Sir,

I have the honour to submit the Annual Report of the Department of Land Records for the year ending 31st July 1939.

CHAPTER I.

PREFATORY.

1. The charge of the Department was held by me as Director of Land Records throughout the year under report. The Director of Land Records is also the Inspector General of Registration and the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages. He is also the controlling officer for the Government Photozinc Press, Poona.

2. *Superintendents of Land Records.*—Under orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2844/33, dated 16th December 1935, the districts in the three divisions were redistributed into three Circles. The Northern and Southern Circles with headquarters at Ahmedabad and Belgaum respectively are under the Superintendents of Land Records, Northern Circle and Southern Circle. The Central Circle with its headquarters at Poona is immediately under the control of the Director of Land Records, who is also the Superintendent for the Central Circle.

In the Northern Circle, Mr. V. Isvaran, I.C.S., held charge from 1st August 1938 to 6th November 1938, Mr. A. L. Dias, I.C.S., from 7th November 1938 to 9th February 1939 and from 10th May 1939 to 31st July 1939, and Mr. V. N. Konnur from 10th February 1939 to 9th May 1939. The charge of the Southern Circle was held by Mr. N. S. Kulkarni throughout the year.

3. *Touring.*—The Director of Land Records toured in all the districts of the Province except Kanara for inspection of District Survey Offices and City Survey Offices, for testing the measurement

and classification work and for inspection of village records and Sub-Registrars' and District Registrars' offices. The total number of days devoted to touring was 152. The Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, toured for 223 days in all the nine districts. The Superintendent of Land Records, Southern Circle, toured for 175 days in all the seven districts.

The total number of field workers (including maintenance surveyors) was 164 in Northern Circle, 148 in Southern Circle and 69 in Central Circle. Of these the Superintendents of Land Records concerned tested the work of 129 men in Northern Circle, 121 men in Southern Circle and 51 in Central Circle.

CHAPTER II.

LAND RECORDS DEPARTMENT.

4. The functions of the Land Records Department are to provide the statistics necessary for sound administration in all matters connected with land, to reduce, simplify and cheapen litigation in the Revenue and Civil Courts, to provide a Record of Rights for the protection of all who hold interests in land and lastly to simplify and cheapen periodical settlement operations.

5. The main function of the Department is to maintain all survey and classification records up-to-date and for this purpose carry out field operations preliminary to the incorporation of changes in these records.

A complete Record of Rights and interests in land has been prepared for all unalienated and many alienated villages throughout the Province and steps are being taken to prepare it in the remaining alienated villages.

City surveys form an important part of Land Records.

6. The superior staff of the Land Records Department consists of a Director of Land Records, two Superintendents of Land Records and 19 District Inspectors of Land Records.

The subordinate staff of the Department is divided into three sections:—

- (a) the district staff of Circle Inspectors under the Collectors,
- (b) the Cadastral Survey staff (including the City Survey staff and the Pot-Hissa Survey staff) under the District Inspectors, and
- (c) the staff in District Survey offices, who keep all the survey records up-to-date.

The function of the officers of the Land Records Department in respect of Circle Inspectors' staff is to advise and assist the Revenue Officers who give the actual orders. All the other establishments are controlled by the Superintendents and supervised by the District Inspectors of Land Records.

7. *Training of Junior Civilians.*—In the Northern Circle Messrs. H. H. A. Whitworth, I.C.S., V. L. Gidwani, I.C.S., V. M. Joshi, I.C.S. and A. L. Lovatt, I.C.S. and in Southern Circle Messrs. B. P. Patil, I.C.S., W. N. Gallagher, I.C.S., L. G. Rajwade, I.C.S. and H. A. G. Acton, I.C.S. were trained in Survey and Settlement matters.

