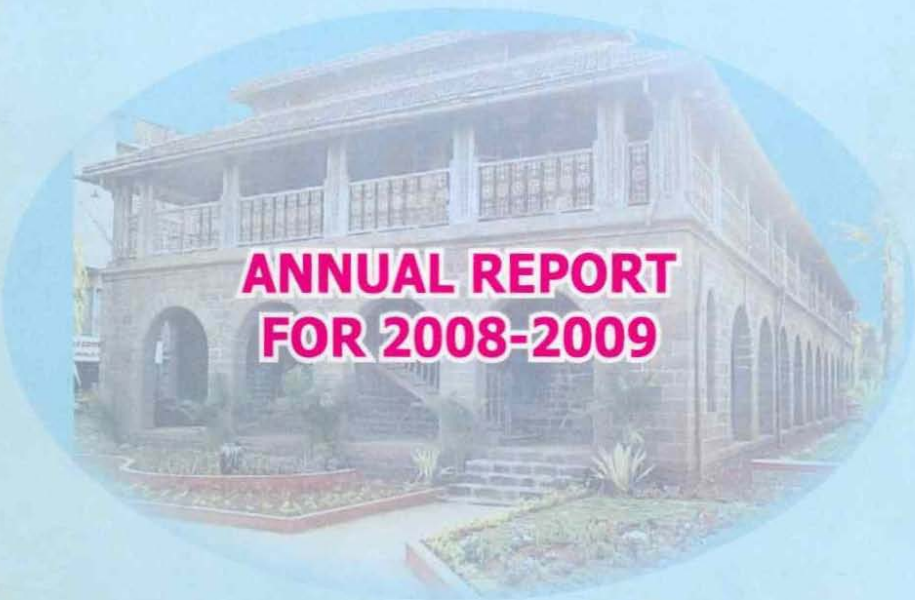

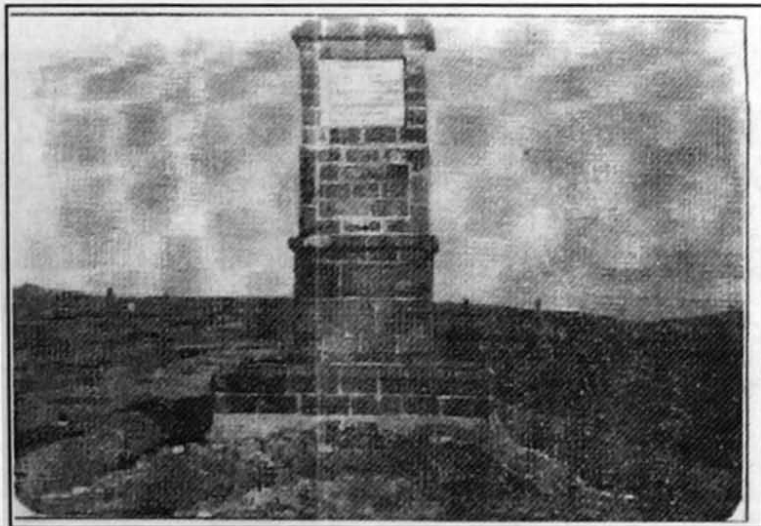

PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original Preamble to the Constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

For some time past the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required. The work that has been accomplished so far has indeed been of the highest value. The growth during the last 104 years of a feeling of common nationality based upon common traditions and ties, common hopes and aspirations, and even common disabilities has been most striking. The fact that we are Indians first, and Hindus, Mohammedans, Parsees or Christians afterwards is being realised in a steadily increasing measure, and the idea of a united and renovated India marching onwards to a place among the nations of the world, worthy of the great past, is no longer a mere idle dream of a few imaginative minds, but is the definitely accepted creed of those who form the brain of the community—the educated classes of the country. A creditable beginning has already been made in matters of education and of local self-government; and all classes of the people are slowly but steadily coming under the influence of liberal ideas. The claims of public life are every day receiving wider recognition, and attachment to the land of our birth is growing into a strong and deeply cherished passion of the heart. The annual meetings of Congresses and conferences, the work of public bodies and associations, the writing in the columns of the Indian Press—all bear witness to the new life that is coursing in the veins of the people. The results achieved so far are undoubtedly most gratifying, but they only mean that the jungle has been cleared and the foundations laid. The great work of rearing the

superstructure has yet to be taken in hand, and the situation demands on the part of workers devotion and sacrifices proportionate to the magnitude of the task.

The Servants of India Society has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country a higher type of Character and capacity than is generally available at present, and the advance can only be slow. Moreover, the path is beset with great difficulties; there will be constant temptations to turn back; bitter disappointment will repeatedly try the faith of those who have put their hand to the work. But the weary toil can have but one end, if only the workers grow not faint-hearted on the way. One essential condition of success in this work is that a sufficient number of your countrymen must now come forward to devote themselves to the cause in the spirit in which religious work is undertaken. Public life must be spiritualised. Love of country must so fill the heart that all else shall appear as of little moments by its side. A fervent patriotism which rejoices at every opportunity of sacrifice for the motherland, a dauntless heart which refuses to be turned back from its objects by difficulty or danger, a deep faith in the purpose of providence which nothing can shake equipped with these, the worker must start on his mission and reverently seek the joy which comes of spending oneself in the service of one's country.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepared to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian People. Its members will direct their efforts principally towards (1) creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seek its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice; (2) organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the

public life of the country; (3) promoting relations of cordial good will and co-operation among the different communities; (4) assisting educational movements especially those for the industrial development of the women, the education of backward classes and industrial scientific education; (5) helping forward the industrial development of the country; (6) the elevation of the depressed classes.

VOWS:

The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.

In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.

I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.

I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.

I will lead a pure personal life.

I will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.

I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2008-2009

INTRODUCTION

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. Its objects are the training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means, of the interest of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields. The circumstances in which the Society was founded and the objects, which the Founder had in view in founding it, are explained in the preamble he wrote to its constitution in 1905, extracts from which are given in the preceding two pages. The Preamble has been a source of inspiration to the Society during the 104 years of its existence.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarters of the Society are at Pune, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Chennai, Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Raygada and Kerala.

Shri A. N. Misra is the President of the Society. Shri Ramakanta Lenka is the Vice-President of the Society. Shri M. B. Deshmukh is the Secretary of the Society. Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar, Shri R. V. Neve, Shri A. C. Tripathi, Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, Shri Dinesh Misra continued to be the Members of Nagpur, Mumbai, Cuttack and Allahabad branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai Branch was looked after by the head quaters. Shri A. N. Mishra, Ramakanta Lenka, Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar, Shri R. V. Neve, Shri A. C. Tripathi, Shri Gangadhar Sahoo were elected members of the Council.

INCOME TAX

BRANCH ACTIVITIES OF THE SOCIETY

SHRI ATMA NAND MISRA

Shri Atma Nand Misra continued to be a member of the Advisory Committee of Uttar Pradesh Vidyalyaya Prabandhak Mahasabha (U. P. Manager's Association) as well as the Zonal Secretary of Vindhyachal Division. He attended two meetings of the Advisory committee and two meetings of the State Body during the year under report.

