## MONEY AND BANKING, 1936/37

#### PREFACE

These two volumes are a continuation of the memoranda on Commercial Banks issued in 1931, 1934 and 1935 and of Money and Banking, 1935/36, issued in 1936.

The first volume, *Monetary Review*, contains five separate studies dealing with foreign exchanges in general, forward exchanges, stabilisation funds, the supply of gold and gold reserves and, finally, money rates and bond yields. These studies cover the period from 1929 to March 1937, but the events of the last two or three years are dealt with in greater detail. Seventeen international tables, which summarise the principal monetary statistics of about forty countries, are appended.

In the companion volume, Commercial Banks, one important change has been made. In the earlier editions, each chapter was prefaced by an introductory note either describing the banking structure of the country with which that chapter dealt or, when that had already been done, summarising the important monetary and banking developments of the past year. A description has now been given of all the banking systems of the countries contained in this volume, so that further descriptive notes are no longer necessary — at any rate for the time being. The introductory notes referring to recent events have been replaced in the present edition by additional monetary and related statistics for the period 1929 to March 1937. It is believed that the real trend of developments can be better ascertained from these data relating to a relatively long period than from a survey confined to a single year. Each country continues to be treated separately, and the statistics are accompanied by brief notes explaining the data given and summarising recent legislative and other measures.

The Summary Tables, in which national statistics relating to commercial bank accounts are adapted to a standard balance-sheet form, are carried in most cases up to the end of 1935, whereas for some of the more important countries the accounts for the end of 1936 have been added.

Value of Currency: Gold parity in 1929: 1 paper peso = 0.44 gold peso. Gold standard officially suspended, December 17th, 1929. Exchange control introduced, October 13th, 1931. Since November 29th, 1933, there are two recognised exchange rates for the peso: the official rate (dealings in foreign exchange derived from "regular" exports), which in effect was stabilised on January 19th, 1934, at 15 pesos to the £ sterling, and which was fixed by the Banco Central on January 2nd, 1936, at 15 pesos for the purchase of foreign currency and at 17.02 pesos to the £ sterling for sales; and the free rate (foreign exchange derived from "supplementary" exports, from the liquidation of blocked accounts, etc.). On December 10th, 1936, the official selling rate was brought down to 16 pesos to the £ sterling.

Banco Central de la República Argentina: The Banco Central was established on May 31st, 1935. For the measures leading to its establishment, see Money and Banking 1935/36, Vol. II, page 10. Gold: Valued at the rate of 25 paper pesos to the gold £ (approximately 15 paper pesos to the £ sterling). Non-interest-bearing guarantee bond: Bond issued by the Government to the Bank as cover for that part of the fiduciary issue taken up by the Bank. Consolidated Treasury bills: Bills issued at the time of the establishment of the Banco Central through conversion of the balance of Patriotic Loan bonds deposited as security with the former Caja de Conversión (145 millions), and of Treasury bills deposited as security with the Banco de la Nación Argentina (255 millions). In view of the liquidity of the market, commercial banks took up participation certificates in these bills, which the

Bank must in fact redeem as and when presented by the commercial banks. The amount of such bills thus varies according to the state of the money market. Capital and reserves of Instituto Movilizador de Inversiones Bancarias: Since the establishment of the Instituto Movilizador, these items (10 and 163.6 millions respectively) no longer figure in the Bank statement. Commercial banks have not resorted to rediscount at the Banco Central.

Subsidiary Notes and Coin in Circulation: Notes not exceeding 5 pesos and small coin, excluding amounts held by the Banco Central. The Government is solely responsible for this subsidiary issue.

Commercial Banks: The Act for the control of banking operations (reform enactments of March 28th, 1935) has now come into operation. Publication of banking statistics, which was held up at the time of the banking reform, has not yet been resumed.

#### 18. Rediscounts.

The amounts shown under this heading in the Summary Table represent rediscounts of commercial paper which the Banco de la Nación effected with the Caja de Conversión.

The ordinary banks rediscount commercial paper with the Banco de la Nación and borrow from it against Government securities. As these borrowings represent neither a net asset nor liability of the commercial banking system as a whole, they have been excluded from the Summary Table and are shown separately outside the balance-sheet proper. See following note.

#### 21. Other Borrowings.

As stated above, the Banco de la Nación's rediscounts of commercial paper for the ordinary banks and its advances to them against Government securities have been excluded from groups 3 and 7 under assets and from group 18 under liabilities. They are shown in the present group and were composed in the years under review as follows:

### Summary Balance-sheet.

The Balance-sheet Summary of Australian and New Zealand banks together covers all business in Australia, New Zealand, London and elsewhere and includes capital and reserve accounts.

The table covers the ten trading banks operating in Australia and, in addition, the National Bank of New Zealand, which carries on business only in New Zealand, apart from its London head office. Table 41 (a) therefore represents a combination of Tables 39 (a) and 40 (a) plus the accounts of Australian and New Zealand banks held in London. For the composition of each item in the Summary Table, reference may be made to the detailed notes to the Summary Tables for Australia and New Zealand above. The amounts shown under "1. Cash" include coin and bullion, cash balances, Australian notes, notes of

the Reserve Bank of New Zealand and other banks, money at short call and some relatively small amounts of Government and other securities held by the Bank of New Zealand in London; "2. Other Items of a Cash Nature" refer to bills receivable in London and remittances in transit, including a certain amount of remittances in transit between branches. For the middle of 1935, the Commercial Banking Co. of Sydney, Ltd., is omitted from the profit-and-loss accounts table as the accounts of that bank are not yet available. Its dividends amounted to £0.24 million.

Value of Currency: The exchange control imposed in 1931 was gradually relaxed in the following years by an extension of private clearing transactions, the only restrictions in force at the end of 1936 being those relating to the export of capital. On April 30th, 1934, the gold value of the currency was officially reduced by 21.3%. The gold and foreign-exchange reserve of the National Bank was written up 27%, the revaluation profit of 20.7 million schillings being used for the reconstruction of the Bankverein (involving its amalgamation with the Creditanstalt) and of the Escompte-Gesellschaft.

National Bank: The figures refer throughout to the last date in the year or month shown. Gold and foreign exchange: These items were written up by 27% on April 30th, 1934; the rate at which the revaluation was effected was I schilling = 0.16667 gramme of fine gold.

In addition to the figures for foreign exchange shown above, the annual end-of-year accounts of the National Bank give the following amounts of net foreign exchange under "Other assets" in the years 1929-1935 (in million schillings): 88, 86, 12, 15, 25, 34, 42.

An agreement regarding the settlement of the "live claims" of the Creditanstalt's foreign creditors, amounting to about 200 million schillings, was reached on January 29th, 1936, under which the Austrian Government paid 60 million schillings in cash to the foreign creditors and, in addition, undertook to make an annual payment of 2 million schillings to them for twenty years. The funds required for the cash payment of 60 million schillings were obtained by the Government from the Creditanstalt in exchange for 4% Government bonds. The effects of this operation on the National Bank are reflected in a decline of the Bank's foreign assets in the early part of 1936. The Government bonds received by the Creditanstalt were allocated to its staff pensions fund. Bills discounted: At the end of 1934 and 1935, the National Bank applied almost the whole of its net profit of about 10 million schillings in each year to the writing-off of "frozen" bills of the Industriekredit A.G., which constitute almost its entire bill portfolio. Government debt: The sharp rise in this item in 1932 was due to the reconstruction of the Creditanstalt, in the course of which the Government took over from the National Bank its entire portfolio of rediscounted Creditanstalt finance bills, amounting to 571.4 million schillings, which it subsequently cancelled, and incurred a liability to the Bank to the same amount.

Savings Deposits: The figures comprise the Post Office Savings Bank, other savings banks, commercial banks, mortgage banks and other credit institutions in Vienna and in the provinces.

Interest Rates: Discount rate: Date of last change: July 10th, 1935. Bond yields: 7% International Loan, 1930. Austrian tranche.

#### 22. Other Contingent Liabilities.

Value of Currency: The devaluation rate of the belga, provisionally fixed on March 31st, 1935, at 28% (1 belga = 0.150632 gramme of fine gold), became final on March 31st, 1936. Note convertibility, suspended on March 30th, 1935, was restored on March 31st, 1936, and the Exchange Equalisation Fund created on April 3rd, 1935, was abolished. On September 26th, 1936, the Belgian Government acceded to the Franco-Anglo-American Tripartite Agreement of September 25th, 1936, and in November to the arrangements for ensuring technical co-operation referred to in the Declaration of October 13th, 1936, made by the United States Secretary of the Treasury.

Banque Nationale de Belgique: Last weekly statement of the month, except the end-of-year figures referring to annual balances. Gold: Revalued on March 29th, 1935 (provisional rate of valuation: 25%), and on March 31st, 1936 (final rate: 28%). The Bank's foreign-exchange holdings on March 29th, 1935, were revalued on the same basis on March 31st, 1936. bills, annuities and securities: Balance of the Government debt (Decree of October 25th, 1926) and difference between the cost of the Bank's sterling holdings on September 21st, 1931, and the revaluation of such holdings on June 24th, 1932 (Law of July 19th, 1932); this balance written off by the Government (Law of December 27th, 1930) and the Bank (Law of July 19th, 1932, and Agreement of July 27th, 1932, regarding exchange losses sustained by the Bank in September 1931) has been reduced, more particularly by drawing on the proceeds of revaluation of the gold stocks and by the Treasury resuming the circulation of 50-franc notes (see below).

Commercial Banks: The statistics of commercial banks compiled by the Banking Commission (Royal Decree of July 9th, 1935) and drawn up at the end of each quarter since December 31st, 1935, refer to 125 so-called private banks (see below: Summary Balance-sheet).

Movement of Clearings: Clearing operations of the Brussels and provincial clearing-houses; monthly figures.

#### Summary Balance-sheet.

The statistics of commercial banks compiled by the Banking Commission since December 31st, 1935, cannot be compared with the statistics for 1929-1933. The differences are due, inter alia, to the following reasons:

(1) Number of banks: the new statistics refer to 125 so-called private banks, nine of which are constituted as companies in foreign law and are obliged to keep separate books for their transactions in Belgium; forty-five of the agencies and branches operate in Luxemburg; (2) rules governing the framing of the balance-sheets and monthly returns of banks; (3) effects of the banking reform (Royal Decree of August 22nd, 1936), particularly the prohibition of mixed banks which both engage in commercial transactions and control industrial concerns, and the separation

of mixed banks into banks properly so called and financial companies.

Value of Currency: Official suspension of the gold standard: September 25th, 1931. Introduction of exchange control: October 3rd, 1931. Since that date the boliviano has had two rates: the official rate and the free rate. The Decree of January 24th, 1935, established two legal rates of exchange — the official rate and the export rate — and fixed the percentage of foreign exchange (varying according to the commodities) which exporters were required to sell to the Banco Central at the official rate and at the export rate. On April 1st, 1936, the export rate, after being reduced from 80 to 50 bolivianos per £, was declared the "official rate". The former official rate of 20 bolivianos per £ was abolished, except, however, in the case of Government purchases of foreign exchange. At the beginning of 1937, the boliviano had three rates: an "official" rate (80 bolivianos = £ 1) for the importation of articles of first necessity subject to rationing; a "commercial" rate (120 bolivianos = £ 1) for non-luxury articles attended to by the "Committee of Control"; and a "bank" rate (140 bolivianos = £ 1) for the importation of other articles.

Banco Central de Bolivia: Gold and foreign exchange: On December 31st, 1936, the gold and foreign exchange) reserves were revalued at the rate of 80 bolivianos = £1. Foreign exchange: Including, since 1931, gold earmarked in London. Government securities: This item began to grow in 1932, the year of the outbreak of hostilities with Paraguay. Sundry bonds: Loans issued by departments and municipalities. Other securities: Bonds issued by mortgage banks and shares.

Commercial Banks: The Balance-sheet Summary, which is drawn up on the same principles as that in the preceding editions of this volume, furnishes particulars, not only for all three banks of the country, including the Banco Central, but also for the two purely commercial banks.

Value of Currency: Exchange control was introduced on May 18th, 1931. The free rate of the milreis was recognised on May 22nd, 1934. Since February 11th, 1935, 65% of the foreign exchange derived from exports may be sold at the free rate; the remainder must be surrendered at the official rate to the Banco do Brasil for Government requirements. Since June 28th, 1935, purchases of foreign exchange on the free market, which from February 11th to June 28th, 1935, were free within the quota of 65%, have again been subject to the previous authorisation of the exchange control — a system which was in force prior to May 1934. On October 15th, 1936, the currency was attached to the United States dollar.

Note Issue: The notes issued by the Caixa de Estabilização, which was abolished at the end of 1931, and by the Banco do Brasil, are being gradually withdrawn from circulation, and replaced by Federal Treasury notes. In 1929 and 1930 the total issue included notes issued by the Caixa de Conversão to the value of 3 and 2 million

Value of Currency: After having been stabilised de facto since 1924, the lev was legally stabilised under the Act of December 4th, 1928 (92 leva = I gramme gold fine). The monopoly of dealings in foreign exchange, set up in 1918 and retained after the legal stabilisation of the lev was tightened up on October 15th, 1931: the National Bank, which since 1923 had enjoyed the exclusive right of purchase and sale of foreign exchange, was then entrusted with the supervision of foreign trade. This system, supplemented at the end of 1934 by a system of private compensations, worked as follows: (1) import quotas; (2) permission to import goods freely against export of certain Bulgarian products specified by the Bank; (3) handing-over to the Bank, at the official rates, of a certain percentage (30% on the average) of free foreign exchange and compensation of the balance against payment by the importers of premiums varying from 25% to 33%, according to the category of goods. As from April 1st, 1936, the Bank was authorised to purchase foreign exchange derived from private compensation trade by paying a premium not exceeding 35%. On November 1st, 1936, all export goods were placed under the same regulations, exporters being obliged to surrender a varying percentage of their foreign exchange to the Bank. The balance of such foreign exchange may, if the Bank allows, be dealt with through private compensation arrangements. In the above table, the value of the currency has been calculated, until the end of August 1936, on the basis of exchange rates in Basle, and on London rates since September 1936.

Dominion Government: Total issue, consisting of the notes held by the public and those held as reserve by chartered banks. Foreign exchange: Difference between sums due from and sums due to banks and banking correspondents outside Canada. See also notes on items 1 and 15 of the Balance-sheet Summary.

Bank of Canada: For the initial establishment operations on March 13th, 1935, and the revaluation of the gold reserve on July 10th, 1935, see *Money and Banking 1935/36*, Vol. II, page 40. *Gold*: Valued up to July 3rd, 1935, on the basis of the rate of 20.67 dollars per ounce of fine gold, and from July 10th, 1935, onwards, under the Exchange Fund Act, at the current selling price of gold on the London or New York market converted into Canadian dollars at the rate of exchange of the day. *Banking legislation*: The Law of July 3rd, 1934, on the establishment of the Bank of Canada has been amended by the Law of June 23rd, 1936 (Bank of Canada Act Amendment Act, 1936), increasing the authorised capital from 5 to 10 million dollars, the difference to be subscribed by the Government, and providing for the appointment by the Government of Directors of the Bank. The amendments introduced by this Law came into force on September 11th, 1936.

Dominion Government: Gold: Valued at the rate of 20.67 dollars per ounce of fine gold.

Bank Debits: Bank debits to individual account; monthly figures.

Interest Rates: From June 1st, 1936, the interest rate on time and saving deposits has been reduced from 2 to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ %. The rates for loans vary as follows: loans to agriculturists, from 6 to 7 %; commercial loans, from  $5\frac{1}{2}$  to  $6\frac{1}{2}$ %; and loans on securities, from 5 to 6%.

The official value of the peso, reduced in April 1932 from 6d. gold to 3d. gold, was fixed on January 2nd, 1935, at  $1\frac{1}{2}d$ . gold. Introduction of exchange control: July 30th, 1931. In addition to the official rate of the peso, there are also an export rate (for transactions with countries, such as the United States of America and the United Kingdom, which have not concluded any compensation agreement with Chile), so-called compensation rates (for transactions with countries which have concluded compensation agreements: Austria, Belgian-Luxemburg Union, Brazil, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland) and a free rate (for transactions involving foreign exchange not derived from exports and for operations which are not covered by the law on exchange control). The fall in the export rate does not differ appreciably from that in the free rate.

