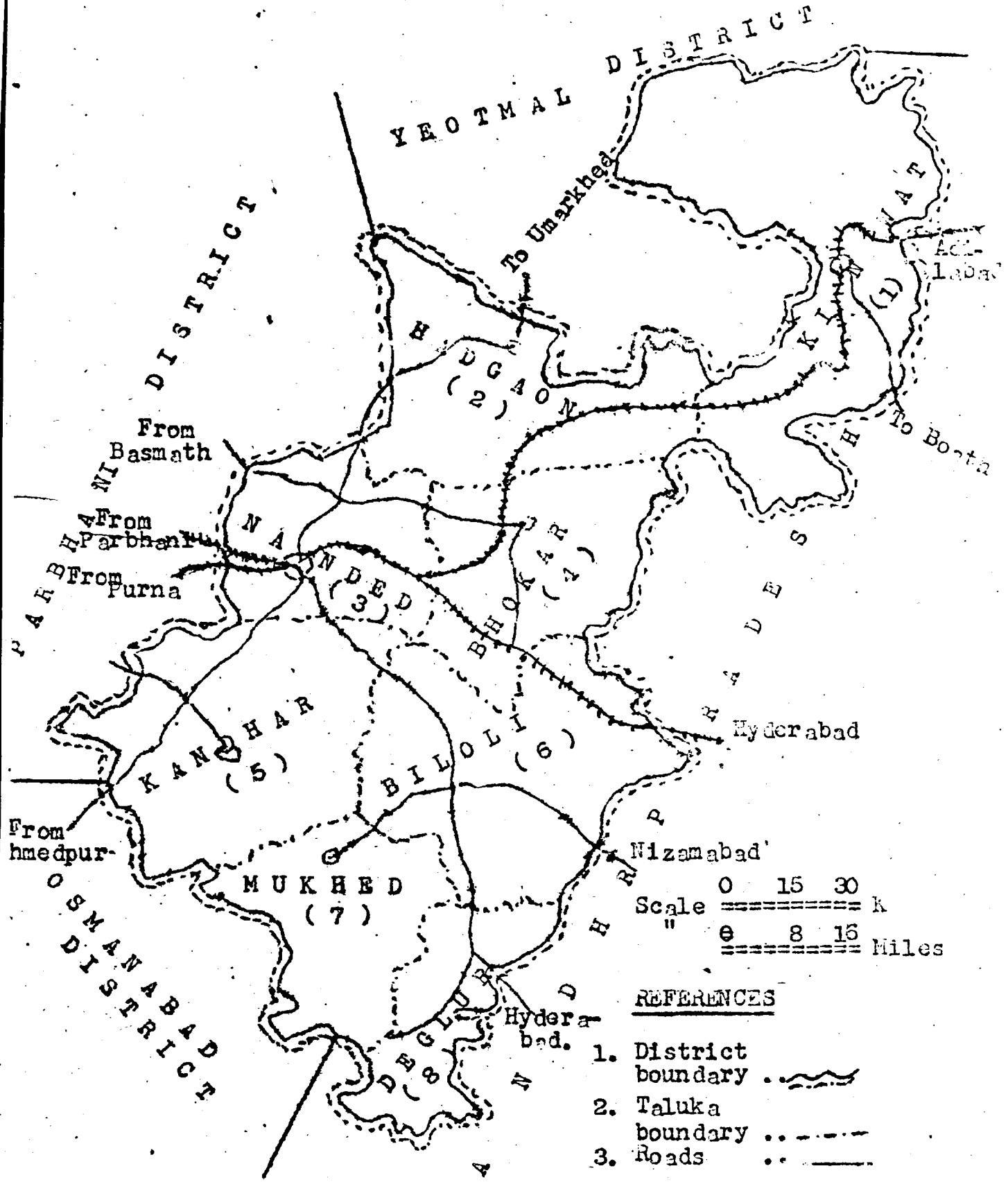

CHAPTER NO. I.

I N T R O D U C T I O N .

1.1 Introduction & Location.

Nanded district lying in the Godavari basin is one of the five districts of Aurangabad region of the Maharashtra. The northern portion of the district lies in the valley of the Penaganga which is a sub basin of the Godavari basin. Nanded town which is the district head quarter is situated on the banks of the Godavari which flows east-wards through the central part of the district. The district lies between 18-15' and 18-55' north latitude and 77-7' and 78-15' east longitude. The area of the district is 10333.30 Sq.Km. i.e. (3989.7 Sq.Miles) and its population according to 1961 population Census is 10,79,674. It accounts for 3.37% and 2.73% of the State's area and population respectively.

1.2 Boundaries.

The district is bounded on the north by Yeotmal district, on the east by Adilabad and south by Nizamabad districts of Andhra Pradesh, on the south west by Osman-^{Parbhani}abad district and on north west by ^{Parbhani} district.

1.3 Administrative set up.

For administrative purposes, the district is at present divided into six talukas and two mahals. The area, number of in-habited villages, number of towns, 1961 population and the percentages of area and population for each taluka and mahal are as follows:-

General Administration and Revenue.

The Collector is incharge of general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and two Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the two revenue divisions and have their headquarters at Nanded and Deglur, respectively. Six Tahsildars are incharge of six taluka offices and two Naib Tahsildars are incharge of the two Mahal offices.

1.4 Area.

Nanded district accounts for an area of 10,333.3 Sq. Kms (10,095.5 Sq. Kms rural and 237.8 Sq. Kms urban area). It is seventeenth largest district in terms of area in Maharashtra State and fifth in Maharashtra.

1.5 Topography.

Nanded is one of the most homogeneous districts in Maharashtra and does not have any well defined natural zones. The southern portion of the district is however, little different because of its poor hilly soils and the crop pattern mainly dominated by yellow jowar. The north eastern taluka of Kinwat is again different because of its extensive forests and barren areas. The northern plateau of the district comprising most of Hadgaon taluka is very favourable for cultivation of wheat. The rest of the central area of the district is flat, fertile land of black cotton soils favourable for cultivation of cotton, jowar, groundnut and pulses.

1.6(A) Hill Ranges and Forests.

There is only one main system of hills known as Bhag or Thanvari range. It traverses the district from north west to south east. There are a few minor ranges of hills in the Nanded, Kandhar, Hadgaon talukas and Bhokar Mahal.

The area under forest is over 777.30 Sq. Kms forming 8.27% of the total geographical area. Major portion of the forests in this district is in Kinwat taluka.

where 25% of its area is under forests. Kinwat and Hadgaon Talukas and Bhokar Mahal are gifted with dense forests and they together account for 95% of the forest areas in the district. This district has various types of forests from sparse and stunted to dense and ever green forests of high rainfall areas. Teak, Bamboo and grass are the main forest products.

1.6(B) Rivers.

The most important river in the district is the Godavari. Other important rivers are the Manjara, Manyad, Sarswati, Penganga, Ashana, Sita and Lendi. The Godavari enters the district from the west and flowing past Nanded in the centre of the district, passes out into Nizamabad district of the Andhra Pradesh. The Manjara which is the largest tributary of the Godavari flows from south to north and demarcates the boundary of the district and Andhra Pradesh. The Manyad flows through Kandhar taluka from west to east and forms the natural boundary between Mukhed Mahal and Deglur Taluka on one hand and Biloli taluka on the other. The Sarswati rises in Wakhad hill and flows from north to south through the eastern portion of the district and finally joins the Godavari near the village Malkavtha. The Ashana flowing in the eastern direction falls into the Godavari on the left bank about 2 miles from Nanded town. The Sita also rises from north and meets the Godavari. The Lendi flows from west to east in Deglur taluka. It runs partly along the southern boundary and after taking a slightly northward course passes through Deglur taluka and meets the Manjara.

The Penganga forms the northern boundary of the district flowing in easterly direction. Further downstream, it falls into the Wardha river in Yeotmal district.

1.6(c) Soil.

The soils of the district are in general black and fertile. The ridges and spurs from the uplands, which are all of trap formation, reduce the cultivable area considerably. The best black soils are found in a narrow strip of ^{land} on the banks of the Godavari and its tributaries..

Good black soil is found along the banks of the

Manjara

Kanjra and the Manyad rivers in Piloli taluka, while elsewhere it is undulating, much inferior in quality and covered with loose stones. It grows rabi as well as Kharif crops. The soil of Nanded taluka consists principally of rich black alluvial deposits. Near the foot of the hills black soil is scarce and it is of a very poor description.

Devlur taluka is considered to have the best soil in the whole of the district. With the exception of a small portion of the taluka towards the west, the soil is of superior quality and most suitable for rabi crops.

Kandhar taluka generally has black and rich soil and grows rabi crops. Nearly half of the taluka is covered with hills and has light soils. It is undulating and covered with loose stones where Kharif crops are chiefly grown.

About three-fourths of Hadgaon taluka is highly fertile. The portion along the banks of the Penganga is the most fertile. Towards the south, nearer the hills, the soil is rather mixed up with certain saline matter. In Bhokar mahal and Kinwat taluka except for the hilly tracts the entire land is of black cotton soil.

1.6(D) Minerals.

The only mineral found in the district is limestone. Deposits of intertrappean limestone have been found to occur in Kinwat taluka. The limestone quarried is not uniform in grade and is highly siliceous at places. The reserves have been estimated at ten million tons. Building

materials like Deccan trap or basalt, sandstones and brick clay are also found in this district.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall.

1.7(A) Climate:

The climate in the district is dry and subject to extremes of heat and cold. The highest temperature reached 41.8 in the month of May and the lowest temperature touched 13.7 during December and January in the year 1966.

1.7(B) Temperature.

The following table shows the maximum, minimum temperature and variation during the year 1965 and 1966.

Local variation are observed within the district and Kinwat taluka in the extreme north east is comparatively hotter. The climate of the district is considered to be good for cattle. The cows and bulls are more robust and the Kandhari breed is note-worthy.

The climate on the whole is quite healthy for the growth of cattle and the crops like cotton Kharif and rabi jowar, paddy, sugarcane etc.

1.7(C) Rainfall.

Rainfall conditions in this district are similar to the other district of Marathwada in particular and other district of the state except districts of Kona and some districts of Vidarbha, in general. Nanded district falls in assured rainfall zone of the State receiving normal rainfall between 35" to 45". In all 75% of the total rainfall is received from the south west monsoon (June to september) and 16 percent is received during post monsoon period from October to December. Pre-monsoon showers contribute about 7% of the total rainfall. The remaining 2% rainfall is received from winter monsoons during January and February.

The crop pattern, the nature of the soil and the nature of rainfall are in perfect harmony. Agricultural operations for Kharif crops start vigourously with the advent of the monsoon. Monsoon is normally ushered in by the pre-monsoon showers which contribute approximately 7% of the total rainfall. Pre-monsoon and monsoon rains support Kharif crops which cover more than 80% of the total area sown. Post monsoon and winter monsoon rainfall helps rabi crops greatly.

Nanded district received average rainfall of 846.4 m.m. and there were 54 average number of rainy days during the year 1966.

It also appears that during the year 1966 Kinwat received maximum rainfall while Kandhar received the least rainfall. Kandhar, Nanded, Biloli, Mukhed and Deglur rather account for an average annual rainfall, 697.0 m.m., 794.6 m.m., 814.2 m.m., 852.5 m.m., and 849.3 m.m., with 53, 59, 54, 51 and 56 rainy days respectively. It is also interesting to note that the rains are not equally distributed in respect of both quantity and duration in different talukas of the district.

CHAPTER No.II.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON THE TABLES INCLUDED IN THE DISTRICT
STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 1966-67, NANDED DISTRICT.

