

Reports on the administration of the local boards in the Bombay Presidency including Sind, for the year 1935-36.

GOVERNMENT OF BOMBAY.

GENERAL DEPARTMENT.

Resolution No. P. 52.

Bombay Castle, 25th March 1937.

Read reports from the Revenue Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners, Northern, Central and Southern Divisions, on the administration of the local boards in their respective charges during the year 1935-36.

RESOLUTION.—*Number of local boards.*—There was no change in the number of district local boards, but on account of the abolition, with effect from 1st October 1935, of all taluka local boards in the Sholapur, Belgaum, Surat, Karachi and Hyderabad Districts, the number of taluka local boards decreased from 217 to 180.

2. *Area and population.*—The area and population of the local boards during the year under report remained the same except in the case of the District Local Board, Sukkur, where there was a slight increase in the area owing to the action of the river and to survey measurements.

3. *Constitution.*—The constitution of the local boards remained unchanged except for the abolition of the taluka local boards mentioned in paragraph 1 above.

4. *Elections.*—General elections were held during the year only in the Southern Division. Lively interest was shown in the election of candidates to all the district local boards except Kanara where members from four talukas were returned without a contest. The elections to the taluka local boards were, however, not so keen, the seats in a large number of cases being uncontested. Twelve seats on taluka local boards had to be filled up by the Collectors under section 18 (3) of the Bombay Local Boards Act. A statement showing the results of the elections in the Southern Division is attached as appendix "A".

5. *Meetings*—

Sind.—The minimum number of meetings prescribed by section 35 (1) of the Bombay Local Boards Act, 1923, was held by all the local boards in Sind.

The percentage of attendance of members of District and Taluka Local Boards was 76.05 and 58.48 respectively as against 75.6 and 62.72 in the preceding year.

Northern, Central and Southern Divisions.—Except in the Northern Division the total number of meetings held by the district and taluka local boards was slightly more than in the previous year. In the Northern Division however the number fell by 34 from 350 during 1934-35 to 316 during the year under report.

The average percentage of attendance of the members at the meetings of the District and Taluka Local Boards was slightly less than in the previous years except in the Central Division where the attendance at these meetings showed a welcome increase of 15 per cent.

The provisions of section 35 (1) of the Bombay Local Boards Act, 1923, were generally observed except in the case of 13 Taluka Local Boards in the Central Division and three Taluka Local Boards in the Southern Division.

6. *Income.*—The aggregate income of the local boards (excluding opening balances and debt) increased from Rs. 1,93,78,936 to Rs. 1,99,22,227. The reasons for the increase in the main sources of revenue are explained below :—

(a) *Local Rates.*—The receipts increased from Rs. 52,33,920 to Rs. 53,79,978. The increase occurred in the Northern Division, and was mainly due to increased collection of the irrigation and local fund cesses.

(b) *Education.*—The receipts increased from Rs. 1,04,64,403 to Rs. 1,06,10,980. The increase occurred in the three Presidency Divisions and was mainly due to increased receipts from fees and Government grants for primary education.

(c) *Medical.*—The receipts decreased from Rs. 3,01,954 to Rs. 2,93,553. The decrease occurred in Sind and in the Central and Southern Divisions and was partly due to (i) the discontinuance of the levy of fees in medical dispensaries in the Nawabshah District with effect from 1st April 1935 and smaller realisations from fees in other Districts and (ii) the stoppage of Government grants on account of the Vaccination Department.

As the progress of rural medical relief which is an obligatory duty of local boards depends on the allocation of adequate funds for this purpose, no District Local Board can afford to neglect the income from fees for treatment given in medical dispensaries. While the poor and the needy have a right to free attendance and treatment, there is no reason why patients who can afford private medical advice should not pay the prescribed fees when they make use of the Board's dispensaries. The action of the Nawabshah District Local Board in abolishing all fees in medical dispensaries in the District is therefore to be deprecated.

(d) *Civil Works.*—The receipts show an increase from Rs. 19,88,407 to Rs. 19,94,142. The increase occurred in Sind and in the Northern Division and was mainly due to (i) enhanced Government grants for communications and (ii) larger receipts from tolls and ferries.

7. *Expenditure.*—The aggregate expenditure of the local boards chargeable to current income increased from Rs. 1,88,19,497 to Rs. 1,94,24,124. The reasons for the increase under the main heads of expenditure are explained below :—

(a) *Administration.*—The expenditure increased from Rs. 7,99,396 to Rs. 8,37,244. The increase occurred in Sind and in the Northern and Central Divisions and was mainly due to the payment of increments to members of the establishments and greater expenditure on account of leave salaries, travelling allowances and the entertainment of additional establishment.