Banco Central de Chile: Gold: Valued at the rate of 1 peso = 6d. gold. Foreign exchange: Including, since 1931, gold abroad. Loans and advances: Advances to the Treasury, made by the Bank to the Government, more particularly in 1932, were consolidated by the Law of November 11th, 1933, so as to constitute a single advance of 672.5 millions, of which 13.7 millions had been repaid by December 1935, the Treasury having undertaken to pay the Bank each year a sum equivalent to interest at 2 % together with amortisation at the rate of 1% of the total amount of this debt. In addition to the balance of this advance — i.e., 658.8 millions in December 1935 — this item includes a further advance of 38.4 millions which the Bank made to the Treasury under the Law of December 23rd, 1933, for the purpose of increasing the capital of the Caja de Crédito Minero. The other loans and advances are made up of rediscounted bills from the nitrates industry (20.5 millions in December 1935), advances to Government credit institutions (32.1 millions), to land banks (11.6 millions), etc.

Commercial Banks: The differences between the figures given above and the corresponding items in the Summary Balance-sheet are due to the fact that the annual figures relate to a greater number of banks than do the quarterly figures. Foreign exchange, deposits and loans in foreign currencies are valued in 1934 and 1935 at the rate of 6d. and in 1936 at the rate of  $1\frac{1}{2}d$ . per peso. Deposits: These include deposits in foreign currencies.

Savings Banks: The savings deposits of the Caja Nacional de Ahorros account for 95 % of the total amount of savings deposits.

Clearing Turnover: All clearing-houses; monthly figures.

Value of Currency: The Chinese (silver) dollar, equivalent to 0.715 former Shanghai tael, was introduced and officially declared the standard coin in April 1933. The rise in the price of bar silver as a result of the purchases of silver for the account of the United States Government under the Silver Purchase Act of 1934 led the Chinese Government to institute foreign-exchange control on September 9th, 1934, with a view to preventing exports of silver. On October 15th, 1934, an export duty of 73/4% was imposed on export of silver dollars and mint bars, and a duty of 10% on export of other forms of silver, together with an equalisation charge equal to the deficiency, if any, existing between the theoretical parity of London silver and a rate of exchange officially fixed by the Central Bank of China after making allowance for the export duty. On November 3rd, 1935, the Government abandoned the silver standard and fixed the rate of the Chinese dollar in sterling (14½d.) and United States dollar (29¾ cents). The silver export duty and the equalisation charge, however, remained in force as before. In May 1936, the Chinese and the United States Governments concluded an agreement by which the Central Bank of China was enabled to draw on New York against the silver deposited by the Chinese Government in that city. As the result of this agreement, the Chinese Government announced, on May 17th, 1936, that the 60% specie reserve against note issue would consist of silver as well as of gold and foreign exchange: the silver constituting not less than 25%, and the gold and foreign-exchange portion to be increased to 35% as its maximum.

Central Bank of China: In the statement given above, the balance-sheets of the Issue department and of the Banking department have been consolidated.

Interest Rates: The Shanghai native interest rate (yearly or monthly average) is a rate for inter-bank loans. It is quoted in cents per 1,000 Chinese dollars per day and is considered the most accurate barometer for the Shanghai money market. Bond yields: Domestic bonds, according to Shanghai quotations.

Three Government Banks: Central Bank of China, Bank of China and Bank of Communications. They are all under the control of the Government and enjoy special privileges. The notes they issue are full legal tender and the reserves held against them are placed under one control. In fact, these three banks act more or less as one in discharging the duties that are performed by central banks in other countries.

Other Banks: They include 161 provincial banks, commercial banks, savings banks, etc. — practically all the banks in existence in China at the end of 1935. (Three Government banks excluded.)

Value of Currency: The gold standard was officially suspended and exchange control introduced on September 25th, 1931. There are two exchange rates for the peso: the official rate, fixed until February 1933 at the ratio 1.05 peso = 1 U.S.A. dollar and raised on several occasions since the dollar devaluation, and the free rate. The margin between these two rates is narrow.

Banco de la República: Gold: Since 1934 (Decree of March 20th), newly acquired gold is valued at cost. In virtue of a Decree of April 6th, 1935, the valuation of the gold reserve is based on the New York price of gold (35 dollars per fine ounce) and the peso exchange rate. The increase in the gold reserve due to revaluation is counterbalanced on the liabilities side by the Special Exchange Account. Advances to Governments: (1) Loans secured by salt-mines concessions (18.2 millions at June 30th, 1936); (2) loans granted since 1933 for purposes of national defence (9.2 millions at June 30th, 1936). Investments: (1) Government securities; (2) shares of the Banco Central Hipotecario (4 millions in 1932, 12 millions since 1933).

Monetary Circulation: There should be added to the notes issued by the Banco de la República, in order to ascertain the total monetary circulation: (1) National notes issued by the State: 8.2 millions in 1929, 7.9 millions since 1930; (2) silver coins, including silver certificates and nickel coins.

Commercial and Mortgage Banks: The discrepancy between the figures given above and the corresponding items in the Summary Balance-sheet is due to the fact that the yearly totals apply to commercial (national or foreign) banks only, and not to mortgage banks or savings banks, whereas the quarterly figures apply to all banks within the country. Discounts: Paper eligible for discount or rediscounted at the Banco de la República. Investments: Including shares of the Banco de la República held by member banks. Loans: Paper not eligible for rediscount at the Banco de la República. Banking legislation: A Law of January 28th, 1936, contains various provisions relating to commercial banks, mortgage banks, agricultural credit, exchange, etc.

Mortgage Banks: Loans: Mortgage loans properly so called, including mortgage loans granted by commercial banks but excluding loans by mortgage banks which figure under the items "Discounts" and "Loans" of the heading "Commercial and Mortgage Banks".

Clearing Turnover: Clearing-houses in eight towns: monthly figures.

Value of Currency: Exchange control was introduced on October 2nd, 1931, and its stringency increased on several subsequent occasions, more particularly September 10th, 1934 (compulsory declaration and surrender of precious metals and foreign exchange), January 3rd, 1935 (compulsory sale abroad of fixed-interest-bearing foreign securities, except those of countries with exchange control, and transfer to the National Bank of the foreign exchange thus obtained), November 30th, 1935 (prohibition of the export of bank-notes), and December 6th, 1935 (prohibition of the import of Czechoslovak bank-notes by persons other than foreign tourists). The crown has been twice devalued: on February 17th, 1934, when its gold content was reduced from 0.04458 to 0.03715 gramme of fine gold — that is, by 16.66% — and on October 9th, 1936, when the Government was empowered to fix the crown's gold content between the limits of 0.03221 and 0.03021 gramme of fine gold. By a Decree of the same date, the Government fixed the parity at 0.03121 gramme of fine gold, representing a total depreciation of 30%.

National Bank of Czechoslovakia: Gold: Valued at the legal rate. The profit made on the first revaluation of the gold reserve (422.3 millions) was set aside for the redemption of the State Notes Debt (cf. below); the profit on the second revaluation was converted into foreign exchange and brought into account partly under the item "Foreign exchange" and partly under "Miscellaneous"; on October 15th, 1936, the date of the first balancesheet after the revaluation of the gold reserve, the latter item showed an increase of 106 millions. The profit on the second revaluation of the gold went to the State, which leaves it at the National Bank on permanent deposit to be used by the Bank to maintain the value of the crown within the limits fixed by the Law of October 9th, 1936 (cf. above, "Value of Currency"). On the liabilities side of the balance-sheet, the revaluation of the gold is apparent in an increase of 498 millions in "Miscellaneous". State Notes Debt balance: This debt, representing the stamped notes, negotiable cash certificates and current accounts of the Austro-Hungarian Bank, which were used after the foundation of the Czechoslovak State as cover for the fiduciary currency, is redeemed through a levy on capital and capital increases; in addition, the profit resulting from the first revaluation of the crown was applied to the reduction of this item (cf. above; see also the following note). Notes in circulation: Under the Law of June 9th, 1932, the 10- and 20-Kč. bank-notes were assimilated to subsidiary coins, and their total value (548.7 millions) was therefore deducted from the note circulation. The amount thus released was applied to writing off the balance of the account of the former Banking Office of the Ministry of Finance (286.2 millions) and to the redemption of the State Notes Debt (262.5 millions; see above).

Commercial Banks: Twelve commercial joint-stock banks in Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia (National Bank Monthly Bulletin).

Provincial Credit Establishments: Zemská Banka, Bohemian Mortgage Bank, Moravian Mortgage and Agricultural Bank, Silesian Mortgage and Communal Credit Institution.

Savings Banks: Savings banks in Bohemia, Moravia, Silesia and Slovakia; district agricultural credit and savings associations in Bohemia; peoples' credit and savings associations in Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia affiliated to the Union; agricultural mutual savings banks in Slovakia and Carpathian Ruthenia.

Clearing Turnover: Clearing-houses at Prague, Brno and Bratislava; monthly figures.

Value of Currency: The gold standard was suspended on September 29th, 1931. Exchange control was introduced in November 1931. The currency has been pegged to sterling at 22.40 kroner to the £ since January 1933.

National Bank: Last day of year or month. Gold: The gold reserve is entered at the old legal parity. New Central Bank Law: By a Law of April 7th, 1936, the private joint-stock company which, under the name of "The National Bank in Copenhagen", had exercised the sole right of note issue for 118 years previously was transformed into an autonomous State institution, called "The National Bank of Denmark". The shareholders of the National Bank in Copenhagen received, in compensation, 4 % State-guaranteed redeemable bonds. Under the statutes of the new bank, 25% of the note issue must be covered by gold, the rest by bills, bonds and collateral

loans. Advances to the "Crisis Fund": This Fund was set up on May 1st, 1933. Its object, at first, was to make advances to banks whose position was endangered by withdrawals of deposits. Later it came to be used mainly for facilitating conversion operations by purchases of agricultural bonds, but this policy of debt relief met with comparatively little success and the borrowings of the Fund at the National Bank have gradually decreased in the last two years. Discount rate: Date of last change: November 19th, 1936.

Commercial Banks: For reasons of a technical nature (such as end-of-year revaluations of security holdings, etc.), the monthly returns on which these figures are based differ slightly from the final end-of-year statements reproduced in the summary balance-sheet below.

Clearing Turnover: Quarterly totals of clearings at National Bank.

Bond Yields: Irredeemable 31/2% Government Bonds.

Value of Currency: The gold standard was officially suspended on February 8th, 1932, and exchange control introduced on May 2nd,1932. After being abolished on October 7th, 1935, the exchange control was reintroduced on July 31st, 1936. The official buying rate, fixed in May 1932 at 5.95 sucres = 1 U.S.A. dollar, has been maintained since the depreciation of the dollar. On December 19th, 1935, the rate of the sucre was fixed at 10.50 sucres = 1 U.S.A. dollar, rate around which the free rate fluctuated since January 1935.

Banco Central del Ecuador: Gold: Revalued on December 19th, 1935, at 9.968331 sucres per gramme of fine gold, and on June 13th, 1936, at 11.6466 sucres per gramme of fine gold (market value of gold at the rate of 10.50 sucres = 1 U.S.A. dollar). Loans and discounts: The fall in the amount of Government loans is due to the earmarking of part of the profit on revaluation of the gold reserve. Banking legislation: Decree of January 15th, 1936, amending the Organic Law of the Banco Central concerning its administration.

Commercial and Mortgage Banks: Commercial banks, mortgage banks, savings banks, pensions fund (except the Banco Central). Mortgage loans: Mortgage loans by mortgage banks and the mortgage departments of commercial banks. Deposits: Deposits by the public. Sight deposits: Deposits in national currency at thirty days' sight and deposits in foreign currencies. Time deposits: Deposits in national currency at more than thirty days' notice.

Value of Currency: The currency was devalued on June 28th, 1933, and has been pegged to sterling since September 1933 at the old parity of 18.16 krooni to the £. The exchange control imposed in the autumn of 1931 has been considerably relaxed since 1934 by an extension of the exchange dealings permitted to private banks; such restrictions as were in force at the end of 1936 related mainly to the export of capital.

Bank of Estonia: The figures refer to the last day of the year or month shown. Gold reserve: The gold held at the moment of devaluation (19 million krooni) is still entered at the old parity, the remainder at purchase price. Loans and discounts: At the end of 1935, items bearing the character of loan accounts, totalling 4.2 million krooni, were transferred from "Other assets" to "Loans". Discount rate: Date of last change: October 1st, 1935.

Commercial Banks: Securities: This item, which only recently has become of some importance, represents mainly certain State-guaranteed bonds issued by mortgage banks for the financing of building, land improvement and other long-term investment.

Gold and foreign exchange: The gold and foreign-exchange reserves continue to be entered at the parities ruling before the suspension of the gold standard on October 12th, 1931. Security portfolio: The recent substitution of bonds expressed in foreign currency by bonds in Finnish currency is largely attributable to the repayment of the Government foreign debts by means of cheaper loans raised at home. Finland's total net foreign indebtedness is estimated to have declined from 8,160 million markkaa at the end of 1930 to 3,830 millions at the end of 1934 and to about 2,900 million markkaa at the end of 1935. - I. THE DEVALUATION OF THE FRANC, THE TRIPARTITE MONETARY AGREEMENT AND EXCHANGE STABILISATION FUND, AND GOLD MOVEMENTS.
- 1. The French Government's decision to devalue the franc was announced on September 26th, 1936, in a statement couched in the same terms as the statements issued simultaneously by the Treasuries of the United Kingdom and the United States of America, making public the conclusion of a tripartite monetary agreement. Pending the ratification of the devaluation Bill, the Government ordered the closing of the Bourse and exchanges, the suspension of the payment of commercial claims in gold or foreign exchange, and the Bank of France virtually suspended gold payments by raising the requirements for obtaining gold from a minimum of 215,000 francs to 5,000 million francs. The tripartite statement, while expressing the welcome of the Governments of the United Kingdom and the United States for the projected readjustment of the franc, reaffirms the purpose of each of the three Governments in pursuing, within the limits set by the intention " to take into full account the requirements of the internal prosperity" of the country and its oversea possessions, a monetary policy which will " maintain the greatest possible equilibrium in the international exchanges" and which will "avoid to the utmost extent the creation of any disturbance of that system" that might come from its monetary action. Each of the three Governments also expresses its intention to use all the appropriate available resources so as to avoid exchange disturbances resulting from the devaluation of the franc and to consult with each other for this purpose. The Belgian Government announced its adherence to this Agreement in an analogous statement issued on September 27th. Switzerland and the Netherlands announced their adhesion on October 5th and November 23rd respectively.
- The devaluation was ratified by the Chamber in a law passed on the 1st and published on the 2nd of October. The Law provides for the lowering of the gold content of the franc between the limits of 49 and 43 milligrammes of gold of a fineness of 900/1000 as compared with the previous rate of 65.5 milligrammes, the determination of the exact content as well as the conditions of the convertibility of the franc being left to a decision of the Government. The Law approves the Convention of September 25th, 1936, between the Bank of France and the Minister of Finance, whereby the former agreed to cede to the latter the profits of revaluation of its gold and foreign assets: recommends similar action by the banks of issue of Algeria, French colonies and protectorates, and provides for the establishment of an Exchange Stabilisation Fund. Purchase and sale and imports and exports of gold are made subject to an authorisation of the Bank of France which will be delivered only in cases when the transaction relates to genuine industrial or commercial operations. International payments agreed to and international securities issued before the devaluation and labelled in francs are not subject to the new definition of the franc. The Law also requires the cession to the Bank of France for the account of the Exchange Fund, by November 1st, 1936, of all gold bullion, bar or coin above 200 grammes in the possession, either in France or abroad, of persons and companies resident in France on September 26th, 1936, at the old rate of 65.5 milligrammes to the franc.

