$ and $79^{\circ}-57'$ East Longitudes. The district is triangular in shape with Seoni and Chhindwara districts of Madhya Pradesh standing in the North, while there stands in the East the district Bhandara, in the South Chanda and in the south west Wardha, all of Maharashtra. It has covered about 3.24% of the area of the State, the total area being 3834 sq.miles (9930 sq. Kilometres).

The district is comprised of 5 sub-divisions or talukas viz., Nagpur, Katol, Saoner, Ramtek, and Umrer. The Collector as the head is incharge of General Administration, Law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector in his office and by Deputy Collectors who look after different branches. The Collector is the District Magistrate. One of the Deputy Collector is also vested with the magisterial powers and is named as the Additional District Magistrate. A Sub-Divisional Officer has been put incharge of the administration in each of 5 talukas.

The area, number of villages, population etc. covered by each of the taluka are as below:-

The Sub-Divisional Officer is assisted by the Tahsildar in administrative work. The taluka has been further divided in revenue circles, each being put under the charge of Revenue Inspector.

Beside the Collectorate, there are many other District Offices of various departments, dealing in departmental matters.

A district level body, known as "Zilla Parishad constituted with the councillors, chosen by elections from electoral divisions, is functioning since 1st May, 1962. The number of such councillors is 44 and there are no nominations. Further, there are 13 Panchayat Samiti@s at Block level and the Chairman of these Samiti@s are the ex-officio members of Zilla Parishad. Five associate councillors are also there, representing the five Federal Cooperative Societies. The Parishad is presided by the President, who is elected amongst the Councillors.

The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad is the entire district area, excluding Municipal and Corporation areas. A Panchayat Samiti area correspond to the block area.

The work of the Zilla Parishad is carried out through a set of seven subject committées. For Administration, there is competent machinery headed by the Chief Executive Officer. He has been vested with full administrative powers for carrying out the provisions

of the Act and is assisted by officers of various departments. The Finance branch of the Zilla Parishad is controlled by the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer and this branch works on the lines of the Finance Department in the State Government.

Nagpur district previously included areas which now are partly in Wardha and partly in Bhandara districts. The area now constituting Wardha district was separated in 1862. There were only four tahsils up-to the year 1908, when a new tahsil was created with headquarters at Saoner. There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district or talukas from 1911 onwards. With the reorganisation of States, the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh to Bombay State and then formed the part of Maharashtra since 1st May, 1960. The area of the district is 3834 sq.miles(9930 Sq. Kilometres) and it accounts for 3.24 area of the State.

HILLS :

The district is situated in the Nagpur Plain and has spread over the southern base of Satpura range. Thus the northern part of the district is covered by strips of Satpura hill, while the remaining part of the district is an undulating plain, but traversed by low hill ranges. The elevation of the plains of the district is between 900 to 1000 feet.

Among hills other than Satpura, the important are the Ambagarh hills lying which ~~have a spread in~~ have a spread in Ramtek taluka, Pilkapar hills lying across the Katol taluka and a hill range running down the South West border of the district. In Addition, there are several detached hills. The hills do not attain high attitude, the highest being 1997 feet of a point in Katol taluka.

RIVERS:

Kanhan, Pench, Kolar are the main rivers in the district. The river Wardha flows along the north

west border, while Wainganga along the eastern border of the district. Both Kanhan and Pench rise in Satpura in the North and slope down southwards.

SOILS: The district lies towards the eastern boundary of the Deccan trap and therefore the soils in the district are either true black cotton soils or mixtures with other soils derived from the gneissic formation. These black cotton soils are essentially clay soils and are sticky, when wet.

The best deep black soils occur in rather small areas around Kalmeshwar and Sabner. Morand, the other type, however, covers more than $\frac{2}{3}$ of the cultivated area. These soils are comparatively of slight depth and are brown in colour. They are easily culturable and contain limestone to some extent. Another important type of soils is classed as Khardi, which is gray in colour. This occurs in Ramtek and Umrer talukas and is suitable for Rice.

The situation of the district is in the classical geological region. The metamorphic and crystalline rocks, stretched along the eastern part contain Manganese or deposits. These rocks are hidden beneath a considerable thickness of alluvial soil deep deposited by the tributaries of Kanhan and Wainganga. Little more than half of district's area is covered by the spread of basaltic and doleritic lavas. The Lamata or Infratrappean rocks are also found in the western part of Umrer taluka. In composition, these rocks vary from a sandy limestone to a calcareous sand stone.

