WELFARE OF THE BACKWARD CLASSES

HARIJANS comprise more than one-fifth of the total population of Uttar Pradesh. Besides them, there are in the State a large number of Backward Communities and those formerly called the Criminal Tribes. All these have been for centuries victims of social prejudices and their inevitable corollaries, appalling poverty and abysmal ignorance. But under alien rule nothing concrete was done for their welfare. It was only when the country became free and popular Governments came into power that untouchability was declared unlawful. The State Government passed the Removal of Social Disabilities Act. in 1947, and repealed the Criminal Tribes Act in 1952.

Apart from giving legal rights to Harijans and other backward classes welfare schemes were also started for them by various departments of the State Government. In 1951, the whole position was reviewed and the depressed classes sections of the Education, Reclamation and the then Harijans Sahayak Departments were amalgamated and a new "Harijan Sahayak Department" was formed. The executive head of this department is a Director who is assisted by the Deputy Director, an Assistant Director, a Harijan Welfare Officer at the Headquarters and seven Regional Harijan Welfare Officers posted at Meerut, Agra, Allahabad, Lucknow, Bareilly, Banaras and Gorakhpur. Field workers have been appointed in all the districts of the State and to associate non-official opinion with Harijan welfare work a State Harijan Sahayak Board and District Harijan Sahayak Sub-Committees consisting among others of members of the Legislature, representatives of the Scheduled Castes and social workers have been constituted. The board determines the policies to be pursued by the Harijan Sahayak Department and from time to time reviews the work done by it. The progress made so far can be estimated from the fact that whereas in 1946-47, Rs.6,97,000 were spent by the State Government on Harijan Welfare, in 1953-54, the expenditure rose to Rs.61.47 lakhs and for 1954-55, a provision of Rs.70 lakhs has been made. These figures exclude the Government of India grants which amounted to Rs.11.70 lakhs in 1953-54.

Welfare Activities

The most important steps taken for the welfare of the Backward Classes have been in the field of education. Lakhs of rupees are being spent annually awarding scholarships to students belonging to these classes and providing them financial assistance for purchase of books, payment of examination fees, etc. These students also enjoy the facilities of free training, free accommodation, stipends, free medical aid, etc., at the vocational-*cum*-technical training centres run by the Harijan Sahayak Department. Students of Kori, Khatik, Tharu and Aheriya communities too which are not included in the Backward Classes enjoy all the educational facilities provided for scheduled castes. In 1953-54, Rs.4,93,040 were spent on providing educational facilities to students of Backward Classes. The total number of scholarships awarded from the primary to the post-graduate stage was 6,149 including 156 to trainees in technical and vocational institutions. Over Rs.39,000 were spent on providing assistance in purchase of books and payment of examination fees. It is now proposed to increase the number of scholarships. The total expenditure on this account in 1954-55 is estimated at Rs.6,13,302.

Recruitment to Service

The educated members of the backward classes are being absorbed in Government services. Instructions were issued, as far back as 1950, that candidates from backward classes (other than those who get within the specified category of Scheduled Castes) be given special consideration in making recruitment to Government services. Some Backward Classes are also given the same concessions regarding age limits for recruitment to public services as are admissible to members of the Scheduled Castes.

Aborigines, Tharus, Bhoksas, Koltas, etc.,

There are no Scheduled Tribes in the State but there are in certain parts, groups of people who live almost in tribal conditions.

The most noteworthy among these are the Adivasis of Mirzapur district, Tharus and Bhoksas of Naini Tal district and Koltas of Jaunsar-Bhabar. The Adivasis of Mirzapur form the largest unit—over a lakh persons comprising some nine different sects. Their main occupations are collection and sale of firewood and other jungle products and unskilled labour when they get it.

Since 1947, efforts are being made to provide educational and other facilities to these people. Every year Rs.20,000 are set apart for this purpose. Last year a sum of Rs.1.50 lakhs was granted by the Government of India also and with the increase in funds more extensive work could be undertaken.

A number of schools have been opened in Robertsgunj and Dudhi tehsils, where most of the Adivasis are concentrated and provision has been made for giving stipends and books to Adivasi children. Grants are given to the Servants of India Society which maintains 25 schools, a Junior High School, 23 primary schools and an adult school. The society has of late taken up certain health schemes also, particularly anti-malaria measures. Last year it was granted Rs.20,000 to implement its welfare schemes in the area.

Tharus are mostly concentrated in Sitargunj and Khatima tehsils of Naini Tal district and Bhoksas are scattered over 55 villages in Kashipur, Bajpur, Gadarpur and Ramnagar tehsils. The main occupation of these people is agriculture. In the Terai-Bhabar Government estates they are provided a large number of educational and housing facilities. Tharus who were previously counted among the Scheduled Castes are still given the facilities provided for those castes.

