EXPLANATIONS

- 1. Academic Year—For the sake of uniformity, the academic year in these tables is taken to coincide with the financial year *i. e.* from 1st April, 1961 to 31st March, 1962.
- 2. Recognised Institutions are those in which the course of study followed is that prescribed or recognised by the Govt. or by a University or by a Board of Secondary and Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities, as the case may be, that they attain to a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their pupils are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Government or the University or the Board.
- 3. Enrolment—For definiteness, the enrolment in the institutions as on 31st March, 1962 is taken.
- 4. Expenditure—In calculating the expenditure from the Govt., District Board or Municipal Board Funds, all payments or contributions from fees and other sources, which are credited to such funds, are deducted.
- 5. Local Bodies include District, Municipal and Cantonment Boards, as well as Town Area Committees and Janpad Sabhas.
- 6. Certificated Teachers are those who have obtained any kind of Teachers' Certificate other than the one granted on the basis of public examination of a Teachers' Training Institution.
- 7. Examination Results refer to those students who were educated during the year 1961-62. These include results of private candidates also.
- 8. Indirect Expenditure represents the amount incurred on direction & inspection, buildings, furniture, scholarships and other miscellaneous items. Its nature is such that it cannot be apportuned to each type of institution.
- 9. All Statistics refer to recognized institutions only.