1. Climate.

Table No.1:- This table indicates, monthly figures about normal rainfall, number of rainy days and rainfall in m.m. for the years 1965 and 1966. This information is given for 8 taluka centres of this district. The talukas of Kinwat, (1,332.2 mm) Deglur (849.3 mm), Mukhed (852.5 mm) and Biloli (814.15 mm) received more rains than other talukas in the district during the year 1966.

This district lies in the area of assured rainfall zone and scarcity conditions due to paucity of rains rarely occur. The average rainfall received in the district during the year 1966 was more than the rainfall received in 1965.

Table No.2:- This table deals with the monthly temperature data for the years 1965 and 1966. The maximum temperature is generally reached in the month of May and minimum temperature reaches in the month of January. The temperature figures for the years 1965 and 1966 do not show big variations. Temperature is more or less similar for both the years.

2. Area and population.

Table No.3 :- This table gives taluka-wise rural and urban population according to 1961 census and variations in population during the last one decade. The area of the district and each of its talukas is also

indicated in the table. In terms of area and population the district forms 3.37% and 2.73% of the state respectively. Highest percentage increase in population was noticed in Kinwat taluka i.e. 32.79 and the lowest in Biloli Taluka i.e. 16.37. The density in Kinwat taluka being 57 persons per sq.km. is lowest due to existence of forests area in this taluka and lack of communications whereas it is highest in Nanded taluka being 192 persons per sq.km. due to the growing importance of Nanded-town as educational and industrial centre in the district. Amongst the 26 districts of the state this district ranks 18th in terms of density of population. The smallest taluka by area in the district is Deglur and by population it is Bhokar taluka.

(Note:- In the table figures are supplied in thousands and as such taluka-wise figures may not add up to district total due to rounding).

Table No.4 :- In this table taluka-wise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1961 census in Nanded district is shown. It is observed that more villages fall in the population range 500-999. Only 3 villages each in talukas Hadgaon, Nanded, Kandhar fall in the population range 5000-9999. The villages with less than 1000 population are 81.81% of the total number of villages in the district and account for 55.94% of the rural population and remaining villages with more than 1000 population account for 18.19% of the total number of villages and 44.06% of the rural population.

Table No. 5 :- This table indicates talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges /in

1961 in Nanded district. Nanded, is the district head quarter town and is the only town in the population range 3/50,000-99,999. 3 Towns in the district fall in the range 5,000-9,999.

Table No. 6 :- This table indicates the number of workers in each taluka of this district according to 1961 census. The total number of workers is 5,63,170 forming 52.2% of the total population. The classification of working population reveals that 83.3% of the working population is engaged in agriculture, mining and allied operations and only 16.7% of the working population is engaged in other than agriculture and allied services. The district ranks eleventh amongst the 26 districts of Maharashtra in so far as the number of workers engaged in agriculture including agricultural labourers is concerned.

(Note:- Talukawise figures may not add up to district total due to rounding).

Table No. 7 :- This table indicates the number of non-workers in each taluka in this district according to 1961 census. The total non-workers in the district are 5,16,504 forming 47.8% of the total population of the district. Out of the non-workers the percentage of different categories of persons is as under:-

Table No.8 :- This table indicates the number of Scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in each taluka of this district. The total number of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes according to 1961 Census is 1.19 Lakhs

Table showing the number of ~~non-workers~~ in each and 40.6 thousands respectively.

3. Agriculture.

Table No. 9 :- This table indicates the land utilization statistics in Nanded district for the year 1965-66. Studying the table it is seen that about 69.61% and 70.07% of the total geographical area of the district was under cultivation during the years 1964-65 and 1965-66 respectively. This indicates slight increase in the proportionate area under cultivation in the district in the year 1965-66 compared to the previous year. Forest occupies about 7.75% of the area of this district. The forest area is mostly found in Kinwat, Hadgaon and Bhokar talukas in this district. Land put to non-agricultural uses and barren and un-culturable land occupied about 5.26% of the total area of the district in 1965-66 and covered 5.22% of total area in 1964-65. There has been slight decrease in the area of other un-cultivated land excluding fallows as the percentage of this area to the district total fell from 9.09% in 1964-65 to 9.03% in 1965-66. The area under current fallows and other fallows also decreased in the year 1965-66 as its percentage to district total dropped from 8.33% in 1964-65 to 7.83% in 1965-66. The area sown more than once, however, has increased in the district from 3.37% of the net cultivated area in 1964-65 to 3.61% in 1965-66. T

Table No.10 :- This table deals with the area under different crops in each taluka of the district

in the year 1964-65 and 1965-66. It is evident from the table that the food crops dominate the cropping pattern of the district. During the years 1964-65 and 1965-66, 66.78% and 67.85% of the gross cropped area respectively was under food crops and 33.22% and 32.15% of the gross cropped area respectively under non-food crops. The figures for the years 1964-65 & 1965-66 indicate slight changes in the cropping pattern of the district. The proportionate area under cereals has increased from 49.24% in the year 1964-65 to 49.39% in the year 1965-66. The area under pulses has also increased from 13.31% in the year 1964-65 to 14.19% in the year 1965-66. Except area under condiments and spices, particularly chillies, there has been increase in the area of other food crops like sugarcane, fruits and vegetables and other food crops in the year 1965-66. The decrease in the area of non-food crops in the year 1965-66 has been due to the reduction in the area of cotton and other fibres and groundnut. The extent of area covered by cotton decreased from 25.69% in 1964-65 to 24.71% in 1965-66 and of groundnut from 4.15% in 1964-65 to 3.92% in 1965-66.

Table No. 11 :- This table deals with the data regarding yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops in the district for the years 1964-65 and 1965-66. In general the out-turn of total cereals in the district increased from 2,01,483 metric tonnes in 1964-65 to 2,09,800 metric tonnes in 1965-66. However, the production of total cereals in the district decreased from 34,952 metric tonnes in 1964-65 to 31,000 metric tonnes in 1965-66.

The production of cotton also increased considerably in the year 1965-66. The production of sugarcane also increased from 9,246 metric tonnes in 1964-65 to 9,356 metric tonnes in 1965-66. However, the production of linseed, chillies, decreased.

Table No. 12 :- This table indicates the area irrigated by different sources in each talukas of Nanded district in 1964-65 and 1965-66. The increase in net irrigated area in 1965-66 over area in 1964-65 was of the order of 53.37%. The percentage of net irrigated area to net cultivated area in the district increased from 1.85% in 1964-65 to 2.72% in 1965-66. Major source of district upto the end of 1965-66 was well irrigation, which accounted for 63.40% of the net irrigated area in the year 1965-66. In the recent years the area served by Government canals has also increased considerably and at the end of 1965-66 it covered 26.73% net irrigated area. Remaining irrigation was provided by the tanks and other sources.

Table No. 13 :- This table indicates the area irrigated under different crops in each talukas of Nanded district during the years 1964-65 and 1965-66. Out of the total gross cropped area 99.64% irrigated area was under food crops and very negligible percentages of gross irrigated area i.e., 0.36% was under non-food crops. Mainly the irrigation in the district is given to rice, wheat, among cereals, gram among pulses, sugarcane, chillies, turmeric and fruit and vegetable crops from food crops. Among non-food crops tobacco, other miscellaneous non-food crops only are served by irrigation. The area

under irrigation for non-food crops is very negligible.

Table No. 14 :- This table deals with number of irrigation wells in each talukas of this district during the year 1964-65 and 1965-66. The total number of irrigation wells in the district increased from 8,175 in 1964-65 to 8,237 in 1965-66. At the end of 1965-66 92.70% of total irrigation wells were in use and 7.30% of total wells were not in use. The highest number of wells in this district are found in Nanded taluka and the lowest in Deglur taluka. However, taluka Kandhar stands first so far as the number of wells in use are concerned. Proportionately less number of wells are found in Deglur, Kinwat, Biloli, Bhokar and Mukhed talukas as compared to other talukas. Particularly in Biloli taluka, number of irrigation wells are less as most of the taluka is served by tank irrigation. Similarly less number of wells are found in Kinwat taluka due to hilly tracts and difficulties of sinking of wells.

Table No. 15 :- Talukawise information regarding minor irrigation works excluding wells in Nanded district (1965-66) is provided in this table. In the figure presented these works are classified as Zilla Parishad, State and private/co-operative. Net area irrigated during 1965-66 is also indicated in the table. Out of total 70 works, 50 works with 3276-00 acres area is found in Biloli taluka bordering Andhra Pradesh which accounts for 61.33% of total net area irrigated by minor irrigation works in this district.

Table No. 16 :- This table indicates the major and medium projects in Nanded district. There was only one major project namely Manar Project by the end of March, 1966, and there was no medium project at all. The first stage of Manar Project is completed with gross area under command of 15,207 hectares. By the end of March, 1966, 3,150.18 hectares area was irrigated by this project. On completion of the stage-II, the gross area under command of this project will increase by 21,565 hectares. The canal works of the first stage have been completed upto 45.16 Kms, out of the total sanctioned canal of 69.35 Kms. Out of the sanctioned canal of 113.00 Kms in stage second, 77.00 Kms canal was completed by the end of March, 1967. The stage-II is likely to be completed by the end of June, 1969, and this will provide additional irrigation facility for 16,592 hectares.

Table No. 17 :- This table indicates the daily wage rates for agricultural occupation. These are shown for months January to December during the years 1965 and 1966. It is compiled for three centres, Ardhapur, Loha, and Bhokar. Comparatively wage rates for skilled labourers at Ardhapur and Bhokar centres were higher than their wage rates at Loha centre. Similarly, in case of unskilled labourer the wage rates both for male and female at Ardhapur and Bhokar centre were higher than the wage rates at Loha centre.

Table No. 18 :- This table indicates talukawise agricultural implements in Nanded district as per 1966

number of ploughs in 1966. Among the total irrigation pumps, electric pumps formed 21.62% and pumps driven by oil engines accounted for 75.38%. Due to the Rural Electrification programme the number of electric pumps has increased considerably, as compared to only 30 electric pumps in 1961 census. Similarly, the number of oil engines has also increased from 636 in 1961 Live stock Census to 1,047 in 1966 Census. The sugarcane crushers worked by power have also increased from 101 in 1961 to 154 in 1966. The number of tractors has also increased from 5 in 1961 to 13 in 1966. This indicates increasing awareness of the cultivators in the use of modern agricultural implements.

Table No. 19 :- Famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data in Manded district for the year 1966-67 is represented in this table. No village was affected due to famine and chronic scarcity during the year 1966-67. In Kandhar taluka 84 villages with a population of 77,030 were classified as villages in akin to scarcity conditions. Half suspension was granted to these 84 villages due to annawari of crop being low. No special relief works were undertaken for these villages.

4. Animal Husbandary, Forest and Fisheries.

Table No. 20:- This table indicates the summary of live stock census conducted during 1966. The total livestock population over the period of 5 years from 1961 to 1966 indicates 0.31% decrease in the livestock of the district. The decrease is contributed mainly by the decrease in the population of goats, horses and

ponies, buffaloes and other livestock as donkeys, pigs, camels etc. The relative percentages of the different categories of the livestock in 1966 indicate that the cattle population is the most important category of livestock in the district as they form 65.54% of the total livestock in the district. Buffaloes, goats, sheep constituted important categories of the livestock as they formed 15.14%, 13.46%, 4.21% of the total livestock respectively. The male cattles of this district are mostly Devani and Red Kandhari breeds. The animals of these breeds are said to be very good for agricultural purposes.

