**Review of the Annual Administration Report of
the Technical Education Department,
Haryana, for the year 1967-68**

The Technical Education Department is playing a vital role in the development of Haryana State which is economically and educationally backward and industrially undeveloped. The Directorate of Technical Education provides technical education at degree and diploma levels on the engineering side. There is one Regional Engineering College located at Kurukshetra which imparts training for degree courses of engineering and there are four Government Polytechnics and two non-Government private Polytechnics in the State of Haryana which provide technical education for diploma courses. The Regional Engineering College is affiliated with Kurukshetra University and a State Board of Technical Education has been set up for looking after the diploma examinations. The list of members of the State Board of Technical Education is given at annexure 'A'. The Board prescribes different courses of training, holds examinations and co-ordinates all activities of the technical education departments in this connection.

2. The Directorate of Technical Education is primarily connected with diploma level education and serves as a Secretariat for the State Board of Technical Education and also co-ordinates the activities of various technical departments concerned with the imparting of such courses in the State. It also functions as the highest body at the State level to advise on policy matter connected with the imparting of technical education and its future development. The main activities of the Department fall into the following broad categories :—

- (a) Implementation of the Plan for Technical Education.

- (b) Grants-in-aid to non-Government institutions after adjudging their suitability.
- (c) Grant of loans and scholarships to deserving students.
- (d) Conduct of examinations and award of diplomas and certificates.

3. During 1967-68, Plan provision of Rs. 35 lakhs was approved for the schemes relating to Technical Education. Against this Annual Plan provision, the modified budget grant was to the tune of Rs 31.96 lakhs and the actual expenditure was Rs. 30.24 lakhs.

Every effort was made to utilise the funds allotted for Plan schemes fully. The position of funds allotted from April, 1967 to 31st March, 1968 and expenditure on technical education schemes, both Non-Plan and Plan, including expenditure on buildings and loans to students is as under :—

Degree Courses

4. *Regional Engineering College, Kurukshetra.*— This is the only institution for degree courses in Engineering in Haryana State. The Regional Engineering

College, Kurukshetra, established in 1963 is a joint enterprise of the Government of India and the State Government. The Institution is managed by the Board of Governors of Regional Engineering College, Kurukshetra Society. The College is affiliated to Kurukshetra University. It imparts training to students in five years integrated B.Sc. (Engineering) Degree Courses in Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering. The annual intake capacity of the College is 250. Fifty per cent of the total seats are reserved for candidates hailing from Haryana State.

5. *Kothari Institute of Engineering Technology, Faridabad.*—In view of heavy intake of Civil Engineering in Colleges throughout country and also increasing unemployment amongst Civil Engineers it was considered that there was no further scope for Civil Engineers in the absence of some practical training in Industries etc. The Haryana State has an ample scope for industrialisation. To meet the demand of engineers for industries, it is necessary that sandwich courses on U.K. pattern be introduced so that the students could get practical as well as theoretical training. Kothari Foundation in collaboration with the Central/State Government has decided to establish a degree level Institute of Engineering and Technology at Faridabad where sandwich type courses on U.K. pattern in Mechanical, Electronics and Chemical Engineering would be provided.

Diploma Courses

6. There are four Government and two non-Government Polytechnics catering for Engineering Diploma Courses in Civil, Electrical, Mechanical and Automobile Engineering :—

Government Polytechnics

- (1) Government Polytechnic, Ambala City.

- (2) Government Polytechnic, Jhajjar.
- (3) Haryana Polytechnic, Nilokheri.
- (4) Government Polytechnic, Sirsa.

Non-Government Polytechnics

- (1) Chhotu Ram Polytechnic, Rohtak.
- (2) Vaish Technical Institute, Rohtak.

7. The total intake capacity in all these ~~three~~ institutions is 1,080. The minimum educational qualification for admission to diploma course is Matriculation or its equivalent with Science and Mathematics. The duration of the diploma course is three years. The examinations of all classes are conducted by the State Board of Technical Education.

8. Y.M.C.A. Institute of Engineering, Faridabad.—
The product of Polytechnics has not been able to make much impact on the industry. The industrialists who are the main employers of this product find them deficient in practical approach and lacking in comprehensive understanding of the industrial job. The main reason for this deficiency is that the training of the present diploma holders is mainly confined to the institutions, and they are hesitant to take initiative and to work with confidence on various industrial operations; and are also not conversant with important aspects of production, such as costing, quality control and industrial management. To overcome the above deficiency, the State Government have decided to establish an Institute of Engineering of Sandwich Course on German pattern in collaboration with Y.M.C.A. of India with the active co-operation of Government of India.

The total cost of the scheme is as under :—

9. *Junior Technical Schools*.—These institutions prepare the students for general education upto Matric standard and specialization is one of the trades viz. machining, turning, smithy, moulding, pattern making, sanitary, welding and electrical. The only two schools in existence are (i) Government Junior Technical School, Gurgaon, (ii) Government Junior Technical School, Nilokheri with an intake capacity of 120 students each. The minimum educational qualification for admission to Junior Technical School course is Middle School Examination or its equivalent with Science, Mathematics and English. Academic duration of the course is three years. The examinations of Junior Technical Schools are conducted by the State Board of Technical Education and the successful students are awarded certificates.

10. Control/Affiliation of Diploma Institutions.—The following Diploma Institutions remained under the control of Director, Technical Education, Haryana, during the year under report :—

11. The Diploma Institutions remained affiliated to the State Board of Technical Education during the year under report.

12. Grant-in-aid.—Grant-in-aid, both non-recurring and recurring, is paid to the non-Government technical institutions as per pattern of assistance laid down by the Government of India.

13. The grant-in-aid given to the private/semi-Government institutions during the year under report is given below :—

14. Grant of Loan and Scholarship.—Interest-free loans are granted to the deserving Haryanvi students to prosecute studies in engineering courses in the engineering institutions located in Haryana State ; Union Territory, Chandigarh ; Guru Nanak Engineering College, Ludhiana; Thapar Engineering College, Patiala and all Regional Engineering Colleges in the country. The Haryanvi

students studying in the institutions now located in Punjab, Union Territory, Chandigarh and areas transferred to Himachal Pradesh, who were paid some instalment(s) of loan before reorganisation in 1966, were also sanctioned loan during 1967-68. The loans sanctioned to the students during 1967-68 totalled Rs. 6.85 lakhs.

15. Scholarships and Stipends.—Scholarships are awarded to the deserving students of diploma level to the extent of 10 per cent of the total intake. Out of these 1/3rd of the value of Rs. 20 per mensem each are awarded on merit basis and 2/3rd at Rs. 40 per mensem each on merit-cum-means basis.

