PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original preamble to the constitution of the Society written by the Illustrious Founder, the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

From some time past, the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress, the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required.

The Servants of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country, a higher type of Character and Capacity than is generally available at present. The advance can only be slow.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepare to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian people. Its members will direct their efforts, principally towards -

- creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seeking its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice;
- organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life on the country;
- promoting relations of cordial goodwill and co-operation among the different communities;
- assisting educational movements especially those for the education of women, the education of backward classes and scientific industrial education;
- helping forwards, the industrial development of the country; and
- the elevation of the depressed classes.

THE SERVANTS OF INDIA SOCIETY

Report for the year 1998-99

INTRODUCTION

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. With the object of training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion, by all constitutional means, of the interests of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarter of the Society is at Pune, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has active branches at Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad and Cuttack.

Dr. R.G. Kakade and Shri P.K. Dwivedi were elected President and Vice-President of the Society respectively, Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued to be Secretary of the Society. Shri Ajgaonkar, Dr. Kakade, Shri P.K. Dwivedi and Shri Damodar Sahoo continued to be Senior Members of Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad and Cuttack branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai branch was looked after by the Headquarters. Shri Ramakanta Lenka, Shri Milind Deshmukh and Shri A.N. Mishra were elected Members of the Council.

The Society held annual session and council meeting from 13th June 1999. All members attended.

The Society observed the birth anniversary of Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale on May 9, 1999.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCES FOR 1998-99

Investments

President

During the year 1998-99, Shri R.G. Kakade was associated with the following institutions and activities.

EDUCATION

As a President of the Trustee Society, Shri Kakade continued to be a Chairman of the Managing Committee of the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (*Deemed to be University*).

Shri Kakade continued to be a member of the Managing Committee of the Maharashtra Association for the cultivation of science. The Association conducts an Institute, named after the founder Dr. Agharkar. The Association owns a farm at Hol in Baramati Taluka and has evolved new varieties of sugarcane and some other crops.

Shri Kakade continues to be the Chairman of Padmashree Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation in Ahmednagar.

Shri Kakade continued to be Chairman of the Academy of Education and Youth Services.

Shri Kakade continued to represent the Society on the Managing Committee of the Servants of India Society and Vidya Jyoti Institute. He attended two meetings of the Committee that were held during the year.

Shri Kakade continued to be a Trustee of the Kanara Welfare Trust at Karwar in North Kanara district in Karnataka state.

COOPERATIVE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Shri Kakade continued to be a Director of the Board of Directors of the District Industrial Cooperative Association. He attended three meetings of the Board that were held during the year. The Association conducts a handicraft emporium.

Shri Kakade continued to be the Chairman of the Institute for Rural and Tribal Development and Applied Research.

SOCIAL WELFARE

Shri Kakade continued to be a member of the Managing Committee of the District Probation and Aftercare Association which conducts a Remand Home for Boys and another for Girls.

Shri Kakade continued to be a member of the Managing Committee of the David Sasson in firm Asylum (now known as 'Niwara').

Shri Kakade continued to be a member of the Managing Committee of the Mahila Seva Mandal and also of the Navjeevan Mandal's Executive Committee and attended their meetings in company of Shri Deshmukh.

Shri Kakade was a member of Vidarbha Maharogi Seva Mandal of Amravati.

The Maharashtra Central Famine Relief Committee has already made Shri Deshmukh Hon. Secretary in my place. The Deccan Agricultural Association's Journal the Shetki Shetkari is edited by Shri Appasaheb Pawar from Baramati.

In all the above institutions religions, caste and politics were kept out.

SHRI P.K. DWIVEDI

Vice-President

Shri P.K. Dwivedi was busy with numerous welfare activities for the uplift and betterment of poor, depressed and poverty stricken people during the whole year. A brief report on the activities has been reproduced below :

EDUCATIONAL

Keeping in view the National Drive of the Central Government for the universalisation of education as well as to make education cheap and better and within the approach of each and every poor people's child, Shri Dwivedi maintained Fifteen Primary Schools, Three Junior High Schools, Three Ashram Type Schools, Five Hostels for tribal boys and one type writing and shorthand Institute in his direct control in Udham Singh Nagar, Haridwar and Kheri districts of Utter Pradesh.