Table No. 21:- This table represents the details of veterinary facilities in each taluka of the district. In all 44 ~~xxx~~ veterinary establishments are providing veterinary facilities to the livestock population in the district. There is one hospital situated at district Head quarter town. Others are dispensaries and veterinary aid centres. Two veterinary aid centres were increased during the year 1966-67. There is 4.1% decrease in total animals treated over total animals treated during 1965-66. It appears to be due to less number of animals treated at veterinary hospital Nanded during the year 1966-67.

Table No. 22 :- This table indicates the disease-wise livestock mortality in Nanded district in 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of animals attacked due to various diseases decreased during the year 1966-67. However, the number of deaths increased from 642 in 1965-66 to 688 in 1966-67. decrease in the number of animals attacked

appears to be due to adoption of various preventive veterinary measures by the veterinary dispensaries and aid centres.

Table No. 23 :- The data on Animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in Nanded district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 is represented in this table. Only one recognised slaughter house in the district is located at head quarter Nanded. Total animals slaughtered decreased from 8,756 in the year 1965-66 to 8,081 in the year 1966-67.

Table No. 24(A) :- This table indicates rangewise forest area in Nanded district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. There is only 2 hectares decrease in forest area of the district during 1966-67. This decrease was in reserved forest area. Approximately, the forest occupies about 7.75% of the area in the district. The distribution of categories of forests into reserved, protected and unclassified indicate that 55.24% are reserved forests, 4.38% are protected forests and 40.38% are un-classed forest in the district.

Table No. 24(B) :- This table indicates the major and minor forest products in Nanded district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. During 1966-67, the total value of forest products increased 6.42% over the value in the year 1965-66. Timber, fuel wood, grazing and other products formed 47.64%, 2.76%, 7.42%, 42.16%, respectively of the total value of the forest products in the year 1966-67.

5. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity.

Table No. 26 :- This table gives data regarding factory statistics for the year 1966-67. The number of working factories and average daily employment of workers is shown in this table. There were 48 registered factories in the district at the end of 1966, out of which 24 were working factories submitting returns, 17 were closed and 7 factories which were not submitting returns. On an average 5,029 daily workers were in employment in the factories of the district. The highest number of factories i.e. 21 were of Gins and presses which covered 43.75% of the factories and 20.93% of the daily employment of workers. Among other important factories there were eight factories of manufacture of grain mill products, Misc. food preparations 2 factories of manufacture of 11 factories of manufacture of wood and cork except furniture and one each textiles, furniture, printing, mechanical products, repair of motor vehicles, electric light power. The most important factory in the district was textile mill namely: The Osmanshahi Mills Ltd., which covered 74.62% of the total factory daily employment in the district.

Table No. 27:- This table indicates the industry-wise distribution of x factories according to working strength in Nanded district. There was only one large scale unit, a textile factory (i.e. Osmanshahi Mills Ltd; Nanded) in Nanded which employed workers between 1,000 to 4,999. There was no factory in this district which employ workers in the range of 500 to 999 and 5,000 and above. Highest number of working factories in

in the district were found employing workers in the range group of 20 to 49 workers.

Table No. 28 :- This table gives the distribution of factories according to number of days worked in Nanded district during the year 1966. Out of 24 working factories in this district 15 factories worked less than 120 days in the year. The number of factories which worked between 121 to 180 days were 3, 181 to 240 days were 2, 241 to 300 days were 2 and more than 300 days were 2. This indicates, except two factories, in the district, all other factories worked seasonally.

Table No. 29 :- This table indicates the monthwise statistics of the employment exchange for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total number of registrations decreased slightly in the year 1966-67 as compared to the registrations during the year 1965-66. Maximum number of registrations are found in the month of July due to declaration of examination results and registration of new candidates. Total number of vacancies notified increased from 996 in the year 1965-66 to 1,011 in the year 1966-67. Similarly the total placements against the vacancies notified from 696 in 1965-66 to 790 in 1966-67. The increase in the number of employers using exchange facilities is also considerable in the year 1966-67 as their number increased from 242 in 1965-66 to 283 in 1966-67.

Table No. 30 :- Occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in employment exchange in district Nanded during the years 1965-66 to 1966-67 is

is represented in this table. Major portion of the registrations and placements is found in the occupation of clerical and related works. Even though the registrations remained more or less the same during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 the placements indicated about 56.41% increase in 1966-67 over the placements in the year 1965-66.

Table No. 31 :- This table indicates the changes in the volume of employment in Nanded district in different industries as on 31st March 1966 and 31st March, 1967. Total establishments and employees as on 31st March 1966 are 195 and 23,960 respectively and the same as on 31st March 1967 are 206 and 26,199. Percentage increase in the employees as on 31st March 1967 is of the order of 9.34% over total employees as on 31st March 1966.

Table No. 32(A) :- The data on Census of Government employees, 1966 in Nanded district, is represented in this table. Total persons in government services in Nanded district are 6,673, out of which 0.34% are class-I, 2.02% are class II, 61.68% are class III and 35.95% are Class IV.

Table No. 32(B) :- This table indicates the departmentwise breakup of number of employees in Nanded district as on 1.7.1966 as per the census of State Government employees. Majority of the employees belonged to Revenue and Forests Department, Home Department and Agriculture & Co-operation Department, with their percentages 38.84%, 19.51% and 13.42% respectively. Remaining 28.23% employees belonged to other departments.

Table No. 33 :- This table indicates the statistics regarding the industries in Nanded district in 1961.

The total number of registered factories in the district was 41. Out of the total factories 48.78% factories were of the category of spinning, weaving and finishing of textiles, manufacture of textiles not elsewhere classified, 21.95% were the factories manufacturing miscellaneous food preparations, 12.19% factories of the category of saw mills and manufacture of wood products and furniture, 7.32% factories manufactured grain mill products, and remaining 9.76% factories were of printing and publishing, repair of motor vehicles and electric light and power.

The spinning weaving and textile manufacturing industry covered 93.76% of the total employment in the industry in Nanded district. The importance of the category of manufacturing textiles was due to the existence of Osmanshahi Mills Ltd., at Nanded.

Table No. 34 :- Data regarding generation and consumption of electricity in Nanded district is represented in this table. The generation of electricity at Nanded has decreased in the year 1966-67 as most of the supply of electricity is made by Paras Thermal Station. Total consumption of electricity increased by 14.9% during the year 1966-67 over for the year 1965-66.

Table No. 35 :- This table provides statistical information about number of towns and villages electrified and population covered in Nanded district.

The number of villages electrified in the district increased from 140 in 1965-66 to 256 at the end of the

year 1966-67 which also increased the coverage of population served from 1.88 Lakhs in 1965-66 to 2.87 Lakhs in 1966-67. By the end of 1966-67 18.5% of the villages and 31.05% of the population in the district was served by electricity.

6. Co-operation.

Table No. 36 :- This table indicates number of different types of co-operative societies working in Nanded district in 1965-66, out of the 1205 co-operative societies 960 are credit societies and 245 are non-credit societies. Among the credit societies the primary agricultural credit societies are the most important. Among non-agricultural credit societies, there are only 3 urban banks and 22 salary earners societies. Among agricultural non-credit societies most important societies are agricultural marketing societies, agricultural processing societies and farming societies. The important societies under non-agricultural non-credit side are housing societies, industrial societies, co-operative spinning mill, consumer's stores, and handloom weavers societies.

Table No. 37 :- statistics relating to co-operative Banks in Nanded district during 1965-66 and 1966-67 is shown in this table. As regards number of branches of the banks there is no change for both the years. Share capital, working capital and loans advanced shown an increasing trend. The District Central Co-operative Bank registered an increase of 40.2% in the share capital

of 47.2% in the working capital and of 23.9% in the loan advanced during the year 1966-67 respectively over the year 1965-66. However, the long term loan advanced by District Development Bank decreased during the year 1966-67 by 34.8% over the advances made during the year 1965-66.

Table No. 38 :- This table indicates the primary agricultural credit society in each taluka of this district during the year 1965-66. The number of agricultural credit societies in the district increased from 927 in 1965-66 to 933 in 1966-67. Similarly, there was considerable increase in the share capital, reserve funds, working capital and loans advanced of these societies in the year 1966-67 compared to the previous year. Highest number of primary agricultural credit societies is found in Kandhar taluka of this district and the lowest in Deglur taluka.

Table No. 39:- This table indicates other co-operative societies of different types in Nanded district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. Among the agricultural non-credit societies, marketing societies, agricultural processing societies and farming societies are important. Among the non-agricultural credit societies the important societies are salary earners societies. Among the non-agricultural non-credit societies important societies are consumer stores, housing societies, handloom weavers societies and other industrial societies.

Table No. 40:- This table indicates the data regarding operation of primary co-operative marketing

societies in each taluka of Nanded district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. There ~~xxxx~~^{are} eight primary co-operative marketing societies functioning at the taluka level and one society at the District level. The number of members of the societies value of the total purchases made by the societies and value of sales effected by the government both as owners and as agents are shown in the table.

Table No. 41 :- This table gives the details regarding the operations of other co-operative societies of ~~fx~~ different types in Nanded district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. Among the other co-operative societies the most important societies are the agricultural marketing societies, agricultural processing society and consumer's stores societies. There has been remarkable increase in the sale purchase operations of these societies during the year 1966-67 over the year 1965-66.

Table No. 42 :- This table indicates the operation of regulated markets in Nanded district. There are 13 regulated markets in the district during the year 1966-67. Commodity-wise quantity sold in these markets together with the value of the commodity is shown in this table.

Table No. 43 :- This table indicates the number of registered money lenders in the district and the loans advanced by them during the years 1965-66 ~~xxx~~ and 1966-67. The total number of money lenders in the district has decreased from 174 in 1965-66 to 138 in

1966-67. Similarly the total loans advanced by them to the traders as well as to the non-traders in the district decreased from Rs. 5.83 lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 4.72 Lakhs in the year 1966-67. The reduction in the number of money lenders and the loans advanced by them appear to be due to availability of more credit facilities from the co-operative banks and other government agencies.

7. Medical & Public Health.

Table No. 44 :- This table gives data regarding medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each taluka ~~of this district~~ during the years 1965 and 1966. There are only two hospitals 1) General Hospital (2) Ayurvedic Hospital located at Nanded town, the district head quarter. These hospitals are fully equipped with operation theatres and X-ray facilities etc. Number of dispensaries, health centres and primary health centres remained the same during the year 1965 and 1966. However the number of maternity homes in the district increased from 6 in the year 1965 to 9 in the year 1966. Similarly the number of beds for female has also increased from 180 in 1965 to 190 in 1966. There was considerable increase in the number of in-door and out-door patients treated in the year 1966 over the year 1965.

Table No. 45 :- This table gives data regarding the number of births and deaths registered in Nanded district during the year 1965 and 1966, together with the number of infant deaths. It is evident from the table that there has been increase in the number of births,

number of deaths and infant deaths, during the year 1966, over the year 1965. The percentage increase in the number of (1) births; (2) deaths; & (3) infant deaths was of the order of 10.7%, 40.3%, & 16.5% respectively in the year 1966 over the year 1965.

Table No. 46 :- This table provides data regarding deaths due to important causes in Nanded district for the years 1965- and 1966. It is evident from the table that the deaths occurred mainly due to periperatory diseases, dycentry and diarrihea, T.B., accidents and other causes.

Table No. 47 :- This table gives vaccination statistics and cholera inoculations in Nanded district during the year 1965 and 1966. Mass vaccination programme is undertaken for eradication of small pox and cholera inoculation programme is undertaken as preventive measure. Due to the mass vaccination and inoculation programmes the number of deaths due to small pox and cholera in the district have fallen down considerably.

