In order to ascertain whether the educational imbalances have widened or narrowed down with time the data for the year 1976-77 has been analysed and compared with that for the year 1970-71.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the co-operation received from the Director of Education, Assam and the project staff of the Planning, Monitoring & Statistics Division who have prepared this report.

INTRODUCTION

Regional imbalances do exist in the field of Educational Development just as in Urbanisation, Industrialisation, Distribution of Income and Wealth etc. with a view to highlight the Regional imbalances in the educational sector, the Ministry of Education & Culture brings out the publication "Educational Statistics - District-wise" quinquennially.

2. A Volume of this nature was first published by National Council of Education Research & Training in 1960-61. Thereafter it was decided that such reviews will be brought out in respect of each State every five year by the Ministry of Education & Culture. Accordingly, the reviews for the year 1965-66 were brought out by this Ministry in respect of some of the States.

3. For making inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as Enrolment Ratios, Percentage of Trained Teachers and Per-Capita Expenditure on Education have been worked out. These indices show wide range of variations between the Districts and hence the need for formulating educational plans at the District level.

II - AREA AND POPULATION

4. The Total Area of Assam State before re-organisation was 99,623 Sq. Kms. The Areas of Mizo Hills and Shillong City having been taken out of it, the re-organised Assam State's Area was 78,523 Sq. Kms. In 1970-71, Assam had 11 Districts as against 10 in 1976-77. Further an additional District of Dibrugarh comprising of 7,023 Sq. Kms. was carved out of the erstwhile Lakhimpur District. The Areas of the remaining 8 Districts remained the same as these were in 1970-71. In 1977 the District-wise Area varied from 4,890 Sq. Kms. in North Cachar Hills to 10,359 Sq. Kms. in Goalpara.

5. The Population of Assam was 150.49 Lakhs in 1971. For 1977, the estimated population for re-organised Assam was 176.80 Lakhs (93.14 Lakhs Males and 83.66 Lakhs Females) and the lowest in North Cachar District (7.6 Lakhs) in 1971. In 1977 also the estimated population varied widely among the re-organised Districts from 26.90 Lakhs in Goalpara District to 9.25 Lakhs in North Cachar Hills.

6. The overall density of population per Sq. Km. was 151 which is estimated to have increased to 226 in 1977. The density of population per Sq. Km. in 1977 varied widely among Districts viz. from 365 the highest in Nowrang to only 19 the lowest in North Cachar Hills. The Area, Total Population and density of population for different Districts for the years 1970-71 and 1976-77 are given in Statement No.(2). Table No.(1) below gives a general view of the extent of variation in Area, Population and the Density of Population 1977:-

7. The Total Population of the State as well as Population of different Age-Groups for the year 1971 and 1977 given in this report are based on the revised population projections (as on 1st March of the year) available from the office of Registrar General of India. District-wise Population in the Age-Groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 are based on the following formula:-

We assume that

To get the Sex-wise break-up of Total Population in the various Age-Groups of the District, first of all the Girls Population is estimated using the above equation with the only difference that in the above formula Total Population is replaced by the Girls Population. The Boys Population is obtained by the residual method i.e.

Boys Population in the Age-Group 6-11 (=)

Total Population in the Age-Group 6-11 (-)

Girls Population in the Age-Group 6-11

Similar formulas are used for estimating the District-wise Population in the Age-Groups 11-14 and 14-17 years.

8. The Total estimated Population of Children in the Age-Group 6-11 years was 24.79 Lakhs in 1977 (12.56 Lakhs Boys and 12.23 Lakhs Girls) which formed 14.0% of the Total Population of the State.

9. Similarly the estimated Population in the Age-Group 11-14 years was 13.73 Lakhs in 1977 (16.96 Lakhs Boys and 6.77 Lakhs Girls) which constituted 7.8% of the Total Population.

10. The Population in the Age-Group 14-17 in 1977 was 12.53 Lakhs, consisting of 6.40 Lakhs Boys and 6.13 Lakhs Girls. This formed 7.1% of the Total Population.