All the primary schools are being financed by the Tribal Development Department of the State Govt. of U.P. and Two Junior High Schools out of Three are being financed by the Education Department of the State Government.

The five hostels, for boys, Typing Institute, and Three Ashram Type Schools were conducted with the financial help of the Ministry of social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi.

Most of the beneficiaries in these institutions were from poor sections of Society.

WOMEN AND CHILD WELFARE

Under Women and Child Welfare Programme Shri Dwivedi conducted of Creche Centres with a view to provide nutrition, medical aid to poor kids, their ailing and working mothers.

These programmes were conducted in identified poor villages. Five Creche Centres out of Seven were conducted with the financial help from the State Social Welfare Advisory Board, Lucknow and Two Creche Centres from Human Resource Development Ministry, New Delhi.

Besides these, Shri Dwivedi also conducted a Working Women's Hostel to provide boarding facilities to employed women in various Govt. Departments and private offices at Allahabad.

GENERAL

As a life member of Adarsh Kanya Junior High School Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar, Shri Dwivedi attended its meetings held from time to time. Shri Dwivedi also continued to be the member of Serv India Shiksha Samiti Bazpur and Intermediate College Bazpur and attended their meetings held during the year.

Shri Dwivedi continued to be the Secretary of Bhartiya Adimjati Sevak Sangh, Udham Singh Nagar Cell, and was also elected as a member of the executive committee of the Sangh and attended its executive Council as well as general council meetings held at its Central Office, Thakkar Bapa Smarak Sadan, New Delhi during the year.

Shri Dwivedi also continued to be member of the "District Blindness Control Society" Udham Singh Nagar and attended its meetings called by the 'District Magistrate' Udham Singh Nagar who was the President of the Society.

In spite of being busy with routine work, Shri Dwivedi had to visit Shri Ganga Ram, I.A.S., the Director Tribal Development Department, Lucknow in connection with the sanctioned grant-in-aid for the last year 1997-98 to primary schools and Shri

Hausala Prasad, Secretary, Social Welfare Department of the State Government of U.P. in connection with the Inspection Report of the Govt. of India Schemes to be forwarded to the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. For the same purpose, Shri Dwivedi had to visit Shri Kishan Lal, Director to the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi during the year.

SHRI S.S. AJGAONKAR

Secretary

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued to be the Honorary Secretary of the Bombay Social Reform Association, a non-political and non party Organisation, founded on 1st September, 1903 by the late Justice Narayan G. Chandavarkar and other fellow-workers of Justice Ranade after his death of 16th January, 1901.

During the year under report the Bombay Social Reform Association participated in the symposium on 'Stree Mukti' & 'Stree Shakti' (Women's Liberation & Women's Power) held at Nagpur under the auspices of Sarvodaya Ashram, Nagpur and Vinoba Vihar Kendra. The programme was held to mark the birth Centenary of Dada Dharmadhikari, an eminent Gandhian of the era. B.S.R.A. contributed Rs.10,000/- as a gesture of appreciation to the celebrations. Justice Chandrashekar Dharamadhikari (Retd.) President of B.S.R.A. represented the Association (B.S.R.A.) actively participated in the seminar and presided over the main function.

SOCIAL SERVICE

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued to be the Vice President of the Social Service League founded in the year 1911. It had pre-

eminent place amongst Institutions which pioneered numerous welfare services in the Country.

RURAL WELFARE & COOPERATION

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was a member of the Florence Nightingale Village Sanitation Fund Committee of the Social Service League, Mumbai. From this Fund grants not exceeding Rs.1,000/- are paid to institutions and individuals in rural areas undertaking to do rural sanitation work by such means as sinking wells, cleaning streets, sweeping refuse, filling in insanitary pools and ditches, digging drains etc.

EDUCATION

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar continued his work on the Education Committee of the Social Service League, Mumbai. The Committee manages four High Schools-A Day High School and Three Night High Schools, a Pre-Primary School, a Primary School, Two Junior College in Arts, Science & Commerce-One for day-students and other for the benefit of night-students. The league provides academic education from mini K.G. level to Junior College in the day and night School for the last several years mainly in the Demodar Hall Educational Campus at Parel, Worli and at Jacob Circle.