Table No. 48 :- This table indicates the hygenic drinking water supply sources available in the rural areas of Nanded district. Out of the total number of 1,325 inhabited villages in the district, about 276 villages or 20.8% of the total number of villages have no hygenic drinking water supply and 25.4% of the total villages have in-adequate water supply. Kinwat taluka has 87 villages without any hygenic drinking water

source. This was due to the difficulties in sinking wells and scarcity of water in the hilly areas of Kinwat taluka. As many as 124 villages in Kandhar taluka existed with inadequate water supply.

8. Education:

Table No. 49 :- This table indicates the number of literates and the percentage of literacy in each taluka of Nanded district according to 1961 Census. The percentage of literacy in the district rose from 7.39 in 1951 Census to 15.14 in 1961 Census due to concerted efforts towards spread of literacy. Literacy amongst the males was 24.83% and that amongst the females was 5.16% in 1961. According to the literacy of males the district was 25th in rank among the 26 districts of Maharashtra State including Greater Bombay. In respect of female literacy the district likewise ranked 26th, being the last. The highest literacy of 23.33% is found in Nanded taluka and lowest i.e. 12.14% is found in Bhokar Mahal. The percentage of literacy is higher in Nanded and Deglur talukas because of the large urban population of Nanded and Deglur towns in their respective talukas. In rural areas, Hadgaon taluka ranks first with 14.40% of literacy. In urban areas Kandhar taluka has the highest literacy both for males and females, their percentages being 51.56 and 22.52 respectively.

Table No. 50 :- The table gives distribution of rural population according to educational standards, as recorded in 1961 Census. In all 87.7% of the rural

population of the district was found illiterate. Amongst the literates in rural areas 8.9% were mere literates without any educational standard. A very negligible percentage of rural population i.e. 0.2% had education upto Matriculation and above. This indicates that the rural population in the district is far behind in education as compared to the urban population of the district.

Table No. 51 :- This table indicates the distribution of urban population according to educational standards in 1961 census. In all 67.7% of the urban population was illiterate. The percentage of literates without any educational standard was 16.8. Persons having educational standard upto primary and matriculation formed 12.5% and 2.4% respectively of the total urban population. The percentage of educated persons above matriculation was less in rural than that in the urban population of the district. The technical/and non-technical diploma holders formed 0.1% whereas graduates and post-graduates other than technical formed 0.3%. Technical graduates and post graduates formed 0.2% of the urban population. This indicates that a very negligible percentage of even urban population had successfully completed university education. This was due to the lack of sufficient higher educational institutions in the district particularly for technical diplomas and technical degrees and post graduations. In so far as provision of number of seats for technical training upto diploma level is concerned, Nanded district ranked 22nd in the districts of the State.

Table No. 52 :- This table gives data regarding the number of educational institutions, pupils and teachers in Nanded district in the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. In the year 1966-67 the pre-primary institutions remained the same as in 1965-66. In case of primary institutions and secondary institutions there has been increase of 1.94% and 7.62% respectively in their number, during the year 1966-67 over 1965-66. The higher institutions remained the same for both the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of special institutions decreased from 13 in 1965-66 to 12 in 1966-67. The number of boys and girls in pre-primary institutions and in special institutions decreased by 31.1% and 19.8% respectively during the year 1966-67 over 1965-66. However the number of boys and girls respectively increased in primary institutions by 5.8% and 2.7% in secondary institutions by 1.53% and 10.5% and in higher institutions by 31.2% and 43.0% in 1966-67 over 1965-66. Similarly, number of teachers in primary, secondary and higher institutions increased by 4.11% , 23.9% , 21.2% , respectively in 1966-67 over 1965-66.

Table No. 53 :- This table deals with the beneficiaries and the concessions to backward class in Nanded district during 1965-66 and 1966-67. The number of total backward class students enrolled increased from 62.3 thousands in 1965-66 to 69.3 thousands in 1966-67. Eventhough the number of students has increased the total concessions granted to them decreased from Rs.8.56 lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 7.95 Lakhs in 1966-67.

Table No. 54:- This table gives information regarding the concessions of free education granted to economically backward class students in Nanded district during the years 1961-62, 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The percentage of secondary students of economically backward classes who were benefited in 1966-67 was 16.42 whereas of the university students and others was 83.58. The percentages of grants to the secondary students and to the university and other students were 44.3% and 55.7% respectively in 1966-67.

Table No. 55 :- This table indicates the expenditure on primary education by way of grants in aid to the local bodies in Nanded district during 1966-67. The total grants given to Zilla Parishad during the year 1966-67 were Rs. 52.2 Lakhs whereas the grants in 1965-66 were Rs. 43.2 Lakhs. These grants were 20.74% higher than the grants in 1965-66.

Table No. 56 :- This table gives the classification of towns and villages without primary schools or schooling facilities by population range during 1966 and 1967. There were no towns without primary schools for both the years. At the end of March, 1967, total 50 villages each with less than 200 population had remained to be covered with schooling facilities. There was no village without schooling facility in Mukhed taluka of this district. These 50 villages, without schooling facility had remained to be covered probably due to non-availability of required number of students in them and existence of schooling facility in neighbouring villages.

9. Transport & Communication.

Table No. 57 :- This table indicates the length of the railway lines in Nanded district as on 31st March 1966 and 31st March 1967. The approximate average railway line per hundred sq.km. works out to 2.16 Km. and average railway line per lakh population works out to 20.78 Km. The Manmad-Hyderabad Railway line running through the Godawari valley connects Nanded town. The other branch line links up Mudkhed in Nanded taluka with Adilabad town of Andhra Pradesh. The Railway line passes through Nanded, Bhokar, Biloli, Hadgaon and Kinwat talukas. The remaining three talukas of Kandhar, Mukhed and Deglur do not have railway lines in them. Bhokar and Kinwat are the only two taluka headquarters linked with Nanded town by railway.

Table No. 58 :- This table indicates road length according to category of surfaces in Nanded district as on 31st March, 1961, 1966, 1967. This also includes the Municipal road in Nanded district. The total road length (excluding municipal road length) in the district at the end of 1966-67 was about 3 times the road length existed at the end of March, 1961. The relative increase in the state highway, major district roads, other district roads and village roads in 1966-67 over 1960-61 was 42.4%, 154.7%, 130.4% and 179.1% respectively. The average road length per 100 Sq. Km. worked out to 12.32 at the end of 1966-67 which was 3.87 Km. in 1960-61. The classification of extra municipal road length according to surface indicates that there was no

cement concret road upto the end of 1966-67. The black topped road covered 15.8%, water bound macadam road 44.5%, granular material road 31.1% and lower type roads 5.6% of the total road length of the district at the end of March, 1967. The total municipal road length in the district was 141.32 Kms. at the end of 1966-67 which was considerably higher than the 92.28 Km. road length at the end of 1960-61. The classification of municipal roads according to surface indicates that 6.9% cement concret road 11.2% black topped road 32.1% water bond macadam road, 11.2% granular material road 38.6% lower type of the total road length existed in the district.

Table No. 59 :- This table gives the data regarding the motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad Division as on 31.3.1966 and 31.3.1967. No separate data was available regarding the motor vehicles in operation in Nanded district. The vehicles in operation in the region increased in 1966-67 by 28.9% over its corresponding number in 1965-66. This increase was mainly due to the increase in motor cars, motor cycles, private lorries, and public carriages trailers, tractors. However there was slight reduction in the number of school buses, and petrol driven lorries.

Table No. 60 :- This table gives the operational statistics of the Nationalised Road Transport. During the year 1966-67 a separate Nanded division of the N.S.R.T was opened in the month of October, 1966. The data in col. 3 of the table for the year 1965-66 is shown for Aurangabad division as it also covered the area of

Nanded district. Since a separate Nanded division is formed with its head quarter at Nanded, figures in No. 4 are given for the newly formed Nanded division.

Table No. 61 :- This table gives data regarding traffic census on important roads in Nanded district on 7th March, 1965. This census was taken on state highways at 7 places on Nagpur-Tuljapur state highway at count post Hadgaon, Waranga, Ardhapur, Nanded, Sonhed, Loha and Malegaon in Nanded district. The census count posts on Nanded, Deglur State border road were at Nanded, Degaon, Narsi, Deglur and Hanegaon. The highest traffic of vehicles i.e. 2442 vehicles per day was found on Nagpur, Tuljapur road at Nanded. The percentages for light motor vehicles, medium and heavy motor vehicles and slow moving vehicles against the total vehicles at Nanded count post were found to be 6.4%, 23.9%, 69.7% respectively. The total traffic intensity per 24 hours of all vehicles including slow moving was 5500 at Nanded count post.

Table No. 62 :- This table gives information regarding number of post offices, telegraph offices, number of telephones in Nanded district during the years 1961-62, 1964-65, 1965-66 & 1966-67. The number of post offices, telegraph offices, and number of letter boxes increased by 9.7%, 166.6%, 20.7% respectively in 1966-67 over the corresponding figures in 1961-62. Number of telephones also rose in 1966-67 showing 73.9% increase over 1961-62 and the radio licences issued and renewed also rose by 187.2% over the same period.

Table No. 63 :- This table indicates the rural broadcasting statistics in Nanded district for the years 1965-66, 1966-67. Out of the total inhabited villages in the district 23.9% villages were provided with rural radios by the end of March, 1967 and these receiving sets served 14.5% of the rural population of the district. There were 90 radio forums in the district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67.

10. Local Bodies.

Table No. 64 :- This table indicates the income and expenditure of local bodies in Nanded district for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. By the end of 1966-67 all the villages in the district were covered by 1058 village Panchayats. The income and expenditure of the local bodies like village panchayats and Zilla Parishad were slightly less in the year 1966-67 than their income and expenditure in the year 1965-66. In case of Municipal Councils the total income in the year 1966-67 had considerably fallen but the expenditure had considerably risen. The decrease in the income of village Panchayats and Zilla Parishad in 1966-67 was of the order of 6.9%, 3.9% over 1965-66. Similarly the decrease in expenditure was of the order of 4.6%, 13.3%.

Table No. 65 :- This table indicates the Panchayat Samitiwise income and expenditure of village panchayats for the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total income of all the village panchayats in the district had fallen down from Rs. 41.20 Lakhs in

1965-66 to Rs. 38.33 Lakhs in 1966-67. Except the village panchayats in Mukhed the income of village Panchoyats in other panchayat samities of the district in 1966-67 were less than the income in 1965-66. Similarly in case of expenditure, the total expenditure of the village panchayat in the district had decreased from Rs.38.47 lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 36.69 Lakhs in 1966-67. The village panchayats, indicating reduction in the expenditure, were found in the panchayat samiti of Kinwat, Bhokar, Kandhar, Mukhed and Deglur.

Table No. 66 (A) :- This table gives the details of head-wise receipts of zilla Parishad, Nanded, for the year 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total revenue receipts in the year 1966-67 were less by about one lakh, compared to the revenue receipts in the year 1965-66. Similarly, the total grants received by zilla Parishad in the year 1966-67 were also less by about 47.55 lakhs than the grants of the year 1965-66. Hence the total revenue receipts of zilla Parishad, Nanded, in the year 1966-67 were 18.60% less than the revenue receipts in the year 1965-66. In the year 1966-67, out of the total revenue receipts of the zilla Parishad, Nanded, the government grants including agency schemes were 92.38% whereas the revenue receipts from self raised resources were only 7.62%.

