CHAPTER - I

Introduction

Aurangabad region comprises five districts of Aurangabad, Parbhani, Nanded, Bhir and Osmanabad commonly called Marathwada.

This land of saints, nursery of culture and seat of empires in a way goes to epitomise the course of Indian history. The achievements of this region in the fields of art, culture, learning and spiritual life are very great. The world renowned caves of Ajanta and Ellora are still with us to speak of ancient glory that India was and what human genius could envision and execute. Shalivahana began his historic career in this region and the " Bhakti " cult was nurtured by Marathwada which produced great mystics.

1.1 - Location

Marathwada forms the central portion of Maharashtra with Aurangabad town being located almost in the centre of the State. In Aurangabad town there is a confluence of North and South.

1.2 - Boundaries

The region is bounded on the north by the districts of Jalgaon (Bombay division), Buldhana and Akola (Nagpur division), on the south by Sholapur (Poona division) and Mysore State, on the east by Andhra Pradesh and on the west by Nasik (Bombay division) and Ahmadnager (Poona division).

1.3 - Administrative set up

The region has in all five districts with 39 talukas and 7 mahals in it. There are 9 talukas and 3 mahals in Aurangabad district, 8 talukas in Parbhani district, 6 talukas and 1 mahal in Bhir district, 6 talukas and 2 mahals in Nanded district and 10 talukas and 1 mahal in Osmanabad district.

For administrative purposes, the region is divided into five districts with its divisional headquarters at Aurangabad town with a divisional Commissioner in charge of the region. Each district in turn is under a Collector at the district level and each taluka or mahal in a district is in charge of Tahsildar or Mahalkari, as the case may be. The Zilla Parishad has jurisdiction over all the rural areas of talukas or for development purposes. With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and for securing greater

measure of participation by people in development plans and local government affairs by decentralisation of powers and functions, the zilla parishad and the panchayat samities have been established in each district under Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act, 1962. The zilla parishad has jurisdiction over the entire district excluding Municipal towns which are covered by the municipalities or town committees as the case may be. The panchayat samities likewise at taluka level have jurisdiction over the entire rural areas of the taluka except the towns under the municipalities or town committees.

The divisional and state level officers of government exercise technical supervision and give guidance to zilla parishads and panchayat samities.

1.4 - Area

Aurangabad region has a total area of 64,797.9 sq.kilo metres (63,309.3 kilo metres of rural and 1,408.6 kilo metres of urban) and its population according to 1961 Census is 6.297 millions comprising 3.208 millions of males and 3.089 millions of females. Different territorial changes have taken place in this region, the districtwise details of which are as follows:-

Aurangabad

There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district or its taluka between 1901 and 1941. During this period eight villages of Ambad taluka were exchanged with six villages of Pathri taluka of Parbhani district. Twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Kandesh and Ahmednager districts were transferred to Aurangabad district in 1950. Consequent upon the abolition of jagirs and sarf-e-khans (crown estate) all the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April 1960 and two new mahals were also created one with headquarters at Khultabad and the other at Jafferabad. The mahal of Soegaon was created in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod taluka and 30 more villages from Kannad taluka.

Parbhani

In 1906 Kalamnuri taluka got the northern villages of Mandad taluka together with 8 villages from Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district in exchange of 6 villages of Pathri taluka of Parbhani

~~district transferred to Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district. No~~
major changes occurred between 1906 to 1948. More than a third of
the district area comprised jagirs which were abolished in 1949
~~and the villages therein were taken over under direct government~~
administration. Gangakhed taluka was formed after the abolition
of jagirs in 1949.

Nanded.

In 1905 Mudhol taluka of Nizamabad district was transferred
to Nanded district and the taluka of Bhainsa then existing was
merged in Mudhol taluka. The taluka called Aowala Narsapur of
~~Nizamabad district (Andhra Pradesh)~~ was abolished and a new taluka
was formed with its headquarters at Kinwat. The taluka of Osmannager
(Lathi) was abolished and all its villages were divided between
Biloli and Kandhar talukas. The northern villages of Nanded taluka
were transferred to Kalamnuri taluka of Parbhani district and a few
other areas were merged in Hadgaon taluka and Mudhol taluka
~~which is now in Nizamabad district of Andhra Pradesh.~~ There were
~~no major changes in the district or taluka boundaries upto 1948.~~
In ~~the year 1949~~ the sarf-e-khas (crown estate) with its headquarters
at Khadka (Mukharabad) was taken over under merger of sarf-e-khas
~~Regulations promulgated in 1949.~~ Consequently all other jagire areas
were also abolished. The taluka boundaries were reconstituted in
1950 when two more mahals were created one with its headquarters
at Mukhed and the other at Bhokar. Due to State's Reorganisation
in 1956 two revenue circles of Deglur taluka and three revenue
circles of Mudhol taluka were transferred to Andhra Pradesh. Kinwat
and Rajura talukas together with Islapur circle of Boath taluka
were transferred from Adilabad district (Now in Andhra Pradesh) to
Nanded district. The revenue circle of Dharmabad or erstwhile Mudhol
taluka (now in Nizamabad district) was included in Biloli taluka.
Islapur revenue circle was included in Kinwat taluka and Rajura which
is isolated and lies 300 miles away from Nanded town was transferred
to Chanda district of Vidarbha in 1959.

Osmabad

The district of Osmabad was temporarily ceded by the Govt.
of Nizam to the British Govt. in 1853. It formed part of Hyderabad
State once again in 1860. The headquarters of the district was at

Naldurg and in fact the district itself was called Naldurg district till 1904. In the year 1905 two taluka headquarters of Naldurg were abolished. The former was merged in Malen taluka and the latter in Tuljapur taluka. The headquarters of Ausa taluka was shifted to Latur and the taluka was named as Latur taluka. The Nizam's own estate called sarf-e-khas (crown's estate) was the biggest in this district which was consequently merged with Govt. areas in 1949. After abolition of Jagirs, the district boundaries and the taluka boundaries also were reconstituted in 1950. Two new talukas called Ausa and Umerga and one mahal with its headquarters at Bhum were then created. In the year 1950, 11 enclave villages from Sholapur district were transferred to this district and 52 villages of this district were sliced out and shunted to Sholapur district.

All the above five districts formed part and parcel of the erstwhile Hyderabad State till 31st October, 1956. On 1st Nov. 1956, they formed part of bilingual Bombay State. From 1st May 1960 they were included in Maharashtra State.

Marathwada covered 21.15% of the total area of Maharashtra and its population forms 15.9% of the total population of Maharashtra.