The Koltas of Pargana Jaunsar-Bhabar of Dehra Dun district consist of about 3,000 families. They primarily live on manual labour and have no proper abode or fixed occupation. The following table gives an idea of the nature of the welfare work and the amount that is spent on it in difficult parts of the State where aborigines, Tharus, Bhoksas, Koltas, etc., live.

Education

From the primary classes to the University stage, education has been made absolutely free for Harijans. No school fees—tuition, games, library, medical or hostel—are charged from Harijan students in any school or college maintained by or receiving grants from the State. Schools maintained by Municipal or District Boards also provide this facility. The loss in income thus incurred by non-Government institutions is made good by Government through special reimbursement grants. Such grants amounted to Rs.17,90,620 in 1953-54 and are estimated at Rs.26 lakhs this year.

Seats have also been reserved for Harijan students in all schools and colleges in the ratio of one Harijan student for every six students of other communities.

A large number of stipends ranging up to Rs.40 per month are awarded to students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Backward Classes and the Momin Ansar community from primary to post-graduate classes. The number of such scholarships in all classes, including teachers' training and technical and vocational classes, which were being given in 1953-54, more than Rs.30,000. Besides monetary assistance for purchase of books, payment of examination fees, etc., is also given to these students.

In 1946-47, Rs.6 lakhs were spent on providing education to these classes. Last year's corresponding figures were Rs.44,06,931. A further increase of about Rs.11 lakhs is anticipated during the current year. The total enrolment in various classes last year was about 12 lakhs. Of these more than 2,000 were studying in Degree and Post-graduate classes.- The total number of students in 1947 was less than two lakhs and only about 100 were studying in Degree and Post-graduate classes.

Steps have also been taken to promote among these classes learned professions such as legal, medical, engineering, etc., by awarding stipends, other monetary help and reserving seats in institutions training in these professions. According to the figures for 1953-54, Government were also running 103 night schools for Harijan adults, 203 schools for boys and 77 for girls, 107 libraries and 78 hostels in different parts of the State. These were primarily meant for Harijans, but students of other communities could also take admission there. On the maintenance of these institutions, Government spent, about Rs.4 lakhs.

Economic Uplift

Economic uplift of Backward Classes received special attention of Government. Efforts are being made to train them in vocational or technical courses and, thereafter, to fix them up in small-scale cottage industries. Stipends are given for technical and vocational studies in various institutions run by Government or recognised private bodies.

The Harijan Sahayak Department has started its own vocational-cum-industrial training centre at Bakshi-ka-Talab, Lucknow. This centre was started with 5 trades in the beginning with accommodation for 100 students. It is continuously being expanded with the result that now it is running classes in 8 different trades and is equipped for imparting training to 210 trainees.

Free training, accommodation, stipend and other facilities are also given to the trainees at the Centre. Fifty-eight Harijan boys trained at the Centre were sent for receiving practical training at the Central Workshop, Kanpur, Carpentry Schools, Allahabad and Bareilly, Precision Instrument Factory, Lucknow, and Electric Supply Co., and Water Works, Lucknow and Delhi.

Seats are also reserved for Harijans in the vocational and technical institutions run by the Directorate of Resettlement and Employment and Cottage Industries, where also provision has been made for giving stipends to trainees. This year two more Technical-cum-Vocational centres were being opened for Harijans and other Backward Classes at Naini Tal and Gorakhpur.

Since 1952-53, arrangements have been made for giving subsidies in cash as well as in kind—machines, tools, etc.—to trained Harijans for developing or starting small-scale cottage industries. These grants were given to 260 Harijans in 1952-53 and to 500 Harijans in 1953-54. Last year they were increased by Rs.50,000.

Government have decided to increase the percentage of reservation for Harijans in State service from 10 to 18.

Suitable grants are also given to non-official institutions and organisations for doing Harijan welfare work. The Harijan Ashram, Allahabad, the Harijan Udyog Shala, Delhi and the Servants of India Society are among such institutions. In 1952-53, a grant was given to start a hide-flaying centre at Bakshi-ka-Talab, Lucknow, for imparting training in improved methods of hide-flaying.

Steps have also been taken to rehabilitate landless Harijans by giving them agricultural land in many of the districts. By the end of 1953, more than 4,000 acres of land was distributed. A number of colonies have been established where landless Harijans have been settled and a drive is afoot for establishing more. The Bhudan Yajna Samiti of the State has accepted the principle that one-third of the land received in Bhudan should be distributed among landless Harijans.