8. *District Survey Offices—Northern Circle.*—The Central Record Office, Ahmedabad, disposed of 2,007 cases involving 6,117 survey numbers as against 1818 cases involving 6,464 survey numbers leaving in arrears 421 cases involving 1,251 survey numbers as against 298 cases involving 809 survey numbers of the last year. The number of survey numbers corrected is less as compared with last year but it is due to the fact that larger number of cases involving less number of survey numbers were disposed of. The balance on hand has also increased owing to receipt of more work than could be disposed of.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records and from the sale of maps amounted to Rs. 3,477 as against Rs. 3,264 of the last year. The cost on account of pay of the copying clerks during the year was Rs. 1,379 and their earnings were Rs. 2,383. The copying staff consisted of one permanent Record Keeper, one temporary Utara Karkun and one candidate.

The District Survey Offices—Thana, Nasik, East Khandesh, West Khandesh and Bombay Suburban District—in the Northern Circle disposed of 1,005 cases involving 3,271 survey numbers as against 1,367 cases involving 3,961 survey numbers leaving in arrears 483 cases involving 1,459 survey numbers as against 238 cases involving 692 survey numbers of the last year. The Superintendent of Land Records is being asked to investigate the causes for the decrease in output.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from the survey records and the sale of maps in the District Survey Offices amounted to Rs. 3,147. The cost on account of pay of the copying clerks came to Rs. 1,618 while they earned Rs. 2,668. The copying staff consisted of three permanent and two temporary Utara Karkuns and a candidate. All the five District Survey Offices and the Central Record Office at Ahmedabad were inspected by the Superintendent of Land Records during the year.

9. *Central Circle.*—The District Survey Offices, Poona, Nagar and Kolaba, disposed of 820 correction cases involving 1,405 survey numbers and 4,633 hissas as against 743 cases involving 2,836 survey numbers and 3,909 hissas of the last year, leaving a balance of 339 cases involving 450 survey numbers and 4,065 hissas as against 531 cases involving 696 survey numbers and 4,548 hissas of the last year. The outturn is satisfactory.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records and sale of maps came to Rs. 5,352. The cost on account of the copying clerks came to Rs. 1,599 while they earned Rs. 4,663. The copying staff consisted of two permanent and two temporary Utara Karkuns.

10. *Southern Circle.*—The District Survey Offices disposed of 7,197 correction cases involving 6,221 survey numbers and 33,358 hissas as against 6,954 cases involving 5,558 survey numbers and 34,811 hissas of the previous year leaving in arrears 724 cases involving 605 survey numbers and 9,950 hissas as against 897 cases involving 648 survey numbers and 13,231 hissas. The output is satisfactory. The Superintendent of Land Records, Southern Circle, has inspected all the District Survey Offices in the year.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records amounted to Rs. 10,238 while the cost on account of the copying clerks was Rs. 5,286. The copying staff consists of 8 permanent and 6 temporary Utara Karkuns.

District Inspectors.

11. Statement IV shows the routine work done by these officers and the number of days spent on tour for inspection work are shown in column 4 of the statement.

12. *Northern Circle.*—The touring of the District Inspectors in Northern Circle considered from the quantity of test of measurement and classification work may be said to be adequate except in the case of District Inspectors of Surat and East Khandesh whose test of measurement work was inadequate in spite of the large number of touring days. The District Inspector, Surat, has since been reverted and the permanent District Inspector of Land Records, East Khandesh, has since retired. The crop and other inspection work done by the District Inspectors of Land Records is on the whole adequate except in the case of District Inspectors of Broach and Panch Mahals, Nasik and East Khandesh. The inspection of Record of Rights entries is poor in the districts of Broach and Panch Mahals and Nasik. The Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, has been requested to bring this to the notice of the District Inspectors and to see that adequate test of all kinds of work is taken by the District Inspectors.

13. *Central Circle.*—The touring of the District Inspectors in Central Circle judged from the quantity of test taken by them of the measurement and classification work may be considered as adequate except in the case of District Inspector of Land Records, Kolaba, but this is due partly to change of hands and other causes. The District Inspector of Land Record's attention is being drawn to this point and he has been asked to see that the prescribed percentage of test is worked up to in future. The crop inspection and test of entries in Record of Rights done by District Inspector, Nagar, cannot be said to be sufficient. The District Inspector explains that it is due to more days being devoted to special measurement works. He has been asked to take adequate test of all kinds of inspection work.