11. Thus out of the Total Population of 176.80 Lakhs of the State, School-Going Population in the Age-Group 6-17 years was 51.05 Lakhs consisting of 25.92 Lakhs Boys and 25.13 Lakhs Girls. The Population in the Age-Group 6-17 years constituted 28.9% of the Total Population. The Percentage for Boys was 14.7%, while for Girls it formed 14.2%.

III - LITERACY

12. According to the 1971 Census the effective Literacy Rate that is the number of Literates per hundred of Population (excluding the Age-Group 0-4) in the State was 34.6. The Literacy Rates for Males and Females were 44.3 and 23.5 respectively indicating a wide gap between the two Sexes. Details are given in Statement No.(7).

IV - GENERAL VIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

13. The Total number of Educational Institutions in Assam was 23,131 in 1970-71 which increased to 26,486 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 14.5% during the period of 6 years. The District of Kamrup had the largest share of Institutions 5,107 and North Cachar Hills had the smallest share 451 in 1976-77. The District-wise position of Institutions is given in Statement No.(1)

(b) ENROLMENT

14. The Total Enrolment in all recognised Educational Institutions in the State increased from 22.71 Lakhs in 1970-71 to 25.83 Lakhs in 1976-77. The increase in Enrolment is observed in all the Districts (by adding up Enrolment of bifurcated Districts in 1976-77). The Enrolment increased with an average Annual Growth Rate of 2.2%. Kamrup District had the highest Enrolment, while North Cachar District shows the lowest Enrolment in 1976-77.

15. The Percentage of Girls Enrolment to Total Enrolment was 37.4 in 1970-71 which increased to 38.7 in 1976-77. Among the Districts Sibsagar 41.4 had the highest Percentage of Girls and the lowest was in Mikir Hills 34.9.

16. The Total Enrolment in all the recognised Educational Institutions as a Percentage of Total Population was 15.1 in 1970-71 and it was 14.6 in 1976-77 at the State level. The Percentage Enrolment to Total Population in 1976-77 was the highest in North Cachar District 19.1 and the lowest in Mokokchung Hills 11.4.

(c) EXTENT OF COVERAGE OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

17. The Percentage of Enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes to Total Enrolment was 8.3 and 13.9 respectively, whereas the Percentage of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes Population to Total Population was 6.3 and 11.0 respectively during 1976-77. (Revised Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes Population figures supplied by Registrar General of India). Hence the extent of coverage or the coefficient of equality for Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes works out to 131.7 and 126.3 respectively.

(d) TEACHERS

18. The Total number of Teachers in the State in all Educational Institutions increased from 71,638 in 1970-71 to 92,526 in 1976-77 showing an Annual Rate of increase of 4.8% during the period. The number of Women Teachers formed 17% of the Total number of Teachers. In 1976-77, the Percentage of Trained Teachers in School Education was 45.1. The Corresponding Percentages for Male and Female Teachers were 45.3 and 44.0 respectively. Among Districts the Percentage of Trained Teachers in Schools varied from 50.1 in Darrang District to 20.3 in North Cachar District. The Percentage of Women Trained Teachers in Schools was highest 55.8% in Cacher District and the lowest 10.2% in North Cachar District. The details of Trained Teachers in Schools may be seen in Statement No.(6).

(e) EXPENDITURE

19. The Total Expenditure (excluding Expenditure on Directorate & Inspectorate) of all recognised Educational Institutions in the State, was Rs.24.31 Crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.48.18 Crores in 1976-77. The Expenditure increased with an average Annual Rate of Growth of 9.4%. The Expenditure increased in all the Districts. The Percentage share of Expenditure in 1976-77 was the highest in the case of Kamrup 24.6 and the lowest in the case of North Cachar 1.0%.