(b) *Education.*—The expenditure increased from Rs. 1,17,34,193 to Rs. 1,21,27,926. The increase occurred in Sind and in all the three Presidency Divisions and was mainly due to (i) the restoration of cuts in the pay of primary school teachers, (ii) the opening of new schools, (iii) the employment of additional staff, (iv) larger expenditure on primary education, and (v) payment of larger contributions to the School Boards.

Medical.—The expenditure decreased from Rs. 13,25,474 to Rs. 13,25,286. The decrease is negligible and calls for no remarks.

Civil Works.—The expenditure increased from Rs. 41,09,004 to Rs. 41,89,511. The increase occurred in Sind and in the Northern and Southern Divisions and was mainly due to increased expenditure on communications, buildings and water supply.

8. *Closing balances.*—The aggregate balances of all the local boards amounted to Rs. 74,97,571, as against Rs. 66,77,934 in the previous year. The closing balances of most of the district local boards were again in excess of the prescribed minima and this was due mainly to the same reasons as in the previous years, *viz.* (i) the accumulation of balances of the district school boards and taluka local boards and other deposits and advances, (ii) the late recovery of local fund cess and (iii) non-completion of budgeted works.

9. *Primary education—Sind.*—There was an addition of a few schools and a small increase in the number of students.

Northern Division.—There was an increase in the number of pupils, night schools and English classes in the Ahmedabad, Kaira and Thana Districts and an increase in the number of pupils in the Surat District.

The District Local Board, Kaira, constructed a new school building at Uttersanda in the Nadiad taluka.

There is a great need for schools in the Panch Mahals and it is hoped that the local authority for this area will devise ways and means to supply this need. The Ashram of the Bhil Seva Mandal and the schools conducted by the Missionaries supplement to some extent the local authority's efforts in the spread of education among the Backward and Scheduled classes in the Panch Mahals. A new school building was constructed at Morwa in the Godhra taluka.

In the Surat District, nine new buildings were completed during the year under report under the Sir Purshottamdas Thakordas School Building Scheme and the construction of thirteen more was sanctioned. This will bring the total number of schools under the Scheme to one hundred. The number of the Sir Purshottamdas Thakordas *Bal* libraries increased from 100 to 150. The District Local Board opened two more English classes.

In the Thana district the number of special schools for the Scheduled classes decreased from 12 to 11. Night schools were opened for the education of adults with a grant-in-aid of Rs. 250 from the village uplift fund at the disposal of the Collector. The number of aided and un-aided schools decreased from 35 to 30.

The District Local Board, Bombay Suburban District, has been reported to be progressive and to have done very good work in the sphere of primary education.

Central Division.—In Poona District the number of primary schools decreased by eight and this was mainly due to the amalgamation of some of the special Scheduled Class Schools and Classes with the main institutions. The number of pupils increased more or less in all districts except in Ahmednagar and Nasik. The decrease in the Ahmednagar District was partly due to the fact that Head Masters were instructed to avoid overcrowding in schools. The decrease in the Nasik District was due to a slight relaxation in the enthusiasm generated by the launching of the village improvement movement.

There was no trouble in any district regarding the admission or seating of depressed class children in the primary schools.

Though there was no increase in the number of Agricultural Bias Classes in Ahmednagar, Poona, Satara and Sholapur districts, the attendance increased by 110.

In order to spread literacy among adults, the Ahmednagar District Local Board in co-operation with the District Village Improvement Committee opened Night Schools in 24 places. The same Local Board also financed a night school at Rashin, Peta Karjat, for adults belonging to the depressed classes. Magic lanterns were provided by the District Local Boards of Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur with the aid of which lectures on educational and Village Improvement subjects were given in the rural areas.

It is encouraging to note that education among the intermediate and depressed classes is being encouraged in all the Districts of the Central Division by way of scholarships and other facilities. Attention is also being paid to the physical education of children by the insistence on games and other exercises in the schools and the introduction of the Boy Scout and Girl Guide movements. There is however a danger in the indiscriminate spread of these movements in the rural areas without proper guidance and control by trained officers of the authorised District or Central Organisation.

Except in one case the relations between the District School Boards and their local authorities, the District Local Boards, were cordial.

