SCHEME OF ASSISTANCE TO VOLUNTARY AGENCIES WORKING IN THE FIELD OF ADULT EDUCATION

Objectives

Elimination of mass illiteracy from the country has been one of the major concerns of the Government of India since Independence. This objective has been sought to be achieved through (a) Universalisation of elementary education, and (b) Promotion of adult education for those who missed the schooling or dropped out from the school system in early stages. Adult education as a component of elementary education forms part of the Minimum Needs Programme in the Sixth Five Year Plan. The "New 20-Point Economic Programme" announced by Prime Minister lays emphasis on involvement of students and voluntary agencies in programmes for the removal of Adult illiteracy.

The Government of India (Ministry of Education and Culture) has formulated a "Scheme of Assistance to Voluntary Agencies Working in the Field of Adult Education" in order to provide facilities for fuller involvement of Voluntary Agencies in the programme. This Scheme aims at: (a) fuller participation by voluntary agencies working at present in the field of Adult Education; and (b) involvement in adult education activities of voluntary agencies not working at present in this field but having the potentiality to do so. Participation of voluntary agencies is visualised mainly in:

- (i) Planning and implementation of field programmes, including post-literacy and follow-up activities; and
- (ii) resource development, particularly production of teaching/learning materials, training, research and evaluation, etc.

Eligibility

- (a) Registered voluntary societies, public trusts and non-prefit making companies would be eligible for assistance under this scheme. Ordinarily, agencies which are not legal entities would not be eligible. However, even agencies which are not legal entities may be considered for assistance provided the Collector/Deputy Commissioner certifies regarding the practical difficulties owing to which they could not be registered and regarding the bonafides of such organisations.
 - (b) In order to be eligible for financial assistance under this Scheme an agency should
 - (i) have a proper Constitution or Memorandum & articles of association;
 - (ii) have a properly constituted managing body with its powers and duties clearly defined in the Constitution;
 - (iii) have completed one year of activity since registration as a society, public trust or a non-profit making company:
 - (iv) be in a position to secure the involvement, on voluntary basis, of knowledgeable persons for furtherance of its programmes;
 - (v) not be run for the profit of any individual or a body of individuals;
 - (vi) not discriminate against any person or group of persons on the ground of sex, religion, caste or creed:
 - (vii) not directly function for the furtherance of the interests of any political party;
 - (viii) not in any manner incite communal disharmony;
 - (ix) not proselytise; and
 - (x) eschew violence.
 - (c) The following categories are excluded from the eligibility:
 - (i) political parties and their mass organisations of workers, peasants and youth, etc.
 - (ii) All India cultural, religious and youth organisations.
 - (iii) Organisations set up by State Governments/U.T. Administrations including State Social Welfare Advisory Boards, Municipalities, Panchayati Raj Institutions, Government Corporations/Companies.

Activities for which Assistance may be Given

Assistance under this Scheme may be provided for any activity planned for the furtherance of the objectives of this Scheme. Priority in approval of activities would be given to the following:—

- —Programmes of functional literacy accompanied by developmental action proposed to be organised for well-defined clientele; agencies working for women, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes would receive a special preference.
- -Post-literacy and follow-up work including organisation of library services, production and dissemination of literature for neoliterates.
- -Resource development activities such as production of learning/teaching materials and training of adult education functionaries.
- -Innovation and experimentation, research and evaluation.
- -Holding of seminars, conferences, etc. and issue of publications for creation of an environment favourable to the eradication of adult illiteracy and involvement of various agencies for furtherance of this Scheme.

Pattern of Assistance

(a) The eligible institutions may be given financial assistance according to the following pattern;

Administrative costs -75 per cent

Programme costs —100 per cent

For the purpose of this paragraph, administrative costs would include expenditure to be incurred at the headquarters office, i.e., on salaries of staff including project officer, clerks and peon, and office expenditure. Programme costs would include expenditure to be incurred on supervisory staff and instructors, transportation, instructional arrangements, training programmes, development of prototype teaching/learning materials, etc.

In cases where there is ambiguity in regard to administrative and programme costs, the Grant-in-Aid Committee shall take a decision on merits of each case.

- (b) The financial pattern for 100, 60, and 30 centres given as Appendices* are approved patterns. The pattern indicated in (a) above will, however, not apply to grant-in-aid for (i) publication of journals, and (ii) holding of seminars and workshops; the grant-in-aid for these items would be limited to 50 per cent for (i) and 75 per cent for (ii) of the approved expenditure.
- (c) Where construction of building is considered necessary for the furtherance of the objectives of the Scheme, assistance may be given for this purpose subject to its being limited to 50 per cent of the construction cost of the building or Rs. 1 lakh., whichever is less.
 - (d) No voluntary agency would, ordinarily, be sanctioned a grant of more than Rs. 10 lakhs per year.
- (e) If an agency is already receiving or is expecting to receive, grant from some other official source for a project for which application is made under this Scheme, the assistance under this Scheme will normally be made after taking into consideration the grant received, or likely to be received, from such other official source. It should also ordinarily be ensured that an agency already in receipt of a recurring grant from any other official source. Central or State, should not transfer any part of that liability to a grant to be sanctioned under this Scheme.