16. In case of Junior Technical Schools merit scholarships are awarded to 50 per cent of students on roll and Rs 20 permensem each during first and second years, Rs. 30 per mensem each during the final year. Out of these 1/3rd are given on merit basis and 2/3rd on merit-cum-means basis.

17. In addition to above-mentioned scholarships and stipends, Government of India/Director of Public Instruction, Haryana, also award scholarships on merit as well as on other considerations, such as scheduled castes, backward classes, etc.

18. Examinations.—The Annual/Supplementary Final Year Diploma Certificate examinations of the institutions affiliated to the State Board of Technical Education, Haryana, were conducted during the year under report and the pass percentage of the results of the above-said examination is as under :—

19. Administration.—Shri J.S. Marya, Chief Engineer, Haryana, P.W.D., B.&R. Branch, was appointed as Director, Technical Education, Haryana, in addition to his duties as Chief Engineer on 1st November, 1966 and continued to hold charge of this post up to 1st September, 1967. The charge of the post of Director, Technical Education, Haryana, was taken over by Shri I.C. Gupta with effect from 2nd September, 1967 who continued as such till 6th February, 1968 with the association of Shri J.S. Marya continuing for overall guidance and supervision. Shri J. S. Marya again took over charge of the office of the Director, Technical Education, Haryana, on the 7th February, 1968 and continued during the year.

CHAPTER I

Administrative Report of Directorate of Technical Education, Haryana for the year 1967-68

TECHNICAL EDUCATION

General.—A provision of Rs 35.00 lacs was made in the Annual Plan for Plan Schemes falling under Plan head 23—Technical Education. Out of this Rs 13.00 lacs was meant for development of Degree Courses, Rs 8.80 lacs for Diploma Courses, Rs 6.85 lacs on loans, Rs 1.26 lacs for the schemes of Industries and Industrial Training Department which fall under Technical Education and remaining amount on staff quarters, students amenities etc. The annual intake capacity of diploma/level institutions situated in Haryana State was 1,140 during this year. The annual intake capacity of degree level institution remained 250 and in Training Institute, Rewari 25 during this year.

Technical Education has been made free up to Diploma level in all the Institutions of the State with effect from 1st August, 1962 and during this year a sum of Rs 0.44 lac has been paid as freeship to the students of C.R. and Vaish Technical Institutes, Rohtak and Private Industrial Schools.

Brief description of activities of these institutions is given below :—

(a) Educational Tours.—The students of final year, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering were taken to extensive educational tours, to places of engineering importance and interest. In addition to this long tour efforts were made to make use of holidays and week ends for visiting neighbouring factories and works, workshops etc.

(b) Examinations.—The results of the State Board Examinations are shown at Appendix No. I at Pages Nos. 44-60 32-33.

The examinations for the diploma/certificate courses are conducted by the State Board of Technical Education. The diplomas/certificates awarded by the State Board to the successful candidates are recognised for the purposes of recruitment/appointment to services under the State Government/Government of India. The institution of Engineers (India) has also granted exemption to the State Board Diploma Holders from studentship examinations.

The certificates are also awarded to the students of the Government Junior Technical Schools which are recognised by the Punjab University as equivalent to the Matriculation certificate.

(c) Scholarships and Stipends.—Scholarships are awarded to the deserving students of Diploma level to the extent of 10 per cent of the total intake. Out of these 1/3rd at Rs 20.00 per mensem each are awarded on merit basis and 2/3rd at Rs 40 per mensem each on merit-cum-means basis.

In case of Junior Technical Schools merit scholarships are awarded to 50 per cent of students on roll at Rs 20 per mensem each during first and second year and Rs 30 per mensem each during the final year. Out of these 1/3rd are given on merit basis and 2/3rd on merit-cum-means basis.

(d) Engineering Education loans.—A sum of Rs 35 lacs has been provided in the Fourth Plan for grant of loan to the needy and deserving

Haryanvi students to prosecute, studies in Engineering courses in the Engineering Institutions located in Haryana State, Union Territory, Chandigarh and all Regional Engineering Colleges in the country. Deserving Haryanvi students prosecuting studies outside Haryana State in other Recognised Institutions in such courses for which facilities are not available in the State are also entitled to this facility. Loans worth Rs 6.85 lacs have been granted to the students during 1967-68.

(e) Freeship.—No tuition fee is charged from the students of Government Diploma Technical Institutions and Industrial Schools and State Government has allowed similar concessions to the students of such private Institutions and compensation to the extent of fee charged in Government Institutions is given to the private institutions in lieu of freeship allowed by them to their students. During 1967-68 freeships to the extent of Rs 0.44 lacs have been allowed.

(f) Administration.—Shri J. S. Marya, P.S.E. (I), Chief Engineer, P.W.D., B. & R. Branch, Haryana, held the charge as Director from 1st April, 1967 to 1st September, 1967 and Shri I.C. Gupta, Superintending Engineer, P.W.D., B. & R. from 2nd September, 1967 to 6th February, 1968. Shri Marya again took over the charge from Shri Gupta on 7th February, 1968 and continued during the remaining period under report. During the year under report the Technical Education Department carried on its normal activities connected with the conduct of examinations of Polytechnics/Government Junior Technical Schools.

Shri S. R. Nayar, M. Sc., Assistant Director-cum-Registrar (Exam.) continued to hold the charge of Assistant Director-cum-Registrar (Exam.) and Shri Siri Ram, H. S. A. S. continued to hold the charge of Assistant Accounts Officer during the year under report.