Those who do not comply with this requirement are to declare all such holdings to the public authorities by November 15th, 1936, and will be taxed to the extent of the increment in the value of their gold holdings. This provision was put into effect by a decision of the Government published on October 14th, 1936. All exchange operations engaged in between September 1st and 26th, 1936, are to be declared to the Ministry of Finance, and the profit on all dealings on the stock exchanges, with the exception of those on Government securities, between September 21st and 26th are subjected to a 50% tax. The last two provisions formed the subject of two detailed Government decisions published on October 7th, 1936. The last title of the Law relates to measures to prevent an unjustifiable increase in prices and the cost of living. Three special laws accompany the monetary law, the first relating to the restitution of reductions in certain pensions, the second approving the Convention of the Government with the Caisse Autonome relating to annuities which authorised certain privileges to be granted to certain holders of Government securities, the third authorising

a Convention with the Crédit Foncier de France, whereby it will obtain an advance of 3,000 million francs from the Treasury with a view to lowering its rate on certain loans.

The provision of the Law regarding the declaration of gold holdings was modified so that the final date for declaration was changed to February 1st, 1937. The provision of the Law relating to the terms on which gold was to be ceded was altered on December 16th, 1936, when holders of gold were offered three-year certificates in exchange for their gold. The certificates will be issued at the rate of 100 francs bearing interest at  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ , but will, on their maturity in three years, benefit from a reimbursement premium of 40 francs per certificate of 100 francs. These certificates were to be admitted on the market at their reimbursement rate and to be accepted as partial payment of estate duty. The article of the law exempting international payments from the new definition of the franc was repealed in the middle of February 1937. The free market in gold was re-established as from March 8th, 1937, the Bank of France purchasing gold offered at the price of the day without requiring any specifications as to ownership or origin.

3. The Exchange Stabilisation Fund, whose object is stated to be "the regulation of the relation between the franc and foreign currencies, while maintaining the parity of the franc in relation to gold within the limits fixed" by the Law, is placed under the management of the Bank of France, but is to be run for the account and under the responsibility of the Treasury. The Bank is further authorised to buy from and sell gold and foreign exchange to the Stabilisation Fund. Under the Convention of September 25th, 1936, between the Bank of France and the Finance Minister, the latter undertook to revalue its gold holdings at the rate of 49 milligrammes 900/1000 fine to the franc, its foreign assets convertible into gold on the basis of the new parities with the franc at 49 milligrammes of gold, and its foreign assets not attached to gold on the basis of the average quotation during the first day on which the devaluation law became operative. The revaluation profits were to be utilised to the extent of 10,000 million francs for the Stabilisation Fund, and the remainder was to be applied to reducing the provisional advances to the Treasury granted according to the Convention of June 18th, 1936 (see Section II below). Any supplementary profits resulting from the definite stabilisation of the franc, as well as the proceeds of the Stabilisation Fund when it is wound up, are to be ceded to the State and used for the amortisation of public debt.

On the day before devaluation, the gold stocks of the Bank of France amounted to 50,111 million francs and its total foreign assets to 1,245 millions (see table below). According to the annual report of the Bank of France revaluation profits amounted to slightly over 17,000 million francs.

The first report of the Bank after devaluation, on October 2nd, shows gold and foreign assets at 57,353 and 1,493 million francs respectively, or only some 7,500 millions over the combined gold and foreign assets on September 25th. The difference between that and the above estimate for the revaluation profits is about 10,000 million francs, and represents the amount of credit allocated to the Stabilisation Fund; only half of this sum was immediately converted into gold. Other important changes in the accounts of the Bank revealed by its return of October 2nd are a reduction of 1,529 million francs in the provisional advances to the State under Articles 1 and 2 of the Convention of June 1936, and the complete liquidation of 2,070 millions of provisional advances under Article 3 of the same Convention outstanding on September 25th, or a total of 3,599 millions. The difference of about 4,000 millions represents the amount of provisional advances obtained by the Treasury and redeemed by the revaluation profits.

With the publication of the first weekly return, it was officially stated that these returns would, in the future, be so drawn up as to render futile any deductions regarding the operations of the Stabilisation Fund.

4. Arrangements involving the free exchange of gold and implementing the Tripartite Monetary Agreement of September 26th were announced on October 12th. In a declaration, the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States undertook to sell or earmark gold for the account of equalisation or stabilisation funds which would accord the same facilities to the United States, and that such gold would be sold at the rate of \$35 per fine ounce plus \( \frac{1}{4} \)% charges. The British Treasury also announced that arrangements for such facilities to the United States authorities in London had been made, and that a similar agreement had been reached with the Bank of France in order to ensure effective co-operation between the three financial centres. The United States Treasury had, prior to this declaration, sold gold only to countries whose currencies were linked to gold,

and the United States and British Exchange Equalisation Accounts had, prior to the devaluation of the franc, bought and sold gold through operations on the franc.

On November 23rd, it was announced that the Belgian, Netherlands and Swiss authorities had become parties to these arrangements. On the following day, the Secretary of the United States Treasury announced the abolition of the right of private individuals to export gold. Gold exports could, in the future, be made only through the Stabilisation Fund or its agents to those countries adhering to the arrangements of October 12th for the export of gold.

# II. THE BANK OF FRANCE: ADVANCES TO THE GOVERNMENT AND REFORM OF THE BANK.

- 1. Treasury Borrowing at the Bank. The cash position of the Treasury induced the Government to raise the upper limit of bill issues from 10,000 to 15,000 million francs on January 31st, 1935, and from 15,000 to 20,000 millions on June 23rd, 1936. Some of these bills were rediscounted at the Bank of France. A Convention between the Bank of France and the Treasury, signed on June 18th and approved by the Government on June 23rd, 1936, provides for the extension by the latter of provisional advances bearing no interest, those under Article 1 being for a maximum amount of 14,000 million francs and those under Article 3 for a maximum amount of 10,000 million francs. The purpose of the first set of advances was to redeem Governmental bills rediscounted by the Bank as they matured. The effect of these provisions on the accounts of the Bank has been principally the substitution of interest-bearing Treasury bills rediscounted by the Bank by non-interest-bearing Treasury bills of three months' maturity and renewable, which the Bank receives for its provisional advances.
- 2. Reform of the Bank. The principal provisions of the Law of July 24th, which came into effect on August 14th, 1936, on the reform of the Bank of France, relate to the administration of the Bank and to the rediscounting of Treasury bills. The administration of the Bank is altered so that all shareholders may take part in its general meetings and that the most representative economic groups constituting the national economy may be represented on its General Council. Regarding rediscounts, Article 13 provides that "all bills of the floating debt issued by the public Treasury and coming to maturity within a maximum period of three months are admitted without limit to rediscount at the bank of issue, except for the benefit of the Treasury" ("sauf au profit du Trésor public").

# III. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTS OF THE BANK OF FRANCE AND OF FOUR LEADING DEPOSIT BANKS. (See table on the following page.)

## Bank of France.

Weekly Returns: The accounts of the last weekly return before devaluation, September 25th, and of the first weekly return after devaluation, October 2nd, are given in the table, the latter figure \$\epsilon\$ being in italics.

Regarding the devaluation of the franc, discounts and Government advances of the Bank of France, see preceding notes.

Foreign Assets: Are composed of sight balances abroad, foreign bills and other foreign assets shown separately in the Bank returns.

Domestic Bill Portfolio: Treasury bills are shown separately in the Bank's returns only as from June 19th, 1936, when they amounted to 13,833 million francs, in conformity with a decision contained in the Convention of the same date referred to above. By the end of June, all but a small fraction had been converted into provisional advances by the Bank of France.

Advances on Securities: Include advances on Government securities with a maturity not exceeding two years which the Bank consented to grant as from February 21st, 1935. See Money and Banking 1935/36, Vol. II, page 87.

Sight Liabilities other than Notes: Those on public account consist of the balances of the Caisse autonome d'amortissement and of the Treasury. The latter since 1931 have been relatively small compared with the former.

#### Four Leading Deposit Banks.

The Banks are the Crédit Lyonnais, Comptoir National d'Escompte, Société Générale, and Crédit industriel et commercial. Data for the other banks are available only for the end of the year, and are given in the adjoining balance-sheet statements.

Cash in Hand: Includes net balances with banks at home and abroad. These rose from 604 million francs in April 1935 to 1,477 and 1,694 millions in May and November of the same year respectively, and were maintained at the last level through May 1936.

Bill Portfolio: Includes foreign bills, domestic commercial bills, and national defence bonds.

## Summary Balance-sheet.

GENERAL NOTE. — The figures in the attached Summary Tables are based on the annual reports of the principal deposit and investment banks, Table 18—I showing six deposit banks — i.e., the Crédit Lyonnais, the Société générale pour favoriser le développement du commerce et de l'industrie, the Comptoir National d'Escompte, the Banque nationale pour le commerce et l'industrie (formerly Banque nationale de crédit, the Crédit commercial de France and the Société générale de crédit industriel et commercial; Table 18—II showing two investment banks — the Banque de Paris et des Pays-Bas and the Banque de l'Union parisienne (the latter having absorbed the Crédit mobilier français in May 1932); and Table 18—II giving the total of Tables 18—I and 18—II.

#### 1 and 2. Cash Assets, etc.

The amounts given under item 2 for deposit banks in 1931-1934 and for investment banks throughout consist chiefly of balances with banks and sums due from correspondents; they also include small amounts of coupons due for payment.

#### 3. Bills discounted and bought.

The sums in this group of the Summary Tables include chiefly Treasury bills (bons de la Défense nationale).

#### 7. Loans and Advances.

Current accounts include correspondents. In the case

of banks which do not show cover for acceptances as a separate item, an amount equivalent to their acceptances has been deducted from current accounts and carried to group 8 of the Summary Table. The other loans and advances (7 (b)) consist of guaranteed advances (avances sur garanties) and contangos (reports).

#### 17. Deposits.

Current and cheque accounts (17 (a)) also include correspondent accounts. The sums given under "other deposits" (17 (d)) represent "accounts payable after collection", etc., where shown separately.

#### Summary of Profit-and-Loss Accounts.

No profit-and-loss accounts were published for the Banque nationale pour le Commerce et l'Industrie until the end of 1933. Summary Table 18—I therefore covers only five deposit banks for 1932. Most of the deposit banks show their net profits only after deduction of working expenses, depreciation, provision for doubtful claims, allocations to staff funds, and sometimes even directors' fees. This policy obviously allows the directors to make whatever statement of net profits they wish and facilitates the setting-aside of hidden reserves.

The investment banks publish more or less detailed profit-and-loss accounts. No statement was published relating to the Crédit mobilier français in 1931. Figures are accordingly not given in Summary Table 18—II for that year.

#### 1 and 2. Gross Profits and Expenditure.

The figures for salaries and other working expenditure shown in the table of investment banks include a large proportion of the fees and remunerations of directors.

#### 3. Reserved for Pension Funds, etc.

The sums given in the investment-bank table refer solely to the Banque de Paris et des Pays-Bas.

## 4. Depreciation.

Including sums used in or reserved for building and construction purposes.

### 5. Net Profit or Loss.

The figures in Tables 18—I and 18—III for 1931 are chiefly affected by inclusion of the net disclosed loss of the Banque nationale de Crédit, amounting to 500 million francs. This loss was covered out of capital, reserves and undivided profits, which are included in the figures given at the top of those tables for 1931.

The capital and reserves (114 million francs) of the Crédit mobilier français are also included in the figures shown at the top of Table 18—III in 1931, although no profit-and-loss accounts of the bank were published for that year.

#### 10. Dividends.

The banks do not follow a common practice with regard to the dividend tax; some include it in their dividend figures, while others do not.

#### 11. Directors' Fees, etc.

The sums shown in this group of the Summary Tables include a small sum representing dividends or "founders' shares". Some banks do not disclose directors' fees, but include them wholly or in part in the expenses which they deduct before showing profits.

Value of Currency: The system of exchange control introduced in July 1931 (centralisation of foreignexchange dealings at the Reichsbank, July 15th; compulsory surrender of foreign-exchange holdings and claims to the Reichsbank, July 18th; creation of the Stellen für Devisenbewirtschaftung to superintend foreign-exchange dealings, August 1st) has since been reinforced by other measures, the more important of which are as follows: Control of foreign exchange derived from exports, November 17th, 1931; gradual reduction of the quota allotted to importers from 50% to 5% of their imports prior to the introduction of the restrictions, February-July 1934; imports to be kept strictly within the limits of exports ("New Plan"), September 4th, 1934, and creation of twenty-five Uberwachungsstellen to control imports, September 11th, 1934; reduction of the total amount of means of payment that a traveller can export from Germany without a permit from 200 marks to 50 marks (April 1934) and subsequently to 10 marks (September 1934); extension of the system of compulsory import permits to goods in respect of which such permits were not previously required, July 24th, 1935; prohibition of importation of German bank-notes, except by travellers, to an amount not exceeding 30 marks per head, December 1st, 1935; regulations regarding emigration and the transfer of property abroad, January 2nd, 1936; new regulations regarding the buying and sale of gold and gold articles, February 1st, 1936; prohibition of importation of German coins, except by travellers, to an amount not exceeding 60 marks per head, June 1st, 1936; compulsory surrender of gold, gold currency and foreign bank-notes, the surrender of which had previously not been demanded if they had been acquired prior to October 3rd, 1931, and did not exceed a total value of 200 marks, November 4th, 1936; compulsory deposit of foreign securities in banks authorised to deal in foreign exchange and prohibition of any dealings in such securities save by the accredited banks, November 19th, 1936; application of the death penalty and confiscation of property to cases of economic sabotage, more especially the smuggling of foreign exchange abroad and failure to declare foreign exchange held abroad, December 1st, 1936, and temporary amnesty in respect of offences under the foreign-exchange legislation for persons declaring by January 31st, 1937, any foreign exchange illegally in their possession, December 15th, 1936; complete prohibition of importation of bank-notes and limitation to 30 marks of the amount in coins which a foreign traveller may have about him on entering Germany, December 23rd, 1936; taxation of profits of German debtors as the result of devaluation of foreign currencies, such debtors being further required to ensure the service of their foreign loans through the Conversion Office at the former parities, December 23rd, 1936; the Reichsbank empowered to make the purchase of foreign securities quoted on the German stock exchange subject to the obtaining of a permit from the Reich Foreign Exchange Office, February 19th, 1937; entry into force of the foregoing rule and consequent discontinuance of the quotation of foreign securities on German stock exchanges, February 28th, 1937.

In addition to the official mark, which has been kept at parity, there are various kinds of depreciated marks, of which the following have been included in the above table: Registermark (Registerguthaben), resulting from short-term credits granted by foreign banks before the 1931 crisis which are subject to "standstill" agreements: it may be used for investment in Germany, tourists' expenses, etc.; Reisemark, a particular category of Registermark which may be used solely for tourists' expenses; Kreditsperrmark (Kreditsperrguthaben), being the proceeds

from repayments of credits not governed by "standstill" agreements and from the sale of property owned by foreigners: it may be used under certain conditions for the purchase of securities, long-term investments, etc.; Effektensperrmark (Wertpapiersperrguthaben), being the proceeds of the sale of securities in Germany, excluding German foreign loans; it may be used, under certain conditions, for long-term investments in accordance with the regulations. Of the other kinds of depreciated marks, reference may be made to: Freie Reichsmark, resulting from the sale of foreign currency to the German banks either by foreigners or, with special permission, by persons resident in Germany: it may be used freely for all transactions within the country; Notensperrmark, representing the amount of German bank-notes paid into blocked accounts: it may be used, under certain conditions, for the same purposes as the Kreditsperrmark; Altguthaben, representing bank deposits of foreign nationals in German banks prior to July 16th, 1931, and not governed by "standstill" agreements: they may be used, under certain conditions, for the same purposes as Kreditsperrmark; Auswanderersperrmark, resulting from the bank deposits of persons who left Germany after August 3rd, 1931, and from all payments into their accounts: it may be used, under certain conditions, for the same purposes as Kreditsperrmark; Sonderkonten — that is, special accounts into which are paid interest, dividends, amortisation, etc., usually paid to the Conversion Office: the marks in this account can be used for certain payments other than purchases of goods and investments; Konversionsguthaben, which are created through payments of interest, dividends and amortisation, and repayments of loans, deposits, etc., by German debtors to the Conversion Office for the benefit of foreign creditors (in respect of debts prior to July 16th, 1931): they may be used — unless the creditors accept the Office's scrip representing payment of interest (not amortisation) — for the payment of taxation and certain non-business payments; Verrechnungsmark, the result of the conversion of marks into the currencies of foreign countries with which Germany has concluded clearing agreements; Aski-mark (Ausländer-Sonderkonten für Inlands-Zahlungen), which is the name used to describe the sum standing to the credits of the accounts opened in German banks in the name of foreign business houses, who accept these marks in payment for their exports to Germany and who are authorised to use them in payment of one-third of the value of goods bought in Germany, on condition that the balance is paid in free foreign currency. For particulars of the various kinds of blocked marks, see Die Wirtschaftskurve, Heft IV, April 1936, and Department of Overseas Trade: Economic Conditions in Germany, 1936.