Southern Division.—Although there was an increase in the number of schools and students in some districts, there was no marked progress of primary education in the Division as a whole.

In Belgaum nearly 56 per cent. of the Scheduled class pupils attended *ordinary* schools, a circumstance which testifies to the fact that in this area deep-rooted social disabilities are gradually disappearing. The District Local Board, Belgaum, granted this year 14 scholarships valued at Rs. 475 and spent Rs. 525 by way of prizes in order to encourage Scheduled Class pupils to receive education.

In Kanara the Scheduled class pupils recorded an increase of 13 per cent. during the year and the Board deputed one Scheduled class girl for training in the Training College, Dharwar, where she obtained a 1st Year Certificate. A note-worthy feature of the year in this District is that 30 new schools have been started by the village improvement committee and tuition is given by primary school teachers in spare hours. The District Local Board, Kanara, remitted one month's school fees in commemoration of the Silver Jubilee of His late Majesty the Emperor King George V.

In Kolaba there has been a rapid increase in the number of Scheduled class children attending schools and every facility is afforded by the local authority by way of scholarships, etc., to encourage the education of children of these classes.

10. *Medical and Public Health*—

Sind.—The District Local Board, Hyderabad, temporarily appointed a touring Medical Officer for the District from February 1936, and also sanctioned the appointment of another touring Medical Officer who is an eye specialist to visit schools in villages for the purpose of examining the eye-sight and general health of school-going children. The board is further subsidising nine private medical practitioners and Unani Hakims by paying them an annual contribution of Rs. 5,400.

A severe outbreak of cholera visited Garhi Yasin in the Sukkur District but the adoption of adequate measures soon brought it under control.

Cholera cases also occurred in almost all the talukas of the Larkana District except Shahdadkot where the adoption of immediate measures counteracted the epidemic.

The District Local Board, Larkana, opened one more dispensary at Kubo, an important agricultural centre in the District.

The District Local Board, Thar Parkar, made arrangements to open two new dispensaries within the Barrage zone.

The District Local Board, Karachi, appointed one mid-wife and one dai during the year under report for maternity cases in the Mirpur Sakro dispensary. The Margaret Gibson Women's Hospital and Maternity Home, Sujawal, has proved to be a very useful and popular institution with the women of the whole district. The District Local Board, Sukkur, opened one new Maternity Home at Khanpur. The District Local Board, Larkana, have started small Maternity Homes attached to some Local Board dispensaries. All the maternity homes are in charge of qualified dais who have received training under Miss Pigott in the Dais Improvement School, Hyderabad. An experiment of appointing trained Dais on retaining fees has been started by the District Local Board, Larkana. The Scheme of appointing seven Lady Doctors in each of the seven Talukas of the Thar Parkar District to render medical aid to women and children was brought into effect by the District Local Board during the year under report. The District Local Board, Upper Sind Frontier, are opening a Maternity Home at Kandhkot and have sanctioned a scheme for the maintenance of trained Dais in improvement centres throughout the district.

Northern Division.—In addition to the grant-in-aid dispensaries maintained by the District Local Boards, the Ayurvedic dispensaries conducted by the District Local Boards, Ahmedabad, Kaira and Thana, are reported to have worked satisfactorily. Two more such dispensaries have been opened by the District Local Board, Kaira. A new dispensary was opened at Mahelol in the Panch Mahals.

The District Local Board, Thana, continued the experiment of opening anti-malarial dispensaries.

Central Division.—During the year under report an epidemic of cholera broke out in all the districts of this Division. There were cases of plague in Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts, and small-pox in the West Khandesh, Nasik and Satara districts. Prompt and sufficient measures were taken in all the districts to combat the epidemics which were soon brought under control.

One ayurvedic dispensary was closed down in the Poona District owing to poor attendance. In the Ahmednagar District all the eight ayurvedic dispensaries were closed as they were not recognised for Government grants and also as a measure of retrenchment necessitated by financial stringency. Two of these eight dispensaries however were subsequently reopened with the aid of popular contributions.

The 47 Medical Relief centres opened in the Satara District are working satisfactorily. Classes were held during the year to train 250 village practising dais collected from 208 different villages and 93 out-fits were distributed among them.

In the Sholapur District the 13 dispensaries started under the "Rural Medical Relief Scheme" worked very satisfactorily. The Sholapur District Local Board also appointed during the year 10 nurses at its dispensaries who helped the Medical Officers besides attending to maternity cases and child welfare work.