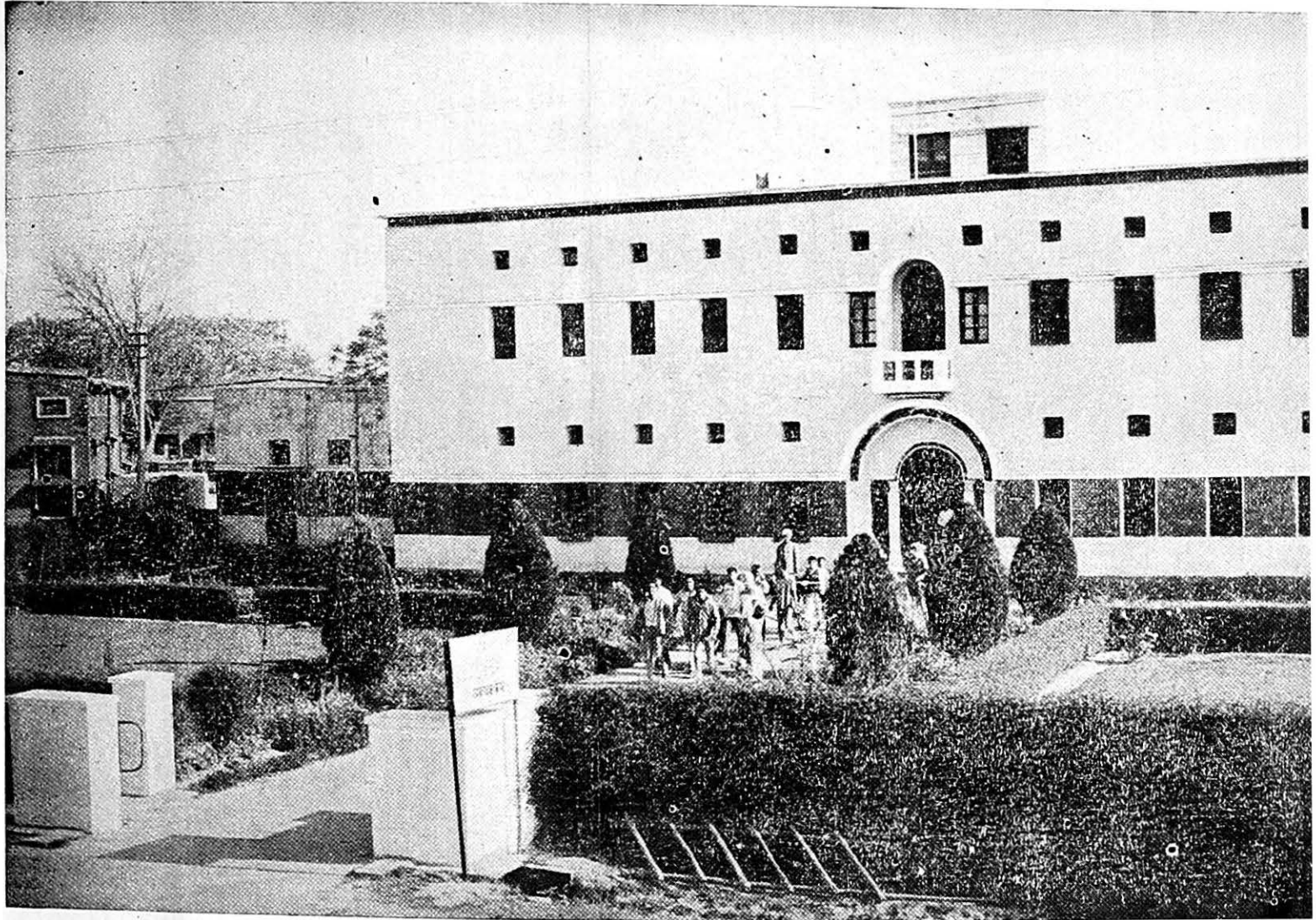

CHAPTER 2

I. HARYANA POLYTECHNIC, NILOKHERI

After partition the Government of Punjab (India) established its own Engineering School at Gurdaspur in November, 1947, to meet their requirements of Subordinate personnel. The Institution was shifted to Chhachhroli (Kalsia State) in November, 1950. The accommodation at Chhachhroli being inadequate the school was shifted again in October, 1951 to Nilokheri. Realising the necessity of a large number of technical personnel for implementing huge projects included in the 2nd five-year plan and subsequent plans, Government of India recommended that Government School of Engineering, Nilokheri, under the control of the Public Works Department and Nilokheri Polytechnic, Nilokheri, under the Punjab Industries Department, be merged and annual intake be increased. Accordingly Government School of Engineering, Nilokheri, and Nilokheri Polytechnic, Nilokheri, were merged on 20th May, 1958 and the combined Institution was named as "Punjab Polytechnic, Nilokheri". It started functioning with an intake of 240 which was further increased to 300 in 1963-64. This Institution has been renamed as Haryana Polytechnic Nilokheri on the formation of Haryana State.

The Institution is located at Nilokheri in Karnal District at a distance of 0.4 Kilometer from G.T. Road.

The function of the institution is to impart the Oratical instruction and practical training in Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Branches of Engineering for three years. The examinations are conducted by State Board of Technical Education, Haryana and the diplomas to successful candidates are awarded by this body. The diploma is recognised by the Government of India as equivalent to the National Certificate and also exempts the students from studentship Examination of the A.M.I.E. Organisation.

Junior Technical School which came into existence with effect from 1st July, 1965, within the campus of this Institute and under the administrative control of a Principal imparts training oratical and practical to students in Technical trades, viz., Turner, Machinist, Moulder, Fitting, Pattern Making, Smithy, etc. Three years of its existence have been completed and the Training work is being carried out efficiently. The aim of starting this scheme to diversify the present education system in the higher Secondary schools to provide technical education to most of the boys between the age 13 and 16 and to provide allurements to the passed out candidates to seek admission into

Polytechnics for further training at Diploma level and also to seek gainful employment in the commercial field of life.

The annual intake of the students of this Institute is 300 for diploma Courses and 60 for J.T.S.

The Institute is fairly equipped for the training work as per standard laid down by the All-India Council for Technical Education.

2. Scholarships and Stipends

3. Staff

Admission to Diploma courses was done in August, 1967 and no result of final Examination was declared upto 31st March, 1968 as the final Examination generally take place during April/May of the next year.

5. Educational Loan

Loans are granted by the Government to the deserving students of this Institute, under the Punjab Engineering Education Loan Rules to the extent of funds available. The deserving students desirous to have loan under these rules are required to submit plain applications on the prescribed form.

Prizes were given to the students standing first and second in the examination and games.

