## WHITE BOOK

#### I. NOTES

I. NOTE FROM THE SPANISH GOVERNMENT TO THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM.

[Translation from the Spanish.]

Valencia, March 13th, 1937.

- r. From the statements made by the Italian officers and men taken prisoner on the Guadalajara front the following facts emerge: On February 6th and the following days, numbers of Italian regular troops, equipped, armed and supplied, landed at Cadiz from the Italian steamer Sicilia and other ships. They were concentrated in the port of Santa Maria and subsequently conveyed to the Guadalajara front to take part in the present offensive. This is being conducted by four divisions of the Italian army the first, second and third divisions of Blackshirts, the last being commanded by General Nuvoloni, whose headquarters are at Brihuega, and the Littoria division, commanded by General Bergonzoli, with headquarters at Almadrones. The commander-in-chief of this army corps is General Mangini, whose headquarters are at Algora. The attacking forces are completed by two special brigades, one of German and Italian regular troops and the other of German regular troops and four motorised companies of "carabinieri". Each division has two regiments of three battalions of 650 men, composed of four companies three of rifles and automatic rifles, and one of Fiat machine-guns. Each regiment has one platoon of 45-mm. mortars and one battery of 65.17-mm. guns, one platoon of 75.27-mm. and one of 100.17-mm., each consisting of three batteries having four pieces, the first on lorries and the others on tractors: an anti-aircraft battery of 20-mm. firing 260 shots a minute, a battalion of fifty mixed tanks, some armed with eight Fiat machine-guns and anti-tank machine-guns, others having in addition 47-mm. guns, one gas and flame-projector company with six platoons of the former and two of the latter, and lastly bridge-train, sappers, artificers, hospital orderlies, supply corps and wireless telegraphists. All the divisions are motorised. Each battalion has seventy lorries and the division has also a reserve park. The battalions in action include Nos. 500, 624, 824, 835 and 840. - 2. The statements summarised in the previous paragraph confirm beyond all possibility of denial the presence in the Guadalajara sector, and hence the participation in the Spanish conflict, on the side of the rebels, of actual contingents of the Italian regular army. In particular, the Government of the Republic wishes to remind the United Kingdom Government that in its Note of January 8th it pointed out that, if, as a result of delay in the establishment of control, successive contingents of "volunteers" were despatched, it might be obliged to modify its attitude of principle towards the idea of control.
- 3. The participation in the struggle of military contingents forming part of the Italian regular army not only constitutes the most scandalous violation perpetrated on the European continent since the Great War of the very principles on which any juridically organised international community is founded and which form the essence and basis of the League of Nations, but openly raises a political issue on the importance of which it is hardly necessary to insist. This is a clear case of the very danger to which the Spanish delegate drew the attention of the Assembly of the League of Nations, of war being openly waged without a previous declaration.

It is impossible for anyone to confuse a more or less open infringement of the obligation not to authorise the departure of "volunteers" for Spain with the organisation and despatch by the Italian Government itself of a veritable military expedition to fight on the side of the rebels. The former can be checked by a more or less perfect technical system of control. The latter raises a political question of the utmost gravity and importance which can certainly not be settled by the application of control, no matter how perfect, but requires the direct collaboration of those countries on which fall the honour and responsibility of applying the fundamental principles governing international relations to-day.

In the opinion of the Spanish Government, this question has already been raised and the responsibilities resulting from it are quite clear; moreover, its opinion is based on definite and categorical evidence. The Spanish Government asks that this should be examined and a final

decision reached to the effect that its opinion coincides with the facts.

This is the purpose of the present Note.

The Government of the Republic appeals in a spirit of confidence and co-operation to the United Kingdom Government to use its weighty influence with the Non-Intervention Committee to induce the latter to undertake at the earliest possible moment the tasks mentioned above, consisting, in short, of the examination of the Spanish Government's charges regarding the real nature and character of the military assistance afforded by the Italian Government to the rebels and deciding whether these are well founded.

The Government of the Republic declares its readiness to co-operate fully in the measures which the Non-Intervention Committee may consider it necessary to adopt for this purpose.

## II. NOTE FROM THE SPANISH GOVERNMENT TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS.

[Translation from the Spanish.]

Valencia, March 13th, 1937.

The statements of the Italian officers and men taken prisoner during the last few days in the Guadalajara sector confirm beyond possibility of denial the presence of regular military units of the Italian army sent to fight on Spanish soil in flagrant violation of the provisions of Article 10 of the Covenant, whereby "the Members of the League undertake to respect and preserve as against external aggression the territorial integrity and existing political independence of all Members of the League".

From these statements made in the presence of the Spanish authorities, it appears that, on February 6th and the following days, numbers of Italian regular troops, equipped, armed and supplied, landed at Cadiz from the Italian steamer Sicilia and other ships. They were concentrated in the port of Santa Maria and subsequently conveyed to the Guadalajara front to take part in the present offensive. This is being conducted by four divisions of the Italian army—the first, second and third divisions of Blackshirts, the last being commanded by General Nuvoloni, whose headquarters are at Brihuega, and the first Littoria division, commanded by General Bergonzoli, with headquarters at Almadrones. The commander-inchief of this army corps is General Mangini, whose headquarters are at Algora. The attacking forces are completed by two special brigades, one of German and Italian regular troops and the other of German regular troops and four motorised companies of "carabinieri". The air force consists of three German flights and four Italian flights of twelve machines each. The Italian flights comprise one fighting and one bombing section. The machines are of the Fiat, Savoia and Romeo types. Two more Italian divisions are to come. Headquarters plans to take Madrid while the Italian and German squadrons, under pretext of guarding the coast, attack Barcelona and Valencia. The above is a summary of the statements made by Antonio Luciano, major on the active list of the Italian regular army commanding the machine-guns of the first major on the active list of the Italian regular army, commanding the machine-guns of the first Littoria division; Achille Sacchi, lieutenant on the active list of the Italian regular army, of the third Blackshirt division; Giuseppe Moretti, of the first company of battalion 835; Andrea Cappone, of the mortar platoon of mortar battalion 835; Francesco Lodo, rifleman of battalion 835; Giuseppe Rossotto, of the second company of battalion 624, etc.

These facts, besides constituting an attack upon the "territorial integrity and political independence" of Spain, represent a series of consummated acts which reproduce under aggravated circumstances the situations incompatible with international law created in recent times by the

totalitarian States and amount to a resort to war without previous declaration — a dangerous proceeding denounced by the representative of Spain in the September Assembly.

The Government of the Republic, being of the opinion that, ever since the foundation of the League of Nations, there has been on the continent of Europe no more scandalous violation of the obligations imposed by the Covenant, and in the same spirit of loyalty to the great institution to which it belongs that led it in December to ask for the extraordinary meeting of the Council to denounce a situation "affecting international relations which threatens to disturb international peace", now brings to Your Excellency's notice the facts stated above and requests you to communicate them urgently to all States Members.

#### IDENTICAL NOTE FROM THE SPANISH GOVERNMENT TO THE GOVERNMENTS OF FRANCE, THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS.

[Translation from the Spanish.]

Valencia, March 29th, 1937.

During the recent action at Guadalajara, the Republican forces seized the orders of the Italian Headquarters Command directing the military operations in that sector and the service documents of the Italian divisions fighting on the side of the rebels.