1.5 - Topography

For almost the whole region of Marathwada the underlying formation is trap rocks which give rise to heavy black soil highly retentive of moisture and particularly suitable for growing cotton. The region is mostly flat plateau with hilly areas in the districts of Aurangabad, Bhir and Osmanabad and cultivation of cotton is concentrated in flat ranges.

Marathwada has extensive hilly ranges and spurts which neither pour water or cultivation nor attracts rainfall. In all the five districts the plateau table land (generally flat country) has elevation between 300 to 900 metres whereas in Aurangabad, Bhir and Osmanabad there is broken country in parts with elevation between 300 to 900 metres.

1.6 - Hills, river system, soil

The country to the north of the Godavari and its main tributary, the Manjra is characterised by the formation of

~~trappean rocks~~ and the soil being derived from the decomposition of those rocks in black and, therefore, fertile yielding cotton and wheat. Particularly the track which lies between the Penganga and the Godavari is noted for its high cultivation and general richness. South of Godavari the country is rugged and not very rich, but the Manjra valley is fruitful. The main river of this region is the Godavari which rises at ~~Rih~~ Trimbekeshwar at Nasik and enters the region ~~at cross section at Gangapur, the western corner of the region.~~ It traverses through Paithan, Shahgadh and Gangakhed while flowing towards east and pass out of the region at Baser which is the last ~~point on the eastern side of Nanded district and winds its course~~ in Andhra Pradesh further down east. It cuts the region into almost two halves with Aurangabad, Parbhani and northern portion of Nanded district lying on its north. The districts of Bhir, Osmanabad and southern portion of Nanded lie on its south. The river Penganga which rises near Buldhana passes through Chikli and Mehkar to touch the ~~northern border of Hingoli taluka of Parbhani district and marks~~ the border of Nanded district ~~from Yeotmal district of Vidarbha.~~ River Manjra is a tributary of the Godavari and rises in the hills of Potoda dividing Bhir district from Osmanabad district and winds ~~its course towards east of the region to enter Mysore State near~~ Kamalnager. The Purna ~~rises from Kenned hills in Aurangabad district~~ and steps into Parbhani district from south west corner. Besides these three rivers there are a number of small minor rivers and streams in each district.

The soil is black in all the five districts of the region and in Nanded district it is a mixture of "lateritic" and black soils. The underlying rock formation is termed as "Deccan traps" in all the districts and in addition in Aurangabad district it is "Archaeon Dharwar" and in Osmanabad district it is "Pleistocene Recent."

CHAPTER-II

EXPLANATORY NOTE ON SCOPE & LIMITATIONS OF STATISTICS
PRESENTED IN STATISTICAL ABSTRACT.

P u r p o s e :-

2.1 This is the third issue of the Divisional Statistical Abstract to be published since the year 1962-63. In this abstract exhaustire statistics about important socio-economic indicators of the economy have been presented. Statistical material on as many topics as possible has been furnished in this publication so as to make it useful as a reference book. The scope of 1965-66 Statistical Abstract has also been enlarged with the addition of few more tables which are included for the first time. As far as possible districtwise information is furnished. The districtwise figures will enable reader to compare the indicators of development between constituent districts of Aurangabad Division. In most of the tables the data for the year 1965-66 have been given. In case of few tables, the data for this year is not available, so the data for latest available year have been furnished. For the sake of comparison similar data for one of the earlier years have also been given.

The statistical material presented here is mainly collected and compiled by the D.S.O.s who have collected the data initially from various offices of State Government, Government of India, Local Bodies & other agencies. Whenever finalised figures are not forthcoming, provisional figures are incorporated with appropriate remarks. The foot notes showing the sources from which the material has been obtained have been indicated at the end of each table.

2.2 Division at a Glance:

In this table some general particulars as well as divisional indicators under various heads like population, agriculture, etc. are presented to bring forth the salient features of this division. Alongwith the figures for this division, corresponding figures relating to Maharashtra State have also been given. The reference period to which the figures concerning this division and Maharashtra State respectively relate is mentioned against each item, as in many cases this period is not identical.

The scope and limitations of the information furnished in this abstract is discussed in the following paragraphs.

2.3 Climate and Rainfall:

The table 1.1 presents monthwise information regarding rainy days and actual rainfall relating to various stations in this division. Most of these rainfall recording stations are at taluka Headquarters. "Normal Rainfall" recorded for each centre, is the average rainfall over long period, usually 30 to 80 years. Table 1.2 gives monthly Maximum, Minimum and Mean temperatures at selected 5 centres in Aurangabad Division. The maximum temperature shown in the table is not actual maximum but average of maximum temperatures during various months.

2.4 Area and Population:

The data of 1951 population census and 1961 population census are presented in tables 2.1 to 2.7. The statistical material published by Government of India in "Census of India 1961, Maharashtra, Vol.X, Part-II-A," and "District Census Hand Books, 1961" of each district have been used for preparing these tables. The various concepts and definitions adopted at the time census, concerning "Village", "Town", "Worker", "household" etc. have been clarified in details in these publications.

The table 2.1 gives districtwise figures of area, Rural and Urban population, population density and variations with 1951 census. The population figures for 1951 census shown in this table have been adjusted for the boundaries and areas of districts as they existed at the time of 1961 census. Table 2.2 shows districtwise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1961 census, while classification of towns according to population ranges have been shown in table 2.3. The table 2.4 presents districtwise figures of No. of workers according to livelihood classes. Distribution of non-workers according to different categories have been incorporated in table 2.5. For both these tables figures for Rural and Urban areas have been given separately. The table 2.6 gives information regarding population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in each district at the time of 1961 census. In table 2.7 the population of each individual town in each district of Aurangabad Division is shown.

2.5 Agriculture:

The tables 3.1 to 3.10, on agriculture included in this section give information on Land Utilization, area and production under principal crops, area irrigated by crops and by sources, minor irrigation works, major and medium projects and percentage distribution of sample households engaged in cultivation, classified by interest on land and size of land. The data regarding famine, scarcity and agricultural implements have also been given. The major part of data on agriculture has been collected from the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona.