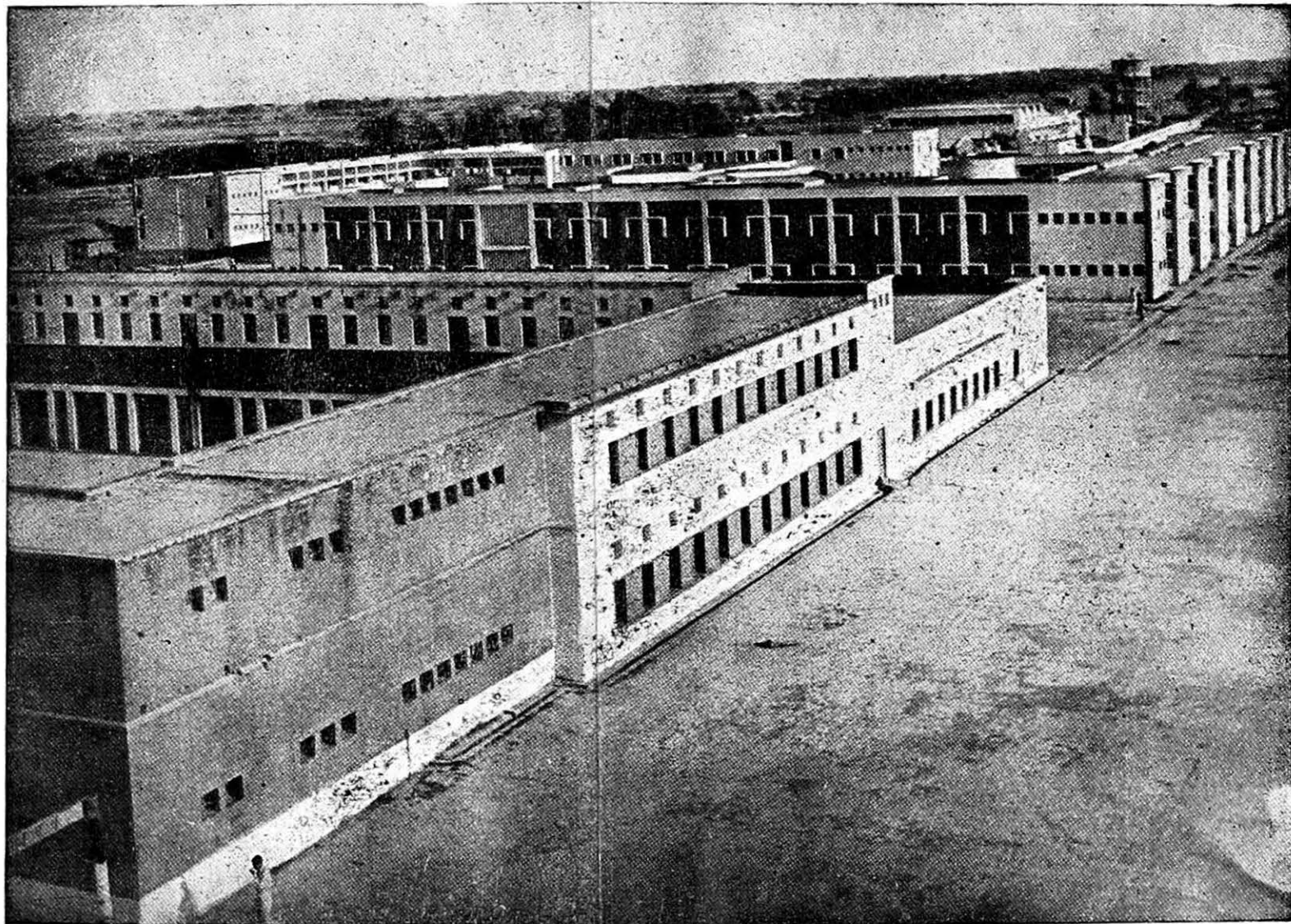
7. Hostels and Building Accommodation

The new building which comprises of Lecture Halls, Drawing Halls, Examination Hall has sufficient accommodation for all the classes. The workshop, laboratories and Administrative Offices are housed in the old building.

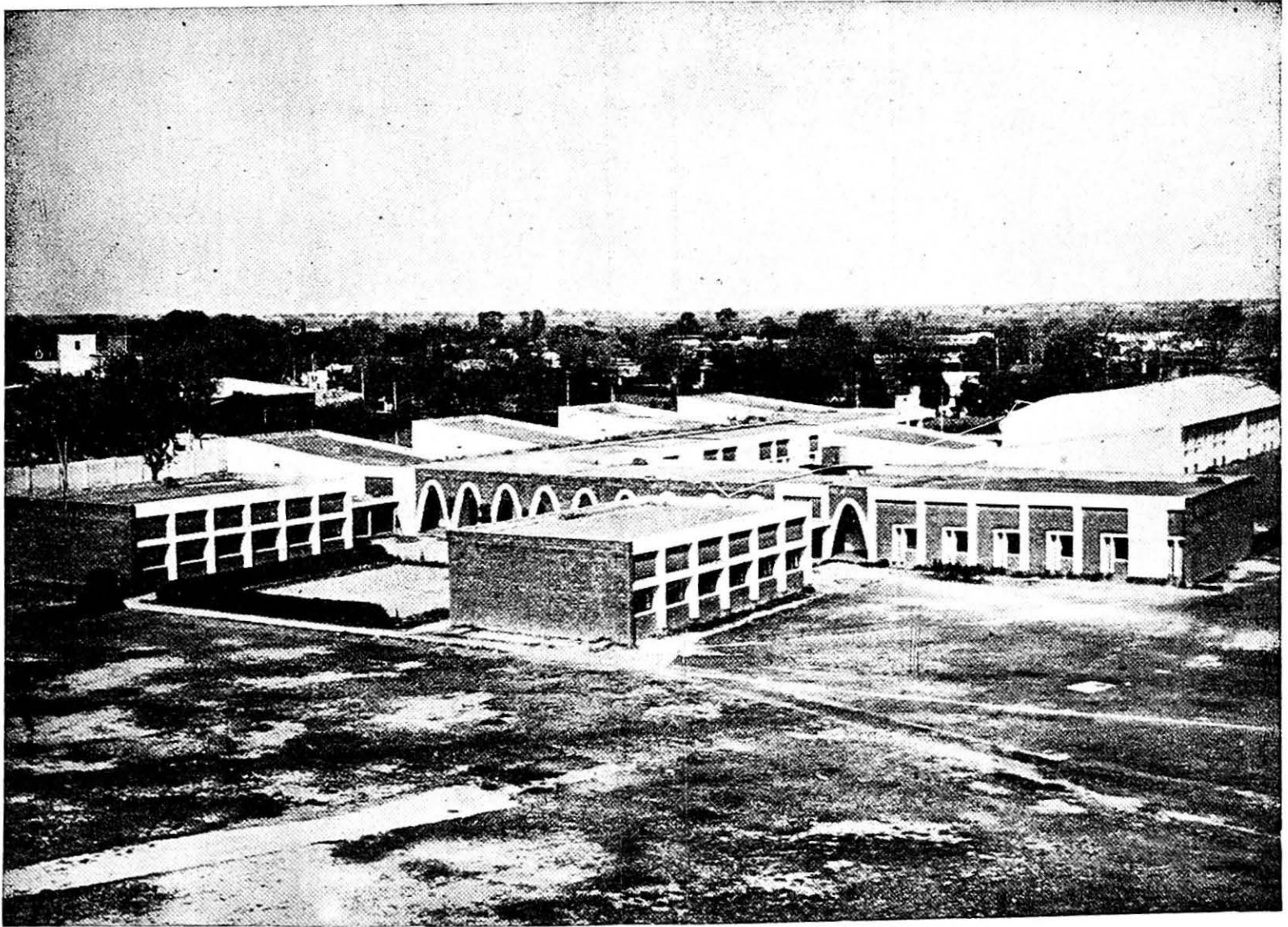
Hostel.—Institute is a residential one and has sufficient Hostel accommodation to house approximately the full intake of the students. The capacity of the four hostels are as under :—

The Institute being residential one, all students are required to reside in the Hostel. Exemption is however allowed to a small category of students whose parents, grand-parents, real brothers, real sisters are residing at Nilokheri proper or near and adjoining stations from where students can easily attend the institute without detriment to their studies and games.