20. The Expenditure on Education per head of Population in the State increased from 15.66 in 1970-71 to Rs.27.75 in 1976-77. In 5 Districts, the Per-Capita Expenditure was more than the State Per-Capita Expenditure. The lowest Per-Capita Expenditure in 1976-77 was observed in Darrang Rs.15.65 and the highest in Sibsagar Rs.43.02. The Expenditure per Institution also increased from Rs.10,509 in 1970-71 to Rs.18,191 in 1976-77. The maximum being in Dibrugarh District Rs.24,092 and the lowest in Mikir Hills Rs.8,872. The District-wise details are given in Statement No.(5).

V - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

21. The number of Pre-Primary Schools in Assam increased from 72 in 1970-71 to 307 in 1976-77. Similarly Total Number of Teachers in Pre-Primary Schools increased from 92 in 1970-71 to 344 in 1976-77.

22. The Enrolment in Pre-Primary Classes was 5,290 in 1970-71 which increased to 17,622 in 1976-77. 1504 students (835 Boys and 669 Girls) belonging to Scheduled Castes 1,228 students (638 Boys and 590 Girls) of Scheduled Tribes were enrolled in Pre-Primary Classes in 1976-77.

23. The Expenditure on Pre-Primary Schools increased from Rs.2,11,359 in 1970-71 to Rs.8,95,599 in 1976-77.

VI - PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

24. The Total Number of Primary Schools in Assam increased from 17,723 in 1970-71 to 20,251 in 1976-77, showing an increase of 14.3% over the period of 6 years. The highest Percentage of Primary Schools was 18.7% in Kamrup District while the lowest Percentage 2.0% was in North Cachar District.

25. On the average, in 1970-71, a Primary School was serving an Area of 5.6 Sq. Kms. over the period of 6 years, this position improved significantly and a Primary School was serving an Area of 3.9 Sq. Kms. in 1976-77. In 1976-77, the average Area served by a Primary School was the minimum in the case of Kamrup 2.6 Sq. Kms. and maximum in the case of Mikir Hills 13.9 Sq. Kms.

26. The Population served by a Primary School in the State registered an increase from 849 in 1970-71 to 873 in 1976-77 during the period of the 6 years. Among the Districts in 1976-77 the Population served by a Primary School varied from 229 in North Cachar to 1,057 in Darrang and Dibrugarh in 1976-77. The District-wise details are given in Statement No.(11).

27. Total Number of Teachers in Primary Schools in Assam also increased from 32,961 in 1970-71 to 44,512 in 1976-77. This shows an average annual increase rate of 5.3% during the period of 6 years. During this period there was increase in the number of Teachers in all the Districts. The number of Women Teachers formed 20% of the Total Number of Teachers in 1976-77. The highest Percentage of Teachers was 18.6% in Kamrup while lowest Percentage i.e. 1.7% was found in North Cachar District.

(b) ENROLMENT

28. In 1970-71, the Total Enrolment in Primary Schools in Assam was 13,95,098 which increased to 15,40,383 in 1976-77. In Classes I-V the Enrolment increased from 15.08 Lakhs (9.07 Lakh Boys and 6.01 Lakh Girls) in 1970-71 to 18.27 Lakhs (10.83 Lakh Boys and 7.44 Lakh Girls) in 1976-77 showing an average Annual Growth Rate of 3.5% per annum. The Annual Enrolment Growth Rates in these Classes separately for Boys and Girls were 3.2% and 3.9% respectively which shows that disparities between the Boys and Girls Education are being narrowed down with time.

29. The Percentage of Enrolment in Classes I-V to the Total Population in the Age-Group 6-11 (also called Enrolment Ratio) gives index of the facilities created at the Primary stages of Education. In Assam this Percentage increased from 66.1 to 73.7 during the period of 6 years. In case of Boys alone the Enrolment Ratio increased from 78.5 to 86.2 in 1976-77 and in the case of Girls from 53.3 to 60.9 during the same period. Among the various Districts, taking Boys and Girls together, the Enrolment Ratio in 1976-77 was the highest in North Cachar 108.3% and the lowest in Darrang District 60.6%.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

30. Of the Total Enrolment of 15.08 Lakhs in Classes I-V in 1970-71, 4.04 Lakhs students belonged to the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes forming 26.8% of the Total Enrolment in these Classes. In 1976-77, the Enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes students was 1.62 Lakhs and 2.78 Lakhs respectively and formed 8.9% and 15.2% respectively of the Total Enrolment in these Classes. The coefficient of equality of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes in these Classes works out to 141.3% and 138.2% respectively. The District-wise details are given in Statement Nos.(12 & 13).