Shri Misra continued to be the Joint Secretary of Girivasi Banvasi Seva Prkalp, Varanasi which is doing a lot of work for Tribal Development in Varansi, Chandauli and Sonebhadra district without any Government grant. He attended almost all the four meetings of the Prkalp held during the year under report.

He was nominated as a member of the Bhartiya Itihas Sankalan Samiti by the Kashi Vidyapith through which they are trying to go deeply in the history of struggle for freedom of India (from 1857 to 1947) but unfortunately so far he could attend only one meeting of the Samiti held on the 10th December 2006. Thereafter, he could not attend any meeting convened by them because of one reason or another.

Being the Chairman of the Board of Management of Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics Shri Misra presided almost all the four meetings of the Board held during the year under report.

Being Secretary of the Mirzapur Centre of the Society, he looked after the day to day management of the Schemes approved by the Government of India (Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment) viz. Ten Primary Schools, Five Women's Welfare Centre, Ashram School Siltham, SC Boys Hostel Ghuwas and Girls Ashram School Khaliyari. Members are aware that grants for these schemes have not been released from the year 1998 which was a great hurdle in smooth management of these schemes. Shri Misra made his

best efforts to get the grants released during the year under report as a result of which Rs. 7 lakhs, were sanctioned during the year under report. After payment of this amount some improvement is found in Ten U.P. & Z.P. Schools but Ashram School Siltham and SC Boys Hostel Ghuwas were remaining closed during the year under report because of non-availability of funds.

Apart from the abovementioned schemes, Shri Misra looked after overall functioning and development of the schemes approved by the State Government i.e. Three Junior High Schools, Six Primary Schools and Two SC Boys Hostels and self dependent schemes viz. Adivasi Inter College Siltham, Birla Vidya Mandir High School / Intermediate College Muirpur, Raja Baldeo Das Birla Songhati Higher Secondary School Salkhan and Ayurvedic Dispensary at Tikuriya. A detailed report on the working of these schemes is submitted separately. Efforts are being made to get the recognition for Science Education in B.V.M. Inter College Muirpur.

Now our only one High School viz. Raja Baldeo Das Birla Songhati Higher Secondary School is remaining to be upgraded to Intermediate College for which Shri Misra has started making necessary efforts.

ADIVASI INTER COLLEGE, SILTHAM - SONEBHADRA

The college is being run without any Grant-in-aid and is depending upon the income from fees only. As a result of this, we are unable to appoint required number of teachers and to allow the admission of all the students who seek admission in this college, though recognition for almost all the subjects except Agriculture and Commerce has been received and eight class rooms were constructed with the generous help of local people and Shri Ram Shakal, Ex. M. P. during his tenure out of local area Development Fund (i.e. M. P. Fund).

This college has got good name and fame in the area and is famous for its standard of education. Details of beneficiaries during the year under report is given below:-

Out of 170 students who passed in last Intermediate examination 38 passed in First Division, 52 in IInd Division and 80 in IIIrd Division. Out of 73 students who passed in last High School examination 59 passed in First Division, 98 in IInd Division and 28 in IIIrd Division.

BIRLA VIDYA MANDIR HIGH SCHOOL/INTER COLLEGE, MUIRPUR - SONEBHADRA

The Birla Vidya Mandir High School was upgraded to Intermediate College during the year 2008-2009. The College is run without any grant-in-aid and is depending upon the income from the fees only. As a result of this, we are unable to appoint required number of teachers and to allow the admission of all the students who seek admission in this college, though adequate building was constructed by the generous help of Hindalco, Shri Ram Shakal the Ex. M. P. and the Shaktinagar Area Development Authority (SADA).

The college has got good name & fame in the area and is famous for its standard of education. Details of beneficiaries during the year under report is given below:-

As a result of this, we are unable to appoint required number of teachers and to allow the admission of all the students who seek admission in this High School, though adequate building is constructed with the generous help of Hindalco and Shri Ram Shakal the Ex. M. P. Efforts are being made to upgrade the school to an Intermediate college. Details of beneficiaries during the year under report is given below:

JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS (THREE)

The Society maintained three Junior High Schools in the Sonebhadra district located at the village Siltham and Muirpur with financial aid from the U. P. Social Welfare Department and at village Salkhan with financial aid from the Education Department of U. P. Government. All these schools are recognized by the U. P. Education Department having good reputation in the locality and possess their own puceabuildings.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS (SIXTEEN)

Out of these Sixteen (16) Primary Schools Two (2) were located in the Mirzapur district and Fourteen (14) were located in the Sonebhadra district. Of these Four (4) Primary Schools of Sonebhadra and two primary schools of Mirzapur district were financed by the U. P. Social Welfare Department and remaining ten primary schools of the Sonebhadra district were financed by the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (SCD Division). All these schools are duly recognized by the U. P. Education Department and are regularly inspected by its inspectorate.

Out of these 16 primary schools, eight (8) have their own pucea buildings and remaining 6 have Kachcha buildings.

GIRLS ASHRAM SCHOOL KHALIYARI - SONEBHADRA

The Ashram provides free residential accommodation, fooding, clothing, oil and soap and reading and writing materials to 50 SC girls of whom 07 in were reading in class Ist, 06 in class IInd, 18 in class IIIrd, 12 in class IVth and 07 in class Vth in the primary school attached with the Ashram.

HOSTEL FOR SC BOYS (TWO)

With the financial aid from the U. P. Social Welfare Department the Society maintained two Harijan and Adivasi Boys Hostels at Muirpur and Salkhan in the Sonebhadra district. According to the provisions provided in the Scheme, only free residential accommodation and cooking facilities are provided in these hostels.

MEDICAL RELIEF

The Society maintained one Ayurvedic Dispensary at Tikuriya Centre through which 453 new patients took benefit during the year under report.

SHRI M. B. DESHMUKH

The case No. 41-D in the Bombay High Court for removal of SIS from the Administration of Gokhale Institute was finally won by the Society. Attending to the Court cases involved studying the case papers, appointing the Advocates and briefing them about the cases and also attending the Court hearings.
3. As a Nominated member of the Society on the Board of Management of the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, and also on the Institute's Finance Committee and the Selection Committees, I attended the meetings as and when they were scheduled by the Director of the Institute.
4. He tried to obtain the TDS Exemption Certificate in respect of Mumbai Branch.
5. Besides, I shouldered responsibilities and carried them out satisfactorily during the year under report. They are as follows:

SHRI RAMAKANTA LENKA

Shri Madhu Sudan Sahoo delivered welcome address and Dr. D.K. Mohanty, Reader in Political Science, Women's College, Rayagada joined as Chief Speaker.

Shri Lenka visit Narsannapet Centre of the Society and Four Schools run by the Society in Kerala State in a team consisting of Shri A.N. Misra, President, Shri M.B. Deshmukh, Secretary and Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, Senior Member from 1st September 2008 to 5th September 2008 and submitted the joint report to the Head Quarters.

Shri Lenka joined as a resource person in session organized by CYSD (Centre for youth and Social Development) Bhubaneswar and PRAGATI, Rayagada for ensuring the execution of already adopted Agricultural Policy for benefit of farmers. He addressed the gathering of more than three thousand farmers of the district on state of affairs of present days agriculture.