8. Educational Tour

The students of final year Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering classes were taken to extensive educational tour up to Bombay this year in three parties accompanied by the staff members. They visited factories and work of Engineering interest at different places. The tour of all the three parties had been of great educational value to the students.

9. Staff Quarters

Actually residential accommodation provided so far for the staff is very inadequate. Only 8 quarters, 1 for Head of Department, 6 for Lecturers, and one for Instructor/P.T.I. are in existence and eight for Class III staff are coming up. There is rush for the provision of more accommodation at this small colony.

10. Land

The total land with the Institute is 40 acres out of which about 36 acres are lawns and play grounds. The maintenance of these lawns and play grounds is done by the Institute with the help of 9 contingent paid Beldars.

About 8-19 Marlas land across G.T. Road has been acquired for J.T.S. working within the institute campus.

11. Physical Training and Games and Swimming Pools

Physical Training and games are compulsory for every student.

The games provided in the Institute are Football, Volleyball, Cricket, Badminton, Table Tennis, Athletics, and Swimming. A swimming pool exists in the institute which provides good exercise to those who know and are expert in the art.

Inter-Polytechnic Athletic meet did not take place this year on account of the over all strike of the students in different Polytechnics

12. N.C.C.

The Institute stands allotted with 2 rifle companies of strength 200 each. The cadets which received regular training by a contingent of military staff and trained staff members are gradually being moulded into smart and disciplined youngmen.

13. Library

This Institute has the biggest library among all the Polytechnics in the State. In the year under review it had 16,072 books on its registers. Besides these, 32 Nos. of papers magazines and technical journals are available for reading by the students. Library is kept open on Sundays to enable the students and staff to make use of its advantageously.

14. Medical

The Institute is providing medical facilities on its own dispensary with the provision of part-time Doctor and Dispenser. Dispensary is situated within the Institution campus and just near the hostels.

15. Old Boys Association

The Institute maintains proper and organised liaison with the old boys who complete their courses and leave the Institute. It runs an employment cell which has been instrumental in getting the students inducted into good and gainful employment.

16. Cinema and Recreational programme

The Cinema Club of the students Recreational Committee arranges and provides selected social and Technical films fortnightly during the period when institute is in session to meet the recreational and educational needs of the students. These activities are manned with the Institute's own projectors and operators.

CHAPTER 3**GOVERNMENT POLYTECHNIC, AMBALA CITY**

1. The Government Polytechnic, which had its inception as a Government Industrial School in 1929 and later on developed to Metal Works Institute in 1933 was organised in 1948 and it was thereafter known as Government Technical Institute. It had for its object training of young personnel in the production of pumps, small internal combustion engines and machine tools. The institute had a remarkable record of progress during the year which could be judged from the various types of Diesel Engines, Centrifugal pumps and machine tools that were manufactured from time to time. During the war and thereafter the Institute became one of the biggest technical training centres for the training of technicians and subsequently, for the training of displaced persons. As the time had come to take stock of the situation in order to raise the standard of training of the request of Punjab Government, the All-India Council for Technical Education, Government of India, Ministry of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs constituted a Committee to inspect the Institution to put up recommendation for upgrading the Institution diploma standard. On the recommendations of the visiting committee, the scheme of studies was recognised dropping the technician trades and introducing the National Certificate Courses in Electrical and Mechanical Engineering with an intake of 30 in each subject per annum in September, 1955. The Institution which was administered by the Industries Department up till April, 1958 was taken over by the Directorate of Technical Education Punjab and thereafter was renamed as "Government Polytechnic". The annual intake of the institution was increased from 60 to 240 with effect from session 1959-60. The annual intake was further increased to 300 during the session 1963-64. Out of students admitted for Electrical and Mechanical Engineering branches facilities for imparting training for diploma courses in Automobile Engineering are available to 30 students. The conversion and selection of students for this course is done in 2nd year of studies.

The Institution is situated at Ambala City at a distance of about 1.6 Kilometer from the Railway Station near the Civil Hospital.

2. Staff

The staff position in this Institution has been quite satisfactory. The detail of posts sanctioned for the year 1967-68 and those actually filled up are given as per Annexure 'A'.

The final year students were allowed to undertake the educational tour during the year in the month of December, 1967. The students of first and second year were also allowed to undertake small tours in the State of Punjab and Haryana.

9. Institution Magazine

The institution is regularly publishing its Magazine. The students and the staff are taking keen interest in the publication.

10. Educational Film

The institution exhibited Educational and Technical and other useful films to the students during the period under report.

11. Staff Colony

To house the staff of this Institution a colony is a necessity for the smooth and efficient working of the Institution.

12. Lecture/Theatre

A lecture theatre having a capacity of 90 seats is a immediate

necessity as it is very difficult to accommodate these sections in the existing two lecture theatres.

13. Prizes and Medals

Prizes were given to the students standing first in the examination and games.

The institution is providing medals to the students standing first and second during the year.

14. Hostel and Building accommodation

The building of Government Polytechnic, Ambala was completed by the P.W.D. authorities in the year 1960 with Class Room Drawing Halls, Laboratories, etc. The building stands constructed according to the standard laid down by the All-India Council for Technical Education. The building consists of Administrative Block, Drawing Halls, Lecture Halls, various laboratories and library, etc.

Hostel.—The hostel building of this Institution consisting of two blocks (Patiala House Hostel and Institution Hostel) has an accommodation capacity for 345 students as under :—

15. Physical Training and Games

Physical training and games are compulsory for every student which helps the students in the development of hard work habits and their physique.

The games provided in the institution are Football, Volley-Ball, Cricket, Badminton, Table Tennis and athletics.

16. N.C.C.

The institution stands allotted with one company of two hundred boys and one platoon of 68 boys. The cadets receive regular training by a contingent of Military staff.

17. Library

The institution maintains a good collection of books of technical, professional and general interest. The students are allowed to make use of these books. In the year under review it had about 12,000 books on its registers. Library is kept open on the working days to enable the students and staff to make use of it advantageously.

18. Annual Functions

Annual function of Athletic meet in this Institution was celebrated and prizes and merit certificates were awarded to the winners.

