AGRICULTURAL PRICES IN THE UNITED PROVINCES

1. *Sources*—An attempt has been made in this monograph to trace the course of agricultural prices in the United Provinces from 1861 until April 1937. To gauge precisely the effects of price variations on agricultural interests some figures relating to land revenue, rents, population, cultivated area and irrigation have also been added for the same period. The main source of the data is the fortnightly statements of retail and wholesale prices collected in the office of the Director of Land Records and published in the *United Provinces Gazette* from week to week. To facilitate the work of calculation, statistics up to the year 1921 have been compiled from the reports on prices and wages in India. These reports give annual averages of the fortnightly statements of retail prices in 26 to 38 districts of the United Provinces from 1861 to 1921 and average annual wholesale prices of certain articles in 4 to 9 important market places in the province from 1897 to 1921. These reports were discontinued in 1922 and therefore we had to fall back upon their parents—the fortnightly statements—for figures beyond 1921.

2. *Retail prices*—In calculating statistics of retail prices in the province the return from the districts of Naini Tal, Almora and Garhwal have not been included. These districts present conditions which are altogether different from the rest of the province. Moreover, the report on prices and wages from which we have compiled most of our statistics of prices also excluded the figures from these districts in drawing up averages of prices for the province. Retail prices have been given for the following commodities: rice (common), wheat, barley, juar, bajra, gram and maize. The figures represent simple arithmetic averages of retail prices in all the districts of the United Provinces reporting such figures except the districts of the Kumaun Division, viz., Naini Tal, Almora and Garhwal for reasons already stated.

3. *Wholesale prices*—Wholesale prices have been compiled for rice (common), wheat, barley, gram, maize, arhar dal, linseed, til, sugar (raw), cotton and tobacco. These make up almost all the important agricultural products of the province. The prices given are simple arithmetic averages of wholesale prices during the 24 fortnights of each year in four districts (mandis) in the province which have been regularly reporting such prices. The districts reporting wholesale prices up to April 1921 were Benares, Cawnpore, Jhansi, Meerut, Agra, Hathras, Shahjahanpur, Lucknow, and Fyzabad. Of these Meerut did not report the prices of linseed, cotton and tobacco; Fyzabad the prices of til, cotton and tobacco; Jhansi the prices of cotton and tobacco; and Benares the prices of tobacco. Even the districts from which prices of certain commodities were called did not report such prices regularly every year. From April 1921 wholesale prices were called from five districts only, viz., Agra, Benares, Cawnpore, Fyzabad, and Lucknow for all the commodities. In October 1930 the collection of wholesale prices was discontinued as a measure of retrenchment and

therefore there is no record of wholesale prices after that date in the office. Arrangements were, however, made with the District Officers concerned to obtain connected monthly wholesale prices of the articles dealt with in this report. A close scrutiny of the figures thus obtained and the statistics recorded in the gazette showed that prices from some districts were very irregularly reported. A fairly complete record of wholesale prices is, however, available from the districts of Lucknow, Cawnpore, Benares, and Agra. Accordingly the wholesale prices quoted in this report refer to these districts only.

4. It is unfortunate that wholesale prices were not recorded in other districts before 1932. Prices in the western districts and the moffussil are generally lower than in places like Lucknow, Benares, etc. and the arithmetic mean of prices prevailing in the above four districts gives an unduly inflated price for the province. Hence we cannot adopt the average of the prices prevalent in these four districts as representative of the province as a whole. The Government has since sanctioned the collection of monthly wholesale prices of 15 agricultural commodities, viz., rice (common), wheat, barley, gram, arhar dal, juar, bajra, maize, til, linseed, mustard, sugar (refined), sugar (raw), cotton and tobacco from 20 important marts of the province. The Bureau will thus be in possession of a complete and reliable record of price variations in the United Provinces from 1932 onwards.