14. *Southern Circle.*—The touring of the District Inspectors in Southern Circle considered from the quantity of test taken by them of measurement and classification work may be said to be adequate in all the districts. The inspection of waste numbers by the District Inspectors of Satara and Kanara and the inspection of entries in Village Form VI and VII done by the District Inspectors of Sholapur, Satara and Ratnagiri is inadequate. The Superintendent of Land Records, Southern Circle, has been requested to instruct these District Inspectors to take adequate test of all kinds of inspection work.

15. All the District Inspectors of Land Records have done adequate inspection of the City Survey Offices in their charge.

Measurement work.

16. *Northern Circle.*—16 posts of temporary Cadastral Surveyors were made permanent under orders in Government Memorandum No. 535-B, Revenue Department, dated 25th May 1938. Thus 33 permanent and 1 temporary Cadastral Surveyor and 8 District Surveyors and 6 Field Party Surveyors were employed on the work throughout the year. 3 temporary Cadastral Surveyors and 11 Maintenance Surveyors also did this work for some period in the year. This staff measured 8233 new hissas and 4911 survey Nos. on private applications and 2615 survey Nos. on Government work. The cost on account of the staff was Rs. 45,252 while the fees earned (including estimated fees for Government work) came to Rs. 48,205.

17. *Central Circle.*—16 Cadastral Surveyors and 3 District Surveyors were employed throughout the year and 7 Maintenance Surveyors also did this work for some time in the year. This staff measured 122 new hissas and 1909 survey Nos. on private application and 2101 survey Nos. on Government work. The cost on account of the staff was Rs. 17,521 while the fees earned (including estimated cost for Government work) came to Rs. 17,341.

18. *Southern Circle.*—21 posts of temporary Cadastral Surveyors were made permanent under orders in Government Memorandum No. 535-B, Revenue Department, dated 25th May 1938. Thus there were 54 permanent Cadastral Surveyors and 6 District Surveyors who were employed on this work throughout the year. 5 Maintenance Surveyors also did this work for some months of the year. In all they measured 6261 new hissas, 7112 survey Nos. on private applications and 5944 survey Nos. on Government work. The cost of the establishment was Rs. 55,275 while the fees earned (including the estimated cost of Government work) came to Rs. 50,898.

The increase in expenditure on account of the staff over receipts in Southern Circle is due partly to the fact that most of the Cadastral Surveyors and District Surveyors have reached the maximum of their grade, and mainly to the fact that in Ratnagiri where a number of non-agricultural cases have to be surveyed on a specially reduced rate of Rs. 2 per each non-agricultural plot under orders in Government memorandum, Revenue Department,

No. 1472-B/33 I, dated 2nd March 1936. The question of increasing the present measurement fees in Ratnagiri District is postponed, under orders in Government Memorandum No. 1472-B/33 I, Revenue Department, dated 9th September 1939. The outturn of work is adequate in all the districts of the Province.

19. Statement II shows the outturn of measurement and classification work done in each district. In Northern Circle, the receipts of measurement cases is less and of classification cases more than the last year. The disposal is satisfactory. In Central Circle and Southern Circle the disposal compares favourably with the last year's disposal.

Circle Inspectors.

20. Statement I shows the work of Circle Inspectors.

The average number of days devoted to inspection work by the Circle Inspectors in Northern Circle and their output of work on the whole was adequate except in Kaira District where the inspection of waste survey Nos. which is important from the standpoint of Government cannot be said to be adequate.

In the Central Circle, the average number of days devoted to inspection work and the output of work is on the whole adequate.

In the Southern Circle, the average number of days devoted to inspection work is adequate in all the districts. The output of work on the whole is adequate except in Belgaum, Bijapur and Dharwar Districts where the inspection of waste survey Nos. is not adequate.