19. Blood Donation Club

During the year under report the Blood Donation Club was also framed and 27 students donated blood.

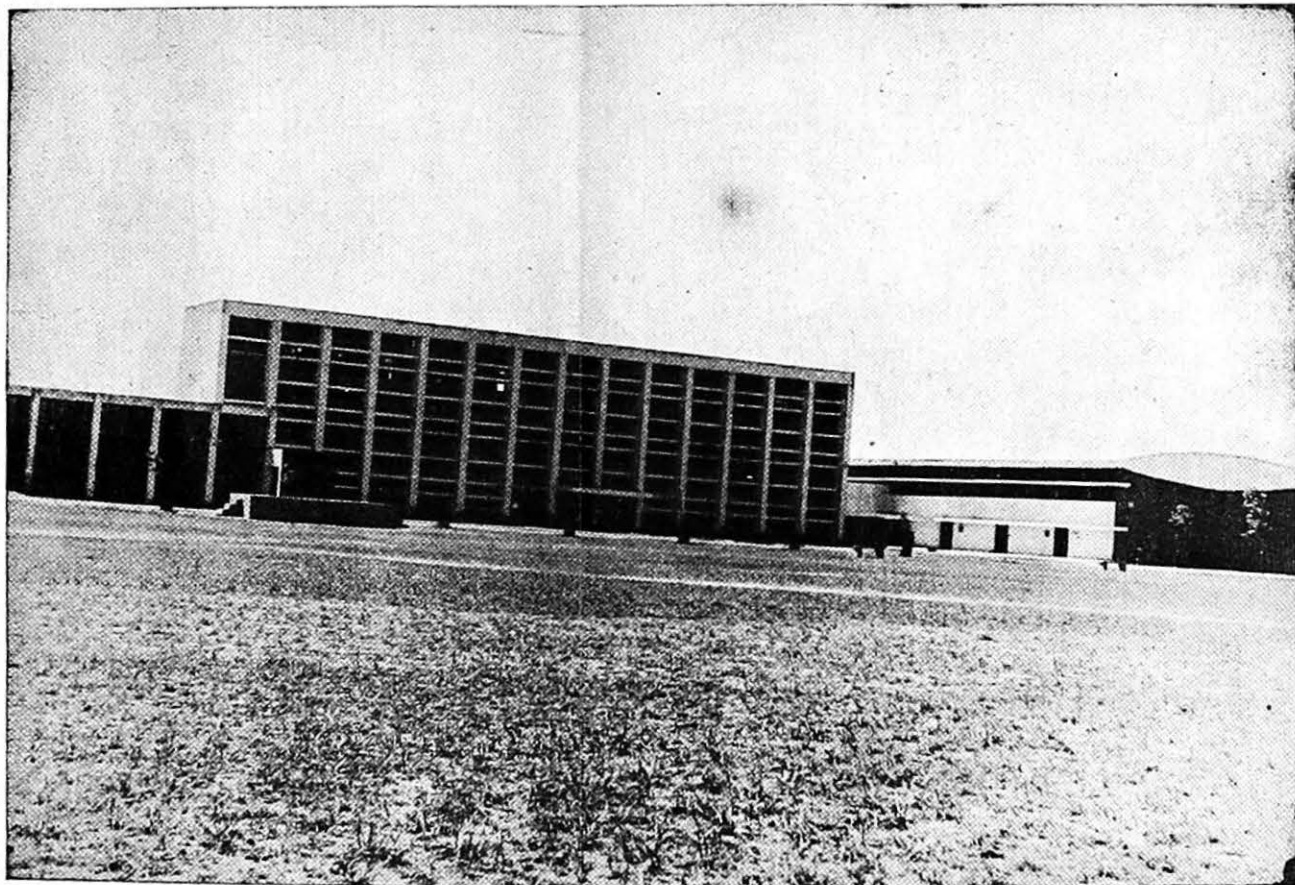

CHAPTER 4

GOVERNMENT POLYTECHNIC, JHAJJAR

1. Government Polytechnic, Jhajjar, was started in the year 1961-62. It is situated on Jhajjar-Bahadurgarh Road at a distance of about three K.M. from the Jhajjar. The nearest Railway Station is Bahadurgarh. The area in which it is situated is very backward and there is lot of scope for its development. The Institution serves a very useful purpose by imparting Technical Education to the students of this area and thus developing their potential for employment.

Staff

2. The position of staff in this institution has been quite satisfactory. The detail of the posts sanctioned for the year 1967-68 and those actually filled up are given as per Annexure A, B and C.

Scholarship

3. In order to encourage Technical Educational large number of scholarships are awarded to the deserving students by the following agencies. The details are given on Annexure 'D' : —

- (1) Government of India 23 scholarships at Rs 50 each.
- (2) D.P.I., Haryana 7 Scholarships of Rs 50 each.
- (3) Haryana Government 16 Merit Scholarships of Rs 20 each.
- (4) Haryana Government 21 merit-cum-necessitous scholarships of Rs 20 each.

Loans

4. The deserving students were given loan by the State Government as per details given below :—

Loan Rules to the extent of funds available. The deserving students desirous to have loan under these rules are required to submit loan application on the prescribed form. No application for loan is considered if not submitted duly completed in all respects.

Prizes and Medals

5. The students take part in different activities such as sports, Dramatic Club, Debate, etc. The students also serve on various committees which are organised for the Welfare of the students. The deserving students were given prizes and certificates at the time of annual function.

Buildings

6. The building of the Institution has been completed according to the standard laid down by the All-India Council of the Technical Education. There is a hostel for 150 seats. But this accommodation is insufficient to cope with the new intake of 180. Sufficient number of staff quarters have also been provided within the campus of the institution. The building which have also since been completed are N.C.C. Block, Canteen and Dispensary.

Equipment and Library

7. The laboratories and workshops are fully equipped according to the standard laid down by the All-India Council of the Technical Education and there is no difficulty in the training of the students.