The co-efficient of equality of extent of coverage is defined as

$$I = \frac{\text{Percentage of Enrollment of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes to Total Enrollment}}{\text{Percentage of Population of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes to Total Population}} \times 100$$

(d) EXPENDITURE

31. The Total Expenditure on Primary Schools in Assam increased from Rs.8,14,49,231 in 1970-71 to Rs.14,80,99,941 in 1976-77. This gives an average Annual Growth Rate of 13.6% during the period under consideration.

The Percentage of Expenditure on Primary Schools to Total Expenditure of the State on Education was 33.5% in 1970-71 and it became 30.70% in 1976-77. This Percentage was as low as 30.5% in the case of Dibrugarh District and was highest in Mikir Hills 53.7%.

32. The Per-Capita Expenditure on Primary Schools in the State was Rs.5.41 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.8.4 by 1976-77. The Per-Capita Expenditure in 1976-77 was the lowest in Darrang District Rs.5.2 and the highest in North Cachar District Rs.27.4.

33. The cost per student in Primary Schools increased from Rs.58.4 in 1970-71 to Rs.96.2 in 1976-77 at the State level. Among the Districts, the cost per student in 1976-77 was the lowest in the case of Darrang Rs.72.0 and the highest in North Cachar District Rs.193.9. The Teacher-Pupil-Ratio improved from 42 to 35 during the period under consideration. The Teacher-Pupil-Ratio varied from 16 in North Cachar Hills to 39 in Kamrup and Nowrang Districts. The details can be seen from Statement No.(14).

VII - MIDDLE SCHOOL

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

34. The Total Number of Middle Schools in the State increased from 3,092 in 1970-71 to 3,545 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 14.6% during the period of 6 years. In 1976-77, the highest number of Middle Schools was recorded in Sibsagar District 583 and the smallest number was in North Cachar Hills 29.

35. On an average, in 1970-71, a Middle School served an Area of 32.2 Sq. Kms. The position improved considerably in 1976-77 and a Middle School was then available for every 22 Kms. Area. In 1976-77 the Area served by a Middle School was less than the State average in 5 Districts. The Area served by a Middle School was the lowest in Nowrang 14.4 Sq. Kms. and the highest in the case of North Cachar Hills 168.6 Sq. Kms.

36. The Population served by a Middle School in the State was 4,867 in 1970-71 and 4,987 in 1976-77 i.e. during the period of 6 years. Among the Districts, the Population served by a Middle School in 1976-77 varied from 7,163 in Darrang District to 3,169 in North Cachar Hills District. The details are given in Statement No.(15). The number of Teachers in Middle Schools also increased from 15,718 in 1970-71 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 20.1% during the period i.e. an Annual Growth Rate of 3.4% during the given period. L to 19673

(b) ENROLMENT

37. The Total Enrolment in Middle Schools was 3,70,150 in 1970-71 which increased to 4,34,934 by 1976-77. The Enrolment at the Middle stage Education i.e. in Classes VI-VIII increased from 4,01,204 (2,56,621 Boys and 1,44,583 Girls) in 1970-71 to 4,18,118 (2,64,357 Boys and 1,53,761 Girls) in 1976-77. This shows an average increase of 0.7% per annum during the period under consideration. The average Annual Growth Rates of Enrolment separately for Boys and Girls in these Classes were 0.5% and 1.5% respectively.