 The Procedure

(a) Application

A voluntary agency eligible to receive assistance under this Scheme should make application on the form appended hereto (APPENDIX 11**). The application should be made through the State Government U.T. Administration and the latter should give its views/regarding agency's eligibility, suitability of the activity to be undertaken, capacity of the agency to implement the proposed programme etc. and non-involvement of the agency in any political or communal activity. It shall not be necessary for all India voluntary agencies having experience in the field of Adult Education to route their proposals for organising seminars, conferences, publication training programmes, etc. through the State Government. However, if an all-India voluntary agency proposes taking an hild programmes, the application would have to be routed through the State Government concerned.

^{**}Appendix.I should invariably be filled up by the voluntary agency and should be appended at the top of application form. State Government/U.T. Administrations may also check that the applications are complete in all respects and are duly supported by documents shown in Check List.

(b) Grant-in-Aid Committee

The applications for grant-in-aid would ordinarily be examined by a Grant-in-Aid Committee to be appointed by the Ministry. Wherever it is considered necessary, a representative of the agency making application may be invited to discuss the proposal with the Committee.

(c) Duration

Assistance may be sought for such duration as the applicant agency may consider appropriate. Indication in regard to the period for which grant has been approved would normally be given in the letter of sanction.

(d) Size of the Project

Projects of less than 30 centres are not considered except in the case of voluntary agencies taking up programmes for women only or in difficult terrains e.g. hills, desert areas, etc. in which case the minmum number may be reduced to 15.

(e) Area of Work

The project should be run in a compact and contiguous area. In the case of programme run in the rural areas, it should relate the project with a Community Development (CD) block area. In case of two agencies running projects in one Community Development block, their respective areas should be clearly demarcated.

(f) Reallocation of Savings

Savings in honorarium to instructors cannot be used for any other purpose. However, savings under the following items of programme cost can be reallocated to each other:

- -Basic learning materials
- -Teaching materials
- --Equipment
- -Kerosene/Electricity
- -Contingent Expenditure

Savings in supervision and administrative expenditure can be used for training if the provision for training is insufficient. Savings under various items of administrative expenditure may be used for any other items under administration cost. Allocation of non-recurring expenditure can be increased out of other savings only where a type-writer is purchased for a project of 100 centres and the cost of typewriter exceeds Rs. 4.000/-. In doing so, prior approval of the Ministry will be necessary.

(g) Carry over of Funds

Unspent balance in a particular year can be carried over to the following financial year in case a continuation project is sanctioned to the voluntary agency. The voluntary agency is required to refund the unspent balance immediately on receipt of the intimation from the sanctioning authority in case, no continuation project is sanctioned to the voluntary agency.

(h) Commencement and closing of the Project

The project should be commenced only after the receipt of the sanction letter from the sanctioning authority. It should not be commenced earlier in anticipation of the sanction. First two months can be used for the preparation of the project including selection of the centres, training of the supervisors/instructors and the remaining 10 months for running the adult education centres. The voluntary agency should inform the dates of the commencement and closing of the centres to the sanctioning authority.

Release of Grant

On approval of the project, grant shall be released to the agency on annual basis in two instalments. First instalment will be released immediately after the project is approved and the sanction letter is issued. For claiming second instalment, the agency will make a proposal to the State Government after the agency concerned has utilised 75% of the first instalment. The agency would be expected to attach a progress report (Appendix-X) and an unaudited statement of expenditure showing 75% utilisation of first instalment. Second instalment will be released only on receipt of a specific recommendation of the State Government/U.T. administration to the effect that the project for which the instalment is sought is running satisfactorily in the approved area and that there is justification for the release of further grants.

Release of First instalment in respect of Continuing Projects

First instalment of the Continuing Project will be released on receipt of following documents/information

(i) Recommendations of the State Government that the agency has implemented the first project satisfactorily.

- (ii) A statement of receipt and expenditure for the first project. No utilisation certificate will be required if the release of grant will fall within 15 months from the date of issuance of first sanction letter. In case it exceeds this period, the Agency must furnish utilisation certificate in respect of grant released 15 months earlier or if possible utilisation certificate and audited statement of accounts for the entire project.
- (iii) Before the release of second instalment of the Continuing project, voluntary agency will have to submit audited accounts and utilisation certificate for the entire grant released for the first project.
- (iv) The agency shall ensure submission of timely reports in respect of its activities.

Disbursement of Funds

Grant payable to a voluntary agency would be remitted to it by a Demand Draft/Cheque drawn in its favour by the Ministry of Education and Culture. The disbursement of the Demand Draft/Cheque would be made by the Collector or the Chief Executive Officer, as may be recommended by the State Government, of the District where the voluntary agency has its registered office/headquarters, Provided:—

- (i) That the State Government may designate any other officer for such disbursement.
- (ii) That if a State Government so desires, the Ministry would make direct disbursement of the Demand Draft/ Cheque to the voluntary agencies of the State concerned.
- (iii) Disbursement to all-India voluntary agencies would be made directly by the Ministry in respect of activities the application of which is not required to be made through the State Government.