Schemes for improving the living conditions of Harijans and providing them better health and medical facilities have also been undertaken by Government. Grants are given for various development purposes such as construction and repair of houses and wells, improvement of colonies, etc. Besides, subsidies are given for reconstruction of houses destroyed by fire, flood, etc. The grant under this head is being increased every year. During the last financial year the money provided for this purpose was Rs.5.7 lakhs. For the whole period of the State Five-Year Plan the money provided is Rs.24.50 lakh. Till 1953-54, 1,213 wells were sunk or repaired, 23 basties were improved and 257 houses were repaired.

Representation in Services

In 1950, instructions were issued by Government that in making appointment to services the interest of the Backward Classes should in general be borne in mind and that a general reservation of 10 per cent. of the vacancies was to be maintained for members of the Scheduled Castes. Further instructions were issued from time to time for facilitating the recruitment of members of the Scheduled Castes so as to secure their due representation in the public services of the State.

The State Government reviewed the entire position in 1953. It was felt that in spite of the efforts that were made in the past, the Scheduled Castes were not yet adequately represented in the public services of the State. With a view to improving the situation, the State Government decided to increase the reservation of vacancies in public services, filled by direct recruitment from 10 per cent. to 18 per cent.

Provision was also made that if in any one year, candidates of the Scheduled Castes fail to be recruited to any service or establishment to the extent of 18 per cent. the deficiency should be made in the following year.

It would be sufficient for a Scheduled Caste candidate to satisfy the minimum standards required for a particular post, even though such a candidate may be below other non-scheduled caste candidates in merit. No discrimination was made in this connection on the ground of religion or creed.

Backward Classes not included among Scheduled Castes are also granted the same concessions in recruitment to public services as are available to members of the Scheduled Castes.

Rehabilitation of ex-Criminal Tribes

The Criminal Tribes Act, 1924, was repealed on August 31, 1952. Since then members of these Tribes are free like any other citizen of the country. Government are making efforts to fix them up in such a way that they may no longer feel the urge of reverting to unlawful activities. Nine hundred and eighty three families of ex-criminal tribes, consisting of 4,575 persons, are living in Government-managed Settlements at Lucknow, Kanpur, Moradabad and Gorakhpur and at Baurish Colony at Muzaffarnagar. Among the settlers

567 persons are employed inside the Settlements and 456 outside. Four hundred and three families of the settlers have also been provided with 3,887 *bighas* of agricultural land.

The settlers have been given the facilities of free education, free medical treatment, free housing and regular employment. Schools, dispensaries and industrial factories are maintained at each settlement. Students are supplied books and stationery free of cost. They are also given stipends in the schools maintained by Government inside the Settlements as also outside, in higher classes.

Government are running a hostel at one Gorakhpur Settlement where small children are segregated from their parents in order to wean them away from the unhealthy environments of their erstwhile criminal parents. Some boys from various Settlements have also been sent to Gandhi Vidya Niketan, Naini Tal, on Government expense on an experimental basis.

Most of the ex-Criminal Tribes are entitled to the same facilities as other Backward Classes and Scheduled Castes. It is proposed to settle about 400 families belonging to these Tribes on approximately 3,200 acres of cultivable waste lands, each family being given 8 acres of land, a size considered economically adequate for one family. Each family will also be given about Rs.1,880 as loan and subsidy for purchase of bullocks and agricultural implements, construction of house, and maintenance during the first six months. Besides provision for seed and irrigation facilities, the new villages will have teachers and new type of primary schools with a farm of 5 acres attached to each one of them. Provision for health and medical facilities will also be made in these villages.

Last year the Government of India gave Rs.8 lakhs and this year they have fixed a ceiling of Rs.9.7 lakhs for the welfare of ex-criminal tribes in the State. The amount will be spent on rehabilitation, education, promotion of cottage industries, digging of wells and survey of the living conditions of the 'tribes'.

Public Co-operation and Propaganda

In ameliorating the condition of Harijans and other Backward Communities, Government realize the value of public co-operation. The Harijan Sahayak Board and the District Harijan Sahayak Sub-Committees have been constituted with this end in view. Steps have also been taken to make the

fullest use of voluntary agencies working in this field. All organizations having a reputation for social work are assisted by Government and their services are utilized to educate the public. A few of these agencies are:—

The Servants of India Society,

The Harijan Sewak Sangh,

The Bhartiya Adim Jati Sewak Sangh,

Sri Ram Krishna Mission,

The Arya Pratinidhi Sabha, and

The Harijan Udyogshala.

Besides these there are numerous other organizations of Harijan and Backward Classes doing work among their communities.