5. *Reporting of prices*—Both the retail as well as the wholesale prices are those prevailing at the headquarters of the district and are reported by honorary bazar chowdharies to the District Officers concerned. In the case of retail prices the figures are sent by the District Officers to the Government Central Press direct and the office of the Director of Statistics, United Provinces, merely gets a copy of these statistics from the Government Central Press after they are published in the *United Provinces Gazette*. In the case of wholesale prices the District Officers forward the figures to the office of the Director of Statistics, United Provinces, where they are compiled and sent to the Government Central Press for publication in the *United Provinces Gazette*. In the case of retail prices whenever the office of the Director of Statistics, United Provinces, finds, between any two fortnights, a difference of more than 20 per cent, in the prices of an article reported from a district an explanation is called for from the District Officer and the figures are corrected in the office copy if the difference is due to a mistake in reporting.

6. Statistics of wholesale prices are those governing a wholesale transaction on the last day of each fortnight or the nearest market day. If no actual transaction of at least 10 maunds in the case of food grains and oilseeds and of at least 1 maund in the case of cotton, tobacco, etc., takes place in a fortnight in the market no price is quoted for that fortnight. The prices are generally quoted for those markets where the articles in question are staples of local trade.

7. *Prices per maund and per rupee*—Prices throughout this report have been expressed in rupees and decimals of a rupee per maund. The fortnightly statements of retail prices, however, contain statistics of prices in the other notation, viz., scers and chhataks per rupee. These have been converted into rupees per maund for the

sake of uniformity. It may, however, be noted that such conversion, when it involves averaging of prices in a number of fortnights and districts, gives rise to varying degrees of mistakes. The mistake, however, becomes marked only in periods when there is a sudden rise or fall of prices.

8. *Rents and revenue*—Rental statistics have been compiled from Revenue Administration Reports. Before 1910 these reports did not contain complete statistics of rents, while in certain years rental figures were altogether omitted from the revenue reports. In all such cases holding and rental registers, which are maintained in the office of the Director of Land Records, have been consulted. *Stable tenants in Agra* include permanent tenure-holders, fixed-rate tenants, exproprietary tenants, occupancy tenants, and tenants of not less than 12 years' standing in 1333 Fasli; while in Oudh they include under-proprietary, exproprietary and occupancy tenants. The term *ordinary tenants* refers to statutory tenants, their heirs and other non occupancy tenants. In either case the total legal rent as well as the excess demand is divided by the total area of land held by each class of tenants in order to obtain their average rents. Statistics of rent as also of revenue and area refer to the agricultural years July to June and not to calendar years. Thus figures entered under 1900 refer to the year July 1, 1899 to June 30, 1900 and so on.

9. *Basic period*—Efforts have been made to obtain a proper basic period for the purpose of comparing the statistics of prices from year to year. The importance of selecting a proper base has been emphasized by every noteworthy writer on index numbers. After examining the views of various authorities on the subject we have come to the conclusion that a basic period of 5 or 10 years is preferable to a single year. As in other provinces prices in the United Provinces show a rhythmic movement and periods of recurring maximum and minima vary from 3 to 6 years. Periods of minimum prices recur most frequently after 4 years while periods of maximum prices recur more frequently after a period of five years. It is, therefore, difficult to fix upon an absolutely typical period which would satisfy all possible points. The period chosen as the base in the present inquiry is the quinqueanum 1901 to 1905 falling within the maxima of 1900 and 1908. Prices during this period showed comparatively little variation. In fact this period was normal in the sense in which few other periods could be picked out in the province.

10. *New series*—Some of the concluding years of the present study have been marked by a phenomenal fall in agricultural prices. Similar drastic changes in price movements have also been noticed during and after the Great European War of 1914-18. It has been felt that the basic period 1901-5, although it is ideal for purposes of noticing price variations over a long period, is not quite so convenient for comprehending the movement of prices at the present time and since the war because of the vast changes which have taken place during the 35 years following that period. Accordingly, a new series of index numbers have been prepared with 1913 as base and are given separately for reference. A single year has been chosen as the base for the new series both because the year 1913 was completely free from

all extraordinary circumstances as well as for purposes of maintaining uniformity with price indices published by the Board of Trade, London, and the other important countries of the world.

11. *Statements*—Statement I gives average retail prices of important articles of food in the United Provinces from 1851 onwards while statement I(a) presents the same information in the form of index numbers. Statement II gives average annual wholesale prices in the United Provinces (Cawnpore) and Statement II(a) their indices. The basal period representing 100 is 1901-5 in both cases and the figures for the other years are percentages of the prices during this period. Statements I(b) and II(b) give index numbers of retail and wholesale prices respectively with 1913 as the base.