The defects noticed in the Circle Inspectors' work which came under inspection of the District Inspector of Land Records, Superintendents of Land Records and Director of Land Records are :—

- (a) Disagreement between the abstract of Village Form I and District Survey Office abstract.
- (b) Neglect in noting in pencil the hissas in village maps.
- (c) Neglect in preparing the new hissa statement.
- (d) Notices of mutations were not posted in the Chavdi and not served on the parties concerned.
- (e) Neglect in preparing Village Form VII-B correctly.
- (f) Village Form VIII-A was not properly maintained.

The omissions noted above were noticed generally in all the districts. The defects noted above in clause (a) were noticed particularly in Kaira, Broach, and Panchmahals, Surat, Bombay Suburban District, Nasik, Satara, Bijapur, Ratnagiri and Kanara. The defects noticed in clause (b) were particularly noticed in Broach and Panchmahals, Thana, Nasik and East Khandesh, those in (c) in Sholapur, Satara and Belgaum and those in (d) in Ahmedabad, Bombay Suburban District, Nasik, West Khandesh, Satara, Kanara and Belgaum. The defects noticed, in (e) in Ahmedabad, Broach and Panchmahals, Thana, Bombay District

and East Khandesh and those in (f) in Broach and Panchmahals, Bombay Suburban District, Nasik, East Khandesh, West Khandesh, Bijapur, Sholapur and Satara.

All these omissions have been brought to the notice of the revenue officers by the issue of inspection notes, but the compliance with the Memos is not reported to be satisfactory in Southern Circle. The Collectors and Frants are being requested to take up the question seriously with the Mamlatdars and see that the inspection notes are carefully and promptly complied with.

Sub-Divisional Officers' and Mamlatdars' test.

21. Statement III shows the inspection work of these officers. But as the figures given in the statement are not in themselves a criterion of the value of inspection work, Government in paragraph 2 of Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. P-62, dated 9th May 1931, have asked the Collectors to offer remarks on the quality of inspection work done by them. Accordingly all the Collectors, except the Collectors of Broach and Panchmahals, Bombay Suburban District, Satara and Sholapur have offered their remarks and most of them consider the outturn as adequate.

The Collectors of Belgaum, Ahmednagar, Ratnagiri, Kanara and East Khandesh have brought to the notice of the officers concerned the inadequacy in their inspection work.

Boundary Disputes.

22. The Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, was the British delegate for the settlement of boundary between the Baroda State and the British territory and he did this duty in addition to his own duties as Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle. During the year under report four meetings were held by the delegates. The details about the number of boundary dispute cases pending settlement on 1st August 1938, the number of cases decided during the year and those pending on 1st August 1939 are as under :—

Out of the four cases referred to the Director of Land Records, three cases were settled by the Director of Land Records and the Suba of the Baroda State and one case was referred to the Boundary Commissioner. The extension of the establishment is sanctioned up to the end of February 1940 as per Government Memorandum No. 325-B, Revenue Department, dated 21st February 1939, and it is expected that the 10 cases pending settlement will be disposed of by that time. The cost of the establishment during the year was Rs. 998-1-6, and the total cost since the commencement of the work comes to Rs. 1,15,088-4-3.

Measurement of Sub-Divisions.

23. Northern Circle.—There were two parties in Nasik, one in East Khandesh, and one in West Khandesh and one Pot Hissa Surveyor in Bombay Suburban District, all working under the control of the respective District Inspector of Land Records. This temporary staff of 40 Pot Hissa Surveyors under 4 Nimtandars in the 4 parties has in all measured 25,554 hissass during the year as detailed in the statement given at the end of the paragraph.

Central Circle.—Two parties in Poona and two parties in Ahmednagar of 16 and 18 Pot Hissa Measurers on an average each under a Nimtandar and 3 Pot Hissa Surveyors worked in the Poona, Ahmednagar and Kolaba districts respectively under the control of the District Inspector concerned. This temporary staff and 3 Field Party Surveyors who were detailed on the sub-division measurement work have in all measured 3,0925 hissass, as detailed in the statement given at the end of the paragraph, during the year.