These documents reveal, in a form which leaves no room for doubt, the nature of the Italian armed intervention in Spain denounced to the League of Nations on November 27th, 1936, and again referred to by the Government of the Republic in its communication to the Secretary-

General of March 13th, 1937, and its Notes to the Powers of the same date.

The existence of an Italian army of occupation fighting against the legitimate Government of Spain not only constitutes a violation of international law and plainly conflicts with the Council resolution of December 12th, 1936, affirming that "every State is under an obligation to refrain from intervening in the internal affairs of another State", but represents the most flagrant infringement so far committed of the non-intervention policy and the international obligations resulting from the Declaration of Non-Intervention of August last.

By this procedure, Italy has helped to prolong the war in Spain, has infringed Article 10 of the League Covenant and has acted as a real belligerent Power.

The following conclusions emerge from an examination of the documents accompanying the present Note:

- 1. The existence on Spanish territory of complete units of the Italian army whose personnel, material, organs of liaison and command are Italian.
- 2. The Italian military units are behaving in the sectors assigned to them exactly as a veritable army of occupation.
- 3. The Italian Government has established on Spanish territory its own services for its military units.
- 4. The most outstanding personages of the regime are taking an active part in the operations of the Italian forces in Spain and are directing and encouraging them.
- 5. All this is equivalent to an invasion of Spain by Italy, with the result that the confidence which should be engendered by solemn agreements is being seriously undermined and that the security of Western Europe and the cause of peace in general are being gravely

The Government of the Republic regards the evidence in its possession, attached to the present Note, as sufficient basis for the foregoing conclusions, and has the honour to communicate it to the Government of France (the United Kingdom, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics), without waiting for the whole of the material collected to be sorted out.

Order of the day for December 28th, 1936/XV.

No. I.

On Board.

From to-day I take command of the battalion.

I send my greetings to all officers and request them to communicate to all Blackshirts under their orders the verbal message from the Duce transmitted by His Excellency Russo to be included in to-day's report.

I recommend the officers to keep in constant touch with their company commanders, so

that they can communicate to them any orders that may be necessary.

On Duty.

Inspecting Conturion. — Centurion Domenico Pisabia.

Officers on Piquet Duty. — Two = One subaltern of the 1st Company; one subaltern of the 2nd Company.

Inspecting N.C.O.s - Four = One for each company detached from the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

Assisted by. - Eight Deputy Squad Leaders or selected Blackshirts, two from each company, detached from the ist, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

- Six Deputy Squad Leaders or selected Blackshirts; two from the 5th Company, one from Surveillance Service. the 1st, one from the 2nd, one from the 3rd and one from the 4th Company.

N.C.O.s on Embarkation Deck Duty. - Two N.C.O.s from the 5th Company.

- One subaltern to be in charge of the guard detached from the 3rd Company.

Two N.C.O.s detached from the 1st Company.

Four Deputy Squad Leaders or selected Blackshirts detached from the 1st Company.

36 Blackshirts detached from the 1st Company.

The Inspecting Captain, the officers on picket duty and the inspecting N.C.O.s. will find the password in the place where they are told to look for it. The troops will be provided with cartridge pouches but not with arms.

The company commanders will send me before 10 a.m. to-morrow, the 29th, two signed copies of the marching report, stating the numerical strength of the troops under the officers, the names of N.C.O.s and other ranks, giving the surname, christian name, father's name and legion of origin of each man. I shall receive company commanders in cabin No. 112 every morning at II a.m. to hear their daily reports.

Situation of the Effectives. — Every day before 8 a.m. the company commanders will report to the Office of the Command (Cabin No. 52) any new occurrences, giving the name of the officer - Every day before 8 a.m. the company commanders will report in command for the day.

Distribution of Tobacco. — While company commanders will give orders that no one is to smoke in the dormitories and will persuade the men to obey these instructions, since the breaking of this rule might obviously have serious effects, they will take steps to comply with requests for tobacco, bearing in mind the fact that each Blackshirt (excluding N.C.O.s) is to be allowed 100 cigarettes for the whole crossing at a reduced price. The cigarettes must be paid for in advance and the whole quantity will be handed over at the place specified by the inspecting captain on duty.

Company commanders will confirm, in their verbal reports to me to-morrow (December 29th),

that all arms have been handed over.

If other ships are encountered during the crossing, orders must be given that no one is to remain on deck and particularly on the side from which these ships are approaching.

- Company commanders will decide forthwith where their company is to meet in case of alarm, and must supply each man with the lifebelt prescribed.

In the meantime, they will take steps to see that the lifebelts are complete in every respect.

The meeting-points must be marked on the plans hung up in each dormitory, showing the dormitories and number of bunks in each and the place where the men are to meet in such cases. Company commanders will keep themselves informed of the instructions issued by the Royal Commissioner on board.

Time-table for the Crossing. — Reveille at 6 a.m.; distribution of coffee with milk and bread at 6.30 a.m.; sick parade at 8 a.m.; first cleaning of quarters from 7.30 to 8.30 a.m.; at the disposal of the officer in command of each unit from 8.30 to 10 a.m.; men's dinner, 10.15 a.m.; N.C.O.s' dinner: first service, 10.30; second service, 11.30; third service, 12.30; second cleaning of quarters after dinner from 11.15 to 12; at the disposal of the officer in command of each unit from 3 to 4 p.m.; supper at 4.30 p.m.; third cleaning of quarters after supper from 5.15 to 6 p.m.; lights out at 10 p.m.

It is understood that, on hearing the call for meals, all men whose turn it is will proceed to the deck assigned to them to wait for the men sent to draw the bread and wine (Deck B) and the

men sent to the kitchen for the hot food (Deck A).

No N.C.O. or private may enter the parts of the ship reserved for officers, not even the subalterns' orderlies, as subalterns may command the services of the ship's stewards.

For the establishment, in agreement with the Command of the M.O.S. Base, of the branch postal services to the Commands and Units in the line; For the detachment to Cadiz of one of the officers under its orders to supervise the embarkation and disembarkation service and the reforwarding of mail, including the Rome-Cadiz air service.

(b) Establishment and mobilisation of the offices: see Annex No. 1.

As from February 1st next, all correspondence from Italy to the units that have been sent outside the Kingdom for Military Operations in Spain should be addressed "Special Post 500", with the Christian name and surname of the addressee followed by the name and number of his unit, which should be given so far as it is known.

It is absolutely forbidden to include in the address any indication of the place of destination

of the correspondence or of the rank or position of the addressee.

All mail to or from Spain shall be subject to censorship, which shall be exercised by the competent offices.

This correspondence will be stamped as for letters within Italy, with the reductions in force for

correspondence sent to soldiers on active service.

Military post offices for Military Operations in Spain will be provided with forms which will make it possible to sent postal cheques in the national currency at the rates obtaining for internal postage.

Units on military service in Spain shall be requested to obtain these forms and postal cheques. In any case, the Central Military Post Office will arrange with the national post and telegraph service for unstamped correspondence from units on military service in Spain to be paid for at ordinary postal rates in Italy without surcharge.

The same Office will discuss with the competent Ministry the possibility of providing post-free

postcards.

#### GENERAL ORDER No. 7.

To all Commands under my Orders, including the Commands of Bandere and Groups (or of Companies and Corresponding Units in the Case of Units not divided into Bandere or Groups).