12. *Weights*—General index numbers of retail and wholesale prices and the subsidiary index numbers of wholesale prices of cereals and others are based on the average of such prices. These index numbers have been weighted according to the comparative value of the commodities, the relative area which they occupy and the yield of each per acre in the basal period. The actual procedure adopted is as follows: The area, the yield and the price of each commodity are multiplied together and the sums thus obtained for each individual commodity are added together. The percentage of each sum to this total is the weight for a particular commodity. The weights thus obtained for each crop are in proportion to their relative economic value.

Thus rice and wheat get such high weights as 27 and 23 respectively on account of the vast area which they occupy and their high yield per acre. Sugar gets a weight of 12 in spite of the small area under sugar-cane cultivation on account of its heavy yield while the weight allotted to cotton would have been much lower had it not been for its high price. The actual weights allotted along with the information on which they are based are given below:

13. *District prices*—Slight adjustments in weights have been made in view of the fact that the area under cultivation and the prices of certain articles have undergone a very marked change since the basal period.

Supplementary tables showing prices and index numbers of wholesale prices in the cities of Cawnpore, Lucknow, Agra, and Benares have been shown in Statements V, VI, VII and VIII and V(a), VI(a), VII(z) and VIII(a). These show the local variations of prices. It will be noticed that Benares which is situated in the far eastern corner of the province differs widely from a town like Agra situated in the western zone. The prices depend largely upon the local supply and the cost of transportation, etc. These index numbers have been weighted according to the area, yield and price of each commodity in the district concerned. The actual weights allotted to each commodity in the four districts are given below:

14. *Purpose of weighting*—It may be admitted at once that index numbers of cereals, other products and the general index numbers obtained by the system of weighting adopted by us do not indicate the course of prices from the point of view of the consumer. For that purpose weights will have to be given according to the demand of each article. These, however, will not differ materially from the indices given above. The general index numbers given in Statement II (a) and those presented graphically in Diagrams III and IV indicate the variations of the economic value of the various agricultural products to the cultivator from year to year. In other words our index numbers show the effects of price changes on the income of the agriculturists, who make up 75 per cent. of the total population of this province. The income of the cultivators depends not only upon the condition of their crops in a particular year but also upon the prevailing prices of the commodities produced by them. The necessity of weighting them arises because all agricultural products do not fetch the same value nor are they grown to an equal extent in the province.

15. *Other statements*—Statement III gives land revenue demand, rents of ordinary and stable tenants, cultivated and irrigated area, agricultural population, wages and rainfall in the United Provinces for the period covered by the indices of prices. Statement III (a) presents the above information in the form of index numbers together with the General index number of wholesale prices in the United Provinces.

16. *Graphs*—The index numbers of retail prices given in Statement I (a) for rice, wheat, barley, juar, bajra, gram and maize together with the weighted average of all the seven commodities have been presented graphically by means of curves in Diagram I.

Diagram II illustrates by means of curves the trend of wholesale prices of cereals and other agricultural products as well as the general level of wholesale prices in the United Provinces which have been presented in Statement II (a) in the form of index numbers.

Diagram III shows graphically the average annual rainfall in the province together with wholesale prices and cultivated area.

Diagram IV presents the curves of weighted average wholesale prices together with the curves of rents of stable and ordinary tenants, of land revenue demand, of agricultural population and the wages of ordinary agricultural labourers.

17. *General comments*—A study of the figures in Statements I and II or of the curves in Diagrams I to III suggests the following observations :