Being a Nominee of the Society to Board of Management of Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Shri Lenka attended all of its Board meetings.

Along with others, Shri Lenka took active part in organizing Rayagada Poetry Festival-2008 in S. C. Jain Memorial Auditorium, J.K. Paper Mill, Rayagada in which renowned poets and writers of the State joined.

Shri Lenka attended the District Level Consultation on Right to information at Rayagada organized by FAAR, Muniguda. He also attended the Annual General Body Meeting of State Judicial Employees Association at Civil Court Premises, Rayagada.

Shri Lenka continued to be the Non-Official Visitor of Rayagada District Jail. He visited the Jail and interacted with its prisoners.

Shri Lenka attended the following meetings/workshops functions/seminars during the year.

The Servants of India Society has now completed 104 years of un-interrupted and dedicated service to the nation. It was founded by the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905, now the Society has found its place in the hearts of the people and needs no introduction. Gokhale inspired the members of the Society to devote them such noble ideals, the Society has a distinguished and unparalleled record of work for the furtherance of the nation's welfare. It contributed to the nation stalwarts like G. K. Deodhar, N. M. Joshi, Srinivas Sastri, Thakkar Bapa and H. N. Kunzru. The traditions of the Society and the rich legacy of the founder

are being carried by the members of the Society which is conducting and organizing activities in various fields.

The Rayagada center of the Society founded in the year 1939 since its inception it has been engaged in the tribal welfare activities in the erstwhile Koraput dist. At present the Rayagada center runs the following activities.

THAKKAR BAPA ASHRAM

The Rayagada Center of the Society runs a residential hostel for SC students popularly known as Thakkar Bapa Ashram, which was funded by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, New Delhi. The Ashram provided free boardings, lodging, educational facilities to 100 SC students. The students were provided with necessary reading and writing materials and intensive coaching to improve their standard of education. Facilities of a children library, indoor and outdoor games, oil and soap, uniforms and free medical assistance are also supplied to them. A group of students visited Puri and Konark in an educational excursion. At present there are 100 SC students and according to their educational standards 40 students are reading in High School and 60 students are reading in UP School. The Rayagada center also managed an UP School inside the premises of the Ashram in which 270 children were reading during the year.

Expenditure incurred on maintenance of the Ashram Total Rs. 8,64,862/-.

EDUCATIONAL COMPLEX

The Rayagada Center of the Society runs an Educational Complex for girls since 1994, which was sanctioned by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India, New Delhi, with a view to improving the tribal female

literacy. The Scheme was revised and came into effect from 1st April 2008 with revised financial norms which was known as “Strengthening Education among Scheduled Tribe (ST) Girls in Low Literacy Districts”.

The Complex has the facility for reading of ST girls from Class-I to Class-V. During year 60 ST girl students were residing and reading in the Complex. The Complex provided the facilities like free boarding, lodging, reading and writing materials, uniforms, incentives for day to day requirement, medicines and periodical medical check ups to the girl students.

The students were imparted intensive coaching to improve their standard of education. vocational/skill development training suitable to their age group were given to the girl students. Cultural function, sports, Mothers Committee meeting and Parents Teachers’ meetings were organized during the year.

Recurring expenditure incurred total Rs. 10,18,520/-.

EMPLOYMENT GUIDANCE

As it is a recognized institution for STs and SCs, various departments of Central Govt. and State Government inform this Institution about their vacancies reserved for SC/ST candidates. Unemployed Tribal youths are benefited by this employment information.

FINANCE

During the period under report the center has incurred an expenditure of Rs. 19,09,563/- on the above mentioned activities. The Center received the Financial Assistance from the Government of India which are given below:

Other expenses are met by the center, out of inter unit transactions own resources of the Institution, grants from Head Quarters and collecting donations from the public.

GENERAL

Many public functions have been organized during the year relevant to public importance in the Thakkar Bapa Ashram, which deserves as one of the Institutions of the first line on the area established for tribal welfare.

SHRI S. S. AJGAONKAR

Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar continued to be the Vice-President of Social Service League which has traversed longest span in Social Service in the city of Bombay. It has now attained a pre-eminent place among Institutions which have contributed to Social Welfare in the Country. Its coming into existence gave rise to many Leagues in places like Calcutta, Chennai, Delhi, Karachi and many other cities of pre-partition, India. It came into existence on March 1911 as an offshoot of Holika Şammelan convened by Bombay Social Reform Association jointly with Bombay Holika Committee. Shri G. K. Deodhar eminent member of S.I.S. was the moving spirit behind the movement along with Justice N. G Chandavarkar, eminent jurist and once President of Indian National Congress, at the Public meeting formerly mooted the founding of Social Service League in Bombay with the object of fostering the spirit of Social Service including helping the

masses to groom in the knowledge of healthy life and promoting the spirit of mutual service among the high and low. The motto of the League was 'NO, LOVE, SERVE'. It is to be noted that there is no field of social work where Social Service league has not touched. e.g. fostering the co-op. movement, promoting social legislation, organizing industrial welfare work, relief craft training for women, vocational training for workers etc. for poor section of the community detail of which is beyond the scope of weekly letter. Most of the member of the Society from G. K. Deodhar, Dinkar Desai, Shyamrao Parulekar, Godavari Gokhale, and N. M. Joshi devoted major portion of their life for the said object. Shri S. K. Patil, B. R. A. mbedkar were associated with the League during pioneering days. League started Quarterly Journal in 1914. It was the first magazine in India solely devoted to the study of social problems. Lae Sarvashri Vaikunth L. Mehta, K. Natrajan, S. L. Brelvi and Prin. T. A. Kulkarni actively associated with it and built up its high standard for more than three decades. S. S. Ajgaonkar was editor of this Social Service Quarterly for many years. Shri Ajgaonkar's work in this connection is beyond the scope of this report. Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar is proud that Shri G. K. Deodhar, Shri N. M. Joshi and Shri Thakkar Bapa, life worker of S.I.S. were instrumental in founding and developing the League. The Social Service League's social work is to a large extent ameliorative in nature and can not be surpassed.

Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar is continued to be the honorary Secretary of Bombay Social Reform Association, a non political organization founded on 1st September 1903 by Justice Narayan G. Chandavarkar and other fellow workers of Justice Ranade after his death on 16th January 1901. It was an offshoot of National Social Conference started by late Justice Ranade in 1887 (Justice Ranade was mentor and Guru of G. K. Gokhale). Justice Chandarashekhhar Dharmadhikari and Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar is the Secretary of the said organization for many years. It is to be noted that Bombay Social Reform Association has done immense work to eliminate disruptive forces as casteism, communalism and regionalism and enactment of common civil code, has a disguised record of service for furtherance social reform in the Country. It has played a valuable part in bringing

Shri Tripathi continued to be a member of Adivasi Intermediate College, Siltham, Birla Vidya Mandir, Muirpur and Raja Baldeo Das Birla Soneghati Vidyalaya , Salkhan in Sonebhadre District and Serve India Shiksha Samiti, Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar managed by Servants of India Society.

