NOTES to supplement, correct and enlarge the information contained in the A Volume Gazetteer of the Narsinghpur District.

Para. 91, page 116.—In 1911 a start was made in the establishment of Co-operative Credit Societies. A Central Bank, with a capital of Rs. 25,000, consisting of 1,000 shares of Rs. 25 each, was established at Narsinghpur for the financing of rural societies. Of these only twelve had been established up to April, 1911, the operations of the Central Bank being purposely restricted during the first year of its existence so as to ensure thorough supervision of the rural societies and thus establish the movement on thoroughly sound foundations. Spontaneous applications for the registration of other rural societies have since been received, and the movement gives promise of being popular and successful.

Paras. 122-124, pages 152-154.—There are now 111½ miles of metalled roads in the district. North of the railway the road from Gadarwara to Jhikoli has been metalled as far as Sainkheda, a distance of 15 miles. This portion is maintained by the P. W. D. at the cost of the District Council.

South of the railway the roads from Narsinghpur to Lakhnadon and Chhindwara are now metalled over their whole length, the work on the Chhindwara road having been completed in 1909, and that on the Lakhnadon road in 1910. Both roads are maintained at the cost of Government.

Page 171, add after para. 136.—In 1907-08, when there was famine in Upper India, the hill tracts of the district shared in the scarcity which prevailed in the Northern Districts of the Provinces owing to the early cessation of the monsoon of 1907. No regular relief works under the Famine Code were opened, but the programme of ordinary works was much expanded and gave employment to large numbers of people. The chief work undertaken was the completion of the Narsinghpur Lakhnadon road as a first-class metalled route. The maximum number of persons in receipt of gratuitous relief was 1,047 in August 1908. Rupees 2,389 privately subscribed, of which Rs. 1,889 were subscribed within the district, were spent on charitable relief. The prices of food-grains rose to an extraordinary high level, food being even dearer than during the famine of 1900. During most

of the period of scarcity and for some months afterwards the amount of wheat obtainable for a rupee was only from $7\frac{1}{2}$ to $8\frac{1}{2}$ seers. This high level of prices, though severely felt by certain classes of the population like clerks and others in receipt of fixed cash salaries, was directly beneficial to the agriculturists of the open wheat tracts where very fair crops were reaped. Petty offences increased in number, but there was no increase of serious crime. Mortality was below normal. The most remarkable feature of this period of scarcity was the stout power of resistance that it rewarded among the people. It was followed by three good or excellent seasons, and the small losses that it caused have been fully repaired.

Page 194, para. 160.—On the 1st April, 1906, the Contract Supply System was introduced, and is now in force throughout the district, outstills being finally abolished on the 1st April 1910.

Page 197 para. 166.—In pursuance of the policy recommended by Lord Curzon's Police Commission, the police arrangements of the district were completely revised with effect from the 1st January 1912. Outposts were abolished, and with the exception of the portion stationed at the Headquarters line, the force is distributed among ten stations at Narsinghpur, Gadarwara, Chhindwara, Chandpoora, Suatalao, Mungwani, Kareli, Tendukhera, Sainkhera and Mohpani with two route-posts at Sokalpore and Barman. Each station is under a Sub-Inspector. Beat-duty is no longer performed by constables, but only by a head constable posted to each station. The total strength of the force is 290, consisting of the District Superintendent, 4 Inspectors, 17 Sub-Inspectors, 40 head constables, 225 constables and 3 mounted constables. The average area under a station is $197\frac{1}{2}$ square miles.