Government have also been making the fullest possible use of the various means of propaganda and publicity. A special scheme of audio-visual publicity was introduced in 1953-54, with the help of the Government of India. Conferences, meetings, exhibitions, melas and other recognized means of publicity are also usefully employed. Since last year the Harijan Sahayak Department has begun to organize camps at various melas and hold exhibitions in various districts of the State. At these exhibitions and melas useful propaganda against untouchability and other social evils prevalent among these communities is done. A few of such publicity camps organized in 1953-54, by the Department were those at the Development Exhibitions at Agra, Aligarh and Chakrata, at Bharat Mein Uttar Pradesh Pradarshini at Lucknow, and at Kumbh Mela at Kumbhnagar, Allahabad.

Extensive propaganda is also carried on through newspapers, publicity literature, hand-bills, posters, cinema slides, etc. Advice and help of the Harijan Sahayak Sub-Committees in the districts is also sought in all matters concerning publicity. Social workers are appointed from all castes and communities for propaganda against untouchability.

The District Harijan Sahayak Sub-Committees of all the 51 districts of the State were given a grant of Rs.2,000 each (except Lucknow district which was given Rs.3,000) during 1953-54. It has also been decided to celebrate Harijan Week or anti-untouchability Week during November, 1954, in the

districts on a State-wide basis, which will include a planned programme of constructive activities like cleaning of Harijan basties by joint squads of Harijans and other classes, inter-dining etc.

As a result of these efforts Harijans today are not only conscious of their rights and privileges, but are also determined on improving their lot. The people of other castes have also begun to change their outlook.

BACKWARD CLASSES AND THE FIVE-YEAR PLAN

The State's First Five-Year Plan seeks to expand and intensify the various welfare activities regarding the uplift of Harijans and other Backward Classes. It consists mainly of educational, economic and social welfare schemes. Reclamation of the 'Tribes' who were known as 'Criminal Tribes' before August 30, 1952, also forms an important part of it.

Educational Uplift

During the first four years the total expenditure on educational activities which include free education to all scheduled caste students from the primary stage to the university stage, liberal provision of stipends, and non-recurring assistance for purchase of books, payment of examination fees and free accommodation in hostels maintained, would come to Rs.161.24 lakhs. The progress made in this regard will be evident from the fact that the total enrolment in classes from the primary up to the university stage was 6 lakhs in 1950-51. It rose to 12 lakhs at the end of 1953-54. The number of institutions maintained for Harijans and other Backward Classes, viz., adult education centres, primary schools, hostels and libraries, was raised from 383 in 1950-51 to 584 at the end of 1953-54.

Economic Uplift

Technical and vocational education is encouraged among members of the Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes. An industrial-cum-vocational training centre was started at Bakshi-ka-Talab in 1950-51. It is proposed to establish at least 2 more technical centres in the remaining two years of the Plan. Funds have been already provided for this purpose. Special grants-in-aid in order to enable trained Harijans to start small-scale cottage industries are also made. Harijans who went to pursue and develop their ancestral arts and crafts are also extended facilities to avail of the benefits of the scheme.

During the first-three years of the Plan it has been possible to give grant-in-aid to 750 Harijans belonging to all the districts of the State. Preference is given in awarding such grants to persons who have qualified themselves in various crafts from institutions run by Government. Other measures aiming at improving the economic conditions of Harijans include (1) provision of land and (2) provision of greater number of jobs in the State services. More than 4,000 acres of land has already been acquired on which nearly 5,100 families of Harijans have been settled. Most of this land was obtained through the Bhoodan Yagna. The percentage of reservation in various services of the State has also been increased from 10 to 18.

Social Welfare

In order to remove the feeling of social inferiority among Harijans, it was essential to improve the insanitary and unwholesome conditions in which these people usually live. The Plan envisages a scheme for construction and repair of houses and basties, reconstruction of houses affected by natural calamities and sinking of wells for the supply of clean drinking water.

A provision of Rs.24.50 lakhs has been made for this purpose for the Plan period. In all 1,213 wells were sunk or repaired, 23 basties improved and 257 houses constructed out of the grants during the first-three years of the Plan. The principal objective of the scheme is to provide assistance to Harijans in order to raise them slowly but steadily to the standard of the so-called higher classes.

Rehabilitation of ex-Criminal Tribes

After the repeal of the Criminal Tribes Act in August, 1952 the problem of rehabilitating the ex-criminal tribes engaged the attention of Government. Most of these people are still living in settlements and are to be settled on agricultural lands. The scheme is being implemented with the assistance of Rs.6 lakhs given by the Government of India during 1953-54, and it is expected that by the end of the Plan period 1,200 such families will have been settled on land at a cost of about Rs.24 lakhs. The cost on running these settlements will be Rs.42.70 lakhs.