Subject: Abandonment of arms and articles of equipment.

In spite of the clear warnings given in my General Order No. 2 of 22.1.1937, some units abandoned, during the recent actions, knapsacks, arms, spare parts of arms, ammunition boxes and similar articles.

The most serious thing is that this was allowed by the higher officers and was even ordered by some of them on the pretext, which I do not hesitate to call absurd, of lightening the troops.

(The pretext is absurd because in this case it was not a question of launching an attack against a single neighbouring position, after the capture of which the troops would return to their startingline, but of continuing the advance for hours and days. In these circumstances, the order to abandon, or the permission to abandon, the material mentioned above was equivalent to a "sabotage" of future actions - i.e., it constituted a veritable offence in face of the enemy).

I order the commanders of the 1st Volunteer Division of the IVth and Vth Group of Banderas to enquire into this matter, to replace the material abandoned (charging it to the account of the unit commanders responsible) and to inform me what disciplinary or penal action they propose to take.

#### CORRESPONDENCE FROM VOLUNTEERS TO ALL DESTINATIONS.

(Letters examined: 11,757; postcards: 183.)

Good correspondence. No substantial change as regards the points mentioned in the previous report. The moral remains high.

Correspondence continues to come in with indications of the various localities from which it has been sent and with information, often detailed, regarding the strength and location of the units and the arms and materials distributed to them.

Pay does not seem to have been definitely fixed. Most of the volunteers remain in doubt as to whether or not allowances have actually been paid to their families, with whom they have not yet got into touch by letter.

References are frequently made in correspondence to radio appointments made by officers and volunteers with their relatives listening in on the Italian system, to whom they wish to speak from a station at Seville. The conversations are usually fixed between 8 and 9 p.m. with a wavelength of 41 metres.

Many, believing that mail arriving from Italy is not subject to censoiship, ask their own families for detailed news "without reticence" on all that is happening in Italy. Others, however, recommend that political subjects and delicate matters should be avoided in order that the letters should not be "held back by the censorship".

From Seville there are reports of attacks against our volunteers by Spanish Communists disguised as National Phalangists; but it is added that steps were immediately taken by the Italian authorities to protect the volunteers.

#### Remarks:

Many volunteers, including officers, have not yet realised the scrupulous reserve required by their mission. In the most careless manner they give confidential information in their correspondence, transgressing the instructions given by the authorities. The wireless appointments with relatives constitute a clear proof of the presence of Italian troops in Spain, and it is a proof accessible to all.

In addition, many letters containing the inevitable criticisms and the usual complaints have been posted in civilian letter-boxes in various towns. As such letters are censored by the Spanish military authorities, they are liable to give rise to erroneous and unfavourable impressions of the character and discipline of the Italian legionaries.

It would be desirable to remove the ground for complaint on this score as soon as possible.

Guards should be placed at frequent intervals round camps in order to ensure absolute safety of encampments, commands, arms and ammunition depots, motor-cars, etc.

It should be remembered that there may be subversive or ill-intentioned elements in the

neighbourhood, and that attacks, etc., may be made.

Each Bandera Group Command will organise police rounds in the inhabited area and the outskirts. Energetic N.C.O.s., and if necessary officers too, will be detailed for this duty, and they will be given clear and definite instructions regarding their police duties and the maintenance of

Men in a state of intoxication will be taken to barracks and handed over to the officer of the guard.

Houses of ill-fame, inns, hostelries, etc., will be inspected.

Strength: one N.C.O., five militiamen, always armed.

#### II. GENERAL AND BARRACKS SERVICE.

#### (a) Service at Headquarters.

Staff for the prompt receipt and distribution of orders (clerks, telephonists, intelligent orderlies).

#### (b) Barracks Service.

Officer of the guard — orderly sergeants — guard.

Orderly captain of the week — evening roll-call and check list — cleaning fatigues — latrine sentry — water — guard inspections (day and night officers).

#### (c) Unit Service.

Orderly officer of the day — orderly sergeant of the week — orderly corporal of the day dormitory sentry, latrine sentry, etc.

#### (d) Commissariat Service.

Commissariat officer of the bandera group — mess committee.

#### (e) Motor-transport Service.

Introduce travel vouchers.

Travel permit for each journey by car.

Provisional vouchers for petrol and oil.

#### (f) Medical Service.

Despatch of sick to hospital by the head of the Medical Service.

#### (g) Communications Service.

Personnel acquainted with the position of the command posts and of the main and subordinate units.

### III. SECURITY AND ALARM SERVICE.

#### (a) Fundamental principle — always on the alert.

Every act, every operation, every situation (sleeping, eating, fighting, spare time) must be

considered from the point of view of safety.

Do not allow yourselves to be surprised by events, situations or incidents — eyes and ears open, always and everywhere. Rely only on yourselves. As regards measures of security within the garrison, apart from the internal measures taken by each bandera group or detached unit,

special orders will be issued separately. Detached units will be regarded as military garrisons. The present general orders will be applicable to them, mutatis mutandis.

#### (b) Alarms.

Arrangements as regards place and action must be made for:

Alarms regarding air and gas attacks.

Alarms calling for emergency departures.

Fire alarms.

Practice alarms will be given in order that everyone may know where to go and how to behave in an orderly, rapid and silent manner.

As regards alarms calling for emergency departures: marching kit, individual equipment and as much as possible of the unit's complement of ammunition, overcoats, gas-masks, armoured

Commands and officers on guard must know the exact whereabout's of subordinate officers for the rapid despatch of orders.

Troops going out for drill must notify the officer on guard of their destination.

#### IV. Exchange of Correspondence, Telephonic and Telegraphic Communications and INTELLIGENCE.

Ordinary correspondence:

at 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily, at these headquarters;

Urgent correspondence:

at any time.

At 6 p.m. I will receive personal reports from bandera group commanders.

Avoid making communications of a military, confidential, delicate or important nature by telephone or telegraph.

#### V. OFFICERS' MESS.

Bandera group commands should inform the mess officer early in the morning of the number of officers who will be present.

Attendance at mess is compulsory.

Requests to mess in private rooms should be refused owing to the shortage of staff and the mess organisation.

#### VI. SALUTING.

Inform subordinates that they should salute superiors and colleagues in the Spanish Army. This is a duty of courtesy and military correctness. Salute Spanish flags and badges.

I intend that registration shall be carried out strictly and conscientiously, in view of its moral and administrative importance.

I shall allow no negligence in this matter, and shall accordingly hold the Adjutants and Commanding Officers of companies and autonomous units responsible.

My orders are therefore as follows:

1. From the section up to the battalion, the nominal rolls must always be kept in perfect order and up to date.

The following particulars will be entered, in addition to the optional ones:

RANK — NAME AND SURNAME — FATHER'S NAME (or in default mother's name) — CLASS — BIRTHPLACE — HOME ADDRESS (whether married and how many children) — OCCUPATION — ARM FROM WHICH DRAFTED — PRESENT EMPLOYMENT — REGISTRATION NUMBER IN THE ARM — CHANGES IN UNIT AND POSITION.