Table No. 66(B) :- This table indicates the head-wise expenditure of zilla Parishad, Nanded, for the year 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total revenue

expenditure of Zilla parishad, Nanded, in the year 1966-67 was 14.89% less than the expenditure in the year 1965-66. This reduction of expenditure was noticed among the heads of agriculture, social welfare, community development programme, buildings and communication and miscellaneous. This was probably due to the reduction in government grants. The classification of expenditure in the year 1966-67 among different heads indicates that education covered 43.9%, building and communication 21.6%, general administration 8.1%, medical, public health and ayurvedic, 5.2%, agriculture and animal husbandry 5.1%, irrigation 4.6%, community development programme 4.2% and all other heads 7.3%.

Table No. 67 :- This table indicates income and expenditure of municipal councils in Nanded district for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total income of municipal councils in the district in the year 1966-67, had decreased by 20.75% over the income in the year 1965-66, whereas the total expenditure of municipal council in Nanded district increased by 29.87% in the year 1966-67 over the year 1965-66. The municipal councils which indicated decrease in income were Nanded and Deglur, whereas the increase in expenditure was indicated by all the municipal councils except Kandhar.

11. Planning and Community Development.

Table No. 68 :- This table gives the information regarding plan expenditure in Third Five Year Plan in the year 1966-67 under different sub-heads of development in Nanded dist. The total expenditure during the year 1966-67

On district level plan schemes was Rs. 267.78 lakhs., out of which Rs. 197.42 Lakhs were spent on the schemes implemented in state sector and Rs. 70.36 Lakhs on the schemes implemented in local sector. The distribution of plan expenditure among the major heads of development for the year 1966-67 indicates that agriculture programme accounted 35.02% co-operation and community development 9.71%, irrigation and power 22.85%, industries and mining 0.35%, transport and communication 17.85%, social services 14.11% and miscellaneous 0.11% of the total expenditure.

Table No. 69 :- This table furnishes the information for selected items of physical achievements under District Level schemes implemented in Nanded district during Third Five year Plan period and during 1966-67. Under agricultural development the programme of distribution of improved seed, improved agricultural implements, chemical fertilizers, etc. was taken-up in the district. As a part of soil conservation measures, substantial area was bunded. Similarly with a view to increase irrigation, ^{facilities} the minor irrigation programme was taken-up. The programme for development of animal husbandry, forest and fisheries was also taken-up in the district. The credit facilities through co-operative societies were provided under co-operation and extension services were continued through community development blocks. under Industrial development programme, loans and subsidies were granted

to small scale industries. Under road development programme construction of new roads and improvements of existing roads were under-taken. The programmes to increase the facilities in general education, technical education, medical and public health, water supply and drainage, housing, welfare of backward classes, labour and labour welfare were also taken-up in the district.

Table No. 70 :- This table indicates the position of C.D. programme in Nanded district as on 31.3.1967. There were no multipurpose development blocks or Tribal Development Block in Nanded district at the end of March, 1967. All the rural population of district was covered by C.D. programme. Only one block namely Kandhar was in stage-I which consisted of 2.00 C.P.A. pattern block. Similarly only one block namely Nanded was in post stage-II (Stage-III). All other blocks in the district were in stage-II.

Table No. 71 :- This table indicates the expenditure incurred in different stages of block in Nanded district upto the end of 1966-67. The total expenditure upto the end of 1966-67 on stage-I blocks was Rs. 13,035 thousands, on stage-II Rs. 3,040 thousands and on post stage-II (Stage-III) Rs. 310 thousands in Nanded district. The total expenditure, all type of blocks, upto the end of 1966-67 in Nanded district was Rs. 16,385 thousands.

Table No. 72 :- This table gives data regarding physical achievements on the selected items in all the U.P. Blocks of Nanded district for the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. During the year 1966-67 the area banded, area reclaimed, improved agricultural implements supplied, the number of animals artificially inseminated, pedigree bulls supplied, drinking water wells renovated, number of persons operated (under family planning) and houses built, increased compared to these achievements during the preceding year 1965-66. Other achievements indicated in the table decreased slightly in the year 1966-67 compared to the achievements in the year 1965-66.

12. Prices.

Table No. 73 :- This table indicates the average retail prices of important commodities at district head quarters, Nanded, for the years 1965 and 1966. In all 49 commodities are included in this table. The prices of rice and jowar are not given in the statement for the year 1965 and upto month of October, 1966 as these commodities were not available in open market. The prices of wheat in 1966, except for the months November and December, remained slightly higher than the prices in 1965, both for Bansi and Lal wheat. The average price of bajara in the year 1966 was higher than the average price in the year 1965. Among the pulses except arhar and masur dal the average price for the year 1966 for all other pulses remained higher than the prices in 1965. Similarly the prices of gur

remained considerably higher in 1966 over the corresponding prices in the year 1965. The prices of groundnut oil and vanaspati were remarkably higher in the year 1966 than the prices of these commodities in the year 1965. Among other oil, the prices, of milk, goat meat, fresh fish and eggs remained throughout the year higher in 1966 compared to the prices in 1965. The prices of dry chillies were about two times higher in 1966 than the prices in 1965. The prices of potato, onion, plantain, tea leaf, coffee powder, kerosin oil, charcoal, firewood, brass, washing soap, supari, tobacco, cigarette etc; also were comparatively higher in the year 1966, than the prices in 1965. In general the retail prices of majority of the commodities indicated in the table were higher in the year 1966 than the prices in the year 1965.

Table No. 74 :- This table indicates the consumers price index number for working classes in Nanded and Aurangabad, centre for the year 1966-67. The base period for revised services of consumer price index number was taken as 1961. At the end of March 1967, the consumer's price general index at Nanded centre was 160 and at Aurangabad centre it was 157. In general from January, 1966 the general index of consumer price indicated continuous increasing trend with the exception of March, 1967 at Aurangabad centre and at Nanded centre also. At Aurangabad centre consumer price general index increased from 142 in January 1966 to 165 in February, 1967 and decreased in

March, 1967 to 159. At Nanded centre however the rise was proportionately higher as the general index number rose from 140 in January 1966 to 163 in February 1967 and fell to 164 in March, 1967.

13. Miscellaneous

Table No. 75 :- This table indicates the strength of police force in Nanded district, for the year 1965 and 1966. In general there was no change in the total strength of police force in the district during the year 1966, as the total strength of police force remained 1,197 for both the years 1965 and 1966. Similarly there was no change in number of police stations, number of out posts, number of lock-ups in the year 1966. Cost of police force however slightly increased.

Table No. 76 :- This table indicates the crime statistics in Nanded district in 1965 and 1966. In this table the details regarding category-wise number of cognizable as well as non-cognizable offences registered, cases tried, and persons convicted or acquitted are shown for the years 1965-66. Majority of the cognizable offences which have taken place were from the categories of serious offences against the persons class III, offences against the state public tranquility, safety and justice class-II, serious and minor offences against persons and property class-IV, class V and Class VI and offences under special and local laws declared to be cognizable. Similarly, the offences from

non-cognizable crimes in the district were mainly from abetting commissions of non-cognizable offences by public, minor and serious offences against persons ~~class-III~~, class IV, class V and class VI and offences under other special and local laws not cognizable by the police. The total cognizable and non-cognizable offences registered in 1966 were 14.59% higher than the offences in 1965. Similarly the cases tried were 64.28% higher in 1966 than the cases tried in 1965. However, the persons acquitted were 13.62% less in the year 1966 than in the year 1965.

Table No. 77 :- This table indicates the data regarding the cases disposed off in civil and criminal Courts in Manded district in the year 1965 and 1966. In the civil side original regular cases decreased from 760 in 1965 to 750 in 1966 and the miscellaneous cases from 498 to 375. In civil appellate side however the regular cases disposed off increased from 109 in 1965 to 247 in 1966 and miscellaneous cases for 48 in 1965 to 82 in 1966. In criminal side original regular cases in 1966 had decreased considerably from 6,679 in 1965 to 2,132 in 1966. However, the miscellaneous cases increased from 534 in 1965 to 1,536 in 1966. Criminal appellate side regular cases increased from 265 in 1965 to 318 in 1966 and miscellaneous cases decreased from 117 in 1965 to 32 in 1966.

Table No. 78 :- This table indicates cinema statistics during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 in

Nanded district. Out of the 12 cinema theatres in 1965-66 one theatre was closed down in the year 1966-67 in Biloli taluka. Hence the total number of permanent theatres in 1966-67 was less by one and the seating capacity was reduced by 475 seats. However 4 new touring talkies were started in the district in the year 1966-67 - one in Kinwat, two in Biloli and one in Mukhed with total seating capacity 1,100.

Table No. 79 :- This table indicates number of banking offices in Nanded district at the beginning of 1967. Total number of scheduled banks in the district increased from 8 in 1965 to 9 in 1966 and the co-operative banks from 26 in 1965 to 31 in 1966. These banking offices were located at 31 urban and rural places in the district.

Table No.80 :- This table gives the information regarding number of Joint Stock Companies in Nanded district during the years 1961-62 and 1964-65. There was no change in the number of joint stock companies over the period from 1961-62 to 1964-65. Out of the two "Companies limited by shares", one was in public sector and the other was in private sector in both the years. Besides this there was only one company in public sector under the category of "Companies limited by guarantees and associations for project". The number of joint stock companies in the district appears to be considerably less probably due to industrial backwardness of the area.

Table No. 81 :- This table furnishes the information regarding the Life Insurance Policies issued and amount ensured in Nanded district. During the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. Number of policies issued in the district decreased from 2702 in 1965-66 to 2,122 in 1966-67, and the amount insured decreased from 1,03,19000 in 1965-66 to 83,85,000 in 1966-67.

Table No. 82 :- This table gives the amount of collection of small savings in Nanded district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. The gross collection of small saving decreased from Rs. 43.27 Lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 35.95 Lakhs in the year 1966-67. On the contrary the withdrawals in 1966-67 increased from Rs.36.92 Lakhs to Rs. 43.14 lakhs in 1966-67. As a result of this at the end of 1966-67 the net collection of small savings in the year 1966-67 (-)Rs.7.19 Lakhs.

Table No. 83 :- This table indicates land revenue collection in each taluka of Nanded district during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67. The total collection of land revenue increased in the district from Rs. 25.92 Lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 28.68 lakhs in 1966-67. This also reduced the arrears of land revenue from Rs. 5.28 Lakhs at the end of 1965-66 to Rs. 0.57 lakhs at the end of 1966-67. The land revenue collection in the district in the year 1966-67 were quite satisfactory against the demand of land revenue including previous arrears. There were no arrears of land revenue at the end of 1966-67 in talukas of Hadgaon, Bhokar,

Kandhar, Biloli and Mukhed. Maximum arrears of land revenue i.e. Rs. 35,775 were found in Kinwat taluka at the end of 1966-67.

Table No. 84 :- This table indicates the number of presses and news paper and periodicals printed at the end of March, 1967 in Nanded district. Out of the total 34 presses in the district at the end of March, 1967, 30 printing presses were located at Nanded and one each at Kinwat and Mukhed and two at Deglur. Only one Marathi daily news paper was published for Nanded town in the district. 5 weeklies, out of which 4 in Marathi and two in other languages, were published in the district. Two monthly periodicals one each in Marathi and Hindi were also published in the district for Nanded town.

Table No. 85 :- This table indicates the statistics relating to general election held in 1967 in Nanded district. There was only one parliamentary constituency in Nanded district namely Nanded Parliamentary constituency and 55.96% votes of the total electorate were polled in the general election of 1967 for the parliamentary constituency. There were seven assembly constituencies in the district namely, Kinwat, Hadgaon, Nanded, Bhokar, Kandhar, Biloli, and Deglur. In general 52.82% votes were polled in the assembly constituencies. The highest percentage of votes polled i.e. 69.03% were in Kinwat constituency whereas lowest percentage of votes polled i.e. 33.01% was in Deglur constituency.