As a member of Advisory Committee of Working Women's Hostel, Shri Tripathi attended its meetings held during the year.

During the year Shri Tripathi persuaded case field eviction of unauthorized occupants of Khatik in the district court at Allahabad.

Besides these as a Member in-charge Shri Tripathi looked after the management of Various schemes at Allahabad and Miezapur districts of Uttar Pradesh run under Servants of India Society, in the guidance and instruction of his Senior Member.

Name of the Schemes and their brief reports are given below:

SHRAM TYPE SCHOOL KHANTARA

With the financial help form Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi the school was maintained by the Society at Khantra in Mirzapur District.

During the session 2008-09 the beneficiaries number on the roll was 60 who were from SC communities. The Ashram provided books and stationary, fooding, lodging, and clothing facilities to the students free charge.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 5,85,254.50 during the year under report.

DR. KUNZRU PRIMARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The school was maintained with its own resources for the educational advancement of the poor students.

During the session no. of students on roll was 64. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 97,240/-.

As Resident member of the Allahabad Centre Shri Tripathy was looking the day to day management of Working Women Hostel as well as Jeevan Santhi Guest House in Allahabad.

SHRI GANGADHAR SAHOO

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, looked into the regular activities of the units of the Choudwar Centre of the Servants of India Society, assigned to him.

During the year Shri Sahoo paid regular visits and looked into the smooth management of 30 nos. of Creche Centres run in the village of Tangi-Choudwar and Athagarh Block of Cuttack District and Kalan area of Jajpur District along with Choudwar Municipality. In these 30 centres more than 800 children from poor families within the age group of 0 to 6 years are being provided with supplementary nutrition and education through play way method in a beautiful homely atmosphere. Sixty numbers of lady workers are engaged in those centres who take care of the children. Shri Sahoo attended several meetings and get-together organized by the villagers of the villages adopted crèche activities. He also attended zonal committee meetings of the said program.

During the year, 22 batches of training were organized in the Anganwadi workers Training Centre in which 665 untrained lady Anganwadi Workers from various ICDS projects were imparted with practical training in ICDS activities. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of the said unit and took the trainees out, for field placement in various ICDS projects, During the year Anganwadi Helpers Training Unit in the premises of the Choudwar Centre, covered 25 batches of training and imparted training to 1100 untrained Anganwadi Helpers of various ICDS projects. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of such unit. In these unit 10 high qualified, wel trained and experienced lady Instructresses and office bearers are engaged in imparting quality based training to the trainees.

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo coordinated almost all the National Pulse Polio Programmes in the Choudwar Municipality area 70 lady volunteers of the Choudwar Centres of the Society fed polio drops to 4150 childrens of Choudwar Municipality area time to time. In the programme, the volunteers went to every doorstep, for two days, in each programme and covered 100% children within the age group of birth to give years, of the area, by feeding polio drops. During the year 3 programmes were conducted.

Shri Sahoo conducted National Filarial Eradication programme in the Choudwar area. With the leadership of Shri Sahoo 100 lady volunteers distributed 1,30,000 DCC (Diethyle Carbamazile Citrate) tables to 42,000 people of the area, at their Door step. This act of Coudwar centre, in implementing the programme in a successful manner is highly appreciated byt he State Health Department.

Shri Sahoo monitored National AIDS Awarness Campaign in the Choudwar Municipality, organized two times, during the year 46 lady social workers of the Choudwar Centre paid doorstep visits, distributed AIDS related leaflets and made the people aware of AIDS and its prevention.

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, during the year attended Block level and District level Disaster Management and Preparedness committee meetings as a representative of the Society. The Social workers of the Choudwar Centre have adopted 6 Panchayats of the Tangi Choudwar Block and trained the people of said panchayats on their preparedness at the time of natural clamities. Shri Sahoo visited several State Govt. Offices and had discussion with the officials on various problems of the area.

Shri Sahoo attended 3 State level review meetings convened bythe Department of Women and Child Development, Govt. of Orissa and actively participated int he discussion. he actively participated in the 143rd Gokhale Jayanti Utshab, organized by the Orissa Branch of the Society. he also took part in the 35th foundation day celebration of Sishu Sadan and 46th death anniversary of Padmashrre L.N. Sahoo organized in the Choudwar entre of the Society. Shri Sahoo continued to be the honorary correspondent of the leading daily Newspaper "The Prajatantra".

SHRI DINESH MISHRA

Shri Dinesh Mishra continued to be a member of Narendra Memorial Shiksha Sansthan, Bazpur. Under the Sansthan a nursery and a primary school namely Modern Public School is being run. Shri Mishra is also a member of Serve India Siksha Samiti, Bazpur Udham Singh Nagar and he actively participated in the meetings of the Samiti from time to time.

Shri Dinesh Mishra also continued to be a member of management committee of Shri Nehru Gram Madhyamik Vidyalaya Saraibanshi in Allahabad district and attended these meetings held from time to time.

Shri Mishra attended the Muslim Van Gurjar conference at Haridwar held on 4th -5th May. This was organized by Bhartiya Adimjati Sevak Sangh, Uttarakhand Board.

As the member in charge of the Palioa center he looked after the day to day management of the Thjaru Janjati Boy's Hostel and Balika A. T. S. in the district Lakhimpur Kheri in Uttar Pradesh.

Brief report of the project is given below:

BALIKAASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL PALIA KALAN

With the financial help from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. The residential school was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri district for the educational advancement of girl belonging to SC community.

During the session 2008-09 the total number of the beneficiaries is 101 who were from the SC communities. The ashram school provided fooding, lodging, clothing books and stationary and medical facilities to

the inmates free of cost. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 9,58,115.00 during the year under report.

THARU BOYS HOSTEL PALI KALAN

With the financial help from Govt. of India Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi the hostel was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri district. During the session 2008-09 the total number of beneficiaries on roll was 47 who were from the scheduled tribes community. The hostel provided fooding, lodging, books and stationary and other facilities to the students free of charges. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the hostel was Rs. 6,38,812.00 during the year under report.

WORKING WOMEN HOSTEL, ALLAHABAD

To solve the residential problems of the working women the Servants of India Society has been maintaining Working Women Hostel since 1984. 36 women coming from different districts were taking the advantage of the hostel during the year. On the maintenance of the hostel the total expenditure was Rs. 1,24,567.70 and total income was 3,67,256.00 during the year under report.

JEEVAN SATHI GUEST HOUSE

To facilitate the natives short of land for organizing various ceremonies, the society has started the Jeevan Sathi Guest House, a marriage garden. This guest house along with being a medium of social gathering is also a tool for increasing the earnings of the society. The total number of bookings during the year was 45. The total income during the year under report was Rs. 9,73,000.00. The total expenditure on taxes etc. was 3,07,193.00.

SHRI DAMODAR SAHOO

During the year under report Shri D. Sahoo was mostly engaged looking after the activities of the Orissa Branch and Choudwar centre and other than the activities of the Society for smooth management. He devoted his time for management of other organizations in which he is acting as Patron, Advisor, Member, Chairman, Secretary etc. He attended number of Seminars where he expressed his ideas and thought on the issues of Child Labour Problem, In- Country adoption and Atrocity of Woman. He represented the Society as a member of Peace Committee for rehabilitation of Tribal Community in industrial area of Jajpur District.