Building Grant

Assistance approved for construction of building would ordinarily be required to be utilised within a period of two years from the date of the first instalment. The first instalment will be released immediately after issue of sanction and the grant would be made in three instalments to be released as follows:—

- -- 50 per cent to be released immediately after issue of the letter of sanction;
- 40 per cent to be released upon receipt of intimation regarding utilisation of the first instalment; and
- -- 10 per cent to be released after receipt of certificate of completion; utilisation of earlier instalments and requirement of the balance from the Executive Engineer of the State PWD having jurisdiction.

Audited statements in respect of a building grant should be received within six months after release of the third instalment.

Monitoring

All Instructors of Adult Education Centres are expected to send initial report (IIR) (APPENDIX-VII) and monthly report (IMR) (APPENDIX-VIII). Initial report of the Project (IPR) (APPENDIX-IX) and Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) (APPENDIX-X) should invariably be sent to the concerned D.A.E.O. IPR should be sent to the D.A.E.O. as soon as possible after the commencement of the project, while QPR should be sent to him at the end of March, June, September, and December. Annual Project Report (APR) (Appendix XI) should be sent to DAEO with a copy to the Ministry after the project is over. It is essential that all voluntary agencies comply with this system of reporting.

Follow-up and Post-literacy Programmes

The responsibility for organisation of the Follow-up and Post-literacy programmes rests with the project agency. All agencies which complete the first cycle of the programme of about 10 months literacy and are authorised to take up Post-literacy project will be considered for assistance for Post-literacy and Follow-up activities for the persons who had participated in the first cycle. Grants for organising these activities will be provided according to suggested pattern and at the same rate as per other field programmes of Adult Education, viz. 100% of the programme cost and 75% of the Administrative cost. Application seeking assistance for these activities will be made on a plain sheet of paper according to one of the approved models indicating the details of the programme along with financial estimates. Ordinarily each voluntary organisation during the 1st phase of one ten month project, should carry on with the 2nd phase of follow-up and post-literacy programme relating to another adult literacy project completed earlier. Therefore, if any voluntary agency does not come forward to undertake this programme before the end of the first phase, their request for continuation of the earlier project may not be acceded to. All proposals for post-literacy programmes should be routed through the State Government/U.T. Administration at the end of first phase projects.

Operational Models

It would not be realistic to indicate a common system of Post-literacy and Follow-up programmes for all parts of the country. Six approved models have been appended hereto. Model-III (Appendix-XII) may be followed by voluntary agencies which will run a project of 100 Adult Education Centres. Model-III (Appendix-XIII) or Model-II (Appendix-XIV) may be followed by voluntary agencies which will run a project of 60 centres, according to their suitablity. Model-I (Appendix-XVI) or Model-II (Appendix-XVII) may be

followed by voluntary agencies which will run a project of 30 centres. Besides, agencies desirous of undertaking innovative Post-literacy and Follow-up programmes can formulate their own proposals for consideration of the Ministry. However, they are advised to keep in view the need for economy and practicability.

Conditions of Grant

- (i) The grant receiving agency will be required to execute a bond on a prescribed form with two sureties.
- (ii) An agency in receipt of financial assistance shall be open to inspection by an officer of the Union Ministry of Education and Culture or the State Education or concerned Department.
- (iii) The Accounts of the Project shall be maintained properly and separately and submitted as and when required. They shall always be open to check by an officer deputed by the Government of India or the State Government. They shall also be open to test check by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India at his discretion.
- (iv) The statement of receipts and expenditure (item-wise) together with utilisation certificates in the prescribed form duly countersigned by the Chartered Accountants are required to be furnished immediately on conclusion of the project or after expiry of the duration for which grant is approved, but not later than 15 months from the date of sanction of grant.
- (v) The agency shall maintain a record of all assets acquired wholly or substantially out of the Government grant and maintain a register of such assets in the prescribed proforma (Form GFR 19). Such assets shall not be disposed of, encumbered or utilised for purposes other than those for which the grant was given without prior sanction of the Government of India. Should the agency cease to exist at any time, such properties shall revert to the Government of India.
- (vi) In case of a building grant exceeding Rs. 10,000/- no portion of grant shall be paid until the controlling authority of the agency has executed and registered a bond in the approved form, securing to the Government of India a prior lien on the building for the recovery of the amount paid as grant alongwith all monetary and other benefits which the agency might have received or derived in the event of the building ceasing to be applied to the purpose for which the grant was given.
- (vii) When the State Government/Government of India have reasons to believe that the sanctioned money is not being utilised for approved purposes the payment of grant may be stopped and the earlier grants recovered.
- (viii) The institution must exercise reasonable economy in the working of the approved project, especially in respect of buildings.
- (ix) The grantee agency shall furnish to the Ministry of Education and Culture progress reports as may be prescribed.
 - (x) Such other conditions as may be imposed by the Government of India, from time to time.
- (xi) The decision of the Secretary to the Government of India in the Ministry af Education and Culture on the question whether there has been breach or violation of any of the terms and conditions mentioned in the sanction letter shall be final and binding on the grantee.