Southern Division.—Plague appeared at a few places in all the districts of the Southern Division except Kolaba. Cholera broke out in a virulent form in 62 villages of Belgaum District, 10 villages of Ratnagiri District and in some villages in the Kolaba District. Small-pox was also prevalent in the Kolaba and Kanara districts. Malaria was rampant in some parts of Belgaum, Dharwar and Kanara districts, and the boards concerned distributed quinine liberally in the affected areas. The Belgaum Board also arranged for the administration of quinine injections. The Belgaum, Bijapur and Dharwar Boards carried on regular propaganda work against plague by means of lectures, distribution of leaflets and inoculation. When the cholera epidemic broke out in the Athni Taluka of the Belgaum District, the Board appointed its own special medical officer on anti-cholera duty in addition to the one appointed by Government. Cholera injections were administered on a large scale till the epidemic subsided. It is satisfactory to note that the Kanara Board has adopted a resolution to maintain a midwife at each of its seven dispensaries and has already given effect thereto by appointing midwives in three dispensaries.

11. *Veterinary dispensaries.*—The number of veterinary dispensaries in Sind and the Northern Division remained the same as in the previous year.

The number of veterinary dispensaries in the Central Division increased by five during the year. All the dispensaries in this Division are reported to be working satisfactorily and are growing in public esteem as is shown by the increase in attendance.

In the Southern Division one new veterinary dispensary was opened during the year at Bagewadi by the Bijapur District Local Board. The goat virus vaccination recently introduced by the Veterinary Department is becoming popular in the Kolaba District.

12. *Civil Works.*—The following table shows the Government grants paid to the boards and the amounts actually spent by them from these grants and their own funds on local public works :—

Sind.—All the district local boards spent their entire allotments of the Government grant except those of Nawabshah and Upper Sind Frontier who had unspent balances of Rs. 20,365 and Rs. 17,116 respectively at the close of the year.

Northern Division.—The District Local Board, Kaira, increased its mileage of metalled roads by 3 miles 5 furlongs. The District Local Board, Panch Mahals, failed to spend Rs. 13,070 of the Government grant allotted to it, including a special grant for a culvert on the Halol-Baroda Road. It has however been permitted to utilise this amount during the current year. The Raita Bridge on the Ulhas river in the Thana District was completed by the District Local Board at a cost of Rs. 1,07,000 and was declared open for traffic in May 1936.

The Bombay Suburban District Local Board asphalted a length of two furlongs of the Malad-Marwe road.

Central Division.—The roads maintained by the District Local Board, Poona, are reported to be in a very bad condition. Government hope that the board will find ways and means to provide the necessary funds for their immediate improvement.

Southern Division.—Except in Kanara and Dharwar all the other boards spent more on communications than in the previous year.

13. *Village Water Supply.*—The following table shows the Government grants to District Local Boards for the improvement of village water supply and the amounts spent by them from these grants and their own funds :—

Sind.—The Karachi, Hyderabad, Thar Parkar, Upper Sind Frontier and Dadu District Local Boards had unspent balances from Government grants. The District Local Boards, Upper Sind Frontier, Karachi and Hyderabad constructed 3, 5 and 32 new wells respectively during the year under report. The District Local Board, Upper Sind Frontier, also sanctioned a scheme of sinking tube wells at 100 selected villages at an estimated cost of Rs. 10,000.

Northern Division.—None of the boards except the Bombay Suburban District Local Board were able to expend fully the Government grants allotted to them for village water supply. Government sanctioned a special grant of Rs. 10,000 for providing increased facilities in respect of water supply for the Scheduled Classes during the year under report but Rs. 5,503 only could be spent on this account by the end of the year.

Central Division.—With the exception of the District Local Boards of Satara and Sholapur, all the other boards had large unspent balances of Government grants left with them at the close of the year.

Southern Division.—The unspent balances of Government grants except those of the Belgaum and Bijapur District Local Boards were excessive. All the Boards have been taking action to post notice boards showing that the wells vesting in them are open to all classes and creeds without distinction.

14. *Standing Committees and other Committees—Sind.*—All the local boards appointed Standing Committees as required by section 36 (1) of the Bombay Local Boards Act, 1923, but none of the District Local Boards except Hyderabad formed Works Committees.

Northern, Central and Southern Divisions.—All the District Local Boards in the Presidency except those of the Panch Mahals and the Bombay Suburban District appointed Standing Committees. The majority of the District and

Taluka Local Boards in the Central Division and a few of the local boards in the other two divisions appointed Works Committees. All the District Local Boards in the Central Division appointed Budget Committees but this practice was not generally followed in the other two Divisions.