Table 3.1 gives utilization of land according to standard heads of utilization for the years 1961-62 and 1964-65. Table 3.2 shows figures of areas under different crops while table 3.3 presents figures of the outturn and average yield per hectare of principal crops for each district & Division. The production of cotton is in terms of bales whereas that of sugarcane is in terms of gur. Table 3.4 shows the distribution of net irrigated area by sources of irrigation. The figures of area irrigated under principal crops of each District have been furnished in table 3.5. Next table 3.6(a) gives the Number of Irrigation Wells in use and not in use for each District. Table Nos. 3.6(b) & (c) give data relating to minor irrigation works and major & medium irrigation projects in each district. Table 3.7 presents the distribution of sample households engaged in cultivation classified by size of land and interest in land cultivated. The interests in land are classified in to 3 types and classification of size of land is done in to 10 size groups. The figures are shown separately for Total, Rural and Urban areas of each district. This data has been collected at the time of 1961 census. Table 3.9 indicates agricultural implements in each district as enumerated at the time of 1966 Livestock Census. The information on famine and scarcity conditions in each district is furnished in table 3.10.

2.6 Animal Husbandry:

Table 4.1 presents districtwise data relating to different categories of livestock, poultry etc., enumerated at the time of Quinquennial Livestock Census, 1966, table 4.2 gives information regarding developmental activities of Dept of Animal Husbandry in this division, and details about

veterinary aid supplied. Disease-wise livestock mortality in Aurangabad region has been shown in table 4.3, while table 4.4 gives information relating to recognised slaughter houses and number of Animals Slaughtered in them.

2.7 Forests:

The two tables included in this section give details of area under different types of forests and estimates of forest produce. The details of area under forests, both in-charge of Forest Department and Revenue Department are shown separately.

2.8 Industries and Employment:

The factory statistics shown in tables 5.1, 5.2, and 5.3 covers following types of factories registered under Factory Act of 1948:-

- 1) Those using power and employing 10 or more workers.
- 2) Those not using power but employing 20 or more workers, and
- 3) Those factories not covered by (1) & (2) above but notified by the Government as covered by the Factory Act.

Table 5.1 presents, for each industry, the total number of working factories, the number of mandays for which they worked during the year and the average daily employment classified by adults, adolescents and children. The data presented in cols. 6 to 13 of this table relate only to the factories submitting the returns. The industries are classified as per Standard Industrial Classification. The table 5.2 gives distribution of factories for each type of industry according to size of factory in terms of average daily employment of worker, while table 5.3 presents the distribution of factories for each industry by number of days worked during the year. It may be noted that the number of workers shown in these 3 tables are the average number of working daily throughout the year and not the total number of workers on the register of factories. The statistics pertaining to Handloom and powerloom industry have been given in table 5.4. The tables 5.5 & 5.6 give usual employment exchange statistics. Table 5.7 indicates changes in volume of employment in different industries as on 31st March, 1965 and 1966. Table 5.8 shows for each industry,

figures relating to number of factories, their productive capital, employment, gross output and value added by manufacture. This information regarding manufacturing industries has been obtained through Annual Survey of manufacturing Industries conducted by Government of India.

2.0 Electricity:

In all two tables are included in this section. Table No 5.9 gives statistics relating to electricity generated, purchased and electricity consumed for various purposes. Table No.5.10 gives Towns and Villages electrified & population covered there in according to 1961 census.

2.10 Co.operation:

In all 7 tables are included in this section, under which statistics relating to various activities of co-operative movement are shown. Table 5.1 gives figures of different types of co-operative societies working in Aurangabad Division. In next 5 tables important information pertaining to different types of Co-operative institutions & details about their operations are presented. Table No.6.7 gives data relating to No.of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them.

2.11 Medical and Public Health:

Table 7.1 presents information about No.of persons engaged in medical & public health profession as enumerated in the 1961 population census. Table 7.2 gives particulars of medical facilities available through public aided bodies. The district-wise classification of patients is furnished in table 7.3. Table 7.4 & 7.5 give details about vital statistics. The information about vaccination statistics, cholera inoculations & B.C.G.vaccinations have been given in the next two tables. Table 7.8 presents information on hygienic drinking water supply sources available in rural areas of each district in Aurangabad Division.

2.12 Education:

In this section 8 tables are included. Table 8.1 indicates literacy in each district according to 1961 census. Percentages of literacy have been shown separately for both the sexes as well as for rural & urban areas. As the literate is defined as a person who can read and write simple letter, persons having higher education are also included in this category. The distribution of literates according to educational levels separately for rural and urban areas have been furnished in tables 8.2 and 8.3. Table 8.4 gives No.

of institutions typewise and enrolment and teachers therein. The information is given districtwise. The data pertaining to beneficiaries and educational concessions to Backward Classes have been shown in table 8.5 while similar data relating to concessions of free education to economically backward class have been furnished in table 8.6. The figures of expenditure incurred by Government of Maharashtra State by way of grant in aids to local bodies have been presented in table 8.7. The table 8.8 indicates the growth of education in towns and villages in each district of Aurangabad Division.

2.13 Transport and Communications:

The statistics relating to different modes of transport are given in this section. The table 9.1 gives length of railway route according to different types of rail gauges in Aurangabad Division. The road length of extra municipal roads in each district as at the end of March, 1961 and 1966 has been shown in table 9.2(a). The road length according to different categories and surface, classification, Surfacewise road length of municipal roads is furnished in table 9.2(b). Table 9.3 gives relevant statistics regarding number of motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad Division. The next table gives operational statistics of Nationalised road transport in Aurangabad Division. It should, however, be noted that Aurangabad Division as on 31-3-1966 comprised of all 5 Dist.s of Marathwada and four depots viz., Akola, Buldhana, Khamgaon and Washim of Vidarbha region. The details of traffic census conducted in May, 1965 in respect of roads in Maharashtra State have been furnished in table 9.5 usual postal statistics have been presented in table 9.6. Table 9.7 indicates the growth of postal facilities in rural areas of each district. The table 9.8 presents statistics pertaining to rural broadcasting.

2.14 Local Bodies:

Table No.10.1 gives the districtwise information regarding number of and income and expenditure of Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Cantonment areas, for the years 1961-62 and 1965-66.

2.15 Third Five Year Plan and Community Development Programme:

5 tables are included in this section. The first two tables give details of expenditure and physical achievements under various schemes, included in Third Five Year Plan for all 5 years i.e. 1961-62 to 1965-66. Table 11.3 gives particulars of C.D. Programme implemented in each Dist. of Aurangabad Division. In the next table expenditure incurred in different stages of blocks is shown while the physical achievements under selected items by all C.D./St.-I/St.-II blocks operating in each district during 1964-65 and 1965-66 are included in table 11.5.