TEMPERATURE:

Being far away from the Sea, the place attains extremes of temperatures. The average maximum temperature during summer is not less than 110 F. The highest level reached by mercury is even 116 F. in the month of May. After May, the temperature rapidly comes down. Then from June, with the arrival

of Mansoons, starts the rainy season and lasts up to the end of September. It is followed by cold weather season, which is quite pleasant. The first fortnight of January is supposed to be very cold. The lowest temperature attained is 45 F.

RAINFALL:

Rainfall is not uniform in the district. The eastern portion lies in the rainshadow of Satpura ranges, recording more rainfall. The total rainfall varies from 700-m.m.-at Saoner to over 1000-m.m.-at Ramtek and Umrer. The distribution of rains determines the crop pattern. Cotton and Jawar are the major crops in the Western part, where as Rice is with Eastern part. The isohyets practically run from north to south. Rains are received from the south-west monsoons, starting from early June and lasting up to September. The untimely rains in January and February are occasionally accompanied by thunder storms, damaging the spring crops.

CHAPTER -II1. POPULATION

The population of Nagpur district, according to 1961 Census is 15,12,807, which is nearly 3.82 percent of the population of Maharashtra State. This population comprises of 47.93 percent rural and 52.07 percent urban population. The Nagpur district is relatively more urbanised than the State as whole (percentage of urban population for the Maharashtra State is 28.22 at against for Nagpur district); this is because of the location of Nagpur City. The population of the Nagpur district has nearly doubled (101.46 % rise) since 1901 i.e. during last 60 years and has increased by 22.54 percent during the decade 1951-61.

The density of population per square kilometer for Nagpur district is (152) which is higher as compared to Maharashtra which is (129). Among the tahsils density is highest per-square-kilometre and in Nagpur tahsil with (394) persons per square Kilometre, and lowest with (75) persons in Ramtek tahsil. Because of Nagpur City the concentration is highest in Nagpur tahsil.

The distribution of population by size of villages shows that about 73.22 percent of the total number of villages are having less than 500 population, which for Maharashtra as a whole such villages account for only 47.72 percent of the total number of villages. Average population per village in 1961 is 439 for the district as against 792 for Maharashtra. The number of villages per 100 sq. Kilometres is about 17 in the district as against 12 in Maharashtra.

No scheduled Tribes have been enumerated in Nagpur district at the time of 1961 Census, while the total Scheduled Caste population in the district in 1961 is about 3.60 percent. The proportion of Scheduled caste has decreased from 18.11 percent in 1951 to

3.60 percent in 1961, it is because of a large number of persons from Mahar caste have returned their religion in 1961 Census as Buddhist or Nava-Buddha.

The concept of dependency which was adopted at the time of 1951 Census has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1961 Census. Instead, the population has been classified as workers and non-workers. The workers are further classified into nine categories of economic activity. The population of workers in the population of Nagpur district is 46.5 percent, which is slightly less as compared to population of workers for Maharashtra State, which is 47.9 percent. The proportion of workers in different categories of economic activity for Nagpur district differ significantly with those for Maharashtra State as a whole, because of very high proportion of urban population in the district. The percentage of persons classified as cultivators and agricultural labourers is 14.9 and 10.1 respectively, thus these two categories together account for 25 percent of the population of Nagpur district. This proportion is quite low as compared to percentage of cultivators and agricultural labourers in the Maharashtra State which is 33.5 percent.

2. AGRICULTURE:

The district has about 3.24 percent area of the Maharashtra State. The proportion of net area sown to the total geographical area in the district is 54.0 percent. The district has considerably lower portion of areas under barren and unculturable waste and old and current fallows. The proportion of permanent pastures to the total geographical area is comparatively much higher (11.7%). The proportion of forest land is about 18.7 percent in the district out of which 9.7 percent is in Ramtek tahsil and 4.4 percent is in Unner tahsil.

The proportion of net area sown to the geographical area ranges between 40.4 percent for Ramtek tahsil and 68.1 percent for Saoner tahsil.

Ramtek tahsil has very high proportion of areas under forests (37.3 percent) hence proportion to net area sown is substantially low in that tahsil. The proportion of fallow lands is low in almost all tahsils. On the other hand the proportion of culturable waste is very high in all tahsils except Saoner tahsil (2.2 percent).