He organized 142nd Birth Anniversary of the founder of the Society Nr. Gokhale on 9th May 2008. The 15th death anniversary of late S. S. Misra, the then President of the Society was also observed on 8th December 2008. Meetings of Utkal Kendriya Bal Seva Sangh, Sarvodaya Relied Committee, Naturopathy Council also organized in the office building at Cuttack in which Shri Sahoo is acting as General Secretary, President and Working President of those organisations. As a member of Utkal Sahitya Samaja Shri Sahooa attended most of the functions held in Sriram Chandra Bhawan, Cuttack. As the founder Secretary of the Gokhale Ideal College Shri Sahoo took active role in smooth management of the College.

CHOUDWAR CENTRE

As the Secretary of the Choudwar Centre he devoted his time for smooth of the activities of the D.C. Home, Sishu Greh, Leprosy Clinic, Vocational Training Centres, Creches, A.W.T. and all other activities inside and outside of the Centre managed by the Society. He organised 46th Death Anniversary of late L.N. Sahu and 35th Foundation Day of Servindia D.C. Home at Choudwar. The Govt. has not yet sanctioned any grant-in-aid for Sishu Greh and have managed it with difficulties. During the year we have taken maximum support of the Donors to meet the deficit amount

in managing the Home due to inadequate grant-in-aid of the State Govt. against the Care and Protection of the Orphanage, Destitute Children.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

As the Executive Member of B.A.J.S.S. he attended meetings in New Delhi and other places organised by the HQ. of B.A.J.S.S. in different times. He has devoted his time for managing the Creche Centres of B.A.J.S.S. in the Dists. of Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Jajpur and Keonjhar.

As the Chairman of “Swarnalata Smruti Sanmsada” Member of Staff Selection Committee, I.C.D.S. Programme, District Child Welfare Committee, he took active role in management of those Organisations. As a founder Member of Poly Technic Society, Govt. of India, he has organised Self-Help Programme, Awareness Training Programme in different Districts of the State.

During the year Shri Sahoo organised 3 Eye Camps at Dharamsala and Rasulpur of Jajpur Dist. in the banner of the Orissa Branch of the Society where 157 persons availed the opportunity of Cataract operations. He has also organised 11 medical camps with the co-operations of Holdz Memorial Hospital and Model Schools of Nadiabhanga in most of the tribal populated areas of Jajpur Dist. Shri Sahoo devoted his time for attending meetings of Board of Management and Staff Selection as the Chairman of Sakti Junior College, a high profile Residential Science College in the state.

He gave a talk for 10 minutes on Gandhi Bichar in All India Radio, Cuttack. The role ‘Sanatan Baba’ in the play of “Sabaramati to Rajghat” was played by Shri Sahoo in A.I.R. was appreciated by the listeners. During the year Shri Sahoo attended 37 public meetings requested by the Schools, Colleges and other organisations as the chief guest and speakers of the functions. As a devotee of Bhagawan Satya Sai, he has contributed

his service in Seva Camp and attended Bhajans, Sat Sangh and Conferences organised by Satya Sai Seva Samittee. District and State conference and other activities of the Samittee.

SHRI MADHUSUDAN SAHOO

During the year under report Shri Madhusudan Sahoo movement was somehow restricted on health grounds. His right eye was operated for cataract in March 2008 and left eye was operated in October, 2008. Though the eye sight was not affected yet the left eye continued to watering for 3 to 4 months.

He has published three booklets on Sadachar Siksha in Oriya language under the Title Sadachar Bharati. Booklet No. 25 was a compilation of some anecdotes of great persons, booklet No. 26 was a bunch of 26 poems on Sadachar Siksha and booklet No. 27 was a small biography of Thakkar Bapa.

During the year he could not visit schools as he was doing before.

SHRI P. K. DWIVEDI

During the year under report Shri P. K. Dwivedi kept himself with various engagements for the advancement of communities (Tribal and others) in the states of Utrakhand and Uttar Pradesh. Shri Dewivedi actively superintended the schemes, field work and related tasks for the Servants of India Society and other sister organizations like Bhartiya Adim Jati Sevak Sangh, H. N. Kunzuru Memorial Seva Samiti, and Shri Purnanand Tiwari Jan Hitkari Nyass, Bazpur etc. along with being the founder of and successful launching of, a fortnightly newspaper from Bazpur.

Shri Dwivedi managed 4 hostels, 2 Balika Ashram Type Schools, 5 Crèches as 14 primary school for the educational development of the Buxa and Tharu communities, under the banner of the Servants of India Society with its center office at Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar.

Shri Dwivedi kept himself updated and involved in the functioning of the Serve India Siksha Samiti, Bazpur. Shri Dwivedi is a founder member of the Serve India Siksha Samiti, Bazpur which is registered under Society's Registration Act XXI 1960. The Serve India Intermediate College, Roshanpur and the Purv Madhyamik Vidyalaya Mazraavidhi, is run under the direct banner of Serve India Siksha Samiti. Shri Dwivedi also continued to be the life member and executive member of Adarsh Kanya Intermediate College, Bazpur and attended its meetings held from time to time.

Shri Dwivedi is a founder member of Hriday Nath Kunzuru Memorial Seva Samiti which is registered under Society Registration act 1960. Hriday Nath Kunzuru Memorial Seva Samiti is undertaking various schemes for the betterment of the educationally backward communities of the region. The Hriday Nath Kunzuru Memorial Seva Samiti is running a Junior High School and Crèches Centres and Condense Course for the drop out girls.

The Nyass is maintaining an Ayurvedic dispensary and a public library at Bazpur, Udham Singh Ngar. On the occasion of shared purnima a Medicinal kheer distribution camp was organized for the asthma patient every year.

Shri Dwivedi was re-elected the Council Member of the Bhartiya Adim Jati Sevak Sangh for a tenure of three years. He attended the council meetings held from time to time at New Delhi.

Shri Dwivedi monitored the maintenance of 74 Creche Centres under the banner of B.A.J.S.S. by establishing a branch at Bazpur.

Keeping in view the ideals of Lord Hanuman like parambhakti, paramveerta, paramparakram, parambrahmcharya, paramjitendriya, kushagra buddhi, param gynai etc. (which is beneficiary for the welfare of man and mankind) Shri Dwivedi founded a Shri Siddh Hanuman Mandir Trust and constructed a Temple of Lord Hanuman with the help of donations from the locals. The trust made a Fixed Deposit of Rs. Three Lakhs for its due maintenance.

BAZPUR UTTRAKHAND VAARTA (Fortnightly)

Shri Dwivedi launched a fortnightly newspaper as its founder from Bazpur. 'Bazpur Uttarakhand Vaarta' is registered under Govt. of India newspaper registration number "UTTHIN 1487/35/1/2008-TC".

The following schemes were managed by the Servants of India Society, the day to day management was looked after by the project superintendent and controlled by Shri P. K. Dwivedi through his office at Bazpur.