Southern Circle.—Two parties of 10 measurers each under a Nimtandar worked in Satara District, one party of 5 under a Nimtandar worked in the Ratnagiri District, 5, 5, 2 and 1 Pot Hissa measurers worked in Sholapur, Belgaum, Bijapur and Kanara districts. All the above establishment worked under the control of the respective District Inspector of Land Records. They have in all measured 17,765 hissass. This is due to the fact that one party in Satara and 2 measurers in Sholapur had to be kept at Headquarters for calculation of assessment and other work till the end of March and February respectively.

The subjoined table shows the total number of hissass measured by the abovementioned temporary staff and by the permanent staff of Cadastral Surveyors and the total number of hissass which remained to be measured at the close of the fair season.

In the villages visited during the year for sub-division measurement work, 7,674, 20,355 and 2,171 hissass were found in excess of the reported number of hissass in Northern Circle, Central Circle

and Southern Circle respectively. This shows that the figures of hissas are not, correctly reported by the taluka officers. The attention of the Collectors is being drawn to this point with a view to secure more reliable figures in future.

The balance of recovery of original Pot Hissa Survey in Bombay Suburban District in Northern Circle is still Rs. 1,739-5-5. There is also a balance of Rs. 15,455-5-3 of Upkeep Pot Hissa Survey fee of 1929-30. As the amounts pending recovery are heavy and long outstanding the Collector has again been requested to take special steps for their early recovery.

The balance for recovery on 1st August 1938 on account of original Pot Hissa measurement fees in Mahad Taluka of Kolaba District was Rs. 41,253-12-4. A sum of Rs. 6,519-6-6 only was recovered during the year as against Rs. 15,000 put down for recovery as per orders in Government Memorandum, Revenue Department, No. 2657-B, dated 6th February 1939. The Collector has been requested to push on with the recoveries and clear off the balance as per Government orders.

The balance for recovery on 1st August 1938 on account of original Pot Hissa Survey fees in Honnavar and Siddapur talukas of Kanara District was Rs. 2,550-11-11. A sum of Rs. 712-3-4 only was recovered during the year leaving still a balance of Rs. 1,838-8-7. The whole amount should have been recovered by the end of 1935-37 as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 6425/23, dated 12th January 1935. The attention of the Collector is being drawn to this point.

The Inam village survey party completed the *barsat* work of the 25 inam villages in Dharwar District of which field work was done in the last year. Field and *barsat* work of village Benakankop in Dharwar District was also completed during the year.

Survey of Inam villages for Record of Rights purposes was taken up in Satara District during this year and the Head Surveyor with the help of one Surveyor completed the Theodolite work of 3 villages—Nigadivandan, Yevateshwar and Lumankhol and that of village Mardhe is nearing completion. The detailed measurement work of all these villages will be taken up during the next fair season.

The survey of inam village Upale in Barsi Taluka of the Sholapur District for Record of Rights purposes sanctioned in Government Memorandum, No. 10008/33, dated 4th February 1939 was taken up. The Theodolite work was completed by the end of June 1939. The detailed measurement work will be taken up during the next fair season.

24. As a result of mistakes detected by Hissa Survey Parties and Cadastral Survey staff in the original hissa survey records, assessment was reduced during the year to the extent of Rs. 75-7-3 in Northern Circle, Rs. 37-4-9 in Central Circle and Rs. 74-15-0 in Southern Circle.

CHAPTER III.

SURVEY AND SETTLEMENT.

Revenue Survey.

26. No work in connection with the survey and settlement of inam villages was undertaken during the year.

The reclassification work of fallow garden lands sanctioned in paragraph 5 of Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5387/28, dated 27th May 1936 has been finished in respect of 105 cases out of 109 cases received so far, the remaining 3 cases are being disposed of early in the next fair season.

27. No revision settlement of Government villages were undertaken during the year. No settlement proposals—whether original or revision—for inam villages were submitted during the year.