The proportion of food crops to the gross cropped area is about 77.3 percent. The proportion of Jawar is the highest in the food crops, percentage of Jawar to the gross cropped area and area under food crops is 39.3 percent and 50.7 percent respectively. Proportion of wheat and paddy to the gross cropped area is 14.7 percent and 4.5 percent respectively. Proportion of pulses is about 12.5 percent to the gross cropped area. Area under wheat is comparatively greater in Ramtek, Umrer and Nagpur Tahsils and under rice it is higher in Ramtek and Umrer tahsils. Oranges are mainly grown in Katol, Saoner and part of Nagpur Tahsil on large scale. Vegetables are also grown in large areas in the vicinity of Nagpur City.

The proportion of non-food crops in the district is 22.7 percent. Proportion of Cotton and Oil seed to the total cropped area is 14.0 percent and 8.4 percent respectively i.e. almost all the area under non-food crops is under these two crops.

The proportion of gross irrigated area to the gross cropped area is 5.5 percent and proportion of net area irrigated to net cropped area is about 5.6 percent. The proportion of area irrigated by wells, tanks and Government canals, is 49.4 percent, 22.4 % and 22.7% respectively. Remaining 5.5% area is irrigated by different sources. Out of the total area irrigated about 98.2 percent is under food crops and 1.8 percent under non-food crops. The important crops under irrigation are Rice (41.1%), Wheat (12.3%) and fruits and vegetables and miscellaneous crops (36.7%).

3. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FORESTS AND FISHERIES

LIVESTOCK

Total number of livestock animals in the district according 1961 livestock Census was 8,12,857 of which 90.49 percent were found in rural areas. Cattle found the highest percentage i.e. 73.50 of the total livestock population. Then came in order the goats which found 15.55 percent of the total population. The class of buffaloes followed with 7.06 percent of the livestock population. Poultry has recorded an increase of about 25.83 percent in 1961 over that in 1956.

An artificial incemination centre works at Telangkhedi for development of livestock . An Animal Geneticist section with a well equiped laboratory has also been working at Nagpur and arranges supply to the Artificial incemination centre and sub-centres.

The central poultry farm located at Nagpur undertakes poultry breeding, management and research in Poultry Science.

The ^{livestock} mortality has decreased due to increased facilities in the district.

FOREST:

The area under forests is about 18.7 percent of the total area of the district. Out of the total area under forest 47.4 percent is under reserved forest, 34.0 percent under protected forest and 18.6 percent under unclassed forest. The forest area has decreased by about 0.6 percent during the year. Production of timber has decreased by about 2.3 percent where as the value of timber product decreased by 15.7 percent. Fuel production though increased to some extent the value of the product has decreased. The value of other products has also been decreased. The decrease in total value of forest produce works to be 18.4 percent.

FISHERIES :

Fishing activities in the district are naturally restricted to inland waters only rivers, tanks and ponds being the chief sources. The commercially important varieties of fish found in the district are Murrel, Dhudkya, botri, Padhan, Tambu, Karradi, Poshsi etc. At some places the fishing activity is done through Cooperative Societies which have been given financial assistance in the form of loan & subsidy. The fisheries Department has also provided loan and subsidy to individuals for the fishing activity.

4. INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITYINDUSTRY:

Nagpur Dity is an important industrial centre in Maharashtra. The industrial development has taken place mostly at Nagpur proper and at few smaller towns. Of the total working factories in the district about 88 percent of the factories were located in Nagpur Tahsil alone.

There are a number of large scale units such as Cotton Textiles, Cotton Ginning and pressing, Saw Milling, Paper and Straw Board, Ceramics, Ferro-Manganese, Steel rolling etc. Out of the total factories about 31.1 percent are saw mills having average workers of about 4.9 percent of the total workers. The Percentage of factories manufacturing machinery other than electrical machinery comes to about 8.3 percent with 3.7 percent of the total workers. The factories under spinning, weaving, and finishing of Cotton Textiles though has less percentage (about 1.67 percent) has the maximum number of workers (about 47.6 percent of total workers) engaged in them

MINING

The district is outstandingly rich in mineral wealth. In addition to known occurrences in the

District large areas still remain unexploited for preliminary prospecting. The valuable minerals like Manganese, Coal, Limestone and Dolomite, White Clay, Ochres, Mica etc. are found in the district.

The production of Manganese ore has raised by about 50% and that of coal by about 17%. Production of building stones and brick earth has also been raised considerably.

ELECTRICITY:

The only power generating station in the district is at Khaperkheda. This power station supplies power to other districts also. The proportion of electricity used for industrial purposes is about 45.7 percent of the total electricity consumed.