HOSTEL FOR TRIBAL BOYS

The buxa boys hostel bazpur has big role in the development of the tribal students around the region. The hostel was inaugurated by Mr. N. D. Tiwari the then Finance Minister (Govt. of U.P.) in May 1970, its establishment was backed by the personal request of Shri Tiwari who is solely responsible for bringing Servants of India Society to Tarai region. Since then the hostel has been a prime peripheral in education gaining of the tribal students. It has helped in fostering their way to success in an all round manner, which is expressly prayed by the number of successful alumai of the hostel. Some of our best alumnae are:

(English), Hindu College, Moradabad; presently Member U.P. Madhyamik Sikshak Chayan Board, Alld; (7) Shri Prahald Rana, Probation Officer, Oriental Bank of Commerce; (8) Shri Moosa Ram Rana, Tehsildar, Jhansi, U.P.; (9) Shri Mahadev Singh, Cane Inspector, Rampur, U.P.; (10) Shri Purmal Singh, Manager, Punjab National Bank, Barabank, U.P.

Apart from this as well there have been a numerous students who are serving the nation holding various posts such as Engineering, Officers, Clerks, and Teachers etc. in various departments of the Utrakhand Govt.

Servants of Indian Society has been running four Hostels for Tribal Boys in various Districts and states with the financial help of Ministry of Tribal Affaris, New Delhi. The hostels provide fooding lodging, reading-writing and playing material free of cost of the inmates along with three sets of uniform. To provide medical facility to the inmates a qualified Part Time Doctor has been appointed who regularly visits and prescribes the required medicines as per the need. The details are given below:-

ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOLS FOR TRIBAL GIRLS:

Keeping in view the necessity of literacy in Tribal Community Shri Dwivedi started two Ashram Type Schools under the banner of The Servants of India Society, Pune - 4 which are financed by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi.

The Ashram Type School is a residential school where fooding, lodging, clothing, sports materialand medicine etc. are provided free of cost to the inmates. A part time Doctor is also appointed for the purpose of medical supervision.

But it is to be noted that the interest of the students has decreased in these type of schools in the past two years. The reason remains clear that the govt., is providing attractive facilities like mid-day meal, compulsory scholar ships, free of cost books etc. in their own villages through the Sarva Siksha Abhiyaan.

I encouraged several organizations to adopt water harvesting mechanism in view of several temperatures. Sometimes I myself swung into action and got the water harvesting system installed in some houses; while advising the need for water storage and further tried my best to create awareness among the masses through social organizations. One among them is fixing Totiyas to public taps to avoid water spilling and also arranged for water through taken for the poor and deprived classes of the society including homeless dwellers.

Likewise, I arranged for chairs tables and other furniture for the students in the classrooms of some schools. I donated furniture for Noorani Education Society's school for the use of poor students and further arranged a drinking water drum for the staff and students. Furthermore, I donated 3 computers and made provision for computer classroom and expert teachers were being given to impart training to these students. This centre is imparting training to 260 students daily. I conducted awareness programmes on cleanliness there by spreading the message that cleanliness leads to better environment, at other educational institutions as well.

I undertook plantation drives and assigned the job of its care and maintenance to some groups, to keep environmental balance. I also conducted awareness programmes in collaboration with Municipal Corporation as to how to overcome the issues pertaining to choking of drainage systems especially during rainy season advocating minimum dependence on governmental agencies.

I shall take up similar such social activities involving citizens in the state of chattisgarh.

SHRI SAGAR KALE

As a life member of the Maharashtra Girls Education Society (Hzurpaga) Pune. He attended all the meetings of the Society as & when invited. He also actively participated in the organization of an Educational Trip of the Society.

During the year under report, he through the Sagar Shikshan Mandal, organized Education Competitions, Women's meetings in Ambegaon of Katraj Area. He tried to Create Awareness among the people there on the question of unmarried mothers.

Owing to the Alchoholism and unemployment among the Youth. He tried to train them in self employment by organizing the meetings of the youth.

The Most historic and memorable event in the long history of G.C. Home since its inception on 15th March, 1945 occurred during this year by the visit of the incumbent President of SIS Sri A. N. Misra, Vice President Sri Rama Kanta Lenka, Secretary Sri M.D. Deshmukh and the senior member Sri Gangadhar Sahoo of Servants of India Society on 1st September 2008 when they were pleased to inaugurate the reconstructed Kitchen and Dining Hall building of our Gc. Home which was named as Kunju Hall. The inaugural function was well attended by the Project Director DRDA Sri T. Baburao Naidu and the local public representatives like the President, Local Mandal Parishat Smt. P. Sarada, Member, Zilla Parishat Sri Ch. Rama Rao, and Sarpuch Smt. V. Rajasri and several other important citizens. In the meeting, philanthropic people like Sri Oruganti Eswara Rao a local entrepreneur donated a sum of Rs. 10,000/- to Gc. Home on the occasion, Smt. The consensus of the meeting was that more such philanthropic people from the locality should be effectively motivated to be empanelled as recurring donors so that the services could be extended to more children to the optimum capacity of the Home and the Home should ultimately grow into an ideal centre for integrated services to the needy and neglected children in the area and develop the infrastructure of the Home into a model centre, while focusing greater attention on the development of Children academically, physically while inculcating the qualities like discipline, character and patriotism in the children.

Sarvasri Chintu Rama Rao, Member, Zilla Parishat and Sri B. Ramesh an industrialist from Kotabommali together hosted a magnificent dinner to all the guests who attended the meeting. Shri K. Bodenna a major donor for the reconstruction of Kunzru Hall who donated Rs. 60,000/- was fittingly honoured on the occasion. The distinguished guests

from SIS gave inspiring messages appreciating the local efforts to improve the G.C. Home. A pledge was taken by some of the local elders who attended the meeting that efforts would be further mounted to make our G.C. Home a model centre for child development in the area.

A local management committee has been constituted to monitor the efforts in the G.C. Home to achieve the objectives for the integrated growth of the needy and neglected children. The Committee is evincing keen interest in the Home, which is a healthy beginning for broadening the involvement of the local public more effectively in the efforts of the home.

On behalf of all the office bearers and members of the newly constituted local management committee when a request was made the local Legislator Sri D. Krishnadas, he immediately responded positively by issuing a letter to the concerned authorities to utilize a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- for the establishment of a mini water supply scheme in the premises of G.C. Home, which is to be grounded soon. Besides, efforts are now on to involve all the members effectively in the development efforts to the home. The Constitution of this Committee was approved by the President of SIS during his visit.

It should be a matter of interest to all the well-wishers of the Home to note that Ms. Avanthika Tankala, now a school student in U.S.A. happened to visit the G.C. Home with her parents Smt. Sudha and Sri Kanishka Tankala recently and she collected the basic information about G.C. Home and the inmates collecting some photographs made a presentation in her school in USA and some of her co-students responded by donating collectively a sum of Rs. 2,323/- from their pocket money. She sent the money along with their good wishes to the inmates in the G.C. Home. She is interestingly the daughter of Sri Kanishka Tankala who is already an empanelled recurring donor of G.C. Home. We very much wish for a very bright future for Avanthika and her friends and we hope that there could be more such initiatives like that of Avanthika. The local Lions Club of Narasmapeta sponsored a medical check up for the inmates on 22nd March, 2009, and some medicines were distributed to the children.