2.16 P r i c e s :

Table 12.1 presents average retail prices of important commodities at each district Headquarter, in Aurangabad Division during the year 1964-65, while details of annual arrivals of various commodities in all regulated markets in each district are presented in table 12.2. Consumer price index numbers in respect of Aurangabad & Nanded centres have been shown in table 12.3. The base year for this series of index number is the year 1943-44.

2.17 Judicial & Administrative:

The statistical data relating to Police Department and Judicial courts are included in this section. Table 13.1 gives strength of Police force and Crime statistics concerning Aurangabad Region while in another table details of work disposed of in Civil and Criminal Courts have been furnished.

2.18 Miscellaneous:

7 tables are included in this section. In these tables statistical material on various topics like Cinema, Banking Offices, Joint Stock Companies, Insurance, Small Savings Schemes, Land Revenue Collections, and General Elections held in 1962 is incorporated.

ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF IMPORTANT INDICATORS OF DEVELOPMENT.

This chapter deals with selected indicators pertaining to some important sectors of the economy with the purpose of providing a periodical assessment of progress achieved in these economic fields as a result of implementation plan programme.

1. Percentage of gross sown area to net sown area.

This indicator shows the extent of double cropping in relation to net sown area. The extent of double cropping largely depends upon the availability of water for irrigated crop and land with deep soil capable of retaining sufficient moisture after kharif rains for the growth of second dry crop. Since area for the dry ~~xxxxxxx~~ double cropping is limited in Marathwada, the scope for increasing double cropping in the region depends upon increase irrigational facilities. The table below shows percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area in the region and in the respective districts of Marathwada for the years 1961-62 and 1964-65.

On the whole, it is seen that only 6% of the net cropped area in Aurangabad region has been brought under double cropping in the year 1964-65. The extent of double cropping in the region is not quite significant and leaves much scope for improvement in the years to come. However, the extent of double cropping increased slightly in the year 1965-66 (6%) when compared with that in 1961-62 (4%). Within the region it is observed that Parbhani district having a large area under dry double crop accounted for relatively higher proportion of double cropping in relation to net cropped area (7%) whereas in Nanded and Osmanabad it was quite less (3%).

3.2. Productivity of important crops

Agriculture is the mainstay of the economy in Maharashtra. It is therefore but obvious that development of agriculture should receive highest priority under plan programme since inception of First Five Year Plan. The average annual production of food grains in the region during the first plan was 14.11 lakhs metric tons and it rose to 14.75 lakhs metric tons in the second plan. During the first 4 years of Third plan period, however, the average annual production somewhat declined to 14.70 lakhs metric tons as during the year 63-64 the production was affected due to paucity of rains.

Following table shows the yield rate and production of important crops in Maharashtra region during the years 61-62 and

64-65 providing an assessment of the progress made during the bigger part of the Third plan period. On the whole it is seen that the food grain production during 61-65 (14.89 lakhs metric tons) has slightly declined when compared to the production of 61-62 (15.33 lakhs mt. tons), mainly on account of decline in production of cereals particularly jowar. The production of cereals was affected on account of late and inadequate rains in some parts of Parbhani, Aurangabad and Osmanabad districts. As regards non-food crops, it is observed that while cotton has shown slight decline in production groundnut has registered increase in production in the year 64-65 compared to the corresponding production in 61-62. Studying the yield rate production of important crops, it has been observed that on the whole the higher yield rate of crops was observed in 64-65 compared to that in 61-62 except in respect of wheat, jowar, gram and cotton.

3. Percentage of irrigated area

In the Marathwada region, lack of adequate irrigational facilities is one of the causes which contributed to the low productivity of land compared to other areas of the State. In the year 1961-62 the net area irrigated was about 1.53 lakh hectares which constituted hardly 3.2% of the net cropped area in the region. As a result of Govt. efforts in increasing the irrigation potential in the region, the net irrigated area in the year 64-65 rose to 1.89 lakh hectares which accounted for 4.04% of the net cropped area. Within the region, it is seen that Bhir district (6.45%) has the highest proportion of the cropped area under irrigation among the districts. The districts of Aurangabad (5.09%) and Osmanabad (4.82%) are the other districts having the proportion of irrigated area above the average for the region. Proportion of area under irrigation in Parbhani and Nanded districts in relation to net cropped area was found to be quite low. In all the districts the proportion of irrigated area to net cropped area has shown increase in the year 64-65 in comparison with that in 61-62.

4. Changes in the cropping pattern

The cropping pattern reveals that the food crops area predominant in this region. Out of the total gross cropped area, the food crops alone accounted for 71%. The principal crops of the region are jowar, cotton, ground nut, wheat and bajra. Jowar in the year 64-65 accounted nearly 37.4% of the area under cropped area and area under cotton was 15.2%. The following table shows the percentage of area under food and non-food crops in Marathwada during 61-62 and 64-65.

Studying the cropping pattern for both the years, it is seen that the proportionate area under food and nonfood crops did not show much variation and the cropping pattern has more or less remained unchanged. The area under pulses among the food crops and oil seeds among the nonfood crops somewhat declined in the year 64-65 compared to the year 61-62. Ever though food crops account for the major part of the irrigated area, it is seen that the irrigated area under nonfood crops has gradually increased.

5. Livestock per hectare of land

The importance of livestock as a source of subsidiary industry and a traction power in agriculture economy can need hardly be emphasised. According to 1966 census the number of livestock in the region was 55.09 lakh. The table below show the availability of livestock in relation to cultivable area during the years 61-62 and 64-65.

The ratio of livestock per hectre of cultivable land in the year 61-62 (0.92) did not show any variation to the corresponding ratio for the 64-65. In the year 61-62 the cultivable area per pair of bullocks accounted for 7.92 hectares and it worked out to 7.90 hectares in the year 64-65 for the entire region. Within the region, it is seen that the ratio of cultivable area per pair of bullocks is quite high in Parbhani (8.15 hectares) and Osmanabad (9.27 hectares) whereas it is comparatively low in Aurangabad district (6.9).

6. Poultry as compared to population

In a country like India, the importance of poultry and poultry products in raising the low nutritional standard of the people can scarcely be overemphasised. The State Govt. have introduced special schemes for development of poultry under Plan programme particularly during the Third F.Y. Plan period. Poultry population the region has registered a steep decline in 1966 census (7.1 lakhs) when compared to 1961 census (10.9 lakhs). As a result of this the ratio of poultry per thousand population in the region has declined from 175 in 1961 to 113 in 1966. Major decline in poultry population was observed in Nanded and Parbhani districts. In the year 1966, the ratio of poultry per thousand population was highest in Bhir district (166) followed by Aurangabad (131). It was lowest in Nanded district (80). The following table shows the ratio of poultry per thousand population in the districts of Marathwada and in the region as a whole for the years 1961 and 1966.

