A complete and authoritative compilation of demographic, economic and financial statistics relating to all states, colonies and other statistical areas throughout the world. The national data are rendered internationally comparable as far as possible.

This fourteenth edition covers broadly the 1930-1939 decade; and the early half of 1940. Like its predecessors, it gives comprehensive data on population conditions, primary and industrial production, trade and transport, employment and unemployment, wages and prices, money and banking, Government receipts and expenditure and public debt.

The population statistics given depict not only the present position of the various countries but also their past and prospective demographic evolution. Currency and exchange measures introduced since the outbreak of war are reviewed in detail, while the effects of the war are clearly discernible in most of the statistical series given, and more especially in those of European countries.