- 2. Group and battalion headquarters must keep a similar nominal roll (showing the same particulars except the registration number in the arm) for officers.
- 3. Every member of the group, from officers down to the rank and file, must be in possession of an identity-card showing the following particulars:

RANK — NAME AND SURNAME — FATHER'S NAME — CLASS — HOME ADDRESS — MOBILISATION CENTRE — LEGION OR REGIMENT FROM WHICH DRAFTED — GROUP OF BATTALIONS — BATTALION TO WHICH ATTACHED — COMPANY — BATTERY — TRENCH MORTAR PLATOON — REGISTRATION NUMBER IN THE ARM (for rank and file only).

4. These identity-cards will be made out at once, as follows:

By the group command for all officers, and signed by the undersigned;

By battalion, battery, or trench mortar platoon commands for all other ranks, and signed by their commanding officers.

Every card will bear in the top left-hand corner the serial number of the officers' nominal roll (groups) or the nominal roll of other ranks (battalions, batteries, and trench-mortar platoons).

- 5. All internal changes, including admissions to hospital, punishments involving deductions of pay, charges, etc., must be recorded on the nominal rolls.
- 6. Transfers from one battalion, battery, etc., to another, and losses of effectives through repatriation, admission to hospital, or transfer to other groups, units, etc., must always be reported by all units, both those whose effectives are reduced and those which are increased by letter in the case of officers and by daily or internal order in the case of other ranks to the proper mobilisation centres and to Headquarters, Blackshirt ZONE XI, NAPLES.

Transfers of N.C.O.s for disciplinary reasons must always be reported by letter.

7. The mobilisation centres for our units are:

For Group Command and Battalions: The 138th Legion "A. PADOVANI", Naples. For the 7th Battery: The 10th Legion M.D.S.C.A.T., Naples. For the 7th Trench Mortar Platoon: The 84th Infantry Regiment, Florence.

All the changes referred to above, with the corresponding documents, must also be sent to this Group Command for information.

- As regards punishments, until further orders the same forms will be used as in Italian East Africa, viz.:
  - (a) Reprimand in writing for officers:
  - (b) Reprimand in writing and confinement to barracks for administrative purposes for N.C.O.s;
  - (c) Reprimand in writing and confinement to room for administrative purposes for other ranks.

Capo Manipolo Lo Cicero is requested to issue the necessary administrative instructions to units and to send me copies of the explanations given. He will proceed similarly in respect of any charges made.

In addition to the punishments specified above, repatriation may always be proposed.

9. It should also be borne in mind that in respect of officers and N.C.O.s, reports are required which must be drawn up on the occasion of every transfer from unit to unit, and sent not only to the new unit but also to the mobilisation centre and to headquarters here.

In the case of other ranks, reports must be drawn up in the event of transfer for disciplinary

reasons or on other special and specified grounds.

- 10. It should be borne in mind that punishments and charges must also be notified to the mobilisation centre and to headquarters here in the manner laid down in paragraph 6.
  - 11. In consequence of the above, every battalion must be in possession of:

A register of punishments inflicted on officers;

A register of punishments inflicted on N.C.O.s; A register of officers reporting sick;

A register of other ranks reporting sick;

A general register of charges brought.

Every company must be in possession of:

A register of punishments inflicted on N.C.O.s and men;

A register of those reporting sick;

A register of charges brought.

Group headquarters must be in possession of a register of punishments inflicted on officers and another for N.C.O.s.

I should also like every headquarters to keep registers (one for officers and one for other ranks) of bounties, rewards, distinctions, etc.

- 12. Every battalion and company command must also keep a journal for the unit.
- 13. Every battalion command, and the battery and the trench mortar platoon, will also keep the prescribed register with a view to improving the ration issue.
- 14. I take this opportunity of calling attention to the necessity for keeping the register of materials on charge and individual deposits, as already prescribed in folio No...... of ......

I recommend all concerned to devote the utmost attention to all these instructions, which are the very life of the units. Further instructions may be issued in due course. I may say that I shall inspect the arrangements under these instructions at the earliest possible date.

PAYMENT TO THE TROOPS OF THE SPANISH MONEY DRAWN FROM THE MILITARY PAYMASTER'S OFFICE.

It appears that for various reasons many units have not been able to distribute to the troops the pesetas drawn in advance from the Military Paymaster's Offices on presentation of regular monthly accounts.

These sums improperly remaining in the hands of units must be paid to those entitled to them

WHEREVER POSSIBLE.

Should the person so entitled be dead, or have been transferred to an unknown unit or repatriated, or be undergoing punishment on board ship, or be untraceable for any other reason, the sums must be paid, accompanied by a list on the attached model, to the Administrative Services Office at Headquarters, to be set aside as an assistance fund at the disposal of the Commander-in-Chief.

Units at a distance will use postal money orders for payment.

No omissions or diversions will be tolerated. Investigations will be made in order to prevent any misuse of monies not received by those to whom they are due.

#### Administrative Orders Series.

Notice.

In order to make promptly available to the families concerned in Italy the Italian monies due up to the end of January and not yet paid to officers, N.C.O.s and men, every unit command managing its own funds will close the January accounts as quickly as possible, establishing accurately the amounts due to every man under its orders, and will send, by the speediest means, copies of the payment warrants referred to in No. 2 of Administrative Order No. 2, which will forthwith be forwarded to Italy by air for immediate payment.

The same arrangements must be made with all speed at the end of February and at the end

of every month thereafter.

The most urgent questions affecting units and individuals have been dealt with and settled by the instructions accompanying Administrative Order No. 2.

Other instructions will follow as experience or new requirements may dictate.

With this object, the Administrative Service's Office will remain in close and constant touch with the unit commands.

THESE INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE CONSCIENTIOUSLY, INTELLIGENTLY, AND CONTINUOUSLY CARRIED OUT.

It is a matter of honour for officers commanding units to interest themselves closely in this particular activity, which has a valuable effect on morale. Troops who are well administered, well fed, looked after, and assisted to obtain their rights are contented and efficient troops. No negligence and no malpractice will be tolerated.

It is necessary to institute a political service for each group of Banderas.

This service should be staffed by a selected personnel, known to nobody, entirely reliable,

and absolutely discreet.

Duties: To watch, listen, study individuals, and report everything. I have reason to believe that subversive cells are being formed in the district, and that agents provocateurs have been instructed to conduct defeatist propaganda among the troops.

Vigilance is necessary in order that everything may be known—what both soldiers and

country people are thinking.

Accordingly, this personnel should frequent all canteens, inns, taverns, meeting-places, listen

to what is said, etc.

Each Group Command will organise this service as it thinks fit, in order to be constantly aware of the pulse of its own men and the temper of the local people.

Never allow yourselves to be surprised, either by the enemy or by events.

I should be glad to be informed by letter addressed to me personally and confidentially, on the 15th and 30th of the month, of anything new that has taken place in this field.

  - II. Numbers, names, and mobilisation centres of the units to be formed: see Annex No. 2.
- III. Formations: Those specified in Annex No. 1; for Blackshirt battalions, with the differences mentioned in the notice on page 1 of that Annex.
  - IV. Personnel (all volunteers for any destination and physically fit for war):
  - (a) H.M. Army. The Army Corps Commands concerned will make use of all effectives under their orders, drawing upon those who have volunteered for any destination. It should be borne in mind that:

Officers should, as a rule, not be on the active list; the employment of officers on permanent service with the colours should therefore be regarded as exceptional, and limited in any event to one or two officers per battalion;

Regular N.C.O.s must not be employed; any shortage of N.C.O.s must be made

good with corporals;

Preference must be given to members of the subordinate units on draft for Italian East Africa;

This Headquarters will make good any deficiencies on being informed by telephone of the requirements.

