APPENDIX.

Notes to supplement, correct and enlarge the information contained in the A Volume Gazetteer of the Yeotmal district.

Paragraph 134, page 138.—No railway runs through the district. The Great Indian Peninsula line from Nagpur to Bombay passes at a distance varying from four to sixteen miles from the northern border, and the Warora branch line comes within seven miles of the eastern border. Good roads connect all the taluqs fairly directly with one or other of these lines. It is proposed to make a railway line right across the district especially to open up the coal fields in Wun taluq. The roads fall into three classes according to whether they are under the care of the Public Works Department, under that of the District Board, or country roads. Among the roads which are under the Public Works Department about half are metalled, and about half merely surfaced with gravel or a similar material. They are all partially bridged and drained. That is, they are broad roads with a surface which is generally good except where the traffic is very heavy, and they have either bridges or stone cause-ways at every nullah (stream bed). They are almost all completely planted with trees. Such roads have been made, firstly, from Yeotmal to Dhamangaon, to Wun, and to Darwha; secondly, from Wun to Warora; thirdly, from Darwha to Karanja, fourthly, from Pusad to Basim; and fifthly, from Khandala upon that road to Umerkhed. The roads from Yeotmal to Dhamangaon is 29 miles in length, $21\frac{7}{8}$ miles within Yeotmal district and $8\frac{1}{2}$ in the Chandur taluq of Amraoti-district. It descends the ghat in the sixth mile from Yeotmal and crosses the Bembla river by a fine bridge in the fifteenth. It connects Yeotmal directly with the main line on the north. It is estimated that nearly 16,000 carts of pressed cotton, containing five bales each, pass along the road in an ordinary cotton season. The road to Wun is $66\frac{3}{4}$ miles in length, about half of it being metalled and the other half surfaced with muram or gravel. It passes south-east across Yeotmal, Kelapur, and Wun taluqs. There are inspection bungalows at Jodmoho, Runja, Karanja, Maregaon and Wun. A branch from Umri connects the main road with Pandbarkowda, the headquarters of Kelapur taluq. Much of the country is very rough. In Wun the land is fertile black-soil. The road passes through two forests, and panther and chital deer are sometimes met actually upon it. The Yeotmal-Darwha road runs to the south-east, and is 27 miles long. It descends a ghat in the fifth and sixth miles. There are inspection bungalows at Larkher and Darwha. Wun is connected with Warora, in Chanda district, by a road about 16 miles in length which crosses the Wardha river, the boundary of the district, by a ford six miles from Wun. It brings Wun taluq within easy reach of the railway. Darwha has a road running 24 miles north-west to Karanja in Murtizapur taluq, 15 miles being within Darwha taluq. Karanja is an important town, and also is connected with the main line of railway at Murtizapur, 21 miles to the north. Pusad taluq, formerly belonged to the old Basim district. A road

The consumption of the district during the past two years has been about 140,000 proof gallons annually, an average of about $\frac{1}{5}$ of a gallon of proof spirit to each head of the population.

Page 197, line 8.

A duty of Rs. 7-8-0 per seer is charged for issue to the whole sale vendors.

Page 198, line 2.

It is under contemplation to substitute caked ganja in place of the present loose stuff received in one seer cloth bags.

Page 198, line 7.

Opium is issued to retail vendors at Rs. 27-8-0 a seer.

Page 198, line 17.

Each of the Darwha, Kelapur and Pusad taluqs has two Executive Excise Sub-Inspectors appointed to superintend the working of the system and to check smuggling in each of the remaining two, *viz.*, Yeotmal and Wun taluqs; there is only one Excise Sub-Inspector for executive work.

Page 198, line 25.

The retail rates of opium and ganja at the border shops in His Highness the Nizam's Dominions are 8 annas and 3 annas per tola, respectively, against 9 annas and 4 annas at the British Border shops. The improved excise system in the Hyderabad territory has thus stopped smuggling to a considerable extent.

Page 198, line 30.

Page 199, line 1. The payment is Rs. 200.

There is a District Jail at Headquarters, with the Civil Surgeon as Superintendent. It has accommodation for 114, *viz.*, 77 convicts, 34 under-trial prisoners and 3 Civil prisoners. The daily average number of prisoners during the last three years has been 88. Only convicts whose sentence is under one year are kept to serve their term in it. Those sentenced to over a year are transferred to the Central Jail Nagpur. The principal industries are stone-breaking (gitti), grinding grain and aloe pounding. A garden is maintained some 400 yards from the Jail, in which well-behaved prisoners are employed in cultivating vegetables for the daily rations of the Jail population.

page 203.

The sanctioned strength of the Police Force in this district is 590 officers and men, comprising one District Superintendent of Police, one Deputy Superintendent, 7 Inspectors of whom 5 are in charge of Circles and 2 are the Reserve and the Prosecuting Inspector, 33 Sub-Inspectors, 85 Head Constables, 460 Constables and 3 camel sowars. The District contains 23 station-houses and 5 road posts, each under a Sub-Inspector and a Head Constable respectively. The recruiting difficulty from among local classes still continues and the matter is receiving the attention of the Head of the Department. Over 200 of the Force are Muhammadans and the rest Hindus, including 200 men from Upper India, known as Pardeshis.