38. The Percentage of Enrolment in Classes VI-VIII to the Total Population in the Age-Group 11-14 i.e. Enrolment Ratio gives an idea of facilities available at the Middle stage of Education. In Assam this Percentage was 34.8 in 1970-71 and 30.4 in 1976-77. In case of Boys the Enrolment Ratio was 43.5 in 1970-71 and 38.0 in 1976-77. In the case of Girls it changed from 25.7 to 22.7 during the period under consideration. Taking Boys and Girls together, the Percentage Enrolment in case of 4 Districts was more than the Corresponding State Percentage in 1976-77. At Middle stage this Enrolment Ratio indicates a wide disparity between the two Sexes in all the Districts. In 1976-77 the highest Enrolment Ratio was in Sibsager District 44.8 whereas the lowest was in Mikir Hills 17.2. The details may be seen in Statement No.(16).

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

Of the Total Enrolment of 4,01,204 students in Classes VI-VIII 88,716 students belonged to the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes in 1970-71 forming 22.1% of the Total Enrolment. Out of the Total Enrolment of 4,18,118 in 1976-77. The number of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was 30,562 and 49,723 respectively forming 7.3 and 11.9 percent respectively of the Total Enrolment. Thus the coefficient of equality for Scheduled Castes was 115.9% and that for Scheduled Tribes was 108.2%. The details may be seen in Statement No.(17).

(d) EXPENDITURE

The Total Expenditure on Middle Schools increased from Rs.397.35 Lakhs in 1970-71 to Rs.694.87 in 1976-77 showing an average Annual Growth Rate of 12.5% during the period under consideration.

41. The Per-Capita Expenditure on Middle Schools in the State was only Rs.2.6 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.3.9 in 1976-77. Each District recorded an increase in the Per-Capita Expenditure during the period under consideration. The range of variation among the Districts is from Rs.7.7 in the case of North Cachar to Rs.2.4 in the case of Nowgong.

42. The Total Expenditure on Middle Schools in 1970-71 formed 16.3% of the Total Expenditure on Education in the State, which was 14.4% in 1976-77. In 5 Districts, the Percentage Expenditure on Middle Schools was more than the State Percentage.

43. The average cost per student in Middle Schools which was Rs.107 in 1970-71 increased to Rs.160 in 1976-77, at the State level. Among Districts the cost per student ranged from Rs.360 in North Cachar Hills to Rs.98 in Nowgong. In 1970-71 Pupil-Teacher Ratio was 23 which became 22 in 1976-77. Among Districts the Teacher-Pupil-Ratio varied from 25 in case of Nowgong, Lakhimpur and Dibrugarh to 17 in the case of North Cachar Hills. Further details can be seen in Statement No.(18).

VIII - HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

44. The Number of High/Higer Secondary Schools in Assam increased from 1,350 in 1970-71 to 1,665 in 1976-77, showing an increase of 23.3% during the period under review. The increase in number of High/Higer Secondary Schools was shared by all the Districts. Among the Districts the largest number was in Kamrup District 370 and the smallest number 16 High/Higer Secondary Schools was in North Cachar Hills.

45. On an average, there was a High/Higher Secondary School for every 74 Sq. Kms. Area in Assam in 1970-71. By 1976-77 a High/Higher Secondary School was available for every 47 Sq. Kms. In 1976-77 there was a High/Higher Secondary School in Kamrup District for every 27 Sq. Kms. Area whereas in North Cachar Hills one High/Higher Secondary School was available for every 306 Sq. Kms. Area.

46. On an average, at the State level, there was a High/Higher Secondary School for every 11,100 persons in 1970-71. By 1976-77, a High/Higher Secondary School was available for every 70,600 persons. Among the Districts the average population covered by a School varied from as high as 13,900 in Goalpara District to as low as 6,900 in Sibsager District.

47. The Total Number of Teachers in High/Higher Secondary Schools in Assam increased from 17,266 in 1970-71 to 21,281 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 23.3% during the period under consideration. During the period of 6 years, there was an increase in the number of Teachers in all the Districts. Women Teachers formed 14.3% of the Total number of Teachers in 1976-77.