Reichsbank: Last weekly statement of the month. Gold: Valued at the legal rate (cf. above, "Value of Currency"). Foreign exchange: Securities eligible as cover for the note issue. Other bills and cheques: Bills and cheques, both inland and foreign, only some of the bills being commercial bills in the strict sense of the term. Securities eligible as note cover: Securities purchased by the Bank in the open market (Law of October 27th, 1933) and eligible as cover for the note issue. Other liabilities: Including the balances of the Conversion Office (cf. below) and Clearing Office (Law of October 16th, 1934), to which the Reichsbank has transferred the clearing accounts. Since May 1935, these two offices have invested part of their funds in promissory notes of the Golddiskontbank (see below), so that the item "Other liabilities" has fluctuated considerably. Banking legislation: On January 30th, 1937, the Reichsbank was "placed under the exclusive authority of the Government of the Reich" and the Reichsbank Law was amended, more especially in the following particulars: (1) the Directorate of the Reichsbank will henceforward be under the direct authority of the Führer (paragraph 6 of the Law); (2) the Reichsbank's obligations under the reparations settlement are abolished (paragraph 21, last sub-paragraph).

Circulation of Coins and Bills other than those of the Reichsbank: In addition to the Reichsbank notes, the total currency in circulation includes (1) coins; (2) the notes issued by four private banks of issue (Privatbanknoten) and Rentenbank notes (Rentenbankscheine). Coins: Under the Order of the Minister for Economic Affairs of October 6th, 1936, the buying or selling of silver at a price higher than that fixed by the authorities is prohibited. As from April 1st, 1937, the 5- and 1-mark silver coins will be withdrawn from circulation. Notes: (1) Rentenbank notes (Rentenbankscheine), 392 and 372 millions in December 1935 and 1936 respectively; under the Law of March 7th, 1934, the State's share in the profits of the Reichsbank is no longer earmarked for the redemption of Rentenbank notes; (2) notes of private banks (Privatbanknoten): In accordance with the Law of December 29th, 1934, the privilege of note issue enjoyed by the four private banks expired on December 31st, 1935, and the Privatbanknoten were withdrawn from circulation during 1936.

Golddiskontbank and Konversionskasse: As regards the past few years, the Reichsbank statements require to be read in conjunction with the statements of the Golddiskontbank and the Konversionskasse. The third of the Reichsbank subsidiaries, the Clearing Office opened under the Law of October 16th, 1934, to manage the clearing accounts, does not publish statements.

Deutsche Golddiskontbank: This establishment, which played an important part during the 1931 credit crisis and in the banking reorganisation, and which has been chiefly engaged, since 1933, in operations connected with the financing of foreign trade, was authorised, by the Reichsbank's decision of May 20th, 1935, to issue three-month promissory notes (Solawechsel), eligible for rediscount by the Reichsbank, for sale to credit institutions at the private discount rate; the funds thus procured by the Golddiskontbank have been used more particularly for the purchase of "work-creation bills" (Arbeitsbeschaffungswechsel) from the Reichsbank or in the market. As a result, the total amount of the Golddiskontbank's bill holding steadily increased until, in April 1936, it reached its maximum (the statement for April 1936 gives the following figures in millions of marks: bills, 1,517; Treasury bills, 96; securities, 272; deposits, 615; Solawechsel, 862). Since April, and more particularly since June, 1936, the Golddiskontbank's bill holding has fallen as a result of the increase in the investments of the ordinary banks consequent upon the repayment of loans and advances and the increase in deposits and also in consequence of the consolidation of the public short-term debt (consolidation loans were issued in July and November 1936) and of the efforts to substitute short-term for long-term bills. During Spring, 1937, new issues of Solawechsel were made to absorb the excess of funds on the market (the maximum amount of Solawechsel reached in February 1937: RM. 1,185 millions).

Konversionskasse für Deutsche Auslandsschulden: The Conversion Office for German foreign debts was created by the Law of June 9th, 1933, as one of the Reichsbank's subsidiaries, to administer the sums paid in marks by German debtors in respect of the service of the short- and medium-term foreign loans. As a result of the suspension of transfers for the service of the German foreign loans, creditors receive "scrip", or consolidation bonds issued by the Conversion Office, for part of the interest not transferred in cash. This scrip represents new foreign indebtedness, the amount in circulation being shown by the figures in the last four columns of the Konversionskasse statement. The Office's assets are made up as follows: (1) Balance at the Reichsbank (cf. above, "Reichsbank"); (2) securities and more particularly Golddiskontbank bills (since May 1935). For various available particulars of the German foreign debt and the liquidation of blocked credits, see Balances of Payments, 1935, pages 88 et seq., published by the League of Nations Economic Intelligence Service.

Interest Rates: Reichsbank's discount rate: Date of last change, September 22nd, 1932. Private discount rate: 56 to 90 days' bills; average of maximum and minimum rates. Blankotagesgeld: Rate on day-to-day inter-bank loans to members of the Stempelvereinigung (association of Berlin banks), not secured by any specific collateral. This rate has been published since 1933. Yield of Government securities: Since April 1st, 1935, the 6% bonds have been converted into 41/2% bonds. Chief measures taken to lower the rate of interest: Conversion of agricultural debts (Law of June 1st, 1933); conversion of municipal debts (Law of September 21st, 1933); e.g., reduction from 6% to 4% of the interest rate on Prussian municipal loans; issue of the 4% Reich loan of 1934 (June 1934) to convert the 6 (7)% tax-free loan of 1929; conversion to a 41/2% basis of the mortgage bills and communal bonds issued by mortgage and semi-public banks (Law of January 24th, 1935); conversion to a 4½% basis of the Public Debt (Law of February 27th, 1935); readjustment of banks' interest rates (March 1st, 1935); limitation to  $6\frac{1}{2}\%$  of the maximum rate of interest on loans made by the banks, to 5% of the rate for mortgage loans (loans by insurance companies) and to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ -5% (loans by savings banks); regulation of the interest rates on loans obtained on the open money market (loans not exceeding 600 marks); reduction of the interest rate on private mortgage loans (Law of July 2nd, 1936); measures for consolidating the floating debt of the Reich: January 1935 (first measure for consolidating work-creation and special rearmament bills) September 1935, June 1936, November 1936, February 1937). Banking Legislation: The chief measures relating to banking are substantially as follows: Law of December 5th, 1934, giving effect to the Banking Commission's recommendations (cf. Commercial Banks, 1929-1934, page 50); new form for the compilation of banks' annual balance-sheets, January 17th, 1936; Law of February 4th, 1937, on deposits and purchases of securities, coming into effect on May 1st, 1937 (protection of persons depositing securities with banks or purchasing them through banks); new law on share companies coming into force on October 1st, 1937.

State Participation in Banks: In October 1936, the German Government liquidated its holding in the Commerz- und Privatbank (cf. Commercial Banks, 1925-1933, page 118) by selling its holding of shares (11 million marks) to a consortium of private banks. The Golddiskontbank also sold to the same consortium its holding (11 millions) of Commerz- und Privatbank shares, but retained shares (34 million marks' worth) in that bank (total capital, 80 millions; cf. Wochenberichte des Instituts für Konjunkturforschung, November 25th, 1936). According to the Deutscher Volkswirt (January 22nd, 1937), the Golddiskontbank has also reduced from 50 to 15 or 18 millions its holding of shares of the Deutsche Bank and Disconto-Gesellschaft (total capital, 130 millions). According to the same source, 90% of the Dresdner Bank's capital (150 millions) is still controlled by the Government. — The Akzeptbank has been wound up (cf. Commercial Banks, 1929-1934, page 49).

#### Summary Balance-sheet.

As in the previous edition, three separate summary balance-sheets are given in the following tables. Table 19—I summarises (1) the statistics of the Statisticses Jahrbuch covering all the commercial banks of the country and (2) the interim reports of the Kreditbanken (excluding the Deutsche Golddiskontbank), as published in the Reichsanzeiger. The former include the big Berlin banks, provincial banks having branches, other commercial banks and special banks for building, etc. The Kreditbanken covered appear to account for about 95% of the total balance-sheet of all commercial banks in 1931. Table 19—II summarises the annual balance-sheets of the big Berlin banks.

For reasons of space, the following notes show the detailed composition of the statistics only of the Kreditbanken and the big Berlin banks, and not of all the commercial banks, as shown in the first part of Table 19 — I. A comparison of the details given in the first edition of this volume will show, however, that the Kreditbanken are fully representative of all the banks. The returns of the big Berlin banks for the end of 1936 are provisional.

Value of Currency: During the period of the legal stabilisation of the drachma (1928-1931), the Bank of Greece was bound to buy and sell exchange on London at the rate of 375 drachmæ = £1. On September 21st, 1931, the Bank announced that it would buy and sell exchange on New York at the stabilised rate of the drachma, and, by the Laws of September 28th and October 8th, 1931, it secured a monopoly of the purchase and sale of foreign currencies. The Law of April 26th, 1932, suspended the Bank's obligation to buy and sell foreign currency at a fixed rate. Under the terms of the Decree of July 29th, 1932, debts in foreign currency (including bank deposits) arising before April 26th, 1932, were compulsorily converted into debts in drachmæ at the rate of 100 drachmæ = \$1, with certain exceptions relating to foreign transactions. On September 28th, 1936, the drachmæ was again pegged to the pound sterling within these limits: minimum, £1 = 540 drachmæ; maximum, £1 = 550 drachmæ. As from September 28th, the buying rate for the £ was fixed at 546 drachmæ, and the selling rate at 550 drachmæ. The strict measures taken in August 1936 to prevent the flight of currency abroad were abolished in October 1936.

Bank of Greece: Up to April 23rd, 1932, the items in the balance-sheet are expressed in stabilised drachmæ. Gold and foreign exchange: Including currency not used as cover, which does not, however, amount to a very large sum (2 million drachmæ in 1929, 0.5 million in December 1935). In December 1934 and 1935, the coin and

bullion holdings amounted to 3,210 and 2,628 million drachmæ respectively. Government gold loan securities: Since May 1st, 1933, these securities are no longer added to the total of the Bank's reserve. Advances to the Government: Non-interest-bearing advances granted by the Bank to the Government, under arrangements with foreign creditors, out of the accumulated deposits in the account of the International Financial Commission. These deposits represent the sums paid into the account of that institution by deduction from the revenues securing the service of the external debt, and accumulated through the suspension of the transfer of part of the interest on the external debt. Government debt: Debt arising from the former compulsory rate and from other gold advances, and transferred to the Bank of Greece by the National Bank of Greece; the annual payment of 200 million drachmæ for the amortisation of this debt (Agreement of October 27th, 1927, between the Government and the Bank) has been suspended since 1932, so that the debt has been reduced only by the amount of the Government's participation in the profits of the Bank of Greece and the amount of the taxes and charges due to the Government by the National Bank of Greece. Sight liabilities in drachmæ: Including the deposits of the International Financial Commission (cf. supra, "Advances to the Government"). In 1930 and 1931, the total comprised 140 millions and 1,261 millions respectively in time deposits (including 140 millions and 447 millions respectively of banks' deposits).

Commercial Banks: Five big banks. Cash: Including balances with the Bank of Greece.

Mortgage Banks: Two mortgage banks.

Agricultural Banks: Two agricultural banks. Total of short-term and long-term loans.

Clearing Turnover: Total of amounts cleared in the clearing-houses of Athens, the Piræus and Salonica; monthly figures.

Value of Currency: The nominal gold value of the currency has been maintained by means of exchange restrictions introduced in 1931. Already in 1932, however, a system was started under which the National Bank applied premia and surcharges on the foreign exchange surrendered to it by exporters and allotted by it to importers respectively. These premia and surcharges varied greatly according to the commodity in question and according to the country of origin or destination. In December 1935, the premium and surcharge rates were unified at 50% and 53% respectively, with the exception of certain countries for which lower rates were fixed. These exceptions included France and Switzerland, for which, however, the premium and surcharge rates were raised, in October 1936, from 38 and 41% respectively to 50 and 53%, while those for Czechoslovakia were increased from 40 and 43% to 45 and 46.5%. At the end of November 1936, the premium and surcharge rates on Italian lire were likewise raised from 40 and 43% to 45 and 46.5%.

A Decree of March 6th, 1935, required all gold held by private persons or firms to be reported at the National Bank, but at the same time authorised the Central Corporation of Banking Companies to buy such gold at the price of 6,000 pengö per kilogramme, which represented a premium of 58% on the official parity of 3,794 pengö. At the end of March 1935, the buying price was reduced to 5,840 pengö. It stood at 5,760 pengö at the end of December 1935.

National Bank: Last day of year or month indicated. State debt: The recent rise in this item is largely due to certain measures of agricultural debt relief, which were described in Commercial Banks 1929-1934, page 62. Discount rate: Date of last change: August 29th, 1935.

Commercial Bank Deposits: The above figures exclude the item of "Creditors", which is included under deposits in the Summary Balance-sheet below.

Situation prior to the Constitution of the Reserve Bank of India: The returns of the Paper Currency Reserve (Treasury) and those of the Gold Standard Reserve (Government of India) have been combined in the foregoing table. Gold: Valued at the rate of  $13^1/_3$  rupees = £1, fixed on April 1st, 1927. In March 1935, 415 million rupees were held by the Paper Currency Reserve and 29 millions by the Gold Standard Reserve. Silver: Coin held by the Paper Currency Reserve. Notes in circulation: The notes issued by the Government of India, and since April 1935 by the Central Bank, represent only a part of the currency in circulation, which to a large extent consists of coin, the exact amount being unknown.

Deposits: Scheduled banks: Imperial Bank of India, seventeen exchange banks, thirty-six Indian joint-stock banks with a paid-up capital and reserves of more than 500,000 rupees. Other banks: Sixty-nine joint-stock banks with a paid-up capital and reserves of less than 500,000 rupees and 236 co-operative banks (number of banks in 1934).

Value of Currency: Section 40 of the Reserve Bank Act of February 16th, 1934 (which established the Reserve Bank of India), requires the Bank to buy sterling at 1s.  $5^{19}/_{64}$  d. and to sell sterling at 1s.  $6^3/_{16}$  d. per rupee.

Reserve Bank of India: See, for the initial transactions relating to its constitution on April 5th, 1935, Money and Banking 1935/36, Vol. II, page 114. In the foregoing return, the balance-sheet of the Issue department and

that of the Banking department have been consolidated. Last weekly statement for the month. Gold: Including the gold held by the Bank of England. Silver: Rupees held by the two departments. Foreign exchange: British Government securities held by the Issue department, maturing within five years. Other: Notes, cash, and short-term securities maturing within ten years from the date of their purchase, converted into rupees at the rate of 1s. 6d., held by the Banking department. Government of India securities: Securities held by the two departments. Notes in circulation: Net circulation, not including notes held by the Banking department. Bank deposits: Compulsory deposits of the scheduled banks and deposits of other non-scheduled banks.

The Reserve Bank of India continues to be responsible for the monetary policy of Burma, and the rupee remains the legal currency of Burma, since the separation of the latter from India in April 1937.

Scheduled Banks: Banks controlled by the Reserve Bank of India (see above). Last weekly statement for the month (beginning on July 5th, 1935). Figures relate solely to cash in India and transactions in India. Cash: Not including balances with the Reserve Bank of India. Discount: The portfolio does not include Treasury bills.

Rate of Interest: The discount rate of the Reserve Bank of India, which had been fixed on July 4th, 1935, at  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  — a rate corresponding to that of the Imperial Bank of India for advances — was reduced to 3 % on November 28th, 1935.