18. *Retail prices*—Speaking generally the retail and wholesale prices of the various food products, viz., rice, wheat, barley, juar, bajra, gram and maize tend to move as though they were one commodity, so much so that if one of the curves, say of wheat, is substituted for another, say of juar, bajra, or maize, even a trained economist would find difficulty in detecting the mistake. It will, however, be noticed that the variations in the price of rice are not quite so steep as they are in the case of the other foodgrains. Rice is produced principally in the eastern districts of the province or in the submontane region where the monsoon is more regular than in the other parts. Moreover, the price of rice is invariably higher than that of wheat and the other foodgrains (*vide Statement I*). Accordingly in periods of scarcity it does not come within the category of the second line of defence. That is to say, the demand for rice is comparatively inelastic. It may also be observed that the prices of the cheaper grains like barley, juar, bajra and maize depend largely on the price of wheat. The fluctuations in the prices of these grains are greater than in the price of wheat because in periods of scarcity the poor folk live almost entirely on them while in periods of low prices even the poorest classes of people begin to take wheat or mixture of wheat. Wheat, moreover, forms a staple of commerce and its price is governed largely by conditions in other parts of the country, if not the world as a whole, while the cheaper grains have a comparatively limited local demand. Their price accordingly depends largely on local supply.

19. *Points of maxima and minima*—The curves show well defined positions of maxima in the year, 1861, 1866, 1869, 1873, 1878, 1884, 1888, 1891, 1897, 1900, 1908, 1915, 1919, 1926, 1929, and 1932.

Points of minima are noticeable in the years 1862, 1867, 1871, 1876, 1881, 1885, 1889, 1894, 1899, 1901, 1911, 1917, 1923, 1927, 1931, and 1934.

20. *Cyclical changes*—The figures indicate a tendency for high prices to recur on an average after every five years. Famines, wars and monetary causes are largely responsible for such deviations from this cycle as may be seen on the curve or discovered from the statements.

Minimum positions seem to be about the middle of every successive point of maxima and also recur after a period of about five years. The recent slump in prices began early in 1930 and was precipitated in the fourth quarter of 1930.

21. *Period of cycle*—Taking into consideration the data of rainfall and cropped area in India for the period 1870--1930, Professor Radha Kamal Mukerjee says that the agricultural cycle is approximately

equal to six years and that scarcity follows usually a cycle of 11·30 years and its double and triple values.* The latter is essentially Bruckner's cycle which Clayton expounded in his famous work "World Weather". The variations of retail prices between the period 1860-1931 seem to follow the above cycles and sub-cycles rather closely. The lack of absolute correspondence in certain years and the shortage of the average period is largely due to such factors as changes in the volume of currency and the relative value of silver and gold as well as to improvements in the means of transport and methods of production effected during the last 50 years.

22. *The course of retail prices in the United Provinces*—The weighted index numbers of cereals show that after 1900, prices went below the basal prices only during the period 1902 to 1904 and became level in April 1931. From April to June there has been a further fall of 6 points. Immediately before the rise in 1913 the index number was 135 and in 1919, when the prices reached their highest pitch, the index number stood at 263, i.e. 163 per cent. above the base year. In 1929 the index number was 218 and at the end of the second quarter of 1931, it stood at 94. Thus the prices were reduced to less than half in little over a year's time. No other period of such short duration in the history of Indian prices shows such a violent change. The effect of this precipitate fall in prices on the income of the agriculturists can be easily imagined. In 1932 the prices looked up a little but in the following year a steady decline was recorded. This decline continued in 1934 when the prices went down almost to the level of the basic period. Some improvement was noticeable during the year 1935 but the figures for the first four months of 1936 do not promise a continuance of this improvement.

23. *Wholesale prices*.—Index numbers of wholesale prices in Cawnpore have been adjusted to provincial weights for the sake of presenting annual and monthly variations in agricultural prices in the United Provinces [Statement II(a)]. As has already been explained in this monograph, connected wholesale prices are available for only four marts in the province; and even these do not report the prices of all commodities regularly. Cawnpore is easily the most important city in the province on account of its central situation, large industries and enormous trade. Incidentally it also has a most complete record of wholesale prices from 1897 to date. Wholesale prices of cereals show practically the same oscillations as have been noticed in the case of retail prices. But the movements of the prices of other products, as shown in Statement II(a) and in Diagram II, present a very different state of affairs. Here it is difficult to trace any well-defined periods of maximum and minimum prices common to all the products.