The reclassification of lands due to deterioration of soil and consequent reduction in assessment is done in case of individual survey numbers on applications from the parties. The reclassification due to deterioration on a larger scale was done in the villages of Timberva and Sadlav in Surat District and the reduction in assessment was sanctioned by Government. Reclassification of lands deteriorated by floods has been done of lands in the villages of Dadapur and Pursa in Broach and Panch Mahals District and the statements of reduction of assessment are being sent to Government for sanction.

CHAPTER IV.

28. *Northern Circle.*—There are in all 56 City Surveys and 38 Village Site Surveys. Out of them, the maintenance of two city surveys of Kaira District and of 7 City Surveys of Thana District has been entrusted to the talathis, the technical part of the work being

attended to by the Cadastral Surveyors. Out of 37 Village Site Surveys, the maintenance of three Village Site Surveys—Ville Parle, Juhu and Malad—has been abandoned as per Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 6464/33, dated 12th August 1937. The question of making arrangement for the maintenance of City Survey of Savda which was completed last year and City Survey of Faizpur sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 9037/33, dated 3rd September 1939, which is nearing completion is under consideration. City Survey operations in Paldhi in East Khandesh District and Naroda in Ahmedabad District sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 3736-B/28, dated 8th December 1938 were also taken up during the year. The survey work is completed and the Enquiry work is in progress.

29. *Central Circle.*—There are in all 13 City Surveys and 6 Village Site Surveys under maintenance. The maintenance of Wambori City Survey in Ahmednagar District and of Roha and Uran in Kolaba District has been entrusted to the talathis, the technical part of the work being entrusted to the Cadastral Surveyors in charge of the taluka.

The enquiry work of the Village Site Survey of the Inam Village Perne in Haveli Taluka of Poona District is still incomplete. No fresh city survey operations were undertaken during the year.

30. *Southern Circle.*—There are in all 27 City Surveys and 6 Village Site Surveys under regular maintenance. Fresh City Survey operations were undertaken during the year in the case of cities of Gokak in Belgaum District and Ashta in Satara District and of the village Uppin-Betgiri in Dharwar District. The detailed measurement work of all these places is complete and the enquiry work is in progress.

GENERAL REMARKS.

31. Statement "A" shows the earning of the City Survey maintenance establishment in the Province and the budget expenditure incurred upon it during the financial year 1938-39.

On the whole, the City Surveys and their maintenance staff earn more than their cost. While this is correct in large towns, in smaller towns the staff is hardly self-supporting. To remedy this, as far as possible, two or more smaller towns are put in charge of one Maintenance Surveyor and the work of maintaining the Property Register is entrusted to talathis. In some places Cadastral Surveyors' work is entrusted to the Maintenance Surveyors to keep them fully engaged.

32. The system of writing Property Registers on cards has been introduced in the towns of Broach, Godhra, Viramgam, Thana, Dahanu, Igatpuri, Nasik (partly), Malegaon, Dhulia, Nandurbar (partly), Jalgaon and Chalisgaon in Northern Circle, and in Poona, Lonavla, Alibag and Ahmednagar in Central Circle, and in

Panchagani, Mahabaleshwar, Sholapur, Belgaum, Bagalkot, Hubli, Gadag, Ranebennur, Byadgi and Haveri in Southern Circle and the system is working satisfactorily.

33. During the enquiry, a large number of encroachments were detected on Government and Municipal lands. Fresh encroachments are also being detected during the maintenance of these city surveys. The progress in the removal of encroachments on Government land is satisfactory but the progress made in removing encroachments on Municipal land is as usual unsatisfactory, the encroachments removed being 1,742 on Government lands and 9,451 on Municipal lands leaving a balance of 6,149 and 60,539 on Government and Municipal lands respectively. The increase in the encroachments on Government land is due to the inclusion of encroachments detected at the time of enquiry in the recently city surveyed towns, the regular maintenance of which was started during the year. Statement "B" shows the position regarding encroachments. The balance of encroachments on Municipal land is due to the indifference of the Municipal Bodies and the Collectors are being requested to take action according to orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 1893, dated 4th June 1925 and Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2558/23, dated 14th August 1933 where necessary. The services of 2 surveyors have been lent to the Ahmedabad Municipality for the disposal of the municipal encroachments. One surveyor was also lent to the Thana Municipality for 3 months. Kalyan and Nasik Municipalities have also asked for an Encroachment Officer. This is a hopeful sign as it shows that at last some of the Municipalities are taking steps to dispose of the long standing encroachments.