Value of Currency: After being legally stabilised on December 21st, 1927, at 92.46 lire to the £ and 19 lire to the U.S.A. dollar, the lira began to depreciate in relation to gold parity in March 1934. The official system of exchange control introduced on May 26th, 1934 (prohibition to export notes and cheques payable in Italy, obligation to submit for stamping foreign securities held in Italy and to declare the amount of foreign-exchange holdings and credits abroad), has undergone frequent alterations, more particularly on December 15th, 1934 (compulsory offer of foreign holdings), November 16th, 1935 (ban on the import of 1,000- and 500-lire bank-notes), June 10th, 1936 (limitation to 300 lire of the amounts which may be exported without special licence), and November 21st, 1936 (banks authorised to accept in deposit, as from December 1st, the proceeds in lire of sales

of foreign exchange, convertible at the owner's option into foreign exchange). On November 27th, 1935, the Banca d'Italia raised the price of gold by 18.53% by fixing the buying price of gold at 15.5 lire per gramme of fine gold (buying price fixed by the Law of 1927 at 12.6276 lire per gramme). A tourist lira was introduced under the Decree of March 20th, 1936, depreciated by 31.6% in relation to parity. On October 5th, 1936, the gold content of the lira was reduced by 40.94% (I lira = 0.04677 gramme of fine gold as compared with 0.07919 gramme, the 1927 parity), corresponding exactly to the reduction in the gold content of the dollar, thus restoring the old parity of 19 lire per U.S.A. dollar. The value of the lira may be reduced by Royal Decree up to 10%. The tourist lira has been kept at a rate lower than the official exchange rate of the lira.

Banca d'Italia: The Bank's statements have not been published since October 20th, 1935. Gold at home: Reckoned at the legal rate (see above: "Value of Currency"). The revaluation profits resulting from the writing-up of the gold reserve on October 5th, 1936, was attributed to the State. Foreign exchange: Foreign exchange and holdings included in the note cover. Gold abroad: Claim on the Government relating to gold deposited in London during the negotiations for war loans and not included in the legal cover. Advances to Istituto per la Ricostruzione Industriale: Amounts advanced in 1929-1932 to the Istituto di Liquidazioni, founded in 1926 to take over from the Banca d'Italia the frozen credits discounted by the latter for the Banco di Sconto and other financial institutions; amounts advanced since 1933 to the Istituto per la Ricostruzione Industriale, set up by the Decree of January 23rd, 1933, the second section of which (Sezione Smobilizzi) took over the assets and liabilities of the Istituto di Liquidazioni. The rise in 1936 in the amount of advances to the I.R.I. is due to the agreement concerning the final settlement of the relations between the Bank of Italy and the I.R.I. concluded in accordance with the Decree-Laws of March 12th, 1936, and May 25th, 1936. Advances to the Treasury: The balance sheet drawn up as at December 31st, 1936, contains two new items: Temporary advance to the Treasury amounting to 1 milliard of lire and Extraordinary advance to the Treasury against ordinary Treasury bills, amounting to two milliards of lire. Notes in circulation: In 1929, the total note circulation included, in addition to Banca d'Italia notes, 80 million lire of Government notes subsequently withdrawn. Since December 1935, Government notes issued on the basis of the Law of May 20th, 1935, are included (see below: Metallic Circulation). Sight liabilities: Assignments on the Bank, interest-bearing current accounts and the Treasury current account (300 million lire in the years 1929-1935).

Metallic Circulation: Silver, nickel and bronze coins for Treasury account. Under the Decree of May 20th, 1935, the 20- and 10-lire silver coins were withdrawn from circulation and replaced by 10-lire Government notes.

Commercial Banks: Number of banks: December 1934 to August 1935: 211; October 1935: 206; December 1935: 205; April 1936: 198; June 1936: 196; October 1936: 189. These statistics, published every two months, are not available for March and September. See the note to the Balance-sheet Summary. Banking laws: For the reform of March 12th, 1936, see the previous edition of this volume.

Clearing Turnover: Average of daily clearings at clearing-houses in eleven principal towns.

Value of Currency: The gold standard was suspended and exports of gold prohibited in December 1931. Exchange restrictions, mainly intended to prevent a flight of capital, were imposed under a Law of July 1st, 1932 ("Law concerning the Prevention of Exports of Capital"). Since 1933, the yen has been held practically stable in relation to sterling at a rate of 1s. 2d. per yen, as compared with the par rate of 2s. 0.582d. Exchange control was rendered more stringent by regulations which came into force on January 8th, 1937, under which a licensing system administered by a Foreign Exchange Control Bureau at the Ministry of Finance was applied to transactions in foreign exchange in settlement of imports to Japan for all amounts exceeding 30,000 yen per month.

Bank of Japan: The figures are based on the last weekly return in the year or month indicated. Gold: The gold reserve of the Bank of Japan is still entered at the parity of 1.33 yen per gramme of fine gold fixed by the Coinage Law of 1897. After the imposition of the embargo on gold exports in December 1931, the Government undertook, in March 1932, to purchase gold from domestic producers, this gold being used for meeting the Government's foreign obligations. By a Law of April 1934, this policy of domestic gold purchases was transferred to the Bank of Japan. The Bank's buying price per gramme of fine gold was fixed at 2.95 yen in April 1934, raised to 3.10 yen in January 1935, and raised further to 3.50 yen in May 1936. It should be noted that the Bank's gold price, being fixed mainly with a view to stimulating domestic production, bears no direct relation to the actual gold value of the currency. The difference between the book value of the gold bought and the actual price paid by the Bank is entered among the assets of the Bank under "Advances to the Government". Advances to Government: The increase of this item in recent years is due to the Bank's gold purchases and represents the excess of the purchase price over the legal book value of the gold bought. Notes issued: On July 1st, 1932, the maximum limit of the fiduciary issue was raised from 120 to 1,000 million yen, and the annual tax on any issues in excess of this amount was reduced from 5% to 3%.

Interest Rates: Discount rate: Date of last change: April 7th, 1936. Market rate of discount: Sixty days' commercial paper, Tokio. Call money rate: Average rate on loans callable at a day's notice in Tokio. Bond yields: Average yield of eight public bonds.

"Ordinary Banks": This group represents the commercial banks proper and covers approximately the same institutions as those included in the end-of-year accounts in the adjoining summary balance-sheet.

"Special" Banks: This group comprises the following semi-public institutions: the Bank of Japan, the Yokohama Specie Bank, the Hypothec Bank of Japan, the Industrial Bank of Japan, the Bank of Taiwan, the Bank of Chosen, the Chosen Industrial Bank, the Hokkaido Colonial Bank and nineteen "agricultural-and-industrial" banks. Most of these banks raise their funds largely through the issue of debentures.

Savings Banks: Excluding Post Office Savings Bank, for the deposits of which see under "Treasury Deposit Bureau".

Treasury Deposit Bureau: This institution, which is attached to the Japanese Ministry of Finance, invests the deposits received by the Post Office Savings Bank from the public.

Total "Other Securities": From particulars available for the "ordinary" banks and the Treasury Deposit Bureau, it would appear that these "other securities" represent to a large extent bonds of local Governments and debentures of the "special" banks.

Clearing Turnover: Quarterly totals of clearings at all clearing-houses in Japan proper.

Sources: Annual reports and Monetary Statistics (monthly) of the Bank of Japan; the Oriental Economist; the Monthly Circular of the Mitsubishi Economic Research Bureau. The summary balance-sheet below, which covers all "ordinary" banks operating in Japan and in addition the Tokio office of the Bank of Chosen and the "ordinary" banks of Formosa, is based on statistics kindly furnished by the Director of the Economic Research Department of the Bank of Japan and by the London Agent of the Bank of Japan.

## Summary of Profit-and-Loss Accounts.

The summary of profit-and-loss accounts is compiled from half-yearly data provided by the London agent of the Bank of Japan, and by the Director of the Economic Research Department of the Bank of Japan. The banks covered by this table and by the Summary Balance-sheet are identical.

Department of the Bank of Japan. The banks covered by this table and by the Summary Balance-sheet are identical.

The Summary Table is established in the following way: By working backwards from items 12 to 9, for each of which individual figures are available, item 8, "Total disposed of for Dividends, etc.", is obtained. Item 11, "Other Purposes", represents the "bonus and allowances" of the original figures. "Remaining Net Profit

or Loss", item 5 of the table, has been obtained by subtracting from item 8 the sum of items 6 and 7, "Carried forward from Preceding Year" and "Taken from Reserves or Capital" respectively, for which separate figures are likewise available. The lump-sum figures for "Expenses", "Depreciation Accounts", "Pensions Fund", etc., have similarly been arrived at by subtracting from the original data on "Gross Profits" the sum representing "Net Profits". The figures so obtained for items 2 to 4 correspond fairly closely to an item given in the Japanese as "Gross Loss for the Year"

Value of Currency: Exchange control was introduced in October 1931. On September 28th, 1936, the Latvian currency, which had remained nominally on gold at a rate, equal to that of the Swiss franc, of 15 to 16 lats to the £ sterling, was legally linked to sterling at a rate of 25.22 lats to the £—i.e., at the parity which was in effect before the suspension of the gold standard in the United Kingdom. This corresponded to a devaluation of the currency by about 40 %. (The actual depreciation was considerably less, as for some time previously direct exchange dealings between exporters and importers were authorised, the ruling rate being about 21 to 22 lats to the £.)

Bank of Latvia: The figures refer to the last day of the year or month indicated. Gold and foreign exchange: At the beginning of October 1936, these items were written up by about 65%, in accordance with the devaluation. The revaluation profit of 38 million lats was credited (partly under "Government deposits", partly under "Other liabilities" of the Bank) to a newly formed Exchange Equalisation Fund. Current accounts: Excluding Government accounts. Discount rate: Date of last change: November 1st, 1936.

State Credit Institutions: The most important of these are: the State Agricultural Bank, the State Mortgage Bank and the Post Office Savings Bank.

Private Credit Institutions: Including the Latvian Credit Bank, mutual credit associations, communal banks, etc., in addition to the joint-stock commercial banks proper.

#### Summary Balance-sheet.

General Note. — The Summary Tables below include the Riga Stock Exchange Bank, in addition to the other commercial banks of the country. The sharp reduction in the number of banks in 1935 was due to the establishment, under a Law of April 11th, 1935, of the Latvian Credit Bank, a State-controlled institution included in the commercial-bank accounts given below, which took over a number of private banks which had been in difficulties for several years.

Value of Currency: Mexico left the gold standard on July 25th, 1931; under the new monetary law which came into force on that date, the peso of 0.75 gramme of fine gold remained the monetary unit, but the silver peso was made legal tender to any amount. Since July 1933, the peso has been attached to the U.S.A. dollar, first at the rate of 3.55 pesos (July-November 1933) and then at the rate of 3.60 pesos per dollar. Following the rise in silver prices due to the policy pursued by the United States of America, the Mexican Government decreed on April 27th, 1935, that all silver and silver coins in the hands of the public and the banks were State property and would be withdrawn from circulation, and the Bank of Mexico was authorised to suspend the conversion of notes into metal and to sell exchange at the rate of 3.60 pesos per dollar. Actually, however, the peso-U.S.A. dollar rate has been maintained. On September 1st, 1936, the essential provisions of the Law of April 27th, 1935, were

abrogated and the silver piastre 720/1000 fine was brought into circulation again. The equivalent value of the piastre will be fixed by a later law.

Situation before the Reform of April 27th, 1935: Owing to the frequent changes made by the Bank of Mexico in the form of its balance-sheet (see below, "Bank of Mexico"), it is impossible to give comparable figures for the whole of the period covered by the present work; the table showing the general monetary situation has, therefore, had to be confined to the most important items in the balance-sheets of the Bank of Mexico and private banks of issue. Gold: Valued at the legal parity (peso-oro). Money in circulation: Notes: The legal basis for issuing notes was broadened in 1932 (see below, "Bank of Mexico"). Metallic coins: Estimated amounts held by private banks and the public. Since April 1935, silver coins have been withdrawn from circulation and exchanged for bank-notes (see above, "Value of Currency").

Bank of Mexico: Founded in August 1925, the Bank of Mexico has been reformed four times. The first three reforms were enacted in June 1931, April 1932 and April 1935 (cf. previous editions of this volume). The fourth reform of the Bank, carried out in pursuance of the Presidential Decree of September 1st, 1936, deals more especially with the following points: (1) Remonetisation of silver (see above, "Value of Currency"); (2) Bank of Mexico notes made legal tender for any amount; (3) silver coins made legal tender for limited amounts: 100 piastres for a single payment, in the case of 1-piastre and 50-centavo coins, 50 piastres in the case of 20-centavo coins; (4) issue by the Bank of Mexico of 5-peso currency certificates, representing legal tender silver coins or bar silver at the rate of 12 grammes of pure silver per piastre, the Bank being obliged to exchange such certificates for notes or metallic currency at the holder's option; (5) fixing of two limits for the note issue: (a) a limit defined by the nature of the transactions giving rise to the issue of notes ((i) investments authorised by the law; (ii) payments obligatory on the Bank, particularly payments due to withdrawal of deposits; (iii) manipulation or withdrawal from circulation of other current forms of cash); (b) a limit represented by fixing the maximum issue, including sight obligations, at 50 piastres per head; (6) metallic reserve consisting of gold or foreign exchange in a proportion of not less than 80% of its total amount, the balance of 20% being in the form of silver; (7) autonomy of the Bank; (8) Bank not allowed to deal direct with the public. — Owing to changes made in September 1936 in the form of the Bank's balance-sheet, returns since that date are not strictly comparable with those for the period when the Bank was governed by the Law of April 27th, 1935. — Gold, silver and foreign assets: Return of the issue department set up under the Law of April 27th, 1935, valued at cost. Since September 1936, metallic reserve and silver earmarked as cover for the silver certificate issue. Monetary circulation: Return of the issue department; including small coins. Since September 1936, note issue plus silver certificates issued by the Bank.

Commercial Banks: Deposits by the public in all banks and banking institutions, except the Bank of Mexico and the mortgage banks. Since July 1936, all private credit institutions.

Value of Currency: On September 26th, 1936, the Government placed an embargo on gold exports and suspended the gold standard. An Exchange Equalisation Fund of 300 million florins was created to prevent excessive fluctuations of the florin, the limits of which have not yet been fixed. On November 21st, 1936, the Government acceded to the Franco-Anglo-American Tripartite Agreement of September 25th, 1936, and to the arrangements for ensuring the technical co-operation referred to by the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States in his statement on October 13th, 1936.

Nederlandsche Bank: Last weekly statement of the month. Gold: Valued at the legal rate. The gold taken from the Bank on September 30th, 1936, to constitute the metallic reserves of the Exchange Equalisation Fund (100 million florins) was returned to it between December 7th and 14th, 1936. Foreign bills: The annual balance-sheets as at March 31st show, in addition to foreign bills, "Balances with Correspondents abroad", the amount of which during the years 1929-1936 varied as follows: (florins 000,000's) 37; 24; 32; 18; 8; 1; 1; 2. Loans and advances: The increase in this item in October 1936 and the corresponding decrease in December are partly due to gold transfers between the Bank and the Exchange Equalisation Fund (cf. Gold, above). Banking legislation: On February 22nd, 1937, the privilege of the Nederlandsche Bank was renewed for five years as from April 1st, 1937, and the Bank was authorised to undertake open-market operations.

Value of Currency: The gold standard was suspended on September 27th, 1931. Since 1933, the currency has been pegged to sterling at the rate of 19.90 kroner to the £.

Bank of Norway: The figures refer throughout to the last day of the year or month indicated. Change in Statutes: The upper limit of the Bank's fiduciary issue was raised from 250 million kroner to 325 million kroner by a Law of June 30th, 1936. This law, moreover, expressly authorised the Bank to carry out open-market operations. Gold and foreign exchange: The gold and foreign-exchange reserve is still valued at the old parities. Discount rate: Date of last change: December 7th, 1936.

¹ In the preceding edition of this publication (Money and Banking 1935/36, Vol. II, page 144) it was stated that the proceeds of a loan of £1.15 million issued in London in September 1934 on behalf of a Norwegian firm were used to liquidate the firm's indebtedness to the Bank of Norway. This statement was erroneous. In fact, the proceeds of the loan were used to liquidate the firm's indebtedness to a commercial bank, and the Bank of Norway took no part in the transaction.