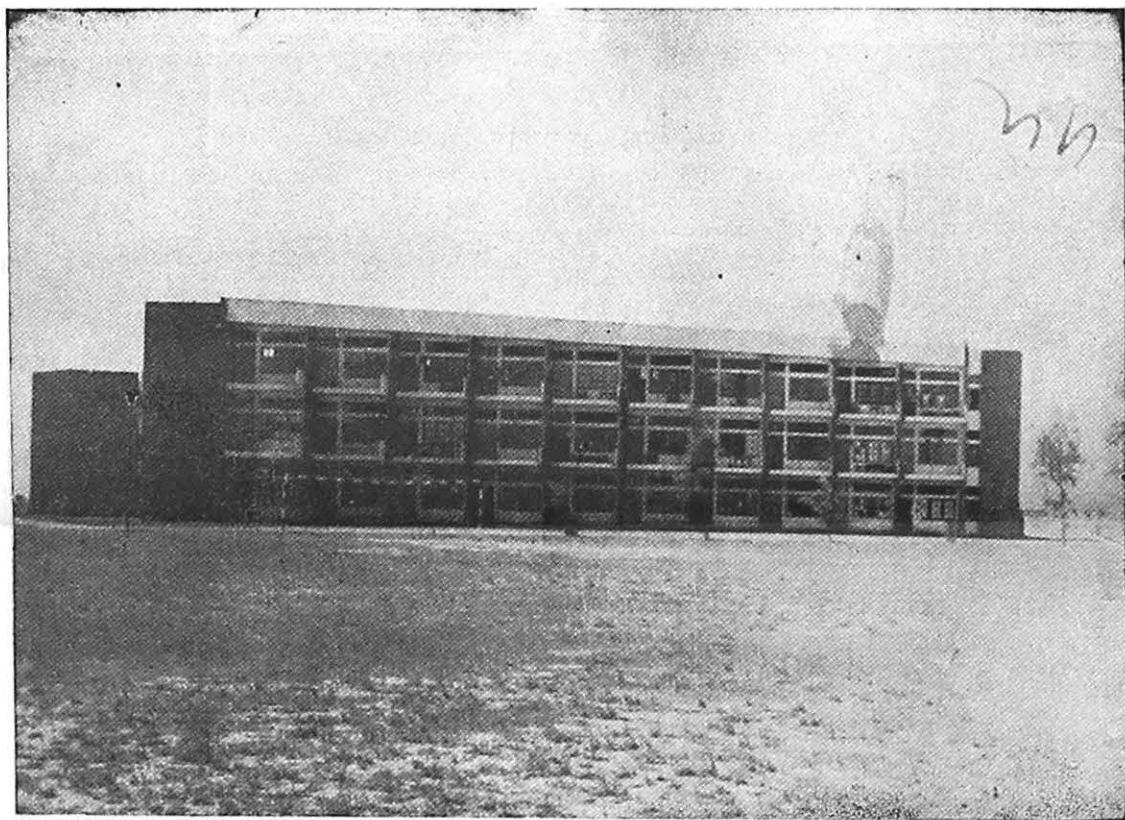
The Institution also has a good library where 5,303 books worth Rs 44,000 approximate, are available.

The students and the members of the staff make full use of the library. A large number of magazines and periodicals are also procured for library.

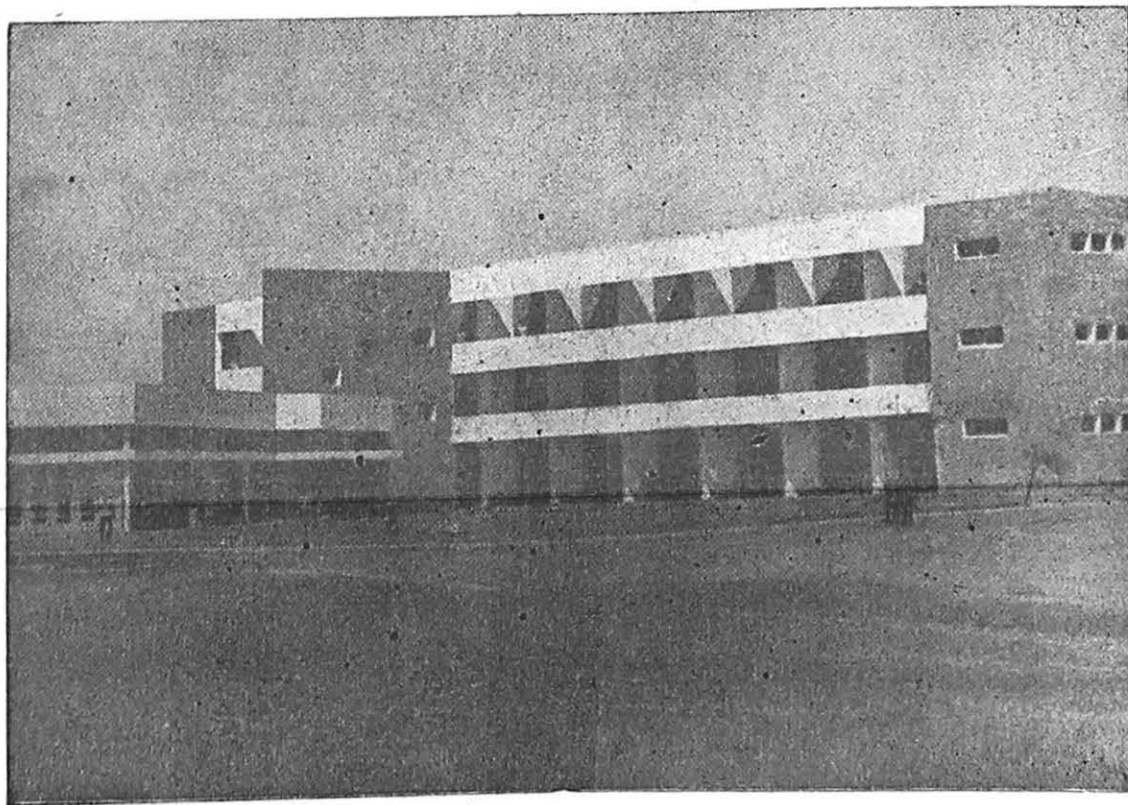
Physical Training and N.C.C.

8. Games are compulsory for all the students. Sufficient playgrounds are available for various games. All the students take part in the games in the evening.

Admission

Admission to Diploma Courses was done during August, 1967. The Institution gives training in the diploma courses of Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering.

Medical Facilities

12. Dispensary building has recently been completed. Part-time medical officers and dispenser have been appointed. Medical services are quite satisfactory.