7. Per capita consumption of electricity

Prior to the formation of bilingual Bombay State, the benefits of electricity were restricted to few towns and fewer villages in Marathwada area. With the implementation of Purna project and availability of grid supply from Paras and Koyna more area and population could be benefitted by the electricity in Marathwada. The per capita consumption of electricity in the region which was ~~xxx~~ hardly 0.59 Kwh in the year 61-62 increased significantly to 3.96 Kwhs in the year 65-66. Within the region, Aurangabad district, being industrially advanced, relatively accounted for the highest per capita consumption of electricity i.e. 7.30 Kwh in 65-66. Nanded was next with per capita consumption of 5.92 Kwh

The lowest per capita consumption was in Bhir (2.22) kWh. In spite of the progress achieved in recent years, the per capita consumption within the region is still below the State average. The distribution of electricity consumption in the region for the year 64-65 shows that industrial consumption accounted for 25.2% of the total consumption while domestic consumption accounted for 20.2%. The table below shows the per capita consumption of electricity during the years 61-62 and 65-66 in the districts of Marathwada and the region as a whole.

8. Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in employment exchanges and vacancies notified

The number of candidates registered in the employment exchanges of Aurangabad region in the year 61-62 was 30.5 thousand which further increased to 42.3 thousand in the year 65-66, the number of candidates registered during the period showing an increase of 38.7%. Against this the number of vacancies notified were only 7403 in the year 61-62 and 7615 in the year 65-66.

Within the region it is seen that the number of candidates enrolled in employment exchanges showed significant increase in Parbhani (105%) followed by Nanded (102%) in the year 65-66, over the year 61-62. The vacancies notified also showed increase in 64-65 in all the districts compared to the year 61-62. However the proportion of vacancies in relation to enrolment was very small.

9. Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated in hospitals

It is seen that the increasing number of patients in Govt. hospitals in recent years indicate the need for provision of more health amenities in the region. The number of indoor patients

treated in Govt. hospitals in the region in the year 1965 were 34.8 thousand which was considerably higher than the number of patients treated in 1961 (27.9 thousand). The number of outdoor patients treated in Govt. hospitals also showed an increasing trend since the year 1961. The number of outdoor patients treated during the year 1965 was 28.06 lakh as against 21.04 lakh in the year 1961. Thus during the period 1961-65, the percentage increase registered in the outdoor patients was of the order of 33.3% and that in case of indoor patients it was 24.6%. The number of patients treated indoor as well as outdoor showed increase in all the districts except that of Aurangabad and Nanded districts in the year 1965 compared to those in the year 1961. In particular it was seen that the number of outdoor patients increased almost the double in the year 1965 in Osmanabad district, over that in the year 1961. The following table shows the number of patients treated in Govt. hospitals and dispensaries in the districts of Aurangabad region.

10. Increase in the number of students in different categories

Marathwada was particularly backward in the sphere of education due to continued negligence of the past regime. Particularly during the Third Plan period greater attention was paid for the promotion of education facilities in the

region. Consequently the number of educational institutions rose significantly within the region. The number of primary institutions which were 5704 in the year 61-62, rose to 7679 in 65-66. As a result of this the number of students in primary schools ~~xxx~~ increased to 6.39 lakhs in the year 65-66 which showed an increase of 49.14% in the number of students over the year 1961-62. In particular the increase was noticeable under girls students. Similar trend was also noticed in regard to strength of students in secondary and higher education institutions in the region. In the year 65-66 the number of secondary institutions was 610 which was almost double the number in the year 61-62. The number of students, taking secondary education was 2.15 lakhs in the year 65-66 which showed an increase of 133.51% over the year 61-62. The number of higher institutions also rose from 25 in the year 61-62 to 32 in the year 65-66. The students in the higher institutions in the year 65-66 were 13.8 thousands showing an increase of 119.08% over the year 61-62. The number of special schools were also registered increase from 25 in the year 61-62 to 59 in the year 65-66. The table below shows the number of students under different categories in the year 1961 and 1965 in the region.

11. Increase in road mileage per 100 sq.kilo metres

In relation to the population and area Marathwada is very much deficient in regard to communication facilities particularly roads. Road development programme was therefore given due priority during the Third F.Y.. As on March 1961, the road length per 100 sq.kms. was 4.5 Km in Aurangabad region. On account of road development programme undertaken during Third plan period the total road length in the district increased from 2940 Kms at the end of March 1961 to 5306 Kms at the end of March 1966, which showed an increase of 80.4%. Thus at the end of third plan period the ratio of road length per 100 sq. km. improved to 8.2 kms. In spite of the rapid progress achieved in providing communication facilities the ratio of road mileage per unit area in Marathwada region is still below the State average. The following table shows the road mileage in the districts of Marathwada as on March 1961 and March 1966 respectively and percentage of increase from 1961 to 1966.

With the region, it was observed that all the districts recorded increase in road length during the period 1961-66. Amongst the districts, Nanded district has relatively better road communication facilities having 11.2 Kms of road length per 100 sq. km. of area.

12. Increase in banking facilities in proportion to population:

The total number of banks in the region rose from 78 in 61-62 to 157 in 65-66 on account of increased commercial activities. The population covered per bank at the end of 1966 constituted 6.29 thousand in the region. Table below shows the number of banks and the population covered by the banks at the end of March 66 in the districts of Aurangabad Region.

CHAPTER IV

THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN IN AURANGABAD REGION.

The Third Five Year Plan of the State was the first Plan for the composite State, giving greater opportunities for reshaping the economy. The Plan programmes were, therefore, aimed at building the agro-industrial society, achieving balanced and rapid increase in agriculture, large industry and small industry. Steps were also taken up in building up social and economic overheads, necessary for removal of imbalances in the underdeveloped areas like Marathwada and Vidarbha.