24. *Sugar* which occupies the most important position amongst non-food products and accounts for 60 per cent. of their value shows very violent oscillations in price. Its price stood blow the basal rate during 1902 and 1903 and just 1 per cent. below it in 1913. The highest point was reached in 1921 when the index number stood as high as 313. It came down to 167 in 1923 only to rise again to 223 in 1926. The index number stood 84 per cent. above the basal period in 1929, wherifter the price fell steeply under the effects of the

Depression until it came down to 84 in January 1931, recording a decline of 100 points in about a year. After March 1931, the price showed an improvement, coming up to 126 at the end of the year. The promise of recovery discernible during the last three quarters of 1931, however, proved false, being followed by an unprecedented fall during the next two years. The index number, which stood at 106 in 1931, slipped down to 87 in 1932 and to 77 in 1933, the lowest figure ever since the beginning of the present century. With the beginning of 1934 an improvement was again visible, which continued in 1935, the indices for the two years being 102 and 126 respectively. The year 1936 has, however, opened with an ominous and steep fall and the index for April 1936 already stands at 82.

25. *Cotton* which occupies the next important position and accounts for over 20 per cent. of the value of non-food crops in the province shows equally violent fluctuations in prices from year to year. Its price was below the basal rate during 1901-3 and in 1907. In 1918 the price of cotton rose to its highest level when the index number went up as high as 367. Since that time the price has been rising and falling almost in alternate years. The index number stood in 1928 at 213 and in 1929, just before the depression set in, at 186. The next year it had fallen down to 108. A further fall was recorded during 1931 when the index number went down to 83. The year 1932 opened with an improvement but the second and third quarters brought a decline, the index for September 1932 being 73. The price, however, recovered during the last quarter of 1932, with the result that the average index number for 1932 came up to 92. The year 1933, however, brought another set-back and the index for 1933 fell back to 81. The next two years showed a slight improvement, the indices for 1934 and 1935 being 83 and 86 respectively. The year 1936 has, however, opened with a downward tendency, the index number for the first four months being 80.

26. *Oilseeds*—Oilseeds account for only 7·5 per cent. of the non-food products and but 1·5 per cent. of all agricultural products in the province. *Linseed* shows comparatively small fluctuations in price. The highest level was reached in 1919 when the index number stood at 260. Since then it fell, more or less steadily, to 154 in 1928. In 1929 it rose to 176 but thereafter fell down steeply to 143 in 1930, 93 in 1931 and 78 in 1932. This decline received a check during 1932 when the index stood at 76. The price of linseed showed a tendency to recover in 1934 when the index came to 80. A definite improvement was visible during 1935 when the index number rose to 96. The opening months of 1936, however, show a decline in the price.

27. The price of *til*, however, shows very violent fluctuations. Index numbers show that prices of *til*, as of linseed, reached their highest level in 1919 when the index number stood 222 per cent. above the base. The next year, however, it had fallen down steeply to 217 but rose again to 266 in 1925. Since then the price has been declining almost continuously, the index number falling to 201 in 1929, 128 in 1931 and 92 in 1934. The prices shot up abruptly with the beginning of 1935, the index for 1935 rising to 146, but a falling tendency is again visible in 1936. It will be observed, however, that the price of *til* has, on the whole, been comparatively high.

28. *Tobacco*—Tobacco accounts for a very small percentage of the value of agricultural produce. Statistics show that its prices have been subject to violent oscillations. The index number stood at 314 in 1922 and at 352 in 1927. The price has since been declining continuously. The index number stood at 283 in 1929 and at 192 in 1931. In 1932 it further fell down abruptly to 77. The year 1933 showed no improvement, though the index remained steady at 76. A recovery was, however, visible during the next two years when the index number rose to 88 in 1934 and 123 in 1935. The opening months of 1936 show a continuance of this rise.

The reporting of the prices of tobacco has been rather unsatisfactory. Frequently prices were quoted for manufactured chewing tobacco instead of for ordinary dry leaves. Attempts have, however, been made to secure accurate prices from 1931.

29. *Prices of other products*—The weighted index number of the prices of other products is necessarily dominated by the prices of sugar. The curve is very irregular and shows rises and falls almost in alternate years. The highest level was attained in 1921 when the index number stood at 265 and the lowest point was reached in 1933 when it came down to 78. It has since recovered to 95 in 1934 and 116 in 1935. The opening figures for 1936, however, again show a downward trend.