Due to the speedy programme of rural electrification in the district nearly 23.1 percent of the total villages and towns were electrified upto the end of the year. The population covered by the electrification is about 72.3 percent. This high percentage is due to the Nagpur & City.

5. CO-OPERATION:

The co-operative movement has taken great strides during the last three Plan periods. By the end of 1964-65 all the villages in the district have been covered by agricultural credit societies. The co-operative movement which was in the beginning mainly agricultural credit movement has entered other fields of economic activity such as dairying, fisheries, farming, marketing, processing, industrial etc. However, the movement still continues to be a predominantly agricultural credit movement as agricultural credit societies accounts for (36.9) percent of the total number of societies, claim (21.1) percent of the membership of all societies and possess (18.36) percent of the share capital of all types of societies.

The Number of societies of all types has increased by 3.5 percent during the year under report, while

their membership, share capital and working capital have increased by 6.9 percent, 7.7 percent and 27.1 percent respectively. The increase in amount of loans advanced during the year has been considerable being about 42 percent.

Important types of co-operative societies besides agricultural credit societies, in Nagpur district are Weaver's societies, Housing societies, Consumer's Co-operative stores, as they account for 10.5 percent, 12.5 percent and 12.7 percent of the total number of societies respectively.

There has been increase in the membership, share capital, reserve and other funds, working capital and loans advanced in respect of agricultural cooperative societies in the year 1964-65 as compared to the previous year. Also the percentage of loans overdue to the loans loans outstanding which was 26.2 percent at the end of 1963-64 has decreased to 24.9 percent at the end of 1964-65.

There were 16 primary agricultural marketing societies and one central marketing society (Vidarbha Co-operative Marketing society, Nagpur) at the end of 1964-65. The total value of purchases made by Primary Marketing societies in the year 1964-1965. ~~The total value of purchases~~ comprised of 47.1 percent of purchases of Agricultural produce, 11.7 percent of Agricultural requisites and 41.2 % of consumers goods. Total value of sales effected by the primary marketing societies consisted of 58.7 percent of sales as owners while 41.3% of sales as agents. The major agriculture produce handed by the marketing societies was paddy and non-food crops such as Cotton, chillies, etc. Cement, Iron and Steel constituted the major proportion (81.8 percent), of the agricultural requisites distributed by the marketing societies.

Number of registered money lenders has recorded an increase during the year under report.

Out of the total loans advanced by the registered money lenders 84.4 percent were advanced to non-traders, while remaining were advanced to traders.

6. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

The Medical and Health programme consists of 1. curative services in Hospitals and dispensaries 2. preventive services to control spread of communicable diseases and to prevent epidemics 3. basic services for maternal and child health in rural areas, and 4. supply of drinking water and housing.

There is no remarkable increase or decrease in the number of institutions and medical and Health staff. The indoor and out-door patients treated in various institutions have decreased by 6.1 % and 0.6 percent respectively. The number of hospital beds per lakh of population in Nagpur, Katol, Saoner, Ramtek and Umrer tahsils are 281, 27, 22, 21 and 14 respectively. Nagpur tahsil has highest number of beds due to a big hospitals in Nagpur City.

The number of births registered has recorded an increase by 4.7 percent and death registered has recorded an increase of 3.9 percent. The infant deaths has also recorded an increase by about 10.8 percent. Fever and respiratory diseases were the main causes observed for death. The vaccination programme seems to have slowed down during the year as the number of vaccinations has ^{considerably} decreased. The cholera inoculations have recorded increase of 136 percent.

Among the out-door patients treated in 1964 major proportion i.e 10.7 percent was of diseases of respiratory system (other than T.B. and pneumonia), followed by injuries, diarrhoea, dysentery, tuberculosis of lung and infectious diseases.

Among the indoor patients treated majority of cases (12.3 percent) were of T.B. of lung, diseases of generative systems.

According to the population Census 1961 there were 1226 Physicians, Surgeons and Dentists ; and 2235 Nurses, Pharmacists and other medical health technicians in Nagpur district. Of the Doctors 85.9 percent were enumerated in urban areas.

Out of the total number of villages in the district, 7.7 percent of the villages were still without any drinking water source while 22.4 percent villages were with inadequate water supply. Well was the main source of drinking water supply while there were only 7 villages having piped water supply.