- (b) Volunteer Militia for National Security: G.H.Q. of the Volunteer Militia will provide as usual
- V. Equipment, material, motor transport, bicycles: separate arrangements will be made by the Services Section of the General Staff.
  - VI. To be ready:

By noon of the 17th instant: 4th Additional Battalion;

By midnight of the 17th instant: remaining battalions.

Arrangements for embarkation will be made by the Transport Office.

- VII. The following are additional instructions for the Naples and Palermo Army Corps Commands:
  - (a) The VIth Battalion will be formed at the depot of the 85th Infantry Regiment, and will move (without arms and with only such personal effects as are essential) to Naples (40th Infantry) by the 15th instant, where arms and equipment will be issued.

In the course of a few days, the Spanish authorities have reported to me five thefts of motor vehicles, some of which were accompanied by threats of violence. Those guilty of such offences are unworthy to be Italians and representatives of the Fascist idea.

Their isolated and sporadic action throws a sinister light on the representation of a country

with a millenary civilisation.

This state of affairs must cease forthwith.

Commanding officers will take effectual corrective action, and should such incidents recur will not hesitate to report the offenders to the Court Martial and, if need be, to take even more painful, but necessary, action.

Report immediately registration numbers, types of vehicle irregularly in your possession, and whence and by whom taken. Withdraw them from service and hold them at my disposal.

During the recent operations, all ranks engaged showed the utmost enthusiasm and gallantry. Certain officers, however, were found to have a professional training, and in some cases a physique, not equal to the above-mentioned qualities, nor, in particular, to the duties entrusted to them. Greatly as the high spirit displayed by all officers is appreciated, responsible commands cannot be allowed to be held in action by persons not possessing the minimum qualifications for such commands.

This cannot be permitted, both in the general interest of the operations and in the interest of the troops, who must be commanded under fire by men who really know how to handle them. Officers commanding troops who have already been engaged will therefore ascertain which of their officers do not possess the minimum qualifications mentioned above, and will inform me of any who, not being even capable of quickly attaining the necessary standard, should be repatriated or employed in Spain in duties more suitable to their capacities.

Officers commanding units which have not yet been under fire will, as a rule, await the test

of action before making me any proposals of this kind.

They should, however, do so at once in any isolated cases in which the officer's inadequacy is so serious and clear that it is inadvisable to await the perilous test of action before judging.

For your general guidance, I am sending a few data and criteria relating to the preparation of the "Fiamme Nere" Brigade for action in the near future.

The following is SECRET and personally confidential to Officers Commanding Groups of Banderas only.

I. The formation of the Brigade with Groups VI, VII and VIII complete is confirmed. The two Banderas left at Seville and Cadiz will rejoin the rest within two or three days. Their material and moral training must be speeded up and intensified to bring them up to the level of the others already at the front.

- II. It is a point of honour for the Brigade to be ready to act at the shortest notice—every day, every hour, every minute lost is a serious fault.
  - III. February 25th must be regarded as the latest date for our preparations to be completed.
- IV. The Mixed Italo-Spanish Militia, to which I have already transmitted, through a staff officer, the request for missing materials, will see that these are delivered as quickly as possible. We shall not lack resources, but that does not mean that we must wait until we have received

the last button, belt, or oil-bottle before we can say we are ready.

Essentials must be sufficient.

V. Meanwhile, it is necessary to intensify to the utmost the training of units for battle. This must be well advanced by the early weeks, and completed by the 23rd instant. Difficulties due to the lack or shortage of materials must be overcome by goodwill on all sides. In this connection, I am assured of your full, complete, and comprehensive co-operation.

Meanwhile, I would ask you to send me by the evening of the 20th instant a brief, synthetic, concrete report on the following subjects:

- I. Morale and mentality;
- 2. State of discipline;
- 3. Technical training:
  - (a) Individual fire (lessons given, general results);
  - (b) Collective fire (lessons given, general results);
- (c) Training of units for battle (how many units have been trained, and to what extent);
  - (d) Battery and trench-mortar platoon fire, hand bombing;
  - (e) Marching exercises with safety precautions;
  - (f) Training in the use of gas-masks;
  - (g) Training of specialists (signallers for aircraft, scouts, patrols, shock troops, etc.);
- (h) General training of officers (lectures, meetings, reconnaissances, collective exercises, etc.).

I note that the motor vehicles are not well kept and the drivers not very practical. I also note that motor transport is used without proper supervision, and is employed for matters of little importance. Officers commanding battalions will make the Officer-in-charge of Miscellaneous Services responsible, and will give him instructions for the supervision, preservation, and control

Accordingly, the car-book and the journey-book will at once be posted up as prescribed, all accessories being registered in the former, and all journeys and quantities of oil and petrol drawn

being recorded in the latter.

Having personally checked at Aranda the delivery of oil and petrol, which is done by noting in a book with the signature of the drawer, I have decided that the converse procedure must also be carried out, the person who delivers the fuel signing on the journey-book.

Further, with regard to the present unit services, I have decided that each battalion and the battery must in turn have the use of only one service lorry per day, and only for genuine and necessary daily supply services. In case it should be necessary, for any other special reason, for a lorry to go out, it must carry a service card signed by the officer commanding the battalion or battery, which must be presented to the Orderly Officer, who will sign it, noting the hour of departure and, again, noting the hour of re-entry.

Seniore Maramaldi will give the necessary instructions to Orderly Officers.

I have also noticed that lorry-drivers go out completely unarmed, and even any escort they may have is not armed in the prescribed manner—i.e., with cartridge-belts, bayonets, and daggers. This impropriety must cease forthwith.

Lorry-drivers not on daily duty must take part in unit training with their respective headquarters platoons—i.e., in the handling and knowledge of arms, the transmission of orders, and signalling.

The reservation made in my report bearing the same number dated the 20th instant is hereby cancelled, and I transmit my report on the efficiency of the 6th Infantry Support 65/17 Battery.

The 65/17 material issued to the Battery is in a somewhat poor condition.

Apart from the artillery piece itself, the material is not in a condition answering to our require-

ments.

During firing, the following defects have been observed:

- (a) The extractor of the first gun had to be changed during the second exercise, because it broke.
- (b) A union bolt of the cradle broke during the third exercise. It could not be replaced because we had no spare part. We have arranged to have one made at a local works.
- (c) A union bolt of the gun-carriage is continually opening during fire. This also we have made arrangements to repair. The first gun is not at present in working order, as the firing-lever also does not work properly.

We have been able to remedy all these defects now, being in an inhabited centre, but in the open country we shall not be able to do so, as the Battery has no specialised workmen.

The other three pieces have shown no noteworthy features during fire. It is to be assumed that, if more effectively used, they may not meet the requirements of the moment, considering the worn state of the material.

It is therefore urgent that two expert Battery workmen should be allotted to us.

These particulars must also appear on the unit nominal rolls of officers and N.C.O.s.