30. *Trend of wholesale prices*.—The net variations in the prices of agricultural products are presented in the form of index numbers in Statement II(a) and by a curve in Diagram II. Well-defined positions of maxima are noticeable in this curve in the years 1900, 1908, 1915, 1919, 1926, and 1935. Minor maximum points appear in 1921, 1929 and 1932. The curve also shows well defined points of minima in 1899, 1904, 1911, 1917, 1923, 1931 and 1934. Less obvious minimum points also appear in 1920 and 1927. The prices were below the basic period from 1902 to 1904. In 1913 the index number of prices was 144 but it shot up to 258 in 1919 and again in 1921 after a slight fall in 1920. The present decline began in 1930 when the index number stood at 162. In another year it had reached 112. The prices recovered a little in 1932 when the index number rose to 119. The next two years, however, again witnessed a decline, the index being 114 in 1933 and 103 in 1934. There was substantial recovery in 1935 when the index stood at 122 but the year 1936 does not appear to be equally promising.

31. *Price trends in the districts*.—Wholesale prices in the districts of Lucknow, Agra and Benares indicate more or less similar tendencies. It will, however, be noticed that the index number has reached an appreciably lower limit in Agra than in the other districts while in Benares the index number has remained comparatively high. These variations seem to be due to the fact that Agra grows mostly wheat and barley, articles which have depreciated much more in value than other commodities while Benares has a preponderance of rice and sugarcane which have not gone down appreciably in value. A further explanation is to be found in the fact that during the recent depression prices fell much lower in the western zone, where most of the rabi crops are grown, than in other parts of the Province.

32. *Rental demand*.—Rents of stable and ordinary tenants are shown in Statement III and in Diagram IV. The curve of stable

tenants shows a slow though continuous rise from the base year and the figure stood 21 per cent. higher in 1930 as compared with the basal period. The only breaks in the curve appear in 1904, 1919 and 1932 when the figures fell by 5, 2 and 1 points respectively. The curve representing rents of ordinary tenants in Diagram III shows an uninterrupted rise until 1930 when it stood 65 per cent. higher than in 1901-5. Rents of ordinary tenants fell slightly during the succeeding four years and stood only 61 per cent. above the base year in 1934.

The Oudh Rent Act of 1922 and the Agra Tenancy Act of 1926 have left unmistakable effects upon the course of rents which is clearly discernible from the curves in Diagram IV. The rise of rents from 1924—27 is comparatively slow while during the period 1928-30 there is practically no increase in rents at all. The sudden rise in the rents of ordinary tenants by 19 points in 1927-28 is due to the efforts of most landholders to get more rents from the tenants-at-will for the conferment of statutory rights upon them. A small decline of 5 points during 1930-34 was due to the severe fall in prices.

33. Land revenue—Revenue demand, as is apparent from Statement III(a) and Diagram IV also shows a slow, though unbroken, increase and the figure in 1934 stood 13 per cent. above the basic period 1901-5.

34. An examination of rental and revenue statistics, however, shows a more or less uninterrupted rise ever since 1900. At first sight it appears that there is no direct relation between prices and rents or between prices and land revenue but an examination of the decennial moving averages of prices, rents and revenue will show that price movements are correlated with rents and revenue. The demand of rent and more specially still of revenue is, however, not directly dependent on seasonal or short period variations in prices. They depend largely on the trend of prices over a long period. A glance at Statement III(a), giving decennial average of index numbers of wholesale prices, rents and revenue and at the curves of the same in Diagram V will clearly show an unmistakable correlation. The correlation is, however, not complete inasmuch as there is a considerable lag between prices and rents and between rents and revenue.

For example, the decennial average index number of prices rose by 9 points between the years 1900-9 to 1904-13, while the index number of rents of ordinary and privileged tenants rose by 7 points and 2 points only and the revenue demand by only one point during the same period. Again, the rise in prices from 1904-13 to 1909-18 was 23 points, while the increase in rents of ordinary and privileged tenants was 8 and 4 points respectively and that of revenue demand only one point. The same tendency reveals itself in later years. The lag in revenue demand is clearly due to the fact that revenue settlement in this province takes place after a period of 30 years while the zamindars are able to increase their rents during this period more or less freely in the case of ordinary tenants and to a certain extent even in the case of stable tenants. Moreover, the State cannot increase its revenue in the same proportion as an increase in rents even after a new settlement, because it has to provide a margin for instability.