7. EDUCATION

The growth in the number of educational institutions and the improvement in literacy rates in the district have been remarkable in the last few years. As per the population Census 1961 the district has the highest literacy percentage (except Greater Bombay) in the Maharashtra State. The percentage of literacy among total population, Males & Females in the district as per 1961 Census was 35.15%, 48.06% and 21.26% respectively. The literacy percentage in urban and rural areas was 48.25% and 20.92% respectively.

The number of primary and pre-primary educational institutions in the district has increased by about .11 percent and the primary school going children increased by 7 percent during the year. The primary education has now covered almost all the villages in the district. The scheme of compulsory education has been applied to 1044 villages upto the end of the year. The number of Secondary education ^{of} institutions has gone up by about 7 % during the year. The number of

Secondary school going children has gone up by about 9 % during the year. Among the students, boys have recorded an increase by 7 % and Girls have recorded an increase by about 12% . The above figures shows that the district has made considerable progress during the year, and now even small places are having the secondary schooling facilities, which are not taluka are block headquarters.

There are very good facilities for higher education in the district. Nagpur City is the important centre of College education in Maharashtra State. All most all types of colleges have been established in the city. The facilities for Medical, Engineering and Agricultural and Veterinary courses are also provided for the district and are mainly established in Nagpur City. As the demand for higher education is increasing day by day, new colleges are being established and the intake capacity of the existing colleges is being increased. All these higher institutions are affiliated to the Nagpur University.

8. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

The demand of transport facilities has been continually increasing on account of the implementation of plan for all round development and particularly on account of the increasing pace of industrial production. If agriculture and industry are the body and bones of a national organism communication are its nerves.

The district is well connected by Rail. The Central Railway and South-Eastern Railway operate in the district. Though there is no change in the length of Railway routes about 22 Kilometres of the broad gauge line was converted into double broad-gauge line during the year. The existing railway length in the district is (3.4) kilometres per 100 Sq. Kilometres of area and 22 kilometres per lakh of population.

The district is also well connected by roads with adjoining district of Wardha, Chanda, Bhandara, Amravati and Madhya Pradesh. The district Head quarter is connected with all tahsil places in the district. The road length was increased by about 19.5 Kilometres during the year 1964-65. The road length in the district during the year is 9.8 Kilometres per 100 square kilometres and 64.2 kilometres per lakh of population.

The length of road surface per 100 sq.kilometres is /road length maximum in Nagpur tahsil and lowest in Ramtek tahsil. The/ per lakh population According to the Nagpur Plan these ratios are much below is highest in Saoner. The percentage of road length under National Tahsil and Highways, State highways, Major District Roads, Other lowest in Nagpur district roads and village roads to the total road Tahsil. length during the year 1964-65 is 22.7, 23.4, 19.3, 26.0

and 8.6 percent respectively. Similarly the surface classification of the total road length is 0.4 percent, Cement Concrete, 60.4 percent black topped, 34.2 percent water bound Macadam and 5.0 percent Granular material and lower type.

A substantial part of the passenger and goods traffic is handled by road transport in the district. The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation has made a considerable progress by increasing number of routes. The State Government is also taking necessary steps to nationalise all the passenger road transport. All the factors such as route, distance, average route distance, earning of vehicles and number of passengers travelled indicates that the State Transport Corporation has made considerable progress during the year. The number of motor vehicles in operation in the district has also gone up by 13.2% during the year.

Nagpur is a centrally situated city in India and as such, is an important airport. The aerodrome is situated 5 miles away from the City & is known as Sonegaon Aerodrome. Planes coming from Bombay, Delhi, Calcutta and Madrasland on this airport.

9. LOCAL SELF GOVERNMENT

With a view to promoting development of democratic institutions and securing greater measure of participation by the people in Development Plans and in Local and Government affairs by decentralisation of powers and functions, the Zilla Parishad & 13 Panchayat Samitis have been working in the district since 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis correspond to the district and the block boundaries except in the case of Municipal towns which are not included in its perview. Kamptee Cantonment which does not have a Municipal Committee is, however, not included under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samiti concerned. Nearly 47.9 percent of the district population is under the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis. The remaining population is included in the urban areas and hence it is covered by the Municipal Corporation and Municipal Committees and Cantonment Board.

Out of the total income of all Municipalities about 13 percents is from Government grants and 65 percent from taxes. The expenditure on Administration, Public Health and Convenience and Public Works is 7.4, percent, 20.9 percent and 23.1 percent of the total expenditure.