Pre-Primary and Primary Schools

All the children are given encouragement and training in music, dancing, drawing and crafts along with the usual school subjects. Talented children participate in group folk dancing programme and secure prizes in the competitions of the Mumbai Arts and Sports.

Midday Meal Scheme

Sponsored and financed by the Trustees of the Maneckji Cooper Education Trust and the social service league for the

children of these schools mostly coming from the weaker sections of the Society has received all round appreciation mainly because of the fact that the health and attendance of the children have improved, as a direct result of this scheme.

Social Service League Day High School and Junior College, Parel

The High School started in 1966 on the feasibility report of Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar has become a popular educational institution in the Parel area due to the special attention given by the teaching and non-teaching staff to improve the quality of education by dedicated and continuous work during the last 24 years amongst the working class families. In 1975, the Junior College was also added, thus making it possible for the students to go right up to Junior College (12th standard) without changing the institution.

Supervised study classes were organised for the students of standard VIII to XII by making available to them class room for study during off hours since many students donot have proper accommodation for home study. About 70 students took advantage of these facilities during the year under report.

G.L. Mehta Book Bank Fund

To perpetuate the memory of late Shri. G.L. Mehta, President of the Social service League and Chairman of ICICI, a donation of Rs.10,000/- was received from ICICI to which the league contributed Rs.5,000/- out of the interest income of the Fund, books are lent to poor and deserving students of the Schools/Colleges. Thirty sets of books were lent during the year.

A Library setup by the School/College is being well maintained by addition of new books every year.

During the year under report books worth Rs.10,436/- were purchased. On an average 100 to 150 students daily take advantage of these facilities which indicate that reading habits amongst the backward and poor section of the Society are gradually spreading.

Special Examination

The students are encouraged to appear for the Elementary and Intermediate Grade Drawing Examinations. Out of 70 and 35 students who appeared for the Elementary and their Intermediate Grade Drawing Examinations, 42 and 20 were passed.

Work experience is provided to the students, of Std. VIII and exam of the Secondary Section and Std. XI and XII of the Junior College. The male students learn bookbinding, pot culture, preparation of files and cardboard boxes, manufacture of chalk sticks, tooth powder, preparation of charts, pictures, teaching aids, blackboards etc. Female students learn stitching, knitting, wall-hangings, preparation of bread, biscuits, velvet-flower making etc. Students have also been deputed for training as Turners, Fitters etc. in the Government Technical High School at Dadar, out of the batch of 35 students who had selected technical subjects and appeared for the SSC exam held in March 1992, 30 passed.

Social Service League Night High School / Junior College of Commerce, Parel, Unnati Night High School, Worli & Pragati Night High School, Jacob Circle

Late Shri. N.M. Joshi, took the initiative and established the Night High School at Parel as far back as 1922 with the sole objective of providing education during evening and night hours to the mill hands and other working community. Thus the night schools have become one of the oldest educational activities of

the League. The Night Junior College of Commerce was added to it 15 years ago. Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was one of the Hon. Teachers of the School in 1923.

The Paragati and Unnati Night High Schools were passed on to the League in 1976 for management by the Social Workers' Organisation.

The students in the Night Schools (and College) Generally find it difficult to cope with the heavy revised syllabus, in which subjects like New Mathematics, Science (Biology), Physics, and Chemistry and English are compulsory. As most of them attend school after a day's hard work. The teachers have to take active interest in developing studious habits amongst them. The students of Std. X were provided with S.S.C. Magazines, Special Classes were organised for them on week days, Sundays and Holidays.

Students are encouraged to participate in elocution competitions, group singing of national songs, workers of Mumbai, when he visited textile mills in Lancashire and Manchester during study tour of UK in 1922. After his return home, he pursued the idea and involved the big Mill owners of Bombay, viz. Navrozji Wadia and Sons, M/s E D Sassoon & Co. Ltd., to donate generous amount of cash and gifts of machinery, which enabled the Social Service League to start the "Textile Training School", in 1924.