### EFFECTS AND VALUABLES OF MEN KILLED, TAKEN PRISONER, OR MISSING.

- (a) It is the duty of those who verify death and identify the body to take every care that the effects, private papers, money, valuables, and any other property of men killed, missing, or taken prisoner, are collected and handed over as soon as possible to the Command of the man's unit, or to the Garrison Headquarters in the case of unattached men, together with a descriptive note signed by the officer who was present at the identification of the objects.
- The effects, private papers, and valuables of men killed, missing, or taken prisoner will be forwarded to the nearest Base Headquarters, together with a descriptive note signed by the officer commanding the unit or hospital.

Money belonging to the deceased will be forwarded by the officer commanding the unit or hospital to the Mobilisation Centre (138th Legion of Militia, Naples, for Blackshirts, and Naples Military District for H.M. Army) by money order, for transmission to the recognised heirs.

Pay due but not drawn will be included in these remittances. Base Headquarters will give a

receipt for the objects handed over, after identification and acknowledgment.

They will then have the articles made up into parcels, properly closed, corded, and sealed, bearing on the outside clear indications and an address, and will have them forwarded to the Detached Section at Cadiz or any other such section which may hereafter be formed at some nearer port of embarkation, with instructions to forward them to Italy, to the Mobilisation Centres indicated on the parcels and on the accompanying notes.

Every precaution must be taken to prevent loss or misdirection.

The address on the outside must always include, in addition to the particulars of the Mobilisation Centre, the following clear information: contents-weight-rank, name, and surname of the dead or missing man.

SUBJECT: Discipline and training.

To all Commands under my Orders (down to Bandera Commands).

The General Officer Commanding has made the following observations:

- (1) In the various places where troops are billeted, especially in Seville—probably owing to the influx of men returning from the zone of the recent operations—troops are seen improperly dressed.
- (2) Notwithstanding strict instructions to the contrary, lorries and other vehicles are still seen bearing flags, inscriptions, etc.
  - (3) Outsiders, including civilians, move freely about in the car-parks.
- (4) Sentries, when presenting arms, do not execute the movement promptly and with precision.

The General Officer Commanding accordingly issues the following orders:

- (1) Strong measures will be taken to ensure the strictest order both in the uniform and in the deportment of men under your command.
- (2) Any flags or inscriptions that may still be affixed to your lorries and motor vehicles in general will be removed. Only passenger cars may bear in front, flown on a small metal staff fixed to the radiator cap, two pennants, one with the colours of the Italian flag and the other with those of the Spanish flag.

The pennants will be in the form of an isosceles triangle of base 15 centimetres and height

30 centimetres.

The Spanish pennant will be flown below the Italian.

These instructions must be carried out as soon as possible.

- (3) Until proper and satisfactory training in the handling of arms can be given:
- (a) Salutes with arms, both individually (sentries) and collectively (units in close order), will not be given by presenting arms, but simply by standing to attention.
- (b) On the march in close order, the rifle or carbine will not be carried at the slope, but either slung or trailed.

Exercises in presenting and sloping arms will of course be carried out during ordinary training. When fixing bayonets in a body, the troops will shout, "A NOI!". They will do the same when dismissing.

The commands must, of course, be so given that the shout can be simultaneous with the

movement.

Until all buglers are properly trained, bugle calls will not be blown, except for practice. The General Officer Commanding has also ordered a band to be formed for every group of

Officers commanding Groups of Banderas will therefore arrange for suitable men to be drawn from the Banderas under their command to form these bands.

This Headquarters should be notified as soon as possible of the formation of the bands and the musical instruments required.

## CENSOR'S OFFICE OF MILITARY MAIL AT NAPLES.

Extract from Weekly Report (from January 28th to February 4th, 1937/XV) concerning Correspondence from or to O.M.S. (Military Operations in Spain).

- (a) Certain volunteers are having correspondence addressed to them by their families at private addresses under names rendered into Spanish. Many of them have their correspondence sent to the following address: "Plaza de los Bandos, 8, Salamanca".
- (b) Letters are also being sent to the correspondent of the *Tribuna*, enclosing others for volunteer officers.
- (c) We find that certain volunteers, possibly with a view to evading the censorship, hand letters containing detailed information regarding the local political situation to sailors returning to Italy.
- (d) Notwithstanding the orders issued in the matter, certain volunteers continue to mention in their letters the names of places, marching-routes, halts, etc. Moreover, certain officers not only state their place of residence but also mention movements of troops, their situation and position and the strength of the units, in some cases even going into details.

## ENVELOPES OF LETTERS SENT FROM ITALY TO ITALIAN SOLDIERS. 1

Hundreds of letters were left behind by the Italian soldiers on the Guadalajara front; a few specimens of the envelopes are reproduced on the opposite page. The Italian stamps and postmarks can be clearly seen in the reproduction. According to the instructions of the Ministry of War, letters for units sent outside Italy for O.M.S. requirements ("Military Operations in Spain") were to be addressed to Special Post No. 500 ("Posta Speciale 500"), Via dei Crociferi, 23, Rome. The envelope was to mention the christian name and surname of the addressee, father's name, "O.M.S." and the unit to which the addressee belonged (in the usual form). No indication of the place of destination, the rank or office of the addressee was to be given; nevertheless, some of the

envelopes contain these particulars: one—as will be noticed—includes the word "Spagna", another mentions "Borgo Osma", another "Cadiz", etc.

By an order of the Ministry of War, Rome, dated January 18th, 1937, this correspondence was centralised at the Military Post Office of Rome, in the case of air mail, and of Naples, in the case of ordinary letters and parcels. These two offices censored both incoming and outgoing mail. Two central postal services were also established in Spain, an official was detached to Cadiz (port of embarkation and disembarkation), and a special system was organised for reforwarding mail. The Italian soldiers put Italian stamps on their correspondence, or, if they had none, sent it unstamped (postage payable by the addressee without any surcharge). Correspondence with the units drafted to Spain, including ordinary letters and air mail, parcels, money orders, etc., was

regarded as inland correspondence and charged for accordingly.

A unit of the National Road Militia has been placed at the disposal of the Traffic Commissioners by this Command.

This unit will see that all the road regulations are observed and must, in particular:

- (a) Place notices at suitable places indicating routes, roads closed, roads in bad condition;
- (b) Prevent motorised columns and single vehicles from parking on highways in builtup areas, thus hampering traffic;
- (c) Take the full name and address of the driver and the registration number of cars which have stopped or are moving;
- (d) Prevent cars unable to proceed on account of damage from being abandoned by their drivers and ascertain the reason why the car has stopped;
  - (e) Make enquiries into motor accidents and road accidents in general;
  - (f) Assist persons who have been injured;
  - (g) Arrange for the removal of cars which have broken down.

This Command trusts that by the use of specially trained personnel, which is rendering in the mother country a service appreciated by all, it will be possible in a very short time to regulate traffic and organise the circulation of the large number of mechanically propelled vehicles now on the roads.

### STANDING ORDERS No. 3.

Subject: Reporting for military and other offences.

In penal matters, so long as the troops remain on service in Spain, the following general rules shall henceforward be applied:

- 1. Soldiers guilty of military offences covered by the Military Penal Code shall be reported to the Military Court now being set up at the Seville base.
- 2. The corps, after completing the evidence against the offenders, must at once place them at the disposal of the said Court and remove them as effectives to the Supernumerary Battalion or the detachment thereof at Seville.
- 3. Such soldiers, from the day on which they are reported, shall lose the whole of their Spanish pay, which, after the amount due for rations has been deducted, shall be transferred to the M.O.S. Intendance, which shall hold it in reserve.
  - 4. Should the accused be discharged, the sums kept back shall be refunded to him.
- 5. Offences not covered by the Military Penal Code also come within the jurisdiction of the Seville Military Court.
- 6. Offences reported by the Spanish authorities shall also be referred to that Court. All other questions shall be regulated in accordance with the provisions relating to soldiers guilty of offences covered by the Military Penal Code.