Commercial Banks: The monthly returns on which the above figures are based cover only sixty-four "free" banks and are therefore not fully comparable with the complete annual accounts shown in the summary balance-sheet table below. Tax on bank deposits: In January 1936, the Government imposed a tax of 25 % on interest derived from deposits in commercial and savings banks. The recent decline in deposits, accompanied by an increase in the note circulation, should be considered in the light of this measure.

#### 16. Due to Banks (Correspondents).

The amounts shown as due to banks at home include indebtedness to the Central Bank. (Rediscounts, under group 18 below, usually constitute but a small part of that indebtedness.) This can be isolated as follows. The mutual indebtedness of the banks is eliminated by subtracting 6 (a) from 16 (a). Of the balance, part is due to the savings banks and part to the Norges Bank. The net deposits of the savings banks with commercial banks can be calculated from the reports of the Bank Inspector (which, however, cover only 81% of the total balances of the savings banks). Deducting these deposits from the difference between 16 (a) and 6 (a), one obtains a balance which represents borrowings of the commercial banks from the Norges Bank. Calculated in this way, these borrowings, at the end of the years 1929 to 1935, stood at about 50, 75, 150, 160, 180, 140 and 104 million kroner respectively; the exact figures cannot be arrived at owing to the incompleteness of the savings banks' statistics.

## **PARAGUAY**

See Money and Banking, 1935/36, Volume II, page 149.

Value of the Currency: Since 1923, the Paraguayan peso has been officially pegged to the Argentine gold peso. The official currency rate, which was fixed at 42.6136 Paraguayan paper pesos to one Argentine gold peso (18.75 Paraguayan paper pesos to one Argentine paper peso) was raised twice after the end of the war with Bolivia, first on August 17th, 1935 (one Argentine paper peso = 25 Paraguayan paper pesos or one Argentine gold peso = 56.8182 Paraguayan paper pesos), and again on February 1st, 1936 (one Argentine paper peso = 35 Paraguayan paper pesos or one Argentine gold peso = 79.5454 Paraguayan paper pesos). Shortly after this second modification, the official exchange value of the peso was fixed at 61.50 Paraguayan paper pesos to one Argentine paper peso. Besides the official exchange value, the peso has an open market rate which fell in October 1935 to about 95 Paraguayan pesos = one Argentine paper peso, although it recovered somewhat subsequently. Exchange control was introduced in August 1932 and exporters were obliged to sell to the Oficina de Cambios part of the proceeds of their exports at the official rates given above.

Notes Issue: Notes in circulation: The amount of paper money in circulation, estimated just before the Chaco war at 200 million pesos, increased very considerably during the years 1932-1935; in spite of a certain deflation accomplished after the cessation of hostilities in June 1935, the amount of paper money in circulation in the second half of 1936 was estimated at 1,125 million pesos, as compared with 1,400 millions a year ago (Department of Overseas Trade: Report on Economic and Commercial Conditions in Paraguay, 1937). Argentine currency, used for certain commercial transactions, is recognised as legal tender in Paraguay. Banking legislation: The Oficina de Cambios, a Government institution which performs both central and commercial banking operations and has charge of the exchange control, was transformed into the Banco de la República del Paraguay; this Government bank, to which the Oficina de Cambios has transferred its assets and liabilities, is still governed by the charter of the former institution, since its own statutes have not yet been drawn up (Decree of February 22nd, 1936).

Value of Currency: The gold parity was fixed on April 18th, 1931, at 1 sol = 0.27998 U.S.A. dollar, 1 U.S.A. dollar = 3.57171 sols (1 Peruvian pound = 10 sols). As the gold parity was not fixed until 1931, the value of the currency, as shown in the above table, has been calculated on the basis of the average rate of the Peruvian currency in 1929. Official exchange control has not been introduced.

Banco Central de Reserva del Perú: Till 1930, Banco de Reserva del Perú. Gold: Since May 18th, 1932 (Law No. 7526 suspending the convertibility of notes), the gold holding has been made up as follows: (1) 38.8 millions of gold, "which cannot be touched", valued at the legal parity of 2.3738 gold sols = 1 gramme of fine gold, and (2) the remainder valued at cost (Law No. 7538) — that is, at 4.66 gold sols in December 1934 and 4.38 gold sols in December 1935 (monthly average for 1 gramme of fine gold). Foreign exchange: Since April 1935, these include gold abroad. Discounts and advances: Treasury bills: Rediscounted by the commercial banks at the Banco Central since 1930. Advances to the Treasury: Direct advances (Laws Nos. 7760, 7837, and, since June 1936, Laws Nos. 8040 and 8191).

Commercial Banks: Including the Lima Savings Bank. Treasury bills: These bills rediscounted at the Banco Central form part of the legal reserve (Laws Nos. 6745, 7538, 7701, 7737 and 7881). Deposits: Excluding inter-bank deposits and court deposits.

Value of Currency: A system of exchange restrictions was introduced by a Decree of April 26th, 1936, which centralised all foreign-exchange transactions with the Bank of Poland and certain private banks authorised by it, made foreign payments subject to the permit of a Foreign Exchange Commission set up at the Bank, and required all firms and persons to surrender at the official rates of exchange any foreign means of payment in their possession. A comprehensive licensing system for imports was, in addition, instituted by a Decree of May 8th, 1936. In June 1936, the transfer of funds on account of foreign debts was suspended; the Polish debtors concerned were required to make their payments in zloty into blocked accounts at the Bank of Poland.

Bank of Poland: The figures refer throughout to the last day of the year or month shown. Discount rate: Date of last change: October 26th, 1933.

Value of Currency: A de facto stability of the exchange having been maintained since 1928, the currency was legally placed on a gold basis in June 1931. When, however, the United Kingdom suspended the gold standard on September 21st, 1931, Portugal linked her currency to sterling at the par rate of 110 escudos to the £.

Bank of Portugal: The annual figures refer to the last day of the year, while the quarterly figures are based on the last weekly return in the month shown. In June 1931, the gold reserve of the Bank of Portugal was written up in accordance with the new legal gold parity and the revaluation profit was in large part applied to the reduction of the State debt to the Bank. Discount rate: Date of last change: May 5th, 1936.

Commercial Banks: For reasons of a technical nature, these figures, based on the monthly returns published in the *Monthly Bulletin* of the National Institute of Statistics, differ slightly from the final end-of-year accounts published in *Situação Bancaria* and reproduced in the summary balance-sheet below, though the banks included are the same in both cases.

Caixa Geral de Depositos: This is a State credit institution intimately connected with the Treasury.

Clearing Turnover: Quarterly totals of clearings at the clearing-houses of Lisbon and Oporto.

Value of Currency: The exchange control, introduced on May 18th, 1932, has been frequently altered; as from June 11th, 1935, the National Bank gave exporters premiums of 10 to 40% on the official exchange rate and imposed a surcharge of 44% on importers. On December 1st, 1935, the various premiums were replaced by one single premium amounting in the case of "strong" currencies (not subject to any restrictions) to 38% of the official exchange rate; an ad valorem tax of 12% was levied on all imports and a tax of 12% on oil exports. This depreciation of the leu has been recognised by putting a premium on the price of gold bought by the National Bank (30% since June 11th, 1935; 38% since July 1st, 1936) and, on November 6th, 1936, by revaluing the bank's gold reserve at 153,333.33 lei per kilogramme, which, compared with the rate of 111,111.11 lei fixed by the Stabilisation Law of February 7th, 1929, represents a depreciation of 27.54%.

The profit accruing from revaluation of the gold reserve (see above, "Value of Currency") belonging to the State has been applied as follows: (1) repayment of the advance of 2 milliard lei made by the Bank to the Government (see below, "Government Debt"); (2) liquidation of various items in the Bank's balance-sheet (premium paid on gold purchases, 220 millions; differences due to foreign currency devaluation, 275 millions), creation of a fund of 100 millions to cover the cost of foreign-exchange control and opening of a special account of 347 millions to pay the premium of 38% on the unpaid balance of the debt contracted by the National Bank in 1931 to the Bank of France and used for the transfer of payments to the State: total, 942 millions; (3) appropriation for the army, 1,360 millions. Foreign exchange: For cover purposes: Gold foreign exchange, forming part of the statutory reserve. Other: Other foreign exchange, foreign exchange reserved for payment of imports and other payments, exchange available on the exchange account and special foreign-exchange reserves. Commercial bills: Current trade bills. Agricultural and urban bills: Non-realisable bills shown separately since the last quarter of 1932. Treasury bills: Bills of the Roumanian Government to cover losses on agricultural and urban debts (Law of April 7th, 1934). Government debt : (1) Old debt (4 milliards on February 7th, 1929), for the amortisation of which the Government earmarks particularly the dividends on its National Bank shares and its share in profits; (2) temporary advance of 2 milliards immobilised since 1932 and repeid on November 6th, 1936.

Coins in Circulation: The Laws of February 23rd and December 20th, 1935, fixed the maximum metallic issue at 4,820 millions.

Commercial Banks: Commercial banks whose maximum nominal capital is 40 million lei. Number of banks is 37 in September 1935, 28 since December 1935.

Value of Currency: Since the war, the gold standard (parity fixed on October 19th, 1868: I peseta = 0.29032 gramme of fine gold = 0.19295 old U.S.A. dollar) has not been restored in Spain. The exchange control, instituted on May 18th, 1931 (exchange transactions centralised with the Centro Oficial de Contractación de Moneda), has, since 1935, been frequently modified, more particularly in June 1935 (measures designed to attract Spanish and foreign capital from abroad), on November 8th, 1935 (creation of endorsable certificates for payment of imports), on March 16th, 1936 (export of capital and repatriation of Spanish notes), on May 16th, 1936 (export of bank-notes, formerly authorised up to an amount of 5,000 pesetas, cut down to 500 pesetas), on May 29th, 1936 (creation of an Exchange Control Fund attached to the Centro Oficial, financed by means of 25.2 million gold pesetas taken from the Banco de España's cash balance and the proceeds of increased Customs duties on certain products), and on October 10th, 1936 (requisition of gold and foreign exchange in territory under Government control in exchange for compensation calculated at the rate of 293.18 silver pesetas for 100 gold pesetas). In August 1936, the chief stock exchanges suspended the peseta quotation.

Government securities and advances to the Treasury: Bonds of the 4% redeemable debt 1928 (344 million pesetas) and advance made to the Treasury under the Law of July 14th, 1891 (150 million pesetas). Chief currency measures taken since July 19th, 1936: (1) Silver coinage withdrawn and replaced by 5- and 10-peseta notes (October 13th, 1936); (2) compulsory stamping of Banco de España notes circulating in the territory controlled by the Burgos authorities (November 12th) and declaration by the Valencia Government annulling the notes stamped (November 29th, 1936); (3) issue of small-denomination notes in Catalonia and the Basque country.

The 1935 figures are provisional.

Riksbank: The figures refer throughout to the last day of the year or month indicated. Gold and foreign exchange: The Riksbank's gold and foreign-exchange reserve is still valued at the old parities. Securities: The sharp rise of this item in 1932 was connected with the breakdown of the Kreuger concern and the measures taken by the Government, with the help of the Riksbank, to support a large commercial bank involved in it. Repayments by that bank of the loans it received for this purpose are reflected in the steady decline of the Riksbank's securities after 1932. Loans and discounts: Rediscounts to commercial banks have been nil since 1933. Discount rate: Date of last change: December 1st, 1933. Since that date, the rediscount rate for bills of less than three months' currency has been 2 %.

Value of Currency: On June 20th, 1935, a "gentlemen's agreement" was concluded between the National Bank and the Swiss banks under which they undertook to scrutinise all exchange operations proposed to them and avoid transactions of a speculative character. By a Decree dated June 23rd, 1936, the Federal Council prohibited the forward purchase and sale of gold, advances on gold or foreign exchange, and the forward buying of foreign exchange, when not based on a bona-fide commercial transaction. By the Federal Council's Decree of September 27th, 1936, the National Bank of Switzerland was released from its obligation to redeem its notes in gold or gold exchange and instructed to maintain the gold parity of the franc between 0.190 and 0.215 gramme of fine gold, which corresponded to a devaluation of from 25.94 to 34.56% of the franc's previous value (1 franc =

0.29032 gramme of fine gold). No restrictions were placed on the movements of gold. On November 21st, 1936, the Federal Council acceded to the Franco-Anglo-American Tripartite Agreement of September 25th, 1936, and to the arrangements for ensuring the technical co-operation referred to by the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States of America in his statement on October 13th, 1936. At the beginning of October 1936, the Government of the Principality of Liechtenstein decided to apply the monetary measures introduced in Switzerland.

National Bank of Switzerland: Gold: Valued at the legal rate. The gold in hand on September 26th has been written up by 35.033% (1 franc = 0.215 gramme of fine gold). The profit resulting from the revaluation (538.6 millions) is included in the balance-sheet at October 7th and is to form an Exchange Equalisation Fund. "Reskripte": Discounted bills of the Confederation, the Federal Railways, cantons and municipalities. Bonds of the Swiss Federal Loan Fund: This institution was created on July 8th, 1932, for the purpose of making loans on bills of exchange and other securities not quoted on the stock exchanges and not secured on a mortgage charge. Public securities: Including, in 1930, United States Treasury bills and securities (93 millions) and Netherlands Treasury bills and securities (6 millions).

Big Swiss Banks: Seven banks. Cash: Including balances at the National Bank.

Cantonal Banks: Members of the Union of Swiss Cantonal Banks.

#### Summary Balance-sheet.

The figures for the years 1931-1934 are not fully comparable to those for 1935, in consequence of the introduction in March 1935 of the new form of balance-sheet prescribed by the regulations in execution of the Federal Law of November 8th. 1934, on Banks and Savings Banks. Furthermore, the balance-sheets of thirty-five local banks (capital: 34.5 millions; balance-sheet total: 117.7 millions) have been introduced in the banking statistics, while eight local banks (capital: 30.3 millions; balance-sheet total: 220.8 millions) have been omitted.

Value of Currency: The gold standard has not been re-established since the war; the value of the currency shown in the above table has accordingly been calculated on the basis of the average exchange rate in 1929. At the end of 1929, 1930 and 1931, the currency was worth 97.2, 97.8 and 98.1 % respectively of that average. Exchange control was set up on February 26th, 1930. As from January 1st, 1932, supervision of exchange transactions was transferred from the Consortium des Banques d'Istamboul to the Central Bank. On September 28th, 1936, the Government linked the Turkish pound, previously attached to the French franc, to the £ sterling, fixing the buying rate at £T6.35, and the selling rate at £T6.38, to the £ sterling.

Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey: Last weekly statement in each month, except for figures relating to the first weekly statement, published on January 7th, 1932, and end-of-year figures, which are taken from yearly balance-sheets drawn up as at December 31st. Gold: From a total of 20,969 kg. held in December 1935, 3,307 kg., equivalent to £500,000 gold, or £T4,652,000, were transferred from the Treasury to the Bank, in accordance with Article 6 of the Act of June 11th, 1930, concerning the founding of the Bank; the remainder of the gold reserve was acquired by the Bank out of its own resources. Including gold held abroad. Treasury bills: Bills transferred to the Bank by the Treasury, in exchange for the State notes taken over by the Bank (£T158,748,563), bearing interest at 1% and amortised, inter alia, by a 1% charge levied on the general budget and on subsidiary and local budgets. In accordance with a Decree of April 7th, 1935, however, the yield of this charge has been used by the Bank for the purchase of Government stock. Securities: Includes securities forming part of the note cover, and securities not eligible as cover for note issues (34.4 and 4.3 millions respectively at December 31st, 1935). Advances: Advances on gold, foreign exchange and, more particularly, on collateral. Notes in circulation: Including State notes taken over by the Bank since October 3rd, 1931. Total issues of the Ottoman Bank have been limited to £T279,069 since June 1933.

Clearings: Clearings of Istanbul clearing-house; monthly figures.

Commercial Banks: Summary Balance-sheet: Accounts of joint-stock banks in Turkey, excluding public institutions, the Ottoman Bank and the Bank of Salonica, which do not publish separate balance-sheets relating to Turkey. The accounts prior to 1933 apply to national banks only; those for 1933-1935 also apply to those foreign banks which publish separate accounts relating to their transactions in Turkey.