BRIEF PARTICULARS OF TRAINING COURSES AND PROGRAMMES

The Institute conducts a number of courses, pre-employment and post-employment training being the most important ones :

- Pre-Employment Training
- Regular Training (Part-time)
- "Statutory Training under the Apprentice Act, 1961 (General)"

- Post Employment Training
 - Textile apprentice Course (Part-time)
 - Certificate Courses in Cotton (Part-time)
- Other Assignments

During the year 44 refresher courses were held in mills.

Industrial Schools For Women

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was a Member of the league's Supervisory Committee for six Industrial Schools for women. These Schools are conducted in different parts of the city :

- Certificate Course in Tailoring and Cutting
- Certificate course in Embroidery and Fancy Works
- Craft Teacher's Course in Card Board Work & Bookbinding
- Craft Teacher's Course in Needle work & Embroidery.

N.M. Joshi Social Workers' Training Class

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was organising the N.M. Joshi Social Workers Training Class of the League for three decades in the servants of India Society's Home, Mubai.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar is member of all the Committees constituted by the League for Supervising the following activities :

- Libraries and Reading Rooms
- The Chinchpokli Centre Library
- The Madanpura Centre Library
- The Toy Library at Girgaum
- Smt. Yashoda Manikrao Memorial Children's Library (Children's Vacation Library)
- Recreation and Wholesome Amusement
- The Social Service League Gymnasium and Physical Culture Centre

OTHER ACTIVITIES

During the year under report, Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was a member of the Board of Management of the Gokhale Institute of Politics & Economics "Deemed University" a member of the Building Committee of the Institute.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar is associated with Vidya Vinay Sabha, which conducts 'Gurukul' residential school at Tungarli, Lonawala, Taluka Maval.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar supervised Madras Branch with constant touch with Shri S.V. Ramakrishnan, the Manager, of Madras Branch. Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was member of the Health Committee of the Association of Social Health in India.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar's prerecorded Radio talk on Servants of India Society was relayed on 12th June 1988 by Pune Radio. His T.V. Interview on Gopal Krishna Gokhale was also relayed by Delhi Doordarshan on 19th February, 1998.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar contributed a review on "Marathi Encyclopaedia of Cricket" written and compiled by his friend Shri Ravindra Patkar.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar presided over the Annual General Meeting of the Senior Citizens of North Mumbai and spoke on Nutrition and Successful Aging.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar was awefully busy, managing Mumbai Branch, dealing with complicated lease-renewal and increased assessment cases, Municipal summons cases with inadequate and incompetent ill paid staff. He was also kept busy with complicated lease affairs at the H.O.

Shri S.S. Ajgaonkar also participated in cultural and sporting activities conducted in Mumbai by Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Dadar Matunga Cultural Centre, Association of Social Health, Shivaji Park Gymkhana, Park Club Ltd., Bengal Club, Samarth Vyayam Mandir.

SHRI A.N. MISRA

Member

Because of non-receipt of grant-in-aid from Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment or any help of H.Q. Shri A.N. Misra became handicapped in maintaining the schemes depending upon that grant and was bound to close the Ashram School Siltham and SC Boys' Hostel Ghuwas w.e.f. 1st October, 1998, as the closure of these two schemes was not affecting the education of children. Anyhow he could manage to run the Ten Primary Schools, Five Women's Welfare Centres, One Typewriting Institute and Girls A.T.S. Khaliyari for the whole year. Schemes depending upon the U.P. Government and State Social Welfare Board Grants i.e. Three Junior High Schools, Four Primary Schools, Two SC Boys Hostels and Five Creches were functioning as usual. Apart from these grant based schemes, our Adivasi Inter College at Tikuriya, being self-dependent, were functioning properly. Though Shri Misra was in the clutches of his family dispute, he looked after overall functioning and development of these schemes according to his capacity besides the follow-up of file of inspection report and persuasion for release of Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Grants.

SHRI A.C. TRIPATHI

Member, Allahabad Branch.

Shri A.C. Tripathi continued to be member of Adarsh Kanya Junior High School and Serv India Shiksha Samiti Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar.