The inmates of G.C. Home are now 13. Their nutritional status is continuously monitored. A special teacher will be recruited this year who would be entrusted with their academic progress. Special facilities are being provided for sports.

The number of inmates would be increased at least to 20 this year. The infrastructure needs will receive continuous attention. We are getting a master plan ready for the total development of G.C. Home. It is indeed a unique happening with our Home this year that the esteemed President and other from Servants of India Society are pleased with the efforts being locally made here and they have released a special grant of Rs. 50,000/- this year and we hope this will turn out to be a recurring grant on annual basis from Servants of India Society. We particularly place on record our sincere thank to the donors for their munificent donations but for which G.C. Home could not have been what it is today. Please visit G.C. Home unfailingly when you visit these parts, since the local management and the inmates look forward to greet you with gratitude and warmth.

An action plan is being prepared to establish a full scale children park as a part of D.C. Home. As usual D.C. Home's financial accounts are audited on annual basis. We herewith furnish the following documents for your notice.

GOVERNMENT OF INDIA SCHEMES

The following Schemes were being run by the Society in Orissa, U. P. and Uttarakhand States which were funded by the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and Ministry of Tribal Affairs.

Schemes of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment

U. P. State (Sonebhadra District)

- 1. Primary Schools (Ten):** Ten Primary Schools were run by the Society which were located in the Sonebhadra district. These schools were financed by the Union Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (SCD-Division). All these Schools are duly recognized by the U. P. Education Department and are regularly inspected by the concerned Authorities. 693 students were reading in these schools out of them 634 children were SCs, 36 BCs and 23 OCs. Out of total children 421 were boys and 272 were girls. There were 128 students in Class – I, 137 students in Class – II, 152 students in Class – III, 131 students in Class – IV and 145 students in Class – V.
- 2. Ashram School, Siltham:** The Ashram provides free residential accommodation, food, clothing oil and soap, reading and writing materials to 100 SC students. Out of these 100 SC students 16 were reading in Class – VI, 18 in Class – VII, 21 in Class – VIII, 25 in Class IX and 20 in Class – X in the Adiyasi Inter College, Siltham, run by the Society. Thus, this has been functioning as a Hostel for SC Boys from its very inception but it is named as Ashram School because the Govt. of India (Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment) has been sanctioning the scheme with this name.
- 3. Girl's Ashram School, Khaliyari:** The Ashram provides free residential accommodation, food, clothing, oil and soap, reading and writing materials to 50 SC girls out of whom 07 students were

reading in Class – I, 06 in Class-II, 18 in Class-III, 12 in Class-IV and 07 in Class V in the Primary School attached with the Ashram.

- 4. SC Boys Hostel, Ghuwas:** The Hostel provides free residential accommodation, food, clothing, oil and soaps, reading and writing materials to 50 SC students of whom 19 were reading in Class-I, 12 in Class-II, 09 in Class – III, 06 in Class – IV and 04 in Class-V in the Primary School, Ghuwas run by the Society.
- 5. Women Welfare Centres (Five):** These five Women’s Welfare Centres were located in the Village Bidar, Mahuariya, Supachuwan, and Kudari in Dudhi Tahesil and in Village Barhaulti in the Robertsganj Tahesil of Sonebhadra district. Training in Tailoring, embriodory and Knitting by hand were being provided through these Centres to 157 women attending these Centre.

U. P. State (Lakhimpurkheri District)

- 1. Balika Ashram Type School at Paliakalan:** With the financial assistance from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, Balika Ashram Type residential School was maintained by the Society at Paliakalan in Lakhimpur Kheri district for educational advancement of girls belonging to SC community. During the Sesslion 2007-2008 the total number of the beneficiaries was 101. The Ashram School provided food, lodging, clothing, books and stationary and medical facilities to the inmates free of cost. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the School was Rs. 9,51,266.50 during the year under report.

U. P. State (Mirzapur District)

- 1. Ashram Type School, Khantra:** The Society maintained an Ashram Type School at Khantra in Mirzapur district which was

funded by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India. The Ashram provided food, lodging, clothing and reading writing materials free of cost to 60 SC Students. The total expenditure incurred on the maintenance of the School was Rs. 5,71,891.40 during the year under report.

Drissa State (Rayagada District)

- 1. Residential Hostel for SCs (Thakkar Bapa Ashram):** The Rayagada Centre of the Society maintained a residential hostel for SC Students popularly known as Thakkar Bapa Ashram. The Ashram provided free boarding, lodging, educational facilities to 100 SC Students. The Students were provided with necessary reading writing materials and intensive coaching to improve their standard of education. Facilities like indoor and outdoor game, oil and soap, uniforms and free medical assistance were also supplied to them. A group of students visited Puri, Konark in an educational excursion. The expenditure incurred on the maintenance of the Ashram was Rs. 8,58,463.00 for the year under report.

Schemes of Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India

U. P. State (Balarampur District)

- 1. Thar Jan Jati Boys' Hostel, Tulsipur:** The Society maintained a hostel for Tharu Janjati Boys at Tulsipur for educational advancement of Tharu ST Communities with the financial aid from the Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The hostel provided lodging, boarding, clothing, reading and writing materials, medical aid to the inmates free of Cost. There were 50 inmates in the hostel out of them 4 were in Class – VI, 4 in Class- VII, 4 in Class VIII, 10 in Class – IX, 12 in Class – X, 8 in Class- XI and 8 inmates in Class – XII.

- 2. Tharu Janjati Boys' Hostel, Pachperwa:** The Society maintained a hostel for Tharu Janjati at Pachperwa in Balarampur district with the financial aid from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. The hostel provided free lodging, boarding, reading writing materials, medical aid, Uniforms to 40 Tharu ST inmates out of them 3 were in Class – VII, 1 in Class – VIII, 10 in Class – IX, 3 in Class- X, 11 in Class – XI, 12 in Class – XII.

- 3. Tharu Janjati Boys' Hostel, Chandanchowki (Lakhimpur Kheri district):** The Society maintained a hostel for 40 Tharu Janjati Boys at Chandanchowki in Lakhimpur – Kheri district for educational development of Tharu Communities. The hostel provided free boarding, lodging, reading writing materials, Uniforms, medical aid to the inmates free of Cost. This project was financed by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India. Out of the total 40 ST inmates, 16 were in Class – VI, 11 in Class – VII and 13 in Class – VIII.

- 4. Balika Ashram Type School (ATS) at Chandanchowki (Lakhimpur Kheri district):** The Society runs a Balika Ashram Type School at Chandanchowki with the financial aid from the Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs for educational development of Tribal girls. The inmates of the ATS are provided with food, lodging, clothing, bedding, reading writing materials free of Cost. There were 81 Tharu ST girls in the ATS out of them 19 were in Class – I, 17 were in Class – II, 17 in Class – III, 16 in Class – IV and 12 in Class-V. The ATS has got the basic recognition from Basic Sikhsya Parishad, U. P.