State Bank: After the banking reforms of 1930 and 1931, which were described in the chapter on the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in *Commercial Banks 1929-1934*, page 117, the State Bank became the sole institution for the supply of short-term credit to production and trade. All payments between the individual State enterprises and organisations are effected through current accounts at the State Bank. The Bank maintains 3,000 branch offices.

Recent Economic Measures affecting the Monetary Circulation: The system of rationing was abolished for bread on January 1st, 1935, for other foodstuffs on October 1st, 1935, and for manufactured articles on January 1st, 1936, while money wages were increased in compensation. With the consequent rise in the turnover of retail trade, cash transactions relating to consumption goods have increased — a fact which has obviously influenced the volume of notes and coins in circulation.

Value of Currency: Under a Decree of November 1935, the selling-rate for roubles to foreign tourists was fixed on the basis of a rate of 1 rouble = 3 French francs (as compared with the gold parity of 1 rouble = 13.20 francs). By a Decree of February 1936, the new exchange rates corresponding to the rate of 1 rouble = 3 francs were extended to all other exchange transactions with foreign countries. On April 1st, 1936, the State Bank revalued its gold stock on the basis of the new rate; the surplus resulting from the revaluation was transferred to the Treasury. After the devaluation of the French franc on September 26th, 1936, foreign-exchange rates were fixed on the basis of 1 rouble = 4.25 francs.

Reduction of Interest Rates: In July 1936, the interest rates charged by the State Bank on short-term loans and overdue loans were reduced from 6% and 8% respectively to 4% and 6%; the rate allowed on savings-bank deposits was lowered from 8% to 3%; and the interest on the internal State loans which have been issued since 1927 at rates of 8-10% was reduced to a uniform level of 4%.

Value of Currency: The gold standard was abandoned on September 21st, 1931. The Bank of England was released from the obligation to sell gold at the statutory price of £3 17s.  $10\frac{1}{2}d$ . per standard ounce. No embargo, however, was placed on exports of gold.

On July 1st, 1932, an "Exchange Equalisation Account" was set up as a Government Fund attached to the Treasury. This Fund was originally empowered to borrow by means of Treasury bills up to a limit of £150 million, plus the balance of the old Dollar Exchange Reserve of £25 million. In May 1933, its resources in the form of Treasury bills were increased by £200 million. The purpose of the Fund is, as its name suggests, to even out irregular fluctuations in the exchanges, but its main significance lies in the fact that its operations are designed to prevent movements of foreign funds from affecting the domestic credit base. Thus, when there has been a movement of foreign balances to London, the Fund has acquired these balances, converting them subsequently into gold, by means of sterling obtained, in effect, by the sale of Treasury bills to the money market; this procedure, though it has influenced the bill holdings and deposits of the commercial banks, has tended to avoid any direct effect on bankers' cash reserves.

For the declaration made by the United Kingdom Treasury simultaneously with the Treasuries of France and the United States of America on the occasion of the devaluation of the French franc on September 26th, 1936, and for the arrangements arrived at on October 12th, 1936, regarding the exchange of gold between these countries, reference should be made to the chapter on France, above.

Bank of England: The figures represent averages based on the published weekly returns relating to Wednesday of each week.

Issue Department: The total note issue of the Issue Department is made up of notes held in the "Reserve" of the Banking Department and of notes in circulation, the latter including, besides notes in the hands of the

public, notes forming part (usually rather more than one-half) of the Clearing Banks' cash reserves and about £20 million of notes held as cover by the Scottish and Irish note-issuing banks. All notes issued by the Issue Department in excess of the fiduciary issue must be covered in full by gold held by the Issue Department and entered at the statutory price of £3 17s.  $10\frac{1}{2}d$ . per standard ounce (or approximately 85s. per ounce of fine gold). The maximum limit of the fiduciary issue was fixed at £260 million by the Currency and Bank Notes Act of 1928, raised to £275 million on August 1st, 1931, and lowered again to £260 million on March 31st, 1933; it was reduced by £60 million to £200 million on December 15th, 1936. The fiduciary issue is covered by the Government securities held by the Issue Department, which may include Treasury bills and other short- and medium-dated Government obligations in addition to long-term and irredeemable Government bonds; the composition of the total lies at the discretion of the Bank. The interest yield of these securities, allowing for any appreciation or depreciation of their capital value and after deducting all expenses connected with the note issue, accrues to the Treasury. It is believed that, similarly, the nominal loss involved in the Bank's purchases of gold since 1932 is borne by the Treasury or by the Treasury's Exchange Equalisation Account. Since the suspension of the gold standard, the London market price of gold, which stood at approximately 142s. per ounce of fine gold at the end of 1936, has been considerably higher than the Bank's statutory buying price of approximately 85s. per ounce of fine gold, and it is therefore generally assumed that the gold acquired by the Bank since 1932 has been transferred to it from the Exchange Equalisation Account. A particularly large transfer of this kind was carried out on December 15th, 1936, when the Bank acquired £65 million of gold at par; at the same time its fiduciary issue was reduced by £60 million, a corresponding amount of the Issue Department's Government securities being transferred to the Exchange Equalisation Account.

Banking Department: Reserve of notes and coin: Of this item, all but a relatively small amount of coin, fluctuating around £1 million, consists of notes. The "Reserve" can only be replenished by a transfer of gold or in the case of an increase of the fiduciary issue — of Government securities to the Issue Department. Like the cash reserve of an ordinary commercial bank, the "Reserve" represents the liquid cover for the Bank's deposit liabilities, and the ratio which it bears to these (generally known as "the Proportion") is normally one of the factors determining the Bank's credit policy. Government securities: Besides long-term bonds, this item, which reflects the Bank's "open-market policy", includes temporary Ways and Means Advances to the Exchequer and such Treasury bills as have been purchased on the market on the Bank's own initiative. Discounts and advances: Besides commercial bills, discounted on the initiative of the Bank's customers, and advances made to discount houses, private clients, etc., this item includes such Treasury bills as may have been offered by bill brokers and others to the Bank for discount. Other securities: Including bonds guaranteed by the British Government, Indian, Colonial, foreign and other bonds, commercial bills - domestic and foreign - acquired by the Bank on its own initiative and any balances which the Bank may hold with foreign central banks. Public deposits: Under this heading, the Bank of England, which acts as the Government's banker, holds all free balances of Government departments and funds, including the accounts connected with the management of the National Debt, and — since 1932 — any sterling balances of the Exchange Equalisation Account which are temporarily not invested in Treasury bills. Bankers' deposits: The great bulk of these deposits is due to the London Clearing Banks, but the figures cover any British banks whose main business is in the United Kingdom. Other deposits: This item represents balances of foreign central banks, British banks operating overseas, dominion and colonial banks, merchant bankers, etc.; deposits of the Dominion, Indian and Colonial Governments, British municipalities, and the Bank's private clients. Discount rate: Date of last change: June 30th, 1932.

Market Rates of Interest: Treasury bills: Weighted average of weekly allotment rates. Since February 1935, the Clearing Banks have by agreement refrained from buying, or bidding for, Treasury bills at a rate below  $\frac{1}{2}$ %. Three months' fine bank bills: Average of brokers' buying rates. Yield of bonds: Irredeemable  $\frac{2}{2}$ % Consols.

London Clearing Banks: These figures represent aggregates of the monthly averages which each of these ten banks calculates on the basis of (unpublished) weekly figures. For purposes of comparison, the figures exclude an eleventh bank, the District Bank, which was admitted to the London Clearing in January 1936. The figures are not comparable with the end-of-year accounts given in the Summary Balance-Sheet below, which covers a larger number of banks. Cash: Coin, notes and balances with the Bank of England. Money at call and short notice: The bulk of this is lent to the bill market; a certain proportion of money at short notice represents loans to the Stock Exchange. Since November 1934, the rate charged by the Clearing Banks on call loans secured by bills eligible for discount at the Bank of England has stood at ½%. Bills discounted: According to figures published in the report of the Macmillan Committee in 1931, which, however, are not fully comparable with those given above, the Clearing Banks' average holdings of Treasury bills and commercial bills respectively amounted to £98.3 and £122.9 million in 1929 and £128.6 and £127.2 million in 1930. The proportion of Treasury bills in the total is believed to have risen considerably since 1930. Investments: The practice of the banks is to enter their securities at purchase price or market value, whichever is lower. They do not, therefore, write up the book value of their securities when market quotations rise above purchase price. "Investments" consist predominantly of Government bonds. Advances: The movement of this item in 1936 was affected by the loan of £40

million at 3% which the French Treasury raised in London in February 1936, and of which over one-half was taken up by the Clearing Banks. The loan was repaid in instalments in November and December 1936. At the end of January 1937, another loan for the French Government, amounting to £40 million, carrying interest at  $3\frac{1}{2}\%$  and repayable in ten months, was arranged in London, of which the Clearing Banks again took up a considerable proportion. Deposits, etc.: Current, deposit and other accounts. These figures are taken as the basis for calculating the percentage ratio of the other items to "total deposits". The rate agreed upon by the Clearing Banks for interest allowance on deposit accounts in London at seven days' notice has stood at  $\frac{1}{2}\%$  since the middle of 1932. Current accounts: The percentage ratio of current accounts to total deposits in 1936 is based on figures which include the District Bank.

Bank Clearings: The figures represent averages per working day in the years or months shown. Town clearings are mainly influenced by the volume of Stock Exchange transactions, while metropolitan, country and provincial clearings are generally taken to reflect the movement of retail trade and productive activity.

### 3. Bills discounted and bought.

The figures given for "bills discounted and bought" in balance-sheet summaries do not represent the total bill holdings of all the banks, as some of the minor banks include Treasury bills in their figures for Government securities (group 4 (a) of the Summary Table). In addition, a few banks do not show discounts separately from loans and advances, and in such cases they are included in group 7 of the Summary Balance-sheet.

## 4 and 5. Investments and Securities; Participations.

The banks do not give full details of the composition of their investments. A few of the minor banks in England and Wales do not show Government securities separately in their published accounts. In such cases these are included under 4 (b) in the Summary Balance-sheet. As mentioned above, a minor portion of the sums shown under (a) consists of Treasury bills not shown separately by some banks. The "other investments" are mainly gilt-edged and do not, as a rule, include stocks, shares and debentures of industrial companies. The sums shown in group 5 of the Summary Table for England and Wales represent the investments in affiliations of the "Big Five".

They consist mainly of capital participation in Scottish and Irish banks, and to a less extent in foreign and other auxiliary financial institutions. There is practically no direct participation in industry and trade.

#### 6. Due from Banks.

Sight balances with, and the cheques in course of collection on, other banks are reported only by the London Clearing Banks and are included in their cash assets. Correspondent accounts are, as a rule, merged with loans and advances under assets and with deposits under liabilities in the published statements of the joint-stock banks.

### 7. Loans and Advances.

As already mentioned, this item includes discounts not shown separately by some of the minor banks, and part of the correspondent accounts.

### 9 and 10. Premises and Sundry Assets.

Premises are not shown separately in the statistics of the *Economist*, but they constitute practically the whole of the joint sums shown in the balance-sheet summaries. It is generally recognised that the market value of the premises of the banks exceeds their book value and that important reserves are therefore concealed in this item of the aggregate balance-sheet.

#### 13. Reserve Funds.

In addition to the ordinary reserve fund shown in the Summary Balance-sheet, other reserves are maintained to meet emergencies. These other reserves are included under deposits in the published statements. Moreover, additional resources are concealed by the fact that the premises and the investments of the banks are booked below their actual market value.

## 15. Notes in Circulation.

Joint-stock banks do not possess the right of note issue in England and Wales. The small note circulation shown in the Summary Table for England and Wales refers exclusively to the Isle of Man, which is not governed by the English currency legislation. The legislation governing the note issue in Scotland and Ireland was set out in detail in the first edition of this Memorandum.

### 17. Due to Banks.

The correspondent accounts as a rule are not shown separately, but are merged in the deposits in the published statements of the banks.

### 18. Deposits.

The banking statistics as regularly published in English sources do not show current accounts separately from deposit accounts. The report of the Macmillan Committee gave these details for the deposits of the London Clearing Banks for the period January 1919-March 1931, and a continuation of these series is published currently in the Bank of England Statistical Summary and in the League of Nations Monthly Bulletin of Statistics. The division of total deposits into current accounts and deposit accounts for the years covered by the Summary Table is shown below:

### 19. Acceptances and Endorsements.

The greater part of the sums given represents bills accepted by the banks on behalf of their customers. These are almost entirely foreign bills accepted on behalf of home importers.

The figures shown in the Irish Summary Table refer almost exclusively to the Northern Irish banks, the acceptance business of the Free State banks being insignificant.

# Summary of Profit-and-Loss Accounts.

Some of the minor English joint-stock banks are omitted from the profit-and-loss statistics of the *Economist*, on which the Summary Table is based. The banks included are, however, fully representative, the aggregate of their capital and reserves constituting over 99% of the total capital and reserves of all the banks included in the Balance-sheet Summary Table in 1933. The profit-and-loss statistics for the Scottish and Irish banks are complete.

### 1 and 2. Gross Profits and Expenses.

As most of the banks in the United Kingdom and the Irish Free State adhere to the practice of deducting working expenses and income tax before disclosing their profit, these items have been excluded throughout. In recent years, the banks have disclosed their profits "after making appropriations to contingency accounts out of which provision has been made for bad and doubtful debts". It is impossible to tell from this vague phrase to what extent depreciation of assets has been covered out of earnings and to what extent out of undisclosed reserves. The amount shown as profits is entirely at the discretion of the directors.

It is evident, then, that the sums shown under 1 in the Summary Table do not represent gross profits in a true sense and are not comparable with the corresponding figures given in the profit-and-loss summaries for other countries.

### 3. Reserved for Pension Funds.

This item of the Summary Table is headed "Staff" in the statistics of the *Economist* and includes all allocations for the benefit of the banking staff, which are shown separately by the banks.

### 4. Depreciation.

As mentioned in the note to group I above, the banks do not show depreciation of investments in their published accounts.

### 6 and 12. Sums carried forward.

The amounts shown in the summary for Scottish banks include the "Rest" (i.e., the Reserve Funds) of the Royal Bank of Scotland.

### 10. Dividends.

The dividend figures given include a certain proportion of income tax not deducted from the sums distributed to shareholders by a number of banks.

Construction of Table: The table brings out the principal factors influencing the size and the movement of member-bank reserve balances with the Federal Reserve system upon which depend the size and the movement of commercial-bank credit which is analysed in Tables II and III below. The first five columns, relating to Federal Reserve bank credit outstanding, monetary gold stock (gold certificates) and standard silver dollars and silver bullion, represent the principal factors supplying member-bank reserve funds — that is, a change in any of these items influences member-bank reserve balances in the same direction. The next three columns and the last column show the principal uses made of the reserve funds, and a change in any of these items leads to a change in the opposite direction in reserve balances. For a detailed description of these items and of their significance, see Federal Reserve Bulletin, July 1935, pages 419-428.

Reserve Bank Credit outstanding: Total includes small amounts relating to "bills bought" and other Reserve Bank credit which are not shown here separately.

Monetary Gold Stock: Since June 1934, the gold stock is shown without the increment of \$2,806 million resulting from the de facto devaluation of the dollar in January 1934, which is reflected in a corresponding increase in Treasury cash and deposits with Federal Reserve banks. The Gold Reserve Act of January 30th, 1934, transferred the title to the gold stock of the Federal Reserve system to the United States Treasury, so that from that date this column represents only gold held by the Treasury. The Federal Reserve banks now hold gold certificates or gold-certificate credits in the books of the Treasury against which the Treasury holds gold. Since that date,

too, \$287 million of gold coin not recovered by the Treasury, though previously recorded as being in circulation, has been excluded from the monetary gold stock and from money in circulation. The gold stock excludes gold in the "inactive" account of the Treasury purchased under the "Sterlisation Plan" of December 21st, 1936. Gold so purchased amounted to \$26.5 millions in December 1936 and 310 millions in March 1937.