34. The cost for the establishment employed on the work of relaying the Theodolite frame work in the city surveyed area at Ahmednagar was sanctioned under Government Memorandum Nos. 7990-B/24, dated 30th April 1938 and 21st August 1939, and the work is nearing completion.

One temporary post of Maintenance Surveyor was sanctioned for the City survey office, Sholapur, with a view to clear off the arrears. The post was in the first instance sanctioned till the end of February 1939 in Government Memorandum, Revenue Department, No. 8657-B/33, dated 10th October 1938 but the period has been extended till the end of current financial year in Government Memorandum No. 8657-B/33, Revenue Department, dated 15th March 1939.

Theodolite survey of the area under non-Agricultural development in the Thana City survey limits has been sanctioned in Government Memorandum, Revenue Department, No. 9743-E/33, dated 16th June 1939 and the work will be taken up when the funds are available.

The maintenance of the village site surveys is as remarked last year, not being done properly. The defects have been brought to the notice of the Collectors concerned.

In order to have a nucleus of survey trained English knowing hands of which the Department is at present very deficient, 15 posts of Field Party Surveyors sanctioned by Government under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5526/33, dated 26th April 1938 are being trained in different branches of survey. These men in course of time will replace the old unqualified hands in the Department. As the settlement work and the city survey work on a larger scale will be undertaken shortly the question of strengthening this staff is under consideration.

Photozinco Press.

35. The inspection of the Photozinco Press from the administrative point of view was done by the Director of Land Records in April 1939 and several improvements were brought into effect. The post of the 1st Assistant Manager in the grade of Rs. 450—30—600 was retrenched from 1st December 1938 under orders in Government Memorandum No. 8771-G/33, Revenue Department, dated 26th August 1938 and a temporary post of printing foreman has been created in the grade of Rs. 100—5—150—10—200 under Government Memorandum No. 8771-G/33, Revenue Department dated 5th August 1939. Twelve posts of printers and one post of a photographer in the grade of Rs. 75—5/2—100 were retrenched and one post of an assistant storekeeper is kept vacant with a view to its ultimate retrenchment.

The work turned out in the printing branch during the year was 1,782,438 machine pulls costing about Rs. 33,747 and 58,371 handpulls costing about Rs. 17,918. Other branches turned out work costing about Rs. 83,603. The total cost of work done in the Press was Rs. 1.35 lakhs. The total amount realised from private work done in the press was Rs. 49,566. The total expenditure of the Press was Rs. 1,69,483-6-7.

CHAPTER V.

RECORD OF RIGHTS.

36. The writing of the combined form VII—XII has already been completed in all the districts of the Province.

37. The Record of Rights (new combined form VII—XII) was for the first time introduced in the Inam village Abbihal of Belgaum district.

38. Efforts have been made to suppress corruption in the Department as directed by Government under Government circular Memorandum No. 8490/33, Revenue Department, dated 7th June 1938 by communicating the orders issued by Government from time to time in this respect. There occurred six cases of corruption in the subordinate services of the Department. Out of these six, in four cases, the allegations were found to be untrue, in one case

the person concerned was reduced to a lower grade and in another the person concerned was found guilty in a criminal court and sentenced.

SUPERINTENDENCE.

39. Mr. A. L. Dias, I.C.S., who took over from Mr. V. Isvaran, I.C.S., as Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, has applied himself with zeal and enthusiasm to his new duties and has already acquired a good grip over the technicalities of the Department. Mr. N. S. Kulkarni also worked diligently and well during the year.

The office staff worked hard and satisfactorily under the able guidance of my office Superintendent Mr. V. N. Konnur who rendered valuable assistance to me in the work of the Department by his thoroughness and outstanding ability and industry.