Table No. 86 :- This table gives data on selected indicators in Nanded district for the years 1950-51, 1955-56, 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67. The data on livestock and agriculture implements indicated in the table is related to the livestock census 1956, 1961 and 1966 and was shown against the corresponding years 1955-56, 1960-61 and 1965-66 respectively. The figures under agriculture and irrigation given in hectares up to the year 1963-64 are calculated by using conversion factor 1 Acre = 0.405 Hectare where as the figures on these items for the year 1964-65 onwards are shown by using the conversion factor 1 Acre = 0.404586 Hectare. As the earlier figures were already published the figures upto the year 1963-64 were not changed. Wherever the figures are not available, N.A. is written.

CHAPTER NO. III

NOTES ON SELECTED ITEMS.

Item No. 1:- Percentage of gross sown area to net sown area for the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

1.1. During the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66, there has been continuous increase in the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in the district, as this percentage increased from 102.26 in 1960-61 to 103.37 in 1964-65 and 103.61 in 1965-66. The taluka-wise percentages of gross sown area to net area sown indicate considerable variations. The following table indicates the taluka-wise percentages of gross sown area to net area for the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

2.2. In general the year 1965-66 was not a good year for agricultural production in the district, as the agricultural production in the year was very much lower than the agricultural production in the year 1960-61. particularly production of food grains in the year 1965-66 decreased by 31.78% over the production in 1960-61. This decrease in production was mainly due to the decrease in production of Rice, Wheat, Jowar, other cereals, Tur and other pulses. Only the production of gram indicated 14.83% increase in 1965-66 over the production in 1960-61. Other food crops and non-food crops also indicated

decrease in production in 1965-66 over 1960-61, their percentages of decrease being, Sugarcane (25.74), Groundnut (11.67), Cotton (31.39), and Castor seed (50.74).

Item No. 3:- Gross value of Agricultural production.

3.1. Agriculture is the main source of income for the population of Nanded district. Hence the changes in the Agricultural production and its value influenced the economic conditions of the population.

3.2. The gross value of Agricultural produce in the 1960-61 at the prices prevailing in 1960-61 was Rs. 16.05 crores and in the year 1965-65 and 1965-66 at the prices prevailing in those years was Rs. 20.20 crores and Rs. 19.64 crores respectively. The gross value of Agricultural production in the district had increased by 25.87% in 1964-65 and 22.36% in 1965-66 over 1960-61. The per capita gross value of Agricultural production in the district worked out to Rs. 149.00 Rs. 187.00 and Rs. 182.00 respectively in the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66 at prices prevailing in the respective years.

Item No. 4:- percentage of Gross irrigated area to Net irrigated area.

4.1. The taluka-wise percentages of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in the years 1960-61, 1964-65, and 1965-66 are indicated in the following table.

4.2. The above table indicates considerable variations in the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area over the years. In general, the percentage of gross irrigated and to net irrigated area has decreased in the district over the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66, even though the net irrigated area in the district has increased considerably. The probable reasons for this decrease in the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area are the growing tendency of the cultivators to grow perinial crops to some extent on one hand and to increase the area under irrigation rather than irrigating the same area more than once on the other.

Item No. 5:- Changes in crop pattern.

5.1. During the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66 the area sown both under food crops and non-food crops had increased considerably in the district. The following table shows the area under food crops, non-food crops and irrigated area under food and non-food crops in the district separately for the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

5.2. The above indicates that the food crops it accounts for dominate the cropping of this district, as/about 67 to 68% of the gross cropped area of the district, and only 32 to 33% area is under non-food crops. In general during the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66, there have not been practically any variations in the cropping pattern of the district.

5.3 Among the irrigated crops also about 99% of the irrigated crops are the food crops. Area benefitted by irrigation under non-food crops is quite insignificant.

Item No. 6:- Increase in Agricultural credit, out standing dues and gross values of Agricultural produce.

6.1 Agricultural credit is continuously increasing in the district due to active participation of the Co-operatives in financing the rural credit needs and growing consciousness among the agriculturists to improve the agricultural conditions by investing more funds in agriculture. With the increase in agricultural credit, the out-standing dues also increased over the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66. The gross value of agricultural production during the same period increased by 22.36% in 1965-66 over 1960-61. However, the value of agricultural produce decreased slightly from Rs. 20.20 crores in 1964-65 to Rs. 19.64 crores in 1965-66.

6.2 The details of agricultural credit, out standing dues and gross value of agricultural production in the district during the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66 are shown in the following table.

6.3. During the period from 1960-61 to 1965-66, the agricultural credit has increased by more than four times and out-standing dues by more than five times in the year 1965-66 over 1960-61. However, the gross value of agriculture production has indicated only 22.36% increase in 1965-66 over 1960-61. In 1960-61, the agricultural credit was 5.14% of the gross value of agricultural production in that year, where as it was 10.11% in 1964-65 and 13.87% in 1965-66. The percentage of out-standing dues to agricultural credit was ~~93.37%~~ 140.54% and 116.05% respectively in the years 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

Item No. 7:- Agricultural wage-rates.

7.1. The agricultural wage-rates for the field labourers as well as skilled labourers employed for different agricultural operations were collected in the district at three centres namely (1) Ardhapur, in Nanded taluka, (2) Loha in wandhar taluka and (3) Bhokar in Bhokar taluka since 1963. The agricultural wage-rates in the district at all the three selected centres indicated considerable variation during the third Five Year Plan period.

7.2. The following table gives the details of average wage-rates for the years 1963 to 1966 at Ardhapur centre in Nanded taluka of the district.

However the average wage-rates of unskilled agricultural labourers like field labour, other agricultural labour and herdsman indicated increase except in case of female field labour.

7.4. The above table indicates that except carpenters the average wage-rates of skilled labourers like black smiths and cobblers had remained constant in the district. The average wage-rates of carpenters had shown a slight increase from Rs. 3.00 in 1963 to Rs. 3.50 in 1965. The average wage-rates for field labourers and other agricultural labourers had also shown increasing trend excepting female field labour. The average wage-rates of herdsmen had remained unchanged over the period from 1963 to 1965.

8.1. The Live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in the district was 1.17 in the year 1960-61 and it increased to 1.19 in the year 1965-66

8.3. Considerable variations are observed in the live-stock per hectare of cultivable land among different talukas of this district both in 1960-61 and 1965-66 because of different strength of live-stock and cultivable area in the talukas. Kandhar taluka had the highest number i.e. 1.54 of live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in 1960-61 whereas Hadgaon taluka with 0.83 live-stock per hectare of cultivable area had the

lowest. In the year 1965-66 Nanded taluka with 1.45 live-stock per hectare of cultivable area had the highest number of live-stock per hectare, whereas Bhokar taluka with 0.93 was the lowest. The talukas of Nanded, Kandhar, Biloli, Mukhed and Deglur had more than one, whereas Kinwat, Hadgaon and Bhokar had less than one live-stock per hectare of cultivable area in the year 1965-66.

Item No. 9:- Poultry compared to population.

9.2. The number of poultry per lakh of population in the district had decreased from 14,860 in 1961 to 8,037 in 1966. This indicates that in general the number of poultry had fallen down considerably over the period of 1961 to 1966.

9.2. In 1961, the highest number of poultry per lakh of population was 18,311 in Bhokar taluka which was more than the district number per lakh of population and the lowest as 3,701 in Kinwat taluka. The talukas Mukhed, Nanded, Deglur, Biloli, Hadgaon, Kandhar and Kinwat having 14,616, 14,526, 13,529, 13,130, 8,842, 5,873, and 3,701 poultry per lakh of population respectively indicated less number of poultry per lakh of population than the district number per lakh of population.

9.3. In 1966, the highest number of poultry per lakh of population was 9,590 in Mukhed taluka and the lowest 1,289 in Kinwat taluka. The talukas of Mukhed, Kandhar, and Hadgaon having 9,590, 8,791 and 8,310 poultry per lakh of population respectively had

more number of poultry than the district number per lakh of population, where as the talukas of Nanded, Deglur, Bhokar, Piloli and Kinwat with 7,278, 6,741, 6,131, 5,420 and 1,289 poultry per lakh of population respectively had less than the district number of poultry per lakh of population.

Item No. 10:- Per Capita consumption of electricity.

10.1. Per capita consumption of electricity in Nanded district increased from 1.49 KWH in 1960-61 to 5.02 KWH in 1965-66 and 5.78 KWH in 1966-67. This indicates that there has been about 4 times increase in per capita consumption of electricity in the district over the period 1960-61 to 1966-67. This increase was due to implementation of urban and rural electrification programme in the district during Third Five Year Plan period and thereafter. More electric power was made available during this period both for agricultural and industrial purposes, due to which the per capita consumption of electricity increased in the district.

Item No. 11:- Candidates enrolled in Employment Exchanges.

11.1. The number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange in Nanded district increased from 7,094 in 1960-61 to 8,547 in 1965-66 and 8,504 in 1966-67. Thus the enrollment of candidates in Employment Exchange in Nanded district increased by 5.77% in 1966-67 over 1960-61.

11.2. The number of vacancies notified with the Employment Exchange in the district, however, decreased from 1,130 in 1960-61 to 996 in 1965-66 and ^{1,011} in 1966-67 indicating 11.86% decrease in 1965-66 and 10.53% decrease in 1966-67 over 1960-61. The number of vacancies notified per lakh of population also fell from 105 in 1960-61 to 92 in 1965-66 and 94 in 1966-67.

Item No. 12.- Increase in in-door and out-door patients treated in Hospitals dispensaries and Primary Health centres in the year 1960, 1965 and 1966.

12.1. The number of in-door patients treated in the Hospitals, Dispensaries and Primary Health Centres considerably increased in the district in 1966 compared to the number in 1960. Similarly the number of out-door patients treated in the above institutions in 1966 indicated considerable rise over the number in 1960. In the year 1960 the highest number of in-door patient treated was in Nanded taluka, whereas the lowest was in Kandhar taluka. The reasons for the highest number of in-door patients in Nanded taluka in 1960 was that both the hospitals were located in Nanded town of Nanded taluka. The reasons for the lowest number of in-door patients treated in Kandhar taluka was that upto 1960 there was no Primary Health Centre in that taluka and that only one dispensary was functioning at Kandhar in Kandhar taluka.

12.2. In 1966, the highest number of in-door patients treated was recorded by Nanded taluka, whereas the lowest number was found in Deglur taluka.

12.3. The highest number of out-door patients treated in 1960 was recorded by Nanded taluka, whereas the lowest number was indicated in Kandhar taluka. Similarly in 1966, the highest number of out-door patients treated was recorded by Nanded taluka and the lowest by Deglur taluka.

Item No. 13.- Increase in the number of students in different categories (Boys and Girls separately).

13.1. The implementation of plan schemes of general education during Third Five Year Plan and there after resulted in increasing the number of educational institutions and number of students of all categories.

13.2. The following indicates the position of educational institutions and students in Nanded district during the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

13.3. It is evident from the above table that the educational institutions 1) Primary 2) Secondary, 3) Higher and 4) Special increased in the district by 54.53%, 126.79%, 66.67% and 50.00% respectively in 1966-67 in the district over 1960-61. Similarly together with the opening of new educational institutions, the strength of students, boys as well as girls increased considerably both in new and existing schools except the strength of girl students in special schools. The highest percentage increase of 235.33 in the number of boys was registered in higher institutions, whereas the highest percentage increase of 266.16 in the number of girls in secondary schools in the year 1966-67 over 1960-61.