15. *Village Panchayats and Village Sanitary Committees—Sind.*—There were no village panchayats in Sind but the number of Village Sanitary Committees increased from 218 to 219.

Northern Division.—The number of Village Panchayats increased from 53 to 78 during the year while the number of Sanitary Committees fell from 43 to 38. Village Benches under section 37 of the Bombay Village Panchayats Act, 1933, were constituted at Hansot and Zadeshwar in the Broach and Panch Mahals District.

Central Division.—As a result of the impetus given by the "Village Uplift Movement" the total number of village panchayats increased from 183 to 278. The District Local Board, Ahmednagar, has sanctioned the appointment of a Village Panchayat Officer for supervising and guiding the panchayats in its jurisdiction. The District Local Board, Sholapur, held a class for training Village Panchayat Secretaries, which was very successful. The large increase in the number of Panchayats in the Central Division need not be a cause for undue optimism because at present only a few panchayats can be said to be doing really useful work. Several existing panchayats are either dormant or are functioning indifferently well.

The number of Sanitary Committees remained the same as in the preceding year, *viz.*, 26.

Southern Division.—The number of village panchayats increased from 61 to 91. The village uplift movement is on the whole gaining in popularity and it is satisfactory to note that most of the village panchayat committees except those in Dharwar have been working fairly well.

The number of Sanitary Committees fell from 63 to 61.

16. *Audit of Accounts—Sind.*—While auditing the accounts of a Taluka Local Board in the Karachi District the Government Auditor suspected the genuineness of a transaction in which Rs. 269 had been paid to a contractor, and as a result of an investigation held by the Criminal Investigation Department the President of the Taluka Local Board concerned, the contractor and the surveyor were prosecuted. As the result of another serious irregularity noticed by the auditors in the accounts of a District Local Board for the year 1934-35, the President had to resign his post and a member of the Board was removed from office. Excess payments in a few cases have been recovered and a few of the minor irregularities pointed out by the auditors have been or are being set right.

Northern Division.—The audit notes of local boards revealed the usual irregularities, *viz.*, (1) negligence in recording measurements of works, (2) want of completion certificates, (3) irregular payments of travelling allowance, (4) absence of, and deviation from, sanctioned estimates and budget provision for works under execution, (5) slackness of supervision, (6) buying of materials in excess of requirements and (7) late remittance of cattle pound receipts.

The following serious irregularities were also detected :—

(i) Delay on the part of a President of a District Local Board in investing local funds, resulted in his being directed to pay up the loss of interest to the Board under section 11 of the Local Fund Audit Act, 1930.

(ii) A surprise verification of the cash balance of a taluka local board in the Thana District by the Chief Officer of the district local board, revealed a deficit of Rs. 1,644-1-2. A criminal complaint was lodged against the clerk concerned and he was convicted and sentenced to pay a fine of Rs. 500 and suffer rigorous imprisonment for 8 months.

(iii) The overseer of a Taluka Local Board in the Thana District made certain alterations in the original estimates of construction of a well and accepted inferior materials in the case of two other works.

The punishment recommended by the Taluka Local Board in this case, *viz.*, the stoppage of the overseer's increment, appears to be inadequate.

Central Division.—The Audit Notes of the local boards do not show any serious irregularities that require special mention. Among the common irregularities were :—

(1) a number of cases pertaining to repair and construction works in which (a) payments were made contrary to law or (b) there were material irregularities in the accounts ;

(2) petty mis-appropriation of amounts by pound keepers ;

(3) non-enforcement of the penalty clause in contract bonds for non-completion of works by contractors within the stipulated time.

The last irregularity was also noticed in the previous year's report.

Southern Division.—A case of mis-appropriation of money belonging to a local board came to light in the Dharwar District and as a result of the action taken by the Collector, the President of the Taluka Local Board and the sub-overseer were convicted by the Session Judge and sentenced to rigorous imprisonment for two years and one year respectively. The convictions were however set aside by the High Court on the ground of a technical flaw, in that the formal sanction of Government was not obtained for the prosecution of the President. This omission has since been made good.

17. *General Remarks—Sind.*—As usual, the administration of the district local boards in Sind was more satisfactory than that of the taluka local boards, but there is still much room for improvement in the matter of village water supply, communications and medical relief. The condition of roads in the rural areas as a whole is still far from satisfactory and requires increasing attention from the District Local Boards.