(b) ENROLMENT

48. The Total Enrolment in High/Higher Secondary Schools of the State in 1970-71 was 4,02,988 which increased to 4,68,706 in High/Higher Secondary Schools in 1976-77. This shows an average Annual Growth Rate of 16.3% during the period 1970-71 to 1976-77. The Enrolment of Secondary and Higher Secondary stage i.e. in Classes IX-XI was 2,56,332 (1,76,645 Boys and 79,687 Girls) in 1970-71 and it became 1,94,474 (1,31,400 Boys and 63,074 Girls) in 1976-77 (because of reorganisation of the State). Among the Districts the Percentage of Enrolment in these Classes varied from 22.4% in Kamrup to 0.4% in North Cachar Hills District. Details may be seen in Statement No.(20).

49. The Enrolment Ratio at the High/Higher Secondary stage for the Assam State as a whole was 25.9% in 1970-71 and it was 15.5% in 1976-77. There is wide desparity in the Enrolment Ratio among the Districts for the Boys and Girls. The Enrolment Ratio was found to be maximum in Kamrup for Boys, Girls and Total 27.9, 17.0 and 22.6 and minimum in Mikir Hills for Boys, Girls and Total 8.2, 3.2 and 5.8%.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

50. Of the Total Enrolment of 2,56,332 in Classes IX to XI, 45,864 students belonged to Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes in 1970-71 which formed 17.9% of the Total Enrolment in these Classes. Out of the Total Enrolment of 1,94,474 in High/Higer Secondary School Classes in 1976-77 12,405 students belonged to Scheduled Castes and 20,005 to Scheduled Tribes in Classes IX to XI. The Percentage of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribe students to Total Enrolment in these Classes were 6.4 and 10.3 respectively whereas the Percentage of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes Population to the Total Population in the State were 6.3 and 11.0 respectively. Therefore, the coefficients of equality for the Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes communities worked out to be 101.6% and 93.6% respectively. The details of Enrolment and Percentages can be seen in the Statement No.(21).

(d) EXPENDITURE

51. The Total Expenditure on High/Higer Secondary Schools in the State increased from Rs.651.37 Lakhs in 1970-71 to Rs.1,149.61 Lakhs in 1976-77. The Expenditure increased with an average Annual Growth Rate of 12.7% during the period under consideration.

52. The Per-Capita Expenditure on High/Higer Secondary Schools at the State level was Rs.4.3 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.6.5 by 1976-77. Among Districts the Per-Capita Expenditure on High/Higer Secondary was the highest in North Cachar District Rs.12.6 and the lowest in Mikir Hills Rs.2.9.

53. The Total Expenditure on High/Higer Secondary Schools in 1970-71 formed 26.8% of the Total Expenditure on Education in Assam. By 1976-77 the Percentage Expenditure was 23.8%. In 4 Districts the Percentage Expenditure spent on High/Higer Secondary Schools was more than the State average. The Expenditure on High/Higer Secondary Schools as Percentage of Total Expenditure on Education was the highest in Darrang 33.4 and the lowest in Mikir Hills 16.3.

54. The cost per student in High/Higher Secondary Schools has increased from Rs.162 in 1970-71 to Rs.245 in 1976-77 during the period of 6 years. Among the Districts, it varies from Rs.477 in the case of North Cachar Hills to Rs.207 in the case of Lakhimpur and Kamrup Districts. The Pupil-Teacher-Ratio varied marginally at the State level during the period under consideration from 23 to 22 in 1976-77. The Pupil-Teacher-Ratio varied from 15 in Mikir Hills to 24 in Dibrugarh, Lakhimpur etc. The details can be seen in Statement No.(22).

IX - PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL & OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION

55. The number of Schools for Vocational, Professional, Special & Other Education was 755 in combined Assam and it became 507 in reorganised Assam.