My dear Son,

We have been to see Cesare, who gave us good news of you and told us that you and the other men from our village were in good health. My dear Son, I have spoken to a friend who tells me that, if you were discharged from service in Africa, you should have had a demobilisation bounty of 300 lire, like the rest; let me know if you have not received this and make enquiries of your superiors: if it is true that this sum is owing to you, you should apply for it to the General Headquarters in Rome. I have written you several letters, the last bearing the date March 4th, in which I told you about the "dopolavoro". Not so much wine is being consumed this year because the men are not here to drink it; many have left for Africa; you say you want to know how we are getting on. We are getting on all right, but, as you can imagine, all our thoughts are for you. You know all our hopes are centred in you; do not think of Marcello; think only of yourself. Take care of yourself and keep your eyes open; is it true that in addition to your pay you receive 20 lire a day over and above the Italian pay? Cesare told us when he came back: We were given 20 lire a day; we hope you also are receiving this pay.

Dear Armando, you have your wits about you; I only pray that God and all the Saints may help you and, if you come back in good health, that we may be able to see Rome again and spend

a good sum on replenishing our stocks. I repeat, tell me something about yourself.

This very day, March 8th, Nerino del Beato married the daughter of Antonio Dicesare and

they have left for Rome.

We read the newspaper. All the news is good. I hope that it will all end as soon as possible with a smashing victory; do not forget your dagger, which gives you courage against your enemies; if possible, tell me what the town of Malaga is like; nothing has happened at Vittorito. We and all our relations are well. Affectionate greetings from your mother, who is always thinking of you. Greetings from Ilda and many kisses from your devoted father.

- (2) The enemy have withdrawn along the whole front attacked by us, except in the Almadrones section. Their forces, unspecified, with a few pieces of artillery and a few Russian tanks, are maintaining their positions on this side of Almadrones, on both sides of the road. A number of Red units have left Guadalajara for Almadrones.
  - (3) The action begun by our troops is being continued to-day according to plan.
  - (4) The Littorio Division must be *ready to leave* its present quarters for service if required.

    Consequently:
  - (a) No soldier may leave his quarters; officers must remain with their respective units.
- (b) Individual soldiers, obliged to leave their unit in order to perform certain duties, must be given a proper pass signed by the officer in command of the unit.
- (c) Motor vehicles must be kept in perfect running order; they must have a full supply of petrol and be ready to start as soon as the order is given; the engines should be started up from time to time to prevent the water from freezing; the radiators should be covered up with blankets.
- (d) When on the road, motor columns should be divided up into sections of not more than 20 to 24 vehicles, the distance between sections being not less than 200 metres, both when the vehicles are moving and when they are stationary, so that traffic may proceed along the road in both directions notwithstanding the presence of the column.

All motor vehicles not due to start as soon as the order is given must in every case be parked

off the road.

#### Dear Cousin,

Forgive me for not having written to you since you left and for taking such a long time to answer you. You asked for news of my husband, and so I have had to wait for a letter from him. Do you know that on account of you fellows the African mail is always very late? I have received letters by air mail dated 32 days previously. What do you think of that? I have got it into my head that you are to blame; is that so? Othello has been at Lalibela in the Semien and told me he was daily waiting to be relieved with a view to repatriation, as orders had arrived from General

Pizzo Biroli to send them to Italy. Think of it, Renzo, he has been there for over two years and I think he is entitled to a little rest. Don't you agree? I read in the papers that in March four divisions would be repatriated as well as other isolated units, and I hope that that blessed Group will also be among them; for I am very tired of this enforced solitude. What a lovely honeymoon I had, don't you think? Two days marriage and 25 months of interminable and painful waiting. If the miracle of his return happens, we will send you a letter. I haven't told him anything of your journey or of Aldo's or of his great friend Zarzanelli's, because I was afraid that he would commit a second folly, you understand. His country comes first and love only second, but I am selfish and rightly so for he was a second. rightly so, for he was among the first volunteers to go to Africa and is now among the last to return; I would rather divorce than go a second time through all I have suffered during this long period of despair. Don't you think I am right? What do I know of married life and of family joys? And I have been married over two years! I hope that Othello has come to his senses and will not give me any more cause for anxiety; I am so weak and nervous that I could not bear any grief. me any more cause for anxiety; I am so weak and nervous that I could not bear any grief. But enough of these lamentations; you need joy and not sadness, don't you? Let us speak of yourself. It has been learned here, through the "Federale", who has had news from Lieutenant Fruttero, that you, Aldo, Bottazzi, Gherardi and others have behaved very well and have been praised, and that all the bigwigs of the district are talking about you. You see that you are not forgotten, even when you are far away. Bravo! Renzo, you are a true Fascist who does not shirk any difficulty, illuminated and guided as you are by your great faith. And God will help you and watch over you. I hope that when you return a poor little job will be kept for you in your ungrateful country, so that you need not wander through the world again in search of work. And those heroes who talk of war in the cafés will have to give up the jobs which they unworthily occupy to those who deserve them better. I am also worried about which they unworthily occupy to those who deserve them better. I am also worried about Othello. Will he find work here or will he have to go back to Rome? That would be sad for me, because then he would say good-bye to his promised conjugal fidelity and my forehead would be adorned with horns like a snail. Well, let us hope that all will go well and that God, who has saved him from certain death in dreadful Tembien battles, will continue to help him in Italy and will enable him to earn the bread of the family which he has founded and of the children that may come. Is this too much to ask? But those whose future is assured do not even think of those who are hungry, and there will be much trouble and anxiety before we can be sure of the morrow in our city; don't you agree? And what is Aldo doing? Lucilla is always asking about him and about you; she is working hard at school and is one of the best in her class, the mistress says, but she is nervous

and obstinate like me. Tell Aldo that Lucilla will deserve the present which he promised her...

And where is Bruno don Sturzo? Tell him that I am not angry with him, but that, on the contrary, now that he cannot take my Othello from me, we shall send him a joint letter when he returns. Ask him if he has forgotten Livia and if he does good business with the beauties out there. Poor Bruno, now he can play the hero, don't you think? He would have his way, and now he

must pay for it.

Tell Aldo that his family are well and they hope that what he said in his rare letters is true. And you, Renzo, how are you? How are you getting on? And Aldo, is he well? Give my kind regards to him and to Bruno. I wish you a final victory and a prompt return; may Easter see peace and tranquillity throughout the world.

- (a) There will be a space of at least five metres between lorries.
- (b) There will be a space of at least 200 metres between sections of motor vehicles (1.e., groups of about twenty lorries).
- (c) Halted motor vehicles of all types will have their right hand wheels on the outer edge of the road, and if possible off the road.
- (d) Troops alighting from halted lorries will remain on the right-hand side of the motor column.

When halting uphill, drivers often place stones behind the wheels to stop their vehicles from running back. Such stones must be removed from the road when the vehicle moves on.