Educational Tour

13. Educational tour is an important part of the training of the students. Students of all classes were taken on tour and shown

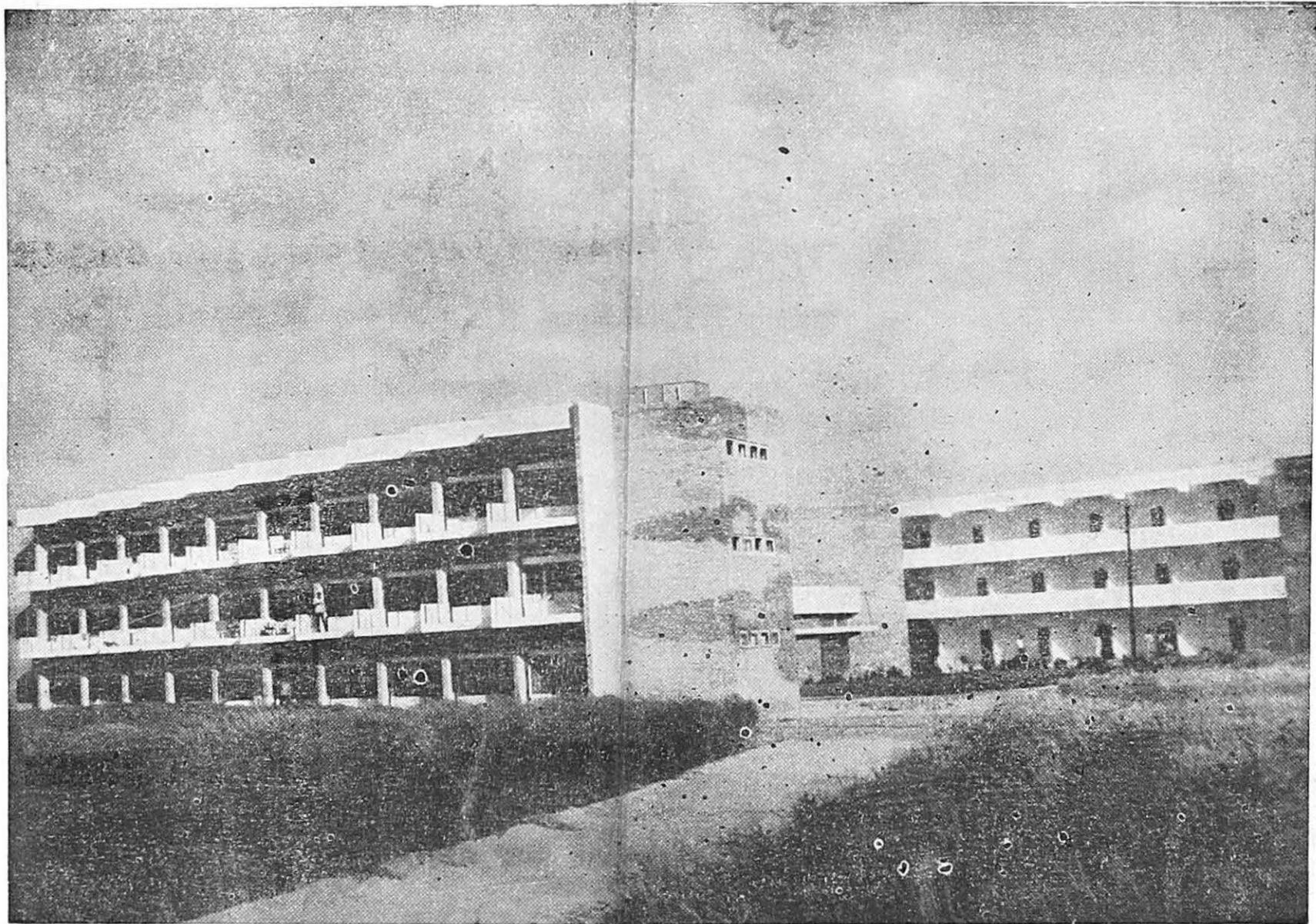
Admission

Building and Hostel

The building of Government Polytechnic, Sirsa was mostly completed by the P.W.D., authorities in the year 1963-64 with class room workshops and Laboratory Block. The Building stands constructed according to the standard laid down by the All India Council for Technical Education. The building consists of Administrative Block, Workshops, Drawing Hall and Lecture Hall, various Laboratories and Library.

Hostel

The hostel building of this Institution consisting on 2 blocks has an accommodation capacity of 180 students as under which is sufficient for local demand of the students. The building in question was constructed by the P.W.D. authorities during the year, 1964-65.

Levelling of Play Ground

The work of levelling of the play ground has been taken up by employing local beldars.

Staff

The position of the staff in this Institution has been quite satisfactory. The detail of the posts sanctioned for the year 1967-68 and those actually filled up are given as per Annexure A, B and C.

Equipment

Efforts for procuring equipment as laid down by the standard of All India Council for Technical Education were made through the Controller of Stores, Haryana, Chandigarh as well as through the Store Purchase Committee constituted for the purpose.

Difficulties were experienced during the year under report and most of the supply orders placed on various firms for the supply of equipments in materials were not matured.

Library Books

The Institution maintained a good collection of books of Technical,

Professional and general interest. The students are allowed free use of these books. The library books worth Rs 2,339.80 were purchased during the year under report i.e., 1967-68.

Examination

Annual Examination of the Polytechnic are usually conducted, during the month of April/May and supplementary in September/October 1967.

The deserving students desirous to have loan under these rules are required to submit an application on the prescribed form.

Annual Functions

Annual function of Athletic meet in this institution was celebrated and prizes and merit Certificates were awarded to the winners in the month of April, 1968.

Medical

The institution is providing medical facilities in its own dispensary with the provision of a part time Doctor and a dispenser.

Educational tour

The students of Final Year Classes were sent on tour to Calcutta side in the year 1967-68.

Cinema and Recreational Programme

The cinema club of the Students Recreational Committee, arranges and provides selected social and technical films fortnightly during the period when institution is in session to meet the recreational and educational needs of the students. These activities are manned with the institute's own projectors and operators.

Staff quarters

At present there are 14 staff quarters to house the various categories of staff. This accommodation is insufficient to cope with the demand of the staff. Efforts are however, being made to provide further facilities of quarters to the staff.

Special Activities

(a) Attention was also paid towards the grow more food programme and about 3½ acres of barren land in the premises of this Polytechnic was brought under cultivation and the produce there from brought a revenue of Rs 1,800 during the year under report.

(b) In the year 1967-68 about 100 plants were planted within the Polytechnic premises during the "Van Mahatasa" week.

CHAPTER 6

GOVERNMENT JUNIOR TECHNICAL SCHOOL,
GURGAON

The scheme for running the Junior Technical School in the State was actually implemented in the month of September, 1959. The aim and the very purpose for the Junior Technical School is to impart education of the Matriculation standard and side by side Workshop training in Mechanical of the preliminary stage. The student is to undergo three years training under this scheme before he is awarded final year certificate by the State Board of Technical Education. Every student is taught all the Mechanical trades as mentioned in the course, but in the final i.e., third year he is to select any one of the trade to specialize in it. The standard of Junior Technical School is equivalent to the Matriculation standard of the Punjab University. The duration of course is three years.

The Government Junior Technical School, Gurgaon is an old institution and is located in Gurgaon Cantt. at a distance of 1.20 K. M. from the district Courts. Its annual intake is 60.