56. The Total Enrolment in these Schools was 28,693 in 1970-71 and 21,280 in 1976-77. Out of the Total Enrolment in 1976-77 16.5% were Girls. The Total number of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes enrolled for these courses was 6,110 which works out to be 21.3 of the Total Enrolment during 1970-71. The number of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes enrolled for these courses during 1976-77 was 1,050 and 2,694 respectively and it was 4.9% and 12.6% of the Total Enrolment. The number of Teachers in these courses was 1,281 in 1970-71 and 1,081 in 1976-77.

57. The Total Expenditure on these Institutions was Rs.45,60,315 in 1970-71 and it was Rs.45,56,018 in 1976-77 during the period under review. Among Districts the maximum Expenditure in 1976-77 on this account is shown by Sibsagar Rs.9,65,294 whereas minimum i.e. Rs.58,271 is shown by Dibrugarh District. District-wise information on Professional, Vocational, Special & Other Education (School) can be seen from Statement No.(23).

X - HIGHER EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

58. The number of Institutions for Higher Education increased from 139 in 1970-71 to 211 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 51.8% during the period under review. In 1976-77 there were 3 Universities one each located in Dibrugarh, Kamrup and Sibsagar District. In all there was 141 Colleges of Degree level, 50 Colleges imparting Education of below Degree level, and 16 Junior Colleges and 1 Board of Intermediate Education. Of all these Affiliated Colleges, 118 were for Arts & Science Courses, 1 for Agriculture, 6 were Education, 2 for Engineering, 8 for Law, 3 each for Medicine and Other Education; 50 Colleges provided Education of below Degree level and 16 Colleges provided Education of Intermediate standard.

59. The number of Teachers for Higher Education increased from 4,320 in 1970-71 to 5,635 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 30.4% during the period.

(b) ENROLMENT

60. The Total Enrolment in all Institutions of Higher Education in the State was 72,613 in 1970-71 which increased to 1,06,310 in 1976-77. Of this 85,349 students were studying in Arts, Science & Commerce Colleges, 375 in Agriculture and Forestry, 846 in Education, 1,300 in Engineering, Technology & Architecture, 2,564 in Law, 2,309 in Medical Colleges and 382 students were studying in Other Courses, 2,357 students were studying in Universities. The Total Enrolment in Institutions for Higher Education was the highest in Kamrup 34,277 and the lowest was in North Cachar 400. District-wise details are given in Statement No.(25).

61. Statement No.(26) gives the Enrolment in Higher Education by type of Education. The Total Enrolment in Higher Education increased from 71,585 (56,890 Boys and 14,695 Girls) in 1970-71 to 1,04,534 (78,564 Boys and 25,880 Girls) in 1976-77 showing an average Annual Growth Rate of 7.7%. Out of the Total Enrolment 90,009 (66,008 Boys and 24,001 Girls) students were enrolled for General Education and 14,525 (12,646 Boys and 1,879 Girls) in Professional Education during the year 1976-77.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES & SCHEDULED TRIBES

62. There were 11,608 (9,173 Boys and 2,435 Girls) students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes communities studying for Higher Education in 1970-71. This formed 16.2% of the Total Enrolment in Higher Educational Institutions. In 1976-77 their number increased to 5,963 (4,796 Boys and 1,167 Girls) of Scheduled Castes and 6,654 (5,617 Boys and 1,037 Girls) of Scheduled Tribes. The Percentage of Enrolment of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes to Total Enrolment was 5.7% and 6.4% respectively. The co-efficients of equality of Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe students at the Higher Education stage were 90.5% and 58.2% respectively.

(d) EXPENDITURE

63. The Total Expenditure on Higher Education in the State increased from 519.83 Lakhs in 1970-71 to 1,438.16 Lakhs in 1976-77 showing an average Annual Growth Rate of 29.4% during the period under review. Among the Districts, the highest Expenditure was recorded by Kamrup District 36.4% and the lowest in case of North Cachar Hills 0.2% during the year 1976-77.