Shri Tripathi also continued to be a member of Adivasi Intermediate College Siltham, Birla Vidya Mandir Muirpur and Raja Baldeo Das Birla Soneghati Vidyalay Salkhan, running Servants of India Society.

As a member of the Advisory Committee of Working Women's Hostel, Shri Tripathi attended its meetings held during the year 1998-99 also looked after the day to day affairs, of the hostel.

During the year, Shri Tripathi persuaded case filed by Shri Bachau & Sons contractor and Mr. Ravindra Nath Shukla in the Hon. High Court at Allahabad.

Besides these, as a Member In-Charge Shri Tripathi looked after the management of various conducted Schemes in Allahabad, Mirzapur and Lucknow districts of Uttar Pradesh running under the Servants of India Society, in the guidance and instruction of his Senior Member, Shri P.K. Dwivedi. Name of the Schemes have been given below :

- Dr. Kunzru Primary School, Allahabad
- Dr. K.P. Junior High School, Allahabad

During the year under report Shri M.M. Dhanore conducted Two schools in the areas of operation of the Kannad and Paithan Co-operative Sugar Factory for the children of migrated harvesting and carting labour's children. One Hundred Twenty Four children attended this school. Out of them Eighty Two were girls and Fourty Two were boys. Thirty Six girls and 14 boys appeared for the Board Examination.

In search of work labours of adjoinment districts migrate and their children miss schooling. It is to help these children

Sugar factory provide sheds for the schools and supply free of cost reading and writing material to the children.

Shri Dhanore continuously working to provide health services to the labourers to the above two karkhanas by appointing two trained women health visitors.

Shri M.M. Dhanore is elected as State Convenor of campaign against Child Labour Maharashtra. CACL is a national level organisation working for the eradication of child labour in fourteen states of India. The organisation demands are :

- every children should get free, compulsory and qualitative education
- 100% enrolment and 0% dropout in one school
- implement of supreme court judgement by the Government
- implementation of NCLP (National Child Labour Project) in every recognised district.

Mr. Dhanore organised the post card campaign addressed to the Prime Minister of India on the 30th April, the World Child Labour Day. He sent 4,000 post cards containing 'Provide Education and Protect Childhood'. He attended National Coordination Committee Meeting held at CACL, Maharashtra.

Shri Dhanore arranged a convention of widows and distorted women at Aurangabad on the 8th March being the World Day for Women.

Shri Dhanore arranged at Kalanki in Kannad Taluka, a ceremony of group marriage of 19 Adiwasi Thakar Community Brides and Bridegroom during the year under report. Articles like utensils etc. worth about Rs.1,000/- were presented to each couple on behalf of Adiwasi Welfare Corporation, Government of Maharashtra.

SHRI R.V. NEVE

GOKHALE DAY

Birth Anniversary of G.K. Gokhale was celebrated in Gokhale Memorial Library Hall, Nagpur on 9th May, 1998. Late Shri G.K. Gokhale and his work was gratefully remembered.

Annual Report, 1998-99**

The Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is one of the oldest research and training institute in Economics in the country. It was founded on the 6th of June 1930.

Since May 1993, the Institute started functioning as "Deemed to be a University".

The Institute has completed 22 research projects during the year 1998-99 and 25 research papers by the members were published in reputed journals. Sixty five students are studying in M.A. course while 24 students are working for their Ph.D. degree during 1998-99. Twenty eight successful students received their M.A. Degree by Dr. S. Venkitaramanan, Ex-Governor, Reserve Bank of India who also delivered the Kale Memorial Lecture on "The Dilemmas of Development - The Indian Experience". This lecture is available as institute's publication. Two UGC sponsored refresher courses were also conducted for 92 teachers from various Universities and colleges.

LIBRARY

The Institute shares the Library of the Servants of India Society and has been mainly responsible for building it as one of the foremost specialised libraries in India with collection of 2,47,860 volumes and subscribes, 467 journals.

The process of computerisation of the library has been initiated. The hardware and software have been acquired and the work of automation may be completed within a period of three years.

Then only shall you be counted among her true and faithful servants".

"Gokhale taught me not to glorify the country in language but to spiritualize its political life and institutions.
