APPENDIX II.

Census of Indians on the High Seas.

An attempt was made at this census to enumerate Indians on the high seas through the agency of the port authorities at Aden, Bombay, Calcutta, Karachi, Madras and Rangoon. High Seas schedules were issued for some six months beforehand to all Masters of vessels shipping Indian crews for a period which was likely to cover the date of the Census of India, viz., the 26th February 1931, to be returned by the Master from the first port of call after that date. All vessels which returned high seas schedules at the Port of Madras were found on examination to have been in Indian waters on the night of the census and were consequently treated as normal port or sea-going population and included in the Presidency totals. The population returned at the ports of Aden, Karachi and Bombay was included in the ordinary provincial population of Bombay and Aden, but such of the figures as were separately available have been again included here with the returns received in Rangoon and Calcutta, which have been tabulated separately in forms corresponding with certain tables of the Imperial series, and appear in this appendix arranged as follows:—