- I. Some cases of self-inflicted wounds have been discovered.
- II. There have been cases of wounded or bandaged soldiers who in reality had nothing the matter with them.
- III. There have been cases where a genuinely wounded soldier was accompanied by others who had no permission to do so and who on their own initiative took this opportunity to leave the firing-line.

#### ORDER:

- A. Any soldier clearly found to be guilty of the above offences will be shot immediately (five men have already suffered this just punishment since yesterday).
- B. The Medical Service is to report immediately cases of self-inflicted wounds or cases which they suspect to be such.
- C. The Command of the Royal Carabinieri, of the Volunteer Troops and of the Divisions will establish a vigilance service for this purpose on the lines of communication, in the medical services, in the field hospitals, etc.

A particularly close watch will be kept on motor-ambulances.

A. — Various circumstances, with which you are acquainted, show that although the units are composed of troops with a high morale and ready to follow their leaders, etc., they are often lacking in dash and aggressiveness, and allow themselves to be impressed too easily by the vicissitudes of battle.

In view of the intrinsic quality of the troops, this is due in 90% of cases to the command, and especially to the subordinate leaders (of whom several are of little professional value, while others show apathy, passivity and a utilitarian and pacifist attitude unworthy of Italian leaders of men in the year XV of the Fascist Era).

This state of affairs, which is already sufficiently regrettable in itself, might become a real danger if, in addition, there was a tendency to over-estimate the value of the enemy, especially in the sense of crediting him with the ability to do with ease things which we ourselves cannot even attempt

Obviously, units commanded by officers holding this point of view would be placed at the very outset in a state of inferiority to the enemy.

B. — The Commanders to whom I am addressing these remarks must react urgently, energetically and constantly against such defects and such a mentality. They should keep in continual touch with their units and should see to it that their immediate subordinates do the same (I already know who does it and who does not), and should speak to the officers, to the N.C.O.s and, when possible, to the whole force together.

Except for the special cases mentioned later, they should endeavour to produce a state of exaltation — that is to say, they should explain carefully to those under their command that our troops in the past few days have gained an important tactical success, rapidly overrunning several lines of enemy trenches in the most unfavourable weather conditions, that they have conquered at one blow an enemy zone 36 kilometres in depth, that they have beaten and taken the positions of some of the best Red troops—the Internationals—that they have repulsed several attacks by the latter, that we have stopped only to allow the most highly tried troops the rest they have earned, etc.

C. — Tell the troops that with such a record it would be inexplicable madness to think that even the most seasoned enemy troops would be capable of doing anything that ours cannot do.

Explain the conditions in which the enemy is placed (virtually abandoned even by Russia; strangled by the blockade), and point out that his moral and material situation is extremely bad, and that his resistance is the resistance that precedes a collapse.

Tell them that the "International Brigades", although composed of better fighters than the ordinary Spanish militiamen, are few in number, that their ranks were already depleted when they came against us (according to reliable documents, one of these units arrived with only 700 men), and that their numbers have been still further reduced by the great losses we have inflicted on them.

Moreover, these men are the same as, or brothers so to speak of, those whom our Fascist squads thoroughly thrashed on the roads of Italy. And, for lack of recruits from abroad, some of these international units are partly made up of poor quality local militiamen.

The Russian tanks do not bear a charmed life. They are armed with guns, it is true, but their caterpillar wheels are most defective, they easily get stuck, and if we do not lose our heads, they can quickly be put out of action.

In our advance we captured ten, and hit and immobilised nine others in front of our lines. Obviously, they do not bear a charmed life!

Of our own tanks, only four were hit, and these are still in our hands.

D. — It should also be explained to the men, who have plenty of common sense and will readily understand, that when we are suffering under the rain the enemy is not sitting in a grand hotel, but is in the same plight as ourselves; if sometimes (an inevitable annoyance in war) the rations are late or do not arrive at all, the enemy is not dining at a restaurant but is fasting more than we are (as his communications are much worse and all the Red areas are short of food), etc.

Explain the reasons why in the early days — when the weather was appalling — the Red aeroplanes were able to fly and ours were not: the Reds have permanent aerodromes near Madrid from which they can start below the clouds, while ours have to use improvised aerodromes situated of necessity on the other side of the mountains; hence, it is often impossible to take off owing to the muddy ground, and it is almost always impossible to cross the mountains flying blindly through the clouds.

As soon as the weather improved, our aeroplanes came into action and have brought down sixteen enemy machines, while three have been destroyed by our anti-aircraft guns.

This has been a terrible lesson to the enemy, who during the same period has only been able to bring down one of our machines and to wound one pilot, who was nevertheless able to fly back to his base!

E. — Commanders, by simple and elementary reasoning, should make it clear to their subordinates (and in some cases also to themselves) how absurd it is to attribute fantastic powers to the enemy: "Forces that attack in daytime without cover or artillery preparation or after only a few rounds; detachments that steal on us by night over unknown ground between the positions occupied by our troops and then advance several kilometres in order to cut off our regiments, etc."

Let us look at things seriously!

I ask, "Would any of you or of your subordinates ever dream in similar circumstances of doing or ordering any of the things which you so lightly attribute to the enemy? Have any of you ever done it?"

I am sure you have not, and if any one of you has, let him bring me the proofs and I will propose him for a gold medal.

Reflect and make others reflect. At the very moment when some of you become anxious and exclaim, "My God! what will the Reds do next?", on the other side, the Reds are asking each other in agitation, "By Lenin! what are the Whites going to do?".

F. — In typical and clear cases of lack of energy, power of command and courage, and when punishment can serve as an example, there should be firm punishment without pity. (There may be pity in private affairs but not in cases in which the lives of others — who are doing their duty — and the good name of Italy are at stake.)

There must be no stragglers. Their rounding up is not a matter of routine as if it was a mere question of collecting material, but a preliminary to an act of military justice involving an investigation of error or guilt, and in the latter case condign punishment.

G. — Whenever possible, especially when the units are at rest, they should be got well in hand again, especially as regards appearance, behaviour, dress and equipment.

Explain why, as even a child could understand, there are only limited possibilities of obtaining supplies owing to the blockade, and point out that nothing should be thrown away. Steps should be taken to stop this deplorable habit.

- H. Take every opportunity of instructing your men or having them instructed. It is a question of willingness and nothing else. Anyone can learn the very elementary things which are necessary in war (such as the use of arms and means of communication, etc.).
- I. Many of these recommendations have already been made before, but not always with satisfactory results. So far I have shown a certain tolerance because I have thought it right to allow some time for adaptation. But now enough! Be energetic make your wishes plain Command! Above all, let it be clearly understood that here it is not as if we were in our own country, lost in the mass of our comrades (in which case the possible deficiencies of some might be offset by the brilliant actions of others).

Here on foreign soil we are the representatives of armed Italy and of Fascism (by the side and under the close observation of our allies and under the distant but searching scrutiny of the rest of the world. By our actions will be judged the quality and efficiency — both moral and technical — of the Italy of the Year XV (even more than in the Ethiopian war, owing to the theatre of operations in which we find ourselves). The judgment formed by friends and enemies will have consequences of incalculable importance to our country.

We have an enormous responsibility, and we must be or make ourselves worthy of it, even though we lose our lives.

Anyone who does not realise this, or who allows his subordinates not to realise it or not to behave as if they did, is no true soldier of Italy.