The Zilla Parishad has increased its sources of income by implementating the rate of cess on land revenue and other taxes. The income and expenditure of the Zilla Parishad have recorded an increase by 17.3% and 26.2% respectively. The income and expenditure of all Municipalities and Municipal Corporation taken together seen to be decreased by 2.2% and 5.5% respectively during the year.

Nearly 91.9 percent of the total income of the Zilla Parishad is received by way of Government grants and for execution of Plan schemes. Of the total expenditure 8.4 percent was incurred on Administration, 51.6 percent on education and 11.0 percent on public works.

The Village Panchayats have covered almost all the rural area in the district. The village Panchayats have increased their sources of income by implementing taxes on houses, bazars etc. The income and expenditure of all Village Panchayats have increased by 45.5 percent and 36.3 percent respectively during the year. The per capita income and expenditure of Village Panchayats works out to be Rs. 5.3 and Rs. 4.0 respectively during the year. Out of the total income during 1963-64 about 25.0 percent has received through Government grants, 11.7 percent from taxes and 63.3 percent from other sources. The expenditure incurred on sanitation and Health, Public works and on Administration is 7.8 percent, 52.3 % and 15.1 percent of the total expenditure during the year 1963-64.

10. PLANNING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The district's Third Five Year Plan as a part of the State Plan was originally earmarked for 7.21 crores which was revised to 6.88 crores in 1964-1965 and further revised to 7.18 crores in 1965-66.

There are 84 district level schemes of which 36 are local sector schemes. Some schemes are implemented by the Zilla Parishad on agency basis.

Upto the end of 31st March, 1965, 53 percent of the plan provision was utilised. The actual expenditure during 1st four years of the plan was of the order of Rs. 382.64 lakhs the expenditure during 1964-65 being 149.6 lakhs (21%).

The expenditure was 101 % in case of

Industry and Mining whereas in Cooperation and Community Development it was 83%. Transport and communications follow next with 55%. The expenditure in Agricultural Programmes and Social Services respectively was 43%.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The programme of Community Development was introduced in the district in October, 1953 with the inauguration of 3 Community Development Blocks viz. Mouda, Kalmeshwar and Narkhed. By the end of 1964-65 all 13 blocks had passed the pre-extension stage.

During the Third Five Year Plan 4 new blocks viz. Parseoni, Hingna, Kamptee and Umrer came into Stage-1. By March, 1965 5 blocks were in Stage-I 5 blocks in Stage-II and 3 blocks in Stage-III. The blocks cover 8929.3 sq. kilometres area of the district over 1879 villages and population 7,20,919 which is 47.9% of the total population.

11. PRICES

In a mixed economy the level and structure of prices are related to a number of basic economic factors, some of which are the result of the Government policy. While the other rest with the producers, consumers and investors, who are widely scattered and act in terms of economic gains to themselves. The behaviour and fluctuation of prices assume greater significance in the context of developmental Planning and of the emergency situation prevailing since November, 1962.

The prices of most of the commodities were steady upto June, 1964. Since June, 1964 prices of food articles which are considered to be essential commodities started increasing and have shown upward trends upto December, 1964. Most of the commodities shown maximum price level in December, 1964. After December 1964 the prices of commodities were constant or shown decreasing trends in some cases. The upward trend was mainly due to scarcity of foodgrains and hoarding of the available stock. Prices of non-food commodities were constant to some extent during the year.

12. MISCELLANEOUS

1. Police and Crime:

The number of cognisable offences have shown an increase by 27.5% while there is no remarkable change in the non-cognisable offences during the year.

2. Courts:

The Civil cases decided in the courts have increased in respect of both original and appellate sides. The cases decided have decreased on the criminal side (original) while the some have increased in criminal (appellate) side.

3. Life Insurance:

The number of policies issued during the year has noted decrease by 1740 cases and the amount insured decreased by about Rs. 15.26 lakhs in the district as compared to previous year figures.

4. Small Savings:

The Nagpur district has made remarkable progress in achieving the targets fixed for the district. The net small saving collection was more by about 50 percent during the year as against the target of Rs. 75 lakhs fixed for the district.

5. Land Revenue and other taxes

The land Revenue demand was increased by about 5.5 percent during the year. The land Revenue collection during the year was about 64.6 percent of the total demand as against 66.6 percent during the previous year.

The receipts from Excise Revenue, Sales Tax and Entertainment Tax have shown increase by 29.6%, 61.5% and 14.4 percent respectively during the year.

The value of property transferred shown an increase by 7.2% during the year. The net income from transfer has also shown increase during the year.