35. *The recent slump in prices*—But the recent momentous fall of prices, to a point lower than has ever been reached during the whole period treated in this monograph, cannot be dismissed as merely a stage in the general cycle of price movements. It is no doubt difficult to say how far this fall indicates a reversal of the upward movement of prices which is traceable from the early eighties of the last century or is merely an anti-climax of the high pitch of 1919–20. The gradual change in the monetary policy of the world due to the adoption of the gold standard by practically every important country, the inability of the supply of gold to keep pace with its demand, as well as the revolution in methods of agricultural production brought about by the introduction of mechanical devices and socialistic practices, have greatly complicated the whole problem, and have rendered the course of prices far from certain.

36. *World factors*—Besides, the payment of reparations by Germany to the Allies according to the terms of the Treaty of Versailles and the adjustments of war debts between the United States of America, Great Britain and France rendered the operations of ordinary fiscal laws for international price adjustments more or less infructuous. Russia with its vast territories, immense undeveloped resources and incomprehensible socialistic practices presented still another factor of great uncertainty. No wonder, therefore, if international statesmen as well as financial experts found themselves almost overwhelmed by the complications of the situation. The most carefully planned scheme of financial and economic rehabilitation was wrecked because of the impossibility of treating an international malady piecemeal by one country or even by a group. In fact the economic structure of modern nations is so closely interwoven one with the other that no unit can live or prosper alone unless it could stand entirely by itself.

We may, however, examine the more important factors affecting price movements in order to gauge their tendency in the immediate future.

37. *Mechanisation of agriculture*—The introduction of farm machinery for the production of agricultural crops on a large scale has been carried to a high degree of perfection both in America as well as in Europe and Australia during the last few years, while Russia has been dumping large quantities of its surplus wheat and other cereals into Europe. The situation has been further complicated by the fact that until recently both the American and the Australian Governments could not foresee this fact of overproduction and had been trying to corner large quantities of cereals in order to arrest a fall in prices. Although this policy has since been given up, it is doubtful if production will be sufficiently curtailed during the next two or three years to admit of any rise in their prices. The World Economic Conference which was called by Mr. MacDonald in London some years back to settle these problems could achieve no positive results. It may also be assumed that in future years Russia will continue to produce certain amount of surplus above its needs. In the present conditions of India no appreciable diversion of agricultural labour to industrial pursuits can be expected. Accordingly there seem to be very scanty

prospects of a recovery in agricultural prices in the near future, so far as the supply of cereals or raw materials is concerned.

38. *Monetary policy*—The breakdown of the gold standard system in some of the most important countries of the world owing to the absence of any equitable and practicable plan of settling international liabilities, and the serious shortage of gold has created new difficulties. The development of transport facilities and the consequent growth of commerce had brought about a kind of international division of labour according to the principle of the balance of advantages, and international accounts used to be settled by the export or import of gold if and when it was found necessary. A rise or fall of the exchange rate above or below the gold parity points served as a barometer for such eventualities. Such adjustments have been rendered impossible at present on account of the embargo placed by most Governments on the export of gold. Besides nations have generally sought to raise high tariff walls against the imports of goods and even depreciated their currencies with a view to encourage exports and discourage imports. These devices have, however, failed to bring about the desired results on account of their universality, and serve merely to accentuate international suspicion and jealousy.

39. *Conclusion*—It is impossible to foresee how long nations will continue to tread the dangerous path of currency inflation and tariff barriers or the extent to which one country or another will go in that direction. And since prices are sensitive to every small change in the value of money or restriction on trade it is difficult to predict the course of prices in the future. It may, however, be affirmed without violating any canons of logic or economic laws that agricultural prices in the United Provinces are not expected to rise appreciably in the immediate future unless the Indian Government or the governments of countries with which she is commercially connected alter the exchange value of their currencies or change their present fiscal policy or unless war or such other abnormal contingencies arise. A serious scarcity or famine in India may also bring about a temporary rise in agricultural prices. On the whole, however, the outlook points towards a period of low prices, particularly in the case of cereals because of the growing competition in wheat from the Punjab.