Uttarakhand State (Udham Sing Nagar District)

- 1. Buxa Boys Hostel, Bazpur:** The Society maintains a hostel for Buxa preemptive tribe boys at Bazpur in Udham Sing Nagar district with the financial aid from Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The hostel provides free food, lodging, Uniforms, reading writing

materials, medical aid to 90 ST inmates out of them 6 are reading in Class – VI, 6 in Class – VII, 31 in Class-IX, 13 in Class –X, 16 in Class-XI, 18 in Class-XII.

- 2. Balika Ashram Type School (ATS), Bazpur:** The Society maintains a Balika Ashram Type School (ATS) at Bazpur in Udhamasingh Nagar district with the financial aid from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. There are 92 ST girl inmates in the ATS and they are provided with free food, lodging, reading writing materials, Uniforms, free of Cost. Free medical aid is provided to them through a medical officer, who visits the ATS twice a week. The ATS has got the basic recognition from the basic Sikhya Parishad, Uttarakhand State. Out of total 92 ST girls, 14 are reading in Class – I, 22 in Class-II, 19 in Class-III, 20 in Class-IV and 17 in Class-V.

Drissa State (Rayagada District)

- 1. Educational Complex for ST girls:** The Society is managing an Educational Complex for Tribal girls at Village Halua in Rayagada district with 100% financial aid from the Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs. The Educational Complex is running with a view to improving the tribal female literacy. The Complex provides the facilities of free boarding, lodging, Uniforms, Cosmetics, reading writing materials, medical aids and medical Checkups to 50 ST girls. It has the facility for reading of ST girls upto Class – V. In Order to motivate the parents to send their daughters to the complex an incentive of Rs. 50/- per month per parent was paid. All girl students of the Complex went on an educational tour and visited Sri Jagannath Temple, Puri Sea beach, Konark, Nandan Kanan Zoo, Planetorium and Lingaraj Temple at Bhubaneswar. The total expenditure incurred on the project was Rs. 4,56,235/- for the year under report.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 80G (5)(VI) OF THE INCOME TAX ACT, 1961
Read With Rule 11AA of The Income Tax Rules, 1962

Donation made to the Society / Institution, namely, Servants of India Society, 846, Shivajinagar, Pune - 411 004, will be eligible for the benefit of deduction under section 80G of the Income Tax Act, 1961, in the hands of the donors subject to the limits and conditions prescribed therein.

2. The above approval shall remain valid for the Assessment Years 2008-2008 to 2010-2011 (i.e. for 01-04.2007 to 31-03-2010) subject to adherence to the following:

- (i) Receipts issued to the donors should bear the Reference Number and date of this order.
- (ii) The Return of Income accompanied by Statement of Accounts and Income & Expenditure Account, Balance Sheet of the above Trust / Society should be submitted to the concerned Assessing Officer within the specified due dates laid down in the Income-tax Act.

3. If further renewal is required, an application in Form No. 10G should be made to this office by the Society / Institution along with:

- I) Statements of accounts for the last 3 years,
- II) Copies of acknowledgments of Returns of Income,
- III) Certificate under Section 13(1)(c) of the Income-tax Act, 1961, signed by all the Trustees, and,
- IV) List of donors of amounts of Rs. 500/- and above for the last 3 years.

3.1 The assessee Society / Institution is advised to incorporate the following clauses in the Trust Deed / Constitution / By-Laws / Memorandum of Association and submit the revised deed by 31.03.2008.

- a) "Any amendment to the Trust Deed / Constitution / By-laws / Memorandum of Association will be carried out only with the approval of the Competent Income Tax authority, i.e., the Commissioner of Income Tax – III, Pune".
- b) "In the event of dissolution, the surplus assets / funds of the Trust / Institution, as would remain after discharging all liabilities, shall be transferred to any other public charitable institution having similar objects and also registered w/s 12A of the Income-tax Act, 1961; and the same shall not under any circumstances be distributed among the members".

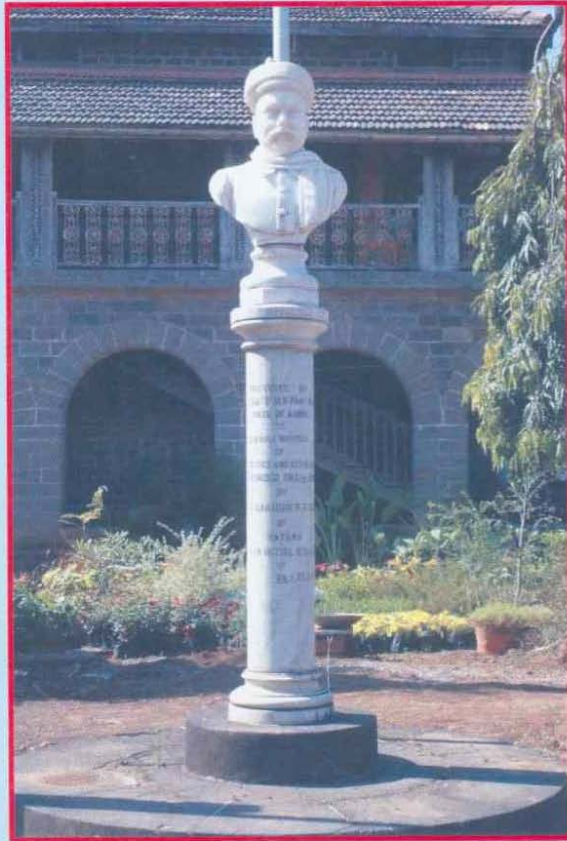

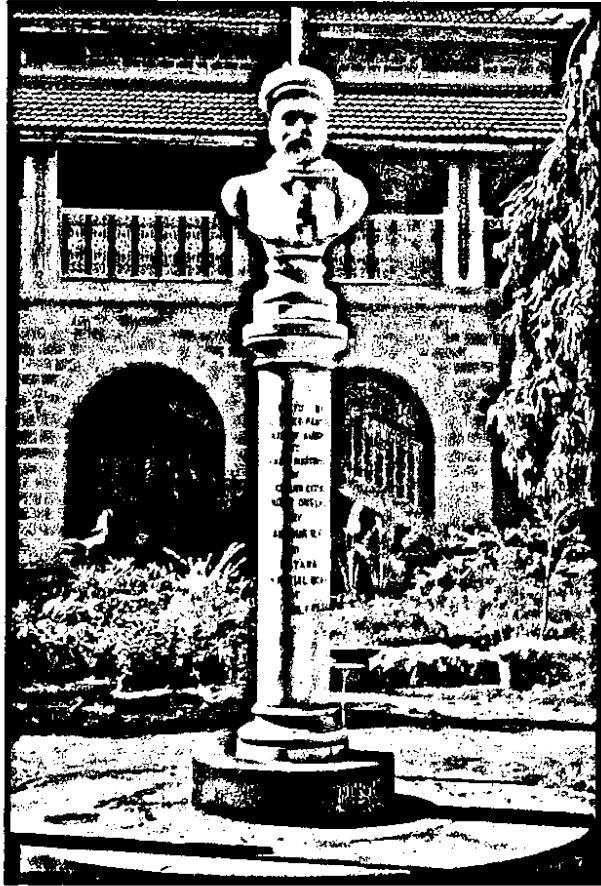