13.4. In the secondary education more than 100% increase was recorded both in the number of institutions and students over the period 1960-61 to 1966-67.

In case of primary and secondary schools the percentage increase in the number of girls in 1966-67 over 1960-61 out-numbered the percentage increase in the number of boys over the same period. This shows that proportionately more girls started attending primary and secondary schools during the period from 1960-61 to 1966-67. However the percentage increase in the number of girls attending higher institutions, i.e. 169.81 in 1966-67 over 1960-61 still remained far behind the corresponding percentage increase of 265.33 of the boys attending higher institutions over the same period.

Item No. 14:- Increase in Road-Mileage per 100 Sq. Km. in 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1966-67.

14.1. The Road-mileage in the district per 100 Sq. Km. increased considerably from 3.79 Kms in 1960-61 to 11.26 Kms in 1965-66 and to 11.66 Kms. in 1966-67. This increase in road mileage was contributed by the implementation of road development programme in the district during Third Five Year Plan period and there after.

14.2. In 1960-61 the highest road length per 100 Sq. Km. was 6.37 Km. in Nanded taluka, where as the lowest 1.08 Km. was in Kinwat taluka. The talukas of Nanded, Biloli, Kandhar and Bhokar having road length per 100 Sq. Km. as 6.37 Km., 6.16 Km., 6.08 Km., and 4.81 Km. respectively were having more than the district road length per 100 Sq. Km. But the talukas of Hadgaon Deglur, Mukhed and Kinwat with road length per 100 Sq. Km. of 2.61 Km., 2.13 Km., 1.10 Km. and 1.08 Km. respectively were having less than the road length per 100 Sq. Km. in the district.

12.3. In 1966-67 Bhokar taluka recorded the highest road length per 100 Sq. Km. as 18.63 Km., where as the lowest 3.37 Km. was found in Mukhed taluka. The talukas of Bhokar, Pileli, Nanded, Deglur and Kandhar with the road length per 100 Sq. Km. as 18.63 Km., 17.51 Km., 15.63 Km., 15.35 Km. and 12.73 Km. respectively had more road length than the district road length per 100 Sq. Km., where as the talukas of Hadgaon, Kinwat and Mukhed having the road length per 100 Sq. Km. as 10.07 Km., 4.72 Km. and 3.37 Km. respectively had the less road length than the district road length per 100 Sq. Km.

14.4. The average road length per 100 Sq. Km. for Maharashtra State was 16 Km. in 1965-66 and 17 Km. in 1966-67, which was much higher than the district road length per 100 Sq. Km. over the same period in Nanded district.

Item No. 15:- Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population.

15.1. The total number of Bank offices in the district increased from 16 in the year 1960-61 to 34 in the year 1965-66 and 40 in the year 1966-67.

15.2. In the year 1960-61, the number of Bank offices per lakh of population in the district was one whereas in 1965-66 it was 3 and in 1966-67 it was 4. In the year 1966-67 none of the talukas in the district had less than 3 bank offices per lakh of population. Nanded taluka having 5 bank offices per lakh of population had the largest number of bank offices in the district. The talukas

of Kinwat and Mukhed had 4 bank offices per lakh of population and the remaining talukas namely Hadgaon, Bhokar, Kandhar, Biloli and Deglur had 3 bank offices each per lakh of population. The increase in Banking facilities is mostly contributed by opening of new branches of Nanded District Central Co-operative Bank in rural areas.

Item No. 16.- Prices.

16.1. In general the retail prices of all most all the commodities indicated increasing trend in the district in the year 1966 as compared to the prices in 1962.

16.2. The following table indicates the average retail prices of important commodities for the years 1962 and 1966 at District Head Quarter Nanded together with the increase or decrease in prices 1966 over 1962.

16.3. It is evident from the above table that the price level in 1966, in general, was considerably higher than the price level in the year 1962. Prices of all the commodities except salt, turmeric and onion were higher in the year 1966 compared to the prices in 1962. More than 100% increase was recorded by wheat, gram(whole), gram dal, groundnut oil and eggs. The prices of the remaining commodities indicated increase between 1 to 100%

CHAPTER - IV

PLANNING.

Part-I.

The year 1966-67 assumes particular importance in the era of planning in the country, as it is the year in which the Third Plan Programme came to an end and formulation of Fourth Plan started. After fifteen years of planning it was necessary to review our past achievements and to revise our plan strategy for the future period having full regard to the changed atmosphere and the gaps in the past planning. The revision in plan strategy was also necessary in view of hostilities with two neighbours China and Pakistan, the droughts and crop failure in some parts of our country, suspension of external credits etc. Hence the Fourth Plan formulation started with a view to consolidate and carry forward the achievements of the three earlier Plans, make up for their short falls as far as practicable and to prepare the grounds for a self reliant economy to be attained by the end of the Fifth Plan. In the year 1966-67 the Fourth Plan for the country was finalised. Hence Annual Plan for the year 1966-67 was prepared with a view to sustain the process of development and to prepare ground for starting the programme of Fourth Five Year plan. Government of Maharashtra also prepared the Annual Plan, 1966-67 keeping in view the main objectives of the long term planning.

2. In the Annual Plan, 1966-67 most of the

Schemes from Third Plan were continued and some of the new schemes were introduced. The total expenditure on the District Level Schemes of Annual Plan, 1966-67 in Nanded district was Rs. 267.78 Lakhs. The total expenditure on district level schemes in the Third Plan was of the order of 545.70 Lakhs. This indicates that the expenditure in the year 1966-67 on the district level plan schemes was about 49% of the total expenditure of the district level schemes in the Third Plan.

3. The total expenditure on different heads of development on district level schemes in Nanded district during the year 1966-67 was as under:-

3. Out of the total expenditure during 1966-67, 73.72% expenditure was incurred on the schemes in State sector and 26.28% on schemes in local sector. The classification of expenditure into different heads indicates that agricultural programme accounted for 35.02%, Co-operation and community development covered 9.71%, irrigation and power covered 22.85%, industries & minning covered 0.35%, transport & communication covered 17.85%, social services covered 14.11% and miscellaneous head covered 0.11%.

The agricultural programme received highest priority in the Annual Plan, 1966-67.

Agricultural Programmes.

4. The agricultural programme included the following sub-heads of development:

In agricultural programmes 81.12% expenditure was incurred on schemes in state Sector and 18.88% on schemes in local sector. Major portion of expenditure was incurred on the scheme of minor irrigation (51.14%), soil conservation (32.97%) and agricultural production (12.10%).

The expenditure on other sub-heads of agricultural programme was ayacut development programme (0.32%), animal husbandry (0.35%), forests (0.27%), fisheries (0.15%) and ware-housing (0.70%). No district level schemes was implemented in Manded district from sub-heads land development & Dairy development. The schemes under agricultural production mostly aim at popularising the improved agricultural practices such as improved seeds, use of chemical fertilizers, insecticides and pesticides, use of improved agricultural implements and use of intensive and improved methods of cultivation etc., for increasing agricultural production. The programme of soil conservation was undertaken with the purpose of stopping the soil erosion and increasing the moisture in the land. The minor irrigation programme was taken with a view to provide quick irrigation facilities to the cultivators as major and medium projects generally take considerable period for their completion. The schemes under animal husbandry were implemented with the object of preserving the live stock and improving the breeds of animals in the district. The forest development programme was planned with a view to increase the plantation of valuable trees afforestation for soil conservation,

development of woodlands and pastures and forest communication in the district. The programme of fisheries development was taken up with the object of increasing fish production by stocking the tanks with carp fry on one hand and by providing assistance to fisherman through loans and supply of fishery requisits on the other. The programme under warehousing and marketing provided financial assistance to market committees for developing necessary facilities such as market yards.

Co-operation & Community Development

Under this head following two sub-heads were included.

5. Under sub-head co-operation the development of co-operative structure at all levels is intended to strengthen the isolated sectors of economy with a view to make them compatible with more organized sectors. Co-operation in rural areas is particularly emphasized with the purpose of inculcating the spirit of self help among the cultivators in villages and providing for their credit needs and other requirements such as marketing storage of food grains etc. on co-operative basis. The schemes under Community Development Programme aimed at socio economic development of rural population in the district. All the schemes under sub-head co-operation were implemented in state sector whereas all the schemes under sub-head community development were implemented in local sector.

III. Irrigation & Power.

6. No district level schemes under sub-head irrigation were implemented in Nanded district. Only one scheme namely the scheme of Rural Electrification was implemented in Nanded district from the sub-head Power projects. The total expenditure of Rs. 61.10 Lakhs was incurred on the scheme of rural electrification.

IV. Industry & Mining:

7. Under this head only two schemes from sub-head small scale industries were implemented in Nanded district. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 0.94 lakhs the expenditure of Rs. 0.72 lakhs was incurred on the

scheme in state sector and 0.25 lakhs on the schemes implemented in local sector. The schemes under this sub-head aimed at development of small scale and cottage industries in the district.

V. Transport & Communication.

8. Under this head the schemes from the sub-head road development only was implemented in the district. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 47.80 Lakhs incurred on road development Rs. 23.10 Lakhs were spent on the schemes implemented in State Sector and Rs. 24.70 Lakhs were spent on the schemes implemented in local sector. The schemes of road development were taken up with a view to increase the road length in the district, improvement in the existing roads and provision of bridges and culverts.

VI. social Services.

9. Planned development aims at all sided development of the society. Together with the development of economy, social standard is also required to be developed so as to stabilise the fruits accrued through economic development for the welfare and well being of the society. Hence the development of social services with a view to educate the masses and to provide them better medical, housing and other facilities to foster required standard social atmosphere is essential. The following sub-heads under the social services were included during the year 1966-67.

10. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 37.78 Lakhs on this head the schemes implemented in the state sector covered 67.10% and the schemes implemented by the local sector covered 32.90% of the expenditure. It is evident from the above table that the major portion of the expenditure was covered by the sub-head water supply and drainage (24.80%), public health (23.21%), technical education (22.31%) and education (14.06%) whereas the remaining sub-heads Medical & nursing, urban development, welfare of backward classes, social welfare and labour and labour welfare, covered 0.37%, 0.55%, 7.97%, 1.11%, 0.48% and 5.11% respectively. The schemes under sub-head General education provided for expansion of educational facilities such as increase in number of schools, number of classes in existing schools, number of teachers, construction of school buildings and training of teachers etc; Schemes under sub-head technical education provided the continuation of polytechnic and provision of polytechnic buildings and polytechnic hostel. Under the sub-head Medical & Nursing one blood bank was functioning in civil hospital, Nanded. The schemes under sub-head public health aimed at providing health and sanitation facilities and programme of eradicating the diseases like malaria, T.B., small pox etc. The programme of family planning was also implemented under this sub-head. Under the schemes of urban development loans were advanced to municipal councils for development of civic amenities. The schemes under water supply and

drainage were implemented with the object of supplying adequate and wholesome and safe drinking water in the urban areas as well as in rural areas by piped water supply schemes. The housing programme taken up in the district aimed at providing housing facilities for the persons belonging to low income ^{groups} and assistance for developing village housing and provision of house sites by extension of gaothans. The socio economic uplift of backward classes was furthered by implementation of the schemes of the welfare of the backward classes, only one scheme of the welfare extension projects was continued in the district under the sub-head Social Welfare. This scheme provided the programme for women and child welfare. Under the sub-head Labour & Labour welfare, one technical and vocational training institute was functioning in the district which provided training facilities to the industrial workers.