In the total outlay of State of Rs.418 crores the total allotment for Aurangabad Division's Plan programme was Rs.68.12 crores,. During the the earlier Plan periods, comparatively smaller amounts were placed for the development programmes of this Division. This shortfall was, therefore, made good by allotting higher amount of outlay of Rs.7.13 crores over the proportional outlay. The additional allotments made, were utilised for programmes of irrigation, primary education and roads. In the total outlay, Rs.26.43 crores were provided for the district level programmes in the Division and Rs.41.77 crores were provided for the Divisional level programmes. The Districtwise allocation of the outlay was Aurangabad Rs.7 crores Parbhani Rs.4.25 crores, Bhir Rs.4.29 crores, Nanded Rs.4.79 crores and Osmanabad Rs.6.10 crores. The total expenditure under different development heads during the Third Five Year Plan in Aurangabad Region is shown in the task given below:-

It will be seen from the above that the programme of Irrigation & Power (Rs.32 crores) has received highest priority followed by Agricultural Programme (Rs.13 crores). Due priority was also given for programme of Transport & Communication & Social Services which also relatively accounted for higher proportion of total plan expenditure.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME:

4.1 The programme for Agricultural Development had aimed at increasing the area of cultivation and improving agricultural productivity. This was to be achieved through variety of programmes of Land Development such as Soil Conservation, Irrigation and tractor ploughing, propagation of improved agricultural practices through improved seeds, fertilizers, composts, green manuring double cropping, improved implements and crop protection from pests and diseases. Under agricultural programme against a total outlay of Rs.918 lakhs, the expenditure was to the tune of Rs.1302 lakhs during the Plan period, forming 142% of the total plan budget utilisation. The performance under various programmes under Agriculture sector is discussed in subsequent paras.

Agricultural production:

4.2 For the various schemes of agricultural production, the total provision of Rs.200.7 lakhs was made against which the total expenditure incurred was Rs.194.55 lakhs. In order to meet the requirement of agricultural assistance for implementation of agricultural programme, agriculture schools were opened in the earlier Plan period, one each in Parbhani, Osmanabad and Bhir districts. During the Third Five Year Plan two more schools were opened one each in Aurangabad and Nanded. About 700 students were trained in these schools during the third plan period.

Development of crops:

4.3 The plan included development of cotton sugarcane, oil seeds and horticulture and also programmes for intensive cultivation of food crops. The total expenditure was Rs.39.08 lakhs. Under Coordinated cotton development programme, about 4.90 lakhs of acres of cotton area i.e. 23% of the total cotton acreage was brought under improved seed while an area of about a lakh of acres was brought under irrigated cotton. In regard to sugar cane cultivation, about 50 thousand acres of area was brought under improved seeds. Under development of oilseeds, nearly 1.5 lakh acres of area was covered in addition to package programme of groundnut, covering 6,000 acres of land in Ahmednagar taluka of Osmanabad Dist, so as to exploit maximum production potential.

Supplies & Services:

4.4 As part of the programme to intensify the agricultural production it was proposed to propagate the use of agricultural implements like iron ploughs, knives, etc. During the plan period about 3,700 iron ploughs were supplied on subsidised rates. For production of improved seed 45 taluka seed farms were newly established covering an area of about 4000 acres. The distribution of improved seeds from the seed farms was over 5000 quintals per year. Under the programme for manuring, municipalities and village panchayats were encouraged to undertake production of town and rural compost manure. By the end of the Third Five Year Plan, the annual production of town compost had reached over 40,000 tonnes and

~~of total output over 90,000 tonnes.~~ The chemical fertilizers were also propagated among the cultivators. The consumption of fertilizers was about 1,000 tonnes in the beginning and it reached the level of about 9,000 tonnes at the end of Plan period.

Improved practices:

4.5 In order to bring 15 lakhs acres area under intensive cultivation, Rs.15 lakhs were spent in selected blocks. The area both under kharif and rabi jowar and wheat crops were covered under the Plan period for the purpose.

Land Development:

4.6 The land development programme was mainly concerned with coverage under tractor ploughing, which was resorted to for ploughing in areas with deep soils or in areas irrigated by canals. An amount of Rs.15.35 lakhs was spent against a provision of Rs.9.50 lakhs. Twenty three tractors were put into operation which covered ploughing of 31,355 acres of land.

Soil Conservation:

4.7 An area of 9.02 lakh acres was covered under bunding during the plan period. The total expenditure incurred was Rs.611.39 lakhs against a provision of ~~Rs.~~217.34 lakhs.

Minor Irrigation:

4.8 Out of the total irrigation of 4.30 lakh acres at the beginning of the Third Plan, irrigation to 3.65 lakh acres was from minor irrigation works viz. tanks and wells. During the Third Plan the proposal was to construct 10,200 new irrigation wells, to install 8,736 pumping sets and to undertake work of 56 minor irrigation works in the division. A total of Rs.335.93 lakhs was provided for the proposed programme. The total expenditure over the works included Rs.42.95 lakhs towards subsidy, for 23,882 wells construction Rs.51.33 lakhs towards subsidy for installation of 16,147 pumping sets and Rs.297.30 lakhs towards works of irrigation tanks. Nearly 27 tankeworks including 6 spillover works were completed creating additional irrigation potential of 29,000 acres in the division.

Animal Husbandry:

4.9 A total amount of Rs.45.83 lakhs was spent over the development programmes. A veterinary Polyclinic was established at Aurangabad. Seventy one veterinary dispensaries with 208 branch dispensaries were also established. The cattle breeding farms at Hingoli and Aurangabad were expanded. Under the scheme for district premium bulls as many as 730 bulls were maintained in the division. In addition 5 artificial insemination centres with 12 subcentres were established. Sheep breeding centres at Padgaon, Hingoli, Udgir and Ambejogri were developed. Thirteen Poultry demonstration centres were started. Nearly 2,000 trainees were trained in the poultry breeding.

4.10 Dairy Development

Town Milk Supply scheme started functioning at Aurangabad from February, 1962. The total distribution of milk through the dairy had reached to 2000 litres per day by the end of the Plan. Nearly Rs. 11 lakhs have been spent on this scheme. Loans of about 3 lakhs rupees granted to farmers for cattle purchase. There were 86 milk producers societies with membership of 4,000. These societies were given Rs. one lakh as financial assistance. A creamery centre at Udaipur was established, where, about 30 Kg. of ghee is produced every day. Also hundred 6 month old high progeny buffalo calves had been distributed to different dairy societies in the region.

4.11 Forests

The total area under forests in the Division is 3 thousand sq. Kms., of which about 2 thousand sq. Kms. categorised as reserved forests. The region has proportionately very low forest cover i.e. 4% of the total area of the region, when for the State it is 22%. In the Third Plan, about 8 lakhs of rupees were provided for development programmes. Financial assistances of over Rs. 40,000 was given to village panchayats for afforestation and development of pastures. Plantation of valuable trees viz. Sandal-wood, was done on about 1,400 acres of area from Aurangabad and lacee cultivation was done on 150 acres in the Division. For transport of forest produce, forest roads of 4 miles were constructed in Nanded district.