Taluka local boards in the Karachi and Hyderabad districts were abolished during the year under report but no difficulty has been experienced in the management of local board affairs owing to this abolition.

Northern, Central and Southern Divisions.—The administration of the boards was on the whole satisfactory and the majority of these bodies evinced a spirit of co-operation with Government officers especially of the Revenue and Public Health Departments in matters connected with the rural uplift scheme. Among public works undertaken by boards, the completion of the Raita Bridge during the year by the District Local Board, Thana, was a notable achievement.

Government are concerned to note that while new village panchayats are springing up as the result of the stimulus provided by the village improvement scheme, many of the existing panchayats are not functioning satisfactorily. It is however encouraging to find that certain panchayats in the Broach and Kaira Districts are doing excellent work and it is hoped that their example will be followed by panchayats in other districts. The District Local Board, Sholapur, continued to show keen interest in the village uplift scheme and its attitude in this respect has stimulated the progress of several beneficent activities for the general improvement of conditions in the rural areas of the District.

There has been a marked improvement in the facilities provided by District Local Boards in the Central Division for the admission of children belonging to the scheduled classes into public schools without restriction. There has not been the same progress however in the matter of throwing open of public wells to members of the scheduled classes, especially in the Northern Division. The Commissioner, Northern Division, has been constrained to remark in this connection that "it seems clear that in most cases the solution is the provision of separate wells for them".

It is satisfactory to note that some District Local Boards in the Southern Division made serious efforts to combat epidemic diseases. Special mention must be made in this connection of the District Local Board, Bijapur, which employed two medical officers throughout the year to combat epidemic diseases.

and to look after the general sanitation and health of the rural areas. This Board has not however been similarly progressive in the sphere of primary education as it has failed to build new schools which are urgently needed, notwithstanding large accumulated balances composed of local fund cess collected at enhanced rate.

The financial position of the District Local Board, Dharwar, is very unsatisfactory and the time has come for it to review this position and find means to augment its resources so as to discharge its obligations adequately. Many of the District Local Boards in the Presidency have still to show improvement in the matter of efficient budgeting of works. The deficiency in this respect is apparent from the large balances held at the end of the year which are partially due to the non-completion of budgeted works.

18. *Special features.*—During the year under report, legislation was passed empowering Government to abolish taluka local boards, wherever necessary. This has resulted in the abolition with effect from 1st October 1935 of all the taluka local boards in the Surat, Sholapur, Belgaum, Karachi and Hyderabad districts.

Another important piece of legislation that was passed by the Council during the September-October Session of 1936 was the widening of the franchise for district and taluka local boards to the same extent as that prescribed for the Bombay Legislative Assembly under the new Constitution. It is hoped that as a result of this legislation the backward and Scheduled classes will be enabled to come into the representational scheme of local boards in a more satisfactory manner than at present.

In a recent case brought to the notice of Government, a District Local Board, notwithstanding the Commissioner's advice to the contrary, punished inadequately an overseer who was proved to be guilty of dishonest practice in the course of his duty. This case is cited as an instance to show how some boards do not yet realise fully their public responsibilities. In the opinion of Government any tolerance by a local body of dishonesty on the part of a member of its staff is contrary to the interests of the public who contribute to the funds of the local body in the hope that such funds will be guarded in a spirit of trusteeship.

19. Government have accepted the suggestion made by the Government of India that an abstract statement containing information relating to the District Local Boards in the form of Table No. 134 of the Statistical Abstract for British India (12th issue) may be attached as an appendix to the Annual Report on the Administration of Local Boards. The requisite abstract is attached to this review as Appendix B.

20. Government note with satisfaction the remarks of the Commissioners and Collectors regarding the excellent work done by several Presidents, Vice-Presidents and officers of district local boards.

21. Copies of the Resolution should be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Government of India, the Government of Sind and to the Commissioners, Collectors and other officers and Departments concerned.

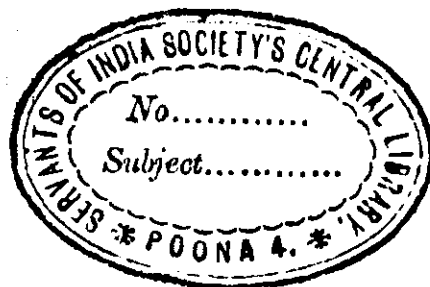