VII. Miscellaneous

11. Under this head only one scheme from the sub-head Information & Publicity was implemented in the district and expenditure of Rs. 0.29 Lakhs was incurred on the schemes of Rural Broad-Casting, during the year 1966-67.

PLANNING

PART-II

1. Primary aim of planned development is to achieve maximum physical targets in a given time. In the earlier part of this chapter, the financial achievements during the year 1966-67 of various developmental schemes are discussed in detail. In the following paras an effort is made to indicate the physical achievements in different sectors as a result of implementation of district level schemes in Nanded district during the year 1966-67.

2. Agricultural Production:- The schemes under this sub-head implemented with the object of increasing agricultural production. One agricultural school continued functioning to provide facilities for agricultural training. The school conducts two years diploma course in agriculture and about 50 candidates are trained for every year. Besides this the programme of training to farmers of short duration was also taken up and 1,200 farmers were trained. With a view to propagate improved agricultural practices, intensive and extensive programme of cultivation was undertaken, and 29,160 acres of area was brought under intensive and extensive practices for oil seed development, and 1,32,500 acres of area was brought under intensive cultivation of food crops. The scheme of horticultural development was implemented with a view to making better

use of land and improving the incomes of agriculturists. Under this scheme 440 acres additional plantation of fruit trees and rejuvenation of fruit trees in 605 acres was achieved. The scheme of development of local manurial resources was undertaken during the year 1966-67, and 4,378 tonnes of local manure was prepared and 372 acres area was brought under green manuring. The programme of plant protection measures was also undertaken with a view to protect the crops against various pests and diseases and 708 sprayers, 340 dusters were supplied to the cultivators for protection of crops. Under the package programme for development of cotton, 58,972 acres area was covered and 1,58,750 acres area was brought under transplanted cotton under well irrigation.

3. Soil Conservation:- Soil conservation programme was undertaken in the district with the object of stopping the soil erosion and increasing moisture retention in the land. During the year 1966-67, an area of 57,176 acres in completed bunding units was bunded. Mostly the graded bunding only is done in the district.

4. Minor Irrigation:- For providing adequate and quick irrigation facilities to the cultivators the programme under minor irrigation was undertaken in the district. Under this programme loans were advanced for construction of irrigation wells and for installation of pumping sets. During the year 1966-67 753 irrigation wells were constructed and 356 pumping sets

were installed. 28 new minor irrigation tanks and 33 bandharas were also constructed and additional irrigation potential of 3,160 acres was created under these tanks and bandharas. To improve the existing conditions of well irrigation 7 bores were taken, depth of 246 feet was effected in different wells, and 23,297 shots by air compressors drilling and blasting were performed.

5. Animal Husbandry:- The schemes of animal husbandry were implemented in the district with the purpose of providing veterinary aid through veterinary dispensaries and aid centres, popularising improved breeds of animals and poultry and preserving the animals from ailments and diseases by preventive and curative vaccination and inoculation programmes. During the year 1966-67, one veterinary dispensary building was constructed. Under the schemes of cattle breeding centres started in Third Five Year Plan period efforts to develop pure breed bulls and cows were made. The services by the bulls provided under premium bull scheme were also continued with a view to improve the breeding of cattle.

6. Forests:- The programme under this sub-head was undertaken with a view to increase plantation of valuable trees, afforestation for soil conservation, development of wood lands and pastures and forest communication in the district. Plantation of general utility timber was undertaken on 230 Hectares under pre-mansoom plantation programme. Similarly, fuel wood

plantation was undertaken on 120 Hectares. For plantation programme one central nursery was maintained and continued during the year 1966-67. Under bamboo plantation programme 300 Hectares area was covered. Afforestation for soil conservation was undertaken on 238 Hectares. Under the schemes of development of wooden resources plantation on 50 Hectares area was done. Construction of forest road was undertaken to the extent of 4.80 Kms. during the year 1966-67 under the scheme of forest communication. With a view to provide facilities to the forest labourers, one drinking water well was constructed.

7. Fisheries:- Under this sub-head schemes of increasing inland fishery production by stocking the tanks with carp fry and providing assistance to the fishermen were implemented in the district. As a assistance to the fishermen 15.59 Kg. nylon twine was supplied to the fishermen and Rs. 2,250 were granted as loan to the fishermen and to the fishery co-operatives. One fishery co-operative society was established during the year 1966-67. The tanks in the district were stocked with 2,06,429 carp fry and 28,527 Kg. fish was netted. The co-operative fishery societies were assisted with subsidy and two societies with share capital.

8. Warehousing and Marketing:- Under this sub-head schemes for development of agricultural marketing were implemented. Financial assistance was given by way of loans to two market committees for

providing necessary facilities in the market yard. Similarly subsidies were also granted to 10 market committees.

9. Co-operation:- The object of the scheme provided under this sub-head was to increase number of co-operative societies of credit and other type and their membership with a view to cover every village in the district and every cultivator in a village. The co-operative societies as a source of providing short term, medium term and long term credit needs of the rural area, had advanced Rs. 141.66 lakhs long term credit and 418.49 lakhs medium and short term credit to the cultivators during the year 1966-67. One branch of central co-operative bank was also opened. Membership of co-operative societies was increased by 4,034 during the year 1966-67. The managerial subsidy was granted to 3 new primary societies. Subsidy and loans for rural godown were sanctioned to 20 societies. Similarly, subsidy and loans to 7 medium godowns and 10 large godowns were sanctioned.

10. Community Development.:- Under this sub-head community development blocks were continued in the district and the works of local development were undertaken. Under the programme of local development works 64 drinking water wells were constructed, and 52 drinking water wells were constructed under rural works programme. Grants were paid to 62 village Panchayats. During the year 1966-67 one applied nutrition

block was opened at Mandi in the district. Under programme of this block all round development for supplying nutrition food particularly to expectant and nursing mothers and school going children with special attention to production of protective foods like poultry, fisheries, fruits and vegetables was undertaken. The activities under the programme include poultry, pisciculture, horticulture, dairy development and common kitchen-cum-demonstration centres to feed the eligible beneficiaries in the village. The objectives of the programme are in brief, to ensure normal growth during formative years and a basic minimum expectancy of life; to increase the resistance of the people to diseases and to create health and nutrition consciousness amongst them.

11. Irrigation and Power:-

Power Projects:

From this head one scheme from sub-head Power Projects was implemented in the district. Under the scheme of rural electrification 120 villages were electrified during the year 1966-67. Similarly with a view to provide better irrigation facilities to the agriculturists 793 electric pumping sets were installed.

12. Industries and Mining:

Small Scale Industries:

The development programme for small scale industries implemented in the district aimed at assisting the artisans, crafts-men, persons engaged in traditional and cottage industries and handicrafts for their

individual development and development of such industries on co-operative basis. Under this programme four industrial co-operative societies were organised. Additional subsidy was granted to 13 societies. Subsidy granted to one central financial agency. Loan for purchase of shares was granted to 48 societies. One society was assisted for opening depots. Assistance was given for construction of 35 tenements. Rebate was given to 9 societies. Loan for purchase of shares was given to 55 societies and share capital was provided to 9 industrial co-operatives.

13. Transport and Communication:-

Road Development:

Under this sub-head the construction of district roads, construction of rural roads and construction of C.D. works were undertaken. During the year 1966-67 40.20 miles district roads were constructed, and 19.25 miles rural roads were constructed. Similarly, 17 C.D. works were also constructed in the year 1966-67.

14. Social Services:-

General Education:

The schemes under general education provided for expanding the educational facilities. During the year 1966-67, 7,100 additional pupils were covered under normal expansion of primary schools, and 179 additional teachers were appointed. Under the scheme of basic training to the primary teachers 555 teachers

were trained. 31 class rooms were constructed under school building programme for providing additional classes in Government Secondary Schools, 54 additional classes were opened and 54 teachers were appointed. 55 sets of scholarships in secondary schools were issued. Special facilities to girl students in schools were provided. Scholarships were issued for 334 girls. As a measure to improve science education at elementary stage 5 schools were improved. Under the scheme of development of non-government secondary schools, assistance for development was provided to 7 schools.

Technical Education:-

Under this sub-head one polytechnic with intake capacity of 60 students continued functioning during the year 1966-67. The expenditure of Rs. 1.900 lakhs was incurred for the purchase of equipments during the year 1966-67. The construction of polytechnic building and polytechnic hostel building was also in progress.

Medical & Nursing:-

Under this sub-head one scheme of expanding facilities in Civil Hospitals was implemented in the district. Under this scheme one blood bank continued functioning in Civil Hospital, Nanded.

Public Health:-

Under public health programme 6 primary health centre quarters at Unri were constructed. Under the scheme of national malaria eradication programme 110 positive cases were detected and treated. The

programme of small pox eradication was also undertaken and 92% population was covered by re-vaccination against small pox. Under the Family Planning programme 533 sterilization operations were performed and 4,875 cases of I.U.C.D. were conducted during the year 1966-67.

Water supply and drainage:

Under this sub-head municipal piped water supply schemes at Dharmabad, Kinwat, Kandhar and augmentation of water supply scheme were under construction in the year 1966-67. The drainage scheme at Nanded was also in progress. Under the programme of water supply to village panchayats piped water supply scheme at Loha, Naigaon, Malkautha and Sankhed were in progress.

Housing:

Under this sub-head village housing project scheme was undertaken in local sector and 58 houses were constructed. Similarly streets and drains to the extent of two hundred Sq. feet were provided in those villages. Under the scheme extension of village gaathans and provision of house site 65 villages were covered in the district and 280 acres and 13 gunthas area was acquired for provision of house site.

Urban development:

Under this sub-head the scheme of financial assistance to municipal council for basic amenities was undertaken and two municipal councils were assisted during the year 1966-67.

Backward class welfare:-

Under this sub-head different schemes of backward class welfare were undertaken in the district. Under the scheme of grant of scholarship tuition fees and examination fees to students, 7 scheduled tribe students 150 scheduled caste students and 33 other backward class students were assisted. Grants to backward class hostels were given to 5 scheduled tribe hostels, 5 scheduled caste hostels and 2 other backward class hostels. Similarly, grants to 4 cosmopolitan hostels were also given. As a measure to propagate improved agricultural implements 27 scheduled caste persons were assisted. Under the programme of grant of loan cum subsidies for cottage industries and professions to individuals 10 persons from scheduled caste and one person from other backward class were assisted. Grant of loan cum subsidy for purchase of milk cattle was given to 2 scheduled caste persons and one other backward class person. Two drinking water wells were also constructed for other backward classes. Under special facilities Vimukta Jaties 8 implements were distributed, 5 artisans were aided, and two milk cattle were supplied. Under the programme of education facilities to Vimukta Jaties 6 scholarships were awarded and one Sanskar Kendra was opened.

Social Welfare:-

Under this sub-head only one scheme of welfare extension project was implemented in the

district, with the object of extending welfare services to women and children in rural areas. Under this scheme 26 Balwadies 9 literacy classes 7 mathematic centres and 6 Arts and Craft centres were functioning during the year 1966-67.

Labour and Labour Welfare:-

Under this sub-head only one scheme of technical and vocational training institute was implemented in the district. Under this scheme one technical and vocational training class and one industrial training institute was functioning at Nanded. The construction of the building of the technical and vocational training institute was in progress during the year 1966-67. The equipment to the extent of Rs. 0.78 lakhs was also purchased by the training institute during the year 1966-67.

15. Miscellaneous:-

Information and publicity:

Under this sub-head one scheme of expansion of rural broadcasting by providing radio sets was implemented in the district. Under this scheme 137 radio sets were installed in the villages of the district.