4.12 Fisheries

In the Third Plan, Rs. 4.04 lakhs were provided for development purposes. Against this, the total expenditure was about Rs. 2.19 lakhs. A fish farm was established at Sidheshwar dam in Parbhani District. A total 323 kg. of nylon twine was distributed to fishermen for fishing nets. Seventeen Fishermen Cooperatives were organised during the plan period.

4.13 Warehousing and Marketing

During the Plan period, 12 markets were regulated and assistance of about Rs. 12 lakhs was made to over 80 committees. As against the Plan targets of organising 17 grading units and one

4.13 Warehousing & marketing Contd.

~~supervising~~ unit in the Division, 11 grading units and one supervising unit were established. The total expenditure on development of marketing was Rs.13.84.

II. COOPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

4.14 The State Five Year Plans have sought to promote Co-operative organisations of different economic activities by giving financial assistance to these institutions in the form of subsidies, capital investments and loans according to the needs of the situation. The Community Development programme was aimed at the betterment of the Socio-Economic conditions of the rural population with active participation of the people and it sought to evolve methods for the best utilisation of local resources. In the Third Plan, the programme of Co-operation & Community Development was provided with nearly Rs.2 crores and Rs.5 crores respectively. Against the total provision of Rs.7 crores, the expenditure was Rs.8 crores. The progress of various schemes under this head is discussed below:-

4.15 Cooperation:

The total provision made were exceeded in all the districts by about 10 to 20%. However, there was shortfall in divisional level programme, as the total expenditure has been just 41% of the provision. The progress in different programmes of cooperation is discussed below:-

4.16 Cooperative Credit:

The Third Plan contemplated to raise the short term and medium term credit levels to Rs.13.21 crores and Rs.1.68 crores as against which the levels actually reached in financing under respective terms were Rs.8.84 crores and Rs.0.6 crores. The total advances on long terms basis were also more than Rs.8 crores. Nearly 100 branches of Central Cooperative Bank and 22 branches of Land Development Banks were opened. Against the target of 4.34 lakh memberships of agricultural primary, the achievements are 2.02 lakhs. Agricultural Credit Societies registered during the Plan was 283, thus taking the total number of societies to 4828.

4.17 Cooperative Marketing:

A total amount of Rs.79.84 lakhs was spent on this programme. Twenty four more primary marketing societies have been organised taking the total to 58. Twelve large sized, 25 medium sized and 151 small sized godowns were completed.

Cooperative processing

4.18 Against a target of establishing 13 cotton pressing units, 27 oil mills, 3 sugar factories and 1 cold storage plant the achievements was 15 cotton pressing units, 25 oil mills and 2 rice mills. Two cooperatives for sugar factories each at Dhoni (Osmanabad) and Kalumber (Nanded) have been organised. One industrial oil complex at Latur on large scale has been set up.

Cooperative farming

4.19 In this region, the scheme intended to cover 50 societies in pilot areas and 105 societies outside pilot areas, as against which 53 cooperatives in pilot areas and 77 outside pilot areas have been organised. About 20,000 acres of area was commanded by these societies and nearly 13,000 acres of area was brought under cultivation.

Community Development

4.20 As per the target, entire area of the division was covered under community development and the total expenditure over C.D. blocks in the five years period was over Rs.6 crores. With the formation of zilla parishads and panchayat sanities, the activities of the blocks received considerable fillip. The total expenditure over the projects exceeded the allotments by about 12%.

Under the Plan of local development works, financial assistance of Rs.14.17 lakhs was granted to various village panchayats for providing basic needs of drinking water and 371 wells have come up for use. An amount of Rs.4.32 lakhs was paid to village panchayats for enabling them to discharge their functions, under Village Panchayat Act. Further Rs.9.37 lakhs were expended over the training programme of the village panchayat officials.

III- IRRIGATION & POWER PROJECTS

4.21 The total expenditure incurred during the Plan period was Rs.24.63 crores. For this division, targetted irrigation potential was of 2.93 lakh acres for the plan period, against which a potential of 1.05 lakhs acres was created. Purna project has created potential of 40,000 acres and Manar project has created potential of 25,000 acres.

Power

4.22 The programme included in the Third Plan was to cover laying of lines of 70 miles of 132 KV and 145 miles of 66 KV and establishing sub-stations of 35,000 KVA, 40,000 KVA and 10,000 KVA. The total provision made in the Third Plan outlay for the works of this division was Rs.681.20 lakhs and was increased to Rs.873.78 lakhs. The total expenditure against this was Rs.737.37 lakhs. After the introduction of Grid Power, the programme of rural electrification was undertaken on a larger scale and 563 villages were supplied with electricity. The electrification programme was followed by connections for irrigation pumps, which were about 5,000. By the end of third plan, nearly 8% of the total villages in the region were electrified.

IV - INDUSTRY & MINING

4.23 By 1964, there were 237 registered factories in the region with total employment of 14 thousands. The number of factory workers per lakh of population (1961) worked out to 216. During the Third Plan period, the programmes for the developments of large scale and small scale industries were included in the divisional Plan. For the division the outlay of Rs.74.98 lakhs was provided and the total expenditure incurred was Rs.72.30 lakhs during the five year period.

Large Scale Industries

4.24 The programme covered establishment of three spinning mills each at Aurangabad, Marol and Latur and 8 cotton ginning and pressing units. The total expenditure incurred was Rs.45.40 lakhs against a provision of Rs.30.48 lakhs.

Small Scale Industries

4.25 Six more Industrial Estates have come up during the Plan period each at Aurangabad, Jalna, Hingoli, Latur, Paithan and Parli Vajinath. Total employment at these estates was 339. The total amount spent for the establishments of these estates was Rs.9.42 lakhs. Financial assistance of Rs.10 lakhs was given to cooperatives organised for industrial workers. Five societies of handloom weavers were also given financial help of 5.56 lakhs. The total provision for programmes of Small Scale Industries was Rs.44.50 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs.26.88 lakhs.

V - TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

4.26 In Marathiwada, the road mileage is insufficient in relation to area and population. Of the total roads of 41 thousand kms. in the State, at the beginning of the Plan, the spread in this region was only a little under 3 thousand kms. The area to road mileage ratio worked to 5 kms. for the region against 14 kms. of roads for the State as a whole per 100 sq.kms. area. The Third Plan provision for the programmes increased to Rs.570.58 lakhs whereas the expenditure exceeded to Rs.632.79 lakhs i.e.110%, thus achieving a significant progress. A total of over 1850 kms. roads were newly constructed and works of 19 bridges were taken up as a result of which the total road length in the region increased to 4874 kms. by the end of the Plan.