The special powers which the Gold Reserve Act of 1934 conferred on the President with regard to gold content of the dollar and the operation of the Exchange Equalisation Fund for a period of two years expired on January 30th, 1936, and were renewed for the one additional year of extension for which the Act provides. These powers were prolonged for two more years up to January 30th, 1939, by Act of Congress on January 20th, 1937.

Regarding the export of gold from the United States since the Tripartite Monetary Agreement of September 26th and the Gold Export Agreement of October 12th, 1936, see chapter on France above.

The movements of gold in and out of the United States since 1929 are shown in detail in Table VI below.

Silver Certificates and Silver Coin in Circulation: The third important source of member-bank reserve balances is Treasury currency, the most significant part of which is silver dollars and bullion. As figures for these items are not available for the whole period, silver certificates and silver coin in circulation have been given instead. These two items have shown significant variations recently, and, of the other items, silver dollars, subsidiary silver, minor coin, and United States notes have varied little in amount, while Federal Reserve bank notes and National Bank notes have tended to decline, the latter on account of the falling-due of certain Treasury bonds having the circulation privilege.

Money in Circulation: Consists, in the order of the volume of various currencies, of: Federal Reserve notes, silver certificates, National Bank notes, subsidiary silver, United States notes, minor coin, gold certificates, Federal Reserve bank notes, silver dollars, and Treasury notes of 1890.

The large increase in money in circulation during the second half of 1936 was in part due to disbursements by the Treasury in connection with the cashing of veterans' service bonds.

Treasury Cash and Deposits with Federal Reserve Banks: This item was increased by \$2,806 million on the close of business on January 30th, 1934, as a result of the reduction in the gold content of the dollar. Since the monetary gold stock of the Treasury was correspondingly increased, this change in itself did not affect the amount of member-bank reserve balances.

Of the same significance for member-bank reserves as Treasury cash and deposits with Federal Reserve banks are Treasury deposits held with all member banks — i.e., an increase in them tends to reduce balances and a decrease tends to augment them. The movement of these deposits has been as follows (end-of-the-month figures):

Non-member-bank Deposits with Federal Reserve Banks: Include deposits of non-member banks as well as of others such as foreign central banks and Governments. In 1933 and 1934, it included special deposits of unlicensed member and non-member banks.

"Other" Federal Reserve Accounts: Comprises "capital", "surplus", "reserve for contingencies", and "all other liabilities" less the sum of "bank premises" and "all other assets".

Member-bank Reserve Balances with Federal Reserve System: Excess reserves are estimated in the Federal Reserve Bulletin by subtracting from total reserves held the estimated required reserves. The reserves required by law prior to August 15th, 1936, to be held against net demand deposits amount to 13% for central city banks in New York and Chicago, 10% for reserve city banks and 7% for country banks; and all banks are required to hold 3% against their time deposits. The Banking Act of 1935 which went into effect on August 24th, 1935, changed the method of computing net demand deposits against which reserves must be held. Previously, net demand deposits were computed for each member bank separately by adding to demand deposits, other than those of banks and the United States Government, any excess of amounts due to banks over and above amounts due from banks. The Banking Act of 1935 prescribes that reserves be carried by member banks against United States Government deposits and permits deductions to be made from gross demand deposits instead of only from balances due to banks.

The Banking Act of 1935 further conferred on the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve system the power to alter reserve requirements from time to time " in order to prevent injurious credit expansion or contraction", provided that the requirements are not reduced below present requirements or increased to more than twice present requirements. This power was utilised by the Board in its decision of July 14th, 1936, to become effective as from August 15th, which raised all reserve requirements by 50% as follows: for demand deposits at banks in central reserve cities, to  $19\frac{1}{2}\%$ ; at banks in reserve cities, to 15%, and at country banks, to  $10\frac{1}{2}\%$  for time deposits at all banks, to 6%. On August 15th, the new requirements reduced the latter to \$1.790 million. A further increase of  $33\frac{1}{3}\%$  was decided on January 30th, 1937, half of which is to become effective as from March 1st, 1937 and the remaining half to become effective as from May 1st, 1937.

This table covers all commercial banks, members as well as non-members of the Federal Reserve system, mutual and stock savings banks, trust companies and private banks. It relates to a greater number of banks than the adjoining detailed balance-sheet summary (Table 26—I), which is based on statistics published in the annual reports of the Comptroller of the Currency. A uniform balance-sheet statement covering the great majority of the commercial banks of the United States made available by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation will be found in Table VII. Beginning with June 30th, 1933, figures in Table II relate to licensed banks only, with some exceptions as to non-member banks. Figures on deposits exclude inter-bank deposits.

Figures have been given in the table on the preceding page for only two out of three groups making up total membership, the third group, "country banks", representing the difference between the figures for all member banks and the sum of those for New York City and other Reserve cities.

Loans to Customers: Loans on securities comprise two items — a relatively small item on loans to brokers outside New York City and "loans to others" on securities. "All other" loans consist of a small amount of reporting banks' own acceptances, loans secured otherwise than on securities, and unsecured loans.

Open-market Loans: Purchased paper consists of acceptances payable in the United States, bills payable abroad, and commercial paper bought.

United States Government Securities: Direct obligations consist of Treasury bills, certificates, notes and bonds. Fully guaranteed securities are those issued by various credit organisations which are financed partly from Government and partly from private funds. (See below under Table IV.)

With the exception of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, most of the organisations covered by the table were established after the banking crisis of March 1933. The first group of organisations financed wholly from Government funds comprises, in addition to the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, the Commodity Credit Corporation, the Export-Import Banks, the Public Works Administration, the Regional Agricultural Credit Corporations, the Production Credit Corporation, and the United States Shipping Board Merchant Fleet Corporation.

The second group is made up of various credit agencies whose working funds are provided in large part by the Government in the form of capital stock and/or in a full guarantee of the obligations issued by them. These organisations are: the Federal Land Banks, Federal Intermediate Credit Banks, Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation, Banks for Co-operatives, Home Loan Banks, Home Owners' Loan Corporation, Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation, Federal Savings and Loan Associations and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Bank Debits to Individual Accounts: Represent monthly debits or charges on the books of reporting member and non-member banks to deposit accounts of individuals, partnerships, corporations, and the Federal, State, County and Municipal Governments in 141 cities as published in the Federal Reserve Bulletin. Annual figures are also available for about another 130 cities; these are relatively insignificant and are not given here.

Index of the Velocity of Circulation of Demand Deposits: Is the one computed by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and published in its *Bulletin*. It is based on the period 1919-1925 and corrected for seasonal movements.

Bond Yields: Treasury: Computed by Division of Research and Statistics of United States Treasury Department and representing the average of yields of all outstanding bonds (6 to 11) due or callable after eight years. Industrial: Computed by Moody's Investors' Service and as published in the Federal Reserve Bulletin. It represents average yields on forty bonds up to 1934 and less than forty bonds since the early part of that year.

Changes in Gold Stock: The difference between the gold stock and the sum of earmark operations and net import and export is due to such factors as domestic production, movements in and out of monetary use, imports and exports that do not affect gold stock during month or year, and the increment of \$2,806 million resulting from the revaluation of the dollar on January 30th, 1934.

Gold Exports and Purchases of Gold: Until the Gold Export Agreement of October 12th, which followed the Tripartite Monetary Agreement of September 26th, 1936, gold could be exported only to countries practising the gold standard. On the former date, the Treasury announced that gold could be obtained in the United States in exchange for dollars by any country which gave reciprocal facilities to the United States, and that such an agreement had been concluded with the United Kingdom and France. On November 22nd, it was announced that the Belgian, Netherlands and Swiss authorities had become parties to these arrangements. On the following day, the Secretary of the Treasury announced the abolition of the right of private individuals to export gold from the United States. Gold exports would in the future be made through the Stabilisation, Fund or its agents to those countries adhering to the arrangements of October 12th. On December 21st, it was announced that the Treasury would in future buy domestic and foreign gold against the issue of Treasury bills. These purchases figure in the statement on the gold position of the Treasury as "inactive gold", shown for the first time on December 24th at \$14.8 million. At the end of March 1937 they amounted to \$310 million.

Table VII provides a balance-sheet statement covering the majority of commercial banks which is based on completely uniform methods of classification imposed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, to whose members it relates. It is naturally more homogeneous, though covering fewer banks, than the first of the attached balance-sheet statements (Table 26—I), which is based on the statistics published in the Annual Reports of the Comptroller of the Currency, which relates to national, State (commercial) and private banks, and loan and trust companies. The banks covered by Table VII represent over 90% of all licensed commercial banks in the United States, and at the end of 1935 were 14,123 in number. Of these, only 6,387 were member banks of the Federal Reserve system, but they accounted for almost 90% of the total deposits of all insured commercial banks and over 84% of the total deposits of all commercial banks.

Value of Currency: Gold standard officially abolished: December 1929. Exchange control introduced: September 7th, 1931. Since the beginning of 1933, the peso has been aligned with the French franc at the rate of 12.06 francs per peso. Apart from this official rate, there are two free rates: the controlled rate (formerly known as the "compensado" rate) and the uncontrolled rate, which are usually applied according to the nature of the transactions. The depreciation in the controlled free rate, though less substantial, does not greatly differ from that of the uncontrolled free rate. In October 1936, the currency was linked to the pound sterling.

Banco de la República: Under the Law of August 14th, 1935, the commercial activities of the Bank were separated from the note issue. In the above table, however, the balance-sheets of the issue and banking departments, which had been published separately since September 1935, have been consolidated. Gold and foreign exchange: The gold reserve was revalued on August 14th, 1935, on the basis of the official rate of exchange of the peso for the last twelve months (\$2.1932 = 1 peso). The balance-sheet of the issue department, however, still shows the gold in terms of old pesos, and the profit on the revaluation of the gold and silver reserve (49 millions) is shown as a separate item on the assets side of the balance-sheet. Including gold abroad. Advances on current account: The fall in the amount of Government loans is due to the earmarking of part of the profits from the revaluation of the gold reserve. Notes in circulation: Not including, since September 1935, the notes held by the banking department. Deposits: Not including departmental and court deposits. Finance Ministry's deposit: The profit on the revaluation of the gold reserve, part of which has been transferred to the Government's deposit account, is, under the Law of August 14th, 1935, to be used for financing various financial operations spread over a period of three years.

Commercial Banks: Uruguayan and foreign banks, except the Banco de la República and the popular banks (Cajas del Interior). Monthly averages of the daily returns. In 1934, figures for the month of November.

Clearing Turnover: Montevideo clearing-house monthly cheque clearings.

From 1931 until October 1933, the rate of the bolivar was from 10 to 30 % below par. After October 1933 it rose rapidly: on that account, and in order to counteract the fall in the price of export products in national currency, due to the depreciation of the United States dollar, the Government, without legally devaluing the currency and without instituting official exchange control, fixed, in August 1934, the selling rate of the dollar at 3.93 and the buying rate at 3.90 bolivars, and the oil companies undertook to sell foreign exchange to the banks at that rate. According to the Decree of December 12th, 1936, foreign exchange proceeds from the export of goods subject to premium must be deposited at the Banco de Venezuela, at the rate of 3.90 bolivars for 1 U. S. A. dollar. This control may be extended by the Minister of Commerce to goods not subject to export premia. In April 1937, the buying and selling rates for dollars were fixed at 3.17 and 3.19 bolivars respectively.

Commercial Banks: The summary table compiled on the basis of the statistics published in the Boletin de la Camara de Comercio de Caracas includes the balance-sheets of the six national banks of issue (Banco de Venezuela, Banco Caracas, Banco Venezolano de Credito, Banco Marcantil y Agricola, Banco de Maracaibo and Banco Comercial de Maracaibo) and those of the branches of the four foreign banks (Royal Bank of Canada, National City Bank of New York, Anglo-South American Bank and Hollandsche Bank voor West-Indië). The two State banks, Banco Agricola y Pecuario and Banco Obrero, whose balance-sheets are not included in this summary, are engaged exclusively in real-estate transactions.

Value of Currency: The de tacto stabilisation of 1925 was followed by legal stabilisation under the Law of May 31st, 1931, which took effect on June 20th, 1931, at the rate: 1 dinar = 26.5 milligrammes fine gold = 0.01761 U.S.A. dollar; 1 U.S.A. dollar = 56.77852 dinara. (In the above table, the value of the currency has been calculated on the basis of the average 1929 exchange rate.) Exchange control was abolished on June 28th, 1931, but restored on October 7th, 1931; the percentage of foreign exchange which exporters must tender to the National Bank, fixed at 80 in 1931, was brought down to 60 in July 1934, to 50 in August 1935, and to 33<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> on February 22nd, 1936. Exporters are free to dispose of the balance on the open market. Control of imports, and of payments for imported goods, was set up on April 6th, 1936. As from October 1932, the National Bank has granted a premium of 20 % above the official exchange rate for all transactions with countries having no clearing agreement with Yugoslavia. This premium was raised to 28½ % on January 15th, 1935, and made to apply to all countries. In accordance with a Ministerial Order of February 22nd, 1936, all deposits and credits in foreign currency have had to be

converted into dinara at the official rate, plus the premium of  $28\frac{1}{2}$ %; credit institutions have also had to transfer their foreign-exchange holdings to the National Bank.

National Bank of Yugoslavia: Gold: Up to June 28th, 1931, valuation based on the pre-war parity of the dinar. The profit of 925 million dinara from the revaluation of the gold reserve in 1931 (see above under "Value of Currency") was used, inter alia, for reduction of the Government debt. Since stabilisation, the gold reserve has been valued at the legal rate, although a Decree of January 15th, 1935, imposes a flat premium of 281/2% and includes provisions specifying a minimum cover of 25% in gold or for sight liabilities, this cover to be calculated at the legal rate and increased by the  $28\frac{1}{2}\%$  premium. The fall in the gold reserve during the first quarter of 1935 (724 million dinara, according to the weekly statement published on January 22nd, 1935) is due to the Bank having repaid revolving foreign credits. Gold held abroad is included. Foreign exchange: Other: Foreign exchange not included in reserve requirements. Government debt : (1) Old loans : This debt, which, prior to June 28th, 1931, amounted to 4,022 million dinara, was on that date reduced through the payment by the Government of 1,400 millions in cash and of part of the product of the revaluation of the gold reserve (770 millions). Under the Law setting up the National Bank, profits derived by the Government from its holding in the Bank are allotted each year for repayment of the Government debt. Interest paid on bons de caisse issued by the Bank under the Law of 1931, on the other hand, are a charge upon the Government, and figure under the heading "Old loans". (2) Temporary advances to the Treasury: 600 million dinara-t.e., the legal maximum-since the end of 1932. Time deposits: The reduction in this item during the first quarter of 1935 is mainly due to the repayment of revolving foreign credits.

Coin: Laws of November 28th, 1931, and August 14th, 1932. The profits from the issue of coinage, which were to have been used in paying off "old Government loans", have been earmarked for meeting Government liabilities.

Commercial Banks: The twenty chief joint-stock banks. Cash: Includes balances with the National Bank. Banking legislation: The Law of November 22nd, 1933, on the protection of banks was renewed on October 5th, 1935, for a further year. At the end of 1935, 193 banks were still suspending payment, 10 had reorganised themselves, and 25 were in liquidation without bankruptcy (total number of banks, 610). A Decree of September 25th, 1936, provides for the liquidation of agricultural indebtedness (debt reduction, repayment of balance of debts by annual instalments, transfer of liabilities from private debtors to the Privileged Agricultural Bank).

## Summary of Profit-and-Loss Accounts.

This summary of profit-and-loss accounts of the joint-stock banks of Yugoslavia, prepared from the data supplied by the National Bank, relates to the same number of banks as the summary balance-sheet. The figures on paid-up capital and reserves and undivided profits of the latter have been used also for the table on profit-and-loss accounts.

have been used also for the table on profit-and-loss accounts.

Except for items 4, 5 and 7, all the specifications shown in the table correspond to the data as supplied by the National Bank. Item 4 represents an item entitled "Losses".

After the deduction of expenses, reserves for pensions funds, etc., and amortisation, the remaining net profit (item 5) is in each of the years under review smaller than the total amount disposed in reserves, dividends and directors' fees, etc., as shown by the original figures. This difference has been accounted for by item 7 (Taken from Reserves or Capital), which is not given in the original data, and may be taken to represent the uncovered losses of the banks which failed in the course of 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933,