VI - SOCIAL SERVICES

4.27 For programmes of general education, technical education, health and sanitation, water supply, housing, welfare of backward classes, etc. provision of Rs.13.40 crores was proposed and the total expenditure incurred was Rs.12.72 crores. The progress of schemes of various programmes is discussed below:-

General education

4.28 The development programme concerning primary education was entrusted to Z.P. Against the total outlay of Rs.550.94 lakhs for the education programmes, the total expenditure was Rs.518.93 lakhs. Ten thousand teachers were trained with the result that the proportion of trained teachers in Primary schools increased to 60% as against 21% at the beginning of the Plan. The number of primary institutions increased from 5437 to 7268 during the period of Third Plan. The enrolments of primary schools totalled to 6.17 lakhs against 3.87 lakhs in 1960-61. Over 400 class rooms were constructed for primary schools. The total enrolment of secondary schools rose from 79,000 in 1960-61 to 118 thousand's by the end of the Plan period. The number of secondary education institutions also increased from 265 to 493. The total grants to non-Govt. schools sanctioned was Rs.24.46 lakhs, benefitting 20 schools, as many as 1123 classes were additionally opened in Govt. schools. Nearly Rs.30 lakhs

were paid to Marathwada University and grants of Rs.17.94 lakhs were paid to non-Govt. colleges.

Technical Education

4.29 In the Third Plan, it was decided to increase the intake capacities of existing Engineering Colleges and Polytechnics and also to open new ones. The total outlay for programme under technical education was Rs.41.47 lakhs and total expenditure incurred was Rs.36.55 lakhs. During the Third Plan, the intake capacity was raised to 180 seats in Engineering College at Aurangabad as against 60 seats in the Second Plan. One new polytechnic with 60 seats was established at Nanded in 64-65. Expansions of the existing polytechnics at Aurangabad and Latur (Osmanabad) were also undertaken and the intake capacities were raised by 120 and 60 seats respectively.

Medical & Nursing

4.30 At the beginning of the Third Plan, there were 10 hospitals, 60 dispensaries and 25 primary health centres. The total bed strength of the hospitals was 1185. The expenditure incurred on the programme was Rs.107.43 lakhs against a provision of Rs.130.89 lakhs. The major programme was the completion of hospital building of Medical college, Aurangabad, with a bed strength of 417. The construction of civil hospital at Bhir was in progress. Each district of the division except Bhir has a T.B. clinic and total T.B. beds are 401. At the end of the Plan period, the total bed strength for the region was increased to 1823 which works out 29 beds per lakh of population.

Public Health

4.31 The total outlay for this programme exceeded to Rs.152.83 lakhs as the total expenditure incurred was Rs.151.73 lakhs. The major programmes included were eradication of Malaria, family ~~xxx~~ planning, and vaccination against small-pox. A review of the physical achievements made under different programmes is given below:-

Primary Health Centres

4.32 The primary Health Centres functioning in the division at the end of the plan were 70. Against the allotment of Rs.9.10 lakhs, the expenditure incurred on construction of

centres was Rs.7.10 lakhs

Control of communicable diseases

4.33 For eradication of malaria, 6 units were functioning and the expenditure incurred was Rs.97.22 lakhs. Under the programme of vaccination against small pox, about 90% population in the division was covered and the total expenditure over the programme was Rs.14.65 lakhs. For campaign against leprosy, one leprosy control unit with 37 set units was established and about 60,000 leprosy patients were treated. The total expenditure incurred was Rs.4.12 lakhs against a provision of Rs.5.20 lakhs. The work of B.C.G. vaccination for T.B. control was undertaken in the division and the total tests carried out was 8,51,000 and the vaccinations performed was 3,19,000.

Family planning

4.34 Under the programme initially vasectomy units were established one each per district. Further, in this division 92 centres in rural part and 10 centres in urban areas and 294 sub-centres have been working for propoganda and treatment. A mobile family planning unit also started functioning at Aurangabad. In the last year of the plan period, the K.U.C.D. programme was launched and over 20 thousand cases in this division were treated during the period of one year.

Ayurveda

4.35 The plan programme included construction of building for college, hospital and pharmacy at Mandad.

Urban development

4.36 The total programme under urban development work is quite satisfactory since Rs.27.38 lakhs were actually expended against the total provision of Rs.30.47 lakhs.

Water supply & drainage

An out/ of ^{lay} Rs.145.42 lakhs was earmarked for the water supply schemes of the division and the total expenditure incurred was Rs.134.86 lakhs. With the completion of all the work of municipal water supply, almost the entire urban population would be served by piped water supply in this division.

housing

4.38 The total outlay for the housing programme of construction of houses for industrial workers was Rs.69.69 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was Rs.81.65 lakhs. The expenditure on village housing project scheme has been over Rs.40 lakhs.

Welfare of backward classes

4.39 An outlay of Rs.74.79 lakhs was earmarked for the welfare programme of backward classes, against a total expenditure of Rs.83.04 lakhs. The programmes undertaken are educational concessions to backward classes, economic uplift of these classes and other welfare measures, i.e. health, housing, etc.

Social Welfare

4.40 Against the outlay of Rs.13.09 lakhs the expenditure incurred was Rs.4.40 lakhs. An amount of Rs.16,000 was paid as grants to the institutions for social welfare measures; while Rs.1.69 lakhs were spent for the physically handicapped students for their education. Nearly Rs.2.50 lakhs were spent for enforcement of Children Act.

Labour & Labour welfare

4.41 Against a provision of Rs.44.86 lakhs, the expenditure incurred was Rs.43.53 lakhs. Major programme was for the development of institutions of technical and vocational training. Under the scheme for extension of Employees' State Insurance, the construction of the dispensary at Nanded was completed. Under the programme for Employment Service, information units for collection of information regarding employment market have been set up. Two youth employment service units were also set up. A labour welfare centre has been started at Sailu (Parbhani), while a workshop was established at Nanded for the training of industrial workers.

VII - MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

4.42 This programme covered grant of concession to economically backward class students. Under the programme, the freeships were granted to the students whose parents annual income was below Rs.1200/-. The number of freeships was ~~2.12~~ 2.12 lakhs for secondary schools and was 0.22 lakhs among University students. The total cost borne by the Govt. on this account was Rs.72.85 lakhs in the five year period of the plan.
